CM distributes land deeds in 2 districts

Bhubaneswar, Dec 14: Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik Thursday distributed land deeds to displaced families of Hirakud Dam project in Jharsuguda and another irrigation project in Ganjam.

Describing it as a historic administrative decision, Patnaik said the government has ended long-pending problems of displaced people. The government action on resolving land issues of displaced families came after 5T and Nabin Odisha Chairman VK Pandian met the affected people of Lakhanpur area in Jharsuguda August 20 and people of Sorada in Ganjam August 26 and 27. A total of 866 families of seven of the 18 displaced villages in Jharsuguda were distributed the land deeds by Patnaik through a virtual meeting. The displaced people of 11 more villages are in line to receive land pattas shortly, benefitting as many as 1,339 families.

The people of Jharsuguda had lost their land during the construction of the Hirakud reservoir in 1957. Similarly, land in 22 villages in Sorada of Ganjam had been recorded in the name of the Water Resources department way back in 1983.

14 out of House for questioning breach

New Delhi, Dec 14: As many as 14 Opposition MPs were suspended from Parliament for the remainder of the Winter Session for disrupting proceedings as the Lok Sabha security breach incident Wednesday snowballed into a major row, Thursday. While the government asked the Opposition not to 'politicise' the 'grave national issue', the Congress, TMC and others demanded a statement from the Home Minister on the issue.

While TMC's Derek O'Brien was suspended in Rajya Sabha, as many as 13 Opposition MPs, including nine from the Congress and DMK's Kanimozhi, were suspended from Lok Sabha for disrupting the proceedings.

Amid Opposition protests, demanding a statement from Home Minister Amit Shah and Prime Minister Narendra Modi over the security breach incident. Parliamentary Affairs Minister Pralhad Joshi moved two resolutions separately for suspension of the MPs for disrupting the Lok Sabha proceedings.

The MPs had moved into the Well of the Lok Sabha raising slogans, questioning the security breach, and demanding a state-

ment from the government. While TN Prathapan, Hibi Eden, Jothimani, Ramya Haridas and Dean Kuriakose, all from the Congress, were suspended when the first resolution was adopted,



8 personnel suspended

Fresh I-T searches at BDPL

Boudh, Dec 14: Income Tax (I-T) officials Thursday resumed searches at the premises of Boudh Distillery Private Limited (BDPL) at Rambhikata under Harbhanga block of the district six days after making the highest-ever haul of ₹350 crore unaccounted cash from multiple concerns of the firm owned by Jharkhand Congress MP Dheeraj Sahu's family.

Although the I-T officials were tight-lipped about the recoveries made during Thursday searches, sources said it mainly pertained to additional documents on the transactions and sources of the proceeds which are currently being scrutinised with the help of cyber experts.

A team of Excise officials from Bhubaneswar Monday visited the plant premises and conducted verification at the distillery which is in operation now.

When contacted, Boudh Excise superintendent Krishna Nayak confirmed the development stating the Excise team from Bhubaneswar verified some documents in the plant and returned those before leaving.



I-T officials had raided the firm on charge of tax evasion December 6, 7 and 8 which led to the seizure of an unprecedented amount of cash stashed in several cupboards. Cash counting machines from nearby banks were deployed for valuation which continued for several days, creating a sensation across the country and triggered a political slugfest with Prime Minister Narendra Modi promising action against the hoarders.

Meanwhile, the BJP stepped

up its attack on BJD. BJP Odisha unit president Manmohan Samal said the ruling party must come clear about the ownership of the huge amount of cash. "It is impossi-

ble to hoard such a huge amount

of cash without the support and assistance of the state government," he said. The BJD strongly rejected

Samal's statement and accused him of making wild allegations.

BJD vice president Prasanna Acharya said that nobody has the guts to bring corruption charges against Naveen Patnaik and he is known across the country for honesty and integrity. In a separate press conference, BJD spokesperson Lenin Mohanty said, "It seems that the Odisha BJP president has more facts compared to Prime Minister Narendra Modi and other Central minis-

ters on the matter of I-T raid." Mohanty said the PM December 8 and 12 had posted messages on X twice. "From PM's posts, it was clear that seized cash belonged to a Congress Rajya Sabha MP and Congress was responsible for it. We request Manmohan Babu that if he has more facts than their central leadership, then let him place it before them, Mohanty said.

The BJD spokesperson also said that from a raid in UP ₹500 crore cash and gold were found with a businessman.

Maoists, security forces exchange fire in Boudh

Bhubaneswar/Phulbani, Dec 14: An encounter took place between Maoists and security forces in Boudh district Thursday, a senior police officer said.

According to (Operations) Dev Datta Singh, the encounter between the security personnel and the ultras started at about noon and continued till evening at Nalikumbha forest. However, there was no report of any injury.

The Maoists opened fire at the Special Operations Group (SOG) and district voluntary force (DVF) personnel while they were conducting a combing operation in the area.

Singh said the security personnel returned the fire leading to a gun battle. However, there was no report of any casualty so far and search operation was going on, the ADG said.

Meanwhile, a report from Phulbani said that two members of the outlawed CPI (Maoist) surrendered before police in the presence of DGP SK Bansal, who was on a tour to Kandhamal district.

The two Maoists, natives of



neighbouring Chhattishgarh, with several cases against them surrendered before the DGP. They were identified as Ranjit Naitam and Unga Poyam. The two had been associated with the Kandhamal-Kalahandi-Boudh-Nayagarh (KKBN) division of the Odisha State Committee of the CPI (Maoist) Association since 2017 and are involved in several violent activities, the DGP said.

Earlier in the day, Maoist posters opposing mining projects and companies in tribaldominated regions were found at Mandibishi village in Rayagada district. The posters and banners appealed to local people to protest against the atrocities and punish company brokers.

MANIPUR VIOLENCE **Bodies of 64 victims** handed over to kin

Imphal, Dec 14: The bodies of 64 victims of the Manipur violence lying in morgues since ethnic clashes broke out in the state in May were handed over to their families under tight security, officials said here Thursday.

According to a report by Supreme Court-constituted committee to look into the violence, 175 deaths were reported during the clashes and 169 bodies identified. The bodies of 60 members of the Kuki community, which were kept in the JNIMS and RIMS hospitals here, were airlifted amid tight security arrangements put in place by the Manipur Police and the Army's Assam Rifles unit.

Four bodies of Meiteis that were lying at a morgue in Churachandpur, a district dominated by tribals, were also brought to Imphal and handed over to their families for the last rites, the officials said. In a statement, the Committee on Tribal Unity said the burial rites of the "fallen KukiZo brethren" will be held Friday at the Martyr Cemetery at Phaijang.

nomic liberalisation when the country's economy was opened up in 1991. The tiny 'people's car', which revolutionised personal mobility and served as a link between the old and new journey that India undertook, turned 40 Thursday.

