Jharsuguda, Feb 8: Congress leader Rahul Gandhi Thursday claimed that Prime Minister Narendra Modi was not born in an Other Backward Class (OBC) family, and he is 'misleading' people by identifying himself as an OBC.

Gandhi, while making a brief speech here on the third and concluding day of his 'Bharat Jodo Nyay Yatra' in the state said, "Modi was born in a family that belonged to the general

"Modi ji has been misleading the people by saying that he is an OBC. He was born in a family of the 'Ghanchi' caste, which was included in the OBC list during the BJP government's tenure in Gujarat in 2000. He changed his caste to OBC after becoming the CM of Gujarat. Therefore, Modi ji is not an OBC by birth," he as-

Gandhi had earlier in his address claimed that Modi belonged to the 'Teli' caste, but later clarified he meant the 'Ghanchi'

The former Congress president also alleged that the PM will never conduct a caste census in the country, without which social justice cannot be achieved.



FINANCE MINISTER PRESENTS ₹1.18L CRORE VOTE-ON-ACCOUNT AS GOVT EXPECTS ECONOMY TO GROW AT 8.5% AGAINST NATIONAL FIGURE OF 7.3%

Bhubaneswar, Feb 8: Noting that Odisha has now become more than a 100 billion dollar economy, Finance Minister Bikram Keshari Arukha Thursday presented an Interim Budget of ₹1.18 lakh crore - for the first four months of the 2024-25 fiscal - in the Assembly that aims at augmenting key sectors like infra, healthcare and education.

The state government has presented a vote-on-account instead of a full Budget in view of the upcoming Lok Sabha and Assembly elections. The government estimated that the total Budget outlay for the next financial year will be ₹2.55 lakh crore, which is about 11 per cent more than the annual Budget of 2023-24.

'Keeping in view the requirement of funds for expenditure on payment of salary, pension, interest payment, repayment of principal, relief, old age pension, scholarship of ST & SC students and other ongoing scheme and programmes, a sum of ₹1,18,000 crore is proposed in the vote-on-account," the minister said in the House.



Of the total ₹2.55 lakh crore provision, ₹1,03,500 crore has been allocated for administrative expenditure, ₹1,40,000 crore for programme expenditure, ₹3,900 crore for disaster management and ₹7,600 crore for transfer to Panchayati Raj Institutions and Urban Local

New Delhi, Feb 8: A 'White Paper' versus 'Black Paper' battle erupted Thursday as the Centre and the Congress unveiled documents and crossed swords over the handling of the economy during the nearly 10 years of the BJP-led NDA rule and the previous 10-year tenure of the Congress-led UPA government.

Tiger found dead in Similipal

BARIPADA: The carcass of a tiger was found in Similipal Tiger Reserve in Mayurbhani district, an official said Thursday, The carcass of the male tiger, around 3.5 years old, was found near a nullah in the core area February 5, the reserve's field director Prakash Chand Gogineni said. During patrolling, forest guards found the carcass, and it is suspected that the death happened two days before being found, he said. "We informed the National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA) and principal chief conservator of forests (PCCF) about the incident February 6," he said. The postmortem examination has been completed. Gogineni said. Samples from the carcass were sent to different laboratories for testing, he said.

Uddhav's aide shot dead

MUMBAI: Shiv Sena (Uddhav Balasaheb Thackeray) leader Abhishek Ghosalkar was shot dead during a Facebook live by local social activist Mauris Noronha in Mumbai. Thursday, police said, adding that Noronha also ended his life by shooting self. Ghosalkar, a former corporator, succumbed to bullet injuries at a hospital in north Mumbai. A viral video of the incident showed Ghosalkar being shot in the abdomen and shoulder as he was live on Facebook with Noronha. Sounds of three other shots being fired are also heard in the clip. Both had 'personal enmity' but the Facebook live was to clarify that they have come together ending their bitterness for the betterment of the IC Colony area in Borivali, an official said.

Radio stn on standby as 200-ft tower stolen





LAccMI: Connecting people, augmenting life & livelihood

n a bid to ensure sustainable, affordable, assured and safe transportation of passengers across rural Odisha, the state government, under the visionary leadership of hon'ble Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik, has launched affordable bus service under Location Accessible Multimodal Initiative (LAccMI).

The state government plans to operate 1,623 buses in rural areas under LAccMI, the ambitious initiative that aims at connecting all gram panchayats, block headquarters, district headquar-

ters, major cities and economic hubs across Odisha.

The hon'ble CM launched the initiative with the flagging off of 36 buses in Malkangiri district on October 12, 2023, in the presence of Chairman 5T

and Nabin Odisha Kartik Pandian. The buses connect all the 111 gram panchayats with the district headquarters. The buses, under the initiative, also ply to Bonda Ghati, the home of PVTG (particularly vulnerable tribal group) people in the dis-

The service was extended to Gajapati district on October 20 when the hon'ble CM flagged off 36 buses in the tribal-dominated district. The buses connect 126 gram panchayats and seven blocks in Gajapati with the district headquarters of Parlakhemundi. At least 69 new bus stops have been built, while 64 have been renovated for the purpose.

LACCMI is likely to transform our rural transport system. The buses will now connect from one village to another, improve social bonding and strengthen the rural economy

The hon'ble CM launched the service in Koraput district on December 14. 63 state-of-the-art buses were flagged off to connect 234 panchayats of the district, benefiting 13 lakh

The affordable bus service was extended to Deogarh, Angul and Dhenkanal districts on January 31. A total of 101 buses—17 in Deogarh, 29 in Angul and 55 in Dhenkanal were made operational in these three districts that will connect 440 panchayats to the block headquarters. It will benefit more than 27 lakh

It was November 1 last year when the hon'ble CM launched the affordable bus service in Kalahandi district. Under the initiative, at least 63 buses rolled out, connecting all the panchayats of the district. November 25, 2023 was an auspicious day for Rayagada residents as they witnessed rolling out of at least 52 LAccMi buses, connecting 182 gram panchayats in the tribal-dominated district. The state government has readied 300 bus stops for the purpose. Under provisions of the scheme, women, students and persons with disabilities will pay Rs 5 bus fare for travelling from their villages to block headquarters. The ambitious bus serv ice was extended to Nabarangpur district on November 30. In

Bhubaneswar, Feb 8: The state government has set an ambitious target for transformation of 1,858 healthcare facilities within a period of five years with an investment of ₹3,389 crore. An outlay of ₹1,314 crore has been proposed for the purpose in the Budget for 2024-25, Finance Minister Bikram Keshari Arukha said.

Similarly, an outlay of ₹5,450 crore has been proposed for Biju Swasthya Kalyan Yojana (BSKY) in the Budget while ₹ 529 crore allocated for Mission Shakti Scooter Yojana, and ₹1,449 crore for disbursement of scholarships to 14.86 lakh ST, SC and OBC students.

The state government has allocated ₹1,050 crore for Skill Development sector and ₹21,004 crore towards infra development, like roads, bridges, airports and railways, including ₹1,000 crore for metro rail - which is 25 per cent higher than the allocations last year, the minister said.

Bhubaneswar, Feb 8: To combat the threat of intestinal worms among children and women, the department of Health and Family Welfare will deworm 12 million children and women across the state during the National

Deworming Day (NDD). The first round of deworming will take place February 10 and the mop-up round will be held February 17 for those who missed the earlier date. Children aged between nine and sixty months will receive age-appropriate vitamin A solution at routine immunisation sites and special village health sanitation and nutrition day during the same period.

