Bhubaneswar, Jan 9: Asserting that the world today listens to India, Prime Minister Narendra Modi Thursday said due to the country's heritage, it is able to tell the international community that the future does not lie in 'yudh' (war) but in 'Budh' (Buddha, a symbol of peace).

Three Naxalites killed in Sukma encounter

Raipur/Sukma, Jan 9: Three Naxalites were killed in an encounter with security forces in Chhattisgarh's Sukma district Thursday, state Deputy Chief Minister Vijay Sharma said.

The security forces have achieved success in the anti-Naxal operation in Sukma, he said.

So far, bodies of three Naxalites have been recovered and the search operation is still underway, Sharma, who holds the Home portfolio, told reporters in Raipur.

Referring to the IED blast triggered by Naxalites January 6 wherein eight security personnel and a civilian driver of their vehicle were killed in Bijapur district, the Deputy CM said, "There is a huge anger among security forces after what Naxalites have done."

"I have met them (security forces). I reiterate that with the strength and courage of our jawans, the (Naxal) menace will be eliminated within the stipulated time," he said.

Vowing to eliminate Naxals from the country by March 2026, Union Home Minister Amit Shah had Monday asserted that the sacrifice of those killed by the extremists in Chhattisgarh will not go in vain.

On Thursday morning, the encounter broke out in a forest along the border of Sukma and Bijapur districts when a joint team of security personnel was out on an anti-Naxal operation, police said.

Personnel belonging to the District Reserve Guard, Special Task Force and CoBRA (an elite unit of CRPF) were involved in the operation, they said.

With this, nine Naxalites have been killed in separate encounters in the state so far this year. Last year, 219 Naxalites

were neutralised by security forces in separate encounters in the state.

The crescent of flames squeezing Los Angeles - including a huge fire between Santa Monica and Malibu on the city's western flank and a conflagration in the east near Pasadena - was so expansive that it was visible from space as a huge pincer.

More than 100,000 people



have been ordered to evacuate as dry, hurricane-force winds spread flames across parched ground that has seen no rain for months. At least five people have died since the fires erupted Tuesday.

The homes of movie stars and celebrities were among those consumed by flames, which tore through some of the world's most lavish real estate, and in the case of the Hollywood Hills fire, above showbiz landmarks instantly recognisable around the world.

"This firestorm is the big one," Los Angeles Mayor Karen Bass told a press conference after rushing back to the city, cutting short an official trip to Ghana.

At least six separate wildfires were burning in Los Angeles County Thursday morning. Three of them were listed as 0% controlled, including the Palisades fire in the west, the Eaton Fire in the east and the smaller Sunset Fire in the Hollywood Hills

2.8km drilled to pull 1.2mn-yr-old ice core from Antarctic

Chicago, Jan 9: An international team of scientists announced Thursday they've successfully drilled one of the oldest ice cores yet, penetrating nearly 2 miles (2.8 kilometres) to Antarctic bedrock to reach ice they say is at least 1.2 million years old.

Analysis of the ancient ice is ex-

Analysis of the ancient ice is expected to show how Earth's atmosphere and climate have evolved. That should provide insight into how Ice Age cycles have changed, and may help in understanding how atmospheric carbon changed climate, they said.

"Thanks to the ice core, we will understand what has changed in terms of greenhouse gases, chemicals and dusts in the atmosphere," said Carlo Barbante, an Italian glaciologist and coordinator of Beyond EPICA (European Project for

Ice Coring in Antarctica), the project to obtain the core. Barbante also directs the Polar Science Institute at Italy's National Research Council.

The same team previously drilled a core about 800,000 years old. The latest drilling went 2.8 kilometres deep, with a team of 16 scientists and support personnel drilling each summer over four years in average temperatures of about minus 35 degrees Celsius.

Italian researcher Federico Scoto was among the glaciologists and technicians who completed the drilling at the beginning of January at a location called Little Dome C, near Concordia Research Station.

"It was a great a moment for us when we reached the bedrock," Scoto said. Isotope analysis gave the ice's age as at least 1.2 million years old, he said.

Both Barbante and Scoto said



that thanks to the analysis of the ice core of the previous EPICA campaign they have assessed that concentrations of greenhouse gases, such as carbon dioxide and methane, seen since the Industrial Revolution began. "Today, we're seeing carbon dioxide levels that are 50 per cent above the highest levels we've had over the last 800,000

The announcement was exciting to Richard Alley, a climate scientist at Penn State who was not involved with the project and who was recently awarded the National Medal of Science for his career studying ice sheets.

Alley said advancements in studying ice cores are important because they help scientists better understand the climate conditions of the past and inform their understanding of humans' contributions to climate change in the present. He added that reaching the bedrock holds added promise because scientists may learn more about Earth's history not directly related to the ice record itself.

"This is truly, truly, amazingly fantastic," Alley said.

curb malpractice: CHSE Bhubaneswar: District-level

squads will be formed to curb malpractice during the upcoming Class XII (Plus II) examination, Council of Higher Secondary Education (CHSE) Controller of Examination Prasanta Kumar Parida said, Thursday. The CHSE had formed district-level squad in three southern Odisha districts last year to check malpractice during the examination. As the experiment was successful, the authorities have decided to implement it in all districts this year.

CISF constable shoots self dead in Rourkela

Rourkela: A Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) constable shot himself dead while on duty inside the Rourkela Steel Plant here in the early hours of Thursday. The deceased constable has been identified as Abhinandan PK, 23, a native of Kerala. Around 2.30am, when his colleagues heard a loud noise, they rushed to the spot and found that Abhinandan shot himself from his service pistol on the right side of his head, a police officer said. The constable was taken to IGH, where he was declared dead by the doctors, the officer said.

Misuse of CAMPA fund alleged

Bolangir, Jan 9: Serious allegations of large-scale corruption have emerged regarding the use of the Compensatory Afforestation Fund Management and Planning Authority (CAMPA) fund in the Bolangir Forest Division over the past 10 years.

It is claimed that funds allocated for compensatory afforestation have been misappropriated under the guise of forest restoration. Hemant Panda, an RTI (Right To Information) activist, has called for a high-level investigation into the corruption.

Speaking at a press conference in Bolangir, Panda provided details of the alleged financial irregularities in the disbursement and utilisation of funds under the CAMPA scheme.

ASHA brings hope & health to remote villages

Nabarangpur, Jan 9: In the remote pockets of Nabarangpur district, where medical care once seemed out of reach, Accredited Social Health Activist (ASHA) Dalimba Mali has emerged as a saviour for pregnant women and patients battling chronic illnesses

Known as the "Nightingale of the Hinterlands", Mali has been tirelessly serving her community for 19 long years, thereby saving lives and ensuring better health outcomes.