At the brand centre of Maruti Suzuki India's headquarters in South Delhi, among the many modern vehicles on display a tiny 40-yearold white car oc-

unit of M800. M800 shook up then sleepy passenger vehicles market in India, challenging the duopoly of Hindustan Motor's Ambassador car and Premier Padmini. It soon became the symbol of aspiration for millions of middle class Indians.

From the handing over of the keys of the first unit to Harpal Singh through a lucky draw in 1983, the model went on to clock a cumulative 1 lakh units production in 1986-87. Equipped with far better technology from Suzuki compared to the other products that were available in the market then, M800 was accepted well among Indian customers and

soon crossed 5 lakh units cumulative production milestone in 1992-93. It then doubled it to 10 lakh units by 1996-97. M800 production crossed the cumulative mark of 20 lakh units in 2002-03 and and 25 lakh units in 2005-06.

It reigned as the numero uno 'people's car' despite others like Tata Nano attempting to challenge it later on. However, nothing lasts forever. With newer technologies coming in, Maruti Suzuki India had to take the hard call of driving into the sunset. From January 18, 2014 the company stopped production of M800. The mention of M800 continues to evoke nostalgia among many to this day.



BMC pins hope on new project

CIVIC BODY'S PLAN TO SET UP WASTE-TO-ENERGY PLANT AT DARUTHENGA A NON-STAR'

Bhubaneswar, Dec 14: Following the failure to set up a waste-to-energy plant at Daruthenga in 2014, and later another unsuccessful venture of micro composting centres (MCC) and material recovery facilities at 43 locations, the Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation (BMC) has now decided to build a 350-tonne MCC at Palasuni with a view to ridding the Capital City of its burgeoning garbage problems.

However, doubts have been raised as to whether the civic body's promises would ever meet with any success on ground given the experience of two failed ventures in the past.

BMC Deputy Commissioner (Sanitation) Manoranjan Sahu claimed that on an average 200 tonnes of waste are being processed at 35 MCCs every day. The work for 350-tonne MCC is underway at Palasuni and it would be completed soon," he said, adding that the solid waste from Sainik School dump yard is being segregated. The polythene collected from that yard is being sent to Rajgangpur resulting in gradual decrease of the waste volume at Sainik School dumping yard, he as-

However, going by BMC's track record, fingers are crossed over the success of the new initiative to process over 800 tonnes

of garbage collected from the City every day. Nevertheless, it is a matter of concern that the BMC has been unable to find a lasting solution to the garbage disposal issue of the City in its 28 years of existence. This in turn has put a population of over 15 lakh to daily misery and unhealthy existence over the

It may be recalled that in 2014 a waste-to-energy plan was conceived for BMC waste manage-

ment. Accordingly, the Housing and Urban Development (H&UD) department had signed an MoU with SL Municipal Solid Waste (MSW) Bhubaneswar Ltd to set up a 11-mega watt power plant

at Daruthenga dumping yard at a cost of ₹200 crore. However, after the Union Ministry of **Environment Forest and Climate** Change (MoEF&CC) prohibited dumping of waste at Bhuasuni dumping yard, the power plant became a non-starter as the government developed a cold feet to go ahead with the project. After SL Municipal Solid Waste withdrew from the proj-

ect, the garbage pile-up turned into a hill at Daruthenga. Moreover, many fatal mishaps took place during the transport of waste from Sainik School to Daruthenga, Following protests by residents of Daruthenga village, the transport of garbage from Sainik School dumping yard to Daruthenga was stopped. With no options available, the

civic body kept on dumping the entire 800 tonne collected garbage at the temporary transit station (TTS) near Sainik School. Over the years, the waste has taken the shape of a hill and the stench emanating from the sludge put the residents of VSS Nagar, Gajapati Nagar, Gadakana, Chandrasekharpur, Chakheisiani, Rasulgarh and Acharya Vihar to untold miseries. Moreover, it has raised concerns about polluting groundwater in these areas.

Former BMC deputy commissioner Srimanta Mishra said, "The waste-to-energy project became a non-starter after the executing firm withdrew upon failing to mortgage 100 acres of land as collateral."

When matters went ahead, in 2019-20 financial year, BMC decided to decentralise waste management under the direct supervision of H&UD department. Accordingly, MCC and Material Recovery Facility were set up at 43 locations to convert waste into manure. However, this project too hit roadblocks owing to various impediments, said

Now, it is to be seen how the upcoming 350-tonne mega MCC project at Palasuni would be able to provide clean air to the residents of smart city and relieve it of its mounting



We will win at least 15 LS seats: Pradhan


Bhubaneswar, Dec 14: Union Minister for Education and Skill Development, Dharmendra Pradhan, exuded confidence Thursday that the BJP will win at least 15 out of the 21 Lok Sabha seats in Odisha in the general elections scheduled next year. During an interview with a national channel Thursday, Pradhan expressed hope that the party will secure more than 45 per cent vote shares in next year's elections. The BJP had garnered 22 per cent votes in the 2014 Lok Sabha polls, while its vote share was 18 per cent in the Assembly elections held the same year. The party managed to win one Lok Sabha and 10 Assembly seats in 2014. In the 2019 general elections, the BJP improved its tally to eight, while its vote share rose to 38 per cent. In the Assembly polls held the same year, the saffron party won 22 seats with a vote share of 32.49 per cent. "Prime Minister (Narendra) Modi is the most popular political leader in Odisha. Kanupur dam project hangs fire with delay in Forest nod



Keonjhar, Dec 14: Delay in forest clearance has hit the Kanupur irrigation project in Keonjhar district pushing completion of the much-awaited dam project into uncertainty as it is set to miss the

It was expected that the project will become operational after works get completed by December this year. However, that is not going to happen as the project is yet to receive forest

clearance. Notably, the irrigation project is being constructed on Baitarani river at Basudevpur under Joda block in Keonjhar district. The project was envisaged 40 years back but was implemented only in 2002 after it received approval of the planning committee. The project is expected to irrigate 29,000 hectare of farmlands in Joda, Champua, Jhumpura, Sadar and Patana blocks of Keonihar district.

The Water Resources department claimed that 90 per cent of the project work has been completed. However, the project has been mired in uncer-

tainty in the final leg due to delay in forest clearance. Several works on the project are yet to get completed owing to the delay.

Sources said works on the main dam, spillway and canal are vet to get completed while land acquisition, rehabilitation and compensation works are also lagging behind. On the other hand, the plan outlay has increased to ₹2,438 crore. While it is apprehended that its budget will shoot up to ₹ 3,000 crore by the time it is completed, the project is also likely to miss the deadline as announced by the state government.

Senior Water Resources official Prasanna Pani said there is an urgent need for forest clearance as the canal passes through Champua, Sadar and Patana forest ranges. He, however, said

way has been completed while the rest is yet to start due to delay in sanction of forest clearance.

