Iran set to hit Israel, asks US to stay away

Tehran, April 6: Iran said it asked the US to 'step aside' as the country prepares a response to a suspected Israeli attack on its consulate in Syria while Hezbollah, its main proxy in the Middle East, warned the Jewish state it's prepared for war.

In a written message to Washington, Iran "warned the US not to get dragged into Netanyahu's trap," Mohammad Jamshidi, the Iranian president's deputy chief of staff for political affairs, wrote on X, referring to Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu. The US should "step aside so that you don't get hit.'

"In response, the US asked Iran not to hit American targets," Jamshidi said.

The US hasn't commented on the alleged message Iran had sent.

CNN reported that the US is on high alert and is preparing for a 'significant' response from Iran against Israeli or American targets in the region. The network cited an unnamed US official.

NBC, citing two unnamed US officials, said President Joe Biden's administration is concerned that any attack could be inside Israel, specifically

Bhubaneswar, April 6: At least four persons were killed and 15 others injured in two separate road accidents in the state, police said Saturday.

Two members of a Danda Nata (folk art) group were killed and 15 others injured when the van in which they were travelling overturned at Sompur Chhak in Ganjam district Saturday morning, police said. The injured persons were rushed to Hinjili hospital. Seven of them were later shifted to MKCG Medical College Hospital in Berhampur as their condition deteriorated. The artistes were returning from Dahimundali village to Kheti Berhampur in two pickup vans after completing a show.

The Biden administration did take the unusual step of communicating directly to Iran that the US was unaware that Monday's strike in Damascus would happen, Bloomberg reported. That suggested the US was trying to prevent its own forces and bases in the Middle East being attacked.

The Islamic Republic has said it will deliver a 'slap' to Israel, its arch enemy. Still, it's unclear when that would happen or whether Iran would try to attack Israel directly or through one of its proxy groups such as Hezbollah, based in Lebanon.

The airstrike hit the Iranian consulate in Damascus, killing at least seven Iranians, including two generals. While Israel has repeatedly targeted Iran-linked assets in Syria over the past few months, this was the first time an attack struck an Iranian diplomatic building.

Israel has been on alert since then, canceling home leave for combat troops, calling up reserves and bolstering air defences. Its military scrambled navigational signals over Tel Aviv Thursday to disrupt GPS-navigated drones or missiles that might be fired at the country.

Jaipur, April 6: Chairperson of the Congress Parliamentary Party (CPP) Sonia Gandhi Saturday said that India is not the property of a few people but belongs to everyone.

"This country is not the property of a few people. It belongs to everyone. Our ancestors have watered it with blood," Gandhi said while addressing a massive rally on the launch of 'Nyay' manifesto for the Lok Sabha 2024 elections in Jaipur.

She said that for the last 10 vears, the country has been in the hands of a government which has left no stone unturned in promoting unemployment and economic crisis.

"Whatever the Modi government has done is in front of us. This time is full of despair but we know that with despair, hope is also born. I have full confidence that our colleagues will light the lamp of justice and will move ahead braving thousands of storms," she said.

She said that PM Modi considers himself great but the (BJP government) is violating democratic norms and instilling fear in the entire system.

'This is dictatorship. Our democracy is in danger," Sonia said.

Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge and General Secretary Priyanka Gandhi were also present on the occasion. Kharge attacked PM Modi, saying that he has been taking

credit for everything without doing anything. "Is it PM Modi's job to take credit without doing any actual work? This man goes everywhere and says I did this, I did that.

How many guarantees have they given to us before?" Kharge asked. Priyanka said that unem-

ployment is at its highest. She said that paper-leak has become a common problem in all states and it is one of the reasons that youths are not getting jobs.

PM doesn't know his history: Cong

New Delhi: The Congress Saturday hit back at Prime Minister Narendra Modi over his remarks that the party's manifesto bore a Muslim League imprint, saying the Prime Minister "does not know his history' as it was none other than Jan Sangh founder Shyama Prasad Mookerjee himself who was part of a coalition government in Bengal with the League in the early 1940s. The Opposition party also accused the BJP of practising "politics of divisiveness". Addressing an election rally in Saharanpur, Modi said the Congress manifesto bears a Muslim League imprint while a part of it is dominated by the leftists. The Prime Minister's attack on the Congress came a day after it released its manifesto, focusing on five 'pillars of justice' and 25 guarantees.

"You have seen how the BJP government has worked in the last 10 years. What have they done to rescue the nation from the evil of unemployment,' Priyanka asked.

"Inflation is also rising each day. The LPG cylinders price was slashed only two months before elections," she added.



The twin cities of Bhubaneswar and Cuttack registered the maximum temperature of 39.6 and 40.1 degrees Celsius respectively.

The IMD forecast that there will be no major change in the maximum temperature over the next 24 hours, and in the subsequent two days, it may dip by two-four degrees Celsius, with no major change thereafter.

It also issued a yellow warning and predicted heatwave conditions at one or two places in Angul, Nayagarh, Bolangir, ২ Malkangiri, Bhadrak, Gajapati and Boudh districts till Sunday.

Warm night conditions are likely to prevail at a few places in Bolangir, Kandhamal, Nayagarh, Cuttack, Jagatsinghpur and Malkangiri, the weather office said.







Thunderstorm forecast amid sweltering heat

Bhubaneswar, April 6: Amid blistering heatwave conditions across the state, the regional centre of the India Meteorological Department (IMD) here Saturday predicted moderate thunderstorm activity with lightning, hailstorms, and heavy rainfall in some districts April 7 and 8.

The weatherman has attributed the prediction to the expected interaction between the trough aloft in middle and upper tropospheric westerlies and the hot and humid air from the Bay of Bengal.

Consequently, the state is likely to experience rain, thunderstorms, lightning, and gusty winds, the regional centre of the IMD said, advising people to monitor the weather closely and seek shelter during thunderstorm activity to protect themselves from lightning and hailposed restrictions on outdoor sports activities in the state during peak hours.

'The SRC has directed the Sports and Youth Services department to restrict outdoor sports activities due to the prevailing heatwave conditions in many parts of the state," an official said.

Warm nights have been observed in one or two places in the Bolangir, while dry weather persists in the rest of the districts. The maximum temperatures

have risen significantly in a few places in coastal Odisha and appreciably in one or two places in

a mysterious wound on his stomach. the Commissionerate Police Saturday arrested his friend in connection with the murder. The incident took place under the jurisdiction of Infocity police station limits, December 6.

DCP Bhubaneswar Prateek Singh identified the accused as Kalia Swain, 40, a resident of Sikharchandi Nagar in Patia area of the Capital City. The victim, Seema Saibal, lived in the same neighborhood and was a good friend of Kalia. However, their friendship turned sour after Seema allegedly passed

lewd remarks about Kalia's wife, resulting in the vengeance crime,

case, Singh said in the months

preceding the murder, Seema would get drunk and pass uncouth comments about Kalia's wife. "For this, Kalia warned Seema on several occasions to stop and even threat-

ened him with dire consequences," the DCP added.

