New Delhi, July 4: India's unemployment rate jumped to 8.45 per cent in June from 7.68 per cent in the previous month. While unemployment rate in urban areas eased to 7.87 per cent last month, rural India saw a two-year high joblessness rate of 8.73 per cent, according to the Centre for Monitoring Indian Economy (CMIE).

India's unemployment rate rose above 8 per cent for the third time this year on the back of seasonal joblessness in rural areas, the Bloomberg reported quoting CMIE's monthly data.

The nationwide joblessness rate was 7.68 per cent in May, 8.11 per cent in April and 7.8 per cent in March. The urban unemployment rate was 10.07 per cent in June 2021, while the rural joblessness rate was 8.75 per cent in the month.

According to the private think tank, India's labour force participation rate (LFPR) fell to 39.5 per cent in the last financial year (2022-23) that ended in March. This is the lowest LFPR reading since 2016-17. The LFPR for men stood at a seven-year low of 66 per cent, while that of women was at a mere 8.8 per cent.

The LFPR is the share of the working-age population (aged 15 years and above) that is employed or unemployed, willing and looking for employment, it was learnt.

The unemployment rate is the share of people who are unemployed despite looking for work. If the proportion of people looking for work is high, then the unemployment rate is a good way to assess the stress in the job market.

June is typically a lean season for the agricultural sector, a key source of livelihood for the country's rural population. Unemployment usually soars in India's villages in June as harvesting ends in May and sowing for a new crop gathers pace only in July when monsoon progresses.

High joblessness is a worry for Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who has been trying to burnish the credentials of his administration by distributing job appointment letters as part of his promise to provide one million government jobs by the end of this year.

A persistent weakness in the labour market, particularly in rural areas where about twothirds of the India's population lives, could make his reelection bid in 2024 polls more challenging and put hurdles in the way of India's world-beating economic growth.

Bhubaneswar, July 4: The state has received 171.7 mm of rainfall, 31 per cent less than normal so far due to the prevalence of a weak monsoon which has affected agricultural activities across the state, India Meteorological Department (IMD) said

Tuesday. The state received de-

ficient rainfall between 1 June 1 and July 4 as compared to the normal of 247.4 mm, it said.

However, Deogarh district recorded 331.8 mm rainfall, the highest in the state during the period, which is 41 per cent more than the normal of 238.9 mm.

Rayagada on the other received the least rainfall of 56.7

mm, marking a departure of 73 per cent during the same period.

mm against the normal of 213.9

Deficient rainfall of 68 per cent and 65 per cent were recorded in Kalahandi and Kandhamal districts respectively. The actual rainfall in the two districts till Monday was 85.6 mm and 78.2 mm respectively.

The coastal districts of Khurda, Puri, Cuttack, Jajpur, Balasore, 00 Bhadrak, Jagatsinghpur, Kendrapara and Ganiam along with the southern districts of Gajapati, Koraput and Nabarangpur and Boudh, Subarnapur, Bolangir and Nuapada in the west are the worst hit. The rain deficit in these districts ranged 22 to 57 per cent, the weatherman said.

First 'flying car' that can ply on road as well

CALIFORNIA STARTUP ALEF AERONAUTICS EXPECTS TO SELL THE 100% ELECTRIC VEHICLE FOR \$300,000 EACH, WITH THE FIRST DELIVERY PROJECTED BY THE END OF 2025

New York, July 4: The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) of the United States (US) has issued a Special Airworthiness Certificate for testing a vehicle that California startup Alef Aeronautics describes as a flying car — the first 100 per cent electric vehicle that can both fly and ply on roads to receive US government approval.

According to Alef Aeronautics, the vehicle/aircraft-Model Ais the first flying vehicle that is drivable on roads and able to park like a normal car. It also has vertical takeoff and landing ca-

pabilities. It apparently will be able to carry one or two occupants and will have a road-range of 200 miles and a flying range of 110 miles.

The company expects to sell the vehicle for \$300,000 each, with the first delivery projected by the end of 2025

The FAA confirmed that it has issued the company a Special Airworthiness Certificate, allowing for limited purposes that include exhibition, research and development. Sources in know of the development said that multiple firms were working on all-electric vehicle takeoff and landing aircraft

FAA said that Alef Aeronautics is 'not the first aircraft of its kind' to get a Special Airworthiness Certificate. Alef Aeronautics, however, claimed that its vehicle is different be-

cause of its ability to function both on roads and in the air-to appear like a normal car and to park in a normal parking space. "We are excited to receive this certification from the FAA. It allows us to move closer to bringing people an environmentfriendly and faster commute, saving individuals and companies hours each week. This is a one small step for planes, one giant step for cars," said Jim Dukhovny, the CEO of Alef Aeronautics.

The company's website said the flying car will be a certified as a 'low speed vehicle', which means it will not be able to go faster than about 25 miles per hour on a paved road. "The assumption is that, if a driver needs a faster route, a driver will use Alef's flight capabilities," the company posted on the site.

Regardless, it also still needs approval from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration to go on roads. Development has been underway on the vehicle since 2015.

Four friends, Constantine Kisly, Pavel Markin, Oleg Petrov and Dukhovny, inspired by the "Back to the Future" movies (which foresaw flying cars being available in that year), decided to form a company to try to develop them.

According to the company, an initial automated test flight of a skeleton version of the car was successfully conducted in 2018, and a full-size prototype was flown the following year. But Alef said that it needed the FAA's special airworthiness certificate to continue conducting the necessary research and development.

The company also said that earlier this year that it had taken refundable pre-orders for more than 400 of the vehicles, with the cost of \$150 for to be in the general queue or \$1,500 for the priority queue.

₹1,950 crore irrigation boost to Subarnapur

Bhubaneswar. July 4: In a bid to irrigate farmlands in Subarnapur district, the state government has decided to construct two in-stream storage structures with an investment of around ₹1.950 crore.

The in-stream storage structures will be constructed at Khairmal and Godhaneswar with an estimated cost of ₹925.59 crore and ₹1,021.81 crore respectively.

As per the direction of Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik, 5T Secretary VK Pandian Tuesday visited Rameswar Ghat where a detailed presentation was made on the proposed in-stream storage structures. He asked the department officials to expedite the process and ensure that the work starts soon. Pandian started his Subarnapur district visit by offering prayers at Patali Srikhetra at Kota Samalei of Birmaharajpur and interacted with temple com-

mittee members for further de velopment of the shrine and pilgrim facilities. The district administration was directed to prepare a detailed project report for the development of the temple

During his visit to Ulunda, he interacted with the locals and heard their grievances. He also instructed officials for timely redressal of the grievances.

Then, he proceeded to Parbati Giri Mega Lift Irrigation Project. The project at a cost of ₹270 crore with a potential of 10,221 ha will be completed by September 2023. The 5T Secretary visited the

mega pipe water supply project at Baunsuni and inspected the progress of the project. More than 60 gram panchayats (GPs) will be provided water supply at a cost of ₹417 crore. In the first phase, 25 panchayats of Dunguripali will get pipe water from December 2023.

Bhubaneswar, July 4: 5T Secretary VK Pandian, Tuesday, faced the ire of Aam Admi Party (AAP) workers when the latter allegedly threw eggs at the IAS officer's carcade during his visit to Subarnapur district.

