On the occasion, eight MoUs were exchanged between the state government and various Singaporean entities to strengthen collaboration in key sectors. The first MoU was signed between the Skill Development and Technical Education (SD&TE) department of Odisha government and ITE Education Services (ITEES), Singapore, to extend cooperation in the field of technical and vocational education and training (TVET) to further enhance skill development ecosystem in Odisha, officials said.

Another MoU was signed between the SD&TE department and ITEES to extend cooperation in the field of TVET. The third agreement was signed between Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Bhubaneswar, GRIDCO Limited and Nanyang Technological University (NTU) of Singapore to advance research and development in renewable energy, hydrogen production, energy

storage systems and microgrids. The fourth MoU was signed between Industrial Promotion and Investment Corporation of Odisha Limited (IPICOL) and Sembcorp Green Hydrogen India Private Limited (SGHIPL) of Singapore to explore the development of a production facility for green hydrogen

and its derivatives, they said. The fifth pact between Singapore-based Sembcorp Development (SCD) and Odisha Industrial Infrastructure Development Corporation (IDCO) was signed to undertake a feasibility study for the establishment of an industrial park within the established industrial belts of Odisha

Similarly, the Electronics & IT department of Odisha signed an MoU with the Singapore-based Global Finance & Technology Network (GFTN) for setting up an InsureTech Hub Global Capabilities Centre in the state.

Further, IDCO collaborated with Surbana Jurong of Singapore to provide consultancy services to the state of Odisha for strategic positioning and planning for Odisha Petro Chemical and Petroleum Investment Region. The last MoU was signed between Bhubaneswar Development Authority and Surbana Jurong to get consultancy services for preparing a new city development plan near Bhu

STATE HIKES SALARY OF JUNIOR TEACHERS

Bhubaneswar, Jan 17: The state government Friday hiked the monthly remuneration of junior teachers from ₹11,000 to ₹16,000, the CMO said in a statement.

This hike will benefit around 13,740 teachers across the state, it said, adding that Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi approved the proposal, which will result in an additional expenditure of ₹89.15 crore to the state's exchequer.

This apart, the government also raised the contribution to the Employees' Provident Fund (EPF). The state will now contribute ₹1,950 per month towards EPF for each junior teacher, up from the previous amount of ₹1,443

Stating that the decision is part of the government's efforts to improve the socio-economic condition of teachers in the state. Maihi said his government is committed to enhancing the welfare of teachers.

Budget Session of Parl from Jan 31

New Delhi: Parliament's Budget Session will be held from January 31 to April 4, with Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman set to table her eighth straight Budget February 1. In line with the convention, the session will start with President Droupadi Murmu's address to a joint sitting of Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha January 31 followed by tabling of economic survey. "The Hon'ble President will address the joint sitting of both Houses on 31st January 2025 at 1100 Hrs in the Lok Sabha Chamber. Union Budget 2025-26 to be presented on 1st February, 2025 in the Lok Sabha," Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju said in a post on X.

Kota: NEET aspirant from state hangs self

It has been 17 days since the beginning of 2025, and the coaching hub of Kota has already seen three student suicides. The latest victim is an 18-year-old from Mayurbhanj, Odisha who aspired to become a doctor. Last year, the Rajasthan city had reported 17 cases of student suicides, while the previous year the figure was 26. The pressure to excel in education at any cost, thanks to unrealistic expectations from parents and society at large amid tough competition in the job market, has been taking a heavy toll on aspirants.

Kota, Jan 17: An 18-vear-old NEET aspirant from Odisha allegedly hanged himself in his hostel room here -- the third such case in Kota this year --, police said Friday.

Officials said that no suicide note was recovered from the room. The incident occurred in Ambedkar Colony, Vigyan Nagar area Thursday

According to police, Abhijeet Giri, hailing from Mayurbhanj district in Odisha, had been preparing for the National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (NEET) at a coach-

ing institute since April, 2024. The incident came to light

when around 8 pm a mess worker went to deliver food to Abhijeet's room, a police officer said.

Upon receiving no response, the mess worker along with a few hostellers forcibly opened the door and found him hanging from the ceiling fan. Assistant Sub-Inspector (ASI) Lal Singh Tanwar said.

A police team reached the spot and sent the body for post-mortem, which will be conducted after his family arrives. They have been informed about the incident, the ASI added.

He said that no suicide note was recovered from the room and the reason behind the suicide is vet to be ascertained.

The ceiling fan in the hostel room was not equipped with suicide prevention device. mandated by the district administration to prevent such cases in student accommodations, the officer said.

Preliminary investigations suggest that Abhijeet was good in studies and attended his coaching classes regularly, he said.

This is the third suicide by a coaching student in Kota in just 17 days.

On January 8, a 20-yearold JEE aspirant, Abhishek, allegedly died by hanging himself from a ceiling fan in his PG room. He hailed from Madhya Pradesh and was preparing for the Joint Entrance Examination (JEE) at a coaching institute since May, 2024.

On January 7, another JEE aspirant from Haryana, Neeraj, hanged himself from the hook of a ceiling fan at his hostel room. The city, a prominent hub for coaching institutes, saw 17 such cases

Kuki-Zo apex body seeks separate admin

New Delhi, Jan 17: A four-member team of the apex body and political platform for all Kuki-Zo people in Manipur Friday placed its demand before the Centre for a separate administration for the community and the initiation of a political dialogue to resolve its issues.

The demands were placed by a delegation, led by Henlianthang Thanglet, chairman, Kuki-Zo Council, before a two-member team of the Centre's representatives, led by interlocutor AK Mishra.

"We placed our demand for a separate administration for the Kuki-Zo people of Manipur and the initiation of a political dialogue," Kuki-Zo Council spokesperson Ginza Vualzong told PTI over the phone.

The Kuki-Zo community has been seeking a dialogue with the Centre to expedite a political solution over its demand for a Union Territory with a legislature under Article 239(A) of the Constitution for the community people living in the hill areas of Manipur.

To prevent future confrontations between the Meitei

council has been seeking complete adherence of the buffer zone by the Meiteis. The dialogue between the Ku-

and Kuki-Zo communities, the

ki-Zo Council and the Centre's representatives was held days after the council met newly-appointed Manipur Governor Ajay Kumar Bhalla in Churachandpur, seeking restoration of peace in the ethnic strife-torn northeastern state and solutions to the issues being faced by the community.

Bhalla sought their cooperation in maintaining peace in Manipur and finding a solution.

The Centre had, in October 2024, called the MLAs belonging to both the Kuki and Meitei communities to Delhi for a joint meeting. But the Kuki-Zo MLAs refused to sit together with their Meitei counterparts. Both groups of MLAs met the Centre's representatives separately.

Organisations representing the Meiteis are opposed to the Kuki-Zo community's demand for a separate administration. The Meitei groups have also been seeking abrogation of the Suspension of Operation agreements with Kuki-Zo insurgent groups.

