5,000 docs, 3,000 paramedics soon

Bhubaneswar, Dec 9: Two days after the CAG report flagged an acute shortage of doctors and nurses in public healthcare institutions in the state, the government Monday said the process will start for recruitment of 5,000 doctors and 3,000 paramedical staff

Replying to a question by BJD legislator Pratap Keshari Deb in the Assembly, Health and Family Welfare Minister Mukesh Mahaling said, "We have brought two amendments in the doctors' recruitment rules. Very soon, we are going to start the process for recruitment of 5,000 doctors and 3,000 paramedical staff."

Mahaling said the government is committed to ensure that every district has one medical college.

"BJP had promised to set up a medical college in each district of Odisha in its manifesto, and the government is committed to implement it," he said.

As per information available with me, around ₹250 crore to ₹300 crore is needed to set up

a 100-seat medical college. The Union government will bear 60 per cent of the cost, he added.

Mahaling said Central government organisations like the National Thermal Power Corporation (NTPC) have established a medical college in Sundargarh district, while the National Aluminium Company Ltd (NALCO) set up a medical college at Talcher in Angul.

Besides, another medical college at Keonjhar has been set up with funding from the District Mineral Foundation (DMF).

"I want to assure the House that we will keep the promise made in our manifesto to open new medical colleges with funding from both the Centre and state, so that every district can have at least one such institute," the minister said.

The CAG had pointed out that there are 49 per cent vacancies in posts of specialist doctors and 40 per cent in positions of medical officers, while nursing staff shortage stands at 30 per cent. This is significantly below the Indian Public Health Standards (IPHS) norms, the

Sanjay Malhotra new RBI Governor



New Delhi, Dec 9: The government Monday appointed Revenue Secretary Sanjay Malhotra as the 26th Governor of the Reserve Bank of India (RBI).

The Appointments Committee of the Cabinet cleared Malhotra's name, who has been appointed as the RBI Governor for three years, starting Wednesday. Malhotra, a 1990 Batch Raiasthan Cadre IAS Officer. will replace Shaktikanta Das, whose tenure ends Tuesday.

Malhotra, 56, will be the 26th RBI Governor. He is an engineering graduate in computer science from the IIT-Kanpur, and has a Master's in Public Policy from Princeton University, the US. In his career of over 33 years, he has worked in multifarious sectors, including power, finance and taxation. information technology, and mines, among others.

Man torched on pyre over sorcery

Eleven years after the promulgation of the Odisha Prevention of Witch Hunting Act, 2013, sorcery-related crimes continue unabated in the state. The family members of a man, who died following protracted illness, brutally murdered a neighbour in a Koraput tribal hamlet and later threw his body on the pyre over sorcery suspicion Sunday. The police have detained five alleged perpetrators of the ghastly crime for questioning. According to a joint study by Odisha State Commission for Women (OSCW) and ActionAid in 2021, around 83 per cent of witch-hunting and witch-branding cases were concentrated in seven tribal-dominated districts. Nevertheless, the incident is symptomatic of a systemic failure in bringing people in these districts out of ignorance and superstition through spread of education and awareness

Koraput/Narayanpatna, Dec 9: In a shocking incident, a man was allegedly beaten to death by his neighbours over suspected

witchcraft and sorcery following the death of one of the latter's kin at Jarpa village under Bandhugaon police limits in Koraput district, Sunday after-

Even a whip was allegedly issued in the village to keep the incident a secret after the angry family members allegedly threw the body over the burning pyre of the deceased to hush up the murder. The victim has been identified as Shiba Minyaka, 34, and the deceased, Dasa Minyaka, 52.

The matter came to the fore after reports surfaced Monday. Following a tip off, the Bandhugaon police reached the village and launched an investigation with the help of a forensic team, IIC Prasanna Kumar Mishra said.

Koraput ASP Manobrata Satapathy also visited the village and took stock of the situation Monday. Police have detained five accused persons who are learnt to have confessed to the crime during questioning.

Police said Dasa breathed his last Sunday afternoon after protracted illness How ever, his family members and kin suspected Shiba responsible for Dasa's death as the former was not in good terms with the latter and his cousins over some past enmity. Moreover, Shiba often used to pick up fights with Dasa and his cousins, and even threatened to kill them using witchcraft and sorcerv.

The alleged incident occurred following Dasa's death. Police said Shiba went to the cremation ground during the last rites of Dasa when five of the latter's kin assaulted him with wooden planks. A critically injured Shiba died on the spot. Panicked, the family members of Dasa threw Shiba's body on the pyre and let it burn to ashes in order to suppress the incident.

They also allegedly threatened the villagers not to disclose the incident before others and warned them of dire consequences if they did so.

Police said the petrified members of Shiba's family did not report the matter to them.

Oppn mulls resolution to remove Dhankhar

New Delhi, Dec 9: The turbulent relations between Rajya Sabha Chairman Jagdeep Dhankhar and the INDIA bloc came to a head Monday with Opposition camp sources saying they are considering submitting a notice "very soon" for moving a resolution to remove the vice president from his office.

They said the Opposition parties had required signatures from all INDIA bloc parties in August itself but did not move as they decided to give Dhankhar "another chance but his conduct Monday" convinced them to go ahead with it.

The sources said the Congress had taken the lead on the issue and the TMC and the Samaiwadi Party, besides other INDIA bloc parties, were supportive of the move.

"The chairman's behaviour is unacceptable. He is sounding more loval than a BJP spokesperson," a senior Opposition leader said. In Rajya Sabha Monday, soon after a brief first adjournment during Zero Hour, Leader of the House JP Nadda said BJP members were agitated over an issue that involved Congress leaders and wanted a discussion.

"The link between FDL-AP



and George Soros is a matter of concern. Its co-president is a member of this House," he said.

Nadda alleged the FDL-AP sees Jammu and Kashmir as a "separate entity" and gets financial support from the Raiiv Gandhi Foundation. As Chairman Dhankhar sought to know why the ruling party members were protesting, many BJP MPs alleged that the top Congress leadership has links with George Soros. They demanded that the issue be discussed in the House as it is connected to national security.

Several MPs of the BJP and NDA allies demanded an immediate discussion on it while Congress members claimed this was being done to divert attention from the Adani issue.

LoP Mallikarjun Kharge and other Congress leaders asked how the Chairman was allowing the ruling party members to raise the issue when he had rejected their notices in this regard.

₹500cr for 2 rly flyovers Bhubaneswar: The Railways

has sanctioned ₹509 crore for the construction of two major flyovers in Cuttack and Rayagada districts, official sources said Monday. The two flyovers include the construction of a 10.89-km structure, connecting Rajathgarh, Radhakishorepur and Machhapur Railway Stations in Cuttack. The total cost for the project is ₹268.92 crore. The second one, a 5.50-km flyover, will be constructed at a cost of ₹239.83 crore at Singapur Road Station in Rayagada to address traffic congestion.

'Polarisation' Merriam-Webster's 2024 word of the year

Washington, Dec 9: The results of the 2024 US presidential election rattled the country and sent shockwaves across the world — or were cause for celebration, depending on who you ask. Is it any surprise then that the Merriam-Webster word of

the year is "polarisation". "Polarisation means division, but it's a very specific kind of division," said Peter Sokolowski, Merriam-Webster's editor at large, in an exclusive interview with The Associated Press (AP) ahead of Monday's announcement. "Polarisation means that we are tending toward the extremes rather than toward the centre."

The election was so divisive,

many American voters went to the polls with a feeling that the opposing candidate was an existential threat to the nation. According to AP VoteCast, a survey of more than 120,000 voters, about 8 in 10 Kamala Harris voters were very or somewhat concerned that Donald Trump's views - but not Harris' - were too extreme, while about 7 in 10 Trump voters felt the same way about Harris — but not Trump.

The Merriam-Webster entry for "polarisation" reflects scientific and metaphorical definitions. It's most commonly used to mean "causing strong disagreement between opposing factions or groupings". Merriam-Webster, which logs 100 million pageviews a month on its site, chooses its word of



the year based on data, tracking

a rise in search and usage. Last year's pick was "authentic". This year's comes as large swaths of the US struggle to

reach consensus on what is real.

