'INDIA' MAY BE DROPPED FROM CONSTITUTION

INDO-ASIAN NEWS SERVICE

New Delhi, Sept 4: The Narendra Modi-led Central government is reportedly planning to remove the word 'India' from the Constitution, sources in the know of things claimed, adding that a preparation pertaining to the proposal is underway.

The sources said that in the upcoming Special Session of the Parliament scheduled to be held from September 18-22, the government is likely to present Bills related to the 'India' word omission proposal.

If sources are to be believed, the government is seriously mulling removing the word 'India' from the expression 'India, that is Bharat', which has been used in the definition of India in Article-1 of the Indian Constitution. The agenda for the upcoming Special Session is, however, yet to be announced officially.

Kohima, Sept 4: In a move that has been assailed as "shooting the messenger", Manipur government Monday filed an FIR against the president and three members of the Editors Guild of India (EGI) accusing them of trying to ignite more clashes in the ethnic strife-ridden state.

Those booked include the

President of the EGI Seema Mustafa, and three members -Seema Guha, Bharat Bhushan and Sanjay Kapoor.

'Shooting the messenger'

The Press Club of India joined a number of bodies in condemning the filing of the case against the EGI fact finding team and termed it as "a strong arm tactic by the state government which amounts to intimidation of the apex media body

of the country".

Slamming the move, the Press
Club of India in a statement
said, "It is a case of shooting
the messenger rather than taking measures to restore peace
in the state. We demand that the

NATIONAL PARTIES DECLARE ASSETS WORTH ₹8,829CR IN FY 2021-22

New Delhi, Sept 4: The total assets declared by the eight national political parties increased to ₹8,829.16 crore during FY 2021-22 from ₹7,297.62 crore in 2020-21 and the highest assets were declared by the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) at ₹6,046.81 crore during FY 2021-22, poll rights body ADR said in its report Monday.

The Association for Democratic Reforms, an electoral reform advocacy group, in its report analysed the assets and liabilities declared by the BJP, INC, NCP, BSP, CPI, CPI(M), AITC and NPP – the eight national parties – for FY 2020-21 and 2021-22.

In financial year 2020-21, the BJP declared assets worth ₹4,990 crore, up by 21.17 per cent to ₹6,046.81 crore in 2021-22.

According to the ADR, in 2020-21, the declared assets of Congress was ₹691.11 crore, which shot up by 16.58 per cent to ₹805.68 crore in 2021-22.

The BSP was the only national party to show a decrease in its annual declared assets, its report said.

The total assets of BSP between 2020-21 and 2021-22 decreased by 5.74 per cent — from ₹732.79 crore to ₹690.71 crore.
The total assets of TMC in-

creased from ₹182.001 crore in 2020-21 to ₹458.10 crore, an increase of 151.70 per cent, the ADR said.

The total liabilities for FY 2020-21 declared by the national parties were ₹103.55 crore. The Congress declared liabilities of ₹71.58 crore, the highest, followed by CPI (M) with ₹16.10 crore, the ADR said.

For FY 2021-22, the Congress again was at top with liabilities

of ₹41.95 crore, followed by CPI (M) and BJP, which declared liabilities worth ₹12.21 crore and ₹5.17 crore.

Between 2020-21 and 2021-22, five parties declared a decrease in liabilities.

INC declared a decrease in its liabilities by ₹29.63 crore, BJP by ₹6.03 crore, CPI (M) by Rs 3.89 crore, AITC by ₹1.30 crore, and

NCP by ₹1 lakh.

The total capital/reserve fund set aside by the national parties during FY 2020-21 was ₹7,194 crore, and ₹8,766 crore for FY 2021-22, after adjusting for liabilities, the ADR said.

For FY 2021-22, the ADR said the BJP declared the highest capital with ₹6,041.64 crore.

China premier, not Xi, to attend G20 summit

New Delhi, Sept 4: Chinese President Xi Jinping will not be attending the G20 summit in New Delhi, which is scheduled to be held between September 9 and 10.

After days of uncertainty, the Chinese Foreign Ministry Spokesperson Mao Ning confirmed Jinping's unavailability for the G20 summit in a statement Monday. It said that Chinese premier Li Qiang will attend the summit in Jinping's place.

"At the invitation of the government of the Republic of India, Premier of the State Council Li Qiang will attend the 18th G20 India on September 9 and 10. Chinese Premier Li Qiang will attend the 18th G20 Summit in Delhi this weekend," Ning said in a statement.

Summit to be held in New Delhi,

"China hopes the summit can consolidate consensus, convey confidence and promote development," the spokesperson said.

The Chinese government did not disclose any reason for Jinping's inability to attend the G20 summit.

There is also uncertainty about Jinping attending the Association of South-East Asian Nations and East Asia summits in Indonesia's Jakarta later this week.



BAHANAGA TRIPLE TRAIN TRAGEDY

28 bodies still lie unclaimed

Bhubaneswar, Sept 4: Bodies of 28 passengers remain unclaimed and unidentified though three months have elapsed since the tragic triple train disaster near Bahanaga Bazar railway station in Odisha, an official said here Monday

The bodies have been kept in special freezers at AIIMS, Bhubaneswar and can be preserved for more time, medical superintendent of the hospital Dilip Parida said.

"We think no more claimants will come forward as no one has arrived in the last 10 days,' Parida said.

The bodies will be handed over to CBI after getting instruction from higher authorities as it has taken over the case, the official





said. AIIMS, Bhubaneswar received 162 bodies in two phases. Of them 28 bodies have remained unidentified as no claimant has

'We handed the bodies to the claimants after cross-matching DNA at the Central Forensic Science Laboratory (CFSL) at Delhi. Now, 28 bodies are still with us. We are waiting for instruction from the Railway ministry for further processing of the unclaimed bodies," Parida said.

More than 100 DNA samples were sent for genetic tests to identify the victims till now.

The tragedy involving Chennai-bound Coromandel Express, a stationary goods train and Yesvantpur-Howrah Express took place near Bahanaga Bazar station in Balasore district June 2 this year. At least 296 people were killed and over 1200 injured in the tragic mishap, considered one of the worst in the

Fund bungling: 2 engineers held

Bhubaneswar, Sept 4: Vigilance sleuths Monday arrested two engineers of Hindustan Steelworks Construction Limited (HSCL) for substandard work and misappropriation of funds in construction of hostels for SC students in Subarnapur dis-

Following allegations of substandard work and misappropriation of funds in construction of four hostels for SC students in Subarnapur under ST&SC Development department, Vigilance sleuths carried out searches at the office and residence of Sourav Dey, senior site engineer, and Saptarsi Goswamy, site engineer, of HSCL in Bolangir district and took them into custody.

The arrests were made in connection with a case (8 of August

26, 2023) registered under Sections 13(2) and 13(1)(a) of Prevention of Corruption (Amendment) Act. 2018 and 406. 409, 420 and 120B of the Indian Penal Code, a Vigilance official

Earlier, Bijay Kumar Agrawal, a Class A contractor, and his power of attorney holder Deepak Kumar Agrawal were arrested in connection with the case, added the official.