Addressing the media here, Bijaya Kumar Panigrahi, Director Family Welfare, informed, "During NDD, the children aged 6 to 19 years and women of reproductive age between 20 and 24 years will be provided with Albendazole tablet while children aged 1 to 5 years will be administered age-appropriate Albendazole suspension at respective schools and anganwadi centres facilitated by teachers. Anganwadi and ASHA workers'

"In some of identified blocks of seven districts i.e. Bolangir, Cuttack, Kalahandi, Kandhamal, Khurda, Nayagarh and Rayagada, where Filariasis doses are administered, the children between 1 and 2 years of age will only be covered under NDD," said Panigrahy.

Bhubaneswar, Feb 8: At least 60 migrant labourers from Odisha have died while working outside the state since 2018, the Assembly was informed Thursday.

While replying to a query of BJP MLA Kusum Tete, Labour and Employees' State Insurance Minister Sarada Prasad Nayak said 5,440 migrant workers have been rescued from other states on the basis of 322 complaints and information received from the labourers in distress from 2018 till now

In case of death or injuries at the workplace, the families of the migrant workers are eligible for compensation, he said.

The minister said that the government has, so far, paid Rs 64.24 lakh to eligible migrant workers as compensation.

During 2023, 1,231 contractors were issued licences for migration of 81.232 workers from Odisha to outside the state, Nayak

The highest number of 54,166 workers from Bolangir district migrated to other states for work in 2023, followed by Nuapada (15,635), Ganjam (3,225), Bargarh (1,150) and Dhenkanal (1,130).

Bhubaneswar, Feb 8: In a first of its kind, cardiologists at the Kalinga Institute of Medical Sciences (KIMS) have performed a complex procedure called MitraClip to clip leaking heart valve of a 70-year-old female pa-

The patient had suffered severe heart failure due to leakage in the mitral valve, one of four valves in the heart that help the blood keep flowing in the right direction. As she was considered 'very high risk' for a surgical valve replacement, the lady was instead recommended the MitraClip method.



"The mitral valve controls blood flow between the lower left heart chamber (ventricle) and the upper left heart chamber (atrium). In case of mitral valve regurgitation, the mitral valve doesn't close properly, causing leakage. This leakage means the heart has to work harder to pump blood through the body, which can cause atrial fibrillation (AFib) or heart failure," explained a doctor from the hos-

Though the MitraClip procedure hadn't been conducted in Odisha before, doctors at KIMS. led by assistant professor Anupam Jena from the Department of Cardiac Science, carried out the procedure, saving the woman's life.

"MitraClip offers significant benefits over open-heart surgery. Patients typically recover more quickly, spending less time

in the hospital and experiencing fewer complications. Patients also report less pain following catheter-based procedures," said the doctor.

The doctor informed that MitraClip is a small device that is used to stop leakage in the mitral valve. "It is placed on the mitral valve in a minimally invasive procedure through a small puncture in the groin. It is also called transcatheter edge-to-edge repair (TEER). No need to open the chest," he said.

Earlier, KIMS had also performed the Transcatheter Mitral Valve Replacement (TMVR) procedure for the first time in the State to repair the damaged valve.

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Wrong injection takes pregnant woman's life

Titilagarh, Feb 8: The death of a woman due to alleged administration of a wrong injection sparked tension Thursday at the Titilagarh Mother and Child Hospital (MCH) in Bolangir district.

The deceased was identified as Binodini Chhatar, 24, wife of Bimal Chhatar of Sihini village under this police limits. The family members blamed the hospital authorities for the death of Binodini. They alleged that she died after being administered a wrong drug through injection.

However, police reached the spot and managed to defuse the situation after holding talks with the irate family members and villagers, informed SDPO Ankita Kumbhar and Titilagarh police station IIC Ababni Sahu. Later, the body was handed over to the family members after conducting a post-mortem.

The irate family members relented after they were handed ₹10.000 from the district Red Cross fund and ₹3,000 under 'Harishchandra Sahayata Yojana' from the local panchayat. Binodini is survived by her two-year-old daughter and her labourer husband. Meanwhile, in a separate development, local sarpanch Birabar Sahu demanded ₹5 lakh financial assistance for the bereaved family from the Chief Minister's relief fund.

Family members informed that Binodini was admitted to the MCH, February 2 where she delivered a stillborn the same day. However, the placenta failed to come out. The next day doctors at the hospital conducted a sur-

Mother-daughter duo killed in road mishap

Angul, Feb 8: Two women were killed Thursday after the car in which they were travelling to Bhubaneswar overturned after being hit from the rear by a speeding car. The mishap took place on Cuttack-Sambalpur old highway near Khandahata ice factory under Sadar police limits in Angul district.

Settler Sanctions

n February 1, US President Joe Biden signed an executive order imposing sanctions on four Israeli settlers in the West Bank, where extremist violence and property destruction have been rising. That comes after five new rounds of sanctions on Hamas since October 7, and after the sanctioning of financial networks funding the Houthis in December.

Biden's historic decision to sanction the private citizens of a close ally reflects both domestic and international political pressure. The administration seems to have recognised that Israeli extremist violence, and the settlements themselves, threaten US strategic interests and the broader liberal international order.

Critics of Biden's "democracy-defense credo" view the Israel-Gaza conflict as another example of him sidestepping the issue driving the conflict: territorial control and sovereignty. It is also worth highlighting that enforcing human rights and the rule of law should be integral to democracy promotion, and shared democratic values underpin US support for Israel, a key ally against Islamist extremism and terrorism. But given Israel's own democratic backsliding and the high civilian death toll in Gaza, Biden's unwavering support for Israel reflects a double standard that undermines America's credibil-

ity and global standing. Of course, the settlements issue is not new. These government-sponsored communities have long been expanding in areas occupied by Israel since the 1967 Six-Day War, including the West Bank, East Jerusalem, and the Golan Heights. A majority of countries, and the United Nations, considers them illegal under international law.

Since 1967, UN Security Council resolutions (such as 237) have urged Israel to observe humanitarian principles in the occupied territories; condemned extremist violence by settlers (271); deemed territorial acquisitions in Jerusalem inadmissible (252, 267, 298); and declared Israel's settle ments to be illegal under international law, and an obstruction to peace in the Middle East (446, 465, 2334). Moreover, the Fourth Geneva Convention prohibits an occupying power from transferring its own civilian population into the territory it occupies.

The new executive order targets individuals initiating riots, assaulting civilians and activists, setting fires, causing property damage, and contributing to the displacement or deaths of Palestinians. The sanctions allow for freezing assets, prohibiting transactions

with individuals and entities, and restricting their entry into the US. The US has a long history of enforcing international law, sanctioning terrorism, policing drug trafficking, and promoting democracy, human

rights, and peace in support of the liberal international order it helped create. Sanctions are often swiftly implemented against US adversaries such as Cuba, Iran, North Korea, and Syria, as well as terrorist groups such as al-Qaeda and Hamas. Belarus, China, Cuba, Iran, Libya, North Korea, Russia, South Sudan, and Syria have all been sanctioned specifically for human-rights abuses.

In other cases, the US has imposed sanctions on countries with which it previously had good relations. These are typically nearby countries whose policies affect the US directly, as in the case of sanctions against Colombian, Nicaraguan, and Venezuelan officials under the Foreign Narcotics Kingpin Designation Act. In other cases, the US soured on faraway countries, such as Myanmar and Zimbabwe, that failed to make a democratic transition.

