

MAN-ELEPHANT CONFLICT Jumbo electrocuted; farmer trampled

Dhenkanal, Oct 15: In two separate incidents, an elephant trampled a farmer to death in Odapada block of Dhenkanal district, while an elephant was electrocuted in Sundargarh district Sunday.

The deceased Ranjit Rout was a resident of Mangalpur village under Kantabania police limits in Dhenkanal.

"A herd of wild elephants has been destroying the crops in the village and surrounding areas for the last couple of days. Sunday morning, the 48-yearold farmer was going to his paddy field located near his village to assess the damage caused by the elephant herd. Meanwhile, an elephant suddenly attacked Rout and trampled him to death. An unnatural death case has been registered in this regard," said a local police official.

In another incident, the carcass of a tusker was found in Koira forest range in Sundargarh district Sunday. The actual reason behind the death is yet to be ascertained. The forest department officials said that the post-mortem report will shed light on the cause of the death.

The state continues to witness an increase in casualties due to human-elephant conflicts. Recently. Forest and Environment Minister Pradip Kumar Amat informed the state Assembly that a total of 602 people were killed in elephant attacks in the last five years. As per information, 698 elephants have died for different reasons in the state between 2015 and 2023.

Bhubaneswar, Oct 15: Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik, who turns 78 Monday, will not celebrate his birthday owing to the demise of his elder sister Gita Mehta last month, a CMO statement said.

Patnaik also requested his well-wishers not to visit his official residence 'Naveen Niwas' to greet him on the occasion, it said. "Due to the demise of his elder sister Gita Mehta last month, the Chief Minister has decided not to celebrate his birthday this year," a communication from the Chief Minister's Office said Sunday.

Patnaik, the five-time Chief Minister of the state, did not celebrate his birthday last year as he went to Hyderabad to attend a business meeting. He had chosen not to celebrate his birthday for four years in a row - in 2020 and 2021 due to the Covid-19 pandemic and also in 2018 and 2019 owing to cyclones 'Titli' and 'Fani'.

He also did not celebrate his birthday in 2016 due to the Uri attack.

Nishikant Dubey Sunday accused TMC's Mahua Moitra of taking 'bribes' from a businessman to ask questions in Parliament and urged Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla to constitute an 'inquiry committee' to look into the charges against her.

Moitra hit back, saying she "welcomes any move against her after the Lok Sabha Speaker is finished dealing with pending charges against him (Dubey). The two MPs, known for their

fiery parliamentary speeches and belligerent attacks on adversaries, have often exchanged blows over a host of issues over the years. Sunday, Dubey wrote to Birla under the subject "Re-emergence of nasty 'Cash for Query' in Parliament, Direct involvement of Smt. Mahua Moitra, Member of Parliament (Lok Sabha) for serious 'Breach of Privilege',

'Contempt of the House' and a

'Criminal Offence' under Section 120-A of IPC." Citing a letter he has received from an advocate, Dubey said the lawyer has shared 'irrefutable' evidence of bribes exchanged between the Trinamool Congress (TMC) leader and a businessman.

Hitting back, Moitra said on X, "Am using all my ill gotten cash & gifts to buy a college/ university in which Degree Dubey can finally buy a real degree

Tagging the Lok Sabha Speaker, she said, "Finish the enquiries against him for false affidavits & then set up my enquiry committee

Bhubaneswar, Oct 15: Senior Congress leader Narasingha Mishra Sunday said that he will not be contesting next year's Assembly elections due to his age. Mishra, who is the leader of the Congress legislative party, said he has made up his mind about it.

"I have made up my mind not to contest any election as I am 83 years old now, and suffering from various diseases. However, the party will take the final call," he said.

Mishra, the MLA of Bolangir, said he has been convincing his party to accept the decision. He said his younger son Soumendra will contest his seat in the next Assembly election, subject to the approval of the party.

"Till now, no other eligible candidate in the constituency has come to my notice. With the hope that Soumendra will be getting the ticket, campaigning has already started," he said.

MP polls: Congress fields TV's Hanuman against Shivraj

The grand old party has apparently fielded Vikram Mastal to counter the BJP's Hindutva ideology

Bhopal, Oct 15: The Congress has fielded young television actor Vikram Mastal, who is popular for his portrayal of Hanuman in Anand Sagar's 'Ramayan' against Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan in the upcoming Madhya Pradesh elections.

Vikram hails from Salkanpur village in Budhni Assembly constituency in Sehore district. He belongs to a Brahmin family (Sharma), but he adopted the surname 'Mastal' due to television serials he worked with.

Notably, state Congress pres ident Kamal Nath, who has pre-

sented himself as a devotee of Lord Hanuman, apparently fielded Mastal to counter the BJP's Hindutva ideology. Political observers also say that the Congress has played an ideological stroke with fielding Mastal against Chouhan.

'Vikram Mastal may not be a big political face against Shivraj Singh Chouhan, but his reel life character has a large canvas which will help the party to create an impression across the state. Any political attack against Mastal will be presented as an attack on his reel-life character --Lord Hanuman and that perception may help to corner the BJP's Hindutva ideology," a Congress worker from Budhni said

The political observers also said that Mastal has the tough job of taking on Chief Minister

Chouhan from the Budhni seat in Sehore district, which is Chouhan stronghold.

the character of Hanuman in the Bollywood movie 'Adipurush'. "I am thankful to the Congress

for showing trust in me. I would go to the people of Budhni with local issues. I would ask people what they have gained after supporting the Chief Minister Chouhan for nearly two decades. Will ask people why Sehore's youths did not get jobs despite the fact that the Chief Minister belongs to their district," Mastal told IANS.

Mastal, who appeared alongside Gurmeet Choudhary and Debina Bonnerjee in Ramayan, has featured in the movie 'Top Gear' (2022), web series 'Battle of Saragarhi' (2017) and 'Ashram' (2020). Chief Minister Chouhan has won five Assembly elections (1990, 2006, 2008, 2013 and 2018). Importantly, Budhni Assembly is one of the strongest seats of the

ruling BJP for more than 20 years. The Congress won the Budhni seat last time in 1980 when KN Pradhan contested on Congress ticket.