According to the case details, the ST&SC Development department had inked a pact with HSCL for execution of projects constriction of hostel buildings for SC&ST students in KBK districts - worth Rs 43.94 crore.

The project included construction of 26 120-seat ST hostels in Rayagada, eight 100-seat SC hostels in Bolangir and four 100-seat SC hostels in Subarnapur districts and three upgraded high school buildings at Gourmunda, Raska and Bijadore.

Following tenders, HSCL inked a pact with M/s Bijay Kumar Agrawal and his power of attorney Deepak Kumar Agrawal for construction of 12 hostel buildings with agreement value of Rs 8,12,30,877. The project included four 100-seat hostel buildings for SC students in Subarnapur district with an agreement value of Rs 2,71,24,207, the official said.

Dey and Goswamy, however, failed to supervise the work being carried out by contractors and, in connivance with them, facilitated release of payments.

"The public servants allowed the contractors to execute substandard work and misappropriate government funds, resulting in wrongful loss to the exchequer," the official.

IndiGo flight makes emergency landing

Bhubaneswar, Sept 4: A Delhibound IndiGo flight made an emergency landing at the airport here Monday due to some technical snag, an official said.

All passengers are safe, he said. The aircraft made the landing 40 minutes after taking off from the Biju Patnaik International Airport (BPIA).

"After the detection of technical problems mid-air, the Delhibound IndiGo flight made the emergency landing at the airport at 8.20 am," BPIA director Prasanna Pradhan said, adding that a full-scale emergency was declared, and the aircraft landed safely. "Shortly after taking off, the pilot informed us about the technical problem and the aircraft made the landing at BPIA safely," Trinath Lenka, a passenger on the flight, said.

LOC against three more Chinese over ponzi scam

Bhubaneswar, Sept 4: The Bureau of Immigration has issued a lookout circular (LOC) against three Chinese nationals in connection with an online ponzi scam case registered by the Economic Offences Wing (EOW) of the state Crime Branch, an official said Monday.

The Bureau of Immigration issued the lookout circular against Liu Huan, Wenhui Zheng and Xu Xiaolu, considered close associates of Guanhua Wang, the prime accused and mastermind of the scam, at the request of the EOW. A lookout notice was issued

against Wang, a 40-year-old resident of Hangzhou in China, in connection with the online scam a few days ago, the EOW official said.

The EOW had registered a case against the pan-India online ponzi scam involving fraud and siphoning off money to the tune of hundreds of crores from innocent people out of India using a complex network of mule bank accounts, shell companies and crypto-traders, he said.

Wang along with the other three Chinese nationals came to India in 2019 and stayed in Bangalore for a few months. They created at least 14 shell companies based in the southern city to run various cyber-financial frauds. Initially, they had focused on the 'killer loan apps' but after these were banned, they switched over to the fraudulent earning and betting apps.

During investigation, the EOW detected more than 85 bank accounts through which Rs 100 crore was transacted. The accused had used numerous mule_ directors; some of them housewives to cheat the people.

Teenage smoking can damage offspring genes

New findings suggest a failure to address harmful exposures in young teenagers today could damage the respiratory health of future generations, further entrenching health inequalities for decades to come

oys who smoke in their early teenage years risk damaging the genes of their future children, increasing their chances of developing asthma, obesity and low lung function, a new study has said.

Researchers from the UK-based University of Southampton and the University of Bergen in Norway investigated the epigenetic profiles of 875 people, aged 7 to 50, and the smoking behaviours of their fathers.

They found epigenetic changes at 19 sites mapped to 14 genes in the children of fathers who smoked before the age of 15.

These changes in the way DNA is packaged in cells (methylation) regulate gene expression (switch-



ing them on and off) and are associated with asthma, obesity and wheezing.

"Changes in epigenetic markers were much more pronounced in children whose fathers started smoking during puberty than those whose fathers had started smoking at any time before conception,"

said Negusse Kitaba, Research Fellow at the University of Southampton.

'Early puberty may represent a critical window of physiological changes in boys. This is when the stem cells are being established which will make sperm for the rest of their lives,"Kitaba added

According to Gerd Toril Morkve Knudsen from the University of Bergen and co-lead author of the study, 16 of the 19 markers associated with father's teenage smoking had not previously been linked to maternal or personal smoking.

This suggests these new methylation biomarkers may be unique to children whose fathers have been exposed to smoking in early puberty. 'Our studies have shown that

the health of future generations depends on the actions and decisions made by young people today long before they are parents - in particular for boys in early puberty and mothers/grandmothers both prepregnancy and during pregnancy,' said Professor Cecilie Svanes from the University of Bergen.

The new findings have significant implications for public health. They suggest a failure to address harmful exposures in young teenagers today could damage the respiratory health of future generations, further entrenching health inequalities for decades


The SCU sleuths arrested the accused persons in connection with a case initially registered at Chandaka police station following directions of the JMFC (Judicial Magistrate First Class)

court here in 2022. "The complainant, Sanjukta Panigrahi, a native of Ganjam, had alleged in her plea before the court that her plot in Paikrapur Mouza of the City was sold to two different persons in 2019 without her knowledge," SCU stated in a press note.

The cops, during the course of investigation, found that one Chinmaya Dalei of Nayagarh contacted accused Biswajit who shared his name and mobile number in online property portals to target and collect prospective customers. Subsequently, Chinmaya came to know Bikash through Biswajit.

Bikash assured Chinmaya to help him get a good piece of land on the City outskirts.

"Accordingly the accused duo,



in a criminal conspiracy with Simanchal and Prasanna, forged sale deed of the plot owned by Sanjukta and sold 100 dcml to Puspalata Swain and Kamala Swain with help of an imposter as the landlord," told a senior official of SCU.

The accused Sanjaya, the head clerk of Khandagiri sub-registrar, helped the fraudsters during the registration of the plot, falsely claiming that the land owner is sick, June 26, 2019.

Sanjay who was supposed to visit Sanjukta's house in Ganjam for examination prepared a false report in which he confirmed that the complainant was ailing by identifying the imposter as Sanjukta. The land was transferred to the buyers with help of the false report produced by Sanjaya.

"During house search of the accused persons, forged land records. Adhar card and seals of different offices were seized, which were used to prepare the forged sale deed and other land records," added the senior SCU

The accused were Monday produced before the court that sent to judicial custody.

Covid vaccines in India pose no heart attack risk

here is no association between the Covid-19 vaccines used in India --Covishield and Covaxin -- and increase in the risk of heart attacks, according to an observational study which emphasises the protective effect of the jabs.

The research, published recently in the journal PLOS One, determined the impact of Covid-19 vaccination on mortality following acute myocardial infarction (AMI) or heart attack.

The retrospective study used data from 1,578 people admitted to GB Pant hospital in Delhi between August 2021 and August 2022. As many as 1,086 (68.8 per cent) were vaccinated against Covid-19 while 492 (31.2 per cent)

were unvaccinated. Among the vaccinated group, 1,047 (96 per cent) had received two doses of the vaccine while 39 (4 per cent) had received only a single dose.