Prison graffiti express fear, love of tormented Syrians

Damascus, Jan 17: Languishing in a dungeon cell of Syria's then-ruler Bashar Assad, an unknown prisoner scrawled a verse of Arabic poetry on his cell wall - an expression of pain and love amid his torment.

"My country, even if it oppresses me, is dear. My people, even if uncharitable to me, are generous," he wrote. It's a well-known verse, composed 800 years ago by a poet defying a tyrannical caliph.

As you walk through the cold, dark cells of Assad's prisons, the graffiti on the walls cry out. They plead to God and yearn for loved ones. Often mysterious, they preserve fragments of what anonymous men were thinking as they faced torture and death.

"Trust no one, not even your brother," someone darkly warns on a cell wall in Damascus' notorious Palestine Branch

detention facility. "Oh Lord, bring relief,"

Since 2011, tens of thousands of Syrians vanished inside the network of prisons and detention facilities run by Assad's security forces as they tried to crush his opposition. Inmates went for years without contact with the outside world, living in overcrowded, windowless cells where their cellmates died around them. Torture and beatings were inflicted daily. Mass executions were frequent.

Most inmates would have fully expected to die. They had no reason to believe anyone would ever see the messages they scratched into the walls except future prisoners.

One wrote a single word in Arabic, "ashtaqtilak" - "I miss vou" - a love letter that could never be sent to a beloved whose name only the writer

More than a month after the prisons were opened by insurgents who ousted Assad in December, The Associated Press toured several facilities to view



can be known about the men who drew and wrote them. Only a few bear names, and few are dated. It's impossible to know who of them lived or died.

Some walls have layers of graffiti on top of each other, marking generations of suffer-

"Don't be sad, mother. This is my fate," reads one, dated Jan 1. 2024. Underneath it are traces of an older text, so faded that only a few words are legible: .. except for you" - a hint of longing for a loved one.

Many of the writings and drawings are cries to parents or loved ones. Someone drew a heart broken in two, with "mother" written in one side, "father" in the other.

Some quote poetry. "When you wage your wars, think of those who ask for peace," reads one, slightly misremembering a verse by Palestinian poet Mahmoud Darwish.

Many kept calendars, filling walls with grids of numbers. "A year passed," was one prisoner's terse summary above a field of 365 dots arranged in rows.

Some drawings are even playful, like googly-eye cartoon faces or a joint of hashish. Others are flights of fancy whose meaning, if any, was known only to the prisoner. One scene shows a landscape of rolling hills and forests of bare trees, where a pack of wolves howls at the sky and a bird of prey grips

CM flags off spl pilgrimage train

First batch of 800 senior citizens leave for holy places in Maharashtra

Bhubaneswar, Jan 17: The first batch of 800 senior citizens from Khurda, Puri, Cuttack, Jagatsinghpur, Kendrapara and Dhenkanal districts began their pilgrimage to places in Maharashtra, such as Shirdi and Nashik, as Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi flagged off a special train to mark the launch of 'Senior Citizens' Pilgrimage Scheme' at Bhubaneswar railway station, Friday.

According to Chief Minister's Office (CMO) sources, this marks the start of the state government's ambitious initiative to send as many as 8,000 senior citizens on pilgrimage to places such as Shirdi, Nashik, Kolkata, Kamakhya, Ayodhya and Varanasi in 10 phases this year. The pilgrimage train will

operate in two phases from Bhubaneswar, Berhampur, Sambalpur, Rayagada and Balasore stations, they said.

The state government launched the 'Senior Citizens' Pilgrimage Scheme' to fulfil the spiritual and religious aspirations of economically-disadvantaged and below poverty line senior citizens in the state.

Majhi said temples were central to cultural exchanges in the past. "Temples were places where heritage, art, culture, literature, and economy were integrated. Every Indian aspires to visit pilgrimage sites and temples," he said.

He highlighted that special officers, guides, and medical teams have been arranged to accompany the pilgrims throughout the journey to ensure a safe





Cuttack, Jan 17: Several patients at Sriram Chandra Bhanja Medical College and Hospital (SCBMCH) here were in for hassles Friday after one of the two CT scan machines installed at the premier healthcare snapped unexpectedly

According to sources, SCB-MCH has two CT scan machines - one installed by the hospital itself near the Casualty distress among them. Patients and their attendants, some of whom had traveled from distant places, were left worried and frustrated. Despite efforts by the hospital staff to fix the problem, the machine could not be restarted.

Lipi Guin, an attendant of one of the affected patients, expressed with dismay. "It's incredibly difficult to consult the doctor, complete tests, and return home in a single day. Technical glitches in machines have become a regular affair here. And today, it was the turn of the CT scan machine,' she said.

The waiting patients were advised to return Saturday for the necessary scans.

Hospital Superintendent incharge Lucy Das was unavailable for comments regarding the issue.

Nevertheless, the incident highlights the perennial challenges in the maintenance of essential diagnostic equipment at SCBMCH, emphasising the need for better infrastructure and technical support to avoid such disruptions in the future.

Concerted efforts key to eradicate dowry: D

Bhubaneswar, Jan 17: Aiming to eradicate dowry, a social stigma the society is still grappling with, Deputy Chief Minister Pravati Parida Friday called for a concerted effort to make Odisha a dowry-free state. Speaking at a one-day Sub-Collectors' Conference on the Dowry Prohibition Act, 1961, held at the Convention Centre of Lok Seva Bhawan here, Parida emphasised the need for greater grassroots-level discussions and public awareness about the harmful practice.

The Deputy CM described dowry as a 'social disorder', reiterating that it is neither a tradition nor a personal issue but a deep-rooted problem in society. Despite the enactment of the Dowry Prohibition Act over 60 years ago, Parida stressed that the fight against dowry is



far from over. She called on administrative officials to actively enforce the law and ensure that citizens are protected from this harmful practice.

As the chief guest at the event, Parida urged Sub-District Magistrates to play a pivotal role in strictly enforcing the Dowry Prohibition Act and preventing its misuse. "It is the responsibility of officials to enforce the laws that are designed to protect our citizens, and the role of Sub-District Magistrates is crucial in this endeavour," Parida said. In an effort to streamline enforcement of the Act, the state government has declared Sub-District Magistrates as dowry prohibition officers. These officials are empowered to take preventive measures, investigate dowry-related cases, and collect evidence against offenders

Parida also stressed that effective implementation of the law depends on timely action and widespread public awareness, which can be achieved through various channels, including social media

"In today's digital age, so cial media is a powerful tool. It must be used to spread awareness about the Dowry Prohibition Act and its consequences, Parida added, noting that the success of the initiative would significantly contribute to the dignity and respect of women.

The Dowry Prohibition Act, 1961 was enacted with the aim of eradicating dowry, a practice where gifts or money are given by the bride's family to the groom's family. The Act makes demanding, accepting, or giving dowry a punishable offence - applicable both before, during, and after the marriage. Violations of the Act can lead to imprisonment for up to five years and a fine extending to ₹15,000, or the value of the dowry, whichever is higher. The law also criminalises those who aid or abet dowry transactions, including the promotion of dowry through advertisements.

