Freedom fighter pension doubled

Bhubaneswar, Jan 2: Freedom fighter pension would be doubled in the state, Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi said during an event held to mark the 38th Freedom Fighters' Day here, Thursday

"Acknowledging free dom fighters' role in India's struggle for Independence, the state government will enhance their pension amount. The freedom fighters, who were imprisoned, will get an increased pension of Rs 20,000 a month from earlier Rs 10,000 a month," he said.

Freedom fighters who actively participated in the Independence struggle but were not imprisoned would now get Rs 15,000 a month, instead of Rs 9,000 monthly, he said.

Maihi said those who were arrested under the Maintenance of Internal Security Act (MISA) during the Emergency will now be eligible for a monthly pension of Rs 20.000

Several people were arrested during the Emergency while fighting for re-establishment of democracy, the CM said.

"This was also called the second struggle for Independence and the pension amount is a step to honour their efforts,' he added.

High nitrate and fluoride levels have been detected in groundwater of 15 and 10 districts of Odisha. The revelation was made in the Annual Groundwater Quality Report 2024 by the Central Ground Water Board (CGWB) after it carried out a nationwide survey on groundwater quality. While nitrate concentration exceeding 45mg/l can cause health

Ayushman Bharat **Digital Mission in** Odisha soon: Min

Bhubaneswar, Jan 2: The state government is set to roll out the Ayushman Bharat Digital Mission (ABDM) soon, Health Minister Mukesh Mahaling said here Thursday.

The state administration would also create Avushman Bharat Health Account (ABHA) IDs for people so that a person's medical records can be accessed from anywhere in the country from one account, Mahaling said.

Speaking to media, he said, "We're raising awareness among people to create ABHA IDs under the National Health Authority (NHA) at common service centres.³

With ABHA, citizens can store their medical and health records in a centralised account and access them through their unique ID. "This initiative is going to be a major achievement for the health sector under the Digital India programme," the minister said. On implementation of the Ayushman Bharat scheme in Odisha, the minister said the process has started to issue new health cards to beneficiaries

About 3.5 crore members of one crore families of Odisha will be covered under the Ayushman Bharat and state-sponsored Gopabandhu Jan Arogya Yojana (GJAY), he said.

Bhubaneswar, Jan 2: In what raises significant health concerns among the people, the Central Ground Water Board (CGWB) has found high nitrate levels in groundwater of 15 districts of the state. The 'Annual Groundwater

Quality Report 2024' released by the CGWB also found excessive fluoride content in the groundwater of 10 districts.

High nitrate levels (above

45mg/l) have been found in the groundwater in Angul. Bolangir, Bargarh, Cuttack, Dhenkanal, Keonjhar, Khurda, Koraput, Mayurbhanj, Nayagarh, Nuapada, Puri, Sambalpur, Subarnapur and Sundargarh districts, the report said.

Nitrate contamination is a significant environmental and health concern, particularly in agricultural regions using nitrogen-based fertilizers and

animal waste. High nitrate levels can cause health issues like blue baby syndrome in infants and are unsafe for drinking.

"High nitrate levels in groundwater can be a result of excessive irrigation which can push nitrates from fertilizers deep into the soil." the report said, adding that poor management of animal waste in livestock farming adds to the problem as it releases nitrates

"High fluoride contents in groundwater used for consumption are harmful to human health. Long-term intake of groundwater with excessive fluoride concentrations often leads to waterborne fluorosis, such as dental and skeletal fluorosis." it said.

A total of 15,259 monitoring locations were chosen nationwide to check groundwater quality in May 2023. High nitrate levels were found in groundwater of 440 districts across India, with 20 per cent of the samples collected exceeding the permissible nitrate concentration, the report said.

New Orleans attacker inspired by IS group

New Orleans (US), Jan 2: A US Army veteran who drove a pickup truck into a crowd of New Year revellers in New Orleans, killing 15 people, had posted videos to social media hours before the carnage saying he was inspired by the Islamic State (IS) group and expressing

a desire to kill The FBI said it was investigating early Wednesday's attack in which the driver steered around a police blockade and slammed into revellers before being shot dead by police as a terrorist act and did not believe he acted alone.

Investigators found guns and what appeared to be an improvised explosive device in the vehicle — which bore the flag of the IS group — along with other explosive devices elsewhere in the city's famed French Quarter. President Joe Biden said

Wednesday evening that the FBI found the videos the driver posted to social media. He called the attack a 'despicable' and 'heinous act'.

The rampage turned festive Bourbon Street into a macabre scene of maimed victims, bloodied bodies and pedestrians fleeing for safety inside nightclubs and restaurants. In addition to the dead, dozens of people were hurt. Zion Parsons, 18, of Gulfport,

Mississippi, said he saw the truck barrelling through, throwing people like in a movie scene, throwing people into the air.

"Bodies, bodies all up and down the street, everybody screaming and hollering," said Parsons, whose friend Nikyra Dedeaux was among the people killed.

"This is not just an act of



terrorism. This is evil," New Orleans Police Superintendent Anne Kirkpatrick said.

The attack is the latest example of a vehicle being used as a weapon to carry out mass violence and the deadliest IS-inspired assault on US soil in years.

The driver 'defeated' safety measures in place to protect pedestrians, Kirkpatrick said, and was hell-bent on creating the carnage and the damage that he did.

