TRUMP IS BACK

PRESS TRUST OF INDIA

Washington, Jan 20: Donald J Trump was Monday sworn in as the 47th President of the United States, marking his remarkable return to power for a second term four years after he left the American capital as a pariah.

The 78-year-old Republican leader storms back to the White House with a strongman persona and a vision of an all-powerful presidency with a promise to aggressively reset US policies in a range of domains, including immigration, tariffs and energy.

Trump registered a spectacular victory over his Democratic rival Kamala Harris in the November 5 presidential election, defying two assassination attempts, two presidential impeachments and his criminal conviction. Four years back, Trump had left Washington as a pariah in the face of his unsuccessful attempt to overturn the 2020 presidential election to stay in office.

His victory in the bitterly fought election was widely acknowledged as the most momentous comeback in American political history. JD Vance was sworn in as the vice presi-

dent ahead of Trump.External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar attended the inauguration ceremony as Prime Minister Narendra Modi's special envoy.

The inauguration ceremony was held indoors under the Capitol Rotunda against the initially planned outdoor venue in view of frigid temperatures in the US capital city.

The ceremony was attended by Trump's wife Melania, his daughter Ivanka and her husband Jared Kushner, and billionaires Elon Musk, Jeff Bezos and Tim Cook.

On the first day in office, Trump is expected to sign a slew of executive orders, in cluding kicking off a process to end birthright citizenship.

Congratulating Trump on his second non-consecutive term as the US President, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said in a post on X, "Congratulations my dear friend President Donald Trump on your historic inauguration as the 47th president of the United States!'

"I look forward to working closely together once again, to benefit both our countries, and to shape a better future for the world. Best wishes for a successful term ahead!" he added. MORE P10

Nat'l Critical Mineral Mission soon: Reddy PRESS TRUST OF INDIA

Bhubaneswar, Jan 20: Optimistic of India emerging as a global hub of critical minerals, Union Minister for Coal and Mines G Kishan Reddy Monday said the Centre will soon launch the National Critical Mineral Mission (CMM) to enhance domestic production. reduce import dependence and encourage offshore mining auctions.

Reddy made the remark after inaugurating the 3rd National Mining Ministers' Conference in Konark, in the presence of Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi, Bihar Deputy CM Vijay Kumar Sinha, Telangana Deputy CM Bhatti Vikramarka Mallu, and other dignitaries and industry leaders "India will be the global destination for critical minerals. We are pioneering offshore mineral auctions for the first time in 75 years to enhance self-reliance and reduce import dependence," the Union Coal and Mines Minister said while stressing on the need for states to accelerate exploration and the auctioning of critical minerals. **P**3

Manu Singhvi, appearing for Gandhi, submitted that there are several judgements which hold that only the aggrieved person can file a criminal defamation complaint. He argued that the complaint cannot be filed by a proxy third party.

Senior Advocate Mahesh Jethmalani appeared for the complainant. BJP Leader Jha filed the com-

plaint case against Gandhi, alleging that in the AICC Plenary Sessions March 18, 2018, Gandate the evidence.

The Magistrate, on the basis of the direction given in the Criminal Revision, passed a fresh order November 28, 2018 and came to a finding that a prima facie case was made out against Gandhi under Section 500 IPC and issued process for his appearance.

Gandhi challenged the Judicial Commissioner's order and the subsequent order of the Magistrate, contending that Jha had no locus standi to file the case, and that the provision under section 199 CrPC had not been complied with.

The High Court held, "Opposite party no. 2 being a party worker of Bhartiya Janata Party in my view, has locus standi to file the aforesaid complaint case under Sections 499/500 of the Indian Penal Code.'

Bhubaneswar, Jan 20: Guidelines for Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (PMAY)-Rural have been relaxed to include the maximum number of households under the scheme, said Panchayati Raj Minister Rabi Narayan Naik Monday, adding that fam ilies owning two-wheelers and refrigerators, and earning up to ₹15,000 per month can avail benefit of the rural housing scheme

Speaking to reporters, Naik said a survey to identify beneficiaries for housing scheme will start in the state January 24 and is likely to be completed in two months.

"Eligible persons apply in both online and offline mode. A portal would also be launched for this purpose," the minister said. Naik appealed to the poor people living in kutcha houses to apply for a house under the scheme. "About 18 lakh new beneficiaries are expected in the state. However, the number may increase to 20-22 lakh," he said.

"No proper list of eligible families for rural housing schemes was prepared in the past. So, we are conducting the survey to identify all eligible beneficiaries," he added.

"Now, families owning two-wheelers and refrigerators, and earning up to Rs 15.000 per month can avail benefit of the rural housing scheme," he said.

India slips to 3rd place on trust barometer

Amid poor economic outlook, depreciating rupee and eroding investors' confidence in Indian markets, one more trust deficit has come to the fore. And this time, it is people's trust in the government, businesses, media and NGOs. India has slipped one place lower while neighbouring China and Indonesia have fared better, if the annual Edelman Trust Barometer's latest report, released just before the Davos World Economic Forum, is any indication

Davos, Jan 20: The annual Edelman Trust Barometer, now in its 25th year, showed that India ranks low at 13th place when it comes to trust of people in other countries, in companies with Indian headquarters.

Canada topped this list of foreign-headquartered companies, followed by Japan, Germany, UK. France and US. while those ranked higher than India also included Mexico, South Africa,

Saudi Arabia, China and Brazil. The overall list for trust of

the general population in the government, businesses, media and NGOs was again topped by China, while Indonesia replaced India for the second spot by virtue of an increased score despite the Indian score remaining unchanged. The survey of 28 countries saw Japan

replacing UK at the bottom. In most countries, including India, the low income population was far less trusting than the high income group.

2025 Edelman Trust Barometer

Trust and the Crisis of Grievance

Within the high income group, India was ranked fourth after Indonesia, Saudi Arabia and China, while the low income population made India the third most trusted nation after China and Indonesia.

However, the percentage of low income population reposing faith in Indian institutions stood far less at 65 per cent, as against 80 per cent in case of high income people.



Odisha to play key role in sustainable mining practices: CM Ambedkar ideologies'

Bhubaneswar, Jan 20: Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Monday said Odisha is poised to play a pivotal role in ensuring sustainable and environmentally-responsible mining practices as part of the 'Purvodaya Mission' which aims to unlock the economic potential of India.

