





Maken said the party is exploring all legal options and would move the High Court 'very soon'.

"The BJP government has deliberately chosen the timing of this to coincide with national elections," Maken said. He said the I-T tribunal order freezing Congress' funds is 'an attack on democracy' as it has come just ahead of national elections. "How can one expect fair elections in such a situation when funds to the tune of ₹270 crore have been freezed or taken away by the Income Tax authorities from

Congress party's accounts,' he asked.

Congress' legal cell head Vivek Tankha said the Tribunal has not even followed its own past precedents in this regard and the party will be approaching the High Court soon. "We are disappointed with the Income Tax Appellate Tribunal order. We will be moving the High Court very soon. They have not followed their own past precedents in granting relief on payment of 20 per cent penalty and that too to a national party which is now on the verge of contesting national elections, which is going to be notified soon,' Tankha said. He appeared before the Tribunal on behalf of the party appealing against the I-T department order imposing penalty worth ₹210 crore for alleged discrepancies in I-T returns for pre-

Bhubaneswar, March 8: The Odisha BJP has said it may field candidates in all the 147 Assembly and 21 Lok Sabha constituencies of the state apparently after its pre-poll alliance and seat sharing talks with the BJD in Delhi remained inconclusive.

BJP state president Manmohan Samal, who along with other senior leaders of the party returned to Bhubaneswar from the national capital Friday evening said, "There was no talk on alliance and we (BJP) will go to polls alone."

Samal said, "We had gone to Delhi to hold discussions with the central leaders on our preparations for the upcoming Lok Sabha and Assembly elections in the state. No talks on alliance or seat-sharing with any party were held during the meeting.'

BJD leaders Kartik Pandian and Pranab Prakash Das, who had rushed to Delhi in a chartered flight Thursday evening to discuss pre-poll alliance issues with BJP central leaders,

also returned to Bhubaneswar. Upon their return, they maintained silence regarding the outcome of their discussions.

Sources, however, said the alliance talks between Odisha's ruling BJD and Opposition BJP hit hurdles over seat sharing.

Though both the parties have mutually agreed for a pre-poll alliance, there was difference over seat sharing. While the BJD sought to contest from over 100 seats in the 147-member Odisha Assembly, it was not acceptable to the BJP, sources in the saffron camp claimed.

In the outgoing Assembly, the BJD has 114 members and, initially, it demanded 112 seats during talks with the BJP.

"The BJD is demanding about 75 per cent of the Assembly seats which is not acceptable to us," a senior BJP leader said, adding such a situation would adversely affect the prospect of the saffron party in the state.

The BJP, on the other hand, sought 14 of the 21 Lok Sabha seats in Odisha which has been rejected by the BJD.



Lateral Entry Push

rime Minister Narendra Modi's preferred lateral entry, introduced with much fanfare in 2018, received a lukewarm response and soon got passed over and forgotten. But Modi never dropped the ball. Now, lateral entry has made a formidable comeback as Modi's second term comes to a close. In a recent development, the Appointments Committee of the Cabinet (ACC) headed by Modi has greenlit the appointment of three joint secretaries and 22 directors/deputy secretaries across various Central government departments.

Traditionally, these positions have been occupied by officers from all-India services such as the IAS, IPS, IFoS and other Group A services. But the latest wave of appointments marks a departure from convention, as it embraces the lateral entry mode – introducing private sector specialists into government departments – to infuse fresh energy and perspectives.

The lateral entry scheme is for recruiting at the joint secretary, director and deputy secretary levels, where these officers wield significant influence on policymaking. Initially, when the scheme was launched, the Personnel Ministry recruited for 10 joint secretary positions, with the hiring being overseen by the Union Public Service Commission (UPSC). In 2021, the UPSC recommended 31 candidates for appointment as joint secretaries, directors and deputy secretaries across various departments. As of date, 33 private sector specialists, including eight joint secretaries, 16 directors and nine deputy secretaries, have joined the government. Notably, two joint secretaries have completed their three-year tenures.

Under the scheme, recruitments are made to posts requiring domain specialization and draw candidates from the private sector, state government, autonomous bod-

ies and public sector undertakings alike.

Obviously, with India on the verge of general elections, any headway in this new round of lateral hiring will have to wait for



the new government to be sworn in. But with Modi exuding confidence that the third term is a shoo-in, he is looking far ahead, including getting his cabinet colleagues and senior babus to chalk out a 100day action plan for after the elections.

