

2 Maoists gunned down in Boudh

Bhubaneswar: At least two Maoists were killed early Thursday in a gun battle between Red rebels and security forces in Boudh district, police said. The exchange of fire between Maoists and personnel of state's Special Operation Group (SOG) took place in Parhel reserve forest under the Kantamal police limits, Additional DG (Operation) Dev Datta Singh said. "Bodies of two Maoists along with arms, grenades and other articles were recovered from the operation site," Singh said, adding that the operation was on till Thursday morning.

1,202 in fray in phase 2 of LS elections today

New Delhi: As many as 1,202 candidates, including prominent faces such as Rahul Gandhi, Om Birla and Hema Malini, will try their electoral luck in the second phase of the Lok Sabha elections Friday. Polling is scheduled from 7am in 88 constituencies across 13 states and Union Territories in the phase. The remaining five phases of the polls will continue till June 1, with counting of votes scheduled June 4. More than 16 lakh polling officials have been deployed across 1.67 lakh polling stations for over 15.88 crore voters, the Election Commission (EC) said. Voters include 8.08 crore male, 7.8 crore female and 5,929 third gender electors.

New Delhi, April 25: Taking cognisance for the first time of a model code violation complaint against a prime minister, the Election Commission (EC) Thursday issued a notice to BJP president JP Nadda on Opposition charge that Prime Minister Narendra Modi gave a divisive speech in Rajasthan's Banswara. Separately, the election watch-

dog also issued a notice to Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge, asking him to respond to the complaints filed by the BJP against him and the main Opposition party's senior leader Rahul Gandhi regarding their remarks.

In the notice sent to Nadda, the EC sought his response by Monday to the complaints filed by the Congress, CPI, CPI (ML) and civil society groups re-

garding the remarks made by Modi April 21 in Banswara. These complaints had referred

to Modi's allegations that the Congress wanted to redistribute the wealth of the people to Muslims and that the Opposition party won't even spare the 'mangalsutra' of women.

The speech led to a major political slugfest with the Congress and other Opposition parties accusing the PM of making false claims and the BJP alleging that the Congress was nursing an agenda of Muslim appeasement at the cost of weaker sections of the society.

The EC also asked Nadda to bring to the notice of all star campaigners of the party to 'set high standards of political discourse and observe provisions of model code of conduct in letter and spirit'.

The poll panel also said that campaign speeches made by those holding high positions have more serious consequences. Officials said it is the first time that the panel has taken cognisance of a complaint against any PM.

In the 2019 Lok Sabha polls, the EC had given a clean chit to Modi on complaints lodged by the Opposition parties. Then election commissioner, Ashok Lavasa, gave a dissent note on some of the decisions taken by the EC on complaints against the PM.

With this, the EC has ensured an 'added layer' of responsibility on party heads, the functionaries explained.

Recently, Kharge was asked to explain remarks made by two of his party leaders against women. The poll authority issued a similarly-worded notice separately to the Congress president with regard to allegations levelled by the BJP against him and Gandhi

The BJP, on the other hand, had written to the EC that Gandhi levelled malafide and utterly sinister allegations against Modi during a speech in Kottavam. Kerala where he alleged that the prime minister was pushing for one nation, one language, one religion.

The EC notices to the two party presidents did not directly name either Modi, Gandhi or Kharge, but the representations received by it were attached to the respective letters and they contained details of allegations against the three leaders

He said Arun had lodged a police complaint over the issue. However, instead of acting on it, the police hushed it up through mutual agreement between both parties. Subsequently, the differences cropped up again and Arun, along with his mother,

Meanwhile, tension erupted in the village following Arun's death.

Irate villagers refused entry of the police to Arun's house for over six hours. Later, the villagers were pacified after police registered a murder case (110/24) and detained two of the neighbours for questioning. The body was

sent for post-mortem.

Jhumpura police inspector in-charge (IIC) Sambhari Hansdah said the investigation started following the receipt of complaint. While denying any lapses on part of the police to act on Arun's earlier complaint against the neighbours, the IIC said matter was resolved following mutual understanding.

"When we received another complaint, we lodged a case under Section 107 and carried out necessary investigation,' Hansdah said.

India sieves online deluge to stamp out disinfo amid polls Now, get SC case info on WhatsApp

Bangalore/Lucknow, April 25: Indian Forest Service officer Surya Sen usually manages a city zoo, but during the world's largest general elections, he has a very different task-rooting out online disinformation in order to prevent any disturbances.

As nearly a billion voters head to the polls in a mammoth sixweek programme that began April 19, officials like Sen counter rapidly spreading online misinformation/disinformation from election cells that also monitor television and public camera images

"Social media is the primary



ground for misinformation/ disinformation," said Sen, whose team monitors social media from an office in India's Silicon Valley city of Bangalore that goes to the polls Friday.

Sen works with an external

agency, where 30 people use keyword tracking software and monitor high-profile influencers round the clock. His operation is one of hundreds of such cells nationwide that co-ordinate with the Election Commission of India (ECI). At the same time, Sen's inhouse team of 40 sifts online posts by political parties to detect everything from hate speech to fake news that violates polling rules. It is a high-stakes job.

In a statement, the ECI said its officials across the country had received 'instructions to be proactive in scotching fake news on social media'.

Sen showed Reuters his messaging app WhatsApp, which buzzed constantly with alerts from the external agency flagging content that could disrupt public order or violate election rules, such as use of hate speech.

They were among results thrown up by online searches for terms such as 'Modi' and 'democracy'

Sen did not identify the external agency, which also tracks posts from a private list of social media influencers with numerous followers, giving them an increasingly louder voice in shaping the public narrative in India.

"We cannot do this job ourselves," Sen said, explaining why the work had to be outsourced. "We do not have the expertise and resources ... (It) is a very, very difficult job," he said.

Suspect posts are flagged to senior election officials for further action, such as directives to Facebook or X to remove content or legal action against the posters. Sen added that 36 such cases have so far been registered in Karnataka.

Since the last general elections in 2019, the number of internet users in the country has swelled 43 per cent to about 820 million, fed by growing use of smartphones and Facebook, WhatsApp and X.

In a similar office in northern Uttar Pradesh, country's most populous state with 240 million people, Reuters encountered just two people working on laptops amid rusting metal racks, tracking online posts by repeatedly refreshing pages.

NEW DELHI: In a significant step towards digitisation, Chief Justice DY Chandrachud Thursday announced that the Supreme Court will share information relating to cause lists and filing and listing of cases to advocates through WhatsApp messages, saying it will have a 'big-bang impact' and will go a long way in saving paper and the Earth. The announcement on integration of WhatsApp with its ICT services was made by the CJI before a nine-judge bench headed by him commenced the hearing on the vexed legal question arising from the petitions about whether private properties can be considered 'material resources of the community' under Article 39(b)

of the Constitution.

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) Thursday warned of heatwave to severe heatwave conditions in parts of West Bengal, Odisha, Bihar, Jharkhand, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Karnataka and Uttar Pradesh during the next five davs.

It has issued a red warning for West Bengal and Odisha and an orange alert for Bihar and parts of Karnataka.

The Met office said high hu-



midity could add to people's inconvenience in Tripura, Kerala, coastal Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry, Assam, Meghalaya and Goa.

