WELCOME DRAGON

New Delhi, July 22: Amid strained ties with China since 2020 after border skirmishes, the Economic Survey tabled in the Parliament by Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman Monday made a strong case for seeking Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) from the neighbouring country to boost local manufacturing and tap the export market. Following

Galwan clashes, India had banned over 200 Chinese mobile apps such as TikTok, and rejected a major investment proposal from EV maker BYD. Visas for Chinese nationals also slowed. However, the focus of the Survey, which pegs a conservative growth forecast of 6.5% to 7%, on fresh ties with the neighbour hints at BJP-led government's economic compulsions.

The Survey said as the US and Europe are shifting their immediate sourcing away from China, it is more effective to have Chinese companies invest in India and then export the products to these markets rather than importing from the neigh-



bouring country.

India faces two choices to benefit from 'China plus one strategy' – it can integrate into China's supply chain or promote FDI from China, said the Survey.

"Among these choices, focusing on FDI from China seems more promising for boosting India's exports to the US, similar to how East Asian economies did in the past. Moreover, choosing FDI as a strategy to benefit from China

plus one approach appears more advantageous than relying on trade. This is because China is India's top import partner, and the trade deficit with China has been growing," it added.

It also said that increased foreign direct investment inflows from China can help increase India's global supply chain participation and push exports.

Anantha Nageswaran said that through this, he is urging the Centre to re-examine the policy with regard to FDI from China. He said that India has a large trade deficit with China and if India continues to import, the trade balance will widen further.

"It also means that you are making yourself vulnerable...Choose the areas in which you can have investments, then entrepreneurs picking up knowhow and at one point also becoming self sufficient," Nageswaran added

Cautious approach

The Survey has taken a more cautious stance than private economists on the outlook for growth this fiscal year, predicting the world's fifth-largest economy will expand between 6.5% and 7%. The projection is lower than 8.2% robust growth seen in the year ended March and a weaker range than estimates of 6.8% to 7.2% from economists. The RBI is also more upbeat, forecasting growth of 7.2%.

"Global growth and trade volume are difficult to come by," Nageswaran told reporters after the release of the annual report citing geopolitical risks, growing protectionism and concerns about supply chains. The Indian economy is on a strong wicket and stable footing, and the real GDP was up by nearly one fifth from pre-pandemic levels, he said.

Mercury may be a diamond treasure

Washington DC, July 22: A recent study suggests that a thick layer of diamonds may exist hundreds of miles underneath the surface of Mercury, according to a report.

A report in a television channel quoting 'Live Science' said Yanhao Lin, a staff scientist at the Centre for High-Pressure Science and Technology Advanced Research in Beijing and coauthor of the study said Mercury's extremely high carbon content made him realise that something special probably happened within its interior.

"The first planet of our solar system has a magnetic field. However, it is much weaker than Earth. Further. NASA's Messenger spacecraft discovered anomalously black areas on Mercury's surface that it recognised as graphite, a type of carbon," said the scientist. The results of the study were published in the journal 'Nature $\,$ Communications' and could provide light on the composition and unusual magnetic field of the planet.

The planet most likely formed from the cooling of a hot lava ocean, similar to how other terrestrial planets developed. This ocean was probably rich in silicate and carbon in Mercury's case. According to the investigations. minerals like olivine most likely developed in the mantle. However, the group also found that the chemical mixture only solidified at substantially higher temperatures when sulfur was added. Diamond formation is more likely to occur under such circumstances. Further, the models suggested that diamonds might have formed during the solidification of Mercury's inner core. According to the estimates, if diamonds are present, they form a layer that is typically roughly 15 km (9 miles) thick.



Bhubaneswar, July 22: The first session of the 17th Assembly started on a stormy note, with both the Opposition parties, BJD and Congress, boycotting Governor Raghubar Das' address to the House Monday over alleged inaction against his son despite allegations of him assaulting an official at the Puri Raj

As soon as the House assembled, Leader of Opposition and BJD president Naveen Patnaik led a walkout of the party law-

The BJD members were followed by Congress MLAs who also staged a walkout led by its legislature party leader Rama Chandra Kadam.


The Opposition parties bovcotted the Governor's address over the alleged assault on Baikuntha Pradhan, then posted as an ASO at Puri Raj Bhavan,

Speaking to reporters outside the Assembly, Patnaik said, "My party and I were disappointed and surprised to find that the present government has taken no action against the Governor's son who had meted out violence to a government officer. The Governor's son had allegedly physically assaulted Pradhan, who has now been transferred to the Home department, in Puri when he was on duty for President Droupadi Murmu's visit. A complaint was lodged at the Sea Beach police station in the Holy city the next day, but no action has been taken against the accused.

The Opposition members, however, later participated in the proceedings when the House

Citizens pin hope on spl grant, infra plans

Bhubaneswar, July 22: As Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman prepares to present the first budget of the Narendra Modi government 3.0 Tuesday, the people in the Capital city are looking forward to some special grants that could significantly impact the state's economic and in-

frastructure landscape. They are also of the opinion that budget may see income tax relief for the common man, middle class and salaried taxpayers.

Orissa POST talked to a crosssection of people to know their views and expectations.

Chandrashekhar Mishra, a solar entrepreneur by profession, said, "All banks including private banks should be mandated to have minimum exposure to Credit Guarantee Fund Trust for Micro and Small Enterprises (CGTMSE) in all regions of the country especially for Ministry of Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises (MSMEs)

including small construction companies

He further said, "For addressing speedy infrastructure growth, small construction companies should be given project finance with government guarantee backed by promoters' profiling.

