No lapses in NEET: Five crore saplings to be planted across state: CM **Centre, NTA to SC**

The NTA, which conducts the NEET-UG, and the Union Education Ministry, in separate affidavits filed before the Supreme Court, have opposed a batch of pleas that have sought the scrapping of the controversy-hit

NEET-PG TO BE HELD AUGUST 11 New Delhi: The NEET-PG 2024 entrance examination will be held

especially to the career prospects of the qualified candidates.' The agency said the entirety of NEET-UG 2024 exam was carried out fairly and with due confidentiality without any illegal practices, and the claim of malpractice' during the exam is 'completely unfounded, misleading, and lacks any basis'. "It is submitted that if the entire examination process is cancelled without there being any tangible factors warranting such actions it would be highly detrimental to the larger public interest involving the academic career of lakhs of students who have attempted the examination fairly without any wrongdoing or even an allegation of wrongdoing," the NTA said. The ministry and NTA said there was no proof of any largescale breach of confidentiality in the test which was taken by over 23 lakh candidates at 4,750 centres in 571 cities. The ministry said the Centre was committed to protecting the interests of lakhs of students who have attempted the question papers fairly and after years of hardwork, without trying to obtain any illegal advantage. The top court is scheduled to hear July 8 a batch of pleas, including those alleging irregularities in the examination and seeking a direction that it be held afresh.



Keir Starmer new **UK PM after** Labour landslide

London, July 5: Keir Starmer became UK's new Prime Minister Friday and vowed to rebuild Britain, hours after his Labour Party secured a landslide victory in a general election in which the weary voters inflicted a 'sobering verdict' on Rishi Sunak-led Conservatives, who suffered their worst electoral drubbing.

Starmer, 61, assumed as the 58th PM after his customary audience with King Charles III at Buckingham Palace, following Sunak's meeting with the British monarch. The Labour Party secured 412 seats in the 650-member House of Commons, up 211 from the last election in 2019. Sunak's Conservatives won just 121 seats, down 250 seats from the previous election. While the Labour had a vote share of 33.7 per cent the Conservatives had 23.7 per cent. "Our country has voted decisively for change, for national renewal and a return of politics for public service," said Starmer in his inaugural address from a lectern outside 10 Downing Street, the official residence of the British PM P10

New Delhi, July 5: Amid the growing clamour for cancellation of the controversy-ridden NEET-UG. 2024 exam over alleged malpractices, the Centre and the National Testing Agency told the Supreme Court Friday that scrapping it would be 'counterproductive' and 'seriously jeopardise' lakhs of honest candidates in the absence of proof of largescale breach of confidentiality. In their separate affidavits, the ministry and the NTA said the CBI, the country's premier investigating agency, has taken over the cases registered in dif-

ferent states. "It is also submitted that at the same time, in the absence of any proof of any large-scale breach of confidentiality in a

Majhi said. Stressing that there is a plan to plant over five crore saplings across the state, the CM called upon the people to get actively involved in this programme.

"As Odisha's population is four-and-a-half-crore, we should plant at least an equal number of trees in this campaign,' he said.



Ruins of garden linked to Roman emperor uncovered



Rome, July 5: Archaeological excavations near the Vatican uncovered the remains of an ancient garden overlooking the right bank of the Tiber River that was likely owned by Roman Emperor Caligula, Italy's culture ministry has said.

The discovery was made during construction work to create a pedestrian piazza linking Castel Sant'Angelo to St. Peter's Basilica and its Via della Conciliazione boulevard, some of Rome's most visited tourist sites

In ancient times the area housed prestigious imperial res-



idences overlooking the Tiber with spectacular porticos, promtine wall, the foundations of a colonnaded portico and a garden, the ministry said. The excavations also uncovered a lead water pipe stamped with the name of the owner of the water supply and likely of the garden.

The details point to Caligula, son of Germanicus and Agrippina the Elder, and emperor of Rome from 37 to 41, the ministry said, adding that there are literary references that seem to confirm the connection of the site to Caligula.

The excavation also revealed an important series of figurative terracottas used to decorate roofs, with unusual mythologi-

cal scenes, reused as covers for the sewers, but originally probably made for the covering of some structure in the garden, the ministry said.

The construction project is part of the Vatican's 2025 Jubilee, a holy year that is expected to draw some 32 million pilgrims to Rome. The run-up to the Jubilee has involved launching dozens of long-delayed construction projects, including the 79.5 million euro piazza, with a tunnel below it redirecting traffic underground.

The project, located at Piazza Pia, is expected to be completed by December.

Bridge collapses: 15 engineers suspended

Patna: The Bihar government Friday suspended 15 engineers in connection with a series of recent incidents of bridge collapse in the state, a senior official said. The decision was taken after a probe panel submitted its report to Water Resources Department (WRD). "It was found that engineers were negligent and monitoring was ineffective... that is the main reason behind the collapse of small bridges and causeways in the state," Additional Chief Secretary of WRD, Chaitanya Prasad, told reporters here. A total of 10 bridges collapsed in the past 17 days, **P**8 officials said.

Amritpal, Rashid take oath as LS members

New Delhi: Jailed radical Sikh preacher Amritpal Singh and Kashmiri leader Sheikh Abdul Rashid, who were granted parole to take oath as members of the Lok Sabha, were sworn in as MPs Friday, amid heavy deployment of security personnel in and around the Parliament complex. While Rashid, popularly known as Engineer Rashid, is in Delhi's Tihar jail in a terror funding case registered under the UAPA, Singh is lodged in a prison in Assam's Dibrugarh district for offences under the National Security Act. Singh, 31, and Rashid 56, won the polls from Khadoor Sahib in Puniab and Baramulla in Jammu & Kashmir, respectively. **P**9



The Balasore resident added that the only way for him was to get the scan done at a nearby private facility.

Acknowledging the breakdown, SCBMCH administrative officer Abinash Rout said the pricy equipment, deployed by a private agency under PPP arrangement, was being repaired as and when required.

