NEET grace marks junked

1,563 CANDIDATES CAN SIT FOR RETEST JUNE 23, CENTRE TELLS SC

New Delhi, June 13: Budging to the nationwide outrage over alleged irregularities in the NEET-UG, 2024, the Centre Thursday told the Supreme Court that it has cancelled the grace marks awarded to 1,563 candidates who took the undergraduate medical entrance test this year. These students will be given an option to either take a retest June 23 or forgo the compensatory marks given for loss of time.

Refusing to stall the counselling for NEET-UG scheduled to begin July 6, the SC made it clear that the admission of successful candidates into medical colleges and other institutions will be subject to the outcome of the petitions which have sought reliefs like cancellation of the examination held May 5 on grounds of question paper leak and other malpractices. A vacation Bench of Justices Vikram Nath and Sandeep Mehta termed as 'fairly reasonable' the decision to cancel the grace marks awarded to 1.563 candidates on the recommendation of a panel set up to look into the grievances of the petitioners.

The National Testing Agency (NTA) conducts the all India premedical entrance test.

At the outset, lawyer Kanu Agarwal, appearing for the Centre and the NTA, said the committee set up to look into the grievances decided June 12 to 'allay the fears of the stu-



dents'. It was of the view that the grace marks be withdrawn and replaced with an option of retest for these candidates which will be conducted June 23.

He said the panel was of the view that the award of grace marks on grounds of loss of time while taking the test resulted in a 'skewed situation' as it had to be limited only to the questions that remained un-attempted. After examining all aspects, the panel concluded that it would be appropriate to recommend cancellation of scorecards of these beneficiary candidates.

"As per the recommendations, it has been suggested that the scorecards of the affected 1,563 candidates issued June 4, 2024 will stand cancelled and withdrawn. These affected candidates will be informed about their actual scores without compensatory marks. Further, retest will be conducted for the affected candidates," the Bench said.

It added, "The results of the affected candidates who do not

wish to appear for the retest will be declared on their actual marks without compensation obtained by them in the examination held May 5, 2024 and the marks obtained by the candidates who will appear in the retest will be considered and their marks based on the examination held May 5, 2024 will be discarded.

The results of the retest will be declared June 30, the Centre said. The SC issued notices to the Centre and the NTA on three petitions. It said they all will be taken up together July 8 after the summer vacation.

While the Congress reiterated its demand for a SC-monitored probe into the exam 'irregularities' asserting that the anger over the matter will also reverberate inside Parliament, Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan rubbished the allegations of paper leak.

Congress leader Gaurav Gogoi said, "We demand a SC-monitored investigation into this entire scandal which has affected around 24 lakh students." "We're waiting for the Parliament session where we'll raise the voice of 24 lakh youth of the country. The anger over the NEET will also reverberate inside Parliament," Gogoi added.

"There is no evidence of paper leak in NEET-UG. The allegations of corruption in NTA are unfounded. It's a very credible body." Pradhan said.

New Delhi, June 13: Spymaster Ajit Doval and seasoned bureaucrat PK Mishra were Thursday re-appointed to the post of National Security Adviser (NSA) and Principal Secretary to Prime Minister Narendra Modi, respectively, for a fresh five-year term.

With this, Doval has become the first NSA to be appointed to the key post for three consecutive terms.

The Appointments Committee of the Cabinet (ACC) has approved the two appointments with effect from June 10, 2024, the Personnel Ministry said.

Their appointment will be coterminus with the term of the PM or until further orders whichever is earlier, it said in identical orders.



Both Doval and Mishra will be assigned the rank of Cabinet minister in the Table of Precedence and terms and conditions of their appointment will be notified separately, it added.

Doval, who belongs to the 1968batch of Indian Police Service, retired as Intelligence Bureau chief in 2005. He was appointed at the NSA for the first time May 30, 2014, and reappointed for another term May 31, 2019.

Mishra, on the other hand, has held various key positions at the Centre and in the Gujarat

government. He served as Additional Principal Secretary in the PMO

in Modi's first term as the PM from 2014 to 2019. Mishra, a 1972-batch retired

Indian Administrative Service officer, was re-appointed to the same post with effect from May 31, 2019, during Modi's second term. He was in September 2019 appointed as the Principal Secretary to the PM. His term was on a co-terminus basis with Modi's tenure.

Bhubaneswar, June 13: The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) launched a state-wide probe into the alleged recruitment fraud in the Odisha Postal Circle-wherein 63 candidates of the Gramin Dak Sevak (GDS) Examination, 2023 submitted forged Class X pass certificates to secure the job - by carrying out simultaneous searches at 67 locations, Thursday.

Over 204 officials, including 122 from the CBI and 82 from other departments, swooped down at various locations in Kalahandi, Nuapada, Rayagada, Nabarangpur, Kandhamal, Keonjhar, Mayurbhanj, Balasore and Bhadrak with an objective of uncovering the interstate or-

POSTAL JOB FRAUD ganised gang responsible for

providing these fake certificates. CBI sources said the Department of Posts had invited applications for recruitment of 1,382 GDSs January 27, 2023. The minimum qualification for the post was Class X pass with pro-

ficiency in the local language. "Selection was automated based on the marks secured in the Class X examination. Selected candidates were informed via SMS and email and asked to report to the verifying authority within 15 days for document verification prior to their appointment," they added.

The verification of certificates by the Odisha Postal Circle showed that 63 candidates from various postal divisions, including Balasore, Mayurbhanj, Kalahandi and Berhampur, had submitted forged Class X pass certificates for the recruitment. Soon after, the Department of

Posts approached the authorities, and the CBI registered a case in this regard. "These certificates were allegedly issued mostly by the Board of High School and Intermediate Education, Allahabad; West Bengal Board, Kolkata and Jharkhand Academic Council, Ranchi. The complaint suggests alleged involvement of an interstate racket in creating and supplying these forged certificates in collusion with the candidates. a CBI spokesperson said.

Stolen twice, coveted Titian painting set to go under hammer

Rome, June 13: A highly coveted painting by Renaissance master Titian that was stolen in 1809 then again in 1995 – after which it was discovered in a plastic bag at a London bus stop - will be put up for auction in July, 'The Guardian' reported, Thursday.

The Venetian painter is believed to have created Rest on the Flight into Egypt in 1508 when he around 20. Painted on a 2-ft-wide wooden panel, the piece depicts the Virgin Mary cradling Jesus as an infant with Joseph looking on.

The most colourful part of that journey so far was perhaps when the painting was taken from the first-floor drawing room of the Longleat stately home in 1995. After a seven-year hunt, the paint-

ing, valued at more than £5m at the time, was found in a plastic shopping bag at a bus stop in Richmond by Charles Hill, a former chief of Scotland Yard's art and antiques

Hill, who died in 2021, said he had been led to the spot by a man he described as a cross between Arthur Daley and Lovejoy, the rogue characters of two TV series that ran in the 1980s and 1990s, in return for a £100,000 reward.

Hill was also known for helping to find Edvard Munch's 1893 version of The Scream after it was stolen from the National Museum in Oslo in 1994, it said.







All gates of Srimandir reopened for devotees

A detailed report has been sought to know why the three gates of the temple have not been reopened after the Covid-19 pandemic, said Cabinet minister Suresh Pujari



Bhubaneswar, June 13: All the four gates of Srimandir in Puri were reopened for devotees in the presence of Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi and his council of ministers Thursday morning, a day after the first Cabinet meeting of the newly-sworn in BJP government in the state took a decision to this effect.

