Over 98K posts lying vacant in state depts

Bhubaneswar: A whopping 98,348 posts are lying vacant across various departments of the state government as of January 31, Skill Development and Technical Education (SD&TE) Minister Pritiranjan Gharai told the Assembly, Tuesday. Responding to a query posed by Bolangir MLA Mukesh Mahaling during the Interim Budget session of the House, Gharai went on to highlight vacancies across 41 departments as per the data of the General Administration and Public Grievances (GA&PG) department. Health and Family Welfare department has the highest number of vacancies (26,815), followed by School and Mass Education department (21,844).

Rourkela, Feb 6: Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and Rashtriya Swayam Sevak Sangh (RSS) are spreading hate and injustice in states like Odisha, Jharkhand, West Bengal and the Northeast, charged Congress leader Rahul Gandhi as 'Bharat Jodo Nyay Yatra' he began January 14, 2024 reached Biramitrapur in Sundargarh district from Jharkhand, Tuesday.

Rahul was given a rousing welcome by Odisha Congress leaders at Biramitrapur.

After entering Odisha through Jharkhand border, Rahul held a meeting near Pattalkanah, 2 km away from Biramitrapur.

Addressing the gathering, Gandhi said he has been listening to the people for seven to eight hours during the 'yatra' and addressing them for 15 minutes every day.

The senior Congress leader said his 'Nyay Yatra' is against social injustice towards tribals,

women, Dalits and farmers as well as price rise, unemployment, and privatisation of govt

companies. The first edition of 'Bharat Jodo Yatra' covered about 4.000 km from Kanyakumari to Kashmir in 2022-23 to unite the country, Gandhi said, adding that it was against "hatred and injustice". It was successful as millions of people participated in the 'yatra', he said.

"However, people from other states like Jharkhand, Odisha, West Bengal and the Northeast told me that their states were not covered by the 'yatra'," Gandhi said. The BJP and RSS are spreading hate and injustice in these states too, he claimed.

The 'Bharat Jodo Nyay Yatra' from Manipur to Mumbai was organised following the request of the people of those states, Gandhi said.

The senior Congress leader said the Nyay Yatra seeks justice for the unemployed, tribals, women, Dalits and youths.

OFFERED BISCUIT TO DOG OWNER: RAHUL

Gumla: Rahul Gandhi Tuesday said he offered a biscuit to a dog owner to feed the animal after it refused to eat from his hands and wondered what is the obsession of the BJP with dogs? His remarks came after a video showing him offering a biscuit rejected by a dog to a person went viral on social media, with RIP leaders alleging this is how he treats workers of his party.

"On the way to Odisha, I met a man in Jharkhand who has a land issue. That has been resolved after my intervention,' Gandhi told the gathering.

He said that during the 'yatra' he had also encountered certain complaints from people like corporate bodies taking land of farmers.

"Nafrat ki bazaar me mohabbat ki dukan khulne aya hnu (Want to open the shop of love in the market of hatred)," Rahul said in his brief speech.

Question paper leak to invite ₹1 crore fine

New Delhi, Feb 6: A day after Assam government proposed stringent punishment of up to 10 years of imprisonment and a fine of up to ₹10 crore on anyone found involved in unfair means in recruitment examinations, a Bill seeking to deal sternly with malpractices and irregularities in competitive examinations with provisions for a maximum jail term of 10 years and a fine up to ₹1 crore was passed in the Lok Sabha Tuesday.

However, the Centre has clarified that students and candidates do not fall in the purview of this Bill and there will be no harm to job aspirants.

Public Piloting The Examinations (Prevention of Unfair Means) Bill, 2024, Union Minister Jitendra Singh said its provisions are meant to safe guard the interest of meritori ous students and candidates.

The Bill was passed by Lok Sabha after rejecting amendments proposed by the opposition members.

The move comes against the backdrop of cancellation of a series of competitive tests such as the teacher recruitment exam in Rajasthan, Common Eligibility Test (CET) for Group-D posts in Haryana, recruitment exam for junior clerks in Gujarat and constable recruitment examination in Bihar following question paper

20-YR RI FOR PARI MURDER ACCUSED

Nayagarh, Feb 6: The Special Children's Court here Tuesday handed down 20 years of rigorous imprisonment (RI) to a minor after convicting him in the sensational rape and murder case of 5-year-old girl Pari in this district in 2020.

The judge of the Children's Court-cum-Additional District and Sessions judge Lily Senapati also slapped a penalty of Rs 6,000 on the convict, apart from the punishment.

In default, the convict will have to undergo an additional two years of imprisonment, the judge observed while delivering the order. The convict being a minor was spared from death sentence. The convict will now be sent to a probation home but will be remanded to jail custody once he attains the age of 21. The court passed the order after examining the statements recorded by 31 witnesses, 135 documents and 18 articles used for the heinous crime.

The judge held the accused guilty and convicted him under Sections-363, 376A, 302, 201 of Indian Penal Code (IPC) and Section-6 of Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act. He has been awarded 20 years RI for rape under Section-376 AB IPC and Section-6 of POCSO Act and 20 years punishment for murder

New Delhi, Feb 6: The Rajya Sabha Tuesday passed two Bills which seek to modify the list of Scheduled Castes (SCs) and Scheduled Tribes (STs) in Andhra Pradesh and Odisha.

The Upper House cleared the Constitution (Scheduled Tribes) Order (Amendment) Bill, 2024, and the Constitution (Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes) Order (Amendment) Bill, 2024 by voice vote

The first Bill seeks to modify the list of STs in Andhra Pradesh, while the second one seeks to modify the list of SCs and STs in Odisha

Both the Bills were piloted by Minister of Tribal Affairs Arjun Munda in the upper house.

Replying to the debate, he said both the Bills have been brought with a long-term planning.

In Andhra Pradesh, three more ethnic groups - Bondo Poria, Khond Porja, Parangiperja - are being added to the list of STs while in Odisha it will add four



Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs) and they have been added to the scheduled list after 75 years of independence.

"There are 75 PVTGs which are spread from Andaman Island to the mainland. The government has started a scheme and worked in mission mode with a target to reach them in the farflung area in which they reside,' said Munda.

According to him, the names of such 10 PVTGs were not added in the list of scheduled tribes and they were deprived of conditional rights and faced injustice.

Munda further said he has written letters to the state governments, where the population of PVTGs is on the decline.

Moreover, the government has also launched schemes such as PM-JANMAN (Pradhan Mantri Janjati Adivasi Nyaya Maha Abhiyan) to improve the socioeconomic conditions of the Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups, he said.

Mom's joke pulls out woman from 5-yr coma

Washington, Feb 6: The saying "laughter is the best medicine" virtually translated into a miraculous remedy for a US woman who triumphed over a 5year coma with nothing but laughter. Yes, it's true. Jennifer Flewellen, hailing from Niles, Michigan, met with a car accident in September 2017 that plunged her into an "irreversible coma." However, her healing journey took an extraordinary turn when she woke up laughing in response to her mother's joke, defying the odds after precisely

four years and 11 months. In an interview with People,



Flewellen's mother Peggy Means, said, "When she woke up, it scared me at first because she was laugh-

ing and she had never done that.' Every dream came true. Today's the day I said, 'That door that was closed, that kept us apart, had just opened. We were back," said Means. Now,

Flewellen is working hard to regain her speech and mobility after being in a coma for 5 years. Moreover, a GoFundMe campaign has begun to help her buy a handicap van and home re-

models. "She woke up, but she didn't completely. She couldn't speak, but

she was nodding," Means, 60, told People. "She would still sleep a lot right at first, but then as the months would go by, she would get stronger and be more awake."