On the fateful day - December 6 evening - Kalia had a heated argument with Seema over the same issue. "It later escalated into a scuffle between the two.

Later, locals intervened and separated them. Kalia left for his home in a huff, only to return after a while (around 11 pm). Seema was then loitering around with some friends near

the local market," Singh said, adding that Kalia took no time to stab Seema with a knife he was carrying on the stomach before fleeing

Locals rushed to Seema's help after hearing his cries and took him to a private hospital with the help of his wife. He was later shifted to SCB Medical College and Hospital where he breathed his last the same night, Singh said.

Significantly, Investigating Officer (IO) Kshyamsagar Nayak of Infocity police station said that the incident, though occurred in public, went unnoticed. "Even locals told Seema's wife that her husband had suffered the injury in a road mishap," Nayak said.

He said days after the incident police got a tip-off that Seema had been stabbed by Kalia, resulting in his death. "We launched an investigation and arrested Kalia today. The murder weapon has also been recovered," Nayak said.

The police have booked Kalia under Sections 302 and 201 of IPC and produced him before a local court today for remand.

New Delhi, April 6: The CBI has busted a syndicate of child traffickers, arresting seven persons engaged in peddling infants to childless couples through ads on Facebook and WhatsApp channels, officials said Saturday.

The agency executed the crackdown last evening and rescued two newborns -- a two days old and an-

other 15 days old, they said. Acting on a tip-off, CBI slo swooped down at seven locations in Delhi and Haryana where they stumbled upon the babies whom the syndicate schemed to sell for Rs 4-6 lakh, sources said.

Anjali of Malviya Nagar allegedly used to bring customers, they said. According to CBI's spokesper-

son, the syndicate purportedly liaised with childless couples seeking adoption prospects via advertorial engagements on platforms such as Facebook pages and WhatsApp clusters.

During the ensuing searches, the CBI confiscated a stash of Rs 5.5 lakh in cash, alongside incriminating documents. The CBI has filed FIR charges against ten individuals, including the arrested, under various sections of the Indian Penal Code and Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act 2015. The arrested accused were sent to CBI remand for four days, the spokesperson said.

ark Zuckerberg has passed Elon Musk to become the third-richest person in the world, the first time since 2020 the arch-rival billionaires have held those positions.

Musk, who ranked first on the Bloomberg Billionaires Index as recently as early March, fell to fourth after Reuters reported Tesla Inc. had cancelled plans for a less-expensive car, sending shares lower. Musk, however, denied the report. That followed news earlier in the week that Tesla's vehicle deliveries fell in the three months through March, their first year-over-year decline since the early days of the Covid pandemic.

Musk's wealth has shrunk by \$48.4 billion this year, while Zuckerberg has added \$58.9 billion to his fortune as Meta Platforms Inc. climbs to fresh highs, including a new record Friday.

It's the first time Zuckerberg has broken into the top three on Bloomberg's ranking of the richest people since November 16, 2020, when he was worth \$105.6 billion and Musk's fortune was \$102.1 billion. Musk now has a net worth of \$180.6 billion, while Zuckerberg has \$186.9 billion.

The reversal of the wealth gap between Musk and Zuckerberg, which was as big as \$215 billion in November 2021, illustrates how oncehot electric vehicle stocks have been usurped by big tech, and particularly anything involving artificial intelligence.

Meta, meanwhile, has surged 49 per cent thanks to strong quarterly earnings and excitement about the company's AI initiatives. It's the fifth-best performer on the S&P 500.

The two billionaires' rivalry extends beyond their wealth: Musk and Zuckerberg have been engaged in an ongoing public spat that intensified when Meta launched Threads, a social-media platform that competes with Musk's X. The two even traded barbs last year about a possible cage fight. Musk, 52, recently revived the idea on X, saying he would fight Zuckerberg, 39, 'anywhere, anytime'.

Musk's net worth could take a further hit after his \$55 billion Tesla pay package was struck down by a Delaware judge. The Bloomberg Billionaires Index continues to use the options from that pay package, which are one of Musk's largest assets, in its calculations of his wealth.

JE gets 3-yr RI over DA

Bhubaneswar, April 6: A Vigilance court in Jeypore Saturday awarded three years of rigorous imprisonment (RI) to a junior engineer (JE) of Rayagada district for possessing disproportionate assets (DA).

The court also slapped a penalty of ₹2 lakh on the convict, Saroj Kumar Panda. Failure to pay the fine would entail additional six months of RI, the court ordered

According to special public prosecutor Sashidhar Patnaik, Panda, who had been posted as a JE at the Gunupur block office in Rayagada district, was arrested by the Vigilance sleuths on charges of possessing assets disproportionate to his known sources of income in 2013.

"Subsequently, a chargesheet was filed with the Special Vigilance Court in Jeypore against Panda under Sections 13(2) r/w 13(1)(e) of the PC Act, 1988 and 109 of the IPC,' Patnaik said.

Cement and fossil fuel production has reached unprecedented levels, with most of the emission growth traceable to a relatively small

Achieving net zero by reducing the emissions of a relatively small number of companies will be much easier than persuading 8 billion people to take collective action on climate. Such drastic reductions in fossil fuel production must also be matched by investment in abundant and increasingly cheap sources of clean renewable energy. The air, water and soil of Kendrapara district are conducive for sunflower cultivation but the need of the hour is proper training

and sponsorship

Kendrapara, April 6: Sunflower cultivation has failed to find many takers in Kendrapara district due to lack of training and sponsorship by the state government.

The highly profitable sunflower farming is being ignored in Kendrapara district despite the district's immense potential for cultivation of the crop and heavy market demand for its oil.

The members of Maa Mangala Women Self-Help Group (SHG) at Koilipur's Charipokharia vil lage under Rajkanika block have cultivated sunflower on seven acre of land for the second year on a row. The experience which they gained in the first year of cultivation has matured them and prepared them better to take up the farming in a more organised manner.

The sunflower oil produced by them has received wide acceptance from the customers in the local market. The women have become an example for others to emulate.

However, their success has

failed to stir up any interest among other farmers towards the cash crop due to lack of training and sponsorship by the state

government. Local intelligentsia claimed that the cultivation done during the Rabi season can lead to establishment of small scale in-

dustries and contribute to the economy of the district if it is encouraged. Local intelligentsia Ashis Kumar Senapati said that the price of edible oil is witnessing a constant increase in the country. The price rise of the edible oil along with petrol, diesel and LPG cylinders has become a cause of concern for the common man. India is laying stress on import of palm oil from Malaysia and Indonesia after a stoppage

in import of sunflower oil from Russia and Ukraine Indonesia has imposed restrictions on export of palm oil while Malaysian government has increased its prices. To combat such a situation, the then Prime Minister Lal Bahadur Shastri had called for green revolution in 1968. As a result, India has now become a leading exporter of wheat, Senapati said.

Similarly, sunflower cultivation should be encouraged in order to tide over the edible oil crisis plaguing the country, he said. The air, water and soil of Kendrapara district are conducive for sunflower cultivation

but the need of the hour is proper training and sponsorship for the farmers to take up the cash crop, he added.

