

Cabinet nod to sync polls

New Delhi, Sept 18: The nation may soon experience the kind of democratic exercise adopted way back in 1951-67 period, as the Union Cabinet has approved the recommendations of a panel led by ex-President Ram Nath Kovind for holding simultaneous elections to Lok Sabha, state Assemblies and local bodies in a phased manner, the move dubbed by the Opposition a 'cheap stunt' and 'impractical'. However, this would require several constitutional amendments, most of which will not need ratification by state Assemblies. Certain amendment Bills would have to be passed by Parliament.

Asserting that several political parties are already on board, the government said even those parties that are opposed to it may now feel pressure from within to change their stand due to the widespread support on the issue from the people of the country.

Announcing the Union Cabinet's approval to the proposal, Information and Broadcasting Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said an implementation group would be formed to take forward the recommenda-

tions of the panel headed by former president Ram Nath Kovind and detailed discussions would be held on various for a across the country over the next few months.

Asked by reporters when the recommendations could be implemented, Vaishnaw evaded a direct reply but pointed out that Union Home Minister Amit Shah has said the government would implement it in its current tenure.

After the discussions are completed, implementation would follow in steps and it would be the government's endeavour to build a consensus over the next few months, he said.

Once the consultation process is over, the government will draft a Bill, place it before the Cabinet and subsequently, take it to polls to come into effect, he added.

In its report submitted to the government in March, just before the general election was announced, the panel recommended implementing simultaneous polls in two phases -for Lok Sabha and state Assemblies in the first phase and local bodies like panchayats and municipal bodies within 100 days of the general

election in the second phase. Meanwhile, Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge said 'one nation, one election' is not practical and alleged that the ruling BJP comes up with such things to

Bhubaneswar, Sept 18: Three days after ${\bf OrissaPOST}$ and Dharitri began a campaign for ensuring justice to an Army officer and his female friend who were allegedly subjected to assault and ill-treatment by Bharatpur police, the Odisha Police Wednesday suspended five officials, including the IIC and SI of the police station, on charge of gross misconduct.

The order issued by DGP YB Khurania Wednesday said inspector Dinakrushna Mishra, sub-inspector (SI) Baisalini Panda, ASI Salilamayee Sahoo, ASI Sagarika Nath and constable Balaram Hansda have been suspended with immediate effect in exercise of powers conferred vide Rule 840 of Police Manual Rules 1940.

In the wee hours of Sunday Major Gurvansh Singh, attached to 22 Sikh Regiment in Kolkata, and his female friend Ankita Pradhan were allegedly abused by a group of miscreants when the duo intercepted their vehicle and confronted them for driving dangerously. To their horror,

they were allegedly subjected to physical torture and misbehavior when they approached Bharatpur polce. Singh was allegedly kept in the lockup while Ankita was taken to a secluded room where she was allegedly assaulted, stripped and molested. But the police booked Ankita.

Condemning the police excess, All Odisha Veteran Soldiers' Association members staged a dharna in front of the Police Seva Headquarters, Wednesday, Meanwhile, the Orissa High

Court Wednesday granted bail to Ankita, who has been lodged at Jharpada Special Jail for the last three days. The court also raised concern

over the police personnel's poor behaviour to the woman.



PAGER BLASTS TOLL 12 14 killed as Hezbolallah walkie-talkies explode

Beirut, Sept 18: A day after pagers used by Hezbollah killed at least 12 and wounded nearly 3,000 in Lebanon, walkie-talkies and hand-held radios detonated Wednesday across Lebanon's south and in Beirut's southern suburbs, killing at least 14 people and injuring more than 400, a security source said, further stoking tensions with Israel.

Sources said at least 14 people were killed and at least 450 iniured as a result of the explosions targeting walkie-talkies across Lebanon Wednesday afternoon, Lebanon's health ministry said. The ministry added that first

responders had almost finished transferring people to hospitals.

Several solar power systems exploded in people's homes across Lebanon, according to the National News Agency, injuring at least one girl in the town

of al-Zahrani, south Lebanon. Pictures of exploded solar panels, finger-print readers and



on social media, though it was unclear if they blew up by themselves or were simply near walkie-talkies which blew up. At least one of the blasts took place near a funeral organised by Iran-backed Hezbollah for those killed the previous day when thousands of pagers used by the group exploded across the country and wounded many of the group's fighters.

The group, which was thrown briefly into disarray by the pager attacks, said Wednesday it had attacked Israeli artillery positions with rockets, the first strike at its arch-foe since blasts wounded thousands of its members in Lebanon and raised the prospect of a wider Middle East war. P10

ASI starts Ratna Bhandar inspection

Puri: Experts and scientists of the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) Wednesday carried out a preliminary inspection of Srimandir's Ratna Bhandar, officials said. The team, including 17 technical members, also conducted a laser scanning of the structure, they added. The temple authorities had earlier urged the ASI to initiate scanning and geophysical investigation of the temple vault before undertaking its repair and renovation work. The exercise took place between 2pm and 5pm. The ASI team led by its Additional Director General Janhwij Sharma also comprised experts from Hyderabadbased CSIR-National Geophysical Research Institute (CSIR-NGRI).

Utkal University prof suspended

Bhubaneswar: A senior professor of Utkal University was Wednesday placed under suspension for allegedly sexually harassing a femal student. The action was taken on the basis of a report of the internal complaint committee, a senior university official said. Sources indicate that the professor has been instructed not to leave the varsity premises without the Vice-Chancellor's permission. The action came a day after the Secretariat of Governor Raghubar Das, Chancellor of varsities, sought a report from Utkal University VC on the incident. The student in her complaint had alleged that she was subjected to sexual harassment by the professor of the Analytical and Applied Economics dept in his chamber in August this year.