The incident took place on Kota Samalei-Ulunda road when Pandian's carcade was on its way to Subarnapur town.

Pandian, a 2000-batch IAS officer, has been accused by the opposition parties of violating the All India Service Rules for bureaucrats and acting like a politician.

Meanwhile, the AAP state unit in a statement said that hurling eggs as a mode of protest was not its ideology.

"If someone from our party has hurled eggs, we will certainly initiate action in this regard," an AAP spokesperson said.

Both the BJP and Congress have moved the Department of Personnel and Training (DoPT) under the Ministry of Personnel. Public Grievances, Pensions, seeking action against the IAS officer.

The DoPT has written a letter to the Chief Secretary of Odisha asking the top official to take appropriate action against the officer amid an allegation of violating the norms of the All India Conduct Rules.

The DoPT's letter came after BJP state president Manmohan Samal and Bhubaneswar MP Aparajita Sarangi lodged a complaint against the officer.

Sarangi had also sought disciplinary action against the officer for violating All India Service rules by conducting public meetings.

Anonymous letter threatens Balasore like train tragedy

Hyderabad, July 4: The South Central Railway (SCR) has received an anonymous letter threatening Odisha-like train tragedy on Hyderabad-Delhi route.

The letter received last week by the SCR Divisional Manager threatened that an Odisha-like rail accident will take place on Hvderabad-Delhi route. The railway officials have informed Hyderabad police about the receipt of the letter.

Deputy Commissioner of Police Chandana Deepti said Monday that they received the information three days ago and the police are investigating to trace the person who sent the letter. Over 290 people were killed in the triple train accident in Balasore June 2.

According to the findings of a high-level inquiry, wrong signaling was the main reason behind the accident. The Commissioner of Railway Safety ruled out any likelihood of sabotage or conspiracy behind the accident, though the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) is probing the accident from a possible criminal angle.

Meanwhile, SCR General Manager (GM) Arun Kumar Jain Monday conducted a safety review meeting with all the principal heads of departments. Locals offer vegetables as bribe to engineer

Bhubaneswar, July 4: Opting for an unusual way of protesting, under the leadership of Cuttack District Congress, locals of Khadeita Panchavat of Cuttack Tuesday offered here vegetables as bribe to Irrigation department Prachi division superintending engineer Pratap Chandra Choudhury.

Cuttack District Congress president Manas Choudhury reached the office of the superintending engineer along with some local farmers and residents to enquire about developments on problems relating to the state of canal road and the canal in Khadeita Panchayat of Cuttack Sadar block.

The local residents were aggrieved that the officer was asking for bribes for construction of the road, despite hundreds of their genuine requests. The people were frustrated as they have been facing problems communicating in the rainy season due



to delay in construction of the 400m stretch road

After learning that the road would not be completed without bribes, they informed Manas Choudhury about the issue. Choudhury accompanied them to the Prachi division office situated here to confront the superintending engineer directly in this unique and innovative way. As most of them belong to below poverty line (BPL) families and don't have money for bribes, the farmers put a bag of vegetables on the table of the officer as bribe to complete the road.

The engineer assured them to complete the construction work within a week.

Then, using satellite imaging, they determined when vegetation emerged around each site. The scientists found that, overall, for every four days earlier that leaves appeared on trees, hinting spring onset, species bred only about one day earlier.

They found that the majority of birds were adversely affected by variations in the start of spring, even as some non-migratory bird species - the northern cardinal, Bewick's wren and wrentit among them - were found countering the trend.

However, the scientists said they were exceptions to the rule, because most non-migratory species couldn't keep up with earlier spring onsets.

Jajpur, July 4: The district administration's bid to get the nomadic 'Mankidia' tribals into the mainstream and rehabilitate them, has hit a roadblock with irregularities plaguing the construction of houses for them, sources said Tuesday.

The 'Mankidia' tribe also known as 'Mankadia', is a nomadic ethnic group specialising in catching monkeys and collecting siali fibre and honey from forests. They mostly live in Mayurbhanj, Jajpur, Sambalpur, Kalahandi and Sundargarh districts. However, the numbers of the tribe are declining rapidly and they are on the verge of extinction.

Members of the tribe currently reside at Mallharsahi village near Kaliapani mines under Sukinda block in this district. The administration allotted 1,742 sq feet of land under the Forest

are collapsing. Locals added that the contractor and engineers have worked jointly to misuse the money for the project.

The matter came to the fore after social activist Mantu Das wrote a letter to the Chief Secretary requesting him to probe the matter. He added in the letter that the aim to provide pucca houses by the administration to the 'Mankidia' people stands defeated.

Sources said locals have no involvement in implementation of development works in mining areas. Development has taken a backseat in these areas and villages like Nagada, Tumuni and Guhiasal under Sukinda block still lack basic facilities. This becomes clear when one sees the deplorable conditions the 'Mankidia' tribals live in at Mallharsahi village.

The DMF fund has been specially created for the interest and benefits of persons and areas affected by mining-related operations. The fund is built with contributions from miners. Locals alleged that nexus between politicians, officers and contractors has affected proper utilisation of the fund.

However, the students are suffering and their studies are being hampered due to lack of classrooms. Last year two rooms of the nearby Kutra High School were used to host the OAV students. This year two more rooms have been added. However, even then problems continue to plague the students. They have to sit on the floor due to the lack of benches and desks. The absence of a proper school building is seriously hindering the activities of the OAV students.

The teachers, local residents and guardians of the students have lodged repeated complaints in this regard but their pleas are yet to be addressed.

The students have been provided with two buses to reach school with each vehicle having a capacity of 65. It means after the district mineral foundation (DMF) sanctioned ₹3,53,52,000 in FY 2018-19. Later, the Rural Works division engaged a contractor and the construction of the building started.

However, controversy has engulfed the construction work. Locals alleged that the contractor is using sub-standard iron rods and cement in construction, which in future may hamper the safety of the students. The contractor meanwhile said that he has stopped work as his bills are not being cleared on a regular basis. However, Sanatan Tudu, an engineer of the Rural Works division refuted the allegation stating that all bills submitted by the contractor have been cleared.

Tudu in fact, misbehaved with this correspondent when asked to comment on the issue, SDO Mahendra Kalet also towed the same line and rejected the charges made by the contractor.

Farmers blame harsh summer for increase in vegetable prices

VEG PRODUCTS GO MISSING FROM MOST MARKETS IN SUNDARGARH DISTRICT

Rourkela, July 4: Vegetable prices have skyrocketed all over the state as well as the country. The increase in prices has been the highest in recent years. People of Sundargarh district are also feeling the pinch of the rising vegetable prices.

However, the reason for the high prices of vegetables is not man-made. In fact most people, both the buyers and sellers, at-

tribute it to nature. Septuagenarian Sardara Singh visits the Traffic Gate market area in this city on a regular basis. "Every day, I buy fresh vegetables, but for the last couple of days I have hardly noticed any seller or customer," Singh pointed out.