Parida's strong message is a step forward in ensuring the complete eradication of dowry, and her call to make Odisha a dowry-free state has resonated strongly within the administrative circles.



These issues are becoming increasingly critical as the demand for EVs and lithium-ion batteries continues to grow. Projections indicate that by 2050, the global supply of cobalt may not meet the rising demand, underscoring the urgent need to develop alternative materials, he said.




"Our research shows that the new cathode retains 74.3 per cent of its original capacity after 100 charge-discharge cycles, a significant improvement over the rapid capacity loss observed in traditional cohalt-based cathodes," he said.

Additionally, the new cath ode minimises the cationic disorder of nickel in lithium sites -- a common issue in traditional NMC-based cathodes that leads to capacity and voltage fade, he said.

Saha explained that this breakthrough has wide-ranging implications and applications and paves the way to produce affordable, high-performance batteries for electric vehicles, contributing significantly to the growing EV industry.

Additionally, it supports India's renewable energy goals by enabling cost-effective energy storage solutions essential for sustainable development. Strategic Snub

handigarh, the city that wears two hats as the shared capital of Punjab and Haryana, is back in the spotlight—but not for its architectural charm or serene lake. Two recent decisions by the Centre have stirred a cocktail of political uproar and administrative change, leaving Punjab fuming and bureaucratic systems reshuffled.

First, the Ministry of Personnel dropped a bombshell by abolishing the post of Adviser to the Chandigarh Administrator, replacing it with the post of Chief Secretary of the Union Territory. While the notification might seem like routine tinkering, its political implications hit like a thunderclap. The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP), Congress, and Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD)—otherwise rivals—found common ground in slamming the BJP-led Centre. The ruling sentiment? This isn't just about a title swap; it's a perceived blow to Punjab's dignity and rights over the UT.

Meanwhile, another Centre-driven decision shook the Chandigarh Police structure. The force now has sanctioned posts for an Additional Director General of Police (ADGP) and Deputy Inspector General (DIG), replacing the earlier practice of IGP-led hierarchy. While this reordering won't displace the current leadership—ADGP Surender Singh Yadav already heads the police—it signals a formal shift towards aligning Chandigarh's policing framework with other Union

The timing of these announcements is striking. For Punjab, which has long viewed Chandigarh as its rightful territory, these moves feel like a strategic snub. For the Centre, it's perhaps an attempt to streamline administration. Either way, this twin development underscores the need for a broader conversation on Chandigarh's governance. The city deserves better than being in a perennial tug-of-war.

Decoding the Centre's mid-Budget shuffle

True to its reputation for springing surprises, the Centre has reshuffled key administrative positions, swapping Revenue Secretary Arunish Chawla (IAS: 1992: BH) with DIPAM Secretary Tuhin Kanta Pandey (IAS: 1987: OD). Pandey, now Revenue Secretary, steps into

this crucial role while Chawla takes over as the Secretary of DIPAM. The move, coming right in the middle of the Union Budget season, has certainly raised eyebrows.

The reshuffle relieves Pan-



dey of his additional responsibilities with the Department of Public Enterprises (DPE), allowing him to focus exclusively on his Ministry of Finance role just months before his retirement on July 31. Meanwhile, Chawla inherits the dual burdens of the Culture Ministry and DPE, on top of his new role in DIPAM. With service tenure until 2028, Chawla seems to have a longer runway to navigate these responsibilities.

Both Pandey and Chawla are trusted hands within the corridors of power in New Delhi. However, the timing and nature of this reshuffle have fueled speculation. The Revenue Department, especially ahead of the Union Budget, is an intense portfolio requiring constant attention. While some argue that Chawla's additional workload—especially with major events like Republic Day and Maha Kumbh—might have influenced the decision, others point out that such factors were likely considered when he was appointed Revenue Secretary just weeks ago. Skeptics view the reshuffle as a reflection of the government's prefer-

ence for experience, with Pandey's familiarity with budgetary matters giving him an edge. Even so, the abruptness of the move has left many officials puzzled, though the government's prerogative in such matters leaves little room for debate.

Empowering citizens or policing narratives?

The Uttar Pradesh police's initiative to enlist social media influencers and students as "digital warriors" has sparked interest and debate. The plan is ambitious: counter fake news, spread cybercrime awareness and highlight police achievements. While this effort builds on an earlier "digital volunteers" programme, its expanded scope raises questions about its real intent.

Previously, the police relied on volunteers like teachers, lawvers. and retired soldiers, connected via WhatsApp, to report crimes and debunk rumours. Now, with the Maha Kumbh Mela 2025 underway, they're targeting tech-savvy students and influencers to operate across platforms like Instagram and X (formerly Twitter). The strategy includes workshops, cyber-awareness training, and creating cyber clubs in schools to foster critical thinking and digital literacy.

On the surface, this appears to be well-structured. It's voluntary and aims to empower youth to tackle online misinformation. Influencers see it as a way to contribute positively to society. However, the campaign coincides with the government's New Digital Media Policy, 2024, which incentivises influencers to promote state achievements with rewards of up to ₹8 lakh a month while threatening legal action against "objectionable" or "anti-national" content.

This overlap blurs the lines between combating fake news and controlling the narrative. While training students to analyze and verify information is commendable, the risk of turning digital warriors into unpaid propagandists is real. Programmes like this should prioritize public interest over public relations, ensuring they don't become tools to stifle dissent or overly glorify the state.

Empowering citizens to fight misinformation is critical in today's digital age. But the balance between fostering genuine engagement and serving political agendas is delicate. If the focus remains on public empowerment and transparency, "digital warriors" could be a transformative initiative. Otherwise, it risks being dismissed as yet another PR exercise.

succession in Odisha within less than six months highlight Odisha's increasing profile in para-diplomacy, which means states as stakeholders in outreach with foreign countries in a federal setup like India. First it was the Bali Jatra in Cuttack in November last year, which witnessed the gracious presence of foreign diplomats, particularly from Southeast Asian countries. The congregation showcased Odisha's civilizational link with South-east Asia and maritime trade with the region. Much before the late Prime Minister Narasinha Rao initiated India's 'lookeast' policy, which was scaled up to the 'act east' policy by Prime Minister Narendra Modi in 2014, Odisha shared a robust cultural and civilisational connect with Southeast Asia. Yet another instance of Odisha's connection with Indonesia was Odisha's iconic figure, the late Biju Pattanaik, and the ace pilot who was entrusted by the late Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru to fly the top Indonesian leaders, including Sultan Sjahrir, from the colonial Dutch encirclement to New Delhi to participate in the historic Asian Relations Conference, which India organised in April 1947, ahead of the country's independence on 15th August, 1947.