The FBI identified the driver as Shamsud-Din Jabbar, 42, a US citizen from Texas, and said

Montenegro: Gunman kills 12, shoots self AGENCIES

Cetinje (Montenegro), Jan 2: Shock and dismay prevailed in Montenegro Thursday after a gunman fatally shot 12 people, including two children, in a west ern town before killing himself.

At least four others were wounded in the shooting ram page in Cetinje Wednesday that followed a bar brawl, officials said. This was the second such incident in the town in the past three years.

The shooter, identified as 45-year-old Aco Martinovic, killed the owner of the bar, the bar owner's children and his own family members, officials have said.

The attacker, who first fled after the rampage, was later located and surrounded by police. He died after shooting himself in the head, Interior Minister Danilo Saranovic said.





Tiger relocation plan deferred

The plan to relocate three Royal Bengal Tigers from Madhva Pradesh was put off owing to erratic behaviour of tigress Zeenat which crossed the STR boundary and wandered into the forests of Iharkhand and West Bengal

Bhubaneswar, Jan 2: The state government Thursday said that plans to bring three more Roval Bengal Tigers (RBTs) from Madhya Pradesh have been delayed because of the "erratic" behaviour of two tigresses - Zeenat and Jamuna - which were translocated from Maharashtra.

State Forest and Environment Minister Ganesh Ram Singh Khuntia said, "There were plans to relocate five RBTs from Maharashtra and Madhya Pradesh to boost the big cat population in Odisha. Two have already been translocated to Similipal Tiger Reserve (STR) from Maharashtra.'

The minister added, "The three other RBTs from Mad-



hya Pradesh will be released in senior forest official said. Debrigarh Wildlife Sanctuary.

Zeenat is currently kept in a soft enclosure in Jenabil range of STR's southern division. Similarly, tigress Jamuna (two-and-a-half years old), released into STR in October, displayed similar behaviour. She crossed the national park boundary and entered Kuldhia Sanctuary in Balasore district, but later returned to STR without much difficulty. Both Jamuna and Zeenat were translocated to Simili-

pal from Tadoba-Andhari Tiger Reserve in Maharashtra to improve the gene pool and were released into the core area in October and November, respectively.

Officials said is focused on providing a well-managed and sustainable environment for the RBTs and is taking measures to increase the big cat population in the state while involving local communities in conservation efforts

Two days ago, state's principal chief conservator of forests (Wildlife) PK Jha mentioned that the Forest department would reassess the situation before deciding whether to proceed with the relocation of the tigers from MP.

Odisha forest officials had visited MP's Bandhavgarh National Park in October after the National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA) gave in-principle approval to bring three more RBTs.

An official said this is not the first time Odisha has faced setbacks in tiger relocation. In 2018, two tigers (one male and one female) were released into Satkosia Tiger Reserve after being brought from Madhya Pradesh. However, tigress "Sundari" was poached, while the male tiger "Mahavir" fell ill and was sent back to Bandhavgarh National Park.

According to the All Odisha Tiger Estimation 2023-24, conducted by the state government, there are currently 30 tigers and eight cubs, with 27 tigers found in STR.









Naveen writes to Majhi for quick crop loss aid

Bhubaneswar, Jan 2: Leader of Opposition Naveen Patnaik wrote to Chief Minister Mo han Charan Majhi Thursday, urging him to take immediate steps to compensate farmers who have been hit hard by unseasonal rains.

Patnaik undertook an extensive tour of rain-affected Ganjam, Puri, Cuttack, Jagatsinghpur and Kendrapara districts December 30 and 31.

"The farmers have suffered huge losses due to unseasonal rains and they are in severe distress. The rains have caused extensive damage to both paddy and non-paddy crops during the harvesting period," he said.

"They were not aware about the intensity of rains as the government advisory was not issued on time. Patnaik said it was "disturbing" and "unfortunate" that several farmers died in the last 10 days.

"During my visit to Jagatinghpur district, I had gone to the house of a young farmer, Krutibas Swain of Balikuda



During questioning, the duo failed to give any satisfactory answer about the making of cement, Preliminary investigations revealed that Navak said Sasmal sourced used concrete sand and hardened cement from several shops near Jeypore in Koraput, Later, they engaged manual labour to crush them into fine particles and repackage them under various cement brands.

Jungle safari opens at Atei reserve forest NHRC sends notice to Keonjhar,

Keonjhar, Jan 2: In good news for nature lovers, jungle safari at Atei reserve forest. located under the Ghatagaon range of Keonjhar Forest Division, opened to the public Thursday. The first-of-its-kind initiative by the Keonihar Forest department aims to attract more tourists and nature enthusiasts to the district

Keonjhar Member of Parliament (MP) Anant Naik inaugurated the facility during a ceremony held on the Maa Tarini Temple premises in Ghatagaon. Several MLAs from Keonjhar district and senior officials were present at the event.

Keonjhar district is known for its natural beauty, with tourists flocking to its waterfalls, streams, forested hills, reservoirs, and religious shrines throughout the year. The Atei jungle safari is expected to further enhance the district's appeal, providing visitors with the opportunity to explore the forest and observe wildlife up close in special vehicles provided by the Forest department.

