

Row over sacrifice

Alleging human sacrifice, angry villagers torch police vehicle, block road after recovery of minor's mutilated body

The mutilated body of Sanjeev Biswal, 13, who was missing since July 23, was found hanging from a tree in Bareni forest under Athmallik block Friday morning.

Sources said the Class VII boy of Subarnapur village under Kiakata police limits of Athmallik block was suffering from certain health issues for the past few days.

Sanjeev's mother, Basanti, had taken him to Mangala temple at Tusar village, a few kilometres away, to perform certain rituals for the boy's wellbeing July 22.

The mother-son duo slept on the temple premises after performing the rituals in the evening. However, Basanti could not find her son the next morning, sources said.

With no way out, Basanti ap-



proached the Kiakata police who registered a case (68/23) and launched a search operation to trace Sanjeev.

Alleging laxity, a few villagers had gheraoed the police station Thursday evening.

A few of them, who had been to Bareni forest Friday morning, were the first to spot Sanieev's mutilated body hanging from a tree and alert his family members.

Soon, villagers staged a blockade near Bareni Square on Athmallik-Kiakata road demanding ₹20 lakh compensation to the bereaved family and arrest

of the accused female 'tantric'. Meanwhile, hundreds of vehicles remained stranded on either side of the road for hours.

"It's a clear case of human sacrifice for tantric rituals (black magic) as Sanjeev's body bore multiple injuries. The body was hanged after the rituals just to paint it as a case of suicide," an agitator said

Kiakata police reached spot to placate the mob. However, the agitators torched the police van.

Soon after, Angul ASP Surendra Rayguru, Athmallik SDPO Balakrushna Kuanr, Athmallik Sub-Collector Tarani Suna and Athmallik Tehsildar Jasbant Dehury reached the spot and managed to pacify the protesters after an hourlong effort.

Later, the body was sent for post-mortem.

SRIMANDIR DONATION BOX LOOTED

Puri, July 28: Cash from a donation box located at the southern gate of the Sri Jagannath Temple, Puri was allegedly looted late Thursday night.

According to sources, the miscreants allegedly broke open the donation box and decamped with the cash.

The matter came to light after some servitors found the empty donation box inside the temple and informed the Jagannath Temple Police (JTP) personnel, Friday morning. The JTP has handed over the donation box to the Shree Jagannath Temple Administration (SJTA).

SJTA chief administrator Ranjan Das said an FIR will be lodged with the police in this regard.

Earlier, several loot incidents had been reported from the world famous temple.

Meanwhile, the locals have raised questions over the security arrangements at the 12th-century shrine.

Meanwhile, the ongoing stalemate over the Banakalagi ritual of Lord Jagannath and His siblings continued as it could not be resolved at the Srimandir Niti Sub-Committee meeting held Friday.

INDIA MPs in Manipur today

Opposition bloc to assess ground situation first-hand and make recommendations to government and Parliament on violence-hit state

New Delhi, July 28: A delegation of 21 INDIA bloc MPs will pay a two-day visit to Manipur beginning Saturday to assess the ground situation first-hand and then make recommendations to the government and Parliament for a solution to the problems in the violence-hit state.

Ahead of the visit, Congress' deputy leader in Lok Sabha Gaurav Gogoi called for an inquiry under a retired Supreme Court judge into the violence in Manipur.

Addressing a press conference here, Congress MP and whip in Rajya Sabha Naseer Hussain said the MPs from 16 parties would visit the affected areas and people both in the valley and the hills. They would also visit two relief camps in both the places and assess the situation themselves.

Sources said the Opposition bloc had written to Manipur Chief Minister N Biren Singh, who allowed the delegation to visit the state.

The delegation would be meeting Manipur Governor Anusuiya Uikey Sunday morning, Hussain said.

The Congress leader said the MPs have sought to use helicopters there and if allowed, they will be able to visit the farflung areas of Churachandpur, where fresh violence has taken place.

"Prime Minister Narendra Modi and the NDA have neither the will nor the ability to resolve the Manipur violence," he said, adding that ever since the Monsoon session of Parliament started, the Opposition has been continuously de-



manding a discussion on Manipur. "PM Modi should come to Parliament and give a statement and prepare a roadmap for peace in Manipur," he as-

The delegation will include Adhir Ranjan Chowdhury and Gaurav Gogoi of the Congress, TMC's Sushmita Dev, JMM's Mahua Maji, DMK's Kanimozhi, NCP's Mohammad Faizal, Jayant Chaudhary of RLD, Manoj Kumar Jha of RJD, NK Premachandran of RSP and T Thirumavalavan of the VCK.

JD(U) chief Rajiv Ranjan (Lalan) Singh, Aneel Prasad Hegde (JD-U), CPI's Sandosh Kumar, CPI(M)'s AA Rahim, Samajwadi Party's Javed Ali Khan, IUML's ET Mohammed Basheer, AAP's Sushil Gupta, Arvind Sawant (Shiv Sena-Uddhav Thackeray), D Ravikumar (DMK), Phulo Devi Netam and K Suresh (Congress) will also be part of the 20-member delegation which will leave Saturday morning and return Sunday afternoon.

INTERNATIONAL TIGER DAY

Rising numbers, shrinking habitats

New Delhi, July 28: With the number of tigers going up and their habitat shrinking, often bringing humans just too close to the big cats, the International Tiger Day, Saturday, calls for both celebration and concern.

In India, with 3,167 tigers according to the 2022 tiger census, about 75 per cent of the global numbers, the once elusive bright orange fur and distinct low rumbling roar is not so rare anymore. Scripting a remarkable story of conservation, Project Tiger started 50 years ago when the count was just 268. However, it has come with in-

creasing human interference in wildlife corridors, thinning prey density, a worsening quality of forest cover and change in policies, all of which can offset the gains.

