





8 KILLED IN FRESH MANIPUR VIOLENCE

Imphal, August 31: At least eight persons have been killed and 18 injured, including two security personnel, in Manipur's Bishnupur and Churachandpur districts following continuous gunbattle between Kukis and Meiteis over the last 72 hours, officials said Thursday.

An official said firing was continuing intermittently in the foothills of Khoirentak in Bishnupur district and adjoining Chingphei and Khousabung areas in Churachandpur district.

Violence started August 29 when a village volunteer aged around 30 years was killed following heavy firing in Khoirentak area, an official said.

Kalimela, August 31: A man was allegedly beaten to death by angry villagers of Majhiguda under Sadar police limits in Malkangiri district late Wednesday night, an official said Thursday.

The deceased was identified as Deba Madkami of the village.

Deba had attacked Mani Madhi, 24, wife of Muka Madhi of the locality with a sharp weapon when she was washing utensils near a tube well in the village, Tuesday. Irked over the attack, villagers caught Deba and beat him to death.





On the first day of the session, the Finance minister will present the first Supplementary Budget for FY 2023-24, the notification issued by the Assembly secretariat said.

"September 23 and 24 will be no working days on account of fourth Saturday and Sunday respectively while official businesses will be taken up on the next three days (September 25 to 27). Demands for grants for the first Supplementary Budget will be discussed September 28 and 30," it said.

The Appropriation Bill for the first supplementary expendi-



ture of the statement will be tabled October 3. The last day of the session has been reserved for private members' business (bill and resolution), it said.

The election to the Speaker's post will be held before commencement of the session, it was learnt. Although no official notification was issued in connection with the Speaker election, sources said it will be held September 21.

SA BUILDING FIRE CLAIMS 73 LIVES AGENCIES

Johannesburg, August 31: At least 73 people were killed and 52 others injured after a massive fire broke out in a multistorey building occupied by migrants in central Johannesburg of South Africa (SA) Thursday, emergency services said.

Authorities said it was unclear what sparked the blaze at the five-storey building in the city centre. City of Johannesburg emer-

gency services spokesperson Robert Mulaudzi said firefighters were alerted to the fire in a building on the corner of Delvers and Alberts streets at about 1:30 am.

Dozens of emergency and rescue workers were on the scene as bodies continue to be brought out.

'We managed to evacuate the people who were inside the building as soon as we arrived while we were conducting firefighting operations," Mulaudzi said, adding that most of those treated for injuries had suffered smoke inhalation or minor Mulaudzi said arrangements

were being made to accommodate those who had been left homeless by the incident. The fire gutted the five-storey

building. A total of 73 bodies were re-

covered and 52 were injured in the fire, Mulaudzi said.

A video posted by Mulaudzi on X, formerly known as Twitter, showed fire trucks and ambulances outside the building with burnt-out windows

Parl spl session from Sept 18 sans agenda **Assembly from Sept 22**

New Delhi, August 31: The government Thursday announced a five-day special session of Parliament from September 18 to 22 but kept the agenda for it under wraps, triggering speculation.

'Special Session of Parliament (13th Session of 17th Lok Sabha and 261st Session of Rajya Sabha) is being called from 18th to 22nd September having five sittings. Amid Amrit Kaal, looking forward to having fruitful discussions and debate in Parliament," Parliamentary Affairs Minister Pralhad Joshi said on X.

It will be the first such special session under the nine years of the Prime Minister Narendra Modi-led government which had convened a special joint sitting of Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha to mark the midnight GST rollout June 30, 2017.

However, it will be a full-fledged session of five days this time with both Houses meeting separately as they usually do during sessions.

Generally, three parliamentary sessions – Budget, Monsoon and Winter - are held in a year. Sources said the special session could see parliamentary operations being shifted to the new

Parliament building which was inaugurated by the Prime Minister May 28. With the government not spelling out its agenda, speculation swirled that the government may push some showpiece

bills in the run-up to some key state assembly polls followed by the all-important Lok Sabha election. Sources, including in the ruling BJP, spoke of the possibility

of bills on simultaneous general, state and local polls, something Modi has assiduously pushed, and reservation for women in directly elected legislatures like Lok Sabha and assemblies.

Congress leader Jairam Ramesh alleged that the special session announcement just three weeks after the end of the Monsoon session was aimed at managing 'the news cycle' and countering the news about the ongoing meeting of INDIA parties in Mumbai and the latest revelations on Adani.

Now, make video & voice calls on X conglomerate saw meteoric rise

New Delhi, August 31: Billionaire Gautam Adani's group was Thursday hit by fresh allegations that it used family associates to secretly invest hundreds of millions of dollars through 'opaque' Mauritiusbased investment funds to fuel the spectacular rise in group stocks. The conglomerate vehemently denied the charge.

The Organised Crime and Corruption Reporting Project (OCCRP) said documents obtained by it revealed details of a complex offshore operation in two Mauritius-based funds managed by the partners of the promoter family to support prices of shares of group companies from 2013 to 2018 - a period during which the ports-to-energy

to become India's largest and most powerful businesses.

OCCRP said two close associates of Vinod Adani -- the elder brother of group founder, and chairman Gautam Adani -- are sole beneficiaries of Mauritiusbased companies through which the money appeared to flow.

Nasser Ali Shaban Ahli from the UAE and Chang Chung-Ling from Taiwan spent years trading hundreds of millions of dollars worth of Adani group stock through two Mauritius-based funds that were overseen by a Dubai-based company run by a

known employee of Vinod Adani. SEBI had been handed evidence in early 2014 of alleged suspicious stock market activity by the Adani Group, OCCRP said citing a letter.

