5.20 LAKH DOG BITE **CASES IN 22 MONTHS**

Bhubaneswar, Dec 4: The state has recorded a whopping 5.20 lakh dog bite cases between January 2023 and October 2024, according to data provided by the state government in the Assembly Wednesday.

This means stray canines or domesticated ones have targeted an average of 777 individuals every day during the period.

In a written reply to a question from Rayagada Congress MLA Kadraka Appala Swamy, Fisheries and Animal Resources Development Minister Gokulananda Mallick said that a total of 5,20,237 dog bite cases were reported in Odisha during those 22 months.

While 2,59,107 dog bite cases were reported during 2023, 2,43,565 such cases were recorded from January to October of 2024. The maximum number of such cases at 33,547, 32,561 and 29,801 were reported during January, February and March of 2024, respectively.

According to the 2019 Livestock Census, Odisha has 17.34 lakh stray dogs.

Following the Animal Birth Control Rule, 2023, municipalities and urban local bodies are implementing Animal Birth Control programme through organisations, which got project recognition certificates from the Animal Welfare Board of India, the minister said.


Murmu, the supreme commander of the country's defence forces, said this while gracing the Navy Day celebration at the Blu Flag Beach in the Pilgrim

Peanuts for farmers

Despite the introduction of a separate agriculture budget by the previous government in 2012-13 and the state receiving 'Krushi Karman Award' on five occasions since 2019, farmers in Odisha continue to languish in distress. This is evident as the state ranks second from the bottom - one spot above Jharkhand - in terms of national farmers' income data revealed in the Assembly Wednesday. Paradoxically, this situation persists even as people grapple with soaring prices of vegetables and pulses, which have contributed to the recent rise in the CPI inflation. In simple terms, while middlemen are reaping the bulk of the price hike, farmers are in the Minimum Support Price from $\stackrel{?}{\sim} 2.183$ to $\stackrel{?}{\sim} 3.100$ by the state government will impact farmers'

Bhubaneswar, Dec 4: Average monthly income of farmers in Odisha stands at a meagre ₹5.112, said Deputy Chief Minister and Agriculture Minister Kanak Vardhan Singh Deo in the Assembly, Wednesday, citing the National Statistical Office (NSO) data from 2018-19.

Singh Deo's statement came in response to a question posed by Congress MLA Taraprasad Bahinipati.

Bahinipati had asked the Agriculture minister to provide details about the per cap-



ita annual income of agricultural households in the state.

He had also sought details about the Minimum Support Price (MSP) offered by the state government per quintal of paddy, as well as the cost incurred by farmers to produce a quintal of paddy.

Additionally, the Congress MLA requested for information on the cost of paddy production in both irrigated and non-irrigated farmlands.

In his reply, the Deputy CM stated that for 2024-25 year. the MSP for common paddy has been set at ₹2,300 per quintal. He also added that the state government is offering additional support to farmers, bringing the total support to ₹3,100 per quintal.

Around 65 per cent of the population in Odisha is dependent on agriculture and deprived of government facilities, the Opposition claimed.

The NSO survey had revealed that the average monthly income of farmers in Odisha came down to ₹5,112 from ₹7,731 in 2015-16. The monthly earnings of farmers in states like Bihar and Haryana are more than that of Odisha.

It is worth mentioning here that the previous BJD government had claimed to double the farmers' income which didn't hannen Besides financial assistance was extended to small and marginal farmers under state-sponsored KALIA scheme (introduced in December 2018) but the average monthly income of farmers dropped by around 35 per cent.

According to the Commission for Agricultural Costs and Prices, the cost of production for paddy in Odisha stands at ₹2,067 per quintal.

Assassination attempt on SAD chief Sukhbir The shooter, a former

Khalistani terrorist Narain Singh Chaura, has been arrested

Amritsar, Dec 4: Shiromani Akali Dal leader Sukhbir Singh Badal escaped a bid on his life Wednesday when a former Khalistani terrorist fired from a close range at Punjab's ex-chief minister at the Golden Temple's entrance here but missed as plainclothes policemen overpowered him.

The audacious attack, which occurred at around 9:30am, was captured on cameras by mediapersons who had gathered to cover the second day of Badal performing the duty of 'sewadar' at the main gate of the Sikh shrine as religious penance for "mistakes" committed by the SAD government in Punjab from 2007 to 2017.

As other devotees were entering, the shooter, identified as former terrorist Narain Singh Chaura, slowly walked towards Badal, 62, a Z+ protectee who was sitting in a wheelchair due to a fractured leg, and pulled



out a gun from his pocket.

Assistant Sub-Inspector (ASI) Jasbir Singh, who was standing close to Badal in plainclothes. sensed the threat to the senior Akali leader and pounced on the shooter, grabbed his hands and pushed them upwards after which the attacker was overpowered with the help of other security personnel and Shiro mani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee (SGPC) task force members.

In the melee, the gun fired and the bullet hit the entrance wall of the shrine behind Sukhbir Badal, who escaped unhurt

Additional Deputy Commissioner Harpal Singh said the police had been keeping an eye on Chaura, 68, who was at the Golden Temple Tuesday as well.

Kolkata, Dec 4: A 104-year-old man was finally released from West Bengal's Malda Correctional Home after languishing in jail for 36 years for murder of his brother over a land dispute.







Murmu calls for extensive research in Ayurveda 'Irregularities' in exams: NSUI

Puri, Dec 4: President Droupadi Murmu Wednesday stressed the need for extensive research in Ayurveda as it holds remedies for many diseases

Addressing the 75th Foundation Day celebration of Gopabandhu Ayurveda College here, Murmu said a person can remain disease-free all along life by remaining connected with yoga and nature.

"Research is capable of proving the scientific basis of any method. Evidence builds trust among people and trust widens the path of acceptance," the President said while calling upon Ayurveda students to undertake research.

Stating that she was aware of the method of treatment prevalent among tribal people for certain diseases, Murmu said that some elder tribal people know about various diseases and the herbs needed to treat them.

"But that traditional knowledge is slowly disappearing. I hope some of you (students) will be interested in exploring



the scientific basis of that treatment. By doing so, the method can be saved from extinction and also be beneficial to the society," Murmu, who hails from Santal community in Mayurbhanj district, said.

