Crorepati DFO held

Bhubaneswar: Vigilance sleuths Friday arrested crorepati divisional forest officer (DFO) of Rayagada Bijaya Kumar Parida in connection with a disproportionate assets (DA) case. Parida was found in possession of 17 plots in prime locations of Bhubaneswar, Puri, Cuttack and Jajpur, apart from two palatial mansions, one each in Capital city and Cuttack. The DFO of Territorial Division in Rayagada district was apprehended in connection with a case (25/23) registered at the Vigilance police station here. Following house search and examination of documents related to income, expenditure and assets of Parida, the Vigilance found him in possession of disproportionate assets worth crores of rupees estimated to be 206 per cent in excess of his known sources of income.

Trump returns to X

New York: Former President Donald Trump has returned to X, the social media site formerly known as Twitter, firing off his first message in 2 1/2 years shortly after he surrendered at an Atlanta jail on charges he conspired to overturn his election loss. He posted a photo of his mug shot and the words, "Election interference. Never surrender!" along with a link to his website which directs to a fundraising site. It was Trump's first post since Jan 8, 2021, when Twitter suspended his account indefinitely, citing fears he would incite additional violence following the deadly storming of the US

More teeth against hate No reason to limit bail period, says SC

New Delhi, August 25: The Supreme Court has held that the courts should not limit the bail for a specific period if the judge has arrived at the conclusion that the applicant is entitled to grant of bail. A two-judge bench of Justices Abhay S Oka and Pankaj Mithal observed that granting of bail for a limited period will only multiply the proceedings as the accused will have to again apply for bail and the court will be required to spend time in dealing with the applications.

"Once the Court comes to the onclusion that an accused is entitled to grant of bail, there is no reason to limit the order granting bail for a specific period. If such orders are passed, it will only multiply the proceedings in as much as on the verge of completion of the limited period of bail, the accused will have to again apply for bail and the Court will be required to spend time in dealing with the subsequent bail applications," the bench said.

The apex court order came on a bail application filed by Ujjal Kumar Pradhan, who has been booked for the offences under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985. He was granted a temporary bail by the Orissa High Court in July last year for a period of three months. The HC recorded a finding that taking into consideration the period of detention of the appellant in judicial custody and the progress of the trial, the appellant is entitled to be released on bail. The appellant had challenged the High Court order in the Supreme Court. The apex court has directed that the petitioner shall be enlarged on bail on the same terms and conditions on which by the impugned order he was enlarged on temporary bail for a period of three months.

SC to strengthen 2018 guidelines to curb hate crimes in country

New Delhi, August 25: The Supreme Court Friday said it will strengthen its 2018 guidelines for dealing with mob violence, hate speeches and lynching to ensure that culprits are dealt with equally, irrespective of their communities for their public utterances spreading bigotry.

In a sig plea by activist Tehseen Poonawalla, the top court had July 7, 2018 issued a slew of guidelines to curb hate crimes, and directed states and union territories to take preventive and remedial measures like appointment of nodal officers in each district to keep a tab on such activities.

The top court Friday asked the Centre to collate details from states and UTs on compliance of its 2018 verdict in three weeks. The court asked the central government to inform it on the next date of hearing if the information is not received by then.

A bench of Justices Saniiv Khanna and SVN Bhatti asked the Ministry of Home Affairs to file a status report giving details of appointment of nodal officers by the states in accordance with its 2018 verdict.

The bench said it has gone through the 2018 guidelines issued by the top court and, in its view, some more elements needed to be added.

"These guidelines of 2018 are fairly elaborate ones. We will be adding more to it and not subtract

60% bird species in **India have declined**

New Delhi, August 25: Of the 338 bird species studied in India for changes in numbers over the last 30 years, 60 per cent have experienced a decline, says a new report based on data from about 30,000 birdwatchers across the country.

Also, 40 per cent (142) of the 359 species evaluated for change over the last seven years have declined, according to the report titled "State of India's Birds".

The assessments rely on three indices: two are related to the change in abundance - long-term trend (change over 30 years) and current annual trend (change over the past seven years) - and the third is a measure of distribution range size within India.

Of the total of 942 species evaluated, long-term trends could be determined for 338 species. Of these, 204 species have declined, 98 are stable and 36 have increased, says the report published by a group of 13 government and non-government institutions, including the Bombay Natural History Society (BNHS), Wildlife Institute of India (WII), and Zoological Survey of India (ZSI).

Current annual trends could be determined for 359 species, of which 142 have declined (64 rapidly), 189 are stable, and 28 have



The report classifies 178 species, including Northern Shoveler, Northern Pintail, Common Teal, Tufted Duck, Greater Flamingo, Sarus Crane, Indian Courser and Andaman Serpent Eagle, as "high conservation priority".

Fourteen species, including Indian Roller, Common Teal, Northern Shoveler and Common Sandpiper, have dropped by 30 per cent or more and have been recommended for IUCN Red List reassessment, the report says.

Habitat specialists — particularly birds of grasslands and other open habitats, wetlands, and woodlands — are declining rapidly.

CM approves 416 new posts in BMC

Bhubaneswar, August 25: Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik Friday approved 416 new posts for Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation (BMC), the biggest local self government body in the state, keeping in view the rising population.

Patnaik said the initiative would protect the historical dignity of the heritage city and help the corporation become more efficient and proactive. With this, the total

strength of the BMC has gone up to 626 from earlier 210. Chief Minister's Office

(CMO) sources said the number of additional commissioner posts has been increased from earlier one to four while that of the deputy commissioners' from three to 16 and assistant sanitation commissioners' from 4 to 13. Similarly, the strength of civil executive officers has been increased from two to six.

This apart, six new zonal commissioner posts, 11 new posts in the Finance department, 17 in the Engineering department, 13 in Social Welfare de-

partment, 19 in Enforcement department and 187 posts in ward office section were created. Twenty new posts in

Drainage department, five in Sanitation department and 67 new ward officer posts have also been created in the civic body, said the CMO sources.

Kishore's fairytale run continues, enters finals

Budapest, August 25: Odisha javelin thrower Kishore Jena is having nothing short of a fairytale run as he sailed into the finals at the World Athletics Championships (WAC), Friday.

