Bhubaneswar, June 20: A day after the Centre enhanced minimum support price (MSP) for paddy by 5.35 per cent to ₹2,300 per quintal for 2024-25 kharif marketing season, the state government Thursday announced that it would procure the crop from farmers at ₹3,100 per quintal as promised by the BJP in its election manifesto. Addressing media, Food Supplies and Consumer Welfare

(FS&CW) Minister Krushna Chandra Patra said the BJP, in its election manifesto, had promised to implement 'Samrudh Krushak Niti' if voted to power in the state.

RICE ATM IN CITY

he state government has decided to set up a rice ATM in Bhubaneswar, Food Supplies and Consumer Welfare Minister Krushna Chandra Patra said, Thursday. "The rice ATM will be first set up in Bhubaneswar for PDS card holders within a week. Later, the facility will be extended to all districts of the state. The beneficiaries can insert their cards in the ATM and receive their monthly quota," Patra said. MORE: P3

Delhi heat kills 22 in 24 hrs PRESS TRUST OF INDIA

New Delhi, June 20: At least 22 persons succumbed to heat-related illnesses at Delhi's three premier healthcare facilities, including Ram Manohar Lohia Hospital, in the last 24 hours, officials said, Thursday,

Delhi has been battling searing heatwave conditions over the last few days. It got some relief Thursday morning due to light rain. Hospitals in Delhi have seen a rise in the number of casualties and patients owing to heatstroke.

According to officials at the Safdarjung Hospital, 33 patients suffering from heat-related illnesses were admitted. Of them

13 died in the last 24 hours, they said. The Ram Manohar Lohia Hospital received 22 patients with a suspected heatstroke in the last 24 hours out of which four have died, a hospital source said. The Delhi government-run LNJP Hospital has 17 patients with heat-related illnesses admitted to its casualty ward. Five patients succumbed in the last 24 hours at the ward, an official source said.

Meanwhile, the Health Ministry said the unrelenting heatwave sweeping large parts of the country has claimed at least 114 lives and left more than 40,984 people grappling with suspected heatstroke between March 1 and June 18 this year.

Fire at apartment in Patia; none hurt

Bhubaneswar, June 20: Inmates of an upscale apartment near Patia Square here woke up to a scary morning Thursday when fire broke out at the eight floor of the 11-storey building, though no casualty or injury was reported in the incident.

Deputy Fire Officer of Odisha Fire Service Abani Swain said the fire originated at KK Plaza on the eighth floor of the building. He also suspected that an electric short-circuit could have caused the inferno, which later spread to other flats of the apartment.

The Fire Service department received a complaint around 6:20am following which two teams - one each from Chandrasekharpur and Kalpana fire stations - were dispatched to the spot to douse the blaze. It took around 40 minutes to completely douse the inferno, he added.

Sources said two rooms of the flat were completely gutted while others suffered partial damage in the fire mishap.

An inmate said the flat owners were absent when the fire broke out, adding that the flat had been lying vacant for the last two months.

Another inmate, who stays in flat no. 801 of the apartment, said thick smoke was found billowed out of the flat's balcony when she woke up around 6am. "I was in total panic when I saw

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Man held for tusker's death POST NEWS NETWORK

Hatadihi, June 20: A day after the body of a tusker was recovered from an orchard near an Ashram School at Neudani under Soso police limits in Keonjhar district, Forest department sleuths Thursday arrested the orchard owner on charge of killing the animal by electrocution.

The accused was identified as Sangram Keshari Behera, 45, son of Satyendra Kumar Behera of Kanpur village. A case was registered in this connection and the accused produced in the court. Anandapur DFO Abhaya Dalei

said the investigators have found credible evidences to substantiate the involvement of the accused in the electrocution of the elephant.

"The accused had put up a fence around the orchard with GI wires and had charged it with electric line. The animal, after coming in contact with charged wire, was electrocuted," he said.

Moreover, GI wires have also been seized from the accused person's orchard, he said. "The actual reason behind the death will be clear after we receive the postmortem and sample testing reports," he added.

Locals, after spotting the tusker carcass had informed the Forest officials alleging it to have died of electrocution.

Notably, the distance between the place where the tusker's body was found, and the Hadagarh elephant sanctuary, is only around five km.

Nayagarh, June 20: Delay in monsoons has affected paddy cultivation and hit farmers hard in this district, sources stated here Thursday. Over 89 per cent of farmlands in the district are yet to be cultivated due to delay in arrival of rains. Farmers said that these days they are frequently witnessing lightning and thunderstorms, but those are not resulting in sufficient rains. The lack of irrigation facilities are worrying them also as they fear that their livelihoods will be affected.

