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

Zelenskyy lands in Saudi Arabia

Dubai: Ukrainian President Volodomyr Zelenskyy arrived in Saudi Arabia Tuesday with plans to visit the kingdom's powerful crown prince to push for a peace plan and the return of prisoners of war from Russia. Zelenskyy's trip comes as Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman has sought to position himself as a potential mediator to end the war between Ukraine and Russia — even as Riyadh remains closely aligned with Russia on energy policies through the OPEC+ group of

PTI to protest on March 2

Lahore: Pakistan's jailed former Prime Minister Imran Khan's party Tuesday announced a countrywide protest Saturday against the alleged rigging in the February 8 elections that has prevented the party from returning to power. Addressing a press conference after meeting Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) founder Imran Khan in Rawalpindi's high-security Adiala jail where he is currently incarcerated, the party's Secretary General and its candidate for the prime minister's slot, Omar Ayub reiterated "large scale" rigging in the polls. PTI would stage countrywide protests against the "rigging" in polls alongside other political parties, he was quoted as saying by Geo News.

Fire at airport, flights delayed

Astana: A fire broke out at the international airport in Astana, capital of Kazakhstan. leading to delay of 18 flights, authorities said Tuesday. The fire, which broke out at 7:50 am local time, was controlled at 8:24 am, the press service of the airport said. Passengers at an airport terminal were evacuated to a safe place due to heavy smoke from the fire, according to a statement by the airport, Xinhua news agency reported.

Man shot dead

Sydney: A man was shot dead Tuesday near Sydney's central business district after which a probe has been initiated. Emergency services were called to Stella Street in Fairfield Heights just after 8:30 am local time, New South Wales Police Force said in a statement. After reaching the spot, officers located a man unresponsive on the footpath, who was confirmed dead by paramedics, Xinhua news agency reported.

Biden signals imminent truce in Gaza

Jerusalem, Feb 27: US President Joe Biden signaled that a ceasefire in Gaza could be at hand, saying that Israel has agreed to pause its offensive during the upcoming Muslim holy month of Ramadan if a deal is reached to release some hostages held by

But both Israel and Hamas downplayed Tuesday the idea that a breakthrough was imminent. The President's remarks came on the eve of the Michigan primary, where he faces pressure from the state's large Arab American population over his staunch support of Israel.

Biden said he had been briefed on the status of talks by his national security adviser, Jake Sullivan, but said his comments reflected his optimism for a deal. not that all the remaining hurdles had been overcome.

In the wake of Hamas' attack on southern Israel October 7, Israel's air, sea and ground campaign in Gaza has killed tens of thousands of people, obliterated large swaths of the urban landscape, displaced 80 per cent of the battered enclave's population and sparked concerns that a famine could be imminent, according to the United Nations. Now the prospect of an inva-

sion of Rafah has prompted global alarm over the fate of civilians trapped there. Talks to pause the fighting gained momentum recently and were underway Tuesday. Negotiators from the United States, Egypt and Qatar have been working to broker a cease-fire that would see Hamas free some of the dozens of hostages it holds in exchange for the release of Palestinian prisoners, a six-week

At the same time, Biden did not call for an end to the war, which was triggered when Hamas militants killed 1,200 people, mostly civilians, and abducted roughly 250 people, according to Israeli authorities. Israeli officials said Biden's comments came as a surprise and were not made in coordination with the country's leadership. A Hamas official played down any sense of progress, saying the group wouldn't soften its demands.

The Israeli officials, who spoke on condition of anonymity because they weren't authorized to discuss the sensitive talks with the media, said Israel wants a deal immediately, but that Hamas continues to push excessive demands. They also said that Israel is insisting that female soldiers be part of the first group of hostages released under any truce deal.

Pak court indicts Imran, his wife in graft case

Islamabad, Feb 27: An accountability court in Pakistan Tuesday indicted Imran Khan and his wife Bushra Bibi in the 190 million pounds Al Qadir corruption case, in another blow to the beleaguered former Prime Minister who is currently in jail after being convicted in multiple cases.

Judge Nasir Javed Rana, who replaced Judge Mohammad Bashir as he is retiring in a few weeks, conducted the hearing at Rawalpindi's high-security Adiala jail where the 71-year-old Pakistan-Tehreek-Insaf founder is incarcerated in graft cases as well as the Cipher leak case.

The Al-Qadir Trust case pertains to the settlement of 190 million pounds, which the UK's National Crime Agency sent to Pakistan after recovering the amount from Pakistani property tycoon Malik Riaz Hussain.

Khan and his wife Bushra, who were brought before the court, pleaded not guilty after the judge read the chargesheet in their presence.

Khan was arrested in the same case from the premises



of the Islamabad High Court May 9, 2023. His arrest sparked violent protests across the country, with his protesters attacking military installations. Later, the Supreme Court declared his arrest May 9 as illegal.

In December, the National Accountability Bureau (NAB) initiated an investigation against Khan, his wife, and others regarding the alleged acquisition of hundreds of canals of land under the name of Al Qadir University Trust. resulting in a reported loss of 190 million pounds to the exchequer. During the hearing Tuesday, the court said that statements of 58 witnesses will be recorded in the case, Geo News reported.

Kremlin warns of conflict with NATO



Kyiv, Feb 27: A senior Ukrainian official Tuesday welcomed talk of European nations sending troops to Ukraine, but the Kremlin said a conflict between Russia and NATO would become inevitable if European members of the alliance sent in troops to fight.

French President Emmanuel Macron raised the possibility Monday of European nations sending troops to Ukraine, but cautioned that there was no consensus. "This shows, firstly, an absolute awareness of the risks posed to Europe by a militaristic, aggressive Russia," Ukrainian presidential adviser Mykhailo Podolyak said in a written comment on Macron's statement.

Some 20 European leaders gathered in Paris Monday to send Russian President Vladimir Putin a message of European resolve on Ukraine and counter the Kremlin's narrative that Russia is bound to win a war now in its third year.

'The opening of a discussion on the possibility of direct support of Ukraine by armed forces should be seen as a desire to set the right accents, to highlight the risks more clearly," Podolyak added. He said it was important

French President Emmanuel Macron raised the possibility **Monday of European** nations sending troops to Ukraine, but cautioned that there was no consensus

at this stage to accelerate the delivery of military equipment to Ukraine.

Asked about Macron's remarks, Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov said: "The very fact of discussing the possibility of sending certain contingents to Ukraine from NATO countries is a very important new element.

Asked what the risks of a direct Russia-NATO conflict would be if NATO members sent their troops to fight in Ukraine, Peskov said: "In that case, we would need to talk not about the probability, but about the inevitability (of a direct conflict).'

A White House official said that the United States had no plans to send troops to fight in Ukraine and that there were also no plans to send NATO troops to fight in Ukraine

Oleg Orlov gets 30 months in jail

Moscow, Feb 27: A Moscow court Tuesday sentenced a veteran human rights advocate, who spoke out against the war in Ukraine, to two years and six months in prison.