Pabitra Kumar Pati, a resident of Patisahi village under Garadpur panchayat, said sunflower cultivation was first done on experimental basis over 30 hectare of land in four panchayats of Garadpur block under Rashtriya Krushi Vikash Yojana. However, the absence of proper marketing facilities or mandis is weaning the farmers from sunflower cultivation, he added.

A farmer leader Rashmiranjan Choudhury said that agricultural investment makes up the lion's share of the district's annual plan. However, this is not done in reality. The district can be an example in sunflower farming if water management is strengthened in the district.

Farming can be taken up on over 40,000 hectare land in the district. Around 55 per cent of oil can be collected from sunflower seeds which will lead to establishment

of small and minor industries. The Agriculture and Horticulture departments. Krushi Vigyan Kendra (KVK), local political representatives, administrators, voluntary outfits, pani panchayat and farmers club should join hands to take up sunflower farming to a greater height. The engagement of women SHGs in more numbers could usher in a revolution in production of sunflower oil. Similarly, proper training and financial assistance to the farmers through Agriculture

Technology Management Agency (ATMA) can take the cultivation forward, he added. When contacted, deputy di-

rector Debadas Dutta of district Horticulture department and senior scientist Prabhanjan Mishra of KVK said that the state government has launched various schemes for sunflower cultivation. It has also planned to provide training to the interested farmers through ATMA and constructing 118 godowns to collect the harvested sunflowers. The farmers can reap this benefit from this year, they added.

Bangladesh is today, according to the Economist magazine, a one party state. Of course parliament exists and other parties are present. But the primary Opposition is missing and its leader, Khaleda Zia, has been convicted.

In January 2024, Bangladesh had its general elections in which the ruling Awami League won 224 seats, giving it a two-thirds majority in a parliament which has 300 seats. In the previous election, Khaleda Zia had asked for a caretaker government to conduct the elections, which Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina refused. Accusations of misuse of government machinery, including jailing and hounding of the Opposition are common. That is one reason why, despite having an elected government, Bangladesh is classified as 'partly free'

India hailed the Bangladesh election. Prime Minister Modi tweeted: Spoke to Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina and congratulated her on her victory for a historic fourth consecutive term in the Parliamentary elections. I also congratulate the people of Bangladesh for the successful conduct of elections.'

The US State Department spokesman said that "the United States shares the view with other observers that these elections were not free or fair and we regret that not all parties participated.³

The following month, February 2024. Pakistan went to elections with the incumbent Prime Minister Imran Khan being jailed. The US said: "We join credible international and local election observers in their assessment that these elections included undue restrictions on freedoms of expression, association, and peaceful assembly. We condemn electoral violence, restrictions on the exercise of human rights and fundamental freedoms, including attacks on media workers, and restrictions on access to the Internet and telecommunication services, and are concerned about allegations of interference in the electoral process. Claims of interference or fraud should be fully investigated."

Pakistan tried to be an Opposition-free democracy like Bangladesh but was less successful. The jailed Imran was still able to get a third of the vote. As is common in our part of the world, post poll 'convincing' of his parliamentarians to see the light, with

the healthy use of agencies, will doubtless continue.

In 1977, Pakistan had an election which was won by the ruling party, at a time when Prime Minister ZA Bhutto was popular. Despite his popularity, the election was seen as not free or fair, with the Opposition hamstrung by the state even though it was weak. Pakistan suffered for four decades as a result of the events of that period.

Democracies are healthy where there is active nourishing of the independence of institutions, such as the Election Commission and the Supreme Court. Meaning their independence from the ruling government. Where the Opposition does not feel that it is playing in a fixed match, with different rules for one team and where the umpires are biased against them. These are basic things but they need to be repeated unfortunately.

India has been sliding since 2014 to arrive at where it has today. The Economist Intelligence Unit's Democracy Index monitors civil liberties, pluralism, political culture and participation and electoral process. In 2014, India was ranked 27th. In 2020, India was classified as a 'flawed democracy'. Last year the ranking was 41.

This was the 'result of democratic backsliding under the leadership of Narendra Modi' and the 'increasing influence of religion under Modi, whose policies have fomented anti-Muslim feeling and religious strife, has damaged the political fabric of the country'.

The CIVICUS Monitor's National Civic Space Ratings monitors the

which is currently host to 1.5 million people, including over 600,000 children. Many of those seeking refuge in this border city have already endured the trauma of multiple displacements over the past half-year. A full-scale Israeli military incursion must not be allowed to happen.

I write these words as someone who looked into the eyes of young Palestinians while preparing the 1996 UN report The Impact of Armed Conflict on Children. Speaking to children in refugee camps, we promised that their suffering would end. Not only have we failed to make good on that promise; we have left an even more hostile world for children who happen to be born Palestinian. I carry this haunting failure with me.

I also write these words as a member of The Elders, the group of independent global leaders that I co-founded with my late husband, Nelson Mandela, and which was chaired in its early years by Archbishop Desmond Tutu and former UN Secretary-General Kofi Annan. Madiba (Mandela) gave us a mandate to work for peace, justice, and human rights worldwide, and he always considered Palestinian liberation to be key to achieving a just and free world for all. How can any of us speak credibly of universal human rights and the international rule of law when we per-

mit brutality and occupation to continue for decades?

Amid such despair and lack of moral courage by those with the power to stop the current carnage in Gaza, I am proud of the exceptional leadership that South Africa has shown in bringing a complaint against Israel for violating the Genocide Convention at the International Court of Justice. The ICJ's preliminary ruling, 26 January, and the additional measures ordered 28 March, explicitly condemn the atrocities taking place in Gaza and are unambiguous about the steps Israel must take to protect innocent Palestinians, including unhindered provision of humanitarian assistance at scale.

Israel and the countries providing it with military and financial assistance must heed the court's findings and adhere to their obligations under international law. But we are not helpless in the face of this monumental suffering. As members of one human family, we have an ethical duty to speak out against these injustices in our own circles of influence. We can wield power through our own individual and community activism. With our votes and protests, we can - and must - demand accountability from our political leaders.

Here is what we must demand. First, additional humanitarian land routes urgently need to be opened to meet the overwhelming need for life-saving aid. The safety of aid deliveries must be guaranteed at all times. Air drops and the recently proposed maritime corridor are insufficient, and must not be allowed to absolve Israel of its own responsibility to civilians in Gaza.

Second, world leaders must use military and financial lever age to compel Israel to cease its violations of international law and comply with the ICJ's orders. All countries providing military as sistance to Israel should imme diately put these shipments under review and set new conditions for future provision. Those that continue supplying arms are enabling the carnage and may be complicit in war crimes.

Third, decision-makers must provide full financial and political support to the UN Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees. Many donors have rushed to suspend funding for the organisation, pending the outcome of investigations into Israel's allegations that some UNRWA staff participated in the 7 October attack. This premature, disproportionate response is now irresponsibly endangering the rights and well-being of millions of Palestinian refugees. The Israeli government has made no secret of its desire to dismantle UNRWA once and for all. Will we allow it to become yet another casualty of the war?