100 DAYS OF BJP GOVT

In a significant turn of events, the BJP stormed to power in last Assembly polls dethroning the BJD which was in the office for the last 24 years. As the Mohan Charan Majhi-led government completes 100 days today, **OrissaPOST** takes a close look at some of its landmark achievements

All 4 gates of Srimandir reopened

Just a few hours after taking oath, state's BJP government in its first Cabinet meeting chaired by Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi June 12 approved the proposal to reopen all four gates of Srimandir in Puri. Accordingly, the four gates of the shrine were reopened in the presence of the CM, Deputy CMs, Cabinet ministers, MLAs and Puri MP Sambit Patra the next morning. The government, in line with the Cabinet decision, also created a corpus fund of Rs 500 crore for conservation, maintenance and management of the 12th century shrine.

Stating that reopening all the gates of the temple was one of the promises in the BJP's election manifesto, the CM said that devotees were facing problems due to closure of the gates by the previous administration since the Covid-19 pandemic. The devotees could enter through only one gate and there were demands that all gates be opened.

Subhadra Yojana

Prime Minister Narendra Modi launched Odisha's government's flagship women empowerment scheme -Subhadra Yojana, September 17. After the launch, the PM initiated the fund transfer to more than 10 lakh women.

The scheme will cover over one crore beneficiaries. Under it, each eligible woman is entitled to receive a total sum of Rs 50,000 over a span of five years, starting 2024-25 fiscal. The financial aid will be disbursed in annual instalments of Rs 10,000, delivered in two equal parts directly into their Aadhaar-linked bank accounts.

CM-Kisan Yojana

The Chief Minister launched the CM-Kisan Yojana from Sambalpur on the occasion of Nuakhai, the state's major agrarian festival, September 8. Under the scheme, eligible farmers will receive Rs 4,000 in two instalments per annum. The first instalment was disbursed on Nuakhai, and the rest will be credited to the beneficiaries' accounts on Akshaya Tritiya. Around 46 lakh farmers are likely to benefit from the scheme.

On the occasion of Nuakhai, around Rs 925 crore was credited to the accounts of the farmers. Landless farmers will also benefit from the scheme. The landless farmers are entitled to Rs 12,500. Launching the scheme at the GM University campus in Sambalpur, the CM said, "A special drive will be launched across the state, and it will continue for two months.



CM revives grievance cell

The CM revived the public grievance hearing July 1 around 16 years after its discontinuation. Many people, including the differently-abled, turned

grievances. Majhi said, "The first priority of the state government is to listen to the people's grievances and resolve them. For this, from the grassroots to the district and state levels, we are

the public grievances and how the people benefit from it."

He added, "For the last few years during the last regime, there was an iron wall between the people and the administration. Today, we dismantled the iron wall. The Chief Minister's Grievance Cell started again. Sometimes people go to different forums but they fail to get their issues addressed. Many people who fail to get justice now can hope to get justice.' **Paddy MSP up**

In what came as a good news for farmers, the state government June 20 decided to procure paddy from farmers at Rs 3,100 per quintal from this Kharif season. "Rs 800 per quintal to be paid for paddy over and above the minimum support price (MSP) under Samrudha Krushak Yojana. The move aimed at benefitting over 20 lakh farmers," the state government said. The Centre had declared Rs 2,300 as MSP for paddy for this year.

Secretariat access to scribes

On its first day in office, the BJP government opened the doors of Lok Seva Bhawan, the heart of the state's administration, to the media. For nearly four years, the Secretariat had been off limits to journalists, as the previous government had barred their access during the Covid-19 pandemic. Even after the pandemic subsided, the former administration did not revoke the entry ban, despite calls for change from Opposition leaders and journalist associations. The BJP had highlighted this issue during their poll campaign, promising to end this un-

democratic practice if elected.

Ratna Bhandar reopened after 46 yrs

Ratna Bhandar, the revered treasury at the 12th-century Srimandir in Puri, was reopened July 14 after 46 years for an inventory of valuables and the repair of its structure. The reopening of the Ratna Bhandar was a major political issue during the last Assembly elections. The treasury was last opened in 1978, and at that time, it took 70 days to prepare the inventory of the valuables, which have been donated to the temple by devotees over centuries. An attempt was made in 2018 as well to reopen the Ratna Bhandar on the direction of the Orissa High Court but the original keys could not be found, and eventually, the plan was abandoned. The government has decided to prepare a digital catalogue of the valuables in the Ratna Bhandar that will

ussian President Vladimir Putin denies Ukraine's right to sovereignty, having invaded it twice since 2014. Thankfully, his efforts to subjugate the country have been thwarted by the courage

After two and a half years of fiercely defending their homeland, it has become abundantly clear that Ukrainians will never submit to Russian tyranny. But despite their resilience, Putin's brutal war of aggression continues. If Ukraine's allies fail to show the necessary resolve, the conflict could drag on for years, undermining European stability.

Moreover, an increasingly militaristic Russia threatens not only Ukraine but the entire world, with potentially catastrophic consequences. Russia's war has already sent shockwaves around the world, driving up energy and food prices and jeopardizing nuclear safety. By violating fundamental principles of international law, Russia has destabilised the global order.

To promote peace, Ukraine's allies must make Putin understand that he cannot dictate the terms of how the war will end. They can do this by building global support for a peace agreement rooted in the fundamental principles of international law, strengthening Ukraine's po-

sition on the battlefield, providing long-term security guarantees, and outlining a clear path to NATO accession.

While Putin aims to prolong the war, Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyv is actively pursuing a sustainable peace. This summer, he gathered representatives from more than 90 countries in Switzerland to rally support for his ten-point peace formula, which calls for strengthening nuclear safety and addressing the conflict's environmental repercussions, in addition to full Russian

Global pressure will be critical to reaching an agreement, but enduring peace also requires strong security guarantees. Given that Russia has repeatedly shown its disregard for international law and basic human rights by violating treaties and committing widespread war crimes, peace cannot rest on Putin's promises alone. The outcome of the war will depend on Ukraine's ability to defend itself.

