



# Subhadra launch today

POST NEWS NETWORK

Bhubaneswar, Sept 16: More than 10 lakh women will receive their first installment of ₹5,000 when the ambitious 'Subhadra Yojana' will be launched in the state by Prime Minister Narendra Modi at the Janata Maidan here Tuesday. It will mark the beginning of the ambitious project introduced by the newly-elected BJP government in Odisha.

'Subhadra Yojana' launch will be one of the key events of the day during the PM's duration in the Odisha capital during which he will also lay the foundation for multiple development projects worth ₹3,800 crore.

Taking to his 'X' handle, Union Minister Dharmendra Pradhan



said Monday that the launch of the 'Subhadra Yojana' will be momentous occasion for women in the

state. It will be mark the fulfillment of promises and will also herald empowerment of Nari Shakti.

It should be stated here that already over 60 lakh women have registered their names for the scheme. Deputy Chief Minister Pravati Parida informed Monday that those who have registered on or before September 15 will receive the first installment of

₹5,000 Tuesday.

The Odisha government will annually deposit ₹10,000, in two installments of ₹5,000 each on Rakhi Purnima and International Women's Day (March 8), in the accounts of the beneficiaries through DBT for five years - between financial years 2024-25 and 2028-29. The government has earmarked ₹55,825 crore for the implementation of the scheme. More than one crore women in the age group of 21 years to 60 years in Odisha will benefit from the Subhadra scheme.

The state government also said that those who have not received a debit of one rupee under the 'Subhadra Yojana' in their respective registered bank accounts do not need to worry. It means that the applications are being scrutinised and once done. the money will be deposited into the account.

All schools, colleges and educational institutions will remain closed in the Odisha capital, in view of Modi's visit. Besides launching Subhadra Yojana, the he will also inaugurate 26 lakh PM Awas houses at Gadakana. Modi will also unveil railway projects worth ₹2.871 crore and highway projects worth ₹1.000 crore.

## 1st round to Jr docs



Kolkata, Sept 16: Bengal Chief Minster Mamata Banerjee, after meeting with the protesting junior doctors, has announced that she had agreed to three of the five demands of the protesting doctors -- the removal of two top officials of the health department and the chief of Kolkata police. Along with it, the police chief of the city's north zone – where RG Kar Medical College, the hospital where the rape-murder of a young doctor took place, is located -- will also be removed. The formal orders will be issued Tuesday, "I think the meeting was positive. Am sure they think too," she said. "Or why else we will sign the minutes of the meeting and they would sign it too?" she added.

The agitating doctors had been demanding the resignation of Goyal from the first day of their agitation. "Forty two doctors, Chief Secretary Manoj Pant signed minutes of meeting," said the Bengal

CM. She added that changes will also be made in the Health department which the junior doctors had been demanding.

"I have requested the agitating doctors to return to work. Dengue and the flood situation in the state is not good at all. In this situation we need the services of the doctors. I will not talk anything about the ongoing case in the Supreme Court. All I will say that the government has accepted 99% of their demands," Banerjee added.

The meeting between the West Bengal government and the agitating junior doctors got over after nearly two hours. Then more than two hours were taken to prepare the minutes of the meeting which was attended by a delegation of 42 doctors. Banerjee had a free-wheeling discussion with the doctors in the meeting which was also attended by Pant and Home Secretary Nandini Chakrabarty.


"There have been agreements on few points and disagreements over some others," the agitating junior doctors said after meeting. However, they did not state whether they will call off the cease work. The doctors said that they have five demands and they have handed over the same in writing.







Bhubaneswar, Sept 16: The department of Mathematics at Central University of Odisha (CUO), Koraput organised a twoday workshop on Vedic Mathematics at the university campus Monday.

Inaugurating the event, CUO VC Chakradhar Tripathi highlighted the relevance of Vedas in modern life while stating India's rich cultural heritage, mythology and ancient texts. He also illustrated a mathematical concept drawn from a stanza of the Hanuman Chalisa, connecting it to the broader theme of Vedic wisdom.

Advisor to the University, VC Jha shed light on the importance of integrating Vedic knowledge into the education system, aligning with the goals of the National Education Policy 2020. He remarked that the Vedas are not merely religious scriptures but serve as guiding principles for the universe.

Dean of the School of Language and Literature and Registrar (in-charge) NC Charan Panda spoke about the significance of the sound "OM" and its profound effects on the human mind. # Cong slams BJP over Subhadra

Bhubaneswar, Sept 16: A day before Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to the state for launching of Subhadra Yojana Odisha Congress Monday raised questions about the meager amount (Rs 833) the women beneficiaries would get per month under the flagship scheme.

At a presser held at Congress Bhawan here Tuesday, Odisha congress leader Biswaranjan Mohanty said the state government is spending huge amount of money on propagation of Subhadra Yojana. The drawback of every BJP government is that it creates confusion and controversy

whenever it launches any scheme," he said. "Before the elections, the saf-

fron party leaders said that all women will be given ₹50,000 immediately. But after coming to power, the government said that they will pay this money in five years. This comes to around ₹833 per month and ₹27 per day. In this sense, what kind of enterprise will a woman set up and be empowered," Mohanty said.

Similarly, the party, which made 'Odia Asmita' its major poll plank during campaign, has conveniently made Gujarat a model for Odisha.

They have planned to suppress Odia Asmita by appointcrucial posts. The Mohan Majhi government has identified itself as a true 'Modi government' by handing over Gopalpur port to Adani group.

He said the BJP government had initially announced that it would launch Subhadra Yojana on Rath Yatra. Later, it was announced that the amount will be credited to beneficiaries' accounts August 15. This never happened. Again, they announced to disburse the amount on the PM's birthday September 17.

He said that crores of rupees are being spent from the state exchequer for the launch of Subhadra Yojana but more than 30 per cent women population of the state are barred from this scheme. Moreover, 13 per cent of the beneficiaries are under the age of 18 while 17 per cent are above 60 years, he added.