The President said she would like to draw the attention of the students and researchers to Odisha's palm leaf manuscripts preserved at the State Museum as they have rich information regarding Ayurveda. Even many people have palm leaf manuscripts at their houses.

"Apart from literature, there are descriptions of medical

methods in those palm-leaf manuscripts. In this direction, I hope you will make efforts to bring our hidden treatment methods to the public by doing

research," the President said. The President said that around the world, people are now eager to learn yoga and Ayurveda.

"By maintaining a balanced diet, we can stay healthy. Yoga can help keep diseases at bay,' she said, adding, "Be yoga yukta to remain roga mukta (remain connected with yoga to be free from diseases).'

Stating that Ayurveda holds

remedies for many diseases, the President said that the students will engage themselves in extensive research in Ayurveda.

Govt speeds up paddy procurement process

Bhubaneswar, Dec 4: The state government is intensifying its efforts to expedite the paddy procurement process during the current kharif season to ensure farmers receive timely payments for their

At present, the procurement activities are in full swing in key districts, including Bargarh, Nuapada, Sambalpur, Kalahandi, and Bolangir. The government has outlined a phased approach for procurement across other districts, with detailed preparations underway to ensure a smooth process in the coming weeks.

In the five districts currently involved, a total of 803 mandis have been set up, with a distribution of 197 mandis in Bargarh, 78 in Nuapada, 129 in Sambalpur, 223 in Kalahandi, and 176 in Bolangir.

These mandis serve as the focal points where farmers can bring their paddy for sale. To ensure the process runs efficiently, the state government has appointed nodal officers to oversee procurement activities at each mandi.

The officers are tasked with monitoring all operations closely, ensuring compliance with established procedures, and addressing any issues that may arise

Additionally, the government is providing registered farmers with necessary information and issuing tokens to streamline the procurement process. Special attention is being paid to the facilities available at the mandis, with minimum amenities being provided to make the experience more convenient for the farmers.

One of the key aspects of the government's efforts is ensuring that farmers receive the minimum support price (MSP) directly into their bank accounts within 48 hours of selling their produce. The Civil Supply department is closely coordinating these efforts, ensuring prompt action and efficient processing to meet this goal.

These steps are part of the state's broader initiative to enhance the welfare of farmers and improve the agricultural ecosystem. By accelerating the procurement process and facilitating timely payments, the Odisha government is helping to secure farmers' livelihoods and contribute to the overall growth and development of the agricultural sector in the state.

66 fake beneficiaries of old-age pension caught

Aul, Dec 4: As many as 66 youths were caught taking oldage pension during an investigation into an alleged pension fraud at Aragal panchayat under this block in Kendrapara district, a report said.

Preliminary findings reveal that 66 youths were fraudulently listed as beneficiaries, block development officer (BDO) Minati Jagadev informed. Official sources said that,

prior to the last election, a government order (No. 329/55) approved pension applications for 303 beneficiaries. However, over 243 of these applicants were later found ineligible.

Despite being aged between

Despite being aged between 30 and 50, these persons falsely inflated their age in voter lists to qualify for pensions. Some even used forged certificates from local schools, including the Nadikula School in Aragal and Biripata High School in Jajpur, to substantiate their claims

to substantiate their claims.
After reports surfaced, several residents of Aragal panchayat raised allegations about the irregularities during a public grievance meeting held at Aul Block by the district Collector,

August 20. However, the officials reportedly did not accept their complaints. The, residents were instead asked to prepare a detailed list of ineligible beneficiaries and submit at the office. Officials assured that action would be taken once the list was submitted.

The development evoked sharp reactions as, the BJP held a press conference in Aul, demanding strict action against the officials involved in the pension scam, September 8. They also urged immediate disbursement of pensions to eligible persons.

When contacted, several senior citizens of the panchayat expressed their frustration. They stated they had been waiting for years to receive their pensions, only to be overlooked in favor of fraudulent claimants.

Following the emergence of this incident, block administration had initially halted payment of allowances for new beneficiaries and remained silent. However, with the investigation now underway, it has been revealed that 66 youths out of 243 beneficiaries have been implicated in vendor-related fraud during the verifications.

Four arrested for gangrape of minor

Berhampur: On the occasion of World Wildlife Conservation Day, a collaborative effort for the protection of the endangered Olive Ridley turtles was initiated Wednesday by Berhampur Sabuja Bahini, Eco Warriors Ganjam, officials from the Forest department and members of various local organisations. The programme took place at the Rushikulya river mouth near Bateswar Shiva temple beach. This marks the beginning of activities to safeguard the nesting and breeding process of these rare turtles. As the mass nesting season approaches, the government has also implemented strict measures to ensure the safety of these creatures. Discussions during the event focused on maintaining cleanliness and ensuring a risk-free environment for the nesting and hatching process in the upcoming days. As part of the programme, students from the Eco Club of Labar Shramik High School and other volunteers cleaned approximately 3 kms of the coastline, collecting over 50 kgs of plastic waste.

cern for the Forest department. During harvest season, elephants often stray into villages causing crop damage. This has led villagers to adopt unethical practices to protect their crops without thinking on its repercussions, ultimately resulting in elephant fatalities. The ongoing lack of effective solutions has prolonged the human-elephant conflict, especially in the Sambalpur division.

Sambalpur, Dec 4: Hard on the heels of death of three elephants due to electrocution, the Sambalpur Forest department has launched efforts to curb

A recent tragedy, where three elephants died after coming in contact with high-power electric live wires near Buromal under Naktideula forest range, has prompted the Forest officials to strengthen patrolling and make it widespread to curb such incidents from recurring.

Sambalpur Regional Chief Conservator of Forests (RCCF). T. Ashok Kumar, stated that the patrol teams in forested areas have been augmented and additional patrolling measures have been taken up in regions with significant elephant movement. Around 120 Forest personnel have been assigned to patrol various locations.

In high-risk areas for elephants, particularly in the Redhakhole Forest Division, 124 sensitive villages (hotspots)



have been identified. Forest officials, in collaboration with Tata Power Western Odisha Distribution Limited (TPWODL) personnel, are conducting regular inspections to check for illegal power connections and unauthorised electrical setups such as hooking.