Educationist and chairperson of SAI International School, Silpi Sahoo said, "The previous budget (2023-24) allocated approximately 2.9 per cent of the nation's GDP to education and higher education, an eight per cent increase from the previous year, which is relatively modest in absolute terms. To meet the objectives of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 and the National Curriculum Framework (NCF), it is essential to continue this upward trend in

"Higher budget allocations are necessary to effectively implement new programmes and

rural schools," she emphasised. On the other hand, Sankar Prasad Pani, an environment lawver drew attention to the alarming situation in the country due to the climate change. Considering India a vulnerable country to the climate change, our preparedness to face the consequences must reflect in the budget.

More allocation in research in terms of adaptive to the climate resilient agriculture, thrust on renewable energy and transition from coal should be in the government's priority list," he added. Expecting a green budget, Prafulla Samantara an environment activist said, "The source of revenue in the budget should not be more dependent on mines and minerals, so that there will be less mining to protect forest and water resources in the interest of tribals' socio economic security."

"There should be more provision of initiatives to farmers who adopt organic farming," he said.

Amrit Pattajoshi, a health expert, said goods and services tax (GST) on health insurance should be brought down from 18 per cent to 12 per cent as it would support the vision of Insurance Regulatory and Development Authority of India (IRDAI) for universal insurance coverage by 2047.

Rapamycin could extend women's fertility by five years

drug that could extend female fertility by five years is safe for a young, healthy population, according to early results of a study.

The study, which is being conducted by researchers at Columbia University in the US, is investigating the potential of using rapamycin – an existing immunosuppressant drug which is currently used to treat tumours and to prevent the recipient of a kidney transplant's body from rejecting the new

Labelled the Validating Benefits of Rapamycin for Reproductive Aging Treatment (Vibrant) study, the research is investigating whether the drug can slow down the ageing of the ovaries, therefore extending fertility, delaying menopause and dialling down the risk of age-

related diseases The study, which will eventually include more than 1,000 women, now has 34 participants aged up to 35, with more women joining every day.

Yousin Suh, a professor of reproductive sciences and professor of genetics and development at Columbia University and Zev Williams, associate professor of women's health and the chief of the division of reproductive endocrinology and infertility at Columbia University Irving Medical Center, co-led on the

Suh said early results suggested it was realistic to hope the drug could decrease ovary ageing by 20 per cent without women experiencing the side effects which commonly impact those who take the drug, such as high blood pressure, infections, headaches and nausea.

'These early results mean we now have a clear shot at our ultimate goal: using rapamycin to extend the lifespan of the ovary and thereby delaying the menopause, while also extending the lifespan of the woman and



improving her health and quality of life," she added.

Suh noted that participants in the randomised, placebo-controlled study self-reported improvements in their energy levels, memory and quality of their skin and hair. Such findings are consistent with other studies

which have investigated rapamycin and have suggested that it could increase one's lifespan by 9-14 per cent while revitalising the immune system and organs that deteriorate in old age.

"The results of this study – the first in human history – are very, very exciting. It means that

those with age-related fertility problems now have hope when before, they didn't," Suh said.

Suh said the team of at least 12 scientists working on the study, which will cost more than \$1m (£750,000) in total, had "great confidence in the results being just as exciting when we scale the study up"

"In a way, our results are too good to be true - except, because rapamycin is so well-studied, we know they are true." she said. "These results are like a dream come true.

"Ovarian ageing is the fundamental driver of ageing in women," said Suh. "HRT is a Band-Aid for ageing that has already taken place but if women take rapamycin in their 30s, when their ovaries start to decline but there aren't yet any symptoms, they can actually slow the whole ageing process.'

Vibrant will report in two years and be followed up by a much bigger, 'phase 2' study. "Our vision is women in their 30s and older can make a simple visit to their family doctor if they want to have more freedom over when they have babies," said Suh.

The findings have been celebrated by Dr Jennifer Garrison, a neuroscientist at the Buck Institute for Research on Aging and the founder of the Global Consortium for Reproductive

Longevity and Equality. "This research is remarkable and marks a paradigm shift in biomedical research for women. she said. "It is the very first in what needs to be many studies to solidify the idea that we can prolong ovarian function.

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Rly siding spews deadly dust

In the last 10 years, more than 100 people have allegedly died of respiratory diseases at Gauda Sahi, Suanla and Manpur villages, which are in proximity to the railway siding

Jajpur, July 22: Severe dust pollution at Manpur railway siding at Kalinganagar in Jajpur district has reportedly caused over 100 deaths during last 10 years in the nearby villages

The area is always enveloped with a thick layer of coal and mineral dust. Dust pollution has come to such a pass that it becomes difficult to breathe when one travels on the road nearby. In the last decade, more than a hundred people have died of respiratory and other related diseases at Gauda Sahi, Suanla and Manpur villages, which are in proximity to the railway siding. It is alleged that hundreds of people in the area are suffering from tuberculosis and jaundice. Tribal women in the villages

are the worst sufferers as around 60 of them have untimely lost their husbands and are forced to live a life of helplessness with their children. The sufferings of the children and students of the Anganwadi centre and schools near the railway siding are no less as they bear the brunt of severe dust pollution.

Locals held the consultancy agency in charge of loading and unloading coal and minerals responsible for the development. They said the irresponsible attitude and wrong handling of coal and minerals by the agency has led to severe dust pollution at the railway siding.

They alleged that the agency is transporting coal and minerals overlooking the pollution norms. It is apprehended that the death toll in surrounding villages might eral laden trains on the railway siding premises are not being put to proper use. As a result, dust of iron ore, coal and gypsum spreads in the air and leads to severe pollution. Residents of Gauda Sahi.

Munda Sahi, Nilapada and Manpur have been demanding to curb the dust pollution from the railway siding but to no avail. A case (34/2020) has also been filed before the National Green Tribunal (NGT) but nothing has happened so far.

Sources said coal is being exported from other countries and transported to various plants in Kalinganagar from this railway siding. Over 200 trucks ply from this railway siding daily for their destinations.

