

BALASORE MISHAP TOLL RISES TO 290

Cuttack: The toll in Bahanaga Bazar train disaster rose to 290 after a 17-year-old resident of Bihar succumbed to his injuries in SCB Medical College and Hospital here Friday, officials said. Prakash Ram who was travelling in the ill-fated Shalimar-Chennai Coromandel Express June 2 when it met with the accident, was undergoing treatment at the surgery ward of the state-run hospital, he said. Prakash is the second accident victim to have died in the hospital from Tuesday. Meanwhile, the identities of bodies of 81 victims are yet to be ascertained.

Security forces kill 5 terrorists, foil infiltration bid in Kupwara

Kupwara (J&K), June 16: Security forces killed five heavily armed foreign terrorists along the Line of Control (LoC) in Kupwara district of Jammu and Kashmir Friday and said it was the biggest infiltration bid to have been foiled since 2021, when India and Pakistan effected a ceasefire understanding.

The operation in the Jumagund area in the Keran sector was launched Thursday night based on intelligence input gathered by the Jammu and Kashmir Police.

Briefing the media here, the general officer commanding of the army's 28 Division, Major General Girish Kalia, said that based on the input, multiple ambushes were set up along the expected routes of infiltration.

"Simultaneously, the entire area, the LoC fence or the antiinfiltration obstacle system (AIOS), was kept under surveillance," he said.

Around midnight, the movement of terrorists was picked up by the alert troops who braved challenging terrain and weather conditions.

The infiltrating terrorists were engaged with precise and accurate fire, and in the ensuing firefight, five unidentified terrorists were neutralised, Maj Gen Kalia said, adding there was no collateral damage.

He said the terrorists were heavily armed and appeared to be very well trained.

During a search of the site Friday morning, a large amount of arms and ammunition, including five AK series rifles, 15 magazines and grenades, and equipment such as night vision devices and binoculars were recovered, he said

Srimandir Mahaprasad (Abadha) was unearthed at Paika Sahi under Baselisahi police station in Puri. This has come at a time when preparation for the world famous Rath Yatra of the divine Trinity is underway in the pilgrim city in full swing.

As per sources, some unscrupulous people were preparing food to be sold as 'Abadha' inside a tent set up in the backyard of a building in Paika Sahi. Hundreds of Koduas (earthen pots) loaded with cooked rice, dal, and other dishes resembling 'Abadha' were found at the spot. The matter came to light after

some images and videos showing the location went viral and the locals informed about the same to the Srimandir servitors.

As per reports, those involved in this racket were defrauding devotees by claiming that they are providing 'Abadha' outside

since the 'Mahaprasad' was not being prepared in Srimandir in view of the 'Anasara Ghara' of the sibling deities. It has been alleged that some traders through this fraudulent activity are busy cheating the gullible devotees to earn easy money.

The revelation has caused massive resentment among the devotees while the servitors have demanded stringent action against persons who are involved in the incident.

Hajuri Krushnachandra Khuntia said, "I am speechless, I do not know how to condemn this incident. It is a sin. Whoever has done this will definitely get punished by God. The Supakara Servitors cook the food with

utmost devotion. Then Servitors conduct Shodasa Upachara Puja and only after that the food turns into Mahaprasad and is sold to the devotees.

"Those, who are cooking food outside and selling them to unsuspecting devotees as Mahaprasad, have committed great sins. The SJTA should take stringent action against them,' he said.

However, the cook, who was preparing the food, said the food was to be served to guests in the street on the twelfth day of a person's death

SJTA chief administrator Ranjan Kumar Das said, "We will conduct an enquiry once we get a complaint in this regard."

Groundwater extraction tilting Earth's spin

New Delhi, June 16: Groundwater pumping has shifted such a large mass of water that the Earth tilted nearly 80 centimetres east between 1993 and 2010 alone, which could impact our planet's climate, according to a study.

The research, published in the journal Geophysical Research Letters, found that during the study period, the most water was redistributed in western North America and northwestern India

Scientists have previously estimated humans pumped 2,150 gigatons of groundwater, equivalent to more than 6 millimetres of sea level rise, from 1993 to 2010. However, validating that estimate is difficult.

Earth's rotational pole actually changes a lot, said Ki-Weon Seo,

a geophysicist at Seoul National University in South Korea, who led the study. "Our study shows that among climate-related causes, the redistribution of groundwater actually has the

largest impact on the drift of the rotational pole," Seo said. The researchers noted that

water's ability to change the Earth's rotation was discovered in 2016, and until now, the specific contribution of groundwater to these rotational changes was unexplored.

The latest study modelled the observed changes in the drift of Earth's rotational pole and the movement of water-first, with only ice sheets and glaciers considered, and then adding in different scenarios of groundwater redistribution.

The researchers said attempts by countries to slow groundwater depletion rates, especially in those sensitive regions, could theoretically alter the change in drift, but only if such conservation approaches are sustained for decades.

The rotational pole normally changes by several metres within about a year, so changes due to groundwater pumping do not run the risk of shifting seasons. However, on geologic time scales, polar drift can have an impact on climate, they said.