They also handed over sance tion letters to 11 startups selected for funding of ₹15.97 crore under S&T-PRISM com ponent of science and technology programme of the Ministry of Mines. These startups will fo cus on indigenous technologies. including sustainable solutions like high-grade silica produc tion, lithium battery materials, and AI-enhanced mining operations.

The Union minister and Odi sha CM also presented awards for excellence in mineral block auctions

The initiative will begin by focusing on key cities like Bhubaneswar, Cuttack, Puri, Paradip, Berhampur, Sambalpur, Balasore and Rourkela and gradually expand state-wide.

Bhubaneswar, Jan 20: The state government has decided to implement the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 in a phased manner, starting from academic year 2025-26.

The School and Mass Education (S&ME) department has already announced the adoption of the NEP and the National Curriculum Frameworks in the first phase of implementation by contextualising those locally as the State Curriculum Frameworks.

The National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, issued by the Ministry of Education (MoE). aims at providing high-quality education for all and introduces landmark reforms in the 21st century education system, a release issued by the S&ME department stated.

In its initial phase, Odisha is focusing on reforms at the

foundational stage and plans to extend the implementation to the preparatory, middle, and secondary stages in subsequent phases, it added.

As part of its initial steps, the state launched the Nipun Odisha programme in September 2024, aligned with the national guidelines. Additionally, PM Shri Schools are being established as model institutions to

embody the vision of the NEP, the release said.

The age of enrolment for Grade 1 has been revised to 6+ years as of September 1 of the respective academic year. The state has also announced the opening of 'Shishu Vatika' in all primary schools to provide pre-school education for children aged 5 and above, as outlined in NEP 2020.

The revision of the State Curriculum Frameworks will commence in a phased manner starting from the academic year 2025-26, with the adoption of the National Curriculum Framework for the Foundational Stage (NCF FS) contextualised for Odisha in the first phase.

The NEP 2020 proposes a shift to a 5+3+3+4 structure for the first 15 years of a child's education, covering ages 3-18 and this structure will be im plemented in Odisha gradually

To streamline the rollout of NEP in Odisha, a three-day national workshop on the implementation of NEP 2020 will be held, starting Tuesday. The workshop, which will be inaugurated by Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi aims to sensitise state teams and develop a roadmap for the phased implementation of the NEP in Odisha.

Water bodies in Capital city reduced to cesspools: Study

Bhubaneswar, Jan 20: The heritage temple tanks, ponds, and wells of Bhubaneswar's Old Town have significantly deteriorated due to urbanisation and neglect. according to a study by the Indian National Trust for Art and Cultural Heritage (INTACH)

The report, Sacred Waters: Preservation Strategy for Temple Tanks was released Sunday by INTACH's state convener AB Tripathy and the director general of KIIT School of Architecture & Planning, SS Ray. Preservation Architect Anisha Swain, who led the study,

revealed that many of these water bodies have been reduced to cesspools. Tripathy stated that Odisha

likely has the largest number of temple tanks in the country, with cities like Bhubaneswar, Puri, and Cuttack hosting numerous heritage tanks. However, nearly 150,000 village ponds across the state are also in severe neglect.

Bhubaneswar INTACH's convener Anil Dhir highlight-

ed that groundwater depletion caused by deep bore wells has dried up natural aquifers in the heritage zone. Of the 30 temple tanks surveyed, 18 were found to be dangerously contaminated, with E coli bacteria. fecal matter. low pH levels, and diminished dissolved oxygen levels rendering them unfit for use.

The study also detected high levels of pesticides, metals, algae, arsenic, and fluoride in the tanks, making the water hazardous. It recommended placing warning signage and implementing stricter measures to prevent pollution. Regular cleaning and maintenance of inlets and outlets were also sug gested, with local stakeholder committees proposed to oversee the upkeep.

Dhir expressed hope that the findings would guide conservation efforts by agencies like the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) and the State Archaeology department. He emphasised the urgent need to revive these historic water bodies to preserve their cultural and ecological significance.

Cash, jewellery worth ₹1cr looted in armed robberv POST NEWS NETWORK

Rourkela, Jan 20: In an armed robbery, looters decamped with valuables worth over ₹1 crore at Barpali under Hemgiri police station in Sundargarh district, sources said Monday.

According to information, a group of six-seven armed robbers entered the house of one businessman identified as Nikhil Agarwal at around 1pm, Sunday night, They had their faces covered. They entered from the backyard of the house of the businessman, after reportedly jumping over the wall. Apparently, they used a rope to scale the wall, sources said.

They soon overpowered all the family members and threatened them at gun point. Later they tied up all the familv members. According to the complaint filed by Nikhil, they were talking in Hindi and took away cash and jewellery worth over ₹1 crore. In his complaint he mentioned the looted cash was worth over ₹1 lakh and gold weighing over 1.5kg and silver over 1kg.

Police, who are investigating the case, are tight lipped about it. However, it is presumed that the looters could be from the other side of the state border as their dialect suggested.

Fake ration card holders queue up for delisting

Kalipada, Jan 20: A statement issued Sunday by Food Supplies and Consumer Welfare Minister Krushna Chandra Patra that approximately 4 lakh income taxpayers had availed the ration cards during the previous government has unnerved many ineligible beneficiaries in villages under Baliapal block of Balasore district.

Moreover, the minister's appeal to the ineligible beneficiaries to surrender their ration cards immediately before facing action has had its effect as many government employees here were seen making a beeline at the Baliapal block to delist their names from the National Food Security Act (NFSA).

In a significant case of misuse of the NFSA, it has been revealed that several government employees in Baliapal block are fraudulently holding ration cards, depriving deserving families of food supplies. These employees, including teachers, nurses, police offi-



cers, engineers, and clerks, have been found to be collecting rations intended to reach the poor

According to the state Food Supply Secretary's report, 165 families from 28 panchayats under the block holding ration cards were found to be ineligible.

This has resulted in vulnerable, differently-abled, and financially disadvantaged households being excluded from the benefits of the scheme. The state government is

taking action to address the is-

sue, with efforts underway to remove the names of ineligible individuals from the food supply lists. The Food Supplies and Consumer Welfare department has warned that those who fail to return their ration cards by 30 January will face criminal charges and any food grains they have received will be sold in the open market with an ad-

ditional 10 per cent surcharge. Disciplinary action will also be taken against the relevant government departments, according to Baliapal Supply Officer Ambika Prasad Rath.