"We had informed the previous government about the requirement of a new CT scan machine. The government had also sanctioned it. We have also appraised the new government about the hospital's needs. We are hopeful of having a new imaging machine soon," Rout pointed



between BJP and Congress workers over Rahul Gandhi's remark in Parliament, the functionaries of Odisha Pradesh Congress Committee (OPCC) here, Friday, gheraoed the police Seva Bhawan demanding action against the BJP cadres.

Congress party workers took out a protest march from Master Canteen Square to the state police headquarters. Later, they submitted a memorandum to Twin City police commissioner Sanieeb Panda and Bhubaneswar deputy commissioner of police (DCP) Prateek Singh for immediate arrest of the accused BJP members who had attacked their party workers.

Police City Twin Commissioner Sanjeeb Panda said the cops have launched an investigation into the matter and would take necessary action against the guilty.

Notably, both $\check{\text{B}}\text{JP}$ and Congress lodged a complaint at Capital police station following the violent clash here, July 3. However, the cops have not arrested anyone in this connection.

Congress' Sanakhemundi MLA Ramesh Jena, who was present at the protest site, said though 48 hours have passed since BJP workers pelted cow dung and stones at our office, the police have not made a single arrest. "At a time when Rahul Gandhi has been raising critical issues in the Parliament, the BJP, on the other hand, is resorting to cowardly tactics like attacks. Our demonstration strongly objects such attacks," he added.

Former OPCC president Jayadev Jena said, "Had the cops been sincere, we would not have gheraoed the CP office. The ironv is BJP, while it was in Opposition, used to criticise BJD for disrupting the law and order. However, they are playing the same game now. Less than a month after coming to power; BJP has ended democracy in the state."

PRESS TRUST OF INDIA

Bhubaneswar, July 5: Former minister and senior BJD leader Surendranath Nayak died here Friday morning, his family sources said. He was 87.

Nayak was suffering from agerelated ailments and died at his residence here.

He was elected to the Assembly seven times from Kakatpur constituency on Utkal Congress, Janata Dal and BJD tickets between 1971 and 2009.

Nayak had served as the minister of several departments, including Excise, Revenue, Agriculture, School and Mass Education and Panchayati Raj under the leadership of Biju

Patnaik and Naveen Patnaik. Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi, Deputy Chief Ministers Kanak Vardhan Singh Deo and Pravati Parida, Speaker Surama Padhi and several others paid floral tributes to the departed soul in the state Assembly.

Majhi said Odisha has lost a tall leader and the vacuum created by his demise can never be



filled. He expressed condolences to the bereaved family of Nayak.

In a post on X, Singh Deo said, "Heartfelt condolences on the passing of Shri Surendranath Nayak, a true leader and dedicated seven-time MLA from Kakatpur. His contributions to our community will never be forgotten.³

Former CM and BJD president Naveen Patnaik condoled the demise of Nayak and said his dedication towards serving the Kakatpur people will always be remembered.

"As an able politician and public representative, his humanitarian work will be a source of inspiration for all. May his soul rest in peace and my condolences to the bereaved family members," Patnaik said.

The mortal remains of Nayak were taken to Sankha Bhawan, the BJD headquarters, where senior party leaders paid respect to him.



Further, lactate was also found responsible for altering the structure of a key protein involved in DNA repair, called NBS1, and affecting its efficiency.

The researchers believe that lactate may be behind chemotherapy resistance in other cancers such as "pancreatic, lung and ovarian cancers"

'This extremely promising research has uncovered a likely mechanism for how cancer evades chemotherapy," said Axel Behrens, Professor of Stem Cell Biology at The Institute of 🛁 Cancer Research.

"In our early-stage study, we've seen that you can prevent the build-up of lactate and make a tumour that was resistant to chemotherapy sensitive again --- the treatment continues to work," Axel added.

According to IMD's Bhubaneswar regional centre, under the influence of a cyclonic circulation over east-central Bay of Bengal, Mayurbhanj, Koraput and Malkangiri districts are expected to experience heavy rainfall Saturday.

The IMD bulletin said heavy to very heavy rainfall is anticipated in Gajapati, Rayagada,

Kalahandi, Nabarangpur, Khurda, Nayagarh, Cuttack, Puri, Mayurbhanj, Keonjhar, Koraput, Malkangiri, Kandhamal and Ganjam districts July 7.

The Met office has issued yellow warnings for Keonjhar, Mayurbhanj, Malkangiri, Koraput, Rayagada, Nabarangpur, Gajapati, Ganjam and Kandhamal districts July 8; and Jharsuguda, Sundargarh, Mayurbhanj, and Keonjhar districts July 9.

IMD Bhubaneswar chief Manorama Mohanty said Angul recorded the highest rainfall of 55.2mm in last 24 hours, while heavy rainfall was reported in several districts.

The regional weather office said that cumulative rainfall received from June 1 to July 5 stands at 191.1mm, against the average rainfall of 255.8255.8mm during the period. While one district received excess rainfall, 11 districts got normal rainfall. Rainfall in two districts fell

under 'large deficient' category while it was 'deficient' in the remaining 16 districts during the period, the IMD said.


Human behaviour abetted deadly bacteria to become epidemic

THE BACTERIA SPREAD OCCURRED MOSTLY AS **PEOPLE BEGAN TO LIVE IN DENSELY POPULATED AREAS. WHERE AIR POLLUTION MADE OUR** LUNGS MORE SUSCEPTIBLE TO INFECTION AND WHERE THERE WERE MORE OPPORTUNITIES FOR INFECTIONS TO SPREAD

Cientists claim, Pseudomonas aeruginosa, an environmental bacteria can cause devastating multidrug resistant infections, particularly in people with underlying lung conditions, has evolved rapidly and then spread globally over the last 200 years, in a new study released Friday. Changes in human behaviour

helped the bacteria -- responsible for over 5.00.000 deaths per year worldwide, of which over 3,00,000 are associated with antimicrobial resistance (AMR) -to become epidemic, said the team from the University of Cambridge in the UK.

People with conditions such as chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) -- smoking-re-



lated lung damage -- cystic fibrosis (CF), and non-CF bronchiectasis, are particularly susceptible to the bacteria. P aeruginosa was found to exploit immune defects to persist in cystic fibrosis patients.