Only in rare cases has the US sanctioned countries where it had major economic or strategic interests. In 1986, a bipartisan vote in Congress passed the Comprehensive Anti-Apartheid Act (overriding President Ronald Reagan's veto), which sanctioned South Africa and demanded Nelson Mandela's release and an end to minority rule. By contrast, the 2018 murder of Saudi journalist Jamal Khashoggi led to sanctions against several individuals under the Global Magnitsky Act, but spared the Saudi leadership, despite CIA evidence of the Kingdom's direct involvement.

As a diplomatic matter, deciding to sanction Israeli settlers may have been as difficult for Biden as it was for Reagan to sanction South Africa or for Donald Trump to sanction the Saudis. Fundamentally, though, sanctioning Israeli settlers for human-rights violations in the Occupied Territories is fully consistent with US support for the liberal international order. Settler violence is illegal under international humanitarian law, as defined by the Geneva Conventions and its Protocols, which offer civilians protection during military strikes, prohibit indiscriminate attacks, and require military operations to be proportionate to the expected military advantage.

By imposing sanctions on individuals for behaviour that is considered illegal under international law, or merely seen as an obstacle to peace, the US is reaffirming its commitment to resolving conflicts through law enforcement. The Biden administration is demonstrating US leadership in promoting peace and adherence to globally accepted norms, and ultimately strengthening alliances with countries that share similar values and have a stake in the existing global order.

But the US can and should do more to end the conflict. Ian Lustick, the founder of the Association for Israel Studies, notes that "Israel has never ended a war without being ordered to do so," suggesting that Israel is using an expansion of the war as a negotiating tactic. It fully expects, even needs, the US to intervene. Clearly, stopping the war should be US policymakers' top priority.

Until then, they should require that participants respect the laws of war. The first step would be to amend America's own legislation accordingly. A bill offering aid to Israel, with no conditions attached, did not pass in the House. If a more comprehensive security package is put to a vote, it should offer only assistance that can be used to find, capture, and neutralize Hamas, and it should offer humanitarian and reconstruction aid to civilians in Gaza in excess of the aid withheld from the UN Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees

Finally, since this is not the last time the US will face such a dilemma, it is worth considering a counterfactual. Had Biden refrained from sanctioning Israeli settler violence, he would have undermined the legitimacy of US sanctioning powers and the very international system such sanctions are meant to uphold.

Given all the precedents, it would be outrageous not to sanction settler terrorism. As Mohamed ElBaradei, the former director of the International Atomic Energy Agency, warned last month, America's failure to respond to Israel's gross violations of international humanitarian law in Gaza exposes its selective commitment to liberal norms and poses a direct threat to the international order.

Punishing transgressions according to its stated principles is vital for shoring up US hegemony within a liberal global framework. At a time when rising powers are challenging that hegemony, the US has a fundamental interest in broadening the coalition in favour of maintaining such an order. It will need that support if the Israel-Gaza war, Russia's war on Ukraine, and the brewing conflict with China spiral into a global war – a risk that is too great to discount.

Biden's evolving Middle East policy has become strategically imperative for the US as it navigates the challenges accompanying today's growing geopolitical turmoil. The more America's stance on the Israel-Gaza war isolates the US internationally (reflected in votes at the UN), the greater the risks for us all.

WILL SOON LAUNCH AN EVEN MORE OVERT PUSH FOR 'REUNIFICATION' **WITH TAIWAN ARE RISING**

he more US President Joe Biden's administration has sought to ease tensions with China through high-level dialogue, the more brazenly Chinese President Xi Jinping has applied coercive pressure to Taiwan. Never was this pattern more obvious than late last month, when China sent 33 warplanes and seven combat ships toward Taiwan, just as Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi and US National Security Adviser Jake Sullivan were holding talks in Bangkok. Fears that Xi will soon launch an even more overt push for "reunification" with Taiwan are rising.

Taiwan was never part of the People's Republic of China. It is a self-governing island that, for most of its history, had no relationship with China and has remained fully outside Chinese control for the last 129 years. Even so, Xi has made no secret of his intention to enforce China's claim to the island. In fact, Xi has called "reunification" with Taiwan his "historic

Xi reportedly reaffirmed his intentions to Biden at their recent summit in San Francisco, noting that the only matter left to be decided is when to take over the island. And there are good reasons to believe that the time might be near. With the wars in Ukraine and Gaza claiming America's attention and resources, and the world undergoing a broader geopolitical reconfiguration, Xi might see a window of opportunity. And Taiwanese voters' delivery of a third consecutive presidential term to the pro-sovereignty Democratic Progressive Party has likely bolstered Xi's motivation to assert control over the island.

Already, Xi has been stepping up intrusions into Taiwan's airdefence zone and encircling the island with warships. China has also fired missiles into the waters around the island and carried out large-scale war

games simulating attacks on it. According to a recent survey by the Center for Strategic and International Studies, two-thirds of US experts now believe that a Taiwan Strait crisis is likely this year. In November, the bipartisan US-China Economic and Security Review Commission warned that China is preparing to wage war over Taiwan – and position itself to launch cyberattacks against the United States that would "wreak havoc" during such a conflict.

One might expect the Biden administration to respond to such developments by strengthening deterrence, by both bolstering Taiwan's defences and stating unambiguously that the US has the strategic intent and political will to defend the island against a Chinese attack. Yet there is a \$14 billion backlog in US military sales to Taiwan, with weapons deals announced as long ago as 2017 still unfulfilled. And Biden has repeatedly declared that the US is "not looking for conflict" with China.

Although Biden's policy of engagement with China – including two face-to-face meetings and five virtual talks or phone calls with Xi since 2021 – has so far yielded no dividends, his administration apparently is unwilling to change course. The

result is a paradox: the stronger established power, in attempting to preserve the status quo, is seeking to appease the revisionist power, which continues to expand its frontiers. In the South China Sea, China has turned its contrived historical claims into reality without incurring any international costs.

The ineffectiveness of US-led sanctions against Russia has probably emboldened Xi yet further. If unprecedented Western sanctions cannot bring down Russia's economy, they certainly cannot destroy China's, especially given Chinese countermeasures. Even if the West could crush China economically, doing so would amount to shooting itself in the foot. China's central position in the global economy may well explain why the country has faced no meaningful Western sanctions for maintaining its Xinjiang gulag, where it is holding more than one million Muslim detainees, or for snuffing out Hong Kong's autonomy.

To be sure, when Biden was asked last September whether US forces would defend Taiwan from a Chinese attack, he replied in the affirmative. But he added a caveat: "if, in fact, there was an unprecedented attack." And an "unprecedented attack" is

precisely what Xi is likely to avoid. Not only does China probably lack the amphibious-assault capability to seize all of Taiwan: a full-scale attack, akin to Russia's invasion of Ukraine would also be out of character for the country, which has typically preferred quieter, more gradual aggression anchored in stealth, deception, and surprise.

Just as China has made great strides in the South China Sea and the Himalayas with this strategy of incremental expansionism, it will probably use hybrid warfare to squeeze Taiwan. The Chinese military has already simulated the imposition of a quarantine or blockade on the island. China could also announce the "lawful" closure of the Taiwan Strait to foreign vessels or periodically block shipping routes to choke the Taiwanese economy.

As former US Defense Secretary Robert Gates has warned, such measures could, over time, "bring Taiwan to its knees and create huge incentives for Taiwan to have a very different attitude toward China. But the measures are also subtle enough that they are unlikely to elicit a concerted USled response until it is too late.