Bhubaneswar, Sept 16: Steel production at Tata Steel's Kalinganagar plant in Jajpur district is set to increase from 3 million tonnes per annum to 8 mtpa with the phase-II expansion of the plant nearing completion. With this, Odisha would emerge as Tate Steel's singlelargest investment destination and also help the company to achieve its target of 40 mtpa capacity in India by 2030, the company said in a release Monday.

The expansion will also enhance company's capability to manufacture high-end valueadded steel products. It will also catapult the eastern state to an enviable position of becoming the single largest investment destination for the country's oldest steel maker," it said.

### Withdraw review plea on mining cess: Jena to PM



## Victim's father demands suspension of IIC

Bhubaneswar, Sept 16: A day after a serving officer of the Indian Army and his female friend were allegedly assaulted at the Bharatpur police station where they had gone to report a road rage instance, the Odisha State Ex-Servicemen Association Monday demanded the suspension of IIC Dinakrushna Mishra and other policemen involved in the brutality.

At a press meet, president of the as sociation Brigadier Antaryami Pradhan, who is also father of Citybased restaurateur Ankita Pradhan who had allegedly been subjected to the police excess along with her friend Gurvansh Singh, a Major attached to the 22 Sikh Regiment at Kolkata, alleged that the police had arranged a 'false report' from the Capital Hospital before producing his daughter in the court. "They had submitted that report to the magistrate," he alleged.

Accusing the police of 'hiding' the original report, he demanded the immediate release of actual medical examination report which would prove how brutally Ankita was assaulted by

the police.

Pradhan wondered why the police preferred to rough up and arrest a decorated Army officer when the latter approached them to file a complaint. "Why did the police not install CCTV cameras on its premises which is a mandatory practice as per the Supreme Court ruling," he asked.

They have not only violated the Supreme Court directive, but also breaking rules and regulation at will. They are damaging the name of police and the uniform," he added.

He said if an Army personnel is facing such situation what about common man. "Such incident will discourage youngsters from joining the Army,' he said adding, "Surprisingly the Army top brass is silent even when such heinous incidents are happening to officers who are dedicating their lives for the country."

According to reports, Major Singh and Ankita were subjected to brutal assault by on-duty cops at Bharatpur police station who they approached them to register a complaint of road rage in the wee hours of Sunday.

The duo was travelling in a car late Saturday night when they had a close shave from a rashly-driven vehicle. Upon intercepting the rouge vehicle, 8-10 miscreants came out of it and misbehaved with them before speeding off. Gurvansh said when the cops misbehaved with them and asked him to lodge a written complaint when he asked them to nab the culprits without wasting time.

He also alleged that three female cops dragged his friend inside a cell and disrobed her. He too was beaten up by a cop when he protested.

# Baramunda IMFL shop sealed for selling water-mixed liquor

Bhubaneswar, Sept 16: Six persons were detained by the Excise department on charges of adulteration following a raid conducted at an authorised (licensed) Indian Made Foreign Liquor (IMFL) shop in Baramunda area here, Monday.

Sources in the Excise department said that the suspects, working as salesmen at the shop, would add water to liquor in bottles by removing seals, before repacking, and sell those to unsuspecting customers.

"They were doing it for extra profit," sources said, adding that the accused persons procured counterfeit bottle caps and Excise department stickers to carry out the adulteration and con act.

A senior Excise official said that earlier the department sleuths had come across samples of liquor bottle caps, hologram and other features which were different from those used in original brands.

Acting on the information, an Excise department team Monday first conducted a raid at the place where the staff of the shop were staying and

found several caps and Excise stickers (adhesives). Thereafter, they raided the shop and detected the same cap and labels on several liquor bottles, the official added.

Following the findings, the Excise department collected samples from remaining bottles and sent those to a laboratory for tests. Moreover, the stock inside the shop, said to be of around ₹40 lakh, was destroyed using an earthmover, while the shop has been sealed. Sources said the licensee, Mukul Kumar, a resident of Jharkhand, has been summoned for questioning. The senior Excise official said that further action against the shop would be decided following questioning of the licensee, and outcome of the lab tests.

He said a customer (or anyone) can check the authenticity of the liquor sold at liquor shops by scanning the QR code which will then show the serial number of the bottle, brand and quantity. "We are also carrying out surprise checks at all licensed shops," the official said.

## Trump Faces Gun

un culture in the US has cast a dark shadow on the crucial presidential elections barely two months away. Former President and Republican candidate Donald Trump faced an attempt on his life for the second time 15 September during the runup to the election. In the first attempt earlier, a bullet had just missed him but torn off a part of his ear. This time it seems the assailant fled after a security personnel located him and fired at him.

The incident has been condemned by one and all. More so, when the contest is getting close as the new Democrat candidate Kamala Harris has changed the election campaign game quite a bit.

The second attempt on Trump's life came after a scintillating debate between the two presidential candidates. Rarely does a presidential candidate in the US or anywhere else have to go through the motions of a nationally televised debate with two different rivals of the same party twice during the run-up to the same election. This could be a blessing in disguise or a curse. For Trump, the debate with his new Democratic Party rival Kamala Harris recently has proved to be a disaster even though he had hugely outperformed his rival Joe Biden in the first debate. This has infused new life into the contest which appeared to be one-sided when it was billed to be between Trump and Biden.

The whole country had been eagerly waiting to see how the Vice President would fare after Biden's shocking failure to match the arguments of Trump earlier. Harris took Trump by surprise from the very beginning by forcing him into a handshake he had not anticipated. She then went on skillfully playing on Trump's ego. She drew him into the pitfalls in which he has invariably become entangled referring to the quality of his campaign rallies and his fascination with dictators.