U K Sinha, who headed the SEBI in 2014, is now a director and chairperson of Adani-owned news broadcaster NDTV.

The fresh broadside, which comes months after US short-selling firm Hindenburg Research published an explosive report in January that accused Adani Group of running the 'largest con in corporate history', sent all 10 listed Adani stocks down. Shares of flagship Adani Enterprises Ltd closed 3.72 per cent lower after dipping as much as 5.2 per cent. Other group stocks closed 2-3.5 per cent lower.

On the Forbes Billionaire list, Gautam Adani lost USD 2.2 billion in personal wealth and was now ranked 24th on the rich list. Congress leader Rahul Gandhi

questioned the PM's silence on

the allegations.

California, August 31: Users of X, the social network formerly known as Twitter, will be able to make video and audio calls through the platform without having to share their phone number, owner Elon Musk said in a post Thursday, in the latest expansion of services as he seeks to create an 'everything app'.

Musk wants X to become more like Tencent Holdings Ltd's WeChat, a messaging serviceturned-super-app that offers everything from social media and video games to fintech.

X chief executive officer Linda Yaccarino has said X will include features such as payments and banking.

Musk, who bought Twitter

last year for \$44 billion, said X will serve as an 'effective global address book' for the new features. and users will be able to make calls through X on iOS, Android, Macs and PCs.

"Video & audio calls coming to X - Works on iOS, Android, Mac & PC - No phone number needed X is the effective global address book," Musk posted on X

"That set of factors is unique,"

The announcement came after the platform updated its privacy policy to include the collection of biometric data. X does not define what it considers biometric, though other companies have used the term to describe data gleaned from a person's face, eyes and fingerprints. X also said it would gather infor-



mation about users' jobs and education histories. Several users expressed their thoughts on this new development.

"Now I can call more people and tell them to buy #Dogecoin directly from X," a user wrote.

"Please make sure there are privacy options to stop randoms from calling us. Even if I follow someone it doesn't mean I want them to be able to call me," another user said.

One more user wrote: "Absolutely groundbreaking! Your team never fails to spearhead innovation! Can't wait to enjoy seamless video & audio calls on X across multiple platforms without the fuss of phone numbers. Truly visionary, setting a new benchmark in user expe rience. Bravo.'

Meanwhile, X has announced that it will allow US political candidates and parties advertise on the platform ahead of the 2024 presidential election.

Since acquiring Twitter, Musk has axed the signature blue bird logo and introduced a raft of changes including reinstating formerly banned users and scrapping the ability to block accounts.

Odisha among 4 leading investment destinations

Mumbai. August 31: The Indian economy is at the cusp of a new private capital expenditure cycle with Odisha being one of the leading states attracting investments, said a domestic credit rating agency here Thursday.

After analysing official data from 2005 to 2022, India Ratings and Research said Uttar Pradesh, Gujarat and Maharashtra continue to dominate fresh capex allocation, while Odisha is getting attention with projects spread across textile, steel and power sectors.

For the past few years, the government led on the investment front while private capital expenditure, which has a trickledown effect on growth and employment, did not take off.



Tracking devices for undertrials

Odisha Directorate of Prisons has proposed the state government to allow it to fit GPS-enabled tracking devices on the ankles of undertrial prisoners (UTPs) and free them of the four walls

said if the proposal is accepted and implemented, Odisha will be the first state in the country to free UTPs involved in nonheinous crimes

Stating that overcrowding was the biggest problem in jails across the country including Odisha. Chhabra said about 80 per cent of prison inmates were UTPs. Many of them were lodged in jails even though they were caught in offences having provision of less than seven years imprisonment.

proposal to Odisha government, GPS-enabled tracking devices will be fitted on the ankles of UTPs facing non-heinous charges for crimes carrying a maximum imprisonment of seven years to reduce prison overcrowding.

Chhabra said this will be voluntary and the UTPs will have the option to wear the devices or stay in jails. He said police and jail authorities will be able to track any UTP with help of the device. If any UTP tries to damage the tracker, the local police station will get an alert and act immediately, he added.

Replying to a question, Chhabra said there are a few factors behind such a move. "While chances of escape is there, a UTP may also commit crime while outside the jail. This apart, he/she may threaten witnesses or attempt to tamper evidence. In all such cases, police can nab them and put them in jail," he said.

Asked whether the move would violate human rights of a person, Chhabra said, "I think human rights activists will support our effort as the UTPs will remain free and not within four walls.

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Speculations fly over Parl spl session

New Delhi, August 31: Amidst the announcement of a special session of the Parliament from September 18 to 22 by Union Parliamentary Affairs minister Pralhad Joshi, speculations have intensified over the palpable reasons behind the unprecedented move of the Narendra Modi gov-

Joshi announced on a social media platform that the government is looking forward to having a fruitful discussion and debate amid Amrit Kaal. The officials are tight lipped to share anything beyond the one agenda that Joshi revealed. However, sources said that the

government would utilize this session for 'branding' ahead of crucial elections in Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Telangana and Mizoram.

During the five days of the session, the government is likely to highlight the success of the Moon mission, G20 summit and would celebrate the Amrit Kaal.

Though the government has not announced any legislative business yet for the special session, there is a buzz that the intent is to bring the 'one nation one election' bill. The idea of 'one nation one election' deals

with holding Lok Sabha and state assemblies' elections simultaneously. The idea has been very close to Prime Minister Narendra Modi's heart and he, on several occasions, pushed for it stating that it would reduce the cost of elections and give more time for governance. In January last year, the PM had said that the continuous cycle of elections results in politicization of everything and suffering of developmental works.