A survey was undertaken to identify the volume of forest land in these ranges after the Water Resources department applied for clearance. The survev indicated the presence of 310.11 hectare of forest land at 839 places under these forest ranges, he said.

An enumeration of trees was undertaken and 60,000 trees were identified for felling in 2016.

The Water Resources department has deposited around ₹90 crore with the Forest department during the last eight years towards loss of forest cover, he said. The canal and rest of the works have failed to make any headway without the forest clearance. No action has been taken on the report which is lying with Forest department since last five vears. The girth of the tree trunks and their height has also increased during these years, he said.

There will be fresh problems if the Forest department permits felling of the trees. As a result, a fresh enumeration of trees is being undertaken, he

The Forest department is asking to deposit more money but not telling the exact amount of money that needs to be deposited. They would deposit the money as and when the Forest department notifies them about the amount, he added.

Champua forest ranger Akshaya Chhatria said the trees are being counted afresh as their girth and height have increased during these years. More than half of the trees have been counted while counting of rest

Plan afoot for greywater mgmt in ULBs of Ganjam

Berhampur, Dec 14: Ganjam district administration will implement the greywater manage ment projects in all its urban local bodies (ULBs) by March-end.

The district has 17 ULBs, excluding Berhampur Municipal Corporation (BeMC).

Hinjili Municipality and Chhatrapur Notified Area Council (NAC) have already started work on a pilot basis and greywater management projects in these two ULBs are expected to be completed in two months, said Nilamadhab Bhoi, project director, District Urban Development Authority (DUDA), Ganjam. Greywater is wasteGreywater is wastewater from nontoilet plumbing systems such as hand basins, washing machines, showers and baths

Around 65 per cent of total household wastewater is greywater, which contributes to water pollution

water from non-toilet plumbing systems such as hand basins, washing machines, showers and baths. Waterbodies become polluted when greywater flows into these. Around 65 per cent of total household wastewater is grey-

water, officials said. "We have conducted greywater management orientation programmes for Hinjili and Chhatrapur ULB stakeholders,

including chairpersons, councillors, executive officers and officers," Bhoi said.

The state has been a pioneer in managing blackwater (used water from household toilets) by establishing FSTP (faecal sludge treatment plant).

"With the execution of the greywater management project, water will be treated at various levels, which will minimise pollution and recharge groundwater," Bhoi said.

Hinjili municipality executive officer Jubulee Behera said they have treated greywater at household levels, lane levels (near drains) and community levels (at the end of drains in

Rescued newborn suffering from internal bleeding PRESS TRUST OF INDIA

Sambalpur, Dec 14: The health condition of the newborn girl, who was rescued from an abandoned borewell in Sambalpur district Tuesday night, is stable but she suffers from internal bleeding, doctors said Thursday.

The girl, who has no claimant, is currently undergoing treatment at the special newborn care unit (SNCU) of Veer Surendra Sai Institute of Medical Sciences and Research (VIM-SAR). A five-member team of

doctors is monitoring her health. "An ultrasound test of the baby revealed internal bleeding in her body. We are hopeful that it will stop by itself in 3-4 days, otherwise, we might have to change the course of treatment. The health condition of the baby is stable but, internal problem is issue," VIMSAR Superintendent Lalmohan Nayak told PTI Thursday.

The doctors are in touch with the government paediatric hos-

pital Sishu Bhawan at Cuttack. The signs she is showing are very common in preterm babies with gross Hypothermia (a condition that occurs when the body loses heat fast, causing a dangerously low body temperature). If the complications do not subside in a few days, we will take de-

services, Sudhansu Sarangi. The rescue team, which included fire officials and a unit of Odisha Disaster Rapid Action Force, immediately supplied oxygen to the baby. During the rescue operation, a 100-watt electric bulb was also lowered inside the borewell to keep the baby warm due to the low night time temperature.

He informed that three excavators were roped in to rescue the child. While one excavator was engaged in digging, the other two excavators removed the soil. Manual digging was also carried out to gain access to the pipe of the borewell, he said.

The child was trapped 13-feet deep in the borewell. During the operation, the iron pipe of the borewell emerged as the challenge for the rescue team. Though the iron pipe kept the newborn safe, it was a difficult task for the team to retrieve the baby by cutting the pipe.

The team also needed a victim location camera which was sent to the spot by a special plane from Bhubaneswar. Finally, after \leftarrow a five-hour operation, the newborn was rescued.

Cost of Saving Lives

n 2021, malaria caused 619,000 deaths, 77% of which were children under five, and 96% of them in Africa. But now, after decades of research – and several false dawns – a malaria vaccine known as R21/Matrix-M (henceforth just R21) has been shown to be effective in 70-78% of cases. Although three doses are required before that level of protection is reached, and a booster is needed one year later, the vaccine, developed at the University of Oxford and the Serum Institute of India, is cheap. It can be produced for \$2-\$4 per dose – comparable to the cost of other childhood vaccines.

Adding costs for delivery and administration, we can say that R21 costs approximately \$5 per dose. A recent study indicates that fully vaccinating eligible children in areas where malaria is prevalent would save more than 600 lives per 100,000 children vaccinated, as well as prevent nearly 200,000 clinical cases of malaria (because once someone gets malaria, it is likely to recur). This suggests that the deaths of hundreds of thousands of children could be prevented for roughly \$3,300 per life saved.

In October, R21 was recommended by the World Health Organization. It now needs to go through the WHO's prequalification process and receive the recommendation of the WHO's Strategic Advisory Group of Experts on Immunization. Then a broad international rollout can begin.

Children eligible for R21 are between five months and three years old. About 80 million eligible children live in malaria-prone regions of Sub-Saharan Africa. To give them all three doses of the vaccine in 2024 would require 240 million doses, followed by a further 80 million boosters in 2025. After that, with the backlog of currently unvaccinated children dealt with, the roughly 30 million children born every year would need 120 million doses. This would save about 450,000 lives per year.

Saving a life for \$3,300 is a bargain. In the United States, Medicare covers the cost of kidney dialysis for patients over 65 who would otherwise die while awaiting a transplant. Fifteen years ago, economists from Stanford and Wharton calculated that the average cost per quality-adjusted year of life gained by this coverage was \$129,000. Adjusting that figure for inflation (and overlooking the fact that medical costs have risen faster than other prices) takes it to \$182,000 - and that's just for one extra year of life. By comparison, if we conservatively estimate that the children saved by vaccination against malaria have a life expectancy of 50 years, the cost per year is \$66.

