CBI files charge sheet in Manipur parading case

New Delhi, Oct 16: The CBI Monday filed a charge sheet against six people and a juvenile in connection with two tribal women being paraded naked in Manipur's Kangpokpi district in May this year.

A video of the incident, which surfaced in July this year, led to widespread condemnation across the country and globally, prompting the Supreme Court to step in and hand over the case to the CBI.

The agency filed the charge sheet against six people and a report against a child in conflict with the law before a special CBI court in Guwahati.

It was alleged that, May 4, a mob of approximately 900-1000 individuals, armed with sophisticated weapons, entered B Phainom village in Kangpokpi District of Manipur, vandalised and set houses ablaze, looted properties, assaulted villagers, committed murders, and sexu-

ally assaulted women. It was further alleged that two family members of one of the women paraded naked were also killed in the incident. The CBI

investigation indicated that the accused arrested by Manipur Police were involved in the incident, following which the charge sheet was filed Monday.

Further investigation is continuing including the identification of other accused involved in the offences beside other aspects of the case. The accused have been charged under various sections of the Indian Penal Code, including those pertaining to gangrape, murder, outraging the modesty of a woman and crimi-

Flag Football and Lacrosse -- in the 2028 Olympic Games

New Delhi, Oct 16: With the International Olympic Committee (IOC) Monday giving its final nod, Cricket in the Twenty20 format will return to the Olympic Games for the first time since 1900 when Los Angeles hosts the mega event in 2028. Los Angeles will host cricket

as a six-team competition for each gender with the host nation confirmed as one of the teams. As of now, the other five teams will be picked based on the ICC T20I Rankings at a pre-decided cut-off date.

As Cricket makes a comeback amid much fanfare, it is only fair to take a deep-dive into the game's history in Olympics.

Cricket and the Olympics made for strange bedfellows when the sport featured in its roster for the first and only time in the 1900 edition of the games in Paris. The French team that played the gold medal match against Great Britain comprised players working as manual labour in construction of the magnificent Eiffel Tower.

In the games that spanned six months, the Olympic cricket programme was a one-match, two-day affair, with a cumulative score of 366 runs across four innings. The post-script was funny and scary in equal measure. The Brits from Devon



Wanderers, after playing the 'Olympics final' were off to their next destination on a motorcoach that had two drivers.

Cricket to make a comeback in LA Olympics

The first driver was punch drunk and had to be pulled out of his seat, and the second one was no good either. In an inebriated state, he rammed the vehicle causing minor injuries.

What was the standard of the match? An article written by Daniel Schofield in 'Daily Telegraph' a few years ago observed that renowned Olympics chronicler the late Ian Buchanan, who had founded the International Society of Olympic Historians (ISOH), had termed the cricket event of that games as shambolic. It was held inside the Vélodrome de Vincennes, a cycling track with ridiculously short square boundaries, less than 30 metres from the centre of the pitch.

If there were 24 people in the field of play, documents of that time suggests that not even 20 had watched that match over two days. R Horne, H Terry, W Anderson, D Robinson, W Browning were weekend cricketers, who formed the French Athletic Club Union, primarily for the British expats living in France. And what did they do for a living? Well, they were building the Eiffel Tower. No wonder that the French team was all out for 26 in pursuit of 184 with no one reaching double figures.

While the Great Britain won the gold medal and a miniature of the Eiffel Tower, the French team was given the silver. Baron Pierre de Coubertin, the father of Modern Olympics, wanted cricket as a part of 1896 Games but there weren't any entry.

That's why saving cricket and the Olympics in the same breath would mostly sound a bit more than odd until the International Olympic Committee (IOC) and the other concerned stakeholders decided to re-introduce thesport at the world's biggest sporting spectacle.







Odia Emirates employee missing for over 50 days

New Delhi, Oct 16: An Emirates International Facilities Management employee, hailing from Khurda district, has mysteriously disappeared after reaching Delhi and has been missing for over 50 days, leaving his family in anguish.

Allegations of a kidnapping have surfaced as Ranjan Swain, 30, disappeared shortly after his arrival at Delhi airport from Abu Dhabi via Mumbai.

According to an FIR, Swin has been employed at Emirates International Facilities Management in Abu Dhabi for the past three years. He was scheduled to return to India August 18, which was the last time he communicated with his

sister, sharing his ticket details. "However, he has since become untraceable. After waiting for 3-4 days, his family contacted the company management, who confirmed

his departure for India with his friend Faheem Ahmad on Vistara Airlines," as per the FIR. Assistance from the NGO Global Odia volunteers resulted in confirmation from the UAE government that Swain had left Abu Dhabi and travelled to India August 18. His family is facing financial

hardship, as he was the sole provider for them. "It has been over 50 days since he went missing, with no sign of his whereabouts. The NGO and the family

have reached out to various individuals and learned that some people are demanding a ransom while threatening his life. This has led to suspicions of a kidnapping case in and around Delhi," the FIR stated. The family members revealed

that Swain had initially gone to Abu Dhabi through a recruitment company three years ago, financing his journey with a loan. "After a couple of days, when

we were not able to trace Ranjan, we lodged a complaint in Odisha and pushed Odisha Police to visit Delhi for the case. Odisha Police had visited and found some clues with help of IGI Airport police but couldn't do much and on advice, an FIR was lodged there October 15," said the family members.

Meanwhile, a senior Delhi Police officer said they have registered an FIR under Section 365 (kidnapping) of IPC at IGI Airport police station and probe is on.



Tamil Nadu Chief Minister MK Stalin took to 'X' to extend birthday wishes to his Odisha counterpart.



"Puri is one of the four dhams of India, and lakhs of devotees from across the globe come here for a darshan of Lord Jagannath. However, they face a lot of problems while visiting the temple. A devotee died recently while standing in a queue to visit the temple, which brought bad name to the state," he alleged.

