ice in April 2023 on charge of submitting fake ertifificates.
The Education deartment has sought details sfom Andhra ucational qualifications of these teachers as al the certificates
were issued by them. The doubts catesumy these teachers areegain-
ing ground As Andhra University is yet to reply on the issue.
Sources said that the depart. Abhivan isued aletere and sought of 14 teachers and B. Ed certificates of 144 teachers, December
$31,2019$. However, the varsity provided the details of only 15 teach.
ers during last four years. Interestingly, 14 of those teach-
ers have either resisined from transferreded elsewhere after the Samagra Sikshya Abhiyan sub-
mitted the certificates for veri fication to the unierssity and
sought details on their authenticity. However, it is surprising
why the university is not submitting the details of rest of the