In the last election, the Congress had fielded former MP Arun Yadav, the son of former minister and strong OBC leader of his time Subhash Yadav. However, Chouhan won the election with a margin of around 59,000 votes.

The only positive note for the Congress was that the winning percentage of Chouhan declined by around 9.7 per cent in comparison to his victory in 2013. In 2018, Chouhhan got 1,23,492 votes, while Arun Yadav got 64,493 votes. In the 2013 assembly election,

Chouhan got 1,28,730 votes, while Congress' Mahendra Singh Chouhan got 43,925 votes.





The charismatic leadership of Naveen Patnaik, who is serving as the 14th Chief Minister of Odisha and has lately become the second longest-serving Chief Minister of India, has transformed Odisha from a starvation economy to a self-sustaining one. When he took charge of Odisha in March 2000, the state's finances were in tatters due to financial profligacy of the previous regimes. By the end of 2001-02, the state had a revenue deficit to the extent of over six per cent of its gross state domestic product. However, those days have faded into oblivion, thanks to the efficient fiscal management of Naveen administration. Some of his recent flagship initiatives like Mission Shakti, 5T school and college transformation programmes, Biju Swasthya

Kalyan Yojana (BSKY), Krushak Assistance for Livelihood and Income Augmentation (KALIA), Mamata, renovation of shrines and mobility boost measures have caught the attention of many. As Naveen turns 78 Monday (October 16), **OrissaPOST** takes a close look at his success story

aveen Patnaik was born October 16, 1946 in Cuttack to former Odisha Chief Minister Biju Patnaik and his wife Gyan Devi. He attended Welham Boys' School in Dehradun and The Doon School. After completing his primary education, he studied at St Stephen's College of Delhi University (DU) and gained a Bachelor of Arts (BA) degree. Initially seen as a reluctant heir to his father's

illustrious political career, Naveen returned to Odisha after Biju Patnaik's death in 1997 and founded the Biju Janata Dal (BJD). Subsequently, he was elected to the 11th Lok

Subsequently, he was elected to the 11th Lok Sabha from Aska Parliamentary constituency in the byelection and became a member of the Consultative Committee of the Ministry of Steel and Mines, a member of the Standing Committee on Commerce, and a member of the Library Committee of Parliament.

Later, he represented the same seat in the 12th Lok Sabha and was subsequently made the Union minister for mines in the Atal Bihari Vajpavee government.

BJD allied with the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) in the Odisha Assembly elections in 2000, following which Naveen Patnaik became CM for the first time. The BJP-led National Democratic Alliance lost the Lok Sabha elections in 2004. However, the coalition led by Naveen Patnaik won the state legislative elections and he became CM for a second time. BJD quit the NDA in 2009 but won a huge victory in the Assembly polls that year. Patnaik became CM for a fourth time in 2014.

In 2013, the United Nations (UN) felicitated Naveen Patnaik by presenting a citation for his government's handling of Cyclone Phailin which hit Odisha in October that year. Patnaik was also invited by the UN to attend the 2015 Third UN World Conference on Disaster Risk Reduction (WCDRR) held in Japan.

In 2019, the UN complimented Naveen for his government's proposal of reserving 33 per cent of seats for women in the National Parliament as well as in the state's Legislative Assembly.

Now, let's take a glance at his flagship initiatives which caught the attention of many including the leaders of other states.

The contribution of Naveen's government towards hockey is immense as he has announced that his government would sponsor the Indian hockey teams till 2033.

"We are already committed to sponsoring the teams till 2033. And we will continue to host the major tournaments so that our teams get the home advantage and improve their rankings," Naveen had said.

Odisha had hosted Men's Hockey World Cup in 2018 and 2023, Champions Trophy 2014, Men's FIH Series finals 2018-19, FIH Olympic qualifiers 2019 and Men's Pro League 2021. Patnaik said his government is 'investing a lot in hockey'.

Naveen's sponsorship bore fruit when India men's hockey team outclassed 2018 champions Japan in the final of the Asian Games-2023 to win the Gold medal for the 4th time in the country's history. India also secured a direct berth for the Paris Olympics next year.

Taking a step forward in women empowerment, Naveen's government launched another flagship initiative - Mission Shakti - which provided the spark that has unleashed the hitherto untapped entrepreneurial talents of women in the hinterland. In all, 7 million women have benefitted, helping them to live with financial security.

Moreover, his government October 12, 2023 rolled out 'Location Accessible Multimodal Initiative' (LAccMI), a forward-looking public transportation system connecting gram panchayats to the state capital. The scheme was launched

in Malkangiri where as many as 36 buses will connect 111 gram panchayats. 



"These data provide evidence for how women navigate mating markets through various fitness cues.

The research focuses on the use of evolutionary perspectives in understanding motives that shape social perceptions and interpersonal preferences.



Women prefer humour for long-term relationship

It shows how people prioritise physical features and behaviours in determining preferences for short-term and long term mates.

The study sampled the preferences of 394 women, identifying as either heterosexual or bisexual, at a large public university

With a mean age of 19 years, 251 participants identified as single and 143 as partnered.

of traits over another.

The researchers sought to determine how women evaluate the desirability of strong men employing affiliative and aggressive humour across shortterm and long-term contexts.

Affiliative humour was defined as benevolent, a type of humour that attempts to connect or associate rather than offend or alienate. This latter type of humour, aggressive, was emphatically undesirable for women in long-term contexts.

The researchers found no interactive effects between physical strength and humour. In other words, strength and humour operated independently in their influence on women's preferences.

Overall, Brown said, their results indicated that women's choices in a male partner are varied and "frequently involve evaluating the costs and benefits of various constellations of traits.

