

POLICEMAN DIES IN CRACKER EXPLOSION

Cuttack: A policeman died Friday when seized firecrackers exploded during disposal on the bank of Kathaiodi river in Cuttack, officials said. The policemar Havildar Pradip Malick, who was a resident of Jagatpur, died on the spot. Additional DCP Anil Kumar Mishra said Malick had been serving the police department for 24 years and recently ioined the bomb disposal squad, he said. Mishra said that a team of investigators was examining the spot to determine the circumstances leading to the accident.

Wholesale inflation at **15-month high of 2.61%**

New Delhi, June 14: The wholesale inflation rose to a 15-month high of 2.61 per cent in May, as heatwave conditions pushed up prices of food items, specially vegetables, and on costlier manufactured products.

The wholesale price index (WPI) based inflation has been rising for three months in a row. It was 1.26 per cent in the previous month and (-) 3.61 per cent in May 2023. "Positive rate of inflation in May, 2024 is primarily due to increase in prices of food articles, manufacture of food products, crude petroleum & natural gas, mineral oils, other manufacturing etc," the Ministry of Commerce & Industry said in a statement Friday.

The May WPI print is at a 15month high. The last high was seen in February, 2023, when inflation was 3.85 per cent.

As per the data, inflation in food articles rose to a 10-month high of 9.82 per cent in May.

Inflation in vegetables was 32.42 per cent in May, up from 23.60 per cent in the previous month. Onion inflation was at 58.05 per cent, while potato was 64.05 per cent. Pulses inflation rose 21.95 per cent in May.

Jaipur, June 14: In hard-hitting remarks on the outcome of the Lok sabha polls, RSS leader Indresh Kumar has slammed the ruling BJP for 'arrogance' and the Opposition INDIA bloc for being 'anti-Ram'.

Speaking at the 'Ramrath Ayodhya Yatra Darshan Poojan Samaroh' at Kanota near Jaipur Thursday, the RSS national executive member did not men-

tion the rivals by name but suggested that the poll outcome reflected their attitudes

'The party which did the bhakti (of Lord Ram) but became arrogant was stopped at 241 but it was made the biggest party," Kumar said, in an apparent reference to the BJP which got 240 seats in the Lok Sabha elections.

"And those who had no faith in Ram, they together were stopped at 234," he said, apparently referring to the Opposition

INDIA bloc. "See the 'Vidhan' of Ram Rajya in democracy; those who did Bhakti of Ram but gradually turned arrogant, that party emerged as the biggest party, but the vote and power that should have been given was stopped by God due to their arrogance," he said.

'Those who opposed Ram, none of them was given power. Even all of them together were made number two. God's justice is true and enjoyable," the RSS leader said.

He said Lord Ram does not discriminate and does not punish. 'Ram does not make anyone lament. Ram gives justice to everyone. He gives and will keep on giving. Lord Ram was always just and will remain so," Kumar said.

Meanwhile, the RSS Friday sought to quell the suggestions of its rift with the BJP and that Bhagwat's recent critical references related to the Lok Sabha polls were aimed at the ruling party, insisting that such claims are just speculation meant to create confusion.

A vacation bench of justices Vikram Nath and Sandeep Mehta, which was hearing a batch of pleas including a PIL filed by Hiten Singh Kashyap, also sought responses from the CBI and the Bihar government within two weeks. "Don't make unnecessary emotional arguments here," Justice Nath said.

Responding to the submission for ordering a CBI probe, the bench said the reply of the NTA

The Centre and the National Testing Agency (NTA) had Thursday told the Supreme Court they had cancelled the grace marks given to 1,563 candidates who took the examination for admission to MBBS and other such courses They will have the option to either take a re-test or forgo the compensatory marks awarded to them for the loss of time, the Centre had said.

The examination was held May 5 across 4,750 centres and around 24 lakh candidates took it. The results were expected to be declared June 14 but were announced June 4, apparently because the evaluation of the answer sheets got completed earlier. There have been allegations of

question paper leaks in states like Bihar and other irregularities in the prestigious exam.

The allegations have led to protests in several cities and filing of cases in seven high courts as also the Supreme Court.

Booker winner Arundhati Roy to be prosecuted under UAPA

New Delhi, June 14: Delhi Lt Governor VK Saxena has accorded sanction to prosecute author Arundhati Roy and a former professor in Kashmir under the stringent Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act for allegedly making provocative speeches at an event here in 2010, Raj Niwas officials said Friday.

The FIR against Roy and former Central University of Kashmir professor Sheikh Showkat Hussain was registered following the orders of the Court of Metropolitan Magistrate, New Delhi, they added. There was no immediate reaction from Roy and Hussain.

The FIR in the matter was registered on a complaint made by Sushil Pandit, a social activist from Kashmir, October 28, 2010.

"Delhi Lt Governor VK Saxena has sanctioned the prosecution of Arundhati Roy and former Professor of International Law in Central University of Kashmir, Dr. Sheikh Showkat Hussain, under section 45(1) of Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act in the case," a Raj Niwas official said Friday.

Roy and Hussain had allegedly made provocative speeches at a conference organised under the banner of 'Azadi - The Only Way' October 21, 2010 at LTG Auditorium, Copernicus Marg, here. Those who delivered speeches at the conference included Syed Ali Shah Geelani, SAR Geelani (prime accused in Parliament attack case), Arundhati Roy, Dr. Sheikh Showkat Hussain and

tologist Richard Fortey in his book about the evolution of life. He was talking about Encephalartos woodii (E. woodii), a plant from South Africa. E. woodii is a member of the cycad family, heavy plants with thick trunks and large stiff leaves that form a majestic crown. These resilient survivors have outlasted dinosaurs and multiple mass extinctions. Once widespread, they are today one of the most threat-

ened species on the planet. The only known wild E. Woodii was discovered in 1895 by the botanist John Medley Wood while he was on a botanical expedition in the Ngoye Forest in South Africa. He searched the vicinity

for others, but none could be

found. Over the next couple of decades, botanists removed stems and offshoots and cultivated them in gardens.

Fearing that the final stem would be destroyed, the Forestry Department removed it from the wild in 1916 for safekeeping in a protective enclosure in Pretoria, South Africa, making it extinct in the wild. The plant has since been propagated worldwide. However, the E. woodii faces an existential crisis. All the plants are clones from the Ngoye specimen. They are all males, and without a female, natural reproduction is impossible. E. woodii's story is one of both survival and solitude.

