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6-YR-OLD DIES **OF SNAKEBITE**

Bhanjanagar, July 8: A sixyear-old girl studying in a tribal residential school in this block of Ganjam district died after being bitten by a snake in the wee hours of Monday. The girl was sleeping in the hostel when she was bitten. This is the third incident of a minor dying due to snakebites in the last couple of months.

The deceased has been identified as Ridhi Pradhan, daughter of Gobarsi Pradhan of Nabagochha village and a student of Class-1 at Darapangia Sevashram School under this block. Hostel officials rushed her to the Bhanjanagar hospital where she breathed her last.

This is the third incident when a minor kid has died due to snakebite since April 28. Overall 34 people have succumbed to snakebites in Odisha this year

and she was residing at the hostel. She woke up screaming after being bitten by the snake. Other inmates found the snake and beat it to death. Hostel authorities

immediately informed Ridhi's

parents who rushed to the hospital only to find the lifeless body

of their daughter. When contacted, Bhanjanagar sub-collector Anil Kumar Sethi said that a probe is on to ascertain the reason and circumstances that led to the girl's death. He said financial assistance will be provided to the parents of the deceased as per

government norms. In the last week of April, sixyear-old Gyandeep Kujur lost his life due to snakebite in Rajgangpur of Sundargarh district. Unable to bear the loss, his mother Sukanti breathed her last a few hours later. In June, a brother-sister duo was bitten by a venomous snake under Bonai police limits in Sundargarh district. While the four-year-old brother died, the 12vear-old sister survived.

Chariots reach Gundicha temple

Puri, July 8: The chariots of the sibling deities, Lord Jagannath, Lord Balabhadra and Devi Subhadra reached the Gundicha temple Monday, with which the first leg of the Rath Yatra cele brations concluded here.

Thousands of people pulled the chariots, while lakhs of devotees gathered on the roadside to watch the procession on 'Badadanda' amid the heat and humidity.

The Rath Yatra began Sunday evening, but halted a few metres later due to sunset. It resumed the 2.5km journey from the 12th-century shrine to the Gundicha temple around 9.30am Monday which concluded at 2.35pm.

The three majestic chariots will remain outside the Gundicha temple on Grand Road. The deities will be taken inside the temple Tuesday in a ceremonial procession. The deities will remain at this temple for a week.

"The chariots have reached their destination. We have put cordons around the chariots and are regulating the crowd. Adequate arrangements have been made for smooth flow of vehicles,' said DGP Arun Sarangi here.

Exam compromised: SC

While hearing more than 30 pleas related to the controversy-ridden NEET-UG 2024 which was conducted May 5, the Supreme Court observed that there is 'no doubt' the exam has been compromised and a retest would depend on the extent of the leak. The bench also said that if the leak had taken place through apps like Telegram and WhatsApp then also a retest should be done as 'the leaked questions spread like wildfire'.

New Delhi, July 8: Observing that a retest has to be ordered if sanctity of the NEET-UG 2024 is 'lost', the Supreme Court sought information Monday from the National Testing Agency (NTA) and the CBI about timing of the question paper leak and duration between it and the actual test. The apex court also sought from the CBI, the number of wrongdoers identified so far and the methodology adopted for the paper leak.

'One thing is clear that leak of question paper has taken place," a bench headed by Chief Justice DY Chandrachud said. He added that extent of question paper leak and beneficiaries across geographical boundaries have to be ascertained before

the court may order retest in the controversy-ridden medical entrance exam conducted May 5. The bench posted the matter for hearing again July 11.

Referring to legal position on ordering a retest, the top court said it will have to be 'scrutinised whether the alleged breach has taken place at systemic level, whether the breach has affected integrity of the entire exam process and whether it is possible to segregate the beneficiaries of the fraud from the untainted students'.

'In a situation where breach affects the entirety of process and it is not possible to segregate the beneficiaries from others, it may be necessary to order a retest," said the bench, also comprising Justices JB Pardiwala and Manoi Misra. During the hearing, the bench

observed if the sanctity of NEET-UG 2024 is 'lost' and if the leak of its question paper has been propagated through social media, then a retest has to be ordered.

It said if the question paper leak was taking place through 'Telegram', 'WhatsApp' and other electronic means, then 'it spreads like wildfire'. "If the sanctity of the exam is lost, then a retest has to be ordered. If we are unable to identify those who are guilty, then a retest has to be ordered," the bench observed. "Let us not be in self-denial about what happened. Assuming that the government does not cancel the exam. what will it do to identify the beneficiaries of the question paper leak?" the bench added.

It said if the breach was confined to specific areas and it is possible to identify the wrongdoers, then it may not be appropriate to order retest.

Khurda, July 8: Making reels turned out to be disastrous for two youths as they fell into a waterfilled stone quarry at Bada Saunlia under Tapang police limits in this district Monday. Till the time last reports came

in one of the youths had been rescued by the Odisha Disaster Rapid Action Force (ODRAF) personnel, but the other one, identified as Om Prakash Rath is still missing. The search was called off late into the night, officials stated. Locals stated that four youths

had come to the water-filled quarry also known as 'Blue Lake' in a vehicle. They were taking selfies and making reels on their mobiles. Two of the youths went perilously close to the banks of the waterbody and slipped and fell.

Locals who were present at the spot immediately informed the police following which cops and teams from the fire brigade and ODRAF arrived.

ODRAF personnel launched a frantic search for the two who had fallen into the waterbody. After about an hour one of the youths was rescued. He has been hospitalised, but doctors said his condition is stable.

Local meanwhile stated that they asked the four not to go near the quarry, but they did not pay heed to the advice.

According to the South China Morning Post, some of the listings on the website include many titles like 'annoying bosses' 'terrible jobs', and 'hated colleagues', who are up for sale in a price range of 34,000 Yuan (approx ₹4 lakh) to 78,000 Yuan (approx ₹9 lakh).

One person wrote on the platform: "Selling a colleague who is very good at being sarcastic for 3,999 Yuan (₹45,925). I can teach you how to deal with this colleague and offer 10 tips to avoid

being the scapegoat at work." A second professional listed his 'terrible boss' for 500 Yuan (₹5,742), claiming that their personalities clashed and that the boss frequently criticised him,

causing significant mental stress. Notably, all this is done as a joke, most of those who have posted stated. If someone makes an attempt to 'buy' someone, the deal is cancelled immediately.

"Someone did pay before, but I applied to offer them a refund, and I deleted the listing afterwards. This is just my way of venting my emotions, not actually buving or selling anyone. I saw many people selling their jobs on 'Xianyu', and I thought it was interesting, so I wanted to try it too. Selling my job that has no weekends for just 9.9 Yuan feels like a small act of revenge," a person was quoted as saying by South China Morning Post.

The same paper talks about another person who says his office has turned into a toxic place because of 'troublesome' colleagues. "It helps to have a crack at their expense," he stated.


SHORT TAKES 5 jawans killed in



CM DIRECTS COLLECTORS TO REMOVE ENCROACHMENTS

Bhubaneswar, July 8: Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Monday directed all district Collectors to initiate steps towards removal of encroachments from government land, both in urban and rural areas. across the state.

Highlighting the necessity of removal of encroachments from government land, Majhi said development works have been adversely affected due to the illegal encroachments of government land which is normally used for welfare works for the general public.

He directed the district Collectors to put up proper signboards after clearing all encroachments and protect the government land by fencing the area so that it would be visible and known to the general



public. Earlier, Additional Chief Secretary (ACS), Revenue and Disaster Management (R&DM) department, Satvabrata Sahu asked the Collectors to identify encroachments on government land and remove those as per extant rules expeditiously.