This is a nice contribution and an important documentation for sure, said Surendra Adhikari, a research scientist at NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory, US, who was not involved in this study.

Adhikari published the 2016 paper on water redistribution impacting rotational drift.







State sizzles under intense heatwave

Bhubaneswar, June 16: Odisha continued to reel under intense heatwave conditions as the maximum daytime temperature hovered between 40 and 45.6 degree Celsius in at least 30 places, Friday.

The regional centre of the India Meteorological Department (IMD) predicted that there will be no significant change in maximum day temperature in the next four days. Similar heatwave conditions will continue to prevail in many parts of Odisha, it said.

The temperature is likely to be above normal by 4-7 degrees Celsius at a few places over the districts of Odisha during next four days. Consequently, hot and discomfort weather would prevail during the next 4-5 days, the IMD said.

During his long career as MP, Das was a member of various Parliamentary committees.

Vigilance sleuths have unearthed seven plots – two in Bhubaneswar and five in Nimapara – belonging to Nayak. Bank deposits and insurance policies worth over Rs 1.5 crore were also found in his name.

Nayak also owns a four-wheeler and three two-wheelers.

Further searches were on when the last report came in. Notably, Nayak was placed under suspension after his corruption was exposed in a report published by Odia daily Dharitri October 18, 2022.

YOUR CONTACT LENSES MAY BE SHEDDING MICROPLASTICS

ontact lenses, worn by millions of people around the world, tend to shed microplastics when exposed to sunlight for a long time, according to a pilot study.

To determine the number of microplastics in the small samples, such as contact lenses, researchers from the universities of Nanjing and Hohai designed an automated system that took microscopic images of the samples, processed those images, and quantified any microplastics that were present.

Their findings, published in the journal 'Environmental Science & Technology', showed that lenses exposed to sunlight over time can shed tiny fragments of plastic, though the health impact is unclear. The researchers gathered six kinds

of contact lenses from various brands and of different lifespans.

To mimic normal wear and care,



the lenses were stored in water, kept under a lamp that mimicked sunlight and were rinsed with water three times every 10 hours.

After receiving the equivalent of 30 or 90 days of sunlight, the water each lens was stored in was analysed. In tests with standard amounts of

microplastics, the team found that the new system's analyses were quicker and more accurate than when the samples were analysed manually. In the absence of any simulated sunlight, no microplastics were detected.

However, the researchers observed increasing amounts when the contact lenses were exposed to the equivalent of 90 days of sunlight. Lenses with shorter lifetimes showed the greatest amount of shed microplastics after this exposure.

Based on their data in this smallscale study, the researchers estimate that more than 90,000 microplastic particles per year could be shed from some lenses if worn for 10 hours a day.

The human health impact of direct exposure of microplastics to eyes is not currently known, but the researchers say their findings indicate that more studies in this area are urgently needed. IANS

'School infra overhaul need of the hour'

Bhubaneswar, June 16: A recently conducted study by some civil society organisations here revealed that 27.32 per cent of schools in the state lack adequate toilet facilities. The finding is based on a comprehensive analysis of data from 7,146 schools of 98 blocks and one urban local body, Bhubaneswar, from across 17 districts of the state.

The study was conducted by Atmashakti Trust in collaboration with Odisha Shramajeebee Mancha (OSM) and Mahila Shramajeebee Mancha, Odisha (MSMO)

As per the analysis, a staggering 75.68 per cent of schools are in dire need of repairs and fail to meet the norms and standards outlined in the Right to Education (RTE) Act. The study further reveals that 12.60 per cent of surveyed schools lack adequate drinking water facilities, while an additional 14.26 per cent have partially damaged water structures.

Furthermore, more than a third of all elementary schools (75.86 per cent) do not have a playground. "Classroom facilities also fall short, with a total of 73.85 per cent of schools failing to meet the RTE criteria. Another finding shows that 13.35 per cent of schools lack a kitchen space or have fully damaged structures, while 20.77 per cent of them have partially damaged



Bolangir, June 16: Illegal parking of heavy vehicles, including trucks, is the root cause of accidents on National Highways (NH) in Odisha, many have opined. This matter has assumed significance after the accident in this district claimed five lives a few days back. In the mishap, a car had crashed into a stationary truck parked near Chhuinbancha Square on Sambalpur-Bolangir National Highway-26.

Local residents have pointed out that accidents frequently occur in the vicinity where the mishap took place. They blamed the illegal parking of trucks on the highway as the main reason behind the accident. However, this is not an isolated

incident in this district alone. Trucks are illegally parked on highways in many districts including Sundargarh and Khurda.

However, truck drivers who park their vehicles on NH-26 said that they have no other option as there is no designated parking area for them. Mohit, a driver from Andhra Pradesh informed that trucks are not allowed to pass through Bolangir town from 6.00am to 12 midnight. As a result they have no option but to wait on the highway at various entry points.