Forest dept scrambles to rein in jumbo deaths

Following electrocution deaths of three elephants, Sambalpur Forest Circle has

To enhance awareness and vigilance, 400 community members, known as 'Gajasathis', have been engaged in the hotspots. They are tasked with monitoring elephant activity, safeguarding paddy fields, and sharing critical information regarding illegal electrical connections and elephant-related risks.

This multi-pronged approach aims to reduce human-elephant conflict and ensure the safety of local communities and wildlife in the region.

Regular awareness campaigns are being conducted through public address system to educate people about the consequences of illegal electricity connections, the penalties associated with such actions, and the government schemes available to compensate crop damage caused by wildlife.

Additionally, residents are

urged not to panic upon spot ting elephants near villages or paddy fields. Instead, they are advised to immediately inform Forest officials or trained ele phant response teams like 'Ga jasathis'. The Forest depart ment is also involving local villagers to take responsibility and collaborate in efforts to en sure the safety of elephants and other wild animals.

According to available data, the Sambalpur Forest Circle re corded seven elephant deaths in the past year, including three each in Sambalpur and Redhak hole Forest Divisions and one in Bargarh Forest Division. Tragically, human fatalities have also occurred, with 10 deaths caused by elephant attacks under six forest divisions. Of these, five were reported in Sambalpur Forest Division. four in Bargarh, and one in Bamra.

All bereaved families have received government compensation of ₹6 lakh each, as confirmed by the RCCF. These measures aim to mitigate human-wildlife conflicts and foster harmony between local communities and wildlife

Indian Navy helicopter makes emergency landing in paddy field

Baripada, Dec 4: An Indian Navy helicopter made an emergency landing at a paddy field in Amarda village under Rasgovindpur police station limits in Mayurbhanj district Wednesday, police said.

The helicopter, which was on a routine sortie, encountered a technical glitch and was forced

to make an emergency landing at a field. Farmers working in the paddy fields noticed the helicopter hovering as it attempted to land in the centre of the field. However, the helicopter was unable to land there due to flying paddy stubble and instead descended on a nearby field. After landing, the pilot came out of the helicopter and examined it.

Fortunately, the pilot and crew

the helicopter sustained damage. The incident caused a panic among the farmers, who were initially startled by the situation but were later excited to get a close-up view of the naval helicopter. After the pilot spent approximately 30-40 minutes repairing, the helicopter took off once again, leaving the villagers filled with excitement and curiosity.

lected salaries from the DMF from October 2017 to May 2021

while Sitanshu from June 2021 to January 2024. Similarly, Uday has also been drawing salary from the DMF fund April 2024 onwards. This practice is reportedly not in compliance with the law.

It is worth noting that the district collector serves as the chairperson of the DMF, and the Project Director (PD) of the DRDA and Zilla Parishad acts as its CEO. All approvals and disbursements related to fund usage are made under the signatures of the chairperson and CEO.

However, questions have come up as to how these government employees, already receiving regular salaries, were additionally compensated from the DMF fund. Residents have demanded a detailed investigation to determine accountability and initiate legal proceedings to recover the full amount.

A Financial Wasteland

t was a bold idea, encapsulated in a snappy slogan: "From billions to trillions." A decade ago, when private capital was sloshing into developing economies, governments and development institutions saw an opportunity to turbocharge progress on poverty reduction and other development goals. "The good news is that, globally, there are ample savings, amounting to \$17 trillion, and liquidity is at historical highs," read a key strategy document of the time.

The bad news is that it all turned out to be a fantasy. Instead, the financing landscape for development has been upended. Since 2022, foreign private creditors have extracted nearly \$141 billion more in debt-service payments from public-sector borrowers in developing economies than they have disbursed in new financing.

But there is one striking exception: In 2022 and 2023, the World Bank and other multilateral institutions pumped in nearly \$85 billion more than they collected in debt-service payments. Thus, multilateral institutions have been thrust into a role that they were never designed to play. They are now lenders of last resort, deploying scarce long-term development finance to compensate for the exit of other creditors

Last year, multilateral institutions accounted for about 20 per cent of developing economies' long-term external debt stock, five points higher than in 2019. The World Bank's International Development Association (IDA) now accounts for nearly half of the development aid going from multilateral institutions to the 26 poorest countries. And in 2023, the World Bank accounted for one-third of the overall net debt inflows going into IDA-eligible countries – \$16.7 billion, more than three times the volume a decade ago.

These developments reflect a broken financing system. Since capital – both public and private – is essential for development, long-term progress will depend to a large degree on restarting the capital flows that benefited most developing countries in the first decade of this century. But the risk-reward balance cannot remain as lopsided as it is today, with multilateral institutions and government creditors bearing nearly all the risk while private creditors reap nearly all the rewards.

When global interest rates skyrocketed in 2022 and 2023, leading to increased debt distress in the poorest countries, the World Bank followed its usual practice. It shifted from providing low-interest loans to providing grants to countries at high risk of distress. It also increased its overall financing for these countries, typically with generous repayment terms ranging from 30 to 50 years. But private creditors headed for the exits, with high interest rates more than fully compensating them for the investment risks they had taken.

In the absence of a predictable

global system for restructuring debt. most countries facing distress opted to tough it out rather than default and risk being cut off indefinitely from global capital markets. In some cases, new financing arriving from the World Bank promptly went back out the door to repay private creditors.

In 2023, developing countries spent a record \$1.4 trillion – nearly 4 per cent of their gross national income – just to service their debt. While principal repayments remained stable at about \$951 billion, interest payments surged by more than one-third, to about \$406 billion. The result, for many developing countries, has been a devastating diversion of resources away from areas critical for long-term growth and development, such as health and education.

The squeeze on the poorest and most vulnerable countries – those eligible to borrow from the IDA – has been especially fierce. Their interest payments on external debt have quadrupled since 2013, hitting an all-time high of \$34.6 billion in 2023. On average, interest payments now amount to nearly 6 per cent of IDA-eligible countries' export earnings – a level not reached since 1999. For some countries, the burden ranges from 10 per cent to as much as 38 per cent of export earnings. It is no wonder that more than half of IDA-eligible countries are either in debt distress or at high risk of it, or that private creditors have

These facts imply that the world's poorest countries are suffering not from liquidity problems, but from a metastasizing solvency crisis. It might be easy to kick the can down the road by providing these countries with just enough financing to help them meet their immediate repayment obligations. But doing so will simply prolong their purgatory. These countries need faster growth if they are ever going to reduce their debt burdens, but faster growth requires higher investment. Given the size of their debt burdens, that is unlikely to materialise. On current trends, their ability to repay will never be restored.