Voters in 88 Lok Sabha constituencies in 13 states and Union Territories will exercise their



Thursday said due to prevailing northwesterly to westerly dry air and high solar insolation day temperature is very likely to be 40°C or above at many places over the districts of coastal Odisha. It also said that there will be further rise of temperature by 2-3°C in the next two days and no large change thereafter at many places over the districts of Odisha. IMD warned heatwave to severe heatwave conditions very likely to prevail in Gaiapati and Ganjam districts during the next 24 hours. Heatwave condition is very likely to prevail in Jharsuguda, Sundargarh, Mayurbhanj, Balasore, Bhadrak, Jajpur, Kendrapara, Jagatsinghpur, Angul, Nayagarh, Bolangir, Boudh, Nuapada , Kandhamal, Khurda, Cuttack and Dhenkanal districts during the next 24 hours., it said. The weather office said though the present heat is tolerable for general public but it can cause slight health concerns for vulnerable people such as infants, elderly, pregnant women and sick people. The IMD has appealed people to take precautionary measures while going outside during peak hours (11am to 3pm) as the heat may cause heat cramp and heat rash.

Increasing nighttime heat is more common in cities because of the urban heat island effect, in which metro areas are significantly hotter than their surroundings.

The threshold for a heat wave is met when the maximum temperature of a weather station reaches at least 40 degrees Celsius in the plains, 37 degrees in the coastal areas, and 30 degrees in the hilly regions, and the departure from normal is at least 4.5 notches.

Bhubaneswar; April 25: The ruling BJD has readied two specially-designed buses for Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik to tour the state during the campaign trail, party leaders said Thursday.

Patnaik, who kicked off the party's campaign from his home turf Hinjili in Ganjam district Wednesday, is slated to address 36 rallies across the 21 Lok Sabha constituencies in the state amid the ongoing heatwave conditions, they said.

Odisha will vote for its 147 member Assembly along with 21 Lok Sabha seats in four phases, starting May 13.

The air-conditioned buses, which cost around Rs 1 crore each, have hydraulic lift, bed, sofa set audio-visual system washroom, conference hall and VSAT facility for communication

"During roadshows, with the help of the hydraulic lift, Patnaik can get out of the sunroof and address the people," a party leader said.

Along with BJD's election symbol 'conch' and photo of the chief minister, the customised vehicles display the photos of former CM Biju Patnaik, and party leaders Kartik Pandian and Pranab Prakash Das prominently.

BJD had made similar arrangements during the 2019 elections as well.

New Delhi, April 25: The Supreme Court is scheduled to pronounce its verdict Friday on a batch of pleas seeking complete cross-verification of votes cast using EVMs with Voter Verifiable Paper Audit Trail, or **VVPAT**

A bench of Justices Sanjiv Khanna and Dipankar Datta is likely to pronounce the verdict.

The top court had on Wednesday said it cannot 'control the elections' or issue directions simply because doubts have been raised about the efficacy of Electronic Voting Machines (EVM), as it reserved its judgement on the clutch of petitions, which also claimed the polling devices can be tinkered with to manipulate the results.

The court said it cannot change the thought process of those doubting the advantages of

The petitioners have sought the court's direction to revert to the old system of ballot papers

polling machines and advocating going back to ballot papers. The bench also took note of the

answers to queries it posed to the Election Commission. It sought answers from an official of the poll panel to five questions related to the func-

tioning of EVMs, including whether the microcontrollers fitted in them are reprogrammable.

After a two-day hearing, the bench had April 18 reserved its verdict on the pleas. However, the matter was listed again Wednesday as the court wanted some clarifications from the EC.

NGO 'Association for Democratic Reforms', one of the petitioners, has sought reversal of the poll panel's 2017 decision to replace the transparent glass on VVPAT machines with an opaque glass through which a voter can see the slip only when the light is on for seven seconds.

The petitioners have also sought the court's direction to revert to the old system of ballot papers.

The seven-phase Lok Sabha polls began April 19 and will conclude with the announcement of results June 4

Oldest evidence of Earth's magnetic field in Greenland rocks

RESEARCHERS SAID THE EARTH'S MAGNETIC FIELD IS POWERED BY ITS MOLTEN IRON CORE, SLOWLY CHURNING UP ELECTRIC CURRENTS IN A SELF-GENERATING 'DYNAMO', AND EXTENDING OUT AND AROUND THE PLANET LIKE A 'PROTECTIVE BUBBLE'

New Delhi, April 25: Rocks uncovered from Greenland have been found to bear the 'oldest evidence of Earth's magnetic field.' according to new research.

Scientists found these rocks to be about 3.7 billion years old, and the strength of the magnetic field to be at least 15 microtesla. This was comparable to the strength of Earth's magnetic field today, they said.

'The fact that it's similar in strength as today's field implies whatever is driving Earth's magnetic field has not changed massively in power over billions of years," said Claire Nichols, a

former postdoctoral researcher at Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), US, and co-author of the study published in the Journal of Geophysical Research.

The team explained that iron particles in these rocks effectively act as 'tiny magnets' that can detect and record the Earth's magnetic field. The rocks were uncovered from the Isua Supracrustal Belt in Greenland. Previously estimated to be at least 3.5 billion years old, the lifetime of the planet's magnetic field may now extend by another 200 million years, according to

the study. 'That's important because that's the time when we think life



was emerging," said co-lead author Benjamin Weiss, a professor of planetary sciences, MIT.

The team described their estimate as a 'more accurate and reliable assessment than previ-

ous studies which used individual crystals.'

"If the Earth's magnetic field was around a few hundred million years earlier, it could have played a critical role in making the planet habitable," said Weiss.

"The magnetic field is, in theory, one of the reasons we think Earth is really unique as a hab-itable planet," said Nichols.

"It's thought our magnetic field protects us from harmful radiation from space and also helps us to have oceans and atmospheres that can be stable for long periods of time."

The findings may shed light on the planet's early conditions that helped life take hold, the researchers said.

The Earth's magnetic field is powered by its molten iron core, slowly churning up electric currents in a self-generating 'dynamo', and extending out and around the planet like a 'protective bubble', the team explained.

While today, the field is powered in this manner, it's thought that the inner core had not yet formed so early in the planet's evolution.

Therefore, the researchers said, the results also raise questions about how the ancient +Earth could have powered such a robust magnetic field.

Vacate medicine stores from campuses: Govt

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In a letter, H&FW Commissioner-cum-Secretary Shalini Pandit said, "Certain campus medicine stores had approached the Orissa High Court assailing the communication of this department dated 27.02.2015, wherein it was directed that no extension of licence of on-campus medical stores is to be permitted, and further, no new campus medical store is to be opened. Despite expiry of their licence agreements, these campus medicine stores had been running their businesses in pursuant to interim orders passed by the High Court."

H&FW dept asks hospital authorities to

issue 'vacation notices' to campus medicine shops affording a time period of 15 days for vacating the premises

Pandit also said, "The High Court after adjudicating the matters has, vide final order and judgement dated 19.04.2024, dismissed all the aforementioned writ petitions. The court has further been pleased to vacate all interim orders passed on the matters.

"In light of the aforesaid development, you are hereby directed to immediately issue 'vacation notices' to campus medicine shops affording therein a time period of 15 days for va-

cating the premises. All pending dues as per the last executed licence agreements have also to be recovered. You are further directed to take all possible steps in accordance with law to recover possession of the premises immediately after expiry of the 15 days period," she said. The department also sought a

compliance report with regard to issuance of notices to campus medicine stores within two working days without fail. Earlier, the HC had upheld

the decision of the state government not to extend the licences of medicine stores set up on the premises of government medical college and hospitals.