Harris seemed to have the upper hand in the debate. Trump cut a sorry figure by going back to his oft repeated charge that the whole show of the second debate had been rigged. The charge itself was an admission that he had not exactly shone in the face of the performance given by the Democratic presidential candidate. Having said that, it also seemed strange that the issue of attempt on Trump's life did not come up once during the debate and that while Trump was 'fact-checked' more than once by the hosts, Harris's various claims went left unchallenged

Biden's decision to withdraw from the presidential race on 21 July, after a disastrous debate with Trump, has in less than eight weeks changed a somewhat weak Vice President of mediocre popularity into a candidate happily backed by the Democratic camp and capable of rallying big crowds

However, Harris still does not seem to be at the peak of her game. It could be that the haste and the highly unusual conditions of her nomination did not allow Harris to draw up a carefully considered political plan, traditionally polished during primaries that would give her candidacy its full weight. That she was not prepared for such an eventuality seems evident from the fact that she has been shying away from directly meeting the Press, granting only one interview since the President stepped down from the race.

Her responses to the issues voters are most concerned about - the economy and immigration - appear to be inadequate. The Western governments expect a clear-cut policy from her on the question of immigration. Harris has not tackled another challenge with required deftness - that is the linkage of her candidacy to the administration she has been part of for more than three and a half years. The performance of the Biden presidency from which she is inseparable is being harshly judged by American voters.

After a successful start to the campaign, a unifying nomination convention and a successful first debate, Harris has an uphill task in maintaining the momentum behind her. Her successful debate with Trump two months before the battle of ballot is no guarantee of success in November.

Until now, the Democrat candidate has played her cards well enough to inspire new hope in her camp after the withdrawal of Biden, who was heading for an inevitable defeat due to his age and phys-

However, Harris has to convince the undecided voters in a country nearly vertically split into two camps that she is the person best equipped to respond to their concerns. She has not yet been able to show the voters what a Harris presidency might look like. The second attempt on Trump's life and failure of the Biden administration and Democrats, including Harris, to address it directly may spoil the chances for her and steer sympathy toward Donald Trump.



stoves, and beauty products. The dominance of Asians in the global consumer class is a relatively recent development. Until 2000, the global consumer class was predominantly Western, totaling 1.7 billion people. In 1980, over 70 per cent of the consumer class was in wealthy OECD countries. World Data Lab estimates that today, almost 60 per cent of the global consumer class is Asian. Asia currently has 2.4 billion consumers and will add one billion more in the next decade. implying that it will account for 65 per cent of the global consumer class. But the Asian consumer is mostly an entrylevel consumer, spending on average \$20 per day. This means that Asia's total spending power is currently \$19 trillion, roughly 30% of global consumer spending.

The dichotomy of rapid growth in Asia's consumer class and only moderately

strong growth in consumer spending will continue. In our latest World Consumer Outlook, we project that Asia will continue to lead global consumer class growth, contributing 110 million of the 134 million new consumers expected next year. Additionally one-third of every additional dollar spent globally will come from Asia.

World Data Lab projects that India will surpass China in adding people to the consumer class next year, with India contributing 47 million new consumers compared to China's 33 million. Following them are five often overlooked Asian economies: Indonesia (+6 million), Bangladesh (+4 million), Vietnam (+4 million), the Philippines (+3 million), and Pakistan (+2.5 million). In Olympic terms, Asia will dominate the top seven positions among the global consumer class leaders for 2024, followed by the United States, Brazil, and Egypt, respectively.

There are still 2.4 billion people in Asia who have yet to enter the consumer class, along with an additional 330 million newborns by 2034. This represents more than half of the world's future consumers. World Data Lab projects that Asia will add one billion new consumers and \$15 trillion in additional consumer spending by 2034. Most countries in emerging Asia, however, have yet to reach the tipping point. China and Vietnam did in the last decade, and World Data Lab projects that India, Indonesia, and the Philippines will soon (in 2027, 2028, and 2029, respectively). Bangladesh, Pakistan, and

Nepal will become majority consumer markets only in the

While the growth momentum of Asia's consumer class is strong, the current economic environment is volatile. Recent market turbulence in Asia has raised concerns about investor confidence and the stability of financial markets in the region. But these risks are likely only to delay, rather than derail, the expansion of Asia's consumer base. Like the COVID-19 pandemic, which similarly interrupted the growth of Asia's consumer class, these challenges will not stop Asia's long-term rise in consumer power. The underlying factors driving this growth - longer life expectancy, better education, urbanisation – have been put in place over the last decades, and these long-term shifts will influence Asia's trajectory more than any short-term shock could undo.

Trendlines will prevail over headlines. It is safe to say that China will remain the world's largest consumer market for seniors, currently at 122 million and growing to 178 million by 2030. By contrast, India will be the largest market for young Gen Z consumers, growing from 150 million today, about as large as in China, to 215 mil lion in 2030. Global consumer goods companies should bet on Asia. If you bet against demographics, you typically lose.

# Ailing healthcare system

THE ENTIRE **HEALTHCARE SYSTEM. NOT JUST** IN WEST BENGAL, **BUT IN THE COUNTRY NEEDS AN OVERHAUL** 

The ongoing agitation of homes? In such a scenario, rejunior doctors in West Bengal demanding jus-RG Kar in Kolkata has raised is-Questions arise as to why interns and post-graduate students have to perform emergency and outdoor duties. Where have such directives, if at all, been written? Why senior doctors, who are full-time employees of the government, spend on an average no more than 16-18 hours per week at the hospital.

In fact, senior doctors are known to be engaged in private practice too or are attached with private nursing homes, where they charge exorbitant fees, especially for operations. Can the government or the Court direct the so-called junior doctors, who are merely paid stipends, to attend to hospital duty? Moreover, it has been seen that these junior doctors spend not less than eight hours per day to attend to the increasing number of patients.

Unfortunately, the state governments are not genuinely concerned with the problem and feel that the alternative for patients should be to go to nursing homes. But can those from lower-income groups access treatment at nursing

ports indicate government clinics and hospitals across rural tice for the murdered doctor of and urban India grapple with shortages of doctors and spesues which need to be addressed. cialists with over 23,000 sanctioned medical posts vacant despite the doubling of undergraduate and postgraduate seats over the past decade. It is disturbing that given the population density little efforts have been made to increase the number of doctors.