To probe how P aeruginosa evolved from an environmental organism into a specialised human pathogen the scientists examined DNA data from

almost 10,000 samples taken from infected individuals, animals, and environments around the world.

Using the data, the team created phylogenetic trees -- 'family trees' -- that show how the bacteria from the samples are related to each other.

Their results, published in the journal Science, showed that almost seven in 10 infections are caused by just 21 genetic clones, or 'branches' of the family tree. These have rapidly evolved (by acquiring new genes from neighbouring bacteria) and then spread globally over the last 200 years.

The bacteria spread occurred mostly as people began to live in densely populated areas,

where air pollution made our lungs more susceptible to infection and where there were more opportunities for infections to spread.

Besides spreading between CF patients, it can also spread with "worrying ease between other patients, too", the team said.

The study on P aeruginosa "has taught us new things about the biology of cystic fibrosis and revealed important ways we might be able to improve immunity against invading bacteria in this and potentially other conditions," said Professor Andres Floto, director of the UK Cystic Fibrosis Innovation Hub at the University of Cambridge.

In this connection, members of Bhitarkanika Suraksha Samiti Sanjay Kumar Bag, Pabitra Sethi, Ranjan Pradhan, Madhab Sethi, Soumya Ranjan Choudhury, Debadatta Sethi, Jagbandhu Khatua, Surya Narayan Mishra, Sudam Kumar Ojha, Abhay Kumar Raut, Raghavendra Mohanty, Liton Sethi, Jagabandhu Das, Shambhu under Bankual Mauza Khata No 7 and Plot No 92. Similarly, Hotel Red Crab has been erected on forest type land under Bankual Mauza Khata No 7 and Plot No 39. A three-storeved hotel Kanika Sundari and its cottages have been built on three plots of forest land under Bankual Mauza Khata No 7 Plot No 85, Khata No 9 Plot

No 86, and Khata No 7 Plot No 86. Furthermore, Hotel Satyapriya has been constructed on Bankual Mauza forest land, Hotel Mangrove Pitta Homestay has been built under Dangamal Mauza, Khata No 246, Plot No 525 and on the canal in front of it under Durgaprasad Mauza. These four hotels have been erected entirely on forest type land and government land under Dangamal and Durgaprasad Mauza.

Hotels and resorts have mushroomed on government and forest land, despite absence of even an inch of private land or any land patta. However, the administration has remained silent without taking any action. This has created sharp resentment and anger among the local residents.

On the other hand, Congress leader Bidhu Bhushan Mahapatra, Bhagirathi Jena and social worker Bhubaneswar Pradhan have said that Bankual village is situated very close to the national park. This village comes under the Eco-Sensitive Zone of Bhitarkanika as recently declared by the Central government. Complaints were raised in October 2023 regarding presence of Swad Hotel on uninhabited and cemetery land despite a ban on new construction in the area. The DFO and local tehsildar were also given a memorandum to investigate the type and location of the land and take action. Even after of frequent agitations over such irregularities, nothing has been achieved. Nowadays, there is a buzz on social media calling for action against the wrongdoers after proper investigation into the location of the land and the ownership. The matter of Swad Hotel came to the fore on social media after an inquiry with the local tehsildar Ajay Kumar Mohanty in this regard. Mohanty

said the matter will be investi-

gated soon and appropriate



Under the leadership of 'Rathamaharana' Nilamani Maharana and under the supervision of the Endowment department, the construction of the chariot is in full swing. About 30 workers have been engaged to complete the



chariot construction. District Collector Vishal Singh recently went to the old city and reviewed the construction of the chariot and preparations for the procession. Similarly, the district

utting speculations to rest, Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath appointed Manoj Kumar Singh as the new Chief Secretary of the state. He took over from Durga Shanker Mishra, who was not granted a fourth extension beyond June 30.

For a while, there was widespread speculation in Lucknow about the possibility of another extension for Mishra. Sources told DKB that the state government had sent a proposal to the Centre seeking an extension for Mishra beyond June 30. However, the Centre indicated that no such proposal had reached Raisina Hill, effectively ruling out any further extension for Mishra.

Notably, when Mishra met with Union Home Minister Amit Shah in mid-June, a former Union Secretary from Uttar Pradesh suggested it marked the end of Mishra's tenure as Uttar Pradesh's Chief Secretary. Certainly, the political landscape in Uttar Pradesh has become increasingly fluid following poor results for the ruling party in the 2024 Lok Sabha elections. Mishra's unexpected meeting with Amit Shah had fueled rumours that he might stay on, by securing another extension as Chief Secretary. That was not to be. But with Manoj Singh's appointment, Yogi has signalled to the Centre that he will continue to run the state government in his own chosen way

Extended tenures of key babus signal stability

Prime Minister Narendra Modi's decision to keep some of his old team while bringing in fresh faces into his Cabinet is all about continuity and stability. This can be seen in the makeup of his Cabinet and the choices his government has been making lately

One big move was extending Tapan Kumar Deka's time as Director of the Intelligence Bureau (IB) for another year beyond June 30, 2024. This shows that the NDA administration really trusts Modi's leader-

ship and experience. To make this happen, the government even relaxed some rules, which may raise concerns in some quarters. But when national security is such a high priority, it won't be questioned much.

Another similar move was extending Bharat Lal's tenure as Secretary General of the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC). Serving in the rank and pay of Secretary to the Government of India on a contract basis, Lal's extension beyond June 30, 2024, ensures the NHRC continues to benefit from his extensive experience and dedication.

These extensions are part of a bigger strategy to value seasoned babus who have proven their capabilities and earned Modi's trust. The NDA government seems to be all about stability and sticking with policies that work. Keeping experienced leaders in critical roles aims to ensure a smooth transition and continued progress.

Lucky Ali alleges land grab by IAS officer, sparks row

Popular singer Lucky Ali's recent allegations against IAS officer Rohini Sindhuri and her family have kicked up a storm. Ali claims that Sindhuri and her family have misused government resources and snatched his farmland in Yelahanka's Kanchenahalli area. This is a big deal and has got everyone talking.

