### Michaung: South Odisha on alert

Bhubaneswar, Dec 5: Southern districts of Odisha were put on alert Tuesday night as the intensity of rains was likely to increase as an impact of severe cyclone Michaung that made landfall in neighbouring Andhra

Pradesh, officials said. The storm made landfall in the afternoon near Bapatla be-Nellore and tween Machilipatnam in Andhra Pradesh, with a maximum sustained wind speed of 90-100 kmph, gusting up to 110 kmph. Light rainfall has been recorded in Malkangiri, Koraput,

Rayagada, Ganjam, Gajapati and Kalahandi districts of Odisha till the evening, and the intensity is likely to increase overnight, officials said.

After landfall, the cyclone is likely to move northwards and weaken into a depression, they said

At least 12 people lost their lives in various rain-related incidents in and around Chennai even as personnel on fishing boats and farm tractors were engaged in rescuing stranded people in the city, Tuesday. The DMK has demanded an immediate Central assistance of ₹5,000 crore for the rain-ravaged state.

### 'Cash-for-kidney': **Investigation ordered**

New Delhi, Dec 5: The National Organ and Tissue Transplantation Organisation (NOTTO) under the Union Health Ministry has ordered an inquiry into allegations of cash-for-kidney scam against Indraprastha Apollo hospital, sources said Tuesday.

Director of NOTTO, Anil Kumar has written to Principal Secretary (Health) in the Delhi government to get the matter examined, take appropriate action according to provisions of the Transplantation of Human Organs and Tissues Act 1994 and furnish an action taken report within a week. The Indraprastha Medical Corporation Ltd asserted that it follows every legal and ethical requirement for transplants.

### **Green push**

Waiver of MV Tax & penalty on old vehicles to facilitate scrapage among 10 proposals to receive Odisha Cabinet nod

Bhubaneswar, Dec 5: In a move aimed at easing vehicular pollution, the state Cabinet, chaired by Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik, Tuesday approved waiver of Motor Vehicle (MV) Tax and penalty pending against more than 50,000 vehicle owners as it would go a long way towards scrapage of their old and polluting vehicles.

Chief Secretary PK Jena said despite notice and special drives, the state government has been able to recover dues from only 4,668 vehicle owners in 2022. "Besides, in line with the country's effort to curb vehicular pollution by phasing out old polluting vehicles, the state government has decided to offer one-time waiver of pending MV Tax and penalty on vehicle owners who want to de-register/scrap their vehicles at Registered Vehicle Scrapping Facility (RVSF)," he said.

The proposal was among the 10 approved by the Odisha Cabinet, Jena said.

The Cabinet has also decided to amend the Odisha **Government Land Settlement** Rules, 1983, to resolve the longpending land issues in Puri Municipality, and wasteland lease for homestead purposes in Bhubaneswar and Jatni tehsils of Khurda district. It also approved a package for Welspun

Group's projects in Cuttack and Sambalpur districts, which includes incentives on land and electricity, he said.

The Cabinet decided to develop a utility corridor between Gopalpur Port and Tata Steel Industrial Park in Ganjam. A tender worth Rs 128.88 crore was approved for the project, which will be executed by the state Industrial Development Corporation, said Jena.

The Cabinet decided to amend the Odisha MSME Development Policy, 2022, and Odisha Food Processing Policy, 2022. With these amendments, a differential amount of financial benefit can be extended to industries that have availed similar incentives from the Centre, if the state offers higher incentives, he said.

The Cabinet also decided that the Secondary Board High School in Cuttack will be taken over by the state government with effect from January 1, 2024.

He hired the boy of Bhanjanagar area, promising a monthly wage of ₹1,500, to work as a helper at the eatery. The boy also used to live with him in that room, police said.

However, he did not pay the boy his wage, and whenever he asked for his dues, the man used to abuse and assault him. He also threatened the boy with a police case in case he tried to leave, Superintendent of Police (SP) Saravana Vivek M said.

In the early hours of November 29 when the man was sleeping, the boy brought a heavy stone slab and bludgeoned him with it. Then, he also hit him with an iron clamp, police said.

After ensuring the man's death, the boy left the house and bolted the doors. The body was recovered after a foul smell started coming from it, they said. The boy was nabbed Tuesday,

the SP said.



Bhubaneswar, Dec 5: Odisha witnessed 542 cases of cybercrime against women in 2022. which is the highest in India, according to the latest report released by the National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB).

Of the 542 cases, 269 were recorded for publishing or transmitting sexually-explicit material and the remaining 273 were registered under other cybercrimes, including blackmailing, defamation, morphing and fake profiles, the report said.

