Al Jazeera bureau

Dubai: Israeli troops raided the offices of the satellite news network Al Jazeera in the Israeli-occupied West Bank early Sunday, ordering the bureau to shut down amid a widening campaign by Israel targeting the Qatar-funded broadcaster as it covers the Israel-Hamas war in the Gaza Strip. Al Jazeera aired footage of Israeli troops live on its Arabic-language channel ordering the office to be shut for 45 days. It follows an order issued in May that saw Israeli police raid Al Jazeera's broadcast position in East Jerusalem, seizing equipment there, preventing its broadcasts in Israel and blocking its websites. 



No headway in probe; police under pressure

Bhubaneswar, Sept 22: With pressure mounting on Crime Branch (CB) officials to submit the probe report in connection with the custodial torture of Army Officer Gurvansh Singh and his fiancée, the investigators took Singh's statement for the second consecutive day at 120 Battalion in Bhubaneswar, Sunday.

Following the local court's bail order for seven students arrested in the case Saturday, the police are already on the back foot. Notably, the Investigating Officer (IO) Deputy Superintendent of Police Nilimarani Panda, prior to booking the accused, visited the crime scene with Fingerprint Bureau, and collected evidences from the spot, which got presented in the court.

Moreover, the CB is likely move a local court Monday for permissions to conduct polygraph tests on the errant cops facing charges of custodial torture and sexual assault. Meanwhile, the snail's pace of Crime Branch's investigation has courted flak from several quarters. With the retired police fraternity protesting against the suspension of the cops, many

Majhi orders judicial probe

Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi late Sunday night set up a commission of inquiry under Justice Chitta Ranjan Dash into the Bharatpur Police Station incident. The commission has been asked to submit a report within 60 days. A CMO release said, side-by-side, the Orissa High Court has been urged to directly monitor the Crime Branch investigation (against the errant police officials) in order to expedite the probe. The CM, who came back from his Keonjhar tour, convened a high-level meeting at Lok Seva Bhawan where the decisions were taken.

New Delhi, Sept 22: Odisha stands among the most hostile states for Dalits as it ranked fifth and third, respectively in cases of atrocities against the Scheduled Castes (SCs) and Scheduled Tribes (STs) in 2022, according to a new government report.

Chess Olympiad in Budapest, Sunday

About 97.7 per cent of all cases of atrocities against SCs in 2022 were reported from 13 states, with Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan and Madhya Pradesh recording the highest number of such crimes, as per the report.

According to the latest government report under the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, the majority of atrocities against STs were also concentrated in 13 states, which reported 98.91 per cent of all cases in 2022.

Of 51,656 cases registered under the law for SCs in 2022, Uttar Pradesh accounted for 23.78 per cent of the total cases with 12,287, followed by Rajasthan at 8,651 (16.75 per cent) and Madhya Pradesh at 7,732 (14.97 per cent).



(6.93 per cent), and Maharashtra with 2,706 (5.24 per cent).

These six states accounted for nearly 81 per cent of the total cases. Thirteen states, cumulatively accounting for 97.7 per cent (51,656) of the total cases (52.866) relating to offences of atrocities against members of SCs, registered under the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, in conjunction with the Indian Penal Code, during the

year 2022, the report said. Similarly, the majority of cases of atrocities against STs were

concentrated in 13 states. Of the 9,735 cases registered under the law for STs, Madhya Pradesh reported the highest number at 2,979 (30.61 per cent), the report said.

Rajasthan had the second high-

est number of cases at 2,498 (25.66 per cent) while Odisha recorded 773 (7.94 per cent). Other states with a significant number of cases included Maharashtra with 691 (7.10 per cent) and Andhra Pradesh with 499 (5.13

per cent). The data also provided insight into the status of investigations and

chargesheeting under the Act. Among the SC-related cases, 60.38 per cent led to chargesheets being filed while 14.78 per cent were concluded with final reports due to reasons such as false claims or lack of evidence.

By the end of 2022, investigation was pending in 17,166 cases. For ST-related cases, 63.32 per cent resulted in chargesheets being filed while 14.71 per cent

ended with final reports. At the end of the period under review, 2,702 cases involving atrocities against STs were still under investigation.

One of the most concerning trends highlighted in the report is the declining conviction rate for cases under the Act. In 2022, the conviction rate dropped to 32.4 per cent from 39.2 per cent in 2020. Moreover, the report pointed

out the inadequate number of special courts set up to handle cases under the law.

2 maiden gold medals for India the competition, winning eight

Budapest, Sept 22: In a historic triumph, India's men's and women's teams clinched gold medals for the first time in the

45th Chess Olympiad Sunday. Led by the stellar performances of D Gukesh and Arjun Erigaisi, the Indian men's team secured the gold medal after a thrilling final round victory over Slovenia in Budapest.

The decisive match against Slovenia saw Arjun Erigaisi

emerging victorious over Jan Subelj, while Gukesh defeated Vladimir Fedoseev. India needed just one more point to clinch the title, which Gukesh delivered.

This victory capped off an impressive tournament for the Indian team, which had previously won bronze medals in the

2014 and 2022 editions. The Indian squad showcased exceptional form throughout consecutive matches before being held to a draw by the defending champions, Uzbekistan. However, they bounced back strongly, defeating the top-seeded USA in the penultimate round. They defeated Slovenia in their final encounter and Second-placed China dropped points on two boards against the USA.

India's success in the men's event was complemented moments later by a similar achievement from the women's team.

Colombo, Sept 22: Marxist leader Anura Kumara Dissanayake Sunday was declared winner of the Sri Lankan presidential election by the country's **Election Commission** after an unprecedented second round of counting of votes.

Dissanavake, 56. the leader of the Marxist Janatha Vimukthi Peramuna party's broader front National People's Power (NPP), defeated his closest rival Sajith Premadasa of Samagi Jana Balawegaya

Incumbent president Ranil Wickremesinghe was elimi-

nated in the first round after he failed to become within the top two in the vote list. NPP said Dissanayake will

take oath Monday.

Earlier, the Election Commission ordered a second round of counting after no candidate secured over 50 per cent votes needed to

be declared the winner Saturday's election. Dissanayake will be

the country's 9th president. No election in Sri Lanka has ever progressed to the second round of counting, as single candidates have always emerged as clear winners based on first-pref-

2 minor girls from J'khand gangraped in Rourkela; 3 held

Rourkela, Sept 22: Two minor girls hailing from Jharkhand were allegedly gangraped here, police said Sunday adding that three youths have been arrested in this connection, they added.

The three accused have been identified as Rajendra Singh, Sajan Singh and Bholu Munda, all in their early 20s. The three allegedly waylaid the victims near the main bus terminus here Saturday evening and took them to a desolate place, where they raped them,

police said. Police said the two minors were staying with their sister at a slum located in Sector-14 here and had arrived at old Rourkela Township after buying footwear from a local market. As they were standing near the bus stand, the three accused struck up a conversa-

tion with the girls. "They soon took the girls into confidence and said better footwear was available near the daily market and they would take the girls there. The accused took the victims in an auto-rickshaw to a desolate place near the stadium and raped them," informed SDPO

Zone 1, Nirmal Chandra Mohapatra. 🔫 The accused left the place after threatening the victims that if they disclosed the matter, there would be severe consequences, police stated.

The incident came to light after one of the survivors informed the relatives and they lodged a police complaint late Saturday evening.

