

41 tainted firms funded ₹2,471 cr to BJP: Activists

Calling the electoral bond scheme the biggest scam of Independent India, senior advocate Prashant Bhushan alleged four categories of corruption was done through it

New Delhi, March 22: Fortyone companies facing probe by the CBI, the ED and the I-T Department gave ₹2,471 crore to the BJP through electoral bonds, and ₹1,698 crore of it was donated after raids by these agencies, civil society activists who challenged the poll funding scheme in the Supreme Court claimed Friday.

Addressing the media after the Election Commission made public a fresh data set of electoral bonds, senior advocate Prashant Bhushan, who appeared for the petitioners in the court, said at least 30 shell companies purchased electoral bonds worth over ₹143 crore.

He said 33 groups which have got 172 major contracts and project approvals from the government also made donations through electoral bonds.

"They have got a total of ₹3.7 lakh crore in projects and contracts, in exchange for ₹1,751 crore electoral bond donations to the BJP," he alleged. In at least 49 cases, Bhushan alleged, ₹62,000 crore in postpaid contracts/project approvals were given by the Centre or BJP-led state governments, for which ₹580 crore in 'kickbacks' in form of electoral bonds were given to BJP within three months.

Bhushan claimed Kalpataru Group gave ₹5.5 crore to the BJP within three months of an I-T Department raid on it August 3 last year. "Future Gaming gave Rs 60 crore to the BJP within three months of I-T and ED raids November 12, 2023 and December 1, 2021 respectively. Aurobindo Pharma gave Rs 5 crore to the BJP within three months of ED raid November 10, 2022," he added.

In a landmark verdict, the Supreme Court scrapped the electoral bonds scheme calling it 'unconstitutional', and ordered the release of all details related to the

Kejriwal remanded till March 28

New Delhi, March 22: A court here Friday sent Delhi CM Arvind Kejriwal to the ED's custody till March 28, a day after his arrest in the excise policylinked money laundering case.

Special Judge Kaveri Baweja at the Rouse Avenue court said Kejriwal will be produced before the court March 28 at 2 pm. The court passed the order on the ED's application seeking a 10day custody in the case.

The ED has claimed that Kejriwal 'took advantage' of being the Chief Minister of Delhi to facilitate money laundering by the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP), which is a 'major beneficiary' of the proceeds of crimes generated in the alleged liquor scam case.

"Arvind Kejriwal, Chief Minister of NCT of Delhi is the kingpin and key conspirator of the Delhi excise scam in collusion with ministers of Delhi government, AAP leaders and other persons," the federal agency informed a special PMLA court while seeking his custody.

The ED claimed in its remand papers that "Arvind Kejriwal was involved in the conspiracy of formulation of the excise policy 2021-22 to favour certain persons and also involved in the demanding of kickbacks from liquor businessmen in exchange of favours granting in the said policy." The 55-year-old former IRS officer and activist was ar-



rested by the ED Thursday under the anti-money laundering law from his official residence in

the Civil Lines area of Delhi. The ED charged that Kejriwal "was directly involved in the use of proceeds of crime generated in the Goa election campaign of the AAP (in 2022) to which he is the convenor and

the ultimate decision maker." It informed the court it has recorded the statements of various people engaged in the election campaign-related activities of the AAP during the Goa polls and it was found that "cash payments were made to them for work like survey workers, area managers, assembly managers etc.'

"These persons and activities related to the election campaign were overall managed by Vijay Nair (former AAP communications chief arrested in this case) and Durgesh Pathak, AAP MLA.'

The agency claimed these charges were also corroborated by one of the candidates of AAP for Goa elections of 2022 who said he received funds for election expenses "in cash" from the AAP volunteers in Goa.

The ED, for the first time in the about two-year-old probe, said the AAP was the "major beneficiary of the proceeds of crime generated in the Delhi liquor It alleged that a part of these

proceeds of crime, to the tune of about ₹45 crore in cash, was utilised in the election campaign of AAP in Goa assembly polls.

It claimed these funds were transferred to Goa via four 'Angadiva' routes.

The 'Angadiya' network is known to move huge cash funds from one location to the other.

"In this manner, AAP has committed the offence of money laundering through Sh Arvind Kejriwal and the offences thus are covered by section 70 of the PMLA," it said.

It said that as the national convener and member of the national executive, Kejriwal was "ultimately responsible for the funds being used in the election expenses including their generation". The agency said it recorded the statement of AAP Rajya Sabha MP and national treasurer ND Gupta last year who told it that while Kejriwal was the overall incharge of the party, no sanction of the national executive or the political affairs committee is taken for deciding election expenses.

State likely to see 40°C around Holi



New Delhi, March 22: The probability of temperatures soaring to 40 degrees Celsius around the festival of Holi late March has multiplied due to climate change, according to an analysis of temperature data since 1970.

Researchers at the US-based Climate Central, an independent group of scientists, conducted the analysis to place India within the context of global warming trends. In the climate of the early 1970s, it would be exceedingly rare to encounter temperatures in late March above 40 degrees Celsius. Maharashtra, Chhattisgarh and Bihar had a more than 5 per cent chance of experiencing such temperatures, they said.

However, the analysis revealed that the chance of reaching 40 degrees Celsius has since expanded to include nine states: Odisha, Maharashtra, Chhattisgarh, Bihar, Rajasthan, Gujarat, Telangana, Madhya Pradesh and Andhra Pradesh.

Maharashtra now has the highest probability at 14 per cent.

To show this change, the researchers calculated the difference between the warming rates in March and April, expressed as the change in average temperature since 1970.

The researchers said a total of 37 cities now have at least a 1 per cent chance of experiencing 40 degrees Celsius or warmer temperatures, and 11 cities have a 10 per cent or greater probability. With the exception of Madurai, the 15 cities with the highest risk of experiencing temperatures above 4 degree Celsius are in central India, the analysis showed. Bilaspur faces the highest risk at 31 per cent, and its chances of reaching 40 degrees Celsius is now 2.5 times higher than in the 1970s.

Indore shows the largest change in risk, with an 8 per cent probability, 8.1 times higher than in the past.

Madurai and Bhopal also have very large changes (7.1 and 5.5 relatively high overall risk (19 per Climate Central said March

times higher, respectively) and

and April are warming across India. Every region considered had net warming during both March and April. During March, the northern and western regions have the fastest warming, with the largest change since 1970 in March occurring in Jammu and Kashmir (2.8 degree Celsius)

Warming is more uniform in April and Mizoram has the largest change since 1970 (1.9 degree Celsius).

'There has been an abrupt transition in the temperatures from cool winter-like temperatures to much warmer conditions now. After the strong warming trend observed in February, March is also likely to follow the same pattern. These warming trends in India are a clear sign of the impacts of human-led climate change," said Andrew Pershing, VP for Science, Climate Central.

The independent group of scientists and communicators previously said that winters are quickly transitioning into summer-like conditions in north India, shortening the spring season. The average temperatures in states in north India showed either a cooling trend or slight warming in January, followed by strong warming in February

This indicates that these regions are now experiencing abrupt transitions from cool winter-like temperatures into much warmer conditions traditionally observed in March, the researchers said.