Odisha also reported the second-highest cases of publishing or transmitting sexually-explicit material in the country, while Uttar Pradesh topped the list with 450 cyber pornography crimes against 455 women.

Similarly, Odisha reported the highest victims of cyber morphing in the country, followed by Uttarakhand and Tamil Nadu.

### Man held for attack

### ₹65cr for Tusura airstrip makeover

Bhubaneswar, Dec 5: Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik Tuesday approved a proposal for modernisation of Tusura airstrip in Bolangir and sanctioned Rs 65 crore for the project.

It may be mentioned here that 5T and Naveen Odisha Chairman VK Pandian had visited Bolangir August 5 and 6 and received many proposals including development of Tusura airstrip. He had directed the Bolangir Collector for preparation of a detailed project report.

The airstrip in Tusura which is about 30 km away from Bolangir was inaugurated October 2, 1967 by the then Chief Minister Maharaja Rajendra Narayan Singhdeo. Built on a sprawling 50-acre land, the airstrip has a 1,200metre long runway

to include Tusura airstrip in Ude Desh Ka Aam Nagrik (UDAAN) scheme. In 2021, the Centre had included 19 unserved and underserved airstrips and airports of Odisha including Tusura airstrip under UDAN scheme.

Accordingly, Air Odisha had also conducted surveys of Tusura and Utkela airstrips. The inspection team had opined that the development of infrastructure can boost the chances of commercial air connectivity in the region.

### Workshop highlights declining child sex ratio in state

Bhubaneswar, Dec 5: Child sex ratio in Odisha has been declining since 1961. This was revealed during a State Level Consultative Workshop on Addressing Low Sex Ratio at Birth organised by Health and Family Welfare (H&FW) department in collaboration with United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) here, Tuesday.

The workshop was conducted in view of decline in sex ratio at birth (SRB) in the state to find out strategies to improve SRB. Some of the reasons commonly put forward to explain the low levels of SRB are preference for sons, sex selective abortions and female foeticide.

During the workshop, officials said the child sex ratio of Odisha

has been showing a declining trend since 1961. In 1961 census, Odisha's ratio was 1,035 which declined to 1,020 in 1971, 995 in 1981, 967 in 1991, 953 in 2001 and 941 in 2011. The National Family Health Survey-5 (2019-2021) had estimated Odisha's child sex ratio at 894, a sharp decline from 932 in NFHS-4 (2015-2016).

The statistical report estimated a fall of 23 points by Odisha in five years from 948 in 2014-16 to 925 in 2018-20.

### Carbon emissions in India to increase by 8.2% in 2023

arbon emissions in India are projected to increase in India by 8.2 per cent in 2023 and by 4 per cent in China, according to an international research.

Global emissions from coal, oil and gas are all projected to increase by 1.1, 1.5 and 0.5 per cent, respectively, even as they are predicted to decline in the EU and the USA by 7.4 and 3 per cent, respectively, the research team that included the University of Exeter, UK, and 90 other institutions globally said in its report.

The Global Carbon Budget report, produced by more than 120 scientists, provides an annual,



peer-reviewed update, building on established methodologies, the researchers said The report projects total global

carbon dioxide (CO2) emissions, arising out of both fossil fuels and land-use change, to be 40.9 billion tonnes in 2023. Of these, 36.8 billion tonnes would be from fossil fuels, up 1.1 per cent from 2022. Atmospheric CO2 levels are projected to average 419.3 parts per million in 2023, more than 50 per cent above pre-industrial levels, the researchers said in their report to be published in the journal Earth System Science Data.

Further, current levels of technology-based Carbon Dioxide Removal, which exclude naturebased means such as reforestation, amount to about 0.01 million tonnes CO2, more than a million times smaller than current fossil CO2 emissions, they said.

About half of all CO2 emitted continues to be absorbed by land and ocean "sinks," with the rest remaining in the atmosphere where it causes climate change,

### Farmers scurry to protect paddy Soil pollution, a worrying trend TFL project running MANY DISTRICTS, INCLUDING JAJPUR, KALAHANDI, KORAPUT AND

**BOLANGIR HIT HARD BY CONTAMINATION OF AGRICULTURAL SOIL**

Jajpur, Dec 5: Contamination and pollution of soil is assuming alarming proportions in the districts of Jajpur, Bolangir, Kalahandi and Koraput. This aspect, which has come to light on 'World Soil Day' has sent alarm bells ringing. This is because without proper soil conservation all forms of life will cease to exist and there will be serious ecological imbalance.