One eager commenter pleaded, "Would you share what the joke was? I am desperate to hear it, please." Another chimed in, 'What was the joke, please? I'm dying to know," echoing the sentiments of many.

Flewellen's physician at Michigan's Mary Free Bed Rehabilitation Hospital Dr Ralph Wang said, "This is so rare. Not just waking up, but making progress. Maybe 1-2% of patients wake up and make progress this





5 coastal districts 'sensitive' for hooch, contraband trade

BHUBANESWAR RANKS TOP ON EXCISE DEPARTMENT RADAR FOR NARCOTICS CONSUMPTION

Bhubaneswar, Feb 6: Ahead of the 2024 elections, the state Excise department has categorized five coastal districts as 'sensitive' for trade of illicit liquor and narcotics drugs, while the Capital City of Bhubaneswar ranks the highest for consumption and distribution of contraband in the state.

Excise Commissioner Narasingh Bhol said Cuttack, Balasore and Nayagarh districts have been identified as areas having the highest illicit-alcohol manufacturing units, while Balasore, Puri, Bhadrak, Cuttack and Navagarh have shot to notoriety for trade of brown sugar. "We have marked them as sensitive for the upcoming elections." he said.

The Excise department top official said Bhubaneswar reported the highest in the state for brown sugar peddling, supply and consumption.

While the department has directed the Bhubaneswar Excise Superintendent to undertake enforcement measures and deploy mobile units in the City's slums, plans are afoot to initiate crackdowns against the various syndicates running the operation in the coastal districts

Sources in the Excise department meanwhile, said that a weekly-report detailing the state-wide enforcement drive would be submitted to the State Election Commission (SEC) till the culmination of the Lok



2 held with 400 gm brown sugar

Bhubaneswar: The special anti-narcotics unit of the Commissionerate Police, here, Tuesday claimed to have seized 400 grams of brown sugar, having an estimated street value of ₹40 lakh, and arrested two peddlers in connection with the case.

The accused, Siba Prasad Dash (27) and Jagabandhu Dash (29) hail from Cuttack district. They are suspected to have been sourcing the drugs from Khurdha for trade in the city, said a senior cop.

Minister Tuesday approved a proposal to include four lakh more beneficiaries under the state government's social security scheme, Madhu Babu Pension Yojana (MBPY).

Bhubaneswar, Feb 6: Chief

The state government had received several petitions for adding more MBPY beneficiaries.

Senior citizens, widows, differently-abled persons, unmarried women, AIDS and leprosy patients, divorced women, transgenders, and children orphaned by the Covid pandemic are covered under MBPY.

With Patnaik approving the proposal, the number of beneficiaries under MBPS increased to 36.75 lakh from 32.75 lakh people. The beneficiaries in the age group of five years to 79 years are eligible to get a monthly pension of ₹500. Those above 80 years are paid ₹700 a month, an official release issued by the CMO said.

New Delhi, Feb 6: The Centre has disallowed installation of mobile towers in core or critical tiger habitats in the country, according to new guidelines by the Environment Ministry.

In an order issued in January, the ministry highlighted that the Standing Committee of the National Board for Wildlife (SC-NBWL) has been receiving a large number of proposals for erection of mobile towers and laying of optical fiber cables in national parks, sanctuaries, and tiger reserves and corridors.

It said while providing connectivity to the people residing within or near wildlife-rich areas should be taken on priority, 'the protection and conservation of wildlife habitats should not get

affected' by such installations. The ministry also expressed concern that the mobile connectivity could be misused by offenders of forest and wildlife laws.

"The core/critical tiger habitat, notified under the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972, should be avoided for installation of the tower," read the order issued to the chief wildlife wardens of all states and Union Territories and the Ministry of Communications.

The ministry said any proposal seeking recommendation of the SCNBWL for 4G connectivity in such areas must be accompanied by an undertaking from the District Magistrate concerned indicating non-availability of alternate revenue/private lands.

It should also include drawings/sketches of the location of various components of the proposals within the required land and a plan for movement of the equipment and men for erection of towers and their maintenance, the order said.

The user agency will be required to provide an undertaking that call data records of suspected persons for contravention



of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 will be provided when requested by the officer not below the rank of deputy conservator of forests having jurisdiction over the area.

The ministry also said new towers should not be installed within a radius of one kilometre of the existing towers to prevent overlapping of high radiation fields.

"If new towers are required to be built, these should be erected with utmost care and precautions so as not to obstruct the flight path of birds, and also not to increase the combined radiations from all towers in the area," the ministry said.

It said the location and frequencies of cell phone towers and other such installations emitting electromagnetic radiation should be made available

in the public domain. Location-wise GIS mapping of all cell phone towers should be maintained which would inter alia help in monitoring the population of birds and bees in and around the mobile towers and also in and/or around protected

areas, it said. Jose Louies, the chief of enforcement at the Wildlife Trust

of India, said, "Installing mobile towers in core tiger habitats would mean laying power cables, deploying generator sets and movement of people which could disturb the wildlife. Mobile towers outside the tiger reserves also provide good connectivity."

A tiger reserve includes two parts: core or critical tiger habitat and buffer or peripheral area.

According to the Wildlife Protection Act, 1972, the critical tiger habitats are core areas of the tiger reserves meant to be "kept inviolate for the purpose of tiger conservation".

The buffer area surrounds the core habitat and serves as a transition zone.

While the core habitat remains intact, the buffer area allows for sustainable human activities and coexistence with wildlife.

The number of tigers in India has increased from 2,967 in 2018 to 3,682 in 2022, an annual rise of-6 percent, according to latest government data.

Researchers scanned the brains of nearly 500 bullied teenagers and found lower levels of the neurotransmitter glutamate in the region known to be crucial to regulate emotions, the anterior cingulate cortex (ACC). Glutamate, usually the most abundant neurotransmitter, is involved in wide-ranging functions, including moderating moods.

The researchers at the University of Tokyo, Japan, also used questionnaires to track bullying victimisation in these adolescents and employed formal psychiatric measurement meth-

ods to assess their experiences. The team found that bullying was associated with the teenagers experiencing preclinical stages of psychosis. They explained that these symptoms 'come close' to psychosis, but do not meet



the full criteria for a clinical diagnosis of psychotic disorders. Some of these disorders include schizophrenia and the manic state of bipolar disorder.

"Studying these subclinical psychotic experiences is important for us to understand the early stages of psychotic disorders and for identifying individuals who may be at increased risk for developing a clinical psychotic illness later on," said Naohiro Okada, project associate professor at the University of Tokyo's International Research Center for Neurointelligence and lead author of the study

published in the journal

Molecular Psychiatry.

While changes in glutamate levels have been implicated in various psychiatric disorders, the researchers said that the link between these changes in the ACC in individuals displaying higher risks of developing psychosis and the effects of bullying in teenagers was unclear.

For measuring the levels of the neurotransmitter glutamate, the team used magnetic resonance spectroscopy, or MRS, a type of radiological imaging applied to depict brain structure and function.

They also measured glutamate levels at a later point, allowing them to assess changes over time, and compare these changes to experiences with bullying or lack thereof, as well as with any intention on the part of those experiencing bullying to seek help.

"First and foremost, anti-bullying programs in schools that focus on promoting positive social interactions and reducing aggressive behaviours are essential for their own sake and to reduce the risk of psychosis and its subclinical precursors.

"These programs can help create a safe and supportive environment for all students, reducing the likelihood of bullying and its negative consequences, said Okada.

Other potential interventions like counselling services, peer support groups and other mental health resources can help adolescents cope with the negative effects of bullying and develop resilience, he said.