Locals alleged that the connecting road of the railway siding is not sprinkled with water on regular basis. Pollution is worsened due to lack of a boundary wall of proper height and absence of green cover in the area. Meanwhile, the agency ferrying minerals and coal from the siding has denied the charges.

According to sources, the NHM team has clearly blamed the hospital's manager Mohit Srivastav for all the major scandals involving laundry bill, theft of freezers from the mortuary and deployment of outsourced staff in the hospital, thereby resulting in huge financial corruption.

It is learnt that the team has issued the third show-cause notice to Srivastav. Previously two show-cause notices have been issued to him May 29 and June 6, when such irregularities indicating his involvement were found and reported by the present director of the RGH Dr Ganesh Dash.

As per the third show-cause notice, Mohit was supposed to reply by Monday evening. The NHM authority's future course of action will be based on the reply.



Biden Bids Adieu

pparently wilting under tremendous pressure from within his party, US President Joe Biden has finally announced he would not be in the presidential race this November and endorsed Vice President Kamala Harris to succeed him. Democrats heaved a sigh of relief that Biden has opted out of the race after having doggedly insisted that he would seek re-election. Efforts were being made by several Democrat leaders, including former President Barack Obama, to dissuade Biden from going ahead with his plan to contest in the election, but he was adamant. It was indeed a difficult call since quitting in the middle of the campaign would have created the impression that the President had run away in the face of sure defeat at the hand of Trump, even if it could have been a close contest. He and his party were seemingly looking for an alibi as his statements during the past few days did indicate. The opportunity appeared to have come when Biden had a COVID attack and was confined to his private house. Now the argument that he would be too debilitated by the virus to campaign at the advanced age of 81 would appear plausible.

The rival camp of the Republican candidate former President Donald Trump was gloating over the likely defeat of Biden after the latter's disastrous showing in a nationally televised debate with Trump. The way he fumbled, broke off in the middle of sentences and presented an image of a too old, doddering and infirm candidate, his party senators, top leaders and supporters were aghast and feared he would be no match for Trump. Whatever vestiges of hope some of them had were dashed after the attempt on the life of Trump that triggered a wave of sympathy for the former President and hugely boosted his chance of winning. That seemingly made the demand for Biden's abandoning the reelection bid even more raucous. The share market responded favourably for Trump and donations for his presidential race increased by leaps and bounds.

At this stage the emergence of Vice President Kamala Harris as the Presidential candidate will force Trump and his campaign managers to redraw their strategy which has so long focused on attacking Biden for his age and policy paralysis. Harris accepted the challenge with glee and said within hours of Biden's announcement that she would seek the nomination in his place. Many Democrats quickly lined up behind her.

If Trump thought he was much ahead of Biden, now it would be a different ball game with Harris on the scene. The words of both Biden and Harris are redolent of new hope and determination. Biden gave a call to fellow-Democrats and said: "It is time to come together and beat Trump. Let's do this." Harris immediately raised the pitch of her campaign and echoed her boss: "Together, we will fight, and together we will win."

No sitting American president has dropped out of a race so late in the election cycle. The Democratic National Convention, where Biden was to have been formally nominated by nearly 4,000 delegates, is scheduled to begin 19 August in Chicago. Harris has certain built-in advantages. She has often been at her best politically when she has taken on the role of prosecutor-in-chief and as a senator on the Judiciary Committee where her intensive cross-examinations went viral. During the campaign she can project herself as the best suited to "prosecute the case" against Trump who still faces more than one future criminal triel

Another strength of Harris is her strong advocacy of the rights of Afro-American and Asian population. She has also forcefully taken up the right to abortion that shook the women of the country when Trump's camp followers created a situation when women had to travel to distant Democrat ruled States to avoid the ban on abortion in their native Republican state.

Harris will have to cross the hurdle of getting her party's nomination. There are some heavyweights in the party who are maintaining a studied silence on the issue. Only about 100 days are left and the Democrats will have to decide on their candidate without any further delay if they want to have a real fighting chance against Trump.

n 19 July, RBI governor Shaktikanta Das flagged concerns over the widening gap between credit and deposit growth saying it will expose the system to structural liquidity is sues as household savings are increasingly moving away from the traditional bank deposits to capital markets and other financial intermediaries. Shaktikanta Das has said the RBI has been reviewing the liquidity coverage ratio (LCR) framework to address the emerging issues. The LCR is a measure intended to force financial institutions to set aside enough highly liquid capital to get them through the early stages of a financial crisis. If successful, that could prevent the crisis from spreading and causing greater economic harm.

Similarly, SEBI chairperson Madhabi Puri had earlier flagged risk of a bubble in the stock market and said that there are "signs" of price manipulation in Small and Medium Enterprises (SME) segment. Advising caution to investors, she said bubbles in the market are not good for retail investors.

While bank deposits continue to remain dominant as a percentage of financial assets, it can be noted that deposits accretion by banks have been falling way behind lending. Since the pandemic, households have been parking their savings in higher return assets like stocks and mutual funds, forcing banks to either offer higher prices for deposits or raise debt capital like long-term infra bonds.

Savings are important in the Indian context as India is a savings economy and that is why it was decoupled from the global financial crisis of 2008-09. The savings of a nation is known as national savings. In the case of India, it is known as Gross Domestic Savings (GDS) which is measured only in current market prices and originates from three distinct sectors -- public, private, and

household. The GDS which peaked to 37.8% in 2007-08 has declined to 29.7% of gross net disposable income (GNDI) in 2022-23, with households being the primary savers and forming 60.9% of aggregate savings, lower than the 10-year average during 2013-2022 which stood at 63.7%.

According to the June edition of RBI's Financial Stability Report, India's overall household savings declined to 18.4% of GDP in 2022-23 from an average of 20% during 2013-2022.

