
Four Odisha teachers get awards from Prez

Two elephant carcasses found

Angul, Sept 5: Decomposed carcasses of a 15-year-old tusker and a five-year-old female elephant were found at Tainsi reserve forest in Satkosia Wildlife Sanctuary in Angul district, Tuesday.

Sources said the carcasses were found in the sanctuary near Jagannathpur village. Some villagers spotted the carcasses and informed Forest officials.

Senior Forest officials and a team of Joint Task Force from Bhubaneswar visited the spot and inquired into the death of the elephants.

Though the exact cause of the death of the pachyderms is yet to be ascertained, Forest officials suspect the elephants might have been electrocuted after coming in contact with the live wires laid by poachers.

It is suspected that the incident might have occurred four days back. However, the Forest department learning about the incident late has raised question on the claims of regular patrolling by officials.

ROW OVER 'BHARAT'

G20 dinner invite describes Droupadi Murmu as 'President of Bharat', triggers political slugfest

New Delhi, Sept 5: Invitations for a G20 dinner sent out by President Droupadi Murmu describing her position as 'President of Bharat', instead of the customary 'President of India', triggered a massive furore Tuesday with the Opposition alleging that the Modi government is planning to drop 'India' and stay with just 'Bharat' as the country's name.

Confirming that Bharat has been used as the name of the country in some of the documents relating to G20, sources said it was a conscious decision.

"Bharat is the official name of the country. It is mentioned in the Constitution as also in the discussions of 1946-48," a booklet prepared for G20 delegates said.

As Union ministers Dharmendra Pradhan and Giriraj Singh shared on X their respective G20 dinner invitations from Murmu for Saturday at Bharat Mandapam, the venue for the G20 summit of world leaders, the Congress alleged



that the government was trying to destroy history.

The move also further fuelled the speculation that the issue of changing the name of the country could come up during the five-day special session of Parliament beginning September 18.

The invitation, which was shared on social media, led to a storm of reactions with the Opposition alleging that the move was reflective of the BJP being scared of the INDIA bloc and the ruling party asserting that there was nothing wrong in using Bharat as it is part of the Constitution.

Several Opposition leaders shared Article 1 of the Constitution which states that "India, that is Bharat, shall be a Union of States" and also the provision that refers to the country's president as "President of India".

Congress general secretary Jairam Ramesh said in a post on X, "Now, Article 1 in the Constitution can read: Bharat, that was India, shall be a Union of States. But now even this Union of States is under assault," Ramesh alleged.

West Bengal CM Mamata Banerjee said, "We all know India is Bharat, but the world

knows us as India." What changed suddenly that we should use only Bharat, she asked.

Tamil Nadu CM MK Stalin also lashed out at the government, saying that after 'non-BJP forces united to dethrone the fascist BJP regime' and aptly named their alliance INDIA (Indian National Developmental Inclusive Alliance), now the BJP wants to change 'India' for 'Bharat.'

Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal asked whether the BJP would change the name of Bharat if the Opposition alliance INDIA rechristens itself Bharat.

NCP chief Sharad Pawar said no one has the right to change the country's name. The row over the issue erupted four days after RSS chief Mohan Bhagwat made a strong pitch for the use of 'Bharat' instead of India.

Congress leader Shashi Tharoor said while there is no constitutional objection to calling India 'Bharat', he hopes the government will not be so foolish as to completely dispense with 'India' which has incalculable brand value.

Banks to ensure heirs of customers: Nirmala

Mumbai, Sept 5: Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman Tuesday asked banks and other financial institutions to ensure that their customers update details about their nominees to help address the problem of unclaimed money in future.

"I want the banking system, the financial ecosystem including mutual funds, stock markets to keep in mind that when someone deals with his (customer's) money, the organisations will have to think about the future and ensure that customers nominate their heirs, give the name and address," Sitharaman said speaking at the Global Fintech Fest (GFF) here.

According to a report, the banking system alone has more than Rs 35,000 crore of unclaimed deposits, while the overall quantum of the unclaimed money is said to be more than Rs 1 lakh crore.

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) August 17 launched a centralised web portal UDGM (Unclaimed Deposits - Gateway to Access information) to help

people search and claim unclaimed deposits.

The portal, launched by RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das, has been developed by the central bank to help the public to facilitate and make it easier for them to search their unclaimed deposits across multiple banks in one place.

The Finance minister said that it is essential to build a responsible financial ecosystem, and added that one laggard can cause a disruption, which can lead to trust deficit and the resultant crisis in the financial world. She also noted that tax havens and round-tripping of money are a threat to responsible financial ecosystem. "We equally should talk about the threats to a responsible financial global ecosystem and the global challenges thereof to build a responsible financial ecosystem," she added.

Listing out the threats faced by the financial system, she said there are physical border threats, which are conventional warfare and other things. Then there are cyber threats whose intensity, unpredictability, and the depth and access have gone up too high.

The Rolling Stones' 1st studio album in 18 yrs

Los Angeles, Sept 5: The wait is over. The Rolling Stones will soon release new music.

The band Monday announced they are preparing to release their first album of original material in 18 years - since 2005's "A Bigger Bang".

Titled "Hackney Diamonds," the band will share details of the release at an event in East London's Hackney district Wednesday, where Mick Jagger, Keith Richards and Ronnie Wood will be interviewed live by "The Tonight Show" host Jimmy Fallon.

The event will be livestreamed exclusively on YouTube.

"Hackney may be at the heart of Hackney Diamonds, but this is a truly global moment we want



to share with fans around the world via YouTube," the Rolling Stones shared in a statement.

The announcement of "Hackney Diamonds" follows a cryptic teaser campaign, in which the band's iconic mouth and tongue logo was projected onto the facade of major landmarks in cities around the world, including New York, London and Paris.

The album is also the group's first since the death of drummer Charlie Watts in 2021.

Jakarta, Sept 5: Indonesian President Joko Widodo will welcome fellow Asian and world leaders with a captivating jungle scene of a two-story waterfall, wild orchids and even an orangutan perched up a tree.

The make-believe wilderness set up in elaborate detail in the huge lobby of the Jakarta Convention Center in the capital includes a widescreen video of a yellow beak hornbill gliding across an azure sky, swaying leaves and piped-in bird chirps.

It's a pleasant icebreaker for Widodo and his guests in Jakarta for a week of Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) summit talks starting Tuesday.



"Indonesia wants to give the best hospitality," Communications Minister Budi Arie Setiadi said about the unique reception for ASEAN leaders and VIPs such as US Vice President Kamala Harris, Chinese Premier Li Qiang and

Russian Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov. The convention centre's lobby was off-limits to the public and a sign barred videos and pictures until the jungle spectacle is unveiled.

Indonesia also wanted to highlight ASEAN's urgent call for

environmental protection and the need to shift to greener energy sources, Setiadi said.

The Indonesian capital is one of the world's most polluted cities and teems with skyscrapers, traffic and 11 million people.

The government has begun a two-decade project to move the capital from Jakarta to Nusantara, on the island of Borneo, that will involve constructing government buildings and housing from scratch in the area about 2,000 kilometers (1,240 miles) northeast of Jakarta.

Aditya L1 completes 2nd earth-bound manoeuvre

Bangalore, Sept 5: Aditya L1, the first space based Indian mission to study the Sun, underwent the second earth-bound manoeuvre successfully during the early hours Tuesday, ISRO said. ISRO's Telemetry, Tracking and Command Network (ISTRAC) carried out the operation.

"The second Earth-bound manoeuvre (EBN#2) is performed successfully from ISTRAC, Bengaluru. ISTRAC/ISRO's ground stations at Mauritius, Bengaluru and Port Blair tracked the satellite during this operation. The new orbit attained is 282 km x 40225 km," ISRO said in a post on X (formerly Twitter).

The next manoeuvre (EBN#3) is scheduled for September 10, 2023, around 02:30 hrs. IST, it said. Aditya-L1 is the first Indian space based observatory to study the Sun from a halo orbit around first sun-earth Lagrangian point.





OSSTA for 7th pay, service benefits SSB lecturers demand grade pay hike

Bhubaneswar, Sept 5: Thousands of school teachers staged a protest here Tuesday to press for their demands including salary as per 7th Pay Commission recommendation, equal pay for equal work, pension and other service benefits.

Wearing black badges, the teachers under the banner of Odisha Secondary School Teachers' Association (OSSTA) took out a protest rally at Lower PMG here and urged the state government to consider their demands.

"We have been demanding government aid for unaided schools, implementation of Seventh Pay Commission recommendations, pension and other service benefits for teachers. But, the government is not paying any heed to our genuine demands. So, we were forced to hit the streets on Teachers' Day," said Ranjan Kumar Das, general secretary, OSSTA.

Vinod Mohanty, a protesting teacher, said, "We have spent 30

important years of our lives in the service of society and to build the future generation. But the government neglected us. If we do not get pension, how will we survive after retirement?"

On the occasion of Teachers' Day, Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik said the contribution of teachers towards building a healthy society by filling life with the light of freedom is unique.

Taking to X, Patnaik said, "My humble tribute on the occasion of holy Guru Divas and birth anniversary of former president, eminent philosopher, veteran politician Dr Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan. The guru-disciple tradition is a unique feature of Indian culture. The contribution of gurus towards building a healthy society by filling life with the light of wisdom is unique."

Bhubaneswar, Sept 5: Lecturers recruited by State Selection Board (SSB) Tuesday observed a peaceful black-badge protest across the state demanding an increase in their grade pay from ₹4,600 to ₹5,400 with retrospective effect from 2016.

They took classes and performed their normal college duty wearing black badges. At least 3,000 SSB recruited lecturers have been demanding an increase in their initial grade pay since 2016. However, they feel that their demand is yet to reach the Chief Minister. So, they decided to hold the black-badge protest to draw the CM's attention to their demands.

Odisha SSB Lecturers' Association president Sarojakanta Nayak said, "We

have been recruited for degree colleges through a transparent and merit-based system by the SSB and are at par with our government college counterparts in discharging duties and responsibilities, but we are getting the salary that doesn't commensurate with our post and status. Though we have been entreating the state government for eight long years to increase our initial grade pay to ₹5,400, we haven't received any response from the government."

While the Chief Minister and the ST Secretary are taking a number of transformative steps in the domain of education through ST initiatives, this issue has been pending for long, he added.

"So, we have organised this peaceful protest to draw the government's attention to our long-standing demand," he said.

The association also said that if the government doesn't fulfil their demand within next seven days, they will be compelled to resort to other forms of protests.

Now, govt insurance for certified snake handlers

Forest, Environment and Climate Change department will pay the premium, while OSDMA will provide training to snake handlers

Bhubaneswar, Sept 5: The state government will provide insurance cover to certified snake handlers, Revenue and Disaster Management (R&DM) Minister Pramila Mallik said Tuesday.

The Forest, Environment and Climate Change department will pay the premium, while the Odisha State Disaster Management Authority (OSDMA) will provide training to snake handlers, she said.

After receiving a detailed proposal from the Forest and Environment department, the training programme will be started, she added.

Snake Helpline, an organisation working for the rescue and rehabilitation of snakes, welcomed the decision.

