State extends food security scheme till '28

AGENCIES

Bhubaneswar, Dec 15: The Odisha government Friday announced that the State Food Security Scheme (SFSS) will be extended by five more years till December 31, 2028.

The proposal in this regard was approved by Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik. The beneficiaries of the SFSS were entitled to get 5 kg of rice free of cost and its tenure was till December 31, 2023.

An official statement issued by the CMO said that the state government will spend ₹1,250 crore from its own resources in five years at the rate of ₹250 crore per year. A total of 9,97,055 people from 3,14,923 families in the state are covered under the SFSS. They are getting 5 kg of rice per month for free.

"By extending the duration of the scheme for another 5 years, these beneficiaries will get this benefit from January 1, 2024 to December 31, 2028," the release said. It said that the CM has given strict instructions to ensure that no poor person is deprived of food security.

Bhubaneswar, Dec 15: Setting the tone for the 2024 general elections, ruling BJD president and Odisha Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik Friday called upon the party rank and file to effectively counter the misinformation campaign by Opposition political parties as they do not have any issue to target the state government.

Move Czech court: SC to Nikhil Gupta's kin

New Delhi, Dec 15: The Supreme Court Friday asked the family of Nikhil Gupta -- the Indian national accused by US federal prosecutors of plotting to assassinate Khalistani leader Gurpatwant Singh Pannun -- to approach the court in Czech Republic where Gupta is presently

A bench of Justices Sanjiv Khanna and SVN Bhatti was considering a writ petition filed by a family member seeking urgent intervention of the top court against Gupta's "illegal arrest and ongoing extradition proceedings.

The bench remarked that the matter is "extremely sensitive" and the petitioner should first approach the court which is outside India. "If there is violation of any law, you have

sonable apprehension about Gupta's

safety in Czech prison. It said that the extradition proceedings initiated in Prague have been marred by procedural failures, highlighting the absence of an arrest warrant, lack of fair representation, and denial of basic rights, rendering the trial anything

but fair The plea alleged that Gupta -- who was detained at Prague Airport June 30 this year -- was subjected to forced consumption of beef and pork during his detention in Czech custody and was denied consular access, the right to contact his family in India, and the freedom to seek legal representation.

"The petitioner seeks the appointment of legal counsel in both countries—Czech Republic and the US. He specifically requests the court to appoint an Indian advocate to represent him, underscoring the language barrier and the lack of adequate representation during the extradition trial in Prague," it added.

New Delhi, Dec 15: The BCCI has decided to 'retire' World Cup winning captain MS Dhoni's No.7 jersey to honour his rich contribution to Indian cricket.

The iconic India captain last played for the country in the 2019 World Cup semifinal against New Zealand. He announced his retirement August 15, 2020 and no other player has worn the No.7 shirt since then.

Even the great Sachin Tendulkar's No.10 has not been worn by any other player since his retirement in 2013 except pacer Shardul

Tahkur, who had opted for No.10 on his ODI debut against Sri Lanka in 2017 but was trolled heavily on social media.

No one since then has played with a jersey with number 10 written on the

According to BCCI vice-president Rajeev Shukla, the Board took the decision Thursday.

"He is a legendary player. His contribution to

Indian as

well as world cricket is immense. To honour his contribution, the deci-

sion to retire number seven has been taken by the BCCI," Shukla told PTI.

Retiring jerseys of the greats is a phenomenon in another sports too. The Chicago Bulls retired the No. 23 jersey worn by basketball legend Michael Jordan following his retirement.

India wicketkeeper Dinesh Karthik, whose international career coincided with Dhoni's, was among the first to demand for No.7 jersey to be retired after the WC winning captain's retirement in 2020. Both Karthik and Dhoni happened to play in that ill-fated World Cup semifinal against New Zealand. "Hope the BCCI retires the No.7 jersey in white ball cricket," Karthik had posted back then.

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





Minister unveils vehicle tracking command centre

Bhubaneswar, Dec 15: Commerce and Transport (C&T) Minister Tukuni Sahu inaugurated the command and control centre for vehicle location tracking device (VLTD) at Bhubaneswar-II RTO new building in Chandrasekharpur area here. Friday.

According to sources in the know of the development, the round-the-clock integrated centre will use global positioning system (GPS)-based vehicle tracking and GSM/GPRS channel for triggering emergency alerts.

'Common emergency toll lines, motor vehicle wing, police control room and other related enforcement units will be looped into a real-time data sharing network, with the command control centre functioning as an interface for the stakeholder agencies," they said, adding that an application has also been developed for various stakeholders.

The Centre has mandated fitment of VLTDs in public transport vehicles under Nirbhaya Scheme. The Central Motor Vehicle Rule 1989 has also been amended for the purpose.

Sahu said the command and control centre will be instrumental in facilitating vehicle location tracking.