He joined his counterparts Olympics gold winner Neeraj Chopra and P Manu in the fi-

Kishore, competing in Group B, made the cut for the 12-man finals with an 80.55m throw. finishing ninth in the standings. He took off with an energetic 80.55m throw in his first attempt but went down to a 78.07m in the second attempt and finished with his lowest of the day with,

Meanwhile, Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik congratulated the troika and wished them luck. "Congratulate javelin throwers @Neeraj_chopra1, DP Manu and #Odisha's Kishore Kumar Jena on qualifying for the men's javelin throw final of the prestigious World Athletics Championships 2023 in Budapest. May they continue to shine and make India proud. Wish them all the best,' Naveen wrote on his X, earlier known as Twitter, handle.

Neeraj, on the other hand, sealed automatic qualification with his season-best throw of 88.77m, while DP Manu finished



sixth overall across both groups with his best effort of 81.31m.

It was a historic moment for Odisha as the 27-year-old from Kothasahi village in the Puri district became the first athlete from the state to qualify for a final event of the WAC.

Notably, a week ago, Jena's WAC participation was in a state of limbo due to his Hungarian visa issues. He finally got his visa August 18 after Neeraj came to his support. Jena's visa application was cancelled by the Hungarian embassy in India August 16 for unknown reasons.

"Just heard that there are issues with Kishore Jena's VISA, preventing him from entering Hungary for the World C'ships. I hope the authorities are able to find a solution, as this is one of the biggest moments of his career. Let's do everything we can," Neeraj had posted on Twitter, tagging MEA and Jaishankar.

Heineken sells off Russian operations for €1

The Hague, August 25: Dutch brewer Heineken has completed its withdrawal from Russia, 18 months after Moscow launched its full-scale invasion of Ukraine, selling its business in Russia for just €1, the company announced Friday.

Heineken said it would incur a total loss of 300 million euros (\$325 million) for the sale to Russian manufacturing giant,

the Arnest Group. Heineken had faced criticism for



the slow pace of its exit in the wake of the outbreak of war, but insisted it was seeking to look after its local employees in Russia.

In March last year, Heineken had said it was quitting Russia as its business there was "no longer sustainable nor viable in the current environment," but added that it wanted to ensure an "orderly transfer" to a new owner.

'While it took much longer than we had hoped, this transaction secures the livelihoods of our employees and allows us to exit the country in a responsible manner," Heineken CEO Dolf van den Brink said in a statement.

The sale covers all of Heineken's assets in Russia, including seven breweries. The company said that Arnest has guaranteed the employment of Heineken's 1,800 local staff for three years

Heineken brand beer was removed from the Russian market last year. One of its other major brands, Amstel, will be phased out within 6 months, the company said.






Bhubaneswar, August 25: A Vigilance court in Keonjhar Friday awarded jail terms to two former employees of Revenue department after convicting them in a bribery case of 2011.

Pradeep Kumar Nayak, former tehsildar of Patna in Keonjhar, and Biswanath Naik, former peon of the tehsil, were convicted for demanding and accepting bribe from a man for issuance of Record of Rights (patta) in five mutation cases.

In 2011, the Vigilance Directorate had registered a case against the two under Section 13(2) and 13(1) (d)/7/12 of the Prevention of Corruption (PC) Act, 1988. The special Vigilance judge sentenced the former tehsildar to two years of rigorous imprisonment (RI) for the offence under Section 13(2) and 13(1)(d) of the PC Act, 1988. The court also slapped a penalty of ₹5,000 on him. Failure to pay the penalty would entail an additional six months of RI, the court said.

'Carbon credits generated by overestimating green efforts'

illions of carbon credits are being generated by significantly overestimating the levels of deforestation they prevent, according to a study published in the journal Science.

This means that many of the "carbon credits" bought by companies to balance out emissions are not tied to real-world forest preservation as claimed.

Carbon credits, also known as carbon offsets, are permits that allow the owner to emit a certain amount of carbon dioxide or other greenhouse

An international team of scientists and economists led by the University of Cambridge in the UK and Vrije Universiteit Amsterdam in the Netherlands found that millions of carbon credits are based on crude calculations that inflate the conservation successes of voluntary REDD+ projects. Consequently, tonnes of greenhouse gas emissions consid-



ered "offset" by trees that would not otherwise exist have, in fact, only added to our planetary carbon debt, the researchers said.

REDD+ schemes generate carbon credits by investing in the protection of sections of the world's most important forests – from the Congo to the Amazon basin. These credits represent the carbon that will no longer be released through defor-

Organisations and individuals can then offset their own carbon footprint by purchasing credits equivalent to a given quantity of emissions.

Carbon credit markets have exploded in recent years. Over 150 million credits originated from voluntary REDD+ projects in 2021, with a value of US USD 1.3 billion. Some companies use carbon offsetting to claim progress towards "net zero" while doing little to reduce greenhouse gases, the researchers said.

The study authors argue that the booming trade in carbon credits may already be a type of "lemons market", where buyers have no way of distinguishing quality, so some sellers flood the market with bad products, leading to a breakdown of trust and ultimately market collapse.

"Carbon credits provide major polluters with some semblance of climate credentials. Yet we can see that claims of saving vast swathes of forest from the chainsaw to balance emissions are overblown," said study senior author Andreas Kontoleon, from Cambridge's Department of Land Economy.

Journalism has seen substantial rise in philanthropic spending

here has been a "substantial" increase in philanthropic spending for journalism over the past five years, particularly outlets that serve poor and minority communities, a report issued Thursday said — but journalists need to tighten ethical rules that govern the new spending, it recommended.

The struggling news industry is increasingly relying on donations and subscriptions, although it hasn't come close to making up for the collapse in advertising that has led to the dramatic drop in outlets that cover local news

More than half of funders surveyed by NORC at the University of Chicago said they have increased their journalism grants. Most nonprofit and for-profit news organizations report more funding.

"We see many more people and that includes people who work in philanthropy — being interested in a stronger civic infrastructure by funding local news," said Sarah Alvarez, founder of Outlier Media, a Detroit-based news source that started in 2016 and now has 16 employees.

Partly because it's a relatively new area of giving, it's hard to get a reliable count of how much philanthropy funds journalism. A report by Boston Consulting Group estimated \$150 million per year is given to nonprofit news outlets. The same report said that industry needs up to \$1.75 billion.

A major drive with a goal of raising \$1 billion for local news is expected to be announced this fall, the NORC report said.