The share of net financial savings in total household savings fell to 28.5% in 2022-23, from an average of 39.8% during 2013-2022. In addition to a rise in financial liabilities, net financial savings declined to nearly all time low of 5.3% of GDP in 2022-23, down from an average of 8% in 2013-22.

What is disconcerting is that household debt levels have significantly risen after the COVID period along with financial liabilities reflecting growing household financial distress. India's overall debt stands at around 40.1% of GDP, low when compared to other EMEs. But RBI notes that this is "comparatively" high in relation to GDP per capita.

The greatest danger is rising household financial distress and declining financial savings. If by any means, people's income doesn't rise, they will fail to repay household debt resulting in banking collapse and financial apocalypse.

Now the question arises how the government will bridge its fiscal deficit through borrow ing if financial savings declines. Corporate investment will get thrashing too. Already private investment has declined. Hence it is imperative on the part of the government to encourage financial savings. Today due to growing expenditure on health, education, surplus incomes have been eroded. Lack of job opportunities, decline in real wages with concomitant inflation have exacerbated the situation.

According to ILO's calculations based on official government data, the average real monthly wage of a regular worker decreased from ₹12,100 in 2012 to ₹10.925 in 2022.

In reality, black money holders have more disposable income which is diverted to physical assets like real estate and gold as a hedge against inflation. This is unproductive and inflationary. Major parts of disposable incomes of rich and middle-class people are diverted towards luxurious consumption including purchase of flats and automobiles. People are feeling discouraged to save in banks, post offices and insurance as they have to pay taxes on interest of bank deposits, premium of insurance policies and in certain cases maturity of insurance policies. Tax rebate under section 80C for savings was not enhanced in tandem with rise of inflation and now it has been removed under the new tax regime. Taxing insurance premium which is a risk protection and some sort of social security measure is reprehensible. Further, it is easy to generate resources by taxing savings. However, those who maintain their livelihoods based on returns from savings are the worst hit. The government is not worried about the poor and vulnerable and it wants GDP to grow. This can happen if the rich become richer and the poor become

Our economy has now been converted into a consumption economy from a savings economy. This does not portend well for the future. There is a need to encourage financial savings. Provision for tax rebate for savings, abolition of tax on interest of deposits and insurance premiums should be considered in the Budget.

s the father of three children who fall right in the middle of Gen Z – anyone born between 1997 and 2012 – I have tried to prepare them for the uncertainties and complexities of twenty-first-century life. Like every parent, my wife and I have wondered where their path will lead them once they become fully independent, and how they will reshape society and the economy.

To be sure, the outlook is not entirely rosy. Having lived through a global pandemic and confronting a worsening climate crisis, members of Gen Z are often portrayed as grappling with a profound sense of pessimism. There is a reason that Greta Thunberg is one of the generation's most prominent voices.

nent voices.
But a recent report by World
Data Lab and NielsenIQ, "Spend
Z: Gen Z Changes Everything,"
paints a very different picture.
It found that Gen Z will be the
largest – and wealthiest – generation in history, and that these
benefits will be more evenly dispersed around the world. In addition to examining Gen Z's val-

ues and behaviour, the report documents how its current and future spending will shape the consumer-goods industry.

Gen Z comprises two billion people, or roughly a quarter of the total global population. As figure one shows, it will likely be the only generation to reach this level (although Millennials came close in 1998, when they peaked at 1.9 billion). And, thanks to the dramatic reduction in child mortality rates over the last 30 years, Gen Z will maintain its dominant demographic position much longer than previous generations.

Moreover, despite the doomand-gloom proclamations that
children will no longer be better off than their parents (a
severe blow to the narrative of
perpetual progress that took
hold after World War II), members of Gen Z are in fact enjoying a relatively prosperous
life. Even given the long list of
global challenges, from violent
conflicts to economic crises,
Gen Z has more spending power
than the generations that preceded it – and that is true across

all continents. To gauge Gen Z's spending

power, the Spend Z report compared the mean spending per capita of today's 25-year-olds to that of Gen Xers and Millennials when they were the same age (in 2017 dollars at purchasing power parity). As table one shows, members of Gen Z spend around 25 per cent more than Millennials in North America and Europe, and roughly twice as much in the Asia-Pacific region.

Of course, most members of

Gen Z are younger than 25 and still enrolled in secondary school or university, which is why the generation's current spending power is only 40 per cent that of Baby Boomers, 54 per cent that of Gen Xers, and 70 per cent that of Millennials. But the report predicts that total Gen Z spending will rise sharply once the entire cohort enters the job market, from \$9.8 trillion today to an estimated \$12.6 trillion already by 2030.

Lastly, unlike previous generations, Gen Z's consumer power will be concentrated not in the West, but in emerging markets.

Only 10 per cent of Gen Zers are from North America or Europe They comprise just 17 per cent of the European population, behind Gen Xers, Baby Boomers, and Millennials, and 20 per cent of the US population. By contrast, they comprise 33 per cent of the population Sub-Saharan Africa and 28 per cent in South Asia. As a result, Gen Z spending is dominated by emerging markets, which account for 55 per cent of the generation's total spending (Asia, where living standards are rising fast, accounts for one-third of this spending).

The digital natives of Gen Z will have more information at their fingertips and more freedom to spend than any previous generation. They really will change everything, not least for manufacturers and retailers. Only by catering to this rising generation of young consumers can today's companies set themselves up for future success.

The prospects for Vice-President Kamala Harris becoming Democratic nominee for US Presidential election is almost certain, but not without risks. Public opinion surveys show Harris' approval ratings are about as low as Biden's. Harris has had a rocky time as VP. Early in the administration, she was given the task of addressing the root causes of the migration crisis at the US-Mexico border. In this daunting challenge, a number of missteps and misstatements opened her up to criticism. However, no matter who the nominee is, the Republicans are sure to blame the Democrats for covering up Biden's age-related weaknesses - and putting the nation at risk. Add to this, Harris has already run for national office - her 2020 bid for the Democratic presidential nomination - and stumbled badly. While she surged early, a combination of fumbled interviews, a lack of clearly defined vision and a poorly managed campaign led her to drop out be fore even the earliest primaries. Opting for Harris is a risk for Democrats, but at this point there are no safe options. And the stakes – a possible Donald Trump victory – are as high as they get.

