Bhubaneswar, Jan 13: The Odisha government Monday announced a monthly pension of Rs 20.000 and other benefits for people jailed during Emergency nearly half a century ago.

Along with pension, the state government will bear the medical expenses of all the people jailed during the Emergency, according to a notification by the state Home department.

The benefits will be available to all eligible people who are alive as of January 1, 2025, it said. Hundreds of people were imprisoned in various jails across the country for opposing the Emergency period which lasted from June 25, 1975, to March 21, 1977, when Indira Gandhi was the prime minister.

Rupee has been falling finally land near us?

Bhubaneswar, Jan 13: Odisha Monday became the 34th state to join the Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (AB PM-JAY), seven months after the BJP came to power in the state.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi congratulated the people of the state and took a swipe at the previous BJD dispensation for not adopting the scheme. Odisha's Health and Family Welfare (H&FW) department inked a pact with National Health Authority (NHA) in New Delhi to become the 34th state to implement the health

assurance scheme. The agree-

ment was signed in the pres-

ence of Union H&FW Minister JP Nadda, CM Mohan Charan Majhi and other dignitaries. Speaking on the occasion, Majhi said, "This significant development will change the health status of about 86 per cent of Odisha's population. It is going to revolutionise the approach from top to bottom." He claimed that though the Centre introduced the Ayush-

man Bharat in 2018, the then Odisha government did not implement it for political reasons. The CM also announced that the state will set up

Ayushman Arogya Mandir, a health centre, in each GP. Majhi said the state will implement the Ayushman Bharat

ic low of 86.70 against the US dollar Monday, weighed down by a stronger American currency and surging crude oil prices. At the interbank foreign exchange, the rupee opened

at 86.12, and moved 1 paisa during intraday to 86.11 before closing the session with a loss of a staggering 66 paise at its lowest-ever level of 86.70 against the greenback.

The fall of 66 paise in one session was the steepest since February 6. 2023 when the unit had lost 68 paise. The Indian currency has witnessed the deepest plunge of more than Re 1 in the past two weeks from the closing level of 85.52 December 30. Rupee had breached the 85-per-dollar mark for the first time December 19, 2024.

On Friday, the local currency had declined 18 paise to settle at 86.04 against the US dollar, a day after registering a marginal gain of 5 paise. In the preceding back-to-back sessions Tuesday and Wednesday, it had plunged 6 paise and 17 paise, respectively.

The unprecedented fall was attributed to the relentless chase of the US dollar by investors, which also led to a massive withdrawal of foreign capital from Indian equities. FIIs offloaded equities worth ₹4.892.84 crore Monday.

RBI has allowed the fall in rupee's exchange rate versus US dollar amid dwindling forex reserves and declining emerging market currencies. "RBI will allow the weakness as demand keeps moving up and supplies dwindle," said Anil Kumar Bhansali, Head of Treasury and Executive Director, Finrex Treasury Advisors LLP.

The RBI Friday said the country's forex reserves




dropped by USD 5.693 billion to USD 634.585 billion in the week ended January 3.

At the same time, the dollar strengthened on better-than-expected job growth in the US market, which also fuelled the rising benchmark treasury yields amid expectations of a slower interest rate cut by the Federal Reserve, analysts said.

Besides, the US has imposed more sanctions on Russia, resulting in Brent oil prices higher to USD 81 per barrel. This comes at a time when investors are already cautious in anticipation of restrictive trade measures by the new regime under President Donald Trump.

Anuj Choudhary, Research Analyst at Mirae Asset Sharekhan, said rising crude oil prices and risk aversion in global markets may weigh on the rupee.



Bhubaneswar, Jan 13: In what would further strengthen the mangrove conservation efforts, a groundbreaking initiative is underway in Devi River Mouth, connecting Puri and Jagatsinghpur areas, as US-based renowned Odia scientist Anjan Kumar Panda is all set to pioneer this initiative through Artificial Intelligence (AI).

Mangroves have long proven themselves to be the guardians of Odisha's coastline, shielding the state from numerous natural calamities. However, despite their importance, mangroves in major estuarine ecosystems like Devi River Mouth, Brahmani, Baitarani, and Budhabalanga have lacked protection due to the absence of a special policy for natural mangrove protection.

During his recent trip to India to attend the 18th Pravasi Bharatiya Divas convention held in Bhubaneswar, Panda had the opportunity to visit a community-led mangrove conservation site in Devi River Mouth.

During his visit, Panda, based in San Francisco, USA, explored the natural mangroves and met the community working at the grassroots level to popularise mangrove conservation in India.

He also interacted with young mangrove conservationist Soumya Ranjan Biswal, who has been working tirelessly to promote community-led mangrove conservation.

Panda is set to develop an AI-led initiative, in collaboration with conservationists, to preserve mangroves and Olive Ridley turtles.

'This groundbreaking initiative aims to harness AI capabilities to conserve these fragile ecosystems at an unprecedented scale, connecting with global mainstream efforts from Astaranga mangrove conservation bases," said Panda.

The initiative will leverage AI technology to monitor mangrove health, predict climate impacts, optimise conservation efforts, enhance community engagement, and inform policy decisions.

By harnessing the power of AI, this project has the potential to revolutionise mangrove conservation and protecting biodiversity.