"It's significantly more important than it was eight years ago," said Tom Rosenstiel, a University of Maryland professor who worked on the report, updating a similar one from 2015. "There are more nonprofit news organizations, and a lot of forprofit news organizations now get charitable donations, including



The New York Times.' Alvarez, a former public radio reporter in Michigan, built an organization intent on delivering information to poor communities — through text messages at first — on topics like housing, utilities and transportation.

Outlier Media has worked with other local news organizations in the Detroit area to develop a network of community reporters to keep an eye on local government meetings, she said.

She found a sharp increase in philanthropic interest in Outlier Media after the pandemic because it showed people who weren't used to living every day with a lack of vital information what that was like.

Nearly six in 10 funders that responded to NORC's survey said they have made grants to outlets primarily focused on communities of color. Rosenstiel said that was partly spurred by the racial reckoning caused by George Floyd's killing, along with a recognition that news organizations have long been better covering wealthier areas because that was what most

interested their advertisers. While the situation has improved since the 2015 study, news organizations have been slow in developing public guidelines on what type of money they will accept, and how that is disclosed to readers, he said. For instance, 72% of for-profit outlets say they don't have written policies, the survey said.

But the policies are vital if the outlets want consumers to understand that they are not accepting money from donors who are interested in specific stories being written to advance an

agenda, he said.

The survey said 92% of nonprofit news outlets and 83% or for-profit organizations said funders never saw editorial content that they helped underwrite prior to publication.

While several donors are interested in journalism that delves into areas that fit their particular interests—like the environment or education — an increasing number are seeing the importance of funding news reporting in general, Rosenstiel said.

The data would suggest that philanthropies are getting a little more sophisticated in understanding that if you're going to fund journalism, it has to be independent journalism, Rosenstiel said.

A total of 129 organizations that fund journalism responded to this year's survey, compared to 76 in 2015. NORC said. The University of Chicago worked with the Lenfest Institute for Journalism and Media Impact Funders for the study.

Task force chairman and regional chief conservator of forests (RCCF) Prakash Chand Gogineni presided over the meeting which was attended by district police SP B Gangadhar, deputy director Samrat Gouda of Similipal Tiger Conservation Project, STR, south division, officials of STR's north division, Baripada DFO Santosh Joshi, his Karanjia and Rairangpur counterparts and ASP Umesh Kumar Panda. The participants prepared a blueprint to make the operation a success.

Civic woes plague Batighara panchayat

VILLAGERS SUFFER DUE TO LACK OF DRINKING WATER, PROPER ROADS

Kendrapara, August 25: Despite their strategic location there are problems aplenty for residents of eight villages in Batighara panchayat in this district. These villages despite being only 48 km away from the district headquarters and 10 km away from the Jagatsinghpur industrial estate lack the basic amenities that people can't do without



There are approximately 5,000 residents living in these eight villages. Lack of electricity, drinking water facilities and educational institutes are some of the prime problems the villagers have to face. Incidentally Batighar and Hukitola have been recognised as tourism sites by the Odisha government in 2016. However, even then no development has happened at these two places.

The non-availability of a bridge on Kharinasi river, absence of proper roads and unplanned growth of forests are major obstacles for development work. Literacy rate (66.2%) is

also very poor among the residents of these villages. Farming and fishing are the main sources of income for people living in this panchayat.

Locals pointed out that the development of infrastructure for tourism can be a huge booster for the panchayat. They pointed out that if tourism is developed at Hukitola, Batighara and False point, then employment opportunities for the locals can be generated. Overall economic development can then be achieved, Other residents of the pan-

chavat stressed on the need for protection of environment. They pointed out effluents from the industries in neighbouring Jagatsinghpur district are polluting river water as well as the atmosphere. They added that due to this pollution various health issues are cropping up in the panchayat. Regularly cases of skin disease and even cancer are surfacing due to drinking of polluted water.

Due to the absence of a bridge on the Kharinasi river, medical facilities for the residents of this panchayat remain a distant dream. Ambulances cannot reach the eight villages while medical camps are not organised for the people of Batighara panchayat. Overall, the entire locality appears as if it is not a part of modern India. However, now there is some hope for them as plans are afoot to build a bridge on the Kharinasi river.

Joda, August 25: A tribal youth who shifted to Joda in Keonihar district after being displaced for the Kanpur dam project has brought about a turnaround in his life by growing vegetable through organic methods.

Gangadhar Banra, 35 has carved a niche for himself as a successful farmer. Vegetables grown by him have great demand in the market as he uses only organic manure for his crops instead of any chemical fertilizer. People are seen flocking to his farm to buy vegetables as they are cheaper than the existing market prices and cultivated in organic methods.

Five years back, Banra was displaced from his village for

the construction of Kanpur mega irrigation project. Left with no other option, he shifted to Joda with his family and moved from mine to mine with a hope of getting work. However, his hopes were shattered after he failed to get work. He finally rolled his sleeves up to take up farming and earn a livelihood for his family.

He started cultivation on four acre land lying vacant near the old-age home in Joda on rent basis. The vegetables he is cultivating are long beans, ridge gourd, bitter gourd, bottle gourd, brinjal and cauliflowers. Slowly fate smiled on him and he started making progress in cultivation works

Now, he is selling a quintal of brinjals per day while he is har-



vesting over 4,000 cauliflowers every year and selling them in local market and to traders. Moreover, an interesting aspect of his cultivation is that he is not using any chemical fertiliser for his crops and raising them in purely organic methods.

He is using Jeevamrut organic fertiliser to boost the growth of his crops and his harvest. Banra said that the use of Jeevamrut fertiliser is helping increase his harvest and maintain the vegetable quality and nutrient content which are very essential.

Banra uses organic manure, cow urine, jaggery, gram flour and soil collected from the root of the banyan tree to prepare

Jeevamrut fertiliser which is a rich source of nitrogen, potassium and phosphorous and other micro nutrients responsible for plant growth and development. The organic fertiliser also prevents plants and crops from disease and pest attack.

All these items are collected in a big drum and left to decompose which is then applied on the crops within a week. Moreover, he has bought waste a decomposer from Ghaziabad in Uttar Pradesh to increase the fertility of the soil. This helps in creation of earthworms which help in increasing the fertility of the soil. Moreover, what has come as a relief for the common consumers is that Banra sells his vegetables at less than their prevailing prices in the market.