"Our study found that vaccines used in India are safe. There was no association of vaccination in India with heart attack. In fact, the study found that there were less chances of death after heart attack in vaccinated individuals," Mohit Gunta, who led the study, from GB Pant Hospital, told PTI.

The adverse effects (AEs) of Covid-19 vaccines have mostly been mild, transient and selflimiting. However, concerns have been raised regarding the cardiovascular adverse effects of these vaccines

Any side effect can have catastrophic effects especially in large



densely populated countries such as India. the authors noted.

In all the enrolled patients. data regarding the patient's vaccination status including details on type of vaccine, date of vaccination and adverse effects were obtained.

The researchers found that the analysis did not show a specific clustering of AMI at any particular time post vaccination, suggesting there was no significant association between Covid-19 jabs and heart attacks.

On 30-day follow-up, all-cause mortality occurred in 201 (12.7 per cent) patients with adjusted odds of mortality being significantly lower in the vaccinated

Similarly, at six months of follow-up, the vaccinated AMI group had lower odds of mortality as compared to the non-vaccinated group.

Covid-19 vaccines showed a decrease in all-cause mortality at 30 days and six months following AMI, according to the

However, increasing age, diabetics and smokers had a higher risk of 30-day mortality, the re-

"Findings of our study showed that the 30-day and six months all-cause mortality risk was significantly lower in the vaccinated subjects as compared to the unvaccinated population," the authors of the study said

This study is the first to be conducted among a larger population of AMI patients which has shown Covid-19 vaccine to be not only safe but also have a protective effect in terms of reduction of all-cause mortality both on short term as well as at six months of follow-up, the authors

of the study said. They noted some limitations, saving that this was a single centre retrospective study, and the findings need to be validated in further larger studies from different ethnic groups.

OSOU closure fear sparks outrage

Sambalpur, Sept 4: The demand to resume post graduate (PG) and under graduate (UG) courses in the Odisha State Open University (OSOU) has increased since the varsity stopped admissions to these two programmes from the current academic session. The OSOU has been forced to close the two programmes due to lack of approval from the UGC

Annoyed by the state of affairs of the varsity, which was set up by the Odisha government in 2015, a group of residents here under the aegis of 'OSOU

Banchao Abhiyan' announced plans Sunday to launch a campaign to save the varsity. They are planning to submit a memorandum to CM Naveen Patnaik, Union Education Minister. Dharmendra Pradhan and all MLAs and MPs of this region.

According to the members of the committee, OSOU received approval to offer 14 PG programmes and 11 UG programmes in 2018-19, valid for a period of five years. However, the approval lapsed in 2022-23.

Convener of the 'OSOU Banchao Abhiyan', Dr Sanjeeb Mishra said, according to the rules, universities seeking fresh

approval from UGC must have at least 60% of self-learning materials, three teachers for each UG or PG programmes or five teachers if both UG and PG programmes are offered and NAAC accreditation.

However, Mishra pointed out that unfortunately, the varsity does not have its own infrastructure. Moreover, though more than six years have elapsed since its inception, the state government has not sanctioned teaching posts. 'The Odisha government has

completely forgotten the varsity which caters to a large number of people from rural areas and women. Thousands of students from across the state benefit from OSOU courses. We ask the government to appoint teachers, provide required infrastructure so that the institution will be able to secure fresh UGC approval," Mishra said. "We will also urge the Union Education Minister to intervene and give necessary direction to the UGC in this regard," he added.

Alarming fall in Indravati water level

POWER PRODUCTION. AGRICULTURE AFFECTED DUE TO LACK OF SUFFICIENT WATER SUPPLY FROM RESERVOIR

Nabarangpur, Sept 4: The reducing water level in the Indravati reservoir due to scanty rainfall might seriously affect power production and irrigation facilities in the region, sources informed Monday. This year, rainfall has drastically declined in the region in comparison to previous years. Officials said that the rainfall has decreased by more than 40 per cent

The Indravati reservoir is spread over 110 square kilometres touching the borders of Nabarangpur, Koraput, Rayagada and Kalahandi districts in Odisha.

The Indravati reservoir has the highest water-retaining capacity of 642 metres but due to sparse showers, the level has come down to 631.41 metres. Locals pointed out that the re-

Indravati reservoir will certainly affect power production. Incidentally, the reservoir is the hub of Indravati hydro-electricity project. It is the second largest hydro-electricity project in Asia.

The highest water-retaining capacity of the reservoir stands at 642 metres while the minimum level which has to be maintained is 625 metres. Till

September 1, the water level stood at 640 metres. However, in just three days, the water level has decreased by close to 10 metres.

Officials stated that 71.21 cusecs of water is entering the reservoir per second while 89.54 cusecs are being discharged. They added that if such a situation persists a time will come when water will not be available for irrigation or for power production. Locals

There has been 40% deficit rainfall in Nabarangpur district due to which the reservoir is not getting sufficient supply of water

Prithwiraj Paikaray and Sadashiv Jani said that if such a situation develops cultivation of crops will be seriously hampered. They informed that the present signs are ominous indeed.

Nabarangpur district has experienced 40 per cent deficit rainfall in August for which farmlands have dried and developed cracks due to lack of water. Lack of sufficient rainfall has sparked fear of drought among farmers in the district.

Last year during the period August 1 to August 31, the power

production from the hydro-electricity project stood at 1,63,056 megawatt (MW). For the same period this year the production has come down to 1,61,417 MW. It is being apprehended that due to deficit rainfall, the power production will further decrease in the days to come.

Janardan Tahsildar, executive officer of Podagada dam division said that the reduction in power production will also hit the revenues of the Odisha government. The state government earns substantial revenues by selling power from the project.

Locals said that the situation will go out of control unless there is sufficient rainfall in Nabarangpur district in the month of September. They also added that the Odisha government must take immediate steps to control the water crisis the reservoir is facing.

Doctor found hanging inside Berhampur house

Berhampur, Sept 4: A 51-yearold government doctor was found dead Monday in Gajapati district, police informed. The doctor, identified as Surendra Nath Rath, was working at the district headquarters hospital in Paralakhemundi, they added. Rath was found dead at his inlaws' house at Shakti Nagar under Gosaninuagaon police station in this city, police further said.

Rath's family said that he hung himself from the ceiling fan of a room in the house. The body has been sent for post-mortem to the MKCG Medical College and Hospital, police said. He went to his in-laws' house Friday where his wife and two sons lived. He used to visit the house on most Fridays and stay over during the weekend, police added.