The initiative will also involve consultation and collaboration with state government agencies to expedite efforts and ensure the preservation of natural mangroves.

# **Argentinean Lessons**

rgentina stands out as a glaring example of how the common man is affected when a political outsider subscribing to extreme-right rhetoric assumes power. In his first 12 months, the country's President Javier Milei has introduced drastic economic measures sparking protests since they have only augmented the distress of a population already plagued by economic ills. It may not be a coincidence that the first foreign leader to meet Donald Trump after his victory last November was Milei. He has been invited to the inauguration of the new President of the United States of America, Trump. This justifies Milei's rightist credentials beyond any doubt. Milei wanted support from Trump to shore up the floundering economy for which his policies are responsible, while Trump needed an avid follower from Latin America.

Milei had declared a war on bureaucrats, imposed drastic public spending cuts and sweeping deregulation of Latin America's second-largest economy. The outcome has been one of unmitigated disasters. A recession has already plunged more than half the country into poverty within the first six months of 2024. It is an irony of history that Milei did not so much win the last election as the previous government gifted victory to him. It is worth remembering that when voters gave their verdict in October 2023, monthly inflation stood at about 8 per cent. This caused so much anger and frustration with the established parties among the people, who feared an uncertain future, that they were looking for a change of leadership outside the ambit of known political outfits. Milei skilfully exploited their sentiments. Soon after his victory monthly inflation far surpassed the level of the earlier government and soared to 25 per cent. However, it dropped back to about 3 per cent in November. One is persuaded to believe that Milei's public sector cuts were painful but necessary. Milei also devalued the peso, making domestic prices go up. However the later situation seems to have improved. His election campaign centred around replacing peso with dollar. There are reports of a very high social cost attached to Milei's austerity programme of slashing services and jobs. Many among the populace, just like India, are unable to afford health insurance, further straining underfunded public hospitals. Violent protests against these measures were witnessed in Buenos Aires last summer. Though the economy is showing signs of tentatively recovering from Milei's shock therapy, reports suggest more unrest is likely if living conditions do not improve in the next few months.

As things stand now, Milei's ability to prevent a backlash depends on external factors, which is why, experts say, he rushed to Trump to seek his blessings even before he could start his presidency. For, Argentina's \$44 billion loan from the International Monetary Fund (IMF) is running out and the government is seeking additional funds to ease currency controls without bringing about further devaluation of the peso. Such an eventuality may again cause inflation and damage Milei's popularity rating ahead of key congressional elections. The IMF, despite its support to Milei's measures so far, is wary of its dollars being used not for the purpose for which they are given. Since its 2018 financial crisis, Argentina has relied on IMF bailouts, while loans from Beijing have stood it in good stead. It has become Latin America's largest recipient of Chinese commercial funds. The problem is this dependency on China may prove counterproductive for Argentina as Trump is known for his insistence on disengaging from China

Even if we allow for the view that SNS is known for these kinds of detours and doesn't really mean it, there are larger issues that come to the spotlight on what CEOs in India can get away with

that come to light now and then offer but a tiny peek into a lot more that is wrong at India Inc. This is not how the strength of "India's Yuva Shakti will make India a developed nation," to quote the Prime Minister Narendra Modi speaking just this weekend at the 'Viksit Bharat Young Leaders Dialogue 2025'. These CEOs may want the political leadership to think they are singing the tune of the day but it's in the interest of the political leadership to be wary of such pretence. The disdain for Murthy and now SNS among employees and in general Gen Z is to be heard and seen (who will measure this important variable?) to be believed.

To the other issues that must be discussed so that all CXOs, not just SNS, are appropriately held to account and where required restrained by strong regulatory measures. Consider that SNS was paid a total remuneration of ₹51.05 crore for FY24, which is 534.57 times the median remuneration at L&T. It represents growth of 43.11% over what was paid to him last year. The remuneration is the highest of all employees, some 40% higher than the second highest paid employee at L&T, who is

the President & CFOR Shankar Raman. How are employees who on average get onefive-hundredth of this meant to react to the comments of SNS?

In this context, the first issue on the agenda for a "developed" India should be to put a ceiling on the amount that CXOs pay themselves, never mind the guardrails or formalities that they don't decide their salaries and that the Board does. In the Indian context, these formalities have not worked well enough, partly because our company Boards in themselves are often pliant and work as birds of a feather flocking together. a chosen few keeping themselves in the seat. Note that in the developed economy of Denmark, the home country of the L&T founders, the late Henning Holck-Larsen and Soren Toubro, the variable remuneration of executive directors comprises on average 37% of the fixed, according to a Deloitte report. In the case of the L&T CMD, it is 980% (salary of ₹3.6 crore, commission of ₹35.28 crore, as reported by L&T for 2024). Without grudging these packages, can it be fairly claimed that the performance of the group (the

basis on which commission is usually calculated) is because of the leadership being provided? And how does L&T calculate the losses on account of SNS' remarks, given that many talented candidates will now think twice about joining the company.