Many parts of Jajpur, Bolangir, Kalahandi and Koraput districts have been seriously affected by the presence of large quantities of aluminum. chromium and cadmium in the soil, as per a report prepared by the Department of Soil Science and Agricultural Chemistry belonging to the Odisha University of

Agriculture and Technology (OUAT), in Bhubaneswar. The report states that unless steps are taken to prevent soil contamination, there will be serious consequences

The report states that there is high concentration of chromite in five agricultural areas that lie close to the mines at Sukinda in Jajpur district. There is approximately 5,758 to 12,687 milligrams of chromite present per kilogram of soil. This can seriously affect agriculture production in the days to come, the report states.

Moreover, soil on 500 hectares of farmland has also been contaminated due to high concentration of nickel in the same areas. As per the report 0.7 to 0.98% of nickel is found in every kilogram of soil. This is quite dangerous and in the

long term can effect agriculture production which in turn may cause famines, the report states.

On the other hand, over 3,567 million tonne of iron ores lie deposited under 24,149 hectares of land in Keonjhar, Mayurbhanj, Sundargarh and Jajpur districts. This iron ore deposit is also causing soil contamination. Notably, Jajpur, Dhenkanal and Keonjhar districts have deposits of 183 million tonne of chromium under 9.197 hectares of land. As a result, cultivation is affected due to such high concentration of chromium on farmlands. The presence of 50 million tonne of manganese ore under 10,605 hectares of land in Bolangir, Keonihar, Koraput, Mayurbhanj and Sundargarh districts is also another reason for soil contamination, the report points out.

Sources said farmers have stopped using organic manure and have become heavily dependent on chemical fertilizers for more output turning the soil acidic. This has led to a decline in sulphur, potash and oxygen content in the soil. Moreover, discharge of industrial wastes and polluted water by various industrial units in the districts men tioned above are the other reasons behind soil contamination. Scientists have harped on the importance of framing laws to prevent soil con-



### **Bungling Spies**

t appears to be a season of Indian spies getting nabbed or identified for messing up with their espionage work in foreign countries. Spies, often masquerading as diplomats the world over, gather intelligence while working in different countries presumably to serve the interests of their own country. They also are mandated to foil attempts to destabilise or harm their countries. As such their work is recognised as legitimate and normal diplomatic activities and the host nations are usually aware of who all are into it and from which embassies. But, when protocols are breached or diplomats engaged in subversive activities bordering on criminality are caught, problems begin.

The issue has attracted global attention and Indian diplomats are at the centre of alleged shady operations. It all started with the charge levelled by Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau that an Indian spy working in the diplomatic services in Canada had a hand in the killing of Khalistani activist Hardeep Singh Nijjar on Canadian soil. Before the hue and cry and allegations and counter-allegations by both sides subsided, a no less serious complaint was made by the US which accused an Indian spy working in the diplomatic services in America of plotting to kill a Sikh, supposedly a separatist, with the help of operatives. Now, it is the turn of the US itself to have egg on its face after a sensational revelation that one of its spies had, for the past four decades, been working as a double agent for Cuba.

US prosecutors termed it one of the most brazen and long-running betravals in the history of the US foreign service after Manuel Rocha was charged in Miami federal court that he had engaged in clandestine activity on Cuba's behalf since at least 1981. As he sat handcuffed and wept in the courtroom, prosecutors revealed he had been meeting Cuban intelligence operatives and providing false information to US government officials about his contacts.

The complaint is short on specifics of how Rocha may have assisted Cuba. But it provides a vivid case study of what American officials say are long-standing efforts by Cuba and its sophisticated intelligence services to target US government officials. This action exposes one of the highest-reaching and longest-lasting infiltrations of the United States government by a foreign agent, Attorney General Merrick Garland said in a statement. The 73-year-old Rocha was arrested by the FBI at his Miami home late last week.

The American spy's case appears rather straightforward compared to the alleged activities of Indian spies and their agents. It is a commonplace occurrence the world over that spies of different countries act as double agents. This is done for their private gains which come when they betray the interests of their own countries. What is not so infrequent is spies killing or plotting to kill supposed enemies of their country on foreign soil where the latter have taken shelter as citizens of those countries. This is the reason why the 15-page indictment filed by the US Department of Justice against an Indian national, believed to be directed by an Indian government official for attempting an assassination plot against US-based Khalistani separatist Gurpatwant Singh Pannun, is so disturbing. The indictment is based on details of communications between the accused, an illicit drugs and arms dealer, Nikhil Gupta, with a serving senior and identified Indian government intelligence officer and two men in the US, who were allegedly engaged to kill Pannun.