Rath went to sleep Sunday night with his elder son. When

the son woke up, he could not find his father and started search-

ing for him. The family found another room locked from inside and after breaking in, they found his body hanging from the ceiling fan, police said. 'We have registered a case of

Pope & Putin

n a bizarre turn of events, Pope Francis has been caught in a crossfire of sorts in the raging war between Russia and Ukraine. He is solely to blame for unwittingly championing Russia's cause and helping President Vladimir Putin reinforce Russia's territorial, spiritual and cultural claim over Ukraine. Kyiv, as is natural, is bristling with anger at the Pope. The bone of contention is the Pope's recent video speech to the All-Russian Meeting of Catholic Youth in St Petersburg, urging them to "not forget their heritage." It has struck a discordant note in international political discourse, not so much for its religious content as for the Pope's unstinted praise of the heritage of "Mother Russia," which he urged his listeners to never give up. Surprisingly, the Pope's words echoed what Putin and his propaganda team has been saying all these years to justify Russia's claim that Ukraine is its integral part. The Pope told the Russian Catholic youth that they are descendants of great Russian saints, rulers, "Peter I, Catherine II,

Precisely, such invocation of Russia's imperial legacies has been regularly used as a historical justification for the military invasion of Ukraine. In this context, the Pope's exhortation has turned out to be particularly insensitive and unwarranted. Putin has been politicising religion in Russia's imperial design to grab territories in its neighbourhood. In fact, the Kremlin's official discourse since 2014 has claimed Kyiv as "the mother of Russian cities" on the back of shared religious heritage. Putin has used the history of the Russian empire and Soviet Union to assert, on the eve of the invasion, that Ukraine was "an inalienable part of our own history, culture and spiritual space." Last February's invasion was preceded by Putin's 7,000-word essay "On the historical unity of Russians and Ukrainians.'

Rewriting a country's history and interpreting it to suit the interests of a particular regime or ruler has been a trend in different countries. The process is sought to be legitimised through indoctrination of the country's people from the school level. Under Putin's regime, new school textbooks depict the "special military operation" in Ukraine as part of the country's historical mission. Though this exercise has gained fresh impetus in recent years, the Russian government launched a special commission in 2009 "to counter attempts to falsify history." The efforts to 'correct' history intensified as discontent with Putin's leadership grew. The intolerance to an objective, critical appraisal of history assumed such proportions that in 2021, Memorial, the human rights group founded to document Soviet political terror and its victims, was closed midway through its work.

The national ideology deployed by the Russian Federation over the past decade is one that glorifies the imperial past. Such glorification is closely linked with Russia's self-proclaimed role as a religious authority. Legacies of the empire - among them territorial conquests, cultural subjugation and religious dogma – have been appropriated by the Kremlin to provide the basis for Russia's invasion of Ukraine. This is why Ukraine calls the Pope's praise of the heritage of the Russian empire unfortunate since it seems to overlook how the history of both the Orthodox church and the Russian empire have been weaponised in Russia

The clarification from the Vatican that the Pope had no intention to justify the invasion has, so far, failed to assuage the feelings of the Ukrainians. More so because the Pope had earlier questioned the sagacity of Ukraine's decision to seek NATO membership.

Religious leaders would do well to steer clear of politics at this crucial stage in history lest their words be used to justify wrongs.

ONE NATION ONE ELECTION **WILL REQUIRE AMENDMENTS TO AT LEAST FIVE ARTICLES OF THE** CONSTITUTION

he government of India has set up a highlevel committee (HLC) to examine and make recommendations on holding simultaneous elections across the country, for national and State legislatures and also village, town and city councils. The committee is chaired by former President of India Ram Nath Kovind. The terms of reference of the HLC say that it is expected to examine requisite amendments to the Constitution, recommend a possible solution to problems like a hung house, defections or no-confidence motions, suggest safeguards to ensure continuity of the cycle of one-election only, of logistics of EVMs, and the use of a single electoral roll for all elections. Obviously, this is a very ambitious agenda for the HLC.

Popularly known as one-nation one-election (ONOE), this was in the 2014 manifesto of the BJP. During 2015 and 2016 it was the subject matter of a Parliamentary Standing Committee, and the subject matter of a communication between the Principal Secretary to the Prime Minister and the Election Commission of India (ECI), and a Union Law Ministry's report sent to ECI. In 2017, President Pranab Mukherjee made a mention of ONOE in his address on the eve of Republic Day Later that year the Niti Aayog published a discussion paper on this topic. In 2018, President Kovind in his joint address to the two Houses of Parliament indicated the desirability of holding simultaneous elections. ONOE has thus been around in discussions for at least nine years now.

The rationale for ONOE is that it will reduce the excessive spending on elections since we seem to be always in election mode. It will remove roadblocks to development caused by the model code of conduct which is in force during elections. And it will reduce large scale deployment of security forces for prolonged periods of time during elections. Each one of these three issues can be questioned.

For instance, if there is excess spending on elections, who is doing it? The government's own spending is not even 0.1% of its total budget, both at the Centre and the state level. This is as per accounts submitted by the ECI or the State Election Commissions. The "excessive" expenditure is actually what is spent by candidates and political parties. This too is not confirmed in official documents. As per accounts submitted to ECI, on an average the official spending by candidates is not even 50% of the permissible ceiling. The candidates are at least officially, underspending not overspending. So, this means that much of the spending is via black money. Prime Minister Modi himself has said that electoral reforms are necessary to get rid of black money. But neither the candidates nor the parties have ever complained or seem to be bothered about excessive spending. If that were so, then a major step forward to get rid of black money would have been to legislate complete transparency on the source and use of funds by political parties. But parties have repeatedly resisted being subjected to the Right to Information Act. The introduction of electoral bonds has made political funding even more opaque since the source and destination can no

longer be connected by the voter. Secondly, it is also not clear whether the imposition of the

model code of conduct seriously hinders developmental work by incumbent governments. If the prime motivation is reducing the evil influence of money power, then several electoral reforms and funding transparency laws can be introduced, without going toward ONOE. But be that as it may, let us examine the hurdles in going toward ONOE? Here are five of them.

Firstly, it will require amendments to at least five Articles of the Constitution. These are Articles 83, 85, 172, 174 and 356. This will need two thirds ma-

jority in both Houses Secondly even if the amendments go through, their validity is likely to be challenged in Supreme Court. This is because these amendments affect the federal character of the Constitution. The federal character of the Constitution is part of the basic structure of the Constitution, which cannot be amended as per the landmark 1973 judgement of the SC. We can do so, only by writing a new Constitution, which needs a new Constituent Assembly. This is thus an enterprise with implications which go far beyond ONOE.

Thirdly, implementing ONOE will require much more paraphernalia for the conduct of elections, of which the security forces and arrangements would be paramount. Even for one large state like Uttar Pradesh, elections had to be conducted in seven phases

spread over two months, mainly to ensure law and order and prevent violence. Imagine conducting national, state and local elections at one go. The re quirement of security forces election observers, returning officers and other resources, as also EVMs would completely overwhelm the current capac ity. What if even one accident or sabotage happens which will vitiate the entire process, and "ring fencing" such incidents will bring constitutional difficulties. The precision and synchronisation effort required are formidable, and unless capac ity is substantially enhanced this is going to be a hurdle.