The lack of government funding to the health sector is a challenge which needs to be met to aid government hospitals to cater to the ever-increasing patient load. Moreso, as corruption appears to be thriving in most hospitals of the country, marginalised patients find it difficult to get admission without having to pay a bribe to get a bed or admission. There are reports of medicines worth crores being siphoned off and sold in the open market; sophisticated machines lying unutilised and specialists in a hurry to wrap up hospital duty by mid-day to facilitate their private practice.

The junior doctors' agitation has put the spotlight not just on the safety of doctors but on rampant corruption in the healthcare system in West

Bengal, with allegations of the ruling party being part and parcel of it. Junior doctors view the government's handling of the case a travesty of justice. It has engaged a battery of 21 lawyers in the Supreme Court to ensure the key persons at the top remain unaffected and the cost is borne by the public exchequer. And it comes as a rude shock that while the Chief Justice of India had some time back given a lecture on dissent being healthy to the functioning of democracy, chose to allow the government counsel to insist that these protesters are not taking permission? Do the doctors leading a non-violent agitation need permission to show dissent in what we call a democratic, pluralistic society? The entire healthcare sys-

tem, not just in West Bengal, but in the country needs an overhaul. The political dispensation is busy quarrelling for or against caste census, but fails to prioritise a survey on health care in the country – such as what percentage of poor and EWS get treatment in districts hospitals or health centres, how many have expressed satisfaction, what factors ail the system, etc.

Not huge buildings but it's the

doctors, specialists, non-medical staff, equipment, free medicines, and tests which symbolise good hospitals. Patients need care and treatment and thus governments must plug the loopholes in hospitals. If they want to depend on private hospitals, rational rates need to be fixed with special rates for poor and impoverished sections. Moreover, insurance should be made mandatory for all employees, not just in the organised sector but in unorganised too. In the latter category, the government should bear around 30 to 40 per cent of the expenses to facilitate treatment.

There can be no two opinions that critical and urgent steps need to be taken by governments, both states and Centre to improve health care. Adequate doctors and specialists must be available across the country, for how can the rising quantum of diseases be tackled without healthcare being extended to all? There is need for serious introspection, not just by West Bengal government, but all states and New Delhi. They must remember that "a stitch in time saves nine!

# **Black stone quarries turn** bane for 2 MIPs in Jajpur



Jajpur, Sept 16: Rampant mining of black stones under Dharmasala tehsil of Jajpur district has led to burying of two minor irrigation projects (MIPs) crucial for irrigation in the nearby farmlands apart from destruction of forest cover in

People have alleged that black stones are extracted from the mines in violation of norms, which is indicative of a conspiracy by some influential persons to bury the MIPs.

destruction Ranibandha and Paikarapur MIPs adjoining the Rahadpur black stone quarry under Dharmasala tehsil is a case in this point. The issue assumes significance as a case has been filed in this connection before the

National Green Tribunal (NGT). In the Case-6/2024/EZ filed by Babuli Jena and others, the apex green body has directed the state Chief Secretary, Principal Secretary of state Water Resources department, Jajpur Collector, Jajpur SP, Jajpur deputy director (mines), Dharmasala tehsildar, execu-

assistant executive engineer of MIP division at Barchana.

The NGT has been frequently sending them reminders to file their responses in affidavits but they are yet to do so.

Expressing displeasure over the delay, NGT has given them a last chance to file their reply by September 27. The advocate general has also sent letters to the respondents directing them to file their counter affidavits by September 19 failing which the green body may consider taking some serious steps.

According to the complaint, a black stone quarry spread on six acre land on khata no-S-235 and plot no 1(P) on Rahadpur hill under Dharmasala tehsil had been leased to Satya Multiplex Private Ltd, June 2, 2022.

This apart, 12 more quarries are operational on 104.77 acre land in this area. It is alleged that the quarry owners are extracting black stones exceeding far beyond the permissible limits through uncontrolled blasting of explosives, thereby affecting human habitats.

The uncontrolled blasting of

pearing on the houses in the nearby villages. Furthermore, frequent transportation of black stones has resulted in severe air pollution due to spread of dust.

This has affected farmlands in the area and seriously damaged the Paikarapur and Ranibandha MIPs. With the two MIPs gradually getting buried with the dust from the quarries, farmers are facing difficulties in cultivation sans irrigation.

The assistant executive engi neer of the MIPs had written a letter (dated-August 31, 2018) to the Dharmasala tehsildar urging him to take necessary steps in this regard. It is apprehended that the day is not far off when the two MIPs will be completely buried by the dust. Things have come to such a pass that the dense forest surrounding the quarry is on the verge of extinction, the petitioners alleged.

When contacted, Dharmasala tehsildar Subhankar Mohanty said that the deputy director of Minor Minerals department has filed his affidavit, and added that there is no need for his office to file a separate affidavit.

Jayprakash Nayak, deputy director, Minor Minerals department also confirmed that the affidavit has been filed. According to a report by the Irrigation department, the two MIPs are located at a distance of 500 metres from the black stone quarries. However, rainwater from the black stone quarries flows down and falls in these two quarries during rain, he added

## Youth killed, brother critical in group clash

Sorada, Sept 16: A group clash during Ganesh idol immersion Friday at Amrutulu village under this police limits in Ganjam district took a violent turn as a youth was killed and his younger sibling critically injured in the attack by the rival family members, Sunday.

The deceased was identified as Babu Swain and his injured younger brother as Jitu Swain. Jitu has been admitted to MKCG Medical College and Hospital in Berhampur.

Police have detained two accused siblings Likun Bisoi and



his younger brother Niku Bisoi, and launched an investigation

Sources said the Ganesh idol immersion procession was held at Amrutulu village, Friday. The deceased Babu and Likun brushed each other's bikes while passing by the procession.

Enraged, Babu went to Likun's house Sunday and hurled abuses holding him responsible for the incident. Later, a scuffle broke out between the two when Likun and his younger brother Niku suddenly attacked Babu with sharp-edged weapons.

Meanwhile, Babu's younger brother Jitu tried to intervene and stop them from assaulting his brother. However, they did not spare Jitu either and assaulted the brothers. Family members rescued them from a pool of blood and first admitted them at Sorada community health centre. As their health condition deteriorated, they were later shifted to the MKCG Medical College and Hospital where Babu was pronounced dead.