Farmers informed that some of them have sowed paddy seeds, but that is only on 11 per cent of the farmlands. Kabuli Pradhan of Balugaon village said they are waiting for rains to arrive. "There has been erratic rainfall last week, but not in a regular manner, which is so essential for paddy cultivation," he stated. Pradhan said that a few of them had sowed paddy seeds on dry farmlands expecting rains to arrive soon. "However, it now looks that the seeds have gone to waste," he said.

Other farmers opined that they were expecting rainfall after the

When contacted, chief district agriculture officer Sanjay Kumar Dalei confirmed the situation.He however, said that paddy seeds are available in stores for farmers. Farmers however, pointed out that there will be no takers for the seeds till the rains arrive.

quenching their thirst. Now with the kiosk running dry, their only source of drinking water has vanished.

Same is the case with a series of such kiosks opened at places like the district Collector's office premises, near courts, bus stops etc. All these citizen's facilitation water booths have become defunct due to lack of water supply.

The residents of the city have demanded an investigation to find out why these kiosks, set up by spending lakhs of ruppes, went dry a time when the heat is at its peak.

Sanjay Choudhury, a local businessman, said, "It is really sad to suddenly stop water supply in Keonjhar city though the government has directed the administration to remain vigilant to water supply issues to tackle heatwave conditions."

Similarly, many water tanks are found lying unused on the premises of the district Collector's office, even as several parts of the town are reeling under severe water scarcity.

Sources said that due to lack of rain this year, drinking water supply to different wards has stopped. This has put people to untold misery.

"There has been no water at the drinking water service centre set up by the Keonjhargarh municipality near daily market. Common people and traders coming to the city for various jobs, and people coming from distant tribal villages to the market are facing drinking water problems. No one is paying attention to their plight," said Anil Sonkar, a local fruit trader.

Similarly, many expensive trees planted on the divider island of roads for beautification of the city are browning off, or died, due to lack of regular water supply for which environmentalists have raised concerns.

Meanwhile, Executive Officer, Keonjhargarh municipality, Basant Kumar Sethi said, "Steps are being taken to restore water supply soon".

Libertarian Dilemma

The multimillionaire tech investor Balaii Srinivasan made his name as an anti-government crusader in 2013, when he gave a talk about Silicon Valley's "ultimate exit" from the United States – what he called the "Microsoft of nations." Perhaps most memorably, Srinivasan described America's "Paper Belt" - Washington with laws and regulation, Boston with higher education, Los Angeles with entertainment, and New York City with ads and publishing – as the modern-day Rust Belt.

In his view, Silicon Valley was usurping all four cities, previously the centers of power in postwar America, by outpacing regulation, scorning academic prestige, introducing streaming services, and reinventing direct-to-consumer marketing. In the years that followed, Srinivasan doubled down on his techno-libertarian message. He gave prolix speeches about his contempt for government and was combative with his foes, often waxing lyrical about a "network state" or a new kind of polity where all decisions were made through ownership, consent, and contract.

Then, in early 2017, Srinivasan deleted his Twitter history. Where had he gone? It turns out that the federal government had come

knocking at his door, seeking his expertise. The newly elected president, Donald Trump, had tapped Srinivasan's friend and fellow libertarian, tech investor Peter Thiel, to help assemble his cabinet, and Srinivasan was under consideration to lead the Food and Drug Administration. Years' worth of strident anti-government pronouncements vanished the moment Srinivasan had a shot at old-fashioned political power.

This was far from an isolated incident. In fact, such hypocrisy is the new norm. In recent years, techno-libertarians have been queuing to attach themselves, remora-like, to the US government. What's happening? Is it simply disingenuousness, or does it reflect some deeper rationale?

The answer has become increasingly clear: leading Silicon Valley techno-libertarians are against the state only insofar as it is not enriching them personally. When faced with the prospect of the government becoming a major client, onceprincipled opposition to state power dissipates.

One can see this transformation in Thiel himself. In 2009, he declared that "the great task for libertarians is to find an es-

cape from politics in all its forms." But by 2016, Thiel was fully engaged in partisan politics, speaking at the Republican National Convention. In the intervening years, Palantir, the data-analytics firm that he co-founded, has grown into a behemoth, benefiting from huge government contracts. It now draws nearly half its revenue from the public purse.