The next significant question that comes up is the complete absence of dissent in India's corporates. The language of sustainability, the appeal to innovativeness and the claim of DEI (Diversity, Equity and Inclusion) policies all ring hollow when it becomes clear that no one in Indian corporations, including in the biggest and the so-called best, challenges the boss. Why? The simple answer is that questions are not asked because questions are not encouraged, building a culture where hierarchy rules, the boss is to be always deemed right, and creativity almost by definition cannot thrive. The inner collapse of L&T is seen from the fact that no one challenged SNS in the undated video that has now become the cause of his misery. The problem is not that the video leaked. The problem is that SNS was not asked how he could even make such a statement. He got away for the moment, as our CEOs often do, only for the world outside to pull him down.

For India to harness the power and thinking of a new generation of leaders, the older lot will have to learn to live with more questions, with less judgement and some deeper realisation that they are not quite as extraordinary as they may imagine themselves to be. Since there is no evidence that is likely to happen anytime soon, the Indian establishment must act with a new set of regulations to bring the house to order.

# AI alone won't save the planet

his year's annual meet-ing of the World Economic Forum in Davos, where participants will address the theme of "Collaboration for the Intelligent Age," comes at a critical juncture for the planet. Ecosystems are straining under the pressure of climate change, and the interconnected cycles that maintain freshwater availability, soil moisture. ocean health, and plant growth are spinning out of balance at an alarming pace At least 420 million hectares of forest globally have been lost to deforestation since 1990. causing biodiversity loss to accelerate and fueling climate volatility. Freshwater resources have declined so precipitously - owing to rising temperatures, groundwater mismanagement. saltwater intrusion, pollution, land degradation, and increased population density - that demand is predicted to exceed supply by 40% by 2030. And wildlife populations in freshwater habitats fell by 85% between 1970 and 2020. The paradox is that we continue to degrade the systems that sustain life on Earth despite knowing more about their fragility than ever before. In the search for solutions, we

often look to technology - especially artificial intelligence - as a panacea. But AI alone cannot save the planet. Instead, we must ensure that AI complements, rather than replaces,

the Arctic identify new fishing grounds amid changing climate conditions. But indigenous populations

are not the only ones with valu-

able insights. Local communi-

should be at the heart of global strategies for biodiversity conservation and climate mitigation and adaptation. Policymakers can take steps to bridge the gap between digital innovators and local environmental stewards. Businesses can align their investments with nature-positive goals and share any resulting knowledge. Innovators can create accessible tools that take into account cultural contexts and input from communities - turning top-down interventions into agile, responsive, and collaborative efforts. When political leaders and executives convene in Davos, they must acknowledge that technology is not a cure-all for climate change and biodiversity loss. Without human guidance - bolstered by our capacity for empa thy, cultural understanding, and ethical reasoning - it will be impossible to unlock AI's potential. In the Intelligent Age, coupling advanced tools with lived experience will enable us to transcend the zero-sum mentality that pits people against machines.

Greater openness fosters trust, which in turn accelerates the adoption and refinement of AI tools. Before long, the willingness to share data, insights, and innovations will be seen as a mark of leadership and prestige, rather than a risk. Those who advocate data sharing will facilitate collective progress, demonstrating the cooperation and wisdom needed to guide us toward a safe and healthy planet. intelligence Augmented

Given the massive numbers of people, there were those who got inevitably separated from their groups - a recall in another era of a favourite Hindi film trope of siblings getting separated in the Kumbh Mela. The times have changed, however.

The Uttar Pradesh government implemented several crowd-control initiatives, including 'Bhula-Bhatka' camps, police assistance centres and deployment of personnel on specially constructed watchtowers.

Within the first couple of hours itself, more than 250 individuals got 'lost' but were 'found' thanks to efforts by the administration, officials said.

Ajay Goyal, a pilgrim from Delhi, shared his experience of being separated for an hour. "Just before we got separat-

ed, we had joked about how this often happens at Kumbh Melas in old Bollywood films. Lucki ly, we were reunited within the same Mela itself." Goval said.

Sharing the numbers on X. Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath said in a post on X, "On the first bathing festival today, 1.50 crore Sanatan believers earned the holy benefit of bathing in the uninterrupted and clean Triveni." It is a massive logistical exercise for the government.


Mahakumbh Nagar is the world's largest temporary city, accommodating 50 lakh to 1 crore devotees at any given time, Adityanath said.

The first of the 'shahi snans' royal baths, takes place Tuesday, Makar Sankranti. when the numbers taking a dip in the waters are expected to rise. The last of the 'snans' will be on Mahashivratri February 26.

The origins of the Kumbh Mela go back in the folds of time.

The Rigveda speaks of a divine event called the "Sagar Manthan" or churning of the cosmic ocean, which is considered the genesis of the Maha Kumbh Mela, according to the website kumbh.gov.in.

Legend has it that during this cosmic churning, a pot (Kumbh) containing the elixir of immortality (amrita) emerged. The celestial struggle for possession led to a battle that spanned 12 days, equivalent to 12 human years. Drops of the nectar fell at four locations, Prayagraj, Ujjain, Nashik and Haridwar, where the Kumbh Mela is celebrated.

Reliance Jio said it has successfully deployed plug-and-play pre-configured equipment at a



forward post, leveraging its indigenous full-stack 5G technology.

This achievement was made possible in coordination with Army Signallers from planning to multiple training sessions, system pre-configuration, and comprehensive testing, the company's spokesperson said.