In his letter to the Collectors Saturday, Sahu said one of the primary works of officers is optimum management of land resources and allocation of adequate land to developmental purposes in different sectors of

"However, due to encroachment of government land in both urban and rural areas, at times, smooth allocation of land for developmental purposes is impaired. Moreover, the opportunity cost of encroached government land is unrealised in such cases. Also, the concomitant litigation arising out of illegal encroachment remains a challenge to all of us, Sahu told the Collectors.

He asked the Collectors to make a realistic survey of rural and urban encroachments and remove those as per the rules.

Sahu also asked the Collectors to submit an action taken report to the R&DM department every fortnight.

1 more arrest in NEET-UG probe; total nine so far

New Delhi, July 8: The CBI has arrested a person in connection with alleged "manipulation" in the NEET-UG examination in Latur in Maharashtra, taking the total number of arrests by the agency to nine, officials said.

The CBI took into custody one Nanjunethappa G in connection with the Latur case which was earlier probed by the Maharashtra Police, they said. It is alleged that two government school teach-

ers in Latur had demanded over Rs five lakh from NEET-UG aspirants to ensure their success in the examination, they said.

The CBI has so far arrested six persons in Bihar NEET-UG paper leak case, and one each in connection with alleged manipulation in Latur and Godhra, and one from Dehradun in connection with general conspiracy, they said.

Take smaller steps to protect environment: Prez

Puri, July 8: Highlighting the recent spate of heatwaves in India and frequent extreme weather events worldwide, President Droupadi Murmu Monday asked people to take 'smaller' and 'local' steps to protect the environment for a better tomorrow.

A day after participating in the annual Rath Yatra, Murmu spent some time on the beach in this holy city and later, penned her thoughts about the experience of being in close commune with nature, a statement issued by the Rashtrapati Bhavan said.

In a post on 'X', she said "Oceans and the rich variety of flora and fauna have suffered heavily due to pollution but people living in nature's lap have sustained traditions that can show us the way to conserve the environment."

"Inhabitants of coastal areas, for example, know the language of the winds and waves of the sea. Following our ancestors, they worship the sea as God,'

Murmu said while suggesting ways to protect and conserve the environment.

The President began her fourday tour of the state July 6.

"There are places that bring us in closer touch with the essence of life and remind us that we are part of nature. Mountains, forests, rivers and seashores appeal to something deep within us. Response sought on e-inspection of judicial records

New Delhi, July 8: In another step towards digitisation of the judiciary, the Supreme Court Monday sought responses from all 25 high courts and the Centre on a PIL seeking a nod for the lawyers and the litigants to einspect the digitised judicial records through either the official web portal or a mobile application.

A bench comprising Chief Justice DY Chandrachud and Justices JB Pardiwala and Manoj Misra issued notices to the reg istrar generals of all the HCs and the Centre on the PIL filed by Kishan Chand Jain, a resident of Agra in Uttar Pradesh. The plea said the SC has

taken admirable and substantial strides towards introducing and leveraging technology for the purpose of ensuring access to justice, encompassing e-filing, virtual hearings, live streaming, suSwagatam (ePass), argument transcripts, judgment translations, onboarding of Supreme Court of NJDG and e-SCR

Certain challenges, however, persist in effectively applying technology due to the lack of proactive initiatives by the HCs, the plea said, adding that e-inspection of digitised records is an area of concern.

"Facilitate e-inspection of digitised records: To direct the HCs and their district courts to allow the applicants and/or their lawyers to conduct e-inspection of digitised court records (pending and disposed off) through the official web portal or mobile application.



UNIFORM BUYER-BUILDER AGREEMENT NEEDED: SC

New Delhi, July 8: Homebuyers in the country are being defrauded, necessitating the need to bring uniformity in builderbuyer agreements, the Supreme Court observed Monday.

"Buyers are being defrauded by builders all across and that is why the need for uniformity now," a bench of Chief Justice DY Chandrachud, Justice JB Pardiwala and Justice Manoj Misra said.

The top court was hearing a PIL filed by lawyer Ashwini Upadhyay in 2021, saying a model agreement was required to ensure transparency and fairness



and to restrain builders and agents from indulging in unfair and restrictive trade practices. Senior advocate Devashish

Bharuka, assisting as an amicus curiae, told the bench that a final status report along with draft builder-buyer agreements had been placed on record.

It was also submitted that suggestions of states had been received and incorporated.

The bench said it would peruse the report of the amicus curiae and the objections to it.

Earlier, the bench had allowed the stakeholders, including industry associations, to furnish their suggestions on these model agreements to the Union Ministry of Housing and Urban

The bench has posted the matter for hearing July 19.

Can't ask accused to share Google Maps location as bail condition: SC

SUPREME COURT SAYS THERE CAN'T BE A BAIL CONDITION ENABLING THE POLICE TO CONSTANTLY TRACK THE MOVEMENT OF THE ACCUSED

New Delhi, July 8: The Supreme Court Monday said there cannot be a bail condition which allows the police to peep into the private life of an accused in a criminal case.

A bench of Justices Abhay S Oka and Ujjal Bhuyan set aside a bail condition imposed by the Delhi High Court requiring a Nigerian national to share the Google Maps pin in his mobile device with the investigating officer in a drugs case.

Justice Oka, pronouncing the verdict said, "There cannot be a bail condition defeating the very objective of bail itself. We have said Google pin cannot be a bail condition. There can't be a bail condition enabling the police to constantly track the movement of the accused. Police cannot be allowed to peep into the private life of the accused on bail."

The court pronounced the verdict on a plea of Frank Vitus, a Nigerian national challenging the



bail condition in a drugs case. On April 29, the top court had reserved its verdict said it would examine whether one of the conditions imposed by the Delhi High Court asking an accused to 'drop a Google pin' from his mobile phone to enable investigators to track his movement while on

right to privacy. In a landmark decision, a ninejudge Constitution bench had August 24, 2017 unanimously declared that the right to privacy was a fundamental right under

bail violated the fundamental

the Constitution.

The top court took note of the condition and said prima facie it was violative of the right to privacy of the accused enlarged on bail.

Similar bail conditions of sharing Google pin have been imposed by the high court on other accused in different cases as well. The top court has taken note of such bail conditions of other accused as well.

On February 8, this year, the Delhi High Court granted bail to one Raman Bhuraria. He was arrested in connection with a money laundering probe arising from an alleged ₹3,269 crore financial irregularity case against Shakti Bhog Foods

The high court had imposed several bail conditions and one of them read that "The applicant shall drop a Google pin location from his mobile phone to the IO concerned which shall be kept operational throughout

In 2022, he had landed in trouble for allegedly refusing to sing Lord Jagannath bhajans and issuing threats to Odia music director Debashis Mallick aka Japani. Japani had filed a complaint against the singer claiming threat to life.

The singer had earlier courted controversy for his song, 'Jhia Nuhe Tu Coronavirus', which compared a college-going girl with the deadly coronavirus. Humane later apologised for it on social media.

Rain to lash across state during next 5 days: IMD

Bhubaneswar, July 8: The India Meteorological Department (IMD) Monday predicted light to moderate rain in the state during the next five days. However, intensity of rain may decrease from Tuesday, said the weather bulletin.

According to MeT office, heavy rain is likely over the districts of Koraput, Rayagada, Malkangiri, Kandhamal, and Gajapati in the next 24 hours under the impact of cyclonic circulation over the West-central Bay of Bengal (BoB) off the south Andhra Pradesh coast.

Also, thunderstorm with lightning is likely to occur at one or two places over the districts of Balasore, Bhadrak, Jajpur, Kendrapara, Cuttack, Jagatsinghpur, Puri, Khurda, Nayagarh, Ganjam and Gajapati.