Cycads are the oldest surviving plant groups alive today and are often referred to as 'living fossils' or 'dinosaur plants'



due to their evolutionary history dating back to the Carboniferous period, approximately 300 million years ago. During the Mesozoic era (250-66 million years ago), also known as the Age of Cycads, these plants were ubiquitous, thriving in the warm, humid climates that characterised the period.

Although they resemble ferns or palms, cycads are not related to either. Cycads are gymnosperms, a group that includes conifers and ginkgos. Unlike flowering plants (angiosperms), cycads reproduce using cones. It is impossible to tell male and female apart until they mature and produce their magnificent cones.

Female cones are typically wide and round, and male cones appear elongated and narrower. The male cones produce pollen, which is carried by insects (weevils) to the female cones. This ancient method of reproduction has remained largely unchanged for millions of years.

Despite their longevity, today cvcads are ranked as the most endangered living organisms on Earth with the majority of the species considered threatened with extinction.

Finding a female would mean E. woodii is no longer at the brink of extinction and could revive the species. A female would allow for sexual reproduction, bring in genetic diversity, and signify a breakthrough – in conservation efforts.

Separately, two private member Bills moved in Rajya Sabha have been removed from the list of pending private members' Bills as while one of the members Ram Nath Thakur has been inducted in the Union Council of Ministers and Biplab Deb has been elected to Lok Sabha and ceases to represent the Upper House. Earlier, another Bill, which aimed to bring uniformity in the age of marriage for men and women, had lapsed as it was pending in Lok Sabha since its introduction in December 2021. The Prohibition of Child Marriage (Amendment) Bill, 2021 was introduced in Lok Sabha in December 2021 and was referred to the standing committee on Education, Women, Children, Youth and Sports.

A Rajya Sabha bulletin issued Thursday said 'The Inter-State Water Disputes River (Amendment) Bill, 2019', passed by Lok Sabha and pending in Rajya Sabha, has lapsed under clause (5) of Article 107 of the Constitution, following the dissolution of 17th Lok Sabha.

The amendment Bill was introduced in Lok Sabha July 25, 2019, by then minister of Jal Shakti Gajendra Singh Shekhawat.

The Bill sought to amend the Inter-State River Water Disputes Act, 1956, which addresses the ad-

According to the original Act, a state government can request the Union to refer an interstate river dispute to a tribunal for adjudication.

If the Central government believes the dispute cannot be resolved through negotiations, it is required to establish a water disputes tribunal within a year of receiving the complaint. The 2019 Bill proposes to replace this mechanism.

Under the amendment bill, when a state raises a water dispute, the Central government

7 IN EVERY 100 ELDERLY FACED ABUSES: ST CM holds 1st meet with Secys

Bhubaneswar, June 14: Seven in every 100 elderly persons faced abuses of various forms, while one in every three elderly persons didn't earn a penny in the past one year, according a study by the HelpAge India.

They include 37 per cent in the age group of 80 and above, and 36 per cent in the age group of 71-79

The report of the pan-India study conducted in 20 Tier I and Tier II cities across 10 states in the country was released during a function on the eve of the World Elder Abuse Awareness Day', at the Centre for Youth and Social Development here Friday.

As per the study, only around 15 per cent of elderly persons (60 and above) reported currently working.

A small proportion of the elderly (29 per cent) reported having access to social security schemes such as old-age pension, contributory pension and provident fund.

Bharati Chakra of HelpAge India said, "Awareness on the issue of elder abuse cannot be created only by discussion. Strong initiatives have to be taken with large number of youth involvement. To bring change and improve the condition of the elderly, we have to take each and every problem of theirs into consideration.

Loneliness is one of the major



issues faced by the senior citizens having a serious effect on their overall health and quality of life. It can be overcome by encouraging communities and their own people to reach out them and provide companionship and support to them, she said.

As per the study, more than half of elderly persons (52 per cent) reported facing at least one challenge related to activities of daily living (ADL). Around 54 per cent elderly female reported facing at least one difficulty related to ADL, which is marginally higher than the male respondents.

Majority of the respondents in the age group of 70-79 (63 per cent) and 80 and above (71 per cent) reported facing difficulties related to ADL

On the digital empowerment front, 59 per cent of those surveyed had no access to gadgets. The most common device being used was smartphones.

Amongst those using of digital devices, 34 per cent of all elderly surveyed used them for entertainment and social media regularly, very often or sometimes.

Women with epilepsy face a rollercoaster of symptoms

bout 50 million people globally have epilepsy. Half of these are women. Until now, treatments for men and women have been identical. But men and women experience epilepsy differently.

For women, fluctuating hormones - spanning from the reproductive years, to pregnancy, perimenopause and menopause - can affect the frequency of seizures at multiple stages in their lives

What is epilepsy?

In people without epilepsy, the brain's overall electrical activity is stable. Signals acting on the neurons (brain cells) allow a fine balancing act between excitation (increased brain electrical activity) and inhibition (reduced brain electrical activity)

However, in epilepsy this balance is disrupted. When there is a burst of uncontrolled electri-

cal activity, some or all the neurons are temporarily over-excited or are "in overdrive". This leads to a seizure (or fit).

This disruption can occur unpredictably a bit like an earthquake, where the seizure comes out of the blue and then generally stops abruptly.

Epilepsy can severely affect people's quality of life. People with epilepsy also face an increased risk of premature death not only from the epilepsy itself but from other complications of seizures, and from suicide.

What part do hormones play? The hormones oestrogen and

progesterone are made in the ovaries and brain. Whether or not a woman has epilepsy, levels of these hormones fluctuate throughout her life. But having epilepsy can also affect the production of oestrogen and progesterone.

In general, oestrogen signals



more electrical activity and progesterone signals less. The ratio of these two hormones is important for the fine balance of electrical activity in the brain. But an unfavourable ratio dis-

rupts the balance, leading to a rollercoaster of symptoms.

Some specific anti-seizure

medications can also alter this ratio by reducing levels of oestrogen and progesterone.

Take the example of "catamenial epilepsy", which one study shows affects about half of women with epilepsy.

What should we be doing?

We need to better understand if we can reduce the frequency of seizures with progesterones during certain times in the menstrual cycle. We also need to better understand if oestrogens (in menopausal replacement therapy, also known as hormone replacement therapy or HRT) can make seizures worse in later life.

If we do not research the influence of hormonal fluctuations on epilepsy, we risk not treating the specific trigger of many women's seizures.