The three gates of the 12th century shrine, which were closed since Covid-19 pandemic, were reopened after the 'Mangal Alati' ritual of Lord Jagannath.

The Chief Minister, his two deputies, ministers, several BJP MPs and party leaders visited the temple and offered prayers before Lord Jagannath. They also conducted a 'parikrama' around the temple complex.

"After the oath-taking ceremony, the BJP government had Wednesday evening taken its first decision to reopen all four gates of the temple. Today, the gates were reopened at 6:30am after the 'Mangal Alati' ritual," Majhi informed the media in Puri.

The government will closely monitor the situation and take

Will fulfil poll promises in 5 years, says Majhi

Bhubaneswar: Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Thursday asserted that the promises made by BJP in its election manifesto are 'Modi's guarantees' and would be fulfilled within the next five years.

Majhi made the assertion while visiting the birthplace Utkalmani Pandit Gopabandhu Das, an icon of the state, in Suando village of Puri district.

Alleging that residents of rural areas were neglected under the previous BJD dispensation, Majhi said his government would solve issues affecting the common people in the villages

The BJP, in its election manifesto, has promised a minimum support price (MSP) of ₹3,100 per quintal of

Cuttack, June 13: Amid celebrations in several districts which got representation in the newly-formed Cabinet of Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi that assumed charge Wednesday, people in Cuttack are feeling left out as the district didn't find a place in the Council of Ministers.

According to reports, there were speculations earlier over one or two MLAs from Cuttack district getting berths in the Majhi Cabinet, but now all hopes have been dashed.

Of the six Assembly seats in the district-Barabati-Cuttack, Choudwar-Cuttack, Cuttack Sadar, Baramba, Banki and Athagarh –, Prakash Chandra Sethi of BJP has emerged victorious by defeating former MLA Chandrasarathi Behera of BJD in Cuttack Sadar. Similarly, saffron party candidate from Niali, Chhabi Malik defeated BJD's Pramod Kumar Mallick.

However, neither Sethi nor Malik managed to secure a berth in the newly-formed Cabinet.



Likewise, Sarada Prasad Pradhan and Bijay Kumar Dalabehera, both Independent candidates, won the election from Mahanga and Baramba Assembly seats, respectively, in the district. Though BJP had set its eyes on these candidates before the announcement of results, none of them was considered for ministerial berth.

Sources said there was enough scope for inclusion of Prakash Chandra Sethi in the Cabinet, but due to some unknown reasons this could not materialise.

Though Orissa Post tried to contact Sethi over the issue, he was not available for comments.

A cursory glance at Cuttack's representation in the state's council of ministers in the past reveals several inclusions. Eminent personalities like Nandini Satpathy and Biren Mitra had won the Cuttack seat and were sworn in as Chief Ministers. Similarly, former CM Janaki Ballabh Patnaik had contested from Athagarh Assembly seat and won twice. 5 HIGHWAYMEN NABBED IN CITY

Bhubaneswar, June 13: The Commissionerate Police here Thursday arrested five members of a notorious robbers' gang involved in at least two dozens of loot cases under the City limits. Police said 40 gold chains weigh-

ing 400 gram, ₹2 lakh cash, four motorcycles and five mobile phones were seized from the accused. Three members of the gang are still at large, they added.

Police Commissioner Sanjeeb Panda said the accused were identified as Ayaz Mahamad, 20, Debasis Barik, 19, Sibaprasad Barik, 23; residents of Jatni area, Ayusman Tripathy, 27, a native of Rourkela, Rajat Kumar Nanda, a resident of Delang. Primarily, they targeted pedestrians and motorists in the National Highway for snatching, especially gold chains. They were also involved in snatching cases along the highway crossing the City, connecting Angul, Bhadrak and Puri, he added

Elucidating the modus operandi of the gang, Panda said, "In a bid to give a slip to the cops, the gang members used high-end sports bikes for looting gold chains and valuables from victims. Besides, they used tampered number plates in their motorcycle to hoodwink police. Following the loot, they used to dispose of the stolen gold ornaments with a different goldsmith each time to avoid crackdown.

Furthermore, Panda said the miscreants' splurged money on costly items including branded shoes, clothes and bikes, which they earned by selling the booty.

Hot, cold exposure in early life alters brain's white matter

hildren and foetuses exposed to hot and cold environments impact their brain's white matter, responsible for connecting various brain regions and enabling communi-

cation, a new research has found. Researchers said that children are especially vulnerable to extreme environments as their bodies' temperature regulation

processes are still immature. They also found that early exposure could have lasting effects on the microstructure of white matter in the brain.

These findings are published in the journal Nature Climate

"We know that the developing brain of foetuses and children is particularly susceptible to environmental exposures, and there is some preliminary evidence suggesting that exposure to cold and heat may affect mental well-being and cognitive performance in children and adolescents," said lead researcher Mònica Guxens, Barcelona Institute for Global Health (ISGlobal), Spain, and the study's corresponding author.

However, there is a lack of evidence with regards to how such exposure can bring about structural changes in the brain, Guxens said.



The research team studied the exposure of close to 2,700 preteens to monthly temperatures from birth until they turned eight years old. They used magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) brain scans.

The impacts of the exposure were measured between nine-12 years of age. For this, the researchers assessed the preteens white matter connectivity by measuring how water flowed

and spread in their brains, or

'mean diffusivity'.

In more mature brains, water flows more in one direction than in all directions, showing lower mean diffusivity, the study said.

The team found that exposure to colder-than-usual temperatures during pregnancy and the first year of life, and exposure to hotter-than-usual environments from birth until three years of age were linked with more mean diffusivity at preadolescence, pointing to a slower maturation of their white matter.

"The fibres of the white matter are responsible for connecting the different areas of the brain, enabling communication

between them. As the white matter develops, this communication becomes faster and more efficient," said first author Laura Granés, a researcher at ISGlobal.

"Our study is like a photograph at a particular moment in time and what we see in that image is that participants more exposed to cold and heat show differences in a parameter -- the mean diffusivity - which is related to a lower level of maturation of the white matter," said Granes

Previous studies have shown changes in mean diffusivity to be related with poorer cognitive function and mental health problems

Farmers turning away from growing paddy as profit dips

Jajpur, June 13: Farmers are gradually turning away from growing paddy crop due to declining profit, a report said.

An analysis of the earnings of farmers from the paddy cultivation in last five years reveals that profit from the crop has been quite disappointing. This is despite the fact that the agriculturists have been working hard during summer, rain and winter seasons to raise the crop.

Reports said on an average, farmers earn around ₹607 to ₹728 as profit from a quintal of paddy which is forcing many to turn away from the cultivation. The phenomenon has raised fears of a sharp rise in the prices of food products in coming days.