Even when judged by global, rather than American, standards, saving a life for \$3,300 is an exceptionally good value. The most costeffective evidence-backed programmes that leading charity evaluator GiveWell has been able to find cost roughly \$3,500-\$5,500

per life saved. For example, the Against Malaria Foundation, which is also one of The Life You Can Save's top charities, distributes bed nets to protect children against malaria. Although each net costs only a few dollars, distributing enough of them to save a life costs over \$4,000.

When vaccines for COVID-19 first became available, governments' highest priority was to get them through the regulatory process. The US Food and Drug Administration normally takes about ten months to authorise the use of a new vaccine, but it approved the use of the Pfizer vaccine in a breathtaking 21 days, and authorisation for Moderna's vaccine took just 19 days. WHO prequalification normally takes 270 days after the WHO recommends a vaccine. That is an unacceptable delay. The WHO should accelerate its process and tell the public how quickly it can complete prequalification.

1Day Sooner was founded to represent people who wanted to volunteer to take part in human challenge trials to accelerate vaccine development. When the organisation was established in March 2020, its focus was a vaccine against COVID-19: getting it out one day sooner would, quite literally, save thousands of lives. Many of the organisation's staff and a high proportion of the volunteers were effective altruists.

The organisation's original mission has broadened to promoting efficient development of life-saving medical research and the speediest and most equitable distribution of its products. As part of that broader mission, 1Day Sooner set up 1Day Africa to promote vaccination on the continent by strengthening Africa's scientific capacity and its ability to manufacture vaccines locally.

Now, 1Day Africa is concerned that the WHO and national governments are not assessing the safety and effectiveness of the new malaria vaccine with the same urgency as they assessed the COVID-19 vaccines. As a result, the organisation is pressing for the production of as many doses of R21 as possible in 2024, and getting those doses into the arms of children as quickly as possible, to prevent millions of cases of malaria and save hundreds of thousands of lives.

Some of the relevant facts are in dispute, including how long the WHO's prequalification process needs to take, and how quickly the necessary quantity of doses can be produced. But one thing should be clear: failing to save the lives of African children when that can be achieved for as little as \$3,300 each would render hollow our lofty rhetoric about the equal worth of every human life.

THE SLOWING **GLOBAL ECONOMY IS IMPACTING**

INDIAN EXPORTS

⁻nion Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman has projected a promising economy that could take the country to a path of glory with huge capital expenditure and rising deficits that is showcased politically to charm voters. She was partially correct during a short duration discussion on the state of the economy in the Rajya Sabha. But despite efforts, deficits remain high, exports drop, rupee slides and government measures such as high cess on petrol, rechristened additional excise duties, and tolls have not added to the ease of the people.

Occasional growth, such as in the second quarter of the year at 7.6% being termed as India being the fastest-growing major economy may cheer up countrymen, but it is not a solution to the overall economic situation. India's growth is not constant but seasonal, often to cater to the festive mood. Most world economies are taking corrective steps before that. It seems as per the RBI, an economy is on fire facing persistent threat of food inflation and severe constriction on farm level prices, both considered extremes. It calls for easing of policies and firming of the dollar that makes imports expensive.

The finance minister compared achievements with developed countries and their growth. The Indian economy despite its large size has yet to match the growth parameters of France, Germany, UK, the US or China, though many of them are in slowdown. Their economies are larger. Even a small growth is substantial than what India could achieve.

Much of the inflation is because of government policies such as maintaining high petrol prices despite a longer period of soft international prices. Despite Israel-Gaza or Russia-Ukraine wars, the crude oil prices have slumped to \$70 a barrel and may fall further as Western economies, particularly the US

sees a glut of oil owing to the slowdown. Instead of a demand of 2 million barrels, it remains at 594,000 barrels. The slowing global economy is impacting Indian exports.

While the benefits of low oil prices are not being passed on to the consumers in India, it has led to an inflationary economy. The Indian GST is high. Organisations such as the National Highway Authority of India (NHAI) have taken advantage to jack up road toll rates atrociously. Toll collections have increased to ₹48028 crore in 2022-23 from ₹33907 crore last year and ₹17942 crore in 2017-18. This is hurting the economy, including farmers' input and transportation costs, according to Statista.

Allocations for education and health have been cut and insurance premia allowed to rise by 30%. Farmers finding prices un-remunerative have been destroying many vegetable crops, including cauliflower, onion and tomato during the season, though prices of many commodities spiralled in the retail

The Opposition has charged the government with being cut off from ground realities during the discussion following a notice from TMC's Derek O'Brien.

Former Finance Minister P Chidambaram said it was "jobless growth." Ram Gopal Yadav of Samajwadi Party alleged the ruling members were only indulging in propaganda and publicity. Of 194 nations, India is at 133 in the growth index even though it is the fifth largest economy. AITC's Jawhar Sircar said in 2022 India's youth unemployment rate was 23.22%, which was even higher than 11.3% of Pakistan, 12.9% in Bangladesh

and 14.4% of Bhutan. Sitharaman says that investments in infrastructure and productive capacity have a larger multiplier effect on growth and employment. The Union Budget steeply increased the capital expenditure outlay by 37.4% to ₹10 lakh crore. This is being spent to demolish government buildings, railways stations, National Museum, National Archives and others.

This apart, reckless construction of roads and other supposed infrastructure have had a heavy toll on the Himalayan states facing severe devastation. Various construction lobbies are preventing the government from reviewing vast delicate areas in Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh and northeastern parts of the

While periodic renovation of buildings is necessary, rebuilding for the sake of it without a discussion with the people or other stakeholders necessarily does not mean that it would achieve the stated objective. The supposed rail upgradation to Vande Bharat and ignoring the usual trains again made the Railways go back to basics and restore the number of general coaches and improve upkeep of ordinary sleeper bogeys. The Railways are also realising that dynamic fare disrupts the lives of average travellers and creates a myth about higher earnings

The Budget notes that revenue expenditure is estimated to grow by 1.2% at ₹35.02 lakh crore in 2023-24 over ₹34.59 lakh crore. Major components of revenue expenditure include interest payments, defence revenue expenditure, and transfers to states in the form of Finance Commission grants and centrally sponsored schemes. Grants to Central autonomous bodies are a substantial part of the Central sector schemes.

Sitharaman says that India's national debt has increased from \$1595 billion in 2018 to \$3288 billion in 2023 and projected to rise to \$4816 billion by 2028. Outstanding government debt and other liabilities are rising to ₹169.46 lakh crore in March 2024 from ₹152.69 lakh crore in March 2023. Though this is considered manageable, its servicing costs are high. The government needs to review various projects for their utility. Interest payments are estimated to be ₹10.80 lakh crore, 30.8% of the total revenue expenditure. The fiscal policy statement highlighted the total expenditure as ₹45.03 lakh crore in 2023-24; increase of 7.5% over 2022-23. The states are to get about ₹10.21 lakh crore.