However, illegal parking is not a problem in Bolangir district alone. Hundreds of heavy vehicles can be found parked on both sides of the road on NH-16 in Khurda district. This affects the normal movements of other vehicles and traffic snarls are a regular problem.

The situation in Koida of Sundargarh district is similar. Residents pointed out that the number of accidents due to illegally parked trucks is increasing. They demanded action from the district administration and said that designated parking places should be assigned for heavy vehicles to prevent loss of lives and injuries.

Traders fleecing ignorant tribals selling Mahua flowers

R. Udayagiri, June 16: Tribals under this block in Gajapati district are suffering and losing out on their earnings as they are oblivious about the prices fixed by the state government for minor forest produces. As a result, they are getting fleeced by unscrupulous traders who are making huge profits at the expense of the ignorant tribals, sources said Friday.

One of the main forest products that the tribal people depend upon for their livelihood is Mahua flowers. Braving the scorching heat, tribal woman collect Mahua flowers from the forests.

However, then they do not get the right price while selling the flowers to the traders. This is because the government is yet to finalise a price for selling of the flowers by the tribals.

The Excise department has been issuing licences for hoarding Mahua flowers to traders. However, no such permission has been given to the tribals. Hence the tribal people are failing to reap the benefits of their hard work. People with the permission to hoard the flowers are buying those at dirtcheap rates exploiting the tribals.

This year plenty of Mahua flowers grew in Mohana, Nuagarh and R Udayagiri blocks in Gajapati district.

However, the tribals got a meagre price for their efforts. Traders bought the flowers at ₹15 to ₹20 per kilogram. Later on they went on to sale the same at more than ₹50 per kilogram to traders of other states and in the process made a killing. However, the ignorant tribals failed to earn a substantial sum.

A section of the tribal groups have now asked the government to fix a price for Mahua flowers so that they can also benefit. They have also asked the government to take action against the unscrupulous traders. The tribals have demanded storage facilities for the flowers as soon as possible.

Hierarchy Concerns

s promotions in various ministries/departments are underway, and the chairmen of these bodies sit in on the meetings, having someone who is comparatively junior sitting as a Member of the Union Public Service Commission (UPSC) is becoming a matter of some embarrassment, if murmurs are to be believed.

In a world driven by hierarchies as much as by performance, babus are rather prickly about these matters. But it appears that the appointment last month of Suman Sharma, a 1990-batch IRS officer, as a Member of the Commission is causing consternation among seniors in her allied services, who find it awkward to appear at meetings at the UPSC, where she sits as their equal.

Sharma started her career as an IRS officer in Gujarat, and the grapevine believes it sometimes confers some extra powers, which may partly explain her meteoric rise now, to a post that is hugely significant

But this aside, even after the confirmation of Manoj Soni as UPSC chairperson and the subsequent appointment of Sharma and 1988batch IAS officer Bidyut Bihari Swain as members, four key member posts remain vacant in UPSC. The tenure of a member of UPSC is six years or until the age of 65 years, whichever is earlier. Sharma, we are told, will get to serve as a UPSC member until May 2029.

Growing vacancies impeding effective governance

Despite the PMO's ambitious goal of providing 10 lakh employments by December 2023, the Department of Personnel and Training (DoPT) has admitted that 1617 posts of section officer grade remain unfilled as of December last year. Further, sources have informed DKB that an additional 300 vacancies are expected to emerge in July due to promotions

from section officer grade to under secretary grade. This will bring the overall vacancy count to more than 1,800, accounting for nearly half of the sanctioned strength.

Section officers are considered the backbone and institutional memory of the Central Secretariat,

playing a crucial role in the units of the ministry or department where they are posted. The minister concerned Jitendra Singh has acknowledged that the shortage of section officers is paralyzing ministries and departments, ultimately affecting the delivery of public services.

Given the situation, sources say that the Central Secretariat Service (CSS) Forum, a representative body of all CSS officers, has raised concerns and urged Singh to prioritize the matter. Apparently, eligible officers face a pecuniary loss of Rs 10,000 per month if not promoted before July 1, 2023. Additionally, considering the vacancies expected to come up in the months ahead due to cadre reviews, there could be 3,000 vacancies at the section officer grade, which would seriously impede the functioning of the Central government.

Unjust pursuit?

In God's own country, an unlikely face-off is brewing between the Kerala government and retired top cop turned author Jacob Thomas. The latest episode in this saga has the state government demanding action against Thomas for daring to write books without its permission! Is the former IPS officer the victim of a political witch hunt? The state's babus are now pondering this troubling question.

Thomas, clearly, has a knack for stirring up trouble. His first book 'Swimming with the Sharks' managed to ruffle a few feathers during his eventful tenure in various posts. He was even suspended twice for having the audacity to publish it.

Now the state government is outraged again, this time taking offence at two more books penned by Thomas. A prominent CPM leader even released the first book, while the second was supposed to be unveiled by none other than Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan. But the function never saw the light of day.