Ali hasn't kept these claims to himself. He's gone public, filing a complaint with the Karnataka Lokayukta Police. He says that Sindhuri, her husband Sudhir Reddy, and her brother-in-law Madhusudan Reddy have illegally grabbed his land, using their clout to escape it.

Sources say that this isn't the first time Ali has brought this issue up. A few years ago, he accused the local police of taking Sindhuri's side and asked higher-ups to step in, claiming there was a 'land mafia' conspiracy. These recurring accusations point to a long-standing and troubling dispute.

At its core, this is about more than just land. It's about the misuse of power and the integrity of public officials. If Ali's allegations are true, a senior IAS officer used her position for personal gain, which is a major breach of trust. The alleged involvement of the local police makes things even messier.

Rohini Sindhuri's past controversies add another twist to this saga. She was previously involved in a public spat with IPS officer D Roopa, which led to both officers being removed from their posts. The episode was covered extensively in this column. This history makes the current allegations even more concerning and highlights the need to look closely at her actions.

DEFINING DEMOCRACY

early everyone agrees that US President Joe Biden's awful performance in his debate with Donald Trump has increased the chances of a Republican victory in November's presidential election. Trump lied and ranted, but he did so with vigor. While Biden made some good points, he spoke and looked like a bewildered old man.

In the end, those good points may mean little. As Frank Luntz, an old hand in Republican electoral politics, wrote in The New York Times, it's not "the facts, the policies, or even the oneupmanship," by Biden and Trump that matters, it's "how they make voters feel." There is no doubt that Democratic voters felt bad after watching the disaster unfold.

Biden has acknowledged his stumble but continues to make the case that a second Trump administration poses an existential threat to democracy in the United States. A liberal democracy cannot function without an independent judiciary, a free press, and a non-partisan government bureaucracy. Biden believes in these key democratic pillars. Trump, for his part, plans to stack the civil service with loyalists, wants to use the judiciary and the Department of Justice as a political tool against his enemies, hates the press, and flirts with mob violence.

So, if Trump's threat to democracy is real, which I believe it is, Americans who care about their system of government would surely prefer a doddery old democrat to an authoritarian rabble-rouser. Even if Biden drops out of the campaign, the danger of a destructive second Trump administration remains as strong as ever.

Many people, especially those drawn to Trump's demagogy, may regard American democracy as a spent force anyway, a corrupt system governed by selfish elites who only pretend to care about ordinary people.



A recent poll of swing-state voters suggests that Americans do, in fact, care about democracy: 61% see threats to US democracy as extremely important. Astonishingly, 44% of all these voters believe that Trump would do a better job of handling these threats, compared to 33% who trust Biden more

Such feelings are prevalent among the middle-aged white people in red MAGA hats who attend Trump's rallies. But some Black and Latino people, as well as disaffected young voters, hold a similar view. They feel betrayed by Democrats who failed to keep their promises.

But a recent poll of swingstate voters suggests that Americans do, in fact, care about democracy: 61% see threats to US democracy as extremely important. Astonishingly, 44% of all these voters believe that Trump would do a better job of handling these threats, compared to 33% who trust Biden more.

This raises the question of what people mean by democracy. In a properly functioning liberal democracy, voters elect politicians who represent their interests. Winners are entitled to govern, but not to dictate from on high. That means political leaders should consider

the welfare of people who voted for the losing parties, or who didn't vote at all, and resolve conflicting interests with debate and compromise. Biden is of the old school: he still believes in negotiation and is willing to slap the odd back, whisper in the right ear, and even twist an arm when necessary to reach some sort of agreement. To people with a different

idea of democracy, this can seem like the way corrupt elites typically do their business. They feel that the voice of the people is not heard; that political leaders can't make decisions; that promises can't be kept; and that radical change is impossible. What they want is "direct democracy," whereby a strong leader, unencumbered by those selfish elected representatives in Congress, speaks for the people.

Fascism is one example of direct democracy. "Decisionism" - the leader decides - was the

phrase used in Nazi Germany and Mussolini's Italy. This was considered democratic because the leader is the direct and sole representative of the people. He is, in a very real sense, above the law. Carl Schmitt, the German jurist who justified this type of rule, wrote about Hitler that the Führer "creates law by virtue of his leadership as the supreme judge."

Communism, which positioned itself as the unyielding enemy of fascism, was another variant of direct democracy. The party, and especially its leader, was the voice of the people, or the proletariat. Both fascism and communism wished to abolish political conflict through the violent imposition of a monolithic state, rather than by negotiation. Communists called for eliminating class enemies, so that only the proletariat remains, whereas the Nazis aimed to create a "racially pure" society.

Most American voters who believe that Trump is the best defender of democracy are not fascists, much less communists. The very thought would horrify them. But they almost surely have a strong opinion on who constitutes the true American people: God-fearing, hard-working, and most probably white. And they worry that these ordinary Americans are being displaced by illegal immigrants, and that their way of life is being threatened by new ideas about gender, race, and sexuality emerging from elite universities.

Trump is stoking these fears and exaggerating these threats His line that the US courts are attacking not only him, but every right-thinking American is horribly effective. Since he is heard as the true voice of the people, he is the purest democrat. As a result, liberal democracy might not withstand another four years of his rule.

Mumbai, July 5: Maharashtra Deputy Chief Minister Ajit Pawar, who also holds Finance and Portfolio Departments, Friday said that their government's budget proposals will transform the state.

"A slew of proposals including Mukhamantri Ladki Bahin Yojana, free electricity up to 7.5 HP to farmers, three free cylinders to women, training to youth in the additional budget 2024-25 are not election Jumla but the government's firm commitment to transform the state, expedite growth and spur development of all sections of the society,' the Deputy Chief Minister said.

He said that the Opposition should not indulge in setting a "fake narrative" as done during the Lok Sabha elections, adding that it won't work in the upcoming Assembly election as the government is committed to implement the budget proposals backed by the necessary financial allocations.