"We are vulnerable to death and permanent disability as we handle poisonous snakes. The



decision of the government is a welcome step. However, some more steps are needed to be taken for the safety of both snake and rescuers," said Snake Helpline general secretary Subhendu Mallik.

Last month, the government issued guidelines for the rescue of snakes from human habitations by certified snake handlers.

Only the certified snake handlers can participate in the rescue and release operations, and they are required to adhere strictly to the stipulated protocols, failing which will invite

Man dupes neighbour of ₹33 lakh, arrested

Bhubaneswar, Sept 5: The Commissionerate Police Tuesday arrested a 59-year-old man for allegedly duping one of his neighbours of ₹33 lakh. The accused was identified as Dillip Kumar Samantray of Khallikote in Ganjam district.

Samantray is currently staying at Royal Heritage Apartment in Patrapada area under Khandagiri police limits.

Police sources claimed that Samantray and complainant Rabintra Prasad Mohanty were staying in the same apartment a few years ago.

Samantray would often visit the residence of complainant on various pretexts. One day, the accused came to know that Mohanty had sold a plot in the City and kept the money in his residence.

Then he started asking Mohanty for loans for different purposes.

Owing to Samantray's continuous insistence, Mohanty reportedly gave ₹33 lakh to the accused for construction of his house two years ago.

The accused had promised to return the money within a year and gave the complainant two post dated cheques.

However, when Mohanty deposited the same in the bank a few months later, the cheques got bounced.

Mohanty asked Samantray to return his money several times, but to no avail.

Finding no other way, he finally lodged a complaint with the police Monday.

Orissa HC gets 2 new judges

Cuttack, Sept 5: Sibho Sankar Mishra and Ananda Chandra Behera were sworn in as new judges of the Orissa High Court Tuesday by Chief Justice Subhasis Talapatra.

With this, the number of judges in the High Court rose to 22, against a sanctioned strength of 33. The number of judges will again come down to 20 after the retirement of Justice Biswanath Rath Wednesday and the Chief Justice October 3.

The Centre September 2 had notified the appointment of ad-

vocate Mishra, and senior judicial officer Behera as judges of the High Court.

The collegium of the Supreme Court, comprising Chief Justice of India (CJI) DY Chandrachud, Justice SK Kaul and Justice Sanjiv Khanna, had recommended their names August 17.

While Mishra began his career in 1991 and specialises in civil, criminal and service law, Behera served as a judicial officer in different capacities over the years. Mishra was an advocate-on-record in the Supreme Court, and represented the Odisha government.

DGP launches '1930' cybercrime helpline

Bhubaneswar, Sept 5: Director General of Police (DGP) Sunil Kumar Bansal Tuesday inaugurated the '1930 cyber helpline call centre' at Cyber Complex here for the victims of online financial frauds.

Victims of cyber frauds can lodge complaints by dialling '1930' for immediate assistance to prevent the transaction and get back money. This facilitation centre has got 10 parallel telephone lines which are manned by trained police personnel. The helpline will be functional 24x7 in three shifts. The call centre maintained by trained personnel would attend the call, initiate the process to track the money trail and take immediate action to block it. It will also try to revert back the money into victim's account.

SC reserves verdict on pleas against Art 370 repeal

New Delhi, Sept 5: The Supreme Court Tuesday reserved its verdict on a batch of petitions challenging the abrogation of Article 370 of the Constitution which bestowed special status on the erstwhile state of Jammu and Kashmir.

A five-judge bench headed by Chief Justice DY Chandrachud reserved the verdict after a marathon 16-day hearing.

The bench, also comprising Justices Sanjay Kishan Kaul, Sanjiv Khanna, BR Gavai and Surya Kant, heard the rejoinder arguments of senior advocates Kapil Sibal, Gopal Subramaniam, Rajeev Dhavan, Zaffar

Shah, Dushyant Dave and others on the concluding day of the hearing.

The top court said if any lawyer appearing for the petitioners or respondents wishes to file a written submission can do so in the next three days. The submission should not extend beyond two pages, it said.

In the course of the hearing over the past 16 days, the top court heard Attorney General R Venkataramani, Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, senior advocates Harish Salve, Rakesh Dwivedi, V Giri and others on behalf of the Centre and the interveners defending the abrogation of Article 370.

The lawyers dwelt on various issues including the constitutional

validity of the Centre's August 5, 2019 decision to abrogate the provision, the validity of Jammu and Kashmir Reorganisation Act, which split the erstwhile state into two Union Territories, challenges to imposition of Governor's rule in Jammu and Kashmir June 20, 2018 and imposition of President's rule in the erstwhile state December 19, 2018 and its extension July 3, 2019.

Several petitions challenging the abrogation of Article 370 and the Jammu and Kashmir Reorganisation Act, 2019 that divided the erstwhile state into two union territories - Jammu and Kashmir, and Ladakh - were referred to a Constitution bench in 2019.

Asians have poor sleep on weekdays: Study

The study led by researchers from National University of Singapore shows that people in Asia have shorter sleep, and display higher variability in both sleep timing and duration on weekdays



sleep extension.

"In Europe, weekends are generally considered time for relaxation, and engaging in social activities with friends and family. In Asia, however, people may use the weekends to catch up on work, do the things they didn't have time for during the week or attend to

more family responsibilities," said Dr Adrian Willoughby, Senior Research Fellow at NUS Medicine's Centre for Sleep and Cognition.

"We think that longer working hours and the difference in work culture in Asia means that people don't catch up on sleep as much at the weekends, but try to catch up whenever they have the opportunity over the course of the week," Willoughby said.

The study, published in the scientific journal Sleep Medicine, is based on sleep data from over 2,20,000 individuals, aged between 30 and 55 years, from across 35

countries.

Previous studies have shown that shorter sleep duration is usually associated with higher sleep efficiency as people try to make the most of their sleep opportunity; however, in this study, despite sleeping less, people in Asia also had lower sleep efficiency.

This may be because factors that result in short sleep (for example work-related anxiety) also lead to lower quality sleep, the researchers said.

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Rain to pound state for next 5 days: IMD

Bhubaneswar, Sept 5: A low pressure area (LOPAR) formed over the north-west and adjoining west-central Bay of Bengal off the south-Odisha, north-Andhra Pradesh coasts Tuesday. Under its impact, light to moderate rain or thundershowers are 'very likely' at most places of the state in the next five days, IMD predicted.

IMD sources informed the LOPAR formed under the influence of Monday's cyclonic circulation over the north-west Bay of Bengal and adjoining areas, with the associated cyclonic circulations extending up to 7.6km above the mean sea level and tilting south-westward with height. The circulations now persist over the same regions.

"It is very likely that the circulations will move westward across south-Odisha and south-Chhattisgarh in the next 24 hours," IMD sources said, further



adding that the western end of the 'monsoon trough' now runs along the foothills of the Himalayas, and its eastern end passes through Najibabad, Lucknow, Satna, Raipur, and then south-eastwards to the centre of the low pressure area over the north-west and adjoining west-central Bay of Bengal off south-Odisha.

Meteorological sources said the average rainfall recorded in Odisha in the last 24 hours was

16.7 mm, while the state's average rainfall recorded from September 1 to September 5 was 50.1 mm, against the September monthly average of 231.9 mm.

The highest rainfall, 142.4 mm, was recorded in the last 24 hours in Belaguntha block of Ganjam. At least three blocks, namely Belguntha in Ganjam, Siluapada, and Khunta in Mayurbhanj, recorded more than 100 mm of rainfall in the past 24 hours.

1 in 3 men worldwide infected with genital HPV: Lancet

THE GLOBAL STUDY ON THE PREVALENCE OF GENITAL HPV INFECTION CAN CAUSE GENITAL WARTS AND ORAL, PENILE AND ANAL CANCER IN BOTH MEN AND WOMEN

Almost one in three men over the age of 15 are infected with at least one genital human papillomavirus (HPV) type, according to a new study published in The Lancet Global Health.


The findings also showed that one in five are infected with one or more of what are known as high risk, or oncogenic, HPV types.

These estimates show that men frequently harbour genital HPV infections and emphasise the importance of incorporating men in efforts to control HPV infection and reduce the incidence of HPV related disease in both men and women.

"This global study on the prevalence of genital HPV infection among men confirms how widespread HPV infection is. HPV infection with high-risk HPV types can cause genital warts and oral, penile and anal cancer in men," said Dr Meg Doherty, Director of WHO's Global HIV, Hepatitis and Sexually Transmitted Infections Programmes.

"We must continue to look for opportunities to prevent HPV infection and to reduce the incidence of HPV-related disease in both men and women," Doherty added.

The study is based on a systematic review and meta-analysis



assessed the prevalence of genital HPV infection in the general male population based on studies published between 1995

and 2022.

The global pooled prevalence was 31 per cent for any HPV and 21 per cent for high-risk HPV.

The majority of HPV infections in men and women are asymptomatic, but they can lead to long-term sequelae and mortality. Each year, more than 340,000 women die of cervical cancer.

In men, HPV infection tends to manifest clinically as anogenital warts, which cause significant morbidity and increase HPV transmission rates.

HPV infections are also associated with penile, anal and oropharyngeal cancers, which are commonly linked to HPV type 16. The International Agency for Research on Cancer estimated that there were about 69,400 cases of cancer in men caused by HPV in 2018.

Police crack murder case after 3 yrs

Deogaon, Sept 5: Deogaon police have finally cracked after three years the mystery behind the murder of Gajanan Meher, a resident of Hatisara village in Bolangir district, with the arrest of the accused, officials said Tuesday. Police had been on the lookout for accused Shira Rana for the past three years. He was finally nabbed Tuesday and police took him to the crime spot to recreate the scene which led to Gajanan's death. A botched up deal between Shira and Gajanan led to the latter's death, Deogaon police station IIC, Tarabati Pradhan informed. Police said that Shira had given 250gm of gold to Gajanan,



the owner of a jewellery shop. A deal was finalised that Gajanan will sell the gold and give ₹10 lakh to Shira and take ₹30,000 as commission. Gajanan called up Shira November 6, 2020 and asked the latter to come to Bangla Square

here to collect the money. Shira arrived and so did Gajanan along with an accomplice and the three then went to a secluded spot behind the Haragouri temple here. Gajanan handed ₹10 lakh to Shira. However, while counting, Shira discovered a number of

fake notes. A heated argument broke out between Shira, Gajanan and his associate. Suddenly Gajanan and his accomplice attacked Shira. During the scuffle that followed, Gajanan lost his footing and suffered a severe fall dying on the spot. Seeing Gajanan dead, his associate fled the scene. Fearing arrest, Shira took Gajanan's body and bike to a secluded area. He then disposed of the body and bike there and left the spot. Since then he had been on the run for close to three years. Police got a tip-off that Shira had come to his native village and managed to nab him easily. Shira was forwarded to court after a case (No 262/20) was registered at Deogaon police station, Pradhan informed.