"Fitment of VLTDs will help



especially women, but also to assist law enforcing agencies. The control and command centre will facilitate the noble initiative," Sahu pointed out.

C&T department Principal Secretary Usha Padhee said State Transport Authority (STA) has inked a pact with Bharat Sanchar Nigam Limited (BSNL) for development and management of vehicle location tracking appli-

BSNL has developed, deployed, integrated and commissioned a vehicle location tracking software 'Mo Yatra Suraksha' for tracking as well as monitoring of vehicles under the project, Padhee said.

Sources said the Centre has a proved manufacturers of VLTDs and panic buttons in public transport vehicles. The state government has published the standard operating procedure (SOP) for empanelment of these man-

As of now, six VLTD manufacturers have been registered in Odisha and 11 have successfully completed their testing procedure. Accordingly, these empanelled manufacturers have started affixing the VLTDs to both new and old vehicles.

The vehicle owners have the liberty to choose and affix VLTDs from the empanelled manufacturers, a list of which is available in the website of state transport department, they said.

Except for auto-rickshaws and e-rickshaws, all passenger transport vehicles will be equipped with VLT panic buttons for the safety of women and children. All goods vehicles operating under the strength of national permit and all goods vehicles transporting explosive and hazardous materials have to install VLTDs, they pointed out.

Specified vehicles bought January 1, 2024 or after shall have to comply with the requirement at the time of registration. Those registered December 31, 2023 or before will have to comply with the requirement by June 30, 2024, they

No immediate plan to tackle TTS stench

Bhubaneswar, Dec 15: The Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation (BMC) has made it clear that it has no immediate remedies for the stench emanating from Gadakana Temporary Transit Station (TTS) even as residents in nearby localities as well as some areas on City outskirts continue gasping for breath

Accusing the civic body of acting at snail's pace, residents of nearby areas like Gadakana, Rangamatia, Bhotapada, VSS Nagar and East Coast Railway Stadium Square have stated that senior citizens and children are



the worst-hit due to the shoddy waste mismanagement of BMC.

President of Dhirikuti Slum Association at Gadakana, Udaynath Barik, said in last month the civic body has instead expanded the area used for dumping waste here. "Presently, around 50-60 dumpers are entering the site every day,"

Elucidating further, he stated that the stink emanating from the dumping yard becomes severe during early morning hours and rainy seasons. The slum dwellers are now suffering from skin infections, itching and dengue, he

In response, BMC Deputy Commissioner Manoranjan Sahu said, "The garbage volume has decreased significantly from its earlier shape of a hill, with the consistent efforts of BMC officials and sanitation workers." However, he could not say anything specific about any immediate plan to resolve the issue.

The slum dwellers criticised the BMC for assembling a large number of machines at the site for waste management if they are not of any help.

Furthermore, they said due to an impending threat of eviction from BMC, it becomes difficult to raise concerns at times.

Slum Development Authority president Rajendra Sahoo said, "The situation could only get better if the BMC authorities set up TTS for waste management in every ward. This will help reduce garbage heaps in one particular area and prevent any kind of sanitation issues.

New SC bench to take up Sarda Mines' plea

New Delhi, Dec 15: In an unprecedented move, a three-judge bench of the Supreme Court led by Justice SK Kaul, after reserving the order on a petition filed by Sarda Mines seeking execution of mining lease in its favour, has directed that the petition shall be heard afresh by a new bench. The bench cited difference in perception on the legal nuances of the case as a reason for referring the case to a new bench.

The bench also comprising Justices CT Ravikumar and Sudhanshu Dhulia had reserved its order November 2 on the petition seeking direction to Odisha government to execute mining lease deed in its favour for the remaining 10 years out of the 30 vears renewal that it was entitled to as per the Orissa HC's 1991 and 1998 orders. "We had reserved orders in this matter November 2, 2023. We had some discussion, but there is some difference in perception on the legal nuances of this case. One of us is demitting office shortly. We, thus, consider it appropriate to direct that the matter be placed before the Chief Justice of India to be assigned to a completely different Bench, which may have an opportunity to afresh apply its mind to the case," the court said. Significantly, Justice SK Kaul is demitting the office December 25 after a tenure of over six years and 10 months. Since the Supreme Court will be on win-

The searches came to a close in the early hours of December 15, the sources told PTI.

A final appraisal report of the entire operation has been sent as per procedure to the CBDT, the administrative body for the tax department, in Delhi by the field investigation unit, they said.

Neither the company, nor Sahu has issued any official statement or response on the I-T action till now even as Opposition parties including the BJP blamed them for dealing in illicit cash funds.

As many as 30-34 premises in Odisha, Jharkhand and West Bengal were searched by the department and about three kg of

gold jewellery was also seized during the operation.

I-T officials have claimed to have made the 'highest-ever' cash seizure of ₹351 crore during these raids, which were launched by the I-T department on charges of alleged tax evasion and 'out of book' transactions.