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Sukinda Seed Farm faces closure

More than 3,000 workers rendered jobless after unit stops production

Jajpur, Feb 6: The Sukinda Seed Farm at Damodarpur under Sukinda block in this district is on the verge of closure due to alleged administrative and political negligence, sources said here Tuesday. The farm touted as Asia's largest seeds production centre was established in 1948 by the Odisha government over 1,437 acres of land. The idea benames from muster rolls and hind setting up the unit was to deprived them of employees' provide quality seeds to farmers provident funds (EPF). Some of the leaders of the labour group of the state. were implicated in false cases

Trouble started for the organisation after the state Agricultural department and the Odisha Seeds Corporation jointly signed an MoU with the National Seeds Corporation (NSC) for privatisation of the farm, July 23, 2016. After the MoU, the state government handed over its farmlands to the NSC. However, NSC without paying any heed to the needs of the farmers launched paddy and Arhar (pulses) cultivation on

Labourers working on the

seeds farm demanded work from the NSC but the latter refused to listen. It handed over the farm to 'Gobind Engineering', a Jharkhand-based consultancy agency. Later, the agency stopped all agriculture and cultivation activities in the farm and labourers were rendered jobless. The private agency allegedly did not pay even minimum wages to labourers. It even struck off their

forcing them to flee. After losing their jobs, the labourers have been driven to penury. Many of them have migrated to other states to earn a living. An effort to revive the seeds farm was launched by the Odisha government. However, it soon fizzled out and since then the farm has been lying unattended

Sources said that the seeds farm since its establishment was engaged in cultivation of crops like paddy, green grams (moongs), black grams, pearl millet (bajra), horse grams, groundnuts, pumpkins, jute, dhaincha, maize, mustard and various other types of seeds. Approximately 3,000 persons from villages like Kuhika, Damodarpur, Pimpudia, Bandhgaon and Manatira were working in the farm and earning their livelihoods. Many of those who worked at the farm were women. However, now everyone is looking at a bleak future, sources pointed out.

Sources informed that the Odisha government had signed an agreement to hand over 108.06 hectares to the NSC. However, the NSC in connivance with influential persons in the area has acquired a sal forest, all buildings and infrastructure that belonged to the farm.

At a meeting of the trust board of the district mineral foundation (DMF), April 6, 2021 a decision was taken to plant 1,03,400 guava trees on the farm lands. The Odisha Mineral Bearing Areas **Development Corporation** (OMBDC) also sanctioned ₹9.75 crore for the purpose. The district Horticulture department also planted guava trees with funds worth ₹76.6 lakh sanctioned in the first phase. The project was estimated to return ₹2.5 crore as profits in five years. However, the project got scuttled after a case was filed in the NGT alleging violation of norms in use of forest land as non-forest land.

Two women Maoists surrender in Boudh

Boudh, Feb 6: Two women Maoists surrendered Tuesday before the police in this district after allegedly being sexually assaulted in camps of the red rebels, a senior officer said here. IGP (Southern Range) Jai Narayan Pankaj said the two Maoists who surrendered hail from Bijapur district in neighbouring Chhattisgarh.

Pankaj told reporters that the two Maoists were associated with the Kandhamal-Kalahandision of the outlawed CPI (Maoist)

outfit. He added the surrendered Maoists had joined the banned outfit in 2018.

Informing that the KKBN division is active in this and Kandhamal districts, Pankaj were involved in various acts of violence. He said the women would receive benefits available for surrendered Maoists

The former women Maoists claimed they were recruited in the banned outfit to sing songs but were used in various 'activities', Pankaj said. Both were frustrated by the 'continuous unethical activities' in the Maoist outfit, including sexual harassment of female cadres, extortion through intimidation and induction of boys and girls in the ises, he said.

The two who laid down arms also strongly resented the highhandedness of senior Maoist leaders who allegedly behaved rudely with the juniors and new cadres, the officer said. One of the surrendered Maoists has said she had 'problems with activities in the organisation that were against Maoist ideology', he added.

Appealing to Maoists to shun violence and return to the mainstream, Pankaj said they would get a suitable rehabilitation package and get a chance to restart

20 yrs RI for Pari 2 ELEPHANT TUSKS SEIZED, 10 HELD murder convict

Nayagarh, Feb 6: The Special Children's Court here Tuesday handed down 20-years of rigorous imprisonment to a minor after convicting him in the sensational rape and murder case of five-year old girl Pari in this district. The judge of the Children's-cum-Additional District and Sessions Court, Lily

Senapati also slapped a penalty

of ₹6,000 on the convict, apart from the punishment. In default. the convict will have to undergo an additional two years of imprisonment, the judge observed while delivering the order. The

convict being a minor was spared from death sentence.

The convict will now be sent to a probation home but will be remanded to jail custody once he attains the age of 21. The court passed the order after examining the statements recorded by 31 witnesses, 135 documents and 18 articles used for the heinous crime.

The judge held the accused guilty and convicted him under Sections-363, 376A, 302, 201 of Indian Penal Code (IPC) and Section-6 of POCSO Act. He has been awarded 20 years rigorous imprisonment (RI) for rape under Section-376 AB IPC and Section-6 of POCSO Act and 20

years punishment for murder under Section 302 IPC. Special Public Prosecutor Chitta Ranjan Kanungo appearing for the state Crime Branch said that conviction terms shall run con-

The incident had rocked the state. Five-year-old Pari went missing while playing in front of her house in Jadupur village in this district, July 14, 2020. The decomposed body and skeletal re-

mains of the kid were recovered inside a gunny bag from a pond in the backyard of her house, nine days missing, July 23, 2020. The incident triggered widespread outrage among the people

in the state. The Odisha government ordered for a probe by the state Crime Branch after the local police failed to crack the case.

The Crime Branch formed a special investigation team (SIT) under the leadership of IG. Arun Bothra. The SIT conducted a probe and arrested the accused in this connection. Forensic and electronic evidences were collected during the probe while psychological experts were pressed into service as there were no eye-witnesses. Later, the SIT submitted the chargesheet following a detailed investigation. The Odisha High Court monitored the case during the investigation by SIT.

Baripada. Feb 6: Acting on tip-off, a special team of Forest department personnel belonging to Similipal Tiger Conservation project in Mayurbhanj district seized Tuesday two elephant tusks weighing around 30kg and arrested 10 persons for their involvement in illegal ivory trade. The matter came to the fore after PCCF Susant Nanda posted about the seizure of the elephant tusks and the arrests of 10 persons in his 'X' handle. A press release on the matter was also issued by Samrat Gouda, deputy director of Similipal Tiger Conservation project.

village under Bisoi police limits. The Forest personnel achieved the breakthrough after

Lecturer held for molesting student

The accused had sent the girl and two of her friends to clean the laboratory December 24. The traumatised girl then fled the spot. However, the matter did not end there as the accused continued to molest and sexually assault the student for some more days. 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Snake conservation awareness programme held at Sonapur beach

Berhampur, Feb 6: A dedicated effort to raise awareness about snake conservation took place at the newlydesignated 'Blue Flag Beach', the Sonapur beach in Ganjam district Tuesday, under the leadership of snake rescuer Ganapati Sahu. With a steadfast commitment spanning 15 years, Sahu has been independently rescuing snakes in Ganjam district through his organisation, the 'Wild Animals Protection Force Ganjam'. This initiative was conducted in collaboration with 'Pati Sonapur Blue Flag Beach' and 'Jungle Lore Foundation'.