'This achievement of conserving tigers, despite our population density and other pressures hasn't come easy and it's been a gradual process since the onset of Project Tiger. We can be justifiably proud that the tiger continues to thrive in India, even as it is unfortunately extinct in some range

tries. This success can be attributed to our people's tolerance, political will and a strong legal and policy framework, one of the strongest in the world,' wildlife conservationist Prerna Bindra told PTI. Over the last few years, however, the legal framework is being "diluted," she alleged, citing the recent proposed amendments to Forest Conservation Act, 1980, or "passing of detrimental development projects in protected areas, mining in tiger habitats, and projects like the Ken Betwa river link in Panna tiger reserve."

'You can't say you are committed to conserving the tiger while allowing Panna to be drowned in a river linking project and there are a number of similar examples such as mines and linear infrastructure in the central Indian tiger landscape," Bindra said.





Bhubaneswar, July 28: In a bid to break a discriminatory superstition, State Transport Authority (STA) Friday asked all the Regional Transport Officers (RTOs) to take action against bus owners who deny women as the first passenger in their vehicles.

Activist Ghasiram Panda had filed a petition before the State Commission for Women (SCW) alleging that women are not allowed to enter buses as first passengers. Panda alleged that a woman faced discrimination when she was prevented from boarding a bus as the first passenger at the Baramunda bus station here.

Acting on the petition, the SCW directed the Transport Commissioner to ensure that women are

The secretary said permits are issued by STA or RTA to stage carriages on different routes to carry passengers on payment of (bus) fare as notified by the offices. So, the owner or conductor of a stage carriage cannot deny any women as first passengers to enter buses, he said.

"Any deviation shall amount to violation of permit conditions and is punishable under Section 192A of MV Act, 1988," the secretary warned.

The RTOs have been asked to check stage carriages regularly and whenever they detect that the owner or conductor is not allowing women as first passengers in a bus, to draw an e-challan against the owner of said vehicle under

Puri ashram inmate bludgeoned to death

Puri, July 28: An inmate of Guru Krupa Ashram in Loknath Road area under Baseli Sahi police limits here was bludgeoned to death by his fellow inmate, Friday.

The deceased was identified as Narugopal Mishra, 58, and the accused Rabindra Jena, 40.

According to sources, Rabindra, who

came to ashram around 12:30pm, went to Narugopal's room and repeatedly hit him with a wooden stump.

As other inmates raised alarm, he also attacked Dayanidhi Das, another inmate, who has been admitted to the district headquarters hospital in a critical condition. Ashram's in-charge Krushna Chandra informed the police.

Rabindra was present at the ashram after committing the crime. Police reached the spot and arrested him. Puri additional superintendent of police told the media that at least three 'sadhus' were staying in one room of the ashram including the deceased and

the killer. "What triggered the murder is yet to be ascertained. A case (165/23) of murder has been registered in Baselisahi police station. Investigation is on while the body has been sent for post-mortem," the official said.





PRODUCER BOOKED FOR **SEXUAL HARASSMENT**

Police launch probe, accused goes incommunicado

Bhubaneswar, July 28: The city police have launched a hunt for film producer Dayanidhi Dahima who has been accused by a popular Odia film actress of mental and sexual harassment.

Police said the accused has gone underground and incommunicado after news about the case came to the fore.

"We are investigating the case from all angles. We will soon issue a notice to the accused to appear before the investigating officer (IO). We tried to contact the accused over phone, but it was switched off," said P Shyam Sundar Rao, IIC, Laxmisagar police station where a case has been registered against Dayanidhi under various IPC sections and Information Technology (IT) Act on a direction of the Judicial Magistrate First Class (JMFC) Court here.

The actress had earlier approached the Bhubaneswar JMFC court seeking intervention in the case.

NHRC seeks reports

on schoolgirl death

Bhubaneswar, July 28: The National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) has sought reports from the Gajapati superintendent of police (SP) and district magistrate (DM) in connection with the death of a minor Dalit girl of a state-run ashram school in the district in May

While hearing a plea filed by rights activist Radhakanta Tripathy, the NHRC has asked the Gajapati SP to submit current status report of probe into the Class VIII girl's death. The DM was also told to submit a report on the payment of compensation to the next of kin of the victim.

The NHRC further ordered that the requisite report be submitted within four weeks, failing which it would be constrained to issue coercive process under Section 13 of the PHR

In his petition, Tripathy alleged that the victim was found to be four-month pregnant. The school authorities, he said, did not inform the parents about her pregnancy earlier.

The rights activist urged the commission to intervene in the issue so as to ensure legal action against the wrongdoers, comilv and regular medical checkup of the students in state-run

According to the petitioner, the Dalit girl, a Class VIII student of an ashram school in Gajapati district run by the ST/SC Development department, died allegedly owing to medical negligence while undergoing treatment at the district headquarters hospital (DHH) May 6 this year.

The commission had earlier directed the Gajapati DM and the SP to submit action taken report (ATR) in the case. The Odisha Human Rights

Commission Secretary was also called upon to inform the NHRC about the date of cognizance taken, if any, at their end in the matter. The commission was informed

May 23 that as per the postmortem report no foetus was found in the uterus and the victim minor girl was not found to be pregnant. The viscera of the girl were sent to SFSL in Rasulgarh and investigation of the case is still on.

Another life lost in man-croc conflict ,

Kendrapara, July 28: In yet another case of man-crocodile conflict, one more life was lost in Kendrapara district.

According to locals, Baba Amulya Das, a sexagenarian of Kulasahi village, Thursday night went to the embankment of Brahmani river nearby to answer nature's call when a ferocious saltwater crocodile dragged him into the river. The forest and fire brigade

personnel on being informed about the incident launched a search and rescue operation but failed to trace the body of

On Friday, the forest personnel with the help of fire tender personnel carried out a search and rescue operation.

However, after 17 hours the locals came across the mutilated head of the Amulya floating on the river water.

The mutilated body was retrieved in the presence of local magistrate and local IIC.

Pattamundai police later seized the body and sent it for autopsy. The forest personnel confirmed the death of Amulya in a crocodile attack.



The man-reptile conflict has been going on in regular intervals mostly at Pattamundai, Kendrapara, Rajnagar, Aul, Rajkanika and Mahakalapara blocks of the coastal district.

As many as four persons, including a minor boy and a woman, have lost their lives in crocodile attacks in the last one and a half months.