Delivering its order on a petition challenging the move of the Health department, the court upheld the decision of non-renewal of licences of oncampus medicine stores at government medical college and hospitals as well as district headquarters hospitals, sub-divisional hospitals and community health centres.

Proprietors and owners of on-campus medicine stores had challenged the order of the department prohibiting extension of licences of any on-campus medicine stores citing that the state government had started providing free medicines to patients under its 'Niramaya Scheme'.

The HC in its ruling observed that free medicinal care policy of the state marks a monumental step forward in prioritising public health and welfare.

Huge potholes, craters and uneven roads are now the order of the day for all the commuters who use NH-26. After rainfall, these potholes turn into death traps once they are filled with water and slush. It becomes difficult for commuters to identify the potholes and craters leading to accidents. In the last two years, road fatalities and injuries have increased substantially on NH-26.

Sources informed that a large number of residents living in the vicinity of the project have refused to give up their lands as they have not been offered proper compensation. Many business establishments have also refused to vacate government land, sources added. As a result, the company entrusted with the construction of the road is sitting idle. Even though some of the trees that were a hindrance to the project have been cut off, many still remain, the sources pointed out.

Residents of Bargarh. Subarnapur and Bolangir districts meanwhile said that it is high time that officials step in to expedite the project. They pointed out that they are suffering due to the apathetic attitude shown by them. Some of the commuters added that NHAI authorities should step in for completion of the project or people will continue to suffer in future also.

The West's Decline

Since Russia launched its full-scale invasion of Ukraine more than two years ago, the West has desperately sought ways to punish Russia without harming itself in the process. It has mostly failed.

So far, not even unprecedented sanctions have derailed Russia's economy, let alone compelled the Kremlin to change its behaviour. Instead, Russia has pivoted to a war economy: it now produces nearly three times as many munitions as NATO, including more missiles than it was producing before the war began.

Much of the West, by contrast, is facing economic stagnation, owing not least to the switch away from cheap Russian energy to costlier supplies from elsewhere. The United Kingdom is officially in recession, and there has been no growth in the eurozone since the third quarter of 2022, when gas prices surged, leading the European Central Bank to start raising interest rates to stem runaway inflation. Higher fuel prices have helped turn former economic powerhouse Germany into the worst-performing developed economy.

European growth is not the only casualty of Western sanctions against Russia. The US dollar – which was already facing "stealth erosion" before the Ukraine war – appears to have lost some of its global influence, even in cil markets, ac ecup

influence, even in oil markets, as countries pursue alternatives to the greenback in response to the West's decision to weaponize finance. Meanwhile, rising gold purchases by central banks in China, Turkey, India, Kazakhstan, and Eastern Europe, coupled with greater geopolitical uncertainty, have helped drive prices to a record high.

The European Commission's move to seize the profits generated by frozen Russian central-bank assets would reinforce these trends. Given the centrality of central banks in the global financial system, their assets have historically been considered sacrosanct. But Russia's assets – over twothirds of which are held by the Brusselsbased clearing house Euroclear – were frozen unilaterally by Western governments, without authorisation from the International Court of Justice or the United Nations Security Council, as required by international law.

Now, with "Ukraine fatigue" weakening Western support for continued military and financial aid, the European Commission wants to start tapping the ≤ 3.25 billion (≤ 3.45 billion) in annual accrued interest on the frozen assets. Under its current proposal, most of the revenues would be channeled through the European Peace Facility, which refunds EU states for sending arms to Ukraine, with the rest going to the EU's central budget, to be used to strengthen Ukraine's weapons-manufacturing capacity.

But such a move would be unlikely to help turn the tide in the Ukraine war. What Ukraine really needs more than weapons and funds are new recruits to replenish the ranks of its exhausted and depleted forces. Here, its options are limited: not even draconian conscription practices have been able to offset the growing troop shortfall.

What seizing Russia's earnings would do is set a dangerous precedent in international law and deal a blow to Europe's credibility as a _champion of a rules-based world order; the Commission's proposed "legal pathway" amounts to lawfare, pure and simple. It would also signal to other countries that their money is not safe in the West, thereby strengthening further their incentive to seek alternatives to Western institutions and currencies. If this trend continues, the West's financial-sanctions arsenal will be weakened considerably. Already, the West's routine use of sanctions is reducing their impact.

Indian elections are seldom influenced by international issues or reactions. But this time around, there is quite a bit of engagement with Western media and international institutions especially by External Affairs Minister (EAM) S. Jaishankar. The EAM, coming from the Upper House, is not fighting the current elections but is stoutly defending India's electoral process and its enduring democracy.

He is doing it with a twinstrategy, one is to fulfil his mandate as the Foreign Minister, and second is to prevent the Opposition from taking electoral advantage of the reactions from overseas. The silver lining in such debates on democracy is perhaps that India is taken more seriously than before by world powers. Let us note that there are three international agencies which occasionally assess democracies across the world and rank countries in terms of their performance. One is the Economic Intelligence Unit. It ranks democracies into three categories - fair, flawed and hybrid. India has been put as a flawed democracy.

The second agency is V-Dem (Varieties of Democracy) located in Gothenburg, Sweden which had called India, "An electoral autocracy." The third one is Freedom House, a non-profit organisation based in Washington DC which assesses maintenance of civil rights and liberties. It had ranked India 'low' in terms of upholding various freedoms.

India's ruling regime had reacted strongly to these observations. Now the EAM is engaging with these agencies and others on India's democracy. In particular, he is extensively talking about the remarks made by spokesperson, Stephane Dujarric, for the UN Secretary General, "What we very much hope that in India, as in any country that is having elections that everyone's rights are protected, including political and civil rights, and everyone is able to vote in an atmosphere that is free and fair."

Jaishankar strongly responded to these remarks, "I do not need

the United Nations to tell me our elections should be free and fair. I have the people of India. The people of India will ensure that elections are free and fair. So, don't worry about it."Jaishankar was campaigning for his ministerial colleague and BJP candidate Rajeev Chandrashekhar in Thiruvananthapuram.

Addressing a forum of nationalist thinkers, Jaishankar tore into Western media, saying, "I get a lot of these noises from the Western press. If they criticise our democracy, it is not because they lack information. It is because they think they are also political players in our elections." Admittedly there are differ

Admittedly, there are different versions and standards of democracies across the world. One can list the major ones – representative democracy, people's democracy, socialist democracy, guided democracy, basic democ racy and direct democracy (this is no longer in practice). Therefore, the parameters of democracy for each country may vary. So, it is easy to criticise one democracy by the other. One may also disagree with the variables that constitute an evaluation matrix used by above-said agencies. The buzz is that India might come up with its own evaluation criteria for democracies in the Global South.

At any rate, let us engage with at least seven points Jaishankar makes in reference to the remarks on Indian democracy. One, he says these are on our domestic politics which is going global. The global politics feels they must now interfere in our electoral process. They think they ought to know who rules India. It is an open secret that the world powers try to influence the government formation in other countries. The gossip is that rich countries in the Middle-East finance those who seek to destabilise democracies. Jaishankar's com-

plaint is not misplaced. Second, "the West actually thinks they are part of our electorate. I think it is time today that we disabuse them and the best way to do that is by our selfconfidence." This seems to be an overreaction. The West has a condescending attitude towards Global South. But their comments on our democracy need not be overplayed.