"Due to phenomenal demand, a third Mumbai date has been added at DY Patil Stadium for 21 January, 2025. Tickets on sale at 2PM IST today," Coldplay said in an X post, alongside the booking link.



are selling Coldplay tickets at inprices. BookMyShow warned fans about unauthorised platforms selling fake tickets for the Coldplay India tour.



BJD calls 6-hr City shutdown Tuesday

Bhubaneswar, Sept 22: The Opposition BJD has called Bhubaneswar shutdown Tuesday, protesting the alleged assault of an Army officer and his female friend in the custody of Bharatpur police station.

Addressing a press conference Sunday, BJD MLA Arun Kumar Sahoo said the hartal will be held for six hours - from 6 am till noon. BJD vice-president Debi Prasad Mishra said, "Our party president, Naveen Patnaik, is shocked over the incident. The custodial torture and sexual assault incident has shamed Odisha. The bandh will be ob-



served to intensify the protest against police brutality. After much discussion, we have decided to call for the six-hour bandh in Bhubaneswar.'

Taking a jibe at the ruling BJP government, Mishra said a relative of Governor Raghubar Das from Jharkhand assaulted an ASO during the initial period of the 100-day journey of the government, while the heinous incident at the Bharatpur police station occurred in the last part of

BJD politicising the incident: Mallick

BHUBANESWAR: Senior BJP leader Dilip Mallick Sunday accused the Opposition BJD of politicising the Bharatpur incident.

He alleged that the BJD during its rule had turned a blind eve to a number of heinous crime incidents like murder and rape, and even used to shield the culprits.

Mallick said that the government has initiated strong steps in the matter related to the alleged police brutality against the Army officer and his fe-



male friend by taking it seri-

Five police officials of the Bharatpur police station had been placed under suspension on an order of the Director General of Police (DGP) following wide-spread furor over the alleged police brutality. The state Crime Branch is presently seized with an investigation against the errant cops against whom a case has been regis-

In a belated action Saturday, the Chandaka police arrested the seven persons involved in the alleged fracases with the woman and the Army officer September 14 night. They were however, bailed out by a magistrate's court just three hours after

memorandum addressed to President Dorupadi Murmu and sought her intervention.



ASI completes Ratna Bhandar technical survey **NO RESTRICTIONS ON** THE ENTRY OF

Puri, Sept 22: The Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) Sunday completed its technical survey of the Ratna Bhandar of Puri's Jagannath temple, officials said.

Though the second round of the technical survey to ascertain whether there is any hidden chamber or tunnel inside the Ratna Bhandar was scheduled for three davs (September 21 to 23), it was completed in two days, Shree Jagannath Temple Administration

(SJTA) chief administrator Arabinda Padhee said.

The SJTA had barred devotees from having a 'darshan' of the sibling deities from 1 pm to 6 pm during the survey of the treasury. However, as the ASI has already completed the survey, there will be no restriction on the entry of the devotees Monday, he said.

The SJTA chief administrator said the findings of the survey can be known from the ASI report.

"We hope that the ASI will submit its survey report very soon for the appraisal of the government," Padhee said, adding, the inventory of all valuables and jewellery stored inside the treasury will be done after completion of the conservation work by the ASI.

The technical team also comprised experts from the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) and National Geophysical Research Institute (NGRI), Hyderabad.

Ratna Bhandar Inventory Committee Chairman Justice Biswanath Rath, who also entered the temple to take part in the survey said, "After getting report from the ASI, we will decide the future course of action."

Speaking to reporters here, NGRI senior scientist Anand Kumar Pandey said, "With the blessings of Lord Jagannath. the survey was completed in two days. We did all the mapping



and generated huge data. Once we go back, we will process the data and prepare the report. Data will be analysed in seven phases before preparing the report.

The first round of the survey was held September 18, when a 17-member technical team of ASI led by its Additional Director General Jahnavij Sharma conducted the preliminary inspection of Ratna Bhandar and its laser scanning in the presence of Padhee and Justice Rath.

On September 18, the SJTA had written to ASI requesting for completion of the technical survey by September 24 in view of special rituals of the deities during Dussehra and 'Kartika' month. The rituals for Durga Puja will commence at the temple September 24.

The temple administration has shifted all valuables and iewellery from the outer and inner chambers of Ratna Bhandar and stored them in a temporary strong room within the temple premises, an official said, adding all the activities are being carried out in accordance with the Standard Operation Procedure (SOP) of the state government.

New Delhi, Sept 22: The Railway

The Ministry, September 20, wrote a letter to the General Managers of 17 Zones asking them to start a special drive against ticketless and unauthorised travellers "for the period October 1 to 15 and October 25 to November 10" and take suitable action as per the provisions of the

Railway Act of 1989 Railway commercial officers. who are part of the ongoing reg-

ular drive in various rail divisions, say that along with common people, policemen will also be on their radar during the festive rush as they are among the top violators.

"In our recent surprise check between Ghaziabad and Kanpur; we found hun-

RUSH dreds of policemen travelling in AC coaches of various Express and Mail trains without any ticket. When we imposed a fine on them, initially they refused to pay and threatened us with dire consequences," a rail-

way official said. He added, "We remained undaunted and made them pay. The response of the passengers was very encouraging as they were happy and surprised to see action being taken against police personnel."



Ticket-checking officials from North Central Railways Zone said that they want to focus on policemen and other unauthorised travellers because they create a nuisance for passen-

gers with valid tickets. When asked about the number of policemen caught travelling without a ticket in the recent past, a railway spokesperson

According to a response under the RTI Act by the Indian Railway to an applicant Chandra Shekhar Gaur, in the Financial Year of 2023-24, the Railway officials caught 361.045 lakh passengers travelling either without tickets or improper tickets and col-

lected ₹2,231.74 cr as fines. Keeping in mind the passengers' comfort during the festive rush, the Ministry has asked zones to nominate senior level officers to monitor these drives at divisional as well as zonal level. "Feedback of these drives may be sent to this office by November 18," the Ministry's letter said.

Watching child porn a crime or not? SC verdict today

New Delhi, Sept 22: The Supreme Court is slated to deliver Monday its judgment on an appeal filed by an NGO against a Madras HC order quashing a criminal case against a man charged with downloading and watching child pornography.

A bench of Chief Justice DY Chandrachud and Justices JB Pardiwala and Manoj Misra is likely to pronounce the verdict.

Terming atrocious, the apex court had earlier agreed to hear the plea challenging the high court ruling that has said mere downloading and watching child pornography is not an offence under the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act and Information Technology

January 11, the Madras High Court quashed the criminal proceedings against a 28-year-old man charged with downloading pornographic content involving



children on his mobile phone

The high court had also said that children these days are grappling with the serious issue of watching pornography and instead of punishing them, the society must be "mature enough" to educate them.

The Supreme Court had taken note of the submissions made in the matter by senior advocate HS Phoolka, who represented two petitioner organisations, that the high court verdict was contrary to the laws in this regard

The senior lawyer appeared in the court on behalf of NGOs Just Rights for Children Alliance, based in Faridabad, and the New Delhi-based Bachpan Bachao Andolan. The organisations work for the welfare of children.

The high court had quashed the criminal case against S Harish under the POCSO Act, 2012 and IT Act, 2000.

In order to constitute an offence under section 67B of the IT Act, an accused must have published, transmitted or created material depicting children in a sexually-explicit act or conduct, it had said.

"A careful reading of this provision does not make watching child pornography, per se, an offence under section 67B of the Information Technology Act, 2000," the high court had added.