Despite India growing at a better pace than Pakistan and Sri Lanka, neighbouring Bangladesh and Vietnam have

500 electric buses

New Delhi, Dec 14: Delhi Lieutenant Governor V K Saxena and Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal flagged off 500 electric buses here Thursday, taking the number of such buses in the national capital to 1.300.

The Delhi government said the capital has the highest number of electric buses plying on its roads in the country."We have rolled out 500 (electric) buses today. These are zero emission buses. We will continue to do such things to make Delhi bet-

Kejriwal in his turn thanked Saxena and promised to keep improving the city transport. "I want to congratulate the people of Delhi on this occasion. I also want to thank the LG for taking out time from his busy schedule to grace this occasion. We now have 1300 electric buses in Delhi. We will continue to strengthen Delhi's transport system," he told reporters.

In a post on X, Transport Minister Kailash Gahlot said, "Congrats Delhi!!! We're celebrating another huge milestone today! Flagged off 500 new Ebuses along with Hon'ble CM @ArvindKejriwal and Hon'ble @LtGovDelhi. Success is never overnight, it is a guaranteed result of Consistency! We are yet again leading the way with a record 1300 e-buses.

Later, addressing a press conference, the minister said the addition of the buses is a strong step in the fight against pollution."In winters, pollution levels go up. One CNG bus emits 800 gram of carbon dioxide per kilometre. One electric bus saves that much amount of carbon dioxide going into the atmosphere," he said.

Before the Thursday addition, 800 electric buses had been plying on Delhi roads since January 2022. These buses have covered a distance of more than 42 million kilometres and cut more than 34,000 tonnes of carbon dioxide so far, the minister said.

By 2025, Delhi will have a total of 10,480 buses with electric ones making up 80 per cent of the fleet. This will help cut 4.67 lakh tonnes of carbon dioxide annually, according to the minister.

The new buses are air-conditioned, comfortable, and equipped with CCTV cameras and panic buttons. "If you do not feel comfortable while travelling, you can press the panic button and immediately the live feed to the command and control centre will start. The feed will also be accessible to Delhi Police that will be able to step in," he said.



Delhi LG, CM flag off Delhi tops in sexual, workplace harassment cases in 2022

New Delhi, Dec 14: The national capital has not only recorded the highest number of sexual harassment cases among metropolitan cities, as per the National Crime Records Bureau's (NCRB) report for 2022, it has also taken the lead in workplacerelated incidents.

Startling statistics from 2022 reveal that Delhi accounted for 19 reported cases, outpacing Mumbai with 15, Hyderabad with nine, and Bengaluru with eight cases. Despite the severity of the issue, reluctance to report incidents of sexual harassment at the workplace persists among victims.

Fear of reprisal and of losing one's livelihood, the stigma associated with coming forward, and the risk of tarnishing one's

professional and personal reputation contribute to the underreporting of workplace sexual harassment.

Sometimes, even after women gather the courage to complain, they face major difficulty in getting the higher authorities to act on a complaint, especially if it involves a very senior person.

For instance, in May this year, the Delhi Government's Directorate of Education initiated disciplinary proceedings against a vice principal in a city Government school over complaints of sexual harassment against him by some women teachers. However, this action came after the Delhi Commission for Women received several complaints of sexual and mental harassment against the head of the school for boys in Qadipur area in the national Capital.

According to the DCW, the complainants had stated that the accused had sexually and mentally harassed the teachers of the school and the educators had submitted several complaints against him before the higher authorities as well, but to no avail.

Further, the DCW also learnt that a FIR under Sections 354(A). 354(C), 354(D) and 506 of the Indian Penal Code was also registered against the said accused by another woman in 2022.

Workplace sexual harassment inflicts significant harm, serving as a stark manifestation of gender discrimination in professional settings. It also represents a violation of fundamental rights enshrined under Article 19 of the Constitution, eroding equality and jeopardising the physical and psychological wellbeing of workers.

UP police to recruit 700 women in first phase

Lucknow, Dec 14: The recruitment for the first all-women battalion of the Uttar Pradesh police is set to begin soon.

In the first phase, the state government is expected to announce vacancies for around 700 policewomen anytime between December and January, said a government spokesperson. Additionally, 20 per cent of over 60,000 vacancies for the post of civil police Constables will be reserved for women.

Sources in the Uttar Pradesh Police Recruitment & Promotion Board said that the state is expected to conduct exams for the recruitment of Constables before the Lok Sabha polls.

Interestingly, the Board is also expected to announce over 25,000 more openings for the posts of Sub-Inspectors, Jail Wardens, PAC Constables, firemen, mounted cops, and Special Security Force (SSF).

Similarly, vacancies for the posts of Sub-Inspectors in the civil police as well as SSF, fire service Second Officer and computer operators will also be declared for women and youth soon, sources said. In total, the number of vacancies through the police department alone are



expected to be over 86,000 if other posts like that of SSF personnel, jail warden etc are added.

Sources said that since 4.5 lakh candidates applied for the 2,000 spots for Radio Operators, for the remaining 83,000 posts, over 20 lakh candidates are expected to apply. The move to set up UP's first all-women battalion is seen as a bid to do away with caste-centric politics and focus on the underprivileged, women, youth, and farmers as suggested by the Prime Minister recently.

Meanwhile, the Board on Wednesday advertised 546 seats under the sports category quota for recruitment of Constablerank personnel in civil police and the PAC. The process to apply for the seats will begin from Thursday (December 14) and the last date will be

Kanpur, Dec 14: The Kanpur district jail has launched a unique prisoner reform initiative under which food outlet will be run by its current and former inmates. Jail superintendent B.N.

Pandey said that the outlet has become functional from Monday. While food will be prepared by the prisoners in the jail kitchen, former inmates will not only man the outlet but also act as home delivery executives as the jail aspires to take the initiative

On its first day, the outlet managed a sale of an impressive ₹5,500 -- most of it coming from people visiting their kin lodged in the jail. Tea, sold for ₹10 per cup, and espresso, sold for ₹20 per cup, made for the bulk of the revenue.

The idea was mooted by District Magistrate Vishak G. Iyer who



was impressed by the culinary skills of inmates as they churned a variety of food items for the erstwhile jail canteen.

rehabilitation," said Iyer, who

to food aggregator platforms. Pandey said, adding talks with two major app-driven service providers were already in the final stages. The project's nodal officer, Anil Kumar, said the rates had been kept reasonable.

"A thali (meal) of four rotis, two curries, dal, rice and salad is sold for ₹70. This is the costliest item on the menu," said Kumar, adding samosa, noodles, rajmarice, kadhi-rice, chole-rice and, puri-sabzi would also be sold.

"Chefs from reputed institutes and hotels will train inmates to better their skills and add new items to the menu," he said. The food joint will be managed by a prisoner welfare and rehabili-

tation cooperative society. A bank account has been opened in the name of the society, and earnings from the outlet would be credited to this account.