Alleging that the state gov ernment failed to do anything for the development of the 12th century shrine, the Congress leaders said now the government has closed three out of four gates of the temple for the general public for which devotees are facing immense problems, Pattanayak said.

However, all three gates (excluding the Lion's Gate) have remained closed for the general devotees in view of the ongoing Srimandir Parikrama project around the temple

government to reopen the Ratna Bhandar of the temple for repairs and inventory of ornaments and valuables stored at the temple treasury.

The Congress leaders also urged the state government to hand over land acquired for the Vedanta University project back to farmers as the Supreme Court has quashed the land acquisition.

'The Ratna Bhandar has not been opened for a long time. No one knows whether all the valuables stored inside the treasury are safe or not. So, the temple treasury should be reopened and a detailed inventory of gold and other ornaments of the Lord should be made," demanded the Srimandir Parikrama project. The government has no intention to put devotees in trouble, he added.

On the reopening of Ratna Bhandar, he said the government will follow the court directions in this regard and added that the Law department was examining the court order.

Notably, entry of devotees to the temple through the four gates was closed March 20, 2020 due to Covid-19 restrictions. Later, when the Covid situation improved, the Singhadwar (Lion's Gate) was reopened for devotees.

In July this year, the government reopened the Paschim Dwar (West Gate) only for Puri residents for performing daily rituals.

However, all three gates (excluding the Lion's Gate) of the temple have remained closed for the general devotees in view of the Parikrama project going on around the temple.

New Delhi, Oct 16: Display of laser lights, lantern lights and wish kites around an aerodrome upto five nautical miles - that disrupt safe operation of aircraft will attract punishment under the Indian Penal Code, the ministry of Civil Aviation said.

The government has amended the Aircraft Rules, 1937 and introduced changes to the Rule 66 addressing concerns related to the display of false lights in the vicinity of an aerodrome. It clarified that the term light encompasses lantern lights, wish kites, and laser lights and the government's jurisdiction over those displaying such lights has been extended from five kilometres to five nautical miles around an aerodrome.

"The government possesses the

authority to take action against individuals displaying lights that disrupt the safe operation of aircraft or pose hazards to the operating crew. Should such

lights remain unattended for 24 hours, the government is empowered to enter the location and ex-tinguish them," the ministry of Civil Aviation said, adding that the matter shall be reported to the relevant police station for legal action under the IPC.

The government also revised the Rule 39C under which the validity

of licenses in relation to Airline Transport Pilot License (ATPL) and Commercial Pilot License (CPL) holders has been increased from five years to ten years. This change is expected to reduce administrative burden on pilots and aviation authorities like DGCA, promoting a more streamlined and efficient licensing process." the ministry said.

The Rule 118 for validation of foreign licenses has been removed as being redundant.

"These amendments to the Aircraft Rules, 1937 represent a significant step towards strengthening aviation safety, security, and the ease of doing business within the aviation sector in India," the ministry said, adding that these reforms will enhance the growth and sustainability of the aviation industry, ensuring it remains at the forefront of global aviation standards.

(MASLD), in young people. Most notably, babies with a low birthweight were found to be four times more likely to deconnection to MASLD remained unclear." said first author Dr Fahim Ebrahimi, a postdoctoral researcher at the Department of Medical Epidemiology and Biostatistics at Karolinska Institutet in Sweden. "Our study now provides com-

pelling evidence that foetal developmental factors play a significant role in the development of MASLD and progressive liver disease," he added.

To investigate the link, the researchers conducted a population-based case-control study of all people aged 25 years and younger, who had been diagnosed with biopsy-proven MASLD between January 1992 and April 2017, totalling 165 cases. They found that individuals

born with a low birthweight



were four times more likely to develop MASLD when compared with those born with a normal birthweight.

Those born as small for gestational age (SGA), falling below the 10th percentile, were also over three times more likely to develop MASLD early in life compared with those with an

adequate (10th-90th) birthweight. In addition, the researchers found that individuals with a low birthweight, or those born as SGA, had an up to about a 6fold higher relative risk of developing more severe stages of MASLD in the form of liver fibrosis or cirrhosis

"Further research is needed to

fully understand the underlying immunological and metabolic mechanisms. Several studies suggest that both overnutrition and undernutrition during pregnancy can lead to lasting epigenetic changes that can affect an individual's metabolism for a lifetime," Dr Ebrahimi said.

Nonalcoholic fatty liver disease is a long-lasting liver condition caused by having too much fat in the liver. In recent times. MASLD was introduced to replace NAFLD. This change reflects the understanding that most conditions classified as MASLD are closely associated with the metabolic syndrome. which is characterised by obesity, insulin resistance and high levels of cholesterol or lipids. 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17 railway projects hang fire 2 DEAD, 2 INJURED IN BOLANGIR MISHAP

Incomplete survey work and disputes over land acquisition lead to inordinate delays in completion

Jajpur, Oct 16: A total of 17 railway projects approved for Odisha have failed to make any headway as the survey for those are still incomplete, sources said Monday These projects have been sanctioned quite a few years back. Not only have the surveys been completed, other important aspects like land acquisition and payment of compensation to the displaced have also not been done.

The Khurda Road-Bolangir railway project is prime example of how work is not progressing. It is not yet fully operational despite the project being sanctioned 28 years ago.

According to details obtained under Right to Information Act (RTI) from East Coast Railway (ECoR), October 12, the construction of the 96km rail route from Jajpur-Keonjhar Road railway station to Dhamra via Jajpur and Aradi in Bhadrak district has not taken off due to incomplete survey work. No plausible answer is available from ECoR regarding the work. The Railway Ministry sanctioned ₹2.40 crore September 11, 2023 for the final survey of the proposed project. One can just hope that now work will progress at a smooth pace.