"It's always been important

to me that the dictionary serve as a kind of neutral and objective arbiter of meaning for everybody," Sokolowski said. "It's a kind of backstop for meaning in an era of fake news, alternative facts, whatever you want to meaning in the culture.'

It's notable that "polarization" originated in the early 1800s — and not during the Re naissance, as did most words with Latin roots about science, Sokolowski said. He called it a 'pretty young word," in the scheme of the English language. "Polarised is a term that brings intensity to another word," he continued, most frequently used in the US to describe race relations, politics and ideology.

"The basic job of the dictio nary is to tell the truth about words," the Merriam-Webster editor continued. "We've had dictionaries of English for 420 years and it's only been in the last 20 years or so that we've actually known which words



59K victims of online trading fraud in 6 yrs

Bhubaneswar, Dec 9: As many as 59,437 people in Odisha have fallen prey to online trading frauds during the last six years, Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi told the Assembly Monday.

Responding to a question of Congress legislator Tara Prasad Bahinipati, Majhi, who also hold the Home portfolio, said, "A staggering 769 online trading fraud cases were reported in the state between 2019 and November 2024. A total of 59,437 people were victims of such frauds during the period."

He said most of these frauds were reported in 2023 and 2024. "Altogether 190 cases involving cheating of 18,994 people were reported in 2023, while 40,270 people were cheated in 472 cases the next year," the CM added.

In 2023, the Economic Offences Wing (EOW) registered four online trading fraud cases against cyber criminals who cheated 18,804 people, he said. Similarly, the EOW registered three such cases in the current year, in which 40,219 people



were cheated during online trading, Majhi said.

Stating that steps have been taken to curb online trading frauds, the CM said a dedicated cyber crime unit under the Crime Branch has been functional in Bhubaneswar since September 5, 2023

"The unit specialises in investigating a wide range of cyber offences, including identity theft, fake email and social media accounts, hacking, ATM and online banking fraud, credit card fraud, website defacement, cyber pornography. child pornography, phishing and cyberstalking," he said.

The unit addresses the increasing complexity of cyber crimes in Odisha through its specialised sub-units, each focusing on specific areas of exnertise he added

Majhi said a cyber police station was established in 2004 under the State Crime Record Bureau. Later, in 2006, it was moved to Crime Branch, Cuttack with jurisdiction across Odisha.



Additionally, 11 new cyber crime police stations have been established and the three existing cyber police stations - Berhampur, Rourkela and Sambalpur have been upgraded in 2021. Besides, cyber crime cells are operational in the offices of all superintendents of police, the CM said.

1930 call centre, children and women online abuse monitoring unit, cyber monitoring and coordination unit, cyber forensic unit, social media cell and cyber tracing unit are functioning in the state to deal with cyber crime-related cases, the CM pointed out.

Mission Shakti support staffers cry govt apathy

Bhubaneswar, Dec 9: As hundreds of women working as support staff under Mission Shakti department staged a demonstration outside the Assembly over a host of issues, the Opposition BJD Monday demanded immediate release of their salaries.

While the agitating women were shouting slogans at Mahatma Gandhi Road leading to the Assembly, the issue was raised in the House during Zero Hour by Opposition Chief Whip Pramila Mallik. She criticised the state's BJP government for stopping the salaries of about 60,000 women working as supporting staff to different women SHGs across the state.

Stating that these supporting staffers were recruited by the previous BJD government to help SHGs, Mallik said, "The BJP government stopped their remunerations after assuming office. There is fear among the women that their jobs will be terminated." She said that former CM Naveen Patnaik had empowered 70 lakh women in the state by bringing them under the umbrella of Mission Shakti.

BJD MLA Byomakesh Ray also supported Mallik and said that the women were appointed as Master Book Keepers, Bank Mitras, Logistic Service Providers, Community Resource Persons, Krushi Mitras and Prani Mitras. They were given salary

on the basis of a state-Centre sharing formula.

BJP member Manas Dutta however, blamed the previous BJD government and held it responsible for not extending their service agreement which ended in April 2024.

"Who was in the government in April this year? Why the previous government did not extend their jobs," he asked and accused the Opposition BJD of misleading the agitating women

Indian Railways approves major projects in Cuttack and Rayagada to enhance train operations and reduce congestion

Bhubaneswar, Dec 9: In a significant boost to operational efficiency, the Ministry of Railways has sanctioned ₹509 crore for the construction of two major railway flyovers in the Cuttack and Rayagada districts of Odisha.

The initiative is part of the Energy, Mineral, and Cement Corridor Scheme of Indian Railways, aimed at enhancing train movements and mitigating traffic congestion on key railway lines.

During a recent visit to Odisha, Union Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw, who also oversees the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting and Electronics & IT, announced the approval of these critical rail infrastructure projects.

The first project involves the construction of a 10.89 km rail flyover in Cuttack district, linking Rajathgarh, Radhakishorepur, and Machhapur Railway Stations. This infrastructure will facilitate simultaneous train movements without the delays caused by cross-traffic, with a total estimated cost of

The second project is a 5.50 km rail flyover at Singapur Road Station in Rayagada district, designed to ease traffic congestion on the Raipur-Vizianagaram Rail Line. The estimated cost for this development

will enable uninterrupted train operations at the station, eliminating delays from cross-traffic.

These new flyovers will allow trains to move simultaneously from different directions, enhancing the efficiency of train operations in the region. By removing cross-traffic, which currently causes significant delays at crucial junctions such as Singapur Road, Rajathgarh, Radhakishorepur, and Machhapur, these projects will lead to smoother and faster travel

The infrastructure upgrades will alleviate congestion in the Nergundi-Cuttack-Barang-Rajathgarh corridor and the Rayagada-Singapur Road section. This will result in a substantial reduction in wait times for trains and an improved travel experience for passengers.

Currently, the Khurda Road and Waltair divisions face severe traffic bottlenecks due to cross-movements at key stations. Up and down trains are often delayed while waiting for clearance, but the new flyovers will establish dedicated paths, ensuring uninterrupted oper-

With a combined cost of ₹508.75 crore, these projects are a significant step toward enhancing the operational capacity of Indian Railways, reducing delays, and boosting train movement. The Indian Railways continues to prioritise infrastructure development to accommodate the growing demands of train traffic and provide a smoother, more efficient experience for travelers.



New Delhi, Dec 9: The National Green Tribunal (NGT) has been informed that various measures, including immediate microplastic cleanup drives and prohibiting high-risk plastic items, were needed to curb microplastic contamination across sea beaches in Puri.

The green body was also in formed that the Swargadwar Beach was "a microplastic hotspot needing urgent mitigation" The NGT, while hearing a

matter regarding alarming levels of microplastics in Puri beaches, had sought a response from the Odisha State Pollution Control Board (OSPCB).

The OSPCB reply dated December 6 said it operated a coastal management cell under the Integrated Coastal Zone Management Programme (ICZMP), headed by the chief environmental scientist cum nodal officer.

"The coastal management cell conducted an inspection November 6. During the inspection, samples of microplastic contamination in seawater and beach sediments of Puri sea beach had been collected and analysed in the board's central

laboratory," the reply said. The board conducted a study about quantitative analysis of

microplastics in seawater and

sediment samples, along with

the characterisation of micro-

plastic types, following which a technical report was prepared. The report recommended several "prioritised actions" such as immediate microplastic cleanup drives, deployment of fibre filters in urban runoff channels, regular seawater sampling to monitor and track

pollution levels and local bans

on high-risk plastic items like

microbeads, straws, and dispos-

able cutlery, the OSPCB reply

said The report, which was annexed to the reply, said the highest microplastic density in sediments was found in the Golden Beach because of heavy tourist activity and localised plastic degradation.

The highest microplastic density in seawater was found in the Swargadwar Beach because of continuous tourist activities and plastics received from land.

The dominant microplastic type across locations were fibres, followed by fragments, pellets, films and foams, the report said.

Microplastic fibres are of various types, including the common polyethene terephthalate (PET) and polyethene (PE).