SC conditionally suspends conviction of Afzal Ansari

New Delhi: The Supreme Court Thursday conditionally suspended the conviction of former BSP MP Afzal Ansari in a 2007 Gangsters Act case, saying his Ghazipur constituency will be deprived of its legitimate representation in the legislature since a by-election may not be held given the remaining tenure of the current Lok Sabha. A bench of Justices Surya Kant, Dipankar Datta and Ujjal Bhuyan, in a majority judgement of 2:1, directed that the Ghazipur parliamentary constituency shall not be notified for by-election in terms of provisions of the Representation of the People Act (RPA) till the high court has decided Ansari's appeal against his conviction. While Justice Kant and Bhuyan delivered the majority verdict, Justice Datta dismissed Ansari's appeal against the Allahabad High Court order.

Faridabad: A group of men allegedly poured flammable liquid on cow vigilante Bittu Bajrangi's brother and set him on fire here, police said Thursday. He has sustained 54 per cent burn injuries and is currently being treated at a private hospital, they said. Bajrangi alias Rajkumar, the national president of Goraksha Bajrang Force, was arrested in connection with the Nuh violence but is out on bail. According to police, Bajrangi's younger brother Mahesh Panchal was allegedly attacked on Wednesday night by six to seven men. They allegedly poured some flammable liquid on Panchal and set him on fire at Chacha Chowk in Baba Mandi, Faridabad, police said. After getting information on the incident, a police team reached the hospital. Panchal told the police that he recognised one of the attackers as one Arman, who had a juice shop in Baba Mandi earlier.

Top court rejects Sisodia's plea seeking review of earlier order

New Delhi: The Supreme Court has dismissed AAP leader Manish Sisodia's pleas seeking review of its October 30 verdict dismissing his bail petitions in the corruption and money laundering cases related to the alleged Delhi excise policy scam. A bench of Justice Sanjiv Khanna and Justice SVN Bhatti dismissed the review petitions Wednesday. "We have carefully perused the review petitions as also the grounds in support thereof. In our opinion, no case for review of the judgment dated October 30, 2023, is made out. The review petitions are, accordingly, dismissed," the bench said in its order passed Wednesday. It also rejected Sisodia's request for an oral hearing on the review petitions.

Delete IAS Sindhuri's photos within 24 hrs: SC to IPS Roopa

New Delhi, Dec 14: In a dramatic turn of events, the Supreme Court Thursday asked IPS officer D Roopa to delete her social media posts against IAS officer Rohini Sindhuri within 24 hours

A SC bench, led by Justice Abhay S Oka, which addressed a dispute involving two highranking civil servants, said if it is impossible to delete all the posts, Roopa should at least put up a post that she was withdrawing all her comments against Sindhuri.

A dispute unfolded between Sindhuri and Roopa in public with allegations of the unauthorized release of sensitive photographs and videos of the

Moreover, Roopa made accusations claiming unethical behavior on the part of Sindhuri.

The bench expressed its dismay at the lack of agreement on mediation, which had been offered earlier. Justice Oka emphasized the need for a resolution, stating, "If IAS, IPS officers continue to fight like this and refuse mediation, this must come to an end. How will the administration work?"

Sindhuri was aghast over dragging her family into the controversy. "How can she bring



my family into this? My 10-yearold son is asking me. Complete character assassination," she had stated.

Thursday, the top court directed Roopa to delete the alleged defamatory posts from social media platforms within 24 hours and issue an apology.

The court pointed out that the trial was in primary stages, and actions must be taken in the interest of both the civil servants.

Sindhuri detailed her grievances, claiming that Roopa had verbally abused her on a recent flight and sent derogatory texts to her parents. She further alleged that Roopa had linked her with male officers, damaging her reputation.

'NO PEACE UNTIL GOALS ACHIEVED'

Moscow, Dec 14: Russian President Vladimir Putin said Thursday there would be no peace in Ukraine until the Kremlin realises its goals, which remain unchanged after nearly two years of fighting that has sent tensions soaring between Moscow and the West.

Speaking at a year-end news conference that lasted over four hours and offered him an opportunity to reinforce his grip on power, Putin gave some rare details on what Moscow calls its "special military operation".

He dismissed the need for a second wave of mobilisation of reservists to fight in Ukraine — a move that has been deeply unpopular. He said there are some 617,000 Russian soldiers there, including around 244,000 troops who were called up to fight alongside professional military forces.

"There will be peace when we will achieve our goals," Putin said, repeating a frequent Kremlin line. "Victory will be ours." Putin highlighted Russian military gains in Ukraine as the conflict's second winter approached.

"Almost all along the line of contact our armed forces, let's put it modestly, are improving their positions, almost all in an active stage of action and there is an improvement in the position of our troops all along," he said.

'The enemy has declared a big counteroffensive, but he hasn't achieved anything anywhere," Putin added, claiming that the latest Ukrainian attempt to create a bridgehead on the eastern



bank of the Dnieper River also fizzled and Ukrainian troops suffered heavy losses. He alleged that Kyiv was sacrificing its troops in order to show some success to its Western sponsors as it seeks more aid.

"I believe it's stupid and irresponsible on behalf of the country's political leadership, but it's their business," he said. Putin. who has held power for nearly 24 years and announced last week he is running for reelection, was greeted with applause as he arrived in the hall in central Moscow. He didn't hold his traditional news conference last year after his military failed to take Kyiv and as the Ukrainian army retook territory in the east and south.

But with Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy forced to plead for more U.S aid amid a stalling counteroffensive and fracturing Western support, he decided to face the media once

more — although the session is heavily choreographed and is more about spectacle than scrutiny.

It was the first time that Putin. who has heavily limited his interaction with foreign media, faced questions from Western journalists since the fighting in Ukraine began, Ordinary citizens had the chance to submit questions alongside those from journalists, and Russian state media said at least 2 million of them had been sent in ahead of time.

The news conference began with questions about Ukraine and highlighted concerns some Russians have about another wave of mobilization."There is no need" for mobilization now, Putin said, because 1,500 men are being recruited every day. As of Wednesday evening, 486,000 soldiers have signed a contract with the Russian military, he

Mother, jailed for 20 yrs, cleared of killing babies

Sydney, Dec 14: A woman imprisoned for 20 years over the deaths of her four children, and pardoned in June, saw her convictions quashed by New South Wales state Thursday, with her lawyer saying she plans to claim "substantial" compensation.

Kathleen Folbigg was convicted in 2003 of murdering three of her children, and of manslaughter in the death of her fourth.

Folbigg maintained her innocence and said the children had died of natural causes over a decade, from 1989-1999.