Mali, an ASHA from Butisargi village under Jharigaon block in the western district. began her journey in 2005. At that time, the region was plagued by high maternal mortality rates and deadly diseases such as malaria and tuberculosis (TB). Pregnant women often delivered at home, leading to

complications and fatalities, while patients with severe illnesses relied on ineffective tra-

ditional and herbal treatments.

Determined to bring a turnaround, Mali made a commitment to eliminate these issues. She began by encouraging pregnant women to seek proper prenatal care and institutional deliveries, urging them to avoid home births. Regular health checkups at local health centres became the norm under her guidance. Her tireless efforts ensured no maternal deaths occurred in her village over the past 19 years, while many patients with severe illnesses have recovered due to timely medical intervention

Mali's work extended beyond healthcare advocacy of the local residents. She personally accompanied patients to hospitals, ensured they received necessary treatment, and fol-



lowed up on their recoveries. Her dedication often meant putting duty above her personal life, leaving her family and children behind to care for the

community without any discrimination.

Her efforts have earned widespread recognition. The district health department

has honoured her for her contributions, and she has even received accolades from the Odisha Governor. Villagers, including Kamala Mali and Tambu Das, praised her selfless service, calling her a beacon of

Reflecting on her journey, Mali said, "Initially, people had little trust in modern medicine, and many refused to seek treatment at hospitals. Today, the mindset has changed. Patients now follow proper medical advice, take their medications regularly, and recover faster."

Through her relentless hard work and unwavering dedication, Dalimba Mali has transformed her village into a healthier and hopeful place to live at. She remains a true testament to the impact of grassroots healthcare workers in India's rural communities

Advanced heart procedure at City Manipal Hospitals

Bhubaneswar, Jan 9: The Commissionerate Police Thursday arrested five individuals, including a couple, in connection with the brutal murder of 35-year-old Sahadev Nayak, which took place Wednesday in broad daylight near Rasulgarh Road Over-Bridge (RoB).

The arrested include Laxmidhar Nayak (29), his wife Lipika Nayak (32), and their associates Rocky Nayak (24), Laxmi Nayak (25), and Rakesh Nayak (27). Book on Indian coolies in Fiji released at PBD

Bhubaneswar, 9: Eminent author and academician Dr Rekha Chaturvedi released her book "Fiji Mein Bhartiyon Ka Itihas Tatha Unka Jeevan (1879–1947)" (The Life and History of Indians in Fiji (1879-1947)) during the Pravasi Bharatiya Divas (PBD) celebrations in

Bhubaneswar. The book delves into the harsh realities and struggles faced by Indian indentured labourers, referred to as "coolies", who

were sent to Fiji under British rule. Highlighting their arduous lives and sacrifices, Dr Rekha emphasised the importance of recognising and preserving their stories for future generations. "Inden-

tured labor is one of the darkest chapters of British colonialism, impacting Indian communities in South Africa, Mauritius, Trinidad, Guyana, and Fiji,' said the author. The book seeks to shed light on the plight of these labourers, who were subjected to inhumane conditions while performing grueling tasks

in foreign lands. The book, published by Sasta Sahitya Mandal, is a poignant narrative of the lives of Indian labourers in Fiji, capturing their struggles and resilience. It is inspired by the works of the author's grandfather, Banarasi Das Chaturvedi, who wrote extensively on the subject, including "Fiji Mein Mere 21 Varsh" (My 21 Years in Fiji), based

on the experiences of Totaram Sanadhya, an indentured labourer.

The Girmitiva system. named after the indenture agreement or "girmit". subjected labourers to harsh working conditions and exploitative practices. This system persisted in Fiji until its formal abolition in 1920.

Dr Rekha's book builds upon her grandfather's advocacy, presenting a comprehensive account of the trials and resilience of Indian diaspora communities in Fiji.

The release of the book on PBD underscores its significance to the Indian diaspora. The 18th PBD convention, inaugurated by Prime Minister Narendra Modi January 9, celebrates the contributions of over-

seas Indians and their enduring ties with their homeland. Dr. Rekha's work serves as a tribute to the resilience of the Girmitiya community and their indomitable spirit.

Despite personal and professional commitments, Dr Rekha dedicated years to researching and documenting the history of Indian indentured labourers. Her work reflects her deep connection to her heritage and her family's longstanding advocacy for the Girmitiva cause.

This historic publication not only highlights a forgotten chapter of history but also aims to inspire a deeper understanding of the struggles faced by the Indian diaspora under co-

ate last year, Australia's parliament, reacting to concerns about the effect of social media on children's mental health, amended the Online Safety Act to require users to be at least 16 years old to open an account on social-media platforms such as TikTok, Snapchat, Instagram, and X. The amendment is expected to come into

The law received widespread support in Australia, both in parliament and among the public, but it has also been criticized. Some dispute the link between social-media use and mental-health problems in teenagers. Others see a violation of the right to freedom of expression. Even those who support the effort wonder how it can be enforced.

There is little doubt that the mental health of teenagers, especially girls, has deteriorated sharply since the introduction of smartphones and the emergence of social media. The digital platforms targeted by the law design algorithms to keep people on their sites, because more clicks mean more advertising revenue. The result? A Gallup survey showed that US teenagers spend an average of 4.8 hours per day on social media.

That is a big slice of a teenager's free time, which could otherwise be spent interacting with friends in person and with places and objects in the real world. Jonathan Haidt, a social psychologist and the author of The Anxious Generation, has said that social-media platforms have 'rewired childhood and changed human de-

velopment on an almost unimaginable scale.' Heavy teenage social-media use and higher levels of depression and anxiety clearly go together; what is disputed is whether this is merely a correlation or a causal relationship. Good studies that test whether sufficiently long periods of reduction in social-media use reduce depression and anxiety are difficult to carry out, because trials in which individual teenagers leave a platform while their friends remain on it can be expected to produce less benefit - and could even cause harm to the children who are now isolated from their friends

It is important that groups of teenagers all go off social media together, so that social media use is replaced by real-world interaction. In addition, one would need other, randomly selected control groups whose members do not reduce social-media use. In the absence of such rigorous trials, the evidence we have does suggest that heavy social-media use causes anxiety and depression, but it is not conclusive.