Combating deforestation

Sir, India is fast losing its forests. The Global Forest Watch, which is an open source web application to monitor global forests in real-time, says that India has lost 354-kilo hectares of tree cover over the last two decades. Given that millions in rural India depend on forests for their livelihood, there is a need for regular monitoring to ensure a balance between development and conservation of forests. In this context, satellite data and analysis help in the fight against deforestation. You cannot stop deforestation if you cannot "see." Though forest guards play a critical role in the fight against deforestation, it is expensive and time-consuming for monitoring extensive areas, let alone stopping deforestation on time. Satellites, on the other hand, are a more effective tool for deforestation as they image vast areas of forests in a short time.

Bangalore, July 22: Karnataka Labour Minister Santosh Lad Monday said the proposal to extend the working hours of employees in the IT/ITeS/BPO sector has come from the IT industry, and the government will take a decision after looking into opinions shared by all stakeholders including leaders in the field and employees.

Stating that the IT employees union has expressed their dissent, he urged industry veterans and captains to also come out and share their views.

The proposed 'Karnataka Shops and Commercial Establishments (Amendment) Bill 2024' seeks to normalise a 14-hour work day. The existing act only allows a maximum of 10 hours work per day including overtime.

"It is not the Minister who has brought himself (the proposed bill). The industry is pressurising. (They) are asking and they want it. Since there is pressure from the industry, the bill has come to us. We are still evaluating it at the Labour department. The question is for all the heads of the industry to discuss this," Lad said.

Speaking to reporters here, he said, "The matter is in open domain, people are free to discuss this. They (industry leaders) express (opinion) for every thing, so I want all the big heads (of the industry) to debate and express their view. There is dissent from IT employees. CM can't take decisions unilaterally, says BJP

The BJP Monday slammed the Karnataka government regarding proposed policies for the IT and ITES sectors, saying that it should be worried about its underperformance across sectors. Speaking to reporters at Vidhana Soudha in Bangalore, state BJP President, BY Vijayendra stated that the issue needs to be discussed and the CM cannot take decisions unilaterally. Thiruvananthapuram, July 22: A day after the BJP attacked the Kerala government over giving an IAS officer extra duties related to 'External Cooperation', the Left government responded Sunday by referring to a 2016 Lok Sabha document where the BJP-led Central government talked about a new division to help states promote exports, tourism, and attract foreign investments.

The BJP in Kerala slammed the LDF government Saturday for giving an IAS officer additional charge of matters connected with 'External Cooperation', and termed it an appointment of a "foreign secretary of the state". The Chief Secretary had responded saying it was nothing new.

The chief minister's office Sunday shared an unstarred question answered May 5, 2016, by then Minister of State for External Affairs Gen VK Singh, who had said that the ministry has set up a new division—"states Division"

- in October 2014 to coordinate with states and union territories for further facilitation of their efforts to promote their exports and tourism and attract more overseas investments and expertise.

"The division is headed by a joint Secretary, assisted by two deputy secretary-level officers and supported by a section," Singh had said.

"The objective of the division is to coordinate facilitation of efforts in these areas between our mission/post(s) and states'/union territories' governments as well as foreign diplomatic and trade missions in India." "It aims to assist states and union territories by sharing with them, where required, this ministry's experience and expertise through training and capacity building in areas relating to external linkages relating to trade, investment, cultural and other such areas," the document read.

The state government released the document a day after Kerala Chief Secretary Venu V, in a Facebook post, said that 'External Cooperation' has been in existence for some time and was created for better coordination with delegates coming to the state from other nations.

Attacking Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan over the decision to appoint an IAS officer for the purpose, BJP State President K Surendran said the Marxist veteran should not consider Kerala an independent country.

Venu had said that many foreign agencies, multilateral agencies, institutions working in embassies of other countries and delegations regularly contact the Kerala government and other state governments. When the CM or ministers from the state go abroad and hold discussions there, representatives of those countries come to Kerala, and to deal with them has been the responsibility of various departments earlier, he had further said. However, as the number of such discussions increased, the need for better coordination was felt and therefore, a division called External Cooperation was created for that purpose.

Principal Secretary, Industries, Suman Billa was given the responsibility of that division in 2023 prior to which former OSD Venu Rajamony had that charge, the chief secretary had said in his post. After Billa went to the Central services, the responsibility of that division was handed over to K Vasuki who is the Secretary of Labour and Skills Department, he had further said.

'Growth in Union govt revenue is not reflected in states'

As political slugfest erupts, Army joins rescue operations

Bangalore, July 22: Amid a political slugfest between the ruling Congress and the Opposition over the handling of the landslide tragedy on the Shirur highway in Karnataka's Uttara Kannada district, the Army Monday joined the local authorities in rescue operations. The district authorities have es-

timated the official death toll to be 10, with seven bodies recovered, and an operation has been launched to track three more. Meanwhile, the Army has sent

Meanwhile, the Army has sent a team of 40 soldiers to join the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) and the State Disaster Response Force (SDRF) to retrieve the bodies trapped under the debris of the massive landslide.

Union Minister for Heavy Industries and Steel, HD Kumaraswamy, has criticised Deputy Chief Minister DK Shivakumar for his comments regarding his visit to the landslide site.

Taking to X, Union Minister Kumaraswamy said Monday, "When I visited Shirur village in Uttara Kannada district, where seven people died due to a landslide, Saturday, the Deputy Chief Minister of the state, DK-Shivakumar, had made a mockery of the situation. He lightly commented that the military

should have been called in and questioned what one person alone could do."