Fourthly, how to deal with gov ernments which fall in middle of the term? And what about premature dissolution before the completion of full terms? This is a democratic prerogative which cannot be denied. Of the 17 Lok Sabhas, 8 were prematurely dissolved. Will the mid-term fall of a government or dissolving of a legislature be only replaced by President's rule? That would be even more detrimental to democratic norms and aspirations of the people. The ONOE also undermines the effort of empowerment of the third tier, by having directly elected mayors.

Fifth, it is not clear that excessive spending will come down, which is the prime motive behind ONOE. Since more than 90% of spending on elections is black money from unaccounted sources, it needs to be tackled differently. And it won't simply go away with ONOE. Strong reforms have been proposed by Law Commissions, the Election Commission and citizens' groups, for over two decades. But not much has been done by lawmakers to reduce black money in elections. ONOE is not likely to make a dent, and that is its very purpose. Much debate and discussion are expected in the coming days, but the road ahead for ONOE is bumpy for sure.

n that descriptive British term for becoming upset or angry, the heir to the throne has been getting his knickers in a twist over the implications of nanotechnology, a new field in which scientists are learning to manipulate matter pretty much atom by atom. He is reported to have called on the Royal Society to discuss the risks of this new technology, which has left British researchers somewhat bewildered, as they consider there is no significant peril in what they're doing. King Charles's attitude towards the field has been described as nanophobia, yet another addition to the cornucopia of nano- terms that have appeared in the past decade, as the implications of this new technology have begun to filter through to the general public. It's a comment on the huge advances made in our understanding of the very small that the prefix nano- is first recorded only in the 1940s, when it became necessary to specify sub-units that were a factor of a thousand million smaller (10-9). It was used first in measurements of small electric currents (nanoamps), or powers (nanowatts), small volumes of liquid (nanolitres), and the like. Whimsical computer scientists have since invented nanoacre, for an area about 2mm square on the surface of a microchip. It was the publication in 1986 of Eric Drexler's book The Engines of Creation that brought to most people's attention the idea that it might be possible to directly manipulate matter at the atomic level. He didn't invent the term nanotechnology - it's first recorded from 1974 but he certainly gave it its current associations, based on the fact that the size of atoms and molecules is in the nanometre range. Many technologists use nanotechnology or nanotech to mean any way to construct things on the nanoscale, such as the creation of ever-smaller microchips. However, Drexler meant two ideas in particular by the term. One was to create new substances, or better ways of making existing materials, by moving atoms one by one to where we want them to be. The other was the creation of molecular-sized machines, capable of carrying out a variety of useful functions semi-autonomously. Sciencefiction writers sometimes call these nanomachines, nanobots (where bot is from robot), nanites, or nanos for short. These might, to take an example, monitor a person's health, as Greg Bear imagined in Moving Mars: "Medical nano filled my bloodstream, rooting out problems, controlling my tendency to slip into shock". Nanos might act as construction tools, turning raw materials into useful objects, acting as nanoassemblers, as in The Hammer of God by Arthur C Clarke: "Luckily all the necessary components are standard items - propellant tanks, thrusters, control systems, and the framework to hold them together. So the nanoassemblers can build ATLAS in a few days". One of the key abilities of these machines would be to make copies of themselves self-replicating machines, or replicators. This is where Charles's worries arise. Somebody evidently told him about grey goo, the unlovely name for what would result if such tiny machines ever got out of control and turned the world and everybody on it into an amorphous atomic soup. Nobody seems to have explained to him that for the foreseeable future the concept lies strictly in the realm of science fiction.

of allies Japan and South Korea to Camp David to discuss how to contain China and counter Russia's influence, for example in Africa's Sahel region, which has recently experienced a string of coups d'état. Leaders from BRICS countries - Brazil, Russia. India, China, and South Africa – gathered in Johannesburg to criticise the West's dominance over international institutions established after World War II. It was enough to give Cold War historians déjà vu.

The West's main adversary today is China, not the Soviet Union, and the BRICS is no Warsaw Pact. But with the world entering a period of uncertainty following the demise of the post-Cold War order, the parallels are sufficient to convince many to turn to pre-1989 conceptual models to gain insight into what might come next. This includes the US and China, though each is betting on a different model. Between the end of WWII and the fall of the Berlin Wall, the two main forces defining the international order were ideological conflict, which split the world into two camps, and the quest

'S President Joe Biden re- for independence, which led to the a US-led bloc, President Jinping Saudi Arabia, and the UAE – would proliferation of states, from 50 in 1945 to over 150 in 1989-1991. While the two forces interacted, ideological conflict was dominant: struggles for independence often morphed into proxy wars, and countries were forced either to join a bloc or define themselves by their "non-alignment."

The US seems to think a similar dynamic will dominate this time around. Faced with its first peer competitor since the fall of the Soviet Union, the US has sought to rally its allies behind a strategy of "decoupling" and "de-risking" – essentially an economic version of the Cold War policy of containment. Whereas the US may be expecting Cold War II, shaped primarily by ideological polarisation. China seems to be betting on global fragmentation. Yes, it has tried to offer non-Western countries an alternative to Western-dominated institutions such as the G7 or the International Monetary Fund. But, in China's view, the quest for sovereignty and independence is fundamentally incompatible with the formation of Cold Warstyle blocs. Instead. China expects a multipolar world. While China cannot win a battle against its place as a great power in a fragmented global order.

Even America's closest allies are not immune from the trend toward fragmentation, despite US leaders' best efforts. Consider the recent Camp David summit. Though some media were quick to herald a "new cold war," the participants' interests diverged in several ways. South Korea's main focus remains North Korea, and the intelligence-sharing agreements and nuclear consultations announced after the summit were as much about signaling their resolve to push back against North Korean dictator Kim Jongun's regime as they were about countering China. Japan, for its part, is eager to avoid strategic escalation over Taiwan – a development that would threaten its economic model, which depends significantly on trade with China (including in semiconductor-related technology). And both South Korea and Japan are unhappy with the zeal with which America is pursuing its de-risking strategy.

Perhaps the biggest surprise last week was the BRICS' announcement that six countries -Argentina, Egypt, Ethiopia, Iran, the beginning of next year. Presummit editorialising notwithstanding, China is under no illusion that countries like Saudi Arabia and the UAE will join it in a bona fide anti-Western bloc; China's goals are more subtle.

Joining the BRICS increases countries' freedom of action for example, by increasing access to alternative sources of financing or, eventually, providing a genuine alternative to the US dollar for trade, investment, and reserves. A world in which countries are not dependent on the West, but free to explore other options, serves China's interests far better than a narrower, more loval pro-China alliance ever could.

Contrary to how it may appear to many, not least in the US, the new cold war seems to be based not on the old logic of polarisation, but on a new logic of fragmentation. Judging by the growth of the BRICS, there is no shortage of countries that find that new logic enticing.

Cong eyes Raj return with freebies

Jaipur, Sept 4: Free mobiles, free ration kits and free power till 100 units...Rajasthan Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot has announced a series of freebies as assembly polls approach near, aiming to make a comeback in the state for next tenure.