Youth gets 20 years RI for raping minor

Keonjhar, Sept 5: A fast track court here Tuesday sentenced Sipun Maharana, 30, to 20 years in prison after convicting him of raping a minor girl. The incident took place November 27, 2017 under Turumunga police station. Justice Bijay Kumar Mishra also slapped a fine of ₹10,000 on the convict. Failure to pay the fine will lead to an additional six months in prison, the judge ordered. As per the case diary, Sipun had forcibly abducted the minor girl when she was playing in front of her home and raped her. At the time of the incident, the family members of the victim had gone to the market. Taking advantage of the situation, Sipun committed the crime, police said. When the family members of the victim returned home, they found her lying in a pool of blood and writhing in pain. The girl then narrated her ordeal to her parents. A complaint was subsequently filed at the Turumunga police station. After medical examination of the victim, police arrested Sipun. During the trial the accused was lodged at the district prison in this town.

Engineer sacked for using fake certificate

Paradip, Sep 5: A superintending engineer of Paradip Port has been dismissed from service for allegedly acquiring the job by submitting a fake caste certificate, officials said Tuesday. The action was initiated against Pramod Kumar Bindhani on the basis of a report of the State Level Scrutiny Committee (SLSC), which was constituted to probe the matter, they informed. According to the report, Bindhani had joined Paradip Port as an assistant engineer in



September 1991 by submitting a fake ST caste certificate. He was later promoted to executive engineer in 2002 availing ST reservation quota and then superintending engineer in 2006. During investigation, the SLSC found that Bindhani belongs to OBC/SEBC category and not ST as he had mentioned to avail the job and other promotional benefits. In 2021, the National Commission for Scheduled Tribes had directed the Paradip

Port authorities to conduct a probe to ascertain the veracity of Bindhani's caste certificate. The matter was then pending with the SLSC following an order of the Orissa High Court.

2 KILLED OVER FAMILY RIVALRY, 7 ARRESTED

Berhampur: Two people were killed in a clash between two families in Ganjam district, following which seven people, including three women, were arrested, police said Tuesday. The incident took place in Pankalabadi village in Kabisuryanagar police station area Monday night when 29-year-old history-sheeter Mithun Bhuyan and his 26-year-old brother-in-law Lipun Swain went to the house of 52-year-old Janaki Bhuyan with firearms, a police officer said. He added that the two families had a rivalry for the last three years. Mithun, who had cases of murder, extortion, dacoity and rioting pending against him, and Lipun went to Janaki's house in an inebriated state and fired at least two-three rounds in the air to scare the latter's family, before leaving the place. However, the duo returned again and started assaulting Janaki and her brother Rohit (45), following which the family attacked the duo with swords, stones and sharp objects, Ganjam Superintendent of Police Jagmohan Meena informed. Both Mithun and Lipun sustained grievous injuries and were taken to Kabisuryanagar hospital, and later referred to MKCG Medical College and Hospital, where doctors declared them dead on arrival, Meena said. Seven members of Janaki's family, including him, his wife Prabhassini (45), sons Sonu (26) and Bibhu (28), Rohit, his wife Rasmita (38) and Janaki and Rohit's sister Kuni (34), were arrested, Meena stated. A country-made pistol, seven cartridges, a sword, a crowbar, an iron rod, a kitchen knife, a wooden plank and a big stone were seized from the spot, the SP added. Patrolling has been intensified in the village and a strict vigil is being kept, the officer said. He added that further investigation is underway.

SMC unveils new waste management plans

Services of domestic helps to be utilised for segregation of dry and wet garbage

Sambalpur, Sept 5: The Sambalpur Municipal Corporation (SMC) has decided to rope in the services of domestic helps for segregation of dry and wet waste in households. The separation is necessary for better utilisation of waste treatment plants, officials said. To achieve this goal, the civic body officials are holding meetings in every ward of this town and sensitising the domestic helps. This is among the new measures implemented by the SMC to keep the town clean. Earlier, the SMC had used leaflets and posters to create awareness among the people regarding the disposition of dry and wet waste materials. All



the garbage collection vehicles of the SMC have two compartments - one for dry waste and the other for wet. However, despite its best efforts, the SMC has not been able to educate the people. Residents of this town still continue to dispose of dry and wet wastes together. The SMC had also imposed fines penalising the mixing of dry and wet wastes. However, it also did not work. Now, the SMC has decided to take the issue to the doorsteps of the residents of this town. As a result it has decided to rope in the

services of the domestic helps. The civic body feels that domestic helping hands, if properly educated, will help in segregation of the two types of wastes. SMC enforcement officer Subhankar Mohanty said the daily disposing of waste materials are increasing rapidly. Many families are handing over garbage to the collection vehicles without separating dry and wet materials. The best way to achieve the objective is to take the help of domestic workers, Mohanty stated. For proper waste management, the SMC has divided the house-

holds into three categories. Those segregating dry and wet garbage have been marked green; those not doing so have been placed in orange category. Houses that do not dispose of waste at all have been put in the red category. The SMC authorities are also trying to sensitise students and members of residential societies about the importance of proper waste management. Sources said that the civic body has engaged 140 vehicles including battery-operated ones to collect garbage from the doorsteps of the houses. The collected waste materials are turned into compost for use in cultivation. Waste materials that do not rot are sent to the material recovery centre (MRC). Mohanty pointed out that the segregation of dry and wet garbage is crucial for proper running of the waste treatment plants. "It is very important for the materials to be separated at the micro-composting centre," Mohanty stated.

National Derangements

Whenever a country's social contract unravels, conditions become ripe for rumors and absurdities to circulate. Even when these are outrageous and obviously nonsensical, they can give expression to a people's deepest fears and prejudices.

Such is the case in Russia today, where Sergei Markov, a former adviser to President Vladimir Putin, has warned that Ukraine is creating "gay super-soldiers" to wage war against his country. "Military theorists and historians know which army in Greece was the strongest, remember? The Spartans. They were united by a homosexual brotherhood. They were all homos. These were the politics of their leadership. I think they are planning the same for Ukraine's Armed Forces." Of course, this mixture of homophobia, fake history, and Marvel comic-inspired ideas of super-soldiers indicates that Markov is not interested in encouraging critical thinking and reasoned analysis. No matter: such idiotic statements apparently resonate with at least some important segments of Russian society.

The same derangement also increasingly applies to Russian historical memories of major national traumas and crimes. At a recent ceremony in Velikiye Luki, in Russia's Pskov region, a priest known as "Father Anthony" doused holy water on a 26-foot statue of Stalin. Though "the Church suffered" during Stalin's long reign of terror, he observed, Russians today should be grateful that they have so many "new Russian martyrs and confessors to whom we now pray and are helping us in our Motherland's resurgence."

Such perverse reasoning is just a step away from arguing that Jews should be grateful to Hitler for opening the way for the State of Israel. In fact, precisely that has already effectively happened. According to a 2019 investigation by Channel 13 news in Israel, future Israeli army officers at the state-funded Bnei David military prep school are taught, by rabbis, that:

"The Holocaust was not about killing the Jews. Nonsense. And that it was systematic and ideological makes it more moral than random murder. Humanism, secular culture – that is the Holocaust. The real Holocaust is pluralism. The Nazi logic was internally consistent. Hitler said that a certain group in society is the cause of all the evil in the world and therefore it must be exterminated. ... For years, God has been screaming that the Diaspora is over but Jews aren't obeying. That is their disease that the Holocaust must cure. ... Hitler was the most righteous. Of course he was right in every word he said. His ideology was correct. ... [The Nazis'] only error was who was on which side."

The lesson does not end there. Students also learn that:

"With the help of God, slavery will return. The non-Jews will want to be our slaves. These people around us have genetic problems. Ask an average Arab what he wants to be. He wants to be under occupation. ... They don't know how to run a country or anything. ... Yes, we are racists. We believe in racism. Races have genetic characteristics. So we must consider how to help them."

To be sure, this extreme rhetoric is openly endorsed by only a tiny, fanatical religious minority. And yet, it hints at the underlying premise behind the current far-right government's policies in the West Bank. To compare the situation in Israel and its occupied territories to Nazi Germany may appear a ridiculous exaggeration, and if a non-Jew makes this comparison, he is instantly dismissed as anti-Semitic; but if leading Jewish figures do so, they ought to be listened to. When a society has wrapped itself in layers of tendentious self-justification, it takes insiders to pull back the shroud.

Consider the case of Amiram Levin, the former head of the Israel Defense Forces' Northern Command. Speaking recently to Israel's public broadcasting station about the situation in the West Bank, he contends that "there hasn't been a democracy there in 57 years, there is total apartheid. ... the IDF, which is forced to exert sovereignty there, is rotting from the inside. It's standing by looking at the settler rioters and is beginning to be a partner to war crimes."

When asked to elaborate, Levin invoked Nazi Germany: "It's hard for us to say it, but it's the truth. Walk around Hebron, look at the streets. Streets where Arabs are no longer allowed to go on, only Jews. That's exactly what happened there, in that dark country."

That a retired IDF general could come to such a conclusion attests not only to his extraordinary ethical stance, but also to just how bad things have gotten there. But as long as there are Israelis like Levin, there is hope, because it is only with the solidarity and support of people like him that the West Bank Palestinians have a chance.

In both Russia and Israel today, the social pact is fracturing under the weight of colonialism and fundamental disagreements about foundational principles. These conditions lend themselves to increasingly absurd and extreme forms of rationalisation. But just because you can come up with a reason for doing something does not mean that you should do it. When societies fragment, resisting wrong reasons often requires more strength than following right reasons.

Political scientists and historians are today engaged in debating what true nationalism is with politicians talking in terms of a new understanding of nationalism. There is confusion in interpreting nationalism as groups of political analysts and politicians are sharply divided on the issue. It is well-known that nationalism is the concept of loyalty towards a nation and is also characterised by love for one's nation.

Since the days of Independence, Indians as nationals, have by and large, carried the legacy of our nationalism. However, India's diversity has led to the approach of nationalism, i.e. following the culture of nationalism in different ways. We are, no doubt a single nation but what is unique is the wide diversity in our lifestyles, food habits, culture, religion and ways of carrying out activities in society. The government's stand of 'one nation' meaning one everything is not quite correct.

India, the world's second-most populous county and most populous democracy, is the homeland for a multi-cultural and multi-religious group of people. Despite the diversity there is unity among people. This comes from the sense of nationalism. It's the feeling of love and pride for the nation that binds the people together. But recent developments in Manipur and Nuh in Haryana add to the growing feeling that communal hatred and projection of any single religion in an aggressive manner can't help the cause of unity or even socio-economic development.

In the film, Chak De India (2007), the coach, who is determined to assemble a winning women's hockey team, asks the players where they were from. When they mention their home states (Andhra Pradesh, Punjab etc.), he disagrees and makes them to say instead they were from India. "Why would the players identify as Indians to a coach who knew it already?" The answer is simple because the

coach wanted to engraft the feeling of nationalism among the teammates to bind them together. The identity of the nation-state matters above all else.

In a general sense, nationalism means oneness, feeling the goodness of the nation and its people, unity in diversity and respect, love and pride towards the nation by its citizens. The concept first emerged in Europe. During the 17th century, a model known as 'The Nation State Model' was developed in Western Europe. It suggests that it is natural for a group of people who share a common territory and culture (language, religion) to have their own state. Thus, the feeling of nationalism led to the formation of nations.