The situation cries out for concerted action by a broad coalition of countries committed to a just and permanent peace that enables Israelis and Palestinians to co-exist under conditions of mutual respect, self-determination, dignity, and security. Palestinian and Israeli lives and security are of equal worth. If this fundamental truth does not prevail on political leaders and ordinary citizens, we will continue to forsake generations of innocent children.

freedoms of association, peaceful assembly and expression, all necessary for democracy. In 2017 India's rating was 'Obstructed' but it has since fallen to 'Repressed'.

In March 2022, Ĉivicus said: "India has been added to a watchlist of countries that have seen a rapid decline in civic freedoms" and that Modi 'continues to resort to drastic measures to silence critics.

Freedom House says "the BJP has increasingly used government institutions to target political opponents." The University of Gothenburg's V-Dem report says India has suffered 'one of the most dramatic shifts among all countries in the world over the past 10 years'. It said that under Modi India lost its status as a democracy and was classified as an 'electoral autocracy', joining nations like Hungary and Turkey. On freedom of expression, media and civil society. India was 'as autocratic as is Pakistan, and worse than both Bangladesh and Nepal'.

This is how democracies die in our part of the world, not with a bang but with a whimper. The independence of institutions is hollowed out from within over time, slowly deflating till little is left. 'Corrupt' and 'anti-national' elements are removed or neutralised through the misuse of law. Elections are held but to the outside world they seem neither free nor fair.

The other interesting aspect of this is that once this sort of state is achieved, it is difficult if not impossible to get out of, as Pakistan and Bangladesh show. No election in those nations is today conducted without bitterness, rancour and one side feeling and saying that it has been wronged. We are either already there or we are almost there.

DATA ON UNEMPLOYMENT IS A VEXATIOUS ISSUE IN INDIA. THIS IS UNDERSTANDABLE AS CLOSE TO 90% **OF THE WORKING POPULATION IS ENGAGED IN THE INFORMAL SECTOR**

ne of the paradoxes of India's growth story after the economic liberalisation has been jobless growth. At its peak during 2004-2009 when average GDP growth rate was 8.7%, the growth in employment was 0.1% only The recently released India Unemployment Report published jointly by the International Labour Organisation and the Institute of Human Development has confirmed that this trend of jobless growth has continued from 2000 to 2023, despite PM Modi's promise in 2014 that 10 million additional jobs would be created every year. The report, apart from addressing the disconcerting trend in employment, has also covered the educational and skill challenges and has suggested five missions that would need to be taken up in right earnest to address the most problem of unemployment.

Data on unemployment is a vexatious issue in India. This is understandable as close to 90% of the working population is engaged in the informal sector, data of which is not captured by the NSSO. The CMIE. a private think tank, has also

been coming up with unemployment data more frequently. When NSSO came up with data that the overall unemployment is 6.11% (7.8% in urban areas and 5.3% in rural areas) it was not allowed to publish the details. These figures were the highest since 1972-73

The report has brought out that the LFPR (Labour Force Participation Rate) has been plummeting from 61.6% in 2000 to 55.9% in 2012 to 50.2% in 2019. It has recovered to 55.2% by 2023, largely due to higher labour engagement in the agricultural sector. The report also brings out how female LFPR which had plummeted from 38.9% in 2000 to 24.5% in 2019 has now gone up to 32.8%. The female LFPR is still much lower than male force participation rate of 77.2%

Beyond these disturbing numbers, the report brings out how 66% of the increase in employment after 2019 is due to increase in self-employment, with the share of regular work declining. The employment in informal sector which accounts for 90% of employment is of poor quality. Wages and earnings are either stagnant or de-

clining in this sector. The report brings out how creation of training capacity in poor regions is particularly low and there is very low level of socioeconomic inclusion. Apprentice training is low. For entrepreneurship development, the report flags the importance of access to funding, supporting regulatory and tax regime, education system that supports entrepreneurial mind-

set and coordination between public, private and NGO sectors. The report rightly suggests that production and growth should me more employment intensive so that we create at least 7-9 million jobs per year. This was also suggested by Prof Amartya Sen in his seminal book Choice of Techniques (1960) where he advocated labour intensive technology as the right choice over capital intensive technology promoted by the West. The report recommends five missions - labour intensive production, improved quality of jobs, overcoming labour market inequality, providing effective skills, creating productive non-farm em-

ployment and supporting SMEs.

Quite clearly, transcending all

political hype and obfuscation, the unemployment rate is increasing. While the total workforce employed has increased from 382.3 million in 2001 to 487.4 million in 2021, the working age population (15-64) has increased from 656 million to 950 million (2001-2021). The unemployment per year has been increasing from 0.39% to 0.44%. This is further roiled by the high incidence of disguised employment. Prof Nagraj (2023) brings out how the index of industrial production has gone down from 5.7% during 2005-2013 to 3.1% during 2024-2023. The Gross Capital Formation which was 34.3% during Manmohan regime has gone down to 28.9% in 2021-22, with the dip predominantly due to private sector investment, while public sector investment has remained constant at 8%. With per capita income lowest among G20 countries and consumption levels low for almost 70% of Indians, without proper skill based education and labour intensive manufacturing, the spectre of unemployment would remain a troubling terrain.

Cautious central bank

Sir, This refers to "RBI keeps status quo," Orissa Post, 6 April. One understands why the Reserve Bank of India's (RBI's) Monetary Policy Committee is in no hurry to cut the repo rate at this point when food inflation spurts every now and then and when crude oil prices have crossed the \$90 per barrel mark. Moreover, headline GDP numbers have been very strong, giving the RBI abundant room to fight inflation. With Deputy Governor Michael Patra observing that it isn't really material to consider the level of real interest rates when inflation is still way above the 4 per cent target, it would appear that a cut in the policy rate would not take place until the MPC is convinced inflation has been durably tamed. The RBI clearly believes it would be prudent to wait to see how the monsoon plays out and ahead of that whether the above-normal temperatures in the coming months impact the production of food crops. But with the policy rate at 6.5 per cent, the cost of the funds remains high. This could limit the revival in private capital expenditure. Right now, it's the government that is investing and that may not be enough to drive the growth further. It is, therefore, not surprising at all that the RBI's growth forecast for FY25 was left unchanged at 7 per cent. Unless the interest rates come down small enterprises will suffer and private capital expenditure won't pick up meaningfully.

No political rallies in strife-torn Manipur

THE ONLY VISIBLE **HINT OF THE IMPENDING ELECTION IS THE HOARDINGS PUT UP BY LOCAL ELECTION AUTHORITIES. URGING CITIZENS TO EXERCISE THEIR FRANCHISE**

Imphal, April 6: Posters of political parties, mega rallies and visible movement of leaders - the traditional elements of campaigning -- are conspicuously missing in violence-hit Manipur where polling for Lok Sabha elections are due in less than two weeks.