Roughly 30 per cent of women with epilepsy do not respond to drug treatment. However, we do know seizures play an enormous role in adding to the burden of this disease. And that burden can be improved by better treating the seizures

Rainagar, June 14: An area meas uring 497.67 sq. km with an extent of 0.10 km to 8.7 km around the boundary of Bhitarkanika National Park, Bhitarkanika Wildlife Sanctuary and Gahirmatha (Marine) Wildlife Sanctuary has been declared as Eco-sensitive Zone (ESZ).

The Union Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEF&CC) of the Central government had issued a draft notification September 6, 2023, which was published June 9, 2024. As per the notification, proposals, objections and suggestions are invited within 60 days of publication as it will come into force thereafter. This has pushed residents of as many as 205 villages in the ESZ to a state of panic and apprehension.

Two sent to jail for poaching wild boar

A team of Forest personnel led by the ranger conducted a raid and managed to nab the two persons while they were trying to distribute the wild boar meat at the backyard of Samal's house. Rourkela, June 14: With the BJP coming to power in Odisha, hopes have once more surfaced that elections to the Rourkela Municipal Corporation (RMC) will be held soon. Elections for office-bearers of the RMC were last held in 2008. The term of the office-bearers ended in 2013 and since then elections have not been conducted for more than nine years. This has affected the functioning of the

RMC, locals pointed out. BJP candidate in the recentlyconcluded Assembly elections in Odisha, Dilip Ray, had during his campaign asserted that if his party comes to power in the state, RMC elections will be con-

ducted soon. Even though Ray lost to BJD's Sarada Prasad Nayak, the BJP has come to power in the state. The question is whether the new government will take the initiative to hold elections to various positions in the RMC. Despite his defeat, Ray has time and again reiterated that elections to the RMC should be held as it will be beneficial for this town

However, there are hindrances that are preventing RMC elections. One of the major issues is the inclusion of tribal villages in the RMC. The BJD government in 2013 had upgraded the Rourkela Municipality to Corporation. Then through a notification issued by the Urban Development Ministry, it had brought six peripheral villages under the RMC. This led to massive protests by the tribals living in those villages.

Following the massive protests the ministry removed four of the six villages from the jurisdiction of the RMC. However, that did not satisfy the agitators led by local leader George Tirkey, who was then in the opposition. He moved the Orissa High Court on this issue and in an order dated March 17, 2015, it stayed the notification of the ministry.

Since then the matter is pending in court. As the issue is still sub-judice, elections to the RMC cannot be conducted, officials in know of things pointed out. Rebel BJP candidate Nihar Ray informed that he has also moved the court so that elections to the various posts in the RMC are conducted. However, there has not been any development in the case so far, he added.

Minor girl killed in lightning strike

Pottangi, June 14: In a tragic incident amid Raja festivities, a minor girl died after being struck by lightning at Bundulpadu village under Ralegada panchayat and this block in Koraput district, Friday.



The deceased was identified as Maria Tamal, daughter of Ramachandra Tamal, a resident of Bundulpadu village.

Coalition Dynamics

The political dynamics have shifted with the entry of coalition dharma, and as Prime Minister Narendra Modi starts his third term as head of the NDA government, there is hope as well as trepidation among babus about the potential changes within the ministries and departments. Who is in and who is out? But all eyes are on the Prime Minister's Office (PMO), which has been an invincible force during Modi's two previous tenures.

Now that the Cabinet has been formed and portfolios allocated, with major ministries retained by old trusted hands, it is clear that the big message of the exercise is continuity. This theme will likely be reflected in the composition of the PMO as well. Observers believe that trusted officers from the Gujarat cadre may largely remain intact. These officers, who have served under Modi during his tenure as Chief Minister in Gujarat, are expected to continue due to the deep trust and familiarity they share with the Prime Minister.

But the recent electoral setback in Uttar Pradesh could prompt a reassessment, some feel. Arvind Sharma, a Gujarat cadre IAS officer who has been Modi's key liaison with Yogi Adityanath in Lucknow, might be called back to the PMO during this period of reevaluation.

Names of trusted aides Cabinet Secretary Rajiv Gauba and Comptroller and Auditor General G.C. Murmu are reported to be under scrutiny. Their long tenures in their high offices may soon come to an end as part

of a broader strategy to infuse fresh perspectives into the government. The coalition angle has further complicated the scenario, with even the Speaker's post now in contention. Any movement will significantly impact the functioning of various



key institutions over the new NDA government's tenure.

Still, despite the current uncertainty, most observers expect that the core team handling communications, secretarial work and policy matters will likely remain stable. The expertise of these officers and continuity are crucial factors for maintaining continuity and efficiency during this tumultuous period.

Babus on edge after TDP victory in Andhra Pradesh

As N. Chandrababu Naidu, the TDP national president, has assumed charge of Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh after an overwhelming win for the TDP-led alliance (including JSP and BJP), several IAS and IPS officers who haven't exactly been TDP-friendly are feeling the heat

Naidu, often hailed for his visionary leadership and technological prowess, is known for his administrative acumen and forward-thinking approach. His return to power is being seen by many as a herald of renewed progress and efficiency. Already, changes are underway.

The first major change is the appointment of Special Chief Secretary Neerabh Kumar Prasad as the new Chief Secretary, replacing K.S. Jawahar Reddy who was asked to take a leave of absence. And he's not alone-several IPS officers who handled key cases against top TDP leaders are also reportedly on edge. This includes names like P.S.R. Anjaneyulu, P.V. Sunil Kumar, N. Sanjay, Kanthi Rana Tata, Kolli Raghuram Reddy, Y. Ravi Sankar Reddy, and Y. Rishant Reddy, along with another senior IAS officer, S.S. Rawat.

Sources informed DKB that initially, Naidu wasn't too keen on meeting IPS officers like Raghuram Reddy and Anjaneyulu without appointments. It is also almost certain that the new administration is planning to transfer all district Collectors, Superintendents of Police, Commissioners of Police, and other senior officials. With this looming, officials are reportedly lobbying for favourable postings through Naidu's close contacts

Meanwhile, senior IAS officers are also eyeing positions in the Chief Minister's Office as secretaries-Principal Secretaries, and Special Chief Secretaries. The shake-up is proceeding well.