Mahesh Palawat, Vice President - Meteorology and Climate Change, Skymet Weather, said, "There is no denying the fact that climate change is behind the soaring mercury levels. Heatwaves in March were rare but with the increasing global warming, the probability of heatwayes or high temperatures has increased. We willwitness similar weather conditions this year as well.'

Milky Way's 'Shakti', 'Shiva' identified

New Delhi, March 22: Earliest 'building blocks' of our Milky Way galaxy have been identified from 12-13 billion years ago, which is very close in time to when the universe's first galaxies started to form, according to a new research. Naming these groups of stars 'Shakti' and 'Shiva', astronomers said the findings are the equivalent of 'finding traces of an initial settlement that grew into a large present-day city.

Milky Way is said to have formed by the merging of smaller galaxies, making way for 'fairly large building blocks,' according to the researchers

When galaxies collide and their stellar populations mingle, most of the stars retain very basic properties, directly linked to the speed and direction of their origin galaxy, they ex-

plained. In this study published in The



Astrophysical Journal, the research team from Max Planck Institute for Astronomy, Germany, analysed stellar datasets and found that stars from the merging galaxies were crowded around two specific signatures of energy and angular momentum, or the rate at which a spinning object's rotating speed changes. Two different star groups were thus formed -

Shakti' and 'Shiva' The study's co-author Khyati Malhan named these two structures 'Shakti' and 'Shiva', the latter one of the principal deities of Hinduism and the former a female cosmic force often por-

trayed as Shiva's consort. The researchers found that the 'like-minded' stars forming Shakti and Shiva, and coming from two different galaxies, had a higher angular momentum compared to the stars at the heart of the Milky Way.

The higher angular momentum observed was consistent with the stellar groups that had belonged to separate galaxies merging with the Milky Way, the team said.

Also, all these stars were low in metal content, signalling that they were formed a long time ago. Stars formed recently contain more of heavier metallic elements, they explained.

Therefore, their energy and angular momentum, along with low metallic content, comparable with that of the stars at the heart of Milky Way, makes 'Shakti' and 'Shiva' good candidates for some of the earliest ancestors of Milky Way, the researchers said.

'Shakti and Shiva represent two of those early, massive progenitors that coalesced at high redshift - perhaps 12 gigayears ago-perhaps the last event from the protogalaxy before disk formation commenced," they wrote in their study. A gigayear has a billion years

Shakti and Shiva might be the first two additions to the heart of the Milky Way, initiating its growth towards a large galaxy. said study co-author Hans-Walter Rix from Max Planck Institute for Astronomy.

For their analysis, the researchers used the data provided by the European Space Agency's Gaia satellite and combined it with the stellar datasets from the US Sloan Digital Sky Survey, having detailed information about the stars' chemical composition.

Launched in 2013, Gaia's dataset now includes positions, changes in the positions and distances for almost 1.5 billion stars within our galaxy, providing an ideal dataset for this kind of 'big data galactic archeology,' the team said

Taking to the social media platform 'X,' the CM said, "Water is the life force for our planet. On World Water Day, reaffirm com mitment to ensure equitable access to drinking water and sanitation through initiatives like Drink from Tap, Basudha. Let's join hands to manage the life sustaining resource judiciously by reducing water use, recycling and recharging ground water for a sustainable future for mankind."

On the occasion, state Water Resource department, with several environmental organisations observed World Water Day with a discussion on this year's theme 'Water for Peace', focusing on the critical role water



and prosperity in the world.

"Protecting and conserving water resource amid climate change and increase in global population has to be the most crucial step. Water can be a stabilizing force and a catalyst for sustainable development in human race," said commissionercum-additional chief secretary Anu Garg while speaking about the different ways our water use can contribute to sustainable development and augment use of other related resources.

Other experts taking part in the discussion focused on judicious and equitable distribution of water among users, promot-

ing the culture of reuse and recycle, diversifying crops and increasing crop intensity, adopting technology for efficient use of water and bringing equity and justice through water gover-

Similarly, the 2-day Odisha River Conference organised by Water Initiatives Odisha and Foundation for Ecological Security (FES) concluded here Friday.

On the second and final day, which coincided with the World Water Day, more than 150 participants took part in discussions about preparing a charter of action to work towards river conservation and to build

Ranjan Panda, convenor of Water Initiatives, said, "The space of rivers is shrinking in our minds, perceptions, dreams, societies, cultures, economies and geographies. We must work together to change this fate of the rivers by engaging with almost all section of the society and in-

Speaking at the event, AIIMS executive director Ashutosh Biswas emphasised on organising such sensitising outreach programmes to put more light on Down syndrome and other genetic disorders. He appreciated the effort of the department for taking such an initiative.

"AIIMS perinatal clinic comprises of experts from various specialties like obstetrics and gynaecology (O&G), paediatrics, neonatology, anatomy and psychiatry, who have been providing comprehensive genetic coun



selling to the parents," said

Gaikwad. She further added that the cytogenetic laboratory in the national institute also helps in detecting the common chromosomal anomalies in conditions like Down syndrome through karyotyping.

"Down syndrome is the commonest Trisomy with a prevalence of 1 in 830 births in India. A baby with the syndrome will have a flat facial profile, upward slanting eyes, simian crease and sandal gap. The babies also suffer from repeated respiratory infections, congenital heart disease and intellectual disability," she said.

As the incidence of Down syndrome increases with inness among the public, medical professionals will help in timely detection of the condition and will lead to appropriate action, stressed the experts.

"While providing various therapies for common genetic disorders such as speech therapy, occupational therapy and physiotherapy, the approach should be single centered and patient centric," said Satya Narayan Mohapatra, director of IHS. He added that handling patients with common genetic disorders is a continuous process including identification, prevention and lifelong management for which we should change the stereotype in

Illegal mine near school causing severe pollution

11 years after OSPCB investigation, no action has been taken as company, admin silent

Keonjhar, March 22: Roida-2 mine of KN Ram Mines Pvt. Ltd. near Tonto under Barbil tehsil in this district is causing severe dust pollution in the area, thanks to the gross negligence and silence of the district adminis-

The mine, running for past many years, is situated not only close to human habitation but also near Tonto Primary School and an airstrip. Similarly, there are anganwadi centres and tribal graveyards near the mine. Dust pollution from the mine is causing strong resentment among the local people.

As per sources, the said mine will be closed in a few years due to less iron ore deposit. Despite that fact, the company instead of solving the problems is preparing to establish a pellet plant, thereby pushing the local residents to stage protests.

Notwithstanding the protests against the pellet factory in the Gram Sabha held a few months back, the company is trying to build the plant with the support of the administration, sources alleged. However, the administration has claimed that the factory is in violation of policy.

According to sources, Tonto Primary School is just about 50 metre away from the mine's lease boundary. Pollution caused by mining activities and transportation of minerals has made life hard for nearby villagers and children studying in the

Notably, an investigation in this regard was conducted about 11 years back in 2013. The probe conducted on behalf of the Orissa State Pollution Control Board (OSPCB) revealed that the school was facing severe dust pollution and recommended the administration to shift it to a safer place. Similarly, the Champua Sub-Collector, Education department as well as the Mining department inspected and reported to the Keonjhar Collector.

Based on all the reports, the then District Collector Bishnu Prasad Sahu wrote to the Secretary of School and Public Education department that the air pollution is spreading due to proximity of Tonto Primary School to the mine. Thereafter, the school was informed that there is a need to transfer it to another place.