Oleg Orlov, 70, was convicted of "repeatedly discrediting" the Russian army in an article he wrote denouncing the invasion of Ukraine. He has rejected the case against him as politically motivated, telling the court in his closing statement: "I don't regret anything and I don't repent anything." Orlov was hand cuffed and

taken directly into custody from the courtroom.

His verdict concluded a retrial in which Orlov was earlier ordered to pay a fine. Underscoring how little tolerance President Vladimir Putin's government has for criticism of its invasion of Ukraine, the prosecution had appealed, seeking a harsher punishment.

The prosecution claimed that Orlov, co-chairman of the Nobel Peace Prize-winning human rights group Memorial published the article motivated by hostility "against traditional Russian spiritual, moral and patriotic values' and hatred of the Russian military, independent Russian news outlet Mediazona said Tuesday.

In a statement, Memorial called Orlov's sentence "an attempt to drown out the voice of the human rights movement in Russia and any criticism of the state.

It vowed to continue its work. Tuesday's verdict drew a crowd of dozens of supporters including 18 Western diplomats, Mediazona reported.

Qin Gang resigns from Parliament Xi Jinping, was dismissed in

Beijing, Feb 27: In a surprise move, former Chinese foreign minister Qin Gang, who went missing after he was unceremoniously sacked last year, resigned from China's national legislature ahead of its key annual session next week.

The Standing Committee of the National People's Congress (NPC), which concluded its session here on Tuesday, said in a statement that the Tianjin Municipal People's Congress accepted Qin's resignation as a delegate to the upcoming annual parliamentary session, state-run Xinhua news agency re-

The NPC regarded as China's rubber-stamp parliament for its routine approvals of the ruling



Communist Party's agenda is due to begin its annual session on March 5 to legislate on a host of new laws and discuss steps to revive the country's economy which is on a slowdown mode.

The NPC statement said Qin has not been dismissed or expelled from the NPC but resigned, according to a report by Hong Kong-based South China Morning Post. Qin, 57, regarded as a close confidant of President

July in a big political surprise just after seven months in office. Later, the NPC passed a resolution sacking Qin and reap-

pointing his predecessor Wang Yi who is also the Director of the ruling Communist Party's Foreign Affairs Commission. This is the first time Qin's name figured in the form of his resignation from the NPC, regarded as a technical requirement.

He was rumoured to have been sacked for an extramarital affair. The announcement of Qin's resignation also coincides with the removal of the sacked former Defence Minister Gen. Li Shangfu from the Central Military Commission (CMC) - the overall high command of the Chinese military headed by Xi Jinping. the Post reported.

Abu Dhabi's first Hindu stone temple to open on March 1

THE GRAND TEMPLE WAS INAUGURATED BY PRIME MINISTER MODI FEBRUARY 14 DURING A **DEDICATION CEREMONY ATTENDED BY OVER 5,000 INVITEES**

Abu Dhabi, Feb 27: The first Hindu stone temple in Abu Dhabi, which was inaugurated by Prime Minister Narendra Modi earlier this month, will be opened to the public from March 1, according to the temple authorities.

The temple has been built by the Bochasanwasi Shri Akshar Purushottam Swaminarayan Sanstha (BAPS) Swaminarayan Sanstha on a 27-acre site in Abu Mureikhah, near Al Rahba off the Dubai-Abu Dhabi Sheikh Zayed Highway, at a cost of around Rs 700 crore.

The grand temple was inaugurated by Prime Minister Modi February 14 during a dedication ceremony attended by over 5,000 invitees. From February 15 to 29, overseas devotees who had registered in advance or VIP guests were allowed to visit the

'The temple will be open to the public from March 1 from 9 am to 8 pm. The temple will remain closed for visitors every Monday. a temple spokesperson said Constructed with 18 lakh bricks



and 1.8 lakh cubic metres of sandstone sourced directly from Rajasthan, the temple has been made in the Nagara style of architecture, just like the recently inaugurated Ram Temple in Ayodhya.

According to the temple authorities, the grand temple has been built as per an ancient style of construction and creation mentioned in the Shilpa and Sthapathya Shastras, Hindu scriptures which describe the art for mandir design and construction.

The United Arab Emirates (UAE) has at least 3.5 million

Indians who are part of the Indian workforce in the Gulf. The land for the temple was donated by the UAE government. The BAPS Hindu Mandir is the largest in the entire Gulf region. The UAE has three other Hindu temples in Dubai.

Seven spires representing the seven Emirates of the UAE, carvings of camels, and national bird falcon, are part of the architecture of the stone temple, to give equal representation to the host country.

"The seven spires have idols of deities, including Lord Ram, Lord Shiv, Lord Jagannath, Lord Krishna, Lord Swaminarayan (considered a reincarnation of Lord Krishna), Tirupati Balaji and Lord Ayappa. The seven shikhars represent the seven Emirates of the UAE," Swami

Brahmaviharidas, head of international relations for BAPS. had said.

To give equal representation to the host country, along with animals like elephants, camels and lions that occupy an important place in Indian mythology, the UAE's national bird, the falcon, has also been included in the temple design.

Apart from 15 tales from India, including the Ramayana and Mahabharata, stories from Mavan, Aztec, Egyptian, Arabic, European, Chinese and African civilisations have also been depicted in the temple. While the outer walls of the temple are made using sandstone from India, the interior, made of white Italian marble, is adorned with intricately designed and carved columns and walls.

Cross-voting mars RS polls

Bangalore/Lucknow, Feb 27: The Congress suffered a major upset in Himachal Pradesh at the hands of BJP in the Rajya Sabha elections Tuesday which were marred by cross-voting in all the three states, though it won three seats in Karnataka, while all eight BJP candidates emerged victorious in Uttar Pradesh.

The Samajwadi Party (SP) suffered a jolt with one of its three nominees facing defeat due to cross-voting by some of its legislators

Polling was held for 10 seats in Uttar Pradesh, four in Karnataka and one seat in Himachal Pradesh.

Himachal Pradesh saw cross voting that led to the victory of BJP candidate Harsh Mahajan over Abhishek Manu Singhvi. The result made it clear that nine MLAs voted in favour of the BJP. At present, the Congress has 40 MLAs, BJP 25 while three are independents in the 68-member Himachal Pradesh Assembly.

There was high drama in Uttar Pradesh where amid concerns over cross-voting, SP chief whip Manoj Pandey quit when polling was underway. Eight SP MLAs also did not attend a meeting called by Akhilesh Yaday, Monday.

In Karnataka, five candidates were in the fray for the four seats, including D Kupendra Reddy JD(S). Those elected are Ajay Maken, G C Chandrasekhar and Syed Naseer Hussain (all Congress) and Narayansa K Bhandage of the BJP. The election was marred by cross-voting as BJP MLA ST Somashekar voted for Maken, while another party legislator A Shivaram Hebbar abstained from voting.

Grace marks for CHSE students

The choice deficit was for 19 marks, CHSE Exams Controller Ashok Nayak said.



Nua-O Scholarship in Khurda, Begunia



5T and Nabin Odisha Chairman Kartik Pandian informed that a total of ₹16.13 crore has been sanctioned for 16.613 students

Bhubaneswar, Feb 27: As per direction of Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik, 5T and Nabin Odisha Chairman Kartik Pandian visited Khurda and Begunia Tuesday.