High voltage drama: Babu ex-couple in power struggle

There's some high drama unfolding in Thaiyur, Tamil Nadu. Justice Anitha Sumanth has put a hold on the decision regarding former Director General of Police (DGP) Raiesh Das' plea to restore power to a bungalow. This isn't just any bungalow-both Das and his estranged wife, Tamil Nadu Energy Secretary Beela Venkatesan, are laying claim to it! Earlier this week, the lawyer representing Venkatesan argued that Das has no right to demand the power be turned back on. After all, it was disconnected at Venkatesan's request. He also mentioned that Das had been MIA for two months before suddenly resurfacing and trying to take over the property. To add to the interest, there's even a criminal case against Das for trespassing and allegedly assaulting the security guard. On the flip side, the lawyer representing the ex-DGP argued that despite the land being in Venkatesan's name, Das has been footing the bill for the housing loan and living there all along. When the judge suggested mediation. Venkatesan's counsel promptly declined.

flooding occur. These events reduced crop yield, livestock productivity, and made millions of people poor and food insecure. In India, a 1.5° C temperature rise and 2 mm precipitation decrease rice yield by 3% to 15%. Excessive fertiliser and chemical use degrades and erodes soil. This makes the soil more susceptible to pests and diseases. Soil nutrient deficiency has slowed productivity. In addition, improper land use practices and crop residue burning during harvest season have caused soil erosion, which has had lasting effects on agricultural productivity and sustainability.

Lack of agricultural infrastructure like storage, pack houses, and efficient supply chains increases post-harvest losses in India. Lack of road and rail connectivity hinders farmers' market access and raises production costs. The Indian agricultural sector uses primitive agri-technologies to produce goods. Modern technologies are scarce, making it difficult to adopt innovative agricultural practices.

Farmers in rural areas often have trouble getting loans and credit due to a lack of banks. Exorbitant interest rates and limited formal credit also reduce farmer productivity. This

prevents them from adopting modern farming methods, managing market risks, and promoting sustainable agriculture. In India, landholdings are fragmented, so individuals own small amounts of land. This makes modern farming and economies of scale difficult.

Agriculture still uses sickles and wooden ploughs, indicating insufficient mechanisation. Largescale production requires a shift from traditional to modern methods. Farmers depend on local traders and intermediaries to sell their produce at low prices due to poor agricultural marketing infrastructure. The Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare estimates that rainfed rice yields in India will decrease by 20% in 2050 and 47% in 2080 without adaptation measures. Also, irrigated rice yields are expected to drop 3.5% in 2050 and 5% in 2080. Climate change reduces crop yields and nutrition. Droughts and flash floods reduce food and nutrient consumption, worsening farmer welfare. The State of Food Security and Nutrition in the World (2020) report states that India produced 314 million metric tonnes of food in 2021-22, but this is not enough to meet food security and the Global Goals for Adaptation.

To overcome these ever-changing challenges, the Indian government has developed climateadaptive agriculture strategies. The National Action Plan on Climate Change includes the National Mission for Sustainable

Agriculture (NMSA). Its goal is to develop and implement climate change adaptation strategies for Indian agriculture. Climate-resilient agricultural adaptation strategies must be prioritised. These practices should improve agricultural productivity to meet global and food security goals, strengthen agri $cultural\, systems' climate\, change$ resilience, and reduce green-

house gas emissions to mitigate

climate risks. India must use a variety of adaptation strategies and climate-resilient practices to address climate change challenges. Technology for adaptation reduces climate change susceptibility or improves resilience. Technologies for adaptation involve identifying and assessing agricultural practices and technologies that boost productivity, food security, and resilience in specific agro-ecological zones and farming systems.

The government must also build capacity to adapt to and mitigate climate change in any policy. The Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development recommends increasing absorptive capacity, a system's ability to handle immediate climate impacts. This includes early warning systems to help farmers adapt and crop insurance to cover losses. For productivity to increase, infrastructure capacity must be climate-resilient. To reduce post-

harvest losses, the government

should build and improve stor-

age facilities.

Agriculture needs soil management to adapt to climate change, strengthen soil, and promote sustainable farming. To achieve these goals, the government should mandate diverse soil management. Methodical crop rotation can also improve soil health by increasing organic matter and decreasing the need for fertilisers and chemicals.

Water management and agricultural policies and investments are essential for climate-resilient agriculture production systems Groundwater sustainability requires regulatory, economic, and collective strategies. Because aquifers are the world's largest water reservoirs, they support irrigated agriculture in key production areas. Water policies include allocation systems that manage demand and supply in response to precipitation.

Policy formulation addresses local, regional, national, and international adaptation principles with strategies and guidelines. These policies aim to replicate adaptation factors across scales. Past experiences with agricultural adaptation technologies have shown that effective policies and recommendations are needed to successfully implement these technologies to adapt agriculture to climate change.

Despite these strategies adapting to climate change has many benefits that mitigate its effects. These benefits include energy efficiency, reduced urban energy and water usage from greening and recycling, sustainable farming, and ecosystem preservation. India's agriculture sector needs technological advances, optimal resource use, policy restructuring, and capability enhancement to overcome its challenges. These adaptation strategies can help India achieve the Sustainable Development Goals by increasing agricultural productivity and food security.

ighty years ago, delegates from 44 countries gathered ∠in Bretton Woods. New Hampshire, to coordinate reconstruction in the aftermath of World War II and promote international economic cooperation. The institutions for which they laid the groundwork - the International Monetary Fund and the World Bank - stand at the heart of the global monetary and financial order.

In recent years, however, climate change and the COVID-19 pandemic have laid bare just how out of step these institutions are with changing global economic realities and development priorities. If the international community is to have a chance of addressing twentyfirst-century challenges effectively and equitably, the global economic and financial architecture must be reformed. Here're a few priorities stand out.

First, developing economies must be given greater voice in multilateral institutions. As has been widely recognized, global economic power has shifted significantly since 1944, with emerging markets and developing

economies carrying far more weight. Quotas and voting systems at the Bretton Woods institutions, however, are still skewed heavily in favor of the advanced economies. Moreover, a 'gentlemen's agreement' whereby a European leads the IMF and an American leads the World Bank persists.