However, locals have alleged that the mine has been functioning since then without shiftprovided land for relocation of the school, but locals have expressed their dissatisfaction as the company is not keen on building the school.

On the other hand, the company has been making efforts to proceed with the construction of the proposed pellet plant for its own profit despite the recent protest by locals in the Gram Sabha.

Sadananda Rana, the vicepresident of the company, said that the decision to relocate the school to the acquired land is with the government. "Construction of the school will be done by the government. We have been informed that we will pay the money. The land shown is of old forest type," he said.

"Measures are being taken for pollution control and people's convenience," said Prashant Kar, Regional Officer of the OSPCB. "Permission has not been granted for the factory. We will study why the school near the mine has not been shifted and take steps," he added.

It is worth mentioning here that the lifting capacity of this mine is 2.5 million tonne per year. Heavy dust and smoke pollution due to mine operation and transportation of ore have affected nearby human settlements, airstrip, schools, and also

Questions have been raised as to how this mine has been approved. While the company sources said the mine will be shut in just about 5-6 years, people have been asking why they are interested in building a factory.

Locals complain that neither the administration nor the state government's committee, or the people's representatives are looking into this problem. The nonresolution of such issues has raised doubts about the role of the State Pollution Control Board

Newfound Favour

The appointment of retired IAS officer Navneet Kumar Sehgal as the chairperson of Prasar Bharati Board has all the signs of the complex and subtly adversarial interplay between the Centre and Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath. The post had remained vacant for over four years since the superannuation of A. Surya Prakash.

Sehgal, undoubtedly, brings a wealth of experience, having served in senior roles in Uttar Pradesh. Just before retiring in 2023, he was Chief Secretary in the Department of Sports and Youth, but also known for his media management skills and his role in organizing UP's global investor summit and hosting the prestigious MotoGP in Noida.

But his career trajectory has been marked by remarkable comebacks after periods of being sidelined. Sehgal was once considered one of UP's most influential officers, an integral member of 'Team 9', a group of nine IAS officers closely associated with Adityanath.

However, after retiring it appears that Sehgal was not given a significant position by the Uttar Pradesh government, suggesting that perhaps he had fallen out with Yogi. But observers suggest that Sehgal, no longer in Yogi's inner circle, has now found favour with the Narendra Modi government at the Centre.

From being the troubleshooter for the UP government, Sehgal will

now be called upon to contribute substantially to Modi's media management, especially amid a crucial national election.



Ashok Khemka's long battle for justice

The recent Supreme Court verdict on Haryana IAS officer Ashok Khemka's annual confidential report (ACR) has sparked the debate about how bureaucrats are evaluated and who should have the authority to do so. In overturning the Punjab and Haryana High Court's decision to uphold Khemka's higher grades, the apex court made a strong case for the specialised understanding needed to assess an IAS officer's performance. It averred that this task should remain firmly within the executive branch's domain.

Back in June 2017, the famed whistleblower received an overall grade of 8.22 from the state chief secretary, who was the reporting authority. Then, the state Health Minister, acting as the reviewing authority, bumped up Khemka's grade to 9.22. But matters took a turn when, in December 2017, the then Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar, act-

ing as the accepting authority, decided to lower Khemka's grade to 9. Despite several representations to contest the decision, Khemka first appealed to the Central Administrative Tribunal (CAT), pleading for the removal of adverse remarks and restoration of grades and remarks by the reviewing authority. But CAT dismissed his application. Refusing to give up, he then turned to the high court, which ruled in his favour and overturned the CAT's decision.

But the legal roller coaster didn't end there. The Supreme Court chimed $\,$ in, highlighting the unresolved status of Khemka's representation before the accepting authority, which is yet to decide on the matter. The apex court has directed the accepting authority to adjudicate Khemka's representation within the stipulated 60 days.

It is clear that the case of Ashok Khemka isn't just about one officer, but about the broader challenges and complexities of administration and ensuring transparency and justice along the way.

Surprise reshuffle sparks speculation

Madhup Kumar Tiwari had barely settled into his role as Special Commissioner of Police for Law and Order when he received a surprising transfer to Chandigarh as DGP in February. At the time, many speculated that his transfer was related to the upcoming Lok Sabha elections. However, the recent reversal of his transfer orders, alongside those of D.C. Shrivastava, mere days before the announcement of the polls has left observers scratching their heads about the underlying reasons behind this abrupt reshuffle.

Surendra Kumar Yaday, who was reassigned from Delhi to assume the role of DGP in Andaman and Nicobar Islands, has now been named the new DGP in Chandigarh.

Sources have informed DKB that Tiwari, upon his transfer from Delhi to Chandigarh, reportedly protested, arguing that his recent assignment of overseeing law and order in Delhi should have precluded the need for relocation. Reportedly, his appeal was successful, allowing him to retain his significant position, a move, some say, could garner favour among the Poorvanchali community in Delhi ahead of the Lok Sabha polls.

There is some speculation that the reversal decision may be linked to the mishandling of the Chandigarh mayoral elections and the ensuing controversy surrounding Anil Masih's role, which caused a lot of embarrassment to the central government.

Meanwhile, the incumbent DG of Arunachal Pradesh Devesh Srivastava, who was initially slated for a transfer to Delhi Police in an earlier notification, finds his Delhi posting is on hold, albeit temporarily.

While such sudden shifts are not infrequent, especially during poll season, these do create some unease among those in khaki.

mong her final acts as chair of the Republican National Committee, Ronna McDaniel requested that her colleagues endorse the two people handpicked by Donald Trump to replace her. Following loud cheering, she announced thatshe would not even bother to ask if there were any "nays." It was a telling moment: procedures meant to ensure a democratic process within the party were entirely replaced by acclamation.

Trump is hardly the only farright populist leader to have subjugated a political party to his will. The hijacking of a party's machinery is a common pattern among populists and would-be autocrats, and history shows that it can have truly dire consequences for a democratic political system. After all, turning your party into an autocracy is a logical first step toward turning your country into one.

True, appeals for democracy and pluralism within political parties can sound like idealism. Endless, exhausting, pedantic debates usually result in a "victory" for the most eloquent party hack - or perhaps for the person with no childcare responsibilities the next morning. Moreover, internal democracy –like primary elections in the United States - may be structurally favorable to ideological purists who prefer extreme candidates, or it may elevate people who treat politics like a hobby and prioritize the process over the results.

But internal debates do often yield better policy ideas. At a minimum, the winners will have a stronger sense of the opposing arguments and the evidence for them. They also will be more likely to respect the legitimacy of the losers in any given intraparty debate. Since fellow partisans are supposed to share the same basic political principles, their differences usually come down to how those principles are interpreted and how policies based on them should be implemented. When the los-

ers feel that they have gotten a fair hearing, they will be less likely to quit the party.

By respecting legitimate opposition within their own party, politicians demonstrate their commitment to the basic rules of the democratic game. When internal contests are close, the winners will continue to face off against other party heavyweights, who in turn may provide a check against them if they stray too far from the party's core commitments - not least the commitment to democracy itself. Such heavyweights have credibility with party members and must be taken seriously.