In the last 24 hours, several places experienced rain and the maximum rainfall was recorded in Keonjhar at 123 mm, said the MeT office. According to MeT, after July

11, the extent of rain will increase again. As of now, 285.8 mm of rain was expected, but only 210.6 mm has recorded. This is said to be 26 per cent less than normal.

Meanwhile, Malkangari has received more than normal rainfall, while 11 districts have recorded normal and 16 districts have recorded below normal rainfall. Heavy rainfall has also been recorded in Mayurbhanj and Balasore districts.

Mitochondrial donation offers hope for healthy offspring

itochondrial disease (or mito for short) is a group of conditions that affect this ability to generate the energy organs required to work properly. There are many different forms of mito and depending on the form, it can disrupt one or more organs and can cause organ failure. There is no cure for mito. But an IVF procedure called mito-

chondrial donation now offers

hope to families affected by some

forms of mito that they can have

genetically related children free from mito. After a law to allow mitochondrial donation in Australia was passed in 2022, scientists are now preparing for a clinical trial to see if mitochondrial

donation is safe and works. What is mitochondrial dis-

There are two types of mito-

chondrial disease. One is caused by faulty genes in the nuclear DNA, the DNA we inherit from both our parents and which makes us who we are.

The other is caused by faulty genes in the mitochondria's own DNA. Mito caused by faulty mitochondrial DNA is passed down through the mother. But the risk of disease is unpredictable, so a mother who is only mildly affected can have a child who develops serious disease symptoms.

Mitochondrial disease is the most common inherited metabolic condition affecting one in 5,000 people.

Some people have mild symptoms that progress slowly, while others have severe symptoms that progress rapidly. Mito can affect any organ, but organs that need a lot of energy such as brain. muscle and heart are more often affected than other organs.

What is mitochondrial dona-

Mitochondrial donation is an experimental IVF-based technique that offers people who carry faulty mitochondrial DNA the potential to have genetically related children without passing on the faulty DNA.



It involves removing the nuclear DNA from the egg of someone who carries faulty mitochondrial DNA and inserting it into a healthy egg donated by someone not affected by mito, which has had its nuclear DNA

The resulting egg has the nuclear DNA of the intending parent and functioning mitochondria from the donor. Sperm is then added and this allows the transmission of both intending parents' nuclear DNA to

A child born after mitochondrial donation will have genetic material from the three parties involved: nuclear DNA from the intending parents and mitochondrial DNA from the egg donor. As a result the child will likely have a reduced risk of mito, or no risk at all.

This highly technical procedure requires specially trained scientists and sophisticated Mitochondrial donation is an experimental IVF-based technique that offers people who carry faulty mitochondrial DNA the potential to have genetically related children without passing on the faulty DNA

A child born after mitochondrial donation will have genetic material from the three parties involved: nuclear DNA from the intending parents and mitochondrial DNA from the egg donor

equipment. It also requires both the person with mito and the egg donor to have hormone injections to stimulate the ovaries to produce multiple eggs. The eggs are then retrieved in an ultrasound-guided surgical procedure.

Maeve's Law

Maeve's law stipulates strict conditions including that clinics need a special licence to perform mitochondrial donation.

To make sure mitochondrial

donation works and is safe, the law also specifies that initial licences will be issued for preclinical and clinical trial re-

search and training.

Before starting the trial, a preclinical research and training programme will ensure embryologists are trained in 'real-life' clinical conditions and existing mitochondrial donation techniques are refined and improved.

One possible source of frozen eggs is from people who have stored eggs they don't intend to

The need for donor eggs

However, research shows that among people with stored eggs. the number one choice for what to do with eggs they don't need is to donate them to research.

This offers hope that, given the opportunity, those who have eggs stored that they don't intend to use might be willing to donate them to mitochondrial donation preclinical research.

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Compensatory afforestation gets a short shrift

Jajpur, July 8: Destruction of forest cover is more than the compensatory afforestation as over 10,074 hectare of conversion land is lying barren without any plantation of saplings

The issue assumes significance as the country celebrated Vana Mahotsav week from July 1 to 8, which aims at promoting plantation drive and environ mental conservation aiming to maintain the ecological balance of the earth. Plantation drive by various industrial and minpointing in the state in comparison to the destruction of forest cover for establishment of their units

While it is claimed that saplings have been planted in much higher numbers as a compensatory measure for the chopped down trees, the reality speaks otherwise

Industrial and mining firms after acquiring land from the government for establishment of their units are required to buy



equal amount of land and carry out compensatory plantation within a period of three months.

According to the details available from the Forest, Environment and Climate Change department, a total of 34,807.02 hectare forest land has been put into use in non-forest works for various mining projects by September 2023 on the basis of Section (2) of Forest (Conservation) Act-1980. The changes were made on the basis of the final approval given by the Forest, Environment and Climate Change department.

However, instead of the conversion land, compensatory plantation has been done on 26,236.03 hectare of forest land and 15.060.81 hectare of non-forest land. Moreover, the Forest department claimed to have planted 85,90,766 saplings as part of compensatory afforestation meas-

ures after chopping down 7,80,767 trees on converted forest land.

On the other hand, plantation has not been done under compensatory afforestation programme on 10,074.95 hectare of converted land by September, 2023. The total land includes 5.699.79 hectare forest land and 4,375.16 hectare non-forest land.

Among the districts, Keonjhar has maximum land where plantation has not been done. Among the firms, Kalaparbat iron mines failed to do plantation on 10.21 hectare, Jiling Langlota mines on 19.561 hectare, KC Pradhan Iron Ore mines on 19.56 hectare, OMC's Gandhamardan block on 459.340 hectare, TISCO manganese iron mines on 313 hectare, and Nuagaon iron ore, JSW and KJS mines on 155.961 hectare land.

Similarly, under Cuttack forest division, Kaliapani Chromite mine in Jajpur district has failed to carry out plantation on 21.62 hectare land. It was also learnt that compensatory plantation has not been carried out in Koraput, Sundargarh, Rayagada, Sambalpur and Khurda districts.

However, the Forest department is vet to reveal as to why the programme has been hanging fire.

It was also learnt that trees are being felled in regular intervals on the lands earmarked for plantation due to negligence of Forest department personnel. The department is also clueless on the creation of forest cover in mining areas and the number of trees that have survived.

As per government norms, 10 trees need to be planted in exchange of one felled tree. However, these rules are only in pen and paper and never seen being implemented.

When contacted, advocate Chandrasekhar Panda rejected the claim of plantation of more saplings than the number of trees felled for establishment of industrial and mining firms. He said trees aged over 200 to 300 vears are being indiscriminately cut down to make way for road construction works which can never be compensated. Moreover, the Forest department has failed to protect areas having dense

Minor's rapist gets 20-year RI

ITI Dharmagarh yet to get permanent campus

Bhawanipatna, July 8: The industrial training institute (ITI) has been running temporarily at the Kalahandi district headquarters town here since the past two and half years as the state government is yet to construct the permanent campus at the proposed site in

Former chief minister Naveen Patnaik had laid the foundation in virtual mode ahead of the 2019 elections. The Skill Development and Technical Education department also gave its administrative approval for the establishment of the ITI at Dharmagarh. The approval clearly mentioned the setting up of the ITI campus in Dharmagarh at a plan outlay of

This inordinate delay sparked resentment among the locals as the requisite land for the institute had been identified and

funds sanctioned for the infra. Sources said that the district administration identified the land for the purpose alongside Biju Expressway in Ward no-13 of Dharmagarh town. The Superintending Engineer of

Works department also floated a tender (tender notice-327/2021-22) for the construction of the ITI. The revised plan outlay was estimated at ₹8.17.06.234 and a contractor qualified the tender at 3.30 per cent less than the

Following the agreement with the contractor, former MLA Mousadhi Bag participated in the Bhoomi Puja rituals and construction works began at the Dharmagarh site, November 24, 2021. The construction was scheduled to get over in 18 calendar months, i.e by May 23, 2023.