The second event was the holding of the biannual Pravasi Bharatiya Divas (PBD). The flagship programme of the Ministry of External Affairs was inaugurated by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on the 9th of this month and was also addressed by President Draupadi Murmu in the valedictory session. The session was also addressed by the President of Trinidad and Tobago virtually. The event was

participated by influential and high-profile Indian diaspora, including those from Odisha. The successful conclusion of the 18th edition of PBD was also addressed by S. Jaishankar, External Affairs Minister. PBD provided a platform and a meeting ground to the Indian diaspora and entrepreneurs and industrialists from Odisha, with the state government offering avenues of cooperation and collaboration. The Ministry of External Affairs has a dedicated States Division to facilitate interaction between the states and foreign countries for investment and collaboration.

It is against this backdrop that the President of Singapore, Tharman Shanmugratnam, who arrived in India on the 15th, is concluding his tour with a visit to Odisha. During his stay in the state, Shanmugratnam visited a vaccine manufacturing unit of Bharat Biotech and also the World Skill Centre supported by Singapore's Institute of Technical Education Services and signed

a number of important MoUs with the state government pertaining to skill development, new energy, and development of new cities. The visit of Singapore President also has traction in the sense that a sizeable Odia diaspora lives in Singapore. The Odia community in Singapore, while maintaining their cultural identity, have contributed to the growth of Singapore's economy in various sectors including ICT.

In terms of historical connection, it is noteworthy to mention that during World War II, when Japan occupied Singapore from 1942 to 1945, Indian nationalists joined hands with Japan to bring an end to the British dominance in the East. It was against this backdrop that Singapore became the base from which efforts by the overseas Indians to jettison British rule in India were envisaged. The swift surrender of British forces in February 1942 created a temporary power vacuum that facilitated new actors to emerge on the political stage. At that

was the Indian Independent League, which was established under the Japanese auspices. The legendary Subhas Chandra Bose, who was born and grew up in Odisha, gave the clarion call of 'Delhi Chalo' in Singapore in 1943. The Indian community in Singapore on the eve of World War II was a fragmented one. It was Bose who fostered a sense of pan-Indian nationalism in Singapore. For a short time in 1943, Singapore served as the seat of the Provisional Government of free India under Bose.

In the demographic profile of Singapore, the Indian community has been assimilated in the mosaic of the island nation. In Singapore, Tamil is one of the four official languages. Besides Tamil, the study of other Indian languages, namely Bengali, Gujarati, Hindi, Punjabi and Urdu have also been incorporated into Singapore's school curriculum signifying the multiculturalism of the city state.

Prime Minister Modi has been a great admirer of Singapore and its model of governance and in particular of Lee Kuan Yew, the architect of modern Singapore. The PM visited Singapore in September last year. Earlier he flew to Singapore in March 2015 to pay tribute to the legendary leader. He also paid tribute to the great visionary of Singapore on his 100th birth anniversary in April 2023. The visit of Singapore President to India ahead of Indonesian President's visit as the Chief Guest at the Republic Day parade underscores India's commitment to Indo-Pacific architecture and India's 'act east' policy.

he farmers' problem remains quite complex, with the Delhi Chief Minister, Arvind Kejriwal, and other opposition leaders alleging that the condition of farmers was never as bad as it is under the BJP regime.

Though many experts believe that the government should announce something in the coming budget, it appears that the situation may not be easily resolved. However, the New Year started with some good news for the sector with the Centre coming out with a draft national policy framework on agriculture marketing suggesting states move towards a unified national market for agriculture produce through a single licensing/registration system and a single fee.

The other significant news is the extension of the crop insurance scheme by the government by a year, enhancing its outlay for five years to ₹69.515 crore while also approving the ₹825 crore Find for Innovation and Technology (FIAT).

Officials said that the enhanced allocation for crop insurance will help take care of risk coverage of crops from non-preventable natural calamities across the country till 2025-26 through the Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana (PMFHY) and the Restructured Weather-Based Crop Insurance Scheme. Added to this, FIAT is expected to be used for large-scale technology infusion in the implementation of the schemes

In spite of these positive developments, almost all states are facing a shortage of subsidised fertilisers like NPK according to their requirements. It is understood that the Union government has gradually reduced the allotment of this fertiliser in the past few years as the Centre has been giving handsome subsidies to this particular fertiliser. As a farmer is required to have 4 bags of fertiliser to grow crops on each bigha, he/she would have to spend ₹5880 on NPK. The expenditure would go up to ₹6960 for a bigha if he uses any alternative to this fertiliser, which may be a burden on small farmers

Delving into the past, it may be said that neoliberalism created a lot of problems for the peasantry. It curtailed subsi-

dies in agriculture, it opened up agriculture to world market fluctuations, it curtailed institutional credit to agriculture, it wound up public extension services, it increased the cost of fertilisers and chemicals, and other inputs marketed by MNCs, etc. Thus, neoliberalism not only split the class alliance and caused a hiatus between the urban middle class and the peasantry but also actually pitted them against one another.

Recently, another favourable development is the forecast that the agricultural sector may recover strongly with growth accelerating to 3.8 percent in the current fiscal year from 1.4 percent in the previous year, supported by favourable monsoon and improved rural demand. One cannot deny that a little more attention can improve the conditions of the farming community and bring a turnaround in their earnings.

But what is necessary at this juncture is that the government must give more attention to the needs of small and marginal farmers. The hiking of the farmers' dole that is being talked about by around

₹3000 or ₹6000 annually due to rising input costs and strong inflationary pressures could stabilise rural incomes and support consumption growth. which is increasingly being driven by rural demand.

Renewed efforts are necessary to make agriculture remunerative by promoting cash crops, setting up peasant cooperatives, and agrobased industries. This will help reduce distress in the rural economy. It cannot be denied that the prospects of agri-exports, as also the role of agriculture, are helping in improving the conditions of the rural mass, but the ruling dispensation has, over the years, not taken any significant step in transforming agriculture.

There is a need to critically examine the problem of farm distress and trying to make agriculture remunerative.

'Emergency' not screened in Punjab ARREST WARRANTS AGAINST 25 FARMERS

Chandigarh, Jan 17: Kangana Ranaut's "Emergency" was not screened at cinemas in Punjab Friday following state-wide protests by the Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee and Sikh organisations against the movie with many politicians calling for a ban, which the actor termed as "harassment".

The SGPC, an apex gurdwara body, and several Sikh organisations held demonstrations against the movie outside cinemas, multiplexes and malls across the state.

Ranaut, who has directed, written and produced the political drama, decried the demand for a ban on "Emergency" and said the film's restricted screenings in parts of Punjab is a "complete harassment of art and the artist".

The film, which sees Ranaut playing the role of former Prime Minister Indira Gandhi, focuses on 21 months of Emergency from 1975 to 1977. The movie, in controversy over its censor certificate and allegations that it misrepresents the Sikh community, was released across the country Friday after several delays

Most cinemas in Ludhiana, Amritsar, Patiala, Jalandhar, Hoshiarpur and Bathinda did not screen the movie. Police force was deployed outside the malls and cinemas in

In Amritsar, for instance, protesters including women were seen carrying black flags and placards saying "Emergency should be banned" and 'Boycott Emergency movie".