In 2019, an initial inquiry into the case reaffirmed Folbigg's

But in 2022, a second inquiry led by a former chief justice found new evidence suggested two of the children had a ge-

netic mutation that may have caused their deaths. Folbigg was released from prison in June this year after being pardoned. "I am grateful that updated science and genetics has given me answers as to how my children died," an emotional Folbigg told reporters outside a

criminal appeals court in Sydney. "However, even in 1999, we had legal answers to prove my innocence. They were ignored. And dismissed," she said.

'The system preferred to



blame me rather than accept that sometimes, children can and do die suddenly, unexpectedly, and heartbreakingly.

Folbigg's lawyer, Rhanee Rago. said her legal team was preparing a claim for "substantial" compensation for her wrongful imprisonment.

"I'm not prepared to put a figure it, but it will be bigger than any substantial payment that has been made before," she The case, which relied pre-

dominantly on circumstantial evidence, caused controversy among scientists and statisticians, some of whom were part of the campaign to secure Folbigg's release.

"Although there was new scientific evidence (in 2019) ... basic scientific principles were not adhered to from the time of trial," said Anna-Maria Arabia, chief executive of the Australian Academy of Science.



Israel vows to fight on in Gaza

Rafah, Dec 14: Israel vowed to keep fighting in Gaza until it crushes Hamas after one of the deadliest single battles of the war for its soldiers, even as it faces mounting international calls for a ceasefire and unease on the part of its closest ally, the US.

The ambush in Gaza City, one of the hardest hit areas of the war, showed Hamas' resilience and

called into question whether Israel can defeat it without wiping out the entire territory. Support for Hamas has surged among Palestinians — in part because of the militant group's stiff resistance to a far more powerful foe — while the US has expressed growing discomfort over civilian deaths.

US National Security Adviser Jake Sullivan was visiting Israel on Thursday, days after President

Joe Biden said that Israel was losing international support because of its "indiscriminate bombing." Israel has imposed a total siege on northern Gaza, including Gaza City, and has flattened much of it in what is already one of the 21st century's most devastating mili-

tary campaigns. Benjamin Netanyahu has vowed to fight to the end, "even given the great pain and the international pressure.

Los Angeles, Dec 14: M-I-C-K-E-Y will soon belong to you and me. With several asterisks, qualification and caveats, Mickey Mouse in his earliest form will be the leader of the band of characters, films and books that will become public domain as the year turns to 2024.

In a moment many close observers thought might never come, at least one version of the quintessential piece of intellectual property and perhaps the most iconic character in American pop culture will be free from Disney's copyright as his first screen release, the 1928 short "Steamboat Willie," featuring both Mickey and Minnie Mouse, becomes available for public use

"This is it. This is Mickey Mouse. This is exciting because it's kind of symbolic," said Jennifer Jenkins, a professor of law and director of Duke's Center for the Study of Public Domain, who writes an annual Jan. 1 column for "Public Domain Day." "I kind of feel like the pipe on the steamboat, like expelling smoke. It's so exciting.

US law allows a copyright to be held for 95 years after Congress expanded it several times during Mickey's life."It's sometimes derisively referred to as the Mickey Mouse Protection Act," Jenkins said. "That's oversimplified be-



was pushing for term extension. It was a whole group of copyright holders whose works were set to go into the public domain soon. who benefited greatly from the 20 years of extra protection." "Ever since Mickey Mouse's first appearance in the 1928 short film Steamboat Willie, people have associated the character with Disney's stories, experiences, and authentic products," a Disney spokesperson said in a statement. "That will not change when the copyright in the Steamboat Willie film expires.

Current artists and creators will be able to make use of Mickey, but with major limits. It is only the more mischievous, ratlike, non-speaking boat captain in "Steamboat Willie" that has become public.

"More modern versions of Mickey will remain unaffected

by the expiration of the Steamboat Willie copyright, and Mickey will continue to play a leading role as a global ambassador for the Walt Disney Company in our storytelling, theme park attractions, and merchandise," Disney's statement

Not every feature or personality trait a character displays is necessarily copyrightable, however, and courts could be busy in the coming years determining what's inside and outside Disney's ownership."We will, of course, continue to protect our rights in the more modern versions of Mickey Mouse and other works that remain subject to copyright," the company said.



Adani Group cash reserves rise 13%

New Delhi: Adani group companies have reported a 13.7 per cent rise in cash reserve to ₹45,895 crore in the first half of the current fiscal as earnings across the business rose while debt was almost unchanged. In the halfyear credit performance report, Adani said while EBITDA rose to ₹71,253 crore in April-September this fiscal from ₹57,219 crore a year back, gross assets increased 6 per cent to about ₹4.5 lakh crore. Gross debt was almost unchanged at ₹2.26 lakh crore, but after considering cash reserves, the net debt at ₹1.80 lakh crore was 3.6 per cent less than ₹1.87 lakh crore in April-September 2022. The group's flagship incubator Adani Enterprises Ltd and ports unit Adani Ports and Special Economic Zone were top EBITDA earners. Adani Enterprises had the biggest debt of ₹103,926 crore, followed by APSEZ ₹99,901 crore and Adani Power Ltd ₹91,742 crore. City gas firm Adani Total Gas Ltd had the lowest borrowing in the group of ₹4.773 crore.

Vedanta debt refinancing

New Delhi: Vedanta Resources Ltd (VRL), the UKheadquartered parent company of Vedanta group, said it has secured a \$1.25 billion loan from private credit lenders to refinance/repay part of the \$3.2 billion debt maturing in 2024 and 2025, but this did not prevent S&P Global from downgrading its ratings. In a statement, Vedanta Resources said the fundraising will help "create a long-term sustainable capital structure" and demonstrate its continued ability to access global capital markets and investor confidence in the underlying business. Unimpressed, S&P Global downgraded Vedanta Resources to 'CC' from 'CCC' on potential bond extensions and continues to keep it on CreditWatch Negative list.

Volvo to increase prices by 2%

New Delhi, Dec 14: Wholesale price-based inflation rose to an eight-month high of 0.26 per cent in November, driven by a sharp jump in food prices, especially onion and vegetables.

The WPI inflation was in the negative or deflationary zone for the past seven months since April and was at (-)0.52 per cent in October.

The last positive WPI inflation was recorded in March at 1.41 per cent.

"Positive rate of inflation in November 2023 is primarily due to increase in prices of food articles, minerals, machinery & equipment, computer, electronics & optical products, motor vehicles, other transport equipment and other manufacturing etc." the Commerce and Industry Ministry said in a statement.

Food inflation spiked to 8.18 per cent in November, from 2.53 per cent in October.

Inflation in onion zoomed 101.24 per cent in November, from 62.60 per cent in the previous month.

The government last week banned exports of this kitchen staple till March next year in a bid to increase domestic availability and contain prices, which skyrocketed to ₹80/kg in the retail market. It expects prices to cool to ₹40/kg by January.

The RBI in its monetary policy review last week had said that there would be an uptick in the inflation data for November and December due to pressure on food prices.