The other railway projects that are still stuck due to incomplete surveys are the 118km-long Junagarh-Nabarangpur rail route, 125km-long Malkangiri-Bhadrachalam route, the laying of tracks for the 58km route from Sasubohumali-Sijumali-Kutrumali bauxite mines to Tikiri, the 79km route from Naupada-Gunupur to Therubali, the 282km-long Talcher-Gopalpur stretch, the Bolangir-Nuapada Road via Patnagarh 100km route, the 33km-long Puri-Konark route and the eight-kilometre long Daitari Station to Baliparbat iron ore mines route.

Survey is progressing, but at a very tardy pace on the 270km-long Raipur to Jabalpur route, the 142km-long Bargarh to Nuapada route, 160km-long route from Barkote to Jharsuguda, 240km stretch from Jagannathpur to Redhakhole and the 254km-long

MCRL inner corridor phase.

It should be stated here that many of the railway projects have already been sanctioned but work is not progressing at the pace expected. Among them are the 301km-long Khurda Road to Bolangir route, 149km-long Talcher to Bimlagarh route, the 126kmlong stretch from Jeypore to Malkangiri and the 50km-long Jeypore-Nabarangpur route.

There are various other reasons also for the slow pace of completion of the projects. There have been disputes over conversion of forest land to non-forest ones, enumeration of the trees, compensation towards tree felling, Forest Rights Act (FRA) certificates and protection of wildlife. Some of the disputes are pending for more than 10 years now. With the work not completed it is the locals who are suffering.

There is no shortage of funds for the various projects. The Centre has sanctioned ₹2,864.50 crore for the Junagarh-Nabarangpur project, ₹3,591.76 crore for the Malkangiri-Bhadrachalam project, ₹1315.16 crore for Sasubohumali-Sijumali-Kutrumali roject and ₹1397.36 crore for Naupada-Gunupur project, as per a reply by ECoR regarding the RTL



'Covishield booster shots increase antibody level'

Sambalpur, Oct 16: Doctors of the Veer Surendra Sai Institute of Medical Sciences and Research (VIMSAR) at Burla have found that Covishield booster shots significantly increased antibody levels against Covid-19, indicating enhanced protection against the virus. The study has been published in the international journal 'Cureus Journal of Medical Science'. The group of doctors of

the premier healthcare institution who conducted the study included Dr Trupti Meher, Dr Subrat Kumar Pradhan, Dr Shankar P Hatei, Dr Subash Chandra Majhi, Dr Aishwarya Panda, Dr Smriti R Mund and Dr Sanjeeb Kumar Mishra.

'The study included 132 healthcare providers, mostly women with a mean age of 35 years. They received the booster shot at least nine months after the second dose. The results showed that antibody levels significantly increased after the booster shot, with a mean fold rise of more than 30 per cent," said Dr Mishra, corresponding author of the study.

Dr Mishra said the study also found that the antibody levels were higher in participants who had a longer interval be tween the second dose and

the booster shot. Interestingly, 38 of the participants had negligible antibody levels prior to the booster dose which signifies the need for the timely shot, he added.

The study suggests that the third booster shot can significantly enhance protection against the virus especially among healthcare providers who are at a higher risk of exposure. The study also highlights the importance of moni-

toring the antibody levels after the booster shot to ensure optimal protection against the virus.

"Overall, this study provides valuable insights into the effectiveness of the ChAdOx1 (Covishield) booster dose in enhancing protection against Covid. The findings have important implications for the ongoing vaccination campaigns and the efforts to control the spread of the virus," informed Mishra. He added

that in future yearly booster doses may be nec essary for the older people.

Polish Poll

n a historic poll in Poland, centrist and progressive forces are poised to form government wresting power from the ruling Law and Justice nationalist party, which has ironically won the most votes for a single party. This is the overwhelming verdict of exit polls which are regarded in Poland as reliable indications of the voting pattern. If the predicted scenario turns out to be true, which is most likely, Poland is going to witness momentous electoral changes comparable to the fall of the Communists in 1989. This time it is the triumph of liberal, democratic parties over rightist, intolerant, anti-immigrant and anti-LGBTQ+ forces. Coupled with this the incumbent party PiS has incurred the wrath of the people for alleged corruption, nepotism and tampering with government institutions to perpetuate a partisan regime that cornered jobs and other privileges for party followers.

The exit polls show a strong second place finish by the main opposition group, Civic Coalition, and better than expected results for two smaller centrist and progressive parties. This means a huge setback for the governing party that was hoping for an unprecedented third consecutive term

The exit polls in Poland have such credibility that immediately after the results were announced October 15 a jubilant Donald Tusk, Civic Coalition's leader, said the projected results mean a resounding "win for democracy" that would end the tenure of Law and Justice in power since 2015.

Tusk is a former Prime Minister who had no hesitation after the exit poll results were known to assert it clearly signals the end of "this bad time." The election for new Parliament was held after a vicious campaign in the highly polarised nation. The European Union nations, Russia and Ukraine have been keenly watching the poll outcome as their future courses of actions have got inextricably linked to it. The Poles seemed to have realised the importance of the elections this time and for this reason they turned out at the booths in record numbers. The voter turnout was nearly 73 per cent which is 10 per cent above the votes polled in 1989 that brought Communist rule to an end. Both the governing Law and Justice and the opposition Civic Coalition made the election this time into a do-or-die moment for the country to ensure Poland has a promising future as a stable democratic state.