He attended the Nua-O Scholarship distribution programmes at both these places where he interacted with students from 30 colleges of Khurda district. During the interaction, he informed the students about the Nua-O Scholarship under which all eligible PG and UG

students of state government universities, government colleges, and non-government-aided and unaided colleges will bene-

The scholarship amount for general and OBC male and female students is Rs 9,000 and Rs 10,000 respectively whereas for SC/ST and Nirman Shramik male and female students it is Rs 10,000 and Rs 11,000 respectively.

On the occasion, Pandian said that 16,613 students from Khurda district will get the scholarship amount in their bank accounts by the end of the day. "With this, a total of Rs 16.13 crore has been sanctioned for 16,613 students," he said while distributing Nua-O Scholarship 'Sanction Orders' to the students.

The 5T Chairman conveyed to students message from the chief minister who had wished the students best for their future. "This initiative would help

you achieve the dream of Nua Odisha," he said.

He said that the government's next major initiative will be to cover all the students through futuristic Nabin Odisha Magic Card, a points-system-based smart card which will enable the youths to pursue academic excellence, personality, skill development and employment.

Based on points earned through various activities and parameters, the cards will be upgraded to silver, gold and platinum levels.

"Cards will be allotted and upgraded based on the performance of students in terms of attendance, discipline, academic performance, participation in extracurricular activities, sports, online courses, personality development courses etc," he said.

The 5T Chairman said that the government will take inputs from students and teachers on activities that can also be included in this points system. "The card will be completely technology driven and will be a revolutionary concept towards youth engagement and empowerment," he said.

Notably, online registration portal for this card will be launched March 5. All the students of the UG and PG courses will be eligible for registration and distribution of the card will start August 15th.

During the interaction, the students expressed their excitement to 5T Chairman about receiving the sanction orders. Immediately after the launch of the programme, they reported receiving messages from the bank about transfer of the scholarship amount to their accounts.

Fishermen seek subsidy on diesel, welfare fund

Bhubaneswar, Feb 27: A large number of fishermen from the coastal areas of three districts of the state Tuesday staged a protest here, demanding fulfillment of their six-point charter of demands, including social security.

The members of the fishing community, under the banner of Odisha State Fishermen Federation, demanded subsidy in diesel, regular dredging in sea mouths, stopping of draining chemical effluents from industrial units into the sea, ending alleged misbehaviour of

forest department and coast guard officials, and formation of a fishermen welfare fund.

The protestors from Bhadrak, Jagatsinghpur and Kendrapara districts, wearing blue caps and waving blue flags, assembled at Lower PMG in City and alleged that the state government ignored their genuine demands.

"Our lives have become miserable as we have to buy diesel at Rs 94 a litre for operating the fishing boats," the president of the Odisha State Fishermen Federation, Srikant Parida, said.

"Fishing in rivers and the sea is our only source of living. Unfortunately, we have to leave the waters and take to the streets because of the government's apathy," he said.

Demanding subsidies on diesel, the agitators claimed that at least seven coastal states are providing diesel subsidies to fishermen.

"There is no such provision in Odisha. We have written many times to the government. But nobody is concerned about our plight, another agitator said. So, we have been forced to come to Bhubaneswar to press for our demands," Parida said.

The agitators also demanded the inclusion of fishermen families in the Public Distribution System (PDS) and other social security schemes during fishing

The state government bans fishing near the coast for three months, April 15 to June 14 every year, to protect brood fish and provide an undisturbed breeding ground. The fishermen cannot work due to adverse calamities like cyclones and low-pressure areas. As many as 15 lakh families are victims of the state government's apathy, they alleged.

They also demanded dredging of river mouths. They said the fish catch has been dwindling due to the closure of river mouths.

Forest department will procure more trap cameras to monitor movement of tigers in Similipal Tiger Reserve

Bhubaneswar, Feb 27: The state government has decided to conduct tiger census every year in order to keep a tab on the tiger population and prepare strategy accordingly, a senior Forest department officer said, Tuesday.

Odisha now has 30 tigers and eight cubs, according to the All Odisha Tiger Estimation 2023-24 conducted by the state government between October 15, 2023 and February 10, 2024 in 47 forest divisions.

The tiger population of the state was 20 in 2022.

"The survey report shows that tiger population rose in Odisha. The state government has already asked the Forest department and the wildlife wing to conduct a yearly census and to keep a tab on the tiger population so that we can manage our strategies," Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (Wildlife) Susanta Nanda told reporters.

The next census report will be released next year, Nanda

said

The Forest department will procure more trap cameras to monitor movement of tigers in Similipal Tiger Reserve (STR).

Of the 30 tigers sighted, a total of 27 adult tigers - 14 females and 13 males - were cameratrapped in Odisha during the All Odisha Tiger Estimation exercise. The other three big cats were found in three other forest areas.


"Earlier, the tigers were moving within the core area of the STR. But now, they are roaming outside the core area. So, more trap cameras are needed to monitor their movement and behaviour even in the rainy season," he said.

In total, 13 adult tigers - seven females and six males - were found to be pseudo-melanistic in Similipal.

Pseudo-melanistic tigers appear black as the black stripes are far more prominent than other Royal Bengal Tigers.

No other wild habitat in the world has such pseudo-melanistic tigers.

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



Hate Eats Hater

ndia had to bear with on an average two anti-Moslem hate speech events per day in 2023 and not surprisingly three in every four of those events – or 75 per cent – occurred in states ruled by the BJP. More significantly, the flurry of these speech events peaked between August and November, 2023 when political campaigning and polling in four major states, including Karnataka and Rajasthan, were held. This is the sum and substance of a report released by India Hate Lab (IHL), a Washington, DC-based research group that has adopted this weird name.

As India is, once again, getting ready for elections to the Lok Sabha, the dates of which are to be announced shortly, the IHL in a first-ofits-kind report maps the spread of anti-Moslem hate speech across the country. The group documented a total of 668 hate speech events. The Indian government rendered the website of IHL inaccessible last month under the controversial Information Technology (IT) Act, 2000. The government also blocked the website of Hindutva Watch, an independent hate-crime tracker also run by IHL's founder.

The new report is a first ever attempt by a research group to have tracked hate speech events spread over a year across India, the agents provocateur and the reasons for their occurrence. These hate speeches, as examined by the group, took place across 18 states and three Union Territories. The top-ranking states for these events were Maharashtra accounting for 118 incidents, Uttar Pradesh with 104 incidents and Madhya Pradesh with 65 incidents. The three states have among the biggest voter bases and are currently ruled by the BJP.