A majority of Taiwanese believe that, in the face of a Chinese invasion, the US would abandon them, just as it did in 1979, when it terminated bilateral diplomatic relations and a mutual defence treaty with the island, in order to restore ties with China. If the US were to forsake Taiwan again, the international credibility of US security assurances would lie in tatters, effectively ending America's global preeminence.

Inequality needs sustained attention

udget analysis from various assisting states in accelerating diversification of agriculture financial experts, and others involved in the analysis rarely try to find out how much of the allocated sum reaches the lower segments of society. This aspect is necessary as around 60% of the population or more belongs to the above category. Experts note that fiscal consolidation was attempted in the interim budget and there were no populist measures, such as reducing the tax slab or increasing the standard deduction so that the middle class pays less tax. However, emphasis on infrastructure, especially railways with allocation of Rs 2.55 lakh crore needs to be appreciated. The three major economic railway corridors announced shall improve logistic efficiency, reduce costs, ensure safety and higher travel speed for passengers. Besides, the decision to roll out the first set of 10 Vande Bharat trains with sleeper facilities and converting 40,000 bogies to such standards shall enhance passenger comfort.

The other positive aspects include the vision of 'Viksit Bharat' which emphasises a prosperous nation in harmony with nature and the steps outlined therein are welcome. Though the focus of the target for each year and the funds to be disbursed have not been outlined.

The interim budget allocates significant resources to bolster the green energy sector, with a focus on harnessing India's vast offshore wind energy potential. One such notable initiative includes viability gap funding for development of 1 GW of offshore wind energy, which is expected to play a crucial role in diversifying India's renewable energy portfolio and reducing reliance on fossil fuels. Besides, there's an ambitious goal to set up coal gasification and liquefaction projects capable of processing 100 tonnes by 2030 to diminish India's import dependency on natural gas, methanol, and ammonia, while simultaneously promoting cleaner sources. There are plans too to set up one crore rooftop solar power units for households.

As regards the farm sector, the government's resolve to increase output of oilseeds, milk aquaculture production to help reduce dependence on imports for its food security and boost exports is a long-awaited step. Experts have been emphasising

For the masses, support for 20 million rural homes is possibly the only area of satisfaction as over Rs 50,000 crore has been allocated to PMAY-G for 2024-25, which is almost double the Rs 28,174 crore spent in the current fiscal, as per revised estimates.

Inequality remains a key problem in the Indian economy and as per government data, per capita national income increased from Rs 72,805 in 2014-15 to Rs 98,374 in 2022-23 -a 35% hike. However, as known this is unequally distributed. A few big capitalists make some big investments, but these are not enough to offset the decline in medium and small enterprises or generate the much-needed employment. The big economic concerns are unemployment and underemployment, poor viability of farming, high food prices relative to workers' incomes and inadequate access to basic services.

Reacting to the interim budget, Congress leader and former finance minister P. Chidambaram had said the fundamental flaw in NDA's approach to the economy and governance is it is biased in favour of the rich. "It is a government of the rich, by the rich and for the rich," he said.

Regarding the government's beyond crops to livestock and claim that it was empowering women by increasing their participation in the workforce, he said the Labour Force Participation Rate among urban women is 24% against 73.8% for men. Perhaps, the government increases workforce participation for women by including unpaid helpers in family enterprises who don't get remuneration for their work.

The other basic problem of the economy is the lack of momentum in the manufacturing sector, with weak private consumption and investment and a rising divide between strong high-end and subdued low-end purchases. Though there is much talk of fiscal consolidation, the basic economic problems remain unresolved

Its basic knowledge that generation of more revenue will lead to increase in development expenditure. Most experts have been insisting on the need to increase tax to GDP ratio, which would of course affect the corporate. This too is being ignored by the ruling dispensation perhaps as some experts feel that top corporates may be making donations to the party and/or for temples. However, it's essential to recognise that Paytm is just one player in India's diverse fintech market, where competition remains high. This ban serves as a reminder for all players to prioritise regulatory adherence to ensure long-term sustainability and trust within the industry. Overall, while the ban has prompted concerns about regulatory trust and investor confidence in Paytm, its broader impact on the Indian online landscape may be limited. New Delhi/Noida, Feb 8: Noida Police Thursday stepped up security along its borders with Delhi as thousands of farmers from around 100 villages took to the streets seeking hiked compensation and made an unsuccessful bid to march towards Parliament.

Barricades were set up at Chilla border with Noida Police on one side and Delhi Police on the other side to prevent protesters, who started their march from Mahamaya Flyover here around 12 pm, from entering the national capital.

Several police personnel were in anti-riot gears with tear gas shells and water cannons handy, even as personnel from the rapid action force and provincial armed constabulary were deployed at the Chilla border.

In the evening, a minor scuffle broke out between the protesters and security personnel as they tried to detain local farmer lead ers near the Dalit Prerna Sthal.

Delhi and at Kisan Chowk and other places. Each vehicle is being checked due to which the traffic is moving slowly, a police spokesperson said. Senior officials and other personnel are present at various locations to control the traffic, he added.

The farmers from around 100 villages were led by the BKP after they assembled at the Mahamaya Flyover in Noida around 12 pm Thursday, with a proposed plan to march towards the Parliament.

From Mahamaya Flyover, the farmers shall march towards the Parliament in Delhi to press for our long-pending demands. BKP leader Sukhbir Yadav 'Khalifa' said earlier in the day.

Later, a scuffle broke out between several villagers and security personnel as they tried to detain local farmer leaders, including the BKP leader, near the Dalit Prerna Sthal.

Farmer organisations proposed to go to Delhi with their various demands. Peaceful talks are being held with them near the Delhi border. Senior police officers are present on the spot, the police spokesperson said around 5 pm.

The Nandi Baba reference was to a recent Varanasi district court order allowing a Hindu priest to offer prayers in a cellar in the Gyanvapi mosque, located next to the Kashi Vishwanath temple.

The order came on a plea by a Varanasi resident who claimed that his grandfather used to offer regular prayers in the cellar up to 1993, when he was stopped from doing so

The same night, hours after the court order, the local administration removed a section of the barricade to provide access to the basement.

A court-ordered Archaeological Survey of India report recently suggested that the Gyanvapi mosque was built after the demolition of a temple there during Aurangzeb's rule.

In Mathura, Hindu litigants

make a similar claim. They say the Shahi Idgah was built on the site believed to be the birthplace of Lord Krishna. A Krishna temple stands next to the mosque.

First brick for new Ayodhya Mosque arrives from Mecca

Mumbai, Feb 8: Symbolising reconciliation and religious harmony, the first brick for the foundation of the proposed grand mosque in Ayodhya arrived here Wednesday after a consecration pilgrimage to the holy cities of cca and Medina.

The brick, baked in a Mumbai kiln, was sent for a 'gusl' (wash) with the holy Zam-Zam water in Mecca and in perfumes in Medina before it was brought back here.

This brick is scheduled to reach the new upcoming Masjid Mohammed Bin Abdullah mosque - named in honour of the Prophet Mohammed - at Dhannipur Village in Ayodhya around mid-April, most likely after Ramadan and Eid-Ul-Fitr celebrations.