Potato supply faces consumer resistance

Bhubaneswar, Dec 9: The Odisha government's effort to sell potatoes at reduced prices has met with consumer reluc tance in Capital city. Potatoes sourced from Uttar Pradesh and sold at ₹30 per kilogram have not been well-received due to quality issues

In collaboration with the National Agricultural Cooperative Marketing Federation of India (NAFED), the Food Supplies and Consumer Welfare depart ment aimed to address the po tato shortage and ease the cri sis. Despite this, many sellers in various markets continue to sell potatoes at ₹40 per kilo gram, as consumers avoid the Uttar Pradesh supply, which reportedly rots quickly



The first phase of the initia tive saw 60 tonnes of potatoes transported to Bhubaneswar in at strategic locations, including near the Additional District Magistrate's office and govern ment fair price shops. Initially, the affordable supply is set to be available at government retail outlets in major cities, such as Bhubaneswar, Cuttack, Ro urkela, and others, with a fixed price of ₹30 per kilogram.

Kabiraj Swain, president of the Unit-I Vegetable Trad ers Association, pointed out that the poor quality of the UP potatoes has turned consum ers away. He mentioned that while sellers were instructed to charge between ₹30-35, some are still pricing at ₹40.

AI to turn saviour of elephants in Rourkela

Truck stuck on NH for 3 days due to Google Maps goof-up

Daringbadi, Dec 9: A truck has been stranded for the past three days at Gajalbadi Ghat on National Highway 59 in Kandhamal district, causing major traffic disruptions. The driver of the truck landed in trouble after allegedly following incorrect directions provided by Google Maps.

The truck, traveling from Sorada in Ganjam towards Rayagada, took a narrow, unpayed road leading to the Gaialbadi Ghat. Due to the vehicle's size and mechanical issues, it got stuck, blocking traffic and leaving numerous vehicles, including passenger buses, stranded.

Efforts to clear the truck using an earthmover have allowed some vehicles to pass, but traffic movement remains severely hampered.

The driver later revealed that



he had followed a route suggested by Google Maps, believing it to be a quicker alternative to the longer, standard road. However, the narrow, difficult terrain of the ghat caused the truck to become trapped.

Locals have criticised the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI), saying that although a warning board was placed to prevent heavy vehicles from using the route, no substantial action was taken to avoid such incidents. The NHAI has also been unable to begin road expansion work, which has been delayed for various reasons. Meanwhile, the road continues to be blocked for heavy vehicle traffic.



ously close to railway tracks were Sunday saved thanks to an innovative pilot project led by the Forest department, harnessing artificial intelligence (AI) technology to safeguard The initiative involves the in-

stallation of four solar-powered towers, each equipped with 360-degree cameras that provide real-time information to a control room. When elephants approach the railway tracks, the system automatically alerts the control room, which can then notify the railway staff at Bondamunda as well as Forest

"We've installed these AI-enabled towers with cameras that



can detect elephants within a 500-metre radius of the tracks,

said Jasobanta Sethi, the Divisional Forest Officer (DFO) of Rourkela. "This is the first time such technology is being used in Odisha," he added.

The towers, which were set up at a total cost of ₹2.9 crore, are positioned at four strategic locations in Chandiposh, Mahipani, Dolakudar, and Sonakhan. The cameras, imported and installed by a vendor from Delhi, are designed to detect elephants and send alerts to the control

The system has already proven effective — on its first day of operation, the tower at Dolakudar near Lathikata prevented a potential mishap, saving two adult elephants and three calves

"This technology not only helps save elephants from fatal injuries caused by train hits, but it will also assist in preventing forest fires and illegal poaching activities," Sethi added.

Environmentalist Satya Behera expressed optimism about the project's success, noting, "From day one, the tower at Dolakudar saved these elephants, demonstrating the system's potential.'

The project is being hailed as a significant step forward in protecting wildlife and improving safety for both elephants and humans. The DFO also mentioned that efforts are underway to treat an injured elephant at Rajgangpur, with the team ready to intervene if necessary

This pilot project marks a promising new approach to conservation and safety in sensitive wildlife zones.

Brown sugar, ₹25L cash seized; Woman detained

BHADRAK: Acting on a tip-off, police seized substantial quantity of brown sugar and cash worth ₹ 25 lakh during a raid on a rented house at Elkha area under Town police limits in Bhadrak, Monday. A woman of Puruna Bazar, Mirzapur area living in the house on ren was also detained in this connection for her alleged involvement. The operation led by Bhadrak tehsildar Priyadarshi Sangram Keshari Khuntia in the presence of a magistrate, commenced at 2pm. According to the Town police of-ficials, the raid was ongoing at the time of filing this report. The police team, acting on instructions from the Superin tendent of Police (SP) Madkar Sandeer Sampad following reliable intelligence input about rampant drug trafficking in the area, conducted a sudden raid on the premises. During the search, a substantial quantity of brown sugar was recovered. A machine was used to coun the seized cash, which exceeded ₹25 lakh. Investigations are underway to ascertain the source of the cash and it intended use, the SP said. Whither Goes France

rench President Emmanuel Macron is fast running out of options to prevent France from plunging into financial and political chaos following the toppling of the Centre-Right Prime Minister Michel Barnier whom he had appointed only three months ago. It is a poor reflection of his leadership that he has to choose four Prime Ministers in the span of a year to run the government. Macron remains in denial mode refusing to take responsibility for the crises. He sensed the public mood well when saying "some people are tempted to blame me for this situation," and instead held political forces inimical to him responsible for the mess. This has prompted critics to use the two-word expression to slam the President's diagnosis: "flagrant

Fact remains that France finds itself without a functioning government for the second time in six months as a result of Macron's disastrous decision to hold snap legislative elections in the summer. Having squandered his relative majority, and handed unprecedented kingmaker status in the Assemblée to Marine Le Pen's Far-Right MPs, the President is now looking for a fourth Prime Minister in the space of a year. Whoever is chosen, there is no reason to suppose the next one will find it easier than Barnier to control a parliament divided into warring blocs. The markets have already tumbled and there is no budget in place for 2025. This happened because of Marine Le Pen's refusal to endorse an austerity budget that targeted pensioners – a constituency crucial to her chances of success in the next presidential election.

Macron now has two options: to choose a new PM within days from amongst Centrist or Centre-Right figures which is sure to make him once again vulnerable to manipulations by Marine Le Pen.

A more durable and ethical solution would be for Macron to sink his differences with the Leftwing alliance – the New Popular Front (NPF) which narrowly won the July snap polls and prevented Marine Le Pen from emerging the winner. The NPF alliance includes the Socialist party and Jean-Luc Mélenchon's France Unbowed. He had not chosen a PM from the broad Left fearing that an NPF-led government would attempt to reverse parts of his legacy, including the deeply unpopular plans to raise the retirement age. The decision was not only undemocratic, but it turned the largest parliamentary bloc of MPs against him. It was wrong of Macron to forget that his political career has been built on the back of 'republican' votes loaned to him to ward off the threat of a Le Pen presidency. In July, the first Far-Right government in post-war history was only averted by a similar mobilisation and the hasty formation of the

If Macron is to avoid a lame duck presidency that may even lead to his own humiliating resignation, he needs to recognise that he cannot dictate terms at this stage. Instead of seeking help from Marine Le Pen to bail him out and prop up the next government, it might be prudent for Macron to start building

FUTURE OF MULTILATERALISM

n today's shifting geo political landscape, few multilateral alliances are as steadfast - or as essential - as the Group of 77 (G77). Since its founding in 1964, the bloc has expanded to include 134 countries from Africa, Asia, Latin America, and the Caribbean, collectively representing 80% of the world's population and twothirds of the United Nations' member states.

But the G77 has struggled to define its role in a rapidly changing world. This was evident at the group's recent policy forum in New York, commemorating its 60th anniversary. I had the privilege of speaking at this event, hosted by its Ugandan chair, which highlighted the G77's longterm challenges while showcasing its immense potential and growing global influence.

Formed as a coalition of the world's poorest countries, the G77 was conceived as a "weapon of the weak," initially seeking to leverage its large membership to amplify the Global South's voice in multilateral institutions. Yet, despite its size, the group has been unable to reshape the Westphalian state system and US-dominated postwar economic order - structures established long before many developing countries gained their independence. The Non-Aligned Movement, established in 1961, emerged as a natural ally to the G77, with many overlapping members and shared objectives. Both groups drove transformative advances in international law, championing the principle of self-determination - especially in Palestine and Western Sahara – while affirming the legitimacy of decolonisation and armed resistance in Algeria, Mozambique, South Africa, and Vietnam. They denounced South Africa's apartheid system as a "crime against humanity."