As the incident came to light soon after Canada had accused India of engineering the killing of Nijjar, the credibility of India's foreign services has come under a cloud. What is even worse is the different responses of the Indian government to Canada and the USA. The foreign ministry dismissed outright the involvement of any of its diplomats in the killing of Nijjar and took retaliatory action against the Canadian diplomatic corps in India. But, when the US levelled similar charges, India pleaded ignorance and announced a probe. The irony is both the USA and Canada belong to the "Five Eyes" group of countries that share intelligence with one another and act in tandem in such situations. Canadian allegations will directly impact India's ties with all these intelligence partner countries.

India's credibility as a country that claims to take principled approach on international issues is under a question mark for what appears to be needless adventurism. The US needs India in dealing with China for its own strategic reasons. That seems to have injected into New Delhi a false sense of pride and importance in the international arena. It appears to believe it can get away with whatever it does. Some of the utterances and conduct of External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar have of late created such an impression.

### **VIEW FROM FRONTLINES**

ust over five years have now passed since the Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (PMJAY), launched in 2018, came into being. During this period, it has issued over 27 crore insurance cards and has financed over 5.75 crore hospital admissions with an average payout of about ₹12,250 per admission, with almost 27,000 empanelled hospitals nationwide. This is an impressive track record and needs to be celebrated. However, any programme or scheme, no matter how welldesigned and executed, has both strengths and weaknesses. Five years is an excellent time to review some of them so that the scheme builds further on its strengths and works towards

filling any gaps that may exist. Of the 27,000 hospitals that are empanelled and about 20,000 that are active, 15,000 are in public sector. While this has not yet been formally evaluated, anecdotal evidence suggests that these public sector hospitals outperform those not part of the scheme. One of the challenges of the public sector, not just in India but globally, is its non-responsiveness. Starting in the 80s with the UK, governments worldwide, including Thailand, Turkey, and, most recently, Vietnam, have moved to finance the public sector based on outcomes. They have gradually moved away from automatic financing based on annual expenditure budgets. This change has allowed them to improve the performance of the public sector, and it is not surprising that something similar is being seen in India when PMJAY pays the government hospitals based on outcomes. Over time, the full power of this can be realised if all financing to the public sector moves in this direction, including at the primary care level.

Given its funding limitations, PMJAY has not yet moved towards total health system financing in any part of the country, but its move towards paying hospitals on a package basis and not on a procedure-by-procedure basis has shown beneficial impacts. For example, increasing the length of stay after a successful surgery in a hospital is often due to poor infection control at

The low package rates offered by PMJAY have come in for much criticism. However, there is global evidence which suggests that merely because package rates are low it does not mean that quality needs to be low. Hospitals and entire health systems can respond to controlled pricing by innovating, bringing down costs, shedding unnecessary frills, and keeping quality high. When Japan moved to a fixed-price regime, Switzerland enacted its comprehensive health care legislation, and Germany instituted strict price controls, there was a fear that their health systems would be unable to cope. These proved unfounded. As a negotiating strategy, the approach adopted by PMJAY has been optimal-start at the lowest point and then revise prices upwards selectively based on actual experience (not lobbying).

While the scheme has many empanelled hospitals, over 25% are inactive, and the number varies significantly across the country - from over 500 active hospitals per crore population in Karnataka to only about 60 per crore in Bihar. As a result, hospitalisations under the scheme have been mainly concentrated in the southern states of Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, and Kerala and range from almost 16,000 admissions per lakh population in Kerala to only about 600 in Bihar. The case of Uttar Pradesh is particularly noteworthy - at over 18,500 cards

with the private sector. Research suggests that in several states, including Delhi, Goa, Kerala, and Himachal Pradesh, current government expenditures are already adequate to finance all necessary healthcare. If, in these states, the independent State Health Authorities could be given charge of the entire state health budget, they would have sufficient funding to implement district-level total health systems financing strategies and take responsibility for overall district and state-level health outcomes.

The durability of tax-financed purchasing schemes for health like PMJAY both at Central and state levels speaks to the continued political and mass appeal of such an approach towards financing healthcare. Over time, stable structures like the National and State Health Authorities which now run these schemes, have evolved, albeit with varying levels of capability. These schemes have also successfully built navigation capability, allowing them to purchase services from the private sector without getting embroiled in one or the other corruption scandals. This durability, stability, and ability to navigate is rare in the health care sector in India. It has set the stage for the next big move-the complete transfer of state health budgets to their State Health Authorities, which will pay the public sector and, where neces sary, the private sector, based on defined outcomes and do away entirely with automatic-budgetbased financing of public sector.

