Nod to ₹4,954cr projects

THE PROJECTS ARE EXPECTED TO CREATE OVER 24K JOBS

Bhubaneswar, Sept 24: The 131st State Level Single Window Clearance Authority (SLSWCA) meeting, chaired by Chief Secretary Manoj Ahuja, approved 31 projects worth ₹4,954.26 crore, Tuesday.

Addressing media after the meeting, Ahuja said the projects are expected to create around 24,162 jobs, contributing to the region's overall economic development.

Polimiroir India Private Limited's proposal for manufacturing industrial steel rollers of capacity 3,000 units per annum in Khurda got the SLSWCA nod. With an investment of ₹128 crore, the unit will generate 200 jobs.

The SLSWCA approved the proposal of Danieli India Limited for establishing facility in Khurda to manufacture mechanical and electrical capital goods. With an investment of ₹190 crore, the plant is expected to create 380 jobs.

Similarly, Parth Electricals and Engineering Private Limited's proposal for an electrical equipment manufacturing unit in Khurda with an investment of ₹51 crore also got a go ahead. The unit is expected to provide 145 jobs.

The SLSWCA granted approval to Bisleri International Private Limited's proposal to set up a beverage manufacturing unit in Khurda with an investment of ₹95 crore, creating 426 jobs.

Jay Bharat Spices Private Limited's proposal for a corn starch manufacturing unit in Cuttack also received nod. With an investment of ₹50 crore, the unit will generate 200 jobs.

"GAK Rice Private Limited is investing ₹70.15 crore in a modern integrated rice mill in Jagatsinghpur with a capacity of 1,44,000 TPA, providing 95 jobs," Ahuja said.

This apart, Shalimar Glass Works Private Limited will develop a packaging container glass manufacturing unit in Khurda with an annual capacity of 1,09,500 MT. The company will invest ₹475.54 crore for the project which is expected to create 450 jobs.

Among others, FM Denim and Twills Private Limited's proposal to establish a denim textile and garments manufacturing unit in Khurda with an investment of ₹130 crore got the approval. It will generate 4,500 jobs.



LEBANON DEATH TOLL REACHES 558

Beirut, Sept 24: Lebanon's Health ministry said the death toll from Israeli airstrikes in the country since early Monday has reached 558. Health Minister Firass Abiad said Tuesday that 1.835 people were wounded during the same period and were taken to 54 hospitals around Lebanon. In a judgment which will have nationwide ramifications, the Supreme Court Tuesday junked a petition filed by the Punjab government, seeking quashing of a high court order to expand the definition of 'NRI quota' for admissions in medical and dental courses, by saying that "this NRI business (quota) is nothing but a fraud". The court said such a system has been depriving admission of candidates with three times higher marks in NEET-UG courses. On September 10, the high court had set aside the AAP-led government's August 20 notification that expanded the NRI seat category to include distant relatives of candidates "such as uncles, aunts, grandparents, and cousins" for admissions under the 15 per cent NRI quota to medical and dental courses in state government colleges.

'We will dismiss all the petitions. This NRI business is nothing but a fraud. We will put an end to all this now the so called precedents must give way to primacy of law," the bench said.

The top court said distant relatives of a 'mama, tai, taya,' who are settled abroad, will get admissions ahead of meritorious candidates and this cannot be allowed.

"This is completely a fraud. And this is what we are doing with our education system!...We will affirm the high court judgement. We must stop this NRI quota business now. The judges know what they are dealing with. The high court has dealt with the case threadbare." the CJI said

"Let us put a lid on this...what is this ward? You just have to say that I am looking after X ... We cannot lend our authority to something which is blatantly illegal.'

Terming the high court verdict "absolutely right," the top court said. "Look at the deleterious consequences... the candidates who have three times higher marks will lose admission (in NEET-UG courses).

Meanwhile, welcoming the SC decision, president of Odisha Parents' Federation, Basudev Bhatt demanded that all NRI admissions in institutions across the state in the past five years be investigated by a 'neutral agency in order to stop such 'corrupt

practices' in future. He said the federation is aware that NRI quota admission fraud has been going on in Odisha (and elsewhere in India) since a longtime. "Rackets are operating in several private medical colleges to facilitate NRI admission. We have received grievances from several parents that they have been charged more than Rs 5-10 lakh for NRI quota in Odisha," he said.

NRI quota a fraud: SC HC jolt to Siddaramaiah

Bengaluru, Sept 24: In a setback to Chief Minister Siddaramaiah, the Karnataka High Court Tuesday dismissed his petition challenging Governor's approval for investigation against him in a site allotment case.

The chief minister had challenged the approval given by the Governor Thaawarchand Gehlot for an investigation against him in the alleged irregularities in the allotment of 14 sites to his wife by the Mysuru Urban Development Authority (MUDA) in a prime locality.

After completing the hearings on the petition in six sittings from August 19, the single judge bench of Justice M Nagaprasanna September 12 reserved its verdict. It had also extended its August 19 interim order directing the special court for people's representatives that was slated to hear complaints against him in the case, to defer its proceedings till the disposal of the petition.

"The facts narrated in the petition would undoubtedly require

investigation, in the teeth of the fact that the beneficiary of all these acts is not anybody outside but the family of the petitioner. The petition stands dismissed," Justice Nagaprasanna ruled. He said: "interim order of any kind subsisting today shall stand dissolved.'

The Governor August 16 accorded sanction under Section 17A of the Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988 and Section 218 of the Bharativa Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS). 2023 for the commission of the alleged offences as mentioned in the petitions submitted to him by complainants Pradeep Kumar SP, TJ Abraham and Snehamavi Krishna. On August 19, Siddaramaiah moved the High Court challenging the legality of the Governor's order.

In the petition, the chief minister submitted that the sanction order was issued without due application of mind, in violation of statutory mandates, and contrary to Constitutional principles, including the advice of the Council of Ministers, which is binding under Article 163 of the Constitution of India. **P8**

6-year-old Gujarat girl killed by principal for resisting rape

Ahmedabad, Sept 24: The investigation into the death of a six-year-old girl in Gujarat's Dahod district has led to a chilling revelation - the Class I student was choked to death allegedly by her school's principal after she resisted his attempts to sexually assault her. He then dumped her body in the school's compound and her bag and shoes near the classroom. Police have arrested the accused, Govind Natt. 55.

The Gujarat Congress has claimed the principal is close to the BJP and RSS

Senior police officer Rajdeep Singh Jhala said the girl's body was found on the premises of her school Thursday evening, sparking panic in the area. The postmortem revealed that she was choked to death.

Police registered a case and formed 10 teams to probe the matter. The girl's mother told the police that she went to school with the principal every day. When the cops spoke to him, the principal said he had dropped off the girl at the school and left for some work.

The cops were not convinced. When they examined Natt's phone location details on the day of the incident, it was found that he reached school late that day. When he was grilled, the principal confessed to the heinous crime, the NDTV reported.

Several devotees also said the row over Tirupati laddoos is a "thing of the past now". Every day, over 3 lakh laddoos are prepared at the temple. Pilgrims visiting the temple buy them in large numbers, often to give to friends and relatives. Ingredients of Tirupati lad-



doo include Bengal gram, cow ghee, sugar, cashews, raisins, and almonds. A whopping 15,000 kg of cow ghee is used daily for preparing laddoos.

The Tirupati temple is at the centre of a massive row after Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister

Every day, over 3 lakh laddoos are prepared at the temple using 15,000 kg cow ghee. Pilgrims visiting the temple buy them in large numbers, often to give to friends and relatives

N Chandrababu Naidu alleged that ghee used to prepare Tirupati laddoos during the previous YSRCP regime contained animal fat.