The immediate priority is to improve Ukraine's position on the battlefield. As Russian missiles and drones continue to kill civilians across the country, with most attacks launched from Russian territory, Ukraine has every right to deploy long-

range weapons to hit these targets and enter Russia to prevent further assaults. Limiting its ability to do so is essentially asking it to fight with one arm tied behind its back. Ukrainian forces have consistently shown they can use Western-supplied weapons effectively and responsibly. It is time for allies to lift any remaining restrictions on the types of weapons delivered and how they can be used.

But along with immediate support, Ukraine's allies must commit to providing it with military equipment and financial resources for as long as needed. Ukraine has already received long-term security guarantees from more than 30 countries as part of the Kyiv Security Compact, which we co-authored. Now is the time to prove that these guarantees have teeth.

In the coming months, our efforts will focus on ensuring that the guarantees deliver on their promise. This involves monitoring their implementation, assessing evolving threats, and highlighting the ways Ukraine's security needs align with Europe's broader defense strategy.

Preventing Putin from winning the peace will require more than security guarantees. Ukraine's allies should expand their support by taking steps like training Ukrainian forces within the country and deploying civilian contractors or specialised military teams to repair damaged equipment on-site. Neighbouring allies could establish an extended air-defense shield over Western Ukraine to intercept incoming Russian missiles and drones, thereby saving civilian lives and enabling Ukraine to redeploy its air-defense systems to the front lines.

Each of these steps will undoubtedly strengthen Ukraine's position in any future negotiations. But ultimately, the only way to ensure longterm peace and security in Europe is to bring Ukraine into NATO. Leaving Ukraine in the grey zone between Russia and the Alliance would only invite more instability, aggression, and violence. NATO leaders must act decisively and offer Ukraine a path to membership. While this does not mean that Ukraine will join overnight, such a commitment would send a strong message to Putin that his war will not prevent its

Faced with Putin's heavily militarised and increasingly revanchist Russia, Ukraine and its allies must embrace the ancient Roman maxim si vis pacem, para bellum ("If you want peace, prepare for war"). Over the past two and a half years, the Ukrainian people have demonstrated an unwavering determination to defend their freedom. But to achieve lasting peace, the international community must muster the courage and strength to support and maintain it.

TAXING LIFE'S UNCERTAINTIES

he 54th GST Council has reached a broad group of ministers chaired by Deputy Chief Minister of Bihar Samrat Choudhary to examine and review the present tax structure of GST on life and medical insurance. The specific modalities will be decided in the next council meeting in November 2024. The Terms of Reference of the panel also include suggesting tax rate of health/medical insurance and life insurance.

Previously, life insurance premiums were subject to a 15% service tax, which included 14% towards Basic Service Tax, 0.5% towards Swachh Bharat Cess, and 0.5% towards Krishi Kalyan Cess. Before GST implementation, it was propagated that this will be reduced to 12%, but this has instead increased to 18%. The transition from 15% service tax to the fixed 18% GST has directly impacted policyholders by raising their premium payments.

The GST rate for term insurance plans, ULIPs, and health insurance policies is 18%, while for traditional life insurance policies, also known as endowment plans, is 4.5% in first year premiums and 2.25% in subsequent years. Further, insurance becomes costlier when maturity value of life insurance policies is taxed, though subject to certain condition.

To make insurance affordable and raise insurance penetration and density, the All India Employees' Insurance Association of LIC met more than 400 MPs/Union Ministers across the country and urged them to raise their voice to eliminate GST on insurance pre-

avowed that GST levv on life insurance premium is tantaties of life. He also pointed to the high GST rates on insurance "deterring growth in the segment," and is a major impediment to India's vision of 'Insurance for all by 2047. Similarly, the INDIA bloc staged a protest on Parliament premises on 6 August demanding a rollback of GST on health and life insurance premiums. It must be noted that a reconsideration of GST levies on insurance had come up at least three times under the Council's aegis, starting a year and a half since GST's July 2017 launch, but the status quo was preferred each time.

During the 37th meeting of the Council, the issue of GST on insurance resurfaced. A detailed proposal was presented, receiving backing from the Financial Services Department and IRDAI. The proposal put forth substantial recommendations, including lowering the GST rate on health insurance, term life insurance, and motor third-party insurance premiums from 18% to 5%. Moreover, the proposal advocated for exemption of GST on annuity purchases made with accumulated

The proposal to lower GST on insurance premiums has met with resistance from several states, which fear a significant loss of revenue, particularly from medical insurance. Many states fear that cutting the tax could result in a significant drop in revenue, a concern made even more pressing by the fact that they no longer have the cushion of compensation from the Centre, which was previously offered when GST was introduced.

The Centre should not stop GST cess compensation on select products which are supposed to end by March 2026 due to increasing GST collection

from Rs 90,000 crore in 2017 to around Rs 2 lakh crore now. Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman indicated that the surplus from the compensation cess could reach roughly Rs 40,000 crore and expected a substantial surplus of around Rs 70,000 crore, even after settling loans taken out on behalf of states during the pandemic.

Another way of generating resources is to curb GST evasion. The GST evasion detected by the Directorate General of GST Intelligence has increased to Rs 2,01,931 crore in 2023-24 compared to Rs 1,01,354 crore last fiscal. Further when Centre is talking of states' probable loss to elimination of GST on insurance premium, it does not tell when states suffered due to corporate tax cut. Revenue lost was Rs 1.5 lakh crore in 2019-20 and loss is increasing with each passing year, affecting states' share.

Over 40 crore people in the country lack any financial cover for healthcare, according to a Niti Aayog report. Indians are plagued by financial distress and household indebtedness. India's health sector is in a decrepit condition. The country's public health expenditure as a percentage of GDP is one of lowest in the world. It is around 1.35% of GDP as compared to the

world average of 6%. Insurance is not just a say ings product like bank deposit, provident fund, share or debenture, it involves risk transfers, ensures sharing of the losses of a few by many. This would align with national goals for low-carbon mobility as outlined in India's National Urban Transport Policy of 2006, which emphasises prioritising people over vehicles.