Banra is assisted by his wife Sumitra who works hand in hand with him to ensure that their hard labour never goes in vain. They have also helped the local residents get organic vegetables which were a dream for them.

Vegetable traders Rajiv and Narsingh said that Banra with his hard work has been able to invent new methods of cultivation and put those into practice. This has helped him become a successful and self-reliant farmer

Scribe Benudhar Behera, educationist Somanath Mohanty, senior citizen Madan Mohan Barik said that Banra has started a green revolution in this mining valley which no person could even dare to think of a few years back.

■ Moxie

oxie, usually so spelt, was (and in New England it would seem Still is) the name of a non-alcoholic drink, first produced in substantial quantities by the Moxie Nerve Food Company of Lowell. Massachusetts in about 1884. Its founder, Dr Augustin Thompson, originally developed it in the 1870s as a patent medicine or nerve tonic, claiming it cured paralysis, loss of manhood, and softening of the brain. The name may come from the Algonquin Indian word root maski- "medicine" which became moxie as a name for wintergreen, one of the early constituents of this bitter drink. Moxie was the first carbonated and bottled soft drink that was widely distributed in America (just beating Dr Pepper and Coca-Cola), being sold from "Moxie bottle wagons" and later "Moxiemobiles". It was heavily promoted in the first three decades of the twentieth century, so that the name became very widely known, especially on the East Coast. In the twenties, the word picked up an informal meaning of "guts, courage, nerve"; the first citation we can find is from a story by Damon Runyon in 1930: "Personally, I always figure Louie a petty-larceny kind of guy, with no more moxie than a canary bird". It would seem the word, at first slang, derived from one or other of the firm's slogans of the inter-war period, such as "What this country needs is plenty of Moxie!". Some have said that it needed courage just to drink the stuff, no doubt a calumny, but even its supporters today admit it's an acquired taste.

ANGELS OF DEATH

THE NATURE OF THEIR JOBS **PUT THESE HEALTH-CARE PROFESSIONALS IN CLOSER PROXIMITY** TO DEATH **THAN MOST ORDINARY PEOPLE**

ecently convicted of murdering seven babies and attempting to kill six others at the Countess of Chester Hospital between June 2015 and June 2016. neonatal nurse Lucy Letby has the grisly distinction of being the United Kingdom's most prolific child serial killer. Over the course of Letby's ten-month trial, believed to be the longest murder trial in UK history, prosecutors detailed how she had harmed the infants in her care by injecting air and insulin into their bloodstreams, infusing air into their abdomens, and dislodging their breathing tubes.

What would provoke a nurse - a caregiver by profession – to inflict such terrible suffering? Even after covering the trial and spending months in Letby's presence, BBC journalist Judith Moritz struggled to understand her motivations. One text message hints at a possible god complex: "...sometimes I think, how do such sick babies get through & others just die so suddenly & unexpectedly?" Letby wrote. "Guess it's how it's meant to be." But, in Moritz's view, this does not provide a satisfying answer.

An examination of similar cases could offer insights into Letby's psychological state. Serial-killer nurses, it turns out, are more common than many would like to believe. Consider Niels Högel, who admitted to killing 43 people while working as a nurse at two clinics in the northern German cities of Oldenburg and Delmenhorst between 2000 and 2005.

Högel, the most prolific serial killer in postwar Germany, embodies the gravity of the danger posed by a disturbed healthcare professional. Officials suspect that as many as 300 patients may have died by his hand.

As a psychologist explained during the trial, Högel did not seem to enjoy killing, nor did he do it for financial gain. Rather,

Högel admitted to acting out of boredom, as well as a deep yearning to flaunt his superior resuscitation skills. After misusing medication to trigger cardiac arrest, reviving a patient was an act of personal aggrandisement – he was even nicknamed "Resuscitation Rambo" by admiring colleagues.

In his ruling, the judge cited a psychologist's assessment that the former nurse was a narcissist who liked to portray himself as a hero. While Högel relished the excitement of resuscitation, and sometimes even succeeded in reviving patients, at least 87 died. Likewise, when Letby was on duty, infants in the Countess of Chester Hospital often inexplicably required emergency resuscitation.

Serial-killer nurses tend to use injectable medications like insulin, opioids, and potassium chloride because they can be difficult to identify after death, as most health-care professionals would know. Beverley Allitt, for example, killed at least two babies by administering large doses of insulin while working as a nurse at Grantham and Kesteven Hospital in Lincolnshire, England, between February and April 1991. She was ultimately convicted of murdering four infants in total, attempting to murder another three, and causing grievous bodily harm to six more.

One theory invoked in the Allitt case is that she suffered from Munchausen syndrome by proxy, a rare and controversial diagnosis in which a caregiver inflicts harm on a child to gain personal sympathy. It is similar to one of the possible motivations that the prosecution in the Letby case identified: the nurse was attacking babies to attract the attention of a doctor with whom it is alleged she had become infatuated.

Insulin injections were also Ontario nurse Elizabeth Wettlaufer's weapon of choice. In September 2016, Wettlaufer admitted to killing eight long-term care residents and attempting to murder six others. Wettlaufer's crimes were uncovered only because she spontaneously confessed while receiving drug-addiction treatment. She had never been under any suspicion, and it would have likely remained that way had she not implicated

Wettlaufer may also have admitted the truth to a childhood friend, telling him: "A lot of what I've done has been triggered by my anger issues." But how could killing people under your care become a means of acting out anger issues? Who hasn't experienced homicidal urges against frustrating colleagues, or maybe undeserving patients blocking your precious beds, if you are a clinician struggling to run an under-resourced service?

The nature of their jobs put these health-care professionals in closer proximity to death than most ordinary people; regularly dealing with mortality could have warped their perspective. Or perhaps they were always drawn to the emotional intensity, and heightened bonding, produced in any team confronted with the ultimate crisis. In any event, because psychological screenings are secondary to technical skills when hiring in medical fields, and all these serial-killer nurses seemed to excel technically, dangerous pathology likely would not have been flagged when it's often difficult to find the basically clin-

ically competent. None of the experts giving evidence during the Letby trial presented a coherent theory explaining her motivation; maybe even expert clinicians remain in denial about the demons in their midst. Although other "angels of death" can provide clues about what gives rise to such evil, the most worrying implication of the "god complex" explanation is that the next "angel" more likely will be found among the better, or even the best, nurses. And it will always be counterintuitive to search for a killer among the healers you most rely on in an emergency.