This is the first safari of its kind in the district, and nature and wildlife lovers are partic-



excited about the development. The Forest department has completed the necessary infrastructure work to make the safari possible. It is anticipated that the new initiative will attract a significant number of tourists to Keonjhar. The safari includes a guided

tour of the forest in specially designed vehicles, with the package covering various points of interest such as the Atei viewpoint, Daragudisila river, the migratory bird zone, a wildlife watch tower, the meadows deer zone, and a bird watching zone, along with various forest management activities.

"Professional driver-guides

with extensive knowledge of local wildlife are part of the tour. Complimentary binoculars will be provided to tourists to aid in wildlife viewing, and refreshment kiosks offering light snacks and water will be available at designated spots,' Dhanraj HD, Divisional Forest Officer (DFO) of Keonjhar, said. During the safari, visitors may spot elephants, deer, wild boars, and other animals, along

with a variety of birds. Tourists can also capture photographs of the scenic landscapes. The duration of the tour is approximately three hours, he added. The safari is expected to become a key attraction, along-

side other local landmarks such as the Maa Tarini temple in Ghatagaon, the Gundicha Ghaghi waterfall, the Sitabinjh historical site, and the Barha Tipura religious place in Ghatagaon.

Every day, thousands of devotees visit Ghatagaon for darshan at the Maa Tarini shrine. With the addition of the forest safari, the region is set to become more popular among tourists. A booking counter for the safari will be available on the Maa Tarini temple premises. The safari begins at Murgapahari up to Kadabahali, covering a distance of approximately 40km along a forest road. Visitors will also be able to enjoy views of the Dargadishila dam during the journey.

The Atei reserve forest gained attention when a photo of a Royal Bengal Tiger (RBT) was captured by a trap camera, and its paw prints were discovered in the area. Following this, Forest officials imposed restrictions on movement within the forest, sealing off all roads through the forest. Additionally, trap cameras installed by the department have recorded images of rare wildlife species in the reserve, further boosting interest in the safari.

Sambalpur DMs over dam safety

Keonihar. Jan 2: The National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) has directed the District Magistrates (DMs) of Keonjhar and Sambalpur to take immediate steps to ensure the safety of people living near the Hadagarh and Hirakud dams The notice follows a complaint filed by senior lawyer and human rights activist Radhakant Tripathi in December. The apex rights body has asked the authorities to take appropriate action within eight weeks.

Tripathi highlighted that the Hadagarh dam, built on the Salandi river in Keonjhar district, serves residents in both Keonjhar and Bhadrak districts. He noted that an embankment was constructed to protect the local population from rising river waters, but the dam has weakened over time, requiring urgent repairs and restoration.

Tripathi also raised concerns over the safety of the Hirakud



dam, alleging that it too is in dire need of repairs. restoration, and sediment recovery. In the complaint, he pointed to the recent devastating floods in Kerala, which were attributed to issues with dam safety, as evidence of the potential dangers posed by poorly maintained dams

In his complaint, Tripathi claimed that dam safety audits are not being conducted properly in a timely manner. Despite the existence of the Dam Safety Act 2021 and the National Dam Safety Authority, many dams across India are operating without adequate safety measures, which he argues puts people's lives at risk.

He further highlighted that by 2025, more than 1,000 dams in the country will be at least 50 years old. Over time, factors such as reduced water-holding capacity and shrinking premis es have weakened both earther and concrete dams, leading to increased flood risks. Tripa thi also pointed to the risks associated with dams in earth quake-prone areas, particularly in the Himalayan basin. There are 6,000 dams in India,

Climate & Inflation

lobal inflation in recent years has pushed the prices of food, energy, and basic goods to unprecedented levels. As a result, the rising cost of living has dominated political discussion around the world, but especially in G20 countries. Ahead of last year's presidential election in the United States, for example, 41 per cent of Americans cited inflation as their top economic issue.

High inflation risks overshadowing another urgent crisis: global warming. But rising prices and climate change are closely linked. Extreme weather damages crops, spoils harvests, and drives up food prices, and its impact is growing more pronounced as heatwaves, droughts, and floods become more frequent and intense. These events also disrupt supply chains and energy production, pushing up the price of other essential goods.

Climate-induced inflationary pressures are especially acute in Africa and Latin America, where food accounts for a significant share of household spending. For example, an extensive drought exacerbated by El Niño raised the price of staples in Malawi, Mozambique, Zambia, and Zimbabwe earlier this year, creating a hunger crisis. By contrast, households in wealthier countries tend to spend a smaller share of their income on food and are thus better insulated.

Discussions about climate change often overlook its economic toll on vulnerable populations and how it deepens inequality, focusing instead on green growth and emissions reductions. But as inflation increasingly disrupts economic stability, this toll can no longer be ignored. Shifting weather patterns have raised the prices of oranges in Brazil, cocoa in West Africa, and coffee in Vietnam. A recent study by the Potsdam Institute for Climate Impact Research and the European Central Bank estimates that rising temperatures could drive up food inflation by 3.2 percentage points per year, with overall inflation increasing by 1.18 percentage points annually by 2035.

Rather than being treated solely as an environmental issue, climate change must be central to economic policy. Fiscal and monetary authorities should incorporate both immediate and long-term climate-related risks into their inflation forecasts and policies – as they already do with the "transition risks" of shifting to a low-carbon economy. Some institutions have begun to adapt. The SIGNIFICANT SHARE South African Reserve Bank has acknowledged the importance of understanding climate risks. Since 2018, the Central Bank of Costa Rica has integrated the impact of global warming into its economic models.