Deputy Chief Minister in his reply to the budget debate in the state Assembly reiterated the state government's resolve to achieve Maharashtra a trilliondollar economy, saving that the government has taken several steps in this regard.

"At the current dollar rate the trillion dollar economy will be worth ₹82.92 lakh crore. The state economy is expected to be worth ₹44.44 lakh crore in 2024 25, which is an increase of 10.9 per cent compared to the GSDP of 2023-23," the Deputy Chief Minister said.

Pune. July 5: The 17-year-old minor allegedly involved in the Pune Porsche car crash that killed two techies has submitted a 300-word essay on road safety complying with the bail conditions of the Juvenile Justice Board (JJB), an official said Friday.

The teenager submitted the essay to the JJB Wednesday, the official said.

The juvenile was released from an observation home last month after the Bombay High Court held that the orders remanding him to the facility were illegal. Hours after the fatal accident

in the city's Kalyani Nagar area May 19, the JJB had ordered that he be kept under the care and supervision of his parents and grandfather. It also asked the minor to write a 300-word essay on road safety.

According to the police, the minor was driving a Porsche car under the influence of alcohol when it rammed into a two-wheeler, killing two soft ware engineers.

Amid a nationwide outrage over his quick bail on lenient terms, the police moved JJB, seeking an amendment of the bail order. The board ordered that the minor be sent to an observation home May 22.

The HC paved his release holding the orders illegal and stressed that the law regarding juveniles must be implemented fully.

Nagpur, July 5: Ten whiterumped vultures, a critically endangered species, were tagged with GSM trackers in Tadoba Andhari Tiger Reserve (TATR) in Maharashtra's Chandrapur district, an official has said.

The initiative was part of the Jatayu conservation project, TATR field director Jitendra Ramgaokar said in a release Thursday. "Ten white-rumped vultures (Gyps bengalensis), previously relocated from the BNHS Vulture Conservation & Breeding

These vultures, which were released into a specially constructed pre-release aviary at Botezari within the Kolsa Range of TATR January 21 this year, underwent tagging to monitor their movements and behaviour. Along with tagging, blood and faecal samples were also collected from these birds as part of comprehensive health assessments to ensure the absence of diseases before their release into the wild," he added.

The International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) has categorised white-rumped vultures as critically endangered.

In a release, the BMC said that along with a large number of wrappers of food items and water bottles, a huge quantity of shoes and chappals (slippers), among other things, were collected during the cleanliness drive.

Of the total trash, shoes and chappals were collected in as many as five jeeps, it said, adding that two dumpers were also used to lift the garbage from the spot. Instead of sending this junk to the dumping ground, all these items will be sent to recycling plants, the civic body added.

The cleanliness drive started at 11.30 pm Thursday and ended at 8 am Friday. One hundred staffers of the Civic Solid Waste Management department and workers of some NGOs took part in it, it said.

With this operation, a neat and clean Marine Drive promenade was made available to people as scores of them use this spot for morning walk and exercising.

During the victory parade, police deployed a large number of personnel and made elaborate security arrangements between Marine Drive and Wankhede Stadium to avoid any untoward incident.

Thrissur (Kerala), July 5: An outbreak of African Swine Fever, a highly contagious and deadly swine disease that can affect both farm-raised and feral (wild) pigs, has been reported from a farm in a village in Kerala's Thrissur district, officials said Friday.

Due to the outbreak of swine fever, which can be readily transmitted from one pig to another through direct contact with bodily fluids from an infected pig, the Thrissur district collector has ordered the culling of 310 pigs at a private farm in Thrissur district's Madakkathara panchayat, they said.

'The disease was confirmed in the pigs owned by Kuttalapuzha Babu of Veliyanthara in the 14th ward. The district Collector has directed the district animal husbandry officer to cull the pigs and bury them," according to an official release here

A team consisting of doctors, livestock inspectors and attendants will conduct the culling process, and further primary disinfection measures will also be taken, it said.

The area within a one-kilometre radius of the affected farm has been declared a disease-affected area, and the area within a 10-km radius has been declared a disease surveillance area.



New Delhi, July 5: Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Russian President Vladimir Putin will review the whole range of bilateral ties, including in areas like defence, investment, energy cooperation, education, culture and people-topeople exchanges, at the upcoming annual India-Russia summit, Foreign Secretary Vinay Kwatra said Friday. Modi will pay a two-day offi-

cial visit to Russia from July 8 to 9 at the invitation of Putin for the 22nd India-Russia summit that will review the entire range of multi-faceted ties between the two countries. Putin will host a private dinner for Modi on the day of arrival. The two leaders will also share perspectives on "regional and global developments of mutual interest," Kwatra said at a media briefing here ahead of Modi's visit to Russia for the summit.

Russia itinerary, Kwatra said, as of now, the Prime Minister is scheduled to arrive in Moscow late afternoon of July 8. The next day, Modi's interactions would include an interface with the Indian community in Russia. The Prime Minister will also lay a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier in Kremlin. And, thereafter he will visit Rosatom pavilion at the exhibition venue in Moscow.

The annual India-Russia sum-

mit is taking place after three years, and "we attach great importance to it," Kwatra said. The issue of early discharge of Indian nationals who have been misled into the service of the Russian Army is expected to figure in the discussions," he added. After concluding his trip to Russia, Modi will travel to Austria, which will be the first visit by an Indian prime minister to that country in 41 years, the Ministry of External Affairs

said Thursday. This will be Modi's first trip to Russia in nearly five years. His last visit to that country was in 2019 when he attended an economic conclave in the Far East city of Vladivostok. This will also be his first visit to Russia since the conflict in Ukraine.

So far, 21 annual summits have taken place alternately in India and Russia. The last summit was held December 6, 2021 in New Delhi. Putin had visited India to attend the summit.

The leaders will also assess the status of bilateral engagements in groupings such as BRICS, Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO), G20, East Asia Summit, and the UN, the foreign secretary said. Other areas of interest will include cooperation across the range of areas. The last summit saw both sides sealing 28 MoUs and

agreements besides coming out with a joint statement titled "India-Russia Partnership for Peace, Progress and Prosperity".