While all these facts are undeniable and true, the global menace of Islamist radicalisation cannot be ignored. India has had, for a very long time, political parties in power, both at the Centre and in states which have pandered to the minority communities simply with the idea of cornering their votes. The vote bank drive went far enough that it eventually helped in creating an equally strong hate group which has successfully fascinated the Hindoos in the past decade. A global look may disturb those who speak against Hindoos. The manner in which Islamic radicalisation is acting out from Spain to the United Kingdom and from France to the Netherlands is a clear indication that history helped India make a course correction. This is not to be misconstrued as a support for hate speeches or any current violent political agendas that are spreading their tentacles across the nation. One needs to remember the constant killings, blasts and terror attacks of the 1990s and 2000s where the mischief mongers did not stay limited to North India alone but spread their wings to Bombay, Calcutta and Hyderabad and other parts of the country. The leaders of the minority communities did not think it necessary to condemn openly nor did they take actions to curb involvement of their youth in such activities at those times. The constant news of police going on Red Alert in different parts of the country had eventually become a soft joke on the Indian establishment. This also should not be misunderstood as if the Establishment has suddenly become more efficient and transparent. On the contrary, the Indian establishment seems to have gone into further slumber. Examples of this can be seen from Pulwama to Galwan. Such incidents, albeit being painted as nationalistic sacrifices also glaringly showcase the inefficiency and unpreparedness of the government machinery which no political party in power has yet been able to change or mend. Therefore, while the world, especially the West, is witnessing a surge of Islamist radicalisation and connected violence, India has been spared from that scourge internally. Whether this governmental attitude should be utilised for garnering votes is a matter of deep reflection because hate eventually destroys the hater.

AN INSPIRING LEGACY

INDIA'S GROSS EXPENDITURE ON RESEARCH **AND DEVELOPMENT IN SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY STANDS AROUND A MEAGRE 0.7 PER CENT OF GDP**

rational Science Day marks the landmark discovery of the Raman Effect by our eminent physicist Sir CV Raman on 28 February, 1928 and his subsequent felicitation of the coveted Nobel Prize as the first Asian in Physics. This marked the beginning of a new culture of scientific research and innovation in the country with subsequent researchers like Homi J. Bhabha, Vikram Sarabhai and Meghnad Saha following up with many outstanding contributions in science and technology. However, it is lamenting to note that despite this rich legacy in scientific pursuit, Indian youth currently are more attracted to careers in technology rather than fundamental research in science This is the reason why the country is now lagging far behind other emerging nations in the field of scientific research. It is also shocking to note that the country has not been able to produce a second Nobel Prize winner in science even 94 years

The state of poor scientific research in India is evident from the fact that the country reportedly has only 140 researchers per 1,000,000 population as compared to 4,651 in the United States and that India ranks 34th in global spending on scientific research and development as India's Gross Expenditure on Research and Development (GERD) in science and technology stands around a meagre 0.7 per cent of its GDP. This is far lower compared to nations like Israel (4.6 per cent), South Korea (4.5 per cent), Japan (3.2 per cent), Germany (3.0 per cent), the United States (2.8 per cent). France (2.2 per cent), the United Kingdom (1.7 per cent), Canada (1.6 per cent), China (2.1 per cent), Brazil (1.3 per cent) and Russia (nearly 1 per cent). India also has fewer world class research institutes and universities to catalyze and support its research activities.

Indian research and manufacturing industries, both in the private and the public sectors, filed only 1428 international patent applications in 2014 as compared to 42,381 filed by Japan, 25,548 by China, and 13 117 by South Korea

The dismal performance in our R & D sector can be attributed to the poor quality of research work in the country, pitiable market value for its products and the lengthy period of research by an individual and lack of patronage and support from the private sector to fund the research. It is also shocking to note that most Indian companies including those in the IT and infrastructure sectors spend only less than one per cent of their revenues

The life of Raman has several important points that should be imbibed by our young generation today. Raman published

his first scientific paper entitled "Unsymmetrical diffraction bands due to a rectangular aperture" in the British journal "The Philosophical Magazine" in 1906 while he was an 18-year-old graduate student. This shows that inclination for path-breaking discoveries should be occupied in one's mind at the very early age. Second, he contradicted with Lord Rayleigh, an established British physicist of that time regarding the explanation for the blue colour of the sea which was believed to be due to the reflection of the blue sky. Rather than being dogmatic in accepting the prevailing view, Raman carried out a series of improvised experiments from the deck of a steamship named SS Narkunda amidst the Mediterranean Sea during his return voyage from Southampton to Bombay in 1921 to conclude that the blue colour of the sea was actually due to the

predominant scattering of the blue wavelength of the sunlight by the water particles. It theoretically proved the Rayleigh explanation wrong and, hence, represented the unfolding of a revolutionary idea from the Eastern world breaking the monopoly of the scientific supremacy of the West. Thirdly, Raman quit the lucrative post of Assistant Accountant General in 1907 held in the Indian Financial Service in Kolkata to join as the Palit Professor of Physics in the University of Calcutta at nearly half of the salary just because of his sheer love for scientific research. Fourthly, although two contemporary Russian physicists namely GS Landsberg (1890-1957) and LI Mandelstam (1879-1944) were also working on the same field of scattering of light by liquid particles and almost have discovered the Effect, it was the wisdom of Raman who mailed the paper first to the British journal 'Nature' for publication to write his name among the Nobels. Finally, the fact that Raman discovered the Effect with the help of a spectrometer that cost hardly five hundred rupees at that time proved that path-breaking discoveries in science can also be achieved even by one's own ingenuity and original approach rather than the instrumentation superiority of a country.

For a developing country like India, research is not just a scientific pursuit, but a vehicle for economic awakening, societal transformation, inclusive growth and people's empowerment that leads to the ultimate goal of national development. Hence, pursuing a career in scientific research at individual level and establishing a right ecosystem for bolstering this base at government's level are worth delving into this field. Raman's rich legacy would continue to be a torch bearer for us in this field!

AP'S 'POWER' GAME 1 killed, 5 injured as truck rams into auto-rickshaw

Nandapur, Feb 27: The ongoing border dispute between Odisha and Andhra Pradesh has reached another level as, this time, the neighbouring state is playing spoilsport in supplying electricity to Raipahad village under this block of Koraput district. According to sources, power

discom Tata Power South Odisha Distribution Ltd (TPSODL) has completed all the ground works for electricity supply to the households of Raipahad and has installed transformer as well as utility poles. However, Andhra Pradesh electricity department was quick enough to install all the required infrastructure and supply power to the households of Raipahad spoiling Odisha's move.

Now, the houses of Raipahad have been lit up with power supplied by Andhra. TPSODL has put up utility poles from Dumuriguda to Raipahad and even installed a transformer in the village. However, in a bid to strike a chord with Raipahad villagers, Andhra lost no time and connected the households with power supply before Odisha

could do it. This has left the district administration red-faced while the neighbouring state is drawing appreciation from some of the villagers.

On the other hand, the villagers and public representatives of Golur panchayat alleged that Raipahad village has been deprived of the benefits of the developmental initiatives as the district administration and block officials have remained silent.

Sources said the non-descript Raipahad village in Golur panchayat under Nandapur block is situated on the border of the

neighbouring state. The neighbouring state is frequently straying into the village and trying to wean away the villagers from Odisha by implementing various developmental projects and doling out the benefits

of welfare schemes This has created dispute between the two states for which the officials of both the states had twice held meetings to sort out the issues. However, Andhra had failed to give any proof on its claim over Raipahad village and agreed to withdraw from the village.