The term 'nationalism' has been understood and defined in many ways. It has been described as "A state of mind in which the supreme loyalty of the individual is due to the nation-state." It denotes the identification of the state or nation with people. Here, the characteristics of the people are – homogenous culture, living together in a close association or territory, sharing belief of common destiny and mentality, tradition, history, etc.

Understanding of the true meaning of nationalism is very important. The sense of na-

tionalism cannot be identified in name of religion, caste or community of people, it's beyond all these. The European model of the nation-state is an old concept. The nation-state model talks about the cultural boundaries of the state that must be like the cultural boundary of the nation. This is a very narrow concept.

In the present scenario, the power-crazed religion of Hindutva in India has become so influential as to largely extrude the ideals of Tagore-Gandhi era. Fritz Stern in his book, 'Einstein's German World' (first published in 1999) remarked that Einstein has "contempt for nationalist narrowness in any form." He believed the continuing persecution of Jews in Europe made their own search for a homeland justifiable. He supported the migration of Jews to Palestine in the belief and hope that "there should be a tiny speck on the earth in which the members of the tribe should not be aliens." Einstein's anti-chauvinist and anti-narcissist philosophy was well expressed in his funeral by fellow physicist, Rudolf Ladenburg in Princeton in 1954: "Brief is this existence as a fleeting visit in a strange house. The path to be pursued is poorly lit by a flickering consciousness, the cen-

tre of which is the limiting and separating."

The hate and violence depicted by Stern through words of Einstein is greatly relevant to conditions existing in India today. While one section of historians argues the present dispensation has been rightly trying to instill a sense of nationalism among Indian citizens which wasn't there earlier; the liberal view is opposed to this as they view things in what could be called unity amidst the diversity of faiths, cultures and different ways of life and living.

If we observe recent debates on nationalism, it can be affirmed that the term is being re-defined for achieving political goals. The present dispensation is exploiting the concept of nationalism for acquiring votes in elections. There are lots of misconceptions and propaganda about nationalism but unfortunately, the levels of education and awareness being very poor in the country, the masses are going for majoritarianism which they confuse with nationalism. Generally, the idea of nationalism becomes negative with irrational blaming and the spread of hatred among people. Nationalism is not a particular idea or thought that can be identified in the name of religion, caste or community of the people, it's beyond all these.

Significantly, people cannot be identified as anti-nationalist just because they have different political views or an ideology that majority people don't follow in the nation at a particular point in time. If a person is critical of the government's style of functioning, this should be welcome as dissent is a part of pluralist democracy where the majoritarian views and beliefs need not be adhered to always. In fact, criticism is in a sense indicative of the concern one has towards the State.

It is not that our political leaders are unaware of what they are doing, but sadly electoral considerations of grabbing the Hindu vote makes them give a new twist to nationalism.

Corruption is everywhere, even in education

MAKING DONATIONS TO GAIN ADMISSION TO GOVERNMENT-RUN INSTITUTIONS IS CONSIDERED ILLEGAL, BUT ANYTHING GOES AT PRIVATE INSTITUTIONS

Indian Police Service officer Arun Bothra recently posted a picture of several currency notes, including Rs 100, Rs 200, and Rs 500, on the social media network X, formerly known as Twitter.

"Pic sent by a teacher," he wrote. "These notes were kept in answer sheets of a board exam by students with a request to give them passing marks. Tells a lot about our students, teachers, and the entire educational system."

Yes, it tells a lot about the educational system. If these students were better educated, they'd realise that Rs 500 is not enough to bribe a teacher. But if they were better educated, they wouldn't need to bribe a teacher.

As you can imagine, Bothra's post went viral and drew numerous comments, including some from teachers.

"This has happened to me at least thrice during my paper correction days! To colleagues too even 20 years ago," one teacher wrote. "The money is usually accompanied by a sad story narration instead of answers to exam questions. Needless to say, such students usually fail."

I love the honesty in this response, perfectly captured in the word "usually."

Judge: "As part of your personal code of ethics, do you refuse to accept bribes from students?"

Teacher: "Usually."

Judge: "What do you mean 'usually'?"

Teacher: "Almost always."

Judge: "What does 'almost' mean? How many times have you accepted a bribe?"

Teacher: "Fewer times than you have."

Yes, corruption is pervasive. As another commenter on Bothra's post noted, the students' attempts to bribe teachers is "a representation of things beyond the educational system. They know that 'cash' can get things done in our country and they are unfortunately not entirely wrong."

When "cash can get things done" in so many spheres of life, it's not surprising that teachers are also offered cash. Money can also affect whether a student gains admission to a college or university.

Admissions officer: "As you know, Mr. Kumar, this is a very

prestigious medical college. What kind of donation are you willing to make to ensure that your son gets admission?"

Kumar: "Any type of donation – you name it. I will even donate one of my kidneys. You can use it for research."

Admissions officer: "Just one?"

Kumar: "Yes, you can have the other one after I die."

Making donations to gain admission to government-run institutions is considered illegal, but anything goes at private institutions. That's also the case in America, where "cash can get things done" for students who want to attend prestigious institutions.

They can't submit cash with their answer sheets, but they can hire an "admissions consultant" who may be able to hire a professional test-taker for them. This is what one admissions consultant, William "Rick" Singer, did for some students – until he got caught.

In a scheme known as Operation Varsity Blues, dozens of wealthy parents had paid Singer lavishly to get their children into elite institutions. Singer not only helped some students

cheat on standardised tests, he also bribed university coaches and administrators. He is now spending 3.5 years in a not-so-elite institution: Federal Prison Camp.

But wealthy parents don't have to resort to illegal methods of securing admission. There are plenty of legal ways to do so. Hiring an admission consultant (not named Rick Singer) is one of the first steps. These consultants can advise students on the ideal blend of academic courses and extracurricular activities to enhance their college applications. They may also help students prepare for standardised tests and write college admission essays.

If the parents are ultra-wealthy, the best way to ensure admission is to make a hefty donation to the university. That's how Jared Kushner, son-in-law of Donald Trump got into Harvard University, according to Daniel Golden, author of the 2006 book "The Price of Admission."

Jared's father, Charles Kushner, pledged \$2.5 million to Harvard.

Jared: "Dad, good news! Harvard has accepted me!"

Charles: "We did it, son! I mean, you did it, son!"

Nanofood

Whenever the prefix nano- appears, referring to any manipulation of matter at near-molecular levels, controversy follows. Opponents of such techniques hold in particular that they shouldn't be used in foodstuffs until we know much more about their effects on human bodies. Nanofood refers to the employment of nanotechnological techniques in any part of the food chain – cultivation, production, processing or packaging – not just in food itself. Big companies are researching the possibilities, some of which sound like science-fiction – smart dust that's inserted into plants and animals so that farmers can monitor their health in real time; packaging that includes smart sensors that can sniff out gases given off by deteriorating food or alternatively tell you when it is ripe; a drink whose flavour can be changed just by microwaving it; and stabilise nutrients in food, such as omega-3 fats, iron or vitamins – which degrade quickly in storage – by enclosing them in separate tiny containers.

Quota fire

Sir, The Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation has been forced to close 46 out of the 250 bus depots that it operates amidst widespread protests over Maratha quota, leading to service disruptions and financial losses. Metropolitan Magistrate Arjinder Kaur summoned Sunita Kejriwal as an accused on November 18 on an application moved by BJP leader Harish Khurana. The BJP leader has alleged in his complaint that the Chief Minister's wife has violated the provisions of the Representation of the People (RP) Act.

facie case is made out against accused person namely Sunita Kejriwal, W/o Arvind Kejriwal, for the alleged commission of

the offences punishable under section 31 of the Representation of Peoples Act, 1950. Hence, the accused be summoned accordingly," the judge said in an order passed on August 29.

The offence attracts a maximum punishment of imprisonment for two years. Khurana claimed Sunita Kejriwal was registered as a voter on the electoral rolls of Sahibabad assembly constituency (parliamentary constituency Ghaziabad), UP, and also Chandni Chowk assembly constituency in Delhi, which was in violation of Section 17 (no person to be registered in more than one constituency) of the RP Act. He claimed she was liable to be punished for the offences under Section 31 of the Act which deals with making false declarations.

'Savera' launched for senior citizens

Prayagraj, Sept 5: The Prayagraj police have launched the 'Savera' scheme that offers services during health and other emergencies to senior citizens in seven districts of the Prayagraj zone.

The Fatehpur police have taken the lead with over 700 senior citizens having registered themselves in the past three days. Under the scheme, police are maintaining a record of people aged 60 and above and are available on call on helpline number 112 for quick response.

The police personnel are also checking the homes of the elderly to ensure their safety and wellbeing. Services under 'Savera' scheme include sending beat police personnel to visit seniors to their homes regularly and ask them about their wellbeing. Additional DG (Prayagraj zone), Bhanu Bhaskar said that the "Savera scheme for elderly people is launched to enhance response time and prevent delays in addressing senior citizens' concerns".

"Senior citizens are coming forward to get themselves registered under the scheme in all districts. They can visit the nearest police station, or use 112 helpline." Safety and security are big issues for the elderly people who live alone and all by themselves.

The scheme seeks to address the difficulties they face. Police are drafting a list of seniors under their police circles and

jurisdiction for quick emergency assistance. Apart from personnel at the police stations, a police response vehicle (PRV) will also cater to their needs.

Bhaskar further said: "The initiative seeks to reach out to all registered senior citizens and to provide timely help against harassment and other crimes, in which they often do not get timely assistance. Savera scheme has been drafted to address senior citizens' issues sensitively and delicately.

"Our focus is on offering timely response to elderly citizens and for that, beat personnel must know the addresses of those registered." This scheme will considerably reduce the reaction time and help send aid faster because the details of the seniors, such as their names, addresses, and phone numbers would already be there in the records.

A person aged 60 and above can register for the service online. The information is transmitted to local police station automatically via 112. Details are registered with the police station concerned, which will verify the information by sending a police officer. Once verification is complete, senior citizen will become a registered user. Seniors face many problems, mainly health and crime-related.

Helpline services, such as 108 for ambulance, 181 for women in distress, and 101 for fire services are integrated with helpline number 112 so that senior citizens registered with Savera scheme can avail of all services.

Basic schools in UP to have quarterly evaluation of students

Prayagraj, Sept 5: The schools of basic education department will be conducting quarterly assessment of its students in Uttar Pradesh.

For this, tests will be conducted from September 11 to 16. It will be based on target/learning outcomes achieved through Saral App. The level of knowledge, in language and mathematics, of students from Classes 1 to 5 and that of mathematics and science subjects of students from Classes 6 to 8 will be tested.

Printing of question papers and OMR sheets for evaluation is being done by the state project office through GeM portal. Selected printers will supply



question papers and OMR sheets in the districts and later the same will be taken to schools.

For students of Classes 1 to 3, one question paper will be provided for every five children. Question papers will be given to every student of Class 4 to 8. The responsibility of conducting



Teachers-turned-politicians who shaped UP politics

These teachers-turned-politicians, who had since long given up their academic activities and interests, are no longer playing a role in UP politics. In fact, many of the new generations do not even know that they started out as teachers



the Congress out of the political centre-stage in the state.