We need to face reality: the poorest countries facing debt distress need debt relief if they are to have a shot at sustained economic growth and lasting prosperity. A twenty-first-century global system is needed to ensure fair play in lending to all developing economies. Sovereign borrowers deserve at least some of the protections that are routinely afforded to debt-strapped businesses and individuals under national bankruptcy laws. Private creditors that make risky, high-interest loans to poor countries ought to bear a fair share of the cost when

In an era of deepening international mistrust, it will be a struggle to establish these precepts. But without them, all major development goals will remain in peril, facing the same fate as the "billions to trillions" promise.

pointed high-power committee to resolve grievances of farmers agitating at Shambhu border has in its interim report significantly stated that stagnancy of agricultural production for three decades coupled with spiralling debts in Puniab and Haryana have created a distressing situation for farmers.

As per the 11-page report, it's estimated that the debt of farmers increased manifold in 2022-23—while in Punjab it was Rs 73,673 crore, in Haryana it was Rs 76,530. Obviously, the challenge is to make agriculture viable and sustainable by experimenting on various available options. "Declining net farm productivity, rising production costs, inadequate marketing system and shrinking farm employment have contributed to the deceleration in farm income growth. Small and marginal farmers along with farm workers, are the most affected and vulnerable segments of this economic squeeze", the report rightly observed.

It further said that Punjab has not escaped the "suicide epidemic," evident among farmers in some other states. The state witnessed 16,000 suicides by farmers, mostly small and marginal and landless farm workers between 2000 and 2015 and in the last five years of the past decade figures remain more or less the same. The panel noted: "As a matter of fact, rural society as a whole is under severe economic stress. At the national level, 46% of total workers are absorbed in agriculture whose share in income is only 15%. it said. "Not only this, there's a very high rate of disguised unemployment and a large number of unpaid family workers. A significant proportion among them is working-poor."

Though some steps have been taken such as the rationalisation of all agri-related centrally sponsored schemes into two umbrella schemes,

having 18 components with total proposed expenditure of over Rs 1 lakh crore, it can't be denied the condition of the agriculture sector remains much to be desired. There are plans that PM Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana will promote sustainable agriculture, the other Krishonnati Yojana will address food security and agricultural self-sufficiency by increasing productivity of farm produce, including oilseeds.

Apart from these, the launch of a National Mission on Natural Farming has seen the increase in subsidy to Rs 20,000 per hectare for farmers willing to shift from green revolution techniques to natural farming. Undoubtedly, the green revolution that required costly inputs - high yielding seeds, chemical fertilisers and tubewell irrigation -- steadily lifted food production and helped the country become self-sufficient in the 1990s. However, it has had adverse side effects such as excessive fertilizer run-off, excessive pesticide use, degradation of land and salinity through excess irrigation. These as well as high cost of production have encouraged experts to seek solutions in natural farming. There have been instances where natural farming has been able to get more or less the same yields, not just

like Japan, and the costs of production are much less. There has been much talk of

organic farming, a close cousin of natural farming, which, however, lays no claim to high yields. But organic products have a large Western market and are exported at fancy prices by many countries. India too has a niche market for organic products, but this is much too small for the vast mass of farmers who feed the country. Though Punjab farmers are still interested to continue with the green revolution, obviously for getting the MSP and high yields, there is need for experimentation and the national mission is expected to carry out innovation at various places and popularise the same. The ICAR and other research institutions have a vital role to play and ensure the maximum possible yield that natural farming can give by adopting practices followed in other countries.

There must be a balance between high productive agriculture with pesticides and chemicals and natural farming. India has high potential for exports and new markets need to be exploited. For this, natural farming based on organic methods of cultivation must be promoted.

Another aspect for seriously considering natural farming is the crisis we face in water requite some time by agricultural experts to shift to dryland farming due to scarcity of water in certain regions of the country. Rice needs about 4000 cubic metres of water per tonne for irrigation. In fact, of the total agricultural greenhouse gas (GHG) emission in India, close to 18% is contributed by rice cultivation. Added to this, free electricity has meant that the water table in paddy growing areas in Punjab and Haryana has been depleted at an unsustainable rate.

As per the Central Ground Water Board (2020), of the assessed farm blocks in Punjab, Rajasthan and Haryana, over 78%, 69% and 60% were overexploited for water respectively. Besides, the standing water used for rice cultivation has been heavily concentrated with fertilizer and pesticide runoffs and causing cancer among a section of farmers.

It's a fact that the agricultural system continues to be led by smallholder producers and with heavy reliance on rainfed irrigation. It's necessary these producers are helped in using soil and water resources as also fertilizers in creating resilient and adaptive systems. Accelerating R&D in developing new climate-resilient crop varieties, enhancing oilseed production and protection to climate shocks are welcome.

Experts have voiced the need for following a balanced approach in the changing landscape of Indian agriculture, mainly due to food shortages having disappeared. The other aspect of the issue is land degradation due to excessive use of pesticides and chemicals. Keeping in view these aspects as also the environmental concerns, there is obviously a need to formulate a sustainable approach to agriculture. In evolving this approach, consideration has also to be given on basic income support and remunerative prices.

Yet, many continue to overlook this critical aspect of financial planning, potentially exposing their loved ones to legal complications and also financial distress. It is highly advisable to lodge nominations in respect of all assets for which this facility has been made available, for example - bank account, bank locker, demat account, mutual funds, flats in co-operative housing societies, provident fund accounts etc.

Nomination in banking is governed by the Banking Companies (Nomination) Rules, 1985. It allows account holders to nominate a person to receive their deposit amount in the event of their death.

As per pension laws, nomination is governed by the

tion is governed by the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) regulations. It allows investors to nominate a person to receive their securities or benefits in the event of their death.

Banking Companies (Nomination) Rules 1985 permits banks to pay dues to nominees in the event of death of depositor(s) without asking for succession certificate or This simplifies settlement. Of course, as trustee the nominee is accountable to legal heirs.

