Bhubaneswar, June 1: The Biju Janata Dal (BJD) is set to win 117 Assembly and 11 Lok Sabha seats in the simultaneous elections, claimed party

Park in Britain, with regulatory authority shifting from corporations and academics to governments, which are now building the capacity to supervise lation. The first approach involves applying specific rules to different use cases. For example, AI development in medicine would need to comply with both existing and new regulatory conditions specific to the health-
care industry. The second, more challenging approach is to regulate AI development at its source This is in response to the risk that AI could potentially outmaneuver