Third, "we need to stand up to these kinds of attacks and criticisms, and rankings and reports because they will question everything." This is a display of cynicism. We cannot dismiss all rankings and reports. We need to be sensitive to them and use them as self-introspection. Fourth, "they will question

our election system, our EVM, our Election Commission even the weather." No international agency has commented on any of these so far. It is the Opposition parties which are raising these doubts and ques-

tions. The main agency ECI is responsible for our elections including the use of EVM. Only they can clear these doubts and answer these questions.

Fifth, "one complaint is The BJP is so unfair, the BJP thinks it is going to win very big." One can sympathise with EAM's angst on this. It could be politics of envy. At the same time, it could also be considered as politics of arrogance as BJP initially claimed to cross 400 MPs in Lok Sabha.

Sixth, the EAM said the decisions, this government will be making are not just for the five years, and will give India, its society, and the coming generations a very big vote of confidence. This is a statesman-like statement. The saying goes that a politician looks at next election whereas a statesman looks at the next generation.

Seventh, "it is the guarantee. The guarantee is an expression of confidence. It is an expression of confidence based on what we have delivered for the last ten years." This is the politician Jaishankar speaking. Although, he is not a career politician, he has picked up some of the political lingua in the last ten years.

Coming back to the international criticism on our democracy and Jaishankar's allegation of Western press and powers wanting to influence our elections, it is not new. It has been happening one way or the other since elections began in India. Instead of being defensive, we should deepen our democracy to silence the critics.

Any remark on democracy in any country is a matter of international concern. The corollary to democracy is solidarity within the country and across the world, of course while isolating the vested interests. India stands out in Asia for sustaining its democracy. Indians have proved time and again that they will not compromise on their democracy and diversity.

The impact of migration on elections

Not only do Western sanctions fail to change the behaviour of the government being targeted, whether Russia, Iran, Myanmar, or Syria; they also almost invariably advance China's commercial and strategic interests. In fact, no country is profiting more from Russia's invasion of Ukraine – and the West's response to it – than China.

Beyond expanding the international use of the renminbi, Western sanctions against Russia created an opportunity for China to secure greater cheap supplies of Russian oil, gas, and grains. Transported along secure overland routes, these supplies would likely continue being delivered even in the event of a war with the West, easing a major source of anxiety for China over its designs on Taiwan.

Moreover, China has more than doubled its nuclear-weapons arsenal since 2020, and it is expanding its conventional forces faster than any other country has since World War II. Yet the West is so fixated on punishing Russia that China has managed to avoid much scrutiny, let alone pushback. US President Joe Biden, for example, is now attempting to "manage competition" with China by laying greater stress on diplomacy than on deterrence, with his latest budget woefully underfunding key enabling capabilities for the Indo-Pacific and even slashing the production target for Virginiaclass submarines from two per year to just one. Small wonder that China is quietly oiling the Kremlin's war machine. For China, the longer the West stays distracted, the better.

Make no mistake: China poses a far greater threat to Western interests and the rules-based world order than Russia. Whereas Russia's designs are largely confined to its neighbourhood, China has the ambition to supplant the US as the preeminent global power. It may well also have the means: China's population and economy are about ten times larger than Russia's, and China spends some four times as much as Russia on its military.

The West, which accounts for just 12% of the global population, should not underestimate the potential consequences of simultaneously enabling China's increasingly aggressive rise and alienating the rest of the world. Unless it abandons its strategic overreach vis-à-vis Russia and turns its attention to its real rival, China, the West is likely to lose its global supremacy, including its hold on the international financial architecture.

THE DEVELOPMENT DIVIDE IN INDIA IS MANIFEST IN THE STORIES OF ITS MIGRANT LABOURERS The voting percentage on 19 April, the first day of polling for the general and state elections underway, has shown some interesting numbers. Whilst the national average was over 60%, there were outliers. Bihar with 48% and Uttarakhand with 53% at the lower end, and North Bengal with more than 82% at the higher end. In these numbers, lies the story of migrant labour, those who moved temporarily and those who be-

came domiciled. Whilst UP (mainly from Central and Eastern UP) and Bihar contribute the maximum number of migrant labourers to the rest of the country, the story of the migrant labourers in North Bengal, is different. They are mainly tribals from the Santhal regions of Eastern India, now in Chhattisgarh. Odisha and Jharkhand, who were employed over a hundred years ago, mainly in the tea industry. They now constitute a distinct voting constituency. Intriguingly, all these regions were part of British Bengal, prior to its first Partition in 1905,

and had a long history of outbound migration, including the nefarious indentured labour system during the British era. Migration for work, therefore is not a new phenomenon in these areas, it's almost a tradition.

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Overtime, migrants become settlers. Signs of which are already visible, where long term migrants from different parts of India, irrespective of socio-economic class, have become domiciled and have voter rights. Old metros like Delhi and Mumbai have had that for years, as have new metros like Bangalore where software programmers from all over India, and paan walas from UP, who dominate the trade, now have 'domicile' voting rights.

There are two important aspects of migration, 'out' migration (from where people leave) and 'in' migration (where people go). In India, these categories have a clear trend, which was startlingly apparent, during the COVID lockdown. When hundreds of millions, walked, cycled, and somehow travelled braving all sorts of challenges including police lathis or being

deluged with chlorine sprays to 'disinfect' them, to get back home. 'Out' migration is mainly from

the eastern parts from Central UP, to the North East, and 'in' to the North, South, and West, including millions who move temporarily for agriculture operations, as well as the now ubiquitous construction industry. The Eastern parts particularly Odisha, Bengal, Assam and the North Eastern states are the more recent and significant contributors, as mobility within the country improved. They work mainly in lower skilled jobs, and the informal sector, or labour intensive industries like textiles. with the Coimbatore region of Tamil Nadu and Surat in Gujarat being major centres. Kerala and TN also see an out migration. predominantly overseas, to the Middle East.

The main reason for migration, of course, is the vast difference not only in jobs being created, but also wages for the same work in the 'in' regions vs the 'out'.

n- Whilst there is no exact numg ber of migrant labour on record, current estimates are in excess of 400 million. With no census records available after 2011, the Periodic Labour Force Survey (PLFS) done during July 2020 to June 2021, the latest official data, shows the average migrant figure for India as over 25%.

The cost of travel, time taken, and importantly, loss of income, to move from the distant 'in' regions to the 'out', will adversely impact the ability of these large number of migrant workers to return in time to vote. It is therefore likely that trends of 19 April could be repeated in the next phases in the states and constituencies that are major suppliers of migrant labour. A 25% of a voting base migrating is not a small number. This could impact the results of the ongoing elections.

The development divide in India is manifest in the stories of its migrant labourers. Sadly, many may not be able to participate in their most basic and important right, the right to vote.

Jammu, April 25: The Jammu parliamentary constituency is all set to go to polls in the second phase of the Lok Sabha elections amid tight security arrange ments Friday Over 17.81 lakh eligible voters are set to exer cise their franchise across 2,416 polling stations to decide the fate of 22 candidates.

The Jammu Lok Sabha seat is one of the 89 constituencies in 13 states and Union territories across the country going to polls Friday. The campaigning for the elections to the Jammu Lok Sabha seat concluded peacefully on Wednesday evening.