Concerns over stalled ITAT appointments

Despite the Appointments Committee of Cabinet (ACC) signing off on the appointment of 18 judicial members and 22 accountant members within the Income Tax Appellate Tribunal (ITAT), these individuals find themselves in limbo, awaiting the issuance of formal orders from the Ministry of Law & Justice for the past two months.

The inordinate delay in issuing formal orders is being compared with the swift actions seen in the appointments to other tribunals like NCLT, CESAT and CAT, where members received their formal orders within a mere two weeks of the ACC notification in November last year. But the situation for ITAT members seems markedly different, leaving them in a state of uncertainty.

While some speculate that the delay may stem from the need to finalize appointment letters for the 40 senior officials, others view such prolonged waiting periods with some scepticism. The 40 appointees will have a four-year term or until they reach the age of 67.

The delay not only raises eyebrows but also invites scrutiny. Moreover, it prompts the question of the efficiency of Law Ministry babus. Perhaps they are dealing with more urgent matters than ensuring the routine functioning of an institution like ITAT.

Controversy and continuity in Rajasthan IAS reshuffle

The recent transfers of divisional commissioners and collectors in Rajasthan have sparked interest due to several noteworthy facts. Despite a change in government, most divisional commissioners appointed by the previous Ashok Gehlot government remain in their positions across various divisions, with only one new appointment in Ajmer with Mahesh Chand Sharma appointed as divisional commissioner.

Notably, only in the three divisions – Kota, Pali and Bikaner – have there been shuffles among the commissioners. The reasons behind the transfers of specific commissioners like Pratibha Singh, Vandana Singh and Urmila Rajoria are unclear. Why were only these three DCs shortlisted when there was talk of bringing Arushi Maik from Jaipur and Neeraj K Pawan from Bhanswara into the mainstream and efforts were also made towards this end? Only these two divisional commissioners are directly recruited IAS officers and are senior IAS officers of the 2003 and 2005 batches respectively, whereas the remaining seven DCs are promotee IAS.

Similarly, the Bhajan Lal Sharma government has reshuffled collectors in almost all districts except for Jaipur, Udaipur and Ajmer. Notably, these districts also serve as divisional headquarters. The decision to retain collectors like Prakash Rajpurohit, Arvind Poswal and Bharti Dixit, despite changes elsewhere, seems to be based on their experience and performance. Overall these transfers highlight both continuity and change, leaving certain choices open to speculation.

REPUTATION AT STAKE

There is growing evidence that some employees of the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East (UNRWA) have been involved in terrorism-related activities in Gaza. If true, and if the problem turns out to be more widespread than is currently known, the implications would be profound. An official UN body being complicit in war crimes would be one of the greatest scandals in the organization's history.

According to an Israeli intelligence document, a dozen UNRWA employees were involved in Hamas's attack on October 7, when 1,200 people were murdered and more than 200 taken hostage. "We were shocked, we took this seriously because these were very serious allegations," UNRWA Director of Communications Juliette Touma told France24. As soon as the revelations were made known, UNRWA Commissioner-General Philippe Lazzarini summarily dismissed the employees in question. Such a hasty move may suggest that the UNRWA had been turning a blind eye to the problem.

Earlier accusations of the UNRWA tolerating, if not supporting, the dissemination of textbooks encouraging Gazan children to take revenge against Jews seem almost trivial compared to the crimes that its employees are now alleged to have committed. Given the role that the UN will almost certainly play in Gaza's reconstruction. an independent investigation of the allegations against UNRWA front-line staffers, as well as of top agency leaders in New York, is urgently needed.

National governments have a clear role to play here. For example, since at least 42 victims of the Hamas attack were French citizens, France has standing to pursue justice through its criminal courts. On October 11, the French National Anti-Terrorism Prosecutor's Office (PNAT) launched its own in-

vestigation into the "murder, kidnapping, and hostage-taking by an organized group and against minors under 15 years of age, in connection with a terrorist enterprise." In addition, 25 families of French victims have lodged a complaint with PNAT, alleging "crimes against humanity." Similarly, on November 16, the French-Israeli editor of Israel magazine filed a complaint against Hamas at the Paris Judicial Court for crimes against humanity.

In this case, the UNRWA, as the main administrator of foreign aid to Gaza, could be indicted for complicity in crimes against humanity and financing terrorism, as could UN leaders who supervise the agency. Since the agency's creation in 1949, it has administered tens of billions of dollars of aid-including more than \$1 billion in 2022. Yet we know that Hamas has had the means to build a sprawling network of tunnels and military infrastructure beneath the enclave. Of course, Hamas receives substantial subsidies from friendly states such as Iran. But critics of the UNRWA argue that it has failed to police how the funds it disburses

are used; the question, then, is whether any such failure amounts to criminality, insofar as Hamas has been listed as a terrorist organization by the European Council since 2003.