"In his eagerness to speak lightly about me, the honorable Deputy Chief Minister also insulted our proud army. This is an unfortunate incident," Kumaraswamy said.

He further stated, "I did not say that the district administration is not carrying out rescue operations. I did not criticize the government either. Nevertheless, over 40 brave soldiers of our proud military have rushed to the rescue operations, speeding up the efforts, moved by the tears of the bereaved families. Does the Deputy Chief Minister have any objections to this He should answer to this."

"We are in a federal system. Saying 'I' is arrogance; saying 'we' is culture. If a person who holds the position of Deputy Chief Minister does not understand such a simple principle of harmony, then there is no greater folly than this," he charged. Chief Minister Siddaramaiah during his visit to the tragic site had stated that Karnataka would write to the Centre regarding the sub-standard national highway. The BJP criticised CM Siddaramaiah for visiting the site six days after the incident and blaming the Centre for hiding his government's failures.

K'taka govt to issue guidelines to malls

Bangalore, July 22: Karnataka Deputy Chief Minister DK Shivakumar Monday said the government will issue guidelines to malls and other establishments, in the wake of a farmer being denied entry because of his attire.

The government July 18 ordered closure of the GT World mall here for seven days after the incident, which drew strong condemnation from members cutting across party lines in the Legislative Assembly.

It had also termed the alleged insult to the farmer as infringement of "dignity and self respect" of an individual, and said it cannot be tolerated.

Kerala boy survives amoebic meningoencephalitis

Kozhikode (Kerala), July 22: Amidst concerns over the outbreak of deadly virus infections like Nipah in Kerala, the state Monday reported a rare case of recovery from amoebic meningoencephalitis, which has a 97 per cent mortality rate.

State Health Minister Veena George announced that a 14year-old boy undergoing treatment for the disease has recovered.

She described this as a rare occurrence in the country, given the high mortality rate of the disease.

Only 11 people worldwide have recovered from amoebic meningoencephalitis, George noted, praising the team that led the coordination and treatment efforts

A highly rare but extremely lethal central nervous system infection, amoebic meningoencephalitis, has been identified as a threat to human health.

Caused by free-living amoebae, this deadly infection is typically contracted from freshwater sources such as lakes, rivers, and streams.

According to an official statement here, when the case was reported, a meeting was convened under the health minister's leadership, and special caution-



ary instructions were issued. Health workers at the Primary Health Centre in Melady in this district suspected that the boy's symptoms might be meningoencephalitis and alerted the authorities.

"The boy had an epileptic seizure and was admitted to a private hospital in Kozhikode on

the same day. The Health department provided Miltefosine medicine (a broad-spectrum antimicrobial used to treat free-living amoeba infections), and he recovered after three weeks of treatment. Early detection and access to available treatments contributed to his recovery," the statement said. Following the

The 46th session of the World Heritage Committee being hosted by India from July 21-31 got underway Sunday with the opening ceremony attended by Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Director General of UNESCO Audrey Azoulay, among others.

Parallel to the plenary session being held at the main hall of the Bharat Mandapam, an 'Incredible India' exhibition has been set up at hall number 14 depicting heritage landmarks and cultural legacy of the country.

The main gateway to this pavilion is a replica of an ornate gateway in Jaipur, with a softly illuminated 'Incredible India'

mounted on its top. As one enters the pavilion,



moving images of iconic cultural heritage sites of India have been depicted on digital walls on both sides.

The gateway leads to a wide open space where different aspects of India's heritage have been displayed, from replicas of monumental sites such as Jantar

Mantar of Delhi to Unakoti, the chiselled 'Angkor Wat of the North-East' region that was put on the Tentative List of UN-ESCO World Heritage Site in

"We have created this 'Incredible India' pavilion to showcase to the delegates and

other visitors a slice of India and its diverse cultural flavour under one roof here at the venue of the World Heritage Committee meeting. It has replicas of monuments, virtual reality experience and much more," a senior official of the Ministry of Tourism told PTI.

The main entrance also has giant cut-outs of several UN-ESCO World Heritage Sites in India from the churches of Goa to temples of south India, and Mahabodhi temple of Bihar to Humayun's Tomb of Delhi.

The special exhibition highlights India's rich cultural heritage, age-old civilisation, geographical diversity and tourism destinations along with modern developments in the fields of information technology and infrastructure, officials said.

Adding a splash of colour to this kaleidoscope of culture is the presence of stalls from various states and Union Territories

"We have divided them into five zones, north, south, east, west and central. In the East zone, one can see stalls of Bihar, Jharkhand, Odisha, and West Bengal, among others," the official from the Tourism Ministry

Next to the West Bengal stall, a panel depicting Durga Puja with idols of Goddess Durga and other deities has been mounted. Kolkata's Durga Puja finds a place on UNESCO's list of intangible cultural heritage.

Various state stalls besides showcasing their tourism destinations are also letting guests sample some delicacies from their respective regions.

New Delhi, July 22: The Supreme Court Monday ordered an interim stay on the directives issued by BJP-ruled Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand asking eateries along the Kanwar Yatra routes to display the names of their owners, staff and other details, a move the opposition has claimed is intended to promote religious discrimination.

Issuing notice to the governments of Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand and Madhya Pradesh, where the Ujjain municipal body has issued a similar directive, a bench of Justices Hrishikesh Roy and SVN Bhatti, however, said eateries may be required to display the kind of food they are serving like they are vegetarian or non-vegetarian.

A large number of devotees travel from various places with 'kanwars' carrying holy water from the Ganga to perform 'jalabhishek' of Shivlings during the Hindu calendar month of 'Shravan'. Many believers shun consuming meat during the month they consider holy.