Locals alleged the forest personnel have ignored their demands to erect iron fencing at the bathing ghats mostly in the crocodile infested rivers of the district to save the life and property of the river side villagers.

When contacted, DFO Rajnagar mangrove (forest) and wildlife division Gopinath Sudarshan Yadav said the Forest department has appealed to the **Crocodile rescued** from village pond 6.5 feet-long male estuarine

Acrocodile was rescued by

forest personnel from the pond of one Vanu Giri of Vekta village under Rajnagar police station limits in this district. The rescued crocodile was later released at Syamsuddin nullah within the Bhitarkanika National Park. The villagers Friday spotted the saltwater crocodile near the pond and informed the forest personnel of Kanika forest range. The forest personnel later rushed to the spot and rescued the reptile

midst murmurs of impending changes in the Central government, there are rumours about Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman being dropped from the Cabinet, though it seems unlikely given that the next budget is only a vote on account, in practical terms. Such ridiculous talk likely stems from the exit of Vivek Singh as Officer on Special Duty (OSD) to the finance minister.

Singh's unexpected curtailment of tenure left many puzzled. An ABVP stalwart, wondering about the reasons behind it, particularly as it happened at midnight, is suggesting it as a sudden decision. Singh, a private person, has been at the helm of affairs and his premature departure makes it all the more surprising. But then, that's to be expected given the nature of this regime where transparency often remains

What adds to the intrigue is that Singh was appointed as OSD to Sitharaman in January 2022 for a four-year tenure. Haryana steps up drive against corrupt babus

With about a year to go for the 2024 Assembly elections, Haryana Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar is seizing the opportunity to convey a strong message against corruption by holding senior officials in the state administration accountable. According to information, as many as 41 senior officers in the state are under investigation by the Anti-Corruption Bureau for their alleged involvement in corrupt practices.

The transformational shift in the fight against corruption began when Khattar renamed the State Vigilance Bureau as the Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) earlier this year, headed by a senior IPS officer Shatrujeet Kapur. The move was a reaction to Opposition accusations that the

government was soft on corrupt officers. Kapur has reportedly led a sweeping investigation that ensnared several government employees, including 12 IAS officers, two IPS officers, three IFS officers, 20 HCS officers and four HPS officers.

According to the ACB chief, several officials were arrested by his team for accepting bribes, and the bureau is pursuing cases seeking permission to prosecute them under the Prevention of Corruption Act. Sources have informed DKB that at least two senior IAS officers who are facing corruption charges have approached the state government challenging the ACB's action. Can Khattar succeed in his aim, and will it be enough to tip the electoral balance in the BJP's favour, is something we will have to wait and see.

The not-so-civil origin of the Indian babu

It is one of those fascinating historical 'double-engine' ironies that the East India Company, a relentless imperial juggernaut, invented the term 'civil servant'. The irony lies in the context of the term's origin. The East India Company relentlessly pursued the extension of British influence in India across two-and-a-half centuries. But it needed Indian compradors to maintain control over its dominions. The civil servant was imported from China, the only thing they brought to India, besides tea, in exchange for opium.

The concept of civil servants embodied a notion of impartiality and public service, even though the reality was often tainted by the company's colonial objectives. Over time, the term 'civil servant' evolved into a government official who works for the public good and administers state affairs, and in the Indian context, the humble babu! Back in the heyday of the Mughal era, 'babu' was the ticket to respect, the ultimate honorific for an Indian. The British picked up 'babu' along the way and decided it was the perfect way to address their trusty Indian

Today the 'babu' has quite the reputation, with a mixed bag of accolades and brickbats. It has weathered the ages, transforming from respect to ridicule, from honour to humour, and back. Babus are on a mission to rewrite the narrative. Along with administrative reforms, they are striving to redefine the term, emphasizing professionalism, accountability and public service. While the origins of 'civil servant' may be tied to a rapacious private enterprise, the transformation of its meaning reflects our complex history and the evolution of administrative systems.

Astrobolism

t refers to the blasting of plants by the sun during high summer. Etymologically, it's the result of being struck by a star, as it comes from the Greek astron (as in astronomy and many other words), plus bolis, a missile (which is also the source of bolide). The star is Sirius, the dog star; because it rises and sets with the sun during summer in the northern hemisphere, it has lent its name to dog days for the hottest part of the year in places north of the equator. The dog days are those from about the middle of July to the middle of August (though the exact dates vary depending on where you live). The thought behind astrobolism is connected to the old idea that this period of summer is under a malign influence, in which dogs run mad, the air is unwholesome, sunstroke is common, and all useful works stagnate for want of effort. It was first recorded in Nathaniel Bailey's Dictionary, dated 1721, Apart from very occasional appearances in other reference works, it has had almost no circulation at all.

Zoochosis

You're likely to find this word used by animal rights activists in reference to what they see as the degrading effect of zoos on the animals they contain. Many animals, especially the large carnivores, become deeply depressed, even psychotic, as the result of captivity. Symptoms of zoochosis include nervous pacing, head rocking, and self-mutilation. The problem is perhaps most acute with polar bears, which have proved especially difficult to keep sane, and which often show disturbed behaviour such as swimming for hours in small circles. (The Central Park Zoo in New York had to call in an animal psychologist to find ways to give its polar bear, Gus, a more varied and challenging environment.) The word, a blend of zoo and psychosis, seems to date from the early 1990s, but is still fairly specialist and hasn't — so far as I know yet made it to any dictionary.

THE TAMIL QUESTION

THAT EXCLUDES THE **LONG-PENDING TAMIL QUESTION WILL BE CONSIDERED INCOMPLETE AND BOTH NATIONS SHOULD TAKE** THIS PERSISTING **DILEMMA ON**

The Sri Lankan President Ranil Wickremesinghe was on a two-day official visit last week, his first since he became the President in July last year. The visit took place in the wake of celebration of 75th anniversary of diplomatic ties between the two countries with the crux being to strengthen relations in multiple sectors. For Sri Lanka, it was reaching out to friends and allies in the quest of economic recovery after the financial collapse last year. For India, Sri Lanka is an important partner in her 'Neighbourhood First' policy and a push for the Vision SAGAR (Security and Growth for All in the Region). However, the elephant in the room is the question of the Sri Lankan Tamils - their rehabilitation and autonomy etc.