Eventually, the million dollar question is, will these freebies help Congress in making a come back in Rajasthan? While Congress seems confident of making a comeback via these free schemes and its social security announcements, the BJP, on the other hand, has been questioning the ruling government in Rajasthan over the highest petrol diesel prices, poor law and order state, and power crisis in the state.

A senior Congress worker said, "CM seems confident that the people of Rajasthan will reelect Gehlot govt. We have taken care for each segment of society. With the aim of women empowerment and reducing the digital divide, one crore women have been announced to be given smartphones under the Indira Gandhi Smartphone Scheme. So far we have given smartphones to 40 lakh women. Next. all 1 crore women will be given a guarantee card, so that they will be able to easily get smartphones from the government in the coming times

Gehlot has also announced to give free ration kits to 33 lakh people. According to the Chief Minister, families deprived of the benefits of the National Food Security Scheme will be given free ration kits. At the same time, kits will also be provided to those people who are taking advantage of the National Food

Security Scheme and are in need. CM has already announced to give LPG cylinder to families below the poverty line (BPL) and beneficiaries of the Ujjwala scheme in Rajasthan for Rs 500, with Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot approving a financial proposal of Rs 750 crore

However, the opposition BJP has termed these announcements as 'Chunavi Revdis'.

BJP state president CP Joshi said that the people of the state are suffering due to the false claims and promises of the Congress government. "Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot has promised free electricity, but as he

couldn't take concrete steps for power generation, the power crisis has deepened in the state. As a result, today there is no electricity for 10 hours in the villages and also in the cities. A packed schedule, cut-throat competition, constant pressure to do better, the burden of parents' expectations and homesickness are the common struggles of students

Kota, Sept 4: Amid the rising number of suicides by NEET and JEE aspirants in this coaching hub, District Collector OP Bunkar wrote a letter to encourage them and assured that he and his team were by their side. In the inspirational letter he penned down Sunday, Bunkar asked students not to get defeated by failure, saying, "If one road closes, other roads are open and waiting for you."

"I and my team are with you," he said, adding, "You are not alone in the city. I am here (main hoon na), doors of my office and home are always open for every student, Don't hesitate, Learn to share the stress. Whatever kind of fear or stress you have, do share it with me."

The collector directed coaching institutes, hostels, and paying guests to put up his letter on their display boards.

Over 2.5 lakh students move to Kota annually to prepare for competitive exams such as the Joint Entrance Exam (JEE) for engineering and the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test (NEET) for admission to medical colleges. The year 2023 has seen the highest number of student suicides - 22 so far - with two ending their lives in a gap of a few hours on August 27. Last year, the figure was 15.A packed schedule, cut-throat competition, constant pressure to do better, the

burden of parents' expectations and homesickness are the common struggles of the students here. In his letter, the Kota collector expressed concern over the suicide incidents and urged students not to get disheartened over failures. Referring to the students who recently allegedly died by suicide here, Bunkar wrote, "You have gone, but before going, you should have thought what would happen to your parents who were committed to fulfilling your dreams by willingly

"You all became members of my family on the very first day you reached this city to fulfil your dreams and I am constantly in an effort to care for you and to provide you a happy environment here," the collector wrote to the students

sacrificing whatever they had.'

Bunkar, in his letter, also recollected the joyous time he spent during interaction with some students.

"All of you work very hard to attain your target," the collector said, adding, "If one road is closed, several other roads are open and waiting for you."

"With a little fall in ranking in a test, you take yourself broken down, sink into tension and pack yourself in a room and continue to think that nothing could happen now," Bunkar pointed out to the students, while adding that "failure is the first step to success" and none of their failures was a parameter to decide their personality.

The collector exhorted the students to explore the city and visit the nature parks and recreation centres for relaxation.

He also advised students to take some time out to meet friends and for other fun activities so that they feel refreshed.

Concluding his letter to students with an inspirational note, the Kota DC said, "Dear students, you are strong, have got a lot to live life. You have the courage to move on ahead surmounting every weakness and difficulty. Believe it, nobody can defeat you until you yourself succumb to defeat.

MP may face drought-like situation

Bhopal, Sept 4: Poor rainfall during August has raised worries of a possible drought-like situation across Madhya Pradesh as 26 of the state's 52 districts have received around 20 per cent deficient rain, and nine, including capital Bhopal, around 30 per cent, according IMD reports.

The situation prompted Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan to call an emergency meeting of senior officials late Sunday and issue directions to chalk out a plan to combat the possible drought threat looming in the state. During the meeting, Chouhan said that due to poor rainfall, farmers may face tough situation in coming days as their crops have been damaged.

We have to be prepared to combat this possible drought. We have to take steps to protect our farmers," he told officials.

The officials apprised the Chief Minister about the situation of dams and other water resources in Madhya Pradesh.

Chouhan also said demand of electricity has increased manifold



and has directed the officials to provide water for irrigation.

According to India Meteorological Department in Bhopal, the entire state as on September 3 has reported 18 per cent below normal rain. As many as 47 out of districts have reported below normal rains, ranging between 2 per cent below normal in Anuppur and 46 per cent below normal in Satna district – both in the Vindhya region.

The IMD report suggested very serious position in at least 29 districts, spanning from Sehore and Vidisha (21 per cent) in central MP and Satna, Mandsaur and Ashok Nagar (40 per cent to 46 per cent below normal) in Vindhya, west MP and Gwalior-Chambal re-

gions, respectively. While 17 of the 29 worst hit districts have reported 21 per cent to 28 per cent below normal rain, between June 1 and September 3, at least eight districts have recorded 30 per cent to 39 per cent below normal rain, while three other districts have reported over 40 per cent below

normal rain in the same period. In western parts of the state

such as Mandsaur, Neemuch. Ujjain, Ratlam, Barwani and Khargone, which form the main soybean and cotton cash crop cultivating areas of the state, farmers have been resorting to bizarre rituals, like feeding gulab jamuns to donkey, village sarpanches riding a donkey and donkeys ploughing the parched fields to propitiate the rain gods.

Meanwhile, state Congress president Kamal Nath has expressed his concern over possible drought-like situation and demanded prompt action from the government.

Struggle for safe commute to remote villages

Ratlam, Sept 4: The sight of women from the Bhil community sitting on the rooftop of an overloaded van - hanging on to their luggage and dear life as the van ascends the hilly roads -- is pretty common on the 50 km stretch of the Ratlam-Shivgarh-Bajna road, traversing a predominantly tribal area bordering Rajasthan

An old joke about an RTO officer telling an auto-driver that he will not levy a fine on him if he shows how he managed to accommodate 20 passengers in a seven-seater auto still makes residents of Ratlam laugh, even as they live this real-

ity every day. The roads are damaged and steep,



and covering 50 km takes over two hours. The private bus service that starts at nine in the morning ceases after five pm, the two villages of Bajna and Shivgarh being the last stops. Those who live in the villages farther away have to rely on the overloaded autos and vans. This includes government and private employees who have to commute to and from Ratlam every day for work. The hilly, potholed roads are frequented by these overloaded vehicles many times a day. Everyone, including women and children, boards these crammed autos, some sitting in the trunk while others even climb atop the mini-vans and sit on the luggage racks on the roof.