Central banks and finance ministries should also work with climate organizations to create practical solutions that help cushion economies from the interrelated shocks of extreme weather, soaring inflation, and food insecurity. For example, the African Climate Foundation (where one of us works) has developed Adaptation and Resilience Investment Platforms (ARIPs), which use advanced analytics that combine climate and weather data, biophysical models, and economy-wide models to facilitate investment and policy prioritisation - a more comprehensive approach to building resilience

The ACF used an ARIP in Malawi last year, after the country was devastated by Cyclone Freddy, the longest-lasting tropical cyclone ever recorded. Using this financial tool enabled policymakers to identify lasting solutions that would mitigate the economic damage caused by the cyclone while protecting key industries and strengthening financial stability.

Other climate think tanks are pursuing similar goals. Iniciativa Climática de México is pushing policymakers to consider climate risks in economic planning, while the Institute for Climate and Society in Brazil has called for social-protection plans and climate-sensitive policies to shield low-income communities from the economic conse quences of extreme weather Equally important is regional collaboration, which would allow countries in Africa and Latin America to develop and share economic policies that are specifically tailored to their climate vulnerabilities and support the most exposed communities. Initiatives like the Inter-American Development Bank's Regional Climate Change Platform of Economy and Finance Ministries can serve as a blueprint for such efforts. At the global level, greater coordination between climate and economic institutions is crucial. Tools like the European Union's Carbon Border Adjustment Mechanism highlight the need for careful policy design to mitigate adverse effects - in this case, higher costs for consumers in developing countries. Brazil, as the host of this year's BRICS Summit and United Nations Climate Change Conference (COP30), and South Africa, as the current G20 president, have a unique opportunity to redefine the global economic agenda, championing policies that address the twin crises of inflation and global warming. Failure to act collectively and decisively could deepen inequality, erode economic stability, and jeopardise climate goals. But if policymakers develop innovative solutions that bridge the gap between climate and economic strategies, they can reduce the immediate risks of extreme weather and foster long-term stability and resilience. As both inflation and the planet heat up, the need for integrated, equitable policies has never been more urgent.

UNLOCKING SOLAR MYSTERIES

Parker Solar Probe spacecraft approached very close to the Sun on Nikunja Bihari Sahu IN 2025

24 December, 2024 withstanding its tremendous heat radiations which no spacecraft has done ever before. The probe passed through the atmosphere of the Sun, the corona, at a distance of nearly 6.1 million km from the Sun's surface making it the first man-made object to pass through any star's atmosphere. The spacecraft's signal was temporarily halted during this horrendous journey close to the Sun. However, its beacon signal was restored and received two days later showing that it had survived the passage through the unimaginable high temperatures and intense radiations of the corona. At its closest approach, the craft raced at an incredible speed of 191 km/ sec, roughly 0.064% the speed of light, becoming the fastest object ever built on Earth. This close pass allowed the spacecraft to conduct unrivaled scientific measurements with the potential to change our understanding of the Sun. The probe, launched in August 2018 to exclusively study the solar corona, will make a total 21 flybys of the Sun during its lifetime, exploring and looking

at its corona. The solar corona, the outermost layer of the atmosphere of the Sun, is visible only during total solar eclipse. It has been a source of mystery for astronomers for decades as regards to its temperature and wind behaviour. The temperature of the bright visible disc of the Sun, the photosphere, is around 6000 degrees Celsius. It was expected that as we move outward from the Sun's sur-

face, the temperature should decrease. However, the temperature abruptly increases as we move outward through the corona to reach nearly 2.5 million degrees Celsius which is roughly 300 times hotter than the photosphere. Scientists have not yet been able to solve this mystery. The Parker probe is expected to shed light on this subject.

The second thing that baffles scientists is the behaviour of solar wind. Solar wind is a stream of charged particles released by the Sun's corona that travels all over our solar system and into the interstellar space beyond. This plasma matter of the solar wind mostly consists of electrons, protons and alpha particles with kinetic energy between 0.5 and 10 keV. These particles can escape the Sun's gravity because of their high energy resulting from the high temperature of the corona, which in turn is a result of the coronal magnetic field. But what is really mes-

merising is that the solar wind doesn't slow down as it leaves the Sun; rather it speeds up. Some particles shoot out of the corona with so much energy that they approach the speed of light. The Parker probe will try to unravel some of the mysteries shrouding the solar wind.

Finally, the Sun sometimes becomes very much violent and burps out knots of plasma matter into space. The Sun could blast out these huge blobs of materials threaded with solar magnetic fields to hurtle away at incredible velocities of several millions miles an hour. These activities give rise to a collection of phenomena that scientists call space weather. If these outbursts are strong enough, they can be dangerous to astronauts and satellites in their orbits and could knock out power grids on Earth causing widespread blackouts espe cially in polar regions. Scientists have some techniques in

place for predicting the space weather just like tornadoes and hurricanes on Earth: but they hope Parker mission will make those predictions more accurate and reliable.