One could even imagine the prosecution of individual UN officials, judging by the case law of the French Court of Cassation in the judgments against the wartime Nazi collaborator Maurice Papon and the French cement maker Lafarge.

In its January 1997 ruling, the court concluded that Papon, while serving as a senior official in the collaborationist Vichy regime, had aided and abetted the "unlawful arrest, false imprisonment, murder and attempted murder amounting to crimes against humanity" against Jews, thus participating in "a concerted plan carried out on behalf of Nazi Germany'

In the Lafarge case, which is ongoing, the court has already noted that the French Criminal Code does not require that an accomplice (whether an individual or a legal entity) in a crime against humanity belong to an organization guilty of such crimes, nor that it adhere to its concerted plan against civil-

ians, nor that it approve of the crimes committed."It is sufficient," the court ruled on September 7, 2021, "that [the accomplicel is aware that the principal perpetrators are committing or will commit such a crime against humanity and that his aid or assistance facilitates its preparation or commission."

Specifically, the company allegedly maintained business relations with jihadist groups in Syria after war erupted in 2011, despite France having designated them terrorist organizations. The case has not yet gone to trial, and the procedural ruling is in no way a verdict on guilt. It is worth noting, however, that the company continued to pay (via its Syrian subsidiary) more than €5 million (\$5.4 mil lion) to jihadist groups to keep its cement plant in Syria operational. The court could have limited itself to qualifying this act as a terrorist-financing offense. In its ruling on the admissibility of legal action against the company, the court concluded that maintaining commercial relations with the Islamic State would constitute both terrorist financing and complicity in crimes against humanity.

Based on this case law, any official at the UN or elsewhere who is proven to have known that funding was going to Hamas would not be immune from criminal proceedings in France.

Of course, the question of diplomatic immunity for UN officials could come up. But section 20 of the 1946Convention on the Privileges and Immunities of the United Nations suggests that this protection can be circumvented when necessary.

Investigations concerning UNRWA should begin at the UN level, but will also come before French courts. At a minimum, greater scrutiny of UNRWA is essential.

New Delhi, March 8: Congress leader Rahul Gandhi will contest the Lok Sabha polls from Kerala's Wayanad again, the party announced Friday as it released its first list of 39 candidates.

Congress general secretary KC Venugopal will contest from Alappuzha, former Chhattisgarh CM Bhupesh Baghel from Rajnandgaon, Jyotsna Mahant from Korba, Tamradhwaj Sahu from Mahasamund and Shashi Tharoor from Kerala capital Thiruvananthapuram.

Venugopal said the list has 15



general category candidates while 24 are from the SC, ST, OBC and minority communities.

Congress treasurer Ajay Maken said the list has a good mix of youth and experience.

The announcement came a

day after the Congress' Central Election Committee (CEC) finalised the names for the upcoming Lok Sabha elections after having a discussion on over 60 Lok Sabha seats from 11 states and Union Territories.

The CEC meeting was chaired $\,$ by party president Mallikarjun Kharge. Discussions were held on Lok Sabha seats in Delhi, Karnataka, Kerala, Chhattisgarh, Telangana, Sikkim, Tripura, Nagaland, Manipur, Meghalaya and Lakshwadeep.

"We are in election mode and on an aggressive path of campaigning with Rahul Gandhi undertaking the Bharat Jodo Nyay Yatra which is in Gujarat, Venugopal said. The Nyay Yatra will end March 17 in Mumbai with a mammoth rally planned and Congress president Kharge is writing to all INDIA bloc part-

ners to attend that rally, he said. There is speculation that Rahul may also contest from Amethi and Priyanka Gandhi Vadra from Rae Bareli, a seat previously held by Sonia Gandhi. Both seats are considered bastions of the Gandhi family and local units of Congress have demanded that the two scions should contest from these seats.











LACCM: SAMBALPUR ROUTE CHART

Padhi may not have a cakewalk as constituency likely to witness tripartite polls

Sunabeda/Semiliguda, March 8: Congress is banking on Rahul Gandhi's Bharat Jodo Nyay Yatra to win the elections as the Pottangi Assembly segment in Koraput district is likely to wit-

ness a triangular fight. Various political parties and independent candidates have gone into a huddle to finalise their poll strategy as the elections are round the corner. Many who are likely to contest as independents, in case they do not get a ticket, are hopeful of winning the seat even as the constituency is likely to witness a triangular contest.