BRICS dilemma: Politics or trade

bloc. Picking up the unfinished agenda from the last Summit, they debated the mechanism for extending membership to some of the 18 countries aspiring to join. This should remind us of the intense debate during 1990s within the European Union, by far the most successful integrated bloc of 27 countries. The debate was about deepening the Union versus widening it. The same challenge faces BRICS although the origin of this bloc is significantly different from the EU as it is more a shared platform than a cohesive bloc.

The acronym BRIC appeared for the first time in 2001 in one of the publications of Goldman Sachs. The paper prepared by the bank economists Jim O'Neill was to capture the future of growing economies of Brazil, Russia, India and China whose initials constitute the name BRIC. South Africa was added later in 2010 to make it BRICS. The group was conceived by the bank as an investment destination. In fact, Goldman started a BRICS-focussed investment fund in 2006. BRICS held its first conference in 2005 in Russia. However. Goldman folded the investment

The BRICS countries in fund nine years later in 2015. their 15th Summit at That act was seen as the BRICS Johannesburg debated the era coming to an end. As a matexpansion of the five-member ter of fact, the big emerging markets were sputtering: Russia and Brazil had fallen into recession while Chinese economy was on the decline. Now, although the BRICS share of the world economy has increased from 8% in 2005 to 26%, the situation for some member countries has become worse. Brazil and Russia registered growth of 1% for a decade, the latter hit by multiple sanctions. South Africa is caught in the mire of corruption and mismanagement. China is increasingly facing isolation by big economies. It is only India that is showing signs of vibrations in economy and politics.

Politically, BRICS countries are the least cohesive. While India, Brazil, South Africa are democracies. China and Russia are autocratic regimes. Chinese aggressive actions vis-à-vis its neighbours have drawn the attention of the world. Russia is fighting a pariah status after its ill-thought-out war on Ukraine.

That said, BRICS countries perhaps share a common strategic perception of a multilateral world less dominated by a single super power. The new countries wanting to join have similar interests. However, they will be

wary of a strong anti-American bloc emerging at the behest of Beijing. Likewise, India and rabidly anti-American platform nurtured by China and Russia. That is why Prime Minister Modi urged that the expansion should

happen only by consensus. Modi proposed five points for further cooperation between BRICS countries as they seek to expand. The first area of cooperation suggested by him was in space. This suggestion is perhaps timely to have traction in the Summit as Chandrayaan-3 soft-landed in the Moon creating a sort of history.

The second area suggested

by Modi consists of cooperation in education and skill development. He highlighted the innovation labs in schools using AI platforms like Bhasini to overcome language barriers. He assured BRICS partners that India will share all these platforms. The third suggestion was to undertake skill-mapping in each country to identify their respective strength for synergy and cooperation.

The fourth suggestion interestingly was about big cats. Modi suggested cooperation within international big cat alliance for the protection of these species. A large number of big cats of

several species are found in the BRICS countries. The fifth suggestion related to the field of Brazil will also be sensitive to a traditional medicine which is essential for creating better health conditions and treatment of several diseases.

Despite the lack of cohesion, BRICS will continue in some form or the other. It provides a platform for members to criticise, often with justification, the functioning of the world institutions under the influence of the West sidelining the Global South. In Cape Town, Foreign Minister Jaishankar talked about the concentration of global economic power leaving too many nations at the mercy of a few. BRICS is projected to be a counterweight to G7. The SCO is too Eurasian. The G20 is too dominated by Western members. BRICS seems to be the best party in the town.

To sum up, how effective BRICS will be is a big question. If it sticks to trade, commerce and investment, it may stay effective as a forum. If it veers towards a political road under the dual leadership of Russia and China, it will prove to be a motley group without much impact.

Punjab Guv warns CM of 'Death better than this nightmare' bringing President's rule

BANWARILAL PUROHIT WARNS BHAGWANT MANN THAT HE COULD LAUNCH CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS IF HIS LETTERS ARE NOT ANSWERED

Chandigarh, August 25: In a sharp escalation of the tussle between the Punjab governor and Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann, Banwarilal Purohit Friday warned that he could recommend President's rule in the state and also launch criminal proceedings if his letters are not answered.

In his latest communication, the governor indicated he was upset over not getting any reply to his previous letters and told the Punjab chief minister that he could send a report to the President on "failure of constitutional mechanism" in the state.

Purohit advised Mann to act before he takes this "final decision" under Article 356 of the Constitution and section 124 of the Indian Penal Code.

A state is brought under direct rule of the Centre with the invocation of Article 356, usually after a report is sent by the governor. Section 124 of the IPC relates to assaulting or wrongfully

restraining the President or a

governor from exercising their

lawful powers. "I have, therefore, to advise you, warn you and ask you to respond to my letters referred to above and give me the information sought by me," the governor said in the letter released to the media.

"Before I am going to take final decision regarding sending a report to the President of India under Article 356 about the failure of the constitutional mechanism and take a decision about initiating criminal proceedings under section 124 of the IPC, I ask you to send me the requisite information sought for under my letters referred to above, as also in the matter of the steps taken by you concerning the problem of drugs in the State, failing which I would have no choice but to take action according to law and the Constitution.'

Purohit mentioned an August 1 communication and said, "It appears that you are deliberately refusing to give the information asked by me.

The governor has earlier writ ten to Mann seeking informa tion on training seminar abroad for 36 school principals, and other issues. He said the chief minister didn't reply.

In the latest letter, the governor claimed he has received reports from various agencies on rampant drug abuse in Punjab.

"It is common knowledge that they are available in chemist shops, a new trend is observed that they are being sold in the government controlled liquor vends," Purohit wrote, citing recent action by the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) and Chandigarh Police in which 66 liquor vends in Ludhiana were sealed for selling drugs.

He also cited a parliamentary standing committee report on drug addiction in Punjab. He said facts pointed at the "breaking down of law and order" in Punjab to the extent that villagers are protesting on the streets and setting up their own defence committees to protect themselves from drugs.

"Please send a report concerning the action taken by you in the matter of these drugs to my office immediately, Purohit said. The governor said it is his duty under the Constitution to ensure that the administration carries out efficient, impartial and honest work, and the state government's proposals are not contrary to the law of the land.