Let us note that Sri Lanka's strategic location in the Indian Ocean has attracted attention from other countries, of late, from India's regional rival China. Beijing had somehow gained an upper hand against New Delhi in Sri Lanka by extending free-flowing loans and infrastructure investment. But the dramatic economic collapse last year, gave New Delhi chance to claw its way back into the Island country especially as China delayed its support for debt restructuring.

India had extended emergency financial support to the tune of \$4 billion mainly in terms of fuel and essential items. India is also a part of an official creditor's committee along with Japan and other Paris Club members. This committee is currently negotiating debt relief solutions for Sri Lanka.

Perhaps the most important outcome of the visit was the adoption of the Vision Document with the intent of boosting economic partnership. The Document is based on five pillars comprising connectivity in five sectors: maritime, air,

energy, people-to-people

Maritime connectivity aims at consolidating local logistics and shipping with the joint development of ports at Colombo, Trincomalee Kankesanthurai. The Document also refers to resumption of passenger ferry services between Nagapattinam in India and Kankesanthurai in Sri Lanka and between Rameswaram (India) and Talaimannar (Sri Lanka). The air connectivity talks of expansion of flights between Chennai and Colombo in addition to exploring connectivity between Chennai and Trincomalee, Batticaloa and other possible destinations in Sri Lanka.

The energy and power connectivity led to: signing of a MoU on renewable energy for Sri Lanka covering 75 per cent of power from renewables by 2030; establishment of a high-capacity integrated power grid to enable electricity trading within BBIN initiative. The BBIN Bangladesh, Bhutan, India and Nepal – is a sub-regional structure created as South Asian Growth Quadrangle for unhindered movements of people and cargo. This sector also included acceleration of Sampur Solar Power Project and LNG Infrastructure to explore green hydrogen; ongoing cooperation in Trincomalee Tank Farms for the development of industry, energy and economic activity; joint construction of a petroleum pipeline from India; and collaborating hydrocarbon exploration in offshore basins. The proposed distribution pipeline by Indian Oil Corporation would connect Nagapattinam in India to Colombo, the strategic city of Trincomalee on Sri Lanka's East Coast where India is helping restore World War-II era oil tanks. People-to-people connectiv-

ity will encompass the promotion of awareness and popularisation of India's Buddhist circuit, and Ramayana trail as well as ancient places of Buddhist, Hindu and other religious worship in Sri Lanka towards enhancing tourism.

The fifth pillar is an agreement on acceptance of UPI payment system in Sri Lanka, signed by Prime Minister Wickremesinghe.

The pending political solution to Sri Lanka's Tamils figured in the high-level meetings. Modi raised the issue with the Sri Lankan President. In response, Wickremesinghe presented a proposal for reconciliation and power sharing. He added that he had urged the Sri Lankan Parliament to reach a consensus and resolve the longrunning conflict.

Wickremesinghe had recently met the Tamil political leadership and offered to implement the 13th Amendment, which followed the Indo-Sri Lanka Accord of 1987. This amendment provides for transfer of powers to North and Eastern provinces of Sri Lanka without the police powers. The Tamil National Alliance (TNA) seemed to have rejected the proposal. Sri Lanka Podujana Peramuna (SLPP) which is providing support to Wickremesinghe has suggested that the President does not have the electoral mandate to implement the 13th Amendment.

At any rate, the fact that Tamil question was not mentioned in the joint statement gives two loud messages. One, Sri Lanka would not like to encourage other countries including India to mix-up ethnic issues with trade and commerce. Second, India is perhaps making course correction after New Delhi's alleged support to Madhesis. New Delhi may not like to bring in a particular segment of population in its bilateral negotiations on trade, security and economy etc. Be that as it may any vi sion document that excludes the long-pending Tamil question will be considered incomplete. Both Sri Lanka and India should take this persisting dilemma on board.

But one thing is not in dispute: Much of the rice now used in jollof is grown not by West African farmers, but in India, Thailand, and Vietnam.

Rice has been cultivated in Africa for more than 3,000 years, and it is now grown by more than 35 million farmers in 40 countries across the region. After maize, it is Africa's most important food staple. Yet Asian rice accounts for over 40% of consumption in the region, making Africa the world's largest import market for the grain. Though the Senegal River Valley was one of the world's earliest rice centers, Senegal's farmers now struggle to compete in the country's urban centers against imports from India.

This development is symptomatic of a wider loss of food self-reliance in Africa, owing to population growth, urbanization, and an expanding middleclass' increased demand for food. While smallholder farming and rural livelihoods still account for over half of employment on

f you are looking for an ar- the continent, African farmers have been pushed out of local markets, and the region's over- mate-resilient, and pest-resistall food import bill has risen from \$7.9 billion in 1993-95 to \$43.6 billion in 2018-20.

No region faces a more severe food-security crisis. One in five Africans – some 260 million people, most of them in rural areas - are going hungry. Progress toward the United Nations' goal of achieving "zero hunger" by 2030 stalled in 2014 and, following the supply-chain disruptions triggered by Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine, has gone into reverse. Climate change is only com-

pounding the problem. We are already witnessing more protracted and intense droughts, less predictable rainfall, floods, and the climate-related spread of pests, like the plague of desert locusts that devastated crops in eastern Africa in 2019. Dependence on rain-fed farming systems is a risk multiplier for Africa. Modeling reported by the International Panel on Climate Change points to potential yield losses in the range of 10-30% for food staples like maize, sorghum, and millet.