Biju Janata Dal (BJD) candidate Pitam Padhi won Pottangi seat in 2019 by defeating his nearest rival Congress' Rama Chandra Kadam by 4,255 votes. This Assembly seat, which was once a citadel of Congress, was captured by BJD in 2009. However, this time around the opposition parties are trying to expand their base and wrest the seat from the ruling party.

The Bharativa Janata Party (BJP), which had secured 25,956 votes in 2019 election, is banking on the developmental programmes of Prime Minister Narendra Modi. BJP's probable candidate Rama Chandra Pangi has started the preparations in full swing to win the election.

Similarly, Congress probable Rama Chandra Kadam is also not lagging behind. He is preparing hard to wrest back the seat for his party as he came second in the 2019 elections by securing 46,989 votes. Kadam is banking on Rahul Gandhi's Bharat Jodo Nyay Yatra to win the election.

Likewise, Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP) candidate Muralidhar Guntha received 4, 153 votes, independent candidates Nandibali Chaitanya received 8,238 votes and Krushna Chandra Jani received 3,517 votes in 2019 elections.



STF seizes 10.5 kg opium, nabs 2 interstate smugglers

Bhubaneswar, March 8: In one of the biggest seizures of opium in Odisha, the STF has confiscated 10.5 kg of opium from two interstate drug traffickers.

Sources from the STF of the Odisha Police reported Friday that, based on intelligence input and with the assistance of Rourkela Police, a raid was conducted by a team of STF Thursday at Panposh in Sundargarh district.

During the search operation, the STF team apprehended two suspects identified as Bitu Singh Munda and Rohit Munda, both belonging to Jharkhand. The STF $team\,recovered\,10\,kg\,508\,grams\,of$ opium and other incriminating

materials from their possession. The two drug traffickers were arrested and are being forwarded to the court of the Additional

District and Sessions Judge cum Special Judge in Rourkela, as they could not produce any document or authority for the possession of such contraband opium. During the investigation and interrogation, STF sources mentioned that the accused persons and their associates, who are yet to be arrested, used to deliver contraband opium to the drug peddlers of Sundargarh, Rourkela, and Jharkhand after procuring the same from Rajasthan.

This is by far the biggest opium seizure in Odisha, as claimed by the STF of the Odisha Police.

It is suspected that the seized opium is illegally diverted from the legal cultivation farms of Madhya Pradesh. The STF will contact the Madhya Pradesh Police and the Central Bureau of Narcotics, Gwalior, in this regard to ascertain the source of procurement.

Truck mows down man

Bhubaneswar: A man was crushed to death by a truck while he was crossing the road near Palasuni bridge under Mancheswar police limits here, Friday. The deceased was identified as Yudhistir Sahoo. 75, a resident of Palasuni area. Yudhistir was going to attend Mahashivratri celebrations at Lingarai Temple when the incident occurred. Mancheswar police said the accused driver, who had fled the spot after the incident, was nabbed within a few minutes from a police check-post.

MFs inflow nears 2-yr high

New Delhi, March 8: Equity mutual funds continued their positive momentum with inflow of ₹26.866 crore in February, making it the highest monthly infusion in 23 months, driven by massive interest for thematic funds and launch of new fund offerings (NFOs).

Also, the latest flow was about 23 per cent higher than inflows of ₹21,780 crore in January.

Moreover, monthly Systematic Investment Plan (SIP) contributions reached a fresh high of ₹19.186 crore, surpassing January's ₹18,838 crore, according to the data released by Association of Mutual Funds in India (AMFI) Friday.

Overall, the mutual fund industry witnessed an inflow of ₹1.2 lakh crore in February, almost similar to the one seen in the preceding month.

The huge inflow was driven by contributions from debt-oriented schemes at ₹63,809 crore, equity schemes at ₹26,866 crore and hybrid schemes at ₹18,105

The strong inflow has pushed the net assets under management to ₹54.54 lakh crore at February-end from ₹52.74 lakh crore in the preceding month.

The flow in February this year was the highest since March 2022, when equity-oriented mutual funds witnessed an inflow

of ₹28,463 crore. Also, the latest flow marks the 36th consecutive month of net inflows in equity

The equity segment was also aided by eight new fund launches during the month which cumulatively garnered ₹8,692 crore, Melvyn Santarita, Analyst, Morningstar Investment Research India, said.