Another example is Marc Andreessen, a founder of the leading Silicon Valley venture-capital firm Andreessen Horowitz (known as a16z), where Srinivasan was briefly a partner. In October 2023, Andreessen wrote "The Techno-Optimist Manifesto," a much-discussed screed praising the Promethean power of free markets and entrepreneurial technologists. "Government" did not appear once in the 5,000-word text, while the only two mentions of the "state" positioned it as the enemy

But the state is Andreessen's bread and butter. It paid for the landgrant university where he helped develop the first internet browser. And, as Bloomberg reports, a16z is a familiar face in Washington these days and spends significantly more on lobbying than other venture funds to push its "American Dynamism" initiative, which consists of backing firms that chase government defense, energy, and logistics contracts.

The internal logic of this shift can be explained by one of Thiel's pieces of public writing, which are now few and far between. In 2020, he wrote a new preface to James Dale Davidson and William Rees-Mogg's 1999 book, The Sovereign Individual: Mastering the Transition to the Information Age, which envisions the possibility of escape from the state, complete with cyber-currencies and the abandonment of conventional citizenship. Thiel identified two developments that the authors failed to account for: the rise of China and advances in artificial intelligence.

In the Silicon Valley of the 1990s, it was possible to suppress the fact that government funding was behind the biggest breakthroughs, and instead to cultivate the myth of the self-made genius. But the meteoric rise of China in the new millennium suggested that another ingredient was necessary for tech supremacy: a state that was willing to deliver reams of personal information about its citizens. Tesla CEO Elon Musk, like Thiel, was supposedly once opposed to forms of mass surveillance - a position he has since reversed, given his recent trip to China to secure precisely that sort of data.

While Tesla's stock valuation has been sliding, Musk can still rely on the more robust elements of his portfolio: SpaceX, now the primary launcher of US satellites, and Starlink, its satellite internet service that is currently underpinning Ukraine's war effort. These ventures, though, are more a reflection of the traditional military-industrial complex than a radical rethink of the relationship between a gifted cognitive elite and the state, as imagined in The Sovereign Individual.

Talk of Silicon Valley's exit from the US was always free-riding by another name, and now it is beginning to reach its ultimate, unvarnished form. Maybe techno-libertarians need a more accurate, if less glamorous, label. After all, they're not forging a mysterious world beyond politics on the far edge of the continent or in the world's oceans, let alone on distant planets, nor are they necessarily accelerating a descent into techno-feudalism. In fact, they're nothing more than techno-contractors, submitting the next invoice to the Paper Belt.

MUTHALAPOZHI RESIDENTS PROTEST UNFULFILLED VOWS

Thiruvananthapuram, June 20: Frequent accidents and resultant deaths at Muthalapozhi here, where the sea meets a river and a lake, prompted the residents of the coastal area Thursday to hold a protest march towards the state assembly carrying a coffin.

Muthalapozhi at Perumathura is a place where the Vamanapuram river and Kadinamkulam lake meet the Arabian Sea and has become a death trap for fishermen while going to sea and also when returning to shore.

The protestors, led by the Kerala Latin Catholic Association (KLCA), marched from Palayam here to the Assembly, but the police set up barricades to prevent them from getting close to the state legislature. They then placed the symbolic coffin before the barricades and shouted slogans against the government.

They cited the death of a fisherman during the wee hours of the day while returning to shore after fishing. They also cited a second accident, in which no lives were lost, that occurred at Muthalapozhi during the day and said that despite the state government being informed again and again that the area was a death trap, nothing was being done.

The protestors claimed that last vear. after the death of four fishermen at Muthalapozhi, the state government had promised to fulfil several demands of fishermen and residents of the coastal area. More than a year has gone by, but the government has not fulfilled even one of the promises, they alleged.

Fuel price hike stir: **BJP leaders detained**

Bengaluru: Several BJP leaders were detained here Thursday as they staged a bicycle rally and tried to go to the Assembly to protest against the recent fuel price hike by the Congress government in Karnataka. BJP state president and MLA, Vijayanedra said, "We are protesting to condemn the hike in petrol and diesel prices in the state."

Bangalore: A Bangalore court Thursday extended police custody of Kannada actor Darshan Thoogudeepa and three other accused in the Renukaswamy murder case by two days. Dhanaraj, Vinay and Pradosh are the other three whose police custody was extended. Thirteen other accused, including the actor's friend Pavithra Gowda, were remanded to 14 days' judicial custody. A total of 17 people are accused in the murder case. All the accused were produced before Additional Chief Metropolitan Magistrate Judge Vishwanath C Goudar as their police custody ended Thursday. According to police sources, Renukaswamy, a fan of the actor, had sent obscene messages to Gowda, which enraged Darshan, allegedly leading to his murder.