Sorada police IIC Anil Kumar Parida reached the spot and detained the two accused brothers. An investigation is underway into the matter, police said.

## Bird population increases in Bhitarkanika National Park

Kendrapara, Sept 16: The population of nesting birds has registered a marginal increase in Bhitarkanika National Park located in Kendrapara district in this monsoon season, a senior Forest official said Monday.

The official statistics of the annual residential bird census pegged their population at 1,30,123 belonging to ten species. With this, the population of the monsoon birds has increased by 6,265 compared to the last census as Forest officials had sighted 1,23,867 birds in 2023.

As many as 27,282 nests atop 1,300 mangrove trees were counted this season, compared to 26,118 nests in the 2023 census. The census report reflects the results only from the direct count method. The Asian openbill stork had the highest number of nests among all the residential bird species.

The increase in the number of birds visiting Bhitarkanika is a good sign for bird conservation programmes in the state, said Sudarshan Gopinath Yadav, Divisional Forest Officer (DFO) of the Rajnagar Mangrove Forest and Wildlife Division.

The census teams monitored all the water bodies and mangrove forest areas of Matha Dia, Laxmi Prasad Dia, Durgaprasad



Dia and Bali Dia heronries in and around the Bhitarkanika National Park, the official said.

While Matha Dia is located inside Bhitarkanika National Park, Durgaprasad Dia, Laxmi Prasad Dia, and Bali Dia are outside the park, according to the DFO.

The highest number of nests were spotted in Laxmiprasad Dia at 12,702, followed by 12,502 in Matha Dia, 1,548 in Durgaprasad Dia, and 520 in Bali Dia

A total of 10 out of 11 local bird species flock to Bhitarkanika National Park for nesting and breeding during the monsoon. These species include the openbill stork, little cormorant, intermediate egret, large egret, little egret, purple heron, grey heron, night heron, darter, white ibis, and cat-

The birds selectively use specific mangrove species such as guan, bani, choranda, kerauan, and oruan trees for constructing their

Abundant fish in the river and creeks and distance from human habitation has made it a suitable and congenial breeding place for thousands of birds. Watching these birds make and mend nests, collect green branches for building and repairing nests, lay, incubate, hatch eggs, feed fledglings, guard them from predators cover them with outspread wings to protect them from scorching rays of sun and heavy downpour is a sight to behold," said the Forest officer.

Forest officials noted that Matha Dia, Laxmiprasad Dia, and Durgaprasad Dia have been the preferred nesting and breeding sites for these monsoon birds for several years. However, this year, the birds skipped Bagagahan heronry, which was once a paradise for these residential birds.

The monsoon bird census was conducted under the supervision of the DFO of Rajnagar Mangrove Forest and Wildlife Division, along with ACF of Kanika, Manas Kumar Das.

Three teams, each consisting of four enumerators, were engaged to carry out the census drive.

## Jumbos break house, eat up paddy, cash

Keonjhar, Sept 16: Panic grips people in Telkoi forest range area of Keonjhar division after a rise in elephant attacks as they stray into the human habitations in search of food. The herds are destroying people's houses to eat stored paddy. Locals here are spending sleepless nights to protect their lives and property.

In one such incident, a 5-member elephant herd raided the forest surrounding Mundasahi of Bena village under Telkoi forest beat at about 11pm Sunday night in search of food. They destroyed two houses in the village and allegedly ate up cash worth ₹10,000 which was kept in gunny bags along with stored paddy. This has become a topic of discussion in the locality.

First the herd trampled and destroyed the banana farm of one Rabindra Patra of the said village. Then the herd destroyed the mud wall of the kutcha house and took the sack containing paddy outside and ate it. The elephant herd allegedly ate up the entire paddy stock along with the



cash, which Rabindra had kept in that paddy sack.

"We belong to a poor family. The herd has eaten the entire paddy along with ₹10,000 that my husband kept in the sack for future use. We want compensation for the loss," Rabindra's wife Kansala said.

After that, the elephant herd broke Baburam Munda's house, ate the paddy stock and damaged the kitchen utensils in the process.

Both the families escaped to another place and saved their lives. Local people have demanded compensation and shelter for the victims.

Telkoi forest range officer Shivaji Mohan Rao said, "We have already visited the place and paid compensation to the victims. We are verifying more details about the money allegedly eaten up by jumbos. We are keeping eyes on the movement of the elephant herd and trying to drive them into the forest area.

Wild elephants frequently come out of the forest to the human habitations on rainy days, destroy houses and eat the rice. Former sarpanch Ban Bihari Nayak demanded compensation and protection for the people.

# **Doctors allege tampering of evidence**

New Delhi, Sept 16: Senior doctors of RG Kar Medical College Monday alleged tampering of evidence in the Kolkata doctor rape and murder case.

Addressing a press conference here, they reiterated their demand for a live streaming of the meeting between them and the West Bengal government.

"We condemn all such heinous crimes. This crime is a fallout of the nexus between the West Bengal government and Health department officials," said one of the doctors.

The doctors alleged there was "tampering of evidence".

In a statement, the doctors



concerned authorities, Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) and the Supreme Court to expedite the investigation process and punish the culprits without any delay.

Remove the director medical education (DME), director health services (DHS) and health secretary as their signatures are present in the order for construction work in the immediate auspices of the crime scene, when it should have been completely cordoned off, they demanded in the statement.

The doctors have also demanded the removal of Kolkata Police Commissioner Vineet Goel for his administrative faildisciplinary action against deputy commissioner (north) for his incompetence and offering money to the victim's parents, and deputy commissioner (central) for trying to hide the identity of a suspected person present inside the crime scene.

They demanded proper security and functional basic amenities in all hospitals and government healthcare centres.

Their fifth demand was to end threat culture prevalent in all facets of government healthcare facilities.