This state of affairs not only undermines the Bretton Woods institutions' legitimacy; it also impedes their ability to meet the urgent and complex challenges of our time. That is why quotas and voting shares must be reallocated – a change that the advanced economies, especially the United States, have so far resisted – and a 'double-majority leadership-selection procedure should be adopted. In such a system, successful candidates would have to obtain both a majority of weighted votes (which reflect countries' shares in the institution) and the support of a ma-

jority of member countries. Second, the Global Financial Safety Net (GFSN) - the network of institutions that provide critical financing in times of crisis -must be strengthened and made

more responsive to the needs of developing economies facing evolving climate and macroeconomic risks. As it stands, the GFSN not only falls far short in terms of the amount of support it provides, it also suffers from built-in structural inequalities that leave developing countries more exposed. A bigger, more equitable GFSN would better safeguard countries against cli-

mate shocks and other crises, freeing up resources to foster development locally

Third, an international mechanism must be established to deliver fair and swift resolutions to sovereign-debt crises. Work on such a sovereign-debt workout mechanism – including an institution that is independent from creditors and debtors (crucial to ensure fair treatment) should begin now. But near-term solutions will also be needed to tackle the sovereign-debt crisis that is currently obstructing development in the Global South, as it hampers critical investments in climate action and the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

be vastly scaled up, and all public and private financial flows including lending by international financial institutions must be aligned with the goals set out in the Paris climate agreement. International standardsetting bodies must commit to addressing climate-related financial risks and supporting this 'Paris alignment.

Last but not the least, international, national, and subnational development banks must be strengthened. Climate-change adaptation and mitigation will require huge amounts of investment, and there are limits to what commercial financial institutions can do.

Therefore, public development banks and funds must play a much larger role in financing structural transformation and sustainable development.

Heatwave hits Delhi street vendors

50% SHOPKEEPERS REPORT SIGNIFICANT INCOME LOSS DUE TO EXTREME HEA

PRESS TRUST OF INDIA

New Delhi, June 14: Over 80 per cent of the street vendors surveyed in Delhi reported a decline in customers during heatwave days in April and May, and around 50 per cent experienced significant income loss, according to a new report by the think tank Greenpeace India and the National Hawker Federation.

The study, involving 721 street vendors, was conducted in April and May in various locations including Meena Bazaar, Old Delhi Railway Station area, Red Fort area, Nehru Place, Guru Tegh Bahadur Nagar, Karol Bagh, India Gate, Janpath, Chandni Chowk, Sadar Bazar Road, Saket, Sarojini Market, among others.

Data from over 700 respondents highlight the devastating impact on their health, productivity and livelihoods. We demand immediate government intervention, including the establishment of heat shelters in markets with essential facilities, safety kits, and institutional support for the most vulnerable, said Sandeep Verma, Convener of the National Hawker Federation Delhi.

80.08 per cent of street vendors observed a decline in customer numbers during heatwaves. 49.27 per cent of them have been experiencing a loss of income due to extreme climatic conditions, the report said.



A large number of respondents experienced health issues due to the hot weather. Irritability was the most common issue, affecting 73.44 per cent of respondents, followed by headaches (66.93 per cent), dehydration (67.46 per cent), sunburn (66.53 per cent), fatigue (60.82 per cent), and muscle cramps (57.37 per cent).

Seven out of eight women street vendors reported experiencing high blood pressure, while women in the middle age group raised concerns about delays in their menstrual cycles due to the extreme heat.

All the women who participated in the study reported that



Women working as street vendors, tea estate workers, and 'safai sathis' in low-paid precarious occupations are on the streets exposed to extreme heat. Their productivity is impacted, and they are exposed to illnesses. For women, sustenance tasks like fetching water; fuel wood, and fodder take longer and impact their health. Pregnant women can face issues of stillbirth and

miscarriages, she said. The participants also flagged the issue of children in their

families exhibiting symptoms like vomiting, diarrhoea, and nosebleeds, further complicating the vendors' challenges

The study found that a majority (71.05 per cent) of street vendors struggled to get medical care due to financial constraints.

Around 20 per cent said they could not afford healthcare at all. Only 27 per cent could afford healthcare without compromising other household necessities.

India experienced multiple intense and prolonged heatwaves in April and May which tested the limits of human endurance and the country's disaster preparedness, with many states, including Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, and Odisha, reporting heatwave related deaths.

According to the India Meteorological Department, 14 of the 36 sub-divisions in the country have recorded over 15 heatwave days (when the maximum temperature is at least 40 degrees Celsius and 4.5 degrees above normal) from March 1 to June 9. Similar heatwaves, which once occurred every 30 years, have become about 45 times more likely due to climate change, according to 'World Weather

Attribution', a group of leading

climate scientists.

Assam's veteran MLA resigns after LS victory

Guwahati, June 14: Assam's longest-serving legislator Phani Bhusan Choudhury of the Asom Gana Parishad (AGP) resigned from the Assembly Friday, following his election to the Lok Sabha. Choudhury, who won the Barpeta Lok Sabha seat, handed over his resignation letter to Speaker Biswajit Daimary, flanked by senior AGP leaders, including party chief Atul Bora and Rajya Sabha MP Birendra Prasad Baishya.

He had been representing the Bongaigaon Assembly segment continuously since 1985 and was a minister during the second AGP government from 1996 to 2001. He was also a minister in the BJP-led government from 2016 to 2021.

He tasted victory in the Lok Sabha elections in his second attempt, having fought the 2014 polls unsuccessfully when AGP had no alliance with any other party.

Speaking to reporters, an emotional Choudhury expressed his gratitude to the people of Bongaigaon for their continued faith in him.

"I thank the people of Bongaigaon, whom I had considered my family and they too had reciprocated my feelings. I am forever indebted to those who have always supported me,' said Choudhury, 72, famous for

ICC MEN'S T20 WORLD CUP Delhi HC restrains illegal streaming

New Delhi, June 14: The Delhi High Court has restrained the unauthorised streaming and broadcast of the ongoing ICC Men's T20 World Cup on a plea by its official broadcaster expressing strong apprehension over illegal dissemination of major sporting events in the past. Justice Sanjeev Naurla passed the interim order on a lawsuit by Star India Private Limited against several rogue websites which were likely to indulge in the unauthorised dissemination of cricket matches on their platforms.

cricket matches organised by the International Cricket Council (ICC) and the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI).

It submitted that based on past instances of illegal dissemination of major sporting events, there was a strong applaintiff which owns several channels and online videostreaming platform Hotstar.

"Therefore, swift action to prevent such infringements is crucial to preserving the plaintiff's investment in the broadcasting rights and maintaining their copyright protection," the court said in a recent order.