The governor also referred to the "derogatory words" used by the chief minister against him in the Punjab Assembly

Himachal bans stone crusher units in Beas river basin

Shimla, August 25: The government has decided to stop the operation of all stone crushers on both perennial and non-perennial rivulets of the Beas river basin and its tributaries till further orders. Himachal Pradesh Chief Minister Sukhvinder Sukhu said.

The decision was made taking into consideration the alarming transformation of the ecosystem during the current monsoon, wreaking havoc downstream in the Beas river and its tributaries in Kullu, Mandi, Kangra and Hamirpur districts, besides Chakki rivulet in

Kangra. The decision has been taken to ensure the safety of human settlements and infrastructure, to preserve the fragile ecology and environment of the state, an official statement said.



However, the lease of legal mining has not been cancelled.

The Chief Minister said the existing captive and temporary stone crushers shall not come under the purview of this order.

He said directions had been given to the Department Environment, Science and Technology and Climate Change to convene a highlevel expert consultation to identify the factors which formed such a disastrous position.

The Chief Minister said

the department will also conduct a comprehensive scientific study by constituting a multi sectoral expert committee to evaluate the cumulative impact of unscientific and illegal mining activities and also assess to redefine distance limits as based on the findings. thereby allowing more effective regulation and management of such operations to preserve the environment in river system and to avoid any such



New Delhi, August 25: The

Supreme Court Friday refused to entertain Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal's plea challenging the high court order rejecting his request to stay the criminal defamation proceedings filed by the Gujarat University over his remarks about Prime Minister Narendra Modi's educational qualification.

Gujarat University Registrar Piyush Patel had filed a defamation case against Kejriwal and AAP leader Sanjay Singh over their alleged comments after the Gujarat High Court set aside an order of the Chief Information Commissioner for providing information about Modi's degrees to them under the RTI Act.

A bench of Justices Sanjiv Khanna and SVN Bhatti said it is not issuing notice on the plea as the matter is pending before the Gujarat High Court and is listed for hearing on August 29. The bench said the Gujarat University and Kejriwal can raise their grievances before the high court.

At the outset, senior advocate Abhishek Singhvi, appearing for Kejriwal, said the high court had wrongly refused to grant interim stay on the defamation proceedings against him. Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, appearing for the University, said there was suppression of

Bangalore, August 25: Chandravaan-3 mission's rover 'Pragyan' has traversed a distance of about eight metres on the lunar surface, and its payloads have been turned on, ISRO said Friday.

All payloads on the propulsion module, lander module, and rover are performing nominally, the Bengaluru-headquartered national space agency said in an update Friday evening. "All planned rover movements have been verified. The rover has successfully traversed a distance of about 8 metres. Rover payloads LIBS and APXS are turned ON," it said in a post on 'X". The Alpha Particle X-Ray Spectrometer (APXS) is aiming at deriving the chemical composition and inferring the mineralogical composition of the lunar surface. The Laser-Induced Breakdown

Spectroscope (LIBS) is attempting to determine the elemental composition (Mg, Al, Si, K, Ca, Ti, Fe) of lunar soil and the rocks around the lunar landing site. Earlier on Friday, ISRO released a breathtaking video of the rover, 'Pragyan', rolling down the ramp from the lander, 'Vikram', to the lunar surface, as observed by



the lander imager camera. ".. And here is how the Chandrayaan-3 Rover ramped (rolled) down from the lander to the lunar surface," ISRO said in an update. The space agency also released the image of 'Vikram'

taken by Chandrayaan-2's Orbiter High Resolution Camera (OHRC) after the lander module soft landed the lunar surface. "Chandrayaan-3 Mission update: I spy you! His inmate number was P01135809. Trump, the leading Republican contender for the Republican Party's 2024 presidential nomination, told reporters that he has done nothing wrong.

The conditions of the agreement in part prohibit Trump from intimidating his co-defendants, witnesses or alleged victims in the case, including on social media. Before he boarded his plane back to New Jersey, Trump said that it was "a very sad day for America."

Accusations of killing Yevgeny Prigozhin an 'absolute lie': Russia

Moscow, August 25: The Kremlin said Friday that Western suggestions that the Wagner mercenary boss Yevgeny Prigozhin had been killed on its orders were an "absolute lie" and declined to definitively confirm his death, citing the need to wait for test results.

President Vladimir Putin Thursday sent his condolences to Yevgeny Prigozhin's family, breaking his silence after the mercenary leader's plane crashed Wednesday evening with no survivors two months after he led a mutiny against army chiefs.

Vladimir Putin cited "preliminary information" as indicating that Yevgeny Prigozhin and his top associates in the Wagner mercenary group had been killed. Russian investigators have opened a probe into what happened, but have not yet said what they suspect caused the plane to suddenly fall from the sky northwest of Moscow.

Nor have they officially confirmed the identities of the 10 bodies recovered from the wreckage. Western politicians and com-

mentators have suggested that President Putin ordered Prigozhin killed to punish him for launching a failed June 23-34 mutiny against the top brass which represented the biggest challenge to Vladimir Putin's rule yet.

Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov said the accusation and many others like it were false. "There is now a great deal of speculation surrounding this plane crash and the tragic deaths

Belarusian President Alexander Lukashenko said Friday that he had warned Russian mercenary chiefs Yevgeny Prigozhin and Dmitry Utkin to watch out for possible threats to their lives, and he insisted that Wagner fighters would remain in Belarus. Russian President Vladimir Putin initially vowed to crush Wagner chief's June mutiny, comparing it to the wartime turmoil that ushered in the revolution of 1917, but hours later a deal was clinched to allow Prigozhin and some of his fighters to go to Belarus.

Firefighters in Greece struggle to control wildfires

Athens, August 25: Authorities battling a major wildfire in northeastern Greece that has been described as the European Union's largest single recorded fire recovered another body, the fire department said Friday, bringing the total death toll from wildfires in Greece this week to 21.

The fire department said firefighters recovered the body of a man from the Dadia-Lefkimi-Soufli Forest National Park, which lies near the border with Turkey, Thursday. Eighteen bodies were discovered Tuesday near a shack in an area near the northeastern city Alexandroupolis, and the body of another person was found Monday in a forest.

In central Greece, a man was found dead Monday in a sheep pen after reportedly trying to save his livestock from an advancing wildfire. With no reports of missing people in northeastern Greece, authorities suspect the people whose bodies were discovered in the area were migrants who may have crossed into the country recently from the nearby border with Turkey.