If early forecasts turn out to be correct when final official results are announced, likely on 17 October, Civic Coalition and its potential partners have won 248 seats in the 460-member legislature, against 200 in the kitty of Law and Justice. Jaroslaw Kaczynski, the governing party's chairman and Poland's de facto leader for the last eight years, has started resigning to the defeat, though he is still clinging to the hope of managing to win. But, he has hardly any chance of retaining power as its ally - a radical right-wing grouping that shares many of the nationalist views of Law and Justice - won only 6.2 per cent of the vote, giving it 12 seats. Exit polls are generally reliable in Poland, though some experts have cautioned that the unusually high turnout could make them less accurate

Sensing the people's anti-establishment mood the ruling party had before the poll sought to tilt the balance in its favour by holding a referendum alongside the parliamentary election. Voters were asked to answer four loaded questions about immigration and other issues clearly intended to put the European Union and the opposition known for its pro-EU stand in a bad light. The questions were nothing but the ruling party's electoral planks. For example, the voters were asked whether they support the admission of thousands of illegal immigrants from the Middle East and Africa, in accordance with the forced relocation mechanism imposed by European bureaucracy. But, many of the voters could see through the game and they stayed away from it responding to a call given by the opposition.

The results as indicated by the exit polls will bring relief to the European Union which is ready to loosen its purse strings and give Poland £30bn for its economic recovery. It has frozen these funds for the anti-EU stand of the ruling party. The EU was also alarmed by the recent posturing of the current dispensation of Poland which stopped supporting Ukraine in its war with Russia. On the other hand, the opposition has made part of its election agenda to reorient the country to the EU and support Ukraine.

But, more than the immediate concerns, the election results in Poland, bringing the liberal and Left parties back to power, are going to be a watershed moment in Europe which is dangerously tilting towards Far-right politics.

SPOTLIGHT ON WOMEN he Economics Nobel prize this year went to a single individual,

GOLDIN'S MOST INTENSIVE AND DEFINITIVE **STUDY IS OF** WOMEN'S LABOUR FORCE PARTICIPATION AND OUTCOMES **OVER 200 YEARS OF AMERICAN** HISTORY

Professor Claudia Goldin of Harvard University. She is the third woman in history to have won this award and the first to be honoured independently. Being the first woman to get the Economics Nobel as a single prize winner is something very special. The Nobel citation, describing her work over five decades says that the prize is "for having advanced our understanding of women's labour market outcomes." Some of her insightful and original contri butions have become common knowledge now. These are worth recalling and are discussed here. Goldin's most intensive and definitive study is of women's labour force participation and outcomes over 200 years of American history. Many of her findings and conclusions, drawn from American data, are applicable to most other countries, including India, despite the cultural and geographic differences. Let us examine some of the prominent ones.

First there is the U-shape of the participation of women in the labour force as the economy develops. With economic development, the economy goes from being agrarian to industrial and finally services dominated. In the agrarian phase, women work on farms along with their men folk. With industrialisation the work is less flexible, more rigid, in the factories and on assembly lines, and hence the participation of women drops. With more economic advancement, the service sector dominates, and women are able to participate in greater numbers. This is the U-shape -- high participation in the early stage. followed by low during industrial phase and high again when there is more prosperity. This has been seen over a long period of American economic history. This pattern is also observed across countries which are presently at different stages of development. Thus, this is a

pattern over time, as well as across the world. Not surprisingly most rich countries which tend to have a very large services sector, tend also to have a high female labour force participation rate (FLFPR). It can be as high as 85 or even 90% as in countries like Sweden. That means 90% of women in their working age are either employed in paid work, or are looking for a job. By contrast the FLFPR in India is low. By some accounts it is below 20% and is the lowest among all G20 countries. This has been disputed. The Economic Survey, 2023, published by the government of India puts the FLFPR at 27.7%. But more about that later below. Another aspect of the U-shape of female participation is through the lens of the family income and social custom, and not just the economic development trajectory of the whole economy. For very poor house holds women cannot afford not to work. Hence the workforce participation rate is high. As family income rises, the women pull back and tend to take care of household work and childcare. For rich and very rich households the workforce participation rate goes up again. This is also U-shaped, but with respect to household income. This pattern is further muddied by social custom. If a woman is working for pay out-

side home, there is a social stigma attached. It implies that the "man" of the household is either lazy or unable to earn enough for his family. This stigma has been observed across different cultures. Thus, social stigma might also prevent women's participation especially for middle income families. Another factor which also exhibits a U-shape is women's education. For the illiterate or those with low education, women participate more. With some education (say till mid dle school) their participation rate drops. With much higher education their participation picks up again. This too is a U-shape. It is seen in Indian data. Here the explanation for the U-shape is not from the supply side of labour, or that middle-educated women do not want to work. It is actually from the demand side of labour. There simply aren't adequate and appropriate jobs for women with high school or middle school education. So in the absence of jobs they just drop out of the labour force. It is quite common to hear

such a comment: "my daughter is in a temporary job, but as soon as she gets married, she will quit." It is as if job is simply a temporary arrangement before marriage and motherhood. Indeed, Goldin's and other people's work has documented, how in olden times, nearly 60% of

an adult woman's prime working age was spent in either being pregnant or nursing a child. Just look at our grandparents' generation which tended to have people with a dozen siblings. Imagine the plight of their mothers. All this changed thanks to family planning, postponing marriages and spacing out pregnancies. Also, the total fertility rate, i.e. average number of chil dren born to prime age woman dropped sharply. The special role of contraception in increasing FLFPR is also highlighted by Goldin's work. Her work also covers the struggle against discrimination at workplace that women had to fight, and also the fight for equal pay. This column cannot possibly do justice to the whole and rich body of work of the Nobel laureate.

The Nobel prize could not have been timelier and more relevant for India. The FLFPR in India has been falling steadily for over two decades, although there is some uptick recently. The Economic Survey of 2023 also documents the silent revolution of the 12 million self-help groups across the country, run almost wholly by women. The recent legislation for women's quota in Parliament and state Assemblies has come none too soon. Across most states, half of all elected persons in village, town and city councils and corporations are women, thanks to reservations in the third tier of government.

Many companies are actively trying to re-recruit women after their first or second pregnancy i.e. mid-career. There are two gaps that India must urgently fill. One is the gap between the male and female labour participation rate (56 and 28% as per Economic Survey). And the second is the pay gap between male and female employees for the same work. If both these gaps are eliminated India's GDP can jump up substantially. Thanks to Goldin's prize, these issues have come into sharp focus.