By fostering a cycling culture, the state can ensure that its residents enjoy cleaner air, quieter neighbourhoods, and a higher quality of life. As the world grapples with the twin challenges of climate change and air pollution, Odisha's push for cycling could be a model for others to follow.

Nightmarish process

Sir, Income Tax refund is a nightmarish process. There was a time when the amount used to be refunded to taxpayers when excess payment of tax was made without request from taxpayers. Of course, even now some cases of tax refund without request can be found. But instances of refunds not given for many years despite huge correspondence with the department have become common. Excess tax paid used to be refunded within a very reasonable time. Taxpayers never felt the burden of approaching the Income Tax office for refund. This was in practice when the ITR were filed manually. The online submission of ITR has made the refund of the amount more complicated. Rectification requests are not yielding the desired results. Online ITR has been paving for chartered accountants to make easy money. Delhi High Court has given a land-mark judgment wherein it has been held that discrepancy in Form 26AS is not the excuse for denial of tax refund. The Court has observed that there is provision for condoning the delay for filing of ITR under Section 119. The court has also ruled that refund and review is in line with the constitutional imperatives of Article 265. Tax authorities cannot take undue advantage of honest mistakes by taxpayers.

Bhubaneswar, Sept 18: Following the Kolkata government Wednesday formulated a policy to ensure a safe workplace environment for doctors, students and all medical personnel in healthcare facilities and health education institutions.

According to a notification issued by the state Health and Family Welfare department, any incident of violence against medical students should be promptly investigated by the college management and an FIR should be lodged with the police within six hours by the head of the institution.

The superintendent of police (SP) of the district concerned has to take immediate and appropriate action as per law against the miscreants, it said.

The detailed action taken report of such an incident of violence should invariably be sent to the National Medical commission (NMC) within 48 hours of the incident, it said.

The healthcare institutions have been asked to deploy security guards in all OPDs and outside wards 24/7. As far as possible, both male and female security guards must be posted.

Konark: Sand removal progress inspected

Asix-member team of ASI, led by its ADG Janhwij Sharma, inspected the progress made in removing sand from the Jagamohan of Sun Temple at Konark. Wednesday. The structure was filled with sand in 1903 and sealed by the then British administration to protect it from collapsing, according to official records. "Konark Sun Temple is a world heritage site, and we conduct inspections from time to time. It was a regular inspection today," Sharma said. ASI begins Ratna Flood situation in Balasore grim; over 11,000 evacuated

Bhubaneswar, Sept 18: The state government Wednesday expedited rescue and relief operation in Balasore district as the flood situation continued to remain grim, prompting the administration to evacuate over 11,000 people to safety.

Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi, who undertook an aerial survey of the flood-affected areas in the district, directed the authorities concerned to ensure the rescue of people living in villages marooned due to the flood in Subarnarekha River following deep depression-induced heavy rain in northern Odisha and upper catchment areas of the river.

After taking an aerial survey of worst-affected Baliapal, Jaleswar and Bhograi blocks, the chief minister told reporters, "One team of NDRF, three teams of ODRAF and eight teams of fire service personnel have been deployed in the rescue and relief operations in the affected areas."

He also asked the district administration to speed up the rescue and relief efforts, as people are still marooned in sev-

SOA's 32 researchers in Stanford Univ's top 2% list

Bhubaneswar, Sept 18: As many as 32 researchers of Siksha 'O' Anusandhan (SOA) Deemed to be University here have been named in the list of world's top two per cent scientists for 2024 by the prestigious Stanford University of USA. The university had 22 of its sci-

entists in Stanford's 2023 list of which 20 have found place in the latest list.

The SOA list includes 14 researchers drawn from different disciplines of engineering who are working in the Institute of Technical Education and Research (ITER), SOA's faculty of engineering and technology, while 11 have been picked from six of the 19 research centers set up by the university.

Five of the scientists are from



the Centre for Nano Sciences and Nano Technology (CNSNT) while two are from the Bio-fuels and Bioprocessing Research Centre. One researcher each has been chosen from the Center for Industrial Biotechnolgy Research (CIBR) Multi-Disciplinary Research Cell (MDRC), Centre for Internet of Things (CIOT) and Center of Excellence in Theoretical and Mathematical Sciences (CETMS).

Among the researchers named in the list are Pradipta Kumar Dash, Director of Multi-Disciplinary Research Cell, and Ashok Kumar Mahapatra, eminent neurosurgeon, both of whom are former Vice-Chancellors of the university.





According to the Kerala Health Department a 38-year-old man from Malappuram district, who had recently returned from the United Arab Emirates, tested positive for the virus. He had been hospitalised with symptoms consistent with monkeypox, Kerala Health said in a statement.

Under the rubric 'empowerment of women', the Congress promised gas cylinders for ₹500 and monthly ₹2,000 to every woman between 18-60 years. To strengthen social se curity, the party promised a ₹6,000 per month pension for the elderly, disabled, and widows, and reinstating the old pension scheme.

Chief Electoral Officer PK Pole said this is the highest voter turnout in the past seven Lok Sabha and Assembly elections in Jammu and Kashmir. The figures might go up after the final reports are received from the remote pockets and postal ballots, he said.

Voting began at 7 am and proceeded steadily through the day. Men and women, the young and old, some too frail to walk and

others patiently waiting their turn, queued up outside polling booths across Kashmir Valley and Jammu.

Of the 90 seats, 24 voted in the first phase -- 16 in the Kashmir Valley and eight in the Jammu region. Over 2.3 million voters were eligible to cast the ballot to determine the fate of 219 candidates. including 90 Independents. At 9 am, two hours after polling began, the turnout was 11.11 per cent. At 1 pm, it was 26.72 per cent. At 3 pm, 50.65 per cent of the voters had turned up. And by 5 pm, the number had inched up to 58.19 per cent.

PM-AASHA is an umbrella scheme to ensure MSP (minimum support price) to farmers. Under the PSS, the procurement of notified pulses, oilseeds and copra at MSP will be 25 per cent of national production from 2024-25 season onwards. This would enable states to procure more of these crops at MSP from farmers to prevent distress sale.