The only visible hint of the impending election is the hoardings put up by local election authorities, urging citizens to exercise their franchise

Amid the muted election fer vour, major party figures have refrained from visiting the conflict-ridden state to canvass for votes or make electoral pledges.

While the BJP has enlisted prominent figures like Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Union Home Minister Amit Shah as star campaigners, the Congress lineup includes Sonia Gandhi, Rahul Gandhi, and other key leaders. However, none of them have made any appearance in Manipur yet.

Though the Election Commission of Manipur maintained that there are no official restrictions on campaigning activities, party representatives emphasised the need for subdued campaigning to avoid aggravating the delicate situation in the state.

"There are no restrictions from the Election Commission's side on campaigning. Anything



which is within the boundaries of the model code of conduct is allowed," Chief Electoral Officer of Manipur, Pradeep Jha told PTI. To tackle the tricky situation, the candidates – BJP's Thounaojam Basanta Kumar Singh, Congress' Angomcha Bimol Akoijam, Republican Party India's Maheshwar Thounaojam and Rajmukar Somendro Singh, who is backed by the Manipur Peoples' Party (MPP), have come up with a

unique solution. They are reaching out to the voters in a non-conventional way which includes holding meetings at their residence or party offices and their supporters indulging in door-to-door

campaigns "It would have been better if I addressed public meetings and

held rallies, but I have decided to keep the campaign low-key,' Maheshwar Thounaojam, who has deployed teams of volunteers for door-to-door campaigning, said.

"The voters know the importance of their vote in the current situation and will make an informed choice," he added.

Basanta Kumar Singh, the sitting Education and Law Minister of the state, who is contesting the Lok Sabha polls this time, is holding small meetings at his residence and the party office. Similarly, Akoijam, a professor at the Jawaharlal Nehru

University, Delhi, mostly meets people at his residence. Posters of Rahul Gandhi's

Bharat Jodo Yatra and those seeking voters for Akoijam have also been put up at the Congress office

in Imphal "Elections are important for us but we cannot rub salt in people's wounds by doing pomp and show. Elections are also like a festival but we cannot celebrate the festival in a loud manner because of the current situation," BJP Manipur president A Sharda Devi told PTI.

"People are living away from their homes, we want them to have faith in us but we are not campaigning," the BJP leader added. A senior state government official asserted that any kind of loud campaign can be detrimental to the law and order situation in the state.

'Though the situation seems to be under control at the moment, any kind of loud campaign can be detrimental to the law and order of the state and no party wants to take that risk," the official said requesting anonymity.

At least 219 people have been killed in the ethnic strife in the state that started May 3 last year after a 'Tribal Solidarity March' was organised in the hill districts to protest against the Meitei community's demand for Scheduled Tribe (ST) status. A majority of over 50,000 internally displaced people are currently staying at relief centres across five valley districts and three hill districts.

Scheduled in two phases April 19 and 26, the Lok Sabha elections in Manipur have garnered attention for the displaced population's voting arrangements.

Special polling stations will be set up at relief camps to enable the displaced people to cast their votes.

UP's double-engine govt running low on fuel: Cong

New Delhi, April 6: Taking a swipe at Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the Congress Saturday claimed that the double-engine government in Uttar Pradesh is running 'dangerously low' on fuel and that the PM must answer key issues of the state before the engine comes to a 'sputtering halt June 4'.

Ahead of the PM's rally in Saharanpur, Congress general secretary Jairam Ramesh posed three questions to the PM including one on Saharanpur's wood-carving industry.

"Today, PM Modi visits Saharanpur in Uttar Pradesh, a state where the double-engine sarkar is running dangerously low on fuel. Before the engine comes to a sputtering halt on June 4th, we hope the PM can answer these three questions on why the machinery is breaking down," Ramesh said on X.

Noting that Saharanpur is globally acclaimed for its woodcarving industry and is popularly known as the Wooden City, Ramesh said the industry is more than 200 years old and is crucial to the economic health of the city as it employs more

than 7 lakh people. "Unfortunately, the wood-carving industry has been hit hard by successive blunders of the Modi government. First, demonetisation, then GST, and finally, the unplanned pandemic lockdowns have decimated the industry, which has been struggling to recover ever since," he said.

At its peak, it was exporting more than 1,500 crores worth of goods but today, this number has reduced by almost 90 per cent, he claimed.

'The 'double-engine' sarkar has been found triply guilty in Saharanpur: What does PM Modi have to say to the lakhs of artisans who are suffering because

of his blunders? What have the BJP governments at the state and Centre done to support this age-old industry?" he said.

Noting that Uttar Pradesh is the largest sugarcane producer in the country, Ramesh said farmers in Western UP have been demanding a hike in the fixed price (SAP) of sugarcane citing increased costs of fertilisers and pesticides.

"Yet, the BJP government has raised the price to just ₹360/quintal, which is grossly inadequate according to UP's farmers. This latest price hike lags far behind inflation and is much lower than Punjab's ₹386/quintal and Haryana's ₹391/quintal," he said.

"As Sudhir Panwar, a former member of UP Planning Commission, remarked, '[I]n UP, the SAP, which was earlier determined by input cost, is now dictated by election schedule', said. Can the PM tell us why the BJP government has been so unwilling to fairly compensate farmers for their work?" Ramesh said. Despite repeated promises of action, the UP government has failed to address the growing stray cattle menace, he claimed.

The lack of adequate animal shelters has led cattle rearers to avoid caring for them by simplv releasing their animals, he said.

"These cattle have now become a nightmare for farmers routinely destroying crops, and given their affinity for highervalue crops, even blocking efforts at crop diversification. Farmers now have to keep vigil around the clock, and some have even died from bull attacks," he said.

"Instead of diverting public discourse, can the Prime Minister address the issues that are actually concerning the local people: what is his vision to solve this problem?" Ramesh said.

But after walking through its long lanes with more than 4,500 stalls spread across three multi-story buildings and a sea of surrounding tin shacks, one unique aspect becomes hard to ignore: every single trader, without exception, is a woman, a fact they take pride in.

The famous market was also the theme of the state's Republic Day tableau this year. Priya Kharaibam, a third-generation pottery trader, questioned the purpose of elections if the status quo remains unchanged.

"If everything has to go on the way it is going on, why do we need elections? What will

change?" she asked. Against this backdrop, a traders' group in the market

'The decision to hold the elections shows that the government has no concern for the life and property of the common people. The people of the state have been witnessing a cycle of violence arising out of conflict between two communities for the last 11 months. We have been facing immense hardship due to the protracted violence," said Yumnam Ibeyaima, general secretary of the traders' body.

Asem Nirmala, general secretary of another traders' body in the market called Lukmaisellup, lamented the lack of governmental responsiveness to the prolonged crisis, emphasising the urgent need for solutions over elections.

"This is the time for solutions. This is not the time for elections.

the very wrong time. We are contemplating whether we should either not vote or vote in unison against the government in power and give other parties a chance and see if there is restoration of peace. I am trying to counsel the women in the market but they are not keen on voting," she told PTI. Ima Keithel Joint Coordinating Committee convener Laishram Ongbi Memma said it was ironic that the government can arrange voting in camps but cannot help the displaced voters in returning to their homes even after 11 months.