The talk is also high over the Women's Reservation bill. The bill seeks to provide 33 percent consider the introduction of the bill in the lower house. The bill was passed in the Rajya Sabha in 2010.

And finally, there are assumptions that the government may pass a resolution giving back State status to the Union Territory of Jammu & Kashmir - as Wednesday both the AG and SG, on instructions of the Central government told the Supreme Court that the status of the UT of J&K is only temporary - and thus pave the way for assembly elections in the state

ince enacting the National Education Policy 2020, India has sought to position itself as a twenty-first-century knowledge hub featuring globally competitive institutions of higher education. But the abrupt resignation of a young economist from one of the country's most prestigious universities, and the subsequent campus revolt over his exit, casts doubt on India's ability to realise this ambition.

In July, Sabyasachi Das, an assistant professor at Ashoka University, released a working paper alleging irregularities in India's 2019 general election. The study, which has not yet been peer-reviewed, suggested that Prime Minister Narendra Modi's Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) won a disproportionate share of closely contested constituencies because of electoral manipulation - namely, the selective culling of Muslims

To be sure, Das notes that the purported irregularities did not affect the outcome of the vote; the BJP won by a landslide. But given that Modi's party promotes a strident form of Hindu nationalism and views India's Muslim minority as electorally irrelevant, the spectre of electoral tampering is troubling.

The paper ignited a firestorm. Ashoka, a private liberal arts university

located outside New Delhi, sought to distance itself from Das, questioning both the relevance and integrity of his research. After university authorities subjected him to a gag order and launched a committee of inquiry, Das resigned. The economics department swiftly condemned the move, insisting that Das be unconditionally reinstated. Other university departments chimed in, and students have also voiced their discontent.

For decades, government has applied pressure – often indirectly to facilitate plausible deniability – on academics whose work contradicts official narratives. But since Modi came to power in 2014, that pressure has reached new heights. In 2021, the political scientist Pratap Bhanu Mehta, a vocal critic of Modi's policies, also resigned from Ashoka, writing that the university's founders made it "abundantly clear" that his association with the institution was a "political liability."

Moreover, the pressure on researchers, likely greater in lesser-known schools, extends beyond college campuses, as evidenced by the regulatory assault on the Centre for Policy Research, one of India's most highly regarded think tanks.

Modi's government seems to want foreign universities to set up outposts in the country and has invested heavily in select Indian universities designated as "Institutes of

Eminence." Yet the recent controversies suggest that India will not be a vishwaguru (teacher to the world), as Modi often boasts, unless both the government and university leaders credibly commit to uphold in-

India's academics must be free to explore controversial subjects and to publish politically uncomfortable findings. The university leaders tasked with creating these conditions are in an unenviable position, given the leverage that the government retains over institutions of higher education – a reminder that its regulatory control never disappeared, but merely evolved after liberalisation. Even private universities with diversified funding sources are not as shielded from political pressure as many had believed.

But that should not stop university administrators from broadcasting their unwavering support for faculty, even – or especially – when they take on contentious topics. In a globalised world, talented Indians who feel stifled at home can seek better opportunities abroad. Many have already done so: more than 225,000 Indians renounced their citizenship in 2022, the most in over a decade. The last thing Indian higher education needs is a mass exodus of talent, not least because the country's best performing university placed 149th in the latest QS World University Rankings.

Government supporters who deride dissenting thinkers as "anti-national" fail to recognise the merits of peer review – a painstaking process through which independent experts weed out subpar research. The controversial findings Das reported in his working paper may wither under scrutiny, but if they pass muster, his data and code will be open for all to scrutinise.

Unfortunately, this case represents the worst of all possible worlds: a promising researcher who felt compelled to leave his job; a prominent university facing a crisis of confidence, as faculty and students push back against administrators; and an abject failure to understand the basic principles of social-science research. As a result, India's liberal credentials have suffered another serious blow.

India, like all societies that aspire to academic excellence, cannot let ideology - emanating from either the left or the right - guide research, and Indian universities cannot abandon faculty who ask politically provocative questions. Otherwise, students - the human capital that is expected to fuel a "new India" - will become collateral damage, watching helplessly as the government snuffs out the spirit of inquiry.

Mumchance

he form and meaning of mumchance suggest it ought to be a close relative of mum in phrases like keep mum, stay silent. There is indeed a close connection, though the words have different origins. Mum is an imitative term known from the fourteenth century, while mumchance is sixteenth century, from Middle Dutch mommecanse, which has cousins in other Germanic languages and in French. Paradoxically, the link between the dice game and silence is the notoriously noisy carnival, since it was traditionally played in the Netherlands during such festivities, in particular by mummers, masked actors in dumb-show. Mumchance was always played in silence, hence the sense. The game of hazard, by the way, is the source of our word meaning a risk or danger. Mumchance seems to have been similarly perilous, as it evolved to mean a high-risk venture and continued in use in that sense after the dice game had been forgotten. The same name was also given to a card game, whose rules are as poorly recorded as those of the dice game, but which was also played in silence.

NEW DELHI SHOULD HAVE NO DOUBT THAT BEIJING HAS AN INCORRIGIBLE APPETITE FOR **TERRITORIES**

hina has done it again. Beijing has brought out a new map that claims vast swathes of Indian territory in the North-East and the entire South China Sea. That too after Narendra Modi's active participation in BRICS, subsequent one-to-one meeting with Xi Jinping and the perceived thaw in the relationship in the run-up to G20 Summit next week in New Delhi. All the efforts and expectations on normalisation of relations seem to end in smoke. As we have persistently maintained in this column, China's belligerence goes unabated, New Delhi needs to seriously rethink its China strategy.