Some of the high-value cash seizures from the past include one from 2019 when the GST Intelligence raided a Kanpurbased businessman and seized cash to the tune of about ₹257 crore and another instance where cash amounting to ₹163 crore was unearthed by the I-T department during searches against a road construction firm at Tamil Nadu in July 2018.

The department, during this operation, deployed a ground scanning wheeled machine at Sahu's house in Ranchi, with a monitor on top, to scan for valuables beneath the surface even as it brought in three dozen currency counting machines, and took the help of various banks and their staffers for counting the huge cash.

The officials said the counting machines failed multiple times as they were being continuously used and even by the fact that many notes were soiled leading to blocking of the infrared sensors that read the thread on the currency to tally the bunch placed inside.

Many notes bunches were counted twice or thrice as the notes were not clean and the teller (staffer counting the currency) had to run the process again to obtain the correct figure, the sources said.

With the announcement that Welspun Group would take over a longclosed textile facility, there is now hope that one of the other gigantic projects that has been shuttered for many years will also be hacked by the bureaucrats. If he does get the coveted position at the helm of the Finance Commission, his demonstrated stewardship and continued influence will be pivotal in ensuring an effective fiscal policy.

MHA push for accountability may need balancing

The recent decision by the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) to revoke the Foreign Contribution Act (FCRA) license of the Church of North India (CNI) has added another layer of complexity to the issue of treatment of minorities in recent times. This move, part of a broader crackdown on NGOs violating FCRA regulations, is not an isolated incident, as numerous NGOs, including well-known entities like Oxfam India, Centre for Policy Research (CPR) and Care India, among others, have faced similar actions in the past year.

Sources have informed DKB that Home Ministry babus have been hyperactive, reviewing and taking action against organizations found in violation. They state that CNI cannot receive or utilize foreign contributions until the license is renewed.

The move implies an intensified commitment to enforcing FRCA regulations, aimed at preventing the misuse or diversion of foreign funds. However, in the backdrop of the ongoing troubles in Manipur, known for its communal diversity and historical tensions, which led to killings and burnings of several churches of the Christian community, the move may be viewed as a sign of the Centre's continued mistrust of the minority community in the state.

While the hyperactive Home Ministry officials rightly believe that accountability is crucial, perhaps a careful assessment of such actions and finding a balance could lead to more nuanced decision-making.



word greeted arriving passengers International Airport, the port of entry for the vast majority of the 100,000 or so climate negotiators, activists, industry lobbyists, and others attending this year's United Nations Climate Change Conference and the events around it. It flickered from ads in the oddly underused metro connecting the airport directly to the official COP28 venue, and it was displayed on the occasional billboard along the two main "roads" spanning the length of the city, each with at least a dozen lanes. Apparently, the neologism is meant to convey not just action, but "vigorous action to bring about change."

This attempt to rebrand an everyday word encapsulates COP28, surely one of the most surreal climate summits to date. Between Dubai's ostentatious fossil-fueled wealth, misguided car-centric city planning, and the fact that COP28 itself was led by a fossil-fuel CEO, it has been much easier than in prior years to be cynical about the whole exercise

But cynicism will not help us address climate change, and while it was tough to spot amid all the greenwashing, there was some real progress on the ground. Two weeks before the conference, the United Arab Emirates opened the world's largest single-site solar plant, with two gigawatts of panels spanning 20 square kilometers and powering almost 200,000 energy-hogging UAE homes for\$1.32 per kilowatt-hour –one of the lowest prices for electricity anywhere delivered at

Nor is this the only development to applaud. The renewables lobby is celebrating a pledge, supported by 118 governments, to triple global renewable-energy capacity and double the annual rate of energy efficiency improvements by 2030. The nuclear industry also has reason to cheer, with 22 governments pledging to triple global nuclear-energy

capacity by 2050. Both commitments are good news for the climate. The world needs both renewables and nuclear in order to cut fossil-fuel use quickly. Building low-carbon capacity fast is what matters, more so than whether the COP28 agreement includes the words "phase out" or "phase down."

Precisely because the world needs to cut fossil-fuel use altogether, it is more difficult to evaluate another pledge made this month to reduce methane (CH4). While carbon dioxide (CO2) is the biggest overall climate culprit, CH4 will be responsible for as much as 45% of the planetary warming this decade - even though it doesn't remain in the atmosphere for nearly as long as CO2.

So it was much more than just well-timed symbolism when the US Environmental Protection Agency announced on December 2, the first Saturday of COP28, that it had finalized a long-awaited rule to cut CH4 emissions from the oil and gas sector by around 80% over 15 years. That news came with a \$1 hillion commitment to help smaller countries address the same problem, leading several to join the Global Methane Pledge (launched at COP26 in Glasgow and strengthened at COP27 in Sharm El-Sheikh) to cut total CH4 emissions 30% by 2030. And all this comes on the heels of an EU law that sets tight CH4 leakage standards. In classic EU regulatory fashion, that provision should reach well beyond European borders.