In the statement, the doctors have stated that numerous attempts have been made to politically exploit their movement but have been successfully defied

#### Ex-principal gave 'deceptive' answers during polygraph, claims CBI

 $\mathbf{R}^{\mathsf{G}}$  Kar Medical College's former principal Sandip Ghosh was found to be "deceptive" while answering important questions on the rape and murder of a trainee woman postgraduate doctor during his polygraph test and layered voice analysis, officials said. The CBI, probing the case, arrested Ghosh September 2 in connection with financial irregularities at the hospital. The federal probe agency later added charges of evidence tampering against him. During the investigation, Ghosh was subjected to layered voice analysis and polygraph test. According to a report from Central Forensic Science Laboratory (CFSL), New Delhi, his version has been found to be "deceptive on certain important issues" relating to this case, officials in the know of the developments said. Information revealed during the polygraph test may not be used as evidence during the trial but the agency may gather corroborative evidence which could be used in court, they said.

#### SC to hear plea Tuesday

The Supreme Court is likely to hear Tuesday a case it has initiated on its own following the rape and murder of a resident doctor at RG Kar Medical College and Hospital in Kolkata amid the ongoing protests by doctors in West Bengal. The hearing assumes significance as resident doctors continue their strike despite the apex court's directive to them to resume work by 5 pm September 10 to avoid punitive action by the state government which had claimed that their absence from work had led to the death of 23 patients till September 9, the day the case was last heard

from their side.

They said many false narratives and rumours have been spread regarding their movement but could never dampen their spirit. They stand firm, rooted to their cause in finding

justice despite all threats posed at them and their movement, they added. The doctors are presently sitting in front of Swasthyo Bhavan for the last six days to make the state government fulfil their demands, it said.

Replying to a question on reports that the BJP-led NDA government would implement 'one nation, one election' within its current tenure, he said Prime

Minister Narendra Modi does not have the numbers to place those constitutional amendments either in the Lok Sabha or the Rajya Sabha. In his Independence Day ad-

dress last month, the prime minister made a strong pitch for 'one nation, one election', contending that frequent polls were creating hurdles in the country's progress. Addressing reporters here,

Chidambaram said, "'One nation, one election' is not possible under the present Constitution. It requires at least five constitutional amendments."

"Mr Modi does not have the majority to put those constitutional amendments in either in the Lok Sabha or the Rajya Sabha," the former Union min-

He asserted that there were greater constitutional obstacles to 'one nation, one election'. "It is not possible. The INDIA bloc



is totally opposed to 'one nation,

Chidambaram rejected Modi's allegation that the Congress wanted to end reservation. "Why should we abolish reservation? he asked rhetorically.

"We are the ones who are saying that the reservation ceiling of 50 per cent must be removed. We are the ones who are asking for a caste census. We are saying reservation must be according to the population. Do not believe everything the prime minister says," he told the reporters.

At a rally in Kurukshetra September 15, Modi lashed out at the Congress, alleging its "royal family" intended to end reservation for Dalits and asserted that as long as he was there, he would not let even a fraction of reservation given by BR Ambedkar be looted or re-

New Delhi, Sept 16: With Modi 3.0 completing 100 days, the Congress Monday claimed that Narendra Modi in his third term had proven to be a "weak" prime minister who was dependent on crutches and setting new records for U-turns.

Congress spokesperson Supriya Shrinate said the past 100 days had weighed heavily on the nation's farmers, youth, women, infrastructure, Railways, and overall peace These hundred days have

proven that Modi has neither a solution nor a vision for the country's problems, she said at a press conference at the AICC headquarters

Modi's "habit" of turning a blind eve to issues and running away from challenges continues to persist, she claimed.

"Each moment of the government in these 100 days has been marked by instability, indecision and immaturity. There have been multiple attempts to inflate a punctured balloon but the thorn pricked by the public in the Lok Sabha elections has not given Narendra Modi anv chance to rise again," she said.

"Do you remember the tall claims made during the election campaign that Narendra Modi was planning for the first 100 days? Where is that plan now? Because from day one, Modi has proven to be a weak prime minister, dependent on crutches, setting new records for U-turns. Shrinate said and cited alleged U-turns on issues of lateral entry in civil services, broadcast bill, Wagf bill, indexation and NPS.





#### **Tribal clash in** PNG kills 20

Sydney: At least 20 people have been killed in heavy fighting that has erupted between two tribes near a gold mine in Papua New Guinea. while women, girls, the elderly, and young boys rushed to escape the area, reports said Monday. The fight in the Porgera Valley in Enga province, home to one of the country's largest gold deposits. started last week when two factions of illegal miners fought among themselves and one faction killed two men from the other faction, Xinhua news agency reported quoting the local newspaper Post-Courier.

#### French member of EC resigns

# Ukraine denies links to 'delusional' suspect

The Secret Service foils a second assassination attempt on the Republican candidate for President, Donald Trump

Kyiv, Sept 16: Kyiv Monday denied links to a man accused of trying to assassinate former US President Donald Trump, after it emerged that the suspect was a supporter of Ukraine who had said he wanted to recruit foreign volunteers to fight there.

Trump was safe Sunday after the Secret Service foiled what the FBI called the second apparent assassination attempt on the Republican candidate for President in two months, capturing a gunman who had brought a rifle to Trump's golf

Media interviews and social media posts showed that the reported suspect, Ryan Routh, 58,

was a staunch supporter of Ukraine who had traveled there after Russia's 2022 invasion.

Ukrainian officials said they had nothing to do with him, and accused Moscow of seizing on the link for propaganda purposes. The Kremlin, for its part, implied there was a link between the assassination attempt and US support for Kyiv, saying "playing with fire has its consequences"

The apparent attempt on Trump's life came just two months after he was grazed in the right ear when a gunman fired on him at a campaign rally. That shooter was killed in return fire

by security agents.

Both incidents highlight the challenge of keeping presidential candidates safe in a febrile campaign, with just over seven weeks to go before the November 5 election.

#### **US PASTOR DETAINED IN CHINA FOR NEARLY 20 YEARS RELEASED**

Washington, Sept 16: A Christian pastor from California has been freed from China after nearly 20 years behind bars and is back home in the US, the State Department said Monday.