More than two decades of experience with tax-financed insurance schemes in India has indicated that the availability of insurance schemes is a necessary but insufficient condition for a robust supply response from the hospital sector.

"I am so happy to get the Guinness World Records title," Balan told the Guinness website. "It's my lifetime achievement

Lifetime achievement? She's only 26. I think her lifetime achievement will be something more significant, such as becoming the first woman to successfully donate her extra teeth to a desperate man.

Balan's extra teeth are known as supernumerary teeth. They started growing during her teenage years. She initially wanted to remove them, but changed her mind later, since they weren't causing any pain. Having set a world record, she's quite happy about her decision. And she may be even happier in a few years, when she gets even more teeth.

Yes, according to Guinness, there are two more teeth in her jaw that haven't come out vet. These teeth are evidently waiting until someone else breaks the world record with 37 teeth, at which point they will pop out of her gums and say, "Ha ha! Kalpana still has the record!'

In case you're wondering, about one in every 25 people has one or more supernumerary teeth. While Balan has the record for females, the male record is held by a Canadian man named Evano Mellone, who has 41 teeth. He has nine extra teeth!

How lucky can some people get? I wish I could get a tooth transplant from these record holders, but if that's not possible, I'd settle for getting a hair transplant from Smita Srivastava of Uttar Pradesh.

She's been growing her hair since she was 14. Three decades later, she gets a lot of attention when she's out in public and her hair is loose.

"People come to me, touch my hair, take pictures, take selfies with me, and they often enquire about the products I use, as my hair is beautiful," she told the Guinness website.

I met Srivastava, I'd ask her only one question: "Would you donate one strand of hair to me?'

Yes, all I'd need is one strand of 236-cm hair. I'd curl it many times over my bald spot. And then I'd try to claim my own Guinness World Record: longest hair on a balding male.

### Is the party now over for Mayawati and BSP in UP? **UP steps up efforts to** check liquor smuggling

Smuggling of liquor from Delhi and Haryana into Uttar Pradesh is common due to price differences that depend on the quality of the brew

Lucknow, Dec 5: Uttar Pradesh Excise Minister Nitin Agarwal has ordered that check-posts be put up in Agra, Mathura, Gautam Buddha Nagar, Baghpat, Saharanpur and Shamli regions to stop inter-state liquor smuggling.

He has also directed that PTZ, or pan, tilt, zoom cameras, be put up on liquor vends in the border areas to maintain an effective vigil.

The state government -- despite 10 per cent increase in excise revenue over the same period last year -- has expressed its concern over liquor smuggling from other states into Uttar Pradesh, especially those like Harvana where differences in pricing have often impacted revenues of vends here.

The minister said that he has ordered that show cause be issued to district excise officers of 10 such districts where revenue collections have been lowest Agarwal also ordered an assessment to find out if the revenue of liquor shops in Baghpat, that are located on the Harvana border was being impacted.

Smuggling of liquor from Delhi and Haryana into Uttar Pradesh is common due to price differences that depend on the quality of the brew.

"The differences have lessened but, at times, a bottle of country-made liquor perhaps still costs more in Uttar Pradesh as compared to Harvana. The difference in pricing goes up if

#### you were to factor in costly liquor, including scotch," a liquor seller from Baghpat said.

The minister said that if revenue was being impacted due to liquor vends located close to the UP-Haryana border, then the Haryana government be approached to shift them accordingly. The minister also ordered that a vigil be maintained on the Saharanpur border too and said PTZ cameras be installed for proper vigil on shops in border areas.

Agarwal, however, noted that till November, the state's excise revenue was Rs 27, 340.97 crore that was 10 per cent (Rs 2,382.47 crore) more than what was a achieved at the same time.

"Efforts should be made to realise revenue worth more than Rs 50,000 crore in 2023-24,' Agarwal has told excise officials. He also ordered that a report be presented before him within 15 days on why there was no any expected increase in excise revenue in Kanpur.

"Special vigil be maintained on the Agra, Mathura, Lucknow highway till Bundelkhand highway and till Mirzapur and Sonbhadra to effectively check liquor smuggling," Agarwal said and ordered that cooperation of GST and police department be sought by the excise department.

On complaints of overrating of liquor from Deoria, Kushinagar, Pilibhit, Bareilly and other regions, the minister ordered that strict action be taken in all such cases where such complaints were found true.

Lucknow, Dec 5: The Bahujan Samaj Party has miserably failed to arrest its downslide in politics.