December 2 also brought a major industry announcement. Around 50 of the world's largest oil and gas firms - including ExxonMobil, Shell, Saudi Aramco, and ADNOC (the company led by Sultan al-Jaber, the COP28 president) – pledged to all but eliminate their own CH4

Climate campaigners are understandably questioning the industry's motives, and emphasizing that such pledges could detract from the need to cut both CH4 and CO2 emissions from fossil-fuel use, not merely from its production. They can cite comments like one by Occidental Petroleum CEO Vicki Hollub, who told S&P Global's CERAWeek conference earlier this year that Occidental's purchase of direct-air-capture technology "gives our industry a license to continue to operate for the 60, 70, 80 years that I think it's going to be very much needed." The statement put "moral hazard" on display better than any climate campaigner

None of that diminishes the real, positive effects that would come from slashing CH4 emissions this decade (or from scaling up carbon-removal technologies, for that matter). But the question of how useful the COP process has been raises an even broader, almost philosophical one: How should we think about CO2, CH4, or any other emissions reductions that are ostensibly "costless" (or even profitable) from a narrow technical perspective, but that have yet to happen?

After all, oil and gas companies here are committing to stop wasting gas, one of their two main products - and an increasingly important and lucrative one at that. Ideally, it would not take the performa tive circus of COP to achieve these kinds of agreements. Yet, as the CH4 pledge shows, apparently it does.

The problem is that coordinating pledges across industry players, civil society, and governments to measure, report, verify, and ultimately enforce action via a unified set of standards takes time and effort. It is for good reason that the acronym-laden COP process has turned "MRV" into a verb. The task now will be to MRV(E) measure, report, verify, and enforce – the pledges on renewables, nuclear, and CH4 coming out of COP28, while also keeping the larger picture in mind.

There are clear hurdles to overcome, even - or perhaps especially – with seemingly cost less emissions reductions that industries themselves have an interest in adopting. The key task for international gatherings, as for low-carbon technologies themselves, is to focus on getting costs down, and fast. Judged by that benchmark, COP28 may yet prove to be at least as important a stepping stone in the global clean-energy race as any of the previous UN climate summits.

Indo-US ties need more engagement

Secretary of Pentagon, Pat Ryder, said in a news conference on December 13 that the US has made great progress in its defence ties with India and is looking forward to making further progress in military-to-military engagement in

At the same time, Indian media reports that US President Joe Biden has declined the invitation to be the Chief Guest at the Republic Day parade next month. Also, India has voted for a resolution that calls for an immediate ceasefire in Gaza, whereas the US has voted against. It is also noteworthy that India also voted for two amendments, one moved by Austria and the other by USA. The Amendment Resolution proposed by USA made specific mention of "Heinous terrorist attacks by Hamas that took place on Israel on 7 October 2023 and the taking up hostages"

Unarguably, in international politics, countries conduct their foreign policies in pursuance of their national interests, re-

senior official, the Press flecting the values and norms they espouse and stand for, as well as the rules they adhere to. But the moot question is how the national interest is defined and realised in short and long term. In the formative years of independent India, the first Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru conceptualised the country's foreign policy while other ministers were busy uniting and stabilising the nascent independent country.

On reflection, experts, scholars and observers argue that the policy of Non-alignment, the hallmark of Nehru's foreign policy proved costly for the country besides it not being maintainable as a strategy.

India is moving on from Nonalignment to multi-alignment. It is leaning towards the US and the West for its growth and security. Is this right approach now or in the long-term interest of India?

To take a few illustrations in order to examine the above assumption, let us look at the war in Ukraine. India abstained on several resolutions moved in Russia as an aggressor, which implied New Delhi's stance has been pro-Russian. New Delhi has a tradition of expressing solidarity with countries suffering from intervention, neocolonial exploitation, and undue interference and intervention.

Is that good for India's reputation of embracing a valuebased approach in international politics, particularly in comparison to China, which is out to grab other countries territory and is posing a systemic threat to world politics?

On Ukrainian war. India would excel as a neutral party if the Prime Minister could broker a peace deal between Ukraine and Russia in consultation with the United States and Europe.

On the war in Gaza, India did display a pragmatic as well as normative approach by expressing solidarity with Israel as it faced a terrorist attack from Hamas. In the latest UN resolution. India has taken a balanced position of calling for a ceasefire as well as calling out

the United Nations on naming Hamas for terror attacks.

On the other hand, the refusal of the invitation from Modi by Joe Biden could also be attributed to the irritation arising out of the "assumed Indian agency hand" in the attempted assassination of the controversial Sikh, an American citizen, Gurpatwant Singh Pannun.