In fact, a visit to many of the markets around this town and other adjoining localities pointed to the disappearance of all varieties of vegetables. The daily market here and the weekly 'haats' at Jhirpani, Chhend, Kalinga Bihar and Panposh, all wore a deserted look due to the absence of vegetable sellers. Similar scenes were also re-

and Talsara. ported from Sundargarh, Bonai, The areas mentioned above. Rajgangpur, Biramitrapur and particularly Rajgangpur, far-off places like Gurundia Biramitrapur, Gurundia, Bonai



and and other adjoining areas, are known as the vegetable basket of this region. In fact, they cater to the coastal places every

season. However, the flow of vegetables from the farmers to the market has completely stopped. "Prices of vegetables have gone up because of lack of production. There are nothing in the fields," said Samir Sahu of Nuagaon, an affluent tribal farmer. "If you look around, you will find most of the fields barren. We have nothing to sell," he added.

Samir and others of his clan have the same story to offer. They informed that the harsh summer preceding the monsoon has affected the growth of vegetables. "Until it rains again properly, we will have nothing to offer," said Surama Ekka, who was trying to sell bitter and long gourds at Jhirpani. Another farmer said that the lack of water has led to poor vegetable pro-

duction. "Most of the rivers have dried up. We suffered due to the lack of water." he said.

The vegetable market at Traffic Gate is usually a hustling and bustling place filled with cacophony of noises. However, Tuesday only a few vegetable sellers were present at the market and the lack of customers was evident. "Most of the farmers have gone to their native places as they have nothing to sell," said Simachala Pradhan, a vendor, who was present at the market. "Tribal farmers come here everyday, but now they are conspicuous by their absence. The harsh summer is responsible for such a scenario. We could not growanything this summer,' Simachala added.

French Racism

aris is burning and along with it several parts of France are engulfed in fire. The extent of violence, looting, attacks on public transports, infrastructure and public anger can be gauged from the fact that over 2,500 cases of arson have been reported from these places during the past few days. All these are due to the mindless killing of a 17year-old youth, Nahel Merzouk, in broad daylight during a traffic stop by a hate-filled, racist, white police officer in suburban Paris. As is the wont of law enforcing agencies across the globe, the police initially lied and accused the youth of trying to run over an officer. But, social media nailed the lie immediately by circulating a cell phone video from a bystander that showed the horrific, cold-blooded killing by the police officer. By now, people across the globe have seen the horrific images of French police brandishing rifles and menacing the occupants of a yellow vehicle in the Parisian suburb of Nanterre before summarily executing the teenage driver with a bullet to the head as he pulled away. Contrary to false claims by the police, no officer was standing in front of the car or physically threatened by the youth driving away.

The cruel irony the current situation has brought to the fore is that France – which taught the world the principles of liberty, equality and fraternity - has long been infected with the virus of racism. The French teen, Nahel, whose life was taken away by the police, was of Algerian ancestry. France has had a long and sordid history of colonial racism and violence against non-white people, stretching from Haiti, Guadeloupe and Martinique in the Caribbean to Réunion Island in the Indian Ocean, North and West Africa as well as Vietnam, among many other populations. France has ruthlessly oppressed Algerians in particular - including those who are French citizens. French colonisation of Algeria dates back to the early 1800s and involved the widespread use of brutal violence and mass killings to establish French rule.

That the embers of racism in French society, even centuries later, are still glowing is evident during similar attacks by French police in recent years. This week's protests echoed the three weeks of rioting in 2005 that followed the deaths of 15-year-old Bouna Traoré and 17-year-old Zyed Benna, who were electrocuted while hiding from police in a power substation in Clichy-sous-Bois. Nahel's mother, identified as Mounia M, spoke the truth with brutal honesty when she said "He (the police officer) saw a little Arab-looking kid, he wanted to take his life. A police officer cannot take his gun and take our children's lives like that.'

The preliminary investigation by Nanterre prosecutor Pascal Prache revealed the officer's use of his weapon was not "legally justified." The death has prompted demands for more accountability in France, which also saw racial justice protests. No wonder, France's iconic footballer, himself a "non-white," Kilyan Mbappe and his co-footballers of the French national team have condemned the killing and appealed to the people for calm and dialogue as they rightly believe violence cannot remedy the racism that the French society is afflicted with. The emergence of Far-Right groups in the political horizon of France has only exacerbated the tension and rift.

What is most unfortunate is that the police force, at least a section of it, which is supposed to remain calm and discharge its duties as prescribed by the country's constitution, could be so driven by racial hatred. France is officially known to be colour-blind, meaning there cannot be any official discrimination on the basis of the colours of the citizens' skin.

In the wake of massive protests, French President Emmanuel Macron called the killing of Nahel "inexplicable." The expression itself shows he is too diplomatic and in a denial mode about the existence of racism in his country. Studies have long demonstrated extensive racial bias in French policing targeting Arab and Black people in particular. In 2020, France's own human rights ombudsperson found that young men who are racialised as Arab or Black are 20 times more likely to be profiled and stopped by the police.

The European Commission against Racism and Intolerance has long warned of racial discrimination perpetrated by French police which cannot be allowed to continue with its jaundiced view of the populace while discharging public duties. It is time that France and the whole of 'white' Europe takes a firm stand against racism. No doubt this is easier said than done as the coloured migrants too are contributing their major bit in making the situation worse.

⁻t has been two months since the ethnic violence between the Meiteis and Kukis broke out in Manipur. This dreadful conflict has already taken over 100 lives and over 40,000 people have been displaced. Still there are no signs of normalcy returning to the state. It's another story that the grave situation isn't getting the coverage it deserves in the national media. On June 24, there was an all-

party meeting, although belated, chaired by Union Home Minister Amit Shah on the situation in Manipur. Many leaders of Opposition parties expressed concern over Prime Minister Modi's silence and at the same time opined that if peace has to be restored, the Centre first has to remove Chief Minister Biren Singh, However, the BJP-led Centre is said to have remained non-committal during the meet-

ing on removing him. It is no secret that Biren Singh has failed miserably to anticipate this violence, despite the fact there were signs of growing dissent. He no longer enjoys the support among the Kukis, who view him as an anti-Kuki politician. Even Kuki MLAs belonging to BJP are critical of him. On the other hand, a significant section of Meitei BJP MLAs too has problems with him. They dislike his style of functioning. Let's note that even before the State slipped into this unending violence, there were clear signs of dissent against Biren Singh.

Recently, even Union Minister of State for External Affairs and Education RK Ranjan, who is MP of Inner Manipur Lok Sabha constituency, has admitted there's no law and order in the state. His statement came after his residence was torched by a mob and is significant as he is signalling towards the complete failure of his own BJP government.

However, the BJP's national leadership till now has avoided taking any action against Biren Singh, whose authority has been severely diminished among the common people. The state is sharply polarised between

Meiteis and Kukis, but the BJP doesn't want to be seen favouring the Kukis by replacing Biren. And it is this view of the BJP which to many seems to be complicating peace efforts. The party could replace him by appointing another Meitei leader, as there are several chief ministerial contenders within the party. They include power minister Thongam Bishwajit Singh, PWD minister Govindas Konthoujam and education minister Yumnam Khemchand Singh — all from the Meitei community.

Importantly, the Kukis have expressed their unhappiness over the inclusion of Biren Singh in the 51-member peace committee headed by Governor Anusuiya Uikey. The committee was formed after Amit Shah's belated four-day visit to the state, wherein he engaged with all sections of people and even visited the remote town of Moreh, situated on the India-Myanmar border. His visit was promising but the results are vet to be seen as violence is being reported every other day. A dialogue between the communities is much needed.