Dolphin census begins at Chilika

Berhampur, Jan 20: A dolphin census began at Chilika lake Monday, officials said, adding that over 100 people, including retired government officers, researchers, students and experts, have taken part in counting the dolphins in the lake.

The annual census is being carried out by the Chilika Wildlife Division in collaboration with the Chilika Development Authority (CDA).

A total of 18 groups, with five to six persons in each, have been involved in the enumeration exercise, said Divisional Forest Officer (DFO) Amlan Nayak.

They have been equipped with maps, binoculars, spotting scopes, GPS devices and notebooks, he said.

Boats will not operate in the lake during the three-day exercise, he added.

Last year's census was marked by adverse weather conditions and data was not released by the government. In 2023, 173 dolphins of two species were found in the lake.

The dolphins are categorised as endangered species on the International Union for the Conservation of Nature's (IUCN) Red List.

Girl attempts suicide after 'sexual assault' by lecturer

Jajpur, Jan 20: A girl student tried to immolate herself after a lecturer of the college under Bari police limits in this district allegedly sexually tortured the girl and tried to rape her inside the classroom, police said Monday.

After reports surfaced, irate students locked up the gate and ransacked the college premises Monday. They demanded the arrest of the accused lecturer Bidyadhar Dhal and the college principal absconding after the incident. Demanding immediate justice, the survivor reportedly poured petrol on her and tried to immolate herself but police personnel present on the spot immediately intervened and foiled her attempt. She also tried to jump from the terrace of the college building to end her life but returned after she found the door of the staircase connecting the terrace closed.

Students have also called for action against others who allegedly assisted the lecturer in covering up the incident. The protest continued throughout the day until around 7pm, when Jajpur SDPO Kailash Sethi, Bari tehsildar Manas Ranjan Swain and BDO Maheswar Sethi reached the spot and tried to placate the agitating students.

The protesters relented after the ASP reached the spot and assured to nab the absconding accused within a period of seven days. Bari police registered a case (16/2025) and launched an investigation. Police said that

Later, when the student screamed again, a few firstyear students arrived and the lecturer fled the scene. The student narrated her ordeal to her mother and the college principal. Following this, Dhal allegedly threatened the girl claiming that he would not let her pass the examination using his contacts in the examination control room. He reportedly said that he would help her get more marks in the examination tion if she obliged. The college principal reportedly promised the student higher marks if she complies. It is alleged that the lecturer also offered her money to suppress the incident.

However, when she refused, she was allegedly subjected to mental torture and threats. In response, students organised a protest at the college and ques tioned the role of the police in the matter.



The accused were identified as Sarjan Dansana, 36, and Prahallad Dash, 33, both residents of Putka village under Bijepur police station limits, and Jayakrushna Dansana, 40, a resident of Dhumabhata village under Jagdalpur police station limits. Here Comes Trump Again

ven before his inauguration as US President for the second term 20 January, Donald Trump had scored two big wins – having a hand in the release of hostages to Israel by Hamas as part of a Gaza ceasefire deal and saving TikTok, at least for now, which briefly, for 24 hours, shut down in the US to comply with a federal ban imposed over fears the social media site could be manipulated by China. Each breakthrough bears the true Trump stamp - showmanship and use of presidential power. But these initial "wins" are hardly any indication of the tectonic changes that are on the cards as per Trump's election campaign. The new challenges will require far-sighted strategic vision that he did not always show in his first term. Experts, however, believe Trump has now matured enough from what he was during his first presidency. He appears to have learnt lessons from his past mistakes and chosen his team more carefully and with far greater degree of confidence than what he did last time.

A day before he assumed office, Trump had clearly indicated how thunderous his new term would be. His statement that "by the time the sun sets tomorrow evening, the invasion of our borders will have come to a halt, and all the illegal border trespassers will be on their way back home" reflects his determination to implement what he promised to his voters. The whole world will be watching how he is going to deliver on his other pledges to defeat inflation, provide the lowest-cost energy on Earth, cut taxes, slash prices, raise wages and return thousands of factories to the US with the use of tariffs. He has also declared he would end the war in Ukraine, stop "chaos" in the Middle East, prevent World War III, crush violent crimes in cities and rebuild the police and the military. As Los Angeles had been burning due to wildfires, Trump said he would rebuild it and make it more "beautiful than before." He plans to visit Los Angeles later this week.

As can be seen, Trump will be in a signing spree from his first day in the White House and is expected to issue over 100 executive orders which are intended to be a shock and awe campaign. As his incoming Press secretary, Karoline Leavitt has put it: "He will use the power of his pen to deliver on many of the promises he made to the American people on the campaign trail.'

Changes to America's immigration policies are likely to be profound and controversial. "Mass deportations" have been promised repeatedly and Trump has filled his inner circle with advisors who are staunch supporters of anti-immigration. Undocumented migrants are likely to be the focus. There are an estimated 11 million people who belong to this category in the US at the moment. It has been suggested that the military could be used to help round up undocumented migrants in cities across the country. This will include immigrants who have been in the country for many years waiting for the chance to change their immigration status. Many of the undocumented migrants will have family members born here who are therefore US citizens. To deal with this problem Trump has proposed banning birthright citizenship - an American right enshrined in the 14th Amendment of the US Constitution.

However, it is not clear yet to what extent these policies are enforceable. Present conditions indicate his immigration plans are likely to face significant legal challenges. Trump however is expected to send the message across that he means business and will take visually impactful actions.

On the energy front Trump is likely to turn Biden's limits on drilling offshore upside down as he is an advocate of fossil fuel. For this reason there is hardly any doubt that he will once again withdraw from the Paris Climate Agreement. President Biden rejoined the agreement after Trump pulled out during his first term. There is also the issue of export of natural gas that was banned by the previous administration.

On many occasions during the election campaign, Trump said he would pardon people convicted for their role in the 6 January, 2021 attack on the US Capitol made to prevent the 2020 election from being ratified. His statement last month in this regard is significant: "I'll be looking at J6 early on, maybe the first nine minutes.

Trade and tariffs will be an issue that will have international repercussions. Weeks after his election, Trump promised he would sign an executive order to implement a 25 per cent tariff on products imported from Mexico and Canada, two of America's biggest trading partners. Now, the question is whether there will be any difference between election rhetoric and reality. The world will wait and watch to what extent Trump's electoral pledges are going to be matched by actual actions. India has already had an early taste of Trump's second beginning. PM Modi not getting invited to the Inauguration has been a major setback for his supporters within the country. It has also shown that the influential group of Indian origin people in the US no more believes in the bravado that was being demonstrated earlier. To top this, the invite extended to Nita and Mukesh Ambani was a clear sign that Trump too has taken sides.