Interest rates on small savings schemes remain unchanged for Q1FY25

New Delhi, March 8: The government Friday left the interest rates unchanged on various small savings schemes for the first quarter of the next fiscal, beginning April 1, 2024.

A notification in this regard has been issued by the finance ministry.

"The rates of interest on various small savings schemes for the first quarter of FY 2024-25, starting from April 1, 2024, and ending on June 30, 2024, shall remain unchanged from those notified for the fourth quarter (January 1, 2024, to March 31, 2024) of FY 2023-24," the notification said.

The deposit under the Sukanya Samriddhi scheme will attract an interest rate of 8.2 per cent, while the rate on a three-year term deposit remains at 7.1 per cent.

The interest rates for popular PPF and savings deposits too have been retained at 7.1 per cent and 4 per cent, respectively.

The interest rate on the Kisan Vikas Patra will be 7.5 per cent, and the investments will mature in 115 months.

The interest rate on the National Savings Certificate (NSC) will remain at 7.7 per cent for the April 1-June 30, 2024, period. Like the current quarter, the interest rate for the Monthly Income Scheme will earn 7.4 per cent for investors.

FOREX KITTY JUMPS TO \$625.63BN

Mumbai, March 8: India's forex reserves jumped \$6.55 billion to \$625.626 billion for the week ended March 1, the Reserve Bank of India said Friday.

In the previous reporting week, the overall reserves had risen by \$2.975 billion to \$619.072

It can be noted that in October 2021, the country's forex kitty had reached an all-time high of \$645 billion. The reserves took a hit as the central bank deployed the kitty to defend the rupee amid pressures caused majorly by global developments since

For the week ended March 1. the foreign currency assets, a

major component of the reserves, increased by \$6.043 billion to \$554.231 billion, the data said.

Expressed in dollar terms. the foreign currency assets include the effect of appreciation or depreciation of non-US units like the euro, pound and yen held in the foreign exchange reserves

Gold reserves increased by \$569 million to \$48.417 billion during the week, the RBI said.

The Special Drawing Rights (SDRs) were down by \$17 million to \$18.18 billion, the apex bank said.

India's reserve position with the IMF was also down by \$41 million to \$4.798 billion in the reporting week, the apex bank data showed.

Coal India output hits record high

New Delhi: Production of Coal India Ltd hit a record 703.91 million tonne (MT) in this fiscal until March 7, surpassing the last fiscal's output of 703.20 MT, the Coal Ministry said Friday. Highlighting that several key measures were implemented to enhance production, the ministry said Coal India maintains an ample stock of 72.70 MT as of 7th March 2024. "Coal India Limited (CIL) has achieved a record production of 703.91 million tonne of coal up to 7th March 2024 during the current fiscal, surpassing last financial year's production of 703.20 MT by an impressive margin of 26 days," the ministry said in a release.



China says more Indian troops at border won't ease tensions

Beijing, March 8: China believes that India's move to add more troops at their disputed border is "not conducive to easing tensions", a foreign ministry spokesperson said Friday.

India has freed up a contingent of 10,000 soldiers, previously deployed at its western border, to strengthen its disputed border with China, according to several media reports.

The two countries have previously agreed to maintain dialogue through military and diplomatic channels, and recently held a constructive meeting on resolving border issues in the western section of the China-India border.

India has deployed 10,000 soldiers from its western border to guard its 532 km (331 mile) border with China in Uttarakhand and Himachal Pradesh, bordering the Himalayas, according to Indian

"China is committed to working with India to safeguard the peace and stability of the border areas," Mao Ning, a spokesperson for the Chinese foreign ministry, said. "We believe that India's practice is not conducive to safeguarding peace and is not conducive to easing tensions."

Mao added that "India's increase in military deployments in border areas does not help to calm the situation in the border areas or to safeguard peace and safety in these areas.'

India and China share a 3,800km frontier, much of it poorly demarcated. At least 20 Indian soldiers and four Chinese troops were killed in clashes in the area

16 kids suffer burns in Kota

Kota (Rajasthan) March 8: Sixteen children and two others participating in 'Shiv Barat' on the occasion of Mahashivratri here sustained burn injuries after getting electrocuted Friday noon, officials said.

The children, aged 10-16 years, were electrocuted from a hightension power line passing overhead in the Sakatpura area under the Kunhari police station, they said. A boy holding the iron rod that came in contact with the power line received 100 per cent burn injuries, while four others sustained around 40-50 per cent burn injuries, officials said.