Or, it can hike rates and throw people out of work to reduce the price of services sufficiently to keep the increase in the price index equal to the inflation target. In the event, central

When considering the monetary-policy response to the 2021-22 global surge of inflation, it is noteworthy that no advancedeconomy central bank began to hike rates until headline inflation had already exceeded its target rate. Equally, nearly all advancedeconomy central banks (save Switzerland and Norway) delayed rate hikes until core inflation, too, had already exceeded

their respective targets. The question that many have asked is why monetary policies across most advanced economies "fell behind the curve" in this way. Critics of the US Federal Reserve suggest that a persistent inflation overshoot, and a delay in lifting rates until inflation was already above target, must stem from a failure of the underlying monetary-policy framework. According to this reasoning, the post-pandemic record indicates a breakdown of both inflation targeting and its "first cousin," flexible average inflation targeting, which the Fed adopted in August 2020.

Kolkata, Oct 16: The West Bengal unit of the Communist Party of India-Marxist (CPI-M) has initiated a special internal review to assess and review the impact of religious rituals on the daily lives of the party members.

The idea behind the survey is to know "how far the grassroots level party workers and leaders are sticking to the original party ideology by practicing 'atheism' - be it in terms of participation in the community pujas or following rituals as per religious prescriptions in social functions like marriages," a source in the know of things said.

At the same time, the party leadership is also trying to understand "how far the grassroots-level comrades are able to



avoid extravaganza or display of luxury again on social occasions like marriages."

Based on the feedback received of from the workers and leaders of at the grassroots level, the matter will be discussed in detail at the extended state committee meeting of the party in November.

As per traditions, Indian Marxists have always maintained a distance from participating in religious functions or community

pujas, unlike their counterparts in the Congress, the Trinamool Congress and the BJP.

Instead, during the four days of Durga Puja, the party leadership utilises the occasion as a public relations exercise by setting up stalls of Marxist literature near the popular puja pandals. Although, as a general prac-

tice, the top CPI-M leaders used to avoid getting associated with or participate in inauguration of any community puja or openly practicing religion in public, former West Bengal minister, Subhas Chakhraborty, a leftist, was an exception. Besides participating in community pujas in his constituency, he had also hit the headlines after he was seen offering puja at the iconic Tarapith Kali temple in Birbhum district.

Despite crackdown, child marriages thrive At least 3,483 PEOPLE WERE ARRESTED DURING THE INITIAL DRIVE AGAINST CHILD MARRIAGE, WHICH BEGAN IN FEBRUARY

Guwahati, Oct 16: The Assam Police has worked hard to stop child marriages in the state. The wide-scale crackdown against child marriages began in February this year, with police arresting more than 3,000 individuals across the state.

This October, the police launched a second round of massive operations and, so far, arrested more than 1,500 people.

Assam DGP, GP Singh, said that there has been a noticeable decrease in child marriage instances. However, he acknowledged that the issue still exists.

"We have noticed that cases have decreased in the majority of the state's regions since our first operation against child marriage. However, the problem still exists in some areas," he said.

The top cop further mentioned _that the police will carry out two massive operations a year until the social scourge of child marriage is eliminated from the state. At least 3,483 people were arrested during the initial drive, which began in the month of February 2023, and 4,515 cases in all were registered. According to the police, 95.5 per cent of the cases from the first phase have already been charged.

In the months of June, July, and August, GP Singh stated: "Our operations led us to unearth 710 incidents of child marriage, which were registered with 1,100 accused named, out of whom 915 people have been arrested so far."

Recently, a case related to child marriage was heard at a court in Cachar district. It was alleged that the father of a girl child forged the birth certificate of his daughter to give her marriage before she reached 18 years old.

Jadav Pal and Bimal Das of Katigorah area in Cachar were arrested by the police on charges of child marriage. Kalain Gram Panchayat Secretary Dulal



Chandra Deb filed a statement and accused Jadav of marrying a 15-year-old girl. Meanwhile, in court, Jadav claimed that according to the birth certificate, his wife was born September 8, 2003, and they got married January 27, 2023. As evidence, the birth cer-

As evidence, the birth certificate issued February 9, 2022, was produced in court. However, while passing judgment on this case recently, Cachar Additional Sessions Judge (Special Judge, POCSO) said: "According to the case diary report of the police, another birth certificate was issued to the girl, where her date of birth is September 8, 2008." "The certificate issued

February 9, 2022, is incorrect,"

the court added. Jadav was allowed bail, but the court accused the girl's father, Bimal Das, of forging the birth certificate of his daughter and sent him to jail.

Senior advocate Dharmananda Deb said: "If a male adult above eighteen years contracts a child marriage, it shall be punishable up to two years imprisonment and/ or a fine that may extend up to Rs 1 lakh. The same punishment will be given to the person who performs, conducts, or directs a child marriage. Unless proved otherwise, the parents or guardians of the child are considered to have failed to prevent the child's marriage and hence are also held accountable.' AIUDF MLA and party general

AIUDF MLA and party general secretary, Karim Uddin Barbhuiya, said: "We need an extensive campaign to eliminate the curse of child marriages. Society should be more aware of the health issues and other difficulties a girl can face in her life if she is married early."

Delimitation to safeguard indigenous people: Himanta

Guwahati, Oct 16: Interests of the indigenous people of Assam are being safeguarded through the delimitation exercise of Assembly and Parliamentary constituencies, Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma has asserted.

Sarma made the observation while attending the Amrit Kalash Yatra in the Nalbari district Sunday.

"Majority of the Assembly seats are now in safe positions for the indigenous people of Assam. Of the 26 Assembly seats, at least 105 can be won by Assamese indigenous people," he told the media.

Earlier also, the Chief Minister repeatedly said that the delimitation exercise would be proven beneficial for the Assamese indigenous people.