Even though the said section of the IT Act has been widely worded, it does not cover a case where a person has merely downloaded child pornography in an electronic gadget and watched the same, without doing anything more, it had said.

Joda, Sept 22: Residents of this mining division in Keonjhar district, one of the major mining zones in the state, have urged the state government to initiate steps to recover penalty to the tune of ₹20,000 crore pending against violating mining companies, and make the mines operational so as to foster devel opment of the area

The huge penalty had been levied during the probe into the mining scam which is yet to be realised and deposited with the state government due to legal and legislative issues

Reports said while the nonrecovery of the dues has resulted in losses for residents of the mining zone, the state government has incurred thousands of crores of rupees loss

According to information obtained under Right to Information Act (RTI), some crore in Case no-40/2018. M/s Mineral Trading Syndicate has been levied a penalty of ₹3,66,14,868 crore in Case no-

Leaseholder Bhanja Minerals has been levied with a penalty of ₹78,38,18,166 crore in Case no-46/2018. M/s Mideast Integrated Steel Ltd has been asked to pay a penalty of ₹677,92,23,53 crore in Case no-48/2018. The SN Das Mohapatra mines has been levied a penalty of ₹5,18,77,922 crore in Case no-50/2018, though the matter is sub-judice at present. Among the defaulters, some leaseholders have partially made payment of their penalty.

The amount is yet to realized from them as the matter is sub-judice in the high court. While several leaseholders have paid their penalty and the cases against them has been closed, several thousand crore of penalty money are yet to be recovered from others.

When contacted, Niranjan Bohidar, president of Joda Vikash Parishad said some mines are now lying closed due to the irregularities committed by the leaseholders. "This has only resulted in losses for the residents of the mining zone. These mines, when operated, will result in more employment for which the state government should take steps in recovering the penalty amount and making the mines operational," he added.

srael and Hezbollah now appear to be going towards an all-out war after months of escalating tension. The deadly pager, walkie talkie **L** and other communication equipment blasts triggered by Israel across Lebanon last week seems to have been the beginning of a new era of modern warfare. The Iran-backed Hezbollah might have fired a barrage of over 100 rockets towards Israel targeting a military base near the city of Hafia but the new methodology of warfare has certainly changed the whole atmosphere globally. Israel's brilliantly audacious bobby trapping of thousands of Hezbollah pagers, followed by the blowing up of that terror group's walkie talkies could be considered a stunning fillip for the Jewish nation.

The Israelis have truly achieved what could be termed as a 'surgi-

The elimination of terrorist leader Ibrahim Aqil by Israel forces, whose funeral took place today, is a sign of great but partial success in this

But the most important lesson to be learnt by the world from this amazing success of Israel, no matter how partial it may seem later, is the act of virtually gouging out the eyes of thousands of Hezbollah combatants simultaneously who were spread over a large geographical area. The pager blasts, reportedly, could be activated when the user put the gadget near his eyes to open it to read the message. Those pagers were open-able, and thereby the confidential messages were readable, by the particular designated user only when the pre scanned eyes (iris) of that combatant were in front of the screen. This is comparable to how iPhones, Samsung and some other phones, that can be programmed to open with facial recognition, operate.

Some countries, like India for example, have achieved hundred percent coverage of their military and para-military forces under biometric based registrations systems. These countries have to be extra careful in this modern day warfare situation. There will arise no need to 'avoid clouds to remain invisible to enemy radars' in future. The enemy might be lurking in the pockets (mobile phones) of every single Indian army, navy, air force, CISF and CRPF jawans and officers. The biometric based Aadhaar card that the Gov't of India has been insistent on using in every little activity, is issued after collecting iris scans of the holder. Along with this, hospitals and dispensaries insisting on Aadhaar numbers to accompany all medical treatment of every single citizen who reaches out to them for help, are also storing various health related data of the card holders. This dangerous move, that few if any Indians understand, is that any hacker can easily break into the humongous database of UIDAI and access all relevant information to make any modern communication or other such equipment to burst on the face of

The whole world saw what modern warfare looks like as only 32 people were killed but thousands were blinded and disabled in two consecutive days of explosions across Lebanon. While Israel has not publicly acknowledged the intelligence operation that led to the simultaneous detonation of pagers and walkie talkies, the incident has drawn attention to the country's covert 8200 Cyber Warfare Unit. Going way beyond the capabilities of the US National Security Agency and Britain's GCHQ, Israel's Unit 8200 is the largest military unit within the Israel Defence Forces (IDF) and traces its origins back to the early code breaking and intelligence efforts established at the founding of Israel in 1948. However, following the IDF's inability to prevent the 7 October attack on Israel, the unit's reputation, along with that of the broader defense and security establishment, was immensely damaged.

The gadgets were apparently rigged by Israel long back but were detonated only recently. This raises questions on the timing of the operation. After international criticism of Israel due to its long drawn battle to dismantle Hamas in Gaza, resulting in the deaths of over 40,000 predominantly Palestinian civilians, Israel's Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu seems to have opted to shift the battleground to Lebanon to pre-empt a larger war on a second front. In order to maintain control over his Far-Right coalition partners, retain his position, and resist US pressure for what he considers an unacceptable resolution, Netanyahu had to show tangible results of the conflict to ease domestic pressure that was mounting on him to soften the war and negotiate for release of the remaining surviving hostages that were taken from Israel on the very first day of the war.

The war in Gaza is now threatening to turn into a regional conflagration. With the 7 November US presidential polls only weeks away, the focus of the White House seems to be to maintain status quo in the Middle East. And the future course of the war can only be determined after President Biden's successor takes the helm in January 2025. Until then, it appears to be a field day for Netanyahu and his brave IDF.



This debt crisis has multiple causes. As the United States and Europe hiked interest rates to tackle inflation after the pandemic, investors poured into safe, relatively higher-yielding bonds in the West and avoided riskier investments in developing countries. And as developing countries were forced to refinance debt at the higher rates, they suffered huge capital outflows. At the precise moment when poorer countries were trying to stage a recovery from the pandemic and make a once-in-a-century switch to clean energy, the cost to borrow on international markets skyrocketed, and the money left

for domestic priorities plunged. Climate change makes all this worse. Many SIDS are on the front lines of rising sea levels, increasingly severe hurricanes, heat waves, water shortages, mass coral bleaching, and other climate risks. Climate-driven disasters not only damage supply chains and infrastructure; they also force SIDS to borrow heavily for reconstruction and adaptation. The result is a vicious cycle that forces already poor countries to accumulate more debt, even as their repayment capacity shrinks.

Nearly all SIDS economies rely on imported fossil fuels, including to generate electricity. Owing to fossil fuels' price

volatility, that electricity often is expensive, further draining public finances and foreign-currency reserves. But because higher borrowing costs have made financing for investments in renewable energy inaccessible, many SIDS are left with no other option.

Consider the following realworld example. When Germany recently tendered for a solarpower project, bids came in from interested companies pricing the project's cost at \$0.04 per kilowatt-hour of electricity produced. But in my country, the Maldives, solar bids typically come in at \$0.15 per kWh - four times the price.

Nor do the difficulties stop there. High debt levels, a recent history of political instability, and the hangover from the pandemic have led ratings agencies to lower the Maldives' credit rating to junk status. Commercial loans now carry eye-wateringly high interest rates. As the cost of capital has skvrocketed, even for public investments, most solar projects have become non-starters.