The company said the Indian Army was pivotal in managing logistics, including airlifting Jio's equipment to Siachen Glacier. This collaboration ensured connectivity at 16,000 feet in the Karakoram range, an area characterised by extreme

New Delhi, Jan 13: Army Chief Gen Upendra Dwivedi Monday said there is still a degree of standoff between the Indian and Chinese militaries along the Line of Actual Control in eastern Ladakh and both sides need to sit down and firm up a broader understanding on

how to calm down the situation. Gen Dwivedi, describing the situation in the region as sensitive but stable, said the core commanders have now been delegated powers to resolve trivial matters or minor frictions relating to patrolling and grazing so that they do not become big issues later.



The Army chief, addressing a press conference ahead of the Army Day January 15, also said that there was no such thing called buffer zones as a tempo-

rary moratorium was put on patrolling in certain areas to avoid chances of violence. Delving into changes witnessing the region since the face-off began in April 2020, Gen Dwivedi said both sides

doctored the terrain, carried out constructions, made deployment of troops and resorted to stocking of military hardware. Therefore, what it means is that there is (still) a degree of standoff. Now as you have changed the situation after April 2020, so the trust be-

tween the two countries has to have a new definition, the Army chief said. Gen Dwivedi said the Army

is looking forward to the next meeting of the Special Representatives on the boundary question of the two countries as well as talks under the framework of WMCC (Working Mechanism for Consultation and Coordination) on India-China border affairs. 'We will be moving forward

based on the guidance emerging from the meetings," he said. Calling India's military deployment along the LAC as balanced and robust, he said the Army is well poised to deal with any situation.

A focused capability development for northern borders enabled infusion of niche technology into a war-fighting system, he said.

On the situation in Manipur, the Army chief said "synergised efforts" by security forces and "proactive" government initiatives have brought the situation in the state under control.

"However, cyclic incidents of violence continue. We are working towards establishing peace in the region," he said.


On Jammu and Kashmir, the Army chief said the situation is "firmly" under control and the 2021 "ceasefire" with the Pakistan military on the Line of Control (LoC) was holding up. At the same time he said,

"The violence level is being orchestrated by the epicentre of terrorism that is Pakistan.'

The Chief of Army Staff said infiltration attempts are continuing including at the IB (International Border) sector along with attempts to smuggle in war-like stores and narcotics.

"Last year, 60 per cent of terrorists eliminated were of Pakistan origin. As of today, whatever is a remnant in the Valley and Jammu area, we feel that around 80 per cent or more are of Pakistan origin," he said.

Vaishnaw opted for Meta's Facebook platform to call out Zuckerberg for spreading "misinformation".

"It is disappointing to see misinformation from Mr Zuckerberg himself. Let's uphold facts and credibility," the Union

information and broadcasting minister said, tagging Meta on

X and other social media platforms "From free food for 800 million, 2.2 billion free vaccines, and aid to nations worldwide during covid, to leading India as the fastest-growing major economy, PM Modi's decisive 3rd-term victory is a testament to good governance and public

trust," he said. Vaishnaw said as the world's largest democracy, India conducted the 2024 general election involving more than 640 million (64 crore) voters.

"People of India reaffirmed their trust in the NDA led by PM Narendra Modi Ji's leader ship," he added.

Vaishnaw said Zuckerberg's remarks failed to recognise these efforts and the strong mandate secured by the Indian government, and risked undermining the credibility of Meta's platforms.

"Mr Zuckerberg's claim that most incumbent governments, including India in the 2024 elections, lost post-covid is factually incorrect," the minister said.

Appearing on the Joe Rogan podcast, Zuckerberg said 2024 was the big election year around the world and in a lot of countries like India, the incumbents lost the polls.

New Delhi, Jan 13: Patna High Court Chief Justice K Vinod Chandran was Monday elevated as a judge of the Supreme Court.

Justice Chandran was appointed as a judge of the Kerala High Court November 8, 2011. He was elevated as the chief justice Patna High Court March 29, 2023.

Once he takes oath as a judge of the top court, the working strength of the Supreme Court would rise to 33. Its sanctioned strength is 34, including the chief justice of India.

"He (Chandran) has served as a judge of the high court for more than 11 years and as a chief justice of a big high court for more than a year. During his long tenure as a judge and chief justice of the high court Justice Chandran has acquired significant experience in di verse fields of law," the collegium resolution said while recommending his name.

# Bengal orders CID probe into 'expired' IV fluid issue

"We have asked the CID to investigate the matter. They will look into all aspects and find out whether there were procedural lapses and wheth er SOPs (standard operating procedures) were properly fol lowed or not," Pant said. The 13-member administrative committee which is tech nically qualified to look into the medical side will parallelly probe the matter, the chief sec retary said. "We have asked the committee to file the final report within three days and hopefully the CID will also be able to submit their findings in quick time," he added. Pant said the CM held a review meeting with officials of the state health department and gave a clear direction that such negligence in administrative and procedural lapses will not be tolerated.