"The preparations are underway and tomorrow (Friday) is the election date. The teams have been dispatched and will reach the polling stations in Jammu by evening," said Sachin Kumar Vaishya, the returning officer for Jammu Lok Sabha constituency.

The officials said that all arrangements have been put in place for an incident free polls.

"Security and other related arrangements are in place to ensure free, fair and peaceful voting. A contingency plan has been also worked out to ensure no disruption in polling along the borders." Jammu and Kashmir Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) Pandurang K Pole said.

He expressed hope that polling would remain peaceful. Pole said that no untoward incident was reported during the campaigning, which ended Wednesday evening. He added that necessarv action has been taken against violators of the Model Code of Conduct (MCC), with

New Delhi, April 25: The National Commission for Backward Classes (NCBC) would be summoning the Karnataka chief secretary over the "blanket reservation" given to the Muslim community in the state, chairperson Hansraj Ahir said Thursday.

The NCBC has criticised the Karnataka government's decision to categorise the entire Muslim community as a backward caste for reservation purposes saying such blanket categorisation undermines the principles of social justice.

"All castes/communities of Muslim religion in Karnataka are considered socially and educationally backward classes of citizens and are categorised as Muslim Caste separately under Category-IIB in the State List of Backward Classes," NCBC chairperson Ahir said.

"This classification enables them to receive reservation in educational institution admissions and in appointments to posts and vacancies in the services of the State, as per Articles 15(4) and 16(4) of the Constitution of India," he said.

The NCBC has emphasised that while there are indeed underprivileged and historically

Bangalore, April 25: Karnataka State Natural Disaster Monitoring Centre (KSNDMC) has issued a series of animated shorts in Kannada advising people of appropriate measures to take during extreme temperatures to keep oneself safe.

"Karnataka has not seen such extreme temperatures and heat waves in the recent past. So, we wanted to ensure a wider reach for safety measures, therefore we decided to issue them in a reader-friendly format," said an official from KSNDMC.

Meteorological Centre Bangalore and Indian Meteorological Department had issued a five-day heat wave orange alert for parts of Karnataka, lasting till April 29.

"In places like Bagalkote, Vijayapura, Kalaburgi, Yadgir, Raichur, Koppal, Ballari, Tumkur, Mandya, Gadag, Davangere and Chitradurga, the temperature is likely to touch 40 degrees Celsius tomorrow," said C P Patil, director of the centre.

On April 25, these places recorded a maximum temperature of 39 degrees Celsius.

Orange alert would mean increased likelihood of heat illness symptoms in people who are exposed to sun for a pro-

"The Income Tax department is being used to target only Congress party people, they haven't got money from anyone. Income Tax people are threatening everyone to say that money belongs to Shivakumar, Congress money," Shivakumar said.

BJD on back foot as two top leaders quit

Sambalpur, April 25: The ruling BJD is caught on the wrong foot following the resignation of former MLA Raseswari Panigrahi from the party which delivered a big blow to the party at the time of elections, sources said.

The development comes at a time when BJP is strengthening its position in Sambalpur Lok Sabha segment under the leadership of Union Education Minister and the saffron party candidate for the seat Dharmendra Pradhan while BJD is apparently struggling to retain its position.

Sources said Panigrahi won 2014 election by a margin of 10,000 votes while she lost to BJP by over 4,380 votes in 2019 polls. However, she still carries an image of the most powerful leader of BJD in the district.

Her strong organisational skill and personal connect with the



most powerful leader late Naba Kishore Das also grew in politics under the patronage and shadow of her family.

The ruling party not giving the ticket to Panigrahi has not only eroded BJD's control on Sambalpur Assembly constituency but has also raised questions on the party's much hyped slogan 'Maa ku Samman' (respect to women).

Along with Panigrahi, another BJD leader and former Athamallik MLA Ramesh Sai has joined BJP after resigning from the party citing misbehaviour with him. Sai is also a leader from dominant Gond community in Athamallik Assembly seat under Samablpur Lok Sabha segment.

The resignation of the two most prominent tribal leaders of the party has raised questions on the party's tribal policy. As a result, BJD's base has not only weakened among the tribals but also raised questions on BJD's

strategy and its political future. Dharmendra's connect at ground level and political skills have boosted his popularity among the people in Sambalpur. Moreover, his pitch for 'Modi ki guarantee' and 'son of the soil slogans has strengthened his position in the Lok Sabha segment.

The resignation of important political leaders will directly impact Pranab Das. The Modi wave in Sambalpur had posed a stiff challenge to Das. However, going by the present situation he has been caught in a whirlpool before he could make a mark for him in Lok Sabha segment.

It is alleged that BJD organisation has crumbled like a pack of cards in front Pradhan's political skill and rising popularity. Moreover, Pradhan's strong political management has halted the BJD election campaign halfway. Going by the present situation, Pradhan's victory appears to be certain while it will be a herculean task for the BJD to retain Assembly seats under the Lok Sabha segment which it had won in the 2019 elections.

2024 Lok Sabha polls pegged as costliest ever: Expert

Kolkata, April 25: The 2024 Lok Sabha elections are on track to break past records and become the most expensive electoral event in the world, according to a poll expert.

The estimated expenditure is expected to reach a staggering ₹1.35 lakh crore, more than double the ₹60,000 crore spent in 2019, claimed N Bhaskara Rao. who chairs the Centre for Media Studies (CMS), a not-for-profit organisation, and has been tracking election spending for 35 years.

Rao stated that this comprehensive expenditure encompasses all spending, direct or indirect, related to polls, including that by political parties and organisations, candidates, the government, and the Election Commission

With the BJP vying for a third consecutive term under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership, industry observers have noted the party's dominant presence in campaigns, irrespective of the mediums used for publicity.

In an interview with PTI, Rao said he revised the initial expenditure estimate from ₹1.2 lakh crore to ₹1.35 lakh crore. factoring in electoral bond disclosures and accounting for all

election-related expenses.

"Initially, we estimated the expenditure at ₹1.2 lakh crore. However, post the electoral bond stake disclosures, we've revised the figure to ₹1.35 lakh crore," he said, adding that this estimate covered spending that took place 3-4 months before voting dates were announced.

Rao emphasised that money flowed into the process through various means beyond electoral bonds.

Recent observations by the Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR) revealed a "significant lack of transparency" in political funding in India.

From 2004-05 to 2022-23, approximately 60 per cent of contributions to the nation's six major political parties, totalling ₹19.083 crore, came from undisclosed sources, including funds from electoral bonds, it claimed.

The ADR has, however, refrained from providing any cumulative expenditure projections for the ensuing Lok Sabha elections.

"Pre-election activities are integral to campaign spending by parties and candidates, covering political rallies, transportation, hiring of workers including field and influencers and even the controversial horsetrading of political leaders,"



Rao said

The Election Commission's budget to manage the polls is expected to be 10-15 per cent of the total expenditure projection, he added

With a voter base of 96.6 crore, per-voter spending is estimated at around ₹1,400. This surpasses the expenditure of the 2020 US elections, which stood at USD 14.4 billion or ₹1.2 lakh crore, according to OpenSecrets.org, a nonprofit organisation based in Washington, DC, that tracks and publishes data on campaign finance and lobbying.

Media campaigns across various platforms are predicted to account for 30 per cent of the total election spend, Rao said.