Greece's Disaster Victim Identification Team was activated to identify the remains, and a telephone hotline operating in English, Arabic, Pashto, Turkish and Urdu was set up for the relatives of potential victims to call. With gale force winds abating, firefighters were making headway Friday in tackling the blazes, appeared improved, although neither of the two main wildfires had been brought under

control, the fire department said. The Alexandroupolis area fire burned for a seventh day after combining with smaller fires to create a massive blaze that consumed homes and vast tracts of



forest. Nearly 15,000 people have been evacuated due to the blaze, government spokesman Paylos Marinakis said Friday.

Authorities were concentrating on two active fronts, the fire department said, with 295 firefighters backed up with 85 vehicles, four planes and two helicopters. According to the EU's Copernicus Emergency Management Service, the fire had scorched more than 772 square kilometres (nearly 300 square miles) by Thursday. Copernicus is the EU space program's Earth observation component and uses satellite imagery to provide mapping data. European Commissioner for Crisis Management Janez Lenarcic described it as the largest wildfire on record in the

European Union. To the south in Athens, a major fire that scorched homes on the fringes of the Greek capital and entered the national park on Mount Parnitha had one main active front, the fire department said. The blaze was being tackled by 260 firefighters backed up by 77 vehicles, 8 planes and five $\,$ helicopters.

With firefighting forces stretched to the limit, Greece called on other European countries for help. Germany, Sweden, Croatia and Cyprus sent aircraft, while dozens of Romanian, French, Czech, Bulgarian, Albanian and Slovak firefighters helped on the ground.

Dozens of new fires have broken out each day. In the last week, firefighters were called to tackle 516 fresh outbreaks. Marinakis said Friday. Officials have said arson caused some of the blazes. Police arrested a 45year-old man Thursday on suspicion of arson for allegedly setting at least three fires in the Avlona area north of Athens.

A search of his home revealed kindling, a fire torch gun and pine needles, police said. Another man was arrested for negligent arson Thursday after allegedly throwing a burning cigarette into a field of dried grass and olive trees, sparking a fire. Harare, August 25: Early parliamentary results in Zimbabwe showed the ruling party and the main opposition neck and neck Friday, after an election in which President Emmerson Mnangagwa's ZANU-PF party was widely expected to maintain its 43-year grip on power.

Presidential results have yet to be announced after Wednesday's vote, which was extended into Thursday in some neighbourhoods due to late printing of ballot papers.

Mnangagwa, 80, is seeking reelection at a time when the southern African country is grappling with soaring inflation and high unemployment, with many Zimbabweans reliant on dollar remittances from relatives abroad to make ends meet. Zimbabwe's chances of resolving a debt crisis and obtaining World Bank and International Monetary Fund loans are at stake, as foreign lenders have said a free andfair vote is a pre-condition for any meaningful talks.



New Delhi: Mining magnate Anil Agarwal has said his group's flagship firm Vedanta Ltd is considering demerger and separately listing all or some businesses like aluminum, iron and steel, and oil and gas to unlock shareholder value. Forex reserves post steepest weekly dip in over 6 months

Mumbai, August 25: India's foreign exchange reserves declined to a near two-month low of \$594.89 billion as of August 18 and posted their steepest weekly fall in more than six months, data from the country's central bank showed Friday.



They fell by \$7.27 billion from the prior week, the sharpest decline since the week ended February 10.

The changes in foreign currency assets, expressed in dollar terms, include the effects of appreciation or depreciation of other currencies held in the Reserve Bank of India's (RBI)

The RBI also intervenes in the spot and forwards markets to prevent runaway moves in the rupee.

In the week for which the forex reserves data pertains, the rupee dropped to a 10-month low of 83.16 against the US dollar, prompting intervention from the RBI, as per traders. The currency ended at 82.6475 Friday rising more than 0.5% for the week and logging its best weekly performance since July 14.

For the week ended August 18, the foreign currency assets, a major component of the reserves, decreased by \$6.613 billion to \$527.786 billion, according to the Weekly Statistical Supplement released by the RBI.

Expressed in dollar terms, the foreign currency assets include the effect of appreciation or depreciation of non-US units like the euro, pound and yen held in the foreign exchange reserves.

Gold reserves were down by \$515 million to \$43.824 billion, the RBI said

The Special Drawing Rights (SDRs) were down by \$119 million to \$18.205 billion, the apex bank said.

New Delhi, August 25: Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman Friday said India's economic growth in the first quarter of this fiscal should be good and that the government's priority is to tame inflation, which has touched a 15-month high.

Addressing business leaders in the national capital, she said that green shoots of private capital expenditure upcycle can be palpably felt as the government's enhanced capital expenditure is now crowding in private sector investments.

While mentioning about the key priorities of the government. Sitharaman also stressed the focus is on Aatmanirbhar Bharat (self-reliant India) but essential imports will not be stopped.

She also emphasised on the need for diversification of supply chains at the earliest to avoid shocks.

Noting that India is the fastest growing major economy, she said that in another few days, the GDP numbers for the first quar-

The probe reports finalised include allegations of manipulation of stock prices, alleged failure to disclose transactions with related parties and possible violation of insider trading in some of the group stocks.

However, on the allegation of non-compliance with the minimum public sharing requirement by investing in its own companies through overseas proxies, SEBI said its investigation covered 13 overseas entities (12 foreign

portfolio investors and one foreign entity).

These 13 were classified as public shareholders of the Adani group companies but allegations including the US short-seller Hindenburg Research termed some of them as close associates or run by Vinod Adani, the elder brother of group chairman Gautam Adani.

"As many of the entities linked to these foreign investors are located in tax haven jurisdictions, establishing the economic interest shareholders of the 12 FPIs remains a challenge," SEBI said adding efforts are still being made to gather details from five foreign jurisdictions pertaining to the actual owners of these investors. New Delhi, August 25: India is working on a new electric vehicle policy that would slash import taxes for automakers that commit to some local manufacturing, following a proposal by Tesla which is considering entering the domestic market, people with direct knowledge said.

The policy being considered could allow automakers to import fully-built EVs into India at a reduced tax as low as 15%, compared to the current 100% that applies to cars which cost above \$40,000 and 70% for the rest, said two of the sources, including a senior Indian government offi-

Tesla's best-selling Model Y, for example, starts at \$47,740 in the US before tax credits.