"Defendants No 1 to 9. andor any person acting on their behalf. are restrained from communicating, hosting, streaming, screening, disseminating or making available for viewing downloading, without authorisation. any part of the ICC events, specifically the ICC Men's T20 World Cup 2024, on any electronic or dig

prehension that certain online platforms were likely to indulge in such unauthorised streaming of the T20 World Cup being held from June 2 to June 24 in

"In pursuance of Section 70 of the Representation of People Act, 1951 read with Rule 91 of the Conduct of Election Rules, 1961, P S Tamang, member, elected from 07-Soreng-Chakung and 19-Rhenock Assembly constituencies has tendered his resignation from 07-Soreng-Chakung Assembly constituency on June 14, 2024," the notification issued by SLA secretary Lalit Kumar Gurung said.

Consequently, Soreng-Chakung Assembly constituency stands vacant with effect from the afternoon of June 14, 2024, it said. The 56-year-old Sikkim Krantikari Morcha (SKM) pres-

ident will represent Rhenock seat in the Assembly.

New Delhi, June 14: Everything has turned to ashes — dreams. the shop and all its goods, said a trader whose shop was destroyed in the massive blaze in Delhi's Chandni Chowk that even brought down two buildings in the area.

His was among over 50 shops that were reduced to cinders in a fire that required 50 fire tenders and 200 on-the-ground personnel to be brought under control after a 12-hour effort.

The number of shops that were damaged by the fire could still go up and the losses made by the traders could be in crores.

The fire broke out in Chandni Chowk's Old Katra Marwadi Market Thursday evening. There were no casualties.

It was 4.15pm Thursday when Narendra, 60, was having a regular call with one of his customers when he heard screaming.

People were shouting about a fire. "We already knew that our shop was in a narrow place. I immediately asked everyone in the shop to evacuate. Within a few minutes, everything was reduced to ashes," he said.

as more buildings could still collapse. 'So far, I got to know that more than 50 shops are gutted causing a loss of ₹70-80 crore of products only,' Mahendru said. The fire started from

shop number 1580 or 1581, and within no time it engulfed

the entire area. Fortunately, no one received any injuries, else it could have been drastic, he added. Police have not allowed the shopkeepers to enter their shops as the Fire department continues its operation. So, a total estimate of the losses incurred has not been made by the traders. According to the Fire department, the blaze erupted from a shop due to a short circuit in an air conditioner (AC) which spread to other shops. Due to the intensity of the fire, two buildings collapsed

DFS officials said firefighters had to face several challenges in the operation. "Due to the (narrow) lanes, we had to extend our fire hose for more than 300 metres and had to add extra pressure," an official said.

The Fire department also had to use water bowsers and robots to douse the flames.

The official further said that there was no water sources nearby which added to the problem of refilling the water tanks. He said, "The shops had combustible material which only

needs a small spark.

Dangling power lines in the area was also a challenge for the firefighters, the official added.

The fire was brought under control at 4.30am Friday, which was followed by a cooling operation at the spot with the help of eight fire tenders.

Gangtok, June 14: More than 1,200 tourists, including 15 foreigners, were stranded as massive landslides triggered by incessant rainfall caused devastation in northern Sikkim's Mangan district, an official said Friday. At least six people were killed

Chief Minister Prem Singh Tamang chaired a high-level meeting in Mintokgang to take stock of the situation, another official said.

stay put in their respective places and avoid taking risks, Rao said. He also stated that there is adequate stock of food supplies and rations to cater to all the stranded tourists.

The office of the chief secretary has already initiated talks with the Centre for airlifting of all the tourists, depending on the weather conditions, he said. If required, the tourists will be evacuated by road, and the department is "working in close co-

ordination with the district administration, police and tourism officials in Mangan" along with the local tourism stakeholders for the safe evacuation of those stranded there, he said

Rao assured the tourists of extending all possible support and assistance to them during this period of distress due to natural calamity.

Only Lachung is cut off from the rest of the state and all other parts of Sikkim are open and

During the meeting, officials concerned provided details on the extent of damages on critical roads and the immediate challenges for affected people.

They also briefed the CM about immediate relief measures, including the deployment of emergency service personnel, and the supplies of essential commodities.

New Delhi, June 14: The Indian Army has received its first indigenously-made suicide drones.

These unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs), known as Nagastra-1, are manufactured by Solar Industries Nagpur.

The company in April 2023 bagged an order to supply unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) Nagastra to the Indian Army, beating competitors from Israel and Poland.

Nagastra-1 is a cutting-edge unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) designed for loitering munitions with advanced features such as abort, recover, and reuse capabilities. The army ordered these drones using its emergency pro-

curement powers, and they were delivered within a year to address urgent needs along the Pakistan and China borders. Furthermore, these drones are capable of operating from highaltitude areas in extreme temperatures.

These systems can target a variety of soft-skin threats and offer a cost-effective alternative to traditional missiles and precision munitions.

Editor-in-Chief of Independent News Service Private Limited (INDIA TV), was also present during the hearing. The controversy arose after Nayak accused Sharma of abusing her on national television during a debate on the show on the counting day of 2024 Lok Sabha polls.

Sharma's counsel said while the debate was happening on the channel on the evening of June 4, the day when election results came, the Congress leaders started tweeting only June 10 and 11.

Only 29% elderly have access to social security schemes: Study

Financial insecurity is a prevalent issue among the elderly. A mere 29 per cent reported having access to social security schemes, such as old-age pensions or provident funds

New Delhi, June 14: Only 29 per cent elderly people reported to have access to social security schemes, such as old-age pensions or provident funds, according to a study by the NGO HelpAge. A similar proportion receives

financial support from family members, with elderly women slightly more likely to receive support than their male counterparts, the study -- 'Ageing in India - Exploring Preparedness & Response to Care Challenges - A HelpAge India Report' -released Friday on the eve of World Elder Abuse Awareness Day said.

The study, which surveyed 5.169 elders and 1,333 caregivers from different socio-economic categories across 20 Tier I and Tier II cities in 10 states, sheds light on issues related to work participation, financial security, health, caregiving, social participation, and digital access.

It reveals that only around 15 per cent of elderly persons are currently working, with a stark gender disparity: 24 per cent of elderly males compared to just seven per cent of elderly females. Work participation is slightly higher in Tier I cities (17 per cent) than in Tier II cities (14 per cent).