Observers attributed administrative negligence as the reason behind the declining profit of farmers from paddy cultivation. Some farmers requesting anonymity claimed that if a quintal of paddy was not sold at ₹3,100 per quintal, as per the announcement made by the Union



government, their hopes of getting adequate profit would

The declining profit from paddy cultivation has frustrated poor and marginal farmers, and led to their migration to other states in search of alternative livelihoods. On the other hand, rapid industrialisation is directly and indirectly impacting rural life and agriculture. Climate change is also impacting cultivation as farmers have to battle drought and floods at frequent intervals to save the crop from

Farmers are also facing losses due to absence of irrigation facilities for cultivation, while irregularities and negligence in paddy procurement have hit

According to reports available from the state Agriculture and Farmers' Empowerment Department, farmers spent ₹1,208 per quintal of paddy cultivation in FY 2019-20, but sold the harvested paddy at ₹1,815 per quintal.

Similarly, farmers spent ₹1,245 per quintal and sold the crop at ₹1,868 in 2020-21 fiscal, while ₹1,293 was spent per quintal and sold at ₹1.940 in 2021-22 FY. Farmers spent ₹1,360 per quintal and sold at ₹2,040 in 2022-23 FY, while they spent ₹1,455 per quintal of paddy and sold it at ₹2,183 per quintal in 2023-24 FY.

The district administration has strictly advised the regulated market committees (RMCs) to ensure that farmers should not face any problems during paddy procurement. Paddy should be procured there at the right time and steps be taken for hassle free payment to the farmers. However, no one ever bothers if the paddy was procured at the right time, number of PACs (primary agriculture cooperative societies) opened, and if farm-

The elected political representatives also forget about the farmers. As a result, the problems of the farmers receive little attention, and they continue to be fleeced due to the alleged negligence and bonhomie between These loopholes frustrate the entire paddy procurement process which starts late every vear to help the middlemen, it is alleged. As a result, farmers resorts to distress sale and relieve their paddy stocks to middlemen at ₹500 to ₹600 below the per quintal MSP.

Earlier, farmers had to endure a lot of hardship as the paddy procurement process was dependent on millers. Realizing the problem, the state government started procuring paddy through the government or government authorised PACs. However, some unscrupulous officials in cahoots with middlemen started fleecing the farmers like before, it is alleged.

Sources said that the mandis are opened late, or not opened at all. Officials are even allegedly manipulating the registration, and in providing tokens to the farmers for paddy procurement. This has only resulted in losses for the farmers and coming on the way of them becoming self-reliant.

Rourkela, June 13: For the past two years, the Patient Facilitation Centre and Attendant Accommodation Centre (PFC-Cum-AAC) has been helping attendants of patients from Sundargarh district referred to the Veer Surendra Sai Institute of Medical Sciences and Research (VIMSAR) with not just accommodation, but the necessary support services required during prolonged treatment.

The operation of the PFC-Cum-AAC, set up within the Red Cross Building of VIMSAR, has been initiated by District Mineral Foundation, Sundargarh. It is being managed by IMTS, a NGO.

The PFC-Cum-AAC which started its operation in June 2022 out of a rented premise in Majhipalli of Sambalpur, later shifted to the Red Cross Building. The objective of establishment of this centre is to provide support to patients and their attendants during their stay while getting treatment at VIMSAR, Burla. This centre not only pro-

vides shelter to the attendants for 10 days upon admission but also provides them food as well as recreation. This facility, in coordination with different medical institutions, takes care of patients' treatment, diagnosis, blood requirement as well as pharmacological. The centre is being managed by a team of 10 professionals - two cooks, two pharmacists, one accountant, two support staff, two security guards and one project co-ordinator.

The 12-bed facility is equipped with a kitchen, toilets and other amenities. Till now more than 1,270 patients and their attendants have taken benefit of this set up, an official said.

Rukmini Barik of Rourkela, Jhirpani, who came to VIMSAR to attend one of her ailing relatives and availed this facility said "Earlier, we would stay in hotels by paying anything between ₹300-400 per day. We came across the project coordinator of this centre once who shifted us here," said Rukmini. "The service at the centre was good and it reduced our expenses to a large extent," she added.

But this positive news cannot obscure the grim reality: more than four years after the COVID-19 pandemic began, the world – especially developing economies – has yet to embark on a

global growth is stabilising – 2.7 per cent, on average, through 2026 – is significantly lower than the 3.1 per cent average in the pre-pandemic decade. That is insufficient to support progress on key development goals. By the end of this year, one in four developing economies will be poorer than it was on the eve of the pandemic. With many major economies holding elections this year, uncertainty over trade policy is higher than at any other moment this century. This helps to explain why per capita income growth in developing economies is expected to average just 3% through 2026, well below the 3.8% average in the decade before COVID-19. Many developing economies will not make any progress at

RESCIND ONE-CHINA POLICY

THE CHINA-**PAKISTAN AXIS CAN NO LONGER BE IGNORED OR DOWNPLAYED**

nce again China and Pakistan have issued a joint statement on Kashmir. New Delhi has been ignoring such statements with a mild reprimand against third party intervention. But it is time that India made a strong strategic shift vis-à-vis China on the latter's meddling in Kashmir. Pakistan's obsession with Kashmir is understandable and can be dealt with at any point, although this also requires a fresh line of thinking. One of the formidable ways to counter China is to rescind India's support of One-China policy. And to deal with Pakistan, New Delhi should make a serious and persistent claim on PoK in order to complete the unfinished task of United Kashmir's integration into Union of India.

China reiterated that, 'Jammu and Kashmir dispute is left over from history and should be properly and peacefully resolved in accordance with the UN Charter, relevant Security Council resolutions and bilateral agreements.'

The MEA swiftly reacted, "the Union Territory of Jammu & Kashmir and the Union Territory of Ladakh are and always will be integral and inalienable parts of India. No other country has a locus standi to comment on the same." Obviously, those concerned with India's territorial integrity beg the question, can India continue to ignore Chinese reference to Kashmir or take some serious steps to deter China from raising its voice on India's internal issues. As said, India should review its One-China policy. New Delhi's One-China policy refers to recognising People's Republic of China as the only legitimate Govt of China and not recognising Taiwan as an independent state.

It is in order that one recalls the historical context of such a stance taken by India. In 1949, as China got independence, it made a precondition with India for establishing diplomatic relations. And that was accepting the One-China policy. For India, the strategic rationale was that of its commitment to non-alignment and anti-colonialism which

implied its opposition to the partition of China.

On reflection, quite a few mistakes have been made by the first Prime Minister Pt. Jawaharlal Nehru; one of them certainly was India's policy towards China - giving away Tibet without any reciprocal commitment from China, offering the Security Council membership to China and being gulled by Chinese overtures, Hindi-Chini Bhai-Bhai etc. He recognised People's Republic of China cutting off all ties with Taiwan However, that is history. Instead of brooding over and blaming the past mistakes, it is prudent to correct the fault lines of history.

It is important to remember that while India recognised One-China policy, Beijing has not yet accepted One-India policy. Worse, Beijing has been unduly interfering in Jammu & Kashmir and making obnoxious claims on Arunachal Pradesh as a disputed territory. Also, China has always disregarded sovereignty of India through its position on PoK, J&K. Arunachal Pradesh, issuing of stapled visas and skirmishes on borders of Ladakh and LAC. China's support to Pakistan in military and economic terms and in international forums is aimed at exploiting Pakistan's difference with India and preventing India from becoming a regional power.

Second, Taiwan has emerged as a global economic and technological power doing business with India. India's stakes in Taiwan are quite high, like jointly making semi-conductors in India and sending a large number of Indians to Taiwan to make up the labour deficit. Recently, both countries signed an agreement on sourcing labour from India to Taiwan.