All of them were referred to SMS Hospital in Jaipur after being initially treated at Kota's MBS Hospital. Eleven other boys and a man and a woman also sustained injuries and were under treatment in MBS Hospital, they said.

Kota city SP Amrita Duhan said that local women with water

pots on their heads and children, some of them holding flags attached to iron rods, were part of the 'Shiv Barat' for Kathaat temple in Kalibasti. One of the boys in the procession was holding a 22-foot-high iron flagpole, which came in contact with a high-tension line passing overhead around noon, the SP said.

A local present at the site said when the flagpole came in contact with the power line, he was electrocuted and flung into the air. Others, in an attempt to rescue the boy, tried to pull the rod away from him but also received electric shocks, the local said.

The women carrying the pots dropped them, spilling water on the ground, leading to commotion at the spot, the local added.

At least 16 children and a 28year-old man and a 38-year-old woman with burn injuries were admitted to the emergency and burn wards of MBS Hospital Friday noon, Superintendent Dr Dharmraj Meena said.

Man held for killing son a day before his wedding

New Delhi, March 8: It was constant humiliation that led the father of a gym trainer to kill his son in a brutal fashion, stabbing him several times, an evening before his wedding.

The Delhi Police late Thursday night arrested Ranglal Singhal, who, according to his confession, stabbed his son Gaurav in his house while the preparations for his wedding were in full swing. Gaurav Singhal, 29, was

stabbed 15 times in his face and chest at his home in south Delhi's Devli Extension early Thursday, hours before he was supposed to

Ranglal Singhal, who was nabbed from Rajasthan's Jaipur, had planned the killing carefully so as to not draw anyone's attention, police said.

"He deliberately chose a time around 10:30 to 11 pm when it was noisy due to dhol-nagara near his house and the deceased had chosen another room to talk to his would-be wife," an officer privy to the investigation said.

Ranglal Singhal showed no remorse for killing his son, At the time of his arrest, he

had on him gold ornaments worth ₹50 lakh and ₹15 lakh in cash, which he had fled with from the house, they said.

Delhi cop suspended for 'kicking' namazis

New Delhi, March 8: A subinspector of the Delhi Police shoved and kicked a few people offering namaz on a road in north Delhi's Inderlok area Friday, leading to a protest by hundreds of locals against the force, which suspended the official with immediate effect. People from various sections

of the society, including political leaders, condemned the act of Sub-Inspector Manoj Kumar Tomar after a video of the incident went viral on social media. The incident took place during a Friday prayer around 2 pm near the Inderlok metro station. The act of the policeman was captured on camera and the video has since gone viral on social media platforms.

In the video, Tomar is seen trying to disperse a few men praying on a road near a mosque and in what seems like a sudden burst of rage, he starts shoving and kicking some of them. Locals blocked the road and demanded action against Tomar, a police post in-charge, which led to stepping up of security in the area to maintain law and order.

Tension gripped the area for several hours following the incident that took place just a few days



ahead of the holy month of Ramzan. Paramilitary personnel have also been deployed in the area. Joint Commissioner of Police (Central Range) Parmaditya and Additional Commissioner of Police (Eastern Range) Sagar Singh Kalsi also reached the spot to diffuse the situation.

According to locals, some people were offering namaz on a road near the mosque due to a space crunch. Faraz Khan, a local resident, said that prayer is held inside the mosque every week but Friday, there were some outsiders who were not aware of the designated place for prayers and thus, started offering namaz

Another resident said, "We are hurt by the act of the police officer and we want his service to be terminated." In the evening, namaz was offered inside the mosque amid heavy deployment of police personnel.

Following the incident, the Delhi Police suspended Tomar with immediate effect and said disciplinary action has also been initiated against him. Later in the day, Parmaditya said that the situation is completely under control. "The deployment of police personnel will continue," he said. Deputy Commissioner of

Police (North) M K Meena said the roads that were blocked by the locals were subsequently opened for vehicular movement. He said the protesters called off their agitation after they were shown the suspension order of the sub-inspector. "The announcements about the action against the officer were made from the local mosque. The locals are with us and they have helped police ensure peace in the area," the DCP said. Hours after the incident. Northeast district of Delhi, which witnessed communal riots in 2020, was put under a strict vigil.

France sets landmark on abortion

IN A HISTORIC MILESTONE, THE COUNTRY BECOMES FIRST IN THE WORLD TO INSCRIBE THE RIGHT TO ABORTION IN ITS CONSTITUTION

Paris, March 8: France inscribed the guaranteed right to abortion in its constitution Friday, a powerful message of support for women's rights on International Women's Day.