Alarmingly, one-third of the elderly reported having no income in the past year. Financial



insecurity is a common concern, with 65 per cent feeling financially insecure. Only 29 per cent receive financial support from family members, with elderly females slightly more likely to receive support than their male counterparts. Health issues are widespread

among the elderly, with nearly half (48 per cent) diagnosed with hypertension and 43 per cent with diabetes. Arthritis or other bone/joint diseases affect 35 per cent and 19 per cent report high cholesterol. Multiple morbidities are common, with 54 per cent suffering from two or more

non-communicable diseases (NCDs). The prevalence of NCDs increases with age, especially among those aged 80 and above. Access to healthcare remains a challenge. While 79 per cent visited government healthcare facilities in the past year, awareness of geriatric healthcare facilities is low at just 15 per cent.

Health insurance coverage is limited to 31 per cent of the elderly. Caregiving primarily falls on family members, especially spouses and children.

This support is more common in Tier II cities, where 66 per cent of elderly live with their spouse and children compared to 57 per cent in Tier I cities. Despite the support, caregiving poses significant physical and financial challenges for caregivers, with 29 per cent reporting physical challenges and 32 per cent facing financial difficulties.

Social participation among the elderly is minimal, with only seven per cent being members of any social organisation. Elder abuse is reported by 7 per cent of respondents. Awareness of the Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizen Act, 2007, is low at 9 per cent.

Digital access remains limited, with 59 per cent of elders having no access to digital devices. Smart phones are the most commonly used device among those who do have access. There is a significant gender divide, with 48 per cent of elderly males having access to digital devices compared to 33 per cent of elderly females.

Digital usage decreases with age, with only 26 per cent of those above 80 years using digital devices. Among users, the primary purposes are entertain-ment, social media, and information searches.

He also said the accused is highly influential and to protect the evidence from being tampered with, it is necessary to take him into custody and continue the investigation.

Nagesh drew the attention of the court regarding other cases filed by the victim's 54-year-old mother, who passed away recently, against her own son and husband.

The victim's brother had filed a petition in the court earlier this week alleging that though the case was registered March 14. no progress has been made in the investigation. The petitioner praved that Yediyurappa should be arrested and interrogated.

After the Sadashivanagar police registered the case in March, the Karnataka Director General of Police Alok Mohan had issued an order transferring it to the CID for further investigation.

In April, the CID collected the voice sample of Yediyurappa after summoning him to the office.

Sheena Bora's bones 'missing', CBI admits

Mumbai, June 14: In a bizarre development, the CBI has told a special Mumbai court that the bones and mortal remains purportedly of Mumbai executive Sheena Bora recovered by Raigad police after her murder 12 vears ago, are reportedly "missing" and untraceable.

The revelation came up luring the examination of a witness, Dr Zeba Khan, a forensic expert at the Sir J J Hospital here, who was the first person to confirm that the bones and other remains found were of a human being. With the help of a local policeman, the bones were recovered by the Pen police in Raigad from the spot where Bora's body was allegedly burnt and dumped in the deep forests near Gagode-Khurd village.

Police said that Bora, an executive with Mumbai Metro, was allegedly eliminated by her mother, and her ex-husband in connivance with her driver April 24, 2012, but the shocking killing came to light only around August 2015.

Dubai, June 14: The death toll of Indians killed in the massive fire in Kuwait has risen to 46 with one more person succumbing to injuries as authorities said that an electrical short circuit in the room of the guard on the ground floor of the building caused the blaze that killed 50 people.

Most deaths were due to smoke inhalation while residents in the six-storey building were sleeping when the fire broke out early Wednesday in Kuwait's southern Ahmadi Governorate. The building was home to 196 migrant workers, mostly Indians.

"One of the injured died" overnight, Kuwaiti Foreign Minister Abdullah Al-Yahya told reporters, raising the death toll of Indians to 46.

Three other deceased are Filipinos and the identity of one of the victims has not been established, the Kuwait Times newspaper reported Friday.

The investigation team of the fire department said Thursday that the fire was caused by an electric short circuit in the room of the building guard and spread to other places. The guard's room is located on the ground floor.

Citing security sources, the paper said that there were 179 workers inside the building when the fire broke out, while 17 were outside. Of the 196 residents, 175 are Indians, 11 are Filipinos and the rest are from Thailand, Pakistan and Egypt.

Modi meets Pope Francis

Drime Minister Narendra Modi and Pope Francis met with a warm embrace at the Outreach session of the G7 Summit in Apulia, southern Italy, Friday, where they joined other world leaders to discuss pressing global issues. Modi was seen in a light-hearted exchange with the 87-year-old head of the worldwide Catholic Church, who was taken around the table in a wheelchair to greet each of the world leaders gathered at the summit venue of Borgo Egnazia. "It is up to each of us to make good use of AI," the Pope said in his address at the Outreach session on the topic of Artificial Intelligence, Energy, Africa and the Mediterranean, attended by the participants of the G7 and other leaders of the Global South invited by Italian Prime Minister Georgia Meloni in her capacity as President of this year's summit. The Prime Minister met Pope Francis during a private audience at the Apostolic Palace in the Vatican in October 2021. At the time, the two leaders discussed the COVID-19 pandemic and its consequences for people across the world. They also discussed the challenges posed by climate change. The Prime Minister briefed the Pope about the ambitious initiatives taken by India in combating climate change as well as India's success in administering one billion Covid-19 vaccination doses. His Holiness is said to have appreciated India's assistance to countries in need during the pandemic.

According to the PMO, India and The Holv See, the Vaticanbased government of the Catholic Church. have friendly relations dating back to the establishment of diplomatic relations in 1948. India being home to the second-largest Catholic population in Asia is hopeful of a papal visit next year.

Moscow: Russia said Friday it had downed 87 Ukrainian drones overnight, of which 70 had targeted the southern Rostov region that houses the headquarters of its military operation against Kyiv. "During the night, an attempt by the Kyiv regime to commit a terrorist attack with drones... was foiled," the defence ministry said. There were no human casualties in Rostov, but the attacks sparked power cuts in several areas, regional governor Vasily Golubev said on Telegram.

Washington, june 14: At the height of the Covid-19 pandemic, the US military launched a secret campaign to counter what it perceived as China's growing influence in the Philippines, a nation hit especially hard by the

deadly virus. The clandestine operation has not been previously reported. It aimed to sow doubt about the safety and efficacy of vaccines and other life-saving aid that was being supplied by China, a

Reuters investigation found. Through phony internet accounts meant to impersonate Filipinos, the military's propaganda efforts morphed into an

anti-vax campaign. Social media posts decried the quality of face masks, test kits and the first vaccine that would become available in the Philippines - China's Sinovac inoculation.

