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## Green Globalisation

International trade has boosted economic growth in many coun-
tries, especially those without abundant natural resources or fixed capital. In addition to creating opportunities for cross-border specialintermediate inputs for manufacturing, and capital equipment. This
is especially true in Asia and the Pacific, which accounted for $35 \%$ of global trade in 2020, up from $25 \%$ a decade earlier.

Likewise, globalisation and open trade could play an indispensable environmental goods and services should be made widely available at
affordable prices to support a rapidly greening world economy Imports of solar panels, wind turbines, and electric vehicles, along with services such as wastewater treatment, could also generate technological
spillovers that stimulate and suport the development of renewable nergy sectors and clean industries domestically. to liberalise trade in environmental goods and services, coupled with a rise in protectionist measures, will almost surely undermine miti gation and adaptation efforts. Global and
regional cooperation is urgently required
to agree on common principles for facilitating such trade and safeguarding sup
ply chains. The first challenge is to define an envi ronmental good or service. The Asia-Pacifi
Economic Cooperation (APEC) agreed to dhist of 54 environmental goods on which
they would apply tariffs of $5 \%$ or less. Yet the agreement has only a limited impact,
owing to its voluntary nature and the rel-
atively small number of products covered.

| he monstrous growth of cause of concern for Indian society. There seems to be no end to the upward movement of the graph of crimes. What is more alarming is the gruesomeness of crimes and the guts and audacity of criminals while committing in full public glare. As if criminals are not at all afraid of the consequences of their actions or may be, sure of coming out scotfree from the proverbial spi- <br> There are many factors behind such an ominous development. Firstly, weak and archaic laws, specifically procedural laws like the Criminal Procedure Code and Indian Evidence Act which were enacted in the 19th century by the British who had the least concern for Indian people or their socio-cultural roots. Secondly, the abnormal and inordinate delay in delivering justice reaffirms the dictum "justice delayed is justice denied."The last, but the most important factor is, the punishment inflicted on the convicts by the courts of law does not commensurate with the crime and thus fails to generate any fear in the minds of the culprits. <br> Now let's see why our pun-ishment-system does not intimidate criminals or fails to make any deterrent effect on 5 people inclined to crime. Sectiontions about five types of punishments: death, imprisonment for life, rigorous or simple imprisonment, fine, and forfeiture of property. <br> Death penalty is awarded for waging war against India, armed fabricating evidence to fraud, ulently obtain capital punishment for an innocent person, abetting a minor's suicide, kidnapping for ransom, causing harm or death, murder, rape |