The brick's auspicious journey will commence from the home of Haji Arfat Shaikh, Indo-Islamic Cultural Foundation member and Chairman of the Masjid Mohammed Bin Abdullah' Development Committee, who

is overseeing the preparations. "The new masjid and the institution around it would be an important centre of prayer and healing in India... Its construction and renovation, by the grace

Delhi PWD issues notice to L&T over design flaws

New Delhi, Feb 8: The Delhi government's Public Works Department (PWD) has issued a notice to Larsen and Toubro (L&T) over alleged "glaring infirmities" in the Pragati Maidan tunnel project while demanding a "token amount" of ₹500 crore from the firm and directing it to immediately initiate repair work

L&T said that they have made a counterclaim of ₹500 crore against the PWD. The notice was issued February 3, asking the company to respond within 15 days.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi had June 19, 2022 inaugurated the 1.3-km-long tunnel and five underpasses as part of the Pragati Maidan **Integrated Transit Corridor** Project that aims to ease connectivity between central Delhi with the eastern parts of the city and the satellite towns of Noida and Ghaziabad.

The tunnel has witnessed multiple closures due to waterlogging during the Delhi floods last year.

The notice alleged that the project with time revealed "glaring infirmities that were not



also design flaws"

"The most glaring as well as alarming issue was the accumulation of water across various locations in the tunnel/underpass. This issue, especially during the monsoon season, rendered the entire project nonoperational for the general public and ultimately ended up causing far more blockages and congestion along the arterial roads of the entire New Delhi area which defeated the very purpose of this ambitious project," the notice stated.

An L&T spokesperson said his company has filed a counterclaim of Rs 500 crore.

"PWD, Delhi, is an esteemed client and we value the long years of association we have enjoyed with them. However, L&T would like to state that a counter-claim of Rs 500 crore has been made by the company against PWD, Delhi," the spokesperson said.

Navratri connection: Female elephant 'adopts' calf

BOTH THE ELEPHANTS HAD COME TO DUDHWA DURING NAVRATRI AND HENCE GOT THEIR NAMES - DURGA AND GAURI

Lakhimpur Kheri (UP), Feb 8: Both were born during Navratri in different years and they now share an undeniable bond. Durga, a seven-year-old female elephant in Dudhwa, has 'adopted' a 15day-old orphaned elephant calf which was rescued by the Forest department from Najibabad forest in Bijnor, in September 2023.

The calf, named Gauri, was sent to the Dudhwa Tiger Reserve (DTR), after the Forest department's team in Bijnor had failed to reunite the calf with herds of elephants crossing over the region.

When the herds did not take the calf along, it was sent to Dudhwa where it got its name, Gauri.



Deputy director of DTR, Rengaraju Tamilselvan, said that it was Durga who accepted

Gauri and took it under her wings, like a mother, making the job of nurturing the calf much easier for them.

Today, Gauri is three months old and scampers along with her doting mother Durga. Both the elephants had come to Dudhwa during Navratri and hence got their names – Durga and Gauri.

Dudhwa has 25 captive elephants, but none except Durga accepted the calf. The reason for her affinity towards Gauri was, perhaps, her own past. She herself was found orphaned in Bijnor in 2018 as a calf.

The Forest department tried to send her back to the forests, but the herds did not accept her. She was also sent to Dudhwa.

There is another link between the two elephants -- their mahout, Irshad, who reared Durga

and is now taking care of Gauri. "His experience with Durga helped us in the case of Gauri too. We knew how to rear the calf like our own child," said

the official.

The captive elephants at Dudhwa were brought from Karnataka and other states to be trained in patrolling, rescue operations and other specialised

wildlife activities. Durga is one of the lot, undergoing training at the reserve. Gauri will also join them by the time she is ten years old and is done with the training, said the deputy director. For now, the

two are inseparable. Gauri is being raised on cow's milk and lactogen daily. About 16 litres of milk and two packs of lactogen is what she consumes in 24 hours, about five times a day and night.

Violence in Haldwani over demolition drive


Haldwani (Uttarakhand), Feb 8: A curfew was imposed here Thursday after local residents set vehicles and a police station on fire and hurled stones, injuring more than 60 people, over the demolition of an "illegally built" madrasa and an adjoining mosque, officials said.

Most of the people hospitalised after the violence at Malik ka Bagicha in the city's Banbhoolpura area were police personnel. The remaining were municipal workers involved in the demolition of the local madrasa and a mosque in its complex, they said. The injured also included Haldwani SDM, they added. In state capital Dehradun, Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami held a meeting with senior officials, including Chief Secretary Radha Raturi and DGP

Abhinav Kumar to review the situation in Haldwani, according to an official statement.

Besides imposition of curfew in entire Haldwani, shoot-at-sight orders against rioters were also issued in the city, the statement said. The Chief Minister urged everyone to maintain calm and asked officials to deal sternly with "anarchic elements", it added.

As the violence escalated, all the shops in Haldwani were closed. After the imposition of curfew, all schools from Classes 1-12 in and around the city have also been closed. Senior Superintendent of Police Prahlad Meena said the madrasa and the mosque stood on an illegally encroached government land and the demolitions were carried out in the heavy presence of police and Provincial Armed Constabulary (PAC) personnel in compliance with a court order.



India scraps FMR with Myanmar

New Delhi. Feb 8: Union Home Minister Amit Shah Thursday said the Centre has decided to scrap the India-Myanmar Free Movement Regime (FMR) to maintain the country's internal security and demographic structure of the northeastern states.

As the Ministry of External Affairs is currently in the process of scrapping it, the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) has recommended the immediate suspension of FMR. Shah said, FMR allows people residing close to the India-Myanmar border to venture 16 km into each other's territory without any documents.

It is Prime Minister Shri @narendramodi Ji's resolve to secure our borders. The Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) has decided that the Free Movement Regime (FMR) between India and Myanmar be scrapped to ensure the internal security of the country and to maintain the demographic structure of India's North Eastern States bordering Myanmar," Shah said on X.

The announcement came two days after Shah said India has decided to fence the entire 1,643-km-long India-Myanmar border.

The India-Myanmar border, which passes through Mizoram, Manipur, Nagaland and Arunachal Pradesh, currently has FMR. It was implemented in 2018 as part of India's Act

Vijayan leads protest against Centre

While leaders from the AAP, the DMK and the NC were among those present, no one from the Congress was there. The Congress-led UDF opposition in Kerala which was invited to join the protest had declined it saying it does not agree with the Left narrative blaming the Centre for all of the state's financial problems.

Attacking the Centre, Vijayan criticised the "Union over states mentality" of the Centre, saying it is not only manifested in financial matters, but was evident in the functioning of governors in opposition-ruled states as

"We have all come together to register our strong protest against this and to preserve the federal structure of India. Today we are marking the beginning of a renewed fight that would herald a dawn of ensuring equitable treatment of the states," he said. He alleged that in opposition-ruled states, governors are acting at the "behest" of the Centre and disrupting the state government's work, with a Union over states' mentality. Kashmir shivers; more than 250 roads blocked

New Delhi, Feb 8: Cold wave conditions prevailed over several regions in north India Thursday with Kashmir shivering at sub-zero temperature and Himachal Pradesh witnessing heavy snowfall and landslides that blocked more than 250 roads.

The national capital witnessed pleasant weather with the city recording a maximum temperature of 20.2 degrees Celsius, a notch below the season's average. The minimum temperature in Delhi settled at 8.2 degrees Celsius, according to the India

spectively, officials said. The minimum temperatures in Pahalgam, Gulmarg, Qazigund and Srinagar were around five degrees below normal for this time of the year.