# From humble start to cutting-edge tech, IMD leads weather race at 150

Born out of calamities -- a devastating cyclone in 1864 and monsoon failures in 1866 and 1871 -- the IMD, turning 150 January 15, has transformed from a humble setup into a cutting-edge hub of weather science

New Delhi, Jan 13: From a few rain gauges in 1875 to rivalling the world's best weather agencies, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) has weathered its way to becoming a glob-

al leader in forecasting. Born out of calamities -- a devastating cyclone in 1864 and monsoon failures in 1866 and 1871 -- the IMD, turning 150 January 15, has transformed from a humble setup into a

science. "HF Blandford, the first Meteorological Reporter to the government of India, prepared the first rainfall map of the

cutting-edge hub of weather

country (undivided India) using data from 77 rain gauges. The IMD has come a long way since its modest start," IMD Director General Mrutyunjaya Mohapatra told PTI.

According to its 2023 report, the IMD operates 39 Doppler Weather Radars, INSAT 3D/3DR satellites providing 15-minute cloud updates, and a robust network of 806 Automatic Weather Stations, 200 Agro-AWS, 5,896 rain monitoring stations, 83 lightning sensors and 63 Pilot Balloon Stations.

The IMD's key advancements include rapid severe weather assessments (2015). 6-minute cvclone scans (2018) and upgraded satellite systems.



Its advanced numerical weather prediction models now deliver seamless forecasts from a few hours to an entire season, backed by high-resolution global models and seasonal forecast systems introduced between 2016 and 2021

Mohapatra said improvements in observations, communication, modelling and infrastructure have significantly enhanced weather and climate

services

"Forecast accuracy for severe

weather events improved by about 50 per cent in 2023 compared to 2014. This has significantly reduced the loss of lives and property during extreme weather events," he said.

By 2023, the accuracy of fiveday forecasts matched the oneday forecast accuracy of 2017. Cyclone landfall forecasts have become highly precise, with zeAs weather patterns grow More unpredictable globally due to the climate crisis, the IMD is taking a giant leap with 'Mission Mausam' to improve weather understanding and forecasting through expanded observation networks, better modelling and advanced tools like AI and machine learning

he mission includes creating a laboratory to artificially develop clouds, increasing the number of radars by over 150 per cent and adding new satellites, supercomputers and other innovations

ro error in most cases (20 km for 24-hour forecasts).

The 24-hour forecast accuracy stands at 80 per cent for heavy rainfall, 86 per cent for thunderstorms and 88 per cent for heat and cold waves

To make this information accessible to the public in simple language, the IMD has launched several mobile applications, including 'Mausam', which provides weather forecasts for every location in the country.

The IMD achieved all this despite India's complex weath er patterns compared to many developed countries.

"Our weather challenges are more complex. Still, on a global level, the IMD is ranked among the top three weather agencies the other two being the National Weather Service of the US and the European Centre for Medium-Range Weather Forecasts, he said.

The IMD not only serves India but also provides cyclone forecasts and warnings to 13 North Indian Ocean countries and weather services to SAARO nations

It is helping Nepal, the Mal dives, Sri Lanka, Bangladesh and Mauritius develop early warning systems to reduce the loss of life and property caused by worsening extreme weather events.



# SC asks UP government to consider premature release of Babloo Srivastava

New Delhi: The Supreme Court has directed the UP government to consider within two months the premature release of gangster Om Prakash Srivastava, alias Babloo Srivastava, serving life term in a 1993 murder case. A bench of Justices Abhay S Oka and Nongmeikapam Kotiswar Singh directed the state government to consider the plea seeking remission under sub-section (1) of Section 473 of the Bhartiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS), 2023. Srivastava sought the relief under Section 2 of the United Provinces Prisoners' Release on Probation Act, 1938 but the plea was rejected. The top court said Section 2 of the 1938 Act was more stringent than Section 432 of the CrPC or Section 473 of the BNSS. It said unless the state government recorded a finding that it was satisfied over the antecedents of a convict, or their conduct in prison, and that they were likely to abstain from crime and lead a peaceful life upon release, the convict couldn't be released. The bench directed the court concerned -- mandated to give its opinion under sub-section (2) of Section 473 of the BNSS -- to forward it within 15 days from the date of receipt of the state's request.

# Mathura Shahi Idgah row: SC to hear mosque committee's plea Jan 15

**New Delhi:** The Supreme Court would January 15 hear a plea of the mosque management committee against an order rejecting its petition in the Krishna Janmabhoomi-Shahi Idgah dispute in Mathura, UP. A single judge bench of the Allahabad High Court August 1, last year, rejected the plea of the Committee of Management, Trust Shahi Masjid Idgah, challenging the maintainability of 15 cases related to the temple-mosque dispute in Mathura, and ruled the "religious character" of Shahi Idgah needed to be determined. A bench comprising Chief Justice Sanjiv Khanna and Justice Sanjay Kumar, December 9, last year commenced the final hearing in the case and the matter is set to come up before the bench January 15, according to the SC website. One of the Hindu parties, represented by advocate Barun Sinha, had argued the mosque committee could have moved the Allahabad High Court against the single judge's order over the dispute.

### Two girls die after falling into reservoir

Thrissur (Kerala): Two girls died after falling into the Peechi reservoir in this central Kerala district during a visit to the site and the two other girls are in critical condition, police said Monday. The deceased have been identified as Anne Grace (16) and Aleena (16), both from Thrissur, they said. The incident occurred Sunday when the girls, who had arrived at a friend's house to celebrate a church festival, went to see the dam. Police, guoting residents, said the girls slipped from a rock and fell into the reservoir.

