

Major fire at govt medicine godown in Bhub

Bhubaneswar, July 9: A major fire broke out at a government medicine godown near Mancheswar police station here late Sunday night.

Fire personnel along with three fire tenders reached the spot and were engaged in dousing the fire.

The fire services department was yet to ascertain the cause behind the mishap. The godown belongs to the Odisha State Medical Corporation Limited (OSMCL) where medical equipment and medicines were stored.

The fire was so severe that the Fire department has sought more firefighters and tenders. OSMCL started using the godown to store medical items during the Covid-19 pandemic.

A security personnel deployed at the godown claimed that the fire was followed by a huge explosion.

New Delhi, July 9: Torrential rains pounded several parts of north India Sunday with 19 people killed in landslides and other rain-related incidents, while most rivers, including the Yamuna in Delhi, were in spate. In cities and towns across the region, many roads and residential areas were submerged in kneedeep water with the civic system unable to hold on in the face of record rains.

Frightening images of the chaos unleashed by the rains -vehicles floating like paper boats on inundated roads, muddy waters gushing into residential areas, temples and other structures submerged on the banks by swollen rivers and land cave-ins -- were shared online by people from Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand and Delhi, among other places.

Heavy downpour warnings have been issued for certain areas of J&K, Ladakh and Himachal, while in Delhi, which recorded its highest rainfall in a single day in July since 1982, authorities have cautioned over rising water level of the Yamuna.

With normal life paralysed, schools in Delhi and its adjoining NCR cities of Gurugram and Noida will be closed n Monday, according to officials. In three separate incidents of landslides in Himachal, where

Danish in fact introduced Abhijeet to his friend Khurram alias Abdul Hamid of Karachi. Khurram is suspected to be a senior Pakistan Army intelligence officer having a big network of agents in India.

The officer said that Abhijeet used to transfer money to various Pakistani intelligence operatives working in India.

It is also suspected that Abhijeet has shared some secret documents relating to the Indian Army, Navy and other defence materials with ISI

Karachi, July 9: Pakistan's Minister in Charge of Sports Ehsaan Mazari has said that if India avoids travelling across the border for the Asia Cup 2023, his country will withdraw from the ICC Men's ODI World Cup 2023 in India.

"My personal opinion, since the Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) comes under my ministry, is that if India demands to play their Asia Cup games at a neutral venue, we would also demand the same for our World Cup games in India," Sports Minister Ehsaan Mazari told Indian Express

The statement from Mazari came just a day after Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif formed a committee over the nation's participation in the World Cup, to be held in India this year.

The minister also targeted the BCCI saying India's reluctance to play cricket in Pakistan baffles him.

"India brings sports into politics. I don't understand why the Indian government doesn't want to send their cricket team here. Some time back a huge baseball contingent from India was in Islamabad to play. There was also the bridge team that had travelled to Pakistan. There were around 60-plus people, I was the chief guest of the event. They won here and left. Pakistan's football, hockey and chess teams

'I am Indian now': Pak woman who crossed border for love

Noida, July 9: Their cross-border love story hit a dead-end after they were arrested and put in jail, but India's Sachin Meena and Pakistan's Seema Haider are set for a new turn as they walked out of prison on getting bail.

Seema was arrested July 4 for illegally entering India without a visa via Nepal with her four children, all aged below seven years, while Sachin was put behind bars for sheltering the illegal immigrants

'My husband is a Hindu, so I am a Hindu. I feel I am an Indian now," Seema told NDTV.

Seema and Sachin had got in touch in 2019 while playing online game PUBG and eventually grew closer to the extent that they decided to live together in India -- all unknown to her husband Ghulam Haider who was away in Saudi Arabia for work. In a video message from Saudi Arabia, Ghulam Haider urged the Indian government to help him reunite with his wife. He said it was through the Indian media that he got to know that his wife and children are in Greater Noida.

However, Seema told reporters

that she did not wish to go back to Ghulam Haider and claimed threat to her life if she returns to their native place in Pakistan, citing stringent local laws.

In March this year, Sachin and Seema met in Kathmandu where they stayed together for seven days and got secretly married, according to police and advocate Parashar.

Later, she went back to Pakistan and Sachin returned to India. Back home, Seema, who claimed discord with her husband, sold a plot for Pakistani rupees 12 lakh, arranged for fight tickets and visa for Nepal for

herself and her children, according to police. In May she reached Nepal via Dubai and spent some time in the tourist city of Pokhara in the Himalayan nation. Then she took a bus for Delhi from Kathmandu and reached Greater Noida May 13 with her children where Sachin had made arrangements for her to stav in a rented accommodation without disclosing her Pakistani identity, officials said. More than one-and-a-half-

month later, local police got a whiff of a Pakistani woman and her children's illegal presence in their area. Sachin, Seema and her children tried to evade police arrest and fled, but were caught in Ballabhgarh in Haryana. Police then guestioned them and officially arrested them July 4, the officials said.





Bhubaneswar, July 9: The National Commission for Scheduled Tribes (NCST) has served notices on the Chief Secretary, Director General of Police (DGP) and Railway Protection Force (RPF) Director General (DG), seeking action taken report (ATR) in connection with brutalities inflicted upon a 22-year-old migrant worker from Kandhamal.

The commission's move came in response to a petition filed by rights activist and Supreme Court lawyer Radhakanta Tripathy who sought justice for Angad Mallick, a resident of Dahalapadi Sahi in Baliguda Notified Area Council (NAC) in Kandhamal, whose hands were allegedly chopped off by miscreants in Mumbai while he was on way to Gujarat in search of work.

The NCST has directed the Chief Secretary, DGP and RPF DG to investigate the barbaric in-



cident and file ATR in its connection within 15 days.

In case, the commission does not receive reply within the stipulated time, it may exercise the powers of Civil Courts conferred on it under Article 338-A of Constitution and issue summons for appearance in person or by a representative before it, the

NCST order read The incident came to the fore after Mallick returned home creants assaulted Mallick leaving him unconscious.

The Mumbai GRP found Mallick in a critical condition and admitted him to a nearby hospital. After regaining consciousness, he was shocked to find his hands chopped off from the elbow. Later, the 22-year-old was sent to an ashram in Gujarat's Kutch.