The spacecraft was renamed the Parker Solar Probe in honour of US astrophysicist Eugene Newman Parker, who had proposed the existence of nanoflares as an explanation of coronal heating as well as having developed a mathematical theory that predicted the existence of solar wind. A memory card containing names submitted by over 1.1 million people was mounted on a plaque and installed below the spacecraft's high-gain antenna. The card also contains photos of Eugene Parker and a copy of his 1958 scientific paper predicting important aspects of solar physics. While making a passage through the Sun's corona, the craft encountered temperatures as high as 982 degrees Celsius that it was able to survive because of a special heat-shield of carbon composite material protection of 4.5 inches thickness provided over its surface.

The Parker probe will make two more close approaches to the Sun in 2025. The Sun, being the source of all energy on Earth, its study is of paramount importance to us to sustain life on the planet. Through these close passages, the Parker Solar Probe is expected to furnish a treasure trove of data to further our knowledge and understanding of the Sun that powers life on our planet.


India and the world

t the end of 2024, and in the beginning of a New Year, it is useful to reflect on the year goneby, the highs and lows, successes and disappointments. Such an exercise helps to re-strategise our actions for the next year. Thinking people across the world do this in their respective domains, so do we in this column on India and the world. To me, two events highlighted the past year - the re-election of Narendra Modi in India, and the bouncing back of Donald Trump to the White House. Modi's third consecutive term as Prime Minister meant maintenance of continuity in India's foreign policy and resumption of Trumpism in US and the world, albeit with a bit of difference. One can trust Trump to be unpredictable, surprising the world with dramatic posturing and positions that he is capable of taking. For Modi and India's foreign policy, it is sticking to the conventional strategy of 'continuity and change', although, admittedly, more change and less continuity. These are subjects for analysis in 2025. Trump may be precise in his public articulations, but

he is definite and decisive in his actions. Besides, the Trump-Modi inter-personal equations, supposed to be close, will determine India-US ties, especially with regard to China and Russia. Modi will be nudged to take

convergence of strategic interests between both countries. At the same time, Indian-Russian relations experienced a voluntary dilution, mainly due to the mess Russia has got into in unwisely invading Ukraine, and failing diplomatically to deal with the West. Russia may have fallen to a Chinese trap of making Moscow vulnerable and more dependable on Beijing. Modi managed to keep both the US and Russia on friendly terms. Although the stance of neutrality may not be viable in practical terms in the long run.

country's national interest. His maiden overseas visit to New Delhi went off well. The Sri Lankan President publicly acknowledged India's timely support and made relevant promises on regional security. He committed not to allow his country to be used against any anti-India activity. Bangladesh gave quite a bit of tension with a political upheaval in the country that brought unprovoked violence against Hindu minorities and anti-India posturing by the current government. This shift took place following the flight of former Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina into India where she is being sheltered. Nepal has not moved away much from India last year perhaps because of the instability of governments. India managed to hold its own in world politics, despite a few challenges and broke new grounds in certain areas and countries. The economy did not grow as it should have in keeping with New Delhi's targets and aspirations, but did not do badly.

Net non-performing assets stood at 0.6%, reflecting improved bank balance sheets capable of supporting private investment and growth. Retail lending trends were a focal point in 2024. Following the RBI's decision to increase risk weightings for specific consumer loans in late 2023, retail lending by banks and to non-banking financial companies (NBFCs) moderated. 



AAP, BJP lock horns over farmers' issues

New Delhi, Jan 2: The BJP and the Aam Aadmi Party clashed over farmers' issues Thursday, with Union Agriculture Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan accusing the AAP government in Delhi of denying peasants the benefits of central schemes, an allegation that comes ahead of the Assembly polls in the capital.

In response, Chief Minister Atishi hit back at the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), saying it should ask Prime Minister Narendra Modi to hold talks with the farmers sitting on a fast unto death in Punjab instead of giving sermons.

She alleged that the condition of farmers was never as bad as it is under the BJP regime.

Former Delhi Chief Minister and AAP chief Arvind Kejriwal, in a post on X. also claimed that the BJP-led Centre is preparing to implement the three revoked farm laws "through the backdoor" by calling it a "policy". He said copies of the new "policy" have been sent to all states for

their views on it. In a letter to Atishi Wednesday, Chouhan alleged that her government is depriving farmers of benefits under central schemes and urged her to keep political differences aside in matters of farmer welfare. The Union minister said the Delhi government has failed to implement major central initiatives,

including the Integrated Horticulture Development Mission, Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana and the Beej Gram programme. "I am writing this letter in

sadness. You have never taken proper decisions in the interest of farmers. Your government has stopped implementation of farmers-friendly central schemes. Your government is not sympathetic towards farmers. Today, farmers in Delhi are upset and worried," Chouhan

said in the letter. The Union minister said the absence of the Integrated Horticulture Development Mission has prevented farmers from accessing benefits for nursery establishment, tissue-culture facilities, planting material procurement and post-harvest infrastructure. In a separate video message, he alleged that the Delhi government has failed

to submit proposals for implementing central agricultural schemes, effectively blocking benefits from reaching farmers in the national capital 'The Centre stands ready with funds, but their release hinges on state proposals. Unfortunately, Delhi's government

has not submitted any proposals, leaving farmers unable to access scheme benefits," Chouhan said in the video message. He urged the Delhi gov-



HC grants 3 weeks' time to ED to respond to Soren's affidavit

Bombay HC stops monitoring of Govind Pansare murder case

Mumbai: The Bombay High Court Thursday discontinued its monitoring of the probe in the 2015 murder of communist leader and rationalist writer Govind Pansare while asking the sessions court to expedite the ongoing trial. The trial at the Kolhapur court should be held on a daily basis, the HC directed. A division bench of Justices A S Gadkari and Kamal Khata said the monitoring of the investigation was no longer necessary, noting that a report submitted by the Anti-Terrorism Squad (ATS) of Maharashtra Police indicates that the case has been probed from all angles.