"We spoke with the central government and the Punjab government to stop the release of the movie but no action was taken," SGPC's Partap Singh told PTI, adding that they had gathered to stop the release because the film had been made to disturb the peace of Punjab.

DoT launches Sanchar Saathi mobile app

New Delhi, Jan 17: The telecom department Friday launched the Sanchar Saathi mobile app to make it easier to report any suspected fraud communications by allowing the public to flag such incidents directly from their mobile phone call logs.

Minister Jyotiraditya Scindia also launched two other initiatives of the DoT -- Vision for National Broadband Mission 2.0 and Intra circle roaming at 'Digital Bharat Nidhi' funded 4G mobile sites. The DoT's Sanchar Saathi portal, launched in 2023, has been an effective mechanism in the crackdown against fraud calls, and the new app will double down on these efforts by for subscribers.

Unveiling the initiatives, Scindia said the Sanchar Saathi initiative provides "a safe and secure environment where privacy and security of each customer are safeguarded" The new app - available for Android and iOS platforms - allows users to report suspected calls and SMS directly from phone logs. Users will also be able to identify and manage all mobile connections issued in their name, so there is no unauthorised usage.

Other features include blocking, tracing and recovery of lost or stolen mobile handsets, as well as the ability to verify the authenticity of mobile handsets, thus ensuring that users buy genuine devices, "With over 90

Two bulls too died in sepa rate incidents. While one bull died during the event in Puduk kottai, a bull owner and his bull died at Siravayal manjuvirattu in Sivaganga, the police said.

At the maniuvirattu in Sir avayal in Sivaganga district Thaneesh Raja of Naduvikot tai Keela Aavandhipatti vil lage, who brought his bull to take part in the event died along with his bull after the animal fell into a farm well at Kambanur while running away from the arena.

Both Raja and his bull drowned when he jumped into the well to get hold of the an imal. About 130 people were injured in the manjuvirattu in which 150 baiters and 250 bulls participated. A spectator Subbaiah of Devakottai was gored by a bull and he died on the way to hospital. A 55-year-old specta tor P Periyasamy of Mettupatti village near Vadipatti, was gored in the neck by a raging bull in Alanganallur in Madurai where atleast 70 people, mostly specta tors sustained injuries, police said. Periyasamy was declared brought dead at the Rajaji Government Hospital, Madurai.

Two spectators were gored to death and 148 persons including bull owners, and tamers were injured in four separate jallikattu events in Tiruchirappalli, Karur, and Pudukottai districts A 60-year-old spectator, Kulan thaivelu, from Samuthram near Kuzhumani in Karur district was gored to death at the jal likattu events in RT Malai Police said a 70-year-old spectator iden tified as C Perumal of Odugam patti near Keeranur was gored to death in the Mahadeva Patti jallikattu in Pudukottai district where 607 bulls and 300 tamers participated. Victim's parents claim investigation half-done

Minister rules out underworld link

Mumbai, Jan 17: The intruder who stabbed Hindi film indusrty actor Saif Ali Khan at his home in Mumbai still remains at large despite more than 30 teams on the lookout for him Friday, while a Maharashtra minister ruled out underworld link to the brutal attack.

The attacker was not working for any criminal gang and probably was not even aware whose house he had entered in, said police, citing their investigation carried out so far.

Police picked up a carpenter in connection with the attack on Khan (54) at his apartment in the wee hours of Thursday as he resembled the intruder, and brought him to the Bandra police station for questioning on Friday morning, but released him later. A senior police official clarified the man was not related to the attack on Khan and no one has been arrested so far. "The person detained in the morning has been released. He was picked up as he looked like the intruder captured in the CCTV footage. But he had an alibi which was verified by the police. Based on that, the detained person has been released. Our probe is still on. We are looking at all angles," said the senior official. "This seems to be a stray incident. The alleged intruder was not working for any gang as per prima facie investigation. He probably was not even aware whose house he had entered in," he added. He said more than 30 teams have been formed to track down and nab the attacker, who stabbed Khan in his 12th floor apartment during a robbery attempt.

The attacker's face was captured in CCTV footage. The video showed the assailant, wearing a red scarf and carrying a backpack, scurrying down the stairs from the sixth floor of the 'Satguru Sharan' building, where Khan lives, at around 2.30 am. Maharashtra Minister of State for Home (Urban) Yogesh Kadam said robbery was the motive behind the incident and clarified no underworld gang was in-

During surgery, the doctors removed a 2.5-inch knife fragment lodged in his spine. They noted that if the knife had gone just 2 mm deeper, it could have caused a severe injury.

"So, we operated and removed it. But from there, the spinal fluid was leaking. Due to that repair, we are keeping him under observation. Today he is doing excellent. Wounds are healing and he has no neurological deficit," Dr Dange informed.

His health parameters have improved and he has been shifted from the ICU to a special room, he said.

Doctors have removed the sharp object and done repairing of the spinal injury, he explained. An image of the sharp object, a knife blade, went viral on social media.

the government are not bothered. The bench said it will also hear the pleas against the ban of firms involved in the manufacture and sale of firecrackers on the next date.

When a lawyer requested the court to lift the complete ban as it also pertains to the manufac-

turers' fundamental rights, the bench said the environmental problems come ahead of their issues. The lawyer then requested the court to at least allow green crackers. "We have to examine how green are green crackers," the bench said.

It also asked the Centre to respond to the pleas of the firecracker-manufacturing firms. Earlier also, the court had directed the Uttar Pradesh and Haryana governments to impose a complete ban on firecrackers until further orders. The bench had noted that the Delhi government had enforced a complete ban on the manufacture, storage and sale, including delivery, of firecrackers through online marketing round the year with immediate effect. "We are of the view that this ban will be effective only when other states forming part of the NCR impose similar measures. Even the state of Rajasthan has imposed a similar ban in that part of the state of Rajasthan which falls in the NCR. For the time being, we di rect the states of Uttar Pradesh and Haryana to impose a similar ban, which is imposed by the state of Delhi," the bench had said. Expressing serious concerns

over the high pollution levels in Delhi during Diwali, the apex court previously took exception to the violation of court orders and said its directives on the firecracker ban were "hardly implemented". The court was hearing a plea filed by M C Mehta in 1985 seeking directions to curb air pollution in the national capital and adjoining areas.





16 Indians serving with Russian military missing

New Delhi, Jan 17: India Friday said 12 Indian nationals have been killed while serving with the Russian military and another 16 listed by Russia as missing.

Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said a total of 126 Indians were serving with the Russian military and 96 of them have so far been discharged. "Twelve Indian

tionals have died in the (Russia-Ukraine) conflict, who were serving in the Russian Army," Jaiswal said, responding to a question at his weekly media briefing.

"Out of the 126 known cases of Indian nationals serving in the Russian armed forces, 96 individuals have already returned. They have been discharged from the Russian armed forces," he said. Of the remaining 18 Indian nationals in the Russian armed forces, the whereabouts of 16 individuals are currently not known, he added.

"The Russian side has catego rised them as missing," Jaiswal said. The MEA is in touch with the families of all the 16 Indians categorised as missing by Russian authorities.