Our predicament is not unique. Investors tend to perceive almost all SIDS as risky, given their high debt levels, political instability, weak legal

systems, and currency risks. These factors all drive up risk premiums, often putting the costs of clean-energy projects out of reach.

Few outsiders understand how central the energy transition is for island states. For all the reasons outlined above, SIDS leaders are desperate to reduce their fossil-fuel imports and switch to renewables. Yet they are hamstrung by a global financial system that discourages them from taking decisive

Acknowledging this problem, the heads of both the International Monetary Fund and the World Bank recently called for debt relief for devel oping countries to help them quickly install clean energy. The message is welcome, but insufficient. SIDS also need development banks to help by underwriting the risks of clean-energy projects and reducing the cost of capital. Without such support, the vision of a sustainable, carbon-neutral future that most SIDS share will re main unrealisable.

Compounding these economic challenges is an increasingly polarised geopolitical environment, with SIDS increasingly finding themselves in the

crosshairs of great-power rivalries. These tensions sometimes bring opportunities as richer countries compete for influence. Too often, however, SIDS are offered aid or investment only if they accept terms that will weaken the integrity of their political institutions and undercut their long-term interests.

Such geopolitical maneuvering tends to destabilise smaller players by turning them into pawns in a larger game. SIDS must navigate this terrain care fully to ensure that they do not trade long-term sovereignty and long-term stability for shortterm gains.

We need an equitable and sustainable global financial system that does not penalise the most vulnerable. At the Climate Vulnerable Forum, we are demanding basic climate justice. Surely everyone can agree that those who contributed the least to the problem should not be left to shoulder the burden of adaptation and mitigation on their own.

We are also calling for an international system in which smaller countries' rights and interests have the same weight as those of large countries. As the secretary-general of the Climate Vulnerable Forum, I urge global leaders to recognise the unique challenges faced by SIDS. We want to be able to contribute to climate-change mitigation, instead of being shackled by economic conditions that exacerbate our vulnerability. But that will require restructuring debt to sustainable levels, and unlocking affordable capital for clean energy and infrastructure. Given rising debts. rising geopolitical tensions, and rising sea levels, the future of the world's paradise islands hangs in the balance.

The scourge of adulteration

terated 'laddoo prasadam' is snowballing into a major issue and has shaken the country because of the supposedly adulterated ghee or a combination of animal fat-based product supplied to Tirumala Tirupati, a widely revered Hindu temple in Andhra Pradesh. The "ghee" supplied by a Tamil Nadu dairy was sold at ₹320 a kg and was claimed to be FSSAI certified. At least 3 tonnes of it were sent to the Avodhva Ramlala Temple at its 'pran pratistha' ceremony on 22 January.

The fake or adulterated products exceed the production of the basic raw material, milk, in the country. The ghee market in India was valued at ₹3,203 billion in 2023. It is expected to grow to ₹6,931 billion by 2032, with a CAGR of 9%. The fake ghee and milk product earnings may be double the market of pure milk and its products.

The fake milk and ghee market would be worth ₹5 lakh crore. The average market price of any packaged ghee is ₹460 to ₹500 plus, though their quality can't be vouched for. This has not only raised suspicion about ghee qual-

The controversy over adulity but also capability of the 5% per cent to the national econ-rested 50 people at different country to produce such large quantities of paneer, ghee, butter milk, ice cream and various sweetmeat products, including perhaps milk chocolates.

According to a report in leading Hindi daily, to produce a kilo of ghee, 25 litres of milk is required and the unadulterated ghee can't be priced for less than ₹1500 to ₹2000. The story is attributed to pure ghee producers. Officially, India's total milk

production in 2022-2023 was 230.58 million tonnes, a 58% increase from 2014-2015. This makes India the world's top milk producer, contributing 25% of global milk production. The country produced over 6.7 million metric tonnes of butter in 2023, making it the world's top butter-producing country. This accounts for 58% of the world's total butter production.

In 2020, India produced around 170,000 metric tonnes (or 17 lakh quintals) of ghee. India is the world's largest producer and consumer of ghee because it is the world's largest producer of cow and buffalo milk.

The dairy sector contributes

omy and employs more than 8 crore farmers directly. Milk production in the country has grown at CAGR of 6.2% to reach 209.96 million tonnes in 2020-21 from 146.31 million tonnes in 2014-15.

That's impressive. Nearly half of all dairies in India fall in the unorganised sector and adulteration of ghee is rampant. Checks to ensure quality are irregular and often difficult. There are varying estimates of the amount of adulterated milk in India. A 2018 FSSAI study found that only 62.3% of milk sold in India meets quality standards. A Consumer Guidance Society of India (CGSI) report found that 79% of branded or loose milk in the market is adulterated.

In July 2024, 3,000 kg of adulterated ghee was seized in Gujarat. Almost at the same time, a team seized fake ghee at a retail mart in Jaipur, supposedly branded as state's popular brand Saras. About 5 quintals of fake Amul butter and ghee was seized in Noida, in June 2023, as the police busted a gang. Madhya Pradesh police raided three factories in Morena and Bhind districts on 19 July and arplaces from Bhopal to Delhi having a chain of factories supplying two lakh litres of "milk" daily to five states.

Dr Sitaram Dixit, chairman, CGSI, says: "According to research conducted last year, the contamination has increased by 5 per cent." The most recent nationwide survey on milk and milk products in India was conducted by the FSSAI in May 2023. This survey is aimed at assessing the quality and safety of milk products and to curb adulteration. While the full results are still being compiled, earlier surveys highlighted that about 7% of milk samples were adulterated with harmful substances. The FSSAI has, meanwhile, launched nationwide surveillance on milk and its products to curb adulteration.

What has happened at Tirupati is merely the tip of the iceberg. With 79% products being adulterated, the spurious market may be having a huge share of ₹5 lakh crore or more as per conservative estimates. This is a great health hazard and must be checked.

Water diplomacy

Sir, India has recently invoked the principle of "fundamental change of circumstances" under international law to seek modifications to the Indus Waters Treaty (IWT). This decision is driven by Pakistan's sustained cross-border terrorism, which India argues has drastically altered the circumstances under which the treaty was originally signed. The IWT, signed in 1960, governs the sharing of water resources from the Indus River and its tributaries between India and Pakistan. For decades, it has been a key framework in managing water relations between the two countries, despite their ongoing political tensions. The treaty has faced several challenges, particularly surrounding Indian hydropower projects on the Kishanganga and Chenab rivers. Pakistan has frequently raised concerns, claiming that India's development projects could potentially violate the treaty's provisions. These concerns have led to numerous attempts at dispute resolution, but the two nations have yet to reach a final solution, often remaining in deadlock. The unresolved nature of these issues continues to strain relations between India and Pakistan. India's recent notice to Pakistan, issued under Article XII(3) of the treaty, highlights a number of concerns, including population growth, environmental challenges, and terrorism. According to India, the treaty, which was negotiated and signed over 60 years ago, does not adequately address the modern realities of today.

WAYANAD AID Kerala CM slams media for 'destructive journalism' Maha transporters

Thiruvananthapuram, Sept 22: Kerala Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan Saturday slammed a section of the media for allegedly spreading "fake news" about the memorandum prepared by the state government for central aid in the context of the Wayanad landslide disaster, terming it "destructive journalism.

He warned that the government is increasingly compelled to take legal action against such "misleading campaigns.

"What is happening in Kerala is destructive journalism. A section of the media has turned into factories for creating controversies," Vijayan said at a press conference.

