New Delhi, June 19: Senior IPS officer Ravi Sinha, an expert on neighbourhood countries and operations, was Monday appointed as the new head of external spy agency R&AW, succeeding Samant Goel who completes his four-year stint June 30.

According to an order issued by the Ministry of Personnel, the Appointments Committee of the Cabinet has approved the appointment of 59-year-old Sinha, a 1988 batch IPS officer from Chhattisgarh, as the Secretary RAW for a tenure of two years. Sinha, who has had an over two-decade-long stint in the Research and Analysis Wing (R&AW), is at present the second-

in-command in the organisation.

(KTF) chief Hardeep Singh Nijjar, one of India's mostwanted terrorists who carried a cash reward of Rs 10 lakh on his head, was shot dead outside a gurdwara in the North American country, officials here said Monday.

A resident of Bharsinghpur village in Punjab's Jalandhar, Nijjar was found dead inside a car with bullet wounds in the parking lot of Guru Nanak Sikh Gurdwara Sahib, of which he was the head, in Surrey around 8.30pm (local time) Sunday, they said.

Quoting preliminary information, the officials said Nijjar was shot by two unidentified assailants and died on the spot.

When his body was being moved from the scene by the Canadian police, a group of Sikhs raised pro-Khalistan and anti-India slogans, according to the officials.

Nijjar was one of the mostwanted terrorists in India for his alleged involvement in terror activities in the country.

In July last year, the National Investigation Agency (NIA) had announced a cash reward of Rs 10 lakh on information leading to Nijjar's arrest in connection with an attack on a Hindu priest in Jalandhar in 2021.

According to the NIA, Nijjar was also promoting the secessionist and violent agenda of pro-Khalistan group 'Sikhs for Justice' in India.



IndiGo orders 500 planes from Airbus

Mumbai/New Delhi, June 19: In one of the largest-ever aircraft purchases by an airline, IndiGo Monday announced placing a firm order to buy 500 narrow-body planes from Airbus as the airline embarks on an ambitious long-term growth path.

The multi-billion dollar deal comes less than five months after Air India placed orders for 470 aircraft with Airbus and Boeing. The latest order by IndiGo is the largest-ever aircraft order placed by any airline with Airbus. Financial details of the order were not disclosed.

The aircraft purchase agreement was signed between the airline and Airbus at the Paris Air Show 2023. The latest order will provide IndiGo a further steady stream of deliveries

between 2030 and 2035, the airline said in a release. Currently, IndiGo operates more than 300 aircraft. It has previous orders totalling 480 aircraft, which are yet to be delivered.

This IndiGo order book comprises a mix of A320NEO, A321NEO and A321XLR aircraft, it said. With this new order, since its inception in 2006, IndiGo has ordered a massive total of 1,330 aircraft with Airbus. More P11

Sunak, Zelenskyy relish homemade 'barfi'

London, June 19: British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak revealed that he shared some barfi (Indian sweet) made by his mother with Volodymyr Zelenskyy at Downing Street recently, hours before his latest phone call with the Ukrainian President Monday.

The 43-year-old British Indian leader posted a reel over the weekend on his official Instagram account of an interview during which he shared the moment his mother Usha's homemade delicacy was en-



joyed by the Ukrainian leader. The incident goes back to last month when Sunak made a quick visit to his hometown of Southampton to launch a new government scheme for the statefunded National Health Service (NHS) to expand the role of high street pharmacies.

"They [parents] were upset because I had come to visit the pharmacy that my mum ran earlier in the week, I hadn't told them I was back in Southampton, they were very upset; they tried to come and see me, but it wasn't possible," he said. "My mum had got some Indian sweets that she wanted to give me

that she'd made, called barfi, that she couldn't give me then but then she managed to give them to me at a football match, which was important to her.'

'Oddly enough, I saw President Zelenskyy on the Monday after that, and he and I were chatting, and he was hungry. So, I actually gave him some of my mum's barfi... she was thrilled by that," he said.

Sunak has often spoken about his family-run Sunak Pharmacy in the southern England port city of Southampton, where he was born and helped out his mother as a schoolboy.

Major fire breaks out at 4-storeyed building

Bhubaneswar, June 19: A major fire broke out at a four-storeyed building near BMC Bhawani Mall under Saheed Nagar police limits here Monday. Though no casualties were reported, properties worth over lakhs were gutted in the fire mishap.