Chhatrapati Sambhajinagar: Activist Manoj Jarange Thursday alleged that the Maharashtra government's stand that inclusion of "sage soyare" term in the Maratha reservation notification will not stand legal scrutiny indicated that it was against such a provision. Speaking to reporters a day before, minister Girish Mahajan had said that Jarange was demanding reservation for 'sage soyare' (those related by birth or marriage) of Marathas who possess the Kunbi caste certificate, but it will not stand legal scrutiny if challenged in the court. "As far as I know, such a reservation cannot be given, but if there is a workable solution, the government will pursue it," the BJP leader had said. Reacting to the statement, Jarange told reporters here that he was firm on his stand that Marathas should get reservation in the Other Backward Class (OBC) category.

AP means Amaravati, Polavaram, says CM Chandrababu Naidu

Amaravati: Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister, N Chandrababu Naidu, Thursday visited Amaravati capital region to get first-hand information about the status of the capital's development work and said Andhra Pradesh stands for Amaravati and Polavaram. A week after assuming office as Chief Minister, he went around Amaravati where work on the capital came to a grinding halt in 2019 after the YSR Congress Party (YSRCP) government decided to develop three state capitals, reversing the decision of the ear lier TDP government to build Amaravati as the sole capital. CM Naidu began his visit from Praja Vedika, a building demolished by the previous government headed by Jagan Mohan Reddy in 2019. He saw the debris of the structure built by him close to his official residence when he was the Chief Minister between 2014 and 2019.

Patna, June 20: In a setback the Nitish Kumar government in Bihar, the Patna High Court Thursday struck down its last year's decision to raise quotas for Dalits, backward classes and tribals from 50 to 65 per cent.

A Division Bench headed by Chief Justice K Vinod Chandran passed the order on a bunch of petitions which had opposed the legislation brought by the state government in November 2023.

The quotas were increased following a comprehensive survey of castes which gave a fresh estimate of the population of SCs, STs, OBCs and extremely backward classes (EBCs) in Bihar.

The Nitish Kumar government November 21 last year issued gazette notifications for raising the quota for deprived castes from 50 to 65 per cent in state government jobs and educational institutions.

"On our plea that the amendments violated Articles 14, 16 and 20 of the Constitution, the court had reserved its judgment in March. Today, the court allowed the petitions," said Ritika Rani, one of the counsels who appeared on behalf of the petitioners

These articles deal with equality before the law and equal protection of the laws (Art 14), equality of opportunity for all citizens in matters relating to employment (Art 16) and safeguarding certain rights in criminal proceedings (Art 20).

Kolkata. June 20: Close on the heels of the disappearance and suspected murder of a Bangladeshi MP in Kolkata, a youth from the neighbouring country, went missing from the city, prompting a police investigation.

According to a senior police officer, 23-year-old Mohammad Delwar Hossain had come to the city for medical treatment and was staying at a hotel on Mirza Ghalib Street in central Kolkata. The management of the hotel concerned revealed that Hossain, who was accompanied by his relatives on his visit to Kolkata, is likely to have sneaked out of the premises late last night.

The incident follows the disappearance and suspected murder of Bangladeshi lawmaker Anwarul Azim Anar, who was also in Kolkata for medical reasons and went missing a day after his arrival May 12

The relatives lodged a missing persons complaint with the Park Street police station Thursday morning. "We are currently reviewing CCTV footage from the hotel and nearby areas as part of our investigation," the officer informed PTI.

The incident follows the suspected murder of Bangladeshi lawmaker Anwarul Azim Anar, who was also in Kolkata for medical reasons and went missing a day after his arrival May 12. Authorities suspect that Anar was killed by a group of people inside an apartment in the city's New Town area, where his body was reportedly mutilated. As of now, police have apprehended two suspects in connection with Anar's murder.

77% of Indians want stronger climate action: Survey

New Delhi, June 20: Amid a crippling heatwave affecting large parts of India, a new survey released Thursday showed 77 per cent of Indians demand stronger climate action, and 33 per cent have recently experienced extreme weather events.

The Peoples' Climate Vote 2024 survey, conducted by the UN **Development Programme** (UNDP) in collaboration with the University of Oxford and GeoPoll, collected responses from over 75,000 people across 77 countries, representing 87 per cent of the global population.