However, though the deadline for construction has expired, the authorities are yet to lay a piece of brick at the site, reports said.

And in the absence of infra, the ITI institute has been functioning at Bhawanipatna since the last two and half years.

People are now hopeful that the present BJP state government will help build the ITI at Dharmagarh.

Meanwhile, when contacted, Principal Shiba Prasad Samantaray of ITI, Dharmagarh said very soon the construction works will be taken up at the Dharmagarh site, while enrollment of students at the insti-

ITI Berhampur sculpture to be displayed at Greece exhibition

Berhampur, July 8: A horse sculpture made from scrap materials by the Berhampur ITI as per SDG goal has been selected to participate in the digital photographic exhibition organised by Indian Institute of Welding (IIW) at Rhodes in Greece.

The five-day long 77th annual conference of IIW has kicked off at Rhodes in Greece from July 7. The IIW had nominated the item made from scrap by the ITI, Berhampur. 50 other teams from 17 countries will participate in the exhibition along with Berhampur ITI. As per the direction of Rajat Panigrahi, the principal of Berhampur ITI, faculties Anil Kumar Mishra, Barsha Nayak, Sunanda Swain, Upasana Das, Basudeb Swain and Narayan Pradhan had constructed the sculp-

ture using scrap items. The sculpture is crafted entirely



by upcycling metal scraps like automobile parts, bike cranks, waste iron rods from demolished buildings, GI sheet from a water tank and repurposed toilet doors. It was shaped mostly with the help of tools such as angle grinder, bench vice and ball peen hammer. France Halts Far-Right

rance along with several other European countries heaved a huge \dashv sigh of relief when a Left-wing alliance of the New Popular Front (NFP) won the most seats in the French parliament after tactical voting in the second round election 7 July. The people rejected outright the Far-Right party - National Rally (RN), relegating it to the third position after President Emmanuel Macron's coalition. The NFP was formed only recently and it is a cluster of several parties ranging from the Far-Left, France Unbowed party, to the more moderate Socialists and the Ecologists. This bloc has won 182 seats in the National Assembly, making it the largest group, but well short of the 289 required for an absolute majority. Macron's Centrist Ensemble alliance won 163 seats and Marine Le Pen's Far-Right RN and its allies won 143 seats.

Liberal and democratic population of the country was on the tenterhooks after the RN had surged ahead of all other rivals in the first round of voting on 30 June. Apparently that triggered panic among majority of the French people with calls from the NFP for national mobilisation to prevent the Far-Right from capturing power. The latter's anti-immigration politics is perceived to be a threat to democracy and an egregious assault on the republican values of the country. The mood of the people could be gauged from the way several players of the French national football squad, which has so many non-white members, urged the people to vote against the Far-Right.

The victory of the Left and the Centre in France over the Far-Right comes only a few days after the UK overwhelmingly voted the Labour Party to power ending the 14 year-rule of the Conservative Party that brought chaos, instability, a dysfunctional economy and cost of living crisis for the working class. The Spanish Prime Minister Pedro Sanchez put the outcome of French parliamentary elections in the right perspective when he congratulated voters in the two countries for rejecting the Far-Right. "This week, two of the largest countries in Europe have chosen the same path that Spain chose a year ago," he said. The path is the rejection of the extreme right and a decisive commitment to a social left that addresses people's problems "with serious and brave policies," Sanchez wrote in a post on X. The UK and France have given their mandate for progress and social advancement and against the regression in rights and freedoms

The loud and clear message is that there is no agreement or government with the extreme Right. Cheers rang out on the streets of Paris the moment the projected results showed a Leftist victory. Speaking to a crowd of his ecstatic supporters near Stalingrad square, Jean-Luc Melenchon, the firebrand leader of France Unbowed, said the results came as a "huge relief for the overwhelming majority of people in our country." For obvious reasons, Jordan Bardella, the Far-Right RN's 28year-old leader, sought to give a spin to the results saying France had been thrown into "uncertainty and instability." The mood in his party's main office, however, was one of sombre bordering on despondency. Even 24 hours before the second round of voting the name of only one party - RN - circulated throughout the length and breadth of France as the next ruling coalition.

It appears this very possibility shook the majority of the population. Just as the smaller parties started withdrawing from the contest in the second round so as to ensure that there was only one candidate against the RN, the people rallied behind the two main alliances opposed to the RN.

France has thus shown to the world the way the UK did last week that the liberal, Left and socialist parties can resist the Far-Right capturing power in several European countries. The results from the two top European countries hold out hope for liberal, democratic rule in the pervading gloom of Far-Right forces spreading their tentacles across the globe.

THE CHINA FACTOR

WITH THE US **UNWILLING TO** TAKE THE LEAD, **IT IS UP TO INDIA TO CONVINCE RUSSIA NOT TO ALIGN ITSELF TOO CLOSELY** WITH THE **PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC**

ndian Prime Minister Narendra Modi's first visit to Russia in five years underscores the strategic importance India attaches to its relationship with Moscow. Indian leaders view that relationship as essential to a balanced foreign policy - especially at a time when India seems, at least to some, to be subtly tilting toward the West - and to provide strategic leverage against China.

Russia and India started holding annual summits in 2000. After Russian President Vladimir Putin's 2021 trip to New Delhi, it was Modi's turn to visit Moscow in 2022. But in the wake of Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine - which spurred the United States and its partners to impose unprecedented sanctions on the country – Modi kept deferring his visit. (He did meet Putin in 2022 on the sidelines of a regional summit in Uzbekistan, where he told the Russian leader that it was no time for war.)

Today it is apparent that Russia has neither been isolated internationally nor hobbled economically, despite the West's best efforts. So, after narrowly winning a third term last month. Modi announced that he would take his long-delayed trip to Moscow. The objective is not to take Russia's side; on the contrary, at last month's G7 meeting in Italy, Modi embraced Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky and engaged in bilateral discussions with him. Rather, Modi seeks to affirm India's enduring foreign-policy independence, while reaping the strategic benefits of closer ties with Russia.

India's relationship with Russia dates back to 1971, when India was at its most vulnerable. The Pakistani military was attempting to crush the independence movement in then-East Pakistan – now Bangladesh by any means necessary. Up to three million Bangladeshi civilians (mainly Hindus singled out by Pakistan's Muslim army) were slaughtered, some 200,000

women were coerced into rape camps, and about ten million people fled to India.

The US was more than complicit in the carnage. Far from pushing back against Pakistan's military dictator, General Yahya Khan, US President Richard Nixon's administration maintained friendly relations with him, in order to advance US interests in Asia. While Khan's army carried out the genocide in East Pakistan, Nixon sent his national security adviser, Henry Kissinger, from Pakistan to Beijing on his now-famous secret trip, which led to Nixon's own visit to China in February 1972.

At a White House meeting, Kissinger credited Khan for the success of his "cloak and dagger" diplomacy with China, joking coldheartedly, "Yahya hasn't had such fun since the last Hindu massacre!" On a memorandum from Kissinger regarding the crisis, Nixon wrote, 'To all hands: Don't squeeze Yahva at this time.

But that was not all. In an effort to prevent Bangladesh from achieving independence, Nixon pressed China to open a military front against India. It was Kissinger's job to goad the Chinese into initiating troop movements toward the Indian border, according to declassified White House tapes and documents. Nixon went so far as to tell Kissinger that India needed a "mass famine."