One of the first steps that must be taken by the Centre to

restore peace is by replacing Biren Singh with another Meitei MLA and appointing a deputy CM from the Kuki community. This way the Meiteis won't feel alienated. Further, the Centre could even consider having another deputy CM from the Naga community, given that the government has two ministers from the Naga community, belonging its ally, Naga People's Front. This way both Kukis and Nagas (the latter are not involved in the violence), won't feel neglected. Remember, Manipur is eth-

nically diverse. The Meiteis account for over 50% of population, whereas Kukis and Nagas account for 30% and 15% respectively. While Kukis and Nagas are followers of Christianity, Meiteis have a religious diversity. Majority of them are followers of Hinduism while a section follow Sanamahism, a local religion. Another section of Meiteis practice Islam, and are called Meitei Pangals. There is also a small percentage of Christians among the Meitei community.

Thus, keeping in mind this diversity, the Centre needs to install an ethnically diverse government with a new chief

minister. At the same time, the demand by some for Presidential rule may not be appropriate in the long run as the state can't be ruled from New Delhi to regain confidence of the people and address the trust deficit. A new chief minister could send a strong message that New Delhi is willing to listen and take a step forward, even though it would hurt the BJP's image.

Additionally, Prime Minister Modi would do well to break his silence as sadly he hasn't spoken a word since violence broke out on May 3. And though Amit Shah says that Modi is regularly monitoring the situation, it doesn't help matters. The people of the state, particularly the Meiteis and Kukis, are eagerly waiting to hear his 'Manipur Ki Baat'. Remember, Modi has his own popularity among the masses, and his message of peace may have an effect. Not just this, perhaps a visit to the State could help calm down tempers, as his silence is deafening, rekindling the alienation felt amongst the north-eastern states.

At the same time, politics must be put in the backburner. Attempts to stop Rahul Gandhi from visiting relief camps in Churachandpur, by stopping his convoy midway and asking him to take a helicopter, hasn't gone down well with Congress supporters. He did eventually get there in a state governmentprovided chopper and interacted with the people.

Lastly, it's critical that no community be dehumanised. Both Meiteis and Kukis are victims of ethnic violence. Both communities have their own concerns, and these must be addressed at the earliest.

The unending violence has also given rise to refugee crises in neighbouring states, particularly Mizoram, where over 10,000 people are said to have taken refuge. Time is running out for the Centre. Before the fire spreads to other states in the region, it must act, and act decisively to restore peace.

Liripipe

Nobody seems to know much about the origin of this word, except that it comes from medieval Latin liripipium, variously explained down the centuries as the tippet of a hood, a cord, a shoe-lace and the inner soleleather of shoes. This suggests strongly that nobody has the slightest idea what it really meant. What we do know is that the English word (on occasion appearing as liripoop, for reasons that are entirely obscure) was used for a dangling extension to the point of a medieval hood. Hoods like these were at first worn by academics as part of their formal dress; indeed a few universities still use the word liripipe for their graduates' ceremonial sashes. Later on, liripipes became part of everyday wear on a hood called a chaperon, a word that is closely related to the modern French chapeau. Over time, liripipes became steadily longer, sometimes down to the ankles; this was hardly practical, so the liripipe was often wound around the head to keep it out of the way. As well as longer, it also grew more ornamental as time passed. The hoods went out of fashion in the fifteenth century and liripipe became a semi-fossil word, most commonly used today by historians of fashion and the occasional academic institution. By the seventeenth century, the chaperon had become an item of female costume exclusively. About a century later the word began to be used figuratively for a married or elderly woman protecting a young woman - a chaperone, as we now spell it. One author explained that "Chaperon ... when used metaphorically means that the experienced married woman shelters the youthful débutante as a hood shelters the face".

Lithophone

This name is applied to any musical instrument made of stone that produces a ringing sound when hit. There are a surprising number of them around the world in places as far apart as Togo, Iceland and Venezuela. The Chinese ch'ing is a set of 16 L-shaped tuned stone slabs, which are suspended in a large frame and struck on their long side with wooden mallets or padded sticks. The word is often applied to a specific example. the Vietnamese dan da, a set of resonant stones. A set in Ho Chi Minh City and another now in Paris can lay claim to be the oldest extant music instruments in the world, from 6,000 years ago. The stones were found in 1949 by Georges Condominas in a village in the central highlands of Vietnam. They were quarried from a place nearby where the rock is made of petrified wood and were chipped and shaped to tune them to a perfect pentatonic scale. They can still be played, by hitting them with wooden mallets, to make a sort of hugely antique stone marimba.

If you are willing to skip work to attend a Taylor Swift concert, you are, by definition, 'sick.

I'm not saying you're "deranged." I'm saying you're "deeply affected with some unpleasant feeling," such as the feeling that if you don't attend the concert, you'll be "deranged." Another meaning of sick, ac-

cording to the dictionary, is "disgusted: chagrined." I don't know about you, but when it comes to work, I am quite often chagrined. But if I called my boss and said, "I'm not coming into work today. I'm chagrined," my boss would be extremely chagrined.

It's much easier to use the word "sick." Many employers provide employees with sick days. They do not provide us with chagrined days.

How many sick days you get depends on your employer. Perhaps you're lucky enough to get several paid sick days per year. If so, you probably know that sick days do not always roll over from one year to another.

You've got to use them or you might lose them. This is not a problem for some employees, who are sick a few times a year. But other employees have the misfortune of being too healthy. They find themselves wondering how to use up their sick days. Is it okay to call in sick when you're just sick of work? What if you just have a mild ailment, such as an itchy back? Can you take the off work day to scratch it?

If you can justify it to yourself, the next step is to justify it to your boss. Here are some tips to ensure that you're still able to retain your job:

1. Prepare your boss for the sick day. The day before you call off sick, make sure you say something like this: "I'm not feeling 100 per cent today." This is the truth, of course. Even "100 per cent" doesn't always feel "100 per cent." Just ask any math teacher.

2. Show some regret. "I hate to do this, because I have so much work to do, but I just can't make it to work today. Whatever I had yesterday has gotten worse."

3. Be as vague as possible. After all, you have an undiagnosed condition. Just say you are "sick" or "not feeling well"-don't say that you've come down with an acute case of IBS (itchy back syndrome).

4. Mention that you're reluctant to spread anything. "I'm a little worried that whatever I have might go viral, like a Taylor Swift song.'

5. If your boss asks if you can work remotely, tell them that vou are indeed planning to remotely work. And try to sound remotely credible.

Ajit's opportunism

Even as a legal battle over the NCP split seems inevitable, the Opposition parties need to introspect about how the BJP repeatedly manages to exploit their weaknesses. The focus must be on the bigger battle — the parliamentary elections. Much will depend on how the wily Pawar tackles the current challenge in the twilight of his rollercoaster political career. Opposition unity needs rational narrative: Kishor

Patna, July 4: Political strategist-turned-activist Prashant Kishor Tuesday said the opposition unity drive would reap electoral benefits only if it came up with a "narrative" and did not rely solely on "arithmetic".