It also decided to stop all the developmental works it is implementing in the village and stopped power supply which it had started in the village. However, it went back on its promise and resumed power supply to the village much to the

chagrin of the district admin-

istration and block officials. TPSODL engineer Bikash Choudhury said two project executive engineers of the department visited Raipahad village and supervised the electrification works. They have informed that the power supplied by Andhra should be disconnected first before Odisha could connect the households with power.

The state government has awarded houses under Biju Pucca Ghar Yojana to all the households in the village. Some of the villagers have already started building their houses under the scheme.

Locals have demanded the district administration and block officials to visit their village and resume power supply to their village by disconnecting the supply from Andhra side.

Digapahandi, Feb 27: In a tragic incident, one person was killed and five others sustained serious injuries when the auto-rickshaw they were travelling in was hit by a speeding truck coming from opposite direction near Rajpur Chhak on Digapahandi-Aska main road under this police limits in Ganjam district, in the wee hours of Tuesday.

The deceased was identified as Ramnath Paraja, a resident of Katinikund village under Baipariguda police limits in Koraput district. The critically injured persons were identified as Ram Paraja, Phulamati Paraja and Kuni Paraja, residents of Katinikunda village, Purandar Sandha of Butapani village and auto driver Ramesh Chandra Sahu of Sahaspur village under

Patapur police limits.

According to sources, the illfated auto-rickshaw (OR-07 X-9093) was carrying five labourers on its way to a brick kiln near Patapur when the threewheeler collided head-on with a plastic pipe laden truck (OD-05 BF-8929) leading to the death and injuries. The auto-rickshaw was badly damaged in the mishap, the source added.

Some locals rescued the injured and rushed them to Digapahandi community health centre (CHC) for treatment. Later, they were shifted to MKCG Medical College and Hospital (MKCGMCH) in Berhampur after their conditions deteriorated. While undergoing treatment, Ramnath Paraja died at the hospital. Digapahandi police reached the spot and began a probe.

Man kills father, sets body on fire

Sambalpur, Feb 27: Sadar police Tuesday arrested a man for allegedly killing his father over a feud and setting ablaze his body at Saharpada village late Monday night.

The deceased was identified as Lingaraj Kumara, 60, and the accused as Aditya Kumara of the village.

As per reports, Lingaraj and Aditya got into a heated argument late Monday night. In a fit of rage. Aditya lost his temper and hit his father on his head with a brick. When the latter collapsed on the ground, Aditya bludgeoned his father's head mercilessly with the brick. He then set Lingaraj's body on fire.

On being informed, Sadar police reached the spot, seized the body and sent it for post-mortem. Sadar Police registered a case (54/24) under Section 302 and forwarded Aditva to court Tuesday. Since Lingaraj's wife is already dead and they don't have any other family member to conduct the last rites, the body was handed over to 'Sambal', a leading voluntary organisation in Sambalpur, after post-mortem was conducted.

Two die, one hurt at Damanjodi plant



Damanjodi, Feb 27: In a tragic incident at the construction site of Nalco's Damanjodi plant in Koraput district, two workers died and another sustained grievous injuries when a huge binding iron rod fell on them, Tuesday.

The deceased were identified as Sanat Kunai, 35, and Shama Rajbanshi, 44 of Jharkhand. The injured was identified as Md. Azad Ansari, 32, of Jharkhand. Sources said one contrac-

tual worker died on the spot while another succumbed to injuries while being taken to Nalco Hospital.

The injured worker is undergoing treatment at the hospital. The workers were engaged in binding of iron rod when the mishap took place and the three workers were reportedly trapped under the rods which fell on them.

Damanjodi Police and CISF personnel reached the spot and started an investigation into the matter. The foundation work of new silo (chimney) was underway near the warehouse in Nalco expansion proiect area. A private firm Jet Works was awarded the tender while the work was being executed by Amulya Constructions, a local consultancy agency.

An effort to contact an official of Amulya Constructions was unsuccessful as his phone was found switched off.

When contacted, Pravat Kumar Das, general manager (security), Nalco admitted that the consultancy agency was executing the work without permit where the accident took place.

The agency had not received the permit from the department concerned. He, however, assured that the security department will tighten the safety measures in coming days.

2 held for murder of woman, son

Berhampur: Odisha Police have arrested two persons for allegedly killing one of their relatives and her seven-vear-old son in Ganiam district. police said Tuesday. The police had February 19 recovered the bodies of D Neelabeni, 28, and her son D Rushi from their residence in Chudialanii village. and sent them for post-mortem. The woman's



husband was in Dubai when the mother-son duc was killed, Berhampur SP Saravana Vivek M said.

"She and her son were strangled to death. The accused persons were arrested Monday from Berhampur," he said. The accused, including a woman, killed Neelabeni and Rushi because the deceased woman had come to know about their illicit relationship, the SP said. Neelabeni warned them to disclose their relationship before the husband of the accused woman, the SP said.



CAA rollout likely before poll code

New Delhi, Feb 27: The rules for the implementation of the contentious Citizenship Amendment Act, 2019 (CAA) for fast-tracking citizenship to undocumented non-Muslim migrants from Pakistan, Bangladesh and Afghanistan are likely to be issued before the Model Code of Conduct for the 2024 Lok Sabha elections comes into effect.

The Model Code of Conduct (MCC) gets enforced immediately after election schedule is announced, which is likely in next fortnight.

LIKELY IN NEXT The rules for the CAA is likely to be issued before the MCC comes into effect, sources privy to the development said.

When the rules for the CAA are issued, the Modi government will start granting Indian citizenship to persecuted non-Muslim migrants -- Hindus, Sikhs, Jains, Buddhists, Parsis Christians -- from Bangladesh, Pakistan and Afghanistan who had come to India till December 31, 2014.

The CAA was passed in December 2019 and it got president's assent subsequently. However, the law could not be implemented so far as rules are a must for its implementation.

There were massive protests in some parts of the country after the CAA was passed by

According to the law, the benefits under the CAA will be given to the undocumented minorities from the three neighbouring

On December 27, Union Home Minister Amit Shah had said that no one can stop the implementation of the CAA as it is the law of the land and accused the

misleading people on the issue. Addressing a party meeting in Kolkata, Shah said it is the BJP's commitment to implement the CAA.

The TMC, led by Mamata Banerjee, has been opposing the CAA since beginning.

The promise of implementing the controversial CAA was a major poll plank of the BJP in the last Lok Sabha and Assembly polls in West Bengal.

The saffron party's leaders consider it a plausible factor that led to the rise of the BJP in Bengal.

According to the Manual on Parliamentary Work, the rules for any legislation should have been framed within six months of presidential assent or seek extension from the Committees on Subordinate Legislation in Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha.

Since 2020, the home ministry has been taking extension in regular interval from the parliamentary committee for framing the rules.