The Chinese Ministry of Natural Resources brought out a map on 28 August that shows within China's borders all of Arunachal Pradesh and Aksai Chinn. Expectedly, New Delhi has reacted strongly to the new map. External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar said on 29 August that the Government of India, "is very clear about what is our territory and making absurd claims does not make other peoples' territories yours.' Recall, Beijing had in 2019 strongly objected to an Indian map showing the newly-created Union Territory of Ladakh. Despite India's clarification on the above said map. Beijing did not seem to withdraw its strong protest. Now, in response to India's protest, Chinese Foreign Ministry Spokesperson Wang Wenbin said that the map was a part of a routine exercise. "It is a routine practice for China to exercise sovereignty in accordance with the law. We hope the relevant side can stay objective and calm, and refrain from over-interpreting it." In fact, he is reiterating the claim made in the map. How ridicu-

It seems obvious that China is testing India. Also, the timing of the cartographic aggression is perhaps to undermine India's stature in the eyes of the world

as it hosts the powerful G20 Summit with several world leaders participating. New Delhi should have no doubt that Beijing has an incorrigible appetite for territories. It has territorial disputes with all its neighbours. It sees India as its competitor in the geopolitics of

the region. For now, New Delhi seems to contain China not confront it unless it is forced to. This may not work. Beijing should get the vibes from New Delhi that it will be ready to confront China at any time. From my conversations with Indian Armed Forces, they are willing and ready to take on China should such an eventuality occur. They are sure that the preparedness as well as the capacity of our Armed Forces is qualitatively much different from what it was in 1962. They say, "Although we may be smaller in size, our determination and commitment is greater than that of Chinese PLA

War is avoidable any day. In Indian tradition and culture. peace is always preferred to war. Remember, Lord Krishna's effort to achieve peace and avoid the epic battle of Mahabharata. He himself went to the Kuru dynasty in Hastinapur as the messenger of peace. Having noted that, let us also remember that Lord Krishna was clearly committed to protecting the virtuous (Dharma) and to destroying the evil (Adharma). While talking peace and giving everyone opportunities to embrace it, he was preparing for a decisive war to establish Dharma. As the omniscient God, he knew that war was inevitable, because of persistence

of Adharma by Kauravas. Although we have discussed many a time in this column India's prospective allies vis-àvis China it needs briefly recounting the arguments and analyses in the wake of the new map brought out by China. One strategic argument is that India should stand firm and resolute on its own. That goes without saying. But pragmatically and in view of global geopolitics, alliance-building is indispensable. Two countries have been important for India in relation to its China policy -- the United States and former Soviet Union, now Russia.

The prevailing perception about United States is that it likes to fish in the troubled water. It has done the doublespeak on Pakistan. While Washington recognised Pakistan as a terrorist hub, it continued to arm Pakistan perhaps to pres-

sure New Delhi. This has created lingering doubts about the dependability of the US as an ally.

The situation involving USA, China and India has drastically changed. It is no more India needing US support to confront China. It is US seeking India as an ally in containing China in the region. So, New Delhi's and Washington's interests for the first time in their bilateral history coincide. President Biden is making a maiden visit to New Delhi for the G20 Summit. His huge entourage indicates Biden's intention of consolidating ties with India. Modi should reciprocate and indicate India's willingness in deepening Indo-US ties in all possible sectors. At the same time, Modi should assert India's position to Chinese leadership through the G20 Summit and in the fringe meetings.

The traditional ally USSR does not exit any longer as it was. Its successor Russia is tied with its own troubles. By badly calculating the war on Ukraine Russia has saddled itself in selfcreated isolation. Russian 'strong man' Vladimir Putin cannot travel for fear of arrest issued by International Criminal Court. He did not go to Johannesburg to attend the BRICS Summit and cannot come to New Delhi for G20. So, relying on Russia to restrain China

is no more realistic. In sum, New Delhi cannot trust Beijing as the latter never keeps its words and excels in duplicity. Though Beijing is struggling to stabilise its economy and to cope with the Western boycott, it cannot restrain its territorial ambitions. New Delhi should never be lulled into complacency by its advisors, policymakers, so-called friendly countries; it must be ready for multi-pronged defence preparedness against China.

Destined for a future of hardship

THE ABSENCE OF **EDUCATION IS A SHARED CHALLENGE AMONG CHILDREN MIGRATING WITH OR WITHOUT PARENTS** nomic prosperity, masks a grim reality: marginalised and exploited children across rural and urban settings. These young lives, shackled by illiteracy, malnutrition, abuse, and exploitation, appear destined for a future of enduring hardship. Their transition to adulthood seems fraught with persistent adversity, perpetuated deprivation, and unrelenting exploitation, surpassing the challenges many adults face.

Despite extensive research by non-governmental organisations, international bodies, and the government, the scourge of child labour persists amidst India's economic progress. Disturbingly, children are ensnared in hazardous migration and trafficking, manipulated by unscrupulous agents and employers, subjecting them to brutal exploitation. Research has investigated the origins and driving forces behind child labour. identifying sectors where it thrives, scrutinising the State's role and legal framework, and advocating for improved working conditions and protections.