The RBI had projected retail inflation to average 5.4 per cent this fiscal.

The Asian Development Bank (ADB) in its December outlook released Wednesday said India's inflation forecasts for 2023 and 2024 are in line with recent data and are still within expectations. It forecast retail inflation at 5.5 per cent for this fiscal.

Sensex, Nifty rally over 1% to hit lifetime highs as US Fed ignites rate cut hopes

Mumbai, Dec 14: Benchmark equity indices Sensex and Nifty rallied over 1 per cent to hit alltime highs Thursday, propelled by intense buying in IT, tech and realty stocks after the US Federal Reserve kept its kev interest rate unchanged and signalled rate cuts next year.

Persistent buying by foreign investors and sliding crude oil prices in the international markets also supported domestic equities, traders said.

Rising for the second straight session, the 30-share BSE Sensex jumped 929.60 points or 1.34 per cent to settle at 70,514.20, its alltime closing high. During the day, it surged 1,018.29 points or 1.46 per cent to hit its all-time intra-day peak of 70,602.89.

A total of 2,064 stocks advanced while 1,702 declined and 126 remained unchanged.

The Nifty rallied 256.35 points or 1.23 per cent to settle at a record closing high of 21,182.70.

During the session, it jumped 284.55 points or 1.35 per cent to 21,210.90, its intra-day peak.

The rupee recovered from alltime lows to close at 83.33 against the US dollar Thursday, gaining 7 paise as the greenback weakened in the overseas markets.

In Asian markets, Seoul and Hong Kong settled in positive territory, while Tokyo and Shanghai ended lower. European markets were trading in the green. The US markets ended with significant gains Wednesday.

The BSE benchmark advanced 33.57 points or 0.05 per cent to settle at 69.584.60 Wednesday. The Nifty gained 19.95 points or 0.10 per cent to 20,926.35.

India cuts logistics costs to below 9% of GDP

New Delhi, Dec 14: India's logistics costs have come down to below 9% of gross domestic product, helped by rising state spending on roads, ports and digitisation, a report commissioned by the federal government said Friday, and could boost manufacturing.

"In terms of competitiveness, logistics costs for our producers - both domestic and exporters - have come down," Rajesh Kumar Singh, secretary at the federal Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT) said after

the launch of the report.

The report "Logistics Cost in India" authored by Delhi-based think-tank National Council of Applied Economic Research. said logistics costs including transportation, warehousing, insurance and administrative charges had come down thanks to improvements in road network, tax reforms and digitisa-

tion of supply chains. The logistics costs were down in the range of 7.8% to 8.9% of GDP in 2021/22, compared to 8.8% to 10% of GDP in 2012/13, said Poonam Munjal, the lead

author of the report. According to the World Bank's Logistics Performance Index, India climbed six places to rank 38th out of 139 countries in 2023, helped by improving road and port networks and digitisation

of the supply chains. The average dwell time, the waiting time for a truck cargo at a port, was just 3 days in India when compared to 7 days in the United States and 10 days in Germany, said the World Bank report.

"Our next aim is to improve our global logistics ranking, among the top 25 countries,' said Singh.

Russian oil imports hit 4-month high

New Delhi, Dec 14: India's Russian oil imports in November rose to a 4-month high of 1.6 million barrels per day (bpd), up 3.1% from October, making up about 36% of the nation's overall imports last month, data obtained from trade sources showed.

Russia became India's top oil supplier this year as the south Asian nation was drawn to Russian oil discounts after some Western companies shunned purchases from Moscow following its invasion of Ukraine in February last year.

India, the world's third biggest oil importer and consumer, has traditionally relied on Middle Eastern producers for meeting the bulk of its oil needs and rarely made purchases from Russia in the past due to high transportation costs.

Last month, India overall imported about 4.5 million bpd oil, a decline of about 4.5% from October and a growth of 13% over the same month last year the data showed.

Iraq and Saudi Arabia were the next top oil suppliers to India after Russia in November.

Booming Indian coal demand powers rise of state-run giants

Already the most coal-dependent major economy, India's reliance on the fuel for power generation is set to rise for a third straight year as the addition of renewables slows, giving the two giants, NTPC and Coal India, a boost

Singapore, Dec 14: Booming demand for Indian coal is driving up the shares of miner Coal India and power generator NTPC Ltd. state giants investors once dismissed as plodding dinosaurs, but which are now outperforming the wider market and global

NTPC, which produces mostly coal-fired power, has surged 78%, far ahead of a gain of 17% in the broader Nifty Index, while shares of Coal India are up 55% for their best year in 2023.

Analysts expect their efforts to boost efficiency and access to cheap capital to extend the

rally, with most recommending that shareholders buy more of the two stocks or retain their holdings, LSEG data shows.

By comparison, shares of coal miners elsewhere, such as Indonesia's Adaro Energy Australia's Whitehaven Coal and US-based Peabody plummeted this year. Shares of China Shenhua and China Coal Energy rose, but less than the Indian companies.

Among coal-fired power generators, South Korea's KEPCO, US-based Duke Energy and American Electric Power suffered sharp declines. Russia's Inter RAO shares rose 16.2%.

Still, with a price to earnings

ratio of 7.63, Coal India is cheaper than major Chinese peers, and NTPC is undervalued, compared with many Chinese and American counterparts.

Foreign funds have been boosting their stakes, despite tougher global environmental, social and governance (ESG) norms for in-

stitutional investors.

NTPC investors include the asset management units of Goldman Sachs and Nippon Life, Vanguard and Blackrock, while Fidelity, Mellon Investments and Charles Schwab figure among Coal India's top 20 shareholders, LSEG data showed.

NTPC, Coal India booked record profits of 78% and 55% respectively, outpacing historic growth

"Foreign shareholding in the company has steadily moved higher over the last two years, highlighting the dialing-down of the ESG discount," JPMorgan said in an August note on Coal

Both companies were long seen as dividend stocks.


Of the eight years of growth the Nifty saw in the last decade, Coal India and NTPC outperformed it just once each. Coal India lost 57% of its value in the decade through 2020, while NTPC lost more than a third.

Since 2021, NTPC has tripled in value to \$34 billion, while the world's largest coal miner has grown 2.5 times to \$26 billion.

In an October note titled, "This elephant can dance," Bobcaps said NTPC's lower cost of debt gave it an edge in the power industry and it stood to benefit from the government's view that thermal additions were key to sta-

NTPC, the only major Indian company still adding coal-fired capacity, is also boosting coal output from its own mines, while Coal India is slashing thousands of jobs a year and outsourcing some operations to boost mar-

While most of the miner's sales are on low-margin, longterm contracts to utilities, surplus output has allowed bigger spot sales in the lucrative auction market. By comparison, tightening funding has choked global coal miners.