Australia may therefore be doing the world a service by effectively running a national experiment. This assumes, of course, that Australia does substantially reduce the time young teenagers spend on social media. Policymakers plan to achieve their goal by imposing heavy fines on companies that operate the newly age-restricted social-media platforms if they fail to take "reasonable steps" to prevent those under 16 from opening accounts. The law assigns the task of outlining what

counts as "reasonable steps" to Australia's eSafety Commissioner, an independent statutory office.

 $Whats App\ and\ similar\ messaging\ apps,\ as\ well\ as\ some\ online\ health$ and educational services, will be exempted from the legislation. Young people will continue to be able to view YouTube videos or pages on social media, such as business landing pages on Facebook, without an account. On the other hand, the government has announced its intention to introduce further legislation creating a "Digital Duty of Care" that will put the onus on digital platforms to prevent known or

Paradoxically, the Australian law may benefit social-media executives and programmers who are sufficiently aware of what they may be doing to children's mental health to be uneasy about it. Given the current lack of regulation, any social-media platform that gets serious about ensuring that children are not opening accounts will simply lose business to less scrupulous rivals. The law creates a level playing field for all platforms, thus overcoming the collective-action problem.

The Australian constitution does not make sweeping statements about basic rights. In general, and in contrast to the United States, courts accept the supremacy of the elected legislature. The High Court of Australia has, however, ruled that the provisions of the constitution establishing representative and responsible government imply that parliament should not place an undue burden on political communication.

One possible response to those who have suggested that Australia's legislation violates this principle is that children under 16 do not vote and hence have less need for political communication. Moreover, it could be argued that the burden is not disproportionate, because the harm caused by social media is sufficiently serious to justify the modest restriction contained in the legislation. The Australian government could also exempt social-media platforms that are limited to political communications, although that would require someone in government to determine which communications are political and which are not.

DECLINE OF THE MIGHTY

largest economy in the world with a nominal GDP of 4.7 trillion dollars in 2024 as per the estimate of the International Monetary Fund. Its population is 84 million. The fourth largest economy is Japan at 4.07 trillion with a population of 124 million. India is fifth with 3.9 trillion dollars and 1.4 billion people. Japan's population is shrinking by half a per cent every year, while for Germany the population has been rising at about 0.8 to 1% per year for the past few years. It is mainly due to the influx of immigrants, many fleeing wars in Ukraine, Africa or Syria. But among the top five economies of the world (in nominal dollar terms), only Germany is stagnant as compared to the level five years ago. The US economy is 10% larger than the pre-pandemic level, even Japan is about 3% larger, China is about 25% bigger and India by about 30%. Germany is close to zero. And for 2024 and 2025 its economy will shrink.

This is a two-vear recession. It is a big geopolitical story for the third largest economy and the world. It has already had political ramifications within Germany. The government led by Chancellor Olaf Scholz has fallen. It failed to get a vote of confidence from Parliament last month. This means there will be early elections in February instead of the scheduled one in September. The loss of the vote of confidence was inevitable after the three-party ruling coalition had collapsed a month earlier. That breakup was because the third member of the coalition, the pro-business rightist FDP decided to break away from the other two, SDP and Green party. There was friction anyway, but the last straw was the surging popularity of the ultra-right wing and anti-immigrant party AfD (Alternative for Germany). The AfD showed huge gains in

the elections in the two provinces of Saxony and Thuringia. The AfD is right-wing, populist, Euroskeptic, and opposes immigration. It is a young party born in 2013 but its rise is very fast and is part of a global trend of the rise of populist politics combined with a clear xenophobic sentiment.

How did Germany get to this situation, and does it have lessons for others? Firstly, there is the China impact. Well into the twenty-first century it was the biggest exporting economy, even ahead of China. The two countries had a symbiotic trade relationship, with Germany exporting high value capital goods, machinery, automobiles and chemicals and China sending back consumer goods. But China subsequently became Germany's competitor, and even German luxury brand cars are now produced in China. Secondly, there was the impact of the sovereign debt crisis of 2011 in Europe. This was following the Lehman crash of 2008. In this second wave, the governments of Portugal, Ireland, Italy, Spain and especially Greece were saved by a mega rescue led mainly by the fiscal and banking might of Germany. That rescue became necessary to prevent a widespread banking collapse, and more so since German banks were heavily exposed to sovereign debt of the

Southern European countries.

It could also be said that it was payback time. Germany had enjoyed the benefits of Euro currency unification since 1999. Since the erstwhile German currency mark was much stronger, in the Euro regime, Germany had a de facto undervalued currency. This helped its exports hugely, and no wonder it became a powerhouse with a large trade surplus. That surplus in turn was capital outflow into banking assets in Europe, which went sour during the 2011 debt crisis. So, Germany had to spend its own fiscal resources to bail out other European governments. The third big reason behind Germany's predicament was the Ukraine war and its fallout. The cosy relationship with Russia for cheap gas has ended after the Nord Stream gas pipeline was destroyed. This has been causing energy costs to soar and also gas shortages in Germany. Chinese overcapacity is leading to global dumping of goods, undermining German export prospects.

It is possible that manufacturing exports will revive at least in value terms if not in volumes. But Germany faces longer term serious challenges which push productivity growth downward. As per a research report from the IMF, the real problems for Germany arise from its ageing population, its very low public

formed bureaucracy. Germany's working age population will decline by nearly 1% in five years, unless offset by immigrants, to which the AfD is vigorously opposed. The public investment to GDP ratio over the last few years is one of the lowest among OECD and European countries. This is partly due to the fact that the federal government is tied by a rather strict fiscal discipline law and the provincial and municipal governments are not investing enough. But this has a negative impact on productivity and growth.

German exports to US, which are robust as of now, run the risk of high tariffs from the Trump government. The markets for German goods are shrinking due to global competition led by China. Even Volkswagen is closing three factories within Germany. Most importantly Germany is a laggard when it comes to digital tech, artificial intelligence and software services. German economist and columnist Wolfgang Munchau has written a book called "Kaput," which says that the growth model is fundamentally broken, and it is the end of the German miracle. He attributes the decline to the mercantilist policies followed by the industrial and political elite, overreliance on Russia and China and a failure to take leadership in new sectors and digital technologies.

This year is one of increased uncertainty. What will be the economic and trade policies of Trump? More protectionist and mercantile, hurting everyone? How will Russia come out of the huge burden of the cost of war? Interest rates are at 21% in Russia and inflation is soaring. Will China be able to arrest its slowdown? This is the geopolitical and geoeconomic landscape against which the German economy must show its resilience. Is the gloom talk about its decline

overdone? Only time will tell.

he recent flight of a satellite-tagged white-rumped vulture which covered a stunning 4,000-km from Tadoba Andhari Tiger Reserve in Maharashtra to Tamil Nadu, offers an opportunity to reflect on the state of vulture conversation projects in India.