Back home, Mallick's family lodged a missing complaint with the Baliguda police April 29.

After learning Mallick's details like his house address June 22, the ashram authorities informed Baliguda police about the 22-year-old's plight.

Soon after, Mallick's family reached Gujarat and brought him back to Odisha June 30.

Sources said the Baliguda police has contacted the Mumbai GRP for details of the case registered by them. Police have also interrogated Rabi. The Kandhamal administration has asked the Labour department to investigate the incident.

RATNA BHANDAR ISSUE GATHERS STEAM AS POLLS NEAR

Bhubaneswar, July 9: Ratna Bhandar, the treasure trove of Srimandir, continues to remain a mystery for the people. There is doubt whether the Lord's ornaments are intact inside or have gone missing over the period of time. With the state Assembly and Lok Sabha polls approaching nearer, the BJP has again brought to the forefront the issue of the reopening of Ratna

Bhandar According to a statement by the state government in the Assembly, Ratna Bhandar was last opened in 1985 but the latest inventories of the valuables were made in 1978.

Until 1985, nobody had seen the inner chamber of the Ratna Bhandar, which was divided into two parts. The outer chamber is regularly opened and ornaments are taken out by the servitors on festivals

Following an order of the Orissa High Court, there was an attempt to open the inner chamber April 4, 2018. But it could not be opened as the temple administration could not find the keys. The officials, servitors and experts, who went inside the Ratna Bhandar, had to re-

turn from the outer chamber. But the administration did not make it public that the keys were missing until the matter was raised in the managing com-

mittee meeting two days after the attempt. Interestingly, after some days, following a hue and cry, all of a sudden the Puri district administration claimed that a duplicate key was available. Where did the duplicate come from and where has the original key gone? These questions created confu-

sion among the Lord's devotees. Later, Justice Raghubir Das Inquiry Commission on Ratna Bhandar was set up and Justice Das submitted the final report to the state government November, 2018. The commission report has not yet been placed in the Assembly.

With this in the background, there has been a demand for reopening Ratna Bhandar for a long time. During his visit to Odisha in December last year, BJP national president JP Nadda had raised the issue and targeted the state government. He had asked about the missing keys. The BJP

chief had also alleged that the state government had failed to protect the valuable gems and

assets of Lord Jagannath. On different occasions, the saffron party has demanded for reopening of Ratna Bhandar, which is also reportedly in need of repairs. Not only the BJP, several opposition parties, including the Congress

Gajapati

Dibyasingha Deb and many senior servitors of Puri temple have also urged the state government to reopen the treasure trove to undertake repairing work and take inventory of the valuables.

Chhattisgarh Governor Biswabhusan Harichandan has also demanded for reopening. However, the state government has not paid any heed to the de-

mand. The BJP has recently knocked at the doors of the Orissa High Court. Admitting a petition filed by former BJP state president Samir Mohanty, the HC July 5 served notices on four persons about opening of Ratna Bhandar. Though 45 years have passed, the government has not reopened the Ratna Bhandar. When the Puri and Lord king Jagannath's devotees across the world are waiting to know whether the valuables of Lord Jagannath are safe or not. The government is in deep sleep,' alleged Mohanty.

The BJP leader said he has moved the HC and the court has taken it seriously. The next hearing is set for August 7.

When asked about the reopening, Law Minister Jagannath Saraka said, "We do not know whether the keys have gone missing or not. The matter is now before the HC. The state government will take necessary steps after examining different aspects as per the directive of the court.

City sees uptick in conjunctivitis cases

Bhubaneswar, July 9: In less than two weeks, cases of conjunctivitis have grown in various localities in the City. With the cases surging manifold and the state government issuing guidelines for this communicable disease, the vendors have shared their helplessness towards it. The schools and offices have asked the students and the employees to stay at home to prevent contamination of virus.

Conjunctivitis or pink eye is the inflammation or infection of the transparent membrane that lines the eyelid and eyeball.

Several hospitals are registering more than 20 cases of conjunctivitis daily. "Weather is a player here, and this environment is suitable for the microbes to sustain. We witness cases every year but it is higher than usual this year, said Lopa, an ophthalmologist in a private hospital

When asked about the transmission of virus through the vendors, she said, "They are doing their job and it is unavoidable. All we can do is avail medical camps and provide them eye drops and let them do their work. On our part, we should maintain as much sanitation that is required and wash the vegetables and fruits to avoid the contagious virus to pass.' Speaking about the rising

cases in the city, Capital Hospital Director Laxmidhar Sahoo said, "It is a seasonal disease and happens every year, but reports show huge numbers of cases being reported this year. Since it is caused by a virus



The prices of vegetables are sky high, first time in the last 4-5 years. Serving a vegetable thali is more expensive than plating a non vegetarian thali these days.

The problem is that the government itself is unsure by when the prices will drop, hence we are indecisive of increasing our rates, said an owner of a restaurant in the City.

Shalima Roy, who runs a cloud kitchen in Bhubaneswar, said, "Without getting any clue from

the government about when the prices shall fall, it is becoming really difficult to manage the canteen with 100 student subscriptions.'

The prices of meals are predecided and now if we put a hike in rates of meals, we will lose the subscribers who take food on a daily basis, she added. Every year we observe a slight

rise in vegetable prices around this time of the year because of changes in weather.

With the import of vegetables from different states a balance is created in the market.

Now that the imports are at a pause, the prices in the market are surging and it might stretch for one month, says Gayadhar Swain, member of Vegetables Traders' Association. Bhubaneswar.

An improvement in the situation will be observed very soon as an attempt is being made to bring local vegetables back to the market, added Swain.

Sankhamedi villagers vote in WB rural polls

Bhogarai, July 9: At a time when border disputes of Odisha are increasingly complicated with Andhra Pradesh Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand and West Bengal, residents of Sankhamedi village under Analia panchayat of this block in Balasore district cast their votes in the panchayat polls of West Bengal held Saturday.

Over 300 voters in Sankhamedi village were learnt to have excercised their franchise in the rural polls of West Bengal, Saturday. People of this border village have voter identity cards of both the states and the residents vote during elections in both the states.