Ahtesham Ansari, a supervisor with the Women and Child Development Department in Ratlam, commutes to Bajna to oversee the functioning of the village anganwadis every day. She catches the bus at nine in the morning, reaching the village a little before noon.

She tries finishing off her work before five in the evening to take the last bus home.

'This is a remote area so I cannot miss the five o'clock bus, else I have to shell out over Rs 2,000 to book a private cab or take the crammed autos or vans, which do not look safe," she says. Capitalising on the situation, autos charge arbitrary prices whereas bus charges are capped at Rs 50.


The situation is even more challenging for the residents of 24 villages lying on the other side of the Mahi River. Residents in the dhanis (small cluster of houses) of Raipada and Jholi Chandragarh panchayat rely on boats to cross the river, and then catch shared vehicles to reach Bajna, from where they can avail of the private bus service. The lack of a bridge over the river makes the situation more challenging as boats are the only sources of commute to the other side.







Four of family hacked to death

Tiruppur (TN): Four members

However, relatives and friends of the deceased declined to accept the bodies till all the culprits were brought to book. They staged a demonstration at Palladam in support of their demand. Senior police officials rushed to the spot to pacify them.

New Delhi: Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge Monday constituted the party's Centra Flection Committee with 16 members including himself and former party chiefs Sonia Gandhi and Rahul Gandhi. The development comes ahead of key assembly elections in states like Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh. The panel discusses and finalises the list of candidates for any parliamentary or state elections, including bypolls.

Flood situation improves in Assam

Guwahati: The flood situation in Assam improved on Monday with no fresh area getting inundated and the number of affected people dipping to nearly 80,000, an official bulletin said. This year's death toll in floods remained unchanged at 18 as no fresh fatality was reported. The Assam State Disaster Management Authority (ASDMA) bulletin said 79,060 people were still affected by the deluge in eight districts. The number of affected people was 1.22 lakh in seven districts on Sunday.

SC asks Lone to file affidavit

New Delhi, Sept 4: The Supreme Court Monday asked National Conference leader Mohd Akbar Lone to file an affidavit swearing allegiance to the Constitution of India and accepting the country's sovereignty unconditionally, after the 'Pakistan zindabad' slogan that he allegedly raised in the Jammu & Kashmir Assembly in 2018 kicked up a massive row. The senior lawyer said he will not represent Lone if he does not file the affidavit as sought. "He is an MP of Lok Sabha. He is a citizen of India and sworn to his office by the Constitution. He accepts the sovereignty of India," Sibal told the bench, also comprising Justices Sanjay Kishan Kaul, Sanjiy Khanna, BR Gavai and Surva Kant.

Earlier in the day, Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, appearing for the Centre, told the bench that the central government wanted Lone to apologise for raising 'Pakistan zindabad' (long live Pakistan) slogan in the Jammu and Kashmir Assembly in 2018. Lone has to state that he owes allegiance to the Constitution and apologises for raising the slogan on the floor of the House, the law officer said, while pointing to the matter having been brought to the court's notice by a Kashmiri Pandit group.

NGO 'Roots in Kashmir', which claims to be a group of Kashmiri Pandit youths, has questioned the credentials of Lone, claiming he was a supporter of secessionist forces.

Terrorist killed, two injured in J&K encounter

Jammu: One terrorist was killed and two security personnel were injured in an ongoing encounter in a remote area in Jammu and Kashmir's Reasi district Monday, officials said. Additional Director General of Police (ADGP), Jammu Zone, Mukesh Singh said the encounter broke out in the Tuli area's Gali Sohab village during a cordon and search operation launched by the security forces based on specific inputs received by police about the presence of two terrorists there. One terrorist was killed and a policeman injured in the initial gunfight, Singh said, adding efforts are on to neutralise the second terrorist. Jammu-based Defence PRO Lt Col Suneel Bartwal said an Army jawan was also injured in the encounter. Both the injured personnel have been hospitalised, officials said. The encounter broke out around 2 pm when a joint team of police, Army and Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) zeroed in on a house where the terrorists had taken shelter at gunpoint on the intervening night of Sunday and Monday, they said.

The attack, carried out Sunday evening in two stages, is believed to be the deadliest aerial bombing targeting high-ranking security and administrative officials since armed resistance was launched more than two years ago against the military that seized power in February 2021 from the elected government of Aung San Suu Kvi.

5 killed, 3 others hurt in Labour Day crash

Duluth (US): Five people were killed and three more injured in a Labour Day crash along a Georgia interstate northeast of Atlanta, authorities said. The three-vehicle collision happened shortly before 4 am Monday on a ramp to the southbound lanes of Interstate 85 in the Duluth area, Gwinnett County police said. A vehicle went over a wall of the elevated ramp, falling onto traffic lanes, police said. Five people were found dead at the scene, and three others were taken to local hospitals.

New Delhi, Sept 4: Deeper and more entrenched divisions over Russia's war in Ukraine risk derailing progress on issues such as food security, debt distress and global cooperation on climate change when the world's most powerful nations meet this weekend in New Delhi.

The hardened stance on the war has prevented agreement on even a single communique at the 20 or so ministerial meetings of the G20 during India's presidency this year, leaving it to the leaders to find a way around, if possible.

But China will be represented by Premier Li Qiang, not President Xi Jinping, while Russia has confirmed President Vladimir Putin's absence, suggesting that neither nation is likely to join any consensus.

That means the two-day summit from September 9 will be dominated by the West and its allies. The G20 leaders who will attend include US President Joe Biden, German Chancellor Olaf Scholz, French President Emmanuel Macron, Saudi Arabia's Mohammed Bin Salman and Japan's Fumio Kishida.

A failed summit would expose



the limits of cooperation between Western and non-Western powers, and prompt countries to double down on the groups they are more comfortable with, analysts said.

To tackle global threats "breaking off into Western and non-Western blocs isn't what you want," said Michael Kugelman. the director of the South Asia Institute at the Wilson Center in Washington. Failing to forge a consensus will also hurt the diplomatic credentials of Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who is using the presidency to bolster New Delhi's position as economic powerhouse and a leader of the global south. India, which has not condemned Russia's invasion of Ukraine, will have to either convince the bloc to agree to a joint statement - the so-called Leaders Declaration or allow its presidency to be

Gabon coup leader sworn in as interim Prez



Libreville, Sept 4: The leader of a coup that ousted Gabon's President Ali Bongo was sworn in as interim president and cheered by jubilant supporters Monday in a televised ceremony designed to cast the military as liberators of an oppressed society.