The programme witnessed the participation of more than 50 individuals from the local community, including youths, fishermen, women



and tourists. Wildlife expert Asish Kumar Dash, along with wildlife scholar Akash Ranjan Rath, served as resource persons, enlightening the audience about the diversity. threats and the crucial role of community in snake conservation.

Distinguished climate activists such as Soumya Ranjan Biswal, IVLP Alumna climate activist Sagar Kumar Patro and Sibaram Panigrahi, president of 'Sabuja Bahini Group' lent their support by encouraging local youths to champion the cause.

During the event, pamphlets were distributed among participants and tourists, providing information about snakes, mitigation measures, and how to assist local snake rescuers and Forest departments in saving these reptiles in the region.

Highlighting the urgency of such initiatives, recent statistics revealed a concerning trend in snakerelated fatalities in the state. Between 2018-19 and 2022-23, a total of 4.870 human deaths were recorded, with 1,026 fatalities in 2018-19, 929 in 2019-20, 1,185 in 2020-21, 954 in 2021-22, and 754 in 2022-23. Speakers on the occasion said that a concerted effort must be made to promote harmony between snakes and human beings in the district and other parts of Odisha.

The arrest on 31 January evening and subsequent remand of now former Jharkhand Chief Minister Hemant Soren in Enforcement Directorate (ED) custody had come at a time when BJP had already succeeded in its "tod jore" (break and join) politics in the adjacent state of Bihar, wrecking an I.N.D.I.A alliance government and replacing it with one of its own bloc. Now the ED, as usual, seems hyperactive in getting in its net another Chief Minister – Arvind Kejriwal – of Delhi. All this is happening when the country is getting ready for the Lok Sabha polls a few months away. These developments are disturbing enough and pose a threat to democracy since Oppositionruled states are being targeted in a controversial manner. At the very outset everyone has to accept, no matter which political party is concerned, there is no single party existing today of any worth that does not collect funds for organizational work and elections. Every single party boss past, present and in future will mandatorily have to 'amass wealth beyond justifiable means' to operate a vast political machine at a state or national level. It is not as if those in power at the Center currently are not funding the functioning of their huge party or are refraining from doling out massive amounts of money to their candidates in Assembly and Parliament elections. Just that there is, at present, no superior authority in the Indian administrative system that would dare to identify, investigate and penalize those currently ruling the country.

For someone like Soren or Kejriwal, it is predictable that they would plead not guilty and complain of being made victims of political mischief as they both and their respective parties are trying to make out of the cases that have been launched against them. Yet, the timing and the manner in which Central agencies are going after Opposition leaders does raise suspicion of abuse of power for grabbing power.

Soren was arrested after a seven-hour grilling by the ED in connection with a money-laundering case linked to an alleged land fraud. This is suspected to be a pattern being followed by the agency to corner Opposition politicians apparently at the behest of their political masters. For this reason, it seems, Kejriwal is avoiding the ED like plague. He has, so far, refused to appear before it for the fifth time forcing the agency to move a Delhi court against him for skipping five summons in connection with what is now known as the Delhi liquor policy case. The court heard some submissions and put up the rest of the matter for "submissions and consideration" 7 February.

In the case of Soren, ED stated that land parcels spanning 8.5 acres were part of the criminal proceeds that the former CM allegedly acquired. ED stated that in a raid conducted 13 April, 2023, they unearthed several property-related records and registers. It said the whole criminal act was engineered by a "very large syndicate."

Soren had no option but to be arrested and tender his resignation as CM, leaving the charge to one of his trusted ministers. His last ditch attempt to get relief from Supreme Court failed as the apex court asked him to approach the concerned High Court with his petition. He had challenged ED's summons issued 22 January and 25 January contending that they were illegal, null and void.

It is for the judiciary to go into these allegations, but the arrest gives rise to more important questions. There is no denying the fact that the ED, under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) is vested with sweeping powers of arrest. Barriers for bail are very high in PMLA cases. The Supreme Court upheld these powers in a judgement in July, 2022. But petitions challenging the judgement are still pending before it. When the powers are used to target a Chief Minister, it does appear that it is not merely a routine case of law enforcement.

However, public perception of some Opposition leaders' conduct is by no means flattering for which the leaders themselves are responsible. In Jharkhand alone since its formation 15 November, 2000, the state has seen six chief ministers and three President's rule terms. In fact, Hemant became the third state CM to be arrested. Before him, his father Shibu Soren and Madhu Koda had been arrested. Only one CM, Raghubar Das of BJP, managed to complete his full term from 2014 to 2019 and is now Governor of Orissa.

Koda was imprisoned for corruption during his tenure from 2006 to 2008. He formed a government in alliance with the UPA. He was allegedly involved in a mining scandal and was accused by the CBI and ED of taking bribes for allocating coal and mining blocks during his tenure as CM. After his arrest in 2009, Koda was released on bail in 2013. In 2017, he was convicted and sentenced to three years in prison with a Rs 25 lakh fine.

It is an open secret how Central agencies are deployed by ruling parties to achieve their political ends. If Opposition leaders by their acts of commission and omission give their opponents a handle to go after them, they are more to blame than anybody else. The BJP has made a political necessity out of it by either getting such politicians into its fold and whitewashing their alleged offences to form a new government or hounding them out and coming to power with breakaway groups.

This is an unhealthy trend that will not end soon but will keep viti-

ating the country's political system.

A STRUCTURAL PROBLEM

suicide note in Kota shook up the nation. A young girl says sorry to her parents, for letting them down. She died of not a broken heart, but of a broken spirit. The inhuman competition, and the burden of expectations was just too much for a teenager of tender age. It does us no good to blame the parents, for all they wanted was a better future for their child. They might have mortgaged their family wealth, although that just increases the burden on the child. It does not help to blame the regimented system of Kota coaching centres, which has already snuffed out twentyfive young lives, just last year.

Kota has already switched to suicide watch mode, alarmed by an increase in suicides and attempted suicides. Hostels fitted with spring loaded fans to prevent death by self-hanging, or high-rise buildings with antisuicide steel nets and special police cells for suicide counselling, have all been in place for some time now. Yet enrolment in Kota has doubled in the last three years. More than 2,00,000 aspirants clock up to 18 gruelling hours of study, seven days a week. Such is the power of the lure of the lottery that are these entrance exams called JEE and NEET. Let us not forget, it is a lottery whose odds are terribly stacked against the ap-

The Union government has proposed guidelines to regulate the coaching centres which form an industry on their own. There are an estimated 30,000 coaching institutes and they also have their own national federation and industry body. In a place like Kota which is India's most famous coaching cluster, there is a local thriving economy of paying guest accommodation, food delivery service, dummy schools and colleges, transport and other services. It is estimated that the annual turnover of all coaching centres exceeds the annual budgets of all IIT and AIIMS taken together! So, the new regulations will affect this industry adversely. The new proposed rules prohibit the in-

stitutes from registering any student who is less than sixteen years old. It also mandates that fees should be reasonable (which means price control), and that coaching centres look after the physical and mental health of their students.

Most members of the Coaching Federation of India are upset because their catchment starts in class five or six. Many parents plan for engineering. medicine careers for their kids, or even for civil services much in advance of class eleven or twelve. So, this catchment will no longer be available to the coaching institutes. The other problem is that enforcement of the rules will be difficult given the spread of coaching classes across the country. This is not to deny that some sort of regulation is certainly needed Whether that is best served by self-regulation of the industry or by the government appointed regulator is the question. Some of the large players in this industry have received substantial investments from private equity or venture funds. It is in their interest to bring some order in the behaviour of all players, and hence self-regulation does have a chance.