The most famous teacher turned politician was Mulayam Singh Yadav, former founder President of the Samajwadi Party. Mulayam Singh Yadav, who completed his masters in Political Science, worked as a lecturer in a college in Karhal in Mainpuri before he was sucked into the vortex of the socialist movement and then politics.

Mulayam, sources say, had maintained contact with his former students, some of whom continued to visit him even when he ceased to be active in politics.

Interestingly, Mulayam had always been a champion of promoting politics among students.

"The colleges and universities should be a nursery for politicians and we must encourage students to take part in politics," he had said on several occasions. BSP President Mayawati is another teacher-turned politician in Uttar Pradesh. The four-time chief minister started out as a teacher in Inderpuri J.J. Colony in Delhi.

She was studying for civil services examination when she met late Kanshi Ram and the latter persuaded her to join politics instead. Mayawati, however, does not

meet her former students and neither is she inclined to revive her relationship with the past.

Satyadev Gautam, one of her students, said: "When she became Chief Minister for the first time, I tried to meet her but she simply refused to recognise me even though I introduced myself. She has not bothered to meet any of her ex-students." The BSP President is averse to 'goondaism on the campus' and had banned student union polls in 2008.

"She is averse to 'mobocracy' that rules the campus and the BSP does not even have a youth wing or a student wing like other

parties," said an aide of the BSP leader.

After consecutive defeats in the 2014 Lok Sabha, the 2017 and 2022 assembly elections and the 2019 Lok Sabha polls, Mayawati and her party have been reduced to a non-player in state politics - for the moment, at least. Another teacher turned politician who has risen to great heights, surpassing many of his peers, is Defence Minister Rajnath Singh.

He may have deliberately cut himself off from state politics but he still welcomes his former teacher colleagues and students with open arms.

Rajnath Singh, who worked as a physics lecturer in Mirzapur before plunging into politics, had created a furore with his first decision as Education Minister in Uttar Pradesh in 1991 when he brought in the Anti-Copying Act in 1992, making copying a non-bailable offence.

Former chief minister Kalyan Singh was also a teacher-turned politician, who started his career as a school teacher in Aligarh before moving on to politics.

His former colleagues say that Kalyan Singh, who passed away in 2021, had always maintained a warm relationship with his former colleagues.



INDIA VS BHARAT RENAMING ROW

WHAT DOES SC SAY

New Delhi, Sept 5: The citizens are free to call the country India or Bharat as per their wishes, the Supreme Court had said in 2016 while dismissing a PIL which sought a direction that India be called 'Bharat' for all purposes.

The apex court's summary dismissal of the PIL becomes relevant in view of a massive nation-wide debate which got triggered following the G20 dinner invitation from President Droupadi Murmu describing her position as 'President of Bharat'.

"Bharat or India? You want to call it Bharat, go right ahead. Someone wants to call it India, let him call it India," a bench of Chief Justice T S Thakur and Justice U U Lalit, both retired, had observed while trashing the PIL filed by Niranjan Bhatwal from Maharashtra. The Centre, facing opposition criticism over the G20 invite, had told the top court in November 2015 that the country does not have to be called 'Bharat' instead of 'India'.

It had said, "There is no change in circumstances to consider any change in Article 1 of the Constitution of India." Article 1(1) of the Constitution says, "India, that is Bharat, shall be a Union of States."

Opposing the PIL, the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) had said issues regarding the country's



name were deliberated upon extensively by the Constituent Assembly during the drafting of the Constitution and clauses in Article 1 were adopted unanimously. It had said there was no change in circumstances since the Constituent Assembly debated the issue to warrant a review.

The Supreme Court had also taken strong exception to the petitioner and asked him whether he thinks it has nothing else to do, and reminded him that public interest litigations are meant for poor. "The PIL is for poor people. You think we have nothing else to do," the bench had said March 11, 2016. The petition had also sought a direction to NGOs and corporates that they use the term Bharat for all official and unofficial purposes. The PIL had said the prominent suggestions before the Constituent Assembly for naming the country were "Bharat, Hindustan, Hind and Bharatbhumi or Bharatvarsh and names of that kind".

NETIZENS CONFUSED

New Delhi: The G20 dinner invitation from President Droupadi Murmu created a buzz on social media Tuesday. Users jocularly wondered if the name of institutions such as the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO), the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) and the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) will be changed. The lyrics "Bharat Kaa Rahane Waalaa Hoon, Bharat Kee Baat Sunaataa Hoon" a popular song from Manoj Kumar starrer Purab Aur Paschim also trended on X with the hashtag "Bharat" (in Hindi and English). "Toughest think to do ISRO to BISRO," a user on X said, while others put out lists of what the abbreviations of names of institutes having India or Indian in them would look like -- "IIM-BIM, IIT-BIT, IISc-BISC, AIIMS-ABIMS, RBI-RBB". "New abbreviation of BCCI would be Bharat Controlling Cricket Internationally," posted another user in lighter vein. Former cricketer Virender Sehwag posted on X, "I have always believed a name should be one which instills pride in us. We are Bhartiya, India is a name given by the British & it has been long overdue to get our original name 'Bharat' back officially. I urge the @BCCI @JayShah to ensure that this World Cup our players have Bharat on our chest".

GYANVAPI ROW Management opposes ASI plea for more time

Varanasi (UP), Sept 5: The Gyanvapi mosque management committee has objected to the Archeological Survey of India (ASI) seeking eight more weeks to complete the survey of the complex.

The Varanasi district court had July 21 directed the ASI to conduct a "detailed scientific survey" -- including excavations, wherever necessary -- to determine if the Gyanvapi mosque located next to the Kashi Vishwanath temple is built upon a temple.

The Muslim side in the case has claimed the ASI is digging in the basement and other places in the Gyanvapi complex without permission, and is removing the debris next to the western wall, endangering the structure.

Government counsel Rajesh Mishra said the ASI has given an application in the court of District Judge A K Vishvesh seeking an eight-week extension for the survey.

The Anjanam Intejamia Masjid Committee filed its objection Monday.

According to Mishra, the Muslim side has objected to the ASI seeking extra time for the removal of debris and garbage and argued that the court only ordered it to survey the premises through scientific methods.

23 ACCUSED SENTENCED TO 10 YEARS IN JAIL

Lucknow/Kanpur (UP), Sept 5: A special court Tuesday sentenced 23 accused to 10 years in jail in connection with the 2020 killing of eight policemen, including a DSP, in an ambush by the Vikas Dubey gang in Bikru village, a senior police official said.

Seven other accused were acquitted in the case by the special Gangster Act court in Kanpur Dehat district, Special Director General (Law and Order) Prashant Kumar said in a statement issued in Lucknow.

The court in Mati in Kanpur Dehat district gave its final judgement in the Bikru case September 5, 2023 and sentenced 23 out of the 30 accused persons to 10 years of imprisonment. It

also imposed a fine of Rs 50,000 on each of them, it said. Mati is the district headquarters of Kanpur Dehat district.

Slain gangster Vikas Dubey's aide Shyamu Bajpai (35) and his alleged financier Jaikanth Bajpai alias Jay (37) are among the 23 accused who were sentenced by Additional District Judge-5 Durgesh.

Earlier, 41 people including Vikas Dubey's close aides Daya Shankar Agnihotri, Shyamu Bajpai, Jahan Yadav, Shashikant Panday, Shivam Dubey, Gopal Saini, Heeru Dubey, Shiv Tiwari, Vishnu Pal, and Ram Singh were

either arrested by the Special Task Force and Kanpur police or surrendered before the court, Additional DCP West (Kanpur) Lakhansingh Yadav said.

While the Gangster Act was invoked against 30 of them, the remaining 11, including some policemen and women, were not booked under the law, he said.

Eight policemen, including Deputy Superintendent of Police (DSP) Devendra Mishra, were ambushed in Kanpur's Bikru village when they were on their way to arrest Vikas Dubey shortly after midnight July 3, 2020.

High voter turnout in Kerala, Tripura, West Bengal seats

Lucknow/Agartala, Sept 5: High voter turnout was recorded in most of the seven assembly constituencies in six states where by-election was held Tuesday, with Dhanpur in Tripura at the top with over 89 per cent voting.

Six persons were injured in a stray incidents of violence in the northeastern state.

In Dhupguri in West Bengal and Puthuppally in Kerala, where the INDIA bloc constituents were up against each other, the voting was around 76 per cent and nearly 73 per cent respectively. Current climate policies not enough to meet Paris goals: Study

New Delhi, Sept 5: Attempts to pursue "green growth" in high-income countries will not deliver the emission reductions required to meet the climate targets and fairness principles of the

Paris Agreement, according to a study.

The study, published recently in The Lancet Planetary Health journal, shows that if current trends continue, even the 11 high-income countries that have "decoupled" carbon emissions from gross domestic product (GDP) growth would on average take over 200 years to get their emissions close to zero.

These countries would emit more than 27-times their fair share of the "global carbon budget" that must not be exceeded if we are to avert catastrophic warming beyond 1.5 degrees Celsius, as required by the Paris Agreement.

The researchers argue that the pursuit of economic growth in high-income countries is at odds with internationally agreed climate targets, and call for trans-

formative "post-growth" climate policy centred around sufficiency, fairness, and wellbeing. The study compared carbon emission reductions in these countries with the reductions required under the Paris Agreement. "There is nothing green about economic growth in high-income countries," said lead author of the study, Jefim Vogel, from the University of Leeds, UK.

"It is a recipe for climate breakdown and further climate injustice. Calling such highly insufficient emission reductions 'green growth' is misleading, it is essentially greenwashing," Vogel said.

Continued economic growth in high-income countries is at odds with the twin goal of averting catastrophic climate breakdown and upholding fairness principles that protect develop-

ment prospects in lower-income countries, the researchers said. The study identified 11 high-income countries that

achieved "absolute decoupling" -- decreasing CO2 emissions alongside increasing GDP -- between 2013 and 2019, which were Australia, Austria, Belgium, Canada, Denmark, France, Germany, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, Sweden, and the UK.

For each country, it compares "business-as-usual" future emission reduction rates to the "Paris-compliant" rates needed to comply with the country's "fair-share" or population-proportionate share of the respective global carbon budget that must not be exceeded if we are to limit global warming to 1.5 degrees Celsius or even just to 1.7 degrees Celsius.

emission reductions anywhere near fast enough to be Paris-compliant.

At current rates, these countries would on average take over 200 years to get their emissions close to zero, and would emit more than 27 times their fair share of the global carbon budget for 1.5 degrees Celsius, they said.

The scale of the gap between achieved and Paris-compliant emission reductions is dramatic. Among the 11 high-income countries examined, emission reductions between 2013 and 2019 were on average just 1.6 per cent per year, the researchers said.

By contrast, reduction rates of 30 per cent per year are needed by 2025 for countries to comply with their fair-shares of the global carbon budget for 1.5 degrees Celsius, they added.