The consequent "illegal" decision of the respondent authority, taken January 1, to form the ad-hoc committee could not be sustained, the petitioner argued. Singh said at no point was the petitioner informed about the purported representations received against it and got no opportunity to be heard.

# Illegal coal mining: A ticking time bomb

H istory repeats itself, first as a tragedy, second as farce, so goes a famous quote. Tragedy is the coal mine accident in Assam January 6 where four people are confirmed dead and a national effort is underway to save the missing. The farce is that not one of the 26,000 abandoned rat-hole mines - in just one district of Meghalaya alone - has so far been closed despite an order, a decade ago. There are much more in many other.

The nation-wide proliferation of illegal coal mining is a ticking time bomb that erupts like a boil on the body fabric of the country every time accidents take place. For the remainder, it keeps patiently nibbling away at the national economy creating black money barons while the establishment of the day is busy cherry picking piddly political opponents.

Some north-eastern states may be pock-marked with 'abandoned' yet activated illegal mines but the activity is rampant in other states like West Bengal, Jharkhand, Chhattisgarh, Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, Karnataka even Gujarat - only the product that is mined varies. In Gujarat,

three labourers were asphyxiated inside an illegal coalmine in Surendranagar district in July last year.

It was the fourth incident reported in the district in which about a dozen people have lost their lives in illegal coal mining. Opposition leaders put the figure at over 20. The district administration forced closure of over 2000 such sites but no sooner that their back turned, many of them were opened up. Gujarat Congress spokesperson Manish Doshi alleges involvement of local politicians of the ruling party in the illegal mining. A taluka and district panchayat husband-wife team of BJP office-bearers figure as accused in this particular case. The National Green Tribunal. Pune had suo moto taken up the issue.

Illegal coal mining in this district has been a persistent problem. The issue was raised by Kuvarji Bavalia, Congress MP (he subsequently switched sides and is now a BJP cabinet minister in Gujarat) in Parliament in December 2010, wherein the Union government admitted that illegal mining was taking place clandestinely in abandoned mines, small and isolated patches and outcrop areas. However the coal deposits are of



very poor quality and therefore not given to scientific or economic mining.

As in this case and most others pertaining to illegal mining, the Centre terms it a law and order problem and therefore a responsibility of the state government to curb it.

While the local and regional industry remains the main beneficiary of the illegally mined coal which has the tacit connivance of local ruling party politicians, the onus shifts to the government every time there is an accident. Even in the present Assam rat-hole coal mine accident, a national effort is underway to save poverty stricken labour employed in a wholly clandestine activity. The Army, Navy, National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) besides elements of the state uniformed forces have been at work round the clock. Coal is the primary source accounting for 70 per cent of the country's power supply through thermal power plants. When demand outstrips supply the coal 'mafia' steps-in. And the rest is a rusted gramophone pin playing poetry.

For the record, India is one of the world's top coal importing countries along with Japan, South Korea, Taiwan and China. In FY24, India imported nearly 264 million tonnes of coal worth ₹3,179 billion. The country's coal production value in this period was over ₹1,553 billion. Coal imports mainly consist of high grade coal and coking coal which are more expensive than thermal coal. The nationalisation of coal took place in two phases, the first with the coking coal mines in 1971-72 and then with the non-coking coal mines in 1973.

The economics of illegal mining is that minimum operational costs turn it into a lucrative business. So surface mining and rat-hole mining. The former is mining when the coal beds are nearer the surface while in the latter the extraction is through a narrow tunnel which is dug merely 3 to 4 feet to enable a single person to crawl in and out. Unlike in Chhattisgarh and Jharkhand, coal seams in Meghalaya are thin, making rat-hole mining economically viable. The state has an estimated reserve of 576.48 million tonnes of low-ash, high-sulphur coal belonging to the Eocene age (33-56 million years ago).

According to the 22nd interim report of the retired judge BK Katakey committee submitted to the Meghalaya High Court there are 26,000 rathole mine openings in East Jaintia Hills district alone which need to be closed down. The panel has not dwelt on the status of the abandoned rathole mines in West Khasi Hills, South-West Khasi Hills and Garo Hills districts of Meghalaya.

The NGT had banned rat-hole mining in Meghalaya over a decade ago but illegal mining remains rampant, leading to death and environmental destruction. In April 2014, the tribunal also banned transportation of coal in the state. "Not a single abandoned mine has been closed so far as the preparation of DPR (detailed project report) by the Central Mine Planning and Design Institute Limited is in progress," the report noted. Bad is called good when worse happens!

### 40 farmers shot dead

Dakar: At least 40 farmers were killed in an attack by Muslim militants in northeast Nigeria's Borno state, a government official said Monday. The attack Sunday was suspected to have been carried out by extremists from the Boko Haram group and its breakaway faction that is loyal to the Islamic State group in Borno's Dumba community, said Borno state Governor Babagana Umara Zulum. # *Turkey launches 'Year of the Family' targeting LGBTQ+*

Istanbul, Jan 13: President Recep Tayyip Erdogan has marked the launch of Turkey's "Year of the Family" Monday with an attack on the LGBTQ+ community and the announcement of measures to boost birth rates

Citing the "historical truth that a strong family paves the way for a strong state," Erdogan unveiled a series of financial measures to support young families.