The Chief Minister said that

Kerala has been discredited due

to the fake news. He alleged that after the media spread false information, a fake narrative emerged, claiming

that Kerala was attempting to unfairly grab aid. "The Opposition also seized upon these reports. The aim behind these stories was to dis-

credit the state government by any means," Vijayan added. The CM clarified that it is not the ministers who prepare the memorandum in the wake of a disaster, but rather professionals who have proven ex-

pertise in the field.

He said that the media had misinterpreted the data prepared by these experts.

The figures in the memorandum are not exaggerated, but are projected estimates, he added.

'Educated media personnel labelling expected expenses as 'expenditure' and later 'inflating amounts' is not merely a problem of lack of education; it reflects their specific vested interests. The government is compelled to take legal action against such misleading campaigns," the Chief Minister said.

The CM alleged that the media misinterpreted the High Court's judgment regarding the memorandum.

'Interferences Administrative Justice are occurring. Considering this, it's time to contemplate taking legal actions," Vijayan said.

In previous statements, Vijayan had said that the government had submitted a memorandum detailing estimated and additional expenses to the Kerala High Court.

"Currently, there are attempts to use that document to unjustly target the state government, which undermines the state's interests," he had asserted. Vijayan had also called on the media to rectify the "false report."

He criticised the media Saturday, asserting that this is not the first instance of media outlets spreading false information.

"We have numerous examples of the media's criminal obsession with distortion. They consistently launch attacks not only against the government but also against political figures and individuals who are not in their favour," Vijayan alleged.

Launching a scathing attack, he claimed that some media outlets are becoming tools for undermining Kerala.

They attempt to mislead by spreading false information on various issues. This unacceptable behaviour needs to be actively discussed by the public, which is why I'm elaborating on this," he said.

Vijayan noted that attacking individuals, political parties, and criticising the government is typical for certain media

Taking a dig at the media, Vijayan said that the recent false propaganda regarding Wavanad relief funds exemplifies the depth and extent of mainstream media's anti-leftist stance.

"After spreading falsehoods throughout the day, some even had the audacity to claim they were misled. After initially reporting incorrect information, they later corrected it, yet they pretend to be the ones who reported it accurately first. This is the state of the Malavalam media," the Chief Minister alleged.

Vijayan noted a surge of fake news and agenda-driven misinformation amid the competition among news channels.

Highlighting that the state has yet to recover from the calamity and that Kerala is working collectively towards Wayanad's recovery, he appealed to the media—"The struggles for survival of a community should not be trivialised for the sake of channel ratings.'

Mumbai, Sept 22: Commercial vehicle owners across Maharashtra claimed they faced challenges in renewing fitness certificates. particularly concerning Speed Limiting Devices (SLD) on vehicles compliant with BS-IV and BS-VI emission norms.

Transporters said issues began in mid-August following changes to the Vahan system- a national vehicle registration portal. It has become mandatory for commercial vehicles—such as trucks, tempos, taxis, and buses—to provide SLD certificate details during the fitness renewal

Many transporters and RTO officials the PTI spoke to view this requirement as unnecessary. They argue it not only delays the renewal of fitness certificates but also fosters corruption, forcing vehicle owners to seek assistance from dealers and RTO

BS4 and BS6 are Bharat Stage (BS) emission norms set by the Central Pollution Control Board.

Under Rule 118 of the Central Motor Vehicles Rules (CMVR), SLDs or speed governors, must be installed in all commercial vehicles (excluding auto rickshaws and quadricycles) to limit speeds to below 80 km/hr, a regulation enforced since October 1, 2015.

Older vehicles were equipped with external speed governors, while newer models feature an Electronic Control Unit (ECU) for speed regulation.

The Transport department requires detailed SLD information—including unique identification numbers, approval and fitment dates, and test report numbers—to be updated in the Vahan system. Without this information, fitness certificates cannot be issued, leaving many BS-IV and BS-VI vehicles in limbo.

'Without updating the SLD details on the Vahan system, fitness certificates for the vehicles cannot be generated," a senior Motor Vehicle Inspector said, adding that fitness renewals for several BS-IV and BS-VI vehicles now remain pending.

frustrated over the situation. "I took my 2-year-old bus for fitness renewal September 3, but the RTO (Regional Transport Office) has yet to issue the certificate due to SLD details. It's been nearly 20 days since the renewal test. and I'm still waiting," claimed a school bus owner from

Another trucker also expressed discontent with the new process, noting that they previously could renew fitness certificates at any RTO.

Father of Vandana, Mohandas told media persons that his daughter had come here to spend her vacation at the family home near the National Waterway in Thrikkanapuzha. He said that she had a strong desire to treat the poor at both Thrikkanapuzha and Attapadi after completion of her MBBS.

Speaking to media persons Mohandas said that the family

was setting up the clinic to treat poor people for free as a memory to Vandana.

It may be recalled that Vandana Das who was doing her internship training after completing her MBBS course was brutally killed by a person later identified as 42 year old Sandeep May 10, 2023, in Kottarkara taluk hospital. Sandeep, who was a suspect in

a criminal case, was brought by police at around 4.30 am at the hospital where Vandana Das was on duty. Police had brought Sandeep

who had an injury in his leg and was under the influence of alcohol. The assailant, who was an upper primary teacher, had himself dialled the police and said that he was feeling threatened with his life by someone.

On reaching the hospita Sandeep attacked policemen on duty and another person. After Sandeep turned violent, everyone ran out of the clinic except for Vandana who was inside.

The criminal took a pair of scissors from the dressing room and stabbed Vandana multiple times. Onlookers said that Sandeep continued to stab Vandana even after she fell

An autopsy conducted at the Thiruvananthapuram Medical College revealed that she was stabbed 10 times in her back

The drastic incident sparked outrage across the state and doctors accused the hospitals and government of poor working conditions for the interns and



A statement issued by the state Disaster Management Department (DMD) said, "Twelve districts along the Ganga are experiencing a flood-like situation and around 12.67 lakh people living in low-lying areas have been affected by rising water



"A total of 361 panchayats in these districts have been impacted. Around 1,400 boats are being used by the district administrations in rescue and relief operations. The government is running eight relief camps in the 12 districts. A large number of people from low-lying areas have been evacuated and brought to the camps," it added. The 12 affected districts are Buxar, Bhojpur, Saran, Vaishali, Patna, Samastipur, Begusarai, Lakhisarai, Munger, Khagaria, Bhagalpur and Katihar.

Chief Minister Nitish Kumar had Saturday visited a relief camp for flood-hit people in Hajipur, and instructed officials to "take all-out efforts to provide assistance and relief".

Meanwhile, several trains were cancelled and many diverted as floodwaters touched the girder of a bridge in Bhagalpur district Sunday.

In a statement, the East Central Railway said that due to floodwaters touching the girder of bridge 195 between Sultanganj and Ratanpur stations. many trains have been cancelled and routes of several others passing through Jamalpur-Bhagalpur division diverted.

New Delhi, Sept 22: India is investigating the business practices of US streaming giant Netflix's local operations, including allegations of visa violations and racial discrimination, according to a government email sent to a former executive.

The details of India's investigation were included in a July 20 email, reviewed by Reuters, which was written by a Home Ministry official to Netflix's former director of business and legal affairs for India, Nandini Mehta, who left the company in 2020.