Third, India and the United States are deepening their relations in multiple sectors. Washington is doing so to counterbalance through India China's growing influence and aggression in the region. India is reciprocating for its own national interests in countering China in partnership with US and its allies. As the US is committed to defending the independence of Taiwan, New Delhi should reconsider its One-China policy. Finally, India should be able to rise as an independent power without being heckled by Beijing.

Arguably, the potential consequences of reviewing India's One-China policy are complex impacting India's foreign and security policy in the region either way. On the one hand, it could lead to increased tension between New Delhi and Beijing to the extent of disturbing the global order. On the other hand, it could lend India leverage and greater bargaining power vis-àvis China. The so-called moderates would

argue that India and China historically have had strong cultural, economic and strategic ties, so both countries should engage through dialogue and

negotiation. This is part of 'containment' strategy. To put it candidly, the containment policy vis-à-vis China has not worked and may not work in future Chinese are by nature duplicitous. They will chip away territories while being ready to negotiate. They are infamous for going back on their commitment. Their political system is based on domination and aggression. Therefore, New Delhi needs to embrace the strategy of countering China. It is time for New Delhi to exploit the geographic, ethnic and economic fault lines of China – Hong Kong, Taiwan, Tibet, and Xinjiang. Out of all these, Taiwan is an independent entity. There are other territorial disputes China is caught in, South China Sea being one such hotspot.

India's policy towards China witnessed a remarkable shift when BJP under Narendra Modi came to power in 2014 in full maiority. Sushma Swaraj, then Minister for Foreign Affairs, at her first meeting with Wang Yi, Chinese Foreign Minister, in June 2014, demanded that China must reciprocate with One-India policy. However, Modi has tried on several occasions to befriend China. That again has not worked.

So, the only option is to counter China. How best to do so could be handled by the sagacious minds in the South Block The political will has to be sounded out to all concerned. One of the ways is to deepen India's contact with Taiwan. The abovementioned pact on labour supply from India to Taiwan has almost sidelined New Delhi's One-China policy.

On rebuffing Pakistan on Kashmir, New Delhi has to up the ante on PoK. New Delhi should announce to the world its intention about reclaiming PoK. This demand will steal the thunder from Pakistan on Kashmir and deprive them of the sympathy they gain from some Muslim countries. China-Pakistan axis can no longer be ignored or downplayed.

Digital capitalism & its feudal order

LIKE MEDIEVAL FEUDALISM, **TECHNOLOGICAL FEUDALISM DOES NOT PRODUCE TANGIBLE GOODS AND SERVICES BUT INSTEAD SURVIVES THROUGH THE ACCUMULATION OF RENT**

eudalism managed to sur-√ vive in different stages of its history. As a social, economic, political, and cultural system that emerged in the Middle Ages, it has shown remarkable resilience by adapting and transforming throughout history. In contemporary times, it has reinvented itself in the form of techno-feudalism. This modern iteration is dominated by platform companies that dominate and control various aspects of economic activities of producers, consumers, and distributers. These companies extract rent from producers, consumers, and distributors, influencing the economic activities of individuals. societies, states, and governments. The pervasive reach of these online platforms underscores the enduring nature of feudal structures, albeit in a new. technologically driven context.

Like medieval feudalism, technological feudalism does not produce tangible goods and services but instead survives through the accumulation of rent. While medieval feudal lords extracted agricultural produce and labour from serfs, techno-feudal lords extract value through data and user engagement on digital platforms. Both systems thrive by leveraging their control over resources and populations to generate wealth, not by producing anything themselves but by appropriating the productivity and creativity abilities of the working masses.

The accumulation of rent has been a central feature of feudalism throughout all stages of its history. This principle, which originally manifested through the collection of agricultural produce and labour from serfs, has evolved over time. In modern iterations, such as techno-feudalism, rent accumulation is evident in the control and monetisation of digital spaces by tech corporations. Whether in medieval manors or contemporary online platforms, the core mechanism remains the same: extracting rent from dependent or subordinate groups to enhance the wealth and power of the feudal ruling and non-ruling entities.

Techno-consumers of social media are akin to free slaves labouring for the rental profits of social media company owners. Despite the perception of freedom and choice, these users are, in reality, contributing to the wealth of the digital platform owners through their engagement and data generation. This dynamic reflects a modern form of exploitation, where the users activities and personal information are commodified for corporate gain. Techno-feudalism is designed to subjugate working people and manipulate their consciousness to serve the interests of techno-feudal lords, all under the guise of technological progress. This system thrives without fostering genuine technological education, skills, and consciousness among the masses, primarily due to digital divides. The technological barriers are intentionally crafted to create an army of unemployed workforce that remains perpetually available to work for low wages and under unfavourableworking conditions imposed by the techno-feudals. This dynamic perpetuates inequality and exploitation, reinforcing the dominance of the tech elites.

The working-class control over technology, the democratisation of digital platforms and technological infrastructure, the

availability and accessibility of technological education and skills for all, and the prioritisation of technology for people rather than profit are some of the immediate alternatives to ensure technological progress that upholds the interests of the masses. Through these concerted efforts, working people can harness technology as a tool for societal advancement and empowerment, ensuring that its benefits are accessible to all members of society, regardless of their socioeconomic status.

By dismantling the barriers erected by rent-seeking behaviours within these systems, working people can pave the way for equitable access to technological advancements. This inclusivity not only democratises innovation but also nurtures a collective awareness of the transformative power of technology, empowering individuals, and communities alike to actively engage with and shape the trajectory of technological progress and future.

Katra. June 13: In the wake of four terror attacks in as many days, Jammu and Kashmir Director General of Police RF Swain Thursday accused Pakistan of trying to disturb peaceful atmosphere through its mercenaries, and asserted that the Indian forces were determined to give a befitting response to the enemy.

He warned the "enemy agents" that they would repent their decision of supporting terrorism and said they have stakes including families, land and jobs unlike Pakistani terrorists who have nothing to lose.


Terrorists struck at four places in Reasi, Kathua, and Doda districts over the past four days, killing nine people, including seven pilgrims returning from Shiv Khouri temple, and a CRPF jawan, and left seven security personnel and several

Two suspected Pakistani terrorists were killed in an encounter with security forces in Kathua and a large quantity of arms and ammunition were re-

covered from them. "The starting point (of terrorism in J&K) is across the border. The clear intent of the adversary is that if they cannot motivate locals for subversive activities to disturb the peaceful atmosphere in Kashmir, send their own people, Pakistanis, after recruiting them there and forcibly pushing them into this side," the DGP told reporters in Reasi

The police chief was in Katra, the base camp for the pilgrims visiting the famous Mata Vaishno Devi shrine, and chaired a high-level meeting to review security in the district, where terrorists attacked a bus Sunday evening, killing nine and injuring 41.

'The law enforcement agencies are committed to bringing the perpetrators to justice and ensuring the safety and security of all residents and visitors in the area," the spokesperson said. Senior Superintendent of Police, Reasi, Mohita Sharma urged people to remain vigilant and report any suspicious activity to the authorities immediately.

Omar accuses admin of harassing locals

Thiruvananthapuram, June **13:** From a father-of-two who planned to leave his job to a 29year-old due to visit his family in August, two dozen Indians from the southern state of Kerala died in a fire that ripped through a labour-housing facility in

Wednesday, leaving their families bereft.