"Instead of pinching your pockets, I am going to pinch the pockets of those grubby foreigners who take unfair advantage of free market access," he told his voters.

The impact of policies of Trump 2.0 is expected to be adverse for India. Firstly, higher tariffs on Chinese goods coming into America will divert those to third countries. China is suffering from a slowdown and excess capacity. Which means that the Chinese will try to dump goods on other countries at very low cost, especially items like steel, non-ferrous metals, consumer electronics and chemicals. India already has a huge 100-billion-dollar bilateral trade deficit with China which is proving tough to reduce.

The other impact is via sanctions against buying cheaper Russian crude oil. India benefited from the cheap crude and exporting refined petrol and diesel to US and Europe. That will be under closer scrutiny and become more difficult. A third impact is via the strong dollar which means a weakening rupee. This makes foreign investors nervous, and that has been reflected in massive

outflows. During this month alone, till 17 January, foreign institutional investors (FII) have pulled out Rs 47,000 crore, and the stock market has taken a big beating. This January the outflow is the highest since 2008. As dollars are pulled out, the rupee has fallen to 87 and might fall further. In trying to defend the rupee strength, the Reserve Bank of India sells dollars. As FII's try to get out, there emerges a shortage of dollars, which would have made the rupee weak and dollar strong. To prevent drastic weakening of the rupee, the RBI sells dollars out of its precious foreign exchange reserves. By one estimate, since the end of September 2024, the RBI might have sold close 40 billion dollars to stem the tide. This depletes India's stock of forex and also reduces the liquidity in the banking system. And the net result is that the rupee is still falling while banks are facing a liquidity crunch. As of end December, the RBI is reporting a net liquidity deficit of 2.5 trillion rupees in the banking system. This liquidity crunch makes short term interest rates shoot up. That is not good news, since on the other hand there has been a demand for the RBI policy rate (the short-term repo

of India as well as from interest sensitive sectors like housing, real estate and personal finance. As such the real disposable income of households is moving very sluggishly, thanks to inflation eating into the household budget, and wages not rising fast enough. Hence consumer spending growth also has been muted, causing worries about GDP growth. As such GDP growth this year is lower at 6.4 per cent compared to 8.2 last year. Next year also the growth rate might be moderate at around 6.5 per cent.

Thus, Trump policies directly are bound to affect us via the Chinese dumping threat, the flight of foreign investors from stock markets, weakening rupee and consequent liquidity crunch, continuing high interest rates and inflationary tendency. Of course, it is incorrect to blame all our economic woes on Trump's policies. We are also facing fiscal limits, so that pumping up growth just by government spending will not work. Private investment spending also has to pick up. That depends on consumer confidence and demand revival, which in turn depends on employment and wage growth. It is all interconnected. And there is a big role for psychology and sentiment. The world is watching as the uncertainty unfolds about how disruptive Trump will be for the world economy. If he pushes for a ceasefire in Ukraine that would be a plus point. But if America hunkers down and becomes more protectionist, isolationist and mercantilist that is not good news for free trade. His curtailment of H1B visas can hurt India's software exports, the current bright spot, quite adversely. We are in for a bumpy ride this year tackling the Trump impact and domestic economic challenges.

ailing to heed the lessons of past wars is a surefire recipe for future conflicts. While it is too early to draw all the relevant lessons from the ongoing war in Ukraine, some are readily apparent. Ignoring them will leave Europe vulnerable for years to come. The first and most important lesson is that European countries must respond much faster to emerging military crises. Just as police cars, firefighters, and ambulances use sirens to signal urgency - knowing that the speed with which they reach the scene can determine whether lives are saved or lost - governments and institutions need their own administrative "sirens" to ensure timely and effective responses. The war in Ukraine has underscored the urgent need for the EU, its member states, and institutions like the European Investment Bank, the European Bank for Reconstruction and Development, and the Council of Europe Development Bank to establish processes for fast-tracking infrastructure and, when relevant, defense spending. When Russia bombs Ukraine's electricity infrastructure, for example, or when the bulk of Ukrainian trade is redirected from sea lanes to land routes, the EU and

other international partners must be able to respond quickly by building cross-border electricity lines and reinforcing other critical infrastructure, such as bridges or border crossings across Central Europe. It must also accelerate the construction of EU-compatible rail systems across the Baltic states, which still use Soviet track gauge. The EU could take a page from the playbooks of other countries that have dealt with similar challenges. In 1950, the US adopted the Defense Production Act, which has since been used to fast-track spending on both military and non-military priorities, from developing hypersonic missiles to advancing the green transition through solar-panel production. More recently, Germany responded to the energy crisis triggered by Russia's 2022 invasion of Ukraine with its LNG Acceleration Act, expediting the construction of terminals for liquefied natural gas imports. The Netherlands is poised to follow suit with similar legislation, while the UK has experimented with a "spiral development" approach to military acquisitions, prioritizing speed over perfection by fast-tracking the production of

Sir, This refers to "Peace at last," OrissaPOST, Jan 20. The recent announcement of a potential truce between Israel and Hamas has brought a mix of cautious hope and lingering fear to those on both sides of the conflict. After months of violence and suffering following the devastating events of October 2023, which saw Hamas' deadly incursion into Israel and the subsequent retaliatory offensive, the prospect of a ceasefire offers a moment of relief. However, the road ahead remains fraught with uncertainty. The conflict has left deep scars on both Israeli and Palestinian communities. A crucial component of the ceasefire includes a surge in humanitarian aid to Gaza. This would enable displaced Palestinians to return to their homes and help rebuild critical infrastructure. Yet, the longterm success of this agreement hinges on both sides' willingness to engage in meaningful negotiations during the second phase. The fragile nature of previous ceasefires-such as the one in November 2023 that lasted only a week-underscores the difficulty of achieving lasting peace. Meanwhile, Palestinians fear that a breakdown in talks could trigger renewed violence, exacerbating an already catastrophic situation. If the ceasefire holds, it could mark the beginning of a much-needed reprieve for Gaza's beleaguered population.

even closer to EU and NATO borders. To this end, they must ensure that Ukraine has the capacity to withstand Russian aggression for decades, if necessarv. Moreover, for Ukraine to achieve lasting peace – not just a ceasefire that collapses after a few years - it must either join NATO or bolster its defenses to the point that any Russian offensive becomes too difficult and costly to pursue. Maintaining a robust international military presence will also be essential for deterring aggression.