But Trump has transformed the Republican Party into something like a personality cult. Those criticizing him have been cast out and vilified (and often personally threatened with violence). Rather than treating Nikki Haley as a worthy adversary in what political theorist Nancy Rosenblum callsa democratic "regulated rivalry," Trump denied her any standing in the party. "She's essentially a Democrat," he said. "I think she should probably switch parties. Never mind that Trump himself appointed Haley as the US

ambassador to the United Nations during his term as president.

Equally telling, the Republican Party no longer even bothers to offer anything like a proper campaign programme. Before the 2020 election, it simply reissued its 2016 programme and pledged total fealty to Trump. A party with a real programme can bear an election loss and simply redouble its efforts to bring voters over to its side the next time. It would have a much longer time horizon, rather than adopting the short-term perspective of an individual – a change that makes every loss seem existential.

Some politicians deal with this challenge by installing relatives as successors, thus turning a party into a quasi-dynasty or a political family business. That is what the Gandhi family did to the Indian National Congress, to the detriment of the party and Indian democracy alike. In France, Marine Le Pen leads the far-right party founded by her father; and Trump, of course, has just enthroned his daughter-in-law, LaraTrump, as co-chair of the RNC, making the party also something like a

Cult leaders can command their followers in ways that even the most charismatic politician cannot. A proper party would have found a way to stop Trump and his fanatical fans before the insurrection of January 6, 2021. And even after that, Republicans could have shown courage and some commitment to their own professed principles by impeaching Trump in February 2021. Instead, they have spoken out only behind closed doors or after leaving politics. As a result, the party is now dominated by a leader with deeply authoritarian instincts, who is patently unfit for office. In America's two-party system, one of the parties is turning against democracy itself.

It is not just Trump, though. At one point while he was in office, former Brazilian President Jair Bolsonaro had no political party at all, and thus no check on his power from somewhat like-minded politicians. Other farright populists do have parties, but they run them in a highly au-

tocratic fashion. Strengthening party regulations might help. In the Netherlands, the party of farright populist Geert Wilders has only two members: Wilders and a foundation with one member, who just so happens to be Wilders. Such one-man rule (literally) would not be legal in neighboring Germany, where the country's Basic Law affirms that parties' "internal organization must conform to democratic principles.'

Yes, there is a limit to internal party democracy: it can tip into factionalism, which can turn off voters; and it can provoke unproductive or esoteric debates that make parties seem overly sectarian. But the Republican Party's transformation into an authoritarian tool shows why such risks are worth taking.

Preventing land grab and acquisition

at Sandeshkhali village in West Bengal by a TMC leader continues to hit headlines, but such incidences shouldn't come as a big surprise as the poor can rattle off cases of their land being unfairly taken either by the government or business houses with the support of political leaders. It's a phenomenon across the country.

This case has, however, drawn much more attention unlike others, as it's got entangled in the murky BJP-TMC rivalry and the alleged sexual abuse of the village women, which of course is unacceptable in any civil society. Developments such as Prime Minister Modi referring to the incident innumerable times during his recent visits to the state; a division bench of Calcutta High Court directing the state to file an affidavit stating the plan to restore the farmlands allegedly grabbed and turned into pisciculture ponds; directing the CBI to file an affidavit stating how protection could be given to those who had lodged police complaints against land grabbing and sexual torture, do make news and shall be forgotten later.

he alleged land grabbing The larger picture, of land movement of cars benefit the been violated and it's said farmgrab or land acquisition, which has been a phenomenon in the country since the 50s and 60s, simply gets lost. It would not be wrong to recall that even the government has somewhat forcibly taken land from people for various projects like widening of roads and highways, railway projects, power projects etc. And this has been done by paying a paltry sum to the villagers.

At that time, there was no National Rehabilitation Policy, and the government didn't deem it necessary to rehabilitate them properly so that these poor people could make a living at their new site. The suffering of those whose land was taken away had been documented as survival continued to haunt them. Insofar as land acquisition is concerned, government could justify it on grounds that it has been taken for essential infrastructure proj ects, but the question remains who benefits the most from such action. The roads and highways, which are normally 6-lane or even wider, to facilitate faster movement of traffic may indirectly help the greater community but essentially such rich and middle-income sections of society.

It is well-known that the land acquisition laws that India inherited from colonial times were undoubtedly heavily loaded against the interests of landowners and other people dependent on land for their livelihood. The Acts passed have enhanced the scale of compensation to be received by landowners and additionally provided for their rehabilitation and resettlement (R&R) in the event of displacement.

In fact, the Land Acquisition Rehabilitation and Resettlement (LARR) Act of 2013 diluted most of the ruthless provisions of Land Acquisition Act of 1894 and, most importantly, it made a deliberate attempt to put in place the building block for easy accessibility of land.

Most states did not think it fit to judiciously enforce the provisions of the Act introduced in 2013, as is the case with others. Moreover, with most of the state governments demarcating lands as Special Economic Zones, the problem has been getting worse. In recent years, the Act has

ers have to unwillingly part with their land with very little compensation and a bleak future.

Land acquisition is indeed a sensitive subject and there are reports indicating that people whose land has been virtually taken have not benefitted to the extent they should have. It is critical to take stock of how much land has been taken away in the last five decades or so and whether the people, whose land has been taken away, are properly rehabilitated, as per the National Rehabilitation Policy, and earning enough for a decent livelihood for themselves and their family

It is also feared that in majority cases, the people who take away such land have the blessings of the ruling party, and in some others, leaders get a share of such transactions.

Not only should fair and just compensation be given, but culprits who cheat the poor in the process of acquiring land must be brought to book. Headlines of land grab or action against a

solitary case is not a remedy.

Chennai, March 22: In the April 19 Lok Sabha polls, undoubtedly, the battle for Coimbatore will be the most watched in Tamil Nadu as the rul ing DMK and main opposition AIADMK-- the well entrenched Dravidian titans will see a new, aggressive challenger in the IPS officer-turned-politician, BJP's K Annamalai

In the wake of fresh challenge from Annamalai, the BJP state chief who has vowed to win the western belt for his party, the ruling DMK chose to not allot the Coimbatore seat, the hub of west ern Tamil Nadu to allies. Instead, the DMK has fielded its own candidate Ganapathi P Rajkumar from Coimbatore, which is also known as Kovai locally.

In this battle of prestige, the DMK is determined to demonstrate that it continues to be all powerful in the region -- its ally CPI(M) nominee PR Natarian won the seat in 2019. The AIADMK, on its part has resolved to disprove the ruling party and has nominated its IT wing chief Singai G Ramachandran who hails from the same region.

For over four decades, the western region of Tamil Nadu, popularly known as 'Kongu mandalam' in Tamil has been without doubt the AIADMK's bas-

tion. It has made significant electoral gains even in losing causes,

such as in 2006 and 2021 Traditionally, though BJP had some pockets of influence in western Tamil Nadu including Coimbatore, it was woefully insufficient to win enough votes to emerge victorious. Thirty-eight year old Annamalai, a native of western Tamil Nadu, belonging to the dominant Gounder community, according to party workers, decided to change the scenario by 'building on strength' in the region.

Coimbatore and the Nilgiris were among the regions in western Tamil Nadu that the BJP, especially under Annamalai has focused in a sustained manner to build the party. Roping in regional level leaders, like former elected representatives and opinion makers at the local level has been part of the BJP's strategy to bring about a real change in its electoral fortunes in the Dravidian state. Coimbatore-Nilgiris region is the crown jewel the Saffron party is eyeing to

make deeper inroads in the state. Annamalai was arguably the first BJP leader in the state to aggressively target the Dravidian ideology and the key two parfirst BJP leader in the state to aggressively target the Dravidian ideology and the key two parties -- DMK and AIADMK-- that

ties -- DMK and AIADMK-- that represent it.