Be that as it may, there is a case for India's greater engagement with the United States that takes a rounded approach, not just sectoral like the increased collaboration in defence. A bilateral relationship is based on shared understanding, deepening trust and often being on the same side on important international issues. Such an approach militates against India's multi-alignment policy which is of course desirable in a globalised world. Is it not necessary to differentiate between issuebased alignment and strategic partnership?

PLEAS FOR DISQUALIFICATION OF SENA MLAS

SC extends time, asks Maha **Speaker to decide by Jan 10**

New Delhi, Dec 15: The Supreme Court Friday extended the deadline for Maharashtra Legislative Assembly Speaker Rahul Narwekar to decide the cross-petitions filed by the rival factions of the Shiv Sena seeking disqualification of each other's MLAs from December 31 to January 10 next year

The top court, which granted 10 more days to the Speaker, had earlier asked him to decide the disqualification pleas by December 31, saying the sanctity of the 10th Schedule of the Constitution (disqualification law) should be maintained.

"The speaker has indicated that the proceedings will be closed December 20 and the Speaker has sought a reasonable extension of time for declaration of the order. Bearing in mind the time limit, which was set out by this court in its previous order dated October 30, was until December 31. We grant extension of time for pronouncement of orders till January 10," a bench of Chief Justice DY Chandrachud and justices J B Pardiwala and Manoj Misra said.

At the start of the brief hearing, Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, appearing for the Speaker, sought extension of the deadline by three more weeks, saying around 2.71 lakh pages of documents have been filed before him and he has to examine them before passing orders.

He said no further extension will be sought in the matter as the Speaker is all set to reserve his orders December 20 and needs time for delivering the same. "The speaker has said that 20

December the judgement would be reserved and no further time would be taken. Hearings took place even during the Assembly session. There are 2.71 lakh pages .. I am seeking an extension of time by three weeks for pronouncing the order. We won't ask

for more," the law officer said. The prayer for extension was objected to by senior advocates Kapil Sibal and Abhishek

Rhea moves HC against

CBI lookout circular

Mumbai, Dec 15: Rhea Chakraborty has moved the Bombay High Court challenging the lookout circular issued against her by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) in connection with its probe into the death of actor Sushant Singh Rajput.

Rajput was found dead in his apartment in suburban Bandra June 14, 2020, and his father had, in July that year, lodged a complaint with Bihar police accusing Chakraborty, the actor's then girlfriend, and her kin of abetting his suicide. In her plea, Chakraborty sought for the circular to be quashed, and in a separate application sought temporary suspension of the circular as she has to travel abroad for a professional event. Friday, her counsel Abhinav Chandrachud submitted to a division bench led by Justice A S Gadkari that it has been almost three years since the FIR was lodged by the CBI and the lookout circular issued but till date there has been no other progress.

The solicitor general persisted with the request and said this is a quasi judicial function and the Speaker needs time.

The top court, while fixing the previous deadline, had said procedural wranglings should not be permitted to delay a decision on the disqualification petitions.

The top court had also asked the Speaker to decide the NCP's petition seeking disqualification of nine MLAs of the Ajit Pawar group by January 31, 2024.

"We are concerned that the sanctity of the 10th Schedule must be maintained. Otherwise. we are throwing these provisions to the wind," the court had said.

The 10th Schedule of the Constitution is designed to prevent defection of elected and nominated members of Parliament and state legislatures from political parties on whose ticket they win, and contains stringent provisions against it under which they can be dis-

The delay in deciding the disqualification petitions against Chief Minister Eknath Shinde and Shiv Sena MLAs loyal to him had come under strict scrutiny by the apex court which came down hard on the Assembly Speaker at previous hearings. saying the proceedings cannot be reduced to a charade and that he cannot 'defeat' its orders.

The top court was hearing two petitions filed by the Uddhav Thackeray faction of the Shiv Sena and the Sharad Pawar bloc of the NCP, seeking a direction to the Speaker to expeditiously decide disqualification proceedings against some MLAS.

Earlier September 18, the bench had directed the Speaker to spell out the time table for adjudication of the disqualification petitions against Shinde and Shiv Sena MLAs owing allegiance to him. They had split the Shiv Sena and tied up with the BJP to form a new government in June 2022.

The court had asked the solicitor general to apprise the bench of the time schedule to be fixed by the Speaker for deciding the pleas for disqualification of 56 MLAs, including lawmakers belonging to the Shinde faction.

The Thackeray faction had moved the apex court in July seeking a direction to the Speaker to expeditiously adjudicate the disqualification petitions in a time-bound manner.

The plea by Shiv Sena (Uddhay Balasaheb Thackeray) MLA Sunil Prabhu, who as the chief whip of the undivided Shiv Sena had filed the disqualification petitions against Shinde and other MLAs in 2022, alleged the Speaker is deliberately delaying the adjudication despite an apex court verdict asking him to decide them within a 'reasonable' time.