The last obvious lesson of the war in Ukraine is not new: the best way to restore peace is to support allies in defending it. The US helped its European allies win two world wars not because it faced an immediate threat, but because it understood that letting its allies fall would ultimately bring the danger to its doorstep. Now, the danger is at Europe's doorstep, and it is EU's turn to step up.

Al-generated meme war ahead of election

New Delhi, Jan 20: The Delhi Assembly election has become a memefest in the digital arena with the BJP. AAP. and Congress trying to captivate voters and take jibes at one another through humorous and satirical posters and AI-generated videos.

While the BJP labelled AAP supremo Arvind Kejriwal 'Ghoshna Mantri", the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) hit back, describing it as "Gali Baaja Party" (party of abuses).

The BJP's Kalkaji candidate Ramesh Singh Bidhuri has become the focus of AAP's campaign, highlighting his "hirni" (doe) jibe at Chief Minister Atishi that has been described by the ruling party as abusive and anti-women.

AAP has posted on social media a satirical video featuring Bidhuri and Amit Shah, humorously portraving a "Gaali Championship,' where Bidhuri emerges as the undisputed winner, even beating other BJP leaders and candidates.

On the other hand, the BJP, looking to dislodge AAP from power, has come up with posters depicting AAP as "AAPda" (disaster) with slogans like



"Aao IDA ko ukhad phenkengay", directly targeting the incumbent's infrastructure development promises.

The Congress too is not far behind. Looking to reclaim its lost ground after drawing a blank in the 2015 and 2020 Assembly polls, it has come up with sharp satires in the form of memes and AI-generated video campaigns using the storytelling format.

A post shared by the Congress, shows a razor blade with the tagline "GST", calling the BJP-led Union government a "pocket maar sarkar".

The grand old party has also come up with an AI-generated video titled "Fekne Mein Vishwa Vijeta", in which the narrator explains a game, similar to an Olympic-style competition that involves contestants delivering the most exaggerated claims, with one participant

ultimately winning the title.

The video concludes with the winner declaring, "Mitron, fekne se mera poora nata hai", taking a jab at BJP's poll promises that its political rivals have termed rhetoric.

On the other hand, AAP has launched sharp retorts, taking on both the BJP and Congress, alleging that the grand old party's Delhi unit has been turned pawns in the electoral game of chess by the BJP and its senior leader Amit Shah.

The BJP also took a swipe at AAP over its Mohalla clinic, with a parody of a Bollywood movie song, claiming that all such health facilities that have been much touted by the AAP government are under lock and keys while the liquor shops are open and the Yamu-

Welfare pensions: Kerala govt sanctions ₹1,604cr

Thiruvananthapuram, Jan 20: The Left government in Kerala Monday sanctioned two instalments of welfare pensions to be distributed to the underprivileged sections of society.

Finance Minister KN Balagopal announced that ₹1,604 crore has been allocated for this purpose. Around 62 lakh beneficiaries will receive ₹3.200 each.

Beneficiaries will begin receiving their pensions starting Friday. New Delhi, Jan 20: Delhi experienced another warm day, with the maximum temperature settling five notches above normal at 24.5 degrees Celsius Monday.

The national capital's air quality remained 'very poor' despite a sunny day, with the 24-hour Air Quality Index (AQI) recorded at 314 at 4pm, according to Central Pollution Control Board data

An AQI between 0-50 is considered 'good', 51-100 'satisfactory'. 101-200 'moderate', 201-300 'poor', 301-400 'very poor' and 401-500 'severe'.

The city recorded a maximum temperature at 26.1 degrees Celsius January 19, marking the warmest January day in six years.

New Delhi, Jan 20: All such persons should be barred from contesting elections, the Supreme Court Monday remarked as it deferred to January 21 the hearing on a plea filed by former councillor and Delhi riots accused Tahir Hussain who has sought interim bail to campaign for the upcoming Delhi Assembly polls. A bench of Justices Pankaj Mithal and Ahsanuddin Amanullah adjourned the

hearing due to paucity of time but just as it was rising for the day, Hussain's lawyer mentioned the matter and requested for a hearing January 21.

"It is easy to win elections sitting in jail. All such persons should be barred from contesting the elections," the bench remarked in response. His lawyer submitted Hussain's nomination was

accepted. The Delhi High Court January 14 granted custody parole to Hussain to file nomination papers from the Mustafabad constituency on

an AIMIM ticket. It, however, refused his plea

for interim bail from January 14 to February 9 to fight the polls, saying the gravity of allegations against Hussain, being the main perpetrator in the violence, resulting in the death of several persons, could not be overlooked. The high court said about 11

FIRs were registered against him in connection with the riots and he was admittedly in custody in a related money laundering case and UAPA case.

The senior counsel counsel appearing for Hussain argued fighting elections was a complicated process, which required him to not only file his nomination by January 17 but also open a bank account and campaign.

Maintaining that contesting elections was not a fundamental right, the police had alleged that Hussain who was the "main conspirator" and "funder" of the February 2020 riots could complete formalities and fight polls on custody parole.

SC directs Atul Subhash's wife to produce minor son through VC

New Delhi: The Supreme Court Monday directed the wife of Bangalore-based engineer, who died by suicide last year, to produce their minor son before it. A bench of Justices BV Nagarathna and Satish Chandra Sharma told the lawyer appearing for Subhash's estranged wife Nikita Singhania to produce the child through video-conferencing. "This is a habeas corpus petition. We want to see the child. Produce the child," the bench said. The counsel appearing for Singhania said he would produce the child within 30 minutes. The top court would continue hearing the matter. The court was informed that the child dropped out of school in Haryana and was currently residing with the mother.