The BSP failed to open its account in Chhattisgarh, Madhya Pradesh and Telangana and bagged just two seats in Rajasthan, negating party President chief Mayawati's claim of emerging as a 'kingmaker.' The BSP's poor performance in the state Assembly elections will have a direct impact on its fortunes in Uttar Pradesh where its graph has been rapidly slid-

ing down since 2012. Moreover, the BSP now stands completely isolated and its stocks have further gone down after the results in four states. For Mayawati to join hands with the Congress could prove to be an uphill task since the Samajwadi Party will not accept the same and this could disturb the fragile alliance within the INDIA bloc.

As a senior party functionary put it, "The game is over for us at least for the time being. We have burnt too many bridges and lost our bargaining power. We are being seen as a stooge of the BJP. If we want to resurrect the BSP, the leadership will have to take a reality check, connect with grassroots workers, instill confidence in them and return to the ideology on which the BSP stands. All this seems a Herculean task and cannot be accomplished before the Lok Sabha

polls. The BSP has fared worse than it had done in 2018 in four states where polls were held. The party polled 2.09 per cent of the votes in Chhattisgarh, 1.82 per cent in Rajasthan, 3.32 per cent in Madhya Pradesh and 1.38 per cent in Telangana.

Sadulpur and Bari in Rajasthan were the only seats that the BSP won this time. The BSP had polled 4.03 per cent votes and bagged six Assembly



state

seats in Rajasthan in 2018. The party had secured 5.01 per cent votes and won two seats in Madhya Pradesh five years ago. In Chhattisgarh, it had polled 3.87 per cent votes and bagged two seats in 2018.

In Telangana, the BSP had fielded candidates on 106 Assembly seats but failed to open its account in 2018 whereas in the 2014 Assembly election, it had bagged two seats even as the BRS (then TRS) wave swept the

The BSP, which had announced to go solo this year, later formed an alliance with Gondwana Gantantra Party (GGP) in Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh after declaration of the poll schedule by the Election Commission.

Mayawati had steadfastly maintained equidistance from the two national political blocs and insisted that it would neither join the Congress-led Indian

National Developmental Inclusive Alliance (INDIA) or the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP)led National Democratic Alliance (NDA).

"The BSP will emerge as the third front in Rajasthan, Chhattisgarh, Madhya Pradesh and Telangana," the party's national coordinator and Mayawati's nephew Akash Anand, who led the campaign, had stated.

Mayawati had planned the Assembly election campaign in the four states as the launch pad for Akash in national politics as well as to send a message to the party cadre that he will be her political successor.

Ahead of the election, Mayawati had pompously announced that her party would take a call on joining the government after the Assembly elections in Rajasthan, Chhattisgarh, Madhya Pradesh and Telangana to emerge as a "balance of power".

### 446 schools de-registered in Bihar Demand for Ram temple models surges

Patna, Dec 5: Bihar School Examination Board (BSEB) has cancelled the registration of 446 private schools after they failed to comply with the required parameters, an officer said Tuesday.

BSEB Chairman Anand Kishore said that the decision was taken during a meeting Monday evening. Of the total, 439 are middle schools, while seven are middle and high schools (Class 6 to 10).

"We carried out inspections of the schools across the state and found that 446 BSEB-affiliated ones lacked proper infrastructure needed to run the schools. We have set parameters for every school and they were not fulfilling it," Kishore said.

"Some of the schools which did not cooperate with our inspection teams, were also deregistered," Kishore said.



According to sources, schools functioning in two-three rooms were higher in numbers.

"As per the policy, the affected students will be shifted to nearby schools. We have also made a pro-

vision for students who are appearing for the board examination. Admit cards, registration cards and other important documents will be issued in the name of previous schools," Kishore said.

Anurag Asthana, who initiated the concept of making replicas of Ram temple, said, "There has been a sudden demand for the Ram temple models across the markets of the state. We dispatch around 500 models of different sizes to Ayodhya alone every week. The demand has particularly gone up since the Dev Deepawali event.<sup>3</sup>

Various handicraft units in Kashi, Prayagraj and Gorakhpur are designing and shaping Ram

temple models to cater to the spurt in the demand.

Asthana said the bulk of demand comes from corporates, banks and event management companies. "We have already delivered 5,000 models in the past four months and are making efforts to increase production," he said.

He said, "Initially, we had one machine to design and shape these models but after witnessing huge demand in markets, we had to install seven machines to catch up with the craze. We have also engaged designers and artisans to manufacture replicas," Asthana said.

"Apart from Ram temple models, there is also demand for Kashi Vishwanath temple models and Hanuman Chalisa miniatures among the devotees," he added. These temple models are also available online and are priced between Rs 1,000 to Rs 10,000, depending on the size.