"We found during initial investigation that an electric short circuit at an electric panel caused the fire. Soon a thick smoke engulfed the whole building including a bar on the ground floor. Four employees of a private travel and tourism firm operating on the fourth floor of the building were trapped in the smoke. Our first priority was to rescue the entrapped staffers unhurt which we managed to do successfully," told Abani Kumar Swain, the Deputy Fire Officer, Bhubaneswar.

Informed, the fire department officials reached the spot along with two fire tenders, advanced equipment like concrete cutter and 25 firemen at 11.45am. The fire was completely doused after around a two and half an hour grueling effort by the fire personnel.

We faced a lot off problem to bring the fire under control and rescue the four persons as the building has no emergency exit door. It has only one door for both entry and exit purposes, no ventilation system in place for smooth release of smoke. We found serious fire safety lapse in the building. We are going to issue notice against the owner for the absence of required fire safety measures in the multiplex building as per the rules," said Swain.

Weaponising UCC

here is every reason to doubt the intent of the 22nd Law Commission of India which has sought views from public and religious organisations about the implementation of the controversial Uniform Civil Code (UCC) that aims at framing one law governing marriages of all communities and religious groups dispensing with their respective personal laws. Similar attempts were made in the past too when it became the rallying point of right-wing Hindoo and fundamentalist outfits to drive a wedge between the majority Hindoo and minority Moslem population for electoral gains. The whole nation was then agitated as the move triggered panic among the minority population over scrapping of their personal laws and undue interference with the age-old convention and faith regarding their system of marriage.

The 21st Law Commission had earlier examined the UCC and solicited the views of all stakeholders through its appeal along with a questionnaire in 2016. It made further public appeals in 2018 and released a consultation paper in the same year on "Reform of Family" in which it cogently argued and concluded that formulation of UCC was "neither necessary nor desirable at this stage." In the 185-paper, the Commission, led by former Supreme Court judge Justice BS Chaushanin, emphasised that secularism could not contradict the plurality prevailing in the country. It categorically stated cultural diversity cannot be compromised to the extent that the urge for uniformity itself becomes a reason for threat to the territorial integrity of the nation. It made its point crystal clear without any ambivalence that a unified nation did not necessarily need to have "uniformity" and that efforts have to be made to reconcile the country's diversity with universal and indisputable arguments on human rights. Differences, it clarified, did not always imply discrimination in a robust democracy. In the same breath, it did not rule out certain uniform measures to be accepted by all religions on marriage and divorce. That was fair enough, given the fact that laws are not immutable and can be changed in the light of changing social conditions and reality.

The 22nd Law Commission's sudden realisation that fresh attempts need to be made to ascertain public views on the UCC as three years have passed since the previous Commission's verdict is, indeed, suspect. In the first place, it is not clear wherefrom the Commission has got the idea that this is the right time for reconsidering the crucial issue fraught with dangers of communal conflagration.

This is all the more dubious since only in February, then Union Law Minister Kiren Rijiju told the Rajya Sabha that the government had not taken any decision "as of now" on the implementation of the UCC in the country. He further clarified that the matter might be taken up by the 22nd Law Commission for its consideration. It could be surmised from his statement that even though there was no immediate need to rake up the vexed question, it could be revived in future to suit the ruling BJP's interests

The question is - what happened in the intervening four months that led to the Commission's decision not to waste any more time and take up this most sensitive issue with the potential to stoke communal passion.

The answer may be that when Rijiju dismissed the immediate possibility of taking up the matter, the BJP-government, led by Narendra Modi, was facing little threat from the Congress and the Opposition for the 2024 Lok Sabha election at that time. But, thereafter the unthinkable happened in the form of an ignominious defeat of the BJP at the hands of the Congress in the Karnataka Assembly elections. That not only ended the Congress' drought of electoral success since the Prime Minister occupied the centre-stage of Indian politics, but exploded the carefully crafted myth of "Modi hai toh mumkin hai" (with Modi around, anything is possible). The BJP seems to have read the writings on the wall that no one is invincible. It could not pass off the debacle as a reflection of the party's state leadership since Modi himself addressed a record number of election rallies and spent over a week campaigning in Karnataka.