Many of the policies and technologies needed to close Africa's yield gap and address climate threats are well-known. CGIAR, the world's largest global agricultural research organization, has developed high-yield, cliant seeds tailored for agro-eco- abysmal delivery record. logical conditions across Africa. More than two million smallholder farmers are already growing drought-resistant maize varieties, raising their yields by The African Rice Center has

produced more than 80 new rice varieties. These include early-maturing seeds which provide a source of food with higher protein content than standard varieties in the pre-harvest hunger period. Yields are comparable to those in Asia. Evaluations find that farmers – many of them women - adopting these seeds are, in some cases, doubling their income. In Senegal, novel rice varieties are slowly clawing back market share from imported rice, creating new value-chains and rural jobs – and displacing

imports used in jollof. But new seed technologies can realize their full potential only if they are part of an integrated response. Farmers also need access to affordable capital, fertilizer, and productive infrastructure like irrigation, energy, and extension services. As matters stand, Africa's farmers – notably women – are poorly served in all these areas. And while the African Union's Comprehensive

Africa Agriculture Development Program, initiated in 2003, provides a plan of action, it has an

Connecting the dots bet food self-reliance and social protection can create win-win scenarios. As the School Meals Coalition points out, millions of African schoolchildren are unable to learn because of hunger. Providing them with nutritious food from local producers would simultaneously combat malnutrition, improve learning, and create predictable markets for farmers, attracting the investment needed to raise productivity. The Kenyan government has already set a benchmark, pledging to provide universal school meals

At a food summit in Dakar. Senegal, earlier this year, African leaders pledged to build more self-sufficient, resilient, and equitable food systems, and to restore "food sovereignty." While Africa's farmers have heard such pledges before, let's hope that this time they will be implemented.

Heavy rains batter parts of Rajasthan

Jaipur, July 28: Heavy rains battered several places in the past 24 hours, causing waterlogging and traffic snarls in several cities such as Jaipur, Jodhpur and Udaipur Friday.

According to Meteorological Department, Jodhpur, Udaipur, Jaipur, and Ajmer districts witnessed heavy rains Thursday night, leading to knee-deep water on the key road stretches in many cities and towns. Light to moderate rains with thundershowers occurred at many places in the state in the past 24 hours, the MeT said.

On Friday, the monsoon is expected to remain active in Ajmer, Jaipur, Bharatpur, and Kota divisions of eastern Rajasthan with the possibility of heavy rains at some places, a spokesperson of the Jaipur Meteorological Centre said.

In the Jodhpur and Bikaner divisions, some parts could witness light rain while moderate to heavy rains have been forecast for one or two places, the spokesperson said. On Friday, Amta in Baran recorded the

maximum rainfall at 32.5 mm, while Kota recorded 32.4 mm, Alwar 24.4 mm and Aimer 24.3 mm, weather data till 5.30 pm showed. In the past 24 hours ending at 8.30 am, Mount Abu in Sirohi was the wettest with 14 cm rainfall, followed by 12 cm at Railmagra in Rajsamand, 11 cm at Phalodi in Jodhpur, 10 cm at Kotputli in Jaipur, and 9 cm each at Behrod in Alwar and Raisinghnagar in Sriganganagar 9 cm. Manali highway tunnels turn out to be saviour

Shimla, July 28: Five all-weather tunnels on the Manali four-lane national highway from Hanogi to Jhalogi, which lay between Mandi and Kullu towns in Himachal Pradesh, turned out to be saviour for the motorists, largely locals, as torrential rain that triggered flash floods in the Beas River has washed away a major portion of the old highway in this segment. Currently, the traffic on the

highway between Pandoh and Aut, part of the Kiratpur-Manali four-lane highway project, is passing through the tunnels that were opened for the traffic May 20. They are yet to be formally inaugurated.

Every year after heavy rainfall, the flooded Beas flows over the highway that has steep hills on one side and deep valleys of the river on the other.

Officials told IANS a large stretch of the old 22-km-long highway between Pandoh and Aut has been washed away. So the traffic is passing through the newly con-



Local vegetable grower Jeevan Negi said flash floods on July 8-9 have extensively damaged the highway from Jhalogi to Hanogi. 'We are thankful to the Central government for completing these crucial tunnels well ahead of the onset of monsoon. 



Oppn preps for fight on Delhi services bill

New Delhi, July 28: From issuing whips to arranging ambulances for their ailing leaders, opposition parties from the newly-formed INDIA bloc are making all-out efforts to ensure that they get 100 per cent attendance of their MPs in the Rajya Sabha to give the BJP a tough fight on the Delhi services bill next week.

Sources said former Prime Minister Manmohan Singh (90), who is ill, is likely to come to the House in a wheelchair, while former Jharkhand chief minister Shibu Soren (79), who is also unwell and has largely withdrawn from public life, has already arrived in the national Capital in anticipation of the voting on the National Capital Territory of Delhi (Amendment) Bill, 2023.

Soren is likely to be brought to the House just before the voting. Another ailing MP, JD(U)'s Bashistha Narain Singh, 75, is likely to arrive in Parliament in an ambulance, sources said. The Bill seeks to replace an ordinance negating a Supreme Court order giving power of



transfer and posting to the Delhi government and has been listed for introduction in Parliament next week.

On Friday, TMC Rajya Sabha MP and leader of the party in the House, Derek O'Brien and Congress leader Jairam Ramesh spoke to Leader of the House Piyush Goyal, requesting him to ensure that the government inform members well in advance before bringing the Delhi services bill to replace the ordinance.

They pointed out that the Jammu and Kashmir Reorganisation Bill was brought in 2019 without giving the op-

position parties time to formulate their stand on it. They also informed him that there were many senior leaders who would come to the House only to vote.

Among various parties, the Congress and the Janata Dal (United) have already issued whips to their respective members to be present in the House. O'Brien and some other opposition leaders have already written to the Rajya Sabha chairman that the ordinance was a serious issue and requested him to let them know in advance about the Bill. They also urged him to ensure that it is not

brought in a supplementary list of business.

"If this Bill springs up in the List of Business, there will be no way to ensure that there is enough opportunity for thorough debate and scrutiny of this important legislation."Also, it will not allow all parties to ensure that ALL members (including those with serious medical conditions restricted to a stretcher or wheelchair and have to be transported by ambulance from hospital or residence) are present in Rajya Sabha on that day. An informal one-day notice will be appreciated so that we can bring these members to the chamber for voting," O'Brien said in his

The INDIA bloc, sources said, has decided that they want a discussion on the Delhi services bill and they plan to use all the time allotted for discussion."Win, lose or draw, we are going for a vote. Let parties stand up and show us whether they are with the Constitution or doing deals with the Bharativa Janata Party (BJP)," O'Brien said on being asked about the numbers in Rajya Sabha.