In West and Central Africa's eighth coup in three years, army officers led by General Brice Oligui Nguema seized power August 30, minutes after an announcement that Bongo had won an election they annulled and said was not credible. Nguema was given a stand-

ing ovation by military officers and officials as he arrived for the ceremony, and again just after he was sworn in by a panel of constitutional court judges. State TV showed images of a

cheering crowd and armoured personnel carriers firing into the sea to mark the moment. In a speech, Nguema proposed

reforms including a new constitution to be adopted by referendum, new electoral and penal codes, and measures to prioritise local banks and companies for economic development. He also said political exiles would be welcomed back and political prisoners freed.

Repeatedly interrupted by cheers, he described the coup, which ended the Bongo family's 56-year hold on power in the oil-producing country, as a moment of national liberation and a manifestation of God's will.

Several figures from Bongo's government, including the vice president and prime minister. attended the ceremony.

The Turkish President has maintained close ties with Putin during the 18-month war in Ukraine. Turkey hasn't joined Western sanctions against Russia following its invasion, emerging as a main trading partner and logistical hub for Russia's overseas trade.

Opening the talks, Putin mentioned various areas of bilateral cooperation, such as a proposed Russian gas hub in Turkey and the construction of the first nuclear power plant there, in which Moscow is actively involved.

Weight-loss drug Wegovy debuts in UK

London, Sept 4: Novo Nordisk (NOVOb.CO) launched its weight-loss injection Wegovy in Britain Monday, expanding into a second major market in Europe in just over a month even as it struggles to keep up with soaring demand.

The Danish drugmaker said in a statement that the weekly injection would be available in the United Kingdom "through a controlled and limited launch".

Surging demand for Wegovy, and Novo's highly effective diabetes drug Ozempic, have sent the company's shares and earnings to record highs. On Friday it unseated LVMH (LVMH.PA) as Europe's most valuable listed company, ending the French luxury group's 2-1/2 year-long reign at the top.

The shares rose as much as 2.3% in mid-morning trading Monday to a record high of 1,331 Danish crowns (\$193). They have risen by 41% so far this year.



Wegovy, shown to help patients reduce body weight by around 15% when used along with exercise and lifestyle changes, is so far available in the United States, Norway, Denmark, and as of late July, Germany.

Novo's inability to keep up with US demand for Wegovy has effectively delayed the launch in most of Europe.

Reuters reported last week that Wegovy supplies were limited in Germany less than a month after its launch in Europe's largest drug market, highlighting the challenge for Novo's ambitions in Europe.

In an early indication of prices, UK-based online pharmacy chain Simple told Reuters it would charge private patients between 199 pounds and 299 pounds (\$251-

\$377) for a monthly supply. That includes a consultation with a general practitioner, prescription and dispensing costs.

In the United States, the drug sells for as much as \$1,350 a month. In March. NICE recommended the use of Wegovy in adults with at least one weightrelated condition and a body mass index of 35, but only within the National Health Service's (NHS) specialist weight management scheme.

NICE's recommendation also calls for Wegovy to be used "for a maximum of two years".

Novo said the drug will be available on the NHS' weight management scheme and 'privately through a registered healthcare professional'

It was not immediately clear what the implications would be of the drug being available through private healthcare professionals.

Two of the country's leading private insurers, Aviva (AV.L) and AXA Health, told Reuters that they would not pay for Wegovy.

Sudan's top general in South Sudan for talks on the war

Cairo, Sept 4: Sudan's top military general arrived in South Sudan Monday for talks with its president on his second trip abroad since the war in his country started in April.

Gen Abdel-Fattah Burhan, $chairman\,of\,\,the\,ruling\,Sovereign$ Council, landed at the airport in South Sudan's capital and was received by South Sudanese President Salva Kiir.

Both leaders inspected an honour guard and then headed for talks that would focus on the conflict in Sudan, according to the council. In April, simmering tensions between the military, led by Burhan, and the powerful paramilitary Rapid Support Forces, commanded by Mohammed Hamdan Dagalo, exploded into open fighting in the capital and elsewhere. The fighting has reduced Sudan's capital, Khartoum, to an urban battlefield, with neither side managing to gain control of the city. The military headquarters, where Burhan has purportedly been stationed since the conflict began, has been one of the epicentres of the conflict.

In the western Darfur region —the scene of a genocidal campaign in the early 2000s — the conflict has morphed into ethnic violence, with the RSF and allied Arab militias attacking ethnic African groups, according to rights groups and the United Nations. South Sudan's Minister of Cabinet Affairs Martin Elia Lomuro said that the South Sudanese president has a solution "to resolve the conflict" in Sudan, according to a statement by the South Sudanese presidency.

Early in the ongoing war in Sudan, South Sudan's Kiir attempted to mediate between the warring generals, as part of an initiative Intergovernmental Authority on-Development, an eight-member regional bloc that includes Sudan.



Honda plans 5 SUVs

New Delhi: Honda Cars India plans to introduce five sports utility vehicle in the country by 2030 as it looks to have a strong presence in the robustly growing segment, according to a top company executive. IndiGo extends order

These planes will be in addition to the nearly 1.0 planes already ordered by the carrier. The latest decision comes little over two months after IndiGo announced placing a firm order to buy 500 narrow-body planes from Airbus, which was one of the largest-ever aircraft purchases by an airline. In a regulatory filing Monday, IndiGo's parent InterGlobe Aviation said its board of directors, at their meeting Monday, "approved placing the order for 10 additional A320 NEO aircraft with Airbus and execute the amendment agreement to the purchase agreement".

POWER DEMAND COAL USE UP TO STOP OUTAGES

THE DRIEST AUGUST IN MORE THAN A CENTURY HAS RESULTED IN POWER GENERATION SURGING TO A RECORD LEVEL

Singapore, Sept 4: India has stepped up the use of coal to generate electricity in a bid to stop outages caused by lower hydroelectricity output, and as an increase in renewables is struggling to keep pace with record power demand.

It is unusual for India's electricity use to spike in August, when temperatures are lower due to the annual monsoon that runs between June and September. Demand typically peaks in May, when Indians crank up air-conditioners to

beat the heat, and industries operate without rain-related disruptions.

"Under this facility, payments through a pre-sanctioned credit line issued by a Scheduled Commercial Bank to individuals, with the prior consent of the individual customer, are enabled for transactions using the UPI System," the RBI said. This can reduce the cost and

Palm oil buying lifts India's August edible oil imports to record

Mumbai, Sept 4: India's edible oil imports in August rose 5% to a record 1.85 million metric tonne as refiners purchased more than 1 million tonne of palm oil for the second consecutive month to build stocks for upcoming festivals, four dealers told Reuters.

Higher purchases by the world's biggest importer of vegetable oils could help to lower palm oil stocks in Indonesia and Malaysia and support benchmark futures. The buying has helped strengthen soybean oil futures and could reduce inventories in sunflower oil-producing Black Sea countries.

India's average monthly edible oil imports in the 2021/22 marketing year were 1.17 million tonne, trade body Solvent Extractors' Association of India (SEA) said.

Palm oil imports increased from 1.09 million tonne in July to 1.12 million tonne in August, the highest in nine months, according to average estimates from the dealers.