Under the circumstances, the BJP leadership appears to be desperately looking for one tool after another for its divisive electoral politics. The UCC is one such weapon that the saffron brigade is trying to fish out of its armoury.

PLAYING WITH FIRE

he Manipur crisis, complex as it is, has a cause, a trigger, and a history. In theory, it can be explained in the light of events in the immediate. Put simplistically, the cause is the long-standing divide between the Meitei (a little over 50% of population, concentrated in Imphal and the Valley districts occupying some 10% of land area) and the Kuki people (some 25%, many of them practicing Christianity, spread across majority hilly regions). The trigger, in part, is the judgement of the single judge of the High Court of Manipur at Imphal, Justice MV Murlidharan. The judge ordered the government to take a decision within four weeks on granting the Scheduled Tribe status to Meiteis, who have been demanding this in the face of opposition by Kukis. The HC order has since been called "factually wrong" by the Supreme Court and is under appeal. The trigger is also in part the action by the Meitei-dominated government against those illegally occupying forest land, action against illegal migrants from neighbouring Myanmar and a drive against poppy cultivation in hilly regions, feeding into new anxieties among the Kukis.

Yet, the immediate causes and triggers and history may not tell the full story. Bitterness in the heart, building bit by bit, cannot be easily understood or measured. Its outpouring into violence against the state and against fellow citizens carries the potential of a nasty surprise that we see today -Manipur is burning and the government knows not what to do next. This is a sensitive state in a sensitive region with not very friendly neighbours. The collapse of state machinery here should be a cause for alarm.

We think we are on a road to a better future but we may be driving up the wrong alley, leaving the nation more divided and ungovernable.

In the book 'The Black Swan', Nassim Nicholas Taleb writes: "What is surprising is not the magnitude of our forecast errors, but our absence of awareness of it. This is all the more worrisome when we engage in deadly conflicts ... Owing to this misunderstanding of the causal chains between policy and actions, we can easily trigger Black Swans thanks to aggressive ignorance-like a child playing with a chemistry kit." There may be an important message in that for the current context in India.

Keep mum

he word mum is one of the few that we can say for certain are onomatopoeic, which imitate or echo some sound. The sound in this case is the inarticulate murmur 'mmmmm', the only noise one can make when one's mouth is kept firmly shut. The word has been recorded in English from the fourteenth century in various spellings but settled to its modern form in the sixteenth century. It has produced several compounds, including mummer (a mime actor, one who performs silently, though the word is also linked to the French momeur), the verb to mumble and, less obviously, the name of that nasty disease mumps. This may derive from mump, an obsolete word for a grimace, which could possibly refer to the altered shape of the face due to the swollen glands in the neck, or perhaps to a resulting difficulty in speaking. It's the same word as the old verb to mump meaning to sulk. (Neither is connected with mumping in the sense of begging, which comes from a different word, Dutch in origin, or of mum for a type of beer, whose origin is uncertain.) And there are the various phrases, like mum's the word and your to keep mum which also include the idea of keeping silent. The sense of mum that produced the delightful double meaning in the headline you spotted is very much more modern. As a shorted form of mummy it appears only at the start of the nineteenth century. Until then, there would have been no joke, nor would that poster slogan of the Second World War have been possible, the one that enjoined people not to talk carelessly to strangers: "Be like Dad: keep Mum".

Kelemenopy

t is an invented word that has no real existence outside the pages of the book in which it was first presented to the world. It was coined by the late John Ciardi, the American poet and teacher, in A Browser's Dictionary in 1980, describing it as "the one essential trope neglected by classical rhetoricians" and suggesting it meant a sequential straight line through the middle of everything, leading nowhere. He said it was "from my own psychic warp, to see if anyone would notice, and because I have always dreamed of fathering a word". The genesis of his creation was the sequence klmnop from the centre of the alphabet, with ten letters before and ten after it, which Mr Ciardi described as "a strictly sequential irrelevance". The word, he suggested, might be applied with special appropriateness to the career of one US politician in particular: "Teddy Kennedy's career has been the classical kelemenopy of the American twentieth century."

Worse, a global biodiversity crisis is upon us: ecosystems are being eroded to the point of collapse, and species extinctions are accelerating at a frightening pace. Here, too, the poor are dispro-

portionately affected. To address this dual crisis at the pace and scale needed, the international community must change its approach. Historically, global agreements to address climate change and biodiversity loss have been negotiated separately, even though the two issues are closely interlinked. Moreover, the process has been marred by structural disparities, power imbalances, and prioritisation of national and commercial interests over the global common good.