"For the last 11 months, the government has not been able to make arrangements for the displaced people to return to their homes but they have alternative arrangements for them to cast vote. The women vendors are not against the upcoming Lok Sabha election but the government should prioritise peace instead of election so that each and every citizen can enjoy their voting rights," said Memma.

Some traders find themselves at a crossroads, contemplating whether to vote collectively against the incumbent government in pursuit of peace restoration. As many as 75 'Imas' or 'mothers' (elderly women traders) from the famed market had visited Delhi in June last year and staged a sit-in protest at Jantar Mantar. demanding a solution and oppos-ing any territorial division of the state on ethnic lines.

Saharanpur (UP), April 6: The Congress manifesto carries the imprint of the Muslim League with "every page reeking of breaking India", Prime Minister Narendra Modi said Saturday, virtually equating the Congress to the party which is blamed for the Partition.

Modi, who addressed BJP's election rallies in Saharanpur in western Uttar Pradesh and Rajasthan's Ajmer, also criticised the Congress for staying away from the consecration ceremony of Ram temple in Ayodhya and for remarks against 'Shakti'

"Opposing the visit to the consecration of Ram temple? Is it appropriate? Not only this, if someone visited, he was expelled from the Congress party for six years. Can this happen in this country, can you imagine the country without Lord Ram?

"Lord Ram has got a permanent abode. Ram Navami is coming and people are going to celebrate. Let's see how much you will oppose it," Modi said.

Prime Minister Modi said the Congress which existed at the time of the freedom movement is long gone and the party today neither has policies nor the vision for the nation's development.

He slammed the Congress manifesto, calling it a bundle of lies and claiming that it has "exposed" the party that wants to "impose" the ideas of the Muslim League on India.

"Every page reeks of breaking India into pieces. The Congress manifesto reflects the same thinking that was prevalent in the Muslim League during the freedom movement. It completely bears the imprint of the Muslim League and whatever is remaining is completely dominated by the Leftists," Modi said. He said it is the misfortune

of the country that the Opposition alliance is talking about fighting against 'Shakti'.

"Worshipping Shakti is a part of our natural spiritual journey. But, the people of the INDI alliance say their fight is against Shakti," Modi said. Hitting back, the Congress ac-

cused the BJP of practising "politics of divisiveness" and reminded Modi that Jan Sangh founder Syama Prasad Mookerjee had joined the coalition government in Bengal with the Muslim League in the early 1940s.

Congress general secretary Jairam Ramesh said, "The prime minister does not know his history as it was, in fact, none other than Mookerjee, the president of the Hindu Mahasabha then, who was himself part of the coalition

government in Bengal with the Muslim League.'

The Hindu Mahasabha was also in coalition with the Muslim League in Sindh and North-West Frontier Province. "It is the BJP, not the Congress. that believes in and practices the politics of divisiveness," Ramesh said.

Stepping up his attack on the opposition INDIA bloc including Congress on the issue of corruption. Modi said their aim is to earn "commission" after coming to power while the BJP-led NDA is working with a "mission" to make India a developed nation.

Modi called the Congress a party of "dynasts and corrupt" that is bereft of both principles and policies.

"Wherever there is Congress, there cannot be any development. The Congress never thought about the poor, marginalised and youths.... These people considered looting public money as their ancestral right. In the last 10 years, Modi has provided a permanent cure for the disease." the prime minister said in Ajmer.

Balurghat (WB), April 6: West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee Saturday accused NIA officials of attacking villagers at Bhupatinagar in Purba Medinipur district and not the other way round.

Claiming that officials of the central probe agency had barged into several houses in the early hours over an incident of 'bursting of crackers in 2022', she defended the villagers' response as self-defence.

'The attack was not perpetrated by the women of Bhupatinagar, but rather by the National Investigation Agency (NIA) team,' she said at an election rally in Dakshin Dinajpur district's Balurghat. 'Will the women sit back if they (NIA) go to their houses at night? They will try to defend themselves?' she asked.

The NIA Saturday arrested two key conspirators in a 2022 blast case amid an attack on the probe agency's team by a crowd in Purba Medinipur district, an official said.

An NIA officer was injured and a vehicle belonging to the probe agency was damaged in the attack, a spokesperson of the federal investigating agency said. Later, the NIA team lodged a complaint at Bhupatinagar po-

lice station, an official said. Alleging a political motive in the NIA action and an attempt to intimidate TMC workers, she questioned why the agency was arresting people days before the polls in a case dating back to December 2022. The Trinamool Congress chief accused the BJP government at the Centre of trying to use the central agencies to win the elections.

agency said "We want the Election Commission to work impartially. not turn into a BJP-run commission," she said. Questioning the transfer of state's police officers by the EC, she asked why ED. CBI and IT officers have not been changed.

"NIA, CBI are brothers of BJP; the ED (Enforcement Directorate) and Income Tax are funding boxes of BJP," Banerjee said. Stating that while the state police looks after law and order throughout the year, central forces like the BSF, CRPF and CISF are brought in during the elections, she added.

"If you (BJP) have the power, win the election by fighting in a democratic manner. Don't arrest my booth-level workers and election agents," she said at the rally. She condemned the arrests of Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Keiriwal and former Jharkhand CM Hemant Soren by central agencies over cases related to excise policy and an alleged land scam, respectively. "There must be a level-playing field in the elec-

tions," she said. The Chief Minister said why should she introduce Ayushman Bharat scheme in Bengal when she is providing healthcare facilities to nine crore people under her pet 'Sasthya Sathi' programme, claiming that the central healthcare scheme will benefit only one crore people with equal share of funding from the state government.

She said several schemes were introduced by her government for various categories of people such as Kanyashree, Sikshasree, agricultural produce insurance, old age pension. Lakshmir Bhandar for women, among others.

Kavitha files plea against CBI quizzing in Tihar

ANTI-INDIA NAXAL CONSPIRACY CASE NIA conducts raids in UP, Bihar

New Delhi, April 6: The National Investigation Agency (NIA) Saturday carried out raids at multiple locations in Uttar Pradesh and Bihar against the CPI (Maoists) in an anti-India

conspiracy case, officials said. The raids were carried out by NIA teams on the premises of accused and suspected persons at 11 locations in the Ballia district of Uttar Pradesh and one location in the Kaimur district of Bihar.

An NIA spokesperson said several digital devices, including mobile phones, SIM cards and memory cards, along with incriminating documents like pamphlets of the proscribed Naxal outfit were seized during the searches.

The NIA had November 10 last year taken over the investigation in the case, relating to the arrest of five persons following

the recovery of arms and ammunition. incriminating documents. literature and books of CPI (Maoist) in Ballia. The agency had chargesheeted four accused in the case February 9, 2024.

According to the NIA's investigation so far, the banned outfit is making active efforts to re-energise its presence in the Northern regional bureau comprising UP, Uttarakhand, Delhi, Punjab, Haryana and Himachal Pradesh.