"There is an understanding with Tesla's proposal and government is showing interest," said the official, who is familiar with the issue.

If such a policy is adopted, it could amount to a drastic reduction in the cost of imported EVs that local carmakers have been keen to avoid. It could also open the door for global automakers, beyond Tesla, to tap the

Tesla first tried to enter India in 2021 by pushing officials to lower the 100% import tax for EVs. Last year, the talks between Tesla and the Indian government collapsed when officials conveyed the company would have to first commit to local manufacturing.

More recently, Tesla has told Indian officials it is keen to set up a local factory and make a new EV priced around \$24,000, roughly 25% cheaper than its current entry model, for both the Indian market and export.

One of the sources said Tesla told Indian officials a potential India factory could operate at full capacity by 2030.

Outside the United States, Tesla currently has a plant in Shanghai - its largest factory worldwide - and one outside Berlin. It is building a new plant in Mexico that will focus on a new massmarket EV platform Musk has said will slash costs for consumers.

Olympics gold-winning javelin thrower enters World Athletics Championships finals along with Manu, Jena

Budapest, August 25: Neeraj Chopra needed just one big throw to qualify for 2024 Paris Olympics and the World Athletics Championships (WAC) javelin throw final, pulling off a commendable first-attempt of 88.77m here Friday.

Not only Chopra but DP Manu (81.31m) and Odisha's Kishore Jena (80.55m) also made the cut as three Indians qualified the final of an event in the World Championships for the first time ever. The 2024 Paris Olympics qualifying mark is 85.50m. The qualifying window had opened

The 25-year-old Chopra's qualifying round lasted just a few minutes as he sent the spear to his season's best distance in his very first attempt in the Group A qualification round. He topped the qualification round. Chopra had won a silver in the 2022 World Championships in USA.

With the automatic final qualification mark set for 83m, Chopra, who has a personal best of 89.94m, packed up and left the competition arena without taking any further throw. The final will be held Sunday. Those who throw 83m or the top-12 best performers from both Group A and B qualify for the final.

Competing in the same group with Chopra in his debut World Championships, Manu finished third and sixth overall with a best throw of 81.31m which he produced in his second attempt. Manu had won a silver in the Asian Championships in July.

Jena, whose visa was rejected first by the Hungarian embassy in New Delhi before being cleared the next day, ended fifth in Group B and ninth overall with 80.55m. It is also his debut World Championships.



"For the first time three Indians have qualified for the final round of an event in World Championships. It has never happened earlier. It's a historic day for Indian javelin," a team coach in the Indian contingent told PTI. India first participated in the World Championships in

Reigning Commonwealth Games champion Arshad Nadeem of Pakistan also qualified for the 2024 Paris Games with his season best throw of 86.79m. Nadeem topped Group B and finished second overall.

Jakub Vadlejch of Czech Republic, who won silver medal behind Chopra in Tokyo Olympics, was second in Group B and third overall with a best throw of 83.50m. Germany's Julian Weber was fourth overall with a best throw of 82.39m.

Defending champion Anderson Peters of Grenada, who has been struggling for form this season, failed to qualify for the final

round after finishing seventh in Group A and 16th overall with

a best throw of 78.49m. A World Championships gold is the only medal missing in Chopra's decorated cabinet and going by the performances of other competitors in the qualification round, the superstar Indian looked primed to achieve the feat and add another milestone in his illustrious career.

He won gold medals in Olympics (Tokyo in 2021), Asian Games (2018) and Commonwealth Games (2018), besides becoming the Diamond League champion last vear.

Six track and field athletes have already qualified for the 2024 Olympics before Chopra. Akshdeep Singh, Vikas Singh and Paramjeet Bisht qualified for men's 20km race walk and Privanka Goswami made the cut for women's 20km race walk. Long jumper Murali Sreeshankar and 3000m steeplechaser Avinash Sable have also qualified.

New Delhi, August 25: A record number of 634 sportspersons were Friday cleared by the Sports Ministry to compete at the Hangzhou Asian Games, surpassing the 572 athletes in the last edition of continental showpiece in Jakarta in 2018.

The Indian Olympic Association (IOA) had recommended 850 athletes for event to be held in Hangzhou from September 23. Track and field events have got the pride of place as 65 athletes - 34 men and 31 women – are part of the huge contingent.

Sportspersons in 38 disciplines have been cleared, with a total of 44 footballers – 22 players in men's and women's sections re-

spectively – figuring in the list. Hockey constitutes the thirdhighest number of athletes at 36, with the ministry clearing 18 players each in the men's and women's sections. The list also includes the men's and women's cricket teams, comprising 15 members each respectively.

Shooting sport, in which India has performed consistently in the continental showpiece, will see a big 30-member contingent competing in Hangzhou, while a 33member sailing contingent has also been cleared.

The ministry has not cleared any male athlete in weightlifting, gymnastics, handball and rugby. Only two sportspersons have been cleared in kurash (martial art) and weightlifting (both women), while only one gymnast has been included in the list. **Bajrang in contingent**

The ministry has included the

19th Asian Games Hangzhou 2022

name of wrestler Bajrang Punia (65kg) in the list, going with the IOA ad-hoc panel's decision to recommend his name without appearing for the Asian Games trials last month. Vishal Kaliraman had topped the trials in the weight category and has appealed to the ministry to include his name.

Bajrang, however, has indicated that he might withdraw from the Asian Games if all the khap panchayats that backed him during the protest at Jantar Mantar ask him to do so.

Wrestler Antim Panghal (53kg) name figures in the list after 2018 Jakarta Asian Games gold medallist Vinesh Panghal – who too had been exempted from the Asian Games trials and given direct entry - pulled out due to

a knee injury. Indian chess player Koneru Humpy, the double Asian Games gold medallist in 2006 who had indicated earlier this year she might not go for the continental event, is an integral part of a formidable chess team that includes D Harika and R Praggnanandhaa, who Thursday finished runnerup at the FIDE World Cup after losing to World No.1 Magnus Carlsen, among others.

In the final Olympic event of the tournament, the Indian duo of Prithviraj Tondaiman and Manisha Keer produced a shot of 133 and finished 22nd. On the other hand, Kynan Chenai and Preeti Rajak also came up with the same score but were placed 24th in the final calculations.