"While visible spending is concentrated in the 45-day direct campaign period, the actual expenditure far exceeds this amount," he added.

Parties and candidates often find ways to circumvent spending restrictions imposed by the Model Code of Conduct. In 2019, the CMS reported that the BJP accounted for 45 per cent of the total spending of ₹60,000 crore, a share that Rao believes will increase in the 2024 elections.

In his latest book, 'Next Big Game Changer of Elections', Rao highlighted the growing reliance on 'money power' over ideology in Indian politics.

He lamented the transformation of election campaigns from ideology-driven movements to 'jingoistic apparatuses" that leverage demographics to create divisive tactics and polarisation.

Rao identified six key trends in the ongoing general election -- prolonged pre-poll activities, affluent candidates dominating the fray, the 'Mandi' phenomenon of political crossovers, manipulation through various channels, lack of fair play, and the power dynamics favouring incumbents.

As digital campaigning gains prominence, political parties are engaging professional agencies for higher brand recall.

Amit Wadhwa, CEO of leading advertising agency Dentsu Creative, said that there has been a significant surge in digital campaigning this year.

He said political parties were behaving like corporate brands and were engaging professional agencies for higher brand recall.

"With the inclusion of both direct and indirect digital campaigns, this medium's footprint is poised to become the mainstay, potentially outshining all others in this election. Television, digital platforms, and outdoor advertising are ahead, relegating print to fourth place," he projected, based on his observations

A top ad agency official said voters unaffiliated to any political ideology, referred to as 'fencesitters', are the primary targets of the intense visual campaigns launched by parties across various media.

Social media giants like Meta and Google play significant roles in political campaigns, he said. Advertisement professional

Jadavendra Sen categorised advertisements into three types -Above the Line (ATL) activities, which include outdoor, television, and print; Below the Line (BTL) activities, encompassing wall writings and posters; and Through the Line (TTL) activities, which involve third-party like influencers and digital platforms.

Sen highlighted that during the initial voting phase in North Bengal, there was a notable demand for flex advertising.

He anticipated that the intensity of visual campaigning would escalate with every passing election phase.

In response to the spending budget this year, agencies associated with leading national parties like BJP and Congress did not offer any comments but acknowledged the increase had been significant.

Ulaka's annual income in 2018-19 was ₹24.88, according to his election affidavit.

However, there is a significant jump in the value of his total assets, from ₹2.83 crore in 2019 to ₹ 4.77 crore. The rise is primarily due to the purchase of an apartment worth ₹2.15 crore in New Delhi jointly with his wife.

His movable assets rose from ₹76.83 lakh to ₹77.46 lakh.

"Earlier, I was a software professional and had a six-digit salary package. Now, my income is the salary I receive as an MP, from agriculture and a few thousand in rent," Ulaka said.

He has been pitted against Kausaliya Hikaka of the BJD, and Kaleram Majhi of the BJP in a triangular contest.

IndiGo to buy up to 100

New Delhi, April 25: The country's largest airline IndiGo Thursday announced placing a firm order for 30 A350-900 planes and the option to buy 70 more such aircraft, foraying into the wide-body aircraft segment nearly two decades after starting operations.

IndiGo, which started flying in 2006, currently has a fleet of more than 350 narrow-body planes and is expanding its presence overseas. The carrier is also operating two wide-body Boeing 777 aircraft leased from Turkish Airlines to Istanbul from Delhi and Mumbai.

The airline aims to double in size by 2030 with new domestic and international routes as well as destinations as the airline pursues soaring global ambitions to match India's

The A350-900 planes will be powered by Rolls Royce's Trent XWB engine and the exact configuration of these aircraft, whose delivery is expected to start from 2027, will be decided later.

In a release, IndiGo said it is entering the "wide-body space with an order for 30 firm Airbus A350-900 aircraft". IndiGo CEO Pieter Elbers termed it as

domestic market share of more than 60 per cent, also has purchase rights for an additional 70 Airbus A350 family aircraft, "at its discretion, for possible future needs under certain conditions".

The pricing of the A350-900 aircraft was not available as Airbus has discontinued the practice of publishing the list price of its planes.

At present, Air India is the only Indian carrier operating A350. Among the domestic airlines. currently, Air India and Vistara have wide-body aircraft in their fleets while SpiceJet has leased some wide-body planes. IndiGo's latest order also comes at a time when efforts are on to make India a global aviation hub.

New Delhi, April 25: In a significant step towards digitisation, Chief Justice D Y Chandrachud Thursday announced that the Supreme Court will share information relating to cause lists and filing and listing of cases to advocates through WhatsApp messages, saying it will have a "big-bang impact" and will go a long way in saving paper and the earth.

The announcement on integration of WhatsApp with Information its and **Communications Technology** (ICT) services was made by the CJI before a nine-judge bench headed by him commenced the hearing on the vexed legal question aris-

ing from the petitions about whether private properties can be considered "material resources of the community" under Article 39(b) of the Constitution, which is a part of the Directive Principles of State Policy (DPSP).

"In the 75th year of its existence, the Supreme Court launches a small initiative. It

has the potential to have a big-bang impact. WhatsApp messenger has been a ubiquitous service in our daily lives and has taken the role of a powerful communication tool. To strengthen the right to access to justice and enhance transparency in the judicial system, the Supreme Court announces integration of WhatsApp messaging services with its IT

services," the CJI said. Elaborating further, Justice Chandrachud said under this initiative, the Advocates-on Records (AoRs) and the litigants, who appear in person before the top court, will get automated messages regarding electronic filing of cases, cause lists, orders and judgements. "The cause lists will be sent to all members of the bar by the registry as and when published. The orders and judgements available on the web-



site will also be sent through WhatsApp," he said.

A cause list features the cases to be heard by a court on a given day. "This is another revolutionary step...," Solicitor General Tushar Mehta said.

The CJI also shared the top court's official WhatsApp number 8767687676 and said it will not be receiving any messages and calls.

"This will bring a significant change in our working habits and will go a long way in saving papers and our planet Earth, Justice Chandrachud said. The CJI, referring to digitisation of judicial functions, said now more and more lawyers will have access to the courts and "even people from remote areas can access simple cases involving

citizen issues as well."

'We are also migrating all our services into Meghraj cloud 2.0 which is the cloud infrastructure created by National Informatics Centre (NIC) ... The data is preserved on servers in India," he said.

Taking note of the submissions of a lawyer that high courts and tribunals are not on the same page as the Supreme Court on the issue of technological advancement, he said, "Some high courts say tell us 48 hours in advance for video conference links and you can get only if you are above 60 years of age (and have difficulty attending the proceedings physically). We had to pass a judicial order saying what this is and how it can be done.' Underscoring the importance

US secretly sent long-range missiles to Ukraine

Washington, April 25: The US has secretly delivered longrange ballistic missiles to Ukraine to be used against Russian forces, the Pentagon has confirmed, while President Joe Biden alleged that China. Iran and North Korea were supplying weapons and technology to Moscow to boost its military.

The US previously supplied Ukraine with a mid-range version of the Army Tactical Missile Systems (ATACMS) but had been reluctant to send anything more powerful, partly over concerns about compromising US military readiness.

The ballistic missiles have a range of up to 300 kilometres, nearly doubling the striking distance of Ukraine's missiles.