The survey reveals robust support for stronger climate measures among the world's largest greenhouse gas emitters. Majorities in these countries favour increased climate action, including 66 per cent in the US and Russia, 67 per cent in Germany, 73 per cent in China,



77 per cent in South Africa and India, 85 per cent in Brazil, 88 per cent in Iran, and up to 93 per cent in Italv.

Women in five major emitting countries -- Australia, Canada, France, Germany, and the US -show even higher support for stronger climate commitments compared to men.

Globally, 72 per cent of respondents support a rapid transition away from fossil fuels, even among the top producers of oil, coal, or gas. Only 7 per cent globally believe their country should not transition at all. At the United Nations COP28 cli mate change conference in December last year, world leaders reached a historic agreement to transition away from planet-warming fossil fuels. iety is widespread, with 56 per cent of people thinking about climate change regularly, and 53 per cent more worried about it than last year. This concern is notably higher in the least Developed Countries (LDCs) and Small Island Developing States (SIDS).

Climate change also impacts major life decisions for 69 per cent of people globally, particularly in LDCs. Cassie Flynn, Global Director of Climate Change, UNDP, said, "As world leaders

decide on the next round of pledges under the Paris Agreement by 2025, these results are undeniable evidence that people everywhere support bold climate action."

"The next two years stand as one of the best chances we have as the international community to ensure that warming stays under 1.5 degrees Celsius. We stand ready to support policymakers in stepping up their efforts as they develop their climate action plans through our Climate

Promise initiative," she said. Countries are required to submit their third round of NDCs 9 to 12 months before the UN climate talks in Brazil next year.

NDCs are national climate plans to achieve the goals set out in the 2015 Paris Agreement, including limiting global warming to well below 2 degrees Celsius and preferably to 1.5 degrees Celsius compared to the 1850-1900 average.

New Delhi, June 20: The Financial Intelligence Unit (FIU) has slapped a penalty of ₹18.82 crore on the world's largest crypto exchange Binance for alleged contravention of the country's anti-money laundering law.

The federal agency issued an order Thursday charging the exchange with "dereliction of duty" being a Virtual Digital Asset Service Provider (VDASP) category of reporting entity under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA).

India's anti-money launder ing law stipulates VDASPs to get registered as a reporting entity with the FIU and share timely suspicious transaction reports with it, which help the FIU to keep a check on financial crimes.



The summary order accessed by PTI said Binance was first issued a notice December 28, 2023 as it operated in India and provided services to Indian clients. Binance had earlier not registered as a reporting entity with the FIU, as required under the PMLA. It did it in May this year after the Union government banned its URLs in India and was issued a show cause notice, along with eight other crypto firms, by the FIU, a senior officer said.

"After considering the written and oral submissions of Binance, the Director, FIU-IND, based on the material available on record, found that the charges against Binance were substantiated.

"Consequently, the Director FIU-IND vide order dated 19th June. 2024 in exercise of powers under Section 13 PMLA imposed a total penalty of ₹18,82,00,000 on Binance...," the order said.

FIU imposes ₹18.82cr fine on global crypto 114 heatwave deaths in India

New Delhi, June 20: The unrelenting heatwave sweeping large parts of the country has claimed at least 114 lives and left more than 40,984 people grappling with suspected heatstroke between March 1 and June 18 this year, Health Ministry sources said Thursday.

Union Health Minister J P Nadda Thursday asked officials to visit Central government hospitals to see if separate arrangements have been made for heatwave affected patients regularly. According to the data, June

19, there have been four deaths due to heatstroke. Swathes of northern and eastern India have been in the grip of a heatwave, increasing heatstroke casualties and prompting the Centre to issue advisory to hospitals to set up special units to cater to such patients.

Nadda Wednesday directed that special heatwave units be set up in all Central government hospitals to cater to those falling ill due to heat.

The health minister also asked officials to ensure all hospitals are prepared for providing the best healthcare to the affected as he reviewed the situation across the country and preparedness of hospitals to deal with it.

Ūnder the directions of Nadda, an advisory for state health department on 'Heat Wave Season 2024' has been issued by the health ministry.

The advisory asked state nodal officers under the National Programme for Climate Change and Human Health (NPCCHH) to start submitting the daily data on heatstroke cases and deaths and total deaths from March 1 besides reporting under Heat-Related Illness and Death Surveillance.

It called for maintenance of digital line list of heatstroke cases and deaths (suspected/confirmed) at health facility/hos-



pital level in given formats They and undertaking. have been asked to ensure dissemination of National Action Plan on Heat Related Illnesses (HRI) to all districts and strengthening of health systems preparedness for HRI.