When a bank account holder has availed of nomination facility, the same may be indicated on the passbook so that, in case of death of the account holder, the relatives can know from the passbook that the nomination facility has been availed of by the deceased depositor. Banks may accordingly introduce the practice of recording on the face of the passbook the position regarding availing of nomination facility with the legend "Nomination Registered." This may be done in the case of term deposit receipts also.

In addition, banks are also advised to indicate the name of the nominee in the passbooks / statement of accounts / FDRs. in case the customer is agreeable to the same, as this would be helpful to the customers/ nominees

In general, nomination in India has the following legal characteristics: i) Nominations can be revoked or changed by the nominator

inations are not considered as wills or testaments; iii) Nominations override the general succession laws, ensuring that the nominated person receives the assets or benefits; iv) Nominations may have tax implications, such as income tax or wealth tax.

The Lok Sabha on 3 December, 2024 passed the Banking Laws (Amendment) Bill, 2024, which allows bank account holders to have up to four nominees in their accounts.

Legally, a nominee is treated as an interim trustee. For example, if a nominee is there and happens to be an outsider, but receives money on death of account holder, the legal heirs can file a case in a court. In such a situation, the nominee has to pay back the money to the legal heirs as he is only an interim trustee. It is essential for nominees to understand their legal responsibilities and seek professional advice, if needed, to ensure they fulfill their roles effectively.

EVE-TEASING TO MATRIMONIAL SCAMS

Delhi women helpline gets 2L calls in 4 months

The complaints are primarily regarding domestic violence, sexual harassment, cyber fraud and physical abuse



New Delhi, Dec 4: From complaints about eve-teasing and cyber fraud in matrimonial scams to disputes over metro seat reservations and altercations with auto drivers, Delhi's women helpline 181 received over 2.41 lakh calls between July and November 2024.

Previously managed by the Delhi Commission for Women, the helpline was taken over by the Women and Child Development (WCD) Department July

Within the first two days

of the transition, the helpline recorded 1,024 calls, marking a sharp increase in public en-

Data shows that during this four-month period, 90,414 calls were categorised as hoax, 2,091 as follow-ups, 29,277 as general inquiries, 2,096 as nuisance calls, and 260 as abusive calls. Common complaints included issues like eve-teasing, disputes with auto drivers and conflicts over metro seat reservations.

Out of the total calls, 8,560 cases were formally registered, of which 146 have been resolved, while the remaining

cases are still under investigation. The complaints are primarily regarding domestic violence, sexual harassment, cyber fraud and physical

An official highlighted that the surge in calls reflects a growing public awareness of safety issues. "We often receive calls about a man occupying a women's reserved seat in the metro, verbal abuse by auto drivers, or inappropriate comments from strangers. Women are seeking information about the help available to them," the official stated.

Officials also noted a rise in cyber fraud cases targeting women. One particularly challenging case involved a scammer who gained a woman's trust through a matrimonial site before disappearing with her money. Delhi breathes easy after 50 days

AQI in 'moderate' category

New Delhi, Dec 4: Delhi breathed clean air Wednesday after a gap of 50 days as the air quality was recorded in the 'moderate' category, offering much-needed respite from the high levels of pollution.

The 24-hour average Air Quality Index (AQI) of the city was recorded at 178 at 4 pm, registering an improvement from 268 Tuesday.

Earlier, the AQI was recorded in the 'moderate' category with a reading of 198 October 15. However, the AQI had deteriorated and shifted to the 'poor' category the following day, according to Central Pollution Control Board data.

Speaking about the improved air quality, an official of the India Meteorological Department said strong surface winds were forecast in the city Wednesday. The winds will blow till December 7 when a new western disturbance is expected, which will lead to moderate fog starting December 8.

Of the 38 air quality monitoring stations in the city, only Sri Aurobindo Marg reported air quality in the 'very poor' category Wednesday, while eight others showed air quality in the 'poor' category. The remaining reported 'moderate' air quality. according to the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB).

The Air Quality Early Warning System for Delhi has forecasted that the air quality is likely to remain in the moderate category from Thursday, with a prediction of deterioration to the poor category on Friday and Saturday.

With clean air, the daytime temperature was recorded at 28 degrees Celsius, three notches above the normal, according to the India Meteorological Department (IMD).

Sikkim team assesses glacial flood risk in Lhonak Valley

Gangtok, Dec 4: An expedition team from the Sikkim government's Science & Technology Department Wednesday reached Muguthang in North Sikkim's Lhonak valley to assess the impact of glacial floods and its mitigation through various measures, officials said.

The team investigated whether Lhonak lake's behaviour was aligned with typical patterns of glacial floods which carry debris. sediment and boulders with massive destructive potential, officials said.

The study team observed that flood water from Lhonak lake slowed down as it passed through the wide areas of the valley between Goma and Dolma Sampa sections.

This natural dissipation of force caused debris deposition, reducing the flood's destructive impact downstream, the officials said. It was only below Dolma Sam-

pa that the flood picked up momentum and debris causing widespread devastation downstream. The team also analyzed the sub-surface geology at Dolma

of the Lhonak River. These insights will be crucial in evaluating feasibility of a retention structure at Dolma Sampa, which could regulate floodwaters and protect downstream

Sampa and measured discharge



data that will help inform future flood management strategies

The expedition team comprised experts in geology, ecology, engineering, hydrology, and remote sensing from the Departments of Science & Technology, of Mines & Geology and the National Disaster

Management Authority. The team endured freezing temperatures of minus 10 degrees Celsius and high winds while camping in Muguthang at 14,000 feet to conduct their studies

The expedition team will re-

turn to Gangtok Thursday carrying critical data and insights that will inform future strategies for managing glacial flood risks.

Their findings will form the basis of a concept note, which will undergo wider consultation and feasibility assessments, officials added. This initiative marks the fourth glacial lake expedition by the Government of Sikkim, aimed at building resilience to safeguard lives, livelihoods, critical infrastructure,

and the environment. The Lhonak lake had burst in October last year triggering a flash flood in Teesta river that claimed more than 40 lives and caused large-scale destruction of road and communication infrastructure in North Sikkim.

Ghaziabad (UP), Dec 4: A delegation of Congress leaders led by Rahul Gandhi on its way to violence-hit Sambhal was stopped by Uttar Pradesh Police at Ghazipur border here Wednesday and had to return, with the Leader of Opposition in Lok Sabha terming the action as "anti-constitutional".