Although 'Chilla-i-Kalan' -- the 40-day harshest winter period -- ended earlier this week, the cold wave has continued in Kashmir. In Himachal, Lahaul and Spiti district's Kusumseri recorded a low of minus 14.2 degrees Celsius while the weather remained dry Thursday.

Thick fog was witnessed in Sundernagar, Mandi and Bilaspur in the morning, reducing visibility to 500 metres



Meteorological Department. Meanwhile, according to of-

ficial data, several parts of Jammu and Kashmir, including Srinagar city, witnessed the warmest January in 43 years. There was no let-up in cold conditions in Punjab and Haryana too, with minimum temperatures staying below normal at several places.

Thursday, Srinagar, the summer capital of Jammu and Kashmir, recorded a low of minus 5.2 degrees Celsius compared to previous night's minus 2 degrees Celsius. The minimum temperature in Gulmarg skiing resort in north Kashmir fell to minus 12 degrees Celsius, while Pahalgam tourist resort in south Kashmir, which serves as the base camp for the annual Amarnath yatra, recorded a low of minus 11.9 degrees Celsius.

Kokernag and Qazigund towns in south Kashmir recorded a low of minus 4.5 degrees and minus 6.4 degrees Celsius, rewhile ground frost occurred in mid and higher hills, making commuting hazardous. Restoration works are in full swing to open 254 roads including five national highways closed due to heavy snowfall and landslides, officials said. Narkanda and Kalpa recorded a low of minus 4.4 degrees and minus 4.2 degrees Celsius, respectively, followed by Manali and Bharmaur minus 2 degrees, Kufri minus 1.8 degrees, Bhuntar 0.1 degree, Sundernagar 0.2 degree and Shimla 0.9 degree Celsius.

The high-altitude tribal areas and other higher reaches reeled under piercing cold with mercury staying 15 to 22 degrees below freezing point. Technical personnel to replace Indian troops in Maldives

New Delhi. Feb 8: India will replace its military personnel operating three aviation platforms in the Maldives with "competent" Indian technical personnel even as New Delhi asserted that it remained an important development partner of the island nation.

"I would like to say that the present personnel will be replaced by competent Indian technical personnel." External Affairs Ministry Spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said at his weekly media briefing.



Following the second meeting of the high-level core group to address the issue of the military personnel, the Maldivian foreign ministry said India will replace its military personnel in two phases by May 10. Maldivian President Mohamed Muizzu Monday said the first group of Indian military personnel will be sent back before March 10 and the remaining manning ones will be withdrawn before May 10.

The second meeting of the core group took place in Delhi February 2. The two sides decided to set up the core group following a meeting between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Muizzu on the sidelines of the COP28 summit in Dubai in December.

month this year, it said. The lowest precipitation in the summer capital of Jammu and Kashmir was recorded in January 2018 when only 1.2 mm



of rainfall or snow took place. According to data, the mean Tmax (maximum temperature)

recorded in January over Srinagar station was 11.9 degrees Celsius while for Gulmarg

in north Kashmir and Banihal in Ramban district, it was 5.7 degrees Celsius and 16.9 degrees Celsius respectively.

Jammu city recorded the lowest mean maximum temperature for the first month of the year in over four decades, it said.

This is the highest mean maximum temperature for the month of January for these stations in the past 43 years, the MeT centre said in a post on X.

"2024 January was one of the driest and warmest January in the last 43 years for most of the stations of J-K except the stations of plains of Jammu (Jammu, Samba and Kathua),'

It said Jammu station, on the other hand, observed a mean maximum temperature of 13.4 de grees Celsius in January, which

is the lowest since 1983. The mean minimum temperature for January observed over Srinagar, Jammu, Gulmarg and Banihal were minus 3.2 degrees Celsius, 5.5 degrees Celsius, minus 3.9 degrees Celsius and 0.1 degrees Celsius respectively. "The 2024 mean Tmin is one of the highest for Gulmarg in the last 43 years," the MET centre said.

World breached 1.5-degree limit for entire year for first time, says European climate agency

New Delhi, Feb 8: The global mean temperature breached the 1.5-degree Celsius threshold for an entire year for the first time, the European climate agency said Thursday.

However, this does not imply a permanent breach of the 1.5-degree Celsius limit specified in the Paris Agreement, as it refers to long-

term warming over many years. Scientists at the European Union's Copernicus Climate Change Service (C3S) also said that the world experienced the warmest January on record.

In fact, every month since June last year has been the warmest such month on record.

They attribute the exceptional warming to the combined effects of El Niño - a period of abnormal warming of surface waters in the central Pacific Ocean -- and human-caused climate change.

C3S said the global mean temperature for the past 12 months (February 2023-January 2024) was the highest on record and 1.52 degrees Celsius above the 1850-1900 pre-industrial average.

The global average temperature in January was 1.66 degrees Celsius above the January average for 1850-1900, the designated pre-industrial reference period. With an average temperature of 13.14 degrees Celsius.

The year 2023 was the warmest on record, with the average global temperature rise compared to pre-industrial levels nearing the 1.5-degree Celsius threshold.

The World Meteorological Organisation in December said 2024 could be worse as "El Niño typically has the greatest impact on global temperature after it

In 2015, countries agreed in Paris to limit the average temperature rise to well below 2 degrees Celsius, and preferably to 1.5 degrees Celsius, compared to preindustrial levels (1850-1900), to avoid worsening climate impacts.

Long-term data shows earth's global surface temperature has risen by around 1.15 degrees Celsius as compared to pre-industrial levels (1850-1900). The business-as-usual scenario will take the world to a temperature rise of around 3 degrees Celsius by the end of the century, scientists have warned.

To limit global warming to 1.5degrees Celsius, countries together need to cut down the emissions of planet-warming greenhouse gases like carbon dioxide and methane by 43 per cent by 2030.

At the 28th UN climate conference on climate change in Dubai, nearly 200 countries, for the first time, agreed to transition away from fossil fuels in a "just, orderly, and equitable manner to avert the worst impacts of climate change

Climate finance will be the main focus of this year's UN climate conference in Baku's capital Azerbaijan, where nations have to set a new post-2025 target for raising funds to help developing nations cut emissions and handle the impacts of climate change.



Pakistan polls end marred in violence

Attacks by Islamic State kills 9; mobile services suspended

Islamabad, Feb 8: At least nine people, including two children, were killed in militant attacks in Pakistan Thursday as the country voted in a general election after suspending mobile phone services and closing some land borders to maintain law and order.

The interior ministry said it took the security steps after at least 26 people were killed in two explosions near electoral candidates' offices in the southwestern province of Balochistan Wednesday. Islamic State later claimed responsibility for those attacks.

"As a result of the recent incidents of terrorism in the country precious lives have been lost, security measures are essential to maintain the law and order situation and deal with possible threats," the ministry said in a post on messaging platform X.

Thousands of troops were deployed on the streets and at polling stations across the country as voting commenced and borders with Iran and Afghanistan were temporarily closed.

Despite the heightened security, five policemen were killed in a bomb blast and firing on a patrol in the Kulachi area of Dera Ismail Khan district in the northwest, authorities said. Another person died in firing on a security forces vehicle in Tank, about 40 km (25 miles) to

In Balochistan, a soldier from a civilian force was killed and 10 others injured in over a dozen blasts caused by grenades or improvised explosive devices, officials said, while two chidren died in a blast outside a women's polling station.

Mohsin Dawar, a candidate from North Waziristan - a hotbed of Islamist insurgents in northwest Pakistan - said in a letter to the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP), that some polling stations in his constituency were taken over by local "Taliban" who were threatening polling

staff and locals.