Talking to reporters in Bihar's Samastipur district, he refused to attach much political importance to the split in NCP in Maharashtra and the CBI chargesheet against Bihar Deputy Chief Minister Tejashwi Yadav

"A combined opposition can work only if it succeeds in creating a narrative against the regime. The Janata Party experiment came on the back of the Emergency and Jayaprakash

Narayan's mass movement. During VP Singh's rule, the Bofors scandal had caught public imagination," said the IPAC founder. Kishor said, "Mere political arithmetic, devoid of a rational narrative, is unlikely to strike a chord with people.

Kishor, who has given up political consultancy, recently revived his "Jan Suraaj" campaign in Bihar after a gap of more than a month during which he nursed a ligament injury. Asked about the development in Maharashtra, Kishor said, "It is for the people of that state to decide whether what has happened is appropriate or not. But normally a party does not lose its support base just because of

some MLAs jumping ship. I don't

see any serious impact on NCP."

He also scoffed at reports in a section of the media speculating that the Bihar CM had grown wary of a fate, similar to that of the NCP, being met by his JD(U). "Politicians are far too hardnosed to be swept away by the cvcle of breaking news. Maharashtra's development will have no impact outside that state, just like the upheaval in Bihar last year did not affect politics elsewhere"

He, however, added, "I repeat that the Mahagathbandhan will not retain its current composition by the time the state faces its next assembly polls. Former CM Jitan Ram Manjhi's exit points in that direction. But any major shift is unlikely before Lok Sabha elections.

On the fresh CBI chargesheet against Bihar Deputy CM Tejashwi Yadav, he said, "People do not resent any politician facing legal action for alleged wrongdoing. But it is becoming a matter of concern to them that only those in the opposition are caught and those who make peace with the ruling dispensation are let off". He, however, added, "It is wrong

Chandrayaan-3 to the Moon on July 13. Authored by national awardwinning filmmaker-writer Vinod Mankara, 'Prism' is likely the first book to be released from a rocket launchpad anywhere in the world. Mankara is the maker of 'Yanam', a science-Sanskrit documentary on India's historic Mars Orbiter Mission 'Mangalyaan'.

A collection of 50 essays in Malayalam, the book comprises articles from various streams of science including space science, astronomy, biology, anthropology, mathematics and so on. ISRO Chairman S Somanath will launch the book by handing it over to Vikram Sarabhai Space Centre (VSSC) Director S Unnikrishnan Nair on July 12 night, it's author Mankara said.

Somanath himself penned the foreword of the 167-pagebook in which he said it was full of the "marvels of science". There are 50 articles in the book and they cover significant topics in science in-depth, Somanath said.

'Prism' is an exploration into the aesthetic and poetic aspects of science, he added. "Besides space and space technology, several other such topics are also presented in a poetic way in the book. What attracted me the most is the aesthetics of its presentation and beauty of its language," the ISRO Chairman said.

Patna, July 4: Bihar State Pollution Control Board has decided to chalk out a roadmap to reduce emissions of greenhouse gases from rolling mills in the state, a top official said Tuesday. Of the 42 rolling mills in the state, 28 are operational, and the emissions from the industry "continue to rise", despite efforts being made to decrease the level of pollution, BSPCB chairman Devendra Kumar Shukla said.

"The board is conducting a study to determine the origins of pollutants, especially greenhouse gases such as carbon dioxide, methane and nitrous oxide.

"The board initiated a plan for brick kilns to adopt cleaner technology, which is less carbon-emitting. Now, we are finalising a roadmap for rolling mills in the state. They will also be asked to adopt cleaner technology that is less carbon-emitting," Shukla, said.

The BSPCB has already collaborated with IIT-Kanpur to in-



stall low-cost sensors in all 534 blocks in the state to identify the source of pollutants, he said. "As many as 13 of the 28 functional mills are integrated but the

greenhouse gas emissions from the industry continue to rise despite efforts being made to decrease this as the steel industry is one of the major emitters of

carbon dioxide. "The industry's emissions are predicted to increase naturally due to infrastructure growth. The emissions from rolling mills are quite high, he said, adding that some of them have updated technologies but a few are still running by burning coal on site.

Apart from being a construction sector industry, this generates employment for locals, he said."The central government recently notified the Carbon Credit Trading Scheme 2023, which has paved the way for the formation of the country's first domestic carbon market. This scheme can prove to be a game changer for industries in contributing to the target of achieving carbon neutrality in the country by 2070," he added.

New Delhi, July 4: The top leaders of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) Tuesday resolved to check spread of terrorism and disrupt terror financing while coming down hard on states using terrorist and extremist groups to advance their political and geopolitical goals

A declaration issued at the conclusion of the virtual SCO Summit hosted by India said the member states will eliminate "sleeper cells" and terrorist safe havens, and counter the radicalisation of youth and dissemination of terrorist ideology.

The SCO states, subject to their national laws, also agreed to develop common principles and approaches to form a unified list of terrorist, separatist and extremist organisations whose activities are prohibited on the territories of the member nations of the grouping, it added. The declaration said the SCO

leaders reaffirmed their commitment to peaceful settlement of disagreements and disputes between countries through dialogue and consultations. The leaders also came out with

a separate statement on countering radicalisation that reiterated that any act of terrorism is criminal and unjustifiable.

It said the leaders emphasised the "inadmissibility of states using terrorist, separatist and extremist groups and their accomplices to implement particular political and geopolitical goals

In his opening remarks, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said the grouping must not hesitate to criticise countries supporting cross-border terrorism as



an instrument of state policy and there must not be any "double standards" in combating terrorist activities

The summit, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, was joined by Chinese President Xi Jinping, his Russian counterpart Vladimir Putin, Pakistan PM Shehbaz Sharif and other

leaders of the grouping. At a media briefing, Foreign Secretary Vinay Kwatra said India has been strongly highlighting the threat of terrorism including cross-border terrorism

The New Delhi Declaration

said the member states are determined to continue taking active measures to "eliminate the conditions conducive to the spread of terrorism, to disrupt the terror financing channels, to suppress recruitment activities and cross-border movement of terrorists." It said the member states note the "inadmissibility of interference in the internal af fairs of states under the pretext of countering terrorism and extremism, as well as unacceptability of using terrorist, extremist and radical groups for mercenary goals.

"The member states consider

it important to build up joint coordinated efforts by the international community to counter the attempts to involve young people in the activities of terrorist, separatist and extremist groups," the declaration said

while strongly condemning terrorism in all its forms "committed by whomever, wherever and for whatever purpose" stressed that terrorism should not be associated with any religion, civilisation, nationality or ethnic group.

ther develop cooperation in countering radicalisation that leads to terrorism, separatism and extremism, including by sharing experiences and best practices, in accordance with the SCO Charter," it said.

The statement said the member states intend to make joint efforts to block and remove radical and terrorist content from the Internet and initiated necessary measures against identified individuals and entities in accordance with the domestic laws

According to the New Delhi Declaration, the member states have expressed their concern about the growing threats posed by increased production, trafficking and abuse of narcotic drugs and using the proceeds of illicit drug-trafficking as a source of funding for terrorism.

No details of expenditure incurred on PM's post Covid foreign visits

New Delhi, July 4: Prime Minister Narendra Modi re sumed his foreign state visits, after a brief halt due to Covid-19 pandemic, in March 2021 with a two-day visit to Bangladesh and toured 15 more countries since then but the Prime Minister did not reveal the expenditure incurred during these visits.