INS Brahmaputra severely damaged in fire; sailor missing PRESS TRUST OF INDIA

New Delhi, July 22: Indian Navy's frontline guided missile frigate INS Brahmaputra sustained severe damage and tilted heavily to one side following a fire onboard the ship while it was undergoing refit at the naval dockyard in Mumbai.

One junior sailor went missing following the fire Sunday evening and rescue operations are going on to trace him, Navy officials said, adding the warship is now resting on her left side.

Navy Chief Admiral Dinesh K Tripathi Monday apprised Defence Minister Rajnath Singh about the fire incident and the damages caused to the ship.

Singh's office said the defence minister prayed for the safety of the missing sailor and that he directed the Navy chief to take "appropriate action"

INS Brahmaputra is the first of the indigenously built 'Brahmaputra' class-guided missile frigates and it was commissioned into the Indian Navy in April 2000.

The nearly 3,600-tonne ship is fitted with an array of weapons including surface-to-surface missiles, surface-to-air missiles. medium range guns, anti-submarine rockets, radars, sonars and state-of-the-art electronic warfare systems.

New Delhi, July 22: The National Testing Agency (NTA) postponed at least 16 exams due to different reasons since its inception in 2018, the Ministry of Education informed the Lok Sabha Monday

The reasons for postponement included Covid-19 pandemic, administrative reasons, logistical reasons, and technical issues.

The information was shared by Minister of State for Education Sukanta Majumdar in response to a written question in Lok Sabha asked by DMK MP Kanimozhi Karunanidhi.

'Since its inception in 2018, NTA has successfully conducted over 240 examinations involving over 5.4 crore students. Since most of the examinations conducted by NTA are held in multiple-subjects, multiple-shifts and span over a number of days, there have been instances due to unforeseen circumstances like Covid-19 pandemic, logistical



and technical issues, administrative issues, legal orders etc, when examination dates initially notified in respect of specific subjects or shifts could not be adhered to," the Minister said.

According to the data shared by the minister, four exams --JEE-Main (2020), NEET-UG (2020), JEE-Main (2021) and NEET-UG (2021) -- were postponed due to Covid-19 pandemic.

CSIR UGC-NET (2020), UGC-NET (December, 2020), UGC-NET (May, 2021) and Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) AIEEA (2020) were postponed due to "Covid-19 pandemic and logistical challenges'

New Delhi, July 22: Indian doctors have expressed concerns that the burden of lungrelated disorders in the country may be higher than projected by a recent Lancet study, due to high levels of air pollution and tobacco consumption.

According to the study published in May, ischaemic heart disease will continue to be the leading cause of death around the world, followed by stroke, diabetes and chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD). In ischaemic heart disease, narrowing of vessels in the organ reduces blood flow.

The study projected that men and women around the world could live longer by up to five and four years, respectively.

"It is going to remain the number one killer and disabling disease with continued bad lifestyle and increasing stress. Yet, there is a lack of under-



standing of the exact mechanism of formation of these blockages (in the heart's blood vessels). Till we understand the mechanism, the solutions cannot be found," said Dr Atul Mathur, Executive Director. Interventional Cardiology and Chief of Cath Lab, Fortis Escorts Heart Institute, New Delhi.

However, the doctors also cautioned that the overall chest disease burden in India will be much higher than what the study predicts, owing to con-

tinuing earlier challenges of infectious diseases, along with air pollution and smoking. This is because we continue

to struggle with the earlier problems of infectious diseases, including tuberculosis. On the other hand, we have started seeing a massive increase in new age diseases like lung cancer," said Dr Arvind Kumar, Chairman, Institute of Chest Surgery, Chest Onco Surgery and Lung Transplantation, Medanta

High levels of air pollution and tobacco consumption could be reasons why COPD would be one of the top leading causes of mortality, according to Dr. Lancelot Pinto, Consultant Pulmonologist Epidemiologist, PD Hinduja Hospital and Medical Research Centre, Mumbai.

"Air pollution, use of indoor biomass fuels and poor lung development in childhood are all significant risk factors for the disease, and unless we take preventive health more seriously, our health systems will not be able to cope with the huge burden of the disease," said Pinto.

"As life expectancy (is expected to) increase, our overall exposure to various agents causing COPD, will also increase. Smoking, despite all efforts, still continues to be rampant and it is the number onecontributor to COPD," said

Among the indices, Energy declined by 0.67 per cent, Realty

by 0.53 per cent, FMCG by 0.27 per cent and Bankex by 0.27 per cent. Commodities, Consumer Discretionary, Financial Services,

Healthcare, Industrials, Utilities

and Power sector indices were among the gainers.

"After a sharp fall in early trades, markets were on a recovery mode and ended with marginal losses on profit-taking in banking and realty stocks. Investors traded with caution as nervousness gripped in ahead of tomorrow's Budget. However, markets could see volatility during the Budget announcement on Tuesday and one may see sectorbased action," Prashanth Tapse, Senior VP (Research), Mehta Equities Ltd, said.

"Benchmark equity indices closed lower for a second consecutive session as investors awaited updates on the final budget and corporate earnings, said Avdhut Bagkar Technical and Derivatives Analyst, StoxBox.

In Asian markets, Seoul, Tokyo and Shanghai settled lower, while Hong Kong ended in the positive territory.

European markets were trading higher in the mid-session deals. US markets ended lower in overnight trade Friday.

According to the Economic Survey, 2023-24 tabled in Parliament Monday, capital markets are becoming more prominent in India's growth story, with an expanding share in capital formation and investment landscape on the back of technology, innovation and digitisation.

Further, Indian markets are resilient to global geo-political and economic shocks, it added.

"Despite heightened geo-political risks, rising interest rates and volatile commodity prices, Indian capital markets have been one of the best performing among emerging markets in FY24," the Economic Survey said.

The Survey projected India's GDP to grow at 6.5-7 per cent in 2024-25, down from a high of 8.2 per cent in the the preceding financial year.