Until the early 1980s, millions of vultures soared across the Indian subcontinent presenting a majestic sight. However, their population has since suffered a steep decline. In particular, the Gyps vultures including the whiterumped, Indian, and slender-billed, began to disappear from their established habitats throughout the 1990s. By 2008. the vulture population in the country had suffered a staggering 99.75% decline. From around 4 crore in the 1980s. fewer than 1 lakh were left. The Bombay Natural History Society (BNHS) duly raised an

alarm in the 1990s. BNHS joined forces with the Royal Society for the Protection of Birds (RSPB) to launch a conservation and breeding programme. These efforts aimed to prevent vulture extinction by establishing a captive population that could eventually be reintroduced to the wild and bolster dwindling numbers. Four

Jatayu Conservation Breeding Centres (JCBCs) were set up across India in partnership with state governments. The first JCBC was established in Haryana's Pinjore in 2001, followed in Rajabhatkhawa, West Bengal (2005), Rani, Assam (2007) and Van Vihar National Park, Bhopal (2011).

The JCBC in Pinjore, Haryana, represents a cornerstone of this critical initiative. Housed within the Bir Shikargah Wildlife Sanctuary, this 5-acre facility, managed jointly by the Haryana Forests Department and the BNHS with support from the RSPB, is the world's largest facility for breeding and conserving Indian vultures.

The centre's research played a landmark role in identifying diclofenac, a non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drug commonly administered to cattle for pain and inflammation, as the primary cause of vulture mortality and population decline. Tissue samples from vulture carcasses collected across India were analysed in collaboration with Aberdeen University, UK, confirming the presence of diclofenac. The study revealed that 75% of these carcasses exhibited "visceral gout," a condition caused by kidney failure leadits on internal organs. Further investigation established that all vultures with visceral gout had diclofenac residues in their tissues, linking the drug directly to their deaths. This strong correlation demonstrated that diclofenac poisoning accounted for at least 75% of the vulture population decline. Subsequently, the centre's

efforts were instrumental in securing a nationwide ban on the veterinary use of diclofenac. The DCGI issued directives on May 11, 2006, instructing state drug controllers to revoke manufacturing licenses for veterinary diclofenac. The final gazette notification banning the drug was published in August 2008. 2006 also saw the release of the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change's Action Plan for Vulture Conservation, concurrent with the DCGI's ban on the veterinary use of diclofenac. This decisive action effectively halted the decline of vulture populations by 2011.

The Jatayu Project has witnessed brisk activity during the last few years. In 2020, the MoEFCC launched a Vulture Action Plan 2020-25 to address the devastating decline of vulture populations in India. The new

plan focused on minimising diclofenac use, regulating NSAID sales, ensuring safe alternatives, and establishing a robust surveillance system to prevent future drug-related threats. It also called for expansion of conservation and breeding centres implementation of vulture safe zone programmes, and development of species-specific conservation plans for the red-headed and Egyptian vultures.

In June 2024, the world's first conservation and breeding centre for Asian king vultures came up in the Maharajganj district of UP. The facility is dedicated to improving the population of Asian king vultures, which were identified as critically endangered on IUCN Red List since 2007. As part of its long-term action plan, the centre aims to release 40 pairs of vultures into the wild over 8 to 10 years.

The Jatayu Conservation and Breeding Project exemplifies a multi-faceted approach to wildlife conservation, from the initial identification of diclofenac as the primary threat to the establishment of breeding centres and the implementation of the Vulture Action Plan.

'Climate change puts India's rice, wheat output at risk'

New Delhi. Jan 9: India's rice and wheat output is projected to dip by 6-10 per cent due to climate change, impacting access to affordable food for millions, senior officials have said.

Another effect of climate change is that sea water is becoming warmer along the coast forcing fish to move away to cooler water in deep sea, which has also hit the fishing community, the officials said India's wheat production had touched 113.29 million tonnes in the 2023-24 crop year, which was about 14 per cent of the global output, while rice harvests topped 137 million tonnes. Rice and wheat form staple diet for the country's 1.4 billion population, 80 per cent of which relies on subsidised food grains



supplied through various government schemes.

"Climate change will reduce the yields of both wheat and rice by 6 to 10 per cent, significantly impacting farmers and food security of the country," Mrutyunjay Mohapatra, the Director General of the India Meteorological Department (IMD), told PTI.

He said global warming was also reducing the frequency and strength of Western Disturbances, which are weather systems emerging from the Mediterranean region that bring winter rain and snow to northwest India. This could lead to severe water shortages the Himalayas and the plains below in the near future. M Ravichandran, Secretary, Ministry of Earth Sciences, said during an interaction with PTI along with Mohapatra.

According to the National Innovations in Climate Resilient Agriculture (NICRA). wheat yield in India is projected to decline by 6-25 per cent by 2100. Irrigated rice yields are expected to reduce by 7 per cent by 2050 and 10 per cent by

CBI books Karti Chidambaram

New Delhi, Jan 9: The CBI has registered a fresh case of corruption against former finance minister P Chidambaram's son and Congress MP, Karti Chidambaram, for allegedly giving relief to alcoholic beverage company Diageo Scotland over a ban on the duty-free sale of its whisky, officials said Thursday.

The case pertains to an alleged suspicious payment made to Advantage Strategic Consulting Pvt. Ltd, "an entity controlled" by Karti P Chidambaram and his close aide S Bhaskararaman by Diageo Scotland and Sequoia Capitals, the CBI FIR said. "Enquiry revealed that out of various proposals of FIPB enquired into, it was found that Diageo Scotland and Sequoia Capitals have suspiciously transferred funds to Advantage Strategic Consulting Pvt. Ltd., an entity controlled by Sh.

Karti P Chidambaram and his close aide S Bhaskararaman," it said. The agency alleged that its enquiry has found that Diageo Scotland, UK used to import duty-free Johnnie Walker whisky.

No immediate reaction was available from the suspects named in the FIR. In April 2005, the India Tourism Development Corporation (ITDC), which had a monopoly over the sale of imported duty-free liquor in India, put an embargo on the sale of the Diageo Group's duty-free products in India, which resulted in a huge loss to Diageo Scotland as 70 per cent of its business in India pertained to the sale of Johnnie Walker whisky, the agency alleged. The CBI FIR alleged that Diageo Scotland approached Karti Chidambaram, seeking help in lifting the ban and made payments of USD 15,000 to Advantage Strategic Consulting, which took it in the guise of "consultancy fee".