These efforts were inspired by the 1960 Declaration on the Granting of Independence to

Colonial Countries and Peoples, a landmark UN resolution that became a cornerstone of the decolonisation movement. During this period, an unspoken Afro-Arab alliance emerged, as African countries supported the Palestinian struggle for statehood and Arab governments backed Black South Africans in their fight against white settler rule.

In its quest to challenge Western-dominated systems, the G77 has also cultivated a unique and enduring alliance with China. This relationship, shaped by heated North-South debates in the UN General Assembly, deepened after the G77 played a pivotal role in Taiwan's 1971 expulsion from the UN, clearing the way for the People's Republic to take its seat. Although not formally part of the G77, China remains the only permanent member of the Security Council to be regularly invited to its meetings.

But the G77, with its sprawling, diverse membership, has faced difficulties maintaining internal unity. The Sino-Soviet split and the 1962 Sino-Indian War, in particular, raised doubts about the non-alignment of countries hosting foreign military bases, testing the bloc's cohesion.

With its 1973 oil embargo,

which nearly quadrupled oil prices, OPEC introduced a powerful new weapon of the weak, spurring the G77 to call for the establishment of a new international economic order. This ambitious vision involved restructuring the global economic system to transfer resources and technology from the Global North to the South, fostering self-sufficiency through intra-regional trade, infrastructure investment, and industrialisation.

The G77 actively sought to advance a new global economic order, focusing on key areas like energy, food and agriculture, water, trade, technology, and South-South cooperation. But after the end of the Cold War, the group adopted a less adversarial approach. This pragmatic turn can be at least partly attributed to the "lost decades" of the 1980s and 1990s, which left many developing countries deeply indebted and increasingly dependent on Western-dominated financial institutions.

Consequently, while the G77 has continued to push for comprehensive reforms of multilateral institutions and remained steadfast in its support for Palestinian liberation and the lifting of the US trade embargo against Cuba,

the bloc's summits since 2000 have largely focused on broader themes such as security, justice, and democracy.

Moreover, the G77's internal

dynamics have changed over

time. By 2019, more than 30 of the group's members had graduated to middle-income status. As Singapore, South Korea, India, and Brazil edged closer to joining the ranks of the world's rich economies, their priorities began to diverge from those of most G77 countries. The G77 policy forum in October reflected this shift. Reaffirming the bloc's traditional emphasis on group solidarity, democratisation of global economic governance, and a shared commitment to sustainable development and social justice - speakers from countries like Brazil, Indonesia, Algeria, and Cuba articulated a clear message: the Global South's aspirations must be recognised. G77 diplomats translated these principles into a series of concrete demands: debt relief, preferential trade access for Global South countries, food security, fulfillment of aid commitments. adequate financing for the UN's Sustainable Development Goals, and stronger regional development banks. They also addressed systemic inequities. calling to limit the power of Western credit-rating agencies and end the Israeli occupation of

Gaza and the West Bank. Regrettably, Donald Trump's victory in the US presidential election threatens to derail efforts to foster effective multilateralism and bolster development funding, underscoring the critical importance of the G77's mission. Given its proven ability to forge global coalitions, the group is uniquely positioned to lead the international resistance to Trump's unilateralist agenda.

ccording to the World Bank's International Debt Report 2024, India's external debt increased by \$31 billion, reaching \$646.79 billion in 2023. The report highlights a significant rise in interest payments, from \$15.08 billion in 2022 to \$22.54 billion in 2023. This development highlights the evolving dynamics of India's financial obligations amidst global economic uncertainties.

The report indicates that long-term debt stocks surged by 7 per cent, aggregating \$498 billion in 2023. In contrast, short-term debt stocks experienced a slight decline, amounting to \$126.32 billion. This shift suggests a preference for more stable, longer-term borrowing to finance development projects and infrastructure needs. However, it also signals a potential rise in debt servicing obligations, given the higher interest costs associated with long-term loans.

India's external debt stock constituted 80 per cent of its exports in 2023, reflecting a moderate reliance on external borrowing relative to its trade

performance. Debt servicing accounted for 10 per cent of exports, indicating increased pressure on export earnings to meet financial obligations. While these figures remain manageable, they highlight the importance of sustaining robust export growth to balance external debt liabilities.

The International Debt Report also sheds light on capital inflows. Net debt inflows reached \$33.42 billion in 2023, suggesting a steady influx of external financing. Meanwhile, net equity inflows were significantly higher, amounting to \$46.94 billion, showcasing investor confidence in India's economic prospects. This balance between debt and equity inflows reflects India's efforts to maintain a healthy mix of foreign investments. The rise in global debt during Q3 2024 marks the third-largest quarterly increase on record, following sharp surges in Q2 and Q4 2020 during the COVID-19 pandemic, where increases exceeded \$11 trillion per quarter.

The sharp increase in interest payments is a matter

of concern. Rising borrowing costs can strain fiscal resources, potentially diverting funds from developmental priorities. Policymakers must address this by implementing measures to enhance foreign exchange reserves, promote export diversification, and manage external vulnerabilities effectively.

Moreover, India must balance leveraging external borrowing for growth and ensuring debt sustainability. Investments in export-oriented sectors, technology, and manufacturing could help generate foreign exchange and reduce reliance on external debt.

To lower the external debtto-export ratio. India should focus on diversifying its export basket and exploring new markets, particularly in emerging economies. Encouraging foreign direct investment in high-potential industries like renewable energy, digital technologies, and infrastructure can reduce reliance on debt-based financing.

Strengthening the rupee through monetary and fiscal measures can alleviate the burden of servicing external debt denominated in foreign currencies. Emphasis on concessional loans and multilateral financing with favourable terms can reduce overall debt servicing costs. Expanding domestic debt markets can provide an alternative to external borrowing, reducing exposure to global financial volatility.

India's external debt trajectory reflects the opportunities and challenges of a rapidly growing economy. While the rising debt levels underline the nation's expanding global engagement, they also necessitate careful policy measures to ensure sustainability. By addressing the rising interest costs and focusing on export-led growth. India can manage its external debt effectively and bolster its economic resilience. This strategic approach will maintain investor confidence and ensure long-term financial stability.

Patna, Dec 9: The Bihar government is alarmed over the state's abysmal "sex ratio at birth" (SRB) which has been flagged in the latest report of the Centre, and decided to strictly implement measures for checking female foeticide, according to a senior minister.

The SRB - the number of female births per 1000 male births - has been declining in the state, according to the Health Management Information System (HMIS) report of the Ministry of Health for 2023-24.

The report kept Bihar among the worst-performing states, with an SRB of 882. While the sex ratio at birth was 894 in 2022-23, it was 914 in in 2021-22.



Mumbai records lowest temperature in 9 years

Mumbai: Mumbai experienced its coldest December morning in nine years Monday, with temperatures plummeting to 13.7 degrees Celsius at the Santacruz observatory, 5.1 degrees below normal. The last time the city witnessed such low temperatures was December 24, 2015, when mercury dipped to 11.4 degrees Celsius. This sharp drop in temperature comes just days after Mumbai experienced its hottest December day in 13 years with temperatures soaring to 37.3 degrees Celsius December 4. The Colaba observatory registered a mini mum temperature of 19.2 degrees Celsius. Maximum temperatures remained moderate, with Santacruz recording 32.2 degrees Celsius, 0.9 degrees below normal, whilst Colaba reached 30.3 degrees Celsius, 2.4 degrees below typical readings Meteorologists expect temperatures to maintain these levels for the next few days before seeing a gradual increase. The city's air quality showed improvement as well. The Central Pollution Control Board indicated an air quality index of 112 across 20 of the 30 monitoring stations, with PM10 (particulate matter of size 10 micrograms per cubic metre) identified as the primary pollutant.



Himachal receives season's first snowfall

WEST Reservation can't be on basis of religion: SC

New Delhi, Dec 9: Reservation cannot be on the basis of religion, the Supreme Court observed Monday while hearing a batch of pleas challenging the Calcutta High Court verdict that struck down the OBC status of several castes in West Bengal granted since 2010.

The pleas, including the one filed by the West Bengal government, challenging the high court's May 22 verdict came up for hearing before a bench of Justices BR Gavai and KV Viswanathan.

"Reservation cannot be on the basis of religion," Justice Gavai observed.