Plan for improving socio-economic conditions of tribals approved

New Delhi: The Cabinet Wednesday approved the Pradhan Mantri Janjatiya Unnat Gram Abhiyan, with a budget of ₹79,156 crore, to improve the socio-economic conditions of tribal communities across the country. The programme aims to provide all government benefits to five crore tribal families in 63,000 tribal-majority villages. It will cover 549 districts and 2,740 blocks in 30 states and Union territories, according to an official statement. "We are committed to the upliftment of tribal communities across the country and their social and economic development. Taking a major initiative in this direction, we have approved the Pradhan Mantri Janjatiya Unnat Gram Abhiyan. This will benefit more than five crore tribal brothers and sisters," Prime Minister Narendra Modi posted on X. The Pradhan Mantri Janjatiya Unnat Gram Abhiyan aims to address "critical gaps in social infrastructure, health, education, and livelihood" through several schemes to ensure holistic and sustainable development of tribal areas and communities, based on the learnings and successes of PMJANMAN (Pradhan Mantri Janjati Adivasi Nyaya Maha Abhiyan), the statement added. The Abhiyan involves 25 interventions to be implemented by 17 line ministries.

New Delhi, Sept 18: The entire 1,643 km porous India-Myanmar border, known for the smuggling of arms, ammunition and narcotics, will be fenced at a cost of ₹31,000 crore, sources said Wednesday.

Union Home Minister Amit Shah Tuesday said fencing work had been completed in 30 km of the border, which he termed the root cause of the ethnic violence in Manipur.

The Cabinet Committee on Security has, in principle, approved the construction of border fencing and roads along the

1,643-km international border between India and Myanmar at an approximate cost of ₹31,000 crore, sources said.

About 10 km of fencing has already been completed near Moreh and work is underway to fence another 21 km of the border in other areas of Manipur.

The India-Myanmar border passes through Manipur, Mizoram, Nagaland and Arunachal Pradesh.

The Central government has already scrapped the the India-Myanmar Free Movement Regime (FMR), which allows people residing close to the border to venture 16 km into each



Teacher accused of corporal punishment

Khajuripada, Sept 18: Despite schools being declared as punishment-free zones across the state, two 5-year-old kids studying at Chhandurupadar Government Primary School under this block in Kandhamal district Wednesday sustained critical injuries after they were allegedly beaten up by a woman teacher with sticks over trivial mistakes.

The victim children were identified as Shankar Kanhar, son of Ranjan Kanhar, and Kiran Jani, son of Chitrasen Jani; both are aged five and students of Class I in the school. The accused teacher was identified as Kumudini Kanhar.

Sources said the primary school has a total of 16 students on its rolls and two teachers including the accused to teach

The incident occurred when the two kids committed some trivial mistake. Enraged, Kumudini allegedly called the two kids and brutally beat them up with a stick resulting in injuries, Shankar's grandmother Anita Kanhar and grandfather Yudhisthir Kanhar alleged.

When contacted, headmaster Jayant Dehuri said the incident occurred when he had been to the office of the Block Education Officer (BEO) over some work at around 3.30pm. He however, expressed his regret for the incident.

BEO Binod Bihari Digal said that he has ordered for a probe which is underway. Cluster Resources Centre Coordinator (CRCC) Swarnalata Moharana said that after completion of the probe, a report will be submitted to the BEO who will take a call on the issue. Locals have demanded stringent action against the accused teacher.

This incident once again has brought to light the atrocities being perpetrated by teachers and forced the parents and the teachers alike to rethink the problem of corporal punishment in schools.

Forester found hanging in government quarters

Bhawanipatna, Sept 18: A forester was found hanging in his government quarters located here in Kalahandi district Wednesday morning.

The deceased forester identified as Sanjay Nayak, 33, a native of Shundisahi in Rayagada district, was serving at the High-Tech Silviculture Nursery at Jaring in Junagarh block. He also held the additional responsibility of the Range Officer in-charge of the Silviculture Office in Bhawanipatna. It was learnt that he was transferred to Bolangir district three days back

Upon receiving information, Bhawanipatna Town police arrived at the scene, seized the body, and sent it to the local hospital for postmortem. After the procedure, the body was handed over



to the family members.

Meanwhile, the deceased forester's brother Rabi Narayan has lodged a written complaint at the Town police station here leveling charges of mental harassment against Debendra Behera, the Divisional Forest Officer (Research Wing) of Rayagada, and holding him responsible for his brother's death.

The deceased's brother has lodged a police complaint leveling charges of mental harassment against a senior Forest official

According to the complaint, Behera constantly harassed Sanjay and demanded bribes, threatening Navak of suspension or dismissal if his demands were not met. A suicide note which was found near the deceased's body also indicated the same. Rabi Narayan in his complaint alleged that Behera was the culprit behind Sanjay's suicide and urged the police administration to take appropriate action against him.

Meanwhile, Kalahandi SP Abhilash G has reportedly directed the Town PS IIC to investigate the matter and take action against the guilty party.

Forest officials tranquilise, fix radio collar on elephant

Rourkela, Sept 18: Forest department officials Wednesday tranquilised and fixed a GPS-enabled radio collar on an elephant which had been running amok in areas under Bonai Forest Division for the last five vears and claimed the lives of at least 15 people during the period. Besides, the pachyderm had caused enormous damage to properties and crops making the locals' lives miserable.

'The elephant was tranquilised near the Jamdihi section under Koira forest range of Bonai Forest Division and the process of attaching the radio collar began at around 4am Wednesday morning," informed Divisional Forest Officer (DFO) Lalit Patra. Units of Bonai Forest Division, consisting of Koira, Bonai, Tamra, Jarda and Sole ranges, were engaged for the purpose, the top Forest official informed.

The DFO informed that the entire process was carried out in the presence and guidance of Principal Chief Conservator of Forest (PCCF), Wildlife and Chief Wild Life Warden (CWLW) Susanta Nanda.