Faced with such hostility, India's then-Prime Minister Indira Gandhi concluded a friendship treaty with the Kremlin. The pact's security provisions helped to deter China from opening a front against India when Indian forces eventually intervened to help Bangladesh gain independence in a swift, 13-day operation.

Nixon's dissatisfaction was obvious: in a show of force aimed at coercing India into limiting its involvement, the US deployed a nuclear-capable naval task force off the southern tip of India. This gunboat diplomacy led India to conduct its first underground nuclear test in 1974; the US responded by imposing technology sanctions on India that remained in place for almost three decades. Meanwhile, the US and China helped Pakistan to build its own nuclear bomb

Today, India maintains deeper and broader ties with the US than with Russia, but Nixon's China opening still haunts the bilateral relationship. With its decades-long policy of aiding China's economic rise, the US not only created the greatest strategic adversary it has ever faced, but also saddled India with a formidable military foe that is aggressively striving for regional hegemony. One manifestation of this is the Sino-Indian military standoff in the Himalayas, which is now in its fifth year.

This is a key motivation behind India's efforts to strengthen its relationship with Russia, which India believes can counterbalance China. After all, Russia ex-

tends across 11 time zones and possesses huge reserves of natural resources, an enormous nuclear arsenal, increasing space prowess, and veto power at the United Nations Security Council. Moreover, Russia and China are natural competitors, with sharply diverging interests in Central Asia, Northeast Asia, and the Arctic, which each country regards as part of its strategic backyard.

Even so, Russia and China have been growing progressively closer in recent years – and it is largely America's fault. This alliance of convenience – which Putin and Chinese President Xi Jinping have termed a "no-limits partnership" - threatens not only to accelerate an overstretched America's relative decline, but also to erode Indian security Already, China has leveraged its position as an economic lifeline for Russia to gain access to advanced Russian military technologies, which were previously sold only to India. In fact, no country is profiting more from the Ukraine war than China.

Someone must drive a wedge between Russia and China. With the US unwilling to take the lead, it is up to India to convince Russia not to align itself too closely with the People's Republic. Fortunately, this is hardly an unrealistic proposition: though Russia's promise to provide North Korea with immediate military assistance in the case of war is not good news, its new defense pact with China's estranged client does suggest that Putin is willing to chart his own course.

The first step for India must be to try to mediate an end to the Ukraine war. This would allow the US to focus on bolstering security in the Indo-Pacific, thereby improving Taiwan's chances of survival.

Boeing crisis & spiralling air fares

sharply as airlines in India, the third largest in the world, face shortage of aircraft. The airlines are to suffer as Boeing is in crisis for its Starliner space vehicle leakage and two fatal crashes, defrauding the US government. Boeing has lost more than \$32 billion since 2019. Fewer companies could lose that kind of money and not be facing bankruptcy. Boeing may face three years of probation, independent safety audits and \$487.3 million in penalty. This has put its new aircraft manufacturing off schedule causing delivery of far fewer planes to airlines of India. As a result, it would hamper the growth of the industry here and limit capability to offer seats to fliers and lead to severe seat shortage and spiralling of fares.

Boeing has agreed to plead guilty to a criminal fraud conspiracy charge and pay a fine of \$243.6 million to resolve a US Justice Department investigation into two 737 MAX fatal crashes in 2018 and 2019 that killed 346 people. The case stems from the department's determination that Boeing violated to resolve a 2021 charge of conspiracy to defraud the US government. Boeing is charged with misleading regulators who approved the 737 Max and set pilottraining requirements to fly the plane. The company blamed two relatively low-level employees for the fraud.

Boeing reached a \$2.5 billion settlement for the 2018 and 2019 Ethiopian crashes with the Justice Department in January 2021 to avoid prosecution on a single charge of fraud - misleading federal regulators who approved the plane. In March 2019, an Ethiopian

Airlines 737 MAX crashed, killing all 157 on board, after which regulators around the world grounded MAX. The crashes were blamed on a flaw with a newly inducted system for pushing the aircraft nose down to prevent the plane from stalling.

Last week the Justice Department's criminal fraud section told a federal court that Boeing violated terms of the settlement by failing to make promised changes to detect and prevent violations of federal anti-fraud laws.

Air India Express and Akasa getting their deliveries do not look bright. Questions arise how the two airlines agreed to the deal of MAX, which still has not cleared safety issues. Reportedly, China has cancelled some of its bookings.

In this background, in June 2022, Tata Sons signed an agreement during the Paris Air Show for 20 Boeing Dreamliners, 10 Boeing 777X widebody aircraft, and 190 Boeing 737 MAX narrow body aircraft along with 250 Euro Airbus for \$70 billion, according to Tata Sons and Air India Chairman Chandrasekaran.

In June 2023, IndiGo made the world's largest aircraft order by signing a deal for 500 A320 neo family planes from Airbus. The airline is expecting some deliveries. But that would not suffice the needs of the growing number of passengers. Indigo is set to ground many aircraft. So would Spice Jet, which met with a number of security issues.

The delays, which are said to be unavoidable, would create shortage of aircraft almost with all major airlines, Indigo,

In such a situation, hope of Spice Jet, Akasa and Air India. Jet Airways and Go First have gone bankrupt adding to the shortage.

Thus, the Boeing crisis could hit India hard with Air India and Akasa having fewer aircraft and an overall shortage of seats for domestic and international routes spiralling fares. Airlines in India carried record 152 million passengers in 2023. The aviation industry fears that the reduced aircraft delivery is set to impact the market severely more so as number of passengers rise owing to a fallacious dynamic Indian Railways fare structure. It hikes train fares to the level of air fares making people prefer to travel by air. This is impacting the railways and the airlines alike.

Fares in certain destinations like Kochi-Delhi or Kolkata-Delhi or Mumbai-Delhi or Guwahati-Delhi could skyrocket and match some of the international routes as the country does not have integrated transportation approach. If rail fares are cut and reservation system rationalised, it could take off a significant load from airlines.

430 farmers in Marathwada commit suicide from Jan to June

Chhatrapati Sambhajinagar, July 8: A total of 430 farmers have committed suicide in Maharashtra's traditionally parched Marathwada region in the first six months of 2024, an official said Monday.

Incidentally, the highes ber of deaths, at 101, has taken place in Beed district, which is the home turf of state agriculture minister and NCP leader Dhananjay Munde.

In June alone there were 30 farmer suicides in Beed. Of the 101 who died in Beed, 46 cases qualified for ex-gratia of ₹1 lakh, five cases were disqualified and 50 are under scrutiny, he said.

Of the 430 cases, 256 qualified for ex-gratia, of which 169 were given aid, while 20 were rejected and 154 are under scrutiny, the official informed.

As per data made available by the divisional commissioner's office, the number of farmer suicides was 101 in Beed, 64 in Chhatrapati Sambhajinagar, 40 in Jalna, 31 in Parbhani, 17 in Hingoli, 68 in Nanded, 33 in Latur and 76 in Dharashiv.

Mumbai, July 8: The 'wagh nakh' or tiger claw shaped weapon of Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj that the Maharashtra government intends to bring from a museum in London is not original, historian Indrajit Sawant said Monday and as-

serted the one used by the legendary emperor remains in the state's Satara itself.

The state government had last year signed a memorandum of understanding with the Londonbased museum to get the 'wagh nakh' that was used by the founder of the Maratha Empire to kill Bijapur Sultanate's general Afzal Khan in 1659.

12 more killed in lightning strikes

Patna: Twelve more people have been killed in lightning strikes in seven districts of Bihar, officials said Monday. With the fresh fatalities, over 40 people have lost their lives to lightning strikes in various districts of Bihar in the last 10 days, including 22 in the last 48 hours. The 12 fresh fatalities were reported in the last 24 hours, while 10 deaths were reported in the preceding 24 hours, they said.