This has sparked a controversy as the Opposition alleged that Sarma has been dictating the Election Commission (EC) that conducted the delimitation process to gain votes for the BJP.

We ferry passengers from dawn till midnight. Many of us will be present at the pandal in the evening hours this time to in-

Guwahati, Oct 16: Opposing the demand to carve out Barak Valley from Assam, the banned militant organisation ULFA (Independent) Sunday asked the Bengalispeaking population in the state to clarify their position on the issue within 60 days.

The group issued a warning that the entire Bengali-speaking population in the state would be held accountable for any (future) 'untoward incident' if the Bengalis failed to make their positions on the matter clear within 60 days.

The Chief Convenor of the Barak Democratic Front (BDF), an organisation centred in the Barak Valley, was criticised by Rumel Asom, a member of ULFA-I's publicity wing, for rallying support for the creation of a new state in the Barak Valley.

An e-mail statement from the outlawed group said: "Various communities in Assam have been living in harmony and in unity. But Pradip Dutta Roy has been trying to create a division among people by raising the demand for separating Barak Valley. He has no right and his forefathers have no contribution to the protection of the Barak Valley from Partition. We will, in no circumstances, allow division of Assam."

In southern Assam's Barak Valley, which includes the districts of Cachar, Karimganj, and Hailakandi, Bengali-speaking Hindus and Muslims are in the majority.

Of 126 Assembly seats, 13 lie in the Barak Valley region.

Many residents of the three districts claim that as most elected officials come from the Assamese-dominated Brahmaputra Valley, the region has been ignored.

The demand for a separate state is the result of this unhappiness.

Even as Bengalis comprise about 30 per cent of Assam's population (3.2 crore), they are under-represented in the Brahmaputra Valley.

The ULFA (Independent) vehemently opposes the demand for splitting apart the Bengali-dominated Barak Valley from Assam as a separate state.



Row over Dubey's allegations against **Moitra escalates**

New Delhi, Oct 16: The row over BJP MP Nishikant Dubey's allegation that TMC's Mahua Moitra took "bribes" to ask questions in the House intensified Monday with senior BJP leaders terming it as a "severe blow to the dignity of Parliament" and Moitra asserting that the charges were based on a "jilted ex's lies"

Also Monday, the embattled Adani Group latched on Dubey's complaint to attack Moitra, who has been at the forefront of criticising the conglomerate ever since Hindenburg alleged fraud, saying groups and individuals have been working overtime to harm its name and market standing.

Dubey Sunday wrote to Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla accusing the Trinamool Congress MP of taking bribes for raising questions in Parliament to "protect the interest of a business group and claimed that advocate Jai Anant Dehadrai had "shared irrefutable evidence of bribes exchanged" between Moitra and Darshan Hiranandani. Dubey also wrote to IT Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw, urging him to investigate the IP addresses of Moitra's log-in credentials for the House.

DELHI EXCISE POLICY CASE Contemplating making AAP accused: CBI, ED to top court

New Delhi, Oct 16: In more trouble for the city's ruling AAP, the CBI and the ED told the Supreme Court Monday they are contemplating making the party an accused in the corruption and money laundering cases linked to the scrapped Delhi excise policy.

Additional Solicitor General (ASG) S V Raju, representing the two probe agencies, told a bench of Justices Sanjiv Khanna and SVN Bhatti he has instructions to state that the agencies are considering making AAP an accused, invoking legal provisions on "vicarious liability" under the anti-corruption law and section 70 of the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA).

"I want to make a statement I have received instructions to make. We are contemplating making the Aam Aadmi Party an accused and invoking offences of vicarious liability under the Prevention of Corruption Act and section 70 of the PMLA," Raju told the court. However, the bench asked

Raju to clarify his stand on Tuesday on whether there will be separate charges against the AAP in the cases being probed by the CBI and the ED. Raju said charges in corruption and



money laundering cases will be different but for the same offence

The ASG made the statement while the bench was hearing the bail pleas of AAP leader and former Delhi deputy chief minister Manish Sisodia, who was arrested in the excise policy cases being probed by the CBI and ED. Senior AAP leader and Rajya Sabha MP Sanjay Singh has also been arrested in connection with the excise policy cases and is currently in jail.

The bench also asked senior advocate Abhishek Singhvi, appearing for Sisodia, to answer legal questions Tuesday on the CBI's allegation that change in excise policy led to a loss to the state exchequer.

"We want you to answer on the allegation of the CBI that the changes in policy was done for uniust enrichment of A, B and C at state exchequer's expense and consumers were made to pay higher price," the bench told Singhvi.

Women's Reservation Bill: Congress leader moves SC

New Delhi: A Congress leader has filed a petition in the Supreme Court seeking directions to the Union government to implement 33 percent reservation for women's in Lok Sabha and state assemblies before 2024 general elections. Congress leader Dr Jaya Thakur has sought the immediate implementation of the Constitution (One Hundred and Sixth Amendment) Act, 2023, which was passed by the Lok Sabha and Rajya during the special session of the Parliament and notified in September after the assent of President Droupadi Murmu. ED raids 30 locations in fraud case against BSL

New Delhi: The Enforcement Directorate Monday said it has conducted fresh searches against the promoters and entities of erstwhile Bhushan Steel Limited as part of a money laundering probe against them linked to an alleged ₹56,000 crore bank fraud case. Thirty locations in the national capital region. Harvana, Kolkata, Mumbai and Bhubaneswar (Odisha) were raided and surveyed last week October 13, officials said. The money laundering case stems from a charge sheet filed by the Serious Fraud Investigation Office. an investigative agency under the Ministry of Corporate Affairs. A probe found that the erstwhile Bhushan Steel Limited (BSL) and its Managing Director Neeraj Singal and his associates formed several shell companies, the agency alleged in a statement.