Former Chief Minister YS Jagan Mohan Reddy, whose party was voted out in the state polls this year, has accused the ruling TDP of "politicising religious matters". "The tender process occurs every six months, and the qualification criteria have not changed for decades. Suppliers must provide an NABL certificate and a product quality certificate. The TTD collects samples of the ghee, and only products that pass certification are used. The TDP is politicising religious matters,' he said, alleging that Naidu is a "pathological and habitual liar".

GOVT TO TEST QUALITY OF GHEE USED AT SRIMANDIR

Puri, Sept 24: The state government Tuesday decided to test the quality of ghee used for preparation of offerings at Srimandir here, an official said.

The decision was taken amid the row over the alleged use of animal fat in the ghee with which the laddoos offered at the Tirupati temple in Andhra Pradesh are prepared

District Collector Siddharth Shankar Swain said that though there have been no such allegations here, the administration will test the quality of ghee being used for the preparation of 'Kotha Bhoga' (prasad for the deities) and 'Baradi Bhoga (prasad on order) at the 12thcentury shrine.

He said the state-run Odisha Milk Federation (Omfed) is the only supplier of ghee for use in the Puri temple. "However, a decision has been taken to examine the standard of ghee being supplied by Omfed to allay any fear of adulteration," he said, adding that discussions will be held with the

"Let the state's BJP government not get confined to changing names and colour of logos, but carry forward Patnaik's schemes as they have proved to be helpful to Odisha's progress," BJD national spokesperson Santrupt Mishra said in a press conference. Citing a report of the Economic Advisory Council to the PM Working Paper (EAC-PM), Mishra and another spokesperson Sasmit Patra said Odisha's economic progress during the last two decades was possible due to inclusive policies and pru-

dent economic management. 'We are not making such claims, but the report of the EAC-PM reveals such facts,"

Quoting the report, the BJD leaders pointed out that during Patnaik's regime, Odisha registered growth in relative per capita income from 55.8 per cent in 2000-01 to 88.5 per cent in 2023-24.

Similarly, Odisha's share in the country's GDP increased from 2.3 per cent to 2.8 per cent during the period.

"While Odisha's contribution to the country's GDP increased. Punjab's share came down to 2.4 per cent from 3.9 per cent. Maharashtra's share declined to 13.3 per cent from 14 per cent, West Bengal's from 8.2 per cent to 5.6 per cent. This indicated that Odisha could flourish due to Patnaik's policies and proper economic management," Mishra said. The BJD leaders also said that when Patnaik took over the charge of Odisha in 2000, the state had incurred an overdraft of ₹144 crore

from the Reserve Bank of India. They claimed that the state was facing difficulties in paying the salaries and pensions to its employees, adding that the state's per capita income increased to ₹1,61,437 in 2024 from

just ₹10,211 in 2000. BJD leaders rejected BJP's allegation that Odisha could not progress during Patnaik's 24

JSW denies reports of withdrawing EV project

Bhubaneswar, Sept 24: Amid media reports that JSW group was planning to shift its proposed ₹40,000 crore electric vehicle (EV) and battery project from Odisha to Maharashtra, the company Tuesday clarified that the group is not "withdrawing" its project from the eastern state.

Asked about media reports, Ranjan Nayak, executive vice president of corporate strategy, office of chairman and managing director said, "We are not withdrawing from Odisha".

JSW group had February 10, 2024, signed a memorandum of understanding with the state government for establishment of an integrated electric vehicle and EV battery manufacturing project at an investment of `40,000 crore in the state.

At Naraj in Cuttack district, the JSW group had planned to set up an EV and component manufacturing plant, while at Paradip in Jagatsinghpur district, it proposed to establish a copper smelter and lithium refinery.

The project consists of a 50 GWH EV battery plant, EV, lithium refinery, copper smelter and related component manufacturing units.

The MoU was signed after the state Cabinet approved a special incentive package for the group's ambitious EV and component manufacturing

Amid media reports about the company's planning to shift its project to Maharashtra, Odisha Industries Minister Sampad Swain Tuesday said the state government is in talks with JSW group for implementation of the EV project in the state.

Swain said the state government is not aware of the company's plans as "reported" in the media.

"Though MoU was signed in February this year, the previous government had not allocated land for the JSW's project. Now, we are talking to the company to set up its plants. We are not informed regarding the shifting of the plant from Odisha. However, there is a delay in the implementation of the project," Swain told PTI over phone.

GOVT WARNS OF ACTION AS NURSES CALL CEASEWORK

Bhubaneswar, Sept 24: As the Odisha Nursing Employees Association (ONEA) have called a two-day ceasework protest from Wednesday due to non-consideration of their demands, the Director of Nursing, Tuesday directed the heads of all the state-run healthcare facilities to take action against the nursing officers as Odisha Essential Services (Maintenance) Act 1988 is still in force.

The letter issued by Director of Nursing Artabandhu Nayak said, "As per the power conferred by Section 3 and Section 2 of the ESMA in interest of public, the state government prohibits strikes in form of cessation of work by nurses paramedics, technicians and other Class III and Class IV employees and the order remains in force for a period of six months with effect from the date of issuance of the order (August 7, 2024).

Earlier, the ONEA, in a letter addressed to Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi, September 18, mentioned about an indefinite ceasework call by all nursing The association demanded

NHRC seeks report on starvation death

Kendrapara, Sept 24: The National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) has directed the Odisha Chief Secretary to submit an actiontaken and compliance report on the disbursal of ₹3 lakh compensation in a starvation death case in Keonjhar.

The apex rights body ordered that the compensation be equally distributed among all the children of the deceased, with proof of payment to be submitted to the Commission within four weeks.

It also asked the Chief Secretary to report on whether the family possesses a valid and updated ration card after the death of the ben-



eficiary, Late Nandi Munda, and if the remaining family members are routinely receiving ration supplies as per the provisions of the NFSA, 2013.

"If the victim belonged to SC/ST community, as recognised by Odisha or the Government of India, the Chief Secretary must also submit a list of applicable benefits for this category, along with information on any benefits already provided to the family," the order mentioned. Acting on a petition filed by

human rights defender Sagar Jena, the NHRC issued the directive last week.

The petitioner, referencing media reports, brought to the commission's attention the incident in which Nandi Munda, a widow and resident of Kuturu Sahi in Padmapur under Sadar block of the district, died from starvation January 3.

According to the complaint, after the death of her husband, the woman lived with her daughter and two sons. The entire family fell ill due to starvation. After the incident was reported in the

media, government officials visited their residence and sent Nandi and her children to the hospital for treatment, where Nandi died.

The complainant previously requested the commission's intervention, seeking compensation for the next of kin (NoK) of the deceased and ensuring the proper care of her orphaned children.

The commission took cognizance of the matter January 10 and directed the District Magistrate (DM) of Keonjhar to submit an ATR. However, no report was submitted despite a reminder sent March 15, 2024.

The Chief Secretary has been instructed to submit the compliance report by October 27.

Sand quarry in Subarnarekha river faces NGT

The green body asked the SEIAA to take necessary action and pass order for revocation of environmental clearance granted by it illegally in favour of the lessee

Bhubaneswar, Sept 24: The National Green Tribunal (NGT) has imposed a ban on sand mining at Rayaramchandrapur along Subarnarekha river in Balasore district in the absence of a State **Environment Impact Assessment** Authority (SEIAA)-approved District Survey Report (DSR), official sources said.

While hearing a plea filed by Abani Kumar Sahu of Jamalpur under Jaleswar police limits of the district, the eastern zone bench of the environment watchdog asked the SEIAA to take necessary action and pass order for revocation of environmental clearance granted by it illegally in favour of the lessee.