Around 45 Indians died in the blaze, which also killed at least 9 other people in Mangaf city, while more than 50 were injured, according to India's foreign ministry. Most of the Indian victims came from Kerala.

Norka Roots, a government

agency Keralites living outside the state, put the number of the state's dead at 24 with seven others injured and their condition serious. The federal government had arranged a special flight to bring the bodies, Norka Secretary K Vasuki said. Among the Keralite victims

was Muralidharan Nair, who had been working in Kuwait for 32 years, including 10 as a senior supervisor in the company that owned the housing facility where the fire broke out.

"He came on leave in December for two months with a plan to end his career in Kuwait. The company called him back," his brother, Vinu V

Nair, told Reuters, adding that the family identified the 61-year-old from a list published by India's embassy. His two roommates also died in the blaze.

Liquid IEDs: New threat emerging in terrorism theatre of Kashmir

Srinagar, June 13: Liquid explosives seem to have made a comeback in Jammu and Kashmir militancy theatre after 17 years as a recent raid by police in the Union territory led to the recovery of such "difficultto-detect (d2d)" Improvised Explosive Devices, officials said.

The liquid IED was recovered with the assistance of one of the Over Ground Workers (OGW), arrested after a gunfight earlier this month in Pulwama in which one of the oldest surviving Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) terrorists Riyaz Dar alias "Sathar" and his associate Rayees Dar were killed.

Riyaz Dar had joined the banned LeT in 2014 and had closely worked with slain Pakistani terrorists Abu Dujana and Abu Ismail. He was involved in many terror-related

While Riyaz, designated as an A++ terrorist, carried a cash reward of above ₹10 lakh, Rayees Dar was categorised as 'A' carrying a cash reward of ₹5 lakh.

Immediately after the gunfight, police cracked down on OGWs working for the Lashkar terrorists and arrested four of them.During interrogation, the officials said, one of the OGWs said the terrorists were given shelter and provided with logistics by Bilal Ahmed Lone, Sajjad Ganie and Shakir Bashir, all residents of Nihama in Pulwama.

The OGW network was unearthed and these three persons were arrested later

 $During\ investigation, the\ OGWs$ nformed the police that the two Lashkar-e-Taiba terrorists had prepared liquid IEDs. Bashir had hid them in the orchards.

Explosive experts from the army decided to destroy the IEDs, weighing around 6 kg and stored in a plastic container, considering them to be dangerous.

This, according to the officials, can be seen as a bigger threat as such explosives can be categorised d2d as they cannot be located with conventional detectors used by Road opening Party (RoP) or by sniffer dogs.

Liquid explosives were used by terror groups in south Kashmir during 2007, but after that, these were not seen during the decade of militancy that hit Jammu



and Kashmir. The officials said there had been intelligence inputs suggesting that Pakistanbased terror groups would now use liquid explosives.

In February 2022, Jammu and Kashmir Police had recovered arms and ammunition from the international border in Jammu which also contained three bottles of a white liquid being airdropped by drones entering from Pakistan. The liquid explosive material, white in colour, was packed in three one-litre bottles and was part of the consignment dropped by drones, which had taken flight from neighbouring

Pakistan, February 24, 2022. Pakistan's external swooping agency, the Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI), which has been providing tactical support to banned terror groups like the LeT, Jaish-e-Mohammed and the Hizbul Mujahideen, operating from across the border, has chosen the way of air-dropping weapons with the help of drones.



Soldier killed as Army vehicle falls into gorge

Rajouri/Jammu: An army personnel was killed and four others sustained injuries when their vehicle skidded off the road and rolled down into a gorge in Rajouri district of Jammu and Kashmir Thursday, officials said. The accident took place near Bhawani village near the Line of Control (LoC) in the Nowshera sector in the evening, they said. Rescuers took the five soldiers travelling in the vehicle to a hospital where one of them was declared brought dead.

NIA chargesheet against seven

New Delhi: The National Investigation Agency (NIA) Thursday filed charge sheet against seven persons for recruiting and radicalising vulnerable youths as "mujahideens" to operate as terrorist sleeper cells, an official statement said. They were part of a bigger conspiracy by proscribed terrorist organisation Islamic State of Iraq and Syria (ISIS) to prepare 50 such sleeper cells in each district of India by 2025,

3 more held in Renukaswamy murder case

Bangalore, June 13: Three people, including the close aide of Kannada star Darshan Thoogudeepa, were arrested in connection with the murder of Renukaswamy even as the police recovered CCTV footage showing the suspected abduction of the victim in a car.

According to police sources, Darshan's aide Nagaraj was looking after all the dealings of the actor.

He was also taking care of Darshan's farmhouse in Mysuru. Nagaraj was on the run ever since the police arrested Darshan,

his friend and actress Pavithra Gowda and 11 other henchmen. Sources did not divulge details about his co-star Pradosh's

role in the murder. Pradosh had appeared in minor roles in some movies in which Darshan was the lead actor. Another henchman identified as Ravi surrendered before the Deputy Superintendent of Police Thursday evening.

He is a resident of Kurubarahatti in the district headquarter town of Chitradurga, and was at large ever since the murder came to light. So far 16 people have been arrested including Darshan and Pavithra. Darshan and his gang were arrested in connection with the murder of Renukaswamy from Chitradurga on June 8 night for allegedly sending lewd messages to Pavithra. The victim's body was then dumped in a stormwater drain at Kamakshipalya police station limits. Police got to know about the murder when a food delivery boy alerted them about dogs eating the body of a man.

Three accused June 9 had approached police and confessed to having murdered Renukaswamy over a financial dispute.

As the investigation progressed, police learnt that the trio was trying to mislead the in-

RAIN WREAKS HAVOC IN SIKK

Gangtok, June 13: At least six people were killed and 1,500-odd tourists stranded as massive landslides triggered by incessant rainfall caused devastation in northern Sikkim's Mangan district, officials said Thursday.

A newly-constructed bailey bridge at Sangkalang collapsed snapping the link between Mangan with Dzongu and Chungthang. Landslides blocked stretches of roads and several houses were inundated or damaged, while electricity poles were swept away, they said.

Towns such as Dzongu, Chungthang, Lachen, and Lachung in Mangan district known for popular tourist spots like Gurudongmar Lake and Yunthang Valley have now been cut off from the rest of the country. "Three persons each died in Pakshep and Ambhithang villages, Mangan District Magistrate Hem Kumar Chettri said.



A number of houses were damaged in Gevthang and Nampathang. A relief camp has been set up at Pakshep for the displaced people, Chettri said.

The district magistrate also held a meeting with other officials to take stock of the situation following the incessant rainfall in and around Mangan District since Wednesday night and instructed them to carry out rescue and relief works.

Mobile network services were affected in North Sikkim even as a request was made by the district administration to send an SDRF team with ration to Mangan, the officials said. The collapsed bailey bridge at Sangkalang was constructed after the massive social flood in

last year. The authorities have asked the stranded tourists to stay where they are right now till alternative road connectivity could be set up for movement of vehicles, officials said.

The Mangan district administration has started works with several agencies to expeditiously construct a bridge at Phidang to restore connectivity in the region.