Neither human societies nor the natural systems that support them can work well in silos. We need a co-pilot. Following recent breakthroughs, artificial

For example, AI could vastly improve international negotiations by illuminating the hithertoneglected connections between biodiversity and climate issues. AI could also shed light on the broader effects of agreements like the Paris climate accords and the many inchoate sectoral initiatives focusing on issues like water, energy security, and oceans. As matters stand, at least 250,000 treaties have been nego tiated in the interest of deepening global cooperation, yet the broader effect of all this diplomacy has been underwhelming.

The predictive capabilities and analytic precision of AI could help solve this challenge. By processing enormous amounts of data from these treaties, AI can identify any conflicts, contradictions, or gaps, thereby helping to prevent ducountries with armies of ex-

But it is not just about numbers. Low-income countries are still catching up in terms of technology and research expertise, and this asymmetry is being exacerbated by the global digital divide. We can overcome the effects of such concentration by making AI co-pilots available to developing countries, rather than waiting for them to develop their own homegrown technologies.

To navigate the AI revolution, we must understand the technology's potential and its limitations, as well as our own responsibilities for ensuring its fair and ethical use. We must guard against biased data and remain vigilant against potential hacking and manipulation. If we can do that, we can forge ahead toward the goal of building a sustainable and equitable future - even at a time when hope is losing its hold in the public imagination.

'LiFi' technology

Sir, 'LiFi' technology is a type of wireless connection that can be 100 times faster than WiFi. Professor Harald Haas, Chairperson of Mobile Communications, University of Edinburgh, is considered to be the founder of this technology. He promoted this technology in a 2011 TED Global Talk. LiFi is a wireless optical networking technology called "light fidelity" that uses LEDs (light emitting diodes) for data transmission. Using light to transmit data allows LiFi to offer some additional advantages. With LiFi technology, we can operate without interference in the sensitive electromagnetic fields of hospitals and airplanes and operate smoothly over high bandwidths while providing high transmission speeds. This technique creates particles of light emitted by an LED bulb that are invisible to the human eye, and through these emitted particles data can travel to the receiver and then from the receiver to the device. The receiver then collects the information and interprets the transmitted data. It's conceptually similar to Morse code decoding, but the process happens at a much higher speed millions of times per second. LiFi transmission speed can exceed 100 Gbps. Asit Mohanty, JAJPUR

Fly ash dumping: Tehsildar asks SPCB to cancel Hindalco's CTO

Sambalpur, June 19: Days after publication of a report on dumping of fly ash at Nildunguri area under Jujumora tehsil of Sambalpur district allegedly by Hindalco

Industries, the local tehsildar asked the state pollution con-IMPAC trol board (SPCB) to

cancel the 'consent to operate' (CTO) to the industrial firm, Monday. Orissa POST had pub lished a report June 15 on dumping of fly ash by the same firm.

Tehsildar Abhishek Sahu in his letter (No-1620) to the regional officer of SPCB has said that the pollution board had issued CTO vide letter No 1570, dated-10.05.2023 to M/s Hindalco Industries Ltd for dumping of flv ash in Nildunguri.

The tehsildar in the letter has



informed that the tehsil office was not consulted for the no-objection certificate (NoC) before granting the CTO. Sahu in his letter has further said that as the land in Khata No-3 and Plot No-44 in Nildunguri mouza has been leased out to a government-run firm, immediate steps are to be taken for cancellation of the CTO and informing the same to his office.

The report had stirred a controversy as public representatives visited the spot and stopped the dumping of ash at the site as it was being done illegally without fulfilling the necessary conditions. A complaint was even

lodged against 'Kalvani Transport' at the Sadar police station. The representatives even alleged the involvement of leaders of a particular political party in carrying out the dumping activities while violating government norms.

The huge quantity of fly ash has created problems both for vehicles plying on National Highway-53 as well people residing near the dumping ground. Thick layers of fly ash can be found both outside and inside the buildings. The villagers have been opposing the dumping of ash and had lodged complaints with the district collector and the SPCB. However, their pleas fell on deaf years.