This has dealt a severe blow to the state government which always vouches to guard the borders of the state from the neighbouring states

Reports said that Sankhamedi village is not a lone example as voters of 12 over villages in Bhogarai and Jaleswar blocks of Balasore district bordering West Bengal have voted in the rural polls of the neighbouring state.

The villagers enjoy ration supplied by both the states, speak both Odia and Bengali,

and use SIM cards of both the state telecom circles. The development has come in the backdrop of Odisha completing 86 vears of its formation as a separate province.

Local intelligentsia have alleged that such large number of voters voting in West Bengal rural polls is indicative that the neighbouring state has almost gobbled up Sankhamedi which is a revenue village of Odisha. This has sparked concern in

various quarters in the state. On record, the people come under two villages-Sankhamedi (ward No 18 of Analia panchayat) of Bhogarai block in Odisha and Bagbrajakishore (ward no 14) of Ramnagar block in West Bengal.

The Sankhamedi has about 320 voters while Bagbrajakishore village has over 700 voters, including the rest from nearby West Bengal hamlets. The villagers revealed that they have been voting in both the state elections for the last 30 years. However, the Election Commission has apparently not

taken note of it. Reports said that the Odisha government was collecting revenue from Sankhamedi village from 1927 to 1980 but it stopped from 1978 after the then West Odisha government was collecting revenue from Sankhamedi village from 1927 to 1980 but it stopped from 1978 After the then WB government declared it as part

of their province by including it in Ramnagar block of East Midnapore district from 1978. Since then, both the states have entered into a face-off over possession of the village

The Odisha government has established a primary school, constructed a road, supplied power and drinking water, constructed toilets and providing the villagers with ration cards. Similarly, the West Bengal government is also providing other basic facilities and houses under

Awas Yojana to the villagers. The students of this village continue to study in the new building of the primary school where the state government has appointed Odia teachers. However, the students of this village have failed to get caste certificates as the state government is not collecting revenue from this village. As a result, students studying in Odia medium schools have been deprived of

getting higher education. The dual rule of both the state government continues in Sankhamedi village while the voters continue to cast their votes in the elections of both the states with the voter cards they have acquired from Odisha and West Bengal.

Users lament as 'smart' bus stops lack smart thinking

Rourkela, July 9: Good to look at, small cubicle like smart bus stands have been set up all over the Steel City for the commuters ease. However, commuters, who are the end users, feel that these 'smart' bus stops are anything but smart. They lamented that no smart thought has gone into conceptualising these shelters.

"No doubt they are very good looking, rather smart looking. But that smartness is limited to the looks only, otherwise they are not very helpful," said an elderly woman Banaia Das of Koel Nagar. Her main complaint was that during heavy rain, the shelters are not able to save commuters from the shower. "I was almost fully drenched while waiting for the 'Mo Bus'. Because the shelter was unable to protect those inside when there is slanted rainfall," she said.



Another person said, "Even the space under it is inadequate if there are large numbers of persons under its roof. And if you have cow or dog taking shelter from sun or rain, then space gets squeezed.

However, the most practical criticism was regarding the platform created for the super elderly, sick, pregnant ladies and especially for the physically challenged. A ramp

has been constructed in all these bus stops with proper steel bars to hold as support


However, what really causes the problem is the height of the bus shelter and the direction of the ramp. In most cases, the bus stop is at an inconvenient height for persons of all the four mentioned categories. Besides, the direction of the ramp is on the side of the stop. This is again another problem for these people to use it.

'Why have you constructed the bus stops at such great height when one finds it difficult to use stairs back home," said a septuagenarian Alibha Patnaik, Most of them and even general commuters say that the height of the bus stops could have been reduced.

"You have to construct one smart stop but where is the smart thinking? If the spot is at a height it could have been reduced," made this point another person at Chhend. Most of the elderlies' observation was, "Had the height of the bus stops in most cases reduced a bit then the ramps could have touched the road and there would have been no problem in using it.'

Besides, when this reporter visited some of the stops to take stock of the situation, it was found that the approach road to the ramp was yet to be cleared of garbage post construction.

n the battle to reduce greenhouse-gas emissions and avert the worst impacts of climate change, the world has a vast resource that remains largely untapped: women. Preventing the catastrophic

effects of climate change requires understanding what and who-drives transformation on the ground. Investing in women, which means improving their access to education, economic inputs, and capital, gives governments a fighting chance of meeting their ambitious climate goals. Several studies have shown

how advancing gender equality can spur climate action. States with larger proportions of women in their legislatures are more likely to approve environmental agreements and treaties. And when more women are involved in group decisions about land management, the group conserves more. Moreover, it is estimated that boosting the productivity of women smallholder farmers could reduce carbon emissions by up to two billion tonne by 2050.

The transition to clean power requires a transition in power. Or, put another way, changing power systems requires changing systems of power. Despite being responsible for half of the world's food production, women own less than 20% of the world's agricultural land. And although women comprise 45% of the agricultural workforce across developing countries (and 37% worldwide), they receive only 7% of investment in the sector. If they received the same access to productive resources as men, women in developing countries could increase yields on their farms by 20-30% and lift 100-150 million people out of hunger. As matters stand, women and

Gender equality is a crucial missing piece of the climate puzzle. If governments want a fighting chance of reducing greenhouse-gas emissions and shifting to renewable energy, they must give women more access to inputs, education, and capital

According to the United Nations, women comprise 80% of those displaced by climate change and are 14 times more likely to die in a climate-related disaster than men are. When extreme weather events rob family breadwinners of their livelihoods and their homes, they can no longer afford to have children studying instead of working; sometimes, girls as young as 11 or 12 become brides. That means squandered talent and lost potential, as well as early motherhood for many. Moreover, children with

The good news is that investing in women and girls promises high returns in terms of fostering growth, building resilience, and strengthening adaptation efforts. But taking advantage of this opportunity requires a shift in imagination and a concerted effort to make women more visible - especially in policymaking settings. At the United Nations Climate Change Conference in Egypt (COP27), women made up less

than 34% of country teams. In 2020, women led only 15% of environmental ministries in 193 countries

Deploying capital to support women in agriculture, keep girls in school, fund women entrepreneurs, and support women-led emergency-information networks has long been recognized as essential to achieve the goal of inclusive economic growth. But it will also contribute to reducing greenhouse-gas emissions and keeping global warming within the 1.5° Celsius limit set by the Paris climate agreement.