Senior advocate Kapil Sibal, appearing for the state government, said, "This is not on the basis of religion. This is on the basis of backwardness. The high court had struck

down the OBC status of several castes in West Bengal granted since 2010, holding as illegal the reservation for them in public sector jobs and state-run educational institutions.

In its verdict, the high court said, "Religion indeed appears to have been the sole criterion for declaring these communi-



ties as OBCs."

The high court further said the "selection of 77 classes of Muslims as backwards is an affront to the Muslim community as a whole".

Deciding the petitions challenging the provisions of the state's reservation law of 2012 and reservations granted in 2010, the high court clarified that the services of citizens of the struck-down classes, who were already in service or had availed the benefit of reservation, or succeeded in any selection process of the state, would not be affected by the judgment.

The high court, in total, struck down 77 classes of reservation given between April, 2010 and September, 2010.

It also struck down 37 classes for reservation as OBC given under The West Bengal Backward Classes (Other than Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes) (Reservation of Vacancies in Services and Posts)

During the hearing Monday, the top court asked the lawyers appearing in the case to give an overview of the matter

While referring to the high court's verdict, Sibal said the provisions of the Act were struck down.

"So these are very serious is sues involved. It affects rights of thousands of students who are aspiring to be admitted to universities, people who are wanting jobs," he said.

Sibal therefore urged the bench for some interim order to be passed and an ex-facie stay on the high court order.

The bench also heard submissions of other lawvers. including senior advocate PS Patwalia, who was representing some of the respondents in the matter. The top court said it would hear the detailed submissions January 7.

UCC's aim to promote harmony, secularism: Allahabad HC Judge

PRAYAGRAJ: The main aim of the Uniform Civil Code is to promote social harmony, gender equality, and secularism, Allahabad High Court Justice Dr Shekhar Yadav has said. The judge made the remarks while addressing a provincial convention of the Legal Cell and High Court Unit of the Vishva Hindu Parishad (VHP) in the Library Hall of Allahabad High Court Sunday. Justice Yadav said the UCC has been a matter of debate in India for a long time. "The main objective of the Uniform Civil Code is to promote social harmony, gender equality and secularism by eliminating unequal legal systems based on different religions and communities," he said, according to a release issued by the VHP. "A Uniform Civil Code refers to a common law that applies to all religious communities in personal matters such as marriage, inheritance, divorce, adoption etc," he said. "The aim of the Uniform Civil Code is to replace various personal laws that currently govern personal matters within different religious communities. Its goal is to ensure uniformity of laws not only between communities but also within a community," the judge added.

Manipur violence: SC asks state to give details on arson, property encroachments

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court Monday directed the Manipur government to submit a detailed sealed cover report on the number of properties that were fully or partially burnt, looted, or encroached upon during the ongoing ethnic violence in the state. The bench comprising Chief Justice Sanjiv Khanna and Justice Sanjay Kumar emphasised the need for the state to address the grievances of the displaced persons and take steps to restore their properties. It therefore asked the Manipul government, represented by Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, to provide specific details such as "buildings burnt or partially burnt, buildings looted buildings trespassed or encroached upon". The report should also provide information about the owners and current occupants of these properties, along with the details of any legal actions taken against trespassers, the CJ said. "We also direct the state government to provide the following details: 1. Buildings burnt and partially burnt, 2. buildings which are looted; and (3) the buildings trespassed and encroached upon," the SC order stated.

Sambhal mosque survey report in 15 days, says court commissioner

SAMBHAL (UP): The survey report of the Shahi Jama Masjid at Sambhal is expected to be filed within 15 days by the court commissioner after he sought more time citing ill before a local court Monday while the Muslim side objected to it. The civil court (senior division) while considering the extension plea marked it as "keep on file", court commissioner, advocate Ramesh Singh Raghav told reporters while informing the survey report would be filed within 15 days. Raghav said, "I had asked for 15 days time from the honourable court but my application has been marked with 'keep on file' because the Supreme Court has given a stay order that the lower court will not pass any order. Now the date of January 6 is fixed in the high court and we will submit our report before 15 days.'

UPSC civil services main exam results declared

New Delhi, Dec 9: The Union Public Service Commission Monday declared the results of the civil services (main) examination for the selection of candidates for the IAS, IPS and other Central services of Group A and B posts.

Around 2,845 candidates cleared the civil services (main) examination. Out of over 13.4 lakh candidates, as many as 14,625 cleared the civil services (preliminary) exam. 2024, held June 16.

In a statement, the Union Public Service Commission (UPSC) said the results were declared based on exams held from September 20 to 29.

The UPSC said the successful candidates in the main examination have qualified for the personality test for selection to the Indian Administrative Service, Indian Foreign Service, Indian Police Service and other Central Services (Groups A and B).

The candidature of these aspirants is provisional subject to them being found eligible in all respects, it said in the statement. The candidates will be required to produce the original certificates in support of their eligibility/reservation claims such as age, educational qualifications, community, econom-



(PwBD) and other documents such as TA form at the time of their interview. The candidates have been advised to keep the said docu-

ments ready with them. Those seeking reservation/relaxation benefits available for SC/ST/ OBC/ EWS/PwBD/Ex-servicemen etc., must also produce original certificates issued by the closing date of the application of the civil services (preliminary) examination -- March 6, 2024. Dates of interviews of these candidates will be notified in due course. It will be held in the UPSC office at Dholpur House in New Delhi. The Schedule for the personality tests will be made available accordingly.

Attacks on minorities concerning: India to B'desh BANGLADESH SAYS NO COUNTRY HAS RIGHT TO INTERFERE IN ITS AFFAIRS

Dhaka, Dec 9: India Monday flagged "regrettable incidents" of attacks on minorities in Bangladesh, which Dhaka called "misleading and false information" and said no country should interfere in its internal affairs as their foreign secretaries met here for the first time since the fall of Sheikh Hasina's government.

Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri told reporters that he conveved India's concerns. including those related to the safety and welfare of minorities, during his meeting with his counterpart Mohammad Jashim Uddin.

"We also discussed some regrettable incidents of attacks on cultural, religious, and diplomatic properties, he said. "We expect, overall, a constructive approach on all these issues by the Bangladesh authorities, and we look forward to moving the relationship forward in a positive, forward-looking, and constructive direction."

Their meeting came amid a low in the relations between the two countries after Hasina fled to India August 5 following massive protests against her government.

India has repeatedly expressed concern over the tar-



geting of Hindus since the interim government of Muhammad Yunus took charge in early

Bangladesh's statement after Monday's talks, however, focused on "misinformation" in Indian media.

Jashim Uddin said the Bangladesh side expected Delhi's active cooperation to halt the "negative campaign" in India to build trust among the people of the two countries.

"We drew their attention and sought appropriate steps regarding dissemination of misleading and false information in Indian media about Bangla

desh's July-August revolution and alleged hostile attitude to the minority communities here in the post-revolution," he said.

Jashim Uddin said Dhaka simultaneously strongly stated that followers of all faiths in Bangladesh were performing their rituals freely.

"At the same time, we said no country is expected to interfere in our internal affairs and reminded that Bangladesh refrains from commenting on internal affairs of other countries and they should as well show identical respect for us," he said.

New Delhi, Dec 9: The Common University Entrance Test (CUET) for admission to undergraduate and postgraduate courses is set to undergo several changes in the 2025 edition following a review by an expert panel, according to UGC Chairman Jagadesh Kumar.

The University Grants Commission (UGC) has constituted an expert committee to review the conduct of CUET-UG and PG.

"Based on the feedback from the past years, it is also essential to continuously improve the examination process to provide a better, more efficient and conducive environment for students taking CUET. In this spirit, the UGC has constituted

an expert committee to review the conduct of CUET-UG and CUET-PG for 2025," Kumar told PTI

'The committee has examined various aspects of the test, such as its structure, number of papers, duration of test papers, syllabus alignment and operational logistics. The commission considered these recommendations in a recent meeting," he added.

Kumar said the UGC will soon release a draft proposal detailing the revised guidelines for conducting CUET-UG and CUET-PG 2025, inviting feedback and suggestions from students, parents, teachers and institutions.

In the first edition of the exam in 2022, CUET-UG was

The exam was conducted in hybrid mode for the first time in 2024. It was cancelled across Delhi a night before it was to be held citing logistical reasons.