Leaders, cadres and sympathisers, Over Ground Workers (OGWs) of CPI (Maoist) are trying to revive the organisation's decrepit presence in this region, the spokesperson said. The NIA has been moving aggressively in recent months to steamroll the organisation's nefarious plans and the investigation in the case is continuing, the spokesperson said.

Quito, April 6: Ecuadorean authorities arrested former Vice President Jorge Glas Fridav evening, seizing him from the Mexican embassy and prompting Mexico to suspend bilateral relations.

Glas, convicted twice for corruption, had been holed up in the embassy in Quito since seeking political asylum in December, a request Mexico granted earlier Friday.

Police forcefully entered Mexico's embassy in Quito before making the arrest. Mexican President Andres Manuel Lopez Obrador posted on X.

"Six months have passed and Al-Qassam Brigades is still able to keep up the fight against the Zionist occupation army," said senior Hamas official Sami Abu Zuhri. The war was launched after a Hames-led attack in which more than 250 hostages were seized and some 1,200 people killed, by Israeli tallies, in the worst single day loss of life in Israel's history

More than 250 Israeli soldiers have been killed since the start of the ground invasion, in addition to almost 350 who were killed October 7.

Palestinian casualty figures do not generally distinguish between fighters and civilians and Israel says more than 10,000 fighters have been killed, a figure not confirmed by the militant groups. But more than a third of the dead have been children, according to United Nations figures.

The scale of the casualties has caused mounting global alarm and demands for a halt but for people in Gaza, the wait continues.

'China may use Al

New York, April 6: China is likely to deploy Artificial Intelligence-generated content via social media to sway public opinion to boost its geopolitical interests during elections in countries like India, South Korea and the US, tech giant Microsoft has warned.

Voting for 543 Lok Sabha seats in India will take place between April 19 and June 4, spread across seven phases. South Koreans will go to the polls in a general election on April 10 while the US will hold the Presidential election November 5.

"With major elections taking place around the world this year, particularly in India, South Korea and the United States, we assess that China will, at a minimum, create and amplify AI-generated content to benefit its interests," Clint Watts, General Manager, Microsoft Threat Analysis Center, said in a blog post.

Despite the chances of such content in affecting election results remaining low, China's increasing experimentation in augmenting memes, videos, and audio will likely continue - and may prove more effective down the line, he said. China will do it along with North Korea, he wrote.



Maldives thanks India for allowing export of essential commodities

Male: Maldivian Foreign Minister Moosa Zameer Saturday said India's gesture to renew the quota to allow the export of certain quantities of essential commodities for his nation signifies the longstanding bilateral friendship and the commitment to further expand trade and commerce. India allowed the export of certain quantities of essential commodities for the year 2024-25 at the request of the Maldives government, the Indian High Commission said here Friday. Announcing the move through a post on social media platform X, the Indian High Commissioner said that this was being done "under a unique bilateral mechanism" under which the quotas for each of these items have been revised upwards. "The approved quantities are the highest since this arrangement came into effect in 1981," the notice by the mission said. Zameer took to X to thank India for the move. "I sincerely thank EAM @DrSJaishankar and the Government of #India for the renewal of the guota to enable #Maldives to import essential commodities from India during the years 2024 and 2025," Zameer wrote. The announcement for the renewal of the quota comes amidst a diplomatic row between the two countries since November last year when President Mohamed Muizzu, known for his pro-China leanings. within hours of taking the oath demanded India to repatriate its 88 military personnel from his country.

US raises automatic extension of EAD

Washington: The US has increased the automatic extension period for employment authorisation and EADs available to certain categories of renewal applicants from a maximum of 180 days to up to 540 days, a move that would benefit thousands of technology professionals from India. The move has been welcomed by Indian Americans. A recommendation in this regard was first made by Ajay Bhutoria, advisor to President Joe Biden on the White House Asian American and Native Hawaiian Pacific Islander (AANHPI) Commission.

Alien fever dreams fuel Peruvian grave robbings

Archaeological materials including human remains command high prices on a black market controlled by well-organised criminal groups, experts said

Nazca, April 6: Leandro Rivera says he chanced upon the cave in Peru's remote Nazca region that contained hundreds of pre-Hispanic artifacts - including human bodies with elongated heads and what appeared to be only three fingers on each hand.

The plateau is famous for the Nazca lines, incisions on the desert floor forming birds and other animals visible from the air. The ancient geoglyphs have long intrigued anthropologists and exert a powerful fascination over some believers in extraterrestrials

Nazca is also known for salt flats that dehydrate and preserve human and animal remains, making it the site of important archeological finds that have deepened modern understanding of ancient cultures - and attracted grave robbers.

Rivera was convicted in 2022 of assault on public monuments for unearthing the artifacts. He received a four-year suspended sentence and was fined about 20,000 Peruvian soles (\$5,190), short of the maximum penalty of an eight-year prison term.

His haul was thrust into the spotlight last year when two of the mummies ended up in Mexico as the centerpiece of congressional hearings on UFOs and extraterrestrial life. Mexican iournalist Jaime Maussan presented the bodies as a sign of life beyond Earth – a claim dismissed by scientists.

In an interview with Reuters, Rivera said he removed as many as 200 sets of remains from the cave, and some bodies had been smuggled out of Peru to France,

The presentation of bodies in Mexico-as well as Rivera's claims to have dozens more - have prompted some experts to ask whether Peru is losing the battle to stop the plunder of its archaeological sites to feed a lucrative black market for mummies and other pre-Hispanic artifacts.

"Peru has done a lot of work to try and control this trade, said Christopher Heaney, a Latin

American history professor at Penn State University and author of a book on Peruvian mummies. "But this implies that these claims for government success need to be re-examined a bit if objects like (the bodies in Mexico) can leave the country."

Peru's Culture Ministry did not respond to questions about the effectiveness of its efforts to control trafficking

Reuters was granted rare ac-

cess to the ministry's anti-smuggling unit at Lima's international airport and spoke to four government officials who said stricter penalties, more resources and better coordination were needed to fight the looting.

The news agency was unable to verify independently key details of Rivera's account. The public prosecutor's office of the culture ministry said in a statement to Reuters that its investigation into Rivera yielded just two altered bodies and two partial sets of bones

Evelyn Centurion, head of cultural heritage recovery for the ministry, said the government is working on a task force with police, the attorney general, the foreign ministry and other departments to toughen penalties for looting cultural artifacts.

"The looting has not stopped," Centurion said in an interview. "We need greater collaboration from local governments and -(local authorities to prevent these illicit acts."

Tata Steel posts record output

New Delhi: Tata Steel India recorded its highest annual crude steel production at 20.8 million metric tonne in 2023-24 which represents a 4 per cent increase over the corresponding figure of the previous year, provisional data released by the company shows. In the January-March quarter crude steel production was broadly stable and stood at around 5.38 million tonne. Domestic deliveries grew by 9 per cent year-on-year driven by the higher demand for steel in the country. However, Tata Steel continued to face headwinds in its overseas operations. The company's production in the Netherlands was 4.8 million metric tonne during 2023-24, down 24 per cent compared to the previous year, while production in the UK was 3.02 million metric tonne, which was the same as the previous year, the company said.