Imagine a world in which women farmers have equal access to inputs, women have the funds to become clean-energy entrepreneurs, girls learn the skills required to take advantage of new green jobs, and womenled networks, such as Women Wetem Weta in Vanuatu, provide early disaster warnings to safeguard their communities. This is a world of "more for more" more children are educated, more societies can sustain them selves, and everyone can enjoy greater prosperity, security, and stability.

To realise this vision, those in positions of power must seize this moment of peril and possibility to ensure that women and girls can fulfill their potential and, in doing so, support the shared fight against climate change and its effects. The energy transition is an opportunity for us all. Making the most of it will require investing in those who will drive it forward.

Khalistan Not Again

The fact that a pro-Khalistan protest outside the Indian High Commission in London 8 July passed off without incident and there are no reports of any trouble by Khalistani activists from Canada, the US or Australia on the same day, as had been feared, are only cold comfort to the Indian foreign service establishment. That such an orchestrated terrorist campaign could be planned simultaneously in four major countries shows there is something seriously wrong in the way India is conducting its diplomacy. On top of it, the comment by the Minister for External Affairs S Jaishankar that India will not tolerate the country's flag in the London embassy having been lowered by Khalistani activists reflects rather a streak of arrogance and lack of diplomatic finesse not expected from a career diplomat that he is. Repeatedly issuing demarches and summoning diplomats from the countries where Khalistani operatives have been threatening and attacking Indian diplomatic staff is certainly not the way to effectively deal with the snowballing crisis. It is no use blaming Pakistan for allegedly sponsoring the terrorist movement and promoting its supposed latest champion - Amritpal Singh trying to be a clone of Jarnail Singh Bhindranwale, who caused incalculable harm during the movement's earlier manifestation in the 1980s.

The current wave of protests by Khalistani activists is part of a series of demonstrations organised in several cities across the world, such as Melbourne, San Francisco and Toronto to protest against the killing of Khalistani activist Hardeep Singh Nijjar in British Columbia on 18 June. Nijjar was wanted in India on terrorism charges and his killing has caused outrage among his followers who accuse the Indian government of being involved in eliminating him.

There has been an outpouring of outrage on social media and in conversations. It seems to be India's intelligence failure that an obscure, lone man Amritpal Singh suddenly shot into the limelight and kept foxing the police and other law enforcing agencies as he roamed free in India dodging arrest for months till he finally surrendered before the court. He is being described as "the man from nowhere," unknown to Indians. He was a clean-shaven transporter from Dubai who suddenly emerged in India as a self-styled heir to the toxic legacy of actor-turned-activist Deep Sidhu who had played a role during the farmers' protest in Punjab-Haryana-Uttar Pradesh-Rajasthan against the Modi government's three anti-farmer legislations. After he died in a car accident, Amritpal Singh donned the mantle of spearheading the Waris Panjab De movement of Deep Sidhu that clamoured for the rights of the people of Punjab. His transformation into a bearded pro-Bhindranwale activist even led many to suspect that he is the creation of Pakistan planted to launch terrorist attacks in India.

The most intriguing development in recent times is the re-emergence of the Khalistani movement even when it does not get traction from a majority of the people of Punjab. The country was taken by surprise when a Khalistani activist hoisted the outfit's flag at the height of the farmers' march towards the Red Fort in protest against the controversial farm laws. At that point the BJP-led Centre even sought to portray the agitation as a Khalistani-backed one.

It seems the government in its desperation and subsequent frustration over not being able to shove the laws down the throats of the farmers apparently at the behest of big corporate houses blackened the movement by bracketing it with Khalistani terrorists operating from outside, especially Canada where there is an influential Sikh diaspora.

Last month, Amritpal Singh invoked Bhindranwale's rhetoric by saying Union Home Minister Amit Shah could meet the same fate as former Prime Minister Indira Gandhi gunned down for launching Operation Blue Star to flush out Sikh terrorists, led by Bhindranwale, from the Golden Temple complex. Shah spoke against Khalistan.

Amritpal Singh's father, Tarsem Singh, has complained the hunt for his son was a "conspiracy," and that his son was working to fight drug addiction.

Whatever the truth, the fact remains that Khalistani activists are operating on foreign soil with the aim of carving out a separate state for the Sikhs. Their deep ties with their native land, Punjab, and moorings with Punjabi culture are strong enough. The government needs to handle the issue with far more care and isolate the subversive forces from the patriotic people of Punjab who form the bulwark for a strong and prosperous India. Bigotry and narrow religious ideology of the BJP are not the answer to the problems in Punjab and the divisive Khalistani movement.

Newspeak in George Orwell's Nineteen Eighty-Four was a logocidal creation since it was designed to limit what it was possible to think about or discuss. Logocidal is an extremely rare word, whose appearances can be counted on both hands with fingers to spare. However, it has been wielded twice in recent years by the journalist Marina Hyde in the Guardian. She uses it for language that's obfuscatory to the point of meaninglessness, the kind employed by politicians and public figures to avoid committing themselves, a travesty of communication that Orwell parodied in his essay Politics and the English Language. David Cameron is far less of a logocidal maniac than Miliband, it must be said, but to listen to the message from any side these days is to wonder if they focusgrouped it in a head trauma unit. The World Investment Report of UNCTAD has come with good news that FPI in greenfield projects has increased by \$5 billion in 2022 from a previous of \$44 billion. Apart from a sharp increase in foreign investments in greenfield projects, the report also noted the country was the secondlargest recipient of international project finance in 2022.

Greenfield projects occupy those areas of land that have minimal to no structure. So, there are no expenditures associated with the clearance of farmlands at the greenfield sites. In short, these are farmlands close to cities and have many strings attached. Farmers have reason to feel concerned as say in the Jewar area of Bulandshahr/Greater Noida in Uttar Pradesh.

The Department of Economic Affairs (DEA) of the Finance Ministry has issued a significant caution in the pre-poll year. In its Annual Review 2023, it

and rural demand on path to recovery, the pace can be hit by increasing geopolitical stress, volatility in global systems, sharp correction in global stock markets, deep impact of El Nino, modest trade activity and lower FDI inflows owing to frail global demand.