The Opposition party's leaders, including Priyanka Gandhi Vadra, returned to Delhi after staying at the Delhi-Uttar Pradesh border for about two hours, failing to proceed onwards. A maassive traffic jam was

witnessed at the Ghazipur border on the Delhi-Meerut Expressway in the morning as Congress workers gathered there amid heavy security deployment and barricading. The carriageway from Delhi to Uttar Pradesh was heavily congested, with thousands of commuters facing a harrowing time on the road.

After being stopped at the Ghazipur border, Rahul Gandhi said he was ready to go alone to Sambhal with police but was not allowed.

"We are trying to go to Sambhal. Police are refusing, not allowing us. As the leader of Opposition in Lok Sabha, it is my right to go... I said that I am ready to go alone, I am ready to go with the police but they did not accept that either," he said. "Now they are saying that if we come back in a few days, they will let us go. This is actually against the right of the leader of opposition in Lok Sabha. I should be allowed to go," he told reporters. BJP leaders in Uttar Pradesh decried the Congress's move as a "drama" aimed at "appeasing its Muslim vote bank".

Meanwhile, Congress legislative party leader in Uttar Pradesh assembly Aradhana Mishra 'Mona' claimed in Lucknow that she was supposed to be a part of the delegation but was put under "house arrest".

"I am under house arrest. This is hooliganism and anarchy by the government. Rahul ji, the Congress party and I will visit Sambhal today, tomorrow or whenever

we can," she said.

Prohibitory orders are in place in Sambhal where violence erupted November 24 over a court-ordered mosque survey, killing four people and injuring several others. Holding up a copy of the Constitution in his hands amid heavy security at the Delhi-Uttar Pradesh border, Rahul Gandhi said the police's decision was against democracy.

Priyanka Vadra said what happened in Sambhal was wrong and as the LoP, Rahul Gandhi has the constitutional right to visit it.

Later, Rahul Gandhi posted on X: "The police stopped us from going to Sambhal. Being the leader of the Opposition, it is my right and duty to go there. Yet I was stopped. I am ready to go alone, but they did not agree to that either. This is against the Constitution. Why is the BJP scared - why is it using the police to hide its failures? Why is it suppressing the message of truth and brotherhood?

Curbs under Section 163 (power to issue an order in urgent cases of nuisance or apprehended danger) of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS), which were set to expire Sunday, have now been extended till December 31 in Sambhal.

Sambhal District Magistrate Rajendra Pensia Tuesday wrote to the police commissioners of Gautam Buddh Nagar and Ghaziabad as well as the police chiefs of Amroha and Bulandshahr districts, urging them to stop Rahul Gandhi in their districts.

Earlier in the day, Ghaziabad Police Commissioner Ajav Kumar Mishra said, "We will not permit Rahul Gandhi to Sambhal as prohibitory orders have been issued by the administration there.

ISRO reschedules Proba-3 launch after detecting 'anomaly'

Sriharikota (Andhra Pradesh), Dec 4: The ISRO has rescheduled the launch of PSLV-C59 to Thursday due to an "anomaly" detected in the PROBA-3 spacecraft, the agency announced Wednesday, minutes before the scheduled launch.

The Bangalore-headquar tered space agency had originally planned the launch at 4.08 pm Wednesday from the spaceport here. "Due to an anomaly detected in PROBA-3 spacecraft PSLV-C59/PROBA-3 launch rescheduled to tomor row at 16:12 hours," the space agency said in an update minutes ahead of the lift-off.



Dubbed as world's first initiative of its kind, the Proba-3 (Project for Onboard Anatomy) consists of two satellites -- Coronagraph (310kgs) and Occulter (240kgs) -- in which two spacecraft would fly together as one maintaining precise formation down to a single millimetre to study the Corona, the Sun's outer atmosphere.

The European Space Agency (ESA) said the Corona is much hotter than the Sun itself and it is where space weather originates. It is also a topic of widespread scientific and practical interest.

Rajya Sabha clears Bill to replace 100 vears old Boiler Act

New Delhi, Dec 4: The Rajya Sabha Wednesday cleared a Bill to provide for the regulation of boilers, safety of life and prop erty of persons from the danger of explosions of steam-boilers

and uniformity in registration.

The Boilers Bill, 2024, seeks to repeal the century-old Boil ers Act, 1923. The Bill, which aims to decriminalise seven of fences and promote ease of doing business, was cleared in the Upper House by a voice vote.

The Bill also has provisions to ensure the safety of persons working inside a boiler. It also provides that repair of boilers should be undertaken by qualified and competent persons. Piloting the Bill, Minister for Commerce and Industry Piyush Goval said several colonial-era laws were prevalent across sectors in the country and the proposed legislation seeks to do away with the colonial mindset. The government is revisit ing pre-1947 laws to make any required changes, he added.

"This Boilers Bill in a way makes the country safe. We need the Boilers Bill to ensure safety, it mandates that competent and qualified people inspect boilers," said

Jabalpur, Dec 4: The Madhya Pradesh High Court has ordered a man to plant 50 trees of indigenous species within a month, while accepting his apology in a criminal contempt case.

A division bench comprising Justice Sanjeev Sachdeva and Justice Vinay Saraf issued the order December 2 in a suo motu criminal contempt petition against Rahul Sahu.

"Keeping in view the conduct, we direct that respondent (Sahu) shall plant 50 trees of indigenous species in the area of Sambalgarh in Morena district. The trees shall be of indigenous nature of at least height of 4 feet," it said. "The trees shall be plant-

ed under the direction of Sub Divisional Officer (Forest), Sambalgarh. The trees will be planted within a period of one month," it said. The high court took suo motu action on a con-

tempt reference received from the Judicial Magistrate First Class (JMFC), Sambalgarh.

"The respondent is present in person. He (Sahu) has filed his affidavit dated October 15, 2024

and has contended that he is a semi-literate person and has studied only up to Class X," the court order said.

"He submits that he does not have formal legal education and has limited knowledge of legal procedure and is unfamiliar with the decorum and requirement of court proceeding," it said.

The order said that Sahu expressed regret and remorse at his conduct and furnished unconditional apology and un-

dertakes to be careful in future. "He has volunteered to undertake social service," the

court said.