Even three years after his retirement, the state seems relentless in pursuing Thomas. Yet strangely, sources point out, there has been no inquiry or action against M Sivsankar, the former principal secretary to the chief minister, who published a book right after being released from jail for his alleged involvement in a major smuggling racket. The plot thickens! To add fuel to the fire, an inquiry is now underway against Thomas for alleged irregularities in a dredger purchase made a decade ago. Is there no end to the retired police officer's woes? Perhaps this is the price he is paying for falling out of favour with the authorities.

FOSTERING CLIMATE AGENCY

The gap between the resources needed to achieve net-zero greenhouse-gas emissions by 2050 and the resources that are available currently amounts to trillions of dollars – and is still growing. As many developing and emerging economies lose ground in the wake of the pandemic, public and private capital must be mobilized to accelerate mitigation and adaptation efforts. But this requires governments to produce credible plans for achieving global sustainability goals, to design and implement these policies themselves, and to ensure that their strategies' costs and benefits are fairly distributed.

Last November's United Nations Climate Change Conference in Egypt (COP27), dubbed the "implementation COP," laid the ground work for a fairer, more robust climatefinance system. The conference's "guidebook" called on the international community to advance a transformative agenda that accounts for developing countries' national priorities and ensures equitable access to financial and technical resources. It included in its definition of climate justice "equitable access to quality and quantity climate financing" that considers "historical responsibility for climate change" and "supports resilient development pathways, leaving no one behind.'

With this in mind, Egypt launched its Nexus of Water, Food, and Energy investment programme during COP27, providing a practical and replicable model for ensuring a just net-zero transition through the NWFE's concept of "country platforms." These platforms are meant to help countries build state capacities, and emphasize the importance of developing countries' agency (or "ownership," in aid parlance).

NWFE (pronounced "nuafiy," which is Arabic for "fulfilling pledges") builds on Egypt's commitments under the 2015 Paris climate agreement and aims to attract financial support for the country's development agenda while accelerating climate action. The stakeholders include multilateral development banks (MDBs) such as the European Bank for Reconstruction and Development, the African Development Bank, the European Investment Bank, and the Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank The NWFE platform inte-

grates several high-priority water, food, and energy projects-all selected by the Egyptian government –worth a total of \$14.7 billion. The projects seek to replace existing inefficient thermal power plants with renewable energy; enhance small farmers' adaptation to climate risks; modernize farming practices to increase irrigation efficiency and boost crop yields; strengthen the resilience of vulnerable regions; create water desalination capacity; and establish early-warning systems. By using innovative financing mechanisms to mobilize

public funds, technical assistance, and private investment, Egypt seeks to leverage its partnerships with the MDBs and other development stakeholders to accelerate its climate agenda. This would support the country's green transition and show that climate action and economic development can go hand in hand. Egypt can also rely on these partnerships to help it phase out "brown" oil, gas, and mineral assets. For example, partial concessional financial support from the United States will enable the country to retrain (or retire) fossil-fuel

workers. Yet, the most innovative instrument may be debt-for-climate swaps, whereby Egypt receives partial debt relief from, say, Germany, in exchange for commitments to reduce greenhouse-gas emissions. These types of performance-linked financial instruments could provide many developing and emerging countries with an opportunity to lower their debt burden or obtain low-cost funds. By tying development assistance to progress on a common global target, such swaps could also prove to be significant in

mitigating the worst effects of climate change.

As a 2018 report by the G20 Eminent Persons Group on **Global Financial Governance** notes, collective action through country platforms has the power to unlock public and private investment to achieve climate-resilient and sustainable development. Such investment platforms can take different forms. For example, Just Energy Transition Partnerships (JETPs) – first introduced during COP26 in Scotland in 2021–aim to direct private capital towards decar bonization targets in the energy sector. Since launching in South Africa, JETPs have also been established in Indonesia, India, Vietnam, and Senegal.

Egypt's NWFE initiative provides a useful model for how developing and emerging countries can expedite the implementation of their national climate agendas in line with global priorities. By encouraging co ordination among domestic and external stakeholders, such programmes could help bridge the information gap, establish shared standards, and increase the number of bankable projects.

But the platform's success hinges on domestic agency, transparency, and accountability in managing these partnerships. Most importantly, the green transition must be perceived as just in order to be sustainable. Predictability is particularly important for the poor, and fair ness is essential to winning longterm public support for climate measures. To achieve these goals, governments must lead on climate finance. The net-zero transition depends on it.

Thus, it can safely be concluded that the root of the problem lies in unequal distribution of resources. Was it not necessary to develop the area equitably so that all sections get the benefits of development?

This is not the case of just Manipur but many other states such as Jharkhand, Chhattisgarh, Uttarakhand, Odisha to name only a few. In Uttarakhand, it is slightly different. Thousands of poor people have been rendered homeless due to subsidence, at-

these homeless people get shelter, but the priority is to enable people to visit the so-called holy sites comfortably as religion is more important than livelihood. Delving back, one may refer to the miraculous growth of the steel city, Jamshedpur, but few have ventured to go into reports of how land was acquired and whether these people benefitted, in any way, from this Tata empire. It may be recalled that since at that time there was no rehabilitation policy, land was acquired from the tribals at very low prices, and they were left to fend for themselves. No rehabilitation was provided and most of these tribals squandered the money as they did not know how to wean out an alternate means of livelihood. In fact, most of the tribal families perished in distress.