Berhampur, Oct 15: Industrial development has taken a backseat in Ganjam district as lakhs of labourers continue to migrate to other states in search of work to earn a livelihood, a report said Sunday.

What is worrisome is that not a single industry has been set up in the district during the last five decades. Moreover, the existing sick industries have been fighting for their survival during this period. The district has remained neglected during the Congress and non-Congress regime.

The Aska Cooperative Sugar Mill that was established during the British rule has now turned sick and the cotton mill is lying defunct. Lakhs of residents, failing to get work in the district, still migrate to other states in search of livelihood.

Locals lament that the government has also turned a blind eye to establishment of agrobased industries in the district where the mainstay of people is agriculture. The proposed rail wagon plant could not be established in the district due to sheer negligence of the Union government. It is alleged that the Centre has shelved the rail wagon plant project.

The Indian Rare Earths Ltd (IREL) is fast turning sick while the Tata Company has withdrawn from the establishment of a mega steel project which it had planned 26 years back.



Balasore, Oct 15: A man and a woman in their 60s, who were cured of leprosy, decided to stay together as life partners and married as their respective families abandoned them years ago. Dasa Marandi (63) and

Padmabati (65), both afflicted with leprosy, were under treatment in a government-sponsored leprosy treatment centre at Bampada under Remuna block in Balasore district.

Both recovered from the disease. Dasa Marandi stayed for four years and Padmabati for about 10 years in the leprosy treatment centre. They found themselves abandoned by their respective family members since they were diagnosed with the disease.

The families did not accept them even after doctors declared them fully cured.

The disease, once considered to be a taboo in the orthodox rural society, still continues to haunt the mindset of people and many are unable to cope up with the changed situations, says Niranjan Parida, a lawyer and social activist from Balasore.

Dasa Marandi, who was under treatment for four years was admitted to the male ward, as his family members deserted him since the detection of the disease, says a villager in Sartha under Sadar block.

Similar was the situation in Padmabati's case. She had to remain alone in the treatment centre for 10 years as her husband died and other family members left her alone though she claims that she has a small house in her village under Oupada block in Balasore district.

Both, deserted by their near



and dear, preferred to remain together for the rest of their life. As per their wishes, inmates and staff of the leprosy treatment centre had arranged a marriage ceremony as per Hindu marriage rituals, said Dasa Marandi.

He said, "We were close for years and first I proposed to her to remain together and she agreed."

They would stay in a rehabilitation centre near the leprosy treatment centre

The chief district medical officer (CDMO) and additional district medical officer (ADMO) of Balasore congratulated the newlywed senior couple along with staff and other inmates of the leprosy treatment centre who arranged the ceremony in the

Middle East Madness

week after Hamas unleashed unprecedented attacks on Israel raining down thousands of rockets, massacring Israeli youth and children and taking several Israelis hostage it is now becoming clear that there is a method in the madness. The horrific barbarity came in the wake of the far-right-controlled Benjamin Netanyahu-government's provocative acts of aggression against the Arabs, including the Palestinians, living in land occupied and expanded by Israel. The attacks seem to be intended to be an answer to the new policies of the government geared to cornering and hounding out the Palestinians with impunity. The ultra-right partner of the coalition ruling Israel appears to have been over-confident about its anti-Arab rhetoric and attempts to displace Palestinians from their homes. This also emboldened the government to go ahead with its judicial reforms to make the Supreme Court subservient to the executive so that it could implement its bigoted policies without any checks and balances. This alone explains the reaction from the wider Arab world. Despite its brutality, Hamas attacks have been celebrated by the Arab public across the region. At the same time Israel's bombing of Gaza in retaliatory strikes has predictably brought even more support for the Palestinian cause. This has also brought to the fore the contradiction of regional governments, including Saudi Arabia, expressing their keenness on pursuing closer ties with Israel and Arab public remaining sympathetic to the Palestinians.

Hamas appears to be cashing in on this pan-Arab sentiment in order to project itself as the rallying point for the Palestinians' cause of getting their own homeland. The whole thing seems to have been carefully planned beforehand. The social dynamics is such that Hezbollah - the powerful Lebanese militia operating on Israel's northern border launched its attack on Israel immediately following that of Hamas. Experts calculate Hezbollah may join Hamas' side depending on the extent to which the war between Israel and Hamas spreads.

There is also a general assumption that Iran is involved in the planning of Hamas' attack on Israel. This is only natural given the fact that Iran is known to provide Hamas with weapons and finance since long. Similarly, the conflagration is getting traction from President Vladimir Putin of Russia. He has already expressed his disapproval of Israel's action in Gaza on the ground of the humanitarian cost of Israel's ultimatum to the Palestinians to run for safety from their homes to safer zones in 24 hours. This has also brought condemnation from the United Nations chief for the patent cruelty involved in Israel's threat to innocent people to leave their home and hearth overnight.

In a bizarre twist to the macabre dance of death in Israel and Gaza, a propaganda war has started to mobilise public opinion in favour of either of the warring sides. This is also something never before witnessed. Propaganda or disinformation campaigns have always been part of war strategies to confuse the rivals and get more support. But, this time around the information or disinformation war has assumed unprecedented proportions taking advantage of the new communication tools. Since launching the massive cross-border attack into Israel, Hamas has been seeding violent videos and graphic images of its attacks on social media, particularly on Telegram and X. The matter has reached such a stage that X owner Elon Musk has received a warning letter from an EU commissioner regarding disinformation being spread on the platform in violation of the EU's Digital Services Act, while the UK's technology secretary has summoned social media executives to demand the removal of violent content from their platforms.

The propaganda offensive is but natural in all warfare. Hamas' seeding of violent content on social media is a military tactic designed to batter Israeli morale and increase the deterrent leverage of the Israeli hostages the group is holding. The ingenuity of Hamas is its ability to take advantage of the lack of content moderation on X and Telegram so as to weaponise social media. Israel's security forces too have long used social media to mould global perceptions of the Israeli-Palestinian conflict to demoralise its adversaries and maintain support from its allies. It is using exactly the same ploy, it appears, regarding its airstrikes and operations in Gaza.