"We remain engaged with the Russian authorities to ascertain the whereabouts of the missing Indian nationals and for an early release and repatriation of those who remain," he said. This week, the MEA confirmed the death of an Indian from Kerala.

The death of Binil TB, who

made public Monday by one of his relatives. Jaiswal described Binil's death as "unfortunate".

The Indian embassy in Moscow is in touch with Russian authorities for bringing his body back, he said, adding that another resident of Kerala, who was injured, is currently being treated in a Moscow hospital.

"The embassy is in touch with him and Russian authorities for his well-being, and we are hopeful that he will return after his treatment," Jaiswal said. Officials had confirmed the deaths of nine Indians till last year and Binil is believed

Following Binil's death India pressed Russia to release all the Indians recruited by its military. Prime Minister Narendra Modi had strongly raised the issue of early discharge of the Indian nationals working in the Russian Army during his talks with Russian President Vladimir Putin in Moscow in July last year.

In October last year, Indian officials said 85 Indian nationals have been discharged from the Russian military and efforts are on to secure the release of 20 more. In August last year, the Russian embassy said Moscow and New Delhi are working in close coordination for an early "identification and discharge" of the Indian nationals who voluntarily joined contractual work in the military service and now want to return home.

Since April last year, the ministry of defence of the Russian Federation has stopped recruiting citizens of a number of foreign countries, including India, into the military service,

MMCH junior docs call off 'cease work' stir

Midnapore(WB), Jan 17: Junior doctors at the Midnapore Medical College and Hospital (MMCH) called off their 'cease work' protest, with services gradually returning to normalcy at the facility Friday evening.

The protest was initially launched in response to the suspension of 12 doctors, including six junior doctors, over their alleged negligence in the death of a woman following childbirth and the critical condition of others after being administered 'expired' intravenous fluid.

The junior doctors, who had begun an indefinite 'cease work' protest Thursday night, announced that several departments, including the emergency, ICU, obstetrics, and paediatrics, had resumed normal operations. The protest was in solidarity with their suspended colleagues and to demand the revocation of the suspension order.

"Following the suspension of six colleagues from the obstetrics and anaesthesia departments, we decided to launch this protest. However, we are now returning to work as services have resumed in various departments," a representative of the Junior Doctors Forum of the MMCH said Friday evening. The suspension of the 12 doc tors came after an investigation revealed that a woman died and four others fell seriously ill after allegedly being administered 'expired' saline at the hospital.

The state government, upon the findings of a CID report and a 13-member expert committee, took action against the medical staff, including the Medical Superintendent and Vice Principal, the head of the department, and senior and junior residents.

New Delhi, Jan 17: Jail administration needs reformation for a better environment and prison culture to ensure prisoners enjoy their right to a dignified life under the Constitution, the Supreme Court Friday said.

Interestingly, a bench of Justices J B Pardiwala and R Mahadevan quoted Fyodor Dostoevsk's famous lines as saying, "The degree of civilisation in a society can be judged by entering its prisons", and underlined the importance of treating prisoners as human beings with rights to dignity and humane conditions.

The observations came in a judgement that set aside the Jharkhand High Court verdict quashing the transfer of one Vikash Tiwary, a convicted gangster, from one prison to another in the state. The bench restored the order of the inspector general of prisons, citing the necessity of ensuring prison safety and pre-

venting potential gang violence.

The transfer was ordered by the Jharkhand prisons authority May 17, 2023, citing administrative grounds and the imminent threat of a gang war in Hazaribagh jail due to the presence of rival factions.

Tiwary challenged the transfer in the Jharkhand High Court, which quashed the order August 21, 2023, deeming it unjustified. The Jharkhand government appealed the high court's decision in the Supreme Court.

Justice Mahadevan, authoring the judgement, said the transfer was a precautionary measure to ensure the safety of inmates and maintain prison discipline. The bench said the prison authorities were tasked with maintaining order and security within correctional facilities, and such transfers should not be treated as routine but necessary responses to extraordinary circumstances.

The inspector general's duty, it outlined, was to act in the larger interest of prison security and dismissed allegations of arbitrariness in the transfer order.

Nine dead after car crashes into ST bus

Pune, Jan 17: At least nine people were killed, including a five-year-old child, and eight others were injured after a tempo collided with their minivan, forcing it to ram into a stationary bus on the Pune-Nashik Highway Friday, a police official said.

The incident took place near Narayangaon at 9:30am, he added. The tempo struck the minivan from behind, causing it to ram into an empty ST bus parked on the side of the road, the official said.

"The impact of the collision was so severe that nine persons died on the spot," said Pankaj Deshmukh, Superintendent of Police, Pune Rural. Police identified the deceased as Debubai Takalkar (65), driver Vinod Rokade (50), Yuvraj Wavhal (23), Chandrakant Gunjal (50) Geeta Gaware (45), Bhau Bade (65), Najma Hanif Shaikh (35) Vashifa Inamdar (5), and Manisha Pacharne (56).

"Eight others sustained minor to moderate injuries and are undergoing treatment. Following the crash, the tempo driver fled the scene. We have registered a case against the unidentified driver of the tempo and bus driver Bhau saheb Jaybhay under Bhara tiya Nyaya Sanhita and Motor Vehicles Act." a Narayangaon police station official said.

The ST bus driver has been booked since he had parked the vehicle in a dangerous manner, the official said.

Efforts are on to nab the driver of the tempo, the officia added. Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis called the incident unfortunate and announced compensation of ₹5 lakh each to the kin of the deceased. Vikram Bhor, sarpanch of

Junnar tehsil's Kandali village from where five of the deceased hailed, said everyone was shocked after hearing about the accident. Parishad school teacher. Visionary filmmaker **David Lynch dies at 78**

Los Angeles: David Lynch, the filmmaker celebrated for his uniquely dark and dreamlike vision in such movies as "Blue Velvet" and "Mulholland Drive" and the TV series "Twin Peaks", has died just days before his 79th birthday. His family announced the death in a Facebook post Thursday. "There's a big hole in the world now that he's no longer with us. But, as he would say, Keep your eye on the donut and not on the hole," the family's post read. "It's a beautiful day with golden sunshine and blue skies all the way." The cause of death and location was not immediately available. Last summer. Lynch had revealed to Sight and Sound that he was diagnosed with emphysema and would not be leaving his home because of fears of contracting the coronavirus or "even a cold". "I've gotten emphysema from smoking for so long and so I'm homebound whether I like it or not," Lynch said, adding he didn't expect to make another film.

Ex-FM running to replace Trudeau

Ottawa: Former Canadian finance minister Chrystia Freeland Friday announced that she would take part in the contest to replace Prime Minister Justin Trudeau as leader of the ruling Liberal Party.Freeland, who was one of Trudeau's closest political allies for a decade, quit last month after resisting his demands for more spending and wrote a letter denouncing his governing style. Her unexpected departure prompted an uproar from Liberal legislators already unhappy about the party's miserable showing in the polls after nine years in power and widespread voter unhappiness about high prices and a housing crisis.