Madras HC dismissed Kerala SRTC claims, says KSRTC on logo war

"I also have a video of this party. This Salim Kutta is out on parole and was partying with a leader of Uddhav Thackeray's



party. Action should be taken against him," said Rane. Minister Dadaji Bhuse, who belongs to the rival Sena faction led by Chief Minister Eknath Shinde, demanded action against Badgujar saying that it was an anti-national act, while BJP MLA Ashish Shelar said there should be a thorough probe and Badgujar should be

Badgujar told reporters that the video that Rane claimed to have could be a morphed one. "I never had any links with Salim Kutta. The allegations have been levelled with political motives. I did not have any links with him, nor do I have any at present. If we met in public life at some point, I do not remember it," he said.

"Guardian minister (for Nashik) Bhuse did not obtain correct information before levelling allegations against me. In 2016, a rally was taken out for the demand of separate Vidarbha state, and Shiv Sena workers protested against it. As a result, cases were filed against party workers. A case was also filed against me and I was in jail for 14 days," Badgujar said. The (1993) bomb blasts convicts were also in the (same) jail but we were unaware of it.... Salim Kutta must have been a prisoner there," he added.

Bangalore, Dec 15: Privatesector Karnataka bank is not 'State' as per the Constitution and it cannot be termed as an institution or company carrying on any statutory or public duty, the High Court of Karnataka



Rejecting a writ petition against the bank, a single judge bench of Justice KV Aravind in a recent order said, "Though the respondent bank is engaged in public finance and regulated by Reserve Bank of India (RBI), it cannot be termed as an Institution or Company carrying on any statutory or public duty. A writ of mandamus cannot be issued to the authorities not contemplated under Article 12 of the

Constitution."

The petition was filed by Rajesh Kumar Shetty against T Subbaya Shetty and the Karnataka Bank seeking a direction to allow him to withdraw the fixed deposits of ₹1,24,27,826 from his account. The genesis of the dispute was a suit filed by Subbaya Shetty in a lower court seeking a declaration that he was the sole executor of the wills of Geetha T Punja and P Thimappa Punja. In November 2022, the lower court had passed a temporary injunction prohibiting any person from withdrawing the money standing in the accounts of Geetha Punja and Thimappa Punja until the

suit was disposed of. When the stay was vacated, Rajesh Kumar Shetty filed representations for release of the money in the accounts for personal necessities. The bank replied that since there was a claim suit pending in the court, it was unable to allow him to withdraw the money.

IISc finds way to encapsulate liquid droplets

Bangalore, Dec 15: Scientists at the Indian Institute of Science (IISc) have developed a technique to encapsulate liquid droplets used for various applications, including single crystal growth and cell

Bengaluru-based IISc in a press release, said, "The technique exploits the capillary effect - the rise of a liquid through a narrow space - to coat droplets in a composite shell containing oil-loving

and hydrophobic particles." It offers the ability to tune the

shell thickness over a wide range, allowing the encapsulation of droplets of different sizes. The study was published in 'Nature Communications'.

Droplets are important in a variety of fields. "In microreactors, droplets can be used to create different reaction environments or mix different chemicals. In drug delivery systems, droplets can be used to deliver drugs or other agents to specific tissues or organs. In crystallisation studies, droplets can be used to control

the growth of crystals. "And in cell culture platforms, droplets can be used to grow cells in a controlled environment, which can help to improve cell viability and proliferation," explains lead researcher Rutvik Lathia, PhD student at the Centre for Nano Science and Engineering (CeNSE), IISc. However, there are several challenges in using such

droplets, the release said. They are vulnerable to contamination from the ambient environment, the ease and success of a particular process depends a lot on the surface they're dropped on, and they can vanish into thin air pretty fast.

While encapsulating droplets with liquids or solids that don't mix with the droplets (like water droplets inside an oil shell) is a plausible solution to avoid these issues, making a shell that is hardy, continuous and has an adjustable thickness at a super tiny scale has proven elusive so far.

To address these challenges, Prosenjit Sen, Associate Professor at CeNSE, and his team have developed a new capillary force-assisted cloaking method to trap droplets within colloidal parti-

cles and liquid-infused surfaces. First, they carefully coated droplets with small hydrophobic and oil-loving beads, turning them into what they call Liquid Marbles

When these LM are kept on oilinfused surfaces, capillary forces kick in, allowing the oil to rise up into tiny pores created between individual beads. These beads play a crucial role in promoting and stabilising the formation of a liquid film around the droplet, effectively encapsulating it. The researchers were also able to use wax instead of oil to create a solid shell by adjusting the tempera-

Sonbhadra (UP), Dec 15: A court here Friday sentenced BJP MLA Ramdular Gond to 25 years of rigorous imprisonment for the rape of a girl nine years ago, setting the stage for his disqualification from the Uttar Pradesh Assembly. According

Representation of the People Act, a lawmaker sentenced to imprisonment of two years or more shall be disqualified "from the date of such conviction" and remain disqualified for another six years after serving time. Ahsan Ullah Khan, the ad-

ditional district and session judge of the MP-MLA court in Sonbhadra, also imposed a fine of ₹10 lakh on Gond which would be used in the rape survivor's rehabilitation. The rape survivor is now married and the mother of an eight-yearold girl

Special Public Prosecutor Satyaprakash Tripathi said the court held the MLA from Duddhi assembly seat -- reserved for Scheduled Tribes -- guilty on December 12. The incident took place in 2014 and a case was registered against Gond under IPC sections 376 (rape) and 506 (punishment for criminal intimidation) as well as under the provisions of the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act on the complaint of the rape survivor's brother. 