Malda/ Kolkata, Jan 2: Trinamool Congress councillor Dulal Sarkar was shot dead by unidentified miscreants in West Bengal's Malda district Thursday morning, police said.

Sarkar, the TMC councillor from Malda, was shot in his head multiple times from close range by bike-borne assailants at Jhaljhalia More area, they said.

"He was taken to a nearby hospital, where he succumbed to injuries. A probe has been initiated and we are trying to identify the culprits," a senior police officer told PTL West Bengal Chief Minister and TMC supremo Mamata Banerjee expressed shock over the killing of Sarkar, who was popularly known as Babla.

India 2nd most targeted by cyber attacks in 2024: CloudSEK

New Delhi, Jan 2: India emerged as the second most targeted nation in terms of cyber attacks in the world as 95 Indian entities came under data theft attacks in 2024, cyber intelligence firm CloudSEK said in a report.

According to the company's ThreatLandscape Report 2024 based on data monitoring in dark web, the US was the most targeted country, with 140 attacks, due to its economic dominance and digital infrastructure followed by India where data of 95 entities were

"India: Rapid digitization exposed 95 entities, making it the second most attacked nation," the report said. Israel was on the third spot where 57 entities faced attacks due to geopolitical tensions.

"The threat actors impacted various sectors in India, with the finance and banking sectors experiencing the highest number of victims at 20. This was followed by the government sector with 13 victims,

"Lockbit was the most active ransomware group in India being responsible for over 20 incidents in the country, followed by more than 15 targets by Killsec. Ransomhub ransomware was responsible for over 12 incidents in the country," the report said.

ment at the historic Gandhi Maidan in the state capital, three days after giving a "48-hour ultimatum" to the Nitish Kumar government for acting on the demand, raised by aggrieved candidates.

The administration, however, said the hunger strike at Gandhi Maidan is illegal as it is not the designated site for holding protests. "My primary demand, of

course, is cancellation of the exam held December 13 and conducting a fresh test. I have also heard allegations that posts to be filled by the exam were virtually put on sale. Such corrupt officials must be identified and brought to justice", said Kishor, who was accompanied by a number of supporters.



Bagh where the aggrieved aspirants have been holding a round-the-clock sit-in for nearly two weeks.

The 47-year-old former poll strategist, who hopes his fledgling party to make a big impact in Assembly polls due in less than a year, also made it clear that the demands he is making were just a few of the things on which he expected the government to act.

Striking a populist note, the former JD(U) vice president said he wanted the state's NDA government to "bring in a domicile policy, reserving two thirds of government vacancies for candidates from the state". He added: "The injustice do-

Hence, an FIR is being lodged against Kishor and his supporters. They are also being served with a notice to either move to Gardani Bagh or face legal action,' the statement added.

In a related development, the CPI(ML) Liberation announced that its students' wing AISA, along with like-minded orga nizations, will Friday stage a demonstration in front of the Chief Minister's residence "to compel Nitish Kumar to break his silence" on the issue.

"Thousands of young men and women, from across Bihar, will gather in Patna for tomorrow's protest. The government will have to cancel the exam and order fresh tests, besides taking action against erring officials," said the Left party.

Notably, nearly five lakh candidates had appeared for Combined Competitive Exams held December 13 when hundreds of examinees, all of them at the Bapu Pariksha Parisar here, boycotted the tests alleging question papers had been leaked.

This was met with a strong denial from the BPSC, which claimed the allegations were "a conspiracy" to force the exam's cancellation, even as fresh tests were ordered for more than 10,000 candidates who had appeared at Bapu Pariksha Parisar.

The candidates have been asked to appear January 4 at 22 newly designated centres across the city.

CM Mamata accuses BSF of infiltration plot

Lack of tech transfer slowing climate action in India: Govt

New Delhi, Jan 2: A concerning lack of technology transfer from developed countries has forced India to rely heavily on domestic resources and stretch national capacity, slowing its efforts to achieve critical climate objectives, the government has said in a biennial update report (BUR) to the

UN climate change office. In its fourth BUR submitted to the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNF-CCC) December 30. India said that in the absence of promised technology and financial support, it is forced to divert resources from other essential needs to develop these solutions independently.

India had also raised the matter at the UN climate con-

ference in Baku, Azerbaijan, in November last year and urged developed nations to eliminate intellectual property barriers to technology transfer that hinder climate action in developing countries.

"India's climate strategy emphasises integrating advanced technologies across kev sectors. such as solar, wind, bioenergy, electric vehicles, climate-resilient agriculture, and carbon capture to foster low-carbon development and build resilience.

"Despite substantial national efforts and investments, barriers like slow international technology transfer and intellectual property rights (IPR) hinder the rapid adoption of these technologies," the BUR report said.

Biennial update reports are



submitted by developing countries to the UNFCCC every two years, providing updates on emissions, climate action progress, and needs for support in mitigation and adaptation. India's previous BURs have outlined essential technologies

required to cut greenhouse gas emissions and adapt to the warming world

However, none of the required technologies have been effectively transferred, facilitated, or made available under the current climate change regime, the report said.