Amaravati: Three persons died of electrocution during the last rites of their relative in Andhra Pradesh's Chittoor district Friday, police said. The incident occurred near a crematorium in Kuppam town of the district. Rani, 65, had died of illness and her relatives had come from different places to take part in her last rites. However, tragedy struck the funeral procession when it had reached close to the crematorium. According to police, three men, who were part of the funeral procession, tried to remove electric wires which were lying on the ground.

Student killed

Kodagu (Karnataka): A college student died in a scooter-bike collision in Kushalnagar town of the district Friday. The deceased was identified as 21year-old Bhavana, a resident ra Locality i Kushalnagar. According to police, Bhavana, a student of Field Marshal K. M. Cariappa college, was travelling on a scooter with her friend near Coorg Cineplex when they were hit by an oncoming motorcycle.

New Delhi, June 16: Former Special Director General of Tamil Nadu Police (Law and Order) Rajesh Das is perhaps the third senior IPS officer to be convicted for sexual misconduct while in service, after K P S Gill and S P S Rathore.

Das was sentenced to three years' imprisonment by a court in Villupuram district in Tamil Nadu on Friday for sexually harassing a woman superintendent of police in early 2021. He had since been placed under suspension.

Before Das, senior police officers SPS Rathore and KPS Gill were convicted for sexual harassment. Rathore was convicted for molesting 14-year-old Ruchika Girhotra in 1990 when he was serving as the inspector general of police in Haryana.

Ĝirhotra, a budding tennis player, committed suicide as her family and friends were systematically harassed and her brother was taken into illegal custody and tortured by the police. The disgraced IPS officer was sentenced to six months in jail in 2009. The sentence was further enhanced to 18 months at the



plea of the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI), which investigated the case. In November 2010, the

Supreme Court granted bail to Rathore on the condition that he would remain in Chandigarh. The Supreme Court later upheld Rathore's conviction in the molestation case but reduced the punishment to six months' jail already served by him considering his age.

Gill, a former chief of the Punjab Police, was convicted for outraging the modesty of a woman IAS officer but was spared from going to prison with the Punjab and Haryana High Court revising his three-month jail term to "probation"

The Supreme Court in 2005

upheld the order of the Punjab and Haryana High Court convicting him. The fabled police officer, credited with stamping out terrorism from Punjab, was convicted by a local court in Chandigarh for outraging the modesty of a woman on January 6, 1996.

It was alleged that Gill, in an inebriated condition, had patted IAS officer Rupan Deol Bajaj in the back at a party hosted by a senior bureaucrat at his residence on July 18, 1988. Another IPS officer, P S

Natarajan, was dismissed from service in 2012 following charges

of sexual exploitation, but he was acquitted by a court in Jharkhand in 2017 due to a lack of satisfactory evidence.

Sentencing Das to three-year imprisonment, the court of the chief judicial magistrate granted him bail and 30 days time to go for appeal.

The Madras High Court, while hearing a review plea by D Kanan, an SP-rank officer charged along with Das, had observed in 2021 that "if a woman IPS officer can be subjected to sexual harassment, less needs to be said about women police personnel in lesser ranks.

5 JeM terrorists held for killing civilian

Srinagar, June 16: Five Jaishe-Mohammad (JeM) militants have been arrested from Anantnag district of Jammu and Kashmir in connection with the killing of a circus worker, Deepak Kumar, last month, police said Friday.

Kumar (27), a resident of Udhampur district, was shot dead by two motorcycle-borne militants from a close range when he had gone to the market to buy milk on the night of May 29. He worked at a circus in the Janglat Mandi area in the south Kashmir district.

Addressing a press conference in Anantnag, Deputy Inspector General (DIG), South Kashmir Range, Rayees Mohammad Bhat said five JeM militants have been arrested in connection with Kumar's killing. "Investigations and searches were launched after the incident. During the investigations, we got some technical leads and some clues. In the meantime, we zeroed in on some suspects and they were interrogated,' Bhat said



He said the investigations pointed at two people, Sehran Bashir Nadaf and Ubaid Nazir Laigroo, both residents of Anantnag town who had gone missing."We launched a massive search operation to nab them. Based on technical and human intelligence, we were ultimately able to arrest these two accused after which the whole conspiracy was revealed," he said.

UP woman kills husband

Muzaffarnagar (UP): A 25-year old woman, along with her paramour, allegedly strangled her husband and buried his body in a seven-feet deep toilet pit in their home in Muzaffarnagar district. The woman continued to stay at the same house, police said. The body of the victim, identified as Sagar Ahmed (30), was found Thursday evening, almost 10 days after he was murdered at village Mandla under Purkazi police station. According to police, the accused woman identified as Ashiya had lodged a missing complaint of her husband on June 7. During investigation, it came to the fore that Ashiya was in a relationship with Sagar's stepbrother Suhail Ahmed (28), who lives in the same area.