New Delhi, July 28: Rajya Sabha Chairman Jagdeep Dhankhar Friday abruptly adjourned the House for the day after a spat with TMC leader Derek O'Brien who was pressing for discussion on the Manipur sit-

Dhankhar was interrupted by the TMC MP who thumped the desk to make a point over nonadmission of notices given by opposition members under Rule 267 to discuss the Manipur situation, prompting him to adjourn proceedings.

As many as 47 MPs from parties, including the Congress, Left parties, TMC, SP, AAP, NCP and DMK, had given notices Friday under the rule that calls for suspension of the listed business and taking up the issue being raised. A visibly perturbed Dhankhar termed O'Brien's behaviour "theatrics" that would not be tolerated.

'We can't suffer this," he said and adjourned the proceedings for the day. The House had met for just 27 minutes during which birthday greetings were extended to two members, farewell accorded to retiring Vinay Dinur Tendulkar (BJP), official papers were laid on the table and business listed for the next week.

Dhankhar then read out names of the 47 MPs who had given notices under Rule 267. Similar notices had been given right since the start of Monsoon session on July 20. Many opposition MPs have been given 267 notices, none of which have been accepted. Fifty such notices were given on July 25.

Dhankhar said he has already



agreed to a short duration discussion on the issue and asked members to rise above partisan interests and agree to discuss the matter under that rule.

"We in this House are to exemplify our actions that are nationally acclaimed, that inspire and motivate people at large. Having this scenario everyday with the same situation does not evoke the kind of respect to which otherwise we should be entitled," he said.

Actions of members of the Upper House "have to be so exemplified that people at large are motivated to emulate them", he said. "I get input from all over. They indicate worrisome, alarming concern." According to the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the Council of States, Rule 267 relates to suspension of rules. A short duration discussion, on the other hand, is a brief discussion not exceeding two-and-a-half hours under Rule 176.

"Everyday, including the last session and the session before that, we had a number of notices under 267. If I go into the precedence of it, in this century, in the last 23 years, the House is fully aware how many such notices have been admitted," he said. He went on to list the importance of Question Hour, where MPs put questions to the government. "Question Hour is the heart of parliamentary working," Dhankhar said.

At this point, O'Brien said, "We are aware of this" and sought to press for the motion that opposition parties have been seeking to move since the start of the Monsoon Session of Parliament last week.

arrested, also allegedly inserted a hard object in her private parts on Thursday, police sources stated, but a senior official said this can be confirmed only after her medical examination report is received.

The profusely bleeding girl was admitted to a hospital at the divisional headquarters Rewa for advanced medical care, said the police, adding the accused were identified as Ravindra Kumar Ravi and Atul Bhadoliya.

"I am not denving that a stick or some other object was inserted into the 12-year-old's private parts by accused Ravindra Kumar Ravi and Atul Bhadoliya. But this is something that can only be confirmed only in a medical report. We are still awaiting her medical report. Yes she was bleeding and doctors are monitoring her health," Satna Superintendent of Police Ashutosh Gupta said. "Her body bore bites and injuries which pertain to sexual assault," he said.

Asked about the condition of the girl, the SP said a panel of doctors treating her said her condition was 'okay" at his point of time. "We are taking legal action against the accused,' Gupta said.

The accused, both aged 30, were on Friday produced in a local court which sent them in 14-day judicial custody,

New Delhi, July 28: The Supreme Court Friday granted bail to activists Vernon Gonsalves and Arun Ferreira in the Elgar Parishad-Maoist links case, noting that they have been in custody for five years.

A bench of Justices Aniruddha Bose and Sudhanshu Dhulia said Gonsalves and Ferreira shall not leave Maharashtra without the trial court's permission and surrender their passports. "Considering the fact that almost five years have elapsed, we are satisfied they have made out a case for bail. The allegations are serious, no doubt, but for that reason alone, bail cannot be denied to them," the bench

Imposing a number of condi-



tions, the apex court directed the two activists to use one mobile phone each and let the National Investigation Agency (NIA), which is probing the case, know their addresses. The apex court also directed that the mobile phones of the activists should be charged and active roundpassports the-clock. "They shall keep location status of their mobile phones active 24 hours a day and their phone shall be paired with NIA's IO to enable him to identify their exact location any time. They shall also report to the investigating officer once a week,'

the bench said.

It also granted liberty to the NIA to seek cancellation of their bail if there is any violation of the bail conditions. The activists had moved the top court against a Bombay High Court order rejecting their bail pleas.

The case pertains to the Elgar Parishad conclave held in Pune on December 31, 2017 which, according to the Pune police, was funded by Maoists. The inflammatory speeches made there led to violence at the Koregaon-Bhima war memorial in Pune the next day, police had alleged

The activists had challenged a December 1, 2021 order passed by a high court bench that granted default bail to lawyer Sudha Bharadwaj, a co-accused in the case, but the same relief to eight other accused.

S'pore hangs first woman in 19 yrs

Kuala Lumpur: Singapore conducted its first execution of a woman in 19 years Friday and its second hanging this week for drug trafficking despite calls for the city-state to cease capital punishment for drug-related crimes. Activists said another execution is planned next week. Saridewi Diamani. 45. was sentenced to death in 2018 for trafficking about 31 grams (1 ounce) of diamorphine, or pure heroin. the Central Narcotics Bureau said. It said the amount was "sufficient to feed the addiction of about 370 abusers for a week". Singapore's laws mandate the death penalty for anyone convicted of trafficking more than 500 grams (17.6 ounces) of cannabis and 15 grams (0.5 ounces) of heroin.