The issue had gained prominence as the area is surrounded by a village, a training centre of the Agriculture department. National Highway-53, forests and farmlands of the residents.

World Cup held earlier in the vear and had become a major tourist attraction. However, when it collapsed, this city lost one of its iconic structures.

The administration has blamed miscreants for the collapse of the statue. Officials had said that a portion of the pole supporting the structure had been cut off. However there were no answers to questions like how could the statue collapse due to a storm or what was the guard doing when miscreants had allegedly tampered with the pole.

The BJP has alleged a sinister plan behind the whole episode. BJP state spokesperson Dhiren Senapaty said, "This is a big scam. Why eight mm steel was


used to support such a huge statue? Many more facts will emerge if the media is allowed


Initially when the statue collapsed, a two-member team com-

prising a PWD engineer and a professor from NIT Rourkela was formed to investigate the matter. The team was then expanded with the joining of the sub-collector of Sundargarh district and two more engineers. However, till now facts have not emerged. Deputy Commissioner of

Rourkela Municipal Corporation (RMC), Sudhansu Bhoi termed the entire episode as 'sabotage'. "The team will soon present its report," Bhoi informed Monday. "We believe it was an act of sabotage the way the steel poles have been cut. Had the poles got broken on their own, the edges would have been rough," Bhoi added. He also informed that the statue will be re-erected once investigations are completed.



👕 t is widely accepted that 'animal sacrifice' is prohibited among the followers of Vaishnavism. However, most readers will be amazed to learn that animal sacrifice ritual takes place inside the Srimandir every year. Researcher Surendra Nath Dash in his book 'Srimandira Sabdakosha' writes that as per Jagannath temple's terminology. the ritual is known as 'Chheda Paka Niti' which is observed near the well of Goddess Bimala during three days of Durga Puja -- Ashwina Shukla Saptami, Ashtami and Navami.

Significance of Goddess Bimala

Devi Bimala temple is situated next to 'Rohini Kund' on the southwest corner inside the inner wall of Srimandir. The sculpture of the deity is made of black granite.

Researcher Dukhi Shyam Behera in his book 'Srikshetra Jijnasa' pens that Devi Bimala is considered 'Kaibalya Bhojini Vaishnavi' (not to be offered non-vegetarian food). During normal course of worship except the three days of Durga Puja, Devi Bimala is served with the remnant of food offered to Lord Jagannath. Following the offering, the Naivedya becomes Mahaprasad which then the devotees partake of.



Tewari said Modi's remarks were contrary to a statement issued by the Ministry of External Affairs a day before, where it was clearly stated that the Galwan incident took place because Chinese soldiers tried to intrude and set up tents on the Indian side of the border.

is the truth of the developments that have taken place on the LAC in the last three years," the Congress leader said.

Bhopal, June 19: The National Security Act (NSA) has been invoked against a group of men who allegedly kept a man on a dog leash and abused him in Madhya Pradesh's Bhopal, state Home Minister Narottam Mishra said Monday.

Talking to reporters, Mishra said he received information about a video of the incident this morning and he had directed the police to act within 24 hours.

In six hours, the police identified the accused and nabbed them, he said, adding that a police station in-charge has been removed from the field duty in connection with the incident.

The stringent NSA has been invoked against the accused and the illegally constructed structures belonging to them have been identified and they will be razed, the minister said.

He further said that provisions of the Freedom of Religion Act were also invoked against the accused after a religious conversion angle came to light in the case. In a video of the alleged incident, the victim is seen with a leash around his neck and the accused are telling him to bark like a dog while abusing him. At the end of the 49-second video. the victim is also heard saying "main Miyan Bhai banne ko taiyar hoon" (I am ready to become Miyan Bhai, a term used for Muslims in Bhopal). The accused are also heard asking why the victim had used abusive language against them and demand that he apologise.

Chandigarh, June 19: The Punjab Cabinet Monday approved an amendment to the British-era Sikh Gurdwaras Act to ensure "free-to-air" telecast of Gurbani from Amritsar's Golden Temple.

Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann said the amendment bill will be introduced in the Punjab Assembly on Tuesday, the second day of its two-day session. Currently, Gurbani is broadcast from the Sikh shrine by PTC, a

private channel often linked to the Shiromani Akali Dal's Badal family. The Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee, the apex religious body of the Sikhs, has contested the move by the AAP government, saying the 1925 Act is a central legislation and can only be amended by Parliament.