As the Covid-19 pandemic was not over completely in 2021, Prime Minister Modi took only four foreign visits during the year to the countries like United States of America (USA) Italy, UK and Bangladesh. In 2022, PM Modi had visited abroad seven times. The Prime Minister visited twice to Japan and

The Prime Minister's Office has made public the expenditure incurred during the 73 foreign visits of former Prime Minister Manmohan Singh and 19 foreign visits of his predecessor Atal Bihari Vajpayee

According to PMO, at least ₹795.17 crore were spent on Manmohan Singh's visits while ₹144.43 crore spent on Vajpayee's foreign tour

Germany in 2022. In 2023. Narendra Modi held two foreign visits till now.

Significantly, the Prime Minister office did not furnish the details of expenses incurred on the chartered flights during the 12 foreign visits to 16 countries undertaken by Modi post pandemic.

Before the breakout of Covid-19, the Prime Minister undertook 59 foreign visits, the last trip was to Brazil November 2019 that incurred expenditure of

₹20.01 crore

According to Prime Minister's Office (PMO) at least ₹588.52 crore were spent during these trips. The PMO informed that the expenses on foreign visits of PM are met from the budget of Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA).

Soon after taking oath as the Prime Minister in 2014, Narendra Modi undertook his first foreign visit to Bhutan in June and expenses incurred on chartered flight for two-day visit

was ₹2.45 crore. The very same year Modi went to Brazil (Rs 20.35 crore), USA (19.04 crore). Myanmar, Australia and Fiji (Rs 22.58 crore).

Well, the most expensive trip of PM Modi was to France, Germany and Canada in 2015 for which ₹31.25 crore were spent.

As per the official information, PM Modi has undertaken eight visits to USA, seven visits to Japan, six visits to Germany, five visits each to France and China. He thrice visited to Britain and twice he went to Brazil and Bangladesh.

During these visits, the Prime Minister held crucial meetings with state heads to strengthenthe relations and also signed several official agreements.

Foiled attack on **Moscow: Russia**

Moscow: Russian air defences Tuesday foiled a Ukrainian drone attack on Moscow that prompted authorities to briefly close one of the city's international airports, officials said, as a Western analysis said that Russia has managed to slow Kyiv's recently launched counteroffensive. The drone attack, which follows previous similar raids on the Russian capital, was the first known assault on the city since an abortive mutiny launched 11 days ago by mercenary chief Yevgeny Prigozhin.

Taliban ban beauty salons

Islamabad: The Taliban are banning women's beauty salons in Afghanistan, a government spokesman said Tuesday. It's the latest curb on the rights and freedoms of Afghan women and girls, following edicts barring them from education, public spaces and most forms of employment. A spokesman for the Taliban-run Virtue and Vice Akif Mahajar, didn't give details of the ban.

Tokyo, July 4: The UN nuclear agency gave its endorsement Tuesday to Japan's planned release of treated radioactive wastewater into the sea from the damaged Fukushima nuclear plant, saying it meets international standards and its environmental and health impact would be negligible.

The plan is opposed by groups in South Korea, China and some Pacific Island nations because of safety concerns and political reasons. Local fishing organizations are worried that their reputation will be damaged even if their catch isn't contaminated.

Rafael Mariano Grossi, the head of the International Atomic Energy Agency, submitted its final assessment of the plan to Prime Minister Fumio Kishida on Tuesday. The report is a "comprehensive, neutral, objective, scientifically sound evaluation,"

and the environment."

Grossi said. "We are very confident about it.' The report said IAEA recognizes the discharge "has raised societal, political and environmental concerns, associated with the radiological aspects.' However, it concluded that the water release as currently planned "will have a negligible

ment for the discharge are "in conformity with the agreed international standards and its application," Grossi said. He said the dilution of treated but still slightly radioactive wastewater for gradual release into the sea is widely used in other countries, including China, South Korea, the United States and France, to dispose of water containing certain radionuclides

from nuclear plants. Japan has sought the IAEA's support to gain credibility for the plan. Experts from the U.N. Agency and 11 nations have made several trips to Japan since early 2022 to examine preparations by the government and the plant's operator, Tokyo Electric Power Company Holdings.

Some scientists say the impact of long-term, low-dose exposure to radionuclides remains unknown and urge a delay in the release. Others say the discharge plan is safe but call for more transparency in sampling and monitoring.

Kishida, after meeting with Grossi, said Japan will continue to provide "detailed explanations based on scientific evidence with a high degree of transparency both domestically and internationally.

A massive earthquake and tsunami on March 11, 2011, destroyed the Fukushima Daiichi

nuclear plant's cooling systems, causing three reactors to melt and their cooling water to be contaminated and leak continuously. The water is collected, treated and stored in about 1,000 tanks at the plant which will reach their capacity in early 2024.

The government and TEPCO say the water must be removed to prevent any accidental leaks and make room for the damaged plant's decommissioning.

Japanese regulators finished their final safety inspection of the equipment last Friday and TEPCO is expected to receive a permit in about a week to begin gradually discharging the water. The start date for the release, which is expected to take decades, is still undecided.

The IAEA will continue to monitor and assess the release, Grossi said.

During his four-day visit, Grossi will also visit the Fukushima plant and meet with TEPCO officials, local fishing groups, heads of nearby mu nicipalities and other stakeholders. "I believe in transparency, I believe in open dialogue and I believe in the validity of the exercise we are carrying out," he said

Grossi is also expected to visit South Korea, New Zealand and the Cook Islands after his visit to Japan to ease concerns there.

Islamabad, July 4: In a relief to embattled Imran Khan, a top Pakistani court Tuesday overturned the ruling of a sessions court and declared the Toshakhana corruption case against the former prime minister inadmissible.

Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) Chairman Khan, 70, was indicted in the Toshakhana case on May 10 by Additional Sessions Judge Humavun Dilawar, who rejected objections about the admissibility of the case.

The PTI chief then approached the Islamabad High Court, which had stayed criminal proceedings on the case till June 8. Following the resumption of the hearing in June, Justice Aamer Farooq on June 23 reserved his verdict on the petition, saying that he would look into the matter after Eid ul-Adha. On Tuesday, the IHC Chief

Justice Farooq pronounced the verdict on a petition filed by the former prime minister, challenging the Toshakhana trial proceedings. The verdict came a day after the PTI chief petitioned the court for Justice Farooq's recusal from the bench, Dawn newspaper reported.

The Toshakhana is a department under the administrative control of the Cabinet Division and stores precious gifts given to rulers, parliamentarians, bureaucrats, and officials by heads of other governments and states and foreign dignitaries. The Toshakhana issue over the sale of state gifts received by the cricketer-turnedpolitician became a major issue in national politics after the Election Commission of Pakistan disqualified the former premier for making "false statements and incorrect declaration".

New York, July 4: India's Consulate in San Francisco came under an attack from Khalistan supporters who tried to set the diplomatic facility on fire in the second such act of violence within months, drawing strong condemnation from the US government which termed it a "criminal offence".