"In 2022, emerging market economies (EMEs) remained subdued and volatile as geopolitical uncertainties rose. Global slowdown in investment flows to EMEs led to India's net FDI inflows dipping in FY23," the report says. Those investment blues have given sharp jitters to FPIs as the Indian and French tax authorities meet in Paris. During the course of the meeting on double taxation avoidance agreement between India and France there was apprehension among foreign funds that India may soon renegotiate the treaty to eliminate capital gains tax exemption.

Currently, France and the Netherlands have major exemption on capital gains as per treaties with India for share sales. This comes ahead of PM Modi's visit to Paris in the com-

Consequently, many foreign banks and large funds shifted their India equity trades away from Mauritius and Singapore to France, which is the tenth largest source of FPI funds to India. It holds ₹1.2 lakh crore securities in Indian market as on May 31. If this happens, the FPI flows would shift elsewhere and the exposure to Indian markets may get reduced.

The UNCTAD report also notes that the inflow into India in 2022 was, however, significantly lower than what was seen in 2020, when \$64 billion of FDI entered the country. Still Indian stock markets are zooming to new highs but on the weekend on July 7, Nifty 50 fell for the first time since it has been rising with the HDFC merger. The US rate hikes have weighed on global equities. The Nifty fell by 0.85% to 19331 and BSE Sensex lost 0.77% at 65280. This in itself may not be an exact indicator, but the US rate rise will have an impact on fund flows

to India on many counts. It has been observed whenever fund flow moves back to

It is also an indicator that rising capital expenses largely on constructions and rebuilding of structures is not boosting the economy to the desired levels. This has made steel, cement and other essentials expensive, but it calls for a study whether the benefits are percolating down.

The greenfield investments that UNCTAD mentions also are not that easy. It is bound in chains of rules and takes time to get released.

Dehradun/New Delhi, July 9: A sinkhole, more than sixfeet wide, emerged near the Saklani home in Joshimath last week. And the crippling anxiety of 'what next' gripped the residents of the ecologically fragile Himalayan town once again.

That was the dead of winter, this is the monsoon, and nothing seems to have changed, said Anju Saklani. As the rain fell steadily, land near their home caved in with water seeping into their home.

"We have since filled the sinkhole with debris and stones,' Anju told PTI over the phone. But that is a band-aid solution at best, added Atul Sati, environmental activist and coordinator of the Joshimath Bachao Sangharsh Samiti (JBSS).

The Saklanis were the first to reports cracks in their home. as early as September 2021. That they are also the first to report a sinkhole has led to trepidation on what lies ahead for their town, a gateway to the ski resort of Auli, several mountain climbing expeditions as well as the pilgrim centres of Badrinath and Hemkund Sahib, and the Valley of Flowers, a UNESCO world heritage site.

The sinkhole near the Saklani's house in Sunil ward is not the only one, he said, expressing his grave concern over the situa tion.

NPP to oppose implementation of **UCC in Arunachal**

Itanagar, July 9: The Arunachal Pradesh unit of the National People's Party (NPP) has decided to oppose the immediate implementation of the Uniform Civil Code (UCC) in the northeastern state.

The decision was taken at the state executive meeting of the party here Saturday, NPP state general secretary Paknga Bage said.

NPP state working president Likha Saaya told reporters, "Though NPP is in alliance with the BJP on developmental issues, but the regional party follows its own ideology".

The party unanimously adopted a resolution at the meeting opposing the UCC, citing the state's diverse multiethnic and multi-tribal composition, as well as its strong customary and traditional iden tity, Bage said.

Elaborating the reason as to why NPP is opposing UCC, Bage said since Arunachal Pradesh has its own unique laws, the NPP has unanimously adopted a resolution to go with the customary laws with certain modifications.

Imphal, July 9: In view of over two-month long ethnic violence in Manipur, banks would provide relief measures by way of rescheduling the existing loans. Accordingly, banks have been instructed to extend the moratorium period up to 12 months, officials said.

Manipur Institutional Finance Department Director Anna Arambam said that a Special State Level Bankers' Committee (SLBC) meeting recently decided that banks would provide relief measures by way of rescheduling of existing loans and sanctioning of fresh loans as per the emerging require-

ments of all loan borrowers in agricultural, MSME and other retail loans

He said that banks have been instructed to extend the moratorium period up to 12 months from the date of implementation of the rehabilitation. restructuring measures and for retail loans under P-segment (Personal/Pension/Vehicle/Hous ing loans etc), EMI repayment may be deferred by 12 months.

Those borrowers, whose repayment capacity has been severely affected due to disruption of economic activities and loss/damage of economic assets, including agriculture and allied activities may contact the concerned banks for availing the moratorium and other rehabilitation and restructuring measures, the official said. Arambam said that opening of bank branches was also reviewed by Chief Secretary Vineet Joshi. Out of a total of 241 bank branches in Manipur, 218 have been opened as July 6. Efforts are being made to reopen the remaining 23 branches at the earliest. Out of 396 ATMs, 320 are functioning.

Banks were requested to make all-out efforts to ensure that the remaining 70 ATMs are also_ made functional.

The government has conveved its readiness to extend all possible assistance to the banks, the official said.

U'khand govt to tighten land laws



Warring groups use quadcopters to target each other

Bishnupur (Manipur), July 9: Technology has become both a boon and a bane in the restive Manipur state. While Army and Assam Rifles are deploying drones to rescue and save people, clashing ethnic groups are using quadcopters to target each other. It has been noticed by security agencies that quadcopters have been put to use by warring factions - Meiteis, mostly concentrated in Imphal valley, and Kukis, mainly on the hillside - to know each other's positions, of-

There have been places like Phougakchao, Kangvai Bazar, and Torbung Bazar in the south-



west part of Manipur where the quadcopters have been put to extensive use by the two communities where their villages face each other. The security forces have created buffer zones at these places to keep the agitated communities away from each other. However, Loibol in Senapati district and Leimaram in Bishnupur district have been hotspots during the violence despite the presence of security forces, the officials said.