President Biden directed his team to take this step following Russia's procurement and use of North Korean ballistic missiles against Ukraine, according to US media outlets. Ukrainian officials have been urging the US for the long-range missiles to target deeper behind Russian lines. American officials have previously resisted, citing

will continue to work with the coalition of more than 50 countries we have assembled to provide critical support for Ukraine's forces," Blinken said in a statement. The Pentagon said this package will surge munitions, weapons and equipment forward to support Ukraine's ability to defend its frontlines, protect its cities and counter Russia's continued attacks.

Biden warned that if Putin triumphs in Ukraine, the next move of Russian forces could very well be a direct attack on a NATO ally.

'You all know full well that invoking article five of the North Atlantic Treaty would be the first thing that comes to mind, which declares an attack on one as an attack on all. If Putin attacks a NATO ally like he is attacking Ukraine today, we would have no choice but to come to their aid, just like our NATO allies came to our aid after the September 11 (2001) attacks here," he said.

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy, in an interview with Fox News, thanked the US for sending much-needed military aid amounting to \$61 billion.

SC hears immunity case in DC while **Trump is in NY for** hush money trial

New York, April 25: A reluctant Donald Trump returned to a New York City courtroom Thursday as his hush money trial resumed at the same time that the US Supreme Court hears arguments in Washington over whether he should be immune from prosecution for actions he took during his time as President.

Jurors will hear more witness testimony from a longtime tabloid publisher, and Trump faces a looming decision over whether he violated a gag order imposed by the judge.

But he had asked to skip out on his criminal trial for the day so he could sit in on the high court's special session. where the justices will weigh whether he can be prosecuted over his efforts to reverse his 2020 election loss to Joe Biden.

"I think the Supreme Court has a very important argument before it today," Trump said has he walked into his trial. "I should be there.'

His request was denied by New York state Supreme Court Judge Juan Merchan, who is overseeing the trial on the hush money scheme that was allegedly meant to prevent harmful stories about Trump from surfacing in the final days of the 2016 campaign. "Arguing before the Supreme Court is a big deal, and I can certainly appreciate why your client would want to be there, but a trial in New York Supreme Court ... is also a big deal," Merchan told Trump's lawyer Todd Blanche last week when he nixed the idea.

155 people killed in Tanzania as heavy rains lash East Africa

Nairobi (Kenya), April 25: Flooding in Tanzania caused by weeks of heavy rain has killed_ 155 people and affected more than 2,00,000 others, the prime minister said Thursday.

That is more than double the number of deaths reported two weeks ago as the amount of rainfall increases, especially in the coastal region and the capital, Dar es Salaam. Prime Minister Kassim Majaliwa told Parliament that the El Niño climate pattern has worsened the ongoing rainy season, causing the flooding and destroying roads, bridges and railways. Flooded schools have been closed and emergency services have rescued people marooned by the flood waters. Majaliwa warned those living in low-lying areas to move to higher ground and urged district officials to ensure that provisions meant for those whose homes were washed away go to those in need of the supplies. He said more than 51,000 households have been affected by the rains. The East African region is experiencing heavy rains, with flooding also reported in neighboring Burundi and Kenya. In Kenya, 35 people were reported dead as of Monday, and the number was expected to increase as flooding continues across the country. In the Mathare slum in the capital, Nairobi, at least four bodies were retrieved from flooded houses Wednesday. Local media reported that more bodies were retrieved from the Mathare River. Kenyan President William Ruto chaired a multi-agency flood response meeting Thursday and directed the National Youth Service to provide land for people in flood-affected areas.

Mass arrest of students as chaos sweeps US varsities

Austin, April 25: Some US universities called in police to break up demonstrations against the Israel-Hamas war, resulting in ugly scuffles and dozens of arrests, while others appeared content to wait out student protests Thursday, as the final days of the semester ticked down and graduation ceremonies loomed.

At Emerson College in Boston, 108 people were arrested at an encampment overnight and four police officers suffered injuries that were not life-threatening, Boston police said. Those arrested were expected to appear Thursday in Boston Municipal Court.

Another 93 people were arrested Wednesday night during a protest at the University of Southern California, the Los Angeles Police Department said. There were no

reports of in-

Earlier Wednesday, officers at the University of Texas at Austin aggressively detained dozens of protesters. Hundreds of local and state police — including some on horseback and holding batons — bulldosed into protesters, at one point sending some tumbling into the street. Officers pushed their way into the crowd and made 34 arrests at the behest of the university and Texas Gov. Gregg Abbott, according to the state Department of Public Safety.

North of USC, protesters at California State Polytechnic University, Humboldt, were barricaded inside a building for a third day. The school shut down campus through the weekend and made classes virtual.

Sydney, April 25: Marine wildlife experts were frantically trying to rescue some 140 pilot whales stranded Thursday in the shallow waters of an estuary in the southwest of the state of Western Australia.

The whales are stranded at Toby Inlet in Geographe Bay, the Western Australia Department of Biodiversity, **Conservation and Attractions** said. The area is near the

town of Dunsborough in a region popular with tourists, and about 236 km (146 miles) south of state capital Perth.

We understand there are four pods of up to 160 pilot whales in total spread across about 500 metres. Unfortunately, 26 whales that stranded on the beach have



died," a department spokesperson said in a statement.

"A team of experienced staff including wildlife officers, marine scientists, veterinarians are on site or on their way." Based on previous strandings.

The platform previously priced its premium offering at 99 rupees a month, or 999 rupees a year, for streaming on up to four devices simultaneously. The plan was not ad-free. Existing JioCinema premium members will get all the additional benefits of the "Family" plan at no extra cost, it said.

Lower prices would place JioCinema in a stronger footing to compete with Netflix and Amazon after an agreement with Disney to merge India TV and streaming assets, and content deals with the likes of Warner Discovery Bros and NBCUniversal. JioCinema hosts popular titles such as "Succession" and shows featuring the character Harry Potter, alongside a variety of offerings targeting kids including popular Japanese anime series, Pokemon,

New Delhi, April 25: The National Financial Reporting Authority (NFRA) has slapped a penalty of ₹5 lakh on an audit firm for professional misconduct and other lapses in the audit of Vikas WSP Ltd for FY20. Vikas WSP Ltd is a BSE and NSE-listed company.

The order came after NFRA received information from the Securities Exchange Board of India (Sebi), that Vikas WSP Ltd did not recognise in its FY20 financial statements the interest expense on its borrowings from banks, which resulted in overstatement of profits by the company.

Thereafter, NFRA initiated action against the audit firm (S Prakash Aggarwal & Co), for professional or other misconduct in the statutory audit of Vikas WSP Ltd (VWL) for FY20.

The regulator noted that the financial statements of VWL were materially misstated due to partial recognition of interest cost on borrowings classified as Non-Performing Assets (NPAs) by banks in FY20, resulting in overstatement of profits.

"The audit firm that was primarily responsible for establishing and maintaining a system of quality control that the firm and its personnel comply with professional standards and regulatory and legal requirements.

"Further, the reports issued by the firm or engagement partners are appropriate in the circumstances, failed to properly implement its quality control policies and procedures," NFRA said in the order Tuesday.

Accordingly, the regulator penalised the audit firm for the audit lapses. "The audit firm failed to meet relevant requirements of the Companies Act, Standards on Quality Control (SQC 12), standards on auditing in several significant respects, and was grossly negligent and failed to apply professional skepticism and due diligence in the audit," it added.