"In case sand mining is still being carried out at Rayaramchandrapur quarry, the SEIAA shall also take steps to ensure that such operation is ceased with immediate effect," said the order passed by judicial member Justice B Amit Sthalekar and expert member Arun Kumar

The petitioner had informed the NGT that the 'lessee' has been carrying out illegal mining at Rayaramchandrapur sand quarry spread over 20.38-acre

The Jaleswar tehsildar executed a lease deed in favour of Asit Kumar Parida April 13, 2021. Environmental clearance was granted by the SEIAA July 13,



2017 in favour of Rajesh Kumar Khatua and thereafter it was transferred to Parida March 9,

The SEIAA issued a clarification May 6, 2022 stating that environmental clearance has been granted in ad hoc manner and will be revoked after December 31, 2022. The consent to operate was granted by the Odisha State Pollution Control Board May 10,

2022 and that was valid till December 31, 2022 and thereafter was renewed February 14, 2023 which was valid till March 31, 2023 for a mining capacity of 2500 m3 of sand, the petitioner

The petitioner claimed that the consent to operate was granted illegally without verifying the validity of the envi ronmental clearance.

It was further alleged that the Balasore Sub-Collector (vide letter March 24, 2023 addressed to the Additional District Magistrate) has clarified that the Rayaramchandrapur sand quarry is situated in the DLC forest and should not be allowed to be operated. It is also stated that the said sand source has not been recommended in the DSR by the Sub-Divisional Committee. The petitioner further alleged

that 'Y Form' (Transit Permit) for Rayaramchandrapur was issued July 8, 2023 for transportation of sand which suggests that mining is going in the monsoon period despite the letter of the Sub-Collector.

The NGT, after taking into consideration submissions from both parties, observed, "Even though the lessee may not be guilty of illegal mining of sand from Rayaramchandrapur on the ground that environmental

clearance granted to him was done illegally by SEIAA but the fact remains that even assuming that he was carrying on mining activity under an environmental clearance, he has carried out mining during monsoon which is prohibited under the Sand Mining Guidelines, 2016 and 2020. And, therefore, he would be liable for payment of environmental compensation.

The NGT directed the SEIAA to compute environmental compensation as per law giving the lessee an opportunity of being heard against the amount so computed. "If the lessee has any grievance in respect of any computation of environmental clearance by SEIAA, in this regard, he may avail legal remedies available to him under Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974 and Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1981," the environment watchdog said.

Security officer for 'cop assault victim'

Bhubaneswar, Sept 24: A day after the alleged Bharatpur police assault victim met Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi along with her father, the Commissionerate Police Tuesday deputed a personal security officer (PSO) for the woman.

The officer, Rabindra Narayan Behura, has been appointed to guard the victim round-the-clock against potential attacks, said official of Commissionerate Police. The officer has also been provided with a 9mm automatic pistol to avert any violent attacks, he added.

Notably, the Chief Minister Sunday evening ordered a judicial inquiry into the alleged torture of the Army officer and the 'sexual assault of his fiancée'. The inquiry commission will be led by Justice Chittaranjan Das, a retired High Court judge. The commission has been directed to submit the report within 60 days.

'Husband calling wife 'No DJ music, crackers, alcohol during Dussehra' parasite insult to her'

New Delhi, Sept 24: Wife being able-bodied to earn a livelihood does not absolve a husband from providing her maintenance, and calling her 'parasite' is an insult to her as well as the entire womankind, the Delhi High Court

The court, while dealing with a husband's plea challenging a lower court's direction to pay maintenance to his wife, observed that Indian women leave their jobs to look after the family, cater to the needs of their children and look after their husbands and his parents.

The petitioner husband, who was stated to have abandoned his wife and children and was living with another woman, was ordered by the trial court to pay ₹30,000 per month as maintenance to his wife, along with ₹5 lakh towards the "injuries" sustained by her, including mental torture, depression and emotional distress

The trial court had also directed him to pay ₹3 lakh as compensation to his wife, including ₹30,000 as litigation costs.

Challenging the order, the petitioner argued in the high court that his wife was an able-bodied lady who has worked in a boutique and, therefore, she could not be allowed to become a 'parasite' by misusing the law.

The court refused to interfere with the directions and said the fact that the wife is capable of earning cannot work to her detriment

The court, in a recent order, noted that the financial and asset profile of the petitioner reflected a 'comfortable and affluent lifestyle' and, therefore, he was in a position to pay ₹30,000 per month as maintenance.

'The fact that the Respondent (wife) is able bodied and can earn a livelihood does not absolve a husband not to provide maintenance to his wife and children. Indian women leave their jobs to look after the family cater to the needs of their children, and look after their husbands and his parents." it said.

'The contention that the Respondent is only a parasite and is abusing the process of law is nothing but an insult not only to the Respondent herein but to the entire women kind, said Justice Subramonium Prasad while dismissing the petition

"The Respondent had to leave her matrimonial house because she was unable to tolerate the fact that her husband is living with another woman. Since the Respondent/Wife was not in a position to take care of her two children, she had no option to leave them with the parents of the Petitioner herein," the court observed.

The court stated that section 125 entails that if the husband has sufficient means, he is obligated to maintain his wife and children, and not shirk away from his moral and familial responsibilities

World Heritage Site tag eludes Bhitarkanika

NON-IMPLEMENTATION OF GUIDELINES FOR ECO-SENSITIVE ZONES POSES THREAT TO THE RAMSAR SITE

Kendrapara, Sept 24: Bhitarkanika, the nature's wonder that has been nationally and internationally acclaimed as a biodiversity hotspot and also a Ramsar site, is yet to get UN-ESCO World Heritage Site tag, primarily due to a delay in conduct of a review of the site for the purpose and non-implementation of Eco-Sensitive Zone guidelines.

Sources said a proposal for inclusion of the national park in UNESCO World Heritage Sites list at the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) meeting in Kraków, Poland in July 2017 was rejected. The review that took place there highlighted several management flaws and disorganisation within the wetlands. The review underscored the fact that the site is under threat for which it was

Environmentalists like Srikanta Nayak and Hemant Kumar Raut, social activists Sanjay Kumar Behura, Pradeep Kumar Tarai and others have stated that Bhitarkanika is rich in biodiversity as National Park is home to species like saltwater crocodiles, six types of dolphins, 41 species of fish, rare Olive Ridley turtles, 36 types of rare wildlife species, 280 species of migratory and native birds, and 34 types of reptiles.

The biodiversity wonder is also home to around 57 species of mangroves and is abundant with medicinal plants and shrubs.

The national park faces ecological threat with issues like



private land ownership, unrestricted access for locals, farming, cattle grazing and shrimp farming gripping the protected area, in violation of Wildlife Protection Act, 1972. These were mentioned in the report by team members Naomi Dock and Remko van der Mare during their visit in November 2016. Additionally, there's a lack of boundary protection and mon-

Even though more than 400

villages exist within Bhitarkanika Eco-Sensitive Zone, guidelines for managing these areas are not being effectively implemented. and DRDO's integrated testing range (ITR) at Wheeler Island (or Abdul Kalam Island) also pose threats to Bhitarkanika's eco-sensitive area.

These apart, mangroves and other species in Bhitarkanika rely on freshwater the availability of which is gradually de-

threat from fishermen, while there is a lack of security personnel to monitor the protected marine zones. Other concerns include the need for funds to manage conservation efforts and prevent coastal erosion.

Environmentalists and social workers have demanded that a review be conducted on these issues, especially on non-implementation of guidelines for Eco-Sensitive Zones. A notification has already been issued regarding the construction of a river-based port and industries in Mahakalapada block, which would impact the biodiversity of the national park and cause economic distress to local fishermen.

When asked about the obstacles to Bhitarkanika getting World Heritage Site tag, Rajnagar DFO Sudarshan Gopinath Yadav said a review is underway and efforts are on to rectify the issues.

Forest officials rescue saltwater _ crocodile from village pond

Kendrapara, Sept 24: Forest personnel from the Rajnagar Forest Division in Kendrapara district rescued a 5.4-foot-long saltwater crocodile late Monday night from a village pond located on the outskirts of Bhitarkanika National Park.