Mistrust runs deep in the two communities which rely on technology to monitor each other's movement, the officials said. Quadcopter, often called a

quadrotor, is an uncrewed rotary wing aircraft that can take flight using four rotors, each consisting of a motor and propellers. Unlike conventional fixedwing aircraft or helicopters, which rely on engines or tail rotors to take flight, quadcopters have neither. Quadcopters, after being airborne, have the ability to hover in place, whereas fixedwing aerial drones have to be on the move constantly. Quadcopters are also capable of much more precise aerial maneuvers while fixed-wing aerial drones can only make much less precise fly-by runs. At the same time, drones have also assisted the Army and Assam Rifles in rescue operations and helped save nearly 2000 - (civilians in the Kakching district of South East Manipur.

Chennai, July 9: Governor R N Ravi is unfit to hold the gubernatorial office as he functioned as a political opponent and looked for 'opportunities to topple the state government', Chief Minister M K Stalin has conveyed to President Droupadi Murmu, the government said Sunday.

"Ravi 'defamed' Tamil culture, indulged in 'cheap politics,' instigated "communal hatred" and he is a "threat" to Tamil Nadu's peace," he said adding through such actions the Governor violated his oath. In a letter to Murmu. Stalin said that Ravi has violated the oath of office he took under Article 159 of the Constitution, the government said in an official release.

"A Governor who looks for 'opportunities to topple the state government' in a state ruled by a party (DMK) opposed to the party in power at the Centre (BJP) could be regarded as a mere agent of the Union government. Such a course of action pursued by a Governor would destroy the Indian democracy's basic tenets by damaging the principle of federalism. Governor RN Ravi is 'a good example' of such behaviour. "Ravi is stoking communal hatred and he is a threat to Tamil Nadu's peace," Stalin said in a letter dated July

In a 19-page statement --extracts from Stalin's letter to Murmu-- the government quoted the CM as saying that Ravi openly functioned against the policies of the Tamil Nadu government. The Governor caused unnecessary delay in clearing Bills passed by the Assembly besides files and posed hindrance to the work of the state government and the Assembly.

Stalin said Ravi's tenure as Governor in Nagaland was also not satisfactory and the Nationalist Democratic Progressive Party (NDPP) there had said that there was peace only after his exit. Ever since he assumed office as TN Governor in September 2021, Ravi had all along been involved in an ideological and political battle with the DMK regime, duly elected by the people

Following the post, Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan accused Congress leaders of spreading "misinformation" and creating social hatred by sharing a "false" post on Golwalkar. Chouhan said the former RSS head worked throughout his life to remove social differences and build a harmonious society.

However, a state Congress leader said Digvijaya Singh shared facts on the basis of a book and that the Bharativa Janata Party (BJP) cannot silence the voice of his party. Golwalkar was the longest serving RSS chief and was at the helm of the organisation from 1940-73.

Digvijaya Singh on Saturday tweeted a picture of a page carrying several controversial comments quoted to the former RSS head, known as 'Guruji' among his admirers. Golwalkar was quoted as saying he would rather live under the British rule than have equal rights given to Dalits, backwards and Muslims. Some other controversial comments were also attributed to him.

Following the post, senior RSS functionary and its publicity department head Sunil Ambekar accused the former Madhya Pradesh chief minister of posting a "photoshopped' image

Amarnath yatra resumes after 3 days

Srinagar, July 9: The Amarnath yatra resumed Sunday from Panjtarni and Sheshnag base camps after remaining suspended for three days due to inclement weather in Kashmir, officials said here.

As soon as the skies cleared around the cave shrine, the authorities opened the gates and allowed the stranded devotees to offer prayers at the naturally formed ice-lingam in south Kashmir Himalayas, they said. "Those devotees who had already performed 'darshan' have been allowed to return to Baltal base camp," a senior official at the Panjtarni base camp said.

The Army has sheltered more than 700 Amarnath pilgrims at its camp in Qazigund in Anantnag district after they were stranded due to heavy rainfall in the valley. Earlier, in the day no fresh batch of pilgrims was allowed from Jammu owing to inclement weather and closure of the Jammu-Srinagar national highway, officials said.

Efforts are on to restore traffic on the highway which was blocked by multiple landslides and washing away of nearly 40-metre road stretch in Ramban district, leaving over 3,500 vehicles stranded, officials said. While most parts of Jammu and Kashmir experienced incessant rains since Thursday night, some areas near the highaltitude Amarnath shrine recorded snowfall as well.

Rijiju and mysterious audio tape

When Kiren Rijiju was removed as Union Law Minister on May 18 and shifted to the insignificant Earth Sciences Ministry, it came as a bolt from the blue. After all, Rijiju was BJP's original face in the North East and the party's three term Lok Sabha MP from Arunachal Pradesh. The popular belief is that he was shunted out as PM Modi wanted to buy peace with the judiciary in an election year particularly after the BJP's humiliating defeat in the Karnataka Assembly polls. But insiders have a different take. They say that it's a misplaced notion as the reason for his removal from the Law ministry was linked to the surfacing of an audio tape. No one is sure about the contents of this audio

tape but one thing is clear that it contained the voice of Kiren Rijiju. It is whispered that the tape's contents were related to appointments of judges and were quite embarrassing. The audio clip has some connection with a CBI case being heard by a special judge who was suspended for demanding and accepting bribes. What did Rijiju have to do with it no one knows. It seems that the scam is deeper than it looks and many heads may roll in the days to come.

BJP eyes Maha-type operation in Bihar

he success of BJP leadership in staging a coup in the NCP may have brought cheers on the faces of leaders in states like Bihar, UP and elsewhere. Many leaders of the NDA have started making claims that the fall of the JD (U)-RJD-Congress government is imminent. However, reports emanating from Bihar indicate that the Maharashtra-type coup is not possible in the Nitish-led government. Reasons are many. The foremost being that the BJP has just 78 MLAs at present in the House of 243 along with HAM's 4 MLAs while Nitish-led ruling alliance is enjoying the support of 160-plus MLAs. Secondly, Nitish Kumar is ruling the state and is a smart cookie, say political analysts. Third, the Speaker of the Assembly belongs to the RJD and without the support of the Speaker no such effort may succeed in any state. The BJP is desperate to garner support in Bihar to turn the tables in Bihar. But the party doesn't have a master craftsman like the

one, Devendra Fadnavis in Maharashtra. The BJP leaders concede that most of their senior leaders wanting to dislodge Nitish Kumar are at loggerheads themselves.