Four killed in violent clash

Chandigarh: Four people were killed after two groups of Gurdaspur district attacked and opened fire at each other apparently over an old rivalry, police said Monday. The incident took place at Lighanwala Chowk in Sri Hargobindpur in Batala Sunday night. There were 13 people in total in the two groups and all of them hail from village Vithwan here. Two persons from each group died in the firing, said Batala Senior Superintendent of Police Ashwini Gotyal.

Fifty injured as bus overturns

Chandigarh: An overloaded Haryana Roadways mini bus overturned near Pinjore Monday, leaving 50 injured, most of them school children, officials said. According to preliminary information, over 40 children were among those injured in the incident, they said. Four adults were also brought to the civil hospital in Panchkula and one of them is a 60-year-old woman, who suffered crush injury on her arm. She has been referred to PGIMER at Chandigarh.

Three cousins drown in river

Jaipur: Three cousins drowned in a river in Banswara district of Rajasthan while washing their hands and feet in it, police said Monday. The three girls, all aged 10-11, had taken their goats for grazing along the banks of Anas river Sunday, they said. As they were washing their hands and feet in the river, they slipped into deep water and drowned, **Assistant Sub-Inspector** Jitendra Patidar said Monday. 'It is all related to Sandeshkhali. You (state) didn't do anything for months. a bench of Justices BR Gavai and KV Viswanathan told senior advocate Abhishek Singhyi. who was appearing for the West Bengal government.

Singhvi told the apex court that far-reaching directions issued by the Calcutta High Court to the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) at the most could be restricted to two FIRs related to an attack on the Enforcement Directorate officials in Sandeshkhali.

"The impugned order (of high court) goes into ration scam," he said, adding that in the alleged scam, 43 FIRs were registered.

"FIRs were registered four years back. Who are the accused? When were the arrests made," the

Mumbai, July 8: Mumbai police formed 11 teams and also roped in the Crime Branch to nab the 24-vear-old son of a ruling Shiv Sena leader after a BMW car the youth was driving crashed into a scooter, killing a woman and injuring her husband, an official said.

A Look Out Circular (LOC) has also been put out against Mihir Shah, son of Rajesh Shah, a Shiv Sena leader from neighbouring Palghar district, the official said Monday.

Mihir Shah was allegedly driving the BMW car which fatally knocked down Kaveri Nakhwa (45) and injured her husband Pradeep while the couple was on their two-wheeler in Mumbai's Worli area Sunday morning, police said.

CCTV footage produced by police in court during the day showed Kaveri Nakhwa being dragged by the car for 1.5 kilometres. Footage showed Mihir Shah and co-accused Rajrishi Bidawat pulling the woman off the bonnet, placing her on the road and then mowing her down again while reversing the luxury vehicle.



As per police, Mihir Shah took the car to Kalanagar in Bandra, abandoned the vehicle in the presence of Bidawat, took another car and fled to Borivali in the northern tip of the metropolis.

"He went to the residence of his female friend and has been untraceable since. He switched off his mobile phone in Borivali area. Considering the possibility of him fleeing Maharashtra, police teams have been sent to nearby states, including Gujarat," the official said. Police have also visited his residence in Palghar but it was locked, the official

As per the probe so far, Mihir was partying with four friends in a bar in Juhu till the early hours of Sunday, after which he and his driver proceeded towards south Mumbai.

Air pollution reduces chances of live birth from IVF

Being exposed to air pollution around the time of egg retrieval can significantly curb the odds of a successful transfer through in vitro fertilisation

New Delhi, July 8: Air pollution could lower the chances of a live birth from in vitro fertilisation (IVF) by nearly 40 per cent even in areas with "excellent" air quality, a study has found.

IVF involves fertilising a mature egg with a sperm in a lab to form an embryo, which is then placed in a uterus to develop into a baby

In this study, over an eightyear period, researchers analysed close to 3,660 frozen embryo transfers (an IVF procedure) from 1,836 patients in Perth, Australia. During the transfer process, frozen embryos are thawed and placed in a woman's


The researchers, including those from the Perth Children's Hospital, looked at air pollutant levels over four lengths of duration - 24 hours, two weeks,

four weeks, and three months prior to oocyte retrieval, which is when eggs are taken from the women's ovaries before being fertilised with a sperm. A higher exposure to fine par-

ticulate matter (PM10) in the two weeks leading up to oocyte collection was found to cut down the successful birth rate of an IVF by 38 per cent. Increasing exposure to PM2.5

in the three months prior to oocvte collection was also related to lowered chances of live birth, the researchers found. The findings were presented at the 40th Annual Meeting of the European Society of Human Reproduction and Embryology (ESHRE) in Amsterdam.

Our results reveal a negative linear association between particulate matter exposure during the two weeks and three months prior to oocyte collec-

The negative impacts of air pollution were observed despite excellent air quality prevailing during the study period, with PM10 and PM2.5 levels exceeding the World Health Organization's guidelines on only 0.4 per cent and 4.5 per cent of the study days, respectively, the researchers stressed.

"This association is independent of the air quality at the time of frozen embryo transfer. These findings suggest that pollution negatively affects the quality of the eggs, not just the early stages of pregnancy, which is a distinction that has not been previously reported," said Leathersich.

Human reproduction is not immune to pollution and climate change, the greatest threats to human health, said Leathersich.



5 soldiers killed, 5 injured in terrorist ambush in Kathua

Kathua, July 8: Five army personnel, including a Junior Commissioned Officer, were killed and as many were injured Monday when heavily armed terrorists ambushed a patrolling party in the remote Machedi area of Jammu and Kashmir's Kathua district, officials said.

The terror attack, the fifth in Jammu region in a month, evoked widespread condemnation with political leaders including three former chief ministers expressing concern over the growing terror incidents, especially in the Jammu region where militancy has returned after being wiped out over two decades ago.

The terrorists targeted an army truck, part of a routine patrolling party, with a grenade and gunfire on the Machedi-Kindli-

Malhar road near Badnota village in Lohai Malhar, approximately 150 km from Kathua town, at around 3:30 pm, the officials said.

After the ambush, the terrorists fled into the nearby forest as the army, assisted by police and paramilitary personnel, retaliated.

The army vehicle, carrying ten occupants, bore the brunt of the attack, resulting in fatal injuries to five soldiers, including a JCO. Five others are undergoing treatment.

An exchange of fire between the terrorists and security forces ensued, with reinforcements quickly dispatched to the area to neutralise the attackers - believed to be three in number and heavily armed - who may have recently infiltrated from across the border.

It is the second major attack in Kathua district within one month, following a similar confrontation June 12 and 13 that left two terrorists and a CRPF jawan dead.

Nithari killings: SC agrees to hear CBI pleas against **HC** verdict acquitting Koli New Delhi: The Supreme Court agreed Monday

to hear pleas filed by the CBI challenging the Allahabad High Court's verdict acquitting Surendra Koli in the sensational 2006 Nithari serial killings case. A bench of Justices BR Gavai and KV Viswanathan sought a response from Koli on separate pleas filed by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) against the high court's verdict dated October 16 2023. The apex court in May agreed to hear a plea filed by the father of one of the victims challenging the high court's order acquitting Koli in the case. In this case, Pandher was acquitted by the sessions court while Koli was awarded death penalty September 28, 2010. On Monday, the top court said the pleas filed by the CBI would come up for hearing along with the petition of the victim's father. During the hearing, Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, appearing for the CBI, said Koli was a "serial killer" who lured young girls and murdered them. Terming the incident as "gruesome", Mehta said accusations of cannibalism were there in the case. New Delhi: The Supreme Court Monday directed the Centre to frame a model policy on menstrual leave for women employees by holding consultations with states and other stakeholders. A bench comprising Chief Justice DY Chandrachud and Justices JB Pardiwala and Manoj Misra said the issue related to policy and was not an issue for the courts to look into. Moreover, such a decision from a court on granting such leave to

women may prove to be counterproductive and "detrimental" to the cause as employers may avoid employing them. How will the leave workforce, the court asked the petitioner and said mandating such leave will lead to women 'being shunned from the workforce".