The crocodile rescued late Monday night had entered the pond belonging to a villager Ranjit Mandal

Debendranarayanpur village. Forest officials believe the estuarine crocodile may have strayed into the pond from the Baunsagadi river which is located about 300 meters from the place, Monday evening.

Villagers spotted the reptile in the pond and informed the Rajnagar forest personnel, who promptly arrived and managed to rescue the crocodile using fishing nets after struggling for over three hours. The rescued crocodile was later released into the Mahipur river, forest officials said.

Villagers said she had to crawl as no other option was available for her to go to the panchayat office.

The village incidentally is in Telkoi block in Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi's home



district, which is Keonjhar.

Telkoi block development officer (BDO) Geeta Murmu informed that pension was being deposited in Dehury's bank account. However, as she fell ill and expressed her inability to visit the bank, the local administration had been disbursing pension personally to Dehury, she added. The question however is, why Dehury had to crawl to the panchayat office if it was being handed to her.

"The panchayat extension officer has been asked to disburse the pension to Dehury at her home each month. A wheelchair has also been provided to her," the BDO said. Champia meanwhile said a civil supply assistant has been asked to provide rations to Dehury at her doorstep.

German Dilemma

erman Chancellor Olaf Scholz got a reprieve after a much _needed win for his Social Democratic Party (SPD) in the eastern state of Brandenburg 22 September. However, that is hardly good news for his three-party coalition which is facing an existential crisis following a sensational rise of the far-right neo-Nazi party, Alternative for Germany (AfD). State elections in Germany do not affect the government in Berlin directly, but they are often seen as a barometer of the national mood and a snapshot of the government's popularity. The election in the state of Brandenburg was the third and final one in a state that was once part of East Germany before the country votes for a new chancellor and federal government in a year from now.

Scholz's party won 31 per cent of the votes, and the AfD got just above 29 per cent, according to official results. Nearly 45 per cent of voters chose extremist parties and the election had the highest voter turnout in the state, 73 per cent, since reunification. These statistics reflect the people's mood against the ruling coalition of the three parties of SPD, Free Democratic Party (FDP) and Green party.

The surprise win for the Social Democrats in Brandenburg is being viewed as the result of the popular governor's intense campaigning and also strategic voting against the AfD. The governor belonging to the SPD, Dietmar Woidke, succinctly summed up the outcome by asserting that their goal from the outset was to prevent the state from being captured by the AfD. Earlier this month, two other eastern states, Saxony and Thuringia, had held their elections and the far-right party dominated. The AfD won around 30 per cent in all three states. In Brandenburg, the Social Democrats still edged out the AfD, but in Thuringia the AfD got 32.8 per cent.

The implications of the victory in Brandenburg are not lost on Woidke who realises that if an openly far-right extreme party can win around 30 per cent of the votes in his state, then it is a wake-up call for all democrats who "stand for freedom, openness and tolerance.

Both the AfD and the new far-left party, Bundnis Sahra Wagenknecht, campaigned on controlling immigration which many Germans perceive as a problem and against military support for Ukraine.

As such, the narrow victory over the AfD in Brandenburg is already overshadowed by debate within the federal three-party coalition over how — and for how long — the government will survive. The coalition will have to reinvent itself in the next months with major policy resolutions on key issues ranging from migration to the economy. While the SPD was able to end a string of election defeats in the Brandenburg vote, the two other parties — the Greens and the FDP — continued their streak of dismal losses. The Greens crashed out of the Brandenburg state parliament, winning just around 4 per cent, a drop of nearly 7 percentage points from the last election and below the 5 per cent threshold needed to gain parliamentary seats. The FDP fared the worst, winning less than 1 per cent of the vote share.

These results, followed by poor outcomes in state elections earlier this month and the European election in June, put the coalition parties — and particularly the FDP — in an existential crisis that is likely to make governing inside the divided coalition even harder. As a federal election is scheduled to be held in a year, the ruling parties are hard put to bury their differences and try to consolidate their bases which at the moment seems to be an uphill task.

The steady rise of the far-right has so much unnerved the FDP that many of its leaders are openly questioning whether it would be better to pull the plug on the coalition in a last-ditch effort to revive their party's fortunes — a move that could lead to an early election.

Experts say the coalition's future now depends on whether it can move to curb the influx of asylum seekers, stimulate economic growth and reach a budget agreement in the coming months.

Time is running out and the coalition government will have to act fast if it wants to seriously take on the AfD. The frictions within the coalition make its prospect appear bleak at the moment unless all anti-Nazi forces close rank in the coming elections and win back the trust of the people. At the moment, their credibility has hit the

wo dimensions of a future scenario emerge after the present Israeli war on Hezbollah in Lebanon by using aerial attacks and triggering explosions on pagers and walkie talkie sets.

One is whether this violates international law. The other is a cold analysis whether Israel's predatory mass explosion of pagers has established a new and dangerous future template which other countries could adapt later.

Israel's step of hiding explosives in pagers and walkie talkie sets could also be copied to blow up aircraft and vehicles are the fears being expressed even by the country's American supporters. One conservative US think tank wondered, immediately after the pager blasts, whether this action could be replicated on cell phones or other electronic equipment in common use.

There is no doubt that the entire communication system of Hezbollah through pagerwalkie talkie system was destroyed which the group had nurtured for so long to prevent the detection of communication by Israeli agencies. There were two waves of massive explosions of pagers and walkie talkie sets in Lebanon. These massive explosions have caused several civilian deaths. As this is written, the casualties in the sudden explosion of pagers and walkie talkie sets on September 17-18 in Lebanon and Syria are 32 deaths including children. Thousands are reported injured

Although Israel has not officially claimed responsibility, defence minister Yoav Gallant publicly revealed that Israel was "entering a new phase of war." Israeli armv chief Herzi Halevi also warned that they were capable of many more surprises as "we are already two stages ahead... We will make it so that terrorists will be afraid of going to the toilet and even eating food.

American National Public Radio (NPR) disclosed on September 20 that an official not authorised to speak pub-

licly told them that Israel had notified Washington after the explosions claiming responsibility "for Tuesday's attacks." Quoting legal experts, NPR added that Israel was responsible for violating international law signed by Israel and Lebanon.

This is because UN had added Article 7(2) in 1996 to the Amended UN Protocol II of the Convention on Certain Conventional Weapons on the use of conventional weapons. Under that amendment, there is a ban on "booby traps" hidden in devices which "civilians are likely to be attracted to or are associated with normal civilian daily use" and which strike "military targets and civilians without distinction.'

Experience indicates that Israel will not be swayed by allegations of human rights violations by the UN bodies or the US Congressmen. It was only on 17 September that the UN General Assembly had overwhelmingly adopted a non-binding resolution drafted by Palestine demanding Israel end "its unlawful presence in the Occupied Palestinian Territory' within 12 months.

Israel also ignored the July 2024 order of the International Court of Justice (ICJ) asking it to stop settlement activity in the occupied West Bank and East Jerusalem and end its "illegal" occupation of those areas and the Gaza Strip as soon as possible. Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu had then said the court had made a "decision of Israeli bombing last Friday

(September 20), after Hezbollah's rocket barrage in the wake of mass pager explosion, killed Ibrahim Aqil. The Hezbollah chief was reportedly killed in an air strike in suburban Beirut during a meeting of the Lebanese militant group's Radwan unit. Aqil also known as Al-Hajj Abdul Khader was the chief of Hezbollah's elite Radwan Force.

Aqil was involved in two bombing of US targets in Lebanon in the 1980s. In 1983, he

reportedly organised two major explosions: One on 18 April 1983 outside the US embassy in Beirut which killed over 100 people including 17 Americans. The second was on 23 October 1983 against multi-national forces. After the "Beirut barracks bombing" the then US President, Ronald Reagan, withdrew the American presence from Lebanon.