Kangaloo hails India's contribution to world

Bhubaneswar, Jan 9: President of Trinidad and Tobago Christine Carla Kangaloo Thursday said India has made some of the "greatest contributions" to the world civilisation in various fields such as mathematics, medicine and navigation.

Addressing the 18th Pravasi Bharatiya Divas, 2025 convention virtually as the chief guest, Kangaloo said, "India's contributions to the world's development are remarkable. The world's first university was established in Takshashila

Stating that Ayurveda is widely acknowledged as an earlier school of medicine, she said that the art of navigation was born in Sindhu river about 6,000 years ago.

"Algebra, trigonometry and calculus were also first devel-

oped in India," she said. This apart, Kangaloo also noted that India was the first country of civilisation which used the symbol zero (0) in arithmetic operations. The

game of chess is also believed to have originated in eastern India while the decimal system is widely acknowledged to have been developed in India.

"And India's very own Shushruta is widely acknowledged to be the father of surgery," she said.

India is one of the countries that established diplomatic relations with Trinidad and Tobago following the country's independence from the United Kingdom in 1962, Kandad and Tobago forever, the Trinidad and Tobago Presi-

Lauding India's efforts in holding the PBD, she said that over the last two decades, this convention has been collaborating between India and its diaspora.

Kangaloo thanked India for conferring the Pravasi Bharatiya Samman Award (PBSA) on her. The award will be handed over by President Murmu Friday.

"In conferring the Pravasi Bharatiya Samman (award), the government and the people of India give powerful expression to the commitment to strengthen the ties between India and all of its children throughout the world," she said.



Three LeT terror associates held

Srinagar: Security forces have arrested three Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) terror associates in the Kulgam district of Jammu and Kashmir, police said Thursday. A police spokesman said the trio were arrested by a joint police, army and CRPF team while investigating an FIR registered under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act in Qaimoh police station in the district. The three -- identified as Ubaid Khursheed Khanday, Magsood Ahmad Bhat and Umer Bashir -- are all residents of Thokerpora in Kulgam.

Four K'taka pilgrims killed in road mishap

Ranipet (Tamil Nadu): At least four pilgrims from Karnataka were killed when the bus they were travelling in was involved in an accident with a vegetable-laden truck and another heavy vehicle here Thursday, police sources said. The victims, mostly hailing from Kolar, were returning home in a KSRTC bus after visiting a temple near Chennai.

Bus catches fire in Navi Mumbai

Thane: Passengers onboard a civic transport service bus had a narrow escape when it caught fire in Maharashtra's Navi Mumbai township Thursday morning, police said. All the 22 passengers were evacuated safely and no one was injured, they said. The incident led to a traffic jam in the area for some time. The bus belonging to the Navi Mumbai Municipal Transport (NMMT) caught fire at Runwal Chowk in Manpada limits on Kalvan-Shilphata Road at around 10.30 am, the police said.

Senior citizen dies in tree crash

Mumbai: A 60-year-old woman died and another was injured when a tree from a private garden fell on them in Mumbai's Ghatkopar area Thursday evening, civic officials said. The incident occurred near a hotel at around 6 pm when the two were walking on the road, they said.

AAP, BJP spar over Jat quota Want to work with

New Delhi. Jan 9: As assembly elections draw closer in Delhi, AAP convenor and former chief minister Arvind Kejriwal Thursday accused the BJP-led Central government of reneging on its promise to provide reservation to the Jat community in the national capital. Addressing a press confer-

ence, Kejriwal, who is contesting from New Delhi seat, said he wrote to Prime Minister Narendra Modi, demanding the inclusion of Delhi's Jat community in the Central OBC list. BJP candidate from New Delhi and former MP Parvesh Verma alleged that Keiriwal has started dividing Delhi on caste lines.

At the presser, the AAP chief also accused the Centre of misleading the community for the past decade, and failing to deliver on its promises "In 2015, the BJP invited

Jat leaders to the prime minister's residence and assured them that Delhi's Jat community would be included in the Central OBC list. Union Home Minister Amit Shah promised the same in 2019. However, nothing has been done to fulfil these promises," Kejriwal

Drawing comparisons, he questioned why Jat students from Rajasthan benefit from reservations in Delhi University (DU), while Jat students from Delhi are denied the same.

"Thousands of children from the Jat community in Delhi are unable to secure admission in DU because they are not part of the Central OBC list," he said. Kejriwal also alleged that

despite Delhi's Jats being recognised under the OBC category in the national capital, the Central government has refused to extend the benefits to them.

"This is nothing but betray al. The Centre must include Delhi's Jat community in the reservations in Central government institutions, including for

Central agencies like the MCD, DDA, and CPWD operate extensively in Delhi, and including Jats in the OBC list would open up significant opportunities for them, Kejriwal said, as he vowed to continue the fight until the community's demands are met.

Reacting to the allegations, BJP leader Verma claimed that as Kejriwal's political ground is slipping, the AAP leader has started dividing Delhi on caste lines. Kejriwal never remembered the Jat community in the past 11 years, he said.

"Arvind Kejriwal, who once spoke of secularism, is now dividing Delhi on caste lines. If anyone has given constitutional recognition to the National OBC Commission, it is PM Modi. For Jats or any caste to be included in the OBC list, the state government must first approve the proposal and send it to the OBC Commission.

"Kejriwal's government held special sessions but used them only to criticise the Centre and the LG, never passing the OBC inclusion for Jats," he stated. Verma criticised Kejriwal for

not convening a session despite two letters from Kailash Gahlot regarding OBC status for Jats. He credited BJP-led govern-

ments in Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, and at the Centre with securing Jat reservations in the past. "Rural Delhi lacks new col-

leges, schools, hospitals, flyovers, and roads, but with elections here, Kejriwal remembers the Jats. It pains me that he accuses me of anti-nationalism for helping women through the 'Ladli' scheme," Verma added.

The 70-member Delhi Assembly will go to polls February 5. The results will be out

Delhi to resolve J&K problems, says Farooq

Jammu, Jan 9: The National Conference government head ed by Omar Abdullah would not 'fight" the Centre but work with it to resolve the problems faced by Jammu and Kashmir, party president Faroog Abdullah as serted here Thursday.

"We don't want to fight New Delhi. We want to work together with Delhi to resolve the state's problems. We don't want to engage in battles. Those who want to fight can do so,' the former chief minister told reporters here.