CUET was introduced as a step towards standardising the admission process for undergraduate (UG) and postgraduate (PG) programmes across universities, Kumar said.

"CUET has provided a level playing field for students from diverse educational boards and socio-economic backgrounds ensuring equal opportunity for all aspirants. Last year, 283 universities adopted CUET, and the number of registered candidates was 13.47.820.

"By encouraging universities to adopt a single, national-level entrance test, CUET has streamlined admissions, reduced the reliance on varying cut-offs, and made the admis sion process transparent and technology-driven," he said.





40 Delhi schools get bomb threat mail

Sender demands \$30,000; police says 'nothing suspicious found'

New Delhi, Dec 9: Around 40 schools in Delhi received a bomb threat mail Monday morning with the sender demanding \$30,000, prompting a multi-agency search of the premises but "nothing suspicious was found", a police official said. The threat was sent in a sin-

gle e-mail marked to the some of the city's prominent schools including DPS RK Puram; GD Goenka, Paschim Vihar; The British School, Chanakyapuri; The Mother's International, Aurobindo Marg; Modern School, Mandi House; DPS Vasant Kunj; Delhi Police Public School, Safdarjung; DPS East of Kailash and Salwan Public Schools.

Most schools that received the threat suspended classes and sent students back home. Officials said the premises

of the schools that received the threat were thoroughly checked and nothing suspicious



Deputy Commissioner of Police (Southwest) Surendra Choudhary said the e-mail was received by four school located within his district as well. "Soon after getting the information, we conducted a thorough check of the school premises. Nothing suspicious was found. I request parents to not panic.

A Delhi Fire Services (DFS) official said they received the first alerts about the bomb threats from GD Goenka, Paschim Vihar, (6.15 am), and DPS RK Puram (7.06

said bomb detection teams, fire officials, local police and dog squads responded immediately and conducted searches at the schools.

Sources said the email was delivered on the schools' id at 11.38 pm Sunday -- when the schools were closed -- from scottielanza@gmail.com.

Missile frigate INS **Tushil inducted into Indian Navy in Russia**



New Delhi, Dec 9: Indian Na Russian-manufactured guided missile frigate INS Tushil was commissioned into the force at Russia's coastal city of Kaliningrad Monday.

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, Chief of Naval Staff Admiral Dinesh K Tripathi and several other senior Indian of ficials were present at the commissioning ceremony.

INS Tushil is expected to significantly bolster the Indian Navy's operational capability in the Indian Ocean, a region that has witnessed increasing forays by China's PLA Navy in the last few years. The warship has been constructed in Russia as part of an over USD 2.5-billion deal that New Delhi had inked with Moscow in 2016 for four stealth frigates for the Indian Navy.

Under the deal, two ships were to be built in Russia, while the other two were to be manufactured in India

In his remarks at the ceremony, Singh described the commissioning of the warship as a proud testament to India's growing maritime strength and significant milestone in long-standing ties with Russia.

"The ship is a big proof of the collaborative prowess of Russian and Indian industries. It exemplifies India's journey to wards technological excellence through jointmanship," he said

Singh said India and Russia will enter a "new era" of coop eration by taking advantage of each other's expertise in areas such as artificial intelligence cyber security, space exploration and counter-terrorism.

The ship's construction was closely monitored by an Indian team of specialists from the 'Warship Overseeing Team' stationed at Kaliningrad.

The 3,900-tonne ship with a length of 125 metres packs a le thal punch and is an impressive blend of Russian and Indian cut ting edge technologies and best practices in warship construc tion. The ship's new design provides it with enhanced stealth features and better stability characteristics, officials said.

With the collaboration of Indi an naval specialists and Sever noye Design Bureau, the indig enous content of the ship has been enhanced to an impressive 26 per cent, the officials said.

The major Indian defence firms involved in the project were BrahMos Aerospace Private Limited, Bharat Electronics Limited, Keltron, Nova Integrated Systems from Tata Elcome Marine, Johnson Con trols India and others

NMC unveils norms to spot fake patients during college audits

New Delhi, Dec 9: The National Medical Commission (NMC) has issued guidelines for identifying "fake patients" in medical colleges and facilities seeking approval for setting up new institutes or for increasing the number of UG and PG seats. This is the first time that the

Commission has come up with such guidelines. The guidelines come after instances of some medical institutions or colleges admitting fake patients (person who does not require any treatment or in-patient treatment) to fulfil the requirement of bed occupancy and investigation.

According to the guidelines, admission of large numbers of patients on the day of inspection or the previous day, admission of multiple patients from the same family or the admitted patients having no or minor problems which can be treated on OPD basis with oral medications, could be a parameter for

identifying "fake patients" Patients, who are admitted

without any evidence of investigations like X-ray, blood tests etc. (before or after admission) or treatment which is generally done for admitted patients like intravenous (IV) fluid, injections, catheterization, giving medicines etc can also be an Another parameter assessors

The assessor/assessors will conduct the assessment to examine the infrastructure, quality of medical education, faculty, AEBAS data, clinical material and other clinical indicators, and financial status of the college to ensure compliance with latest NMC guidelines

It may also conduct interviews with staff and all students during the assessment. Medical colleges established by the state or central government, registered for additional PG seats may be exempted from physical inspection based on self declaration and analysis of documents furnished by the medical college.

The college will have to follow guidelines of attendance of the faculty and other staff and preparation of the documents issued by NMC or respective boards from time-to-time. Required number of faculties as mentioned in MSR guidelines of respective boards (UG or PG) should be available throughout the year and for any given period of time. As it is a minimum require

ment document, no relaxation will be permitted except in spe cial circumstances in larger interest by following due pro-

Blow for Le Pen

Paris: Days after orchestrating the downfall of the French government, Marine Le Pen's far-right National Rally (RN) has lost a seat in a by-election in northeastern France. RN critics pounced Sunday's narrow defeat as a sign of voter condemnation of the party's push last week to topple former Prime Minister Michel Barnier's government over his 2025 budget bill. In a further blow for the RN, there were signs France's next government may be led by the left, after President Emmanuel Macron Monday met with leftist leaders as he seeks to name a new prime minister.

Choppers collide

Ankara: Two Turkish military helicopters collided in midair Monday, causing one of them to crash and killing six military personnel on board, officials said. The second helicopter landed safely. Five of the victims died at the site of the accident while a sixth died of his injuries at a hospital the defense ministry said. The crash occurred in the southwestern province of Isparta during regular training flights, according to the region's governor, Abdullah Erin.

PAWN OF Blow to Iran's 'Axis of Resistance'

Only a few years ago, the Islamic Republic was ascendant across the wider Middle East. Its "Axis of Resistance" was at a zenith but Assad's fall triggers dramatic reversal in Iran's regional might

Manama (Bahrain), Dec 9: For Iran's theocratic government, it keeps getting worse.

Its decades-long strategy of building an "Axis of Resistance" supporting militant groups and proxies around the region is falling apart. First came the crushing Israeli campaign in Gaza triggered by the October 7, 2023, attack on Israel by Iranian-backed Hamas.

That war spawned another in Lebanon, where Israel has mauled Iran's most powerful ally, Hezbollah, even as Israel has launched successful airstrikes openly inside of Iran for the first time.

And now Iran's longtime stalwart ally and client in Syria, President Bashar Assad, is gone. As dawn broke Sunday, rebel forces completed a lightning offensive by seizing the ancient capital of Damascus and tearing down symbols of more than 50 years of Assad's rule over the Mideast crossroads. Ali Akbar Velavati, a kev ad-

viser to Iran's Supreme Leader Avatollah Ali Khamenei, once called Assad and Syria "the golden ring of the resistance chain in the region". "Without the Syrian gov-

ernment, this chain will break and the resistance against Israel and its supporters will be weakened."

That break in the chain is literal. Syria was an important geographical link that allowed Iran to move weapons and other supplies to Hezbollah in

Lebanon. Its loss now further weakens Hezbollah, whose powerful arsenal in southern

Lebanon had put Iranian in-

fluence directly on the border

of its nemesis Israel. "Iran's deterrence thinking is really shattered by events in Gaza, by events in Lebanon and definitely by developments in Syria," a senior diplomat from the United Arab Emirates, Anwar Gargash, said at the International Institute for Strategic Studies' Manama Dialogue in Bahrain.