A study of the history of terrorism would reveal that the present Israeli action of triggering pager and walkie talkie explosions might be the first predatory step by any State compared to the usual practice of action or over-reaction like the US invasion of Afghanistan after 9/11. Starting with the first suicide bombing in history in 1881 by "Narodnaya Volya," the organisation, which killed Tsar Alexander II in St. Petersburg, to the modern day, no State has triggered such an attack, with such serious ram

From the airport while he was being ferried to Manhattan to his jail, an FBI officer taunted him, pointing out the World Trade Center building still standing to which Yousef calmly replied: "It would not have been, had we had more money."

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ways of thinking of our bodies. The latest research indicates that one person's fat is not necessarily the same as another person's. Whether you have healthy fat or unhealthy fat depends on how you use it. Do you take it to the gym with you or do you let it hang out on the couch?

To illustrate this, let's picture two roommates, David and Rohan. They have similar builds, each with a pot belly. At least four times a week. David takes his belly to the gym, giving it a 30-minute workout on an exercise bike. While David's belly is on a stationary bike. Rohan's belly is merely stationary. It's sta-

tioned on a stool at the bar. After two years, their bellies look the same. Despite his effort at the gym, David has been unable to reduce his belly. And despite his effort at the bar. Rohan has been unable to expand his.

David wonders if he should quit trying. What's the point of exercising regularly if you can't lose weight?

Well, as countless studies have shown, exercise can improve your health in many ways, even if you don't lose weight. But here's another reason for David to keep working out: a new study at University of Michigan in the US has found that regular aerobic exercise makes your fat tissue healthier.

Hearing about the study, David bought himself a T-shirt that says, "My pot belly is healthier than your pot belly."

To conduct the study, researchers recruited 32 overweight adults with a similar amount of body fat. Half of them had exercised regularly like David for at least two years, while the other half were sedentary like Rohan.

Researchers examined samples of their subcutaneous belly fat and found significant differcisers had more blood vessels, more protein and less inflammation.

Perhaps most importantly, the researchers found that the fat of regular exercisers wasn't rigid and had the capacity to expand and accommodate more fat. Because of regular exercise, David could make his fat more welcoming to immigrants (other fat cells).

But why is that a positive thing? Because storing fat just under your skin is safer than in other parts of your body, according to Jeff Horowitz, a professor who led the University of Michigan study.

"Unfortunately, most of us, even regular exercisers, gain weight as we get older," Horowitz told CNN. "If we have a greater capacity to store that in our fat tissue, less of it'll go to our liver, less of it will go to our heart, less will go to all these other places that in excess can be re-

Many of us exercise to make our muscles stronger, but we should also exercise to make our fat healthier. After a good workout, don't just look in the mirror and flex your muscles -- jiggle your fat too.

While many people have a negative view of fat, Horowitz wants us to recognise its importance for our bodies.

"Fat tissue itself is very, very important for health," he said. "It's actually an important reservoir of our extra energy."

The main takeaway from his study is that exercise can make even your fat tissue healthier. Don't let your weight keep you from exercising. It's better to be overweight and healthy than slim and unhealthy.

Whether you're going for a brisk walk, jogging down the street, or using a stationary bike like David, your body will thank you.

UP tightens food safety rules

UP RESTAURANTS ASKED TO INSTALL CCTVS, EATERIES TO DISPLAY NAMES OF PROPRIETORS. **STAFF TO WEAR MASKS, GLOVES**

Lucknow, Sept 24: Taking cognisance of incidents of spitting and mixing of urine in eatables in Uttar Pradesh, Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath Tuesday directed that the name and address of operators, proprietors and managers should be mandatorily displayed at all food centres.

He also directed that chefs and waiters should wear masks **FOOD ADULTERATION**

and gloves besides making installation of CCTVs in hotels and restaurants mandatory.

Addressing a high-level meeting here, Adityanath said the presence of human waste in food items was disgusting and ordered strict action against those who adulterate food items with human waste or dirty things, an official statement said.

A purported video showing a teenager spitting on rotis while preparing them at an eatery in Saharanpur district went viral on social media September 12, leading to the arrest of the facility's owner.

Last week, a juice vendor in Ghaziabad district was arrested for allegedly serving fruit juices mixed with urine to customers. In June, two men were arrested



by police in Noida for allegedly selling juice contaminated with their spits.

In view of such incidents, the chief minister has also given instructions for thorough investigation, verification of all hotels, dhabas, restaurants, and related establishments in

Instructions were also given to amend the rules as per the need while ensuring the health safety of the general public.

Adiyanath said, "Dhabas, restaurants and food establishments should be thoroughly investigated and police verification of every employee should be done and necessary amendments should also be made in the Food Safety and Standards Act to ensure the purity and sanctity of food items.'

According to the statement. now it will be mandatory to display the name and address of the operator, proprietor, manager etc. at the food centres.

"Now whether it is a chef or a waiter, they will have to wear masks and gloves and it will be mandatory to install CCTV in hotels/restaurants," the chief min-

In the meeting, Adityanath said in recent times, incidents of adulteration of food items like juice, pulses and roti with human waste, and dirty things have been seen in various parts of the country.

"Such incidents are gruesome and have an adverse effect on the health of the common man. Such efforts cannot be accepted at all," he said.

Concrete arrangements are necessary to prevent such incidents in Uttar Pradesh, he said, adding that by running a statewide intensive campaign, verification of all the employees working there including the operators of these food establishments should be done.

The chief minister said this action should be completed quickly by a joint team of Food Safety and Drug Administration, police and local administration.



SEBI must name big players: Rahul on F&O trading

New Delhi, Sept 24: Congress leader Rahul Gandhi Tuesday said 90 per cent of small investors have lost ₹1.8 lakh crore in Futures and Option (F&O) trading in three years and asked the SEBI to reveal the names of the "so called big players" profiteering at their expense.

Gandhi, who is the leader of the Opposition in the Lok Sabha, said on X, "Uncontrolled F&O trading has grown 45X in 5 years. 90% of small investors have lost 1.8 lakh Cr in 3 years.

"SEBI must reveal the names of the so called 'Big Players' making a killing at their expense," the former Congress chief said. The study said in FY24 alone, individuals incurred about ₹75.000 crore in net losses.

It found the top 3.5 per cent of loss-makers -- about 4 lakh traders faced an average loss of ₹28 lakh per person over the same period, inclusive of transaction costs. On the other hand, only 7.2 per cent of individual F&O traders made a profit over the period of three years and only 1 per cent of individual traders managed to earn profits exceeding ₹1 lakh, after adjusting for transaction costs.

Moreover, the number of retail traders, or individual traders, has almost doubled in two years to about 96 lakh in FY24 from about 51 lakh in FY22.

■ More than 91 per cent, or 73 lakh, individual traders lost money in the F&O segment in FY24 with an average net loss of ₹1.2 lakh per person, a study conducted by markets regulator SEBI revealed

■ Further, 93 per cent of over 1 crore individual F&O traders incurred average losses of about ₹2 lakh per trader (inclusive of transaction costs) during the three years from FY22 to FY24

■ The aggregate losses of such traders exceeded ₹1.8 lakh crore during the period

Although such investors contributed about 30 per cent to the total turnover in FY24, they are a clear majority in number terms, as 99.8 per cent of total traders in the equity F&O segment are individuals. "The availability of sophisticated trading platforms and lower transaction costs have enabled retail investors to actively trade in options and futures contracts, contributing to the surge in market liquidity," SEBI said.

The regulator said rapid growth in F&O trading activity has highlighted the need for investor education and risk management practices, as a significant proportion of retail traders continued to incur losses in the market.

TN: NIA raids 11 places to probe promotion of anti-India ideology

New Delhi, Sept 24: The NIA conducted searches at multiple locations across Tamil Nadu Tuesday as part of its probe into an "anti-election campaign' promoted by the Hizb-ut-Tahrir, a pan-Islamist organisation seeking to establish Islamic rule in the country, an official statement said.