Reuters identified at least 300 accounts on X, formerly Twitter, that matched descriptions shared by former US military officials familiar with the Philippines operation. Almost all were created in the summer of 2020 and centered on the slogan #Chinaangvirus - Tagalog for China is the virus.

Covid came from China and the VACCINE also came from China, don't trust China!" one typical tweet from July 2020 read in Tagalog. The words were next



to a photo of a syringe beside a Chinese flag and a soaring chart of infections. Another post read: "From China - PPE, Face Mask, Vaccine: FAKE. But the Coronavirus is real

After Reuters asked X about the accounts, the social media company removed the profiles, determining they were part of a coordinated bot campaign based on activity patterns and internal data

The US military's anti-vax effort began in the spring of 2020 and expanded beyond Southeast Asia before it was terminated

in mid-2021, Reuters determined. Tailoring the propaganda campaign to local audiences across Central Asia and the Middle East, the Pentagon used a combination of fake social media accounts on multiple platforms

to spread fear of China's vaccines among Muslims at a time when the virus was killing tens of thousands of people each day.

A key part of the strategy: amplify the disputed contention that, because vaccines sometimes contain pork gelatin, China's shots could be considered forbidden under Islamic law.

The military programme started under former President Donald Trump and continued months into Joe Biden's presidency, Reuters found – even after alarmed social media executives warned the new administration that the Pentagon had been trafficking in Covid misinformation.

The Biden White House issued an edict in spring 2021 banning the anti-vax effort, which also disparaged vaccines produced by other rivals, and the Pentagon initiated an internal review, Reuters found.

In an email, the Chinese Ministry of Foreign Affairs said

that it has long maintained the U.S. government manipulates social media and spreads misinformation.

The effort to stoke fear about Chinese inoculations risked undermining overall public trust in government health initiatives, including US-made vaccines that became available later, Lucey and others said. Although the Chinese vaccines were found to be less effective than the American-led shots by Pfizer and Moderna, all were approved World Health by the Organization.

The issue will be Hyundai's first such listing outside South Korea, with the sources saying



the company aimed to raise between \$2.5 billion and \$3 billion from the stake sale in the offer.

Hyundai is seeking approval to sell an up to 17.5% stake in the IPO to investors, but the final percentage could be lower, the sources said.

Sources previously estimated Hyundai's India unit to be valued at up to \$30 billion.

The India IPO is aimed at accelerating Hyundai's expansion in a country where it has operated for over 25 years and where its affordable cars like Santro and sports-utility vehicle Creta are popular with Indian buyers.

The listing will reduce Hyundai Motor India's dependence on its Korean parent for funds, giving it the financial muscle to take on local rivals such as Tata Motors and chart its own growth plans in a market that accounts for 14% of Hyundai's total global sales.

The company has plans to sell locally made electric vehicles in India, as well as set up

a charging network and a battery facility. It also plans to expand its manufacturing capacity in the country, Reuters has previously reported.

Hyundai plans to issue up to 142 million shares in the IPO, out of a total 800 million outstanding shares, the sources said.

Mumbai, June 14: Vodafone Group is looking to sell its entire \$2.3 billion stake in India's Indus Towers through stock market block deals next week, two sources with direct knowledge said, as part of the British firm's effort to repay debt.

Vodafone owns 21.5% of mobile-tower operator Indus via various group entities. As of Friday's closing stock price in Mumbai, the investment is worth \$2.3 billion.

The final size of the stake sale is yet to be decided and could be lower than 21.5% if demand, which is still being assessed, is insufficient, said the sources, who declined to be named as the discussions were private.

Shares of Vodafone Idea extended gains, rising as much as 4.8% after the report, while Indus Towers pared gains and closed up 0.3%. Vodafone has hired Bank of America, Morgan Stanley and BNP Paribas to manage the stake sale in Indian stock markets, the sources said.

Vodafone in 2022 announced it would sell all of its then-28% stake, but has managed to sell only a small portion so far. The sources said the talks with rival telecom firms for a stake sale had not materialised.

Vodafone plans to repay part of its \$42.17 billion net debt using proceeds from the Indus stake sale, the sources said.

Indus, which says it is one of the world's biggest tower companies, also counts India's second biggest telecom firm. Bharti Airtel, as a shareholder. It has nearly 220,000 towers, with services also including providing power, space and green technology for tower equipment.

Private equity giant KKR and Canadian fund CPPIB were also_ investors in Indus, but sold their entire stakes in February.

Imports also increased by 7.7 per cent to \$61.91 billion in the month under review from \$57.48 billion in May 2023 due to increase in crude oil imports.

Oil imports rose by 28 per cent to \$20 billion in May. It was up by 24.4 per cent during April-May 2024-25 to \$36.4 billion. However, gold imports dipped marginally to \$3.33 billion in May this year from \$3.69 billion in the same month of FY24. The previous high in the deficit was recorded in October 2023 at

\$31.46 billion. In April 2024, the outbound shipments dipped to \$41.68 billion

from \$41.96 billion a year ago. Cumulatively, exports during April-May this fiscal rose by 5.1 per cent to \$73.12 billion and imports rose by 8.89 per cent to \$116 billion.

Domestic air traffic rises 4.4% in May

Domestic air passenger traffic went up 4.4 per cent to around 1.37 crore in May, Daccording to official data released Friday. The Indian scheduled air operators flew 1.32 crore passengers on domestic routes in May last year. "Passengers carried by domestic airlines during January-May 2024 were 661.42 lakhs as against 636.07 lakhs during the corresponding period of the previous year, thereby registering an annual growth of 3.99 per cent and monthly growth of 4.40 per cent," the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) said. In terms of on-time performance (OTP), Akasa Air topped the list at 85.9 per cent, followed by Vistara (81.9 per cent), AIX Connect (74.9 per cent), IndiGo (72.8 per cent), Air India (68.4 per cent) and SpiceJet (60.7 per cent), as per the data. During the previous month, no-frills carrier IndiGo saw its market share growing to 61.6 per cent, while that of Air India declined to 13.7 per cent from 14.2 per cent in April. The market share of

Vistara stood at 9.2 per cent but that of AIX Connect fell to 5.1 per cent from 5.4 per cent, the DGCA said. Air India, Vistara, and AIX Connect are part of the Tata Group. Meanwhile, Akasa Air's market share increased to 4.8 per cent in May from 4.4 per cent in April. At the same time, SpiceJet's market share declined to 4 per cent from 4.7 per cent in the previous month.