London, Dec 15: A UK judge ruled Friday that Prince Harry was a victim of phone hacking by journalists working for Mirror Group Newspapers (MGN), and awarded him £140,600 (\$179,600)

The high court judge ruled in favour of the Duke of Sussex in 15 of the 33 sample articles that he submitted as evidence in his lawsuit against MGN, which publishes The Mirror, Sunday Mirror, and Sunday People.

Justice Timothy Fancourt said he had concluded that the newspapers carried out "extensive" phone hacking of celebrities between 2006 and 2011, even when a public inquiry into the conduct of the British press was "I consider that his phone was

only hacked to a modest extent, and that this was probably carefully

controlled by certain people at each newspaper," Fancourt said. Prince Harry said in a statement read outside court by his lawyer that the ruling was "vindicating and affirming".

paid appropriate compensation." Harry, the younger son of King Charles III, became the first British royal in over a century to take to the witness stand when he gave evidence in the trial. The last time a royal had given evidence in court was in the 1890s, when the future king Edward VII took the stand in a slander trial.

Harry, 39, accused the publisher of "industrial scale" phone hacking during emotional testimony in which he relived upsetting episodes of his life.

He argued he had been the victim of relentless and distressing media intrusion virtually his entire life.

The prince and several other claimants alleged the titles engaged in "illegal information gathering", including intercepting phone voice mails, to write dozens of stories about him.

The Duke of Sussex, as he is also known, has launched legal action against several tabloid media groups, alongside barrages of attacks aimed at his family and the monarchy.

Harry has long had a turbulent relationship with the press and holds the media responsible for the death of his mother, Princess Diana, in a 1997 Paris car crash while being pursued by paparazzi.

France finds British boy missing since 2017

LONDON: A teenager from Britain who was found in southern France after disappearing six years ago is expected to return to his family in northern England in the next few days, after he apparently fled a spiritualist mountain community. Alex Batty disappeared at the age of 11 during a holiday with his mother and grandfather to Malaga, Spain, in 2017 and both are still wanted in connection with his disappearance. Greater Manchester Police (GMP) told a press conference Friday they were working with the French authorities to bring Batty back to Britain, and to his grandmother, who British media have reported

was his legal guardian. A French newspaper reported a delivery driver spotted the teenager wandering along a highway in the region around the southern city of Toulouse, after having fled a spiritualist mountain community in the Pyrenees mountains. GMP Assistant Chief Constable Chris Sykes told a press conference said Batty had spoken to his grandmother via video call Thursday evening. "She has a whole host of emotions and feelings as you could imagine," Sykes said.

Biggest solar flare in yrs knocks out radios



CAPE CANAVERAL: A NASA telescope has captured the biggest solar flare in years, which temporarily knocked out radio communication on Earth. The sun spit out the huge flare Thursday, resulting in two hours of radio interference in parts of the US and other sunlit parts of the world. Scientists said it was the biggest flare since 2017. Multiple pilots reported communication disruptions, with the impact felt across the country, said the

government's Space Weather Prediction Centre. Scientists are now monitoring this sunspot region and analysing for a possible outburst of plasma from the sun, also known as a coronal mass ejection, directed at Earth. The eruption occurred in the far northwest section of the sun, according to the Centre. The sun is nearing the peak of its 11-year or so solar cycle. Maximum sunspot activity is predicted for 2025.

Why Indian Ocean could be China's Achilles' heel

Hong Kong, Dec 15: Every day, nearly 60 fully loaded very large crude-oil carriers sail between the Persian Gulf and Chinese ports, carrying about half of the oil that powers the world's second-largest economy.

As the vessels enter the South China Sea, they ply waters increasingly controlled by China's growing military, from the missile batteries and airfields at its bases on disputed islands to its stealthy Type 055 destroyers.

But when crossing the Indian Ocean, joined by others headed to China from Africa and Brazil, these tankers lack protection in a naval theatre dominated by the US.

A dozen military attaches and scholars say that vulnerability is now being scrutinised as Western military and academic strategists discreetly game scenarios about how a conflict with China over Taiwan, or elsewhere in East Asia, could evolve or escalate.