The owner had used wooden strips to cover the well, and following thunderstorms and rains in the area in the last few days, one of the strips had fallen in, they said.

In the second incident in neighbouring Korba, those killed were identified as Jahru Patel (60), his daughter Sapina (16), and two other members of the family, Shivcharan Patel (45) and Manbodh Patel (57), Korba Superintendent of Police Siddharth Tiwari said.

In both the incidents, bodies were fished out by personnel of State Disaster Response Force (SDRF) and sent for the post mortem, as per police.

Chief Minister Vishnu Deo Sai expressed grief over the two_ incidents and instructed officials to provide compensation of ₹9 lakh each to the kin of the deceased.

Rain disrupts life in U'khand, Himachal

New Delhi: Heavy rain disrupted daily life in vast swathes of north India including Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand Friday while the flood situation in Assam remained grim with major rivers flowing above the danger mark and nearly 22 lakh people affected. In Uttarakhand, which has received heavy rain over the past few days, a five-yearold drowned in a rainwaterfilled pit in Dehradun and a teenager in a Haridwar rivulet Heavy rain also lashed several parts of Himachal Pradesh in the past 24 hours, leading to the closure of 64 roads.

Patna, July 5: The Bihar government Friday suspended 15 engineers in connection with a series of recent incidents of bridge collapse in the state, a senior official said. The decision was taken after

a probe panel submitted its report to the Water Resources Department (WRD). A total of 10 bridges collapsed in Siwan,

Saran, Madhubani, Araria, East Champaran and Kishanganj districts in the past 17 days, officials said.

The report found that the engineers were "negligent" and monitoring was "ineffective", which is the main reason behind the collapse of small bridges and causeways in the state, Additional Chief Secretary of WRD, Chaitanya Prasad, told reporters here. Those suspended include four executive engineers.

"The Rural Works Department has also initiated the process of blacklisting the contractor who was involved in the construction of the bridge in Araria district. The department has also stopped payment of the contractor/firm for its previous work till the completion of the probe," said Dipak Kumar Singh,

RWD. Besides, the department has sought explanation from officials concerned for the collapse of bridges in East Champaran June 23 and in Madhubani June 26

"A probe has already been ordered into the collapse of RWD bridges in these two districts,

said Singh. Commenting on the bridge collapse incidents, RJD leader Tejashwi Yadav told reporters: "Why are leaders of the NDA-led Bihar government, including Chief Minister Nitish Kumar, maintaining a stoic silence... These incidents prove how corruption is rampant in the ruling dispensation.

'The portfolio of the RWD, which constructs most of the small bridges in the state, is always with JD(U) leaders. Who should be held responsible for this mess?" the former deputy CM said.

Reacting to Yadav's comments, Jitan Ram Manjhi, Union minister and founder of the Hindustani Awam Morcha (Secular), which is an alliance partner of the NDA, said the matter should not be politicised.

HC asks CBI to respond to Kejriwal's bail plea

New Delhi: The Delhi High Court Friday asked the CBI to respond to Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal's bail plea in the corruption case registered by the CBI in connection with the alleged excise policy scam. Justice Neena Bansal Krishna issued a notice to the CBI on the bail plea and listed it for further hearing July 17. Kejriwal sought bail claiming that there was no necessity to arrest him in the CBI case and that his custody was illegal. Senior advocate Abhishek Singhvi, representing Kejriwal, said the AAP leader is not a flight risk and not a terrorist, and the CBI arrested him after he got bail in the ED's money laundering case.

> Patna, July 5: A Bihar man, who was bitten by a snake, bit it back, killing the reptile. Santosh Lohar, a resident of Navada, was sleeping at his base camp after a day's work on laying railway lines when the snake attacked him.

Driven by a superstition that biting the snake back would neutralise its venom, the 35-yearold took matters into his own hands and bit the snake twice. This unconventional response led to the snake's death, but it also landed Lohar in the hospital. His colleagues rushed him to

the Rajauli subdivision hospital where he received treatment. r Lohar recovered fast and was discharged the next day. The news of this unusual in-



cident quickly spread, and a crowd gathered at the hospital to catch a glimpse of Santosh and hear his story. Many locals speculated that the snake might not have been venomous, or else Santosh's life could have been in serious danger.

Earlier, a man in Uttar

Pradesh's Fatehpur miraculously survived five snake bites in nearly two months, leaving the doctors astonished. The bites occurred June 2, June 10, and June 17, and twice in July. His condition is now stable, and the case has been deemed "strange" by med ical professionals.

Hathras/Aligarh (UP), July 5: Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi Friday said there were lapses on the part of the administration in the Hathras stampede incident that killed over 100 people, but added that he did not want to make it a political issue.

Rahul, after meeting the victims of the stampede in Uttar Pradesh's Hathras Friday morning, urged Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath to release "maximum compensation" for the victims without any delay. One of the family members who met Gandhi said he assured them that he will raise the issue in Parliament so that such incidents do not happen in future.

Speaking to reporters in Hathras Friday morning, Gandhi said. "It is a matter of grief that so many families have suffered, so many people lost their lives." "I don't want to



speak from a political prism. but there have been some lapses on part of the administration. There have been mistakes, which should be identified," the senior Congress leader said.

A total of 121 people, mostly women, died in the stampede at self-styled godman Baba Bhole's satsang in Hathras Tuesday.

Gandhi said this is a tough time for the victims and they would need the compensation quickly as they are poor.

'They are poor people and they need it (compensation) now. If you give them after six months, after a year or delay it, then it will not benefit anyone. Compensation should be given as soon as possible. Gandhi said. The government has announced a compensation of ₹2 lakh for those killed and ₹50,000 for the injured. Gandhi also said that he had a

"personal" interaction with the family members of the stampede victims. Before meeting family members in Hathras, Gandhi made a stop at Aligarh and met the kin of victims from the district. According to police, 17 people from Aligarh and 19 from Hathras were killed in the stampede. Gandhi left from Delhi early morning by road and was accompanied by UP Congress

The MPs-elect took oath in the chamber of the Lok Sabha speaker after completing for-

malities, a source said. Singh, 31, and Rashid, 56, won the recent Lok Sabha elections from Khadoor Sahib in Punjab and Baramulla in Jammu and Kashmir, respectively, as Independents while being incarcerated. They could not take

oath as members of the 18th Lok Sabha June 24 and 25 along with the other winning candidates.