It said officials of the National Investigation Agency (NIA) raided the houses of 11 suspects in Chennai, Tambaram and Kanyakumari districts, and seized incriminating materials, including digital devices, unaccounted cash and literature belonging to the Hizb-ut-Tahrir.

The NIA said the searches were conducted as part of a case related to causing and creating disaffection through various social media handles and campaigning against the exercise of the electoral franchise, which is deemed by the Hizb-ut-Tahrir as un-Islamic or 'Haram'.

The Hizb-ut-Tahrir is a fundamentalist organisation engaged in instigating its followers to overthrow the lawfully established democratic government through divisive actions, according to the anti-terror

Hameed Hussain, a key conspirator in the case, had collaborated with five other accused to hold secret meetings to promote the anti-India ideology of the Hizb-ut-Tahrir, it said.

"NIA investigations in the case so far have revealed that the accused, along with several groups of people, had carried out campaigns throughout Tamil Nadu to establish Khilafah or Islamic rule in India, and had been involved in activities aimed at dividing the people and disrupting the sovereignty and territorial integrity of the country," the statement said.

Investigations in the case, taken over by the NIA from the Chennai City Police in July this year, are continuing, and the

Don't drag us into your agenda: SC slams NCPCR

SIT PROBE AGAINST MISSIONARIES

New Delhi, Sept 24: The Supreme Court Tuesday told NCPCR not to drag the apex court in its agenda over a plea seeking an SIT probe into cases of children allegedly sold by shelter homes in Jharkhand of the Missionaries of Charity founded by Mother Teresa.

Slamming the National Commission for Protection of Child Rights (NCPCR), a bench of Justices B V Nagarathna and Nongmeikapam Kotiswar Singh dismissed the plea filed by the child rights body. It said the relief sought is vague and omnibus, and it cannot be considered.

"Dont' drag the Supreme Court into your agenda. What kind of

relief is sought in your petition? How can we pass such directions? The petition is totally misconstrued," the bench told the lawyer appearing for the NCPCR.

At the outset, the lawyer ap-

pearing for the NCPCR submitted that the plea has sought direction for an apex court-monitored time-bound investigation of all such organisations in Jharkhand to ensure protection

The NCPCR in its plea filed in 2020 had sought enforcement of fundamental rights of prohibition of trafficking in human be-

ings guaranteed under Article 23 of the Constitution. It had said discrepancies have been found in children's homes in various states and it has added them as parties in its plea.

The plea had cited cases of child rights violation in Jharkhand and said the authorities in the state have adopted a callous approach to protect minors. "During course of inquiry by petitioner (NCPCR), shocking revelations were made by the victims which included the factum that the children were being sold in the children homes. These facts were emphatically brought to the notice of the state government (Jharkhand) but continuous attempts were made to sabotage and derail the inquiry,"the plea said.

ENCOUNTER DEATH OF BADLAPUR ACCUSED

Kin, Oppn challenge police claims

Mumbai, Sept 24: The Opposition as well as the kin of Akshay Shinde, accused in the Badlapur sexual assault case, Tuesday picked holes in police's version of his killing and accused the government of trying to shield the school management.

Shinde's father Anna Shinde moved the Bombay High Court seeking probe by a Special Investigation Team into his son's death in a "fake encounter". His mother and uncle had alleged Monday night that it was a conspiracy by police and management of the Badlapur school where the alleged sexual assault had taken place. Akshay could not have snatched the weapon of a policeman as claimed by officials, they said.

Akshay Shinde (24), died in 'retaliatory firing' by a police officer after he allegedly snatched the pistol of a policeman in a van and

opened fire, leaving an assistant inspector injured Monday. The incident took place near Mumbra bypass in Thane when he was being taken to Badlapur in Thane district from Taloja Jail for the probe into a case registered against him on the complaint of his former wife.

A contractual sweeper, Akshay was accused of sexually assaulting two kindergarten girls at the Badlapur school in August. "We want justice," his father told PTI.

The Opposition too slammed the government and refused to accept the police's theory. Shiv Sena (UBT) leader Sanjay Raut said though the encounter was suspicious, there was no need to show sympathy for Akshay. 'How convincing is it that a school janitor snatches a gun from a policeman and fires a locked weapon? This is the basic question," he said, alleging that Akshay was the main piece of evidence that was destroyed as Chief Minister Eknath Shinde and deputy CM Devendra Fadnavis wanted to shield the school management.

Thane Police registered a case of attempt to murder against Akshay for allegedly opening fire at police. Meanwhile, the father of Akshay Shinde has moved the Bombay High Court seeking probe by a special investigation team into the death.

Spycams in toilet, bedroom

New Delhi, Sept 24: A 30-year-old man has been arrested for allegedly installing spy cameras in the bedroom and washroom of his female tenant's home in east Delhi's Shakarpur area, police said Tuesday.

The victim, a civil service aspirant, was staying alone in the house for the past few months and would handover the keys to her landlord's son Karan before going out of town, they said. The matter came to fore after the woman noticed some unusual activity on her WhatsApp, Deputy Commissioner of Police (east) Apoorva Gupta said "After being advised to check her linked devices, she discovered that her WhatsApp account was logged into an unknown laptop and she promptly logged out of it," she said.

The woman became more suspicious and began searching her apartment for hidden cameras or surveillance devices and she found one in the bulb holder of her bathroom, the officer said. Following this, she made a PCR Monday. A police team conducted

a thorough search and found another camera installed in the bulb holder of her bedroom, Gupta said. The woman told police that wherever she went out of town, she gave her house keys to Karan, who lives on a different floor of the same building, she said. During interrogation, Karan admitted that three months ago, when she left for her hometown in Uttar Pradesh, she had handed over her keys to him, the DCP said.

Taking advantage of this, Karan bought three spy cameras commonly available in electronics markets and installed one in her bedroom and the other in her bathroom, she said. Since these cameras could not be operated online and used a memory card to store videos, Karan persistently requested the woman to give the keys of her house under the pretext of repairing electrical fixtures and fans as he wanted to transfer the recorded videos from the memory card to his laptop, she said. During further probe, another spy camera was recovered from Karan's possession, along with two laptops used to store the recorded videos, a police officer said.

SUB-CLASSIFICATION OF SCs FOR QUOTA

SC TO REVIEW ITS JUDGMENT

New Delhi, Sept 24: The Supreme Court is scheduled to consider in-chambers Tuesday a batch of pleas seeking review of its judgement which held that states are constitutionally empowered to make sub-classifications within the Scheduled Castes, which form a socially heterogeneous class, for granting reservation.

As per the cause list, a seven-judge Constitution bench comprising Chief Justice D Y Chandrachud and Justices B R Gavai, Vikram Nath, Bela Trivedi, Pankaj Mithal, Manoj Misra and Satish Chandra Sharma is likely to take up the matter at 1.35 pm.

The top court August 1 had held that states are constitutionally empowered to make sub-classifications within the Scheduled Castes, which form a socially heterogeneous class, for granting reservation for the uplift of castes that are socially and educationally more backward. The apex court, however, made it clear that states have to make subclassification on the basis of "quantifiable and demonstrable data" of

sentation in government jobs and not on "whims" and as a matter of "political expediency"

seven-judge Constitution bench headed Chief Justice Chandrachud, by a majority of 6:1, set aside the apex court's five-judge bench verdict of 2004 in the EV Chinnaiah vs State of Andhra Pradesh case which had held that no sub-classification of Scheduled Castes (SCs) can be allowed as they are a homogeneous class in themselves. Except for Justice Trivedi, the other five judges concurred with the findings of the CJI.

Justice Trivedi, in her 85-page dissenting judgement, said it is only Parliament which can include a caste in the SC list or exclude it, and states are not empowered to tinker with it.