The area where the trees shall be planted would be decided by the Sub Divisional Officer (Forest), Sambalgarh, it added.

'The respondent complying with the direction, the proceedings shall stand closed,' the court order said.

Sahu posted certain photograph of the court in Morena with a comment on a social media platform related to court proceedings when a family case filed by his wife was being heard, his advocate Ashish Singh Jadoun told PTI.

The JMFC took cognisance of the social media post and served notice to Sahu, but he did not respond despite giving an opportunity.

The JMFC later referred the matter to the high court, the counsel said.





New York: UnitedHealthcare CEO Brian Thompson was killed Wednesday morning in what investigators suspect was a targeted shooting outside a Manhattan hotel where the health insurer was holding an investor conference. MARTIAL LAW Yoon faces impeachment

The Opposition has threatened to impeach President Yoon if he

does not resign voluntarily, following his ill-fated move to impose martial law

Seoul, Dec 4: South Korean lawmakers Wednesday proposed impeaching President Yoon Suk Yeol for his sudden decision to declare martial law, which he rescinded after a chaotic standoff between parliament and the army that damaged the country's standing.

Yoon's declaration of martial law late Tuesday attempted to ban political activity and censor the media in South Korea, which has Asia's fourth largest economy and is a key US ally.

Washington had no advance notice of the decision, US Secretary of State Antony Blinken told Reuters, adding that he expected to speak with his South Korean counterpart in the coming days.

Armed troops had forced their way into the National Assembly building in Seoul but stood back when parliamentary aides sprayed them with fire extinguishers. Lawmakers re-



iected the martial law decision while protesters scuffled with police outside

Civic and labour groups held a candlelight vigil Wednesday evening in downtown Seoul calling for Yoon's resignation - a reminder of the massive candlelight protests that led to the impeachment of former President Park Geun-hye in 2017. They then marched to the presidential office.

Six South Korean opposition parties submitted a bill in parliament to impeach Yoon, who had already faced accusations of heavy-handed leadership from his opponents and from within his own party, with voting set for Friday or Saturday.

A plenary session to formally introduce the bill was scheduled to begin shortly after mid-

The leader of Yoon's ruling People Power Party called for Defence Minister Kim Yong-hyun to be fired and the entire cabinet to resign. Kim has offered to resign, the defence ministry said.

The crisis rattled global financial markets and left South Korea's benchmark KOSPI index .KS11 down 1.4%, taking its year-to-date losses to over 7% and making it the worst performing major stock market in Asia this year.

The president then rescinded the declaration of martial law, around six hours after its proclamation. Protesters outside the National Assembly shouted and clapped. "We won!" they chanted, and one demonstrator banged on a drum.

'DODGED A BULLET'

If Yoon resigned or was removed from office, Prime Minister Han Duck-soo would fill in as leader until a new election was held within 60 days.

"South Korea as a nation dodged a bullet, but President Yoon may have shot himself in the foot," Danny Russel, vice president of the Washington-based Asia Society Policy Institute, said of the first martial law declaration in South Korea since 1980.

Blinken said he welcomed Yoon's decision to rescind the martial law declaration.

South Korea's political situation is an "internal matter", China's Foreign Minister Wang Yi said. Russia said it was following the "tragic" events in South Korea with concern.

French PM faces no-confidence vote

Paris, Dec 4: France's far-right and left-wing forces are expected to join together Wednesday to oust Prime Minister Mi chel Barnier's government in a historic no-confidence vote prompted by budget disputes.

If the motion succeeds, it would mark the first time a French government has been toppled this way in more than

President Emmanuel Macron insisted he will serve the rest of his term until 2027 despite growing Opposition calls for his departure amid the turmoil. However, Macron will need to appoint a new prime minister for the second time this year, further reshaping France's political balance after his party's losses in

July's legislative elections. The political drama comes as Macron, currently on a presidential visit to Saudi Arabia, dismissed the threat of a government collapse, according to French media reports Tuesday saying discussions about his potential removal from office were "make-believe politics."

The no-confidence motion rose from fierce Opposition to Barnier's proposed budget. The National Assembly, France's lower house of parliament, is deeply fractured, with no single party holding a majority.

In the remarks delivered virtually to her supporters at an event in New York, Hasina, presently living in India, also claimed that there were plans to kill her and her sister Sheikh Rehana just like their father Sheikh Mujibur Rahman was assassinated in 1975.

Describing Yunus as "power-hungry", Hasina alleged that the places of worship in Bangladesh are under attack and the current dispensation has totally



failed to deal with the situation. Hasina was speaking to supporters of her Awami League party at the event organised Sunday to mark "Bijoy Dibos" or Victory



Al-Golani: Leader behind Syria's shock insurgency

Beirut, Dec 4: Over the past dozen years, Syrian militant leader Abu Mohammed al-Golani has worked to remake his public image and the insurgency he commands, renouncing longtime ties to al-Qaida and consolidating power before emerging from the shadows.

Now al-Golani, 42, seeks to seize the moment yet again, leading his fighters in a stunning offensive that has put them in control of Syria's largest city, reigniting the country's long civil war and raising new questions about President

Bashar Assad's hold on power. The surge and al-Golani's place at the head of it are evidence of a remarkable transformation. Al-Golani's success on the battlefield follows years of maneuvering among extremist organisations while eliminating competitors and former

Along the way he moved to distance himself from al-Qaida, polishing his image and his extremist group's de-facto "salvation government" in an attempt to win over international governments and the country's religious and ethnic minorities. Putting himself forward as

a champion of pluralism and tolerance, al-Golani's rebranding efforts sought to broaden his group's public support and legitimacy.

AL-GOLANI'S BEGINNINGS IN IRAO

Al-Golani's ties to al-Qaida stretch back to 2003 when he joined extremists battling US troops in Iraq. The native of Syria was detained several times by the US military, but remained in Iraq. During that time, al-Qaida usurped likeminded groups and formed the extremist Islamic State of Iraq, led by Abu Bakr al-Baghdadi.

The move paved the way for al-Golani to assert full control over fracturing militant groups. A year later, his alliance rebranded again as HTS as the groups merged, consolidating al-Golani's power in northwest Syria's Idlib province.