However, Mann said the state government is fully competent to amend this Act as the Supreme Court had already ruled that this Act is not an inter-state Act, but a state Act, an official statement said.

The statement quoting the chief minister said the state cabinet has decided to amend the Sikh Gurdwaras Act by inserting Section 125A, thereby making it the responsibility of the SGPC to ensure "free-to-air" live telecast of the holy Gurbani from Sri Harmandir Sahib (Golden Temple).

PATEL PEERLESS IN CYCLONE COMBAT

ver 22 years after a massive earthquake flattened Kutch district of Gujarat bordering Pakistan, the once blood-soaked region seemed headed for a double whammy last week. June 14 dawned to searing winds and soaking skies slicing the coastal landmass of Saurashtra and a 3.5 magnitude tremor in Kutch as the entrails of the earth and the wrath of the ocean joined in a destroyer dance on a cowering populace. Mercifully the earth relented though the sky had no such intentions as the ardour of the Arabian Sea poured its frenzy on the comely coastline

drenching its depths in a well of water. Cyclone Biparjoy has come and gone after a relentless pummeling and a night of fury leaving ordinary mortals to pick up the remnants of their soggy shattered and poverty penetrated lives.

Union Home Minister Amit Shah who conducted an aerial survey of the cyclone affected region reiterated the Gujarat government's claim that 'not a single life was lost' though unofficial sources have put the fatalities at a considerably low count of five so far. 40-yr-old Rajshri Kasundra was killed in Maliya Miyana near Morbi



when a wind flown tin sheet fell on her. Another woman was killed in a wall collapse in Vadodara, published reports said. The aftermath of the cyclone havoc speaks of a long night ahead both for the people as well as the official agencies working to restore normal services. The reports of damage to infrastructure, water invaded fields and farms, homes and hearths are slowly beginning

to trickle in. In Kutch alone 80,000 electricity poles are in the dumps and over 33,000 hectares of land rendered temporarily unusable. Power supply to over 4000 villages has been fully or partially affected. Unending sheets of water have blighted coastal villages.

The cyclone has had a crippling affect on trade and industry. The Gujarat Chamber of Commerce and Industry (GCCI) has put the loss to industrial trade at Rs 5.000 crores. There are almost 10,000 trucks stranded in Kutch as the bulk of the roads in the coastal areas are blocked with fallen trees.

Jerusalem: Israeli troops killed three Palestinians, including a minor, and wounded at least 29 others during a massive gunbattle with militants in the streets of the occupied West Bank city of Jenin Monday, the Palestinian Health Ministry said. Floods kill 6 in Nepal

Kathmandu: Rain-triggered floods and landslides have killed at least six people and injured as many across Nepal police said Monday. Three persons died in Tapleiung and one each in Paanchthar. Nuwakot and Sankhuwasabha districts, the Nepal Police said. Three persons were injured in floods and landslides in Sankhuwasabha, two in Tapleiung and one in Paanchthar, Police said 29 people have gone missing in rain-related incidents in different parts of the country in the last 48 hours. Search for the missing is underway, police said, adding that 35 houses, 10 huts, 13 bridges, five industries and two government offices were damaged in the natural disaster.

Beijing, June 19: China and the United States agreed Monday to try and stabilise their intense rivalry to avoid veering into conflict, but did not announce any major breakthroughs during a rare visit to Beijing by US Secretary of State Antony Blinken.

Chinese President Xi Jinping hailed "progress" after shaking hands with Blinken at the Great Hall of the People, a grand venue usually reserved for greeting heads of state.

Blinken, the first holder of his post to meet the Chinese leader since 2018, told reporters he had raised contentious issues such as Taiwan, the democratic island Beijing claims as its own.

And while he said the two sides had not moved forward on establishing regular militaryto-military communications - a major concern for the wider world - he expected more senior US officials would visit China in coming weeks.

It had been hoped their roughly 30-minute meeting could help facilitate a summit between Xi and US President Joe Biden later in the year.

Biden and Xi last met on the sidelines of the G20 summit in Bali, Indonesia in November, pledging more frequent communication, although ties since then have deteriorated over Taiwan, espionage accusations and other concerns.