ICC chief prosecutor meets Syrian leader

The Hague: The International Criminal Court's chief prosecutor Karim Khan made an unannounced visit to Damascus Friday, meeting with the leader of Syria's de facto government. Khan's office says he visited on the invitation of Syria's transitional government to offer support in ensuring accountability for alleged crimes committed in the country. Khan met with the country's leader Ahmed al-Sharaa and the foreign minister to discuss options for justice in The Hague for the victims of the conflict. which has left more than half a million dead and more than six million people displaced.

Gaza truce goes for final sign-off

Jerusalem/Cairo, Jan 17: The Israeli security cabinet has recommended approving the Gaza ceasefire and hostage return deal, ahead of a full cabinet meeting expected later Friday, a statement from the prime minister's office said.

Cabinet is expected to meet at 3.30 pm (1330 GMT) to give final ratification to the agreement, which Prime Minister Beniamin Netanyahu said is expected to take effect Sunday, with the release of the first hostages.

If successful, the ceasefire would halt fighting between Hamas and Israeli forces that has razed much of heavily urbanised Gaza, killed more than 46,000 people, and displaced most of the enclave's pre-war population of 2.3 million several times over, according to local authorities.

It could also ease hostilities in the Middle East, where the Gaza war spread to include Iran and its proxies - Lebanon's Hezbollah, Yemen's Houthis and armed groups in Iraq as well as the occupied West Bank.

In Gaza itself Friday, Israeli warplanes kept up heavy strikes, and the Civil Emergency Service said that at least 101 Palestinians, including 58 women and children, had been killed since the deal was announced Wednesday.

Under the six-week first phase of the three-stage deal, Hamas will release 33 Israeli hostages, including all women (soldiers and civilians), children, and men over 50.

Israel will release all Palestinian women and children under 19 detained in Israeli jails by the end of the first phase. The total number of Palestinians released will depend on hostages released, and could be between 990 and 1.650 Palestinians, including men, women and children.

Netanyahu was informed by the negotiating team that agreements have been reached on a deal to release the hostages, his office said in a statement.

Underscoring the potential obstacles facing a final ceasefire, hardliners in Netanyahu's coalition have opposed the deal as a capitulation to Hamas, which had controlled Gaza. National Security Minister Itamar Ben-Gvir threatened to resign if it was approved. However, he said he would not bring down the government.

His fellow hardliner, Finance Minister Bezalel Smotrich, has also threatened to quit the government if it does not go back to war to defeat Hamas after the first six-week phase of the ceasefire was completed.

Nevertheless, a majority of ministers were expected to back the agreement.

In Gaza, the airstrikes continued. In the aftermath of one strike on tents housing displaced people, a boy picked through damaged items on the floor that was littered with canned food and coffee pots.

PIO sentenced to 8 years for attempted attack on White House

Washington, Jan 17: Indian national Sai Varshith Kandula, 20, Thursday was sentenced to eight years for an attempted attack on the White House with a rented truck May 22, 2023.

The attack aimed to overthrow the democratically elected American government in order to replace it with a dictatorship fuelled by Nazi ideology, the Department of Justice said.

Kandula had pleaded guilty May 13, 2024 to a charge of willful injury or depredation of US property. Born in Chandanagar, India, he was a lawful permanent resident of the US with a green card. In addition to the prison term, District Court Judge Dabney L Friedrich ordered Kandula to serve three years of supervised release.

The Indian national flew on a commercial flight from St Louis, Missouri, to Washington DC on the afternoon of May 22, 2023, connecting through another airport on a one-way airline ticket, according to court documents, and arrived at Dulles International Airport about 5:20 pm, wherein he rented a truck at 6:30 pm. He stopped for food and gas,

and then drove to Washington. DC, where he crashed into the barriers protecting the White House and the President's Park at 9:35 pm at the intersection of H Street, Northwest and 16th Street, Northwest. Kandula drove onto the sidewalk, sending pedestrians running from the scene. After striking the barriers, the truck backed up in reverse, then lurched forward. striking the metal barriers a second time. The second impact disabled the truck which began smoking from the engine compartment and leaking fluids.

Kandula next exited the ve hicle and went to the back of the truck. From a backpack he removed a flag, a three-byfive foot red-and-white banner with a Nazi Swastika in the centre, and brandished it. US Park Police and the US Secret Service officers arrested Kandula at the scene and took him into custody, the Department of Justice said

SpaceX's Starship blasts in flight test

Washington, Jan 17: A SpaceX Starship rocket broke up in space minutes after launching from Texas Thursday, forcing airline flights over the Gulf of Mexico to alter course to avoid falling debris and setting back Elon Musk's flagship rocket program.

SpaceX mission control lost contact with the newly upgraded Starship, carrying its first test payload of mock satellites but no crew, eight minutes after liftoff from its South Texas rocket facilities at 5:38 pm EST (2238 GMT).

imminent and, although experts have said the app will not disappear from existing users' phones once the law takes effect January 19, new users won't be able to download it and updates won't

That will eventually render the app unworkable, the Justice Department has said in court filings. The decision came against the backdrop of unusual political agitation by President-elect Donald Trump.

Child sexual abuse: UK orders 'rapid audit'

London: The UK government has ordered a "rapid audit" of the scale and nature of grooming gangs based child sexual exploitation, including an examination of Home Secretary Yvette Cooper laid out the plans in a statement in the House of Commons Thursday, also noting that many major investigations into the issue have involved "Pakistani heritage gangs". Amid growing demands for a national inquiry into the scandal since Tesla CEO Elon Musk attacked the UK's handling of the historic scandal on his X platform, the minister told Parliament that the Child Sexual Exploitation Taskforce will immediately expand the ethnicity data it collects and publishes. "Many major investigations have involved Pakistani heritage gangs and the police taskforce evidence also shows exploitation and abuse taking place across many different communities and ethnicities. But the data on ethnictity of both perpetrators and victims is still inadequate," Yvette Cooper told MPs.
"In order to go much further, I have asked Baroness Louise Casey to oversee a rapid audit of the current scale and nature of gang-based exploitation across the country and to make recommendations on the further work that is needed.

China's population falls for third straight year

Taipei (Taiwan), Jan 17: China's population fell last year for the third straight year, its government said Friday, pointing to further demographic challenges for the world's second most populous nation, which is now facing both an ageing population and an emerging shortage of working age people.

China's population stood at 1.408 billion at the end of 2024. a decline of 1.39 million from the previous year. The figures announced by the

government in Beijing follow trends worldwide, but especially in East Asia, where Japan. South Korea, Hong Kong and other nations have seen their birth rates plummet. China three years ago joined Japan and most of Eastern Europe among other nations whose population is falling.

The reasons are in many cases similar: Rising costs of living are causing young people to put off or rule out marriage and child birth while pursuing higher education and careers. While

people are living longer, that's not enough to keep up with rate of new births. Countries such as China that

allow very little immigration are especially at risk.

