crime against women in 2022, which is the highest in India, according to the latest report released by the National Crime
Records Bureau (NCRB). Of the 542 cases, 269 were recorded for publishing or transmitting sexually-explicit material and the remaining 273 were
registered under other cybercrimes, including blackmailing, defamation, morphing and fake profiles, the report said.
Odisha also reported the Odisha also reported the sec-
ond-highest cases of publishing or transmitting sexually-explicit material in the country, while Uttar Pradesh topped the list with 450 cyber pornography
crimes against 455 women. Similarly, Odisha reported the highest victims of cyber morphing in the country, followed by Uttarakhand and Tamil Nadu.