Justice Minister Eric Dupond-Moretti used a 19th-century printing press to seal the amendment in France's constitution at a special public ceremony. Applause filled the cobblestoned Place Vendome as France became the first country to explicitly guarantee abortion rights in its national charter.

The measure was overwhelmingly approved by French lawmakers earlier this week, and Friday's ceremony means it can now enter into force.

While abortion is a deeply divisive issue in the United States, it's legal in nearly all of Europe and overwhelmingly supported in France, where it's seen more as a question of public health rather than politics. French legislators approved the constitutional amendment Monday in a 780-72 vote that was backed by





was a key event on a day focused on advancing women's rights globally. Marches, protests and conferences are being held from Jakarta, Indonesia, to Mexico City and beyond.

The French constitutional amendment has been hailed by women's rights advocates around the world, including places where women struggle to access birth control or maternal health care. Macron's critics questioned why he pursued the measure in a country with no obvious threat to abortion rights but where women face a multitude of other

230 million females circumcised globally Cairo: Over 230 million women and girls have undergone female

genital mutilation, most of whom live in Africa, according to a report issued Friday by the United Nations children's agency. In the last eight years, some 30 million people have undergone the procedure, in which external genitalia are partially or fully removed, UNICEF estimated in the report, which was released on International Women's Day. The percentage of women and girls who experience female genital mutilation is declining, UNICEF said, but it warned that efforts to eradicate the practice are too slow to keep up with fast-growing populations. "The practice of female genital mutilation is declining, but not fast enough," the report said. The practice, incorrectly believed to control women's sexuality, can cause serious bleeding and even death. Girls are subjected to the procedure at ages ranging from infancy to adolescence. Long term, it can lead to urinary tract infections, menstrual problems, pain, decreased sexual satisfaction and childbirth complications, as well as depression, low self-esteem and post-traumatic stress disorder. Some 144 million women and girls have been through female genital mutilation in Africa alone, followed by Asia and the Middle East with 80 million and 6 million respectively, the report said. Somalia tops the list of countries where the practice, also known as female circumcision, is prevalent, with 99% of the female population between the ages of 15 and 49 having been circumcised.

Haiti extends emergency

GOVT IMPOSES NIGHTTIME CURFEW TO TRY AND REPEL WIDESPREAD GANG ATTACKS

Port-Au-Prince, March 8: Haiti's government said Thursday that it was extending a state of emergency and nighttime curfew to try and curb violent gang attacks that have paralyzed the capital of Port-au-Prince in a fierce battle for political power.

An initial three-day curfew was announced over the weekend, but gangs have continued to attack police stations and other state institutions at night as Haiti's National Police struggles to contain the violence with limited staff and resources.

'The people with the guns are essentially the current arbiter of Haitian politics," said Robert Fatton, a Haitian politics expert at the University of Virginia. "The gangs have won the battle so far.'

The attacks began a week ago, shortly after embattled Prime Minister Ariel Henry agreed to hold general elections in mid-2025 while attending a meeting of Caribbean leaders in Guyana. Gangs have burned police stations, shot up the main international airport, which remains closed, and raided Haiti's two biggest prisons, freeing more than 4.000 inmates.

During that time, Henry had traveled to Kenya to push for the deployment of a UN-backed police force from the East African country to help fight gangs in Haiti. But a court in January ruled that the deployment was unconstitutional, and it wasn't



clear if the force would deploy given the worsening violence in

Henry is currently in Puerto Rico, where he was forced to land Tuesday after the armed groups laid siege to the international airport, preventing him from returning.

Dozens of people have died in Haiti's recent gang attacks, including several police officers. The violence also has left more than 15,000 people homeless, in addition to some 300,000 Haitians who lost their homes to gang wars in recent years.

In addition, there were reports that gangs Thursday looted shipping containers filled with food at the main port in Portau-Prince, raising concerns that provisions in the capital and elsewhere would dwindle quickly.

"If we cannot access those containers, Haiti will go hungry soon," said Laurent Uwumuremyi, Haiti director for Mercy Corps.

Gunmen abduct 287 students in Nigeria

Abuja, March 8: Security forces swept through large forests in Nigeria's northwest region Friday in search of nearly 300 children abducted from their school by motorcycle-riding gunmen in the latest mass kidnapping, which analysts and activists blamed on the failure of intelligence and a slow security response.