Meanwhile, in last two years, over district magistrates and home secretaries of nine states have been given powers to grant Indian citizenship to Hindus, Sikhs, Buddhists, Jains, Parsis and Christians coming from Afghanistan, Bangladesh and Pakistan under the Citizenship

According to the annual report of the Ministry of Home Affairs for 2021-22, from April 1, 2021 to December 31, 2021, a total of 1,414 foreigners belonging to these non-Muslim minority communities from Pakistan, Bangladesh and Afghanistan were given Indian citizenship by registration or naturalisation under the Citizenship Act, 1955.

The nine states where Indian citizenship by registration or naturalisation is given under the Citizenship Act, 1955 to non-Muslim minorities from Pakistan, Bangladesh and Afghanistan are: Gujarat. Rajasthan, Chhattisgarh, Haryana, Punjab, Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, Delhi and Maharashtra.

Interestingly, authorities of none of the districts of Assam and West Bengal, where the issue is politically very sensitive, has been given the powers so far.

Govt extends ban on J&K Jamaat-e-Islami for 5 years

New Delhi, Feb 27: The ban on the Jamaat-e-Islami, Jammu Kashmir (JeI), has been extended by another five years for continuing activities that pose a threat to the security of the nation, Union Home Minister Amit Shah announced Tuesday.

Shah said stringent actions will be taken against any individual who jeopardises the nation's security.

He underscored the government's decision to extend the ban on Jamaat-e-Islami, Jammu Kashmir was in alignment with Prime Minister Narendra Modi's policy of zero tolerance towards terrorism and separatism.

The home minister cited the organisation's persistent engagement in activities deemed detrimental to the security, integrity, and sovereignty of the nation as the primary rationale behind the extension.

"Pursuing PM @narendramodi Ji's policy of zero tolerance against terrorism and separatism the government has extended the ban on Jamaat-e-Islami, Jammu Kashmir for five years," he wrote on X.

The home minister said the organisation is found continuing its activities against the security, integrity and sovereignty of the nation. The outfit was first declared an 'Unlawful Association' February 28, 2019.



In a notification, the Union home ministry said the Jamaate-Islami, Jammu and Kashmir, has been indulging in activities which are prejudicial to internal security and public order and have the potential to disrupt the unity and integrity of the country.

The home ministry has listed 47 cases registered against the JeI which includes an NIA case for collection of funds used to encourage violent and secessionist activities.

It said that the funds were also used by the active cadres and members of Hizb-ul-Mujahideen, Lashkar-e-Taiba and other terrorist organisations through a well-established network of their cadres to organise violent protests, create public unrest and communal disharmony, thus creating a sense of fear and insecurity in Jammu and Kashmir and all over the country.

AM Khanwilkar appointed as Lokpal chief

New Delhi: Former Supreme Court judge A M Khanwilkar was Tuesday appointed as the chairperson of the anti-corruption ombudsman Lokpal, nearly two years after the post fell vacant. President Droupadi Murmu also appointed former Chief Justice of Karnataka High Court Ritu Raj Awasthi, who is at present the chairperson of the Law Commission of India, former Chief Justice of Himachal Pradesh High Court Lingappa Narayana Swamy and former Chief Justice of Allahabad High Court Sanjay Yadav as the judicial members in the Lokpal. Former civil servants Sushil Chandra, Pankaj Kumar and Ajay Tirkey have been appointed as the non-judicial members in the Lokpal, according to a communique issued by the Rashtrapati Bhavan Tuesday.



Indians face high risk of lung damage after severe Covid-19

New Delhi, Feb 27: Indians suffer high rates of lung function damage after acute Covid with about half reporting shortness of breath, according to a recent study, a worrying finding that experts attribute to various reasons, including comorbidities and pollution.

The study by the Christian Medical College, Vellore, is the largest from India to investigate the impact of COVID-19 on lung function. It examined 207 individuals, showcasing substantial impairment in lung function, exercise capacity, and quality of life among recovered individuals.

The study revealed a high prevalence of respiratory symptoms among Indians who recovered, even after a mean of over two months following acute illness, with shortness of breath reported in 49.3 per cent and cough in 27.1 per cent of the cohort. "It is clear from the study that lung function is affected more in the Indian population compared to data from other countries across every category of disease severity," said study lead researcher DJ Christopher, professor of pulmonary medicine at CMC Vellore.

"Although it is impossible to know the exact cause of worse impairment among Indians, co-morbidities may be a factor contributing to lung damage, as our population had much higher co-morbidities than the others" Christopher told PTI. The study, published recently in the journal PLOS Global Public Health, compared data from Europe and China. An Italy-based study, for instance, found dyspnoea or shortness of breath present in 43 per cent and cough in less than 20 per cent of the subjects. The corresponding figures from a Chinese study were also lower than those seen in the Indian study.

However, the CMC study did not cite any specific data from China or from European countries other than Italy.

In terms of co-morbidities, CMS Vellore researchers found 72.5 per cent of individuals reporting underlying health conditions such as diabetes mellitus, systemic hypertension, and chronic lung

Lung function tests revealed a concerning trend of impairment, particularly in diffusion capacity (DLCO), a sensitive test to assess the lungs' ability to transfer gas from inspired air to the bloodstream, the researchers said.





Sebi asks small, mid-cap funds to disclose more about risks

Small and mid-sized funds have seen high inflows, causing concern among authorities about how they would hold up in the event of a sharp market selloff

Mumbai, Feb 27: India's market regulator has asked the country's asset managers to give investors more information about the risks associated with their small and mid-cap funds, according to a fund manager and two people with knowledge of the matter.

Small and mid-sized funds have seen high inflows, causing concern among authorities about how they would hold up in the event of a sharp market selloff. The Securities & Exchange Board of India (SEBI) has also been reviewing stress tests conducted by such funds, sources have previously said.

The funds are being asked to disclose how long it might take to accommodate large redemptions, what impact large outflows could have on the value of the portfolio and how much cash and liquid assets the fund holds to meet outflows, the people said. "Investment committees were always aware of liquidity challenges but investors were not. Once this information is available to them, they can compare each fund," said Harsha Upadhyaya, chief investment officer at Kotak Mutual Fund.



Funds in India (AMFI), which is working with SEBI, is proposing a standardised format for the disclosure of risks, he said, adding that the disclosures would

be made on a regular basis. SEBI and AMFI did not immediately respond to requests for comment.

Heavy inflows have sent the Nifty small-cap 250 index surging 71% over the past 52 weeks and lifted the Nifty mid-cap 100 index 64%. That far exceeds the benchmark Nifty's 28% rise.

Funds are likely to begin making these disclosures from April. said one of the sources who was not authorised to speak to media

Mutual funds tend to keep between 1% and 5% of their assets as cash as a prudent measure to meet outflows, according to public documents. There is, however, no minimum regulatory requirement

Funds need to invest at least 65% of their assets in small-cap stocks to be categorised as a small-cap fund and the remaining 35% can either be in cash or invested in large-cap stocks. The rule is similar for mid-cap funds.

"In some cases, the funds do not have enough cash. While in others, funds are fully invested in small/midcap stocks with no prudent investments in large-cap stocks," said the second source.