"This lack of technology transfer has forced India to rely heavily on domestic resources and stretch national capacity, slowing its efforts to achieve critical climate objectives," it said.

Technology transfer is a critical component of climate change mitigation and adaptation that faces both demand and supply-side challenges which must be addressed within the framework of the 'Common but Differentiated Responsibilities and Respective Capabilities (CBDR-RC) principles

"The Convention, along with subsequent agreements such as the Kyoto Protocol and the Paris Agreement (Article 10), emphasises the central role of transferring financial resources and technology from developed to developing nations for climate action. The establishment of the Technology Mechanism, consisting of the Technology Executive Com mittee (TEC) and the Climate Technology Centre and Network (CTCN), was intended to facilitate this process.

On the demand side, India said, access to relevant, affordable, and scalable technologies is often limited due to high costs, lack of infrastructure, and regulatory barriers.

Addressing both demand and supply side issues is crucial for effective technology transfer requiring a comprehensive approach that includes policy interventions, capacity build ing, financial support, and in ternational cooperation, it said.

New Orleans, Jan 2: Joe Biden and Donald Trump have given drastically contrasting reactions to the deadly New Year's Day explosions in New Orleans and Las Vegas that killed at least 16 people.

The US president cautioned against "jumping to conclusions" and expressed empathy for victims and the city of New Orleans, while his incoming successor sought to blame Democrats, "open borders" and institutions that he has vowed to purge, including the FBI, once

he returns to office. Speaking from the White House Wednesday evening, Biden cited FBI reports that identified the suspected perpetrator of the attack in New Orleans's busy Bourbon Street. 42-year-old Shamsud-Din Jabbar, as "an American citizen, born in Texas" who appeared to have been inspired by the

Islamic State. "He served in the United States army on active duty for many years," Biden said in a four-minute address.

The president also said he had been told by the FBI that Jabbar had posted videos on social media hours before the attack, which killed 15 people. The videos "indicated that he's inspired by ISIS, expressing a desire to kill".

FBI investigates link between Tesla blast, New Orleans attack

Las Vegas: The FBI is investigating whether there is any connection between the explosion of a Tesla Cybertruck outside the Trump International Hotel Las Vegas and a New Orleans truck attack that killed 15 people on New Year's Day, officials said. Gasoline canisters and large firework mortars were packed into the Cybertruck that burst into flames shortly after a driver intentionally drove a pickup truck into crowds celebrating the new year in the French Quarter of New Orleans according to officials. The sole occupant of the truck was found dead inside and seven people sustained minor injuries, the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Depart ment said in a statement. Videos taken by witnesses inside and outside the Las Vegas hotel showed the vehicle exploding and flames pouring out of it, as it sat outside the hotel at around 8:40 am local time (1640 GMT) Wednesday. A Trump spokesman did not return a request for comment Thursday on the Cybertruck in cident. Eric Trump praised Las Vegas fire and law enforcement officials Wednes-day for their quick action on the explosion. The Trump International Hotel in Las Vegas is part of the Trump Organization, the company of President-elect Donald Trump, who will return to the White House Jan. 20. Tesla (TSLA.O), opens new tab CEO Elon Musk was a key backer of Trump in his 2024 presidential campaign and is also an adviser to the incoming president.

Dhaka, Jan 2: A court in the southeastern port city of Chattogram Thursday denied bail to Hindu monk and former ISK-CON leader Chinmov Krishna Das in a sedition case.

A group of 11 lawyers stood for him with a bail petition during the hearing for which Das appeared virtually.

"The hearing continued for some 30 minutes when (Metropolitan Sessions) Judge Mohammad Saiful Islam heard both the prosecution and the defence lawyers and then rejected his (Das') bail petition, a court official said.

Das, formerly with the International Society for Krishna Consciousness (ISKCON) and now a spokesperson for the Bangladesh Sammilita Sanatani Jagran Jote organisation, was arrested at the Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport in Dhaka November 25. He was brought to Chattogram where the court sent him to jail rejecting his bail petition the next day.

He was arrested on sedition charges for allegedly "desecrating" the Bangladesh flag brought to Chattogram where subsequent violence over his arrest left a government prosecutor dead, sparking further tensions.

New textbooks to alter credit of declaration of independence

Bangladesh has introduced new textbooks that state that Ziaur Rahman declared the country's independence in 1971, replacing the previous ones crediting founding father Bangabandhu Sheikh Muiibur Rahman with the declaration. according to a media report. The new textbooks for primary and secondary students have several changes, The Daily Star newspape said. The textbooks also removed the title "Father of the Nation" for Mujibur Rahman. The new textbooks for the 2025 academic year will state that "March 26. 1971. Ziaur Rahman declared the independence of Bangladesh, and March 27. he made another declaration of independence on behalf of Bangabandhu," the paper quoted Prof AKM Reazul Hassan, chairman of the National Curriculum and Textbook Board, as saying. The information has been included in the free textbooks where the matter of the declaration was mentioned, he added. According to the paper writer and researcher Rakhal Raha, who was involved in the process of making changes in the textbooks, said they tried to free the textbooks from "exaggerated. imposed history".

Israel's ex-defence chief Gallant quits parliament

Jerusalem, Jan 2: Former Israeli Defence Minister Yoav Gallant, who had often taken an independent line against Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu and his far-right government allies, said Wednesday he was resigning from parliament.