But the larger point may be lost in this discussion about regulating a wild industry or in the tragic stories of suicides by young students. The Annual

(ASER) by Pratham, the innovative learning organisation created to improve the quality of education in India, is an excellent source to gauge the depth of the real problem. Their report says that parents pay upward of Rs one lakh even for coaching at the level of class nine. This points to an utter lack of quality of education received from regular schools. It also points to the huge gap between available seats in engineering and medicine which are considered to be of good quality and the number of applicants. In 2024 around 12,31,874 students have registered for JEE Mains and the total number of seats across 23 IITs are 16,232. That is a success ratio of 1.3%, among the most difficult in the entire world. And who is to say, that those ten thousand students after the last rank admitted, are not as good? This story is repeated in NEET, the all India entrance exam for medical seats too. Even for the all India civil services, the applicants to seats ratio is extremely adverse. And many students appear several times, especially for civil services. This is an utter waste of the prime years of their lives.

Status of Education Report

This is a deeply structural problem, and points to a very big weakness of our education system. The 1991 economic reforms were transformational because

it took the nation from one of scarcity, to one of choice and abundance. The dismantling of the licence permit raj, and the free entry of anyone into the manufacturing sector, meant that there was competition for quality and lower price. Across products such as automobiles, white goods, household items and even food products we got used to expecting and getting world class quality products. This extended to services such as telecom, retail, banking, finance and stock markets. But the field of educational services remains shackled by regulation, licensing and rigid legacy practices. Of course, education is constitutionally in the States List, but higher education is influenced by Central government policies too. Much reform has been attempted to unshackle the sector. But the proliferation of what is called the "coaching culture" by the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 and the thriving economy of the coaching industry points to the widening gap between demand and aspirations on one hand, and supply of good educational institutions on the other.

India's richer parents now send their kids abroad, not only for post-graduate studies, but increasingly even for bachelors degrees after class twelve. The steep prices for medical and business degrees are an added factor to choosing an affordable alternative in America, Europe or Australia. India's annual "import" of education, i.e. dollars spent on foreign education is upward of \$30 billion, half of our entire defence budget! Just like Bisleri and the bottled water industry prospered, the booming coaching industry is a manifestation of the scarcity of quality supply that still plagues India's education sector. This supply has to increase vastly both from public and private sources. That is the highest priority to enhance India's human capital, if we want sustained increase in all round wellbeing.

the crime rate is high among young people in some countries, they will tell you that it's because there aren't enough jobs. If these youths were working, they wouldn't have the time to commit crimes.

I've been wondering if the same theory applies to monkeys. If we gave them jobs, would they stop stealing cellphones and purses from tourists?

Depending on where you live, you may not realize how much crime is committed by monkeys. Here is a fact that might surprise you: According to scientists, the average monkey is 10,000 times more likely to steal an object from a tourist than the av-

erage cow. Yes, in many countries around the world, monkeys are the leading criminals among all animals that do not drive getaway cars. But the only monkeys we lock up are the innocent ones. Just go to any zoo and you'll see dozens of innocent faces and not a lawyer in sight

Meanwhile, the monkeys running loose are committing all

f you ask the experts why kinds of crimes. In some Asian cities, they travel around in gangs, raiding homes and terrorising people. Monkeys have also learned to grab valuables and demand a ransom for their return.

The monkey that stole a woman's phone in Bali, Indonesia, last year was a veteran crook. A video shared on X shows the monkey taking a fruit from the woman but not returning the phone until a second fruit is offered.

A Canadian study conducted

several years ago found that monkeys at Uluwatu temple in Bali target the most valuable items that tourists carry, such as mobile phones, wallets and prescription glasses.

After filming interactions between monkeys and tourists for more than 270 days, researchers determined that the monkeys expected bigger rewards for items of higher value. In one case, it took 17 minutes of negotiation for a tourist to get an item back. Imagine that: a monkey negotiating for 17 minutes. I wish I could have hired that monkey when I was negotiating the price of my car.

The monkeys of Bali learn to rob and bargain during their juvenile years, according to the study, which was published in Philosophical Transactions of the Royal Society. "These behaviours are socially learned and have been maintained across generations of monkeys for at least 30 years in this population," Dr. Jean-Baptiste Leca, an associate professor in the psychology department at the University of Lethbridge in Canada and lead author of the study, told The Guardian newspaper.

If monkeys can learn to commit crimes, they can certainly learn to be productive members of society I would love to hire one of these monkeys, but I'm not sure how to go about it. Here are just three of the questions I have:

1. Is there a minimum wage for monkeys? I'm willing to pay as much as two bananas per hour. I might even go as high as three bananas per hour if the monkey has any column-writing skills.

2. Is it okay to expect a monkey to work on Sundays? The monkeys in Bali do not take Sundays off, as far as I know. When you're paid in food, can you really afford to take any days off?

3. If monkeys are gainfully employed, do they have to pay taxes? It's only fair that they do, but I might have to hire a tax accountant to figure out exactly how many bananas to mail to the government.

Courts facing complex time due to AI: Delhi HC judge

New Delhi, Feb 6: Delhi High Court Justice Anish Daval Tuesday said the courts are facing a complex and difficult time with the advent of artificial intelligence (AI) as the judges may not be able believe the evidence presented before them.

Speaking at the 3rd IP Excellence Awards and Global IP conclave 'Envisioning India's IP - Innovation Ecosystem for Viksit Bharat', organised by AS-SOCHAM, Justice Dayal said "With the advent of AI, we are standing at the threshold of a very interesting, complex and difficult time where we may not be able to believe the evidence which is presented before us.'

A statement issued by ASSOCHAM further quoted Justice Dayal as saying that instituting Intellectual Property (IP) division was a completely new era in IP adjudication as the Intellectual Property Appellate Board (IPAD) was abolished in 2021. "The Delhi High

Court February 28, 2022 instituted the first intellectual property division putting an end to a long hiatus of lack of clarity. The IP rules allow us to have technical advisors advising us, which is an extremely innovative system. The IPD of the Delhi High Court has adopted modern methods such as hot tubbing, confidentiality club and video

and transcription," he said. The judge said in the first year itself, 1000 cases related to all elements of intellectual property rights (IPR) were filed and in 2023, 1300 cases were filed comprising about 750 civil suits,

300 trademark rectifications and 51 patent appeals, the statement added.

As a responsible adjudication institution with a clear eye on disposals, out of the 1300 cases, 1352 were disposed of in 2023 reducing the pendency, Justice Dayal said. He added that the setting up of the IP division by the Delhi High Court was noticed by the parliamentary committee which said IPAD does not need to come back. Rebuild another mosque, demand locals

New Delhi, Feb 6: A week after the Delhi Development Authority (DDA) razed a 600-year-old mosque in Sanjay Van in south Delhi's Mehrauli, locals have demanded that the agency rebuild another mosque at the same site.

The DDA has defended its action before the high court on the ground that the demolition took place pursuant to the recommendations of the Religious Committee dated January 4.

The residents claimed a cemetery was also demolished during the drive.

Fauzan Ahmed Siddiqui, a member of the management committee of Dargah Qutub Sahan in Mehrauli, said that nobody the area where the mosque, madrasa and cemetery were demolished has been barricaded

and no one is allowed to go inside. The Delhi High Court Monday asked the Delhi Development Authority (DDA) to maintain status quo with respect to the land in Mehrauli where a mosque, stated to be over six

last month. The court, while listing the matter for further hearing February 12, stated that the DDA shall maintain status quo over the site where the Akhoondji mosque was located.