Afterward HTS clashed with independent Islamist militants who opposed the merger, further emboldening al-Golani and and his group as the leading power in northwestern Syria, able to rule with an iron fist.

India votes for UNGA resolution on Palestine

United Nations, Dec 4: India voted in favour of a UN General Assembly resolution that called for the withdrawal of Israel from the Palestinian territory occupied since 1967, including East Jerusalem, and reiterated the call for achieving a comprehensive, just and lasting peace

in West Asia. The draft resolution 'Peaceful settlement of the question of Palestine' tabled by Senegal was overwhelmingly adopted in the 193-member General Assembly Tuesday.

India was among the 157 nations that voted in favour, while eight Member States -Argentina, Hungary, Israel, Micronesia, Nauru, Palau, Papua New Guinea and the United States voted against it. Cameroon, Czechia, Ecuador, Georgia, Paraguay, Ukraine and Uruguay abstained.

The resolution, adopted as orally revised, reiterated its call for the "achievement, without



delay, of a comprehensive, just and lasting peace in the Middle East (West Asia)" on the basis of the relevant United Nations res olutions and an end to the Israel occupation that began in 1967, including of East Jerusalem. The resolution called for the

"withdrawal of Israel from the Palestinian territory occupied since 1967, including East Jeru salem" and for the realisation of the inalienable rights of the Palestinian people, primarily the right to self-determination and the right to their independent State.

Services growth eases moderately in November

Employment growth fastest since 2005

New Delhi, Dec 4: India's services PMI marginally dipped to 58.4 in November while employment in the segment recorded robust growth, a monthly survey said Wednesday.

The seasonally adjusted HSBC India Services Business Activity Index was down marginally to 58.4 from 58.5 in October as sales increased at a softer pace. Last month, the country's services

PMI recovered from its 10-month low. In the Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI) parlance, a print above 50 means expansion, while a score below 50 denotes contraction.

"India posted a strong 58.4 services PMI in November, down only a fraction from the prior month's 58.5. During November, services sector employment notably grew at the fastest pace ever recorded since this survey began in 2005," Pranjul Bhandari, Chief India Economist at HSBC, said. Panellists of the survey continued to signal improving international demand for their

The hiring surge reflected the sector's improving business confidence, growing new orders, and vigorous international demand. At the same time, high food and labour costs drove up input and output prices to their fastest rates in 15 months and nearly 12 years, respectively

Export curbs drive boom in barter smuggling with B'desh

The smuggling distorts India's bullion trade with discounts from official prices, hides unaccounted wealth, and weakens New Delhi's efforts to curb food inflation by limiting exports

Petrapole, Dec 4: Guards on either side of a border checkpoint between India and Bangladesh scour vehicles and frisk passengers in a hunt for illicit consignments of gold and drugs, as well as food staples such as sugar, grain and even onions.

"We caught smugglers in August who were transporting sugar concealed beneath a laver of sand in their vehicle," said an officer of India's Border Security Force (BSF) in the northeastern city of Shillong, who sought anonymity.

Despite such efforts, illegal barter trade of gold for food items has surged since mid-2022,

as India's export curbs fuelled a vast disparity with prices in Bangladesh, causing combined government revenue losses of billions of dollars. The practice of smuggling

gold to buy grain has persisted even after India, the world's second-largest gold consumer, slashed 9 percentage points from its import duty in July, taking it to the lowest in more than a decade.

It is driven by significantly higher food prices in Bangladesh, which traditionally relies heavily on Indian supply.

But instead of simply exploiting the price difference between Indian and overseas gold, grey market operators use gold to



wheat, and onions smuggled into Bangladesh.

The goods are concealed, said a BSF officer, citing the example of a smuggler in West Bengal, arrested in October with 4.7 kg (10.3 lb) of gold worth ₹35.1 million (\$414,000) stashed in his motorcycle's air filter.

He had been offered just ₹10,000 rupees to ferry 18 gold biscuits into India to pay for food items already smuggled into Bangladesh, said the officer, who spoke on condition of anonymity.

But gold prices have rallied more than 50% since the middle of that year, encouraging wider activity by grey market operators to exploit the arbitrage opportunity as food prices in Bangladesh spiked as much as 150% over those in India.

The gold-for-grain trade flourished as India steadily tightened curbs on food exports over the past two years, said a grains dealer in the eastern city of Kolkata, who spoke on condition of anonymity. More than 2 million metric

tons of staples have been smuggled into Bangladesh each vear in exchange for gold, up from less than 300,000 tons before India's curbs, officials estimate.

"The government limits farm exports to quickly lower local prices. But smuggling weakens that strategy, and farmers end up bearing the brunt of the restrictions," said Balwant Holkar, a trader from Lasalgaon in Maharashtra. Meanwhile India's illegal imports of about 156 metric tons of gold last year, worth about \$9 billion, were up from 100 tons in 2022, the World Gold Council (WGC) says. Nearly a third originated

from Bangladesh, say industry and government sources, with the bulk used to settle payments for smuggled grain, the BSF and India's Directorate of Revenue Intelligence (DRI) officials told Reuters.

The drawn match left both the players on an identical tally of four points each, still shy of 3.5 points in order to win the world crown.

The two players signed peace after 51 moves. It was the sixth draw of the 14-round match. The 32-year-old Liren had won the opening game while the 18-yearold Gukesh had emerged victorious in the third game.

Liren decided against risking much and took home a draw while it was possible in a complicated position. The game lasted more than four hours. It seemed like Gukesh would also take it given the chances Liren has misplayed in the match.

didn't repeat, I didn't think I was in much danger. I always thought with his weak king and my strong pawn on b3, I should play, I thought maybe I might even have some chances. But okay, yeah, it was just a misjudgment of the po-

sition," added Gukesh. It was an English opening by Liren who played his fourth white game and Gukesh chose for a variation favoured by Alexei Shirov. Obviously, Gukesh has something planned for every opening and Wednesday was no exception and it was vet again Liren who had to sink in to a long thought in order to counter

the black's opening idea. Gukesh thanked his team for managing to surprise Liren in the openings. "My team they're been doing great job, not only 'Gaju' (Grzegorz Gajewski), but other team members as well, we managed to surprise him in the openings, I would like to thank my team and hopefully more interesting ideas will come," Gukesh said.