The renaming game

Even as the controversy with regard to the renaming of Nehru Memorial Museum and Library (NMML) in the national Capital as the Prime Ministers' Museum and Library (PMML) has not subsided, its cascading effect is being witnessed in states. The name of Nehru is being erased wherever possible is seen in states with Madhya Pradesh taking the lead. The Congress alleged that Nehru Park in Madhya Pradesh's Budhni, was renamed after Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan's elder son, Kartikeya Chouhan.

Budhni is the Assembly constituency of Shivraj Singh Chouhan. As if this was not enough, another park in Budhni was named after Kunal, younger son of Shivraj Singh Chouhan. The BJP leaders defended it saying it was the wish of the local people and no motives be attributed.

Cairo, July 9: UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres said Sudan was on the brink of a "full-scale civil war" as fierce clashes between rival generals continued unabated Sunday in the capital. Khartoum.

He warned Saturday evening that the war between the Sudanese military and a powerful paramilitary force is likely to destabilise the entire region. according to Farhan Haq, deputy spokesperson for the secretary-general.

Health Minister Haitham Mohammed Ibrahim said in televised comments last month that the clashes have killed over 3,000 people and wounded over 6,000 others. The death tally, however, is highly likely to be much higher.

The fighting came 18 months after the two generals led a military coup in October 2021 that toppled a Western-backed civilian transitional government. The conflict dashed Sudanese hopes of a peaceful transition to democracy after a popular up-

Pope puts stamp on Church future with new cardinals REUTERS

Vatican, July 9: Pope Francis Sunday announced that he would elevate 21 churchmen to the high rank of cardinal, again putting his mark on the group that will one day choose his successor after his death or resignation.

The ceremony to install them, known as a consistory, will be held September 30, the 86-yearold Francis announced during his noon prayer to pilgrims and tourists in St. Peter's Square.

It will be the ninth consistory called by the pope since his election 10 years ago as the first pontiff from Latin America.

The new cardinals come from countries including the United States, Italy, Argentina, Switzerland, South Africa, Spain, Colombia. South Sudan. Hong Kong, Poland, Malaysia, Tanzania, and Portugal.



Eighteen of the 21 are under 80 and will be able to enter an eventual secret conclave to choose the next pope. They are known as cardinal electors.

After the September consistory, there will be 137 cardinal electors, about 73 percent of them chosen by Francis. This increases the possibility that the next pope will share his vision of a more progressive, inclusive Church.

Francis has also increased the possibility that the next pope will come from Asia or Africa, having consistently named cardinal electors from those continents and giving less importance than his predecessor to countries in Europe.

Whether the pope will name even more cardinals depends on how long he lives

Yellen sees 'progress' in rocky US-China ties

Beijing, July 9: US Treasury Secretary Janet Yellen said 10 hours of meetings with senior Chinese officials in recent days were "direct" and "productive" helping stabilise the superpowers' often rocky relationship as her four-day Beijing trip ended. Before departing China

Sunday. Yellen said the United States and China remained at odds on a number of issues but expressed confidence that her visit had advanced efforts to put the relationship on "surer footing"

"The US and China have significant disagreements," Yellen told a press conference at the US embassy in Beijing, citing Washington's concerns about what she called "unfair economic practices" and recent punitive actions against US firms.

"But President (Joe) Biden and I do not see the relationship between the US and China through the frame of great power conflict. We believe that the world is big enough for both of our countries to thrive.' With US-China relations at a

low over national security issues, including Taiwan, US export bans on advanced technologies and China's stateled industrial policies, Washington has been trying to repair ties between the world's two biggest economies.

Secretary of State Antony Blinken visited Beijing last month, the first trip by the top US diplomat in Biden's presidency. Climate envoy John Kerry is expected to visit this month The US diplomatic push

comes ahead of a possible meeting between Biden and President Xi Jinping at September's Group of 20 summit in New Delhi or a Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation gathering scheduled for November in San Francisco.

Quoting sources, Geo News reported that Khan asked the IMF to ensure that the general elections, scheduled to take place in October, will be held on time.

"What guarantee can you (IMF) give that the elections in the country will be held on time," the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) chief was quoted as saying in the huddle.

The IMF representatives, as per insiders, responded by saving that the Washingtonbased lender keeps a close eye on the situation in the country but "we cannot interfere too much in internal political matters".

Rotterdam. Following Moscow's invasion of Ukraine in February last year, Russian oil was sanctioned and shunned by European buyers and some in Asia, such as

FPIs continue to be bullish on equities; pump in ₹22,000cr

New Delhi, July 9: Foreign Portfolio Investors (FPIs) continue their liking for Indian equities with a net infusion of nearly ₹22,000 crore in the first week of this month due to resilience of the domestic economy amid an uncertain global macro backdrop.



If this trend continues, investment by FPIs in July will exceed the figures recorded in May and June, which were ₹43,838 crore and ₹47,148 crore, respectively, VK Vijayakumar, Chief Investment Strategist at Geojit Financial Services, said.

According to data from the depositories, FPIs have been continuously buying Indian equities since March and poured ₹21,944 crore this month (till July 7).

Before March, overseas investors pulled out ₹34,626 crore collectively in January and February

Also, robust net inflows from FPIs coupled with the strong advance of monsoon in various parts of the country, and buoyancy in global markets helped the Indian markets to scale at an all-time high last week.

Apart from equities, overseas investors put in ₹1,557 crore in the Indian debt market during the period under review. With the latest inflow, investment by FPIs into Indian equities has reached ₹98,350 crore and ₹18,230 crore in the debt markets so far this year.

In terms of sectors, FPIs have been steadily buying financial services, automobiles, capital goods, and construction. Recently, they have stepped up buying in FMCG and power. On the other hand, the selling trend in IT continues.

Mcap of 6 of top-10 most valued firms jump ₹1.19L-crore

The funding winter at Indian startups has already led to layoffs and delayed stock listings. It is set to worsen and will likely lead to industry consolidation

Indian startups fell by 36 per cent in January-June to \$3.8 billion, the lowest half-yearly number in the last four years, as investors are taking longer time in due diligence of every aspect of business, according to a PwC India Report.