Imran Khan's party president rearrested

Islamabad: Parvez Elahi, the president of former Prime Minister Imran Khan's party, was rearrested Tuesday soon after the Islamabad High Court suspended his detention and ordered his release. The Islamabad police in a post on X said the former Punjab province chief minister was arrested in a terror case. It posted the update soon after saying that the 77-year-old Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) leader was released after the high court's order. Elahi is among several PTI leaders and workers arrested amid the state's crackdown on the PTI leadership following the May 9 riots during protests over party chief Khan being whisked away by paramilitary personnel at the Islamabad High Court (IHC) premises.

Four sentenced to death in Pak

Lahore: A Pakistani court has handed down death sentences to four youths for committing blasphemy on social media, the country's top investigating agency said Friday. Additional District Sessions Judge (Rawalpindi) Ahsan Mahmood Malik sentenced the four to death on Monday for posting blasphemous material on Facebook. Each of them has also been handed a 28-year jail term for committing blasphemy against the Quran as well, the Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) said. However, a fifth suspect, Usman Liaqat, was handed seven years of imprisonment.

Israel opens new embassy in Bahrain

Manama: Israel opened its new embassy in Bahrain, days ahead of the three-year anniversary of a US-brokered deal in which the kingdom agreed to normalise relations with Israel, the media reported. The embassy was officially inaugurated in the presence of visiting Israeli Foreign Minister Eli Cohen, the Bahrain News Agency quoted Bahraini Foreign Minister Abdullah bin Rashid Al Zayani as saying on Monday. The Bahraini top diplomat said that "the historic step is another important milestone in relations between the two countries".

Palestinian killed

Ramallah: Israeli troops shot and killed a Palestinian in overnight clashes at a West Bank refugee camp, amid rising tension in the region, sources said Tuesday. An Israeli military spokesperson said that army and paramilitary Border Police forces, accompanied by a bulldozer, raided the Nur Shams refugee camp near the city of Tulkarm, reports Xinhua news agency.

Will work with all parties for G20 Summit success: China

Beijing, Sept 5: China Tuesday said it has supported India in hosting this year's G20 Summit and it's ready to work with all parties to push for the success of the high-profile global conference in New Delhi this week.

Two detained for damaging Great Wall



Beijing, Sept 5: Authorities in China's Shanxi province have detained two people for allegedly damaging a section of the Great Wall with an excavator, according to state media.

On Monday, state broadcaster CCTV reported that the authorities in Youyu county said they received a notification on August 24 that a gap in the wall was created in Yangqianhe township.

After an investigation, police found a 38-year-old man and a 55-year-old woman had used an excavator to breach the wall in order to create a shortcut to pass through, causing "irreversible" damage to the integrity and safety of that portion of the wall, CNN quoted the broadcaster as saying.

Police said the investigation was ongoing. The area, known as the 32nd Great Wall, is one of the surviving complete walls and watch towers dated back to the Ming dynasty (1368-1644) and is listed as a provincial cultural relic site. The Great Wall was designated a Unesco World Heritage Site in 1987.



Economic crisis: Pak Army chief steps in

Karachi, Sept 5: Signalling the powerful military's key role in Pakistan, army chief General Asim Munir has held a series of meetings with the business community, promising all-out efforts to bring in foreign investment worth billions of dollars to the cash-strapped country.

Gen Munir held a marathon four-hour meeting Saturday with 50-odd prominent businessmen, including Zubair Motiwala, chairman, Businessmen Group (BMG), Tariq Yousuf, president, Karachi Chamber of Commerce and Industry and Irfan Iqbal Sheikh, president of the Federation of Pakistan Chambers of Commerce & Industry (FPCCI).

The meeting came on the back of a traders' strike Saturday protesting the soaring cost of living, including higher fuel and utility bills and record depreciation of the Pakistan rupee against the US dollar.

The army chief updated the business community about his recent visit to Saudi Arabia and said Saudi Crown Prince Mohammad Bin Salman assured him of investing USD 25 billion in Pakistan under the Special Investment Facilitation Council (SIFC), the Dawn newspaper reported Tuesday.

In the same meeting, Gen Munir also "assured businessmen of bringing USD 25-30 billion investment from Qatar and Kuwait in his next visit." In another report by the Geo News website, FPCCI president Sheikh said that the army chief had told the business community that Saudi Arabia had assured Pakistan of investment in IT,

Kim, Putin plan to meet in Russia

Seoul, Sept 5: North Korean leader Kim Jong Un expects to make a rare trip abroad to meet with President Vladimir Putin in Russia to discuss providing arms to Moscow for its war in Ukraine, the United States said Monday.

Ukraine is pushing a highly-scrutinised counteroffensive in both the south and east that Putin on Monday dismissed as a failure, though Moscow appears eager to urgently secure more military supplies to bolster its forces.

The White House's National Security Council (NSC) spokeswoman Adrienne Watson said that "arms negotiations between Russia and the DPRK are actively advancing," using an acronym for North Korea. "We have information that Kim Jong Un expects these dis-

cussions to continue, to include leader-level diplomatic engagement in Russia," she added. The United States last week warned that Russia was already in secret talks with the North to acquire a range of munitions and supplies for Moscow's war effort.

Kim is likely to head by armored train later this month to Vladivostok, on Russia's Pacific coast not far from North Korea, to meet with Putin, according to The New York Times. The paper said Putin wanted artillery shells and antitank missiles from North Korea, and Kim could even travel to Moscow, but that was uncertain.

Kim is reported to be seeking advanced technology for satellites and nuclear-powered submarines as well as food aid for his impoverished nation. An official at Seoul's unification ministry, which handles inter-Korean relations, said various developments "indicated" the growing possibility of an arms deal between Pyongyang and Moscow.

"Any form of cooperation between North Korea and neighboring countries must be conducted in a way that does not undermine international norms and peace," he said.

China to deploy most powerful sky survey telescope

Beijing, Sept 5: China will soon put into operation a wide-field survey telescope, set to be the most powerful sky survey telescope in the Northern Hemisphere, that will help scientists monitor dynamic astronomical events and carry out the time domain astronomical observation research, the official media reported Tuesday.

The telescope was jointly developed by the University of Science and Technology of China and the Purple Mountain Observatory under the Chinese Academy of Sciences.

The telescope will likely start operation in mid-September, helping scientists monitor the dynamic astronomical events and carrying out the time domain astronomical observation research, according to the observatory, Xinhua news agency reported.

Measuring 2.5 meters in diameter, the Wide Field Survey Telescope (WFST) is now the largest time-domain survey facility in the Northern Hemisphere, it said. "After the WFST becomes fully operational, we can use it to detect some very faint and distant celestial signals, including those from distant



galaxies and galaxy clusters outside the Milky Way," said Lou Zheng, chief engineer of the observatory's Qinghai observation station.

It will become the most powerful sky survey telescope in the Northern Hemisphere, said Kong Xu, the project's chief designer at the University of Science and

Technology of China."The use of the WFST will greatly improve China's near-Earth object monitoring and early warning capabilities." In 2022, the telescope was nicknamed after the ancient Chinese philosopher Mozi, or Micius, who is said to be the first in history to conduct optical experi-

TURKEY, GREECE TO REVIVE TALKS

Construction of the telescope project started in July 2019 in Lenghu Town, which has an average altitude of approximately 4,000 meters. The town is also known as China's "Mars Camp" due to its eerily eroded desert landscape that resembles the surface of the red planet.

The Lenghu area has the advantages of the plateau region's clear night skies, stable atmospheric conditions, dry climate, and less artificial light pollution, meaning it has the potential to become one of the best sites for stargazing in the Eurasian continent.

Since 2020, Lenghu has attracted 11 scientific research institutions and 12 telescope projects, with a total investment of 2.7 billion yuan (about 370 million US dollars). On completion, the town will become the largest astronomical observation base in Asia, said the observatory.

Ankara: The foreign ministers of Greece and Turkey agreed Tuesday to revive high-level contacts between their countries and seek "new approaches" to problems as part of efforts to improve ties between the two NATO allies who are at loggerheads over a string of decades-old disputes. Discussions between Greece's Giorgos Gerapetritis and Turkey's Hakan Fidan were held in a friendlier climate triggered by Greece sending assistance to Turkey following a devastating earthquake earlier this year, and Turkey offering condolences after a deadly train accident in Greece. "We have entered a new and positive period in our relations with Greece," Fidan told journalists at the end of their talks. "We reiterated our belief that our problems will be resolved through a constructive dialogue between the two neighbours and allies." The meeting came as Ankara, in the throes of an economic downturn, is seeking a reset of its often-troubled relations with Western nations.

Inflation to remain elevated: S&P

New Delhi, Sept 5: Inflation in India is likely to remain elevated in the near terms but government policies will prevent it from rising further, S&P Global Ratings Economist (Asia Pacific) Vishrut Rana said Tuesday.

In July, the consumer price index based retail inflation spiked to 15-month high of 7.44 per cent in July, with specific food commodities mainly driving the increase.

Speaking at the 'Monthly Asia-Pacific Credit Focus' webinar, Rana said in India the monsoon has been very patchy and overall rain was about 11 per cent below normal.

"That is a significant concern as it can affect grain prices in India over next few months," he said.

The government has already imposed export curbs on rice and levied a 40 per cent export duty on onions to make available enough stock in local market ahead of the festive season.

"Supplies remain very strong and the government is likely to step in to prevent significant increase in commodity, wheat and rice prices. It will help to keep



food price inflation little bit low," Rana said.

Tomato prices, which had skyrocketed in July, had started cooling in late August.

The significant spike in vegetable prices is coming down, Rana said.

"Overall, the inflation environment for India will depend on energy prices. Food prices will remain elevated but is unlikely to go up because of public policies. We expect overall inflation to remain elevated but not rising further for India over the next few months," Rana added.

The finance ministry in its monthly report had last month said that price pressure on food items is expected to be

transitory, but the government and RBI need to step up vigil to deal with elevated inflationary pressure.

Going forward, while domestic consumption and investment demand are expected to continue driving growth, global and regional uncertainties and domestic disruptions may keep inflationary pressures elevated for the coming months, warranting greater vigilance by the government and the RBI, it had said.

RBI focused to bring down inflation: Das

New Delhi: Reserve Bank Governor Shaktikanta Das Tuesday said the central bank is firmly focused on bringing down inflation to 4 per cent and remains prepared to undertake policy responses to deal with supply shocks, which have become more frequent with profound implications. The current episode of high global inflation and preceding overlapping shocks of the pandemic and Russia-Ukraine war have raised significant issues and challenges for the conduct of monetary policy, the governor said in a speech on 'Art of Monetary Policy Making: The Indian Context' at Delhi School of Economics (DSE) Diamond Jubilee Distinguished Lecture. He said the monetary policy framework in India has evolved in line with the developments in theory and country practices, the changing nature of the economy and developments in financial markets. Within the broad objectives, the relative emphasis on inflation, growth and financial stability has, however, varied across monetary policy regimes since independence.

RBI plans to widen use of digital currency

New Delhi, Sept 5: Reserve Bank is planning to extend wholesale Central Bank Digital Currency (CBDC) as token for interbank borrowing or call money market, RBI sources said Tuesday.