This is regarding visa and tax violations concerns regarding the business practices of Netflix in India," wrote Indian official Deepak Yadav from the Foreigners Regional Registration Office (FRRO) of the Home Ministry in New Delhi.

"We have received certain details in this regard w.r.t (with respect to) the stated company's conduct, visa violation, illegal structures, tax evasion and other malpractices including incidents of racial discrimination that company has been engaged in while conducting its business in India," he added.

In an emailed statement, Mehta said she is pursuing a lawsuit in US against Netflix for alleged wrongful termination as well as racial and gender discrimination - charges the com-

The FRRO works closely with home ministry's Intelligence Bureau, the domestic intelligence agency, and is the main agency looking into foreigners' visa compliance and permissions to visit so-called 'sensitive" regions.

Last year, India accused Chinese smartphone player Vivo and its Indian affiliates for breaching visa rules by visiting certain "sensitive" regions without permission. India classifies parts of certain states such as Jammu & Kashmir in north and Sikkim in east as restricted areas.

The FRRO also acts as a liaison in matters related to foreigners with other government offices.

Mehta worked at the company's Los Angeles and Mumbai offices from April 2018 to April 2020, her LinkedIn profile shows.

The Indian government email asked her to provide "details/documents"as she was a former legal executive of the company. In 2021, Mehta sued Netflix in Los Angeles County Superior Court in California for alleged wrongful termination and racial and gender discrimination, among other things, US court filings show.

Netflix has in US court denied "each and every allegation" and said in its statement that Mehta was fired for repeatedly using her corporate credit card for tens of thousands of dollars in personal expenses. Mehta said she will "continue to fight for justice." Her case is set for a status hearing Monday in Los Angeles.

Kolkata, Sept 22: Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee wrote another letter to PM Narendra Modi on the flood situation in West Bengal, maintaining that Damodar Valley Corporation (DVC) released water from its reservoirs without consulting her government, inundating several districts.

Responding to Banerjee's earlier letter to the PM, Union Jal Shakti Minister CR Paatil had said the state's officials were

informed at every stage about the release of water from DVC reservoirs, which was essential to prevent a major disaster.

The CM said, 'While the hon'ble minister claims that the release from DVC dams was carried out by consensus and collaboration with the

Damodar Valley Reservoir Regulation Committee, including consultations with representatives of the government of West Bengal, I may respectfully disagree.3 'Moreover peak release from

the reservoirs lasting for a prolonged period of nine hours were conducted with only 3.5 hours notice which proved insufficient for effective disaster management,' she said in the letter dated September 21, which was made public Sunday.

Banerjee said that on the night of September 16, she had requested the DVC chairman to defer the release, but it was not adhered to. Stating that her government did not consent to the

peak discharge of 2.5 lakh cusecs, she said it had requested the volume of discharge be reduced to 2.3 lakh cusecs at 4.34 pm September 17 and 2 lakh cusecs at 5 pm.

The CM said the peak discharge of 2.5 lakh cusecs could have been avoided.

Banerjee said that as a protest against the "apparent disregard for West Bengal's concerns" and the lack of cooperation regarding flood moderation, her government was withdrawing its representative from the DVRRC immediately.

Despite these projects being approved for a 100 per cent central grant under the River Management Activities in Border Areas (RMBA) on March 14, no funds have been received, she said. In her letter to Modi September 20, she claimed that 5 million people in the state were affected by the floods.

In his response to it, Paatil had explained that the releases were managed by the Damodar_ Valley Reservoir Regulation Committee (DVRRC), which includes representatives from the Central Water Commission, West Bengal, Jharkhand, and the DVC. BJP MP Samik Bhattacharya

accused Banerjee of politicising the flood instead of mitigating sufferings of people.

'Poor most hit on fertility front due to lifestyle issues'

New Delhi, Sept 22: Infertility is not just a medical condition but a crisis fuelled by lifestyle choices, with infertility rates soaring particularly in lower-income groups and tier 2 and 3 cities where access to healthcare is limited, a top IVF specialist said.

Dr Ajay Murdia, the man behind one of India's largest fertility chain, Indira IVF, said while advancements in assisted reproductive technologies like In Vitro Fertilization (IVF) offer hope, it is a reality that the underprivileged are hit hard.

"Infertility rates are soaring, particularly in lower-income and tier 2 and 3 cities, where access to healthcare, nutrition, and education is limited," Dr Murdia, founder and chairman of Indira IVF, told PTI.

"Infertility is no longer just a medical issue; it's a crisis fuelled by lifestyle choices that hit the underprivileged hardest. Without action, even advancements like IVF will remain out of reach for many," he said.

Lifestyle factors such as obesity, poor diet, smoking, and chronic stress, which are often exacerbated in marginalised communities due to lack of resources and awareness, are increasingly recognised as significant contributors to infertility.

These issues go beyond personal health; they represent barriers to conception that have a more pronounced impact on those with fewer means, Dr Murdia stated. The scope of this crisis be-

comes evident when examining

the startling statistics sur-

rounding obesity and its impact

on fertility. World The

Health Organization reports that one in eight people worldwide is classified as obese, a condition that dramatically raises the risk of infertility.

Obese women are three times more likely to struggle with infertility compared to those maintaining a healthy weight, while for men, every additional 9 kg beyond their ideal weight raises their risk of infertility by 10 per cent.

These trends are often exacerbated in less affluent areas. where healthcare support and

lifestyle interventions are scarce, he said.

Smoking/tobacco chewing stands as another lifestyle choice with major implications for reproductive health, Dr Murdia highlighted.

Studies show that female smokers have a 54 percent higher chance of delayed conception over a year compared to nonsmokers, and men who smoke more than 20 cigarettes a day experience a 19 percent decline in sperm concentration, he said. These findings, published by the American Society for Reproductive Medicine and the National Library of Medicine, underscore the severe impact of smoking on fertility and the necessity of public health

strategies to address this issue. The consequences of these lifestyle factors in lower-income communities extend beyond physical health, he said adding infertility can place an enormous emotional and psychological burden on individuals and families, leading to anxiety, depression, and strained rela-

tionships. This burden is often magnified for those in underprivileged areas, where social stigma around infertility is more pronounced and mentalhealth support is limited, he highlighted.





NK sends more trash balloons

Seoul: North Korea sent more balloons likely carrying trash toward South Korea Sunday, the South's military said, just four days after a similar launch. The Joint Chiefs of Staff said that North Korea resumed its balloon campaign and warned the balloons may float toward Seoul and the surrounding Gyeonggi Province. Since late May, the North has launched thousands of balloons carrying trash in retaliation against anti-Pyongyang leaflets sent across the border by North Korean defectors and activists in South Korea, In response to the balloon launches, the South's military has been blasting daily anti-North Korean propaganda broadcasts through loudspeakers on the border since July 21. It has refrained from directly shooting down the balloons, citing safety concerns.

Bomb hits foreign diplomats' convoy

Peshawar: A roadside bomb hit a convoy of foreign diplomats visiting northwest Pakistan Sunday, killing a police officer in their security detail, police said. Swat district police officer Zahidullah Khan said the diplomats were visiting the Swat valley area on the invitation of local chamber of commerce. "The squad that was leading the convoy was hit by a roadside bomb," he said. Another four police officers were wounded, Khan said. All the nearly dozen diplomats were safe and were heading back to Islamabad, police said. "All the ambassadors remained safe in the attack and had been shifted to a safe place before their departure to Islamabad," Deputy Inspector General of police Mohammad Ali Gandapur told Reuters.