It stressed on dissemination of early warning of heatwaves issued by the India Meteorological Department (IMD) and said forecast for the next four days should be disseminated to health facilities and vulnerable populations.

The advisory also directed for health facility preparedness for prevention and management of severe HRI and procurement and supply of adequate quantities of ORS (oral rehydration solution) packs, essential medicines, IV fluids, ice-packs, and equipment to support management of volume depletion and

electrolyte imbalance, etc. It also called for ensuring availability of sufficient drinking water at all health facilities, general cooling appliances in waiting and patient treatment area and their functioning, and stressed that cases with suspected heatstroke should be rapidly assessed and actively cooled using standard treatment protocols.

New Delhi, June 20: Southwest Monsoon started northwards Thursday after a 10-day lull, covering parts of Odisha, Chhattisgarh and large tracts of Vidarbha, bringing relief to the parched regions that were reeling under hot weather conditions.

India Meteorological Department data showed the country has received 17 per cent deficient rainfall than normal this monsoon season -- 77 mm as against the normal of 92.8 mm between June 1 and 20. "Southwest Monsoon has

further advanced into some more parts of Vidarbha, Chhattisgarh, Odisha, Northwest Bay of Bengal, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal and some parts of Bihar," the weather office said. The IMD said conditions

After reaching the Indian mainland two days earlier than usual and swiftly covering many other states, the rain-bearing system made no significant progress between June 10 and 19. extending the wait for north India, which is reeling from a sweltering heat wave.

Since June 1, northwest India has recorded 14.2 mm of rainfall (63 per cent less than nor-

mal), central India 58 mm (33 per cent less than normal), the south peninsula 117.6 mm (13 per cent excess than normal), and east and northeast India 188.5 mm (four per cent less than normal).

In an update to its forecast earlier this week, the IMD had said monsoon rains in the month of June would be below normal. The southwest monsoon advanced into parts of the Nicobar

Islands May 19. It subsequently covered most parts of the south and some parts of the central Bay of Bengal by May 26 along with Cyclone Remal. It simultaneously reached Kerala and the northeastern states on May 30. two and six days earlier than normal, respectively.

Last month, the IMD said the country could see above-normal rainfall in the four-month monsoon season (June to September) with cumulative rainfall estimated at 106 per cent of the LPA of 87 cm. Below-normal monsoon rainfall is expected in northeast India, normal in the northwest and above-normal in central and south peninsular regions of the country.

India's core monsoon zone covering most of the rain-fed agriculture areas in the country is predicted to receive abovenormal rainfall this season, the MeT office said.

OF SUMMER Scorching heat roasts millions

London, June 20: Dangerous heatwaves are scorching cities on four continents as the Northern Hemisphere marks the first day of summer, a sign that climate change may again bring about record-breaking heat that could surpass last summer as the

warmest in 2,000 years. Countries around the Mediterranean have endured another week of blistering high temperatures that have contributed to forest fires from Portugal to Greece and along the northern coast of Africa in Algeria, according to the US National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's Earth Observatory.

In Serbia, meteorologists forecast temperatures of around 40 degrees Celsius this week as winds from North Africa propelled a hot front across the Balkans. Health authorities declared a red weather alert and advised people not to venture outdoors. Belgrade's emergency service said its doctors intervened 109 times overnight to

treat people with heart and chronic health conditions. In neighbouring Montenegro, where health authorities also warned people to stay in the shade until late afternoon, tens of thousands of tourists sought refreshment on the beaches along its Adriatic coast.

Europe this year has been contending with a spate of dead and missing tourists amid dangerous heat. A 55-year-old American was found dead on the Greek island of Mathraki, police said Monday, the third such tourist death in a week. Parts of the US Northeast and

Midwest are also wilting under a heat dome, with more than 86 million people under a heat alert Thursday, according to the National Weather Service.

Under its heat emergency plan, New York City said it would open its cooling centers for the first time this year. Meteorological authorities

India's summer period lasts from March to May, when monsoons begin slowly sweeping across the country and breaking the heat.

But New Delhi Wednesday registered its warmest night in at least 55 years, with India's Safdarjung Observatory reporting a temperature of 35.2 C at 1 am.