A video by Khalistan supporters, dated July 2 posted on Twitter, showed the act of arson at the Indian Consulate in San Francisco. The video, with the words "violence begets violence" emblazoned over it, also showed news articles related to the death of Canada-based Khalistan Tiger Force (KTF) chief Hardeep Singh Niiiar. Nijjar, one of India's mostwanted terrorists who carried a cash reward of Rs 10 lakh on his head, was shot dead outside a gurdwara in Canada last month. Responding to the incident, State Department spokesperson Matthew Miller in a tweet on Monday said: "The US strongly condemns the reported vandalism and attempted arson against the Indian Consulate in San Francisco on Saturday, Vandalism or violence against diplomatic facilities or foreign diplomats in the US is a criminal offence.' The suspected shooter was identified as a 40-year-old man. A second person was also taken into custody who may have returned fire at the suspect, but police did not know whether there was a connection between the two

Ajay Bhutoria, an Indian community leader, said the attack on India's consulate in San Francisco is extremely concerning and must be condemned in the strongest possible terms. "It is deeply disturbing to see such acts of violence targeting diplomatic missions," he said.

Vietnam bans 'Barbie' movie over South China Sea map

Hanoi, July 4: Vietnam's state media have reported that the government banned distribution of the popular "Barbie' movie because it includes a view of a map showing disputed Chinese territorial claims in the South China Sea.

The newspaper Vietnam Express and other media said posters advertising "Barbie' were removed from movie distributors' websites after Monday's decision. The reports cited Vi Kien Thanh, director general of the Vietnam Cinema Department, as saying the National Film Evaluation Council made the



decision. It said a map in the film shows China's "nine-dash line", which extends Beijing's territorial claims far into waters that fall within areas claimed by Vietnam and other countries.

The "nine-dash line" is an arcane but sensitive issue for China and its neighbours that shows Beijing's maritime border extending into areas claimed by

other governments and encompasses most of the South China Sea. That has brought it into tense standoffs with the ASEAN nations of Indonesia Vietnam, Malaysia, Brunei and the Philippines, with Chinese fishing boats and military vessels becoming more aggressive

in the disputed waters. Asked about the issue at a

daily briefing on Tuesday, Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesperson Mao Ning said, 'China's position on the South China Sea issue is clear and consistent." "We believe that the countries concerned should not link the South China With Sea

Palestinian attacker wounds 8 in Tel Aviv

Jenin (West Bank), July 4: A Palestinian man drove his car into a crowded bus stop in Tel Aviv Tuesday and then began stabbing people, wounding eight in an attack praised by the Islamist militant group Hamas as a response to Israel's ongoing military operation in the occupied West Bank

Police chief Kobi Shabtai told reporters at the scene that an armed civilian shot and killed the assailant. The attack came as Israeli troops pressed ahead with their hunt for Palestinian militants and weapons in a refugee camp, after military bulldozers tore through alleys and thousands of residents fled to safety. The two-day Palestinian death toll rose to 10.

The large-scale raid of the Jenin camp, which began Monday, is one of the most intense military operations in the occupied West Bank in nearly two decades. It bore hallmarks of Israeli military tactics during the second Palestinian uprising in the early 2000s and came as Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu faces growing pressure from his ultranationalist political allies for a tough response to recent \rightarrow attacks on Israeli settlers, including a shooting last month that killed four people.

But the current violence is also different from the intense second intifada, a period that claimed thousands of lives.

SBI MF AUM crosses ₹8L cr

Mumbai: SBI Mutual Fund, largest fund house by a wide margin in the 43-player industry, has clocked yet another milestone crossing the ₹8 lakh crore-mark assets under management, adding ₹90,000 crore to the asset pile during the first quarter of the fiscal. Given the current run rate in adding AUM (asset under management), the fund house expects to sniff at the ₹10 lakh crore AUM-mark over the next 12 to 18 months too, a top company official has said. The 43-player mutual fund industry closed May with total assets of ₹43.2 lakh crore despite a fall in net inflows into open-ended mutual funds, which almost halved to ₹59,879.31 crore from ₹1.24 lakh crore in April, when the industry-wide AUM stood at ₹41.61 lakh crore.

Meta to target Twitter with rival app Threads Toyota's 'battery

Threads could be the latest headache for Elon Musk, who acquired Twitter last year for USD 44 billion and has been making changes that have unnerved advertisers and turned off users

London, July 4: Meta is poised to unveil a new app that appears to mimic Twitter — a direct challenge to the social media platform owned by Elon Musk.

A listing for the app, called Threads, appeared on Apple's App Store, indicating it would debut as early as Thursday. It is billed as a "text-based conversation app" that is linked to Instagram, with the listing teasing a Twitter-like microblogging experience. 'Threads is where communi-

ties come together to discuss everything from the topics you care about today to what'll be trending tomorrow," it said.

Instagram users will be able to keep their user names and follow the same accounts on the new app, according to screenshots displayed on the App Store listing. Meta declined to comment on the app.

Musk replied "yeah" to a tweet from Twitter co-founder Jack Dorsey saying, "All your Threads are belong to us," along with a screenshot from the App Store's privacy section showing what personal information might be collected by the new Meta app. Threads could be the latest headache for Musk, who ac-



quired Twitter last year for USD 44 billion and has been making changes that have unnerved advertisers and turned off users. including new daily limits on the number of tweets people can view Meta has good timing because

Twitter users are growing frustrated with Musk's changes and looking for a viable alternative, said Matt Navarra, a social media consultant.

Threads presents the "opportunity to jump to a platform that can give them many of the things that they want Twitter to continue to be that it no longer is," he said.

Allowing Instagram users to port their profile to Threads could give the new app more traction with potential users by providing a ready-made set of accounts for them to follow, said Navarra, former director of social media at tech news site The Next Web and digital communications adviser for the British government.

Twitter has rolled out a series of unpopular changes in recent days, including a requirement for users to be verified to use the online dashboard TweetDeck. The policy announced Monday takes effect in 30 days and appears to be aimed at raising extra revenue because users need to pay have their accounts verified under Musk's changes

TweetDeck is popular with companies and news organisations, allowing users to manage multiple Twitter accounts.

It comes after outcry over Musk's announcement this weekend that Twitter has limited the number of tweets users can view each day - restrictions that the billionaire Tesla CEO described as an attempt to stop unauthorized scraping of potentially valuable data.

Still, some users might be put off by Meta's data privacy track record, Navarra said. And wouldbe Twitter challengers like Mastodon have found it a challenge to sign up users.

"It's hard to tell whether the upset and discontent is strong enough to make a mass exodus or whether it will be somewhat of a slow erosion." Navarra said.

Musk's rivalry with Meta Platforms also could end up spilling over into real life. In an online exchange between Musk and Meta CEO Mark Zuckerberg, the two tech billionaires seemingly agreed to a cage match face-off, though it's unclear if they will actually make it to the ring.

breakthrough' could boost EVs

London, July 4: Toyota says it has made a technological breakthrough that will allow it to halve the weight, size and cost of batteries, in what could herald a major advance for electric vehicles, a media report said.

The world's second largest carmaker was already pursuing a plan to roll out cars with advanced solid-state batteries, which offer benefits compared with liquid-based batteries, by 2025, The Guardian reported.