Hamas, in a sense, is paying Israel back in the same coin. That is the truth and the savagery by both sides cannot possibly hide it.

It is interesting to note how Indians too are reacting to the Hamas-Israel conflict. Many Right wing social media handles are supporting Israel and baying for the blood of Hamas. They presume all Palestinians

XENOPHOBIC POPULISM

f she was not already the bête noire of British liberals, UK Home Secretary Suella Braverman's recent string of statements has cemented her image as a nationalist bigot. Despite facing criticism from within her own party, she has doubled down on her anti-immigrant, anti-refugee rhetoric.

In a recent speech in Washington, Braverman claimed that multiculturalism in Europe had failed, that uncontrolled immigration poses a threat to Western civilisation, and that the United Nations' 1951 Refugee Convention – which the United Kingdom ratified under Winston Churchill - is outdated. Braverman went on to claim that refugees facing persecution in their home countries for their gender or sexual identities are "bogus asylum seekers" who should no longer be allowed to enter Britain.

This is a mixture of callousness, straw dogs, and nonsense. In some countries, people can be executed for being gay. In other countries, women are not even allowed to go to school. Few serious people advocate "uncontrolled" immigration. And the British Refugee Council issued a report claiming that 74% of people arriving in Britain by boat in 2023 would be recognised as asylum seekers. This figure is based on statistics compiled by Braverman's own Home Office.

Braverman herself was born in the UK to immigrant parents of Indian descent. Her Christian father migrated from Kenya in the 1960s, and her Hindu Tamil mother arrived in the UK from Mauritius. Given her own family's history, one might have expected Braverman to avoid stoking an anti-refugee panic.

But this is not the first time a second-generation immigrant has sought validation through hypocritical displays of chauvinistic nationalism, and Braverman went a step further in her speech to the Conservative Party Conference on October

3, invoking her family's immigration story to promote an anti-immigrant agenda. "The wind of change that carried my own parents across the globe in the twentieth century was a mere gust compared [with] the hurricane that is coming," she warned.

The prevailing belief among British political analysts is that Braverman is simply courting the hard-right factions within her party in a quest to become its next leader. Much like the Republican Party in the US, the Tories, who once considered themselves the champions of middle-class centrism, are now being pulled to the right by populist agitators.

While it is possible that Braverman is just a political opportunist, her anti-immigrant diatribes resonate far beyond Britain's borders. In portraying immigrants and asylum seekers as criminals and threats to Western civilisation, she is tapping into the same right-wing populist current that has propelled Germany's Alternative für Deutschland. Marine Le Pen's National Rally in France, and former US President Donald Trump's GOP.

But does the rise of xenophobic populism mean that Western populations are becoming increasingly racist? The data suggest otherwise. More

than 70% of Britons believe that a wide variety of ethnicities and cultures is part of British identity, and 75% support mixed-race relationships. Such sentiments were not common in the UK 50 years ago.

Moreover, most British people who fear a "hurricane" of refugees have likely never encountered any, given that asylum seekers are confined to designated camps and not allowed to work or interact with the general public. And citizens of cities with the largest number of non-Western immigrants tend to be more accepting of them than people in areas where there are relatively few.

But today's populist revolt is not really about refugees. The greatest resentment among supporters of the hard right is reserved for the so-called "liberal elites," the highly-educated urban folks who Braverman, in her conference speech, called "the privileged woke minority, with their luxury beliefs." These elites are generally blamed for everything from the loss of industrial jobs and uncontrolled immigration to the alleged "tyranny" of international institutions such as the World Health Organisation and the European Union.

- 1758: American lexicographer Noah Webster, who was instrumental in giving American English a dignity and vitality of its own, was born. Known for his American Spelling Book (1783) and his American Dictionary of the English Language, 2 vol. (1828; 2nd ed., 1840), Webster was instrumental in giving American English a dignity and vitality of its own. Both his speller and dictionary reflected his principle that spelling, grammar, and usage should be based upon the living, spoken language rather than on artificial rules. He also made useful contributions as a teacher, grammarian, journalist, essayist, lecturer, and lobbyist.
- 1793: Marie-Antoinette guillotined. After the French Revolution began, Marie-Antoinette, queen consort of Louis XVI, was targeted by agitators who, enraged by her extravagance and attempts to save the monarchy, ultimately guillotined her on this day in 1793. Her name is associated with the decline in the moral authority of the French monarchy in the closing years of the ancien régime, though her courtly extravagance was but a minor cause of the financial disorders of the French state in that period. Her rejection of reform provoked unrest, and her policy of court resistance to the progress of the French Revolution finally led to the overthrow of the monarchy in August, 1792 Louis XVI was executed on orders from the National Convention in January 1793, and in August the queen was put in solitary confinement in the Conciergerie. She was brought before the Revolutionary tribunal on October 14, 1793, and was guillotined two days later.

Lake located at 17,000 ft was predicted by researchers about 20 years back. Experts feel that this was triggered because of dam building and unplanned construction along the Teesta's downstream. According to estimates, over 60 people have died and 130 are still missing due to the floods.

Worryingly, India's drought-prone area has increased by 57% since 1997 while instances of heavy rainfall have risen by almost 85% since 2012. This can have far-reaching impacts, affecting several generations. The other factor is the occurrence of floods and landslides in the Himalayan region.

The seriousness of the problem of hunger and malnourishment should be highlighted and tackled at the national level, since states alone cannot handle a problem of such enormity.



Shimla, Oct 15: The apple transportation period in Shimla this vear has witnessed a 44 per cent decline in road accidents as compared to last year, with authorities imparting skills on hill driving to drivers with a focus on halting of vehicles at accident prone spots and not over apply-

ing brakes on slopes The period from July to mid October in Shimla is the peak period when apples are transported and it is also a time when the number of road accidents increase as many drivers are not proficient in hill driving.