It was not immediately clear from Xi's remarks what progress he was referring to, although he

Beijing's tone on Taiwan was particularly pointed throughout Blinken's visit. Wang said "China has no room for compromise or concessions", according to the Chinese readout.

The United States has long stuck to a policy of "strategic ambiguity" over whether it would respond militarily to an attack on Taiwan, which Beijing has refused to rule out.

When asked last year, US President Joe Biden said Washington would defend Taiwan in the event of a Chinese invasion, though aides later said his comments did not reflect a policy departure from the longstanding "one China" policy.

US officials have underscored that the United States does not support Taiwan independence.

US officials have been playing down the prospect of a major breakthrough in talks, but they and analysts expect Blinken's visit will pave the way for more bilateral meetings in coming months, including possible trips by Treasury Secretary Janet Yellen and Commerce Secretary Gina Raimondo.

Kyiv, June 19: Ukraine said Monday it had driven Russian forces from an eighth village in its two-week-old counteroffensive, a settlement on a heavily fortified part of the front line near the most direct route to the country's Azov Sea coast.

A Russian-installed official said Sunday that Ukraine had taken control of the village, Piatykhatky, in the southern Zaporizhzhia region. He later said Moscow had pushed them out and Monday morning he said Ukraine was attacking again.

Ukraine's Deputy Defence Minister Hanna Maliar said Ukrainian forces had not only retaken Piatykhatky but had advanced by up to 7 km into Russian lines in two weeks, capturing 113 square km of land.

"In the course of two weeks of offensive operations in the Berdiansk and Melitopol directions, eight settlements were liberated," Maliar said on Telegram, referring to two cities on the Russian-occupied coastline.

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy hailed the efforts of the troops and said he would continue talks with



Western allies to get weapons and ammunition supplies to them as soon as possible.

"Our troops are advancing, position by position, step by step, we are moving forward," he said Sunday evening. "The main thing is the speed of supply."

On Monday, the Russian Defence Ministry said its forces had thwarted a Ukrainian attempt to take the village of Novodonetske in the eastern Donetsk region, another area where Kyiv's counteroffensive has been focused

It released a video showing what a soldier heard talking in it said was a captured Frenchmade tank. Kviv did not comment and Reuters could not verify the latest battlefield accounts.

Europe likely to singe under more deadly heatwaves

The continent, which has been warming twice the global average since the 1980s, saw its warmest summer on record last year, with countries including France, Germany, Italy, Portugal, Spain and United Kingdom experiencing their warmest year on record

Paris, June 19: Europe should brace for more deadly heatwaves driven by climate change, said a sweeping report Monday, noting the world's fastest-warming continent was some 2.3 degrees Celsius hotter last year than in pre-industrial times.

Crop-withering drought, record sea-surface temperatures and unprecedented glacier melt are among the consequences laid out in a report by the World Meteorological Organization and the European Union's Copernicus Climate Change Service.

The world has warmed an average of nearly 1.2C since the mid-1800s, unleashing a devastating cascade of extreme weather, including more intense heatwayes. more severe droughts in some



areas and storms made more ferocious by rising seas.

Hardest hit are the most vulnerable people and the world's poorest countries, who have done little to contribute to the fossil fuel emissions that drive up temperatures. But impacts are becoming increasingly severe across the world, with regions in the northern hemisphere and around the poles seeing particularly rapid warming.

Temperatures across the continent rose 1.5C in 30 years, from 1991 to 2021, according to the report, the State of the Climate in Europe 2022.

Severe heat left more than 16,000 people dead last year, the report said, while floods and storms accounted for most of the \$2 billion in damages from weather and climate extremes.

Increasing temperatures have taken a toll on economies and ecosystems, the report said. In the Alps, glaciers saw a new record mass loss for a single year in 2022, caused by very low winter levels of snow, a hot summer as well as deposits of wind-blown Saharan dust.



Mumbai, **June 19:** Equity benchmarks Sensex and Nifty pared early gains to close lower Monday as investors offloaded the 30-share BSE index fell 216.28 points or 0.34 per cent to settle at 63,168.30. During the day, it declined 336.75 points or 0.53 per cent to 63,047.83.

The NSE Nifty went lower by 70.55 points or 0.37 per cent to end at 18,755.45. The index registered its lifetime peak of 18,826 Friday.