David Lin, 68, was detained after he entered China in 2006, later convicted of contract fraud and sentenced to life in prison, according to the US Commission on International Religious Freedom and advocacy groups.



"We welcome David Lin's release from prison in the People's Republic of China. He has returned to the United States and now gets to see his family for the first time in nearly 20 years,' the State Department said.

Lin frequently travelled to China in the 1990s to spread the gospel, according to China Aid, an US-based advocacy group for persecuted activists in China. The group said Lin sought a license from the Chinese government to carry out Christian ministry. It's unlikely he was granted permission, and he was detained in 2006 when assisting an underground church, China Aid said.

Lin was formally arrested in 2009 on suspicion of contract fraud and, after a court review, was sentenced to life in prison, China Aid said.

In China, all Christian churches must pledge loyalty to the ruling Communist Party and register with the government. Any unregistered church is considered an underground church, and its activities are considered unlawful in China. Beijing has always cracked down on "unlawful preaching," and efforts\_ have only intensified in the past

## China calls for crackdown against Tibet separatists

Beijing, Sept 16: China's top security official visited Tibet last week and instructed the local authorities to step up a crackdown against separatists in the backdrop of the US stepping up its support for the region by passing a new law pressing Beijing to hold talks with the Dalai Lama.

Chen Wenqing, the head of the Central Political and Legal Affairs Commission, the ruling Communist Party's top security body, visited the Tibet Autonomous Region (TAR) and some of the 10 Tibetan autonomous prefectures across Yunnan, Sichuan, Gansu and Qinghai last week and reviewed security. He called for a resolute crackdown against separatists.

He also asked the local officials to maintain stability and guard against independence activities, the Hong Kong-based South China Morning Post reported Monday.

 $His\ visit\ took\ place\ as\ China\ is$ tightening security in Tibet ahead of the 75th anniversary of the founding of the People's Republic to be celebrated October 1.

China's top judges and prosecutors have also made their rounds of Tibet.

Zhang Jun, President of the Supreme People's Court, visited Tibetan courts last week and said it was necessary to hand down tough punishment to keep up the pressure on violent terrorism, ethnic separatism and other serious criminal crimes, the Post reported.

Ying Yong, head of the Supreme People's Procuratorate, also inspected public prosecutors' offices in Tibet earlier this

He stressed the need for pros-



ecutors to "harshly crack down on all kinds of separatist infiltration, sabotage activities and crimes endangering national security in accordance with the law'

In July, the US passed the Resolve Tibet Act, which enhances its support for Tibet and promotes dialogue between China and the Dalai Lama toward a peaceful resolution of the dispute over the status and governance of the remote Himalayan region.

Signing the legislation passed by the US Senate and the Congress in July, President Joe Biden said it showed the bipartisan commitment in America to advancing the human rights of Tibetans and supporting efforts to preserve their distinct linguistic, cultural, and religious heritage.

He also called on Beijing to resume direct dialogue, without preconditions, with the Dalai Lama, or his representatives, to seek a settlement that resolves differences and leads to a negotiated agreement on Tibet.

China opposed the Resolve Tibet Act, terming it as a destabilising Act.

#### Saudi Arabia to allow tougher nuclear oversight Vienna: Saudi Arabia

plans to scrap light-touch oversight of its nuclear facilities by the UN atomic watchdog and switch to regular safeguards by the end of this year, the kingdom said Monday, a step the watchdog has

long been calling for. Saudi Arabia has a nascent nuclear programme that it wants to expand to eventually include activities like proliferationsensitive uranium enrichment. Riyadh has yet to fire up its first nuclear reactor, which allows its programme to still be monitored under the Small Quantities Protocol (SQP), an agreement with the International Atomic Energy Agency that exempts less advanced states from many reporting obligations and inspections. "The kingdom has submitted a request to the agency in July 2024 to rescind the Small Quantities Protocol and implement to the full Comprehensive Safeguards Agreement," Saudi Energy Minister Prince Abdulaziz bin Salman told.

# Taliban suspends polio campaigns in Afghan

#### **Monsoon dents state** retailers' diesel sales



New Delhi, Sept 16: Indian state retailers' diesel sales fell in the first half of September from the previous month, preliminary sales data showed Monday, as monsoon rains hit industrial activity and mobility.

Fuel demand in India, the world's third-biggest oil importer and consumer, typically falls during the four-month monsoon season beginning in June as parts of the country are affected by heavy floods.

State retailers sold 2.4 million metric tons of diesel in the first half of September, down 4% from the same period in August and by 12.3% from a year earlier, the data showed. Diesel in mostly used by trucks and commercial vehicles.

Sales of gasoline, primarily used in passenger vehicles, remained flat at 1.23 million tons. However gasoline sale was down 5.1% from the first of September last year, the data showed.

Apart from restricting mobility, monsoon rains also hit demand from the agriculture sector as farmers use gasoilfired generators for irrigation. Gasoil consumption is directly

linked to industrial activity in Asia's third-largest economy. State retailers Indian Oil Corp,

Hindustan Petroleum Corp Ltd and Bharat Petroleum Corp Ltd own about 90% of the country's retail fuel outlets. The four state fuel retailers

sold 1.32 million tons of liquefied petroleum gas in the first half of September, up 3.3% from the previous month and down 2.9% from last year.

Rate cut to be based

on long-term inflation

New Delhi, Sept 16: Reserve Bank of India (RBI) Governor Shaktikanta Das has said the decision on interest rate moderation will be based on longterm inflation trajectory and not monthly data.

The Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) headed by the RBI Governor is scheduled to meet between October 7 and 9 and take call on interest rate.

The RBI kept the repo rate unchanged at 6.5 per cent for the ninth time in a row amid risks from higher food inflation. In the August meeting, four of six MPC members voted in favour of the status quo.

In an interview to CNBC International, Das said the focus will be on the month-on-month momentum -- whether inflation is building up or moderating and the upcoming inflation trajectory will be carefully monitored with a forward-looking approach, and decisions will be made based on that assessment.