Regarding the recommendation from the Religious Committee, Siddiqui said the (DDA) should have gone to the court for a decision on the matter. He demanded that people be allowed to enter the cemetery area. "If someone dies today, where do we take him? There is already a lack of a cemeteries. The madrasa, graveyards and



the mosque were demolished without giving any prior inti-mation," he said. "It is being told that a notice was received from the revenue department January 2. The religious committee meeting was held January 4 and later no one received any notice. They came and gave a notice one hour before the demolition and told the people present there to remove their

belongings," he added. Israr Ali, general secretary of Akhoondji mosque, said the property is in the gazette of Waqf

"The Waqf board has board. this property in its gazette. There were around 25 children in the madrasa who have been shifted to nearby madrasas. In 1994, the mosque came under Sanjay Van protected area which covers 738 acres of land,"Ali said.

Siddiqui, however, said, "If there was encroachment, it does not mean that you will raze the entire mosque. Encroachment had to be removed. There is a difference between an encroachment and a structure. We demand that the demarcation

should be done along with the fencing. The cemetery should be opened and the mosque should be rebuilt at that place and given protection by the Waqf board,"

he said in a statement. Siddiqui added that the Akhoondji mosque was very old and renovated around 100 years ago. Nasir Ali, who is digging graves at the cemetery since 1976, alleged, "The demolition took place around 5 am. There were several orphan children who lived in the madrasa. They were made to stand outside. The officials took away the mobile phone of the Imam during the drive." The high court's order on Monday came on a plea by the managing committee of the Delhi Waqf Board which has argued that the demolition of the mosque

was illegal. The waqf counsel urged the court to direct maintenance of status quo on the site.

The decision to raze the mosque, DDA stated, was taken after the Religious Committee afforded an opportunity of hearing to the CEO of Delhi Waqf Board.

Budget session extended by a day

Four women labourers killed

Rampurhat (WB): Four women lahourers were killed and several others injured after a mini-truck rammed into a motor van in West Bengal's Birbhum district Tuesday, police said. The accident took place at Munsuha More on National Highway - 14 in the district's Rampurhat area, the police said, adding, three women died on the spot, while the fourth woman was declared dead at the hospital. The speeding mini-truck hit the motor van, which was carrying 15 people, from behind and its riders fell on the road. The vehicle, while fleeing the spot, crushed three women labourers under its wheels, and they died on the spot, a police officer said.



Dehradun, Feb 6: The Uttarakhand government Tuesday tabled in the Assembly the Uniform Civil Code bill, the first such move in any state after Independence that could be followed by similar legislation in other BJP-run states.

The hill state's small tribal community is exempted from the proposed law, which also mandates registration of live-in relationships. Children born of live-in relationships will be considered legitimate and deserted women will be entitled to maintenance from their partners.

Coming just ahead of the Lok Sabha elections, the Uniform Civil Code, Uttarakhand, 2024 bill ticks off an important item on the BJP's ideological agenda – a common law on marriage, divorce, land, property and inheritance for all citizens, irrespective of their religion.

The bill stipulates a penalty of up to a month in prison or a fine of Rs 10,000, or both, if the partners do not submit a statement on their relationship to the registrar within a month.

ED conducts searches in WB

Kolkata, Feb 6: The Enforcement Directorate (ED) Tuesday carried out simultaneous searches at multiple places in West Bengal, including residences of some state officers, in connection with its investigation into alleged embezzlement of MGNREGA funds, officials said.

The ruling Trinamool Congress denounced the searches as "vendetta politics" and a "desperate manoeuvre" by the BJP to divert attention from the TMC's ongoing dharna demanding clearance of the state's dues, while the saffron party asserted that central agencies such as the ED act independently but it welcomes the action.

The ED was conducting searches at the residence of a West Bengal Civil Services (WBCS) officer in Salt Lake's IA Block. He was earlier posted as a block development officer in Dhaniakhali in Hooghly district, they said. ED officer said that he was not in his residence when they reached. "We are trying to locate him." he said.

New Delhi, Feb 6: The **Enforcement Directorate** Tuesday searched premises of Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal's personal assistant Bibhav Kumar and others as part of its probe into charges that the AAP and some officials received kickbacks of about Rs 21 crore through alleged irregularities in a Delhi Jal Board contract, official sources said.

The action is part of a money laundering investigation focusing on alleged bribes that were garnered through irregularities in the Delhi Jal Board (DJB) tendering process and purportedly channelled as election funds to the AAP, they said.

A dozen premises in the national capital were searched by the federal agency's officials from 7 am under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA). The residences of Bibhav Kumar, former DJB member Shalabh Kumar, the office of party Rajya Sabha member and national treasurer N D Gupta, and the premises of chartered accountant Pankaj Mangal and others associated with the ruling party in Delhi were covered in the search action.

In response to the raids, Delhi minister Atishi accused the authorities of attempting to "intimidate" the AAP. These searches are related to the investigation concerning alleged irregularities in the tendering process of the DJB, for which the ED had arrested retired Jal Board chief engineer Jagdish Kumar Arora and contractor Anil Kumar Aggarwal January 31.

Following the ED's assertion that further custodial interrogation was necessary to uncover a "larger conspiracy," a special PMLA court had extended their remand by five days Monday.

The money laundering case originated from a CBI FIR that alleged corruption and bribery in the DJB of the Delhi government. The FIR alleged that Arora awarded contracts to NKG Infrastructure Ltd. for a total cost of Rs 38 crore, despite the company's "failure" to meet the technical eligibility criteria.

ED officials claimed that NKG Infrastructure Ltd. secured the bid by submitting forged documents. The probe further indicated that the contract was inflated, allowing kickbacks to be collected from the contractors.



factory, and his son had come there to deliver food to him. "My son Ganesh handed me lunch just as the first explosion occurred. He was running ahead, but I have not been able to find him so far," he said, looking visibly distressed.

Raju said more than 150 people worked at the factory and he was lucky to escape unhurt. Another factory worker, Rukhsar Bano, who sustained injuries, said the ground shook at the time of the first blast. "When we heard the blast, we ran frantically and came out of the building. There was fire all around," she said.

"The building has three to four floors and different workers were assigned on each floor.

Women and children were on my floor. My colleague's three children are missing. I saw some children and other people lying dead," Bano claimed. Eyewitnesses claimed that materials in the unit were blown to bits in the explosion and some of them hit vehicles were passing by the site. Some people shot videos of the fire even as they were fleeing, while some caught a glimpse of the site from the roofs of houses. Several houses located near the factory were also damaged, local residents said. Though the area was not densely populated, there were 30 to 40 houses in the vicinity and the ill-fated factory was mostly surrounded by open

New Delhi, Feb 6: India has decided to fence the entire 1.643km-long India-Myanmar border, Union Home Minister Amit Shah announced Tuesday.

The move could virtually put an end to the Free Movement Regime (FMR) prevalent along the porous border. The FMR allows people residing close to the India-Myanmar border to venture 16 km into each other's territory without any document.

The 1,643-km-long India-Myanmar border, which passes

Lucknow, Feb 6: A Varanasi court Tuesday fixed February 15 for the hearing of a petition seeking a survey of all closed basements in the Gyanvapi mosque complex by the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI). According to the petition, there are "secret cellars" inside the basements and it is necessary to survey them to reveal the entire truth of the Gyanvapi mosque, which Hindus claimed was built on the remains of a pre-existing temple.

Mohan Yadav, said acting District Judge Anil Kumar has fixed February 15 as the next date of hearing on the petition. He said that on the petition of Rakhi Singh, lawyers said that there are eight basements in the Gyanvapi complex which have not been surveyed earlier. According to Yadav, though the district court had ordered an ASI survey of the entire Gyanvapi mosque complex except for "wazu khana", it could not be carried out in eight basements which were locked due to protest from the Muslim side. The lawyers for the Gyanvapi mosque management committee expressed their objection to the demand for a survey.