The pilot in wholesale segment, known as the Digital Rupee-Wholesale, was launched November 1, 2022, with use case being limited to the settlement of secondary market transactions in government securities.

"RBI is now planning to go into interbank borrowing market. The purpose of wholesale CBDC has been to try out different technologies...Experimenting on technology is relatively easier for wholesale pilot because participants are related," RBI sources said.

The introduction of CBDC was announced in the Union Budget 2022-23, by Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman and necessary amendments to the relevant section of the RBI Act, 1934 was made with the passage of the Finance Bill 2022.

The RBI began the pilot project wholesale CBDC and picked up nine banks - State Bank of India, Bank of Baroda, Union Bank of India, HDFC Bank, ICICI Bank, Kotak Mahindra Bank, YES Bank, IDFC First Bank, and HSBC.

Besides, RBI has already rolled out a pilot in the retail version of the CBDC, December 1, 2022. It is in the form of a digital token that represents legal tender.

It is being issued in the same denominations as the paper currency and coins. It is being distributed through financial intermediaries, i.e., the banks.

With regard to RuPay, sources said no instructions have been given to promote this. However, sources said, this has to be popularised by making it attractive. Asked when CBDC pilot ends,

sources said, there is no deadline as of now and 10.83 crore transactions amounting to ₹24,000 crore witnessed in August.

Meanwhile, RBI will showcase various digital initiatives in the financial sector at the exhibition pavilion at the G20 Summit later this week.

These include Public Tech Platform (PTP) for Frictionless Credit, CBDC, UPI One World, RuPay On-The-Go, and Bharat Bill Payment System.

At Public Tech Platform, visitors can experience an interactive demonstration of the entire process i.e., from onboarding to sanction and disbursement of the KCC and dairy loans in an entirely digital manner in a few minutes, revolutionising rural credit.

Sources said going forward this platform can be used for distribution of small ticket loans like MSME, personal loans etc.

Besides, the central bank will showcase an informational video on the RBI's digital rupee and its journey and there would be live digital rupee transactions demonstrated by select banks which are participating in the pilot.

UPI One World would enable visitors to be on boarded to UPI without having a bank account in India.

RuPay On-The-Go would allow customers to carry out contactless payment transactions through accessories they wear (watch, ring) or use (key chain) every day and highlight the adaptability of the domestic card scheme associated products at par with such global products.

BBPS (Bharat Bill Payment System) cross-border bill payment will highlight the adaptability of the BBPS platform to integrate with fintechs and conventional financial players to facilitate domestic as well as cross-border payment transactions.

BSE firms' m-cap hits all-time high

New Delhi: The market capitalisation of BSE-listed companies hit a fresh all-time high of ₹316.64 lakh crore Tuesday as the benchmark Sensex logged its third day of rally amid strong macroeconomic data. In three days, the benchmark index has gained 948.85 points, or 1.46 per cent. Helped by the optimistic trend in equities, the market capitalisation of BSE-listed firms reached a new lifetime peak of ₹3,16,64,085.18 crore. Investors' wealth also went up by ₹7 lakh crore in the three days of market gain. "While markets extended gains for the third straight session, the mood was more or less range-bound with a positive bias as US markets were shut on Monday and investors preferred to take selective bets. One needs to be watchful about the sharp volatility in rupee, which could impact FI flows going ahead," Shrikant Chouhan, Head of Research (Retail), Kotak Securities Ltd, said.

AI to induct 2 A350 planes

New Delhi: Air India will induct two A350 aircraft this year for which it has received DGCA approval and expects to have six such planes in its fleet by the end of March 2024, according to officials. Steered by the Tata Group, the loss-making Air India is expanding its fleet as well as operations. In February, the carrier placed an order for 470 aircraft, including 40 A350-900/1000 planes. The officials in the know said, Air India has received the Letter of Type Acceptance (LoTA) from the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) for inducting two A350 aircraft - A350-900 and A350-1000. Both planes will be powered by Rolls Royce engines. An official at the airline said it will be inducting the two wide body aircraft this year.

JFSL to be out of NSE indices

New Delhi: Jio Financial Services Limited, the demerged financial services unit of Reliance Industries, will be excluded from various indices of NSE, including the benchmark Nifty 50, from September 7. Shares of Jio Financial got listed on the stock exchanges August 21, after its spin-off from parent Reliance Industries. In accordance with the index methodology, as JIOFIN has not hit price band on two consecutive trading days on September 4 and 5 at NSE, the Index Maintenance Sub Committee (Equity) of NSE Indices Ltd has decided to exclude JIOFIN from various indices effective from September 7, 2023 (close of September 6, 2023), as per a statement by NSE Indices Ltd.

Cement, Maruti, HDFC Bank, Wipro, State Bank of India and NTPC were among the laggards.

In the broader market, the BSE midcap jumped 1.09 per cent, and smallcap gained 0.61 per cent. Sectorally, healthcare rallied 1.29 per cent, realty climbed 1.08 per cent, energy (1.01 per cent), consumer durables (0.90 per cent), oil & gas (0.83 per cent) and services (0.72 per cent).

Financial Services, telecommunication and bankex were the laggards. In Asian markets, Tokyo settled in the green, while Seoul, Shanghai and Hong Kong ended in the negative territory.

The rupee plunged by 35 paise to close at 83.06 (provisional) against the US dollar on Tuesday, amid a strong American currency and higher crude oil prices.

According to a survey, manufacturing activities in India gained momentum in August.

Sebi to have 1-hr trade settlements

FROM ONE DAY TO ONE HOUR TO INSTANTANEOUS IS THE ROADMAP

Mumbai, Sept 5: Markets regulator Sebi will introduce one-hour trade settlements by the end of this fiscal, in the run up to making such processes instantaneous, a top official said Tuesday.

Amid concerns raised by certain foreign portfolio investors on the shortening of the settlement cycles citing forex-related worries, the official made it clear that faster settlements are optional and investors can opt out.

Securities and Exchange Board of India (Sebi) has adopted a roadmap towards realising its aim of making trade settlements instantaneous, the official told reporters.

"From one day to one hour to instantaneous is the roadmap," the official said, adding one hour settlements are much quicker to implement than instantaneous.

The official said technology for one hour trade settlements already exists and the regulator is confident about the same, while the instantaneous settlements need more technology development.

At present, Sebi is thinking of rolling out the one hour trade set-



tlement for all investors by March next year, and is looking at a time frame of 6-8 months more for the instantaneous settlements, the official said.

The Application Supported by Blocked Amount (ASBA)-like facility for secondary markets will start by January for all investors and it will take another couple of months for the one-hour cycle to set-in after that, the official said.

Addressing investor concerns, the official said the early settlement facility will be optional for investors and they can opt out of it and stressed that data analysis does not indicate any problems on the trading side if some investors were to opt out.

"If the FPIs don't want to do that (instantaneous), they're free to do that. And we've looked at the matching data (on) whose trade matches with whom. So,

our belief based on that data is that it will not be a problem for anybody," the official said.

Elaborating on the recently issued proposals to tackle the menace of financial influencers, the official said Sebi is acting keeping the future in mind and its intent is only to get into a situation if a regulated entity comes into the picture.

Separately, the markets regulator is also keeping tabs on activities with the help of states-law enforcement agencies, the official said.

SEHWAG'S REQUEST

New Delhi: Former India cricketer Virender Sehwag Tuesday urged the BCCI to have "Bharat", instead of India, inscribed on the jerseys of the national team players in the upcoming ODI World Cup. Sehwag tagged BCCI secretary Jay Shah and suggested that the players wear a jersey with Bharat written on it. "I have always believed a name should be one which instills pride in us. We are Bhartiya, India is a name given by the British and it has been long overdue to get our original name 'Bharat' back officially. I urge the BCCI (secretary) Jay Shah to ensure that in this World Cup our players have Bharat on our chest," Sehwag posted on X. In another post, he wrote, "Team India nahin #TeamBharat. This World Cup as we cheer for Kohli, Rohit, Bumrah, Jaddu, may we have Bharat in our hearts and the players wear jersey which has 'Bharat' @JayShah." Sehwag, a swashbuckling opener of his time, also cited examples of other nations who had changed their names. "In the 1996 World Cup, Netherlands came to play in the World Cup in Bharat as Holland. In 2003, when we met them, they were The Netherlands and continue to be so. Burma have changed the name given by the British back to Myanmar. And many others have gone back to their original name," he added in another tweet.

Shreyas Iyer, who played against Pakistan in the Asia Cup, occupied one spot in the middle-order, and there was a two-way tie for the remaining position between Suryakumar Yadav and Tilak Varma.

However, Suryakumar was preferred over the youngster despite the former not having a good run in the ODIs. The 32-year-old floundered in the three-match ODI series against West Indies recently, but the selectors took into account the Mumbaier's ability to explode with the bat.

In view of the players who missed out on the selection such as Samson and Tilak, Rohit said the management at times will have to take tough calls for the benefit of the team.

On the bowling front, the selectors went on expected lines picking up Jasprit Bumrah, Mohammed Siraj and Mohammed Shami as three front-line pacers. Bumrah has recently returned from a long injury lay-off during the T20I series against Ireland, and he is also a part of India's Asia Cup squad.

Vice-captain Hardik Pandya

and Shardul Thakur will give India the option of two more pacers. As expected, India opted for left-arm wrist spinner Kuldeep Yadav, Ravindra Jadeja and Axar Patel, the left-arm spinners, in the squad.

Hence, veteran leg-spinner Yuzvendra Chahal continued to be on the sidelines, while the absence of R Ashwin and Washington Sundar ensured that India will not have the services of an off-spinner during the World Cup.

Rohit said the decision to go ahead with Thakur and Axar aligned with the team's desire to attain as much balance as possible. The Indian captain also hoped that players like Thakur and Axar will be able to provide some crucial runs in the back-end of the innings which at times can be a deciding factor.

Qinwen stuns Jabeur, enters last 8

New York, Sept 5: Zheng Qinwen routed last year's US Open runner-up Ons Jabeur 6-2, 6-4 Monday to move into the quarterfinals at Flushing Meadows for her deepest run ever in a Grand Slam tournament.

Zheng, who is seeded No.23, becomes the first Chinese player to reach the quarterfinals of the US Open since Wang Qiang in 2019. She did it by overpowering the fifth-seeded Tunisian with an aggressive baseline game that produced 21 winners.

For Jabeur, who committed 33 unforced errors and has appeared ill at times during her US Open run, it was a disappointing finish after reaching the finals of three of the last five Grand Slam events, including the last two Wimbledons.

Zheng's win means three of last year's four US Open singles finalists are gone, leaving only second-seeded Aryna Sabalenka, a Belarusian who will take over the No.1 spot in the WTA rankings because of the fourth-round loss by No.1 seed Iga Swiatek.

Zheng will next play Sabalenka. That will give Zheng the chance to play for more history — to equal the best runs ever by Chinese players at the US Open, semifinals appearances by Peng Shuai in 2014 and Li Na in 2013.