Iran: Coal mine blast claims 31

Dubai: A gas explosion in a coal mine in Iran's South Khorasan Province killed at least 31 people and injured 20, Iran's state media said Sunday. The accident was caused by a methane gas explosion in two blocks, B and C, of the mine run by the Madanjoo company, state media said. "76% of the country's coal is provided from this region and around 8 to 10 big companies are working in the region including Madanjoo company," the governor of South Khorasan Province Ali Akbar Rahimi told state TV Sunday. The rescue operation in block B has been completed. Of the 47 workers who were in the block 30 died and 17 were injured, Rahimi said earlier.

Ouad leaders unveils major steps amid shared concerns over China's military posturing in Indo-Pacific

Wilmington, Sept 22: Top leaders of Quad unveiled major steps to expand maritime security cooperation in the Indo-Pacific and called for lasting peace in Ukraine with Prime Minister Narendra Modi asserting that the grouping is for a rules-based global order that respects the sovereignty and territorial integrity of nations.

In the annual Quad summit hosted by outgoing US President Joe Biden at his home state of Delaware, the leaders, without directly naming China, expressed serious concern over the situation in the South China Sea and nearby waters and condemned the "dangerous" use of coast guard and maritime militia vessels in that region.

Besides Modi and Biden, the fourth in-person summit Saturday was attended by Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida and his Australian counterpart Anthony Albanese.

Amid shared concerns over China's growing assertiveness in the Indo-Pacific, the Quad leaders strongly opposed any "destabilising or unilateral" actions that seek to change the status quo by force or coercion

"We seek a region where no country dominates and no country is dominated, one where all countries are free from coercion, and can exercise their

agency to determine their futures," the leaders said in a joint statement.

In a joint statement, the leaders rolled out a number of new and ambitious initiatives in areas ranging from maritime security, infrastructure to critical and emerging technologies and humanitarian assistance and disaster relief.

A key outcome of the summit was a decision on having joint coast guard operations under which a first-ever "Quadat-Sea" ship observer mission will be launched in 2025 to advance maritime safety and to continue with further missions in future across the Indo-Pacific.

The leaders also announced a new regional Maritime Initiative for Training in the Indo-Pacific (MAITRI), to enable partners to maximize tools provided through Indo-Pacific Maritime Domain Awareness (IPMDA) and other Quad initiatives.

The initiative is aimed at monitoring and securing waters, enforcing laws, and deter unlawful behaviour.

The IPMDA was announced in May 2022 that allowed the partner countries to fully monitor the waters on their shores and help ensure peace and stability in the region

Under the initiative, data is being supplied for countering illicit maritime activities and responding to climate-related and humanitarian events.

On the situation in Ukraine. the leaders expressed "deepest concern" over the raging war in that country including its "terrible and tragic" humanitarian consequences.

Anura Dissanayake: JVP gets its biggest high with his rise

DISSANAYAKE IS SRI LANKA'S FIRST-EVER MARXIST PARTY LEADER TO BECOME HEAD OF STATE

Colombo, Sept 22: Marxist leader Anura Kumara Dissanayake rose from a humble background to the pinnacle of leadership in Sri Lanka, presenting himself as a transformative leader to young voters and those tired of the "corrupt politics" of the traditional politi-

Dissanayake, 56, popularly known as AKD, was Sunday declared the winner of Saturday's

presidential election.

The election Saturday was the first to be held since mass protests unseated Gotabaya Rajapaksa in 2022 after the country suffered an economic crisis.

His accession to the post is a remarkable turnaround for his half-century-old party Janatha Vimukthi Peramuna (JVP), which had long remained on the margins. He is Sri Lanka's firstever Marxist party leader to become head of state.

The leader of the JVP's broader front, the National People's Power (NPP), Dissanayake's anti-corruption message and his promise of a change in political culture resonated strongly with young voters who have been demanding system

change since the economic crisis.

The NPP's popularity has risen sharply since 2022 after securing only around three per cent of the vote in the last presidential elec-

Dissanayake, who hails from rural Thambuttegama in the North Central province, is a science graduate from the Colombo suburban Kelaniya University.


He joined the JVP, the mother party of the NPP, in 1987 at the height of their anti-Indian rebellion.



India, EU FTA talks

New Delhi: Senior officials of India and the 27-nation European Union (EU) will commence the next round of talks for a proposed free trade agreement from Monday here, an official said. The agreement is aimed at further boosting bilateral trade and investments between the two regions. The two sides are negotiating a free trade agreement, an investment protection agreement and an agreement on geographical indications (GIs). "The fiveday talks will start from September 23. It will be the ninth round of negotiations. Also, the concerns of Indian stakeholders regarding the EU's sustainability measures. such as CBAM, deforestation and others, will be discussed with the EU," the official said.

Coal import up 41%

New Delhi: India's coal import rose by 40.56 per cent to 25.23 million tonne (MT) in July, according to data compiled by B2B e-commerce platform mjunction services. The country's coal import was 17.95 MT in the corresponding month of previous fiscal. Coal import also rose to 100.48 MT in the April-July period of the ongoing fiscal from 89.11 MT a year ago, it said. mjunction MD & CEO Vinaya Varma said the import demand is likely to be buoyant in coming weeks, ahead of the festive season next month. "Imports of noncoking coal showed an uptrend amid softening of prices in the seaborne market. There, however, was a drop in coking coal volumes due to tepid demand from the steel mills," mjunction services said.

PRIVATE CONSUMPTION RISES

ASPIRATIONAL INDIA FUELS AUTO LOAN SURGE

New Delhi, Sept 22: As private consumption rises across the country, there has been a surge in auto loans for car ownership as people from tier 2, 3 cities and beyond opt for longertenure financing options to afford latest vehicles.

"The consumers in the country are engaging in informed auto finance decisions by conducting broader searches, using general terms like car loan interest rates or auto loan eligibility" About 80 per cent of car pur-

chases in the country are financed through bank loans or non-banking financial companies (NBFCs).

As per Jato Dynamics data, the aspirational India is now driving the auto loan industry.

A continued momentum in discretionary spending of consumers, coupled with favourable price effect, helped private final consumption expenditure (PFCE) pick up by 12.4 per cent in India in the April-June quarter this fiscal, as against 8.1 per cent in Q1 FY24, according to the Bank of Baroda (BoB) report.

From two-wheeler sales to fast-moving consumer goods (FMCGs), the overall consumption is surging. The total production of passenger vehicles, three-wheelers, two-wheelers and quadricycle reached 24,37,138 units in July.

Passenger vehicles sales were 3,41,510, three-wheeler sales were 59,073 units and two-wheeler sales reached 14,41,694 units.

Two-wheeler segment posted a decent growth of 12.5 per cent in July compared to the same month last year, asper SIAM data.

GST RATE RATIONALISATION

GoM to discuss slab, rate tweaks

New Delhi, Sept 22: The ministerial panel on GST rate rationalisation will meet September 25 and is expected to discuss tweaking of tax slabs and rates.

"The meeting of the GoM on rate rationalisation is scheduled for September 25 in Goa," an official told PTI.

The six-member Group of Minister (GoM) under Bihar Deputy Chief Minister Samrat Chaudhary, last met August 22 and had submitted a status report to the GST Council September 9.

During the August meeting, the panel had tasked the fitment committee comprising tax officers from the Centre and states to analyse the implication of tax rate change on some items and gather more data.