Early-stage deals accounted for 57 per cent of the total funding in the first half of 2023 (H1 2023) in volume terms, said the

report titled, "Startup Perspectives - H1 2023" In value terms, early-stage deals contributed to approximately 16 per cent of the total funding in H1 2023 but was at its

lowest in H1 2023 as compared to the previous two years. 'The Indian startup ecosystem reported the lowest six-

month funding in the last four years in H1 2023 at \$3.8 billion across 298 deals - a decline of nearly 36 per cent as compared to H2 2022 (\$5.9 billion). Fintech, SAAS and D2C continued to be the most funded sectors in H1 2023," it said.

New Delhi, July 9: The GST Council is likely to decide on a new rule in GST law under which businesses would be required to explain the reasons for excess input tax credit (ITC) claimed or deposit the amount with the exchequer, sources said. They said the Law Committee,

comprising tax officers from Centre and states, has opined that where the ITC availed in GSTR-3B return exceeds the amount of ITC available in accordance with the auto-generated statement GSTR-2B by a specified threshold, the registered person may be intimated on the portal about such difference and be directed to either explain the difference or pay the ex-

cess ITC along with interest. The Committee has suggested that the provision should kick in if the difference is more than 20 per cent and over ₹25 lakh. GST Council is likely to take a final call on the recommen-

dation of the Committee in its 50th meeting July 11.

GROWING USAGE OF OVER-THE-TOP APPLICATIONS FOR MESSAGING, VOICE COMMUNICATION, HAS LED TO A TRANSITION FROM VOICE AND SMS TOWARDS DATA AS A **PRIMARY SOURCE OF REVENUE FOR TELECOM** SERVICE PROVIDERS GLOBALLY

New Delhi, July 9: Telecom operators' revenue share from voice calls has declined by about 80 per cent and by 94 per cent from SMS in the last 10 years as the usage of internet-based calling and messaging apps grew,

according to a Trai paper. Telecom regulator Trai in its latest paper to regulate internet messaging and callings app like WhatsApp, Google Meet, Facetime etc said that with grow-

ing usage of over-the-top (OTT) applications for messaging, voice communication, has led to a transition from voice and SMS towards data as a primary source of revenue for telecom service providers globally.

'In India, composition of the revenue basket of wireless access service providers has undergone a sea-change in the period from the year 2013 to 2022," the **Telecom Regulatory Authority** of India (Trai) said in its consultation paper on "Regulatory

Mechanism for Over-The-Top (OTT) Communication Services, and Selective Banning of OTT Services"

All the major components of average revenue per user (ARPU) -- which is a key matrix to measure telecom operators' growth, except data revenue share, have declined between June 2013 quarter and December 2022 quarter. According to the paper, while

share of revenue from data has grown over 10-fold to 85.1 per Meanwhile, revenue share per user from data usage grew over 10 times between June 2013 guarter to December 2022 quarter

cent in December 2022 quarter from 8.1 in June 2013 quarter per subscriber, the ARPU grew only about 41 per cent to ₹146.96

from ₹123.77 during the same period.

The data in the paper shows that the share of revenue calls declined to ₹14.79 or 10.1 per cent in ARPU of ₹146.96 from ₹72.53 or 58.6 per cent between December 2022 quarter and June 2013 quarter.

Similarly, revenue share from SMS declined to 23 paise or 20 per cent of ARPU from ₹3.99 or 3.22 per cent.

Trai in the paper is exploring if OTT players can be brought under licensing framework which will result in them coughing up entry fees, pay revenue share, facilitate lawful interception, provide call data record, spend on regulatory compliance etc for providing service

The regulator in its past recommendations has allowed OTTs to operate in the country without obtaining any licence.

However, a Parliamentary panel on Communications and IT recommended evaluating a selective ban on services of internet calling and messaging apps to mitigate the impact of a complete internet shutdown in a disturbed area.

Trai in its examination of various recommendations, orders and studies said that shutdown of telecommunications or the internet can have significant ramifications for a country's economy and it also disrupts critical services such as education and healthcare.

"For these reasons, selective 🗦 banning of specific OTT applications and websites etc., which are likely to be used by the terrorists or anti-national elements to ferment trouble in the specified regions, appears to be prefer-able as compared to complete internet shutdown," Trai said.















Biggest Tour win for Canada's Woods

Puy De Dome: Canadian Michael Woods delivered an impressive solo effort to claim the biggest success of his career at the top of a legendary Tour de France climb Sunday. Woods, who rxides for the Israel-Premier Tech team, has no ambition in the general classification and was part of an early breakaway that the main contenders allowed to form early in the ninth stage. Woods managed to catch American Matteo Jorgenson iust 500 metres from the summit after his 24-year-old rival jumped away from the leading group with less than 50 kilometres left. Woods then dropped Jorgenson at ease and reached the summit of the Puv de Dome, a famed volcanic crater in the Massif Central region of south-central France that last hosted a stage 35 years ago. Frenchman Pierre Latour finished second with Matej Mohoric completing the stage podium.

MB recruit Ali

Kolkata: Mohun Bagan Super Giant boosted their backline Sunday, roping in young national defender Anwar Ali, fresh from his exploits in India's SAFF Championship triumph. "The Warrior Arrives! Anwar Ali is a Mariner!" the defending ISL champions announced on Twitter without disclosing the particulars of the contract. "Every player has a dream to play in Kolkata. Since childhood I always wanted to play here," Anwar said in a club statement. "Mohun Bagan is the oldest club of India, and so I'm really excited to don the greenand-maroon jersey.

Chhetri backs Stimac

New Delhi: Captain of the Indian football team, Sunil Chhetri backed head coach Igor Stimac's demand for a four-week camp before the Asian Cup early next year. He said that the team need to have enough preparation time to face the best sides in the continent. The 38-yearold Chhetri also pitched for at least one international friendly against a top-seven ranked country in Asia such as Iran, Japan or Saudi Arabia. "We are going to face Australia, Uzbekistan and Syria in the Asian Cup (group matches). That is why we need a long camp," Chhetri said.