Earlier, Carlos Alcaraz had little trouble beating unseeded Matteo Arnaldi 6-3, 6-3, 6-4 to reach the quarterfinals, the third time in as many appearances he's gotten at least that far at Flushing Meadows.

The top-seeded Alcaraz, who is seeking to defend his title after winning Wimbledon in July, said afterward that he now prefers hard courts over any other surface and also likes playing under the Arthur Ashe Stadium roof.

Eighth-seeded Andrey Rublev of Russia slugged his way past Jack Draper of Britain 6-3, 3-6, 6-3, 6-4 to advance to his fourth US Open quarterfinals and the ninth Grand Slam quarterfinals of his career. He will face third-seeded Daniil Medvedev, a 2-6, 6-4, 6-1, 6-2 winner over Alex de Minaur.

Earlier, Madison Keys overpowered fellow American Jessica Pegula 6-1, 6-3 in just over an hour to book her spot in the quarterfinals. Keys' quarterfinals opponent will be ninth-seeded Marketa Vondrousova of the Czech Republic.

Sabalenka through

Sabalenka is going to be the No.1 player in the WTA rankings next week, replacing Swiatek there. That much is certain. The way Sabalenka is playing at the moment, she might very well supplant Swiatek as the US Open champion, too.

In Sabalenka's first match since being assured of rising to the top of women's tennis, she showed off the power-based game that allows her to dominate so many opponents, overwhelming No.13 seed Kasatkina Monday night in Arthur Ashe Stadium to advance to her fifth consecutive major quarterfinal.

FAN EJECTED

New York: A fan was ejected from a US Open match early Tuesday morning after German player Alexander Zverev complained the man used language from Adolf Hitler's Nazi regime. Zverev was serving at 2-2 in the fourth set of his match against No.6 Jannik Sinner when he suddenly went to chair umpire James Keothavong and pointed toward the fan, who was sitting in a section behind the umpire. "He just said the most famous Hitler phrase there is in this world," Zverev told Keothavong. "It's not acceptable." Keothavong turned backwards and asked the fan to identify himself, then asked fans to be respectful to both players. Then, during the changeover shortly after Zverev held serve, the fan was identified by spectators seated near him, and he was removed by security. Zverev said after the match that he's had fans make derogatory comments before, but not involving Hitler. "He started singing the anthem of Hitler that was back in the day. It was Deutschland über alles' and it was a bit too much," Zverev said.

Pallekele (Sri Lanka), Sept 5: The inclusion of wicketkeeper-batter KL Rahul, whose fitness was under scrutiny, headlined the announcement of India's 15-member World Cup squad Tuesday, as the selectors strived for all-round balance.

Chief selector Ajit Agarkar said there was no concern about Rahul's fitness, though he did not travel to Sri Lanka for India's group stage Asia Cup matches. Rahul is scheduled to reach Sri Lanka ahead of India's Super 4 matches, starting September 9 against Pakistan. Agarkar said the 31-year-old managed to prove his fitness at the NCA on both batting and wicket-keeping counts.

The selectors also named Ishan Kishan as the second wicket-keeper-batter, and captain Rohit Sharma did not rule out the possibility of playing both Kishan and Rahul in the 11 if the situation warrants so.

The selection of both Rahul and Kishan meant that there was no place for Sanju Samson, who is currently in Sri Lanka as a travelling reserve for the Asia Cup.

Sri Lanka break Afghan hearts in thrilling match

Lahore, Sept 5: Mohammad Nabi's game changing 65 off 32 balls came to nothing as Sri Lanka pulled off a thrilling two-run win over an audacious Afghanistan to qualify for the Super4s of the Asia Cup, here Tuesday.

Kusal Mendis' high-quality 92 had pushed Sri Lanka to 291 for eight at the Gaddafi Stadium. Due to their inferior run rate, Afghanistan needed to chase down 292 in 37.1 overs and Nabi put them on the cusp of a famous win by smashing the fastest half century by an Afghanistan batter in ODIs.

In what turned out to be a riveting finish, the qualifying equation came down to 15 runs needed off seven balls and Rashid Khan increased the heart rate on either side of the dressing rooms by finding three fours off left-arm spinner Dunith Wellalage in the 37th over.

At that tense moment, Afghanistan needed three runs off the first ball of the 38th over with two wickets in hand. However, Mujeeb Zadran's wicket on the first ball of the over caused heartbreak in the Afghanistan camp with the disappointment written all over the players' faces in the dressing room.

Such was the level of their dejection was that they were not alert enough to know that Afghanistan still had a chance if they hit a six of the following

three balls of the 38th over. Rashid was left stranded at the end with Fazalhaq Farooqi trapped in front by Dhananjaya de Silva.

Following the close finish, Sri Lanka became the second team to qualify for Super4s from Group B after Bangladesh.

Afghanistan had lost their top three for 50 runs before Nabi produced an innings to remember while batting alongside skipper Hashamatullah Shahidi (59). His special effort comprised five sixes and half a dozen boundaries.

Earlier, Sri Lanka openers Pathum Nissanka (41) and Dimuth Karunaratne (32) gave a brisk start to the innings before being dismissed by medium pacer Gulbadin Naib. Batting at No.3, Mendis then put Sri Lanka on course for a 300 plus total with a near flawless effort comprising six boundaries and three sixes.

His 102-run stand with Charith Asalanka (36 off 43) further consolidated for Sri Lanka. In the end, Sri Lanka did well to get close to the 300-mark thanks to a 64-run stand for the eighth wicket between Maheesh Theekshana (28) and Dunith Wellalage (33 n.o).

Hima Das provisionally suspended

New Delhi, Sept 5: Star India sprinter Hima Das has been provisionally suspended by the National Anti-Doping Agency (NADA) for three whereabouts failures in 12 months, according to sources.

The 23-year-old Assam runner has not been named in the Hangzhou Asian Games team due to an injury she had sustained earlier this year.

"Yes, she has committed three whereabouts failures in one year period and so she has been provisionally suspended by the NADA," an Indian team official told PTI on conditions of anonymity.

Hima, who has already left the national camp, faces a maximum two-year ban, which can be reduced to a minimum of one year depending on the degree of her fault.

Under the World Athletics Anti-Doping (WADA) rules, any combination of three whereabouts failures — filing failure and/or missed test — within a period of 12 months constitute an anti-doping rule violation. The details of whether Hima's whereabouts failure related to filing or missed test is not known.

Athletes included in the



Registered Testing Pool (RTP) must provide full address for their overnight location, the name and full address of each location where they train, work or conduct other regular scheduled activities, as well as the usual time-frames of each activity.

RTP athletes must also identify a 60-minute window and location for each day of the quarter, during which they must be available for testing. Failure to comply with whereabouts and testing obligations will result in a whereabouts failure.

A lower back problem has been troubling Hima for the past few years. Indian athletics chief coach Radhakrishnan Nair had earlier said that Hima had suffered a hamstring injury too in April just before a Grand Prix event in Bangalore, and she has been on "medical investigation and treatment".

That was why Hima missed the Federation Cup in Ranchi in May and the National Inter-State Championship, which was the final selection event for the Asian Games, in June in Bhubaneswar.

PRANNOY, SEN DISAPPOINT, MAKE FIRST ROUND EXITS

Priyanshu Rajawat then went down 13-21, 24-26 to Indonesia's Shesar Hiren Rhustavito.

With that, the Indian challenge ended in the men's singles.

The women's doubles pair of Treasa Jolly and Gayatri Gopichand lost to top seeds Chen Qing Chen and Jia Yi Fan of China 18-21, 11-21. There is no Indian in the women's singles after star shuttler PV Sindhu pulled out in a last-minute decision to focus on the upcoming Asian Games.



Asia Cup: Super Four, final matches to stay in Colombo

Colombo, Sept 5: The Asian Cricket Council (ACC) Tuesday decided to keep the Asia Cup Super 4 and final matches in Colombo itself as the weather in the Sri Lankan capital has shown signs of improvement.

It has been speculated over the last few days that the Super 4 and final games of the Asia Cup could be shifted to Hambantota after heavy rains lashed Colombo.

The PTI has been informed that the ACC held parleys with Sri Lanka Cricket (SLC), hosts Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) and the official broadcaster before arriving at the decision to keep the matches in Colombo itself. The broadcaster too has explained the difficulties to relocate their equipment and staff to Hambantota, a deep Southern district, at such a short notice.

In fact, it was SLC who suggested Hambantota as an alternate venue for the five Asia Cup Super 4 matches and the final as the city has been experiencing a drought over the last few weeks.

The Sri Lanka-leg of Super 4 will be started with a game between India and Pakistan



September 10 at the R Premadasa Stadium. This will be the second time India will take on Pakistan in the Asia Cup. The league match between the two sides was rained off.

The ACC also briefly dabbled with the idea of shifting the matches to Pallekele and Dambulla only to abandon it later. While Pallekele too has been experiencing heavy rains, the Rangiri International Stadium in Dambulla is under maintenance to install new floodlights and a few other facilities.

Both of India's group matches were affected by rain. The much anticipated India-Pakistan clash at the Pallekele stadium in Kandy was called off after one innings due to heavy downpour Saturday, while India's match against Nepal Monday was also truncated due to rain.

India eves finish sixth, mixed pairs bow out

PYEONGCHANG (South Korea): The Indian women's team finished sixth in the Asian Table Tennis Championships after being blanked 0-3 by Thailand here Tuesday. The Indians beat Singapore 3-2 in a 5-8 positions match before going down to Thailand in the fifth-position showdown. The women's team was comprised of Manika Batra Sreeja Akula and Ayhika Mukerjee. The paddlers faltered in the mixed doubles too. G Sathiyam and Manika went down 2-3 to Thai pair, Phakpoom Sanguansin and Orawan Paranang. Harmeet Desai and Sreeja Akula followed suit and lost to the top-seeded Japanese pair of Tomokazu Harimoto and Hina Hayata 0-3.

India clubbed with Egypt, Switzerland, Jamaica

NEW DELHI: Reigning Asian champions India have been clubbed alongside Egypt, Switzerland, and Jamaica in Pool B of the upcoming FIH Men's Hockey5s World Cup slated from January 24-31 in Muscat. Sixteen national teams will compete in the inaugural edition of the tournament and they have been divided into four groups of four teams each. India earned their qualification after beating Pakistan at the inaugural Men's Hockey5s Asia Cup. The Netherlands have been drawn with Pakistan, Poland and Nigeria in Pool A. Australia, New Zealand, Trinidad & Tobago and Kenya are placed in Pool C, while hosts Oman will face Malaysia, the United States and Fiji in Pool D.

Shubham finishes 3rd

RIYADH: Making his debut at the World Championships, Indian weightlifter Shubham Todkar finished third in Group D of the men's 61kg event here. The 26-year-old national champion from Maharashtra lifted a total of 269kg (119kg+150kg), which was six kilograms better than his Asian Championships effort (263kg) in May and 10kg heavier than his 259kg lift that fetched him a gold medal at the Commonwealth Championships in July. As expected, Tokyo silver medalist and former World Champion Mirabai Chanu, who is saving her best for the Asian Games later this month, withdrew after weighing-in for the women's 49kg event, where she was placed in Group D.