Meanwhile, global oil benchmark Brent crude dipped 0.08 per cent to USD 82.53 a barrel.

Foreign Institutional Investors (FIIs) bought equities worth ₹1,506.12 crore Friday, accord-

ing to exchange data. The BSE benchmark hit its new all-time high of 81,587.76 in the initial trade Friday but failed to carry forward the winning momentum and tanked 738.81 points or 0.91 per cent to settle below the 81,000 mark at

80,604.65.

Nifty tumbled 269.95 points or 1.09 per cent and ended at 24,530.90 after hitting its freshrecord peak of 24,854.80 during the opening bell Friday.








Gambhir's new roadmap

HEAD COACH EXPLAINS HIS EXPECTATIONS FROM PLAYERS

Mumbai, July 22: Newly-appointed head coach of the Indian cricket team Gautam Gambhir said Monday that he expected both Rohit Sharma and Virat Kohli to be available for most of the ODIs and Tests as the team start preparing for the 50 overs World Cup in 2027. In his first press conference after his appointment, Gambhir stated that with the two retiring from T20Is, they will have enough time to recover between matches of the other two formats.

"Workload management for a bowler like Jasprit Bumrah is important. He is a rare gem and the aim will be that he is available for all the important games," Gambhir stated. "However if a batter is in form he should continue to play all matches and I expect Rohit and Virat to do that. I hope that they maintain their fitness and are available for the 50 overs World Cup in 2027," the head coach added. To put it simply Gambhir made it clear that he was not in favour of players picking and choosing the games that they play in.

Even though Rohit and Kohli were not too keen to play the ODIs against Sri Lanka, both were named in India's squad for next month's three ODIs keeping in mind the Champions Trophy, which is slated for the first

quarter of the next year.

"One thing I can be very clear of is that both of those guys have a lot of cricket left in them. More importantly with the Champions Trophy and a big tour of Australia coming up they will be motivated," Gambhir asserted.

Gambhir declared his much talked about relationship with Kohli 'is between the two of us and not for TRPs'. He asserted that they are going to be 'on same page' in the coming times.


"Good for the TRP, but my relationship is not public. What kind of a relationship I share with Virat Kohli... I think it's between two mature individuals," Gambhir said ahead of the team's departure for Sri Lanka.

"On the field, everyone has got the right to fight for their own jersey and come back to a winning dressing room. But at the moment, we're representing India, representing 140 crore Indians and I'm sure we're going to be on the same page and try and make India proud," added Gambhir.

Availability helped Surya get captaincy

Mumbai: Fitness, feedback from the dressing room and consistent availability swung the pendulum in Suryakumar Yadav's favour when it was decided to appoint him captain of the Indian T20 team ahead of Hardik Pandya, chief selector Ajit Agarkar said here Monday. "Why Surya was made captain? Because he is one of the deserving candidates. The one we know has been around the dressing room over the last one year; you get feedback from the dressing room a lot. He has got a good cricketing brain and he is still one of the best T20 batters in the world," Agarkar said. "You (would) want a captain who's likely to play all the games. We think he's a deserving candidate and hopefully we'll see over time how he develops into the role," the chief selector added.

Gambhir said the two share a very good relationship off the field. "...and will continue to do that. But yes, to make it more public, what kind of a relationship... I think it's between two individuals. I've had a lot of chats with him (Kohli)... we've shared messages," Gambhir said.

Sreejesh decides to quit after Paris Games

New Delhi. July 22: Celebrated India hockey goalkeeper PR Sreejesh announced Monday that he will bid adieu to the game after the Paris Olympics, ending a career which spanned 18 years during which he was a pivotal figure in some historic moments for the side.

The 36-year-old, a veteran of 328 international caps, including three Olympic Games, and multiple Commonwealth Games and World Cups, will be playing in his fourth Olympics in Paris beginning July 26.

"As I prepare for my last dance in Paris, I look back with immense pride and forward with hope," Sreejesh said in a Hockey India (HI) press release.

'This journey has been nothing short of extraordinary, and I am forever grateful for the love and support from my family, teammates, coaches, fans and Hockey India. Thank you for believing in me," Sreejesh further stated.

"My teammates have stood beside through the tough and the ardent times. We all want to give our absolute best in Paris and certainly, the desire is to change the colour of our medal,' Sreejesh added, referring to perhaps the biggest moment of his career - a bronze in the 2020 Tokyo Olympics.

"Paris 2024 will indeed be a special tournament. We have decided to dedicate our campaign to the legend PR Sreejesh," said Harmanpreet.

"He has been an inspiration for all of us and I still remember his mentorship in 2016 Junior World Cup when we won the title. It was the beginning of many of our careers in international hockey and he has shaped each one in his own way," Harmanpreet added.

Pogacar wins 3rd Tour crown in style

Paris, July 22: Tadej Pogacar had no need to attack on the final stage of the Tour de France. Defending a lead of more than five minutes in Sunday's time trial, he was set to comfortably win the race for the third time and first time in three years, anyway. But defense has not been in his vocabulary during this race and he simply could not resist another attack.

With his main rival Jonas Vingegaard unable to challenge him, Pogacar cele-



brated his Tour victory in style with a dominant win in the time trial ending in Nice for the 17th stage win of his already illustrious Tour career. The 25-yearold Slovenian rider also became the

first cyclist to secure the Giro d'Italia and

Tour de France in the same year since the late Marco Pantani in 1998.

'To win both together is another level above," said Pogacar, who rides for 'UAE Team Emirates'. "I think this is the first Grand Tour where I was totally confident every day. Even at the Giro I remember I had one bad day. This year, the Tour was just amazing. I was enjoying it from day one," Pogacar said.

Two-time defending champion Vingegaard of Denmark was second overall. He also finished the 21st and final stage in second place.

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