No child sexual abuse content found: YT in reply to govt notice

New Delhi, Oct 16: YouTube Monday said it did not detect materials related to child sexual abuse on its platform despite multiple probes and also has not received evidence of such content on the video streaming platform from regulators.

The statement from YouTube spokesperson came after the government issued notices to social media platforms, including YouTube, X (formerly Twitter) and Telegram, earlier this month asking them to takedown child sexual abuse material from their platforms in India.

In a statement, YouTube spokesperson said: "We have a long history of successfully fighting child exploitation on YouTube. Based on multiple thorough investigations, we did not detect CSAM on our platform, nor did we receive examples or evidence of CSAM on YouTube from regulators.²

ebanon's Hezbollah has been exchanging fire with Israel across the border for days in the deadliest escalation since they fought a major war in 2006, threatening to expand a conflict between Israel and Palestinian group Hamas. Backed by Iran, Hezbollah has said it is ready to help when the time comes in the war between Israel and Hamas, which is also backed by Tehran. Sources said last week Hezbollah's attacks so far had been designed to be contained and so avoid another major war. Israel's defence minister said on Oct. 15 that Israel had no interest in waging war on its northern front, and that if Hezbollah restrained itself then Israel would also keep the situation along the border as it is. Iran's Revolutionary Guards founded Hezbollah in 1982, the middle of Lebanon's 1975-90 civil war. It was part of Iran's effort to exports its 1979 Islamic Revolution around the region and fight Israeli forces after their 1982 invasion of Lebanon. Sharing Tehran's Shi'ite Islamist ideology, Hezbollah recruited Lebanese Shi'ite Muslims. The



group has risen from a shadowy faction to a heavily armed force with major sway over the Lebanese state. The United States, some Western governments and others deem it a terrorist organisation. While other groups disarmed after Lebanon's civil war, Hezbollah kept its weapons to fight Israeli forces that were occupying the predominantly Shi'ite south of the country. Years of guerrilla warfare led Israel to withdraw in 2000. Hezbollah demonstrated its military advances in 2006 during a five-week war with Israel, which erupted after it crossed into Israel, kidnapping two soldiers and killing others. Hezbollah fired thousands of rockets into Israel during the conflict, in which 1,200 people were killed in Lebanon, mostly civilians, and 158 Israelis were killed, most of them soldiers. Hezbollah's military power grew after it deployed into Syria, another of Iran's allies in the region, to help President Bashar al-Assad fight mostly Sunni Muslim rebels. Hezbollah boasts weapons including precision rockets and drones, and says it can hit all parts of Israel. In 2021, Hezbollah leader Sayyed Hassan Nasrallah said the group had 100,000 fighters. Iran gives Hezbollah weapons and money. The United States estimates Iran has allocated it hundreds of millions of dollars annually in recent years. Hezbollah has deep ties to Hamas, which controls Gaza, and Islamic Jihad, another Palestinian faction backed by Iran. Hezbollah has been a source of inspiration and support for other Iranian-Palestinbacked groups across the Middle East. It has trained armed groups in Iraq and taken part in fighting there. Saudi Arabia says Hezbollah has also fought in support of the Iran-allied Houthis in Yemen. a global financing net-Hezbollah denies this. Rafah (Gaza Strip), Oct 16: Palestinians in besieged Gaza crowded into hospitals and schools Monday, seeking shelter and running low on food and water.

More than a million people have fled their homes ahead of an expected Israeli ground invasion aimed at destroying Hamas after its fighters rampaged through southern Israel. As the enclave's food, water and medicine supplies dwindled, all eyes were on the Rafah crossing between Gaza and Egypt, where trucks carrying badly needed aid have been waiting for days as mediators press for a cease-fire that would allow them to enter Gaza and allow foreigners to leave. Rafah, Gaza's only connection to Egypt, was shut down nearly a week ago because of Israeli airstrikes.

Egypt's Foreign Minister Sameh Shoukry said Israel "has not taken a position to open the crossing from the Gaza side". The Israeli government did not respond to a request for comment. With a ground invasion of Gaza expected, Israel was preparing for the potential of a new front opening on its northern border with Lebanon, where it has exchanged fire repeatedly with the Iranian-backed Hezbollah group. Hamas has urged people to stay in their homes. For a third day, Israel's military announced a safe corridor for people to move from north to south between the hours of 8 am and noon. It said more than 600,000 people have already evacuated the Gaza City area. Hospitals in Gaza are expected to run out of generator fuel in the next 24 hours, endangering the lives of thousands of patients, according to the UN. REUTERS/PTI

BoM profit up 72%

FUEL SALES FALL

New Delhi: Petrol and diesel sales fell in the first half of October ahead of the start of festival season that is expected to boost consumption. preliminary data of state-owned firms showed. Petrol sales by three state-owned fuel retailers fell 9 per cent year-on-year, the first drop in two months. Diesel consumption dropped 3.2 per cent. Petrol sales dropped to 1.17 million tonne during the first half of October from 1.29 million tonne a vear back. Consumption of diesel, the most consumed fuel in the country accounting for about two-fifths of the demand, dropped to 2.99 million tonne during October 1 to 15 from 3.09 million tonne a year back. With the continuing rise in passenger traffic at airports, jet fuel (ATF) demand rose 5.7 per cent to 2,95,200 tonne during first fortnight of October against the same period last year. It was 36.5 per cent more than in October 1-15, 2021, but 6.6 per cent lower than pre-Covid October 2019.

Dharamsala, Oct 16: South Africa are making quite a statement at the World Cup, playing entertaining cricket and plundering tons of runs as they steamroll rival teams.

As the Proteas take on the Netherlands in this hilly paradise Tuesday, the perennial underperformers and 'chokers' have shown in the last two games their determination to go the distance in the tournament.

Their 102-run win against Sri Lanka in the opener in New Delhi after putting a record 428/5 on the board, followed by 134run victory against five-time champions Australia in Lucknow, have made South Africa the team to beat in the competition.