Philippine ferry was overloaded

Manila: The skipper of a Philippine ferry which flipped over in a lake in an accident that killed 27 passengers decided to sail despite knowing that his boat was filled beyond capacity, the coast guard chief said Friday. Forty-three passengers were rescued after the M/B Aya Express capsized in Laguna de Bay Thursday shortly after leaving Binangonan town southeast of Manila in what should have been a 30-minute cruise to nearby Talim Island, officials said. Coast guard, police and other government personnel continued to search the lake Friday but said they had no idea whether anyone was still missing because of uncertainties over the number of passengers on the ferry.

Environmental groups sue FAA

Cape Canaveral (US): Wildlife and environmental groups sued the Federal Aviation Administration Monday over SpaceX's launch last month of its giant rocket from Texas. SpaceX's Starship soared 24 miles (39 kilometers) high before exploding over the Gulf of Mexico April 20. The rocket's self-destruct system caused the nearly 400-foot (120-meter) rocket to blow up, as it spun out of control just minutes into the test flight.

Pak police avert major terror attack

Lahore: Police in Pakistan Friday arrested 10 terrorists who were plotting a major terror attack on foreigners, including on Chinese nationals, and planning to sabotage the Muharram commemorations in the Punjab province. The Counter Terrorism Department (CTD) of Punjab police made the arrests during intelligence-based operations in Lahore, Attock, Sargodha, Gujranwala, Multan and DG Khan districts of Punjab.

Tchiani spoke, state TV identified him as the leader of the group of soldiers who said they staged the coup, and his appearance seemed to be an effort to show he was in charge.

Later, state TV aired a statement from the mutinous soldiers, who call themselves the National Council for the Safeguarding of the Country. accusing some prominent dignitaries of collaborating with foreign embassies in an effort to "extract" the deposed leaders. The statement warned that would lead to violence and also warned against foreign military intervention. Some cars honked in solidarity at security forces as they drove by but it was not clear if that meant they backed the coup. Elsewhere, people rested after traditional midday prayers and others sold goods at their shops.

India's election as the Chair of the 62nd Session of the Commission for Social Development February 15 marks a "momentous occasion" as it was the first time since 1975 that India has held this position within the Commission for Social Development, it said.

Moscow blames Kyiv for a missile attack in southern Russia

Moscow, July 28: Russian forces Friday pounded a key village that Ukraine claimed to have recaptured in its grinding counteroffensive in the country's southeast, while Moscow accused Kyiv of firing a missile at a city in southern Russia that officials there said wounded 15 people.

President Volodymyr Zelenskyy, meanwhile, marked Ukraine's Statehood Day by reaffirming the country's sovereignty — a rebuke to Russian President Vladimir Putin, who used his claim that Ukraine didn't exist as a nation to justify his invasion.

The Russian Defence Ministry said it shot down a Ukrainian missile in the city of Taganrog, about 40 kilometers (about 24 miles) east of the border with Ukraine, and local officials reported 15 people were injured. Debris fell on the city, the ministry added, alleging the missile was part of a "terror attack" by Ukraine.

Rostov regional Gov. Vasily Golubev said on Telegram that another missile was intercepted by air defenses elsewhere in the region.

He didn't provide any details. Ukrainian Defense Minister Oleksiv Danilov blamed Russian air defense systems for the explosion in Taganrog.

Earlier in the day, a Ukrainian drone was shot down outside Moscow, the Defense Ministry said, in the third drone strike or attempt on the capital region this month.

The ministry said there were no injuries or damage in the latest incident, and it didn't give an exact location where the drone fell. Since the war began, Russia has blamed Ukraine for drone, bomb and missile attacks on its territory far from the battlefield's front line. Ukrainian officials rarely confirm being behind the attacks, which have included drone strikes on the Kremlin that unsettled Russians. Kyiv officials did not comment Friday's incident



Tokyo, July 28: The Japanese government stepped up its alarm over Chinese assertiveness, warning in a report issued Friday that the country faces its worst security threats since World War II as it plans to implement a new strategy that calls for a major military buildup.

China, Russia and North Korea contribute to "the most severe and complex security environment since the end of World War II," according to the 510-page report. It says China's external stance and military activities have become a "serious concern for Japan and the international community and present an unprecedented and the greatest strategic challenge.

On Thursday, Russian and Chinese delegates joined North

Russia and China have also stepped up strategic ties, the white paper said, noting five joint bomber flights since 2019, and several joint navigations of

Chinese and Russian warships that it said were "clearly intended for demonstration of force against Japan and of grave concern" to both Japan and the region.

The report predicted that China will possess 1,500 nuclear warheads by 2035 and increase its military superiority over Taiwan, in what Japan views as a security threat, especially to its southwestern islands including Okinawa. While Okinawan Gov Denny Tamaki has called for US Bases there to be reduced and for greater efforts in diplomacy and dialogue with Beijing, the central government has been reinforcing the defenses of the remote southwestern islands, including Ishigaki and Yonaguni, where new bases for missile defense have been installed.

China claims self-governing

Exclusion zone set up around military base

Now they ask why not invest in India," he added. Modi said 300 colleges in India have been identified for starting courses on semiconductor design.



Mumbai, July 28: Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman Friday said domestic companies can now go in for direct listing on foreign exchanges and the International Financial Services Centre (IFSC) in Ahmedabad.

The provisions for direct overeas listing were approved by the government, as part of the Covid relief package announced in May 2020, but the rules in this regard are yet to be notified.

The direct overseas listing will allow Indian companies to access foreign funds on various exchanges overseas.

"A direct listing of securities by domestic companies will now be permissible in foreign jurisdictions. I'm also pleased to announce that the government has taken a decision to enable the direct listing of listed and unlisted companies on the IFSC exchanges," Sitharmanan said here.

A senior government official said the rules for direct overseas listing of Indian companies will be notified in a few weeks.

To begin with, Indian companies will be allowed to list on the IFSC, and later, they will be permitted in specified seven or eight foreign jurisdictions, the official said. Sitharaman made the announcement about the di-

Earlier, media reports said the government was considering allowing foreign listings in seven countries initially, including_ Britain, Canada, Switzerland and the US.