Iran still holds the card of its nuclear programme. Though it denies that intention, it can use the potential for building a weapons capability to cast a shadow of influence in the

"Iran remains a critical regional player," Gargash said. 'We should use this moment to connect and speak about what's

Iran in contact with Syria's new leadership Dubai: Iran has opened a direct line of communication with rebels in Syria's

new leadership since its ally Bashar al-Assad was ousted, a senior Iranian official told Reuters Monday, in an attempt to "prevent a hostile trajectory" between the countries. The lightning advance of a militia alliance spearheaded by Hayat Tahrir al-Sham, a former al-Qaeda affiliate, marked one of the biggest turning points for the Middle East in generations. Assad's fall as president removed a bastion from which Iran and Russia exercised influence across the Arab world. Hours after Assad's fall, Iran said it expected relations with Damas-cus to continue based on the two countries' "far-sighted and wise approach" and called for the establishment of an inclusive government representing all segments of Syrian society. There is little doubt about Tehran's concern about how the change of power in Damascus will affect Iran's influence in Syria, the lynchpin of its regional clout. But there is no panic, three Iranian officials told Reuters, as Tehran seeks diplomatic avenues to establish contact with people whom one of the officials called "those within Syria's new ruling groups whose views are closer to Iran's". "The main concern for Iran is whether Assad's successor will push Syria away from Tehran's orbit," a second Iranian officials said. "That is a scenario Iran is keen to avoid."

Travel ban for SK's Yoon after martial law fiasco

Seoul, Dec 9: South Korean President Yoon Suk Yeol has been banned from leaving the country over a failed attempt at imposing martial law, a justice ministry official said Monday, amid growing calls for him to step down and a deepening leadership crisis.

Yoon has apologised for the botched attempt and said he was leaving his political and legal fate to his ruling People Power Party (PPP) but has not resigned. He has become a subject of criminal investigation, according to local media reports.

On Monday, the defence ministry said Yoon was still legally commander in chief, but growing dissent among senior military officers against the president has thrown into question his grip on power.

Oh Dong-woon, the head of the Corruption Investigation Office for High-ranking Officials, said he had barred Yoon from foreign travel, when asked at a parliament hearing what actions have been taken against the president.

A justice ministry official, Bae Sang-up, told the committee the travel ban order had been executed.

The panel was established in 2021 to investigate high-ranking officials including the president and their family members but it does not have authority to prosecute the president. Instead it is by law required to refer the matter to the prosecutors' of-

Auto retail sales up 11.21% in Nov: FADA

New Delhi, Dec 9: Retail sales of vehicles across categories in India grew by 11.21 per cent at 32,08,719 units in November, as compared to 28,85,317 units in the same month last year riding on two-wheeler demand. Federation of Automobile Dealers Associations (FADA) said in Monday.

Retail sales of two-wheelers were at 26,15,953 units last month, as compared to 22,58,970 units in November 2023, a growth of 15.8 per cent buoyed by the festive spillover. On the other hand, passenger

vehicle (PV) retail was down 13.72 per cent at 3,21,943 units, as against 3.73.140 units in the year-ago month. The PV segment faced notable headwinds, FADA said in a statement.

"While November was initially expected to build on its prior momentum, particularly due to the marriage season, dealer feedback suggests that this segment underperformed overall expectations," FADA President, CS Vigneshwar said in a statement.

He further said, "Although rural markets offered some support, primarily in the two-wheeler category, marriage-related sales remained subdued."

The late occurrence of Deepawali at the end of October also caused a spillover of festive



affecting the month's sales trajectory, Vigneshwar added.

On PV retail, he said, "Dealers cited weak market sentiment, limited product variety and insufficient new launches. compounded by the shift of festive demand into October."

Vigneshwar further said, "Although rural interest was present, it failed to significantly improve sentiment. Inventory levels have reduced by about 10 days, but to remain high at around 65-68 days.

He reiterated FADA's request to Original Equipment Manufacturers (OEMs) to further rationalise inventory so that the industry can enter the new year on a healthier footing, reducing the need for addition-

segment, FADA said retail sales were at 81.967 units last month as compared to 87,272 units in November 2023, down 6.08 per cent.

Vigneshwar said factors such as restricted product choices, older model issues. limited financier support, and the absence of major festivals in November following a strong October impacted CV uptake.

"External elements such as elections, a slowdown in coal and cement industries, and weak market sentiment also weighed heavily on this category," he added. FADA said three-wheel-

er sales in November were at 1,08,337 units, as against 1,03,939 units in the year-ago month, up 4.23 per cent.

On the overall near-term

the near-term outlook for December is not overwhelmingly strong across segments, it leans towards stability with pockets of potential growth, underlining a sentiment that overall remains cautiously optimistic. With prospects of a bumper

Kharif harvest likely to temper food inflation, the broader mac roeconomic environment appears set to improve, potentially aiding consumer sentiment in the months ahead. However the immediate December outlook derived from dealer feedback is mixed, it added. In the two-wheeler segment,

FADA said, "Dealers suggest that while some buyers remain hesitant' either awaiting newyear models or influenced by subdued post-festive sentiment others could be drawn by potential vear-end discounts and sta ble rural demand.'

As for the PV category, heavy discounting and improved product availability are expected to help offset weak consumer sentiment and a general yearend lull.

"While some customers are deferring purchases for newyear models, overall interest could pick up due to aggressive offers and end-of-year promotions. This sets a tone of cautious optimism, with a moderate chance of improved sales compared to November,"

CCI seeks SC hearing to speed up Amazon, Flipkart cases

New Delhi, Dec 9: India's antitrust body has asked the Supreme Court to hear legal challenges to an investigation of Amazon and Walmart's Flipkart e-commerce platforms, saying those challenges, filed by Samsung, Vivo and others at Indian high courts, were aiming to scuttle the probe.

In a filing December 3, reviewed by Reuters and not released publicly, the Competition Commission of India (CCI) asked the court to hear 23 challenges, filed by Samsung, Vivo, and several vendors on the Amazon and Flipkart platforms, to enable the case to be decided quickly.

Amazon declined to comment, while Flipkart, Samsung, Vivo and the CCI did not respond to requests for comment.

The investigation is a major regulatory challenge for Amazon and Flipkart in a market where e-commerce sales are set to exceed \$160 billion by 2028, up from \$57 billion to \$60 billion in 2023.

The commission's investigation unit concluded in August that Amazon and Flipkart breached India's antitrust laws by favouring selected sellers on their websites. It also found that smartphone companies such as Samsung and Vivo broke those laws by colluding with the two e-commerce companies to exclusively launch products online.

Since the findings, almost two dozen lawsuits across five Indian high courts have been filed by some Amazon and Flipkart vendors, as well as by Samsung and Vivo, to block the investigation as they want to "debilitate and scuttle" the process, the commission said. The separate lawsuits, if al-

lowed, "will lead to absurdity since it will interfere with the flexibility of the (commission's) Director General to carry out investigation in any matter."

Amazon and Flipkart have faced criticism from smaller re tailers for years over their business practices, saying they have suffered due to deep discounts and preferential treatment met ed out by the platforms.

Amazon and Flipkart deny any wrongdoing. A Reuters investiga tion, opens new tab in 2021, based on Amazon internal documents, found the company gave preferential treatment for years to a small group of sellers and used them to bypass Indian laws.

The current commission in vestigation started back in 2020 but has faced many delays. Most of the 23 lawsuits filed

across India in the latest challenge to the case accuse the commission of not following due process during its inves tigation. The commission's filing asking for the 23 cases to be transferred to the Supreme Court is likely to be heard this week, a lawyer familiar with the proceedings said.

Copper demand rises 13% in FY24

New Delhi, Dec 9: India's copper demand grew by 13 per cent annually to hit 1,700 kilo tonnes in FY24, driven by the rapid pace of infrastructure development and building constructions, the International Copper Association India said Monday.

Traditionally, building construction and infrastructure account for 43 per cent of copper demand while contributing 11 per cent to GDP. International Copper Association India said in a statement.

As per the study undertaken by the International Copper Association India, the copper demand in the country witnessed a 13 per cent year-onyear growth in FY24, reaching 1,700 kilo tonnes (kt).