Besides, the Regional Chief Conservator of Forest (RCCF) of Rourkela Circle, the veterinary units of Satkosia Wildlife Division, Kapilash Wildlife Division, Rourkela Forest Division and RRT team were also present.

"It is our primary duty to avoid human-elephant conflict and ensure safe passage to the elephants using various safety measures," clarified Patra adding that the solitary elephants especially are aggressive and cause damage.

The DFO further informed that the radio collar started providing information once the elephant became mobile around midday. "Regular tracking will help us track the movement of the elephant and take necessary action much before it could cause any damage to human lives and properties in Koira and Barsuan forest ranges. We will keep a constant watch on the animal through the signals," informed Patra.

Diarrhoea outbreak: Medical team takes stock at Jhiripani

Baliguda, Sept 18: Following reports of diarrhoea outbreak in Jhiripani panchayat of Tumudibandha block under Baliguda subdivision in Kandhamal district, a medical team took stock of the situation Wednesday and stated that the situation in the panchayat is under control.

Various media outlets reported the death of two individuals due to diarrhoea outbreak in the area. While several villagers have been affected by the disease, the exact cause of deaths remains unclear.

However, he stated that the deaths were not solely due to diarrhoea and could have been caused by other factors.

Amman: Jordan's King Abdullah swore in a reformist government Wednesday tasked with accelerating IMF-backed reforms and pushing through political and economic modernisation crucial to reversing a decade of sluggish growth, officials said. The Harvard-educated Prime Minister, Jafar Hassan, headed the monarch's office in his last job. Hasan has proven to be an able administrator during a long public career in which he oversaw economic reforms as a deputy premier and during a stint as planning minister, according to officials and politicians

China to sanction **US companies**

Beijing: China Wednesday announced sanctions on American companies selling arms to the self-ruled island of Taiwan, which Beijing claims as its own territory and threatens to annex by force. Chinese state media made the announcement, citing the Foreign Ministry, but gave no details on the companies involved. Taiwan is awaiting deliveries of F-16 fighter jets, Abrams tanks and a range of missiles from the US. China has been upping its threats to attack Taiwan, whose 2.3 million citizens overwhelmingly favour their current status of de-facto independence. Despite their lack of formal diplomatic ties, the US has long been a key provider of armaments and is legally bound to ensure the island can defend itself.

UK launches eVisa

The country urges all, including Indians, to take immediate transition to eVisa

London, Sept 18: The UK Wednesday launched a major drive urging all immigrants across the country, including Indians, who are using a physical immigration document to take immediate action to transition to an eVisa

As part of plans to fully digitise the UK border and immigration system, all those using a physical biometric residence permit (BRP), a passport containing a visa vignette sticker or ink stamp confirming their "indefinite leave to enter remain" in the country, or biometric residence card (BRC) as evidence of their immigration rights will be switched over to an entirely online system by next year.

A majority of the BRPs are set to expire towards the end of this year and are being automatically transitioned online in phases to be accessed by creating and logging into a UK Visas and Immigration (UKVI) online account.

"Everyone with physical immigration documents is urged to take action now to switch to an eVisa, and I want to reassure those who need it that free advice and support is available, said Seema Malhotra, the Indian-origin Minister for Migration and Citizenship at the UK Home

To help with the transition process, during which physical documentation will still be accepted, the Home Office is laying out around GBP 4 million of grant funding from this month to a UK-wide network of voluntary and community sector organisations to provide independent support for "vulnerable customers" unsure about accessing eVisas.

A nationwide advertising campaign will also raise awareness of the move to eVisas and encourage those affected to take action before many immigration documents expire in December 2024.

"It is free and straightforward to switch to an eVisa, which offers greater customer convenience, significant cost savings and enhanced security for the UK's border and immigration system. An eVisa cannot be lost, stolen or tampered with, and allows visa holders to instantly and securely prove their immigration rights. Switching won't change, impact or remove a customer's current rights or immigration status,' the Home Office said

Pak HC bars trial court from issuing verdict against Khan

Islamabad, Sept 18: A Pakistan high court Wednesday restrained a trial court from delivering its verdict in a case of alleged corruption against former Prime Minister Imran Khan and his wife Bushra Bibi.

The move comes after Khan and his wife petitioned the Islamabad High Court to stay the proceedings of the Al-Qadir Trust case and acquit them.

An anti-corruption court has been hearing the Al-Qadir Trust case against the former first couple which is based on the charges that Khan caused a loss of over ₹50 billion to the national exchequer.

During the hearing, a two-member bench headed by Chief Justice Amir Faroog rejected the plea to stay the legal proceedings against Khan and his wife. However, in a relief to them, the High Court restrained the accountability court hearing the case from delivering its final verdict.

PORTUGAL DECLARES STATE OF CALAMIT

LISBON: More than 100 wildfires stretched thousands of firefighters to the limit in northern Portugal on Wednesday, with seven deaths since the worst spate of fires in recent years spread out of control over the weekend. Portuguese Prime Minister Luís Montenegro declared a state of calamity for the hardest-hit areas late on Tuesday, invoking powers to mobilise more firefighters and civil servants. He also called on police investigators to redouble their efforts to find those who started the fires and pledged help for those who have lost their homes or have been evacuated. "We are well aware that these difficult hours are not over yet," Montenegro told the nation in a televised address. "We have to continue to give everything we have and ask for help from our partners and friends so that we can reinforce the protection of our people and property." The hot, dry conditions behind the outbreaks in Portugal coincided this week with flooding in central Europe. The European Union said Wednesday that the juxtaposed extreme weather phenomena are proof of a "climate breakdown".

Worst drought lowers Amazon river levels

The second-consecutive year of critical drought has parched much of Brazil's vegetation and caused wildfires across South American nations

Brazil, Sept 18: The worst drought on record has lowered the water level of the rivers in the Amazon basin to historic lows, in some cases drying up riverbeds that were previously navigable waterways

The Solimoes, one of the main tributaries of the mighty Amazon River whose waters originate in the Peruvian Andes, has fallen to its lowest level on record in Tabatinga, the Brazilian town on the border with Colombia.