Superintendent of Police. Shimla, Sanjeev Kumar Gandhi

told PTI that an analysis of factors leading to loss of life and property due to accidents during the apple season was done and it was found that overloading, over speeding and lack of proficiency in hill driving led to frequent accidents,

Over application of brakes on slopes by drivers leads to loss of pressure and heats up the wheel which impacts the brake system and results in accidents. Imparting knowledge and skills

on hill driving especially not applying brakes frequently, use of heavy gears and holding and halting of vehicles at accident prone spots to coordinate traffic and speed helped in reducing the number of accidents, he added.



According to police data, 32 people were killed and 130 were injured in 79 road accidents during the apple season from July 1 to October 13 this year as compared to 65 deaths and injuries to 255 persons in 142 accidents in the corresponding period in 2022 which implies that accidents, deaths and injuries reduced by 44 percent, 50 percent and 49 percent respectively. Despite challenging condi-

tions following heavy damage to roads infrastructure caused by landslides and flash floods triggered by torrential rains in the months of July and August, the road accidents count during the apple season has significantly come down in the district, police officials said Sunday.

About 1.91 crore apple boxes crossed Shoghi, Gumma, Fagu, Kuddu and Balog barriers in the district this season, according to police.

As many as 1,12,571 vehicles including 78,819 pickups, 29,958 trucks and 3,804 trolla (big trucks), were used for transportation of apples.

Reduction of road accidents during the apple season has also reflected in the total accidents reported in 2023 and the road accidents from January 1 till October 13 decreased from 283 last year to 233 this year, a decline of 17 percent while number of deaths and injuries reduced from 140 to 99 (29 percent) and 579 to 366 (36 percent) respectively.

About 70,000 less challans were issued but the number of accidents reduced which means there is no direct correlation between high numbers of challans and road accidents, the police said and added that voluntary compliance to traffic norms is our new initiative and traffic schooling on roads yield much better results in hill area like Shimla, the police said.

Devotees flock to Himachal temples as Navratri arrives



Under the proposed regulations, the trekkers will be required to register with the authorities before embarking on their journeys. They will also be provided with tracking devices as a mandatory safety measure to enable swift tracking in the event of an emergency.

According to the statement, the forest department will offer the services of trained guides to

the trekkers to further increase their safety. These guides will be registered and provided with specialised training. This will not only improve the trekkers' safety but also create employment opportunities for local youngsters.

"This initiative aims to mitigate the incidents of missing trekkers and ensure a more secure trekking experience," Sukhu said.

Emphasising the economic importance of tourism in Himachal Pradesh, the chief minister reiterated the state government's commitment to pro-mote religious, adventure and ecotourism.

New Delhi, Oct 15: The Congress Sunday announced its first list of party candidates for the Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh and Telangana assembly elections.

While the party announced 144 party candidates for Madhya Pradesh elections, it announced 30 candidates for the Chhattisgarh polls and another 55 for Telangana assembly polls slated next month.

In Madhya Pradesh, the party fielded former chief minister and PCC chief Kamal Nath from his Chhindwara assembly constituency. Former chief minister Digvijaya Singh's son Jaivardhan Singh has been fielded from Raghogarh seat. He was a minister in the last Kamal Nath government.

Another former minister in the state, Vijay Laxmi Sadho, who has been a former Rajya Sabha member, has been fielded from the Maheshwar-SC assembly seat. Former cabinet minister Jitu Patwari has been fielded from Rau assembly constituency.

Telangana polls: BRS releases manifesto

Hyderabad, Oct 15: Raising social security pension amounts, increasing financial assistance given under the 'Rythu Bandhu' investment support scheme for farmers and providing LPG cylinders at ₹400 each are some of the promises made by the ruling BRS for the upcoming assembly elections in Telangana.

Releasing the party manifesto for the November 30 assembly polls, BRS chief and Chief Minister K Chandrasekhar Rao said all 93 lakh families living below the poverty line (BPL) in the state would be provided life insurance cover of ₹5 lakh and that the government would bear the cost of the premium. Rao, also known as KCR, said the social security pension, which currently stands at ₹2.016. will be increased to ₹5,000 per month gradually over the next five years. According to the manifesto, it will be increased to ₹3,016 in the first year after the BRS returns to power, and then be raised incrementally up to ₹5,000 in the next four years. Similarly, pension for Divyang people (persons with disabilities) will be enhanced to ₹6,016 in the coming five years, from the existing ₹4016. Under the 'Rythu Bandhu' scheme in which farmers get ₹10.000 per annum per acre, the payments will be enhanced gradually to ₹16,000 per annum over the next five years. The BRS, after returning to power, will give each gas cylinder at ₹400 to 'eligible beneficiaries' and the remaining cost will be borne by the state government, the manifesto said, alleging that "the BJP-led government at the Centre has put an unbearable burden on the common man with a sharp rise in the

Revanth Reddy is currently the sitting Lok Sabha MP from Malkajgiri Parliamentary constituency. The party has also fielded its sitting Lok Sabha MP N Uttam Kumar Reddy from the Huzurnagar assembly constituency. He currently represents the Nalgonda Lok Sabha seat in Telangana.

Besides, first timer Kota Neelima, wife of national spokesperson Pawan Khera, has also been fielded from Sanathnagar assembly seat. While Chhattisgarh assembly polls will be held in two phases on November 7 and 17, Madhya Pradesh elections will be held on November 17. Telangana assembly polls will be held November 30. The results will be declared December 3.

Chhatrapati Sambhajinagar, Oct 15: At least 12 people were killed and 23 others injured when a speeding mini-bus hit a container truck on Samruddhi Expressway in Maharashtra's Chhatrapati Sambhajinagar district in the early hours of Sunday, police said.

As many as 35 passengers were travelling by the private bus. They were returning to Nashik after visiting the Sailani Baba dargah in Buldhana district, an official said. President Droupadi Murmu and Prime Minister Narendra Modi expressed grief over the loss of lives in the accident.