Colombo: The cash-strapped Sri Lankan government has reserved Rs 10 billion to hold the two major elections, including the presidential election this year. A Cabinet note on the two major elections - the Presidential and parliamentary polls - came as no action has been taken to hold the local council elections postponed since March of last year. The Cabinet note released after Monday's meeting said: "The Cabinet of Ministers considered that an allocation of rupees 10 billion has been made by the budget estimated for the year 2024, within the financial stamina of the government and those provisions have to be managed for covering the expenditure of the Presidential election and general election". The local election to appoint over 300 local councils was postponed as the government did not release the funds citing the economic crisis mitigation measures taken at the time. At least four court cases remain pending on the issue as the government reported to the court that it was unable to provide funds due to the economic crisis.

Iran waives visa requirement for **Indian tourists**

New Delhi, Feb 6: Indian tourists do not need a visa for visiting Iran with a new policy coming into effect from February 4, according to a statement issued by the Embassy of Iran here Tuesday.

"Individuals holding ordinary passports will be allowed to enter Iran without a visa once every six months, with a maximum stay of 15 days," the Embassy said in a statement.

The visa-free entry applies only to individuals entering Iran for tourism purposes. Indians who visit Iran for business or educational purposes would have to apply for visa under the respective categories. Those who want to visit Iran more than once within the six-month time span will have to obtain a visa.

The statement also made it clear that the visa-free entry would be applicable only to those Indian tourists who arrive in Iran by air.

Those coming to Iran via the land route through Turkey, Afghanistan, Pakistan or any neighbouring nation would not be allowed to enter without a prior visa.

Court rejects Trump's immunity claim

Washington, Feb 6: A federal appeals panel ruled Tuesday that Donald Trump can face trial on charges that he plotted to overturn the results of the 2020 election, rejecting the former president's claims that he is immune from prosecution.

The decision marks the second time in as many months that judges have spurned Trump's immunity arguments and held that he can be prosecuted for actions undertaken while in the White House and in the run-up to January 6, 2021, when a mob of his supporters stormed the US Capitol. But it also sets the stage for additional appeals from the Republican expresident that could reach the US Supreme Court.

The trial was originally set for March, but it was postponed last week and the judge didn't immediately set a new date. "We conclude that the interest in criminal accountability, held by both the public and the Executive Branch, outweighs the potential risks of chilling Presidential action and permitting vexatious

litigation," the judges wrote. The trial date carries enormous political ramifications, with the Republican primary frontrunner hoping to delay it until



after the November election. If Trump defeats President Joe Biden, he could presumably try to use his position as head of the executive branch to order a new attorney general to dismiss the federal cases or he potentially could seek a pardon for himself.

The appeals court took centre stage in the immunity dispute after the Supreme Court last month said it was at least temporarily staying out of it, rejecting a request from special counsel Jack Smith to take up the matter quickly and issue a speedy ruling. The legally untested question before the court was whether former presidents can be prosecuted after they leave office for actions taken in the White House related to their official duties.

The Supreme Court has held that presidents are immune from civil liability for official acts, and Trump's lawyers have for months argued that that protection should be extended to criminal prosecution as well.

They said the actions Trump was accused of in his failed bid to cling to power after he lost the 2020 election to Biden, including badgering his vice president to refuse to certify the results of the election, all fell within the "outer perimeters" of a presA three-judge panel of the US Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit rejected Trump's claim that he cannot be prosecuted because the allegations relate to his official responsibilities as President

ident's official acts. But Smith's team has said that no such immunity exists in the US Constitution or in prior cases and that, in any event, Trump's actions weren't part of his official duties.

US District Judge Tanya Chutkan, who is presiding over the case, rejected Trump's arguments in a December 1 opinion that said the office of the president "does not confer a lifelong get-out-of-jail-free' pass". Trump's lawyers then appealed to the DC appeals court, but Smith asked the Supreme Court to weigh in first, in hopes of securing a fast and definitive ruling and preserving the March 4 trial date.

The high court declined the request, leaving the matter with the appeals court.

Pak may suspend internet services on election day

Islamabad, Feb 6: The caretaker government in Pakistan will consider shutting down the internet connections on the polling day Thursday only if there is a request from a district or a province, interim Interior Minister Dr Gohar Ejaz said Tuesday.

'So far, there has been no decision made regarding the suspension of internet services at any place. The caretaker government will consider shutting down the internet connections only if there is a request," The News International newspaper reported, quoting him as saying. Ejaz was addressing a press conference along with the caretaker Information Minister Murtaza Solangi.

Ejaz's announcement is important as just a day earlier, Solangi had turned down the possibility of an internet shutdown February 8.

"Local administrations have the authority to decide on an internet shutdown in light of the law and order situation, however, no such situation hasso far been reported," Solangi had said Monday.



The net profit base in the year-ago quarter was higher as the company had gains on sale of 49 per cent equity stake held in Britannia Dairy Private to French cheese maker Bel SA.

Nykaa profit almost doubles

New Delhi: Lifestyle e commerce platform Nykaa Tuesday reported a 97.55 per cent rise in its consolidated profit to ₹16.18 crore for the December 2023 guarter. The company's profit (attributable to equity shareholders of parent) stood at ₹8.19 crore in the corresponding quarter of the previous year. Its revenue from operations rose 22.28 per cent to ₹1.788.79 crore in the quarter under review from ₹1,462.82 crore a year ago, according to a regulatory filing. A company statement said that the EBITDA (earnings before interest, taxes. depreciation, and amortisation) margin expanded to 5.5 per cent for the quarter, marking an annual growth of 26 per cent. driven by direct and indirect cost efficiencies.

JK Tvre net jumps 3-fold

New Delhi: JK Tyre & Industries Tuesday said its consolidated net profit surged over three-fold to ₹227 crore for the third quarter ended December 31, 2023, riding on the back of robust sales. The tyre major had reported a net profit of ₹67 crore in the October-December quarter of last fiscal. Revenue from operations rose to ₹3,688 crore for the period under review as against ₹3,613 crore in the year-ago period, JK Tyre & Industries said in a regulatory filing. The company's board declared an interim dividend of Re 1 per share having face value of ₹2 per share, it added. "We remain committed to achieving profitable growth centered on product premiumisation, volume expansion, and optimizing our product mix," JK Tyre Chairman and Managing Director Raghupati Singhania said.

Walmart, Google swoop in amid Paytm crackdown

Paytm app downloads fell 20% last week, while rival apps including Walmart's PhonePe and Google Pay recorded an average 52% growth

Bangalore, Feb 6: Hit by a regulatory crackdown, Paytm is mobilising its sales team to reassure the merchants who use its app to accept digital payments just as Walmart and Google are targeting those same vendors with their rival offerings.

Cash was once king in India, but Paytm is credited with revolutionising India's digital payments market which is set to be worth \$10 trillion by 2026. Backed by SoftBank, and earlier by billionaire investor Warren Buffett and China's Alibaba, it has 100 million monthly users and clocked \$61 billion worth of merchant payments between October and December.

But many merchants are now refusing to deal with Paytm after India's central bank last week asked its banking unit - which mainly powers the popular payments app - to cease most operations from March 1 for 'persistent non-compliance'

In Telangana, around 2,000 shops have put signs saying 'No Paytm, Pay Cash', and some have even covered up the Pavtm QR code which customers scan for payments, said Mohammed Salahuddin, a member of a local retailers association.

"I have decided to avoid using Paytm. Customers have to give cash," he said.