Sikkim Chief Minister Prem Singh Tamang, who is in Arunachal Pradesh to attend the swearing-in ceremony of BJP leader Pema Khandu, asked the administration, police and officials of various departments to ensure a swift response to the devastation

POCSO: Non-bailable arrest warrant against Yediyurappa Jarange suspends

Bangalore, June 13: A court here Thursday issued a non-bailable arrest warrant against former Chief Minister and senior BJP leader BS Yediyurappa in a POCSO case.

The Special Investigation Team of the Criminal Investigation Department (CID) had moved the First Fast Track court seeking an arrest warrant against him since he failed to appear for questioning Wednesday.

The BJP veteran, who is also a member of the party's parliamentary board, is presently in Delhi, and he is likely to join the probe after he returns, sources close to him have said. According to police, Yediyurappa has been booked under the POCSO Act and Section 354 A (Sexual harassment) of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) based on a complaint by the mother of a 17-year-old girl who alleged that he molested her daughter during a meeting February two this year, at his

residence in Dollars Colony here. The victim's brother had filed a petition in the court earlier this week alleging that though the case was registered March 14, no progress has been made in the investigation.

The petitioner prayed that Yediyurappa should be arrested and interrogated. After the Sadashivanagar police registered the case in March, the Karnataka Director General of Police Alok Mohan had issued an order transferring it to the CID for further investigation.

tions," Chandra said. The campaign slogan for this year's World Blood Donor Day will be "20 years of celebrating giving: Thank you, blood donors!", the secretary said, as

he suggested an action plan of activities to be organised at all central government ministries, hospitals, institutions and government and private medical

"The event will aim to maximise the registration of willing blood donors along with optimal blood collection," he said. The Union health secretary

urged them to spread awareness among rural masses by organising activities of felicitation of blood donors and pledge-taking ceremonies at the gram panchayat level. The pledge will be administered by the respective sarpanch.

Similar activities will be organised at the block and district level. The office of the district collector or district magistrate will be involved in supervising the entire activity in the concerned district, Chandra said.

A pledge in English or Hindi or regional language for blood donation will be administered through both physical events at the levels and digital platforms, Chandra said. The letter contained a template of the pledge in English and Hindi,

which he said will be translated into regional languages for wider dissemination. "To promote registration of

blood donors and create awareness, a facility for blood group testing may be made available 14th June, 2024 at all PHCs/CHCs/Sub-district and District Hospitals and other blood banks as per feasibility. It said the Chinese side reiterated that the "Jammu and Kashmir dispute is left over from history, and should be properly and peacefully resolved in accordance with the UN Charter, relevant UN Security Council resolutions and bilateral agreements". The MEA spokesperson also took strong note of the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) that featured in the joint statement. "The same joint statement also mentions activities and projects under the so-called China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC). some of which are in India's sovereign territory under forcible and illegal occupation by Pakistan," he said.

"We resolutely oppose and reject any moves by other countries to reinforce or legitimise Pakistan's illegal occupation of these territories, impinging on India's sovereignty and territorial integrity," he said.

What NEET-UG controversy is all about

New Delhi, June 13: Medical entrance exam NEET-UG with over 24 lakh candidates appearing for it has become a centre of controversy over allegations of several irregularities and has triggered protests across the country and a political slugfest. Here is an explainer on what has happened so far:

1. ALLEGED IRREGULARITIES

There have been allegations of inflation of marks in NEET-UG which has led to a record 67 candidates sharing top rank with perfect score. Last year. two students shared the top rank. Students have been alleging the marks have been randomly reduced or increased for several candidates, affecting their ranks. The grace marks awarded to over 1,500 students to compensate for loss of time for delay in exams at six centres is also under scanner.

There have been allegations of paper leak too. The Economic Offences Unit of Bihar Police had last month said that its investigation has revealed that the question papers and answers for NEET-UG were provided to approximately 35 aspirants before the May 5 exam. Thirteen individuals have been arrested so far in connection with the case.

2. WHY WERE STUDENTS AWARDED GRACE MARKS?

Students from at least six centres in Meghalaya, Haryana, Chhattisgarh, Surat and Chandigarh had complained about the loss of time during the exams. At these locations. the students did not get the full 3 hours and 20 minutes to write the exam due to administrative reasons, such as the distribu-

tion of the wrong question paper, torn OMR sheets, or delay in the distribution of OMR sheets.

A committee formed by the NTA investigated the matter and chose to use the formula devised and adopted by the apex court in a 2018 judgement, to address the loss of time faced by candidates. The loss of time was ascertained and such candidates were compensated with grace marks.

3. NTA'S STAND ON **ALLEGATIONS**

The National Testing Agency (NTA) has maintained that the sanctity of the exam has not been compromised. It has attributed the rise in the number of top scorers to increase in the competitiveness of the exam and increase in performance standards.

According to officials marks have been awarded to 1,563 candidates to compensate for the loss of time in line with the Supreme Court approved formula. Out of the 67 candidates who got 720 out of

720 marks, 44 are on account of the revision in one Answer Key of Physics, and six are on account of compensatory marks

for loss of time This adjustment aimed to address inconsistencies in NCERT textbooks, ensuring candidates were not disadvantaged by factual discrepancies.

Sixty-three cases of students using unfair means were reported in NEET-UG out of whom 23 have been debarred for varying periods.

4. EDUCATION MINISTRY'S STAND

The Ministry has set up a fourmember expert panel headed by former UPSC chairman to review the grace marks awarded to students. Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan has denied the allegations saying there is no evidence of paper leak and claims of corruption in NTA are unfounded.

5. POLITICAL SLUGFEST

The Congress has been demanding a Supreme Court-monitored probe into the NEET

Exam, asserting the anger in the country over the matter will "reverberate inside Parliament as well."

Shiv Sena leader Priyanka slammed Chaturvedi the Education Minister for defending NTA, claiming that the Bihar Police investigation has found a paper leak.

The Maharashtra government has sought immediate cancellation of the exam, alleging that its results have caused injustice to the students from the state.

Tamil Nadu Chief Minister MK Stalin said the trends from the latest NEET results have once again vindicated the DMK on its stand opposing the exam and reiterated that the entrance test goes against social justice and federalism.

6. SUPREME COURT'S STAND

The apex court has noted that the sanctity of NEET-UG, 2024 was affected and has refused to stay the counselling process for admissions. The NTA expert panel has told the court that the decision to give grace marks to 1,563 NEET-UG candidates for admission to MBBS BDS and others courses had been cancelled and they would be given an option to take a retest June 23

If the candidates do not wish to take up the retest then their earlier marks, minus the grace marks, will be given for the purposes of the results, it said.

The results of the retest will be declared June 30 and the counselling for admission in the MBBS, BDS, and other courses will start July 6.

Last year, we issued a record number of student visas, numbering 1,40,000, which has been a record...And, we will continue to focus on this area, as we go forward during this year," Andrabi told PTI.

Asked about the extent of the expected rise in student visas in 2024, he said, "It will be similar or in excess" to last year. America gives "high priority" to student visas because it knows people-to-people ties "last a lifetime," US envoy Eric Garcetti

had told PTI in an interview here late April. The US Embassy in statement said the number of Indians who choose to study in the US has increased significantly in the past three years.

In 2023, the US Mission to India issued "more student visas than in 2018, 2019, and 2020 combined.'