Temperatures normally drop at night, but scientists say climate change is causing nighttime temperatures to rise. In many parts of the world, nights are warming faster than days, according to a 2020 study by the University of Exeter.

uman-caused climate change dialed up the thermostat and turbocharged the odds of this month's killer heat that has been baking the Southwestern United States, Mexico and Central America, a new flash study found. Sizzling daytime temperatures that triggered cases of heat stroke in parts of the United States were 35 times more likely and 1.4 degrees Celsius because of the warming from the burning of coal, oil and natural gas, World Weather Attribution, a collection of scientists that run rapid and non-peer reviewed climate attribution studies, calculated Thursday. "It's an oven here; you can't stay here," 82-year-old Magarita Salazar Pérez of Veracruz, Mexico, said in her home with no air conditioning. Last week, the Sonoran Desert hit 51.9 degrees Celsius, the hottest day in Mexican history, according to study co-author Shel Winkley, a meteorologist at Climate Central. Climate change made nighttime temperatures 1.6 degrees Celsius warmer and unusual evening heat 200 more times more likely, she said

New Delhi has clocked 37 con secutive days with maximum temperatures at or above 40 C since May 14, according to weather department data.

An official at the Indian health ministry said Wednesday there were more than 40,000 suspected heatstroke cases and at least 110 confirmed deaths between March 1 and June 18, when northwest and eastern India recorded twice the usual number of heatwave days in one of the country's longest such spells.

Gaining accurate death tolls from heatwaves, however, is difficult. Most health authorities do not attribute deaths to heat, but rather the illnesses exacerbated by high temperatures, such as cardiovascular issues. Authorities therefore undercount heat-related deaths by a significant margin - typically overlooking thousands if not tens of thousands of deaths

Ohannesburg: South Africa's Democratic Alliance (DA) suspended Thursday a newly sworn-in member of parliament after an old video of him calling for the killing of Black people resurfaced on social media. A snippet of a video resurfaced on social media platforms Wednesday, where a young Renaldo Gouws who is white, could be seen and heard making the anti-Black remarks. In the video, he said that he did not mean any of his racially-charged remarks and that he was giving context on then-African National Congress youth leader Julius Malema singing an apartheidera song that called for the killing of white farmers.

London, June 20: British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak's Conservative Party is facing a series of allegations Thursday involving his bodyguard and aides over betting around the general election date, which is scheduled for July 4.

The Metropolitan Police initially suspended an officer from Sunak's personal security detail and later arrested the individual on suspicion of misconduct in public office.

Soon after, it emerged that the UK's Gambling Commission was investigating several individuals linked to the governing Tories over allegedly betting on the timing of the election. While betting is legal in the UK, any bets placed with the advantage of insider in-

formation could fall within the purview of illegality.

'The matter was immediately referred to officers in the Met's Directorate of Professional Standards, who opened an investigation, and the officer was also removed from operational duties," the Met Police was quoted by the BBC as saying.

"The officer was subsequently arrested Monday 17 June on suspicion of misconduct in public office. He was taken into custody and bailed pending further enquiries," the Met Police said.

Last week, the 'Guardian' newspaper reported that Sunak's close parliamentary aide, Craig Williams, placed a GBP 100 bet with Ladbrokes at a five to one odds on a July election just three days before the British Indian leader had sur-



prised the country with a summer election, as opposed to a widely expected autumn date later in the year. Williams, 39, is the Tory candidate for Montgomeryshire and Glyndwr in Wales. In a statement, he said his "flutter" on the election had prompted some "routine inquiries" and that he would "fully cooperate with these"

"The Gambling Commission regulates gambling in the in-

terests of consumers and the wider public," a commission spokesperson said.

"Currently, the commission is investigating the possibility of offences concerning the date of the election. This is an ongoing investigation, and the commission cannot provide any further details at this time. We are not confirming or denying the identity of any individuals involved in this investigation," the spokesperson said.

Under Section 42 of the UK's Gambling Act 2005, it is an offence to cheat at gambling or to do anything that allows someone else to cheat. The Conservative Party has said that the Gambling Commission being an independent regulatory body, it would not be "proper to comment fur-ther, until any process is concluded"

The decline in aggregate funds of Indian clients with Swiss banks for the second consecutive year, after hitting a 14-year-high of CHF 3.83 billion in 2021, was largely driven by a sharp plunge in funds held through bonds, securities and various other financial instruments.

Besides, the amount in customer deposit accounts and funds held through other bank branches in India also declined significantly, the data showed. These are official figures reported by banks to the Swiss National Bank (SNB) and do not indicate the quantum of the much-debated alleged black money held by Indians in

Switzerland. These figures also do not include the money that Indians, NRIs or others might have in Swiss banks in the names of third-country entities.