His remarks came in the backdrop of party Lok Sabha MP Aga Rullah's comments during a TV interview that Omar Abdullah should not distance himself from the aspirations of the people of Jammu and Kashmir and should not be seen by the people as a "Delhi's representative" Addressing concerns about

the unity within the INDIA bloc, Abdullah said the alliance is not just about contesting elections, but it is about strength ening India and eliminating hatred. "The alliance is permanent -- it is for every day and every moment," he said. He was replying to media questions on a range of issues including fissures in the INDIA bloc with the AAP and Congress fighting the Delhi polls separately, the



dual power structure in Jammu and Kashmir, the Maha Kumbh and the Tirupati stampede.

He expressed concern over unemployment in Jammu and Kashmir, calling it a significant issue in the region. "How will people's problem be solved when unemployment is so severe here? Our hospitals and schools are in dire condition. We need teachers, doctors, and paramedics, but instead, unnecessary battles are being fought," he said.

Abdullah said his National Conference has nothing to do with the BJP, but it is the responsibility of the central government to support state governments in addressing local issues.

Abdullah stressed that both the central and state governments should prioritise the needs of the people rather than engaging in conflicts that hin-



Attack on Chad's prez palace leaves 19 dead

N'Diamena: An attack on Chad's presidential palace left 18 assailants dead and six in custody, with one soldier killed and three wounded. state media reported Thursday. The attack Wednesday night occurred while Chadian President Mahamat Debv Itno was inside the palace, but authorities said the situation was quickly brought under control. "The situation is completely under control. There is no fear," Foreign Affairs Minister Abderaman Koulamallah said while surrounded by soldiers in a live Facebook broadcast filmed inside what appeared to be a quiet presidential palace late Wednesday. In an interview with state TV. Koulamallah praised the vigilance of the palace quards, describing the attackers as disorganised and intoxicated by alcohol and drugs. When asked if the attack was terrorism, he said it was probably not, as the attackers were local vouths from the capital, N'Djamena.

Army airstrike killed at least 40 people

Bangkok: An airstrike by Myanmar's army on a village under the control of an armed ethnic minority group killed about 40 people and injured at least 20 others, officials of the group and a local charity said Thursday. They said hundreds of houses burned in a fire triggered by the bombing. The attack occurred Wednesday in Kyauk Ni Maw village on Ramree island, an area controlled by the ethnic Arakan Army in western Rakhine state, they said. The military has not announced any attack in the area. The situation in the village could not be independently confirmed, with access to the internet and cellphone service in the area mostly cut off.

Hush money case: **No relief for Trump**

Albany (US): New York's highest court Thursday declined to block Donald Trump's upcoming sentencing in his hush money case, leaving the US Supreme Court as the president-elect's likely last option to prevent the hearing from taking place Friday. One judge of the New York Court of Appeals issued a brief order declining to grant a hearing to Trump's legal team. Trump has asked the Supreme Court to call off Friday's sentencing. His lawyers turned to the nation's highest court Wednesday after New York courts refused to postpone the sentencing by Judge Juan M Merchan, who presided over Trump's trial and conviction last May on 34 felony counts of falsifying business records.

WILDFIRES SINGE CALIFORNIA

Los Angeles, Jan 9: Firefighters battled early Thursday to control a series of major fires in the Los Angeles area that have killed five people, ravaged communities from the Pacific Coast to Pasadena and sent thousands of people frantically fleeing their homes.

Ferocious winds that drove the flames and led to chaotic evacuations have calmed somewhat and were not expected to be as powerful during the day. That could provide an opportunity for firefighters to make progress reining in blazes that have hopscotched across the sprawling region, including massive ones in Pacific Palisades and Altadena.

The latest flames broke out Wednesday evening in the Hollywood Hills, striking closer to the heart of the city and the roots of its entertainment industry and putting densely populated neighbourhoods on edge during exceptionally windy and dry conditions. But only about a mile away, the streets around the Hollywood Walk of Fame, the TCL Chinese Theatre and Madame Tussauds were bustling, and onlookers used their phones to record video of the blazing hills.

Within a few hours, firefighters had made major progress on the Sunset Fire in the hills. Los Angeles Fire Department Capt Erik Scott said they were able to keep the fire in check because "we hit it hard and fast and mother nature was a little nicer to us today than she was yesterday."

A day earlier, hurricane-force winds blew embers through the air, igniting block after block in the coastal neighbourhood of Pacific Palisades as well as in Altadena, a community near Pasadena that is about 25 miles east. Aircraft had to be grounded for a time because of the winds, hampering firefighting efforts.

Nearly 2,000 homes, businesses and other structures have been destroyed in those blazes — called the Palisades and Eaton fires — and the number is expected to increase. The five deaths recorded so far were from the Eaton Fire.

Some 130,000 people have been put under evacuation orders, as fires have consumed a total of about 42 square miles — nearly the size of the entire city of San Francisco. The Palisades Fire is already the most destructive in Los Angeles history. The dramatic level of destruction was apparent in a comparison of satellite images before and after the fire.

A swath of about 250 homes



in an Altadena neighbourhood that had been dotted with the green canopies of leafy trees and aquamarine swimming pools was reduced to rubble. Only a few homes were left standing and some were still in flames in images from Maxar Technologies. Along a stretch of about 70 wall-to-wall homes overhanging the Pacific Ocean in Malibu, fewer than 10 appeared to be intact.

In Pacific Palisades, a hillside area along the coast dotted with celebrity homes. block after block of California Mission Style homes and bungalows were reduced to charred remains. Ornate iron railing wrapped around the smoldering frame of one house Swimming pools were blackened with soot, and sports cars slumped on melted tires.

More than half a dozen schools in the area were either damaged or destroyed, and UCLA has canceled classes for the week. Another fire has hit Sylmar, a middle and working-class area on the northern edge of the San Fernando Valley that has been the site of many devastating blazes

Fast-moving flames allowed little time

The main fires grew rapidly in distinctly different areas that had two things in common: densely packed streets of homes in places that are choked with vegetation and primed to burn in dry conditions.

Flames moved so quickly that many barely had time to escape. Police sought shelter inside their patrol cars, and residents at a senior living centre were pushed in wheelchairs and hospital beds down a street to safety. In the race to get away in Pa-

cific Palisades, roadways became impassable when scores of people abandoned their vehicles and set out on foot. **Actors lost homes**

The flames marched toward highly populated and affluent neighbourhoods, including Calabasas and Santa Monica, home to California's rich and famous.

Mandy Moore, Cary Elwes and Paris Hilton were among the stars who lost homes. Billy Crystal and his wife, Janice, lost their home of 45 years in the Palisades Fire.