This "unprecedented growth" reflects the ongoing commitment by the US government to prioritise students and to facilitate their travel, even as the Mission met a 400 per cent rise in demand for all other visas between 2021 and 2023, it said.

EU fines Hungary

Brussels: The European Court of Justice ordered Hungary Thursday to pay a fine of 200 million euros and a further 1 million euros per day of delay for failing to comply with the bloc's asylum rules. The court had ruled in December 2020 that Hungary had failed to abide by the bloc's policies for granting international protection and returning illegal migrants. "In its judgment, the Court holds that Hungary has not taken the measures necessary to comply with the 2020 judgment," it said in a statement. "That failure, which consists in deliberately avoiding the application of a common EU policy as a whole, constitutes an unprecedented and extremely serious infringement of EU law.

Kuwait identifies bodies of 45 Indians, 3 Filipinos

Dubai, June 13: Kuwaiti authorities have identified the bodies of 45 Indians and three Filipino nationals killed in the tragic fire incident in a building housing foreign workers in the Gulf Kingdom, a top official said Thursday.

At least 49 foreign workers were killed and 50 others injured in the fire Wednesday at the seven-storey building where 196 migrant workers were staying in the southern city of Mangaf.

Sheikh Fahad Al-Yousuf Al-Sabah, serving as the First Deputy Prime Minister, Minister of Interior, and Minister of Defence, said that authorities have identified 48 bodies, among which 45 are of Indians and three are of Filipino nationality, English language daily Arab Times reported.

The efforts are still underway to determine the identity of one remaining body, said the first deputy Prime Minister.

Kuwaiti authorities are conducting DNA tests on the bodies of those killed in the devastating fire incident in southern Kuwait's Mangaf area and an Indian Air Force aircraft is on standby to bring back the mortal remains of Indians killed in the incident, officials said in New Delhi Thursday. Minister of State for External

Affairs Kirti Vardhan Singh, who reached Kuwait to oversee assistance to Indians injured in the fire and to ensure early repatriation of mortal remains of those killed, met Kuwait's Foreign Minister Abdullah Ali Al-Yahya who assured full support and vowed to promptly investigate the tragedy.

Singh also met some of the Indians injured in the massive fire and assured them all support from the Indian government.

Meanwhile, Sheikh Fahad Al-Yousuf Al-Sabah is heading an overall inspection campaign on illegal properties in many areas in Kuwait Thursday.

The Interior Ministry, Kuwait Municipality, Kuwait Fire Force, Ministry of Electricity and Water

The minister has warned that any building violation would be addressed without prior warning as of Thursday.

"As of Thursday, the Municipality and its teams will respond to all violations at all apartment buildings without prior warning," the minister told reporters while inspecting the fire site. The owner of the affected building will be kept in custody until investigations into the causes of the fire are over, the minister added.

Kuwait's Emir Sheikh Meshal Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber al-Sabah has issued directives for the distribution of financial assistance to the families of the deceased. Additionally, he has ordered the preparation of aircraft to repatriate the bodies of deceased Indians back to their homeland,

Meanwhile, Kuwait's public prosecutor has launched an investigation into the incident. The probe aims to uncover the circumstances behind the incident and what might have triggered the deadly fire, the public prosecutor said on X

Houthis rebel launch boat-borne bomb attack in Red Sea

Dubai, June 13: Yemen's Houthi rebels launched a boat-borne bomb attack against a commercial ship in the Red Sea Wednesday, authorities said, the latest escalation despite a USled campaign trying to protect the vital waterway.

The use of a boat loaded with explosives raised the spectre of 2000's USS Cole attack, a suicide assault by al-Qaida on the warship when it was at port in Aden, killing 17 on board.

Yemen's military spokesman Brig. Gen. Yahya Saree claimed responsibility for the attack, identifying the vessel targeted as the Liberian-flagged, Greekowned bulk carrier Tutor. He described the attack as using a "drone boat," as well as drones and ballistic missiles



The US military separately missile launchers in Houthiheld Yemen, as well as one rebel drone over the Red Sea. The Houthis launched two anti-ship ballistic missiles over the Red Sea, but they caused no damage, Central Command said. Houthis say the attacks are

aimed at stopping the war and supporting the Palestinians, though the attacks often target vessels that have nothing to do with the conflict.

The Houthis have launched more than 50 attacks on shipping, killed three sailors, seized one vessel and sunk another since November, according to the US Maritime Administration. A USled airstrike campaign has targeted the Houthis since January, with a series of strikes May 30 killing at least 16 people and wounding 42 others, the rebels say.

Hezbollah attacks military sites in Israel with rockets, drones

Beirut, June 13: Hezbollah said it had launched rockets and weaponised drones at nine Israeli military sites in a coordinated attack Thursday, ramping up hostilities on Lebanon's southern border for the second consecutive day.

The attacks were carried out in retaliation for an Israeli strike Tuesday that killed a senior Hezbollah field commander. A security source told Lebanon it was the largest attack waged by Hezbollah since October, when the group started exchanging fire with Israel in parallel with the Gaza war.

Hezbollah said in a statement



it had fired volleys of Katyusha and Falag rockets at six Israeli military locations. Its Al-Manar television reported more than

100 rockets fired at once. Hezbollah's statement said it had also launched attack drones at the headquarters of Israel's northern command, an intelligence headquarters and a military barracks.

London, June 13: A new set of laws governing the use of artificial intelligence (AI) in the European Union will force companies to be more transparent about the data used to train their systems, prying open one of the industry's most closely guarded

In the 18 months since Microsoft-backed OpenAI unveiled ChatGPT to the public, there has been a surge of public engagement and investment in generative AI, a set of applications that can be used to rapidly produce text, images, and audio content.

But as the industry booms, questions have been raised over how AI companies obtain the data used to train their models,

and whether feeding them bestselling books and Hollywood movies without their creators permission amounts to a breach of copyright.

The EU's recently-passed AI Act is being rolled out in phases over the next two years, giving regulators time to implement the new laws while businesses grapple with a new set of obligations. But how exactly some of these rules will work in practice is still unknown.

One of the more contentious sections of the Act states that organisations deploying general-purpose AI models, such as ChatGPT, will have to provide "detailed summaries" of the content used to train them. The newly established AI Office said it plans to release a template for organizations to

Amid growing scrutiny, tech companies have signed a flurry of content-licensing deals with media outlets and websites. Among others, OpenAI signed deals with the Financial Times and The Atlantic, while Google struck deals with NewsCorp social media site Reddit.


Despite such moves, OpenAI drew criticism in March when CTO Mira Murati declined to answer a question from the Wall Street Journal on whether YouTube videos had been used to train its video-generating tool Sora, which the company said would breach its terms and conditions.

Last month, OpenAI faced further backlash for featuring an AI-generated voice described as "eerily similar" to her own by actress Scarlett Johansson in a public demonstration of the newest version of ChatGPT.
















In a report titled Credit Conditions – Asia-Pacific H2 2024 Credit Outlook, Moody's Ratings said Indonesia, the Philippines and India led the way in terms of growth in first half of 2024 and should continue to outperform pre-Covid growth numbers on the back of rising exports, local demand and government spending on infrastructure.

"India will remain the region's fastest-growing economy, sustaining last year's domestically driven momentum. We anticipate policy continuity after the general election, and a continued focus on infrastructure development and encouragement of private sector investment," it said.