Gallant was fired from the government in November by Netanyahu, after months of disagreements over the conduct of the war against Hamas in Gaza, but kept his seat as an elected

member of the Knesset. "Just as it is on the battlefield, so it is in public service. There are moments in which one must stop, assess and choose a direction in order to achieve the goals," Gallant said in a televised statement.

Gallant had often broken ranks with Netanyahu and his coalition allies of far-right and religious parties, including over exemptions granted to ultra-Orthodox Jewish men from serving in the conscript military - a hot button issue.



In March 2023, Netanyahu fired Gallant after he urged a halt to a highly contested government plan to cut the Supreme Court's powers. His dismissal triggered mass protests and Netanyahu backtracked.

The International Criminal Court has issued arrest warrants for Gallant and Netanyahu, along with a Hamas leader, for alleged war crimes and crimes against humanity in the Gaza conflict, which Israel has contested.

Israeli airstrikes killed at least 18 people in the Gaza Strip Thursday, including three children and two high-ranking officers in the Hamas-run police force, according to Palestinian and hospital officials.

The group of kung fu nuns, aged from 17 to 30, are members of the 1,000 year-old Drukpa lineage, which gives nuns equal



status as monks and is the only female order in the patriarchal Buddhist monastic system.

Usually, nuns are expected to cook and clean and are not allowed to practise any form of martial art. But His Holiness Gyalwang Drukpa, a monk who ranks only slightly below the Dalai Lama in the Tibetan Buddhist hierarchy, decided to train women in kung fu to improve their health and spiritual vell-being

He opened the nunnery in 2009 and it now has 300 members aged between six and 54. "We do kung fu to keep our-

selves mentally and physically fit, and our aim is to promote women's empowerment and gender equality," said Jigme Jangchub Chosdon, 23, a nun who is originally from Ladakh in India.

The nuns come from Bhutan, India and Nepal and are all trained in kung fu, the Chinese martial art for self-defence and strength.

"With the confidence from kung fu, I really want to help the community, young girls to build their own strength," said 24-year-old Jigme Yangchen Gamo, a nun from Ramechhap in U sually, nuns are expected to cook and clean and are not allowed to practise any form of martial art

Jigme Konchok Lhamo, 30, from India, said her main goal was to achieve enlightenment like Lord Buddha, who founded Buddhism 2,600 years ago.

"But for now as I am a nor mal person. I think I will be focusing more on helping others," she said. "Helping others is our religion."

Manufacturing growth hits 12-month low in Dec amid softer rise in output, new orders

New Delhi, Jan 2: India's manufacturing sector growth fell to a 12-month low in December. as new business orders and production expanded at softer rates, a monthly survey said Thursday.

The seasonally adjusted HS-BC India Manufacturing Purchasing Managers' Index was at 56.4 in December, down from 56.5 in November, indicating a weaker improvement in operating conditions.

Despite the decline, the headline figure remained above its long-run average of 54.1 thereby signalling a robust rate of growth. In PMI parlance, a print above 50 means expansion. while a score below 50 denotes contraction.

"India's manufacturing activity ended a strong 2024 with a soft note amidst more signs of a slowing trend, albeit moderate. in the industrial sector. The rate of expansion in new orders was the slowest in the year, suggesting weaker growth in future production," Ines Lam, Economist at HSBC, said.

The manufacturing sector growth was hampered by competition and price pressures.

Lam said there was some uplift in the growth of new export orders, which rose at the fastest pace since July. "Although new export sales

rose at a slower rate than total

new business, the pace of growth for the former strengthened as firms were able to secure international orders from across the globe," the survey said.

According to the survey, the "substantial" rate of growth resulted in further expansions in

buying levels and employment. Ongoing improvements in new work intakes prompted manufacturing companies in India to purchase additional inputs for use in production processes and on the job front, around one in ten companies recruited extra staff, while fewer than 2 per cent of firms



Oldest Olympic gold

Budapest, Jan 2: Five-time Olympic champion Hungarian gymnast Agnes Keleti, the world's oldest living Olympic gold medallist and a survivor of the persecution of Jews in World War Two, died at the age of 103 Thursday, the Hungarian

Olympic Committee said. Born as Agnes Klein in Budapest January 9, 1921, Keleti ioined the National Gymnastics Association in 1938 and won her first Hungarian championship in 1940, only to be banned from all sports activities that year because of her Jewish origin.

"Agnes Keleti is the greatest gymnast produced by Hungary, but one whose life and career were intertwined with the politics of her country and her religion," the International Olympic Committee said in a profile on its website.

The HOC said Keleti escaped deportation to Nazi death camps where hundreds of thousands of Hungarian Jews were killed, by hiding in a village south of Buda pest with false papers. Her father and several relatives died in the Auschwitz death camp.

She won her first gold at the Helsinki games in 1952 aged 31 when most gymnasts had long been retired, the HOC said.

Keleti reached the peak of her career in Melbourne ir 1956, where she won four gold medals and became the oldest female gymnast to win gold the HOC said. A year later Keleti settled in Israel, where she married and had two children

Her 10 Olympic medals, in cluding five golds, rank Keleti as the second most successful Hungarian athlete of all time, the HOC said. She has also received multiple Hungarian state awards.