Among 1,09,000 persons shifted from coastal areas to temporary shelters there were 10,918 children, 5,070 senior citizens and 1,152 pregnant women, the government release said. The cyclone made landfall

along Saurashtra-Kutch coasts near Jakhau around 6:30 pm on Thursday, bringing incessant rains and wind speeds as high as 140 kmph. The landfall was over by 2.30 am on Friday, and several parts of Kutch as well as Devbhumi Dwarka, Jamnagar, Rajkot and Morbi districts in

Saurashtra regions were battered with very heavy rainfall of 100-185 mm on Friday accompanied by strong wind of up to 95 kmph, the State Emergency Operation Centre (SEOC) said.

In all, 175 talukas of the state received some amount of rainfall during the day, it said. The storm caused extensive financial loss to the state power utility Paschim Gujarat Vij Company Limited with 5,120 electricity poles getting damaged, relief commissioner Pandey said.

As many as 4,600 villages were left without power, but electricity supply was restored in 3,580 villages, he added. At least 23 people were injured due to cyclone-related incidents while many houses were also damaged, he said. Asked about a cattle-rearer duo of father and son dying on Thursday while trying to save their goats stuck in a flooded ravine in Bhavnagar district, Pandey said that since the district was not cyclone-affected, their deaths were not counted as cyclone-related.

Imphal/Kochi, June 16: Manipur saw a spurt in violence as riotous mobs combated Rapid Action Force, set up flaming roadblocks and torched properties in the heart of Imphal town on Friday, officials said.

Among others, a house belonging to Union Minister RK Ranjan Singh was attacked and attempts were made to burn it down. A warehouse near the royal palace belonging to a retired tribal IAS officer was burnt down completely. Security guards and fire-

fighters managed to control arson attempts by the mob and save the house of the minister of state for external affairs here from being gutted. A mob clashed with RAF personnel on Friday evening after it had set the warehouse afire. The group also burnt tyres, logs and waste in the middle of streets in Wangkhei, Porompat and Thangapat areas affecting the flow of traffic in Manipur's capital town, officials said.

The RAF fired tear gas shells to disperse the crowd late in the evening. No casualties have been



reported as yet. Sound of firing could be heard in Imphal East district till the early hours of Friday as security forces fired numer ous rounds of tear gas shells and mock bombs to disperse angry locals protesting the killing of nine civilians on Wednesday.

The development comes after the burning of two houses and clashes between RAF and a mob in the heart of Imphal town on Thursday afternoon. Reacting to the developments. Union minister RK Ranjan Singh said: "I am trying to bring peace and stop violence since May 3 (when ethnic clashes began in the state) ... this is all a misunderstanding between two communities. The government has set up a peace committee, the process is on. Civil society leaders are sitting together."

ED TO GRILL BALAJI'S **BROTHER, OTHERS**

Chennai, June 16: The Enforcement Directorate (ED) has summoned arrested Tamil Nadu Minister Senthil Balaji's brother R V Ashok Kumar, personal assistant B Shanmugam and others for questioning next week in an alleged cash-for-jobs linked money laundering case, officials said Friday.

The two, along with some other accused and a woman who is suspected to be linked to an alleged 'benami' land deal related to the minister, have been called for recording their statements under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA), they said

They have been asked to depose before the agency at its office here on different dates next week. The agency had earlier claimed that Balaji allegedly "misused" his office for illegal gratification and "engineered" a job racket scam in the state's transport undertakings during 2014-15 with purported kickbacks paid by candidates through his associates who included Kumar and Shanmugam.

Balaji, 47, was arrested by the ED on Wednesday and is currently in hospital. Calling the minister the "prime suspect" in the cash-forjobs case, the federal probe agency also stated in its custody papers that alleged unaccounted cash deposits worth about Rs 1.60 crorewere made in the bank accounts of Balaji and his wife.

Academicians back NCERT textbook rationalisation Youth fires at lineman in UP

A day ago, a group of academicians, who were part of the textbook development committees of the National Council of Educational Research and Training (NCERT), wrote to the council demanding their names be dropped from books as their

"collective effort is in jeopardy". A few days earlier, political scientists Yogendra Yadav and Suhas Palshikar had asked the NCERT to drop their names from textbooks over "several sub-



stantive revisions of the original texts". The joint statement issued by 106 academicians on Thursday night alleged that there have been deliberate attempts to malign the NCERT in the last three months and this reflects the "intellectual arrogance of

academicians who want students to study 17-year-old textbooks". The signatories to the state-

ment include the vice-chancel lors of the Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU), Tezpur University, Mahatma Gandhi Central University, The English and Foreign Languages University, Central University of Jharkhand, Ranchi University, University, Bangalore Behrampur University, Central University of Gujarat, Indira Gandhi National Tribal University, the NIT Jalandhar director, the chairman of the Board of Governors of IIM Kashipur, the ICSSR secretary and the NIOS chairman.