Moody's said stronger portfolio inflows are likely in India and ASEAN economies, because of robust corporate credit metrics and appealing valuations.

Last month, the rating agency projected India to grow 6.8 per cent in the current year, followed by 6.5 per cent in 2025, on the back of strong, economic expansion along with post-election policy continuity.

India's real GDP grew 7.7 per cent in 2023, up from 6.5 per cent in 2022, driven by robust capital spending by the government and strong manufacturing activity.

Reliance clears hurdle in bid to launch satellite internet

Bangalore, June 13: A joint venture between Reliance Industries' Jio Platforms and Luxembourg-based SES to provide gigabit fibre internet has won approval from the Indian space regulator to operate satellites there, a government executive said.

The three approvals issued to Orbit Connect India, opens new tab - which aims to provide satellite-based high-speed internet access - come as companies from Amazon.com to Elon Musk's Starlink have been vying for the go-ahead to launch satellite communication services in the world's most populous nation.

The authorisations have not been previously reported. They were granted in April and June from the Indian National Space Promotion and Authorisation

Centre, known as IN-SPACe. These allow Orbit Connect to operate satellites above India, but further approvals are needed by the country's department of telecoms to begin operations.

Inmarsat, another company hoping to provide high-speed satellite-based internet, has also gotten approval to operate satellites over India, IN-SPACe chairman Pawan Goenka told Reuters. Two other companies, Elon Musk's Starlink Amazon.com's Kuiper have ap-

Eutelsat's Bharti Enterprisesbacked OneWeb was given all of its approvals late last year.

Amazon plans to invest \$10 billion in Kuiper, which was announced in 2019, the year SpaceX began deploying its first operational Starlink satellites.

Last week, Sri Lanka gave Starlink preliminary approval to



provide internet services there. Goenka said the more companies were involved in the sector in India, the better off consumers would be. "Comparatively low pricing

India's satellite broadband service market is expected to grow 36% per year over the next five years and reach \$1.9 billion by 2030

of communication services in India will compel global players to drive innovation to reduce their pricing," said Goenka, the former managing director of automaker Mahindra & Mahindra.

New York, June 13: He is wreaking havoc with the ball these days but India pacer Arshdeep Singh is still not quite satisfied. He wants to become a reliable lower-order batter as well, for which he is putting in the hard yards with batting coach Vikram Rathour.

"It can be two runs, four runs, anything. So, you just have to give your best. And I am trying to work as hard as possible with Vikram bhai regarding my batting as well," Arshdeep added.

Arshdeep came in at No.9 in the high-voltage game against Pakistan here June 9. He scored nine off 13 deliveries before being run out. The left-arm pacer said he insisted on going ahead of Jasprit Bumrah in that match.

"...Jassi Bhai (Bumrah) was supposed to go before me, but I just went in after asking Rohit (Sharma). They were surprised

it, but I told them I will go up regardless of whatever you he revealed

"I will go at No. 9 because I faced the quickest bowlers in the last game. So yeah, that's the plan now. I am very confident about my batting. And be it fielding or bowling, you just try to keep getting better," the Punjab pacer asserted.

Arshdeep said adapting to conditions across varied venues will be crucial to success as the tournament goes on.

'The main thing is how we adapt to the conditions and to the situations. If there is help in the wicket, we try to get early wickets and restrict the opposition to a low total and if we are batting first, we try to make as many as possible and give the bowlers good enough chance to restrict the opposi-

With three wins in a row, the tournament co-hosts qualified

for the Super Eight stage, while over following back-to-back losses. They had earlier lost to Afghanistan by 84 runs after being shot out for 75. The 2021 runners-up, among the most consistent sides in World Cups, have been found wanting this time.

They made the semifinals in the 2015, 2019 and 2023 editions of the ODI World Cup, and in 2016, 2021 and 2022, the Black Caps ensured a last-four ap-

pearance in the T20 World Cups. "It was fantastic. I was sitting there with Nicholas (Pooran) and it was such a beautiful night for someone to stand up and be counted," skipper Rovman Powell said. "That (Rutherford) innings gave us confidence and belief. It is only the start of something big to come. Hopefully we can continue the momentum," added Rutherford on making the Super Eight.

Kiwi skipper Kane Williamson rung in three changes to the line-up beaten convincingly by Afghanistan and the intent was clear when Trent Boult (3/16) dismissed Johnson Charles (0) in the first over.

Wickets continued to fall at regular intervals and soon the West Indies were 23/4 at the end of the power play.

But Rutherford had other ideas and played one of the best innings of his career. The 25-yearold Guvanese all-rounder hung around before turning up the heat in the final five overs, blasting five sixes and two fours.

In reply, New Zealand got off to a poor start and lost both their openers – Devon Conway (5) and Finn Allen (26) – in the power play.

Thereafter left-arm spinner Motie foxed the Kiwi batters before Joseph turned on the heat with his four-wicket haul. Motie dismissed both Rachin Ravindra

(10) and Williamson (1). Glenn Phillips kept the Kiwi hopes alive with his 33-ball 40 before being dismissed by Joseph. EUROPE BRACES FOR SOCCER FEST

HOSTS GERMANY FACE SCOTTISH CHALLENGE ON OPENING DAY IN MUNICH

Munich, June 13: Euro 2024 football tournament kicks off Friday in Germany as the continent's footballing heavyweights prepare to fight it out over the next month with the aim of taking the crown away from reigning champions Italy. Germany play Scotland in the opening game here Friday and the host nation are hoping their journey will continue all the way to the final July 14 in Berlin.

Euro 2020 was delayed by a year because of the pandemic, finally taking place in 2021 in front of limited crowds. Hence the tournament lost much of its charm. This time all supporters will descend on Germany, where matches will be played in 10 stadiums, from Hamburg in the north to this city in the south.

Philipp Lahm, the captain of Germany's 2014 World Cup-win-

ning team and now Euro 2024 tournament director, hopes the competition will bring people together at a time of division and disunity across the continent.

"I hope at the very least the Euro will lead to a more united Germany again," said Lahm.

A good performance by Germany on the field would help, and the outlook is more positive for Julian Nagelsmann's team now than a few months ago.

The group also has Hungary

and Switzerland. However, it should be easy for the hosts to top the group and qualify given the quality in Germany's ranks, from veteran playmaker Toni Kroos to younger stars Florian Wirtz and Jamal Musiala.

"We have gone through difficult phases as a national team, but something big can happen here," Musiala, of Bayern Munich was quoted saying Thursday by Sportbild.

However, there are good reasons

why France and England are so strongly fancied to raise aloft the Henri Delaunay trophy July 14.

France are Europe's top-ranked nation and have been in the last two World Cup finals. Fresh from sealing his move to Real Madrid, Kylian Mbappe is eager to make up for a disappointing showing at the last Euros

"Kylian is our captain and a great leader. We will need him to be at his best," admitted France coach Didier Deschamps when the team arrived here Tuesday.

England have never been European champions, although they came mightily close in 2021 when they lost the final on penalties to Italy. Optimism about their prospects this time is fueled by the fact that star players Harry Kane, of Bayern, and Jude Bellingham, formerly of Borussia Dortmund, should feel so at home on German soil. "We want to make history," said England midfielder Declan Rice this week.