From staying under the radar in the lead-up to the ODI showpiece to becoming high-flyers, the Proteas have started playing to potential and will be firm favourites against the Dutch.

Unlike the Australian and England cricket teams, whose patchy performance so far has left a lot to be desired, the South Africans have come out with full combat capabilities -with the likes of wicket-keeping stalwart Quinton de Kock, top-order batter Rassie van der Dussen and Aiden Markram making a massive impact here.

The trio smashed a century each against Sri Lanka to pile up a mountain of runs with Heinrich Klaasen and David Miller playing useful cameos in the 428-run total.



Though their bowlers did take a beating from the Sri Lankans. they hit back with full force against the Australians in the next match.

A second consecutive century by De Kock and a massively improved performance from tall pace bowler Marco Jansen and Kagiso Rabada floored Pat Cummins' side. The 177-run loss for the five-time champions following the humiliating loss to India in the opener has put the Kangaroos on the mat.

The Proteas would look to attack with even more firepower against the Netherlands. But they have posed a challenge occasionally, like the huge upset they made during the 2009 T20 World Cup, defeating England at Lord's.

Last year, the Dutch eliminated the Proteas, handing them a shocking 13-run defeat in the Super 12 stage of the T20 World Cup in Australia. The Scott Edwards-led side will certainly take inspiration from that victory, though T20 and 50-over formats are like chalk and cheese.

But, on a cricket field, where miracles happen, the Dutch too would want to aim for a victory for the ages after seeing Afghanistan overrun defending champions England Sunday night in New Delhi.

The Proteas, once bitten twice shy, would be looking to opener De Kock, Rassie van der Dussen and Aiden Markram to once again set the stage on fire and then give their bowlers a big total to defend.

alistic ambitions of winning Euro 2024, but they have arguably exceeded expectations by qualifying from Group A. Indeed, until losing to Spain Thursday, the Scots had made a 100% start to qualifying.

Scotland have now qualified for back-to-back Euros, having failed to reach the finals from 2000-

Cricket in Olympics: A sporting, business bonanza in the men's section and 66 in the most importantly, the BCCI and


Bangalore, Oct 16: For long cricket remained a statistical global sport sans a true global footing. A solid fan base of 2.5 billion and an ever-swelling TV revenue formed its axis to be labelled as a sport with a worldwide appeal, second only to football.

However, in reality, all of it is parked in the Commonwealth countries and even among them India alone helm around 70 percent, if not more, of those numbers.

But now, all this could change as cricket, in its T20 avatar, has made its re-entry into the Olympic fold through the 2028 edition at Los Angeles, and it is a mutu ally beneficial association from sporting and commercial angles.

From a sporting perspective, the Olympics provides an unmatchable platform for cricket, perhaps even bigger than a World Cup.

Standing on the podium wearing an Olympic medal around the neck is an unmatched feeling for any sportsperson, as it is a reverentially warm handshake with history that dates back to 1896



"It is an excellent piece of news for cricket to be part of the Olympics. It will certainly add to the global image of cricket,' says Keith Joseph, president of the Caribbean Association of National Olympic Committees (CANOC), who gave a strong backing to ICC's efforts to get

Olympics. T20 provides an excellent platform too in terms of duration and connection with younger audiences. That USA will be co-

of the Olympics," he points out. However, expecting cricket to match the universal appeal of football, something the sport always cherished, just because of an Olympic appearance is quite naive.

Sample this: The ICC men's T20 ranking list features 87 nations

women's segment. But the FIFA ranking list touches 207 men's teams and 186 women's outfits, the numbers reveal the vast gulf between the two sports.

Of course, this is not to deny that the T20 format has helped cricket to reach some hitherto unexplored corners of Africa, Europe and Latin America. However, cricket had to leap over several self-imposed hurdles to make its return to the Olympics.

Both the officials and players did not want to follow several clauses, especially the one pertaining to their whereabouts that is mandatory for random dope testing, laid out by the IOC, IOA, WADA etc.

England, the champion side when cricket was last staged in the Olympics in 1900, was another country which was initially reluctant to take this plunge.

"Yes, there were some difficulties in reaching an understanding for some time over certain issues such as the whereabouts clause. However,

ICC and few other boards have found a common ground to take cricket to a global stage," said a BCCI administrator.

Beyond the sporting field, the IOA also might have thought about the crowd-pulling power of cricket, especially in the USA, a country with a large Asian diaspora.

An industry insider, whom PTI contacted, said the million eyeballs that cricket ensures will have a massive influence on the purchase of broadcasting rights of the LA Olympics. "It is great news (cricket in

Olympics) if you are a businessperson. America has a large section of Asian expats, who are crazy about cricket and they will fill the stadium and of course will follow the game on TV or streaming apps.

"Since cricket is in LA, our estimate is that the selling price of broadcasting rights might see at least a 20-30 percent jump from the existing one, which is huge for a single edition," the expert said.

DMK leader Udhavanidhi Stalin posted the video with a comment that such crowd behaviour is "unacceptable". "India is renowned for its sportsmanship and hospitality. However, the treatment meted out to Pakistan players at Narendra Modi Stadium in Ahmedabad is unacceptable and a new low. Sports should be a unifying force between countries, fostering true brotherhood. Using it as a tool to spread hatred is condemnable," he wrote on X.

Trinamool Congress (TMC) MP Saket Gokhale also criticised the fans for heckling Rizwan. "PM Modi desperately wants India to host the 2036 Olympics. But if this is what BJP has reduced our audiences to - where they heckle a Pakistani player with chants of Jai Shri Ram massive doubts remain over whether we're qualified & sporting enough to host ANY international sporting event," he wrote.

Pakistan players, led by Babar Azam, have received tremendous respect and a warm welcome upon their arrival first in Hyderabad and then in Ahmedabad.

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