"Indian equities shied away from closing at all-time high levels amid profit-booking, primarily driven by private banks. Global markets also took a breather after a strong rally last week as investors looked forward to China's rate decision and the Fed chair's testimony," said Vinod Nair, Head of Research at Geojit Financial Services.

Kotak Mahindra Bank was the biggest loser from the Sensex pack, skidding 1.83 per cent, followed by Axis Bank, NTPC, Hindustan Unilever, ICICI Bank, Bharti Airtel, Reliance Industries, HCL Technologies, IndusInd Bank and Nestle. In contrast, Bajaj Finance, Bajaj Finsery,



telecom, power and utility stocks amid a bearish trend in global markets and profit booking.

Besides, intense selling in Reliance Industries, ICICI Bank and Kotak Bank counters also hit investor sentiments, traders said.

After hitting its lifetime high Friday,

SIP closures surge 7.4% MoM in May

The surge in SIP inflows amid higher cancellations shows that new investors continue to invest more money than the average ticket size

New Delhi, June 19: The number of systematic investment plan (SIP) accounts being discontinued rose 7.4 per cent month-on-month (MoM) to 14.19 lakh in May, despite the stellar inflow into mutual funds through the route.

At the same time, the number of new SIP registration rose to 24.7 lakh last month from



19.56 lakh in April, implying fresh registration of over 5 lakh, data with the Association of Mutual Funds in India (AMFI) showed.

Meanwhile, investors continued

to park their money in mutual funds, with contributions in SIPs reaching a new high of Rs 14,749 crore last month, after a brief dip to Rs 13,728 crore in April. It was Rs 14,276 crore in March.

This robust inflow has led to assets under management of SIP rising by five per cent to Rs 7.53 lakh crore last month from Rs 7.17 lakh crore in April.

Going by the data, the number of SIP accounts discontinued or matured rose from 13.21 lakh in April to 14.19 lakh in May.

SPAIN REIGN SUPREME Fencer Bhavani Devi creates history

La Roja claim Nations League title ending 11-year trophy drought as Unai Simon saves two penalties in shootout against Croatia in the final

Rotterdam. June 19: Spain's 11year trophy drought is over. Croatia and its veteran captain Luka Modric are still waiting for their first international title. Goalkeeper Unai Simon saved two shots as Spain beat Croatia in a penalty shootout after their tense Nations League final had finished 0-0 Sunday.

The Bilbao goalkeeper used his feet to save a penalty by Lovro Majer when the shootout was level at 3-3 and then dived fulllength to tip Bruno Petkovic's spot kick around the post. Dani Carvajal converted his penalty -with a 'Panenka' chip - to seal the victory.

Spain's other previous titles came in the 2010 World Cup and the European Championships in 1964, 2008 and 2012.

Midfielder Rodri, who punched the air after scoring his penalty, has four titles this season after also winning a historic treble with his club, Manchester City. He was named the player of the Nations League tournament to cap his memorable year.

Spain did not manage a shot on target until the 84th minute of the match and when substitute Ansu Fati finally looked

like breaking the stalemate, Ivan Perišic was on the goal line to block his effort. It was Spain's only goal-bound attempt, compared to five by Croatia.

In the first period of extra time, Majer broke through and fell in the penalty area under a challenge by Nacho, but German referee Felix Zwayer ruled that the Spain defender had played the ball and waved off Croatia's ap-

peals for a penalty. Croatia's fans – many wearing shirts with Modric's name and No.10 on the back — far outnumbered their Spanish counterparts at De Kuip stadium in Rotterdam. But they were forced to leave disappointed as their nation and the 37-year-old Modric continued their wait for a first

New Delhi, June 19: Olympian CA Bhavani Devi Monday created history by securing India's first-ever medal at the Asian Fencing Championships - a bronze – after losing in the women's sabre semifinal at the continental event in Wuxi, China.

Bhavani lost to Uzbekistan's Zaynab Dayibekova in a hardfought semifinals 14-15, but ensured India its maiden medal in the prestigious event. Bhavani had earlier stunned reigning World Champion Misaki Emura of Japan 15-10 in the quarterfinals to script history.

Misaki had won the women's sabre gold medal at the 2022 World Fencing Championships held in Cairo. It was Bhavani's first win over Misaki as she had lost all her matches against the Japanese in the past.