The Prime Minister's Office (PMO) in a post on X said an exgratia of Rs 2 lakh from the Prime Minister's National Relief Fund (PMNRF) would be given to the next of kin of each deceased and the injured persons would be given Rs 50,000.

The accident took place shortly after midnight on Sunday in Vaijapur area of the expressway, located nearly 80 km from the district headquarters and 350 km from state capital Mumbai, as per officials. The bus driver lost control over the wheels. As a result, the bus hit the stationary container truck from the rear side near Jambargaon toll plaza, police officials said.

India is located in a seismically active region. But with a lot of microearthquakes occurring every day, the stored-up energy gets released, according to Director O P Mishra of the National Centre for Seismology, Ministry of Earth Sciences.

Experts say the impact of a large-scale earthquake can be reduced if people and institutions strictly comply with the bylaws and codes to build resilient structures. They say the resonant frequency of a building can play a critical role in determining the level of damage that it experiences during an earthquake. Buildings have natural frequencies of vibration, also known as resonant frequencies, which are determined by their mass, stiffness and size. The ground motion during an earthquake can excite these natural frequencies, causing the building to vibrate at its resonant frequency.

RABAT: Thousands took the streets of the Moroccan capital Sunday to rally in support of Palestinians in Gaza and denounce Israel's actions in the latest war with Gaza's militant Hamas rulers. Waving Palestinian flags, the rally also marked a major showing for the banned Islamist movement Al Adl Wa Ihssane, which supports Hamas. After Hamas's unprecedented and deadly October 7 incursion into Israel, Morocco issued a statement condemning the violence. Royal Air Maroc, temporarily cancelled flights from Casablanca to Tel Aviv - a route that began in 2021. Demonstrators marched in central Rabat and threw smoke bombs and fireworks as riot police stood between them and the Parliament building and other landmarks.

Pope renews call for release of hostages

ROME: Pope Francis Sunday renewed his call for the release of Israeli hostages held by Gaza's militant Hamas rulers and called for humanitarian corridors to help those under siege in Gaza. "I continue to follow with much sorrow what is happening in Israel and Palestine," Francis said during his Sunday's Angelus prayer in St Peter's Square. "I think back to the many people, especially the little ones and the elderly." The Pope reiterated his appeal for the release of scores of Israeli hostages snatched during Hamas' deadly incursion into southern Israel last weekend and taken to Gaza


No escape from danger

GAZA: As Israel intensified air strikes on the Hamas-controlled Gaza Strip and told residents to move south towards the border with Egypt, some like father of six Fadi Daloul thought that would be a safe option and gathered up his belongings. Palestinians are desperate to find a safe hiding place as the Israeli military prepares for what is expected to be a ground offensive in Gaza accompanied by relentless air strikes. Many Gazans have refused to leave their homes for the south, fearing a repeat of the "Nakba" or "catastrophe", when many Palestinians fled or were forced from their homes during the 1948 war that accompanied Israel's creation. Some 700.000 Palestinians, half the Arab population of what was British-ruled Palestine, were dispossessed and displaced, many spilling into neighbouring Arab states where they or many of their descendants remain. Many still live in refugee camps.

The Gaza Health Ministry said 2,329 Palestinians have been killed since the fighting erupted, more than in the 2014 Gaza war. which lasted over six weeks.

That makes this the deadliest of the five Gaza wars for both sides. More than 1,300 Israelis have been killed, the vast majority of them civilians killed in Hamas' October 7 assault. An estimated 150 others, including children, were captured by Hamas and taken into Gaza. This is the deadliest war for Israel since the 1973 conflict with Egypt and Syria. The US State

Strong earthquake shakes west Afghan

Islamabad, Oct 15: A powerful 6.3 magnitude earthquake struck western Afghanistan Sunday, just over a week after strong quakes and aftershocks killed thousands of people and flattened entire villages in the same province.

The US Geological Survey said the latest quake's epicentre was about 34 kilometres (21 miles) outside Herat, the provincial capital, and eight kilometers (five miles) below the surface.

Save the Children said four people have died and that Herat Regional Hospital has received 153 injured.

Everything in the Baloch area of Rabat Sangi district has collapsed. Several villages have been destroyed, according to the aid group. Authorities have given lower casualty numbers.

Sayed Kazim Rafiqi, 42, a Herat city resident, said he had never seen such devastation before with the majority of houses damaged and "people terrified.' Rafiqi and others headed to the hospital to donate much-needed blood. "We have to help in any way possible," he said. The earthquakes October 7 flattened whole villages in Herat, in one of the most destructive quakes in the country's recent history.

More than 90 per cent of the people killed a week ago were women and children, UN officials reported Thursday. Taliban officials said the earlier quakes killed more than 2,000 people across the province.

Indigenous Australians vow silence after referendum fails

Sydney, Oct 15: Australian Indigenous leaders called Sunday for a week of silence and reflection after a referendum to recognise First Peoples in the constitution was decisively rejected.

More than 60% of Australians voted "No" in the landmark referendum Saturday that asked whether to alter the constitution to recognise Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island people with an Indigenous advisory body, the "Voice to Parliament", that would have advised parliament on matters concerning the community.

Australia's first referendum in almost a quarter of a century needed a national majority and majorities in at least four states to pass. All six states rejected the proposal. "This is a bitter irony," the Indigenous leaders said in a statement. "That people who have only been on this continent for 235 years would refuse to recognise those whose home this land has been for 60,000 and

more years is beyond reason.' They said they would lower the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island flag to half-mast for the week and urged others to do the same. The outcome is a major setback for reconciliation efforts with the country's Indigenous community and damages Australia's image in the world re-

garding how it treats First Nations people. Unlike other nations with similar histories, such as Canada and New Zealand, Australia has not formally recognised or reached a treaty with its First Peoples.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island people make up 3.8% of Australia's 26 million population and have inhabited the country for about 60,000 years. But they are not mentioned in the constitution and the country's most disadvantaged people by most socioeconomic measures.