'In the past three months. there have been deliberate attempts to malign the NCERT, a leading public institution, and disrupt the much-needed process for curriculum updation. Academicians trying to capture media attention through this name-withdrawal spectacle seem to have forgotten that textbooks are an outcome of collective intellectual engagement and rigorous efforts," the statement said.







PoJK: Displaced people get domicile certificates

Jammu, June 16: "We have been reconnected to our roots". says Anil Mahajan, who is among the over 21,000 displaced people from Pakistan-occupied Jammu and Kashmir (PoJK) given a new domicile certificate mentioning the place they originally belonged to.

The certificate carries the name of the "original place of residence" in PoJK from where their family members had migrated during the Partition in 1947, said officials in the Jammu and Kashmir administration that is issuing the document.

'We have been reconnected to our roots. It is very emotional,' said Mahajan, whose domicile certificate mentions the Mirpur area in PoJK as his original place of residence. "Everybody in my family has got one. They took our details and provided us with the domicile certificates. It is really very encouraging", he told PTI over phone from Chandigarh where he currently lives.

The certificate, the officials said, is exclusively for those who were displaced from areas of Jammu and Kashmir that are under the illegal occupation of Pakistan. In 1947, they migrated to different parts of India, including Jammu and Kashmir. Delhi, Punjab, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand.

SIT set up to probe smuggling, shooting incident in Samba

Jammu, June 16: A special investigation team has been formed to bust a drug trafficking racket after the recovery of heroin worth ₹14 crore near the International Border in Samba district, police said.


Shimla, June 16: Himachal Pradesh Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu has instructed the Public Works Department (PWD) officials to prioritise the construction of tunnels for new road projects to ensure high-quality construction.

Sukhu, who presided over a review meeting with the PWD officials virtually from Shimla, also stressed the need for constructing ropeways in the state. a statement issued here said.

He informed that after the formation of the new government in the state, projects for the construction of 62 roads with an outlay of ₹336 crore have been sanctioned till now under the National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD).

Moreover, the state government has sanctioned ₹97 crore to decongest the circular road of Shimla city to facilitate the commuters, he added.

Reviewing the progress of the Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana-3, he said that



the Detailed Project Reports (DPRs) of 45 roads with an estimated cost of ₹422 crore have been approved for the state and out of these, tenders for 44 roads have already been awarded. He said that DPRs for 256 roads with an outlay of ₹2.662 crore have been sent to the Union government for approval in the second phase.

These road constructions will encompass 644 kilometres using the full depth reclamation (FDR) technique and 499 km with a cement sub-base tech-

Raj Kumar, one of the workers from Delhi who were busy assembling the bamboo sticks underneath the shade of a flyover to escape the scorching sun, said they are expecting to complete the job within a week and hand over the possession to the concerned authorities.

"It is both wind and waterproof. The base is made of iron and we also use polythene and fibre sheets. One hut takes almost four to five days for completion," he said, adding they have imported the bamboo material from Assam. In the private sector, he said their firm had constructed restaurants and huts at different places in Rajouri and Katra - the base camp for the pilgrims visiting the Mata Vaishno Devi shrine atop Trikuta hills in Reasi district. Political clashes will not be tolerated: Bose

Kolkata, June 16: West Bengal Governor CV Ananda Bose Friday said that political violence will not be tolerated, asserting that "there will be action and no alibi for inaction". Bose said this after visiting Bhangore in South 24 Parganas district, where supporters of two political parties clashed Thursday, the concluding day of nomination filing for the panchayat election, leaving three persons dead

"Some undesirable incidents have happened in some parts of Bengal. I have made my inferences about them. No violence will be tolerated and we will have to end it. There will be action and no alibi for inaction," Bose said.

People of the state have the right to exercise their franchise to vote fearlessly, the governor said assuring the voters that the "perpetrators of violence would be permanently silenced" and would be brought to book.

The governor said he has already discussed the situation with Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee."The CM is my constitutional colleague. What we discussed cannot be revealed outside. Certainly, whatever is ex-

pected of the governor under the Constitution will be done." "I interacted with the victims of violence and the locals. I can assure the people of Bengal that violence will be the first victim in this election," Bose told reporters after taking stock of the situation at Bhangore, around 30 km from Kolkata.

The governor spent almost two hours interacting with the

Food choices key to tackling global warming: Study

New Delhi, June 16: Food consumption in the five highest greenhouse gas (GHG) emitting countries, including India, was responsible for more than 40 per cent of global food supply chain emission in 2019, according to a study.

The research, published in the journal Nature Food, found that action to protect the planet against the impact of climate change will fall short unless emissions are reduced from the

global food system, which now makes up a third of man-made GHG emissions

The largest emission increase within food supply chains is triggered by beef and dairy consumption in rapidly developing countries, such as China and India, while emissions per head in developed countries with a high percentage of animal-based food declined, the researchers

said. The team noted that the growth of the global population and rising demand for emission-inten-



sive food are likely to boost emissions further."A global shift in diets, including reducing excessive intake of red meat and improving shares of plant-based protein-will not only reduce emissions but avoid health risks such as obesity and cardiovascular disease," said study cor-

responding author, Professor Klaus Hubacek from the University of Groningen in The Yuli Shan, Netherlands. from the University of Birmingham, UK noted that the agrifood system drives global land use and agricultural activities-contributing to around

one-third of global anthropogenic greenhouse gas.