Indices rebound on gains in heavyweights

Mumbai, Feb 27: Benchmark equity indices Sensex and Nifty rebounded Tuesday following buying in index major Tata Consultancy Services, Tata Motors and Sun Pharma amid mostly firm global markets.

The 30-share BSE Sensex climbed 305.09 points or 0.42 per cent to settle at 73,095.22. The index was hit by volatility in the first half of the session but gains in index heavyweights helped the barometer end two sessions of losses. During the day, the Sensex jumped 371.17 points or 0.50 per cent to a high of

Snapping its two-day falling streak, the broader Nifty ended 76.30 points or 0.34 per cent up

Among the Sensex firms, Tata Motors, Tata Consultancy Services, IndusInd Bank, Power

Grid, Bharti Airtel, Sun Pharma, JSW Steel and Tata Steel were the major gainers.

On the other hand, Bajaj Finance, State Bank of India, Bajaj Finserv, Axis Bank and NTPC were among the laggards.

"Markets rebounded from 2session losses as selective buving in frontline stocks aided recovery from early weakness. There is no major trigger and investors are taking cues from global markets. As we approach F&O expiry day on Thursday, volatility will begin to kick-in as traders will rollover their positions to next expiry day," said Prashanth Tapse, Senior VP (Research), Mehta Equities Ltd.

"The hopes for a ceasefire in the Israel-Hamas war and the drop in crude oil prices supported the sentiment," said Vinod Nair, Head of Research, Geojit Financial Services.

In the broader market, the

BSE smallcap gauge declined 0.25 per cent and the midcap index dipped 0.10 per cent.

Among the indices, realty jumped 1.02 per cent, consumer durables climbed 1.01 per cent, teck (0.85 per cent), capital goods (0.79 per cent), IT (0.76 per cent) and consumer discretionary (0.45 per cent).

Commodities, financial services, telecommunication, utilities and oil & gas were the laggards.

In Asian markets, Tokyo, Shanghai and Hong Kong settled in the green while Seoul ended lower. European markets were traded largely in the green. The US markets ended marginally lower Monday.

Foreign Institutional Investors (FIIs) offloaded equities worth ₹285.15 crore Monday, according to exchange data.

Global oil benchmark Brent crude climbed 0.16 per cent to USD 82.66 a barrel.

Byju's investors allege \$533mn siphoned off

Bangalore, Feb 27: Investors in Byju's Tuesday alleged that the edtech giant siphoned off \$533 million in an obscure hedge fund in the US and sought a stay on a USD 200 million rights issue, calling it illegal and contrary to law.

The company law court asked Byju's to submit a written response to the investors' plea within three days, and reserved its order.

The rights issue through which promoters of Byju's are seeking to infuse funds into the startup, is to close Wednesday and the two sides cited technicalities if the rights issue could go ahead.

While Byju's did not comment on the charges levelled by four of its shareholders in proceedings before the Bangalore-bench of the National Company Law Tribunal, sources close to the firm said in absence of a stay by NCLT, the rights issue can proceed as planned and would close Wednesday.

However, investors, who are baying for the blood of founders for mismanagement and eroding value of the company through misdemeanours, argued that a rights issue can happen only if the authorised share capital of the company is increased and existing shareholders apply and get the

This hasn't happened yet and it can be done only through an extraordinary general meeting of shareholders where at least 51 per cent vote for such an increase.

During the hearing before the NCLT, sources said the investors alleged that the company's move to call for rights issue is illegal and contrary to law and sought a stay of it. The company management on the other hand argued that the investors were creating obstructions to the company.

Investors, in their plea, stated that Byju's in 2022 transferred \$533 million to Camshaft Capital Fund, which was founded by a 23-year-old and whose principal place of business once was a pancake restaurant in Miami.

The founder of the investment firm, who apparently lacked formal training in investing, had luxury cars - a 2023 Ferrari Roma, a 2020 Lamborghini Huracán EVO, and a 2014 Rolls-Royce Wraith - registered in his name since the transfer occurred.

While Byju's did not comment on the allegations made in NCLT Tuesday, the firm had when the allegations first surfaced in September last year stated that "an offshore subsidiary remains the beneficiary of the money invested in high security fixed income instruments invested with a multi-hundred billion dollar fund in the US." It had denied insinuation that it was no longer a beneficiary owner of the funds.

STOKES PROUD **OF TEAMMATES**

Ranchi, Feb 27: Skipper Ben Stokes expressed pride in how England have fought toe to toe with India despite not having "a chance in hell of competing" with the hosts in the ongoing se-

"3-1 doesn't look great, but the way in which we've come at India is what I'm most proud of," Stokes told British media. "We didn't have a chance in hell of even competing with India. But even today(Monday), that wasn't an easy win for India, and I think they would admit that,'

In the fourth Test, England tried to fashion a fight-back before India crossed the line on the fourth day in Ranchi. Chasing 192, India slipped to 120/5, before Shubman Gill and Dhruv Jurel stitched a 72-run unbroken partnership.

This young, inexperienced team have been successful over the past two years, but coming to India is a completely different beast, something that this team have not been exposed to. The way in which we have reacted to everything, even being on the wrong end of three results, is something I'm incredibly proud of.

The visitors had started off with a thrilling win in the opener but the hosts have come back strongly taking the next three fixtures in an emphatic manner. "I'm very proud of the way every player has thrown everything at India. No one has

ever taken a backward step,' Stokes said.

England have let slip several promising opportunities in the series. Their batters have displayed poor judgement, giving away the advantage to the hosts. Opting to bat first, England had a first-innings lead of 46 but weren't able to capitalise on it as they were bowled out for just 145 in their second essay.

Stokes conceded that the Indian spinners' skill in those conditions made it "nigh-on impossible" to play with their attacking game. "Looking back at when we had our chance to bat yesterday, cricket is always skill against skill. R Ashwin, Ravindra Jadeja and Kuldeep Yadav and the conditions we found ourselves in against them was very, very challenging.

"When India have a sniff in conditions like that, any team is going to find it hard to not only keep the scoreboard ticking but rotate the strike. You've got to give them a lot of credit for the way in which they bowled in very favourable conditions. On this occasion, their skill was better than ours yesterday (Monday).

"When you've got three worldclass spinners operating in conditions like that, you know you're going to be up against it. That period yesterday (Monday) after lunch was the game. Nothing is impossible, I wouldn't say that. But it was nigh on impossible to operate how we wanted to," he added.

McCullum backs Bairstow

England head coach Brendon McCullum has backed the outof-form Jonny Bairstow to make an impact in Dharamsala, where he will play his 100th game. Bairstow is the only English batter yet to play a significant knock in the Test series against India. The rubber is already out of England's reach but runs from Bairstow's bat will be more than welcome. His highest score in eight innings thus far is 38, which came in the

first innings of the Ranchi Test. "It'll be really emotional for him," said McCullum in a interaction with the UK media in reference to Bairstow's land mark game. "Everyone knows Jonny's story. He is quite an emotional character at times and big milestones like that do mean a lot to him. (In this match) he walked taller, looked stronger, had that presence and that real Jonny Bairstow swagger to him. When he has that you kind of feel he's never too far

India have handed England their first series loss in the Bazball era but the head coach remains optimistic about the future. "There's times in games where we haven't quite screwed down our method just yet. We've lost here, didn't win the Ashes (2-2), but we're a better team than 18 months ago and we've got an opportunity in the next 18 months to do some special shit. We'll keep chiselling away at those rough edges. It's not a bad time to be coach of the England team," he said.