The abduction of the 287 children in Kaduna state, near the West African nation's capital, is one of the largest school kidnappings in the decade since the kidnapping of schoolgirls in Borno state's Chibok village in 2014 stunned the world.

Analysts and activists say the security lapses that allowed that mass abduction remain.

The victims of the latest attack among them at least 100 children aged 12 or under — were surrounded and marched into a forest just as they were starting the school day, said locals in Kuriga town, located 55 miles (89 kilometers) from the city of Kaduna. One man was shot dead as he tried to save the students,

school authorities said. As Kaduna Governor Uba Sani and security officials met with aggrieved villagers Thursday, they pleaded with the governor to ensure the release of the students and secure their town like many in the area, once a bustling agrarian community but now sparsely populated and where roads are often avoided be-

cause of rampant kidnappings. "Please stay and help us, pleasedon't leave us," one woman cried as the governor's convoy sped off.

Being a reservoir-based project, there will be no fear of crop loss for farmers. Water management will be controlled through Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition System (SCADA).



A pipeline network of nearly 3,100km has been laid for the am-

bitious project. The main pipeline has crossed three major rivers

which was a challenging job for the Water Resources department.

Eleven feet diameter pipe has been used for carrying water from Hirakud dam, which is one of the biggest in the country. Three pump houses have been set up at Rengali, Turunga and Kanapali. Water will be lifted to nearly 45 metre high for irrigation.

The project is highly water efficient and farmers can go for cash crops and horticulture crops both in khariff and rabi seasons as the entire project is micro-irrigation enabled.

Around 30 per cent of the project command area (nearly 19,000 acres) has been equipped with micro-irrigation systems. Every field will get water equitably as outlets have been provided in each hectare.

Dharamsala, March 8: Skipper Rohit Sharma (103, 162b, 13x4, 3x6) and Shubman Gill's (110, 150b, 12x4, 5x6) splendid hun-

dreds gave India complete control of the fifth Test against England despite a late batting collapse that saw the hosts end day two at 473 for eight here Friday. It was their 171-run five wickets for just 97 runs in the final session. However, India got a shot in the arm as Kuldeep Yadav (27 batting, 55b, 2x4) and Jasprit Bumrah (19 batting, 55b, 2x4) put on an unbroken stand of 45 runs for the ninth wicket.

Debutant Devdutt Padikkal (65, 103b, 10x4, 1x6) showed a lot of class in his innings while Sarfaraz Khan (56, 60b, 8x4, 1x6) piled on the agony for England. They ensured that the first two sessions of the day belonged to India with a 97-run partnership for the fourth wicket. Currently India have a first innings lead of 255 runs

Off-spinner Shoaib Bashir (4/170) was the best bowler for England. He was well-supported by the toiling left-arm spinner

Gill, who played some audacious strokes on the opening day, carried on in the same vein as he took two steps forward against the great Anderson for a straight six, which was followed by a square cut.

Rohit completed his 12th Test hundred and second of the series by flicking Hartley for a single. Two balls later. Gill followed him into three digits by slogsweeping Bashir for a four.

Devdutt to work hard

Dharamsala, March 8: Devdutt Padikkal's struggles with health over the past two years did not allow him to be at his best but he said Friday that the phase made him hungrier than ever. After making his India debut in 2021 in a T20I against Sri Lanka, Devdutt's career graph did not go up as expected due to Covid-19 and a stomach-related health complication.

Devdutt overcame the challenges to pile a mountain of runs in domestic cricket and was the leading run-getter for Karnataka in the Ranji Trophy with 556 runs. A hundred against England Lions also helped him seal his maiden berth in India's Test squad. He helped his cause with a classy 65.

"I have believed that discipline is the key to success in anything that you do. Whether your practice or day to day habits or food, I have tried to be disciplined and that was my main goal," Devdutt told reporters here Friday.

"When I was sick, I couldn't do much. However, I still wanted to ensure that I did not lag behind in other areas and continued to work on myself whether mentally or any other small thing," the elegant lefthander added.

The love for the game got stronger when Devdutt regained full fitness and of late, he made technical changes in his batting.

"Technically I made a couple of small changes but mentally yes, I made some changes. I wanted to ensure that I enjoy the game a lot more because the last couple of years I couldn't play that often. Missing on games made me realise how much I longed to play the sport," Devdutt pointed out.

An ankle injury to Rajat Patidar on the eve of the game led to Devdutt making his debut. The southpaw knew he would play the night before, but was nat-