Downriver in Tefé, a branch of the Solimoes has dried up completely, as seen by Reuters reporters who flew over the river Tuesday.

The nearby Lake Tefé, where more than 200 freshwater dol-



phins died in last year's drought, has also dried up, depriving the endangered pink mammals of a favorite habitat

Chinese aircraft carrier enters Japan's contiguous waters

Tokyo, Sept 18: A Chinese aircraft carrier entered Japan's contiguous waters for the first time Wednesday, leading Tokyo to convev its "serious concerns" to Beijing over China's increasingly assertive military actions around Japan, officials said.

Windfall tax on crude oil slashed to zero

New Delhi: The government has slashed windfall tax on domestically produced crude oil to 'nil' per tonne with effect from September 18. The tax is levied in the form of Special Additional Excise Duty (SAED) and is notified fortnightly based on average oil prices in two weeks. The last such revision took place effective August 31 when the windfall tax on crude petroleum was set at ₹1,850 per tonne. The SAED on the export of diesel. petrol and jet fuel or ATF, has been retained at 'nil'. The new rates are effective from September 18, an officia notification said Tuesday. India first imposed windfall profit taxes July 1, 2022, joining a host of nations that tax supernormal profits of energy companies.

Refund for Sahara depositors raised

New Delhi: The government has raised the cap on refund amounts for small depositors of the Sahara Group Cooperative Societies to ₹50,000, up from the previous limit of ₹10,000, a senior cooperation ministry official said Wednesday. The government has so far released ₹370 crore to more than 4.29 lakh depositors of Sahara Group of Cooperative Societies through the CRCS-Sahara refund portal. "With an increase in the limit of refund amount to ₹50,000, about ₹1.000 crore payment will be made in the next 10 days," the official said. Last week, the cap on refund amount for small depositors was raised to ₹50.000 each from ₹10.000, the official said. The government is vetting the claims of depositors carefully before releasing the refund.

Reliance Infra cuts debt by 87 per cent

New Delhi: Anil Ambani's Reliance Infrastructure Ltd has slashed its standalone debt by 87 per cent to ₹475 crore after it cleared outstanding dues of Life Insurance Corporation of India, ICICI Bank and other lenders, the firm said Wednesday. In stock exchange filings and press statements, Reliance Infrastructure said its standalone external debt has reduced from ₹3,831 crore to ₹475 crore. "Consequently, the net worth of the company will stand at ₹9,041 crore." "Reliance Infra has cleared its funded outstanding dues to Life Insurance Corporation of India, Edelweiss Asset Reconstruction Company Limited, ICICI Bank, Union Bank, and other lenders," it said. It paid ₹600 crore to Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC) to settle all outstanding.



Diamond sector in jeopardy

THE INDUSTRY FACES SEVERE CRISIS WITH FACTORY CLOSURES, JOB LOSSES, SAYS GTRI

New Delhi, Sept 18: India's diamond sector is facing a severe crisis as both imports and exports have sharply declined in the past three years, which has triggered defaults, factory closures, and widespread job losses, think tank GTRI said Wednesday.

It said that while export returns have surged, a large inventory of unprocessed rough diamonds is piling up due to reduced orders and growing competition from lab-grown di-

"This has triggered defaults, factory closures, and widespread job losses. Tragically, more than 60 people in Gujarat's diamond sector have committed suicide, reflecting the severe financial and emotional strain India's diamond sector is facing," Global Trade Research Initiative (GTRI) Founder Ajay Srivastava said.

He said that immediate action is essential to address these problems and safeguard the future of the sector.

According to the think tank data, a 24.5 per cent drop in rough diamond imports from \$18.5 billion in 2021-22 to \$14 billion in 2023-024 shows weaker global markets and fewer processing

After adjusting for re-exported rough diamonds, net imports declined by 25.3 per cent, from \$17.5 billion to \$13.1 billion, indicating reduced demand for processing in India.

Exports of cut and polished diamonds fell by a higher margin of 34.6 per cent, from \$24.4 billion in FY2022 to \$13.1 billion in

FY2024, it said.

"Additionally, the share of unsold diamonds returned to India increased from 35 per cent to 45.6 per cent during this period,' it said adding the net exports of cut and polished diamonds dropped by 45.3 per cent, from \$15.9 billion to \$8.7 billion, reflecting a weak market and rising unsold inventory.

The gap between net rough diamond imports and net cut and polished diamond exports widened significantly, from \$1.6 billion in FY2022 to \$4.4 billion in FY2024, signalling a large inventory buildup and a lack of sufficient export orders.

It added that some challenges of the sector stem from regulatory issues and internal inefficiencies within the industry.

It said the demand for polished diamonds has dropped sharply in key markets like the US, China, and Europe due to economic uncertainty, inflation, and geopolitical tensions, leading to reduced consumer spending on luxury goods, including diamonds.

"Fluctuations in global diamond prices have caused uncertainty, with buyers hesitant to purchase rough diamonds in anticipation of further price drops," Srivastava said.

He added that the Russia Ukraine conflict has also disrupted the global diamond supply chain, with sanctions on Russia, a major rough diamond producer, further complicating trade and slowing down the global diamond trade.

Shifting consumer preferences toward lab-grown diamonds, which are more affordable, ethical, and sustainable, are also impacting the demand for natural

On internal factors, the think tank said that many polishing units have large unsold inventories of polished diamonds. which discourages them from importing fresh rough diamonds as they cannot afford to take on more stock without selling their existing inventory.

"Rising operational costs, including labour, energy, and materials, along with reduced margins in the global diamond trade, have made it difficult for many polishing units to remain viable, leading to shop closures and layoffs, especially in Surat,"

The industry also heavily depends on financing, but tighter credit conditions and reduced lending from banks have made it difficult for companies to purchase rough diamonds, further stalling production, he said.