Decide Rajoana's mercy plea by March 18, SC asks Centre

New Delhi: The Supreme Court Monday asked the Centre to take a decision by March 18 on the mercy petition of death row convict Balwant Singh Rajoana, convicted in the 1995 assassination case of then Punjab chief minister Beant Singh. "We are granting you time by way of a last chance. Either you take a decision or otherwise we will hear it on merits, a bench of Justices BR Gavai, Prashant Kumar Mishra and KV Viswanathan told solicitor general Tushar Mehta, representing the Centre. The bench was hearing Rajoana's plea seeking directions to commute his death sentence to life term due to the "inordinate delay" in deciding his mercy plea

Yasin Malik trial: SC orders to ensure proper VC facilities in Jammu court

Dip at Sangam, 'yagya', attending to pilgrims

Akhadas are monastic institutions or sects that unite seers (ascetics) *under specific spiritual* traditions and practices

Mahakumbh Nagar (UP), Jan 20: Their barely-clad bodies smeared in ash and long hair in deadlocks, seers at the Maha Kumbh begin each dav at 4 am with a dip at the holy Sangam and a litany of rituals before proceeding to receive the pilgrims visiting them.

Life in the 'akhadas' for these seers involves a bevy of customs -- worship of their gurus, performing rituals such as

'yagya', meditation and evening prayers.

Depending on their following, most of their day is occupied by 'satsang', Bhagavad Gita 'path (recital)', singing 'kirtan (hymns)' and chanting mantras.

The rest of the time is spent attending to the pilgrims, who visit them either out of curiosity or faith.

"The idea behind our lives is not having greed. We lead simple lives. Here also, we wake up at 4 am and go for a 'snan (dip)' at the Sangam," Sawan Bharti, a seer from the Juna Akhada told PTI

"Once we come back, we have our rituals, we worship our gurus and gods, there are the yagya. There is a sea of



pilgrims who visit us to take 'dhuni (ash)'. In the evenings, we have prayers and then we sleep by midnight," he said.

He added their routine was more or less the same even in other places as well.

"We are in a sacred place and can take a bath at the Sangam.

We also attend rituals when new seers are taking 'diksha',' Bharti said

He explained that each seer had a job (assigned task) related to the akhadas -- from arranging meals, procuring items, cleaning the premises and preparing for the rituals.

During the Amrit Snan, the akhadas hold the privilege of taking the first holy dip, and their bathing sequence is determined by the Akhada Parishad, which allocates time slots based on hierarchy

Mounted on horses, with drums and cymbals, ash-smeared Naga sadhus carrying tridents and swords were the first to arrive at the Triveni Sangam and take a holy dip during the sacred 'Brahma Muhurta'

As they plunged into the water, their cries reverberated across the area marking the beginning of Amrit Snan, believed to cleanse a lifetime of sin

Akhadas are monastic institutions or sects that unite seers (ascetics) under specific spiritual traditions and practices.

The Juna Akhada is one of the oldest and largest among the 13 that are a part of the Maha Kumbh.

The 13 akhadas are divided into three groups -- Sanyasi (Shaivite), Bairagi (Vaishnav) and Udaseen.

Each akhada is allocated specific time slots for certain rituals, creating a vibrant atmosphere filled with processions featuring decorated elephants, horses and bands.

Mahant Vashishth from the Panchayati Akhada said each of their prayers were performed in a ritualistic manner.

New Delhi, Jan 20: Congress leader Rahul Gandhi has written to Union Health Minister JP Nadda and Delhi Chief Minister Atishi, flagging the plight of hundreds of patients and their family members huddled on the footpath and subway outside AIIMS here and sought concrete steps to resolve this "humanitarian crisis". The Leader of Opposition in

the Lok Sabha also urged the central government to take concrete steps to strengthen the public healthcare system in the upcoming budget and increase

the necessary resources for it. In a post in Hindi on X. Gandhi said, "I have written letters to the Chief Minister of Delhi and the Union Health Minister to provide better facilities to the patients and their families coming to Delhi AIIMS from all over the country."

"Recently I saw that in freez-



ing cold these people are forced to sleep in the subway under the metro station, where there is no provision of drinking water or a toilet. There are heaps of garbage lying around. The arrival of such a large number of patients to Delhi AIIMS also shows that people are not getting affordable and good quality health facilities where they live," Gandhi said.

"I hope that taking cognizance of my letter, the Chief Minister of Delhi and the Union Health Minister will take immediate steps to resolve this humanitarian crisis," he said. In his letter to Nadda, Gandhi said he wants to bring to his

attention "the distressing situation" outside AllMS, Delhi and went on to add that during

his recent visit to the area he was saddened to see hundreds of patients and their family members huddled on the footpath and in the subway in the bitter winter cold, with only thin blankets to protect them without drinking water or sanitation facilities.

"Many of these patients travel from across the country, spend their life savings. and wait for months on end for medical care at India's premier medical institution. I am

sure you will agree that no one should face such hardship, es pecially while already battling serious medical conditions, he said.

While AllMS Delhi delivers excellent and affordable care, the condition of patients and their families shows that health-care is still out of reach for crores of Indians, he said in his letter dated January 18.

"As public representatives, we must all work together to address these issues. I urge you to take immediate and timely steps to address the situation at AIIMS Delhi. The government of India should work with the AIIMS leadership, the Government of Delhi and charitable organizations to provide heating, bedding, water, and shelter to patients and expand permanent facilities for accommodation," Gandhi said in his letter to Nadda.

In addition, reducing the long wait times would help reduce patients' uncertainty, he said.

'Crucially, the larger system ic issue is that AIIMS Delhi is overburdened because crores of people do not have access to affordable and high-quality healthcare where they live. I urge you, as Health Minister, to recognise and address this systemic issue," Gandhi said.

As a first step, the new AllMS facilities across the country should be operationalised at the earliest, he said.

Rules under UCC

Dehradun, Jan 20: Uttarakhand Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami Monday said the rules under Uniform Civil Code (UCC) have been approved and the date of its implementation will be announced soon.

After chairing a state cabinet meeting, Dhami said that preparations for implementing the UCC in the state are almost complete.

'The training process for the UCC implementation is almost complete. During the cabinet meeting, we discussed implementing it as soon as possible. After reviewing everything, we will soon announce its implementation date.'

In December, Dhami had announced that UCC would be implemented in January. With municipal elections scheduled for January 23 and results expected January 25, speculation is rife that the governmnet might announce UCC implementation on Republic Day.

Responding to a question, the chief minister said that its implementation will bring a big change in the state. He added that his party had promised to bring UCC before the 2022 elections, and the process was initiated in the first cabinet meeting after assuming power.

He said, "We constituted an expert committee to draft the UCC, following which a bill was



passed in the state Assembly. The Chief Minister said the Governor and subsequently

the President gave the assent to the bill March 12, 2024 making it an Act. Uttarakhand is se to become the first state in in dependent India to implement uniform laws for all its citizens, he said. Dhami dismissed the Congress's allegations that UCC represents divisive politics, calling them baseless.