Tech companies plug into India's smaller cities for talent

Madurai/Bangalore, April **25:** Indian engineer B Ramachandran now prefers living in the smaller cities than the major tech hubs of Bangalore and Chennai.

After the pandemic, the 47year-old moved to Madurai, a temple town in the southern state of Tamil Nadu. He has no plans to leave his hometown, saying the chance to live with his ageing mother while working for New York-based technology services firm Genpact (G.N) is a 'blessing"

IT companies are now expanding into smaller cities, in part to tap on workers like Ramachandran, and to capitalise on cheaper land costs, rents and wages.

Some are already finding it easier to hire staff in tier 2 cities, in contrast to before the pandemic when workers largely went from smaller cities into the country's major IT hubs for jobs.

"The HR and I used to drive down to Bangalore and Chennai to interview experienced talent



and convince them to move to Madurai," said Selvaganesh MP, founder of IT firm SMI that was bought by mid-cap IT company Happiest Minds (HAPP.NS) in 2023. "This is no longer needed

as the equation has changed after COVID-19.'

US-based Cognizant (CTSH.O) and India's Tata Consultancy Services (TCS.NS), Infosys (INFY.NS),

- Cognizant is trying to exit a major Chennai facility as part of its plan to cut real estate costs by \$100 million by 2025
- Tech Mahindra (TEML.NS) is running an initiative called "Nxt.Towns" to win talent in tier 2 cities
- Wipro is encouraging employees to relocate to its offices in smaller cities through "Project Lavender"

HCLTech (HCLT.NS) and Wipro (WIPR.NS) are moving into smaller cities due to cost efficiency, government incentives and availability of talent.

HCLTech has two offices in Madurai with 6,700 employees. It had originally aimed for 5,000 staff by 2025, which

it exceeded, as a result of pandemic-induced demand. It also expanded its workforce in tier 2 locations such as Nagpur in Maharashtra state, Vijayawada in southern Andhra Pradesh state and Lucknow in the northern state of Uttar Pradesh since the pandemic. Industry watchers say the

trend to smaller cities helps companies reduce attrition and cut costs at a time when the \$254 billion Indian IT sector is grappling with weak sales growth amid global economic uncertainty.

Employee salaries are 25%-30% lower and real estate rentals are around 50% cheaper than in established tech hubs, according to a report by Deloitte and industry body Nasscom.











RCB end losing streak KKR bowling woes under spotlight vs shaky PBKS

Hyderabad, April 25: Rajat Patidar's explosive fifty and a collective effort from the spinners set up Royal Challengers Bengaluru's 35-run win over Sunrisers Hyderabad in the IPL here Thursday, bringing an end to their six-match losing streak.

Patidar's 50 off 20 balls (2x4 5x6) stood in stark contrast to Virat Kohli's measured 51 off 43 balls (4x4, 1x6) as RCB put up 206/7 after opting to bat.

For a team that has breached the 250-run mark thrice season, the target was very gettable but the in-form SRH batting line-up could not deliver on this occasion and ended at 171/8 in 20 overs. It was a much-needed result for RCB, who lost seven of their

Liverpool, April 25: Jurgen Klopp's hopes of a dream sendoff were left in tatters after a 0-2 loss at Everton dealt a major blow to Liverpool's Premier League title bid Wednesday.

Goals from Jarrad Branthwaite and Dominic Calvert-Lewin at Goodison Park meant Klopp tasted a bitter defeat in his last Merseyside derby before standing down at the end of the season.

The loss keeps Liverpool three points behind league leaders Arsenal in second place and one ahead of defending champions Manchester City, who are third and have two games in hand on both of their rivals

Klopp had spoken last week of needing perfection to win his second title at the club. But this was the latest setback for his team, which has lost two of its last three games in the league.

While the result hurt Liverpool's title chances, it delivered a boost to Everton's survival bid, with the win moving Sean Dyche's team eight points above the relegation zone. That fact seemed to be of less concern to the home fans, who were too busy reveling in the damage caused to Liverpool's season.

"You lost the league at Goodison Park," they chanted as the final whistle approached and the majority of the 39,000 crowd remained inside the stadium to drink in the atmosphere as the players celebrated on the field. Klopp had dominated this fix-

ture since taking over at Anfield in 2015, winning nine of the past 16 derbies before Wednesday's match. Statistics showed Everton won 75% of all duels in the opening half hour, a league record for any top flight team this season. MAN UNITED SCARE

Barcelona, April 25: Xavi Hernandez says he walked back his decision to leave Barcelona this summer after his players convinced him "this is a winning team" even if this season will end without any trophies.

"Many people, including my players, have made me see that this is not over," Xavi said Thursday at a news conference. Xavi spoke a day after he

reached an agreement with Barcelona to reverse his January decision to leave his boyhood club after this season. He has committed to finishing out the final year of his contract that lasts until June 2025.

Xavi said the improved play of this team has been key. That, and feeling he "has the strength" to go on. The Spain great said he has always put the good of the team and club first. And while he once thought his team needed a new approach, now he thinks he can still be successful. He denied it was about money:

"The club president knows that if I had not finished the last year of my contract I would not have asked to be paid one single euro."

The decision to stay came three days after a 2-3 loss to Real Madrid that all but ended the team's chances of a trophy. The loss in Madrid left Barcelona 11 points behind its rival with six matches remaining in the Spanish league. A week ago, Barcelona were eliminated by Paris Saint-Germain in the Champions League quarterfi-

nals.

But at least Barcelona showed some improvement since Xavi's unexpected announcement in January to leave. After that, they strung a 13-game unbeaten streak before falling to PSG.

"I don't think my time here is over and I believe that we can be successful. I am convinced of that, and these three months have made me see that," Xavi said. "And since changing one's mind is a sign of wisdom, I have decide to change my mind.

Ekta, Ranvir, Anurag bag gold in Asian U-20 meet

New Delhi, April 25: Ranvir Singh and Ekta Dey clinched men's and women's 3000m steeplechase gold medals respectively as Indians continued their dominant show Thursday in the Asian U-20 Athletics Championships in Dubai. With these two latest additions, India's gold tally has swelled to three. Ekta claimed gold with a time

of 10:31.92 seconds, while Ranvir emerged victorious clocking 9:22.62 seconds. Anurag Singh Kaler earlier won the gold in the men's shot put with a distance of 19.23m as Indians added a total of seven medals to their kitty on this day.

In the morning session, race walker Aarti set the ball rolling, winning a hard-fought bronze in the women's 10,000m. Aarti's bronze-winning time of 47:45.33 seconds was better than the U20 World Athletics Championships qualification time of 49 minutes.

Later, throwers added three medals, including a gold to the team's tally. Kaler took time to settle down in the shot put. He battled with South Korean Park Sihoon for gold.

Kaler's gold-winning throw was achieved in the third attempt. His opening throw was 18.44 and his second attempt was 18.69m. Fourth and fifth were no marks and sixth and final throw was 18.79m.

Sihoon also found a distance of 19.23m but had to be satisfied with the silver as the Indian had a better average in the contest.

Defending champion Siddharth Choudhary settled for bronze with a throw of 19.02m, scored in the second attempt. His other throws were below the 19m mark. Amanat Kamboj added a silver to the team's tally. Her best throw was 50.45m. Aman Choudhary also won bronze in 47.53 seconds.

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