"It is not a question that in the current context, like in July, the inflation came to about 3.6 per cent, that is the revised number, and August has come at 3.7 per cent. So, it is not so much how the inflation is now; we have to look at, for the next six months, for the next one year, what is the outlook on inflation.

"So, therefore, I would like to sort of step back and look more carefully at what is the future trajectory of inflation and growth, and based on that, we will take a decision," he said.

On whether the RBI's Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) will be actively considering a rate cut in early October,

'We will discuss and decide in the MPC but so far as growth and inflation dynamics are concerned, two things I would like to say. One, the growth momentum continues to be good. # Sebi to address staff complaints internally

Capital markets regulator withdraws statement on unprofessional work culture

New Delhi, Sept 16: Seeking to defuse tensions with employees protesting against alleged "unprofessional work culture," Sebi Monday retracted its earlier statement blaming "external elements" for the unrest and committed to address the concerns 'amicably through internal chan-

The withdrawal comes nearly two weeks after a protest September 5, where hundreds of Sebi employees gathered outside the regulator's headquarters demanding the withdrawal of the contentious September 4 press release and the resignation of Sebi chairperson Madhabi Puri Buch.

The initial statement had suggested that the protesting employees were being influenced by external forces to target Sebi's credibility and leadership.

This was not the first instance of a protest at the Sebi, which witnessed a similar protest over a month-ago by some employees. At that time, officials had said that the protests were by a few elements and did not have the backing of the recognised unions or associations.

In its fresh statement Monday, the Sebi emphasised that it handles employee-related matters through proper internal mechanisms and that it had constructive discussions with officers from various grades.

# India gets \$386bn funding for renewables target

Gandhi Nagar, Sept 16: Reliance and Adani. India's two biggest conglomerates, and other firms committed to help the country reach its goal of 500 gigawatts (GW) of clean energy by 2030, while financial companies vowed \$386 billion in funding, the renewable energy minister said Monday.

"We received overwhelming commitments from states and Union Territories as well as from the developers, manufacturers and financial institutes to support our goal of 500 GW by 2030,' Pralhad Joshi said during the annual Renewable Energy Investor's Meet and Expo.

India added slightly more than 18 GW of renewable energy capacity in fiscal 2024, compared



with 15.3 GW a year earlier, taking its total to 153 GW.

The government also received an additional 570 GW of power

generation commitments, while manufacturers committed additional capacities of 340 GW in solar modules and 240 GW in

solar cells, the minister said. Indian conglomerate Reliance Industries committed 100 GW of additional renewable capacity, while Adani Green Energy committed 38.8 GW of capacity.

Analysts expect India's renewable energy capacity addition to likely scale up to 25 GW in 2024-25 from more than 18 GW for the prior period.

Heatwaves and rising economic activity increased India's electricity generation, on average, by about 8% annually following the pandemic.

Due to increasing power demand, India expects coal-fired power output to rise 8.9% over 2024-25, outpacing a growth of 8.2% projected for renewable energy output, which includes solar, wind, small hydro plants and power from biomass.



# Wrestlers announce Wrestling Champions Super League



New Delhi, Sept 16: Olympic medallists Sakshi Malik and Aman Sehrawat, along with former world championship bronzewinner Geeta Phogat, Monday announced that they would soon launch a Wrestling Champions Super League (WCSL) for the country's budding grapplers but the national federation has refused to sanction the initiative.

Sakshi, along with Bairang Punia and Vinesh Phogat, had spearheaded the wrestlers' protest against ousted Wrestling Federation of India President Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh, who was accused of sexual harassment.

She has, however, distanced herself from the latter two after they took the political plunge by joining Congress ahead of next month's Haryana assembly elections

She won the 58kg bronze in 2016 Rio Olympics, and announced the project with Phogat, a 55kg bronze winner in 2012 World Championships through their social media handles. The two, while announcing that they



had Paris Games bronze-winner Aman on board, did not provide any details.

Phogat told PTI that she is hopeful of support from the federation and the government.

'Sakshi and I have been planning this League for long. Soon it will take a final shape. We have not yet spoken to the WFI but it would be great if WFI and government support us. It will be the first league that will be operated only by the players,

Phogat said.

"We are doing it for the players, for their benefit. That is the idea and vision, so no one should have any problem with it. It's a proud moment for us. ### 7 IOC members in race to replace Bach as president

Geneva, Sept 16: Two former Olympic champions are in the race to be the next IOC president. So is a prince of a Middle East kingdom and the son of a former president. The global leaders of cycling, gymnastics and skiing also are in play.

The International Olympic\_ Committee published a list Monday of seven would-be candidates who are set to run for election in March to succeed outgoing president Thomas Bach for the next eight years.

Just one woman, IOC executive board member Kirsty Coventry from Zimbabwe, entered the contest to lead an organization that has had only male presidents in its 130-year history. Eight of those presidents were from Europe and one from the United States

Coventry and Sebastian Coe are two-time gold medalists in swimming and running, respectively. Prince Feisal al Hussein of Jordan is also on the

Juan Antonio Samaranch Jr of Spain is one of the four IOC vice presidents, whose father was president for 21 years until

David Lappartient is the president of cycling's governing body, Morinari Watanabe leads gymnastics, and Johan Eliasch is president of the International Ski and Snowboard Federation. Coe is the president of track's World Athletics.

All seven met a deadline of Sunday to send a letter of intent to Bach, who must leave the post next year after reaching the maximum 12 years in of fice. Bach declined at the Paris Olympics last month to seek to change IOC rules in order to stay in office longer.

A formal candidate list should be confirmed in January, three months before the March 18-21 election meeting in Greece, near the site of Ancient Olympia.

Only IOC members are eligible to stand as candidates, with votes cast by the rest of the 111strong membership of the Olympic body.

The IOC is one of the most exclusive clubs in world sports. Its members are drawn from European and Middle East royalty, leaders of international sports bodies, former and current Olympic athletes, politicians and diplomats plus industrialists, <del>(</del> including some billionaires