The president returned to themes he has espoused before about LGBTQ+ people, including the portrayal of the LGBTQ+ movement as part of a foreign conspiracy aimed at undermining Turkey.

"It is our common responsibility to protect our children and youth from harmful trends and perverse ideologies. Neoliberal cultural trends are crossing borders and penetrating all corners of the world." he told an audience in Ankara. "They also lead to LGBT and other



movements gaining ground."

"The target of gender neutralisation policies, in which LGBT is used as a battering ram, is the family. Criticism of LGBT is immediately silenced, just like the legitimate criticisms of Zionism. Anyone who defends nature and the family is subject to heavy oppression.' Despite its low profile in Tur-

key, the LGBTQ+ community has emerged as one of the main targets of the government and its supporters in recent years.

Pride parades have been banned since 2015, with those seeking to participate facing tear gas and police barricades. In recent years, meanwhile, anti-LGBTQ+ rallies have received state support.

Turning to the "alarming" decline in the population growth rate, Erdogan said Turkey was "losing blood" and recalled his 2007 demand that families have at least three children.

life and rising divorce rates as causes for concern. Turkey's annual population growth rate dropped from 2.53% in 2015 to 0.23% last year. "If we do not take the necessary measures. the problem will reach irreparable levels. In such an environment, population loss is inevitable," he added.

To combat the threat to the family, Erdogan revealed policies such as interest-free loans for newlyweds; improved monetary allowances for the parents of new-born children; financial, counselling and housing support to encourage new families; and free or low-cost childcare.

# Croatia President wins another term after defeating ruling party candidate in runoff

Milanovic is the most popular politician in Croatia, and is sometimes compared to US President-elect Donald Trump for his combative style of communication with political opponents

Zagreb, Jan 13: Croatia's opposition-backed President Zoran Milanovic, a critic of the European Union and NATO, overwhelmingly won re-election for another five-year term Sunday, defeating a candidate from the ruling conservative party in a runoff vote, official results showed.

Milanovic won more than 74 per cent of the vote compared to his challenger Dragan Primorac, who received nearly 26 per cent, according to the results released by Croatia's state



election authorities after more than 99 per cent of the ballots were counted.

The result presents a major boost for Milanovic, who is a critic of Western military support for Ukraine in its war against Russia. Milanovic is also a fierce opponent of Croa tia's conservative Prime Minister Andrej Plenkovic and his government

In a speech after the results were released, Milanovic said his victory was a sign of approval and trust from the voters but also presented a message "about the state of affairs in the country for those who need to hear it".

### 4 days of market crash wipes out ₹24.69L-cr

NEW DELHI: Investors lost ₹24.69 lakh crore in market valuation in the last four days of severe drubbing in the equity market. Spike in global crude prices, unabated foreign fund outflows, a strong US jobs data diminishing early rate cut expectations, and the rupee logging its steepest single-day fall in nearly two years dampened investors' sentiment. The BSE Sensex tanked 1,869.1 points, or 2.39 per cent, in the past four trading sessions. The market capitalisation of BSE-listed firms eroded by ₹24.69.243.3 crore to ₹4.17.05.906.74 crore (USD 4.82 trillion) in four days. With Monday's sharp fall in equities, the market cap of BSE-listed firms dived below the USD 5-trillion mark. On Monday alone, investors' wealth dropped ₹12.61 lakh crore.

# Dec inflation eases to 4-month low of 5.2 pc

New Delhi. Jan 13: Retail inflation declined to a fourmonth low of 5.22 per cent in December, mainly on account of easing of prices in the food basket, including vegetables according to government data released Monday -- giving headroom to the Reserve Bank to reduce the key interest rate in upcoming monetary policy

was 5.48 per cent in November period.

"During the month of December 2024, significant decline in inflation is observed in vegetables, 'pulses and products', 'sugar and confectionary', 'personal care and effects', and cereals and products," the National Statistics Office (NSO) said while releasing the CPI data.

The top five items showing highest year-on-year inflation in December 2024 were peas (89.12 per cent), potato (68.23 per cent), garlic (58.17 per cent), coconut oil (45.41 per cent), and cauliflower (39.42 per cent).

The key items having lowest vear-on-vear inflation in December were jeera, ginger, dry chillies, and LPG (excluding conveyance).

"The CPI (General) reached its lowest point during this period in July 2024. However, the CPI (General) and food inflation in December, 2024 is the lowest in the last four months,' NSO said. Inflation in the food basket was at 8.39 per cent in December, down from 9.04 per

and Head -- Research and Out reach at ICRA -- said while the CPI inflation declined in De cember 2024 from 5.5 per cent in November 2024, the pace of the correction was narrower than expected.

In sequential terms, the dip was driven by food and bever ages, even as the year-on-year inflation for fuel and light, and pan, tobacco and intoxicants recorded mild upticks, she said.

"With the headline inflation stuck stubbornly above 5 per cent, the probability of a rate cut in the February 2025 policy review has certainly receded. However, the considerable de cline in vegetable prices that is underway could convince some MPC members to consider an early cut in the upcoming meeting, with a view to supporting growth," Nayar said.