Within India, child migration across state boundaries is an escalating concern, marked by stag-

In India, the alluring prom-gering figures. The 2011 Census poverty, landlessness, inade-ise of a demographic divirevealed that India harbors the quate livelihoods, and low eduhuman trafficking. Profiteering ulation, comprising 18.9% (92.95 million) of the total population. This concerning trend is particularly noticeable in metropolitan areas where child labour is rampant, often involving hazardous jobs accompanied by exploitation and forced labour. Geographic patterns emerge. with certain regions serving as sources of migrant and trafficked child labour, while others become destinations for these unfortunate children Chronic poverty inequality, social discrimination, and natural disasters' aftermath drive this dichotomy, pushing families, including children, into distressing migrations for urban livelihoods, where they are often subjected to neglect and exploitation.

This reality necessitates urgent tailored strategies against child trafficking and migrant child labour. For instance, from Kalahandi, children migrate to states like Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, and Tamil Nadu, where brick kilns are the primary employers, highlighting the prevalence of child migrants in impoverished regions. These areas are characterised by cation levels, making rural households vulnerable, with children often accompanying their migrating families.

Despite economic growth, the persistence of these issues casts shadow on progress. Globalisation and modernisation haven't shifted societal attitudes towards child labour significantly. Paradoxically, even segments of middle-class prosperity indirectly rely on the toil of migrant child labourers. While India advances economically, exploiting vulnerable groups remains entrenched, coexisting with modernisation. Rural poverty and lack of assets drive impoverished households' reliance on adult and child labour migration.

Increased attention from national and international entities has drawn focus to the issue. Collaborative efforts strive to align domestic policies with international norms. Initiatives to identify, rescue, and rehabilitate child labourers have been implemented, though with mixed results.

Despite commendable efforts, the problem persists. The numbers of child labourers and trafficked youngsters continue to contributing communities remain stagnant due to dire poverty, illiteracy, unemployment, and

gender-based discrimination. Focusing on these complex issues requires multifaceted solutions. Strong legislation must be enforced to curb these practices. Source areas require sustained interventions such as livelihood programmes and education initiatives. Empowering women, eradicating discrimination, and eliminating factors perpetuating child labour and trafficking are imperative.

The absence of education is a shared challenge among children migrating with or without parents, with the latter facing more significant obstacles. Government intervention is crucial for establishing residential schooling and counseling facilities for at-risk children. Without such efforts, child migrant labour and trafficking will persist, robbing countless children of their rightful opportunities and futures.


Varanasi, August 31: A fresh application has been moved before Varanasi district judge by Rakhi Singh, the main plaintiff in the Shringar Gauri case, demanding survey of the 'wuzukhana' (ablution pond), excluding the purported 'Shivling' found in it last year, in the Gyanvapi mosque by the Archaeological Survey of India

The court has fixed September 8 for taking up the application.

The ASI, at present, is surveying the mosque complex, excluding the 'wuzukhana' in which the purported 'Shivling' was found during a court-mandated survey May 16, 2022.

The Varanasi district judge ordered this survey July 21 on an application filed by the other four plaintiffs in the Shringar Gauri case.

the ASI to conduct a scientific investigation of the Gyanvapi mosque compound using ground penetrating radar (GPR), excavation, dating method and other modern techniques to determine whether it has been constructed over a pre-existing structure of a Hindu temple.

This survey was to be conducted by excluding the 'wuzukhana' area, sealed on the orders issued by various courts May 17, 2022, May 20, 2022 and November 11, 2022

In view of the order, the ASI started the survey July 24 but the survey was stopped after a few hours, as the Supreme Court allowed the Anjuman Intezamia Masajid (AIM) to move the Allahabad High Court for relief.

August 2, the High Court dismissed the plea of AIM after which ASI resumed the survey from August 4. August 2, Rakhi Singh had moved an application before the Varanasi district judge to seek directions to preserve signs of Hindu temple on the

Further hearing on this application will also take place on September 8.

In the Shringar Gauri case, first filed in August 2021, Rakhi Singh and four other women plaintiffs are seeking regular worship of Shringar Gauri and other deities in the Gyanvapi mosque compound.

This plea led to the court-mandated survey in May 2022 in which a Shivling-like structure was found in the ablution pond of the compound. This case has now been clubbed with seven other cases of similar nature and being heard by the Varanasi

UP to reward power theft informers

Lucknow, August 31: A cash reward now awaits those who provide information about electricity theft anywhere in Uttar Pradesh to the UP Power Corporation Ltd.

The corporation may plan and announce a scheme in this regard very soon. "People who share information about power theft on Bijli Mitra Portal must be rewarded with some cash incentive to encourage more people," said UPPCL chairman Ashish Kumar Goel. He said a lot of people were giving information about power theft on the department's portal. He said the portal needed to be made more popular by announcing a cash reward on accurate tip-offs. Goel asked officials to make a policy in this regard very soon with the provision that names of informers did not come in public domain.

He also said there was a possibility of power theft on feeders with high power demand. He said a special watch should be kept on such feeders and action taken accordingly. Goel stressed the need for designing a portal for displaying the amount of assessment in power theft cases to bring about greater transparency.

AI TO SOLVE TRAFFIC WOES

Lucknow, August 31: The Lucknow administration will now implement traffic control through artificial intelligence (AI) at major intersections of the city

In this change, the help of sensors will be taken to control vehicles at the intersection.

For this, a new software which is already in place but not used often will be added to the signal system.

It is hoped that the move will help control the traffic scenario in the city which right now seems to be running out of control. Changes will be made in the

traffic signals installed in Lucknow under the Smart City According to the traffic department spokesman, there are

85 intersections in the city, of which 10 major intersections will have such a provision. With the help of sensor-based

integrated traffic management system (ITMS), the vehicle load in a particular direction will be detected and the green light will be given to that direction rather than the one which does not

"So far, three types of software are working in the traffic control system at ITMS. This AI-based software will be added to the system. Within a month, the system of controlling traffic through sensors will be implemented," said Ashish Srivastava, DCP Traffic, Lucknow.