To counter such concerns, the company is sending sales staff directly to customers ranging from roadside snack sellers to big retail outlets to ask them to use Paytm's partner banks so that they can continue to receive payments, more than 40 shopkeepers and several company sales staff said.

'We are receiving a lot of calls from merchants," said a Paytm team leader in Chennai, adding that each salesperson there is



tasked with visiting at least 10 shops daily.

In a statement to Reuters, Paytm said customers continued to use its app, adding it is onboarding more merchants and 'there will be no disruptions' for vendors who 'can seamlessly be transitioned' to other partner banks.

However, with about 15% of Paytm's 40 million merchants needing to be migrated, the company last week said it would be a 'large exercise'.

Very few shopkeepers in India are also tech savvy, which adds to the challenge

The speakers - which give audio alerts to vendors when payments are received - were pioneered by Paytm with its Soundbox that is used by about million Indian merchants.

Neil Shah, director at Counterpoint Research, estimates Paytm's rivals - PhonePe's SmartSpeaker and Google's Soundpod - have around 3 million such devices in India. 'This is where PhonePe and

Google can now hit," he said. "The Soundbox and service from Paytm has been a major stickiness factor for Paytm which contributed to its success.3

High capex, rail corridors to boost **exports: Exporters**

Delhi, Feb 6: Announcements of measures in the interim Budget such as high capex, three major economic railway corridors, and a target to increase seafood exports would help boost the country's overall outbound shipments, exporters say.

Sensex rebounds 454 pts on foreign fund inflows

The Nifty gained 157.70 points or 0.72 per cent to close at 21,929.40, driven gains in BPCL, HDFC Life and HCL Tech.

A rebound in Chinese markets also bolstered the sentiment, analysts said. Chinese markets jumped up to 4 per cent after Monday's steep losses as a state-run investment fund said it would jack up share purchases. Reports also suggested China President Xi Jinping was set to meet with officials to discuss the markets. Among the Sensex firms, HCL

Mumbai. Feb 6: Hiring of whitecollar workers fell 11 per cent on an annual basis in January, while it sequentially rose 1 per cent during the same period, a report said Tuesday.

On a year-on-year basis, the overall hiring in the IT sector declined 19 per cent in January this year. However, healthcare, hospitality and FMCG witnessed annual job growth last month in an otherwise cautious market. according to Naukri JobSpeak Index. The Naukri JobSpeak is a monthly index representing the state of the Indian job market and hiring activity based on new job listings and job-related searches by recruiters on the resume database of Naukri.Com. As per the report, hiring for

MPC starts deliberations; RBI likely to hold rates PRESS TRUST OF INDIA

New Delhi, Feb 6: RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das-headed ratesetting panel Tuesday started its three-day deliberations amid expectations of continued status quo on short-term lending rates as the retail inflation remains near the higher end of the central bank's comfort zone.

For almost a year, the Reserve Bank has kept the short-term lending rate or repo rate stable at 6.5 per cent. The benchmark interest rate was last raised in February 2023 to 6.5 per cent from 6.25 per cent to contain inflation driven mainly by global developments.

The retail inflation in the current financial year has declined after touching a peak of 7.44 per cent in July 2023, it is still high and was 5.69 per cent in December 2023, though within the Reserve Bank's comfort zone of 4-6 per cent

the decision of the Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) Thursday (February 8) morn-

State Bank of India (SBI) in a report said the RBI is expected to continue its pause stance in upcoming policy.

"Strong US non-farm payroll data and wages seem to have pushed back on market expectations for a quick pivot to rate cuts," it said, and added the first rate cut on the table could be from June to August period "looks the best bet now."

The state-owned lender also expects the RBI will continue with the withdrawal of accommodation stance.

SBI further said the CPI is expected to come around 5.4 per cent in 2023-24 and 4.6 per cent to 4.8 per cent in the next fiscal $(2024-\overline{25}).$

The government has mandated the central bank to ensure the retail inflation based on the Consumer Price Index (CPI) remains at 4 per cent with a margin of 2 per cent on either side. The MPC is entrusted with

the responsibility of deciding

the policy reporate to achieve the inflation target, keeping in mind the objective of growth.
In an off-cycle meeting in May

2022, the MPC raised the policy rate by 40 basis points and it was followed by rate hikes of varying sizes, in each of the five subsequent meetings till February 2023. The repo rate was raised by 250 basis points cumulatively between May 2022 and February 2023.

The external members on the panel are Shashanka Bhide, Ashima Goyal, and Jayanth R Varma. Besides Governor Das. the other RBI officials in MPC are Raijy Ranjan (Executive Director) and Michael Debabrata Patra (Deputy Governor).

The data provided by the minister shows that Maharashtra leads with 3,079 EV charging stations followed by Delhi with 1,886, while Karnataka is at the third spot with 1,041 charging

The top three states are followed by: Kerala (852), Tamil Nadu (643), Uttar Pradesh (582), Rajasthan (500), Telangana (481), Gujarat (476) and Madhya Pradesh (341), making up the

The Ministry of Heavy Industries (MHI) has been making consistent efforts for facilitating the promotion of EVs in India. The FAME-II scheme inter-

The guidelines specify a ceiling of ₹2.50 per unit and ₹3.50 per unit of electricity used for slow AC charging of EVs at PCS during the solar and non-solar hours, respectively. Additionally, a ceiling limit

of ₹10 per unit and ₹12 per unit of electricity used for DC fast charging of EVs at PCS during the solar and non-solar hours, respectively, has also been specified.

Average cost of supply (ACoS) by DISCOMs to PCSs during solar hours shall have a rebate of 20 per cent and a surcharge of 20 per cent during all other times.

The Green Energy Open Access Rules, 2022, has been notified with the objective of further accelerating renewable energy adoption, ensuring access to affordable, reliable, sustainableand green energy for all, the minister added.





Hussain lauds 'magical' Bumrah

There was nothing that England batters could do feels former skipper

London, Feb 6: The magical first innings spell by Jasprit Bumrah was the difference between India and England in the just-concluded second Test, according to former England captain Nasser Hussain. He asserted that the visitors were powerless against the Indian pacer's genius.

Bumrah displayed brilliance with the ball to play a key role in the team's series-levelling 106-run win. He picked up nine wickets, six in the first and three in the second and had match figures of nine for 91, a feat which helped him win the player of the match award.

"I think, really, it was just the magic of (Jasprit) Bumrah that was the difference. He got three wickets in the second innings, but it was that incredible spell in the first innings which blew away England for 253 on a really good, flat pitch,



Hussain wrote in his column for 'Sky Sports'.

Hussain felt that England could do nothing but 'doff their cap' to the genius of Bumrah. "Sometimes you can be critical of your own team, look at your performances and say, 'what could we do better?' But sometimes you also have to just doff your cap to the opposition and say they were touched by genius," Hussain wrote.

"That's exactly what happened. That spell from Bumrah in England's first innings was genius. Reverse swing, with

his slightly unorthodox action and the way he leans across to the offside, he creates angles," the former England skipper added.

Bumrah dismissed Joe Root for the eighth time in Test cricket before producing a ripping yorker that bamboozled an in-form Ollie Pope in England's first innings.

"He's all over Joe Root at the moment – he's got him out eight times in Test cricket, and he got Pope with an absolute beauty of an in-swinging yorker. He also bowled Ben Stokes from round the wicket, who dropped his bat in disbelief," Hussain said. Hussain feels England should be prepared for an even stronger hit-back from the hosts in the remaining three Tests.

"It (series) is set up perfectly, with three Tests to play. I think it will be a tight series but England are going to have to expect India to come back even harder," he wrote.

Foden hat-trick sinks Brentford