Paras Jasrai, Senior Economic Analyst at India Ratings and Research, said the February 2025 monetary policy would be happening at the outset of the Union Budget.

"The conviction of fiscal arithmetic would also be weigh ing closely on the monetary policy action. While the cur rent data is positive from the monetary policy perspective, Ind-Ra believes that the mon etary authority would want to wait for one more policy before undertaking any change on the rates front," Jasrai said.

Akhil Mittal, Senior Fund Manager -- Fixed Income, Tata Asset Management, said early price trend in January show vegetable inflation moderating and this could mean inflation falls below 5 per cent sooner and well within the RBI expect ed trajectory going forward.

"This could open up space for the RBI to support growth, which is estimated to have slowed down most since

Mumbai, Jan 13: Ahead of the Union budget announcement, foreign brokerage Goldman Sachs said it expects a slowdown in the government capex growth in the new financial year.

Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman is likely to announce a 13 per cent increase in the public capex for the new fiscal, as against the 17 per cent in FY24, and the healthy growth in three years before that, it said in a report.

The government will stick to the fiscal consolidation roadmap and narrow the fiscal deficit further to 4.5 per cent of GDP. it said. The foreign brokerage said given the BJP's reduced majority in Parliament, there will be re-allocation of expenditure towards rural transfers and welfare spending.

The brokerage said the multi-quarter low of 5.4 per cent in real GDP growth for the September quarter is due to a mix of slower public capex and also **RBI's restrictions constraining** credit growth in the economy.

"We expect capex growth to slow to 13 per cent from over 30 per cent in FY 21-24, while there might be a tilt towards welfare expenditure or transfer payments," the brokerage said.

We continue to believe the fastest growth pace in public capex is behind us, and we expect capex to grow at or below nominal GDP growth rates from here on," the report said.

# US tightens its grip on AI chip flows across globe

New York, Jan 13: The U.S. government said Monday it would further restrict artificial intelligence chip and technology exports, divvying up the world to keep advanced computing power in the U.S. and among its allies while finding more ways to block China's access

The new regulations will cap the number of AI chips that can be exported to most countries and allow unlimited access to U.S. AI technology for America's closest allies, while also maintaining a block on exports to China, Russia, Iran and North Korea

The lengthy new rules unveiled in the final days of outgoing President Joe Biden's administration go beyond China and are aimed at helping the U.S. keep its dominant status in AI by controlling it around the world.


"The U.S. leads AI now both AI development and AI chip design, and it's critical that we keep it that way," U.S. Commerce Secretary Gina Raimondo said.

The regulations cap a fouryear Biden administration effort to hobble China's access to advanced chips that can enhance its military capabilities and seek to maintain U.S. leadership in AI by closing loopholes and adding new guard rails to control the flow of chips and global development of AI. While it is unclear how Pres-

ident-elect Donald Trump's incoming administration will enforce the new rules, the two administrations share similar views on the competitive threat from China. The regulation is set to take effect 120 days from publication, giving the Trump administration

> time to weigh in. New limits will be placed on advanced graphics processing units (GPUs), which are used to power data centers needed to train AI models. Most are made by Santa Clara, California-based Nvidia, while Advanced Micro Devices also sells AI chips. Nvidia and AMD were down between 2% and 3%

providers would no longer need export licenses for AI chips, allowing them to build data centers in countries that cannot import enough chips because of U.S.-imposed quotas.

cluding security requirements, reporting demands and a plan or track record of respecting human rights.

Until now, the Biden administration had imposed sweeping restrictions on China's access to advanced chips and the equipment to produce them, updating the controls annually to tighten restrictions and capture countries at risk of diverting the technology to China. **NVIDIA FEARS 'OVERREACH'** 

#### Because the rules alter the landscape for AI chips and data centers around the world,

powerful industry voices criticized the plan even before it was published.

Nvidia Monday called the rule "sweeping overreach" and said the White House would be clamping down on "technology that is already available in mainstream gaming PCs and consumer hardware." Data center provider Oracle argued earlier this month the rules would hand "most of the global AI and GPU market to our Chinese competitors.

The rules impose worldwide licensing requirements on certain chips, with exceptions, and also set controls for what are known as "model weights" of the most advanced "closed-weight" AI models. Model weights help determine decision making in machine learning, and are generally the most valuable elements of an AI model.

The regulation divides the world into three tiers. About 18 countries, including Japan, Britain, South Korea and the Netherlands, will essentially be exempt from the rules. Some 120 other countries, including Singapore, Israel, Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates will face country caps. And arms-embargoed countries like Russia, China and Iran will be barred from receiving the tech nology altogether.

In addition, U.S. headquartered providers likely to receive global authorizations such as AWS and Microsoft will be al lowed to deploy only 50% of their total AI computing power outside the United States, no more than 25% outside of the Tier countries, and no more than 7% in a single non-Tier 1 country.

AI has the potential to in crease access to healthcare education and food, among other benefits, but also car help develop biological and other weapons, support cyberattacks and assist with surveillance and other human rights abuses.

"The U.S. has to be prepared for rapid increases in AI's ca pability in the coming years which could have transforma tive impact on the economy and on our national security," US National Security Adviser Jake Sullivan said.

Following the early goal, the