"The measure will give relief from traffic jams at the intersection. It will also save time for commuters," he added.



Caste compounds Malana's garbage woes THE VILLAGE IS FAMOUS FOR ITS INDIGENOUS DEMOCRATIC SYSTEM AND RATHER INFAMOUS FOR

HOW THE NATIVES PERCEIVE OUTSIDERS — AS 'UNCLEAN' AND UNTOUCHABLE

Kullu, August 31: Nestled amid the picturesque landscape of the Himalayas, Malana village is wellknown for many reasons, the primary of which is the premium hashish that is produced here, nicknamed 'Malana Cream'.

It is also famous for its indigenous democratic system and rather infamous for how the natives perceive outsiders — as 'unclean and untouchable. The hamlet draws around 15,000 to 20,000 tourists every year during the peak season in April-June and September-October.

This mountain village is now grappling with a mounting garbage crisis which is marring the natural beauty. Piles of garbage welcome vou as vou enter the village, and along the way, the shiny wrappers of chips and chocolates are littered until even the remotest parts of the village.

Experts say that the surging influx of tourists coupled with the village's unique social and cultural practices have hindered effective waste management initiatives.

According to Pradeep Sangwan, founder of Healing Himalayas -- which conducted a clean-up drive in the village in 2019 -- the social fabric of the village impeded their campaign since the locals of the area identify themselves as descendants of Aryans, upper caste and refused to par-

The village is overwhelmingly homogenous with only 28 out of

Experts say that the surging influx of tourists coupled with the village's unique social and cultural practices have hindered effective waste management initiatives. The village is overwhelmingly homogenous with only 28 out of the 1,722 people identifying as Schedule Caste

the 1,722 people in the village identifying as Schedule Caste, according to the 2011 Census.

Sangwan tells of his experience in other villages while conducting a cleanliness drive.

"In other areas like Kaza town and Chitkul village, we always received strong support from the local panchayat and the community -- especially from the younger generation and educational institutions. In many villages, residents themselves also volunteered to collect the trash," he

This is in stark contrast to how the population reacted to the drive in Malana.

"Residents were not willing to clean their surroundings. We even obtained permission from the temple committee but they refused to participate due to their high social status. Some even said that they were willing to pay as much as required but they would not participate in any cleanliness drive. This was very discouraging for the volunteers,' Sangwan said, adding that the organisation has not organised any other cleanliness drives in the village since then.

"The villagers consider themselves special and sacred, leading them to believe that they cannot fully integrate with the general population. The local customs dictate that outsiders cannot touch Malanis, their temple or sacred platform," explains Vijay Kumar (42), who plies his taxi between Jari to Malana village entry point.

"The people of Malana believe that participating in such communal efforts may potentially expose them to individuals from lower castes -- and fear that this could incur the wrath of their deity Jamlu Devta. This fear, in turn, reinforces the practice of untouchability, further segregating them from others and isolating the village from participating in broader initiatives aimed at maintaining cleanliness and hygiene," Vijay says.

Raju Thakur (55), the Malana sarpanch agrees that the 'upper caste status' of the residents makes them hesitant to pick up garbage

"If outsiders are not allowed to touch us, how can we touch their garbage?" he wonders.

When asked about whether the

munity-led cleanup drive in the past, he evaded the question citing lack of funds as an excuse.

panchayat has initiated any com-

Swaru Thakur (82), one of the oldest residents of the village, blames 'outsiders' for dirtying their surroundings, saying that the tourists bring their trash and dump it in the village area.

Thakur's statement is not without merit. A spot near a water stream cutting across the village has a mound of plastic bottles, courtesy of the tourists.

According to Sharwan, a cafe owner, all of this is due to a misunderstanding.

The locals have a belief that water flowing through this stream is scared to Jamlu Devta. No outsider has to be allowed to cross the stream with 'outside' water, and therefore the tourists are asked to empty their water bottles before proceeding further. However, due to a language barrier tourists often misinterpret the villagers' intention thinking that they should discard their bottles, which is leading to a significant buildup of plastic waste there," he said.

No attempt has been made by the residents or panchayat to find an alternative to check the miscommunication.

The unsegregated solid waste is not only hampering the beauty of the village but also plaguing its only water source. Most of the garbage is dumped at the entrance of the village near Malana Nala.

"In certain areas, the river has completely changed its flow due to the garbage heaps," says the sole ASHA worker of the village Nirmal Devi.

No official study or testing has been done regarding the con-

tamination of water in the area. The deputy commissioner of Kullu Ashutosh Garg expressed concern over the garbage crisis in the Malana village.

"The administration has attempted numerous clean-up drives with NGOs and school children in the past but received no support from the village. No one came forward to participate.'

The official adds that there is a glimmer of hope as some of the vouth of the village have started leaving to pursue higher education, signalling a gradual shift in mindset and possible progress in future.

HP bans felling of mango, 5 other tree species

Shimla, August 31: The Himachal Pradesh government has announced a ban on felling mango and five other tree species.

Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu said apart from mango, the other species were Triyambal (Ficus species), Toon (Toona ciliata), Padam or Pajja (Prunus cerasus), Ritha (Sapindus mukorossi) and Baan (Quercus leucotrichophora).

All these six species have been brought under 10-year felling programme and these can now only



be axed with the permission from the Forest Department. However, under the new regulations the felling of a maximum of five trees in a year for domestic purposes

will be allowed, he said. The Chief Minister said there would be a total ban on export of timber and fuel wood of these species out of the state -- a measure to curb illegal trade and preserve the valuable resources.