"We raised our children and grandchildren here. Every inch of our house was filled with love. Beautiful memories that can't be taken away," the Crystals wrote in the statement.

In Palisades Village, the public library, two major grocery stores, a pair of banks and several boutiques were destroyed. Landmarks get scorched and studios suspend production

This is all his fault!!!" Trump previously took to Truth Social to blast both Newsom and Joe Biden for their "incompetence" in handling the tragedy. "The fires in Los Angeles may go down, in dollar amount, as the worst in the History of our Country. In many circles, they're doubting whether insurance companies will even have enough money to pay for this catastrophe," the president-elect wrote. "Let this serve, and be emblematic, of the gross incompetence and mismanagement of the Biden/ Newscum Duo January 20th cannot come fast enough!"

Los Angeles Mayor faces calls to resign

The Los Angeles mayor, Karen Bass, has come under severe criticism for cutting the budget allocation for the fire department as the massive wildfire rages uncontrollably, destroying thousands of homes across vast acres in Pacific Palisades and nearby areas, forcing over a lakh residents to evacuate. Mayor Bass slashed the fire department budget by more than \$17 million last year, as she directed more resources toward addressing homelessness. For the 2023-2024 fiscal year, Los Angeles allocated \$837 million to the Los Angeles Fire Department (LAFD), accounting for roughly 65 per cent of the \$1.3 billion budget designated for homelessness initiatives, Fox News reported. However, out of the \$1.3 billion budget for the homeless, roughly half the budget for homelessness went unspent. From the 2023-2024 to the 2024 2025 budgets, the fire department's budget was reduced by over \$17 million, from \$837.19 million to \$819.64. This budget cut happened despite the region being at high risk of wildfires and climate experts warning about extreme events and dry conditions. The mayor has also been slammed for travelling to

Ghana, despite reports as early as last week about an impending windstorm in the region. She returned to a burning city. "RESIGN! WHY ARE YOU IN GHANA?!" one person commented on a nost by her office giving an update on the wildfires. However, Bass brushed off questions about the fire department budget and lack of water supplies and claimed that the fire budget had topped last year.

Water runs short as wildfires burn out of control

Crews battling multiple wildfires that craged across Los Angeles Wednesday were up against a near-perfect storm: intense wind, low humidity and, most troubling for residents, inadequate supplies of water to contain the blazes. Los Angeles authorities said their municipal water systems were working effectively but they were designed for an urban environment, not for tackling wildfires. Jay Lund, a professor in civil and environmental engineering at the University of California Davis, said city water tanks are typically designed to be able to put out localized fires, not widespread fires like the ones blazing in

Lebanon's army chief elected President

Beirut, Jan 9: Lebanon's parliament elected army chief Joseph Aoun head of state Thursday, filling the vacant presidency with a general who has US support and showing the weakened sway of the Iranbacked Hezbollah group after its devastating war with Israel.

In a speech to the chamber, Aoun, 60, vowed to work to ensure the state has the exclusive right to carry arms, drawing loud applause as lawmakers from Hezbollah -- which runs its own military forces -- sat

He promised to rebuild south Lebanon and other parts of the country he said had been destroyed by Israel, and also to prevent Israeli attacks on Lebanon, which was mired in deep economic and political crises even before the latest conflict. "Today, a new phase in the history of Lebanon begins," he said.

His election reflected shifts in the power balance in Lebanon and the wider Middle East, with Shi'ite Muslim Hezbollah badly pummelled from last year's war, and its Syrian ally

Bashar al-Assad toppled in December. It also indicated a revival

of Saudi influence in a country where Riyadh's role was eclipsed by Iran and Hezbollah long ago.

US ambassador Lisa Johnson, attending the session, told Reuters she was "very happy" with Aoun's election.

Officials say Gaza death toll tops 46,000

Deir Al-Balah: More than 46,000

Palestinians have been killed in the Israel-Hamas war, Gaza's Health Ministry said Thursday, with no end in sight to the 15-month conflict. The ministry said a total of 46.006 Palestinians have been killed and 109.378 wounded. It has said women and children make up more than half the fatalities, but does not say how many of the dead were fighters or civilians. The Israeli military says it has killed over 17,000 militants, without providing evidence. It says it tries to avoid harming civilians and blames Hamas for their deaths because the militants operate in residential areas. Israel has also repeatedly struck what it claims are militants hiding in shelters and hospitals, often killing women and children. The war began when Hamasled militants stormed into Israel Oct 7, 2023, killing some 1,200 people, mostly civilians, and abducting around 250. Some 100 hostages are still inside Gaza. Israeli authorities believe at least a third of them were killed in the initial attack or have died in captivity.



Yoon's party sees signs of revival



Seoul (South Korea): South **Korean Opposition parties** introduced a bill Thursday calling for an independent investigation into impeached President Yoon Suk Yeol's brief martial law declaration, as thousands of his supporters and critics held tense rallies near his residence ahead of his potential detention. The bill, jointly submitted by six parties, including the main liberal Opposition Democratic Party, proposes that a special prosecutor investigate whether Yoon's martial law decree December 3 constituted an attempted rebellion. The bill also calls for an investigation into opposition claims that Yoon sought to provoke a clash with North Korea by allegedly flying drones over Pyongyang or discussing the possibility of shooting down trash-laden balloons launched from North Korea across the border, to justify a power grab at home. Yoon's lawyers and the South Korean military have denied the

suspicions.

MISTREATMENT OF INDIAN FISHERMEN

B'desh rejects allegations

Dhaka, Jan 9: Bangladesh Thursday rejected as "baseless and fabricated" the allegations about mistreatment of Indian fishermen, an apparent reference to recent remarks by West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Baneriee.

Expressing its "utter dismay and deep disappointment,' Bangladesh Foreign Ministry also urged "all parties" to avoid such unfounded accusations that undermine the "spirit of bilateral cooperation and mutual respect.'

Banerjee had Monday alleged that some of the 95 fishermen, who were released by Bangladesh recently, were beaten up

"I found some of them were limping. When asked, the fishermen told me that they were assaulted in jail with their hands tied. As a result, they have injuries below the waist and the legs ... They were crying while talking to me," Banerjee had said at the felicitation of the released fishermen

They were arrested for illegally entering Bangladesh wa-

ters more than two months ago. Bangladesh's Foreign Ministry on Thursday termed as 'baseless and fabricated" the allegations of mistreatment of its fishermen detained in Ban-



gladesh, and urged "all parties" to avoid making such unfound ed accusations that undermine the spirit of bilateral cooperation and mutual respect.