The Securities and Exchange Board of India (Sebi) had previously recommended a framework within which such direct listing will be facilitated, and it is expected that the Sebi frame work will be the basis for future regulation in this area.

Sebi had proposed allowing listings on stock exchanges in ten "permissible jurisdictions" with strong anti-money laundering regulations, including the NYSE, Nasdaq, the LSE and Hong Kong, along with other major exchanges in Japan, South Korea, France, Germany, Switzerland and Canada.

Deep-seated minerals include gold, silver, copper, zinc, lead, nickel, cobalt, platinum group of minerals, diamonds, etc, which are difficult and expensive to explore and mine as compared to surfacial or bulk



"Thus share of deep-seated minerals in total mineral production is meagre at present. The country is mostly dependent on imports of these minerals. The proposed exploration licence would facilitate, encourage and incentivize private sector participation in all spheres of mineral exploration for critical and deep-seated minerals,"

a full member nation. Even the Ruturaj Gaikwad-



led men's team have got a direct entry into the quarterfinal on the basis of their ICC T20 ranking June 1. The men's event will comprise 18 teams while women's event will have 14 outfits.

The women's competition will start September 19 and end with the gold and bronze medal matches September 26. The men's event starts September 28 and the final will be played October 7, two days after the men's ICC 50-over World Cup starts in Ahmedabad. If the Indian cricket team qualify for the final, they will have to play on three back-toback days - October 5 (quarterfinal), October 6 (semifinal) and October 7 (final).

In all likelihood, India's quarterfinal will be against a secondstring Afghanistan or Bangladesh team, as the first teams of both nations will be in India during that time for the World Cup.

It is unlikely that the men's team will be reporting to the Games Village before the start of the opening ceremony as there will be nearly two weeks time before their campaign starts.

Also the BCCI hasn't yet confirmed whether the cricket teams will stay in the Games Village or at a five-star facility in the city.

In all, 32 matches across men's and women's event will be held at the Hangzhou Games, with the women's event accounting for 14 games and the men's event

New Delhi, July 28: Outgoing Wrestling Federation of India president Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh has convened a meeting Sunday to nominate his panel, which will contest the upcoming WFI elections to elect the new office-bearers. Though Brij Bhushan and his

son Karan are not part of the electoral college for the elections, the BJP leader's son-in-law Vishal Singh is a representative from Bihar in the polls and could likely contest for a top position. Outgoing WFI assistant sec-

retary Vinod Tomar confirmed that a meeting had been scheduled by Brij Bhushan July 30, though he did not specify the

"Yes, the outgoing president has convened a meeting Sunday. It has not been decided where the meeting will take place. The meeting will likely be attended by all those (state body officials) who support him (Brij Bhushan)," said Tomar.

"The presidents and secretaries of the various state associations will likely come for the meeting to discuss the candidates for the elections. The venue for the meeting has not been decided as yet," added Tomar.

The last date for filing nominations for the August 12 elections is July 31. Brij Bhushan is not eligible to contest as he has



already completed 12 years as an office-bearer, which is the maximum term allowed as per the National Sports Code.

The day-to-day affairs of the WFI are currently being managed by the Indian Olympic Association-constituted ad-hoc committee led by Bhupender Singh Bajwa.

Punjab Wrestling Association secretary Ranbir Kundu said on Friday that so far his state association had not received invite from any quarter or candidate to attend their meeting.

"So far, we have not received any invite. We are not going to field any candidate in the upcoming elections for the top posts. However, we will vote for truth and the betterment of wrestling in the country," said

Incidentally, the Punjab Wrestling Association's president, renowned former grappler Kartar Singh, was a secretarygeneral of the WFI until he was removed in 2013. Two representatives from each state unit will be allowed to vote.

Maharashtra and Tripura will not have any representatives at the elections as the Returning Officer deemed claims of both factions from the former "ineligible" while Tripura has remained disaffiliated since 2016. The WFI elections are taking place after several postpone-

The scrutiny of the nominations will be conducted August 2 and a final list of the candidates will be published August 7. If election is required, voting will be conducted August 12.

London, July 28: Australia led England by 12 runs at the end of a tense and fluctuating second day to leave the final Ashes Test at The Oval on a knife-edge

Steve Smith's patient 71 (123b, 6x4) was the backbone of Australia's 295 in reply to England's 283 and a ninth-wicket partnership of 49 between Pat Cummins (36, 86b, 4x4) and Todd Murphy (34, 39b, 2x4, 3x6) edged the touring side ahead.

Australia, 2-1 up in the series and bidding to win the Ashes in England for the first time since 2001, were bowled out just before the close.


Resuming the play on 61/1 Friday, Usman Khawaja (47, 157b, 7x4) and Marnus Labuschagne (9, 82b) had adopted a no-risk approach, adding only 21 runs in the first 12 overs before the latter was brilliantly caught by Joe Root at first slip off Mark Wood

Labuschagne edged Wood between wicketkeeper Jonny Bairstow and Root who dived to his left and plucked the ball out of the air one-handed.

England captain Ben Stokes did not have the option of using his main spinner Moeen Ali, who sustained a groin injury while batting, but his quick bowlers produced disciplined spells to keep the hosts in the game as Australia reached 115/2

to seize the initiative. James Anderson (1/67) claimed his first wicket when Mitchell Marsh, on 16, dragged the ball on to his stumps and Alex Carey lifted Root (2/20) for six before perishing next ball when he miscued a drive into the hands of Stokes at short extra cover.

Mitchell Starc fell to a short ball from Wood for seven, Ben Duckett taking a simple catch at long leg, and Australia were reeling at 186/7 at tea.

Smith, who narrowly avoided being run out for 42 when the third umpire decided Bairstow had not gathered the ball cleanly before breaking the stumps, reached another Test fifty before trying to sweep Chris Woakes (3/61), the ball flying high off the edge of his bat and Bairstow running back to take a good catch.

Australia's tail wagged hard, however, and Murphy hit Wood for three sixes, his first in top-level cricket, before Woakes returned to dismiss him lbw. Cummins was the last man out, superbly caught by Stokes on the boundary to end another dramatic day in an enthralling series.