China has long been among the world's most populous nations, enduring invasions, floods and other natural disasters to sustain a population that thrived on rice in the south and wheat in the north. Following the end of World War II and the Communist Party's rise to power in 1949, large families re-emerged and the population doubled in just three decades, even after tens of millions died in the Great Leap Forward that sought to revolutionize agriculture and industry and the Cultural Revolution that followed a few years later.

After the end of the Cultural Revolution and leader Mao Zedong's death, Communist bureaucrats began to worry the country's population was outstripping its ability to feed itself and began implementing a draconian "one child policy."

While spending on the military and flashy infrastructure projects continues to rise. China's already frail social security system is teetering, with increasing numbers of Chinese refusing to pay into the under-

funded pension system. Already, more than one-fifth of the population is aged 60 or over, with the official figure giv en as 310.3 million or 22% of the total population. By 2035, this number is forecast to exceed 30%, sparking discussion of changes to the official retire ment age, which one of the lowest in the world. With fewer students, some vacant schools and kindergartens are meanwhile being transformed into care facilities for older people.

Such developments are giving some credence to the aphorism that China, now the world's second largest economy but facing major headwinds, will "grow old before it grows rich.

Use '1600xx' series to call customers, savs RBI to banks PRESS TRUST OF INDIA

Mumbai, Jan 17: The RBI Friday asked banks to use only the '1600xx' phone numbering series to call customers for transactional purposes with a view to preventing financial fraud.

It further said that for promotional purposes, banks and other regulated entities (REs) should use only the '140xx numbering series for the prevention of financial frauds perpetrated using voice calls and SMS. Banks and other regulated

entities (REs) have also been asked to monitor and clean their customer database.

The proliferation of digital transactions, while offering convenience and efficiency, has also led to a surge in frauds, a press ing concern underscoring the need for concerted action, said a Reserve Bank circular to REs.

The mobile number of a customer has emerged as a ubiquitous identifier, instrumental in the account authen tication and verification process, receiving sensitive pay ment communication, such as OTPs, transaction alerts, and account updates.

"The mobile number, however, can also be misused by scamsters in multiple ways for committing various types of online and other frauds," the circular said on 'Prevention of financial frauds perpetrated using voice calls and SMS Regulatory prescriptions and Institutional Safeguards'. "Undertake transactional

service calls only using '1600xx' numbering series, when oper ationalised; undertake promo tional voice calls only through phone numbers using '140xx numbering series; follow the 'Important Guidelines for send ing commercial communication using telecom resources through Voice Calls or SMS' issued by Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI)," it said.

New Delhi, Jan 17: Manu Bhaker and D Gukesh provided a sprinkling of stardust but it was India's perseverant para-athletes who walked away with the most boisterous applause when President Droupadi Murmu bestowed the National Sports Awards in a regal ceremony at the Rashtrapati Bhavan here Friday.

Double Olympic-medallist Bhaker, 18-year-old chess world champion Gukesh, men's hockev captain Harmanpreet Singh and Paralympic gold-winning high jumper Praveen Kumar were presented the country's highest sporting honour -- the Major Dhyan Chand Khel Rat-

The 22-year-old Bhaker became independent India's first athlete to win two medals in a single edition of the Olympics with her bronze-winning show in the 10m air pistol individual and 10m air pistol mixed team events in August last year.

Murmu met the 80-year-old war hero half way to present him the award.

Petkar was disabled waist down due to bullet wounds sustained during the 1965 battle against Pakistan. He was originally a boxer but turned to para-swimming due to the multiple injuries.

He fought the adversity to win a historic gold medal in the 1972 Paralympics in Heidelberg.

The veteran was welcomed with a rapturous applause that did not stop till he was seated back after collecting the award from the President.

One among those clapping for him at the Durbar Hall was actor Kartik Aryan, who played Petkar in a recent biopic titled 'Chandu Champion'.

Dignitaries, including sports minister Mansukh Mandaviya, parliamentary and minority affairs minister Kiren Rijuju, sports secretary Sujata Chaturvedi, were among those who attended the ceremony that lasted a little over an hour.

While the Khel Ratna comes with a cash prize of Rs 25 lakh, the Ariuna and Dronacharva awards include a cash prize of Rs 15 lakh

Among the most prominent Droncharya winners this year was shooting coach Deepali Deshpande, who mentored Kusale, and former national football manager Armando Colaco.

The Arjuna Awards are given to sportspersons who have demonstrated good performance over the past four years and have shown qualities of leadership, sportsmanship, and discipline. The annual honours are decided by a points system in which the maximum emphasis is on performances delivered at the Olympics and the World Championships.

Kuala Lumpur: India's GenNext cricketers will be eager to extend their dominance in the global stage as they seek to defend the title of the ICC II-19 Women's T20 World Cup beginning here Saturday. Clubbed with the West Indies, Sri Lanka and hosts Malavsia in Group A, India will begin their campaign against the Caribbeans at the Bayuemas Oval here Sunday. India had won the last edition -- also inaugural -- held in South Africa in 2023, beating England by seven wickets in the final. The tournament, featuring 16 teams, are divided into four groups, with the top three from each group progressing to the Super Six stage. From there, the top-two teams from each Super Six group will advance to the semi-finals, culminating in the summit clash February 2.

Haaland extends deal

Manchester: Erling Haaland has signed a new contract at Manchester City that ties him to the Premier League champions until 2034.City announced the new 91/2-year deal Friday for the 24-yearold Haaland, who has scored 111 goals in 125 games since joining the club from Borussia Dortmund in 2022 to establish himself as one of the best strikers in the world. The Norway striker will be turning age 34 when the contract expires. The new deal for Haaland comes as City awaits a verdict after being charged with 115 breaches of the Premier League's financial rules. Haaland scored 52 goals in all competitions in his first season with City, including a single-season record 36 in the Premier League.

Wiik Aan Zee: World champion D Gukesh will take on local star Anish Giri in the opening round of the 87th Tata Steel Chess tournament here Saturday, marking his first competitive outing since claiming the coveted crown last month. Giri. the 2023 winner, holds the reputation of being a tough cookie thanks to his impeccable theoretical knowledge and research that has been the Dutchman's forte for many years now. However, 18-year-old Gukesh, who likes to go with a no-draw approach in every game he plays, is in great form and can look forward to a solid campaign after the World Championship triumph over Chinese Ding Liren in Singapore.

New Delhi, Jan 17: Two-time Olympic medallist PV Sindhu's valiant fight ended in disappointment, but Satwiksairaj Rankireddy and Chirag Shetty lifted the spirits of the Indian camp with a dominant perfor mance as they stormed into the semifinals of the India Open Super 750 badminton tournament

Satwik and Chirag, the 2022 champions, pulverised the Korean pair of Jin Yong and Kang Min Hyuk with a barrage of attacking shots, winning 21-10, 21-17 in just 41 minutes.

The victory marked their third consecutive semifinal appearance on the tour, following finishes in the last four at the China Masters and Malaysia Super 1000 last year.