'This ban is imposed keeping in mind to address the issue of illegal deforestation and to preserve biodiversity. A revised list of permissible tree species has been notified, allowing only 13 species to be felled with intimation to the Range Officer, while felling of the other species will require forest clearances. This step not only safeguards indigenous species but also plays a pivotal role in wildlife preservation," added the Chief Minister.



2 women among 3 of family beaten to death after pigs destroy crops

Ranchi, August 31: At least three persons, including two women, were beaten to death by around a dozen people Thursday after their pigs allegedly destroyed crops in their relative's farm on the outskirts of the Jharkhand capital, police said.

The incident took place in Jhanjhi Tola village in Ormanjhi police station area, around 25 km from the city, Ranchi Rural Superintendent of Police Haris Bin Zaman told PTL

"Pigs belonging to one family allegedly destroved crops in their relative's farm a few days back. A dispute had erupted between the two families over the issue. Around 11 am Thursday, around a dozen people armed with sticks and agricultural tools attacked the members of the other family. Three members of the family, including two women, were beaten to death by the mob," he said.

The deceased were identified as Janeswar Bedia (42), Sarita Devi (39) and Sanju Devi (25). The bodies were sent for post-mortem examination and police forces have been deployed in the village, he said.

Pragyan makes more discoveries on Moon

Another instrument onboard the Chandrayaan-3 mission's rover 'Pragyan' has confirmed the presence of sulphur in the lunar region by deploying a different technique, ISRO said

Bangalore, August 31: ISRO Thursday used an adorable mother-child reference and a term for the Moon most Indians have a nostalgic connect with—'chandamama'-- to inform the progress of the Chandrayaan-3 mission, as rover 'Pragyan' continued to make more discoveries on the lunar surface.

Another instrument onboard the Chandrayaan-3 mission's rover 'Pragyan' has confirmed the presence of sulphur in the lunar region by deploying a dif-

ferent technique, ISRO said. What caught the eye of many on X. formerly Twitter, Thursday was the mother-child mention by ISRO's official handle.

"The rover was rotated in search of a safe route. The rotation was captured by a Lander Imager Camera. It feels as though a child is playfully frolicking in the yards of Chandamama, while

the mother watches affectionately. Isn't it?" ISRO said in the post. The space agency released a video showing an automated hinge mechanism rotating the 18 cm tall APXS, aligning the detector head to be approximately five centimetres in proximity to the lunar surface.

ISRO further said the Alpha Particle X-ray Spectroscope (APXS) has detected sulphur, as well as other minor elements on the Moon.

"This finding by Ch-3 compels scientists to develop fresh explanations for the source of Sulphur (S) in the area: intrinsic?, volcanic?, meteoritic?,.....? read the post.

The Laser Induced Breakdown Spectroscope (LIBS) instrument onboard the rover has already confirmed the presence of sulphur. Detailed scientific analysis of these observations are in progress. The 26-kg, six-wheeled, solar-powered Pragyan rover is equipped to use its scientific instruments to record what the lunar soil and rocks are made of in the south polar region where Chandravaan-3 landed and it would also show how the readings contrast with that of the highland regions.

APXS instrument is best suited for in-situ analysis of the elemental composition of soil and rocks on the surface of planetary bodies having little atmosphere, such as the Moon, an ISRO statement said.

APXS observations have discovered the presence of interesting minor elements, including sulphur, apart from the major expected elements such as aluminum, silicon, calcium and iron.

In a first, England rolls out 7-minute cancer treatment jab

THE HEALTHCARE SYSTEM OF ENGLAND ANTICIPATES THE MAJORITY OF THE APPROXIMATELY 3,600 PATIENTS STARTING THEIR ANNUAL ATEZOLIZUMAB TREATMENT IN ENGLAND TO SWITCH ONTO THE TIME-SAVING INJECTION

New Delhi, August 31: An anticancer jab that can cut down treatment time for some by three quarters has been rolled out by National Health Service (NHS) England, the UK's publicly funded healthcare system.

The jab takes as little as 7 minutes to administer, NHS England said in a statement, adding that it will be the first health system in the world to roll out the sevenminute injection to hundreds of NHS cancer patients each year.

The vaccine has been approved by the Medicines and Healthcare products Regulatory Agency (MHRA), the statement said. MHRA is a UK state agency responsible for ensuring that medicines and medical devices work and are acceptably safe.

Currently, the patients receive the life-extending immunotherapy atezolizumab in hospital directly into their veins via a drug transfusion (intravenously), which can take from 30 minutes to up to an hour to administer, the statement said.

This anti-cancer jab, a subcutaneous or under-the-skin iniection, is swifter and is expected to enhance the patients' experi-



ence, it said. The quicker administration could also free up

valuable time for NHS cancer teams, it said

The healthcare system of England anticipates the majority of the approximately 3,600 patients starting their annual atezolizumab treatment in England to switch onto the timesaving injection. Atezolizumab is an immunotherapy drug, currently offered by transfusion that empowers a patient's own immune system to seek and destroy cancerous cells. The drug is administered to NHS patients with a range of cancers, including lung, breast, liver and bladder.

However, patients receiving intravenous chemotherapy in combination with atezolizumab may remain on the transfusion, the statement said."Maintaining the best possible quality of life for cancer patients is vital, so the introduction of faster underthe-skin injections will make an important difference," said NHS National Director for Cancer, Peter Johnson. "This is great news for both pa- 🛶

tients and clinicians. We welcome any new initiative that brings speedier treatment to patients and gives them more comfortable care," said Alexander Martin, a consultant oncologist at West Suffolk NHS Foundation Trust.