Currently, goods and services tax (GST) is a four-tier tax structure with slabs at 5, 12, 18, and 28 per cent.

Under GST, essential items are either exempted or taxed at the lowest slab, while luxury and demerit items attract the highest slab. Luxury and sin goods attract cess on top of the highest 28 per cent slab.

There have been talks of merging the 12 and 18 per cent tax slabs, but nothing has been proposed so far. Around 12 per cent, the average GST rate has fallen below the revenue neutral rate of 15.3 per cent. This has prompted the need to start discussions on GST rate rationalisation.

States such as West Bengal and Karnataka were not in favour of tinkering with GST slabs for now.

The six-member GoM also includes Uttar Pradesh Finance Minister Suresh Kumar Khanna, Rajasthan Health Services Minister Gaiendra Singh, and Kerala Finance Minister KN Balagopal.

Shetty, who is the youngest chief executive of a Big Four accounting and consultancy firm in India, said inflation is reasonably under control, there has been a pick-up in rural demand and vehicle sales are im-

"We believe that we would be in the 7-7.1 per cent range in terms of the growth (this fiscal vear). You have got the headwinds, the tailwinds... But the fact is, still India is in a better position, in spite of whatever is happening globally but we can't say we're decoupled from the world,' he said, adding that the geopolitical crisis in the Middle East and Ukraine and the slowdown in the western world will impact GDP growth.

According to Deloitte projections, growth is likely to be 6.7 per cent in the next fiscal year

In an interview with PTI, Shetty said he expects the Modi 3.0 government to continue with

the economic reforms, including privatisation, at the same pace and there is a tremendous push to get things done within the government departments. India - the world's fifth largest

economy -- is set to expand to \$5 trillion and become the third largest within this decade. Oil price decline is in some sense good for India because the

country is a net importer of a lot of things, and the US Fed rate cut will be positive for India Observing that India will be the services capital of the world,

Shetty said the country has to focus on using technology in agriculture to increase productivity and also look for niche areas where India can dominate globally. To a question on whether India can achieve the developed na-

tion tag by 2047, Shetty said the per capita income has to increase from \$2,500 currently to \$20,000. If the per capita income rises above a certain level, then the economy also grows at a faster pace from there.

"My own belief is that when the per capita income moves to \$5,000, you will see much more buying happening. So the shape of the economy, the domestic economy itself, will also change. It becomes more self-reliant as well...," Shetty said.

"Vodafone Idea has concluded a mega, about \$3.6 billion (around ₹300 billion), deal with Nokia, Ericsson and Samsung for supply of network equipment over a period of three years. The capex programme is directed towards expanding the 4G population coverage from 1.03 billion to 1.2 billion, launching 5G in kev markets and capacity expansion in line with data growth," the company said in a statement.

The supplies against these new long-term awards will start in the coming quarter.

The top priority for the company is to expand the 4G coverage to 1.2 billion Indians, the statement said.

VIL CEO Akshaya Moondra said that the company has started the investment cycle and it is on the journey of VIL 2.0.

"Nokia and Ericsson have been our partners since our inception and this marks another milestone in that continuing partnership. We are pleased to start our new partnership with Samsung," Moondra said.

VIL had recently raised ₹24,000 crore through sale of equity and will fund the capital expenditure from the latest capital.



VIL was the biggest telecom operator formed with the merger of Vodafone India and Idea Cellular in August 2018 with a mobile subscriber base of 40.8cr. With continuous decline in the subscriber, VIL is now left with 21.5cr mobile services subscribers



New Delhi, Sept 22: Around 75 per cent UPI users will stop using it if any transaction charge is levied on the service, a survey by Localcircles said Sunday.

The survey found that 38 per cent of users make over 50 per cent of their payment transactions via UPI instead of debit. credit or any other form of digital transaction.

"Only 22 per cent UPI users surveyed are willing to bear a transaction fee on payments, 75 per cent of respondents stated that they will stop using UPI if a transaction fee is introduced," the survey said.

The survey comprising three broad areas claims to have received 42,000 responses from 308 districts but the number of



replies on each question varied. The questions regarding trans-

action fee on UPI received 15,598

The National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI) posted a record 57 per cent rise in the volume of transactions

and 44 per cent rise in value in the 2023-24 fiscal year, compared to the previous fiscal year.

For the first time UPI transactions crossed 100 billion and closed at 131 billion in a financial year, compared to 84 billion in 2022-23. In value terms, it

touched ₹199.89 trillion, compared to ₹139.1 trillion, the report

The survey found 37 per cent of respondents shared UPI transaction accounts for more than 50 per cent of their total payment in value terms.

"With UPI rapidly becoming an integral part of nearly 4 in 10 consumers, there is strong resistance to any kind of direct or indirect transaction charges being imposed. LocalCircles will escalate the findings of this survey with the Ministry of Finance and Reserve Bank of India (RBI) so that the pulse of the UPI user is taken into account before any MDR charges are permitted,' the survey report said.

The survey was conducted online between July 15 to September 20.

Chennai, Sept 22: Veteran offspinner Ravichandran Ashwin's (6/88) mastery over his craft, underlined by a six-wicket haul, proved too immense for Bangladesh as India cantered to a massive 280-run victory in the first Test with five sessions to spare, here Sunday. Maintaining a clean slate against the Asian neighbours, India now lead the two-match series 1-0.

The victory has historical significance too. This is the first time India have achieved more victories than the tally of losses they have suffered in the longest format since they started playing Tests since 1932. The victory against Bangladesh was India's 179th in Tests more than the 178 losses that they have suffered so far.

Starting from their overnight 158 for four, Bangladesh were bundled out for 234 in their second innings as Ashwin scythed through their line-up. Ravindra Jadeja (3/58) supported him with a threewicket haul taking his own personal tally to 299.

Skipper Najmul Hossain Shanto 82 (127b, 8x4, 3x6) waged a lone battle for the visitors with a good knock but there was hardly any mean $ingful\, support\, for\,$ him from his colleagues.

The day, however, began on

bright note for the Bangladeshis with Shanto and Shakib Al-Hasan (25) extending their fifthwicket stand to 48 runs, resisting the Indian bowlers in the first hour. However, once Shakib departed with the score on 194, Bangladesh lost the remaining five wickets for just 50 runs.

There was nothing much on the surface for the spinners but Ashwin, who possesses a scientist's acumen, does not need such generosity from the deck or conditions. The Chennai man put into use his ability to find acute angles from around the wicket to left-handers to optimum effect against Shakib. Ashwin pushed the ball a bit deep and it hit the handle of Shakib's bat as he attempted a forward defence, and the resultant edge went into the eager hands of Yashasvi Jaiswal at backward short leg.

Soon, the star off-spinner completed his 37th five-wicket haul, equalling Australian legend Shane Warne, nipping the stay of Mehidy Hasan Miraz (8), who lobbed a catch to Jadeja at long-on. In the process, Ashwin also went past New Zealand legend Richard Hadlee's five-wicket haul tally -36. Captain Rohit Sharma was

no doubt elated at the clinical way India performed.

"We want to build our team around strong bowling options, we have to be ready to face whatever the conditions offer," Rohit said at the post-match presentation. "No matter what the conditions are, whether we play in India, whether we play outside, we want to build the team around strong bowlers," he added.

Brief scores India 376 and 287 for 4 decl beat Bangladesh 149 and 234 (Najmul Hossain Shanto 82, Ravichandran Ashwin 6/88, Ravindra Jadeja 3/58) by 280 runs.