"Additionally, a significant

portion of cut and polished diamonds exported from India are being returned due to quality issues, overstocking by buyers, mismatches in specifications, and price fluctuations. Handling these returns is costly and timeconsuming due to complex customs procedures, putting further strain on exporters," he

GTRI also stated that Dubai does not produce diamonds, vet its share in India's import of rough diamonds is increasing steadily.

Dubai imports rough diamonds from Botswana, Angola, South Africa, Russia and re-exports these to India.

Dubai's share increased from 36.3 per cent in FY 2020 to 60.8 per cent in FY 2024 and further to 64.5 per cent in April-June 2024.

It said that a major reason for higher share of Dubai is India's high corporate tax regime applicable on foreign suppliers of rough diamonds, and this forces them to re-export diamonds to Dubai and export from there to

'This has rendered India's Special Notified Zones (SNZs) in Mumbai and Surat largely ineffective," it added.

Further to support the sector. GTRI suggested host of steps including extending export credit terms, exempting foreign rough diamond sellers from corporate tax in India; regulating the labgrown diamond industry; and reconsidering zero tariff import of cut and polished diamonds from Dubai under the India-UAE

India tops China for 1st time ever in key **MSCI** equities index

Bangalore, Sept 18: India has overtaken China for the first time ever in a key MSCI equities index, bolstered by steady economic growth and strong flows.

India's weight in the MSCI investible large-, mid- and smallcap index has risen to 2.35%, greater than China's weight of 2.24%, Morgan Stanley said in a note Tuesday.

"India will continue to gain share due to market outperformance, new issuances and liquidity improvements," analysts led by Jonathan Garner of Morgan Stanley said.

India's nominal gross domestic product growth rate is running in the low teens, more than thrice the economic growth in China, generating a "profound divergence in earnings growth environment", according to the bro-

China's weight on the index had peaked in early 2021.

Earlier this month, Morgan Stanley forecast that India will overtake China in the MSCI Emerging Markets index as India's stock market rally was only past the halfway mark". India's rising weightage in

the MSCI indexes will bring additional inflows, analysts said. India is among the best-per-

forming markets this year globally, with its benchmark indexes NSE Nifty 50 and S&P BSE Sensex up 17% and 15%, respectively. China's Shanghai Composite

index is down about 9% this year amid concerns over the economy and the property sector.

BROADCASTING DEAL FAIL Star seeks \$940 million from Zee Entertainment

Bangalore, Sept 18: Disneyowned Star India has sought \$940 million from Zee Entertainment in damages in a London court for the termination of a cricket broadcasting agree-_ ment, the Indian broadcaster said Wednesday.

In January, Zee quit a \$1.4 billion deal with Star India, under which the latter was to license television broadcasting rights for the International Cricket Council's tournaments to Zee for four years.

Zee said in a statement Wednesday that Disney India has quantified damages to the tune of \$940 million as of August 31, which Zee has rejected.

"The arbitration is at its initial stage and the London Court of International Arbitration Tribunal is yet to determine if the company is liable in any manner," the company said.

Zee said that Star India breached the agreement and had sought a repayment of ₹685.4 million (about \$8 million), according to its December-quarter earnings report.

The company is among the biggest players in India's media and entertainment industry, where the likes of Reliance Industries and the Adani Group are expanding their presence.

Mumbai, Sept 18: Benchmark stock indices Sensex and Nifty hit fresh lifetime intra-day highs before closing lower Wednesday due to profit booking in IT shares ahead of the keenly-awaited US Fed's decision on interest rates.

The 30-share BSE Senses dropped by 131.43 points or 0.16 per cent to settle at 82,948.23 in a volatile trade. The index opened lower but cut short losses in late morning trade, climbing 246.72 points or 0.29 per cent to scale a new all-time intra-day peak of 83,326.38

The barometer re-entered the negative territory in afternoon trade as investors preferred to book profits at record levels. Sensex hit a low of 82,700.63 in pre-close session.

The NSE Nifty declined by 41 points or 0.16 per cent to close at 25,377.55. During the day, it advanced 63.65 points or 0.25 per cent to hit a fresh intra-day lifetime high of 25,482.20.

From the 30 Sensex firms. Tata Consultancy Services and HCL Technologies dropped over 3 per cent each. Infosys, Tech Mahindra, Sun Pharma and Tata Motors were the other major

New York, Sept 18: Tupperware Brands, the company that revolutionised food storage decades ago, has filed for Chapter 11 bankruptcy protection.

Orlando, Florida-based Tupperware plans to continue operating during the bankruptcy proceedings and will seek court approval for a sale, "in order to protect its iconic brand," the company said just before midnight Tuesday.

The company is seeking bankruptcy protection amid growing struggles to revitalise its business. Tupperware sales growth improved some during the early days of the Covid-19 pandemic, but overall sales have been in steady decline since 2018 due to rising competition. And financial troubles have continued to pile up for the company.

Doubts around Tupperware's future have floated around for some time. Last year, the company sought additional financing as it warned investors about its ability to stay in business and its risk of being delisted from the New York Stock Exchange.

The company received an additional non-compliance notice from the NYSE for failing to file its annual results with the Securities and Exchange Commission earlier this year. And Tupperware had continued to warn about its ability to stay afloat in more recent months, with an August securities filing pointing to "significant liquidity challenges In Tuesday's bankruptcy pe-

than \$1.2 billion in total debts

and \$679.5 million in total assets.

Shares for the company have fallen 75% this year and closed Tuesday at about 50 cents apiece.

Tupperware's roots date back to 1946. According to the company's website, shortly after the Great Depression, chemist Earl Tupper found inspiration while creating molds at a plastics factory — setting out on a mission to create an airtight seal for a plastic container, similar to that on a paint can, to help families save money on food waste. The brand experienced ex-

plosive growth in the mid 20th century — particularly with the rise of Tupperware parties, first held in 1948. Tupperware parties notably gave many women a chance to run their own businesses out of their homes, selling the products within social cir-