He said, "This is not any divi sive politics. UCC has a uniform system and uniform law for all.

The UCC includes detailed provisions related to marriage divorce, annulment of marriage willful and non-willful succes sion and live-in relationship Officials said to ensure seamless implementation of the state government has implemented state-of-the-art technology based arrangements, allowing citizens to access services conveniently.

A dedicated portal has been developed, providing an online platform for registration of mar riages, divorces, rights of suc cession, live-in relationship and their termination, they said.

Donald Trump, the oldest person in US history to be elected president, returns to power for a second term, four years after he left the *American capital as a pariah*

Washington, Jan 20: Donald Trump pledged to rescue America from what he described as vears of betraval and decline in his inaugural address Monday, prioritizing a crackdown on illegal immigration and portraying himself as a national savior chosen by God.

"First, I will declare a national emergency at our southern border," he said. "All illegal entry will be immediately halted and we will begin the process of returning millions and millions of criminal aliens back to the places from which they came.

The speech echoed many of the themes he sounded at his first inauguration in 2017 when he spoke darkly of the "American carnage" of crime and job loss that he said had ravaged the country.

Trump, 78, took the oath of office to "preserve, protect and defend" the US Constitution at 12:01 pm ET (17:01 GMT) inside the US Capitol, administered by Chief Justice John Roberts. His vice president, JD Vance,

was sworn in just before him. Trump will be the first felon to occupy the White House after a New York jury found him guilty of falsifying business records to cover up hush money paid to a porn star.

Trump intends to sign a raft of executive actions in his first hours as president, incoming White House officials said Monday, including 10 focused on border security and immigration, his top priority.

In addition to declaring an emergency, the president will send armed troops there and resume a policy forcing asylum seekers to wait in Mexico for their US court dates, officials told reporters.

He will also seek to end socalled birthright citizenship for US-born children whose parents lack legal status, a move some legal scholars have said would be unconstitutional.

The inauguration completes a triumphant comeback for a political disruptor who survived two impeachment trials, a felony conviction, two assassination attempts and an indictment for attempting to overturn his 2020 election loss. The ceremony was moved inside the Capitol due to the cold, four years after a mob of Trump supporters breached the building, a symbol of American democracy, in an unsuccessful effort to forestall Trump's loss to Democrat Joe Biden, 82.

Numerous tech executives who have sought to curry favor with the incoming administration - including the three richest men in the world, Tesla and SpaceX CEO Elon Musk, Amazon CEO Jeff Bezos and Meta CEO Mark Zuckerberg had prominent seats on stage, next to cabinet nominees and members of Trump's family.

Trump, the first US president since the 19th century to win a second term after losing the White House, has said he would pardon "on Day One" many of the more than 1,500 people charged in connection with the January 6, 2021, attack. He skipped Biden's inauguration and has continued to claim falsely that the 2020 election he lost to Biden was rigged.

Biden, in one of his last official acts, pardoned several people whom Trump has tar-

geted for retaliation, including former White House chief medical adviser Anthony Fauci, former Republican US Repre-

sentative Liz Cheney and former chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff General Mark Milley.

Trump ends CBP One, Biden-era border app that gave legal entry to 1 million migrants

The Trump administration Monday ended use of a border app called CBP One that has allowed nearly 1 million people to legally enter the United States with eligibility to work. A notice on the website of Customs and Border Protection Monday just after Trump was sworn in let users know that the app that had been used to allow migrants to schedule appointments at eight southwest border ports of entry is no longer available. The notice said that existing appointments have been cancelled. The move adheres to a promise Trump made during his campaign and will please critics who say it was an overly generous magnet for more people to come to Mexico's border with the United States. The CBP One app has been wildly popular. It is an online lottery system to give appointments to 1,450 people a day at eight border crossings. They enter on immigration "parole," a presidential authority that Joe Biden used more than any other president since it was introduced in 1952.

Trump to withdraw from Paris climate agreement once again

President Donald Trump will once again withdraw the United States from the Paris climate deal, the White House said Monday, removing the world's biggest historic emitter from global efforts to fight climate change for the second time in a decade. The decision would place the United States alongside Iran, Libya and Yemen as the only countries in the world outside the 2015 pact in which governments agreed to limit global warming to 1.5 degrees Celsius above pre-industrial levels to avoid the worst impacts of climate change. The announcement, in a document from the White House, reflects Trump's skepticism about global warming, which he has called a hoax, and fits in with his broader agonda to unfotter U.S. oil and gas drillers from regulation so

Iran sentences pop singer to death for 'insulting' Prophet Muhammed

Tehran: An Iranian court has sentenced popular singer Amir Hossein Magh-soudloo, known as Tataloo, to death on appeal after he was convicted of blasphemy, local media reported Sunday. "The Supreme Court accepted the pros

ecutor's objection" to a previous five-year jail term on offences including blasphemy, reformist newspaper Etemad reported online. It said "the case was reopened, and this time the defendant was sentenced to death for insulting the prophet", referring to Islam's Prophet Mohammed. The report added that the verdict was not final and can still be appealed. The 37-year-old underground musician had been living in Istanbul since 2018 before Turkish police handed him over to Iran in December 2023. He has been in detention in Iran since then.



China executes two men involved in deadly social revenge killings

Beijing: Chinese authorities Monday executed two men who were involved in carrying out deadly social revenge killings with a car and knife last year, according to a media report. The authorities Monday executed a 62-year-old man who drove his car into people exercising outside a stadium last year, killing 35 people and injuring over 40, the report said. Fan Weiqiu, who was stated to be angry over the division of the prop

Signs of rising asset quality stress spook bank stocks



Mumbai, Jan 20: The stock prices of Indian private lenders that have reported an increase in bad loans in their personal loans and micro-credit businesses are bearing the brunt of investors' fears of a U-turn in the asset-quality cycle for the country's banks.

RBL Bank's shares fell as much as 5.8% Monday after the lender reported a near 28% sequential jump in quarterly slippages, or loans that were classified as non-performing for the first time.