For taking oath, Rashid was granted a two-hour custody parole, excluding the travel time from Tihar to Parliament, and Singh a four-day custody parole, beginning July 5, in view of the travel from Assam to Delhi and back. Their parole orders stated that during their period of temporary release, they can neither speak to or address the media on any issue or make any statements.

New Delhi, July 5: The Supreme Court is scheduled to consider July 10 a batch of pleas seeking review of its last year's judgement which refused to accord legal recognition to same-sex marriage

According to the cause list of July 10 uploaded on the apex court website, a five-judge bench headed by Chief Justice DY Chandrachud would consider in chambers the pleas seeking review of the October 17 last year verdict.

As per the practice, the review pleas are considered in chambers by judges.

Besides the CJI, the other members of the bench will be Justices Sanjiv Khanna, Hima Kohli, BV Nagarathna and PS Narasimha.

In a setback to gay rights activists, the apex court had October 17 last year refused to accord legal recognition to samesex marriage, saying there was 'no unqualified right' to marriage with the exception of those that are recognised by law.

The apex court, however, had made a strong pitch for the rights of queer people so they don't face discrimination in accessing goods and services that are available to others, safe houses known as 'Garima Greh' in all districts to provide shelter to members of the community facing harassment and violence and dedicated hotline numbers which they could use in case of trouble.

Holding that transgender people in heterosexual relationships have the freedom and entitlement to marry under the existing statutory provisions, the top court had said an entitlement to legal recognition of the right to union, akin to marriage or civil union, or conferring legalstatus to the relationship can be only done through "enacted law".

Record Indian-origin MPs elected to Parl

A record number of around 26 Indian-origin members of Parliament have been elected to the House of Commons in the UK's general election as results were announced Friday, with several Conservatives surviving an overall brutal outcome for their party. Outgoing prime minister Rishi Sunak leads the Tory charge of British Indians holding on to their seats, with a decisive win in his Richmond and Northallerton constituency in Yorkshire. Other prominent British Indian Tories holding on to their seats included former home secretaries, Suella Braverman and Priti Patel, as did Sunak's Goan-origin Cabinet ally Claire Coutinho. Gagan Mohindra held on to his South West Hertfordshire seat for the Conservatives, with Shivani Raja registering a gain for the party in the keenly watched constituency of Leicester East where she was contesting against fellow Indian-origin Labour candidate Rajesh Agrawal. Reflective of the overall election results tally, it was the Labour Party that saw the maximum number of winning Indian diaspora candidates, starting with party veterans such as Seema Malhotra – who held on to her Feltham and Heston constituency with a comfortable margin. Goan-origin Valerie Vaz, sister of Keith Vaz, won in Walsall and Bloxwich, as did Lisa Nandy with a big margin in Wigan.

wave, Starmer's success was built on the same voter desire for change and to punish perceived incompetence by incumbent governments that is driving support for the far right.

Britain, once renowned for political stability, has lurched from crisis to crisis since the 2016 vote to leave the European Union, through the Covid-19 pandemic, increasingly stretched public services and a cost of living crisis.

"I think there are cycles in politics and I think in a way the UK

is coming out of a cycle of quite a populist flavoured government since the Brexit vote," said Peter Ricketts, a former top official in Britain's foreign office and a former ambassador to France. FAR RIGHT RISING

Across Europe, far-right parties are rising.

Le Pen's National Rally has moved closer than ever to forming a government in France, while the centrist alliance that Emmanuel Macron formed has seen a collapse in support only two years after he won a second term as president.

The outcome - for France and its EU partners - will depend Sunday's run-off vote.

The Alternative for Germany (AfD) came second in the European Parliament elections in Germany and party membership is at a record high.

Italian Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni's arch-conservative Brothers of Italy group saw its position strengthened by winning the most votes in those elections, while Dutch anti-Islam populist Geert Wilders saw ministers from his party sworn into government for the first time this week.

The Conservative government had increasingly become associated with scandals under former PM Boris Johnson and his successor Liz Truss's disastrous 44-day premiership and her economic plans which brought chaos to financial markets.

Outgoing British prime min-ister Rishi Sunak said he will step down as the leader of the Conservative Party, taking "responsibility" for its debacle in the general election.

Several lawmakers are expected to compete to replace Sunak, the party sources said, with the right wing likely to promote two former interior ministers known for a tough line on immigration - Priti Patel and Suella Braverman - as well as former trade minister Kemi Badenoch, named minister of the year by the website ConservativeHome in 2023 after she took a robust position on trans issues

Braverman was quick to prom-

ise change to voters. "I'm sorry that

my party didn't listen to you," she said in a speech after winning reelection. "I will do everything in my power to rebuild trust. We need to listen to you, you have spoken to us very clearly."

The party sources said centrist candidates were also preparing campaigns, with James Cleverly and Tom Tugendhat, interior and security ministers under Sunak respectively, named as possible contenders

Indicating the likely arguments ahead, three Conservatives questioned the right-wing credentials of Robert Jenrick, a former immigration minister who has been working hard to shore up his support, after he previously adopted more centrist positions.

Iranians vote

Dubai: Polls opened in Iran Friday for a run-off presidential election that will test the clerical rulers' popularity amid voter apathy at a time of regional tensions and a standoff with the West over Tehran's nuclear programme. The run-off follows a June 28 ballot with historic low turnout, when over 60% of Iranian voters abstained from the snap election for a successor to Ebrahim Raisi, following his death in a helicopter crash. The low participation is seen by critics as a vote of no confidence in the Islamic Republic.

Manila, July 5: The Philippines has turned down offers from the United States to assist operations in the South China Sea, after a flare-up with China over missions to resupply Filipino troops on a contested shoal, its military chief said.