"Bangladesh expresses its utter dismay and deep disappointment over the unfound ed remarks and fabricated allegations of ill-treatment in cluding physical abuses of the detained Indian fishermen by the Bangladesh authorities, the Foreign Ministry said in a

statement here. Dhaka "firmly rejects such unfounded allegations, which undermines the spirit of trust, goodwill and mutual respect between Bangladesh and In dia," it said and added that the matter was thoroughly investigated and it was found that "no such ill-treatment or incident of physical abuse happened."

The statement, however, nei ther named anyone nor men tioned any Indian media.



Gold firms near four-week peak

Mumbai, Jan 9: Gold prices hovered near a four-week high Thursday, supported by safe-haven demand, while in vestors pondered about how US President-elect Donald Trump's policies would impact the economy and inflation.



Spot gold inched up 0.1% to \$2,663.34 per ounce, as of 0926 GMT. US gold futures rose 0.3% to \$2,679.60. "Safe haven demand is modestly supporting gold, offsetting downside pressure coming from a stronger dollar and higher rates," UBS analyst Giovanni Staunovo said.

The dollar index hovered near one-week high, making gold less appealing for other currency holders, while Treasury yield stayed near eight-month peaks. Gold hit a near four-week

high Wednesday after a weak er-than-expected US private employment report hinted that the Fed may be less cautious about easing rates this year.

Equity mutual fund inflows surge over 14%

Actively managed equity mutual fund inflows saw over 14 per cent monthly growth at ₹41,155.9 crore in the month of December, the data by the Association of Mutual Funds of India (AMFI) showed Thursday. The growth in equity mutual fund inflows came as thematic/sectoral and small-cap funds saw higher investments. The small-cap funds clocked a net inflow of ₹4,667.7 crore in December, while the net inflows stood at ₹4,111.8 crore in the previous month. The mid-cap category saw an inflow of ₹5,093.2 crore in December, from ₹4,883.4 crore in the previous month, as per the AMFI data. Inflows into the sectoral and thematic category rose to ₹15,331.5 crore. Meanwhile, flexi-cap funds saw an inflow of ₹4,730.7 crore, while multi-cap funds recorded inflows worth ₹5,084.1 crore. Inflows from new fund offers accounted for inflow of ₹13,643 crore last month. Passive fund category saw the most number of new find offering (NFO) launches. NFOs brought a total of ₹4,052-crore inflow into the industry last month. Indian mutual fund industry's assets under management (AUM) saw significant growth over the last decade, as it increased by a whopping 524 per cent to 68.08 lakh crore in November 2024 from 10.9 lakh crore in November 2014. The AUM growth in B-30 (Beyond 30 cities) outpaced the top-30 cities during this period. The mutual fund industry's AUM has increased by more than ₹37 lakh crore in the last four years.

AUSTRALIAN OPEN 2025 Cases involving top rankers Jannik Sinner and Iga Swiatek raise questions OFCW prepares to begin title defence

Melbourne, Jan 9: It is a topic that shadowed tennis in 2024 and is still a talking point as the 2025 Grand Slam season opens at the Australian Open Sunday: doping and the cases involving Jannik Sinner — which actually is still not fully resolved and Iga Swiatek.

Both spent much of last year at No 1, and Sinner still will hold that spot in the ATP rankings when he steps on court at Melbourne Park to begin the defense of his championship, one of two major trophies he won over the past 12 months.

Swiatek, a five-time Slam champ and the woman leading the WTA rankings most of the past three seasons, is currently No 2 behind Arvna Sabalenka. who will be chasing her third consecutive title in Australia.

"Obviously, there are going to be some negative comments," Swiatek said. "You're not going to avoid that.'

Most current players prefer to remain silent when asked about the cases. But there are those who have been happy to weigh in, including 24-time major champion Novak Djokovic, raising questions about whether Sinner and Swiatek were treated the same as other players facing similar circumstances and why their situations were kept under wraps for months.

"I sit and wonder, Why such a big difference in treatment and judgment?"" was two-time major champion Simona Halep's reaction to Swiatek's punishment. "I can't find, and I don't think there can be, a logical answer.

Halep initially was banned for four years after testing positive for the banned drug Roxadustat at the 2022 US Open, then had that penalty reduced to nine months on appeal — although she already had been off the tour longer than that. She was supposed to compete at Melbourne Park for the first time in three years, but withdrew from qualifying because of knee and shoulder pain.

No one has been louder about the subject lately than Nick Kyrgios, the 2022 Wimbledon runner-up who missed nearly all of the past two seasons because of injuries. He has been commenting regularly, in real life and online, even taking a jab (that he said was in jest) at Cruz Hewitt after the 16-yearold son of Australian Davis Cup captain Llevton posted a photo with Sinner from a practice

"It's been handled horrifical-



ly in our sport. Two world No 1s, both getting done for doping, is disgusting for our sport, Kyrgios said at the Brisbane International, the first event of his comeback. "It's a horrible look.

Where do things stand with Sinner's positive drug tests?

Sinner was the dominant player in men's tennis last year, and there's little reason to think that won't continue. In 2024, he went 73-6 with eight titles, including at the US Open, and led Italy to the Davis Cup. He heads into the Australian Open on a 14-match winning streak.

Hanging over it all is this: Two positive tests for a trace amount of an anabolic steroid in March were made public in August; the International Tennis Integrity Agency (ITIA) determined he shouldn't be suspended because the exposure to Clostebol was considered accidental — the result of a massage from a trainer who used the substance after cutting his own finger

The World Anti-Doping Agency was not entirely convinced about the exoneration and thinks a ban of one to two vears would be appropriate. Its appeal, lodged in September, is still pending, and a final determination is expected after the Australian Open ends. "It's in (my) head a little bit." Sinner said, adding that he is

confident everything will go his way.

What happened with Swiatek's failed doping test?

Swiatek accepted a onemonth suspension in late November after testing positive for a banned heart medication known as TMZ. She failed an out-of-competition test in August, and the ITIA accepted her explanation that it was caused by the contamination of a nonprescription medication, melatonin, that Swiatek was taking for jet lag and sleeping issues.

She missed three tournaments — although the real reason wasn't revealed at the time — and finished serving her punishment after the season was done.

"This whole process was pretty abstract sometimes and hard to understand," Swiatek said, surely speaking for many observers.

Which is why, perhaps, Dutch captain Paul Haarhuis said what he did after his team lost to Sinner's Italy in the Davis Cup finals.

"Jannik, in my personal opinion, is an unbelievably nice guy (and) great player, Haarhuis said, "but we (might) never know what happened."