Tuesday, the Japanese company said it had simplified production of the material used to make them, hailing the discovery as a significant leap forward that could dramatically cut charging times and increase driving

range, the report said. "For both our liquid and our solid-state batteries, we are aiming to drastically change the situation where current batteries are too big, heavy and expensive," said Keiji Kaita, President of the Japanese auto firm's research and development centre for carbon neutrality. "In terms of potential, we

will aim to halve all of these factors." David Bailey, a professor of business economics at the University of Birmingham, said that if Toyota's claims were founded,

it could be a landmark moment for the future of electric cars. The Guardian reported. Kaita said the company had developed ways to make batteries more durable and believed it

could now make a solid-state battery with a range of 1,200km (745 miles) that could charge in 10 minutes or less. The company expects to be able to manufacture solid-state batteries for use in electric vehicles as soon as 2027, according to the Financial Times. which first reported on Toyota's claimed breakthrough. Solid-state batteries have been

widely seen as a potential gamechanger for electric vehicles.

The cushion provided by Indian markets on the back of its strong fundamentals are offsetting some of the negative catalysts seen in key developed economies, and strong backing by the FIIs in recent weeks is a testimony to it," said Shrikant Chouhan, Head of Research (Retail), Kotak Securities Ltd.

IFFCO to procure 2,500 agri-drones

New Delhi: To promote use of nano fertilisers across the country, leading cooperative IFFCO will procure 2,500 agridrones and train 5,000-odd rural entrepreneurs as part of its national campaign launched Tuesday. Already, IFFCO has signed an agreement for procurement of the drones -- to be used for spraying of its products nano urea and nano di-ammonium phosphate (DAP) -- in a phased manner. Along with drones, the cooperative will also procure 2,500 electric three- wheelers (loader types) to carry drones to farmers' fields, IFFCO said in a statement. "The technical specifications of agri-drones being procured by IFFCO for spray of nano fertilisers are in accordance with the industry standards," IFFCO said.

Housing sales down 1% in January-June across top 8 cities

New Delhi, July 4: Housing sales fell marginally by 1 per cent during January-June period this year, while gross leasing of office space rose 3 per cent across eight major cities, according to Knight Frank India.

Housing prices increased 2-10 per cent year-on-year. Releasing its bi-annual report for India's top eight realty market on Tuesday, real estate consultant Knight Frank India said housing sales have dipped 1 per cent to 1,56,640 units in January-June from 1,58,705 units in the year-ago period. In contrast, gross office space leasing increased 3 per cent to 26.1 million square feet from 25.3 million square feet.

Commenting on the findings, Knight Frank India CMD Shishir Baijal told reporters that housing and office markets across major cities have remained steady in the first half of this calendar year despite rise in interest rates on home loans and global headwinds.

On housing market, he said a strong positive consumer sentiment was observed.

New Delhi: LTIMindtree Ltd will replace Housing Development Finance Corporation Ltd in the Nifty 50 index from July 13, the National Stock Exchange said Tuesday. The stock exchange has announced changes to various indices, including Nifty 50 and Nifty 100, on account of scheme of amalgamation of HDFC with HDFC Bank. From July 13, LTIMindtree will replace HDFC in the benchmark Nifty 50 index and Jindal Steel & Power will take the place of the mortgage lender in the Nifty 100 index, according to NSE.

Analysts see market gain for Jio post Bharat phone launch

New Delhi, July 4: The launch of internet-enabled Jio Bharat phones at an "attractive pricing" will enable Jio to gain market share at the lower end segment and signals a reduced probability of tariff hike in the near term, brokerages tracking the sector said.

Jio Monday launched internet-enabled Jio Bharat phones at ₹999, packing in a cheaper monthly plan of ₹123 for unlimited voice calls and 14 GB data. The new offering aims to accelerate the '2G Mukt Bharat' vision, as India still has 250 million mobile subscribers trapped in the 2G era with feature phones.

In its note, JP Morgan said this "disruptive step" can halt incremental tariff increases for 2G and help Jio gain a share in that segment.

"We believe with this phone Jio can take market share at the lower end of the market. This also puts Bharti at risk as it can see increased churn from its recent 2G price action of increasing the ₹99 plan to ₹155 plan," it said.



Jio already had become aggressive at the premium end of subscribers in March 2023 through an aggressive postpaid plan launch, and the latest move showcases its aggressiveness towards the lower end of the subscriber spectrum as well, it noted.

"We believe this is negative for Bharti as any hopes of a tariff hike should be diluted over the next 12-18 months," JP Morgan added.

Emkay, in its note, said that JioBharat is better placed to disrupt the market as compared to the original JioPhone in 2018, "as it is a more focused product, has a simpler value propositionand has better distribution and production planning".

ment. Of the seven ports, which witnessed negative growth in June 2023, VO Chidambaranar Port saw cargo traffic declining 14.15 per cent followed by Kamarajar Port (9.55 per cent drop) and Chennai Port (8.62 per cent fall), as per the IPA.

Chhangte, Subasish Bose and Mahesh converted while Udanta Singh missed. Before the shootout drama, Kuwait held a slight edge as they pressed forward for goals often in the first half.

The relentlessness fetched the desired result in the 14th minute. Mobarak Al Faneeni released Abullah Al Bloushi on the left wing with a deft pass. Al Bloushi found Shabaib Al Khaldi inside the box with an accurate cross which the latter slotted past India custodian Sandhu to give Kuwait 1-0 lead.

India could have levelled the scores within a minute but Kuwait goalkeeper Abdul

Rahman blocked Chhangte's long ranger. But Chhangte, who was named AIFF Men's Player of the Year earlier on the day, was not to be denied a second time in the 39th minute.

After a lovely exchange of passes between Sahal Abdul Samad and captain Chhetri, the latter found an unmarked Chhangte deep inside the box. Chhangte, India's energetic No.12, had little trouble in beating Abdul Rahman to find the equaliser. It atoned for Chhetri's failure to score during the regulation time for the second match in a row to an extent.

In the second half, the action

continued to flow thick and fast as both India and Kuwait searched for the winner. Both sides came close to scoring their respective second goals, but unable to do that, as the match moved towards the extra time for the second successive time for both the teams.

The extra time too witnessed frenetic action from both the sides. There were couple of injuries, yellow cards to players and officials of both sides and a slew of corners. But that the decisive goal did not come through, making a penalty shootout mandatory to pick the winner.

After the peloton rode at a snail's pace most of the day, things got hectic in the finale on the Paul Armagnac racing track, near the vineyards that once belonged to 1973 Tour champion Luis Ocana of Spain.

With just over 1.5 kilometre to go, European champion Fabio Jakobsen hit the deck on a righthand bend, with his Quick Step-Alpha Vinyl team mate Julian Alaphilippe saying the riders were caught by surprise by the turns.

More riders crashed inside the final kilometre, but nothing could derail Philipsen, who took the green jersey for the points classification leader from France's Victor Lafay.

The Tour de France hits the mountains Wednesday with a 162.5km trek from Pau to Laruns. featuring the punishing Col de Soudet (15.2km at 7.2%) and Col de Marie Blanque (7.7km at 8.6%).

Yates leads Tadej Pogacar, the 2020 and 2021 Tour winner and his UAE Emirates teammate, in the overall standings by six seconds with his twin brother Simon in third place, also six seconds off the pace. Defending champion Jonas Vingegaard is sixth, 11-

seconds further back.