Guidelines on portrayal of disabled persons in visual media, films

New Delhi: The Supreme Court laid down guidelines against "disparaging" portrayal of persons with disabilities in visual media and films Monday, saying that terms such as "cripple" and "spastic" have acquired "devalued meanings" in societal perceptions. The verdict came on a plea filed by one Nipun Malhotra, who submitted that the Hindi film 'Aankh Micholi' contained deprecatory references to differently-abled persons. Pronouncing the verdict, a bench headed by Chief Justice DY Chandrachud said, "Words cultivate institutional discrimination and terms such as cripple and spastic have come to acquire devalued meanings in societal perceptions about persons with disabilities." Laving down several guidelines, the bench said the film certification body CBFC must invite the opinion of experts before allowing screening.



The leftist New Popular Front (NFP) emerged as the dominant force in the National Assembly after Sunday's election, but with no single group securing a working majority the possibilities include the NFP forming a minority government or the building of a broad, unwieldy coalition.

The result delivered a blow to President Emmanuel centrist alliance 168 Macron and leaves and Le Pen's National the euro zone's second largest economy in limbo, heralding a period of political instability just weeks before Paris hosts the Olympic Games.

Kyiv, July 8: A major Russian missile attack across Ukraine Monday killed at least 31 people and injured 154, officials said, with one striking a large children's hospital in the capital of Kyiv, where emergency crews searched the rubble for victims.

The daytime barrage targeted five Ukrainian cities with more than 40 missiles of different types, hitting apartment buildings and public infrastructure, President Volodymyr Zelenskyy said in a social media post. Ukraine's air force said it intercepted 30 missiles.

Strikes in Kryvyi Rih, Zelenskyy's birthplace in central Ukraine, killed 10 people and injured 47 in what the head of city administration, Oleksandr Vilkul, said was a massive missile attack. Seven people were killed in Kyiv, authorities said.

'It is very important that the world should not be silent about

it now and that everyone should see what Russia is and what it is doing," Zelenskyy said on social media. At the Okhmatdyt children's hospital in Kyiv, rescuers searched for victims under the rubble of a partially collapsed, two-story wing of the facility. Mayor Vitali Klitschko said at least 16 people, seven of them children, were injured.

On the hospital's main 10-story building, windows and doors were blown out and walls were blackened. Blood spattered the floor in one room. The intensive care unit, operating theatres and oncology departments all were damaged, officials said.

Rescuers searched for children and medical workers in the rubble. Volunteers formed a line, passing bricks and other debris to each other. Smoke still rose from the building, and volunteers and emergency crews worked in protective masks.

The attack forced the evacuation of the hospital and its temporary closure. Some mothers carried their children away on their backs, while others waited in the courtyard with their children as calls to doctors' phones rang unanswered.

June warmest on record across five continents

12th consecutive month that breached 1.5 degree Celsius threshold: EU agency

New Delhi, July 8: With millions of people across five continents experiencing scorching heat last month, the European Union's climate agency, Copernicus Climate Change Service (C3S). confirmed Monday that June

was the warmest on record. It also marked the 12th consecutive month of global temperatures reaching or breaking the 1.5 degrees Celsius threshold.

According to C3S ERA5 data, every month since June last year has been the warmest such month on record.

At the 2015 UN climate talks in Paris, world leaders committed to limiting the global average temperature rise to 1.5 degrees Celsius above the pre-industrial period to avoid the worst impacts of climate change. However, a permanent breach of the 1.5degree Celsius limit specified in the Paris Agreement refers to long-term warming over a 20 or 30 year period.

Earth's global surface temperature has already increased by around 1.2 degrees Celsius compared to the average in 1850-1900 due to the rapidly-increasing concentration of greenhouse gases, primarily carbon dioxide and methane, in the atmosphere. This warming is considered to be the reason behind record droughts. wildfires and floods worldwide.

According to the EU's climate agency data, June 2024 was the warmest on record, with an average surface air temperature of 16.66 degrees Celsius, 0.67 degree Celsius above the 1991-2020 average for the month and 0.14



degree Celsius above the previous high set in June 2023.

It was also the 13th consecutive month of record-high temperatures, a result of the combined effect of the 2023-24 El Nino event and human-caused climate change. While unusual, a similar streak of monthly global temperature records happened previously in 2015-16.

"This is more than a statistical oddity and highlights a large and continuing shift in our climate. Even if this specific streak of extremes ends at some point, we are bound to see new records being broken as the climate continues to warm. This is inevitable, unless we stop adding greenhouse gases into the atmosphere and the oceans," said Carlo Buontempo, the director of C3S.

World Meteorological Organization (WMO) Secretary-General Celeste Saulo said the lat-

"However, it is important to stress that temporary breaches do not mean that the 1.5 degrees Celsius goal is permanently lost because this refers to long-term warming over at least two decades," she said.

The world's sea surface temperature (SST) in June was also the highest ever recorded for the month. This is the fifteenth month in a row that the SST has been the warmest in the ERA5 data record for the respective month of the year.

Several countries experienced record-breaking heat and devastating floods and storms in June. According to an analysis by Climate Central, an independent group of scientists and communicators based in the United States, more than 60 per cent of the world population faced extreme heat that was made at least three times more likely by climate change during June 16-24.

Climate Central said the blistering heat in June impacted 61.9 crore people in India, 57.9 crore in China, 23.1 crore in Indonesia, 20.6 crore in Nigeria, 17.6 crore in Brazil, 17.1 crore in Bangladesh, 16.5 crore in the US, 15.2 crore in Europe, 12.3crore in Mexico, 12.1 crore in Ethiopia and 10.3 crore in Egypt.



New Delhi: German luxury carmaker Mercedes-Benz Monday reported a 9 per cent growth in sales at 9,262 units in India in the first half of 2024, its highest ever halfyearly sales in the country, riding on strong demand across categories and availability of volume models. The company had posted sales of 8,528 units in the January-June period of 2023, which was its previous highest half-yearly sales, Mercedes-Benz India said in a statement. It plans to launch six new products in the second half (H2) of 2024. SUV penetration was at 55 per cent in H1 2024, while the TEV (top-end vehicle) segment priced above Rs 1.5 crore comprised 25 per cent of total sales, it added.

L&T bags solar projects in ME

New Delhi: Larsen & Toubro Monday said its renewable energy arm has bagged two orders from a leading developer in the Middle East to build two Gigawatt scale Solar PV plants, "The renewable arm of Larsen & Toubro (L&T) has finalised mega orders with a leading developer in the Middle East to build two Gigawatt scale Solar PV plants," the company said in a regulatory filing. L&T did not reveal the financial details of the contract, but as per its project classification, the value of a mega order ranges between Rs 10,000 to Rs 15,000 crore. The plants will have a cumulative capacity of 3.5 GW.

Time to push divestment of PSBs, says SBI report

New Delhi, July 8: The government should go ahead with disinvestment of public sector banks (PSBs) as they are in good condition, SBI said in its research report Monday.

The report also pitched for the consolidation of existing government-owned banks.

"As banks are in good condition, the government should take stance on disinvestment of PSBs," the report titled 'Prelude to Union Budget 2024-25' said.

With regard to the privatisation of IDBI Bank, it said the government and Life Insurance Corporation of India are selling an almost 61 per cent stake in the lender.