Millions voted in the general elections in which former PM Nawaz **Sharif is hoping to** secure a record fourth term with the backing of the powerful military amid a crackdown on his rival Imran Khan's party, rise in violence and economic stagnation

In spite of the security worries and bitter winter cold, long queues began forming at polling stations hours before voting was due to start. "The country is at stake, why should I come late?" said 86-year-old Mumtaz, a housewife a decade older than Pakistan itself as she queued up in Islamabad.

Besides the militancy, the election is also being held as Pakistan remains mired in a deep economic crisis and a highly polarised political environment. Many analysts believe no clear winner may emerge.

Unofficial first results are expected a few hours after voting closes at 5 pm and a clearer picture is likely to emerge early Friday.

London, Feb 8: British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak joked that the leader of the opposition Labour Party could not define what a woman was, during a parliamentary exchange Wednesday that the mother of a murdered transgender girl had been invited to watch.

NORTH SCRAPS ECONOMIC

Seoul. Feb 8: North Korea's rubber-stamp parliament has voted to abolish laws on economic cooperation with the South, state media said Thursday, as relations between the two neighbours hit new lows.

Ties between the two Koreas have been in a deep freeze as Pyongyang accelerates its weapons development programmes and Seoul ramps up military cooperation with Washington and Tokyo, with key inter-Korean economic cooperation projects suspended for years.

At a plenary meeting of the Supreme People's Assembly on Wednesday, officials voted to scrap the law on inter-Korean economic cooperation "with unanimous approbation", the Korean Central News Agency reported.

The latest decision comes after



Pyongyang last month declared Seoul its main enemy, jettisoned agencies dedicated to reunification, and threatened to occupy the South during war.

The parliament also unanimously approved a plan to abolish a special law on the operation of the Mount Kumgang tourism project, once a prominent symbol of inter-Korean co-

The resort was built by South Korea's Hyundai Asan on one of the North's most scenic mountains, and once drew hundreds of thousands of visitors from the

But its tours ended abruptly in 2008 after a North Korean soldier shot dead a tourist from the South who strayed off an approved path, and Seoul suspended travel.

The Mount Kumgang resort was once one of the two biggest inter-Korean projects, along with the now-shuttered Kaesong Industrial Complex, where Southern companies employed North Korean workers while paying Pyongyang for their serv-

Seoul pulled out of the venture -- launched in the wake of a 2000 inter-Korean summit -- in 2016 in response to a nuclear test and missile launches by the North, saying Kaesong profits were helping fund the provocations. In 2020, the North blew up a

liaison office with the South on

its side of the border -- paid for

by Seoul -- saying it had no in-

terest in talks.


Washington, Feb 8: Saturn's moon Mimas is known for its uncanny resemblance to the dreaded Death Star in the original "Star Wars" movie. But it has another intriguing distinction as well, according to researchers a subsurface ocean hidden under

its icv and crater-scarred outer

shell.

Astronomers said Wednesday that data obtained by NASA's Cassini spacecraft on the rotational motion and orbit of Mimas confirm the presence of an ocean of liquid water beneath an ice layer 12-19 miles (20-30 km) thick. This ocean, they said, appears to have formed recently, in cosmic terms - less than 25 million years ago and likely between 5 and 15 million years ago.

"At first glance, it is the most unlikely place in the solar system to look for liquid water,' said Observatoire de Paris astronomer Valery Lainey, lead author of the study published in the journal Nature. "It looks old



and inactive - a huge amount of craters. Nothing betrays the ocean existence, at the moment.'

Mimas becomes the smallest of five moons in our solar sys tem with compelling evidence of subsurface oceans, alongside Saturn's Enceladus and Titan, and Jupiter's Europa and Ganymede, Lainey said. There also are suspicions of subsurface oceans on a few other moons, including Jupiter's Callisto.

Cassini finished 13 years of studying Saturn and its moons in 2017 with a death plunge into the huge ringed planet's atmosphere. Cassini's observations of the icv

surface of Mimas did not spot any deformations suggestive of an ocean below. But the researchers determined that certain aspects of its orbit could be explained only by the presence of an internal ocean, not a solid interior.

Mimas is the seventh-largest moon of Saturn, which all told has well over 100 moons ranging from Titan - larger than the planet Mercury - to some only the

size of a city block. Mimas, not precisely round, has an average diameter of about 250 miles (400 km). It is tidally locked, meaning it perpetually shows the same side toward Saturn, as our moon does toward Earth. The most emblematic feature of Mimas is the Herschel crater, which stretches a third of the way across its face and makes it resemble the Death Star.

Earth's moon is roughly 2,000 times more massive than Mimas.

An internal ocean's presence implies a strong heat source inside Mimas that turned ice into an ocean. Mimas follows an elliptical orbit around Saturn at an average distance of about 115,000 miles (186,000 km). As its distance from Saturn changes along its orbit, the gravitational and tidal forces exerted by Saturn also change.

"This results in periodic deformation of Mimas' interior, and part of the energy involved in these deformations is converted into heat," said planetary scientist and study co-author Gabriel Tobie of the French scientific research agency CNRS

and Nantes Université. The liquid water inside Mimas represents more than half of this moon's total volume, though it amounts to just 1.2-1.4% the amount in Earth's oceans. The fact that the water is in contact with the rocky core of Mimas may facilitate the type of complex chemistry that could pave the way for life, they added.

Scientists believe the basic ingredients for life - warmth, water and organic compounds - exist in the Saturnian system on— Enceladus, which has huge plumes erupting off its surface.

The Central Bank keeps interest rate unchanged at 6.5%

Mumbai, Feb 8: The Reserve Bank of India Thursday decided to keep policy rate unchanged for the sixth time in a row in view of global uncertainty and the need to bring down retail inflation to 4 per cent.

Following RBI's decision to maintain status quo, banks and financial institutions will largely keep lending rates stable.

Announcing the decision of the Monetary Policy Committee (MPC), RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das Thursday said it has decided to keep the policy reporate unchanged on the basis of an assessment of the current and evolving macroeconomic situation.

MPC also decided to remain focused on withdrawal of accommodation to ensure that inflation progressively aligns to the target while supporting growth, he said.

These decisions are in consonance with the objective of achieving the medium-term target for Consumer Price Index (CPI) inflation of 4 per cent within a band of +/- 2 per cent while supporting growth.

GDP GROWTH

For 2024-25, RBI has projected a growth rate of 7 per cent and retail inflation at 4.5 per cent with risks evenly balanced.

MUMBAI: Reserve Bank Governor Shaktikanta Das Thursday said there are no systemic worries and the action on Paytm was driven by a lack of compliance at Paytm. Deputy Governor Swaminathan J said the actions against the fintech have been taken due to persisted non-compliance. The Governor declined to specify the specific shortcomings resulting in the RBI action, but made it clear that it is driven by a lack of compliance at Paytm.

MUMBAI: All lenders will now have to provide Key Fact Statement (KFS) about the terms of the loan agreement, including all-inclusive retail as well as MSME loans, the RBI said Thursday. Currently KFS is specifically mandated in respect of loans by commercial banks to individual borrowers, digital lending by RBI-regulated entities (REs), and microfinance loans.

KFS MADE MANDATORY

Das said that CPI inflation is projected at 5.4 per cent for 2023-24 with Q4 inflation at 5 per cent.