### Bihar's tradition of men being kidnapped for marriage back in news

Patna, Dec 5: 'Forced marriage' or 'Pakadwa Vivah' is again in the news these days in Bihar after one such case was reported from Vaishali district in the state.

However, the practice of this kind of marriage in Bihar is quite old. After 'Pakadwa Vivah', many couples are living a contented married life while several marriages have broken down. In, 'Pakadwa Vivah', neither the consent of the boy nor the girl is taken for marriage. Boys are taken hostage by kidnapping or coaxing and then married to a girl as per customs and traditions. In this, the wishes of the boy and girl, who become bride and groom, have no importance.

Recently, a case of a newly appointed teacher of a government

school being forced to marry has come to light in the Patepur police station area of Vaishali district of Bihar. Before this incident. the Patna High Court had given a decision against forced marriage in November.

It is said that in the 1970s and 80s, this type of marriage was conducted very frequently. There were many districts of Bihar where this marriage was prevalent. Such areas include Begusarai, Lakhisarai, Munger,

Jehanabad, Nawada. If we look at the statistics, in previous years, 2,000-3,000 such cases were registered in the police records in a year. However, these also include many cases of love affairs.

According to senior citizens, the main reason for this was that people were unable to marry their



daughters to employed men due to their inability to pay dowry. However, they wanted to marry their daughters in a good family, and hence this type of marriage was started by them.

Earlier, 'Pakadwa marriages' were organised as a social initiative, but after criminal gangs got involved, people started getting their daughters married to boys after kidnapping them with the help of criminals. It is said that around 1990, this trend completely


came into the clutches of criminals. Annu Kumari, a resident of Gopalganj and a sociology re-

searcher at BHU, told IANS that the biggest reason for forced marriage is the demand for dowry and illiteracy among girls. In such a situation, the parents are inclined towards such marriages despite their reluctance. She said that only a few cases come to light these days because nowadays girls are also educated and are taking their own decisions in life.

Kumari Shalini, professor of psychology at ITI Bihta, believes that this type of marriage is a result of feudal ideology. This trend is seen in Bihar. She says that it would also be considered a perversion where people think that by marrying off the girl they are relieved of their burden. However, she also said that now these practices are decreasing.

Police officials also consider it a crime. A police officer says that

whenever such cases come to light, action is taken. They believe that some cases come up during the wedding season



### Top ourt seeks data on grant of citizenship to immigrants in Assam

New Delhi, Dec 5: The Supreme Court Tuesday sought data on the beneficiaries of section 6A of the Citizenship Act in Assam, saying there was no material before it which could indicate that the effect of granting Indian citizenship to Bangladeshi immigrants between 1966 and 1971 was so great that it impacted the demographic and cultural identity of the border state.

While acknowledging the problem of cross-border infiltration in Assam, a five judge constitution bench headed by Chief Justice D Y Chandrachud referred to the humanitarian aspect of the 1971 Indo-Pakistan war for the liberation of Bangladesh which also led to the influx of immigrants.

The bench, also comprising Justices Surya Kant, M M Sundresh, J B Pardiwala and Manoj Misra, commenced hearing 17 petitions to examine the constitutional validity of section 6A of the Citizenship Act relating to illegal immigrants in Assam

Section 6A was inserted in the Citizenship Act as a special provision to deal with the citizenship of people covered under the Assam Accord.

It says those who came to Assam on or after January 1, 1966 but before March 25, 1971 from specified territories, including Bangladesh, in accordance with the Citizenship Act amended in 1985, and since then are residents of the northeastern state, must register themselves under section 18 for acquiring Indian citizenship.



Paris, Dec 5: Teenagers' mathematics and reading skills are in an unprecedented decline across dozens of countries and COVID school closures are only partly to be blamed, the OECD said Tuesday in its latest survey of global learning standards.

The Paris-based Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development said it had seen some of the steepest drops in performance since 2000 when it began its usually triennial tests of 15-year-olds reading, maths and science skills.

Nearly 700,000 youths took the two-hour test last year in the

OECD's 38 mostly developed country members and 44-non members for the latest study, closely watched by policymakers as the largest international comparison of education performance.

Compared to when the tests were last conducted in 2018, reading performance fell by 10 points on average in OECD countries, and by 15 points in mathematics, a loss equivalent to three-quarters of a year's worth of learning.

While more than half of the 81 countries surveyed saw declines, Germany, Iceland, the Netherlands, Norway and Poland saw particularly sharp drops in mathematics scores, the OECD said.

On average across the OECD,



one out of four 15-year-olds tested as a low performer in maths, reading and science, which means

they could not use basic algorithms or interpret simple texts, the study found. "COVID probably played some role but I would not overrate it," OECD director of education Andreas Schleicher told a news conference.