"They invited bids from buyers in October 2022. In January 2023, the Department of Investment and Public Asset Management (DIPAM) received several expressions of interest for the IDBI Bank stake on offer. We expect the government to clarify this in the Budget," it said.

Presently, the government owns over 45 per cent stake in IDBI Bank, and LIC has a 49.24 per cent shareholding.

The report also recommended that the government should tweak the tax on deposit interest and make flat tax treatment across the maturity ladder in line with mutual fund and equity "Household net financial sav-

ings has declined to 5.3 per cent of GDP in FY23 and is expected to be 5.4 per cent in FY24. If we make deposit rate attractive in line with MFs, then this could push up household financial savings and CASA," it said.

As this amount will be in the hands of depositors, the report said, it could unleash additional spending and thereby, more GST revenue to the government.

'Increase in bank deposits will bring not only stability in



core deposit base and financial system but also financial stability in household savings as the banking system is better regulated and having a superior trust as compared to other alternatives with high volatility/risk," it said.

Deposits are taxed on an accrual basis and other asset classes only on redemption and there is also a need to remove this treatment, it added.

The report by the Economic Research Department, State Bank of India (SBI), expressed expectation that the government will look into the concerns over the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code (IBC) that must be improved and expediting cases under the IBC should be a key change.

Recoveries through IBC in FY24 were 32 per cent, and financial creditors lost 68 per cent of their claims. The time taken to reach a resolution is 863 days instead of the stated 330 days, it said.

"IBC is a crucial pillar for a vibrant secondary market for stressed assets. But for this market to take off, the pool of prospec-

tive resolution applicants needs to widen. In this regard, the introduction of the Special Situation Funds (SSFs) by Sebi has been a promising start," it added.

Going forward, the report said, policymakers need to make the regulatory regime on SSFs more attractive for stressed asset in-

In a separate Budget recommendation, Akshat Khetan, founder of AU Corporate and Legal Advisory Services made a case for enhancing budget allocations for promoting mediation, arbitration, and other ADR methods to reduce the burden on traditional courts.

The Budget should also emphasise reforms related to commercial courts, insolvency and bankruptcy code, and other critical areas, he said.

The Budget 2024-25 is expected to be presented in Parliament on July 23 by Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman.

Budget should offer tax relief, says India Inc

New Delhi, July 8: The Union Budget FY25 should focus on offering relief to taxpayers, especially in the lower income brackets, to stimulate consumption, industry players suggested.

Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman is scheduled to present the full Budget for fiscal 2024-25 on July 23 which will be the first major policy document of the new government.

The industry also urged the finance minister to lower corporate tax, phase out tax exemptions, and broaden tax base to boost economic growth.

"Rationalise and simplify the tax system to improve compliance and promote investment. Consider measures such as reducing corporate tax rates, phasing out tax exemptions, and broadening the tax base to make the tax regime more efficient and equitable," Assocham said.

Rating agency ICRA said the government is likely to set a fiscal deficit target at 4.9-5 per cent for FY25, as against 5.1 per cent estimated in the Interim Budget on February 1. without compromising the capital expenditure target of Rs 11.1 lakh crore.

"While favourable developments on the revenue front portend positively for the fiscal dynamics in FY2025, ICRA believes that fiscal consolidation will turn quite challenging beyond the current fiscal," the rating agency said.

Mayank Gupta, co-founder and COO of Zopper Insurtech said the Budget is expected to focus on policies to promote economic growth and offer relief especially for the lower income brackets to stimulate consumption.

"From the point of view of insurance, we suggest amending section 80C of the Income Tax Act to permit a greater limit on insurance premium payments, thereby encouraging more individuals to buy insurance products. Additionally, there should also be an allowance of deduction for term life insurance under

DEALS SOAR TO NEW HEIGHTS

Mumbai, July 8: Indian dealmaking activity soared to new heights in the second quarter of 2024 (Q2 2024), according to Grant Thornton Bharat Dealtracker.

The second quarter of 2024 witnessed a record-breaking 501 deals valued at \$21.4 billion, marking the highest quarterly volume since Q2 2022. Mergers & Acquisitions (M&A) and PE deals together stood at 467, valued at \$ 14.9 billion. This translates to a 9% increase in volumes but a 28% decrease in values compared to the previous quarter. primarily due to the absence of mega-mergers like the Reliance-Disney deal in Q1 2024. The quarter saw a significant

rise in high-value deals (over USD 100 million), with 30 transactions compared to only 19 (including three billion-dollar deals) in Q1 2024, reflecting a 58% increase. "Indian corporates are increasingly investing domestically, reflecting strong confidence in the local investment climate. Despite declining crossborder deals due to geopolitical instability, traditional sectors grew in volumes over the previous quarter. With recent election results and anticipated policy clarity from the upcoming budget, political stability is expected to boost investor confidence and drive deal activity in the next six months," said Grant Thornton in a report.



London, July 8: Lorenzo Musetti just needed a little time to adjust. To life and to 6-foot-8 Giovanni Mpetshi Perricard's serve.

Musetti advanced to the first Grand Slam quarterfinals of his career Monday at Wimbledon by beating the 21-year-old Frenchman 4-6, 6-3, 6-3, 6-2.

Musetti joins No 1 Jannik Sinner and women's No 7 Jasmine Paolini in collectively making Italian history: it's the first time three Italians have reached the quarterfinals at the same Grand Slam.

The No 25-seeded Musetti dropped to the grass when Mpetshi Perricard sent a forehand long to end a 30-stroke rally and the match. His back to the ground, the 22-year-old Italian's chest heaved.

After an up-and-down season, Musetti is on quite a roll at the All England Club. He became a father in March.

"It's been almost a year, really challenging with a lot of new experiences with the pregnancy of my girlfriend, and becoming a father. A lot of things happened and changed," Musetti said in an on-court interview.

Never give up, fight till last moment: Sreejesh's learning from Rohit's men

Bangalore, July 8: Playing in his fourth and probably last Olympics, veteran India hockey goalkeeper PR Sreejesh has learnt a valuable lesson from the T20 World Cup-winning cricket team – 'never give up and celebrate' early and this is something which will be embedded in his mind in the Paris Olympics.

The Indian cricket team rose from the ashes in the final of the T20 World Cup, snatching a seven-run victory over South Africa from the jaws of defeat to end an 11-year ICC title drought.

India's last major ICC title was the Champions Trophy in 2013 under Mahendra Singh Dhoni's leadership.

"I did watch the final. The biggest learning from this World Cup is that don't celebrate before the last ball. South Africa was almost winning till the 15th over but the Indian team did not give up hope and snatched the win from the jaws of defeat," Sreejesh, who has 328 India caps, told PTI Bhasha.

'That's what not only us (hockey team) but every Olympicbound athlete can learn from

our cricket team is that never give up, just wait and fight till the last moment, you will achieve it. I will remember this in the Olympics," he said.

Regarded as the 'The Wall of Indian hockey', Sreejesh still remembers that one advice he got from 'The Wall of Indian cricket', Rahul Dravid "I met Dravid bhai long back.

He told us about the importance of patience and waiting for your moment. That's what I did. I did not become one of the best goalkeepers in the world overnight. I waited for my opportunities. I have also learnt to remain humble from him," he said.

Sreejesh started playing hockey to get grace marks in the board exams but went on to win an Olympic medal -- bronze in Tokyo -- and also became the only goalkeeper from the coun $try\ to\ feature\ \bar{}$ in four Olympics.

"It's a great honour, a proud moment but comes with a lot of responsibilities. You need to guide the youngsters, you need to keep the team together and help to achieve the common goal of winning a medal at the Olympics," said the former FIH player of the year.