New Delhi, April 6: BoB Essential Commodity Index (BoB ECI) has increased at the fastest pace since August 2023 by 5.9 per cent in March 2024, on YoY basis and by 0.4 per cent, on a sequential basis, says Dipanwita Mazumdar, Economist, Bank of Baroda.

On a seasonally adjusted basis. the increase is sharper at 0.8 per cent. Much of this is attributable to the rise in prices of vegetables such as potato and onion. Apart from this, edible oils and pulses have also provided some bit of discomfort on food inflation, the research said.

High-frequency price data showed that vegetable prices, especially potato and onion continue to pose considerable upside risk to food inflation. Potato prices were impacted as production was hampered due to unseasonal rains in December, the research said.

On a year-on-year (YoY) basis, BoB ECI inched up to 5.9 per cent in March 2024, the sharpest pace of increase in the index observed since August 2023. This is higher compared to last month's increase of 4.2 per cent in the index

Nine out of 20 commodities have registered some momentum in prices. Vegetables such as potato and onion prices have

gained considerably. From 5.3 per cent and 28.9 per cent increase respectively seen in February 2024, it inched up to 22 per cent and 40.1 per cent in March 2024 (on YoY basis).

Other items where price buildup was visible were wheat (atta), edible oils such as sunflower oil, sova oil and mustard oil. Some components of pulses such as Gram dal, Masoor and Urad also showed some bit of upward correction, the research said.

On month-on-month (MoM) basis, BoB ECI rose by 0.4 per cent in March 2024 from 0.2 per cent decline seen in February 2024. Notably, on a sequential

WORLD FOOD PRICES RISE FOR FIRST TIME IN 7 MONTHS: FAO

Global food prices rose in March, the first increase since July, pulled higher by Cooking oil prices despite the cost of grains continuing to ease, the UN's Food and Agricultural Organization (FAO) said Friday. The FAO's overall Food Price Index climbed 1.1 percent over the month to stand at 118.3 points in March 2024. On an annual comparison it was 7.7 percent lower. The sub-index for vegetable oils jumped by 8.0 percent over the month to reach one-year high. The FAO said prices for palm. soy, sunflower and rapeseed oils all climbed higher. Rising palm oil prices were driv en by seasonal drops in output in leading producing nations that coincided with strong demand in Southeast Asia, while demand from the biofuel sector pulled up soy oil prices. Dairy prices rose by 2.9 percent in March on a monthly basis, while meat prices climbed 1.7 percent. Meanwhile, cereals prices slid 2.6 percent on a monthly basis, while sugar prices fell 5.4 percent. Food prices reached a record high after Russia invaded agricultural power Ukraine in February 2022 but have dropped since then. Last month's uptick comes as inflation has slowed dramatically in many countries but a recent rebound in global oil prices has sparked concern it may persist at a level that could discourage central banks from cutting interest rates.

Singapore, April 6: The bilateral trade between Singapore and India rose to \$35.6 billion in 2022-23, a growth of 18.2 per cent on the year, a senior diplomat at the Indian High Commission here said Saturday. Singapore is India's eighth largest trade partner (2022-23), with a share of 3.1 per cent of India's overall trade, T Prabakar, the First Secretary (Commerce)

at the high commission said. He was addressing the Institute of Company Secretaries of India (ICSI) Third International Conference being held in Singapore from April 5-6.

Trade between Singapore and India saw a growth of 18.2 per cent in the year and rose to \$35.6 billion in 2022-23, Prabakar said.

"Our imports from Singapore in FY 22-23 were \$23.6 billion, a growth of 24.4 per cent, and exports to the city-state totalled \$12 billion, up 7.6 billion in the previous financial year," he told some 100 delegates at the conference. It is not only in merchandise

adding that FDI (foreign direct investment) equity inflows into India from Singapore during 2022-23 stood at \$17.2 billion.

The cumulative FDI inflows from Singapore to India stood at \$155.612 billion from April 2000 to December 2023, accounting for 23 per cent of the total FDI flows into India, he said.

Giving an overview of India-Singapore relations, Prabakar pointed out that Singapore is also amongst India's largest sources of External Commercial borrowings.

He also highlighted a wide range of strategic cooperation between the two nations in new fields, such as technologies, AI and green energy.

New Delhi, April 6: Hvdroelectric power projects with an aggregate capacity of 15 GW are under construction in the country, which will increase the hydro capacity by more than 50 per cent from 42 GW to 67 GW by 2031-32, the Ministry of Power said Friday.

The Indian Meteorological Department (IMD) has predicted higher rainfall in the current financial year. Further, hydropower projects located in the Himalayan region get base flow from the melting snow and any rise in temperature will increase



the flow from this source, the Ministry said. Moreover, given the ongoing energy transitions in the country, the development of Pumped Storage Projects (PSPs) assumes importance for providing greater inertia and balancing power to the grid.

PSPs are also known as 'the Water Battery', which is an ideal complement to modern clean energy systems.

Currently, PSPs with an aggregate capacity of 2.7 GW are under construction in the county and another 50 GW is under various stages of development. It is

The billionaire boss of the electric car maker did not provide details, saying only in his post on X that the "Tesla Robotaxi unveil" will come August 8.

Tesla shares rose more than three percent in after-market trades following the post, after finishing the day down. Musk has long boasted of work Tesla is doing on its systems for electric cars to drive themselves.

Tesla models with FSD (Full Self-Driving) "will be superhuman to such a degree that it will seem strange in the future that humans drove cars, even while exhausted and drunk!" he said in a post on X in March.

Musk has also said that owners of Tesla vehicles with FSD will be able to have their cars serve as robotaxis, rather than remain idly parked.

Despite its potential, rollout of self-driving vehicles in the United States has been tentative and rocky so far as both regulators and the public voice safety concerns.

San Francisco has been a testing ground for the technology.

Robotaxis from Google's Waymo in the city have been targeted by vandals opposed to autonomous vehicles, while GMowned Cruise indefinitely suspended its robotaxi service at the end of October after several accidents sparked a crackdown by California regulators.

Tesla's "autopilot" feature has also come under scrutiny, facing accusations the marketing of the feature oversold its actual capabilities.

Tesla's robotaxi reveal came on the heels of a Reuters report that the company had abandoned Musk's long-touted plan to manufacture an electric car model selling close to \$25,000 to drive adoption in the mass market.

Tesla this week reported sharply lower first-quarter auto sales amid an underwhelming demand outlook for electric vehicles, while legacy players including Toyota rode improved US inventories to higher sales.

Musk's auto giant reported global deliveries fell 8.5 percent in the quarter, reflecting in part a weak sales market in China, where it faces heavy competi-tion from local electric vehicle makers.

ple. Mohammedan Sporting needed one point to secure their maiden I-League title. But it was never going to be a walk in the park.