In fact, the reason given by the AIADMK last year to snap ties with the BJP was that the Saffron party brass did nothing to stop Annamalai from targeting Dravidian ideologue CN Annadurai and late party matriarch J Javalalithaa.

With Annamalai often taking the lead in targeting the DMK on allegations of corruption besides everyday issues, the AIADMK was perceived by sections of people to be lagging behind in showing the spirit of real opposition.

The fact that Prime Minister Narendra Modi took out a wellattended roadshow here on Monday, shows the focus the party has given to Coimbatore. Incidentally, he had attended events in two other districts in the 'Kongu' region-- Tiruppur and Salem, in the past one month.

Lucknow, March 22: Along with the Lok Sabha elections, Uttar Pradesh will also witness bypolls to four Assembly seats - Lucknow East, Dadraul in Shahjahanpur district, Gainsari in Balrampur district and Duddhi in Sonbhadra district.

Three of the four seats -Lucknow East, Dadraul and Duddhi -- were held by the BJP while Gainsari was with the Samajwadi Party

The election in the Lucknow East seat was necessitated following the death of sitting MLA Ashutosh Tandon November 9, 2023. A three-time MLA from the seat, Ashutosh Tandon -- son of former minister Lalji Tandon -- was a cabinet minister in the first government of Yogi Adityanath.

The seat has been a BJP stronghold but the party is yet to announce its candidate for the bypoll. Other parties have also not announced their candidates for the seat. Polling in Lucknow East Assembly constituency will be held May 20, the fifth phase of the general elections.

Bypoll to the Dadraul Assembly constituency in Shahjahanpur district will take place May 13 in the fourth phase of the Lok Sabha

polls. The Assembly seat became vacant following the death of BJP MLA Manvendra Singh January 5 after a prolonged illness. He was 70.

Having been with the Congress for a long time, Manvendra Singh joined the BJP in 2017 and became an MLA from Dadraul. He retained his seat in the 2022 polls.

The voters of the Gainsari Assembly seat will exercise their franchise May 25, the sixth phase of the Lok Sabha polls. The constituency in Balrampur district was declared vacant following the demise of sitting Samajwadi Party MLA Shiv Pratap Yadav January 26 at the age of 74. Shiv Pratap Yadav had started his political career from Lok Dal and was a four-time MLA from

The bypolls to the Duddhi Assembly segment in Sonbhadra district will be held June 1, the seventh phase of the general elections. The Assembly constituency, reserved for Scheduled Tribes, fell vacant following the disqualification of the BJP's Ram Dular Gond from the House after being convicted in a rape case.

Ram Dular Gond was sentenced to 25 years of rigorous imprisonment for raping a girl nine years ago. He was disqualified as a member of the Uttar Pradesh Assembly in December 2023. "Our effort will be to win all four seats and the candidates will be announced soon," said a BJP functionary. A Samajwadi Party (SP) spokesman said that they will also declare their candidates well in time

According to official sources, efforts are being made to ensure the safety and comfort of the devotees during Ram Navami by providing water and mats on the open floors, keeping in view the approaching hot weather

"There will be round the clock availability of medical facilities with extra beds in government health institutions and private hospitals. Traffic will also be streamlined and there will be a watchful eye on visitors to segregate criminal elements. Ram Navami celebration will begin with a prayer to the sun early in the morning. At midday, when Lord Ram is supposed to have been born, a special prayer will be performed. People will sing devotional songs in praise of Lord Ram and rock images of him in a cradle to cel-

ebrate his birth. Rath yatras or chariot processions of Ram, his wife Sita, brother Lakshman and devotee Hanuman will be taken out from many temples and people will gather on the banks of the sacred river Saryu for a holy dip.

IIT-M scientists develop electric standing wheelchair

Chennai, March 22: Scientists at the Indian Institute of Technology, Madras, here, have developed NeoStand -- an indigenously developed electric standing wheelchair, officials said.

Available at Rs 89.990, the electric wheelchair enables a wheelchair-bound physically challenged person to stand and perform his or her work whichever he intends to. It may be taking a book from a shelf or having a cup of coffee by standing over the counter or even to maintain eye contact

during conversations. The project was led by TTK Centre for Rehabilitation Research and Device Development Head professor Sujatha Srinivasan and her team at the institute.

"Several patents have been secured following the development of this product. Three to four research scholars have worked on this project. I am actually overjoyed on seeing this product as it provides the freedom to do what a wheelchair borne person intends to do." IIT Madras Director Professor V Kamakoti said after

launching the wheelchair. He referred to a similar initiative by IIT-M scientists who performed robotic operation to clean septic tanks in residential houses as currently manual scavengers involved in taking up such works."We cannot import these kinds of chairs because of costs. We should therefore produce such chairs which

are cost-effective," he said. Ramya, a beneficiary who received the electric standing wheelchair at an event here, said

With a significant following among children and teenagers, this medium enables the EC to effectively engage with the youth, fostering a sense of informed and responsible citizenship from an early age, officials said.



Close contest on cards in Biramitrapur

SITTING RIP MI A SHANKAR ORAM LIKELY TO FACE A ROUGH RIDE THIS TIME

Rourkela, March 22: Biramitrapur is another Assembly segment under Sundargarh Lok Sabha constituency which is set to witness a close contest between contesting candidates in the forthcoming elections.

The seat is reserved for candidates belonging to the Scheduled Tribe (ST). At the peak of the Congress regime, party candidates had managed to win only twice, in 1980 and 85, respectively. Apart from these two victories, this tribal dominated constituency has seen independents, Janta Dal, JMM, Samata Kranti Dal (SKD) and, the latest being, BJP candidates securing victory.

"The constituency has a trend of not supporting the Congress despite having a sizable tribal population," said Dr. Prabhat Mallick, a retired professor of History. He opined that the tribes here have a rebellious past. Amco Simco the great tribal uprising against British Rule took place here. "Perhaps that is the reason



they have never been supporters of Congress, rather mostly voted against it," he said.

Besides, the tribal voters had a liking for the Sibu Soren-led tribal movement in neighbouring Jharkhand, which shares a border with Biramitrapur. "The voters are definitely influenced by the ideology and hence JMM won here thrice," argued Dr Mallick.

Firebrand tribal leader George
Tirkey won from here in 1995
and 2000. Over the time, he fell
out with Soren and, in 2004, left
it. Still, JMM's influence remained intact as party nominee
Nihar Surin won from here in
2004. Tirkey, who was no more of
his earlier charm, however, won
again in 2010 as an independent, and thereafter on a SKD
ticket in 2014.

won from here. This was amongst the three seats that the saffron party won in this district. It is said RSS threw its weight behind Oram and ensured his victory. However, this time people in the know of things as well as surveys are indicating a very rough ride ahead for Oram. Sanjay Barua, a local said, "Oram lost contact with the people and became very indifferent. It seems success went to his head and this led to a gradual loss of his popularity."