FOUR-QUARTER HIGH Q1 GDP GROWS AT 7.8%

India remains world's fastest growing emerging economy

New Delhi, August 31: India recorded GDP growth of 7.8 per cent during the April-June period of 2023-24, the highest in the past four quarters, on the back of double-digit expansion in the services sector, retaining its position as the world's fastestgrowing major economy.


The Gross Domestic Product (GDP) recorded a growth of 13.1 per cent in the first quarter (Q1) of 2022-23, 6.2 per cent in the second, 4.5 per cent in the third and 6.1 per cent in the last quarter.

India's 7.8 per cent GDP growth in the April-June quarter is higher than the 6.3 per cent recorded by China during the same period.

According to the National Statistical Office (NSO) data released Thursday, the agriculture sector gross value added (GVA) recorded a growth of 3.5 per cent up from 2.4 per cent in the April-June quarter of 2022-23. The expansion in 'financial, real estate and professional services' GVA was 12.2 per cent, up from 8.5 per cent in the yearago quarter.

A growth of 9.2 per cent has been witnessed by 'trade, hotel, transport, communication and services related to broadcasting sector', though lower than 25.7 per cent expansion in the year-ago quarter.

The manufacturing sector GVA too decelerated to 4.7 per cent in the first quarter of the current fiscal compared to 6.1 per cent in the year-ago period.

"Real GDP or GDP at constant (2011-12) prices in Q1 2023-24 is estimated to attain a level of ₹40.37 lakh crore, as against ₹37.44 lakh crore in Q1 2022-23, showing a growth of 7.8 per cent as compared to 13.1 per cent in Q1 2022-23," NSO said in a statement.

It further said the nominal GDP or GDP at current prices in the first quarter of 2023-24 has been estimated at ₹70.67 lakh crore, as against ₹65.42 lakh crore in the year-ago period, showing a growth of 8 per cent

as compared to 27.7 per cent in Q1 2022-23.

Fiscal deficit at 33.9% of full-year aim at end-July

New Delhi, August 31: The Centre's fiscal deficit in the first four months of 2023-24 touched 33.9 per cent of the full-year target, government data showed Monday.

In absolute terms, the fiscal deficit -- the gap between expenditure and revenue -- was ₹6.06 lakh crore as of end-July, according to the data released by the Controller General of Accounts (CGA).

The deficit stood at 20.5 per cent of the Budget Estimates (BE) in the corresponding period of the financial year 2022-23.

In the Union Budget, the government projected to bring down the fiscal deficit to 5.9 per cent of the gross domestic product (GDP) in the current 2023-24 financial year. The deficit was 6.4 per cent of the GDP in 2022-23 against the earlier estimate of 6.71 per cent.

Unveiling the revenue-expenditure data of the Union government for the April-July



period of 2023-24, CGA said the net tax revenue was ₹5.83 lakh crore or 25 per cent of the BE for the current fiscal. The net tax revenue collection was 34.4 per cent at end-July 2022.

The central government's total expenditure in the first four months stood at ₹13.81 lakh crore or 30.7 per cent of BE. The expenditure touched 28.6 per cent of the BE in the yearago period.

Of the total expenditure, ₹10.64 lakh crore was on the revenue account and ₹3.17 lakh crore was towards the capital account.

Fiscal deficit is the difference between the total expenditure and revenue of the government. It is an indication of the total borrowings that are needed by the government.

All-India House Price Index up 5.1% in Q1

Let's keep the momentum going and continue to revolutionize the way we make transactions with UPI!." NPCI, which run the payment system, said on social media platform X, formerly known as Twitter.

In July, UPI registered 9.96 billion transactions, with the total value for the month hitting ₹15.34 lakh crore, as per NPCI data.



UPI transactions have been

on the rise over the past few years owing to the arrival of several such interfaces, and people increasingly using them to make all sorts of payments, from small shopkeepers to big institutions preferring such modes of payment.

Unified payments interface (UPI) transactions rose manifolds between 2018 and 2022 in terms of value as well as volume, by 1,320 per cent and 1,876 per cent respectively. In 2018, UPI transactions in terms of volume stood at 374.63 crore, which went up by 1,876 per cent to 7,403.97 crore in 2022.In terms of value, the UPI transactions were ₹5.86 lakh crore in 2018, which went up by 1,320 per cent

By making it widely available, Baidu will be able to gain "massive" human feedback to improve the app at a swift pace, CEO Robin Li was quoted as saying in the statement.

Generative AI apps including chatbots such as ERNIE are trained on vast amounts of data as well as their interactions with



users so they can answer questions, including complex ones, in human-like language

according to the guidelines published this month.

When tested by AFP Thursday, ERNIE Bot easily answered mundane questions such as "What is the capital of China?" and "Do you have any hobbies?

China's bloody clampdown on the pro-democracy protesters at Beijing's Tiananmen Square in 1989, it said: "Let's change the topic and start again.'

Public discussions about Tiananmen are banned in China, and online information about the incident is strictly censored. When asked about Taiwan, a

self-ruling island that China claims as its territory, ERNIE Bot offered a longer answer. "Taiwan is part of the sacred

territory of the People's Republic of China," it responded. "China's sovereignty and territorial integrity cannot be violated or di-Then, it said: "Let's talk about

tion "Can we freely discuss any


topic?" ERNIE Bot replied: Yes, we can talk about any-



to New Zealand's 139/9.