Reconciliation Australia, an Indigenous body, said the community was left to grapple with the "ugly acts of racism and disinformation" that they said were a feature of the debate.

Australian Indigenous leader and former national rugby union player Lloyd Walker said the path to reconciliation seemed difficult now but the community needed to keep fighting.

Prime Minister Anthony Albanese staked significant political capital on the Voice referendum, but his critics say it was his biggest misstep since coming to power in May last year. Opposition leader Peter Dutton said it was a referendum "that Australia did not need to have" and that it only ended up dividing the nation.

One of the biggest reasons for the loss was a lack of bipartisan support, with leaders of the major conservative parties campaigning for the "No" vote.

Putin to visit China

Moscow/Beijing, Oct 15: Russian President Vladimir Putin will meet Xi Jinping in China this week in a bid to deepen a partnership forged between the United States' two biggest strategic competitors.

Putin will attend the Belt and Road Forum in Beijing October 17-18, his first trip outside the former Soviet Union since the Hague-based International Criminal Court issued a warrant for him in March over the deportation of children from Ukraine.



China and Russia declared a 'no limits" partnership in February 2022 when Putin visited Beijing just days before he sent tens of thousands of troops into Ukraine, triggering the deadliest land war in Europe since World War Two.

The United States casts China as its biggest competitor and Russia as its biggest nation-state threat while US President Joe Biden argues that this century will be defined by an existential contest with between democracies and autocracies.

Caracas (Venezuela), Oct 15: Frightened by unprecedented violence on the streets and within prisons, Ecuadorians have a universal demand for the president they are choosing Sunday — safety

The runoff election in the South American country pits an heir to a banana empire, Daniel Noboa, against an attornev. Luisa González. Both have limited governing experience and will undoubtedly have their work cut out. The election comes as more Ecuadorians become victims of drug-related violence that erupted roughly three years ago and intensified in August, when a presidential candidate was assassinated in broad daylight. People continuously watch their backs and limit how often they leave home. The uneasiness even pushed Noboa to add a bulletproof vest to his daily outfit. Whoever wins with a simple majority of votes will govern for only 15 months, until May 2025, which is what remains of the tenure of President Guillermo Lasso.

He cut his term short when he dissolved the country's National Assembly in May as lawmakers carried out impeachment proceedings against him over alleged improprieties in a contract by a state-owned company.

Lasso, a conservative former banker, clashed constantly with lawmakers after his election in 2021 and decided not to run in the special election.

Minutes before polls opened Lasso called on Ecuadorians to have a peaceful election and think about what is "best for their children, their parents and the country.'

He said voters have the wisdom "to banish demagoguery and authoritarianism as they look toward a tomorrow of peace and well-being for all." He added that the government would ensure security, transparency and respect for the election results.

New Delhi, Oct 15: The government Sunday said it is actively considering the review of the minimum export price of \$1,200 per tonne of basmati rice. amid the industry's concern that outward shipments have been affected due to high value.

Rice exporters associations have been demanding that this rate should be brought down to around \$850 per tonne.

In late August, the government decided not to allow exports of basmati rice below \$1,200 per tonne to restrict possible "illegal" shipment of white non-basmati rice in the garb of premium basmati rice.

On August 27, the ministry directed trade promotion body APEDA not to register export contracts below \$1,200 per tonne.

In a statement Sunday, Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food & Public Distribution said the Central Government has taken various steps to boost domestic supply of rice and check prices.

Based on the representations received from the rice exporter associations that the high FOB value is adversely affecting the export of basmati rice from India, Food and Consumer Affairs Minister Piyush Goyal had attended a consultative meet with the basmati rice exporters,

According to official sources, India had exported around 45 lakh tonne of basmati rice during the last fiscal year. In the first half of this fiscal, the country has exported 18 lakh tonne.

New Delhi, Oct 15: The country's first electronic chip manufacturing plant is expected to be in place within a year, according to Union Telecom and IT Minister Aswhini Vaishnaw.

The government has initially earmarked \$10 billion incentive for setting up a semiconductor manufacturing ecosystem in the country including a wafer fabrication plant. The wafer fabrication plants are the first building block of physical chips that are used in all high-tech electronic products.

"We are focussing on some niche area where we can take global leadership. Telecom and EV (electric vehicles) have emerged as a big segment for semiconductors. If we focus on developing and manufacturing chips used in these segments then we can become global leaders in these two segments,' Vaishnaw told PTI in an interview.

He said the work is being done with a focus on these emerging



areas

"We should have some good success in the coming months. It will be fab (wafer fabrication), design, manufacturing, complete (ecosystem)," Vaishnaw said.

When asked if it would be in a year, the minister said, "No. We will see success very soon."

Memory chip maker Micron started building a semiconductor assembly plant at Sanand in Gujarat last month. The company in June announced setting up a semiconductor assembly and test plant in Gujarat entailing a total investment of \$2.75 billion (around Rs 22,540 crore).

Micron will invest up to \$825 million in setting up the plant in two phases and the rest of the investment will come from the Centre and the state government.

The minister said that component suppliers of Micron are also in an advanced stage of identifying land in collaboration with the state government.

activity involving India targeted the financial sector which totalled \$30.6 billion, down 55.9

per cent in value, and accounted for 46.7 per cent market share, followed by industrials at \$7.7 billion, down 32.4 per cent and 11.7 per cent market share.

High technology, which saw the greatest number of deals announced in the period captured 9 per cent market share with \$5.9 billion worth of deals, down 71.7 per cent compared to last vear.

Private equity-backed M&As amounted to \$11.1 billion, down 58.1 per cent from a year ago, and the lowest first nine months period by value since 2020.

Equity capital markets (ECM) raised \$18.4 billion in the first nine months of 2023, a 34.4 per cent increase compared to a year ago. The number of ECM offerings saw 253 equity and equitylinked issuances, up 30.4 per cent on-year.