"Assuming a normal monsoon next year, CPI inflation for 2024-25 is projected at 4.5 per cent with Q1 at 5 per cent; Q2 at 4 per cent: Q3 at 4.6 per cent: and Q4 at 4.7 per cent . The risks are evenly balanced," he said.

The MPC noted that domestic economic activity is holding up well and is expected to be backed by the momentum in investment demand, optimistic business sentiments and rising consumer confidence.

On the inflation front, large and repetitive food price shocks are interrupting the pace of disinflation that is led by the moderation of core inflation.

However, geopolitical events and their impact on supply

chains, and volatility in international financial markets and commodity prices are key sources of upside risks to in-

"The cumulative effect of policy repo rate increases is still working its way through the economy. The MPC will carefully monitor any signs of generalisation of food price pressures to non-food prices which can fritter away the gains in the easing of core inflation," he said.

India to begin LNG supplies to SL in '25

Betul (Goa), Feb 8: Petronet LNG Ltd, India's biggest liquefied natural gas company, will in 2025 start supplying LNG to Sri Lanka, initially in containers loaded on ships and later going on to build an import terminal, its chief executive said Thursday.

Sri Lanka is seeking supply of gas in liquid form to meet requirements for generating electricity and other industries.

Petronet CEO Akshay Kumar Singh said the company will ship 850 tonne of gas daily to the island nation in containers of 17 tonne each. The supplies would be for five years during which the company will build a floating LNG receipt facility at Colombo port.

'The supplies will start in 18 months or so," he said.

The Indian firm imports LNG from Qatar, Australia and other countries at two terminals -Dahej terminal in Gujarat and a facility at Kochi in Kerala.

It plans to load LNG or superchilled gas in containers from Kochi in containers. A ship will



make a ferry every two days, carrying 100 such containers. At Colombo, a small regasification unit will turn the LNG into

gaseous state again for use in

gas-fired power plants. Speaking to reporters on the sidelines of India Energy Week, Singh said Petronet also plans to commission a floating storage regasification unit (FSRU) in Colombo, for which it hopes to get Sri Lankan government ap-

Singh said Petronet, which earlier this week extended a 7.5 million tonne a year LNG import deal with Qatar for another 20 years beyond 2028, is looking at sourcing more gas, including on long term contracts.

It is expanding the Dahej facility from 17.5 million tonne per annum to 22.5 million tonne and is looking to build a new terminal in Odisha. Also, its 5 million tonne a year Kochi facility will by next year start operating at full capacity after a pipeline taking the gas to consumers in Bangalore gets commissioned.

Kochi is currently operating at a fifth of its capacity, he said. "So naturally, there will be a

requirement for more gas," he said but refused to say how many long-term contracts the company is looking to tie up. "We need more long-term deals. It is a country requirement.

Besides 7.5 million tonne from Qatar, LNG is also imported from the Gorgon project in Australia. Currently, 1.44 million tonne a year of LNG is imported, which will rise by 1.2 million tonne between 2025-26 to 2028, he said.

The Indian economy is expanding at a world-beating pace and it needs energy supplies to meet its needs. Natural gas is considered a transition fuel to net zero carbon emissions. The government is targeting raising the share of natural gas in the primary energy basket to 15 per cent by 2030 from the current 6.2 per cent. With domestic production hardly meeting half of the demand, the fuel is imported in the form of LNG.

'Booked' Varun pulls out Eves aim to turn the tide

New Delhi, Feb 8: Accused of rape under the stringent POCSO act, Arjuna award-winning Indian hockey player Varun Kumar has withdrawn from the FIH Pro League in Bhubaneswar to explore his legal options against the allegation, which he described as a "calculated attempt to extort money" from

The 28-year-old has been granted "urgent leave" from national duty by Hockey India after he stated that the incident has taken a toll on his "physical and mental health".

Varun has been booked by the Bangalore Police after a woman accused the defender of sexually abusing her multiple times when she was a minor.

The 22-year-old, in her complaint filed Monday, said that she came in contact with Varun in 2018 through Instagram, and the player raped her on multiple occasions promising her of marriage when she was 17.

In a letter to Hockey India president Dilip Tirkey, which is in possession of PTI, Varun claimed that the complaint against him is false and a misuse of the "state machinery".

"Through media reports I got to know that a false and frivolous case has been filed against me by a girl with whom I was in a relationship previously and the said case has been culminated into an FIR in Bangalore though I have not been contacted by any police official in this regard, Varun's letter, sent Wednesday to Tirkey, read.

"The aforesaid case is nothing



but a calculated attempt to extort money out of me and to tarnish my reputation and image as I'm an accomplished hockey player having played for India and being an Arjuna Awardee and she knows that such a case could hamper my career and image."

Varun, who was with the Indian team in Bhubaneswar for the Pro League matches, said he will fight the allegations legally. "In order to avail my legal remedies and legal rights I would require urgent leave from the academy and furthermore given the circumstances, I will unfortunately not be in a position to participate in the Pro League," Varun wrote.

"This incident has taken a toll on my physical and mental health and this is a very tough time for me and my family...Being a sportsperson I have always been taught to fight till the very end and therefore I request your support in these difficult times," he added.

Road to 2024 Paris Olympics challenging: Sindhu

New Delhi, Feb 8: Set to return after an injury-induced break, two-time Olympic medallist PV Sindhu is aware the road to Paris will be "challenging" and she needs to be "smarter" in her pursuit of coveted gold medal in the French capital.

Former world champion Sindhu has been enduring a lean patch. She has suffered injury setbacks and a dip in form in the last 18 months. She suffered stress fracture on her left ankle during the successful 2022 CWG campaign and later sustained another injury on left knee during the French Open in October last year, forcing her out for three months.

"I would say, this Olympics is going to be a different experience because the 2016 and 2020 Olympics were very different. Paris will be more challenging but at the same time, I have much

more experience and I will have to be much smarter this time,' Sindhu told PTI in an interaction.

The 28-year-old from Hyderabad was in Mumbai Thursday at 'Great Place To Work's FOR ALL' summit. "In women's circuit, players in the top 10-15 are tough. It is important to be focused and have a strategy so that you can switch to plan B if plan A doesn't work. It is important to stay calm as sometimes you can go blank. It is important to have a strong mindset," she said.

Desperate to find her mojo back after a series of low results, Sindhu parted ways with Korean coach Park Tae-sang early last year. She trained with Sports Authority of India's (SAI) Vidhi Chaudhary and then Malaysia's former All-England champion Muhammad Hafiz Hashim in July but success continued to elude her. Then former All England

Champion Prakash Padukone reached out to her and soon she shifted her base to Bangalore. She is currently training under Indonesia's Agus Santoso at

Prakash Padukone Badminton Academy (PPBA), which operates out of the Padukone-Dravid Centre for Sports Excellence. Asked if the focus is on fine-

tuning strokes and strategising against the top players, Sindhu said: "Definitely yes. After the injury, it is important to focus on physical, mental, and technique, where we focus on a lot of skills. We have been working on every aspect at the moment. I have not played tournaments in the last three months, so I will come to know where I am after I start playing tournaments. It has been pretty good so far.

"We have been talking and discussing against all the top 10-15 players in the women's circuit. I think right now Aya Ohori, An Se Young, (Akane) Yamaguchi, and Carolina (Marin) are doing well.

'So it is not just one or two players, we need to know how every player is playing and we have been discussing them but it is important to focus on our own skills and technical aspects and also physical aspect," added the current World No.11.

India to meet Sweden in away match in Sept