1.039.8 million, described by the SNB as 'total liabilities' of Swiss banks or 'amounts due to' their Indian clients at the end of 2023, included CHF 310 million in customer deposits (down from CHF 394 million at 2022-end). CHF 427 million held via other banks (down from CHF 1,110 million), CHF 10 million (down from CHF 24 million) through fiduciaries or trusts, and CHF 302 million as other amounts due to customers in form of bonds, securities and various other financial instruments (down from CHF 1,896 million). According to the SNB, its

data for 'total liabilities' of Swiss banks towards Indian clients takes into account all types of funds of Indian customers at Swiss banks, including deposits from individuals, banks and enterprises.

This includes data for branches of Swiss banks in India, as also non-deposit liabilities.

On the other hand, the 'locational banking statistics' of the Bank for International Settlement (BIS), which have been described in the past by Indian and Swiss authorities as a more reliable measure for deposits by Indian individuals in Swiss banks, showed a deThe total amount stood at a record high of nearly 6.5bn Swiss Francs in 2006, after which it has been mostly on a downward path, except for a few years including in 2011, 2013, 2017, 2020 and 2021

cline of nearly 25 per cent during 2023 in such funds to \$70.6 million (Rs 663 crore).

It had dropped by 18 per cent in 2022 and by over 8 per cent in 2021, after rising by nearly 39 per cent in 2020.

This figure takes into account deposits as well as loans of Indian non-bank clients of Swiss-domiciled banks and had shown an increase of 7 per cent in 2019, after declining by 11 per cent in 2018 and by 44 per cent in 2017.

It peaked at over \$2.3 billion (over ₹9,000 crore) at the end of 2007.

Swiss authorities have always maintained that assets held by Indian residents in Switzerland cannot be considered as 'black money' and they actively support India in its fight against tax fraud and evasion.

The overall funds of foreign

clients, including institutions, declined to CHF 983 billion (over ₹92 lakh crore) in 2023, from CHF 1.15 trillion at the end of 2022.

In terms of assets, Indian clients accounted for CHF 1.46 million at the end of 2023, marking a decline of 63 per cent from the previous year and the lowest level in over two decades.

This included dues from Indian customers worth about CHF 188 million, up from CHF 164 million at the end of 2022.

While the UK topped the charts for foreign clients' money in Swiss banks at CHF 254 billion, it was followed by the US (CHF 71 billion) at the second spot and France (CHF 64 billion) at the third place.

These three were followed in the top 10 by West Indies, Germany, Hong Kong, Singapore, Luxembourg and Guernsey. India was placed at 67th

place, down from 46th place at the end of 2022.

Pakistan also saw a dip to CHF 286 million (from CHF 388 million), while Bangladesh witnessed a sharp plunge from CHF 55 million to CHF 18 million. Just like in India, the issue of

The currency declined to a lifetime low of 83.6650 against the US dollar in the latter half of the trading session and ended at a record closing low of 83.6525. Mumbai, June 20: There has been a record drop in the number of future unicorns, with 25 startups slipping out of the list because of funding winter, actions by financial regulators and also a bias towards profitability of ventures, a report said Thursday.

The number of unicorns -startups valued at over \$1 billion -- slipped by one to 67 in 2023. The unicorns had grown by three to 68 last year, as per the ASK Private Wealth Hurun Indian Future Unicorn Index.

There were "record dropouts" in future unicorns at 25, including five companies valued at over \$500 million that were likely to turn unicorn in three years (called gazelles) and 20 entities valued at over \$200 million likely to turn unicorn in five years (called chettahs), the report said.

The country is now home to 67 unicorns, 46 gazelles and 106 cheetahs, as per the list. It also added that there were 38 new entrants to the list, in-

cluding seven gazelles and 37 cheetahs. ASK Private Wealth's Chief

Cologne, June 20: Switzerland moved within touching distance of a place in the last 16 at Euro 2024 as Xherdan Shaqiri's stunning strike earned a 1-1 draw against Scotland here Wednesday.

Murat Yakin's side trailed to an early Scott McTominay goal that took a hefty deflection off Swiss defender Fabian Schar. But Shaqiri produced one of the goals of the tournament so far as the former Liverpool forward punished Anthony Ralston's woeful backpass with a brilliant curler from 20 yards. With honours even here, the Swiss sit in second place in Group A with four points, two behind Germany after the hosts beat Hungary 2-0 earlier Wednesday.