This surge is attributed to overall economic expansion. After the Covid pandemic, the average annual copper demand increased by 21 per cent between FY21 and FY24, the

industry body said.

It further said that the demand for the commodity will continue to rise in the next financial year as well, fuelled by rapidly growing infrastructure and building construction sectors in the country.

As per the latest GDP data. the infrastructure and construction sectors grew by 9.1 per cent and 6.8 per cent, respectively, in the first half of the ongoing financial year.

"The trends reflect robust growth in copper demand, aligning with India's GDP growth trajectory. The growth is fuelled by public and private sector investments, higher consumer spending, and advancements in key sectors like building construction, infrastructure, transportation, industrial and consumer goods wherein copper demand grew by double-digits," International Copper Association India Managing Director Mayur



thrilling three-run win against Chandigarh, here Monday.

With no clarity over his international comeback, the 34-year-old played his eighth SMAT T20 game in 16 days. He has bowled his full quota in almost all the games.

On the day, he first used the long handle to good effect, taking 19 runs off seasoned Sandeep Sharma's final over as Bengal reached 159 for nine after tottering at 114 for eight. He hit two sixes and three fours,

and the last wicket stand of 21 off 10 balls with Sayan Ghosh proved crucial.

Gukesh loses 12th game allowing the Chinese player to restore parity

Singapore, Dec 9: Indian challenger D Gukesh lost the 12th game against defending champion Ding Liren of China to allow his opponent bounce back and level the scores in the World Chess Championship match here Monday.

The 18-year-old Gukesh was ahead by one point after he notched his second win of the match Sunday, which came after seven consecutive draws, but Liren's win Monday has brought things on an even keel.

The two players are now tied at six points each with just two games left in the 14-round classical time control format, still shy of 1.5 points in order to win the title. The remaining two games will be played Wednesday and Thursday, after a rest day Tuesday.

Irrespective of what happens in the next game Wednesday, the match will go the distance (14 games) and more likely there will be tiebreaker – where

games are of shorter duration to determine the winner.

The 32-year-old Liren had won the opening game before Gukesh emerged victorious in the third game. The second and the fourth to 10th games were drawn.

In what was the first victory for Liren with white pieces, Gukesh's preparation did not come as good as the other 11 games that he played here.

The start was an English opening by the Chinese and much to the surprise of the fans Gukesh went for a position that led to a Benoni defense with colours reversed.

Gukesh started to miss out creating counter play in the middle game as white played just normal developing moves. By the 15th move though less on time on the clock, white had a small advantage as a central breakthrough looked inevitable, giving Liren the space advantage.

Gukesh's 17th move did not help his cause as white was able to get the desired break in the centre. Five moves later, another error by Gukesh gave Liren a huge advantage.

Liren then sacrificed a rook which helped him win the match in 39 moves.

Nine wins in a row for Atletico Madrid

Madrid: Atletico Madrid conceded three goals in a Spanish league game for the first time this season here Sunday but still managed to beat Sevilla 4-3 with Antoine Griezmann's double helping to make it nine wins in a row in all competitions for Diego Simeone's in-form side. Thirdplace Madrid restored their three-point lead over fourthplace Athletic Bilbao, who beat Villarreal earlier Sunday. The other goals for Atletico were scored by Rodrigo De Paul (10th) and Samuel Lino (79th). Sevilla may have led 3-1 till deep into the second half of the game, but Atletico showed great resilience to come back.

India go down to 3rd in WTC table

Dubai: South Africa replaced Australia at the top of the ICC World Test Championship (WTC) table Monday after their massive 109-run over Sri Lanka while India are now in the third place following their defeat in the Adelaide Test. South Africa now have 63.33 percentage points after 10 matches in the cycle and they are followed by Australia (60.71 PTC). India were leading the WTC table, heading into the Adelaide Test after their massive win in the Border-Gavaskar Trophy opener in Perth. However, now with with 57.29 percentage points, they are third.

Maini's unique feat

Abu Dhabi: Indian driver Kush Maini made history by clinching the F2 Constructors' race here, making him the first from the country to win a FIA Constructors' World Championship, The monumental achievement Sunday adds to a stellar vear for Maini, who earlier became the first Indian to claim a F2 pole position. Despite the ups and downs of the season, Maini played a pivotal role in Invicta Racing's success, securing five podiums, including a race win in Hungary, His pole position in Jeddah set the tone for the team's dominant campaign, culminating in their victory by a 34.5-point margin over Campos Racing, Maini's former team.

ICC 'disciplines' Siraj, Head



Indian pacer fined while Australian batter escapes with 'sanction'

Adelaide, Dec 9: Mohammed Siraj was fined 20 per cent of his match fees, while Australian batter Travis Head was also 'sanctioned' by the ICC for indulging in a heated exchange of words during the just-concluded day-night Test here. Siraj and Head were held guilty of breaching the world body's code of conduct following a disciplinary hearing Monday.

"Siraj has been penalised 20 per cent of his match fees after being found guilty of breaching article 2.5 of the ICC Code of Conduct for Players and Player Support Personnel," the ICC said in a statement.

The cited rule relates to 'using language, actions or gestures which disparage or which could provoke an aggressive reaction from a batter upon dismissal'.

The ICC said Head too was 'sanctioned' for breaching Article 2.13 of the ICC Code of Conduct for Players and Player Support Personnel. However, he escaped a fine for breaching the rule that relates to the 'abuse of a player, player support personnel, umpire or match referee during an international match'.

Siraj and Head also received one demerit point each on their disciplinary records, marking their first offence in the last 24 months. "Both admitted their offences and accepted the sanctions proposed by match referee I only celebrated and he abused me and you saw that on TV too. It's a huge lie what Head is saying now

Ranjan Madugalle," the ICC said. Head and Siraj had a brief showdown on day two of the match which Australia won by 10 wickets Sunday. Head had struck a splendid 141-ball knock of 140 before being castled by Siraj, who went on to give him an aggressive send-off following an exchange of words.

Head later claimed that he had merely said 'well bowled' to Siraj and that he was disappointed at how the visiting bowler had responded. Siraj disputed that claim, asserting that Head had abused him.

"I only celebrated and he abused me and you saw that on TV too. I only celebrated at the start, I didn't say anything to him," Siraj told broadcaster *Star Sports*.

"What he (Head) said in the press conference wasn't right, it's a lie that he only said 'well bowled' to me. It's there for everyone to see that that's not what he said to me," Siraj added.

Indian eves rout Malaysia

Muscat, Dec 9: Defending champions India shrugged off a slow start to record a 5-0 win over Malaysia in the women's junior Asia Cup contest with yet another impressive showing in

India earned their first penalty corner of the game in the 10th minute but Malaysia defended well. The outcome was the same when India got another penalty corner four minutes later. Malaysia defended dourly and at

the interval it was still goalless.
However, the situation changed quickly in the third quarter as India finally breached the Malaysian defence when Vaishnavi hit the target.

Delhi lad Aarit creates history

Youngest-ever Indian to beat a chess GM

Bhubaneswar, Dec 9: Nineyear-old Delhi boy Aarit Kapil has become the youngest Indian to beat a chess Grandmaster (GM) as he emerged victorious against Raset Ziatdinov of United States in the ninth and penultimate round of the KIIT International open tournament here Sunday.

At nine years, two months and 18 days, Aarit is the youngest Indian and third in the world to beat a GM under the classical time control.

The youngest player in the world to beat a GM is Indian-origin Singapore boy Ashwath



Kaushik who won against Jacek Stupa of Poland when he was just eight years and six months old earlier this year.

Ziatdinov, 66, is certainly past his prime if the game was any indication. As is usually the case when an experienced GM plays against a youngster, Ziatdinov did many things right positionally to get the upper hand thanks to his better pawn structure.

To Aarit's credit, he fought on after standing slightly worse with his white pieces. It was a long-drawn endgame wherein Ziatdinov made the final mistake and lost a knight.

The resulting position just needed decent calculation and the young lad from Delhi had no troubles whatsoever in converting his advantage in to a well-deserved win. The game lasted 63 moves.

While the victory places Aarit among the elite young talents, it remains to be seen how he performs in upcoming tournaments. The next challenge awaits him in form of under-13 national championship to be held at Durgapur later this month, followed by his own age group event, the under-9 nationals in Pune.

Pooja shatters her own record