Overruling the Chinnaiah verdict, the CJI dealt with the scope of sub classification of SCs and said the objective of any form of affirmative action, including the subclassification, is to provide "substantive equality of opportunity for the backward classes".

Kathmandu: Four people were arrested Tuesday for their alleged involvement in issuing a fake Nepali citizenship certificate to a Tibetan, police said. He sought to calm tensions as the nearly vear-long war between Israel and Palestinian militants Hamas in the besieged Gaza Strip now threatens to engulf Lebanon, where Israel targeted more than a thousand Hezbollah targets Monday.

Islamabad, Sept 24: Saudi Arabia has raised concerns about the growing number of Pakistani beggars arriving in the Kingdom under the guise of religious pilgrimage and asked Islamabad to take action to prevent them from entering the Gulf country, a media report said Tuesday.

'The Saudi Ministry of Haji has issued a warning to Pakistan's Ministry of Religious Affairs, urging action to prevent Pakistani beggars from entering the kingdom under Umrah visas," the paper said.

In response, Pakistan's Ministry of Religious Affairs has decided to introduce an "Umrah Act," which aims to regulate travel agencies facilitating Umrah trips, bringing them under legal oversight, it said. Additionally, the ministry has asked the Pakistani government to find ways to prevent beggars from travelling to Saudi Arabia under the guise of religious pilgrimage.

SL's new Prez dissolves Parl

Colombo, Sept 24: Sri Lanka's newly appointed President Anura Kumara Dissanayake Tuesday signed the special gazette notification ordering the dissolution of Parliament, officials said.

The dissolution will be effective from midnight Tuesday and the election will be held November 14.

Dissanayake in the run-up to Saturday's presidential election said he would immediately dissolve parliament to order a snap poll. The last Parliament was convened in August 2020. The dissolution has come 11 months ahead of schedule.

Dissanayake, 56, was sworn in as Sri Lanka's ninth President by Chief Justice Javantha Jayasuriya at the Presidential Secretariat Monday.

His swearing-in came hours after Prime Minister Dinesh Gunawardena resigned from his post as part of a power transition in the country following the presidential election.

On Monday, Dissanayake said he wanted a new assembly to push through his National People's Power (NPP) reform agenda. Earlier today, President Dissanayake appointed his cabinet of four, including himself and also Harini Amarasuriya was sworn in as the new Prime Minister of Sri Lanka, making her the 16th person to hold the position. She was sworn in as the new Prime Minister in the pres-



ence of President Dissanayake. NPP parliamentarians Vijitha and Laxman Nipunarachchi were sworn in as cabinet ministers. They would serve as the caretaker cabinet.

Also, the Election Commission has announced its readiness to conduct a general election at any given time.

Commissioner General of Elections, Saman Sri Ratnayake, stated that the estimated cost for a general election would be approximately Rs. 11 billion.

The Election Commission also noted that the voter registration list prepared for the presidential election will be used for the general election.

Dissanayake, the leader of the Marxist Janatha Vimukthi Peramuna party's broader front National People's Power (NPP), defeated his closest rival Sajith Premadasa of Samagi Jana Balawegaya (SJB) in Saturday's election.

Telegram can disclose user data at authorities' requests: Co-founder

Moscow, Sept 24: Telegram can disclose users' data upon reasonable requests from authorities, the encrypted messaging service's co-founder Pavel Durov said on his Telegram channel.

'We've made it clear that the IP addresses and phone numbers of those who violate our rules can be disclosed to relevant authorities in response to valid legal requests," Pavel Durov said Monday, specifying that the messenger has updated its terms of service and privacy policy, bringing them to uniformity across the world. Xinhua news agency reported.

Such changes were introduced to "further deter criminals from abusing Telegram Search," he noted. Pavel Durov also pointed out that some users were abusing Telegram's search function to sell illegal goods. However, the team of the platform has removed all problematic content

from searches in recent weeks. Pavel Durov, a native of Russia, was detained in Paris last month and later released on a \$5.6 million bail for charges including failing to act against Telegram users involved in cyberbullying, sharing pedophilic content and glorifying terrorism. He was placed under judicial supervision and banned from leaving France.

Hezbollah commander Beirut, Sept 24: An Israeli

airstrike on the southern suburbs of Beirut Tuesday killed a Hezbollah commander who was a leading figure in its rocket division, two security sources in Lebanon said, as fears of a fullfledged war in the Middle East mounted.

The sources identified the commander who was killed as Ibrahim Qubaisi. The attack, in which six people were killed, dealt another blow to the Iranbacked group which has faced a series of setbacks at the hands of Israel over the past week.

The relentless pressure on Hezbollah has increased fears that nearly a year of conflict will explode into another all-out war and destabilise the Middle East, where a conflict between Israel and Hezbollah's ally Hamas is already raging in Gaza.

Israel struck the Hezbollahcontrolled area of the Lebanese capital for a second consecutive day after mounting a new wave of airstrikes on Hezbollah targets in Lebanon, increasing fears that nearly a year of conflict would explode into an all-out war and destabilise the oil-producing Middle East



After nearly 12 months of war against the Palestinian militant group Hamas in Gaza on its southern border, Israel is shifting its focus to the northern frontier, where Hezbollah has been firing rockets into Israel in support of Hamas, which is also backed by Iran.

The sources in Lebanon declined to identify who had been targeted in Tuesday's strike on Beirut and said his fate was unknown. The health ministry gave an initial toll of six dead and 15 wounded in the strike.

The Israeli military, which carried out airstrikes against Hezbollah Monday which Lebanese authorities said killed more than 500 people, said it had carried out a strike in Beirut Tuesday, but gave no details.

The airstrike hit a building in the usually busy Ghobeiry neighbourhood. One of the security sources shared a photo showing damage to the top floor of the five-storey building.

Israel's military chief said attacks on Hezbollah would be accelerated. "The situation requires continued, intense action in all arenas," said Military Chief of General Staff Herzi Halevi after holding a security assessment.

Lebanese authorities said 558 people had been killed, including 50 children and 94 women, in Israel's airstrikes Monday, A further 1,835 were wounded, they said, and tens of thousands more have fled for safety.

The casualty tolls and constant pressure from the most powerful and advanced military in the Middle East has spread panic in Lebanon, which suffered from devastating destruction when Israel and Hezbollah fought in 2006.

"We are waiting for victory, God willing, because as long as we have a neighbour like Israel, we can't sleep safely," said Beirut resident Hassan Omar.

Afif Ibrahim, a taxi deriver from southern Lebanon, was defiant. "They (Israel) want us (Lebanese) to kneel, but we kneel only to God in our prayers; we bow our heads to no one but God." he said.

Mexico City, Sept 24: Ten years ago, Edgar Vargas' life forever changed when he was shot in the face in one of Mexico's most notorious cases of mass violence in recent memory: the attack and disappearance of 43 students from the rural teachertraining school of Ayotzinapa.

A bullet pierced Vargas' jaw on the night of September 26, 2014, as he tried to help his classmates trapped in a bus being shot at by gunmen. Vargas, then 19, survived by crawling along the road until he found shelter, though he was left with deep physical and emotional scars.

"I knew that nothing would ever be the same again. I could hardly look at myself in a mirror," Vargas, who has undergone seven surgeries, said through tears in an interview with Reuters

"I couldn't (speak), I saw my body full of tubes inside my mouth, of cables, it was very hard.

Vargas, now a teacher, is part of a group of survivors who have since scattered across Mexico, many of them saying they have been threatened by organized crime members and government officials, warning them to stop discussing and protesting or face unspecified consequences along with their family members

Despite fear and trauma, some say they want to continue to seek truth and justice that has eluded them for a decade.