Within the ECM space, initial public offerings (IPOs) raised \$3.5 billion during the first nine months, down 38.1 per cent by proceeds, but the number of IPOs rose 35.2 per cent. Followon offerings, which accounted for 81 per cent of the overall ECM proceeds, raised \$14.9 billion, up 85 per cent on-year, while the number of follow-on offerings grew 24.4 per cent year-on-year. ECM issuance from the financial sector accounted for majority of the activity with 19.8 per cent market share or \$3.6 billion, down 6.2 per cent on-year. Industrials captured 18.3 per cent market share followed by high technology and materials with 11.5 per cent and 11.2 per cent market share, respectively.

Jefferies leads the ranking in the ECM underwriting space with \$2.3 billion in related proceeds and 12.4 per cent market share

In debt capital markets, primary bond offerings saw \$65.1 billion being mopped up during the first nine months, a 39.3 per cent increase in proceeds and making it the highest first nine months period since 2019.

Financial sector issuers captured 78 per cent market share at \$50.8 billion, up 61.6 per cent, followed by industrials with a 5.6 per cent market share worth \$3.7 billion, up 86.3 per cent.

ICICI Bank tops the ranking for bond underwriting, with related proceeds of \$10.96 billion and accounted for 16.8 per cent market share.

VALUATION OF SIX OF **TOP 10 FIRMS JUMPS**

New Delhi, Oct 15: The combined market valuation of six of the top 10 valued firms jumped Rs 70.527.11 crore last week, with Reliance Industries Ltd (RIL) emerging as the biggest gainer.

While Hindustan Unilever Ltd, Bharti Airtel, ITC, ICICI Bank and HDFC Bank were the gainers, Infosys, Tata Consultancy Services (TCS), State Bank of India and Bajaj Finance emerged as the laggards.

The market valuation of Reliance Industries rallied Rs 22,191.43 crore to Rs 15,90,408.31 crore, the most among the top 10 firms. Hindustan Unilever added Rs 17,222.5 crore taking its valuation to Rs 6,04,326.62 crore. **Reliance Industries remained**

the country's most valued firm followed by TCS, HDFC Bank, ICICI Bank, Hindustan Unilever,-Infosys, ITC, Bharti Airtel, State Bank of India, and Bajaj Finance.

Afghanistan conquer England

IN ONE OF THE BIGGEST UPSETS OF THE ODI WORLD CUP THE DEFENDING CHAMPIONS ARE

New Delhi, Oct 15: Displaying the valour that best epitomises the people of the strife-torn nation, Afghanistan caused one of the biggest upsets in the history of ODI World Cup as they outclassed defending champions England by 69 runs here Sunday.

The Afghans' epic triumph against the overwhelming favourites, one of the game's traditional heavyweights, was a reflection of the spirit and courage of the battle-hardened tribe from the country ravaged by years of war and internal conflicts. Rahmanullah Gurbaz (80, 57b, 8x4, 4x6) gave early impetus while Ikram Alikhil (58, 66b, 3x4, 2x6) provided the final flourish to guide Afghanistan to a competitive 284 all out after being put into bat

The Afghan bowlers then thrived under lights, dishing out a collective effort to bundle out England for 215 runs in 40.3 overs and register just their second World Cup win, eight years since their last against Scotland in Australia.

While this was Afghanistan's first win in the ongoing tournament after two losses, England slumped to their second defeat from three games.

Rashid Khan (3/37) and Mujeeb Ur Rahman (3/51) were the pick of the Afghan bowlers. Harry Brook (66, 61b, 7x4, 1x6) was the only shining light in what was

IOC members ask Bach to continue

Mumbai, Oct 15: Members of the International Olympic Committee (IOC) urged Sunday the incumbent president Thomas Bach to stay on in his role after he completes his term in 2025.

Bach, the former Olympian from Germany, is the ninth president of the IOC. He was elected to an eight-year term at the 125th IOC Session in Buenos Aires in 2013. In March 2021, Bach was again re-elected IOC president for four years.

The Olympic Charter restricts a president's term to 12 years, a norm that was put in place by Jacques Rogge to avoid lengthy tenures. Bach had succeeded Rogge, who had served as the IOC chief from 2001 to 2013.

On the inaugural day of the IOC's 141st Session here, most of its 99 members were of the opinion that Bach should stay on for a third term after his tenure ends in 2025, though it will require changes to be made to the Olympic Charter. "You have shown us the best way to go forward. We have to look after this (Olympic) movement. That is why I would like to put forward this approach," IOC member Luis Mejia Oviedo said. Bach thanked the IOC members and said their appeal had touched his heart. However, he refused to divulge if he planned to stay on and propose an amend ment to the Olympic Charter to help him continue his tenure. If Bach gets his third term, he could be at the helm of affairs when the 2036 Olympic Games host is announced. India has made it official that it wants to host the 2036 edition of the Olympics.

Bid withdrawn

London: Qatari banker Sheikh Jassim Bin Hamad Al Thani has withdrawn a bid to buy Manchester United, a source close to the deal said Sunday here. Man United announced nearly a year ago that they were exploring 'strategic alternatives to enhance the club's growth', with a full sale one of the options. Sheikh Jassim and British billionaire Jim Ratcliffe were the front-runners after several rounds of bidding earlier this year, but the process has stalled in recent months despite the anger of supporters towards current owners, the Glazer family. The Daily Mail reported that Ratcliffe is now set to secure a 25 per cent stake in the club for around 1.5 billion pounds (\$1.7 billion).

Title for Railways

Bangalore: The Railways team walked away with the overall title with 220 points in their kitty as the National Open Athletics Championships ended here Sunday The men's team title went to Services with 175 points, while the women's trophy was claimed by the Railways with 156 points. Services' javelin thrower Manu DP was declared the best male athlete with 1,127 points, while Yamuna Ladkat of Maharashtra was named _the best female athlete of the meet. She had 1,128 points.