'Population growth, expansion of food production, and an increase in animal-based diets are likely to further increase emissions and squeeze the global carbon budget," said Shan, corresponding author of the study.

The study first author, Yanxian Li, a Ph.D. Student at the University of Groningen said mitigating emissions at every stage of food supply chains from production to consumption is critical if we are to limit global warming. "However, widespread and lasting diet shifts are very difficult to achieve quickly, so incentives that encourage consumers to reduce red meat or buy products with higher environmental dividends could help to reduce food emissions," Li said.

Johnson last week said he would stand down as the lawmaker for Uxbridge and South Ruislip, an area in West London, after he read a parliamentary report over whether he misled parliament over gatherings at his office during Covid lockdowns.

That report, published in full Thursday, found he had deliberately misled parliament over the rule-breaking parties, though Johnson has dismissed the report as a "lie" and a "charade"

United Nations, June 16: As the violent conflict in Sudan has entered its third month. humanitarian situation across the country continues to deteriorate, UN relief chief Martin Griffiths said.

Griffiths, UN Undersecretary-General for Humanitarian Affairs and Emergency Relief Coordinator, also warned that situation in Sudan's Darfur is spiraling into humanitarian calamity, reports Xinhua news agency. Some 1.7 million people are now internally displaced

while close to half a million people have sought refuge outside Sudan, he said.

which further raises the risk of food insecurity, the UN official said and noted that there has also

"I am particularly worried about conditions in Darfur where people are trapped in a living nightmare," Griffiths said in a statement

In addition to dire humanitarian situations, inter-communal violence is spreading in Darfur, threatening to reignite the ethnic tensions that stoked the deadly conflict there 20 years ago, he said. He noted that the violence is hampering humanitarians' efforts, and urged parties to the conflict and those with influence to ensure the movement of humanitarian supplies and personnel from other parts of Sudan, as well as from neighbouring countries, to Darfur where close to 9 million people need assistance.

"Darfur is rapidly spiraling into a humanitarian calamity. The world cannot allow this to happen. Not again," said Griffiths.



India, China bought 80% of Russian oil in May: IEA

India's imports of Russian oil were 14% higher than in April and a fresh record high for Russian crude flows into the country

New Delhi, June 16: India and China, the world's top oil users, continued to lap up heavily discounted Russian crude oil, buying as much as 80 per cent of the oil that Moscow exported in May, the International Energy Agency (IEA) said in a report.

"Heavily discounted Russian crude oil has found new buyers primarily in Asia. India has increased purchases from almost nothing to close to 2 million barrels per day, while China has raised liftings by 500,000 barrels per day to 2.2 million barrels per day," the Paris-based energy agency said in its latest Oil Market Report.

Russia-origin seaborne crude exports averaged 3.87 million barrels per day in May, the highest since Russia invaded Ukraine in February 2022.

"In May 2023, India and China accounted for almost 80 per cent of Russian crude oil exports," IEA said. "In turn. Russia made up 45 per cent and 20 per cent of crude imports in India and China, respectively.'

With Russia's formerly main crude export markets in Europe banning import and G7 imposing shipping restrictions, more than 90 per cent of Russian seaborne crude is now headed to Asia, up from pre-war levels of 34 per cent.



Rourkela, June 16: Former Indian hockey star Ashok Kumar is optimistic for the 'One Step Forward' programme – an initiative to promote the game at the grassroot level – saying he is hopeful for the 'innovative project'.

In a tête-à-tête with Orissa POST, Kumar, son of hockey legend Major Dhyanchand, bared his mind on several issues relating to the game.

"I am hopeful about this project and this is a real innovative one. This will certainly help the game like anything and will take Sundargarh hockey to the next level," said Kumar.

He, however, has concerns considering the handling of talents in the past. "I have one apprehension and that is the psychological conditioning of the trainees. They are good and tal--ented but I have seen many talents getting wasted when they

come to the national scene and meet with players from Haryana and Punjab, who are little flamboyant in nature and also aggressive," he pointed out.

"And these tribal players who are very good but are not so like their counterparts from other states find it very hard to adjust to the camps. So, I highly recommend their mental conditioning and making them tough,' he said further.

The 'One Step Forward' programme is a joint initiative by Dilip Tirky Sports Research and **Development Foundation** (DTSRD) and The Jindal Steel and Power Foundation (JSP).

The main objective of the project is to spread the game of hockey at the grassroot level, between the age group of 7-15, and make them aware of the basics. Speaking about the entire plan, Hockey India President and former Indian captain Dilip Tirky said, "we are planning to teach them the basics of the