"There are underlying structural factors and they are much more likely to be permanent features of our education systems that policymakers should really take seriously." Countries that provided extra teacher support during COVID school closures scored better and results were generally better in places where easy teacher access for special help was high.

Poorer results tended to be associated with higher rates of mobile phone use for leisure and where schools reported teacher

shortages. The OECD said the decline was not inevitable, pointing to Singapore, where students scored the highest in maths, reading and science, with results that suggested they were on average three to five years ahead of their OECD peers.

After Singapore, Macau, Taiwan, Hong Kong, Japan and South Korea also outperformed in maths and science, where Estonia and Canada also scored well.

In reading, Ireland, Japan, South Korea and Taiwan earned top marks, and was all the more notable in Ireland and Japan because their spending per student was no higher than the OECD average.

### **Mineral output** up 11.5% in Sept

New Delhi: Mineral production increased by 11.5 per cent in September as compared to the year-ago period, the government said Tuesday. The index of mineral production of the mining and quarrying sector for the month of September 2023 at 111.5, is 11.5 per cent higher compared to the level in the month of September 2022, according to the provisional data of the Indian Bureau of Mines (IBM). The cumulative growth for the April-September period over the corresponding period of the previous financial year is 8.7 per cent, the mines ministry said in a statement. The production of important minerals in September includes coal (673 lakh tonnes), lignite (29 lakh tonnes), manganese ore (247,000 tonnes) and limestone (347 lakh tonnes).

New Delhi, Dec 5: The services sector growth in India fell to a one-year low in November on softer expansions in new work intakes and output, despite receding price pressures, a monthly survey said Tuesday. The seasonally adjusted S&P

**Global India Services Business** Activity Index fell from 58.4 in October to a one-year low of 56.9 in November. Despite witnessing a month-on-month decline, the rate of expansion was stronger than its long-run average. In Purchasing Managers'

Index (PMI) parlance, a print above 50 means expansion while a score below 50 denotes contraction.

The survey is compiled from responses to questionnaires sent to a panel of around 400 service sector companies.

"India's service sector has lost further growth momentum midway through the third fiscal quarter, but we continue to see robust demand for services fuelling new business intakes and



pansion look very healthy when considering their respective longrun averages and the outlook for business activity remains bright in spite of optimism fading due to rising inflation expectations," said Pollvanna De Lima, Economics Associate Director at S&P Global Market Intelligence.

On the prices front, rates of both input cost and output charge inflation slipped to eight-month lows. "Fewer companies hiked their own fees as a result, an aspect that might provide a further boost to demand as 2023 draws to a close," Lima said.

On the employment front, services companies curbed recruitment to some extent amid broadly stable levels of outstanding business among services companies.

'... Given the lack of pressure

on operating capacities signalled by stable backlog levels, services firms became more cautious when it comes to hiring. Net employment still rose in November, but the rate of job creation was marginal and the slowest in seven months. Lima said. Going ahead, businesses maintained a positive outlook for activity in the coming 12 months, although confidence somewhat faded due to rising inflation expectations.

Meanwhile, the S&P Global India Composite PMI Output Index fell from 58.4 in October to 57.4 in November, signalling the weakest rise in private sector activity across India for a year.

The Composite PMI indices are weighted averages of comparable manufacturing and services PMI indices. Weights reflect the relative size of the manufacturing and service sectors according to official GDP data.

"Manufacturers outperformed service providers, and noted a quicker rate of growth. Services saw the slowest upturn in one vear." the survey said.

Similarly, factory orders rose to a greater extent and demand for services somewhat cooled. At the composite level, sales increased at the weakest rate since November 2022, as per the survey. Meanwhile, the Reserve Bank

is likely to maintain the status quo on the short-term interest rate in its monetary policy review later this week.

New Delhi, Dec 5: India will become the world's third largest economy by 2030, S&P Global Ratings said Tuesday as it forecast the nation's GDP growth reaching 7 per cent in 2026-27 fiscal year.

In its Global Credit Outlook 2024, S&P saw a 6.4 per cent GDP growth in the fiscal year through March 2024 (2023-24) as compared to 7.2 per cent in the previous financial year.

The growth rate will remain at 6.4 per cent in the next fiscal (2024-25) before climbing to 6.9 per cent in the next and 7 per cent in 2026-27, the rating agency said. "We see India reaching 7 per cent in 2026-27 fiscal.'

"India is set to become the third-largest economy by 2030, and we expect it will be the fastest growing major economy in the next three years," S&P said.