Shami undergoes ankle surgery, set to miss IPL

New Delhi, Feb 27: Senior India pacer Mohammed Shami has undergone a surgery on his left achilles tendon, which rules him out of next month's Indian Premier League and possibly the T20 World Cup in June.

The 33-year-old, who last played for India in the ODI World Cup final against Australia November 19, went under the knife in London Monday. Shami, who is eager to "get back on my feet soon" stares at a recovery time of a minimum of three months.

He will thus miss the IPL slated to be played from March 22 to May 26, as reported by PTI last week. Shami is also a doubtful starter for the T20 World Cup in the Caribbean and USA.

"Just had a successful heel operation on my achilles tendon! Recovery is going to take some time, but looking forward to getting back on my feet,' Shami tweeted, along with several pictures of him in the hospital, on 'X' on Monday.

Shami, who was one of the architects of India's stupendous ODI World Cup campaign with 24 wickets, had played through pain as he had problems with his landing but didn't let it affect his performance.

He had flown to London in

January to take special ankle injections. However, the medication didn't work and the fast

bowler had to opt for surgery. The absence of Shami is a major blow for Gujarat Titans, who have also traded all-rounder Hardik Pandya to Mumbai Indians in an all-cash deal. Shami was the side's highest wicket-

Disciplined bowlers set Bhagat opens up on next goal, dream

New Delhi, Feb 27: Dead chuffed to have equalled Chinese badminton icon Lin Dan's record of five World Championships titles, Indian para shuttler Pramod Bhagat now wants to defend his Paralympic gold in Paris, and has also set himself a long-term target of staying fit till the 2036

The 35-year-old Bihar-born para shuttler Sunday matched Lin Dan's record after outwitting nemesis England's Daniel Bethell 14-21 21-15 21-14 in SL3 (standing/lower limb impairment/severe) final.

"Since the Olympics, I lacked in my training and he also worked on his game and he always had an upper hand in the 7 to 8 times that we have played in the finals. So, it became a mental barrier for me. I had to break that barrier before the Paris Olympics," Bhagat, who was diagnosed with polio when he was five years old, told PTI.

"I wanted to rectify the mistakes which I had committed in open tournaments. So, in January, my doubles partner Sukant (Kadam) and I went to



Nikhil Kanetkar Badminton Academy in Pune.

"Nikhil sir is an Olympian and has a lot of experience. He helped me. We focussed mainly on how I could regain my strengths and beat Daniel. Since it is a big event whoever wins will have an upper hand ahead of the Olympics.'

With the win, Bhagat completed a hat-trick of crowns after Stoke Mandeville in 2015 and Basel in 2019. He also won a gold medal at 2022 Tokyo and 2009 Seoul edition.

A fan of the Daddies - 39-yearold Hendra Setiawan and 36year-old Mohammad Ahsan of Indonesia – Bhagat says he has a long-term goal of competing at the 2036 Olympics.

"I also have a goal of participating at the 2036 Paralympics, which hopefully, India will host. Age is a number and I am fit and I hope I can stay fit and compete in 2036. It is a very longterm goal but not an impossible dream," Bhagat said.

India is likely to bid for the hosting rights for 2036 Olympics with Prime Minister Narendra Modi also declaring last October the country's interest in hosting the Games. "If not singles, I can play in mixed or men's doubles. India is becoming a sports hub and I want to be there when India gets to host the Paralympics.'

Iyer in Mumbai squad for Ranji Trophy semifinal

While Dube is on the mend having suffered a side strain issue, Iyer has recovered completely and will be available for the semifinal against Tamil Nadu.

Kosovo dash India's title hopes

Alanya (Turkey), Feb 27: India's hopes of winning their firstever senior title outside the SAFF region were dashed by an injury-time goal by lower-ranked Kosovo in their concluding round-robin Turkish Women's Cup match here Tuesday.

While the 1-0 victory, thanks to a strike by Ereleta Memeti (90+2'), propelled 100-ranked Kosovo to nine points from three matches and gave them their second title in a row, India, placed 35 spots above their opponents in the FIFA chart, finished runners-up with six points.

It was the Blue Tigresses' best performance in the tournament in three appearances. India's Manisha Kalyan was adjudged the best midfielder of the tournament for her exemplary display throughout the competition.

It was a do-or-die match for India. For Kosovo, a team, who last tasted defeat in November 2022 (1-3 against Slovenia), a draw was enough, though they did even better.



India were happy to keep their shape and contain Kosovo, though the epicentre of the battle was quite far from the Indian box. India, while sitting on a mid-press on most occasions, chose their moments to impose a high press on the Kosovo backfour, a tactic that yielded several chances and also served to confuse the opposition defence.

Soumya Guguloth had the best chance of the first half and perhaps even the game on the quarterhour mark, when Pyari Xaxa managed to steal the ball at the edge of the Kosovo box, before playing it to Indumathi Kathiresan, who threaded a delicate through ball between the lines, to Soumya behind the defence.

The India winger only had Diellza Mehmeti to beat from inside the six-yard box but managed to side-foot it straight at the Kosovo keeper. India's ploy to pressurise the Kosovo defence worked wonders, with Pyari, the striker, being the chief workhorse. She managed to make a crucial interception at the edge of the area in the 38th minute, an action that required a high boot from Donieta Halilaj to bring her down.

If the first half seemed like a tight match-up, the second half was twice as much. Kosovo looked to implement their own high press, which often left the Indian fullbacks isolated when the ball was played out wide to them.

Malla had achieved the feat during the Hangzhou Asian Games last year when his side had posted a world-record total of 314/3 against Mongolia. Long-serving HI CEO Elena Norman resigns

New Delhi: Fresh turmoil hit Hockey India (HI) Tuesday when its long-serving CEO Elena Norman resigned from her position owing to non-payment of dues for the past few months, sources in the national federation told PTI. The Australian held the post for nearly 13 years and had not been paid for the last three months. Norman's resignation comes days after the chief coach of the Indian women's hockey team Janneke Schopman who claimed that she was not valued and respected by the national federation. Norman's resignation is another setback for the body, which did not give the exact reason for her departure in the official statement.

Furor erupts over CR7's obscene taunt

Riyadh: Cristiano Ronaldo is reportedly being investigated for making an alleged offensive gesture while playing for Al Nassr in the Saudi Pro League. Footage on social media appeared to show Ronaldo cupping his ear and repeatedly thrusting his hand forward near his pelvis, seemingly aimed at rival Al Shabab supporters. The incident occurred Sunday after Al Nassr beat Al Shabab 3-2. In the background were chants of "Messi." While the incident was not captured by television cameras, criticism of the 39-yearold Portugal striker has been swift. Local media reports say the Saudi Arabia Football Federation has opened an investigation.