Last time, Oram, a lifelong RSS volunteer, polled 60,937 votes (34.86 per cent), and BJD's Makhlu Ekka got 44,586 (25.36%) votes. Tirkey's Son Rohit Joseph Tirkey gave a good fight to BJD and polled 44,212 (25.15%) votes and came third. The JMM came a distant fourth with slightly over 14,000 votes.

However, this time, BJD may repeat Makhlu as he is popular and also close to the party's inner circle. A political analyst said, "He (Makhlu) will start with more than fifty thousand votes lead because Shankar is facing huge dissension and will get almost wiped out in several pockets."

But, another interesting equation is emerging here. George's attempt to get into the BJD fold never materialised. Now he is very active in his stronghold and lobbying for his son Rohit. "If Rohit gets the ticket, then it will be a cakewalk for BJD," said a BJP dissident.

There is a possibility that Congress and JMM may come together and field a common candidate. The combination of the two parties will be a formidable force.

Nevertheless, in the event of an alliance between the two parties the poll equations will undergo change, and Oram is precisely eyeing that, said one of his supporters.

Centre misusing probe agencies: INDIA bloc

New Delhi, March 22: A day after Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal was arrested by the Enforcement Directorate (ED), a delegation of leaders of the INDIA bloc parties approached the Election Commission of India alleging "unrelenting, blatant and illegal deployment of Central agencies" by the ruling BJP to stifle the opposition parties.

What is the need to raid him tomorrow? Right in the middle of the election. It is because you want to win by unfair means before the first vote is cast," he alleged, referring to the arrest of Keiriwal

visible in the constituencies. "Earlier, candidates used to

come here and take away loads of banners and flags but not anymore. Everyone has become tech-savvy and are creating memes of leaders of other parties and posting them on Instagram which are a huge hit," he explains.

However, he hopes that his stocks of flags and banners would 'vanish in a day' when rallies of top leaders are held.

Candidates, on the other hand, say that the entire complexion of electioneering has changed –

mainly after Covid.
"I am even trying to address

people in different villages through an online meet and hope to succeed," said a candidate. "It is much more economical

and convenient to campaign through social media. The campaign, through the audio-visual medium, also has greater recall value," said a BJP candidate from central UP.

He said that Prime Minister Narendra Modi's digital India campaign has made everyone tech-savvy which was proving to be a boon in the elections.

Massive setback for Congress UP Madarsa Education

The I-T department, however, asserted there was no violation of any statutory provision by the tax authority and that as per the material recovered, the "escaped" income of the party is more than Rs 520 crore.



Act unconstitutional: HC

Allahabad High Court Friday declared the Uttar Pradesh Board of Madarsa Education Act. 2004. unconstitutional and violative of the principle of secularism, and asked the state government to accommodate current students in the formal schooling system.

A division bench comprising Justice Vivek Chaudhary and Justice Subhash Vidyarthi of the Lucknow bench of the court declared the law ultra vires on a writ petition filed by a person named Anshuman Singh Rathore.

In his reaction to the order, UP Madarsa Education Board Chairman Iftikhar Ahmed Javed said the board will study the decision and decide the further course of action.

Now after 20 years, the Madarsa Education Act has been declared unconstitutional. Obviously there has been some mistake somewhere. Our lawyers could not present their case properly before the court," he said.

Senior All India Muslim Personal Law Board (AIMPLB) member Maulana Khalid Rashid Farangi Mahali said the order should be challenged in the Supreme Court. The petitioner had challenged the constitutionality of the UP Madarsa Board as well as objected to the management of madarsa by the Minority Welfare Department, rather than the education department.

The petitioner and his counsel submitted that the Madarsa Act violates the principles of secularism, which is the basic structure of the Constitution, fails to provide quality compulsory education up to the age of 14 years/Class-VIII as is mandatorily under Article 21-A; and fails to provide universal and quality school education to all the children studying in madarsas."Thus, it violates the Fundamental Rights of the students of the

madarsas," they claimed. Opposing the petitioners, the state government counsel said that no doubt the Madarsa Board is providing religious education as well as religious instructions to the students, but the state has sufficient power to impart such education under the Constitution of India and is rightly permitting such education.

"Providing religious education and instructions is not barred or illegal. For such religious education a separate Board is necessarily required, which needs to have members of such particular religion," he said.

There are about 25,000 madarsas in Uttar Pradesh of which 16,500 are recognised by the Uttar Pradesh Madarsa Education Board. Of them, 560 madarsas receive grants from the government. Apart from this, there are 8,500 unrecognised madarsas in the state.

Reacting on the decision of the High Court, Madarsa Education Board Chairman Javed said that his lawyer probably could not present their case properly before the court.

Supreme Court denies bail to Kavitha

New Delhi, March 22: In a setback to BRS leader K Kavitha, the Supreme Court Friday refused to grant her bail in the money laundering case related to the

alleged Delhi excise policy scam. The development came a day after Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal was arrested by the Enforcement Directorate in the same case. A bench of Justices Sanjiv Khanna, MM Sundresh and Bela M Trivedi asked Kavitha to approach the trial court, saying it is a practice which this court is following and cannot bypass the protocol.

"Issue notice. Counter affidavit shall be filed in six weeks. Rejoinder, if any, in six weeks. It will be open to the petitioner to move the trial court or invoke any other remedy for grant of bail,"

the bench said, adding all pleas and contentions available to the petitioner are left open.

It clarified that the court has not made any comments on merits of the case. The bench said as far as Kavitha's plea challenging the provisions of the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) is concerned, the court is issuing notice to the ED and

seeking its response. "The petition challenging the provisions (of PMLA) will come up with the pending matters," the bench told senior advocate Kapil Sibal, appearing for Kavitha. At the outset, Sibal told the bench that he has one request to the court that he should not be asked to go to the High Court.

"Please see what is happening in our country. People are being arrested on the basis of an approver's statement. I am



very upset," he said. The bench told Sibal, "As a counsel, you should never be upset. Don't be so emotional. Main writ petition can be put up for hearing with other petitions (pending matters) in July. As far as bail is concerned, we are very clear, you have to go to the trial court."

When Sibal referred to the arrest of former Jharkhand Chief Minister Hemant Soren and other political leaders, the bench asked him not to make political statements.

"We have been very clear and uniformly following this practice in this bench. All of us in principle agree we should not, because there is a political person or someone who can directly afford to come to the Supreme Court, bypass all the statutory and constitutional forums," the bench said. Sibal then referred the statement made by the ED in the court last year in September that she is not an accused. The bench said it is not going into the merit of the case at the moment.

ISRO achieves major milestone

Bangalore, March 22: ISRO Friday said it has achieved a major milestone in the area of reusable launch vehicle technology through the RLV LEX-

02 landing experiment. This is the second of the series conducted at Aeronautical Test Range, Chitradurga, in Karnataka at 7:10 am. After the RLV-LEX-01 mission was accomplished last year, RLV-LEX-02 demonstrated the autonomous landing capability of reusable launch vehicle (RLV) from offnominal initial conditions at release from helicopter, the Bangalore-headquartered space agency said in a statement.

"The RLV was made to undertake more difficult maneuvers with dispersions, correct both cross-range and downrange and land on the runway in a fully autonomous mode," it said.

The winged vehicle, called Pushpak, was lifted by an Indian Air Force Chinook helicopter and was released from 4.5 km altitude.