Tensions in the disputed waterway have boiled over into violence in the past year, with a Filipino sailor losing a finger in the latest June 17 clash that Manila described as "intentionalhigh speed ramming" by the Chinese coast guard. The US, a treaty ally, has offered support but Manila prefers to handle operations on its own, Armed Forces Chief General Romeo Brawner told Reuters late Thursday.

"Yes, of course, they have been offering help and they asked us

Cairo, July 5: Efforts to secure a ceasefire and hostage release in Gaza were gathering momentum Friday after Hamas made a revised proposal on the terms of a deal and Israel said it would resume stalled negotiations.

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu told US President Joe Biden Thursday he would send a delegation to resume negotiations, and an Israeli official said his country's team would be led by the head of the Mossad intelligence agency.

A source in Israel's negotiating team, speaking on condition of anonymity, said there was a real chance of achieving agreement after Hamas made its re-



vised proposal on the terms of a deal, received by Israel Wednesday.

'The proposal put forward by Hamas includes a very significant breakthrough," the source said, speaking on condition of anonymity and giving no details. The Israeli response to the Hamas proposal, submitted via mediators, was in marked contrast to past instances during the nearly nine-month-old war in Gaza, when Israel said conditions attached by the militant Islamist group were not acceptable.

A Palestinian official close to the internationally mediated

peace efforts told Reuters the new Hamas proposal could lead to a framework agreement if it is embraced by Israel

He said Hamas was no longer demanding as a pre-condition an Israeli commitment to permanently cease fire before the signing of an agreement, and would allow negotiations to achieve that throughout a first six-week phase.

"Should the sides need more time to seal an agreement on a permanent ceasefire, the two sides should agree there would be no return to the fighting until they do that," the official told Reuters.

Brazil's Supreme Court has yet to receive the police report with the latest indictment. Once it does, the country's prosecutor-general, Paulo Gonet, will analyse the document and decide whether to file charges and force Bolsonaro to stand trial.

The indictment dramatically raises the legal threats facing the divisive ex-leader that are applauded by his opponents but denounced as political persecution by his supporters.

"The Russia we hold dear has fallen into the hands of fools,' Roman Trotsenko, the former head of the country's largest shipbuilding company, confided to another businessperson during a leaked phone conversa-tion in April 2023. "They adhere to strange, outdated nineteenth-century ideologies. This will not end well. It will end in catastrophe.'

In another leaked conversation, the renowned music producer Iosif Prigozhin (not related to Yevgeny Prigozhin) referred to Russian President Vladimir Putin and his government as "criminals." Some of the oligarchs who were abroad at the time of the invasion refused to return to Russia, including Mikhail Fridman, the owner of the country's largest private bank. However, that was then. As

2023 progressed, the elites began to support the war. More musicians started traveling to perform in the occupied territories. In October, Fridman returned to Moscow from London, having concluded that life in the West under sanctions was unbearable and that the situation in Russia was relatively comfortable. And there have been no new recordings of oligarchs complaining about the war. In fact, it is difficult to imagine such conversations taking place.

This is because Russian elites have learned to stop worrying about the conflict. They have come to the conclusion that the invasion, even if they do not openly support it, is an acceptable fact of life. As a result, the likelihood that they might challenge the Kremlin's decisionswhich was always slim-has disappeared entirely. And instead of debating whether to support Putin, Russian elites are now

discussing a different question: how the war might end.

They have different answers Some believe that a big battlefield win would allow Putin to claim a partial victory and, therefore, pause the war. Others think that Putin will not stop until he has gone all the way to Kyiv. Some are convinced that what truly matters to Putin is confrontation with the West, not victory in Ukraine, and that he will thus

attack another state in Europe irrespective of what happens with the current conflict. But a few pessimists maintain that the premise of the question itself is wrong. As they see it, the war suits Putin's political interests, and so he will keep fighting for as long as he lives.

There are multiple reasons why Russian elites have shifted toward Putin. One is that they have become more cautious as Moscow cracks down on dissent. Another, relatedly, is that they understand it is meaningless to protest. But perhaps the biggest reason for their change is they have begun to see the invasion in a fundamentally different light. Today, they believe Russia is prevailing. Moscow, after all, is making steady, if slow, battlefield gains. Ukraine is battered and outgunned, operating with a massive artillery-shell disadvantage. And Western support for Kyiv is waning, jeop ardizing Ukraine's access to military supplies.

"It's bad to be an outcast as a winner, but it's worse to be an outcast as a loser." one Russian oligarch, who had criticized the war before but now seems to understand it, told me. (He, like others, spoke on the condition of anonymity, to protect his safety.) The oligarch said that everything in Russia has changed: attitudes toward Putin, views of Ukraine, and outlooks on the West. "We must win this war," he told me. "Otherwise, they won't allow us to live. And, of course, Russia would collapse.'

The notion of an endless war in Ukraine terrifies Russia's elite, who still hope that the invasion will conclude. They dream of returning as quickly as possible to the peaceful time of February 23, 2022.-But for now, they are silent. They see no way back. AGENCIES

For the week ended June 28, foreign currency assets, a major component of the reserves, decreased \$1.252 billion to \$572.881 billion, the data released Friday showed. Expressed in dollar terms, the foreign currency assets include the effect of appreciation or depreciation of non-US units like the euro, pound, and yen held in the foreign exchange reserves.

Gold reserves were down \$427 million to \$56.528 billion during the week, the RBI said.

The special drawing rights (SDRs) declined \$35 million to \$18.014 billion, the central bank said. India's reserve position with the IMF was up \$1 million to \$4.573 billion in the reporting week, the data added.

The third-seeded Alcaraz was outplayed for stretches by the No. 29 Tiafoe but surged to the finish and improved to 12-1 for his career in fifth sets.

Tiafoe was not able to pull out what would have been a surprising victory for someone who arrived at Wimbledon with a sprained ligament in his right knee and a losing record this season. In the end it was the durability and never-say-die attitude that helped the defending champion.

When the fourth set tie-breaker started Tiafoe tried his very best to win, but Alcaraz always had the one extra shot to subdue his opponent. And once Alcaraz won the fourth set, his game improved by a couple of notches that left Tiafoe struggling.