Every anniversary is a painful reminder of the assault on more than 100 student teachers from Ayotzinapa, in the city of Iguala in the violent state of Guerrero,

some 220 kilometers south of Mexico City.

The motive for the attack remains a mystery.

In its initial findings, the previous government concluded the 43 had been kidnapped by

corrupt police in cahoots with a local drug gang who believed the students had been infiltrated by members of a rival outfit. The gang then killed the students and burned their bodies, their report said.

The administration of President Andres Manuel Lopez Obrador, who took power in 2018, has described the disappearances as a "state crime" that authorities had tried to cover up. No one has been convicted in relation to the incident and authorities have only managed to identify remains of three of the students

UNFULFILLED PROMISES Families of the disappeared are still clamoring for the truth, clinging ever more skeptically to the government's promises to find the young people or get to the bottom of what happened.

President-elect Claudia Sheinbaum, who will take office October 1, has promised the investigations will continue into the incident that occurred during the mandate of thenPresident Enrique Peña Nieto, who was criticized by international investigators and victims' families for bringing about an abrupt closure of the case.

Peña accepted the assertion by his attorney general's office that the students' bodies had been burned on a pyre. But that was later rejected by international investigators, including the Interdisciplinary Group of Independent Experts (GIEI), a panel set up by the Inter-American Commission on Human Rights.

Many family members are also disappointed by Obrador, who had promised to resolve the case. The outgoing President has defended the armed forces, who have been accused of playing a role in the events by the foreign investigators and lawyers for the parents of the victims.

The military has denied that any of its members participated directly and says it hasprovided information for the investigations.

Besides helping countries build payment systems, the NIPL is also tasked with linking UPI with other countries' real-time payment systems, such as Singapore's PayNow.

There are seven such links already and "several more are in the pipeline," Shukla said, declining to provide details.

The NIPL plans to double its 60member team by March 2025 to deploy more staff overseas besides the handful of executives it has in Singapore and the Middle East currently, Shukla said.

S&P expects RBI to cut rates in Oct

New Delhi, Sept 24: S&P Global Ratings Tuesday retained India's growth forecast at 6.8 per cent for the current fiscal and said it expects the RBI to start cutting interest rates in its October monetary policy review.

In the economic outlook of Asia Pacific, S&P Global Ratings also retained its GDP growth forecast for the 2025-26 fiscal at 6.9 per cent and said solid growth in India will allow the Reserve Bank to focus on bringing inflation in line with its target. "In India, GDP growth mod-

erated in the June quarter as high interest rates temper urban demand, in line with our projection of 6.8 per cent GDP for the full fiscal year 2024-2025," S&P said.

The Indian economy grew 8.2 per cent in the last fiscal

S&P said the Union Budget in July outlined that the government remains committed to fiscal consolidation and to keeping the focus of public expenditure on infrastructure. The Budget has earmarked a capital expenditure of ₹11.11 lakh crore in the current fiscal end-

ing March 2025.

S&P said the RBI (Reserve Bank of India) considers food inflation a hurdle for rate cuts. It reckons that unless there is a lasting and meaningful decline in the rate at which food prices are increasing it will be tough to maintain headline inflation at 4 per cent.

"Our outlook remains unchanged: we expect the RBI to begin cutting rates in October at the earliest and have pencilled in two rate cuts this fiscal year (year ending March 2025)," S&P said. S&P expects inflation to average 4.5 per cent in the cur-

Sensex hits 85,000 before closing flat

Mumbai, Sept 24: Benchmark Sensex scaled the 85,000 level and Nifty breached the 26,000 mark for the first time before paring gains to close flat in a volatile session Tuesday, dragged by losses in FMCG and select banking shares.

The 30-share BSE benchmark declined by 14.57 points or 0.02 per cent to settle at 84,914.04, snapping its three-day recordbreaking run.

In the morning trade, the 30share BSE Sensex scaled the 85,000 level, jumping 234.62 points or 0.27 per cent to scale a new alltime intra-day peak of 85,163.23. China announcing stimulus measures to bolster its economy fuelled metal shares.

The index, however, hit a low of 84,716.07 in the afternoon session due to profit-taking at record Selling in Hindustan Unilever,

Kotak Mahindra Bank and ICICI Bank dragged the key index from the day's highs

The Nifty eked out gains of 1.35 points or 0.01 per cent to close at a fresh high of 25,940.40. During the day, it climbed 72.5 points or 0.27 per cent to hit a new record intra-day high of 26,011.55.

Investors are struggling to find clear directions following a record rally, traders said.



Vinod Nair, Head of Research, Geojit Financial Services said, Domestic benchmarks are attempting to sustain new highs, driven by the US Fed's aggressive rate cut. SEBI probes investment banks over handling of small IPOs

The captial markets regulator is looking to curb coordinated activity

Mumbai, Sept 24: India's securities regulator, worried about malpractice in a frothy IPO market, is investigating six domestic investment banks that have worked on offerings by small businesses, two sources with direct knowledge of the matter said.

The probes by the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) began earlier this year and are focused on the fees that the banks have charged, according to the sources who declined to be identified as the investigations are confidential.

It has found that at least half a dozen small investment banks have charged companies fees equivalent to 15% of funds raised practice of 1-3% in India.

via their IPO, they added. That's much higher than the standard Reuters was not able to learn the names of the banks under in-

vestigation. SEBI did not re-



spond to requests for comment. The investigations follow efforts by SEBI to warn investors about the dangers of investing in some small businesses as well as plans for tighter rules for

such IPOS. In India, smaller businesses with annual turnover of 50 million to 2.5 billion rupees (\$600,000-\$30 million) list on separate sections of the BSE and National Stock Exchange of India (NSE). There are fewer disclosure requirements and the offerings are vetted by the exchanges as opposed to large IPOs which have to be cleared by SEBI.

SEBI's preliminary findings suggest that the high fees are being charged to ensure the offerings are oversubscribed, according to one of the sources.

The regulator is looking to curb coordinated activity between banks and some investors who break rules to place huge bids both as high net-worth individuals and as ordinary retail investors, the second source said.

"These bids are not genuine and are cancelled at the time of allotment but the high subscriptions end up attracting more bids and investments from other investors," the source added.

India has more than 60 investment banks that actively work on IPOs for small businesses - a segment that like the rest of India's IPO market has been booming.

In the last fiscal year ended in March, 205 small firms raised 60 billion rupees, a sharp jump from the 125 companies that raised 22 billion rupees a year earlier, according to PRIME Database, a capital markets data provider.

For the April-August period this year, 105 small firms have raised 35 billion rupees with more than two-thirds of the offerings oversubscribed.

Ashwani Bhatia, a senior SEBI official, said this month that IPOs for small and medium-sized enterprises have lacked checks and balances. The regulator will soon issue a proposal for tighter rules, he added.

As part of its clampdown, the regulator in July capped share gains for a small firm's first day of trade at 90%

The sources also said that SEBI has asked auditors and exchanges to be vigilant and stop companies from listing in cases where there is dissatisfaction with the information stated in IPO documents.

SEBI is also working on 12-15 action points that would tweak how smaller firms go about their IPOs, one of the sources said.

"If speak just about the Olympics, despite costing India a medal, false perception was created that something wrong happened with her. If I was in Vinesh's place, I would've apologised to the country," added Dutt.

Dutt, a BJP supporter, also criticised Vinesh for being a part of the protests. "She should not have tarnished the image of the country by joining protests when the new Parliament was inaugurated May 23," Dutt opined.

Sridhar said that since their association is not long-term, he is taking it week by week. "We've made significant progress, and in two weeks, we'll head to tournaments in Europe," the 41-year-old Sridhar said. "I'm taking it week by week. Since we haven't committed to anything long-term, it's hard to plan for 2025. However, there are a couple of tournaments in 2025 that Sindhu should aim to peak at. The immediate focus is to enhance her consistency and get her back on the podium," added Sridhar.



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