Four envoys and eight analysts familiar with discussions in Western and Asian capitals, some speaking on the condition of anonymity to discuss a sensitive topic, said this enduring

weakness gives China's adversaries a ladder of escalatory options, especially in a drawn-out conflict, like Russia's war on Ukraine. These scenarios range from

harassment and interdiction operations against Chinese shipping that could divert Chinese naval vessels to the region, up to a blockade and beyond. In a full-scale war, the tankers

China has an extensive network of military satellites but just one dedicated military base, and no air cover from land or sea, for Indian Ocean naval deploy-

In its October annual report on China's military, the Pentagon lists 11 potential Chinese bases on the ocean's fringes, including Pakistan, Tanzania and Sri Lanka. Those locations reflect Chinese diplomatic and commercial outreach under Xi's Belt and Road Initiative.

But these have not emerged as hard military assets, with neither a permanent PLA presence nor publicly known guarantees of access in a conflict, the attaches and an Asian diplomat said

The Pentagon report notes in language used for the first time this year, that China still "has little power projection capability" in the Indian Ocean.

China's initial overseas base in Djibouti, on the ocean's western edge, opened in 2017 and hosts 400 marines, reflecting Chinese involvement in international piracy patrols around the Horn of Africa since 2008.

But the base has no airfield and is flanked by military facilities of seven other countries, including the US, France

and Britain. The US Indian Ocean presence remains in stark contrast,

reflecting its Cold War build-up. The US 5th Fleet is based in Bahrain while the Japan-headquartered 7th Fleet operates out of Diego Garcia, a UK-administered atoll with runways for long-range bombers and a lagoon adapted to house US aircraft carriers.

To the east, Australia is increasing patrols using its submarine-hunting P-8 Poseidon aircraft and is expanding a westcoast base for British and US nuclear-powered submarinesand, eventually, Australian nuclear-powered boats.



Mumbai: The National Company Law Appellate Tribunal (NCLAT) December 15 refused to grant a stay on the merger of media giants Zee **Enterteinment Enterprises** Limited (ZEEL) and Sony. The tribunal has however issued notice in the plea and listed the case for hearing on January 8. Axis Finance and IDBI bank had challenged the merger in the NCLAT. During the course of the hearing, Additional Solicitor General (ASG) N Venkatraman, who appeared for IDBI Bank argued that the ZEEL stood guarantee for loans they had given to an Essel entity and they would not be able to recover the loan from ZEEL if the merger progresses. He thus urged the NCLAT to stay the progress of the merger.

Paris. Dec 15: Global coal use is expected to reach a record high in 2023 as demand in emerging and developing economies remains strong, the International Energy Agency (IEA) said in a report Friday.

ployment, weather conditions, and structural shifts in the Chinese economy, the report said.

This year, China, India and southeast Asia are expected to account for three-quarters of global coal consumption, up from a quarter in 1990, with consumption in southeast Asia expected to eclipse the US and EU in 2023, the report said.

Through 2026, India and southeast Asia are the only regions where coal consumption is expected to grow significantly, the report said.

Mumbai, Dec 15: Benchmark equity indices surged more than 1 per cent to hit their new all-time highs Friday, with the Sensex breaching the 71,000 mark, as domestic macroeconomic data and easing concerns over the US economic growth bolstered market sentiment.

Besides, heavy buying in IT, tech and metal counters amid sustained buying by foreign investors helped the domestic equities, traders said.

Rising for the third day running, the 30-share BSE Sensex jumped 969.55 points or 1.37 per cent to settle at its record closing high of 71,483.75. During the day, it surged 1,091.56 points or 1.54 per cent to 71,605.76, its alltime intra-day high level.

As many as 1,969 stocks advanced, while 1,801 declined and 118 remained unchanged.

The Nifty climbed 273.95 points or 1.29 per cent to settle at its new closing high of 21,456.65. During the day, it zoomed 309.6 points or 1.46 per cent to hit its record intra-day peak of 21,492.30.

"The Nifty's upward momentum persists with the bulls maintaining control in the market. Achieving a new all-time high,



the index has marked its seventh consecutive weekly gain," said Rupak De, Senior Technical Analyst, LKP Securities.

On the weekly front, the BSE benchmark jumped 1,658.15 points or 2.37 per cent, while the Nifty climbed 487.25 points or 2.32 per cent.

New Delhi, Dec 15: India's merchandise exports slipped by 2.83 per cent to \$33.90 billion in November while the trade deficit narrowed to \$20.58 billion, according to government data.

Imports also fell by 4.33 per cent to \$54.48 billion in November, the data released by the commerce ministry Friday showed.

Cumulatively, the country's merchandise exports in April-November FY2023-24 contracted by 6.51 per cent to \$278.8 billion.

Imports were also down by 8.67 per cent to \$445.15 billion in the eight-month period due to a fall in oil imports. Oil imports dipped to \$113.65 billion as against \$139.29 billion in April-November 2022-23