After release at a distance of 4 km from the runway, Pushpak autonomously approached the runway along with cross-range corrections. It landed precisely on the runway and came to a halt using its brake parachute, landing gear brakes and nose wheel steering system, ISRO

It added that this mission successfully simulated the approach and high-speed landing conditions of RLV returning from

"With this second mission, ISRO has re-validated the indigenously developed technologies in the areas of navigation, control systems, landing gear and deceleration systems essential for performing a highspeed autonomous landing of a space-returning vehicle," the space agency said.

New Delhi, March 22: Ahead of the summer season, the live storage capacity in India's 150 primary reservoirs stands at just 38 per cent of their total capacity, which is less than the last decade's average for the same period, according to data.

Cities like Bangalore are already grappling with a shortfall of water of around 500 million litres per day (MLD), against a demand of 2,600 MLD. Karnataka, among other states, registered lower storage levels compared to the same period last year, according to the weekly bulletin by the Central Water Commission.

Bangalore hosts 14,000 borewells with 6,900 of them

having dried up. Water bodies have either been encroached upon or have dried up. The city requires 2,600 MLD of water, out of which 1,470 MLD is sourced from the Cauvery river and 650 MLD from borewells, Karnataka CM Siddaramaiah had said.

Several other states, including Himachal Pradesh, Punjab, Madhya Pradesh, Tripura, Rajasthan, Bihar, Maharashtra, Uttar Pradesh, Gujarat, Chhattisgarh, Andhra Pradesh and Telangana (two combined projects in both states), and Tamil Nadu, also reported lower storage levels compared to last year.

The total live storage capacity of these 150 reservoirs is 178.784 BCM, which accounts for about



69.35 per cent of the nation's total live storage capacity estimated at 257.812 billion cubic metres, according to official data.

According to the reservoir

storage bulletin Thursday, the live storage available in these reservoirs is 67.591 BCM, representing 38 per cent of their total live storage capacity. However, during the corresponding period last year, the live storage available was 80.557 BCM, with an average of 72.396 BCM over the past decade.

Thus, the current live storage in these 150 reservoirs amounts to 84 per cent of the storage during the same period last year and 93 per cent of the average storage over the past decade."The overall storage position in the country is lower than the corresponding period last year and also falls short of the average storage over the past ten years for the same period," stated the bulletin.

The Southern region, which includes states like Andhra Pradesh and Telangana (two combined projects in both states),

Karnataka, Kerala, and Tamil Nadu, monitors 42 reservoirs with a total live storage capacity of 53.334 BCM.

As of the Reservoir Storage Bulletin dated 21.03.2024, the total live storage available in these reservoirs is 12.287 BCM, which constitutes 23 per cent of their total live storage capacity. This marks a decrease compared to the storage levels during the corresponding period last year (39 per cent) and the average storage over the past ten years

(32 per cent). Thus, the current storage levels in the Southern region are lower than those observed during the same period last year and also fall below the average storage over the past ten years.

Russia's ambassador, Vasily Nebenzia, said that the United States was doing nothing to rein in Israel, mocking Washington for speaking of a ceasefire after Gaza has been virtually wiped off the face of the Earth."

The King announced the conferment of the award during Bhutan's 114th National Day celebrations held at the Tashichhodzong, Thimphu December 17, 2021. On Friday, Prime Minister Modi received it during his two-day State visit, his third since he took over as the



prime minister in 2014.

According to the ranking and precedence established, the Order of the Druk Gyalpo was instituted as the decoration for lifetime achievement and is the pinnacle of the honour system in Bhutan, taking precedence over all orders, decorations and medals. the MEA statement added.

The two countries exchanged several MoUs and signed agreements in the fields of energy, trade, digital connectivity, space and agriculture, and finalised the MoU on the establishment of rail links between the nations. In 2020, Modi received the



Deepfake images: Meloni seeks compensation

Rome: Italian Premier Giorgia Meloni has been asked to testify in court July 2 in the trial of two men who are accused of making deepfake pornographic images using her face and posting them online. Meloni, who is listed as an injured party in the trial in Sassari in Sardinia, is seeking 100,000 euros (\$108,212) in symbolic damages and will donate any award to an Interior Ministry fund for women victims of domestic violence, her attorney Maria Giulia Marongiu said in an email Friday to The Associated Press. "The crime in question is particularly odious, as it allegedly involves the uploading of fabricated pornographic images that could affect any unsuspecting woman with damaging consequences for her reputation and private life," Marongiu said. "Given the role played by Giorgia Meloni, it seemed all the more fitting that she should be a civil plaintiff, in the hope that this would be useful in raising awareness of the issue also on behalf of the many women who often remain defenceless." According to the ANSA news agency, Italy's postal police in 2020 identified the father and son who allegedly uploaded the deepfake images to a US-based porn site by tracing the data to one of their cell phones. At the time Meloni



was not premier, but head of her Brothers of Italy party.

Largest of its kind: Israel seizes West Bank land



Jerusalem: Israel reported Friday the seizure of 800 hectares (1,977 acres) of land in the occupied West Bank, which activists called the largest action of its kind in decades. Israel's Finance Minister Bezalel Smotrich declared as "state lands" the area in the northern Jordan Valley, as US Secretary of State Antony Blinken arrived in Israel for Gaza war talks. Israeli settlement watchdog Peace Now said the size of the seized area is the largest since 1993's Oslo Accords, and that "2024 marks a peak in the extent of declarations of state land". Israel captured the West Bank, east Jerusalem and the Gaza Strip in the 1967 Arab-Israeli war. "While there are those in Israel and the world who seek to undermine our right over the Judea and Samaria area and the country in general, we are promoting

settlement through hard work and in a strategic manner all over the country," Smotrich said, using Israel's term for the West Bank. Settlements in the Palestinian territories are illegal under international law. Smotrich, who heads the extreme-right Religious Zionism party, lives in a settlement.

Kyiv, March 22: Russia Friday staged its largest air strike on Ukrainian energy infrastructure of the war, opens new tab, hitting a vast dam, killing at least five people and leaving more than a million others without electricity, Kyiv said.

Ukraine, which has long allies to supply more air defences, said its energy system had received emergency power supplies from neighbouring Poland, Romania and Slovakia, as seven of its regions faced blackouts.

The attack by Russia, which vowed last week to punish Kyiv for conducting attacks and strikes during its presidential election, brought back memories of the first winter of the invasion when Moscow regularly bombed the

Ottawa, March 22: Canada plans to reduce its temporary residents and set a cap on temporary immigration for the first time ever, Immigration Minister Marc Miller said Thursday, the latest government effort to address a housing shortage and stretched essential services.

In recent years Canada has seen a sharp rise in international students, foreign workers and other temporary residents who come to the country on time-limited visas as Prime Minister Justin Trudeau's govplug labor gaps.

But the Liberal government has also come under political pressure for its immigration policies, with critics arguing they have exacerbated a housing crunch. Some services provided by the provinces, such as education and healthcare, are also struggling to keep up with population growth.

tion targets. In November, the Trudeau government said it would stop ramping up immigration for permanent residents from 2026 onwards.

Muizzu's comments praising India came after the first batch of Indian military personnel left the island nation this month as planned. By May 10, Muizzu had demanded that all 88 military personnel, manning the three Indian aviation platforms, should leave the country. India has been providing hu-

manitarian and medical evacuation services to the people of the Maldives for the last few years using two helicopters and a Dornier aircraft. The Maldives' proximity to

India, barely 70 nautical miles from the island of Minicoy in Lakshadweep and 300 nautical miles from the mainland's western coast, and its location at the hub of commercial sea lanes running through the Indian

Ocean Region (IOR) gives it significant strategic importance. During the interview, Muizzu urged India to accommodate debt relief measures for the Maldives in the repayment of



DGCA slaps ₹80L fine on Air India

New Delhi: Aviation watchdog DGCA Friday imposed a fine of Rs 80 lakh on Air India for violations of norms related to flight duty time limitations and fatique management system of flight crew. The decision came after the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) conducted a spot audit of Air India in January, during which evidence was collected and fleet-wise random reports were analysed. "The analysis of reports and evidence revealed that Air India Limited operated flight(s) with both flight crew aged above 60 years flying together in a few instances. The operator was also found deficient in providing adequate weekly rest, adequate rest before & after ultra-long range flights to the flight crew, which violates the extant provisions of the Civil Aviation Requirements pertaining to FDTL," the regulator said.

Apple antitrust suit mirrors strategy that beat Microsoft

THE US SUED APPLE CLAIMING THE TECH BEHEMOTH ILLEGALLY MAINTAINED A MONOPOLY FOR ITS IPHONE BY STIFLING **COMPETITION AND IMPOSING HIGH COSTS ON CONSUMERS**

Washington, March 22: The US government's antitrust lawsuit against Apple draws on the watershed 1998 case that broke Microsoft's stranglehold on desktop software, but that may prove to be an imperfect blueprint for addressing smartphone competition.

The market for the iPhone today looks very different from the near-monopoly enjoyed by Microsoft's Windows operating system two decades ago, and the government as a result may face a tougher time in taking on

Apple, legal experts said. The Department of Justice,

along with 15 state governments, accused Apple of unlawfully monopolizing the smartphone market through restrictions on app developers that curb choice and innovation, which it said forces consumers to pay higher

Apple said the government is

wrong on the facts and law. The government has to prove that Apple's business practices were "exclusionary" and harmed consumers by degrading the quality of rival products, according to several legal experts.

The government accused Apple of suppressing technologies that would have increased competition among smartphones



apps," cloud streamed gaming apps, messaging apps, smart watches and digital wallets.

One example the government gave is familiar to anyone who texts from an iPhone to a user of an Android phone — the dreaded "green bubble" that results in hindrances such as grainy photos sent by text that don't apply when texting between two phones using Apple's iOS operating system.

Antitrust enforcers said Apple was rapidly expanding its influence and power in industries including content creation and financial services

By comparison, Microsoft was accused of abusing its market dominance to impede users from freely installing software on computers using the company's operating system.

That might sound similar to Apple's control over the app store, but legal experts said there are important differences.

Apple can contract with whom it want and to design products as it sees fit, legal experts said.

MARKET SHARE

Microsoft was forced to open its operating system because it controlled 95% of desktop operating systems in the 1990s. By comparison, Apple had 55% of the North American market for smartphones at the end of September based on shipments, with the rest largely made up of phones using Google's Android operating system, according to Canalys, a market analysis firm.

The Justice Department seeks to define the market as that of smartphones in the United States. Apple representatives said they will try to persuade the court to define the market as the global smartphone market.

Apple and rival Samsung Electronics each had about a 20% market share globally in 2023, though Apple beat Samsung slightly on shipments, Canalys data showed.

Microsoft "clearly was a monopolist and there were no effective competitors in the PC operating system space," Ross said. On the other hand, Android "is very popular, especially in the rest of the world, and is a very

effective competitor with iOS. In 2021, in an antitrust case brought by "Fortnite" creator Epic Games, a federal judge found after a trial that Epic failed to prove that Apple users were "locked-in" to their iPhones and would not switch to Android devices.

Litigator Melissa Maxman in Washington said the Microsoft case changed the tech landscape and lauded the government's lawsuit as a step toward greater competition in the smartphone market.

"If you open up the market for other competitors to get in you will see prices go down and quality go up," Maxman said. "That's exactly what was said in-Microsoft — and guess what, it

was true.'

Abha (Saudi Arabia), March 22: India played out a goalless draw against Afghanistan after both sides failed to turn their opportunities into goals in a Group A fixture of the 2026 FIFA World Cup Qualifiers here.

It was end-to-end contest in the first half Thursday night with India coming close to scoring through Manvir Singh on two occasions and the hosts too had their share of chances.

With this result, India climbed to the second spot in Group A with four points from three matches, followed by Kuwait, who are on three points from as many games. The equation was quite clear for both teams. A win would do either side a world

India have provisionally taken the second spot in Group A, three points ahead of Kuwait, who lost to Qatar 0-3 earlier in the night. Afghanistan, following a draw and to losses are fourth in

A feisty midfield battle ensued in the opening exchanges as lunging tackles were frequently on display at the Damac Stadium. While Afghanistan looked to use their pace and physical built to assert dominance, India were intent on playing a passing game.

Vikram Partap Singh, who had earned his senior national team debut in January, was a constant thorn in the flesh of the Afghanistan defence. The forward kept drifting between the centre and the wing, often switching with Manvir, which caused

much confusion in the Afghanistan ranks.

With India and Afghanistan resorting to open football, the first half (45+3 minutes) saw a wave of attacking moves but the strikers were not able to come alive in the final third, leaving coaches Igor Stimac and Ashley Westwood a bit frustrated as they shouted instructions from the touchline.

India were on the offensive from the word go and caused some anxious moments in the Afghanistan defence. Had Manvir not spurned a great chance in the 17th minute, the visitors would have taken an early lead in their away leg of the second round of the 2026 World Cup and 2027 AFC Asian Cup preliminary joint qualification match.

After a few early exchanges,

the Indian midfield slowly began to clamp their control. Lallianzuala Chhangte, prancing down the left, found an unmarked Manvir with a low cross. But the latter, who had drifted inside from the right flank, sent his shot wide.

Despite India's control over the game, Afghanistan kept finding chances, especially on the counter. Mosawer Ahadi was released down the right flank, as he cut in and unleashed a leftfooted curler that India custodian Gurpreet Singh Sandhu grabbed with both hands.

Manvir had more than one opportunity to score in the first half itself. A corner from Chhangte, and a cross whipped in by fullback Nikhil Poojary were great chances for the India forward to score, but both went begging, as the first half came to a close.

After Manvir, it was Vikram Pratap's turn in the second half to miss a couple of chances. While on the first occasion, the ball was just a yard too far, the 22-year-old managed to wriggle past his marker on the second opportunity, only to run into a culde-sac, where the angle was too narrow for him to take a crack at the goal.

His last opportunity came just minutes ahead of the hour mark, when he managed to get into the six-yard box unmarked, and connected a header onto a cross by Akash Mishra. But the effort went inches wide.

Subhasish Bose was added to the list of Indian players who managed to get a free header inside the Afghanistan box, as he nodded a Colaco corner inches wide of the target.

As the match went into injury time, Colaco created one last opportunity, sprinting down the right flank. His low cross missed captain Sunil Chhetri, but landed at Mahesh's feet, as the latter tried to feint his marker to create shooting space but he was soon dispossessed.