Axis Bank, India's third-largest private bank, forecast retail asset quality would take a few more quarters to normalise. Its stock sank 4.5% Friday and dropped a further 1.1% Monday. Kotak Mahindra Bank, however, gained 9% after reporting lower slippages than the previous quarter, although it also

warned that the stress in parts of its loan book would persist. Indian banks are grappling with rising bad loans, particularly in sectors such as microfinance, credit cards and personal loans. Analysts have attributed this to over-lever-

aging and an increase in loans outstanding per borrower. The rise in delinquencies has



forced lenders to allocate more funds for potential losses and pare back loan growth in these segments, which, in turn, hurts profitability.

'The sign of stress that is visible across microfinance and unsecured loans is a mild symptom of a tougher macro environment," said Kranthi Bathini, director of equity strategy at Wealthmills Securities. "That is largely because

banks are conservative towards loan growth, which coupled with tighter liquidity conditions, could mean that an economic recovery could be prolonged." RBL Bank -- over 50% of

whose slippages came from credit cards and microfinance loans -- should start seeing a

normalisation in asset quality in the unsecured segment latest by July-September, CEO R Subramaniakumar said on a post-earnings call.

Kotak's gross non-performing assets ratio worsened slightly at the end of December and the lender said it would be cautious about unsecured loans going forward

The stress "will take a couple of quarters to normalise," starting only from April-June, CEO Ashok Vaswani said at a media conference Saturday.

Banks' gross NPA (non-performing asset) ratio could rise to 3% by the end of March 2026, from a 12-year low of 2.6% last September, the central bank said in its Financial Stability Report in December.

NCLT orders liquidation of Go First

New Delhi, Jan 20: The National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT) Monday ordered the liquidation of Go First, the budget carrier that stopped flying nearly two years ago amid financial woes.

In May 2023, the airline filed for a voluntary insolvency resolution process

The tribunal, in a 15-page order, said it is ordering the liquidation of the corporate debtor Go Airlines (India) Ltd.

On Monday, the NCLT said the Committee of Creditors (CoC) in the legislative scheme is empowered to take the decision to liquidate the corporate debtor, at any time after its constitution and before confirmation of the resolution plan.

"It is well settled that the decision taken by the CoC for liquidation in commercial wisdom of the CoC should not be interfered with by the Adjudicating Authority. Further, the resolution for liquidation of the corporate debtor was approved by the CoC with 100 per cent voting. Therefore, this Adjudicating Authority sees no merit in interfering with the commercial wisdom of the CoC," it noted.

The order comes a little over two months after the Supreme Court, on November 7, 2024 ordered the liquidation of the once-storied airline Jet Airways, which had stopped flying in April 2019.

Go Air, which was rebranded as Go First, flew for more than



17 years before suspending operations on May 3, 2023.

Dinkar Tiruvannadapuram Venkatasubramanian has been appointed as the liquidator.

The liquidator has been asked to follow up and continue to investigate the financial affairs of the corporate debtor. "The liquidator shall also follow up the pending applications for their disposal during the process of liquidation, including the initiation of steps for recovery of dues of the corporate debtor as

per law," according to the order. Further, the liquidator should submit a preliminary report to the tribunal within 75 days from the date of commencement of the liquidation.

During the insolvency resolution process, there were at least two bidders in the fray --Busy Bee Airways, along with SpiceJet chief Ajay Singh, and Sharjah-based aviation entity Sky One. Travel portal EaseMy-Trip's Co-Founder Nishant Pitti was the majority shareholder

in Busy Bee Airways. In between, aviation regula-

tor DGCA deregistered the 54 aircraft of Go First. The resolution process did not take off, and now, the tribunal has ordered the liquidation of the airline. The cash-starved air line reported a loss in the range of ₹1,800 crore, including an ₹800 crore notional loss due to accounting standards in the fi nancial year ended March 2023

It started domestic opera tions in 2005-06 with the first flight from Mumbai to Ahmedabad. and then in 2018-19 launched international opera tions. Since commencing operations, Go First had placed two orders for 72 A320 neo planes each with Airbus, one in 2011-12 and another in 2016-17.

On May 13, 2021, when the coronavirus pandemic headwinds were blowing strong, the airline announced rebranding itself as 'Go First' with a focus on an ultra-low-cost business model.

IDBI Bank reports 31% rise in profit

New Delhi: IDBI Bank Mondav reported a 31 per cent growth in net profit to ₹1,908 crore in the December quarter on lower provisioning and better interest income. The LIC-controlled bank reported a net profit of ₹1,458 crore in the year-ago period. The bank's total income increased to ₹8,565 crore during the quarter under review from ₹7,514 crore in the same period last year, IDBI Bank said in a regulatory filing. The bank's interest income improved during the third guarter of the current fiscal year to ₹7.816 crore, as against ₹6,541 crore a vear ago. The net interest income improved to ₹4,228 crore as against ₹3,435 crore in Q3 of FY24.

The gross NPA ratio improved to 3.57 per cent as on December 31, 2024, as against 4.69 per cent as on December 31, 2023.

IOB profit up 21% as NPAs decline

New Delhi: State-owned Indian Overseas Bank (IOB) Monday reported a 21 per cent rise in net profit at ₹874 crore for the third guarter ended December 2024 on the back of a reduction in bad loans. The Chennaibased lender had earned a net profit of ₹723 crore in the same quarter a year ago. Total income increased to ₹8.409 crore during the quarter under review from ₹7,437 crore in the same period last year, IOB said in a regulatory filing. Operating profit of the bank improved to ₹2.266 crore as against ₹1.780 crore in December 2023. Interest income also rose to ₹7.112 crore over ₹6,176 crore for the quarter ended December 2023. On the asset quality front, the bank's gross NPAs declined to 2.55 per cent of gross loans by the end of December 2024 from 3.90 per cent a year ago.

Billionaire wealth soars three times faster in 2024: Oxfam

Davos, Jan 20: Billionaire wealth across the globe surged by USD 2 trillion in 2024 to USD 15 trillion at a rate three times faster than the previous year, a study showed Monday here as the richest of the world began to assemble for their annual jamboree in this ski resort town.

In its flagship inequity report released every year on the first day of the World Economic Forum Annual Meeting, Oxfam International contrasted the huge jump in the billionaire wealth with the number of people living in poverty barely having changed since 1990. Wealth of billionaires in

In its report titled 'Takers, not Makers', Oxfam said the richest 1 per cent in the Global North extracted USD 30 million an hour from the Global South through the financial systems in 2023. It further said that 60 per cent of billionaire wealth is now derived from inheritance, monopoly power or crony connections, showing that "extreme billionaire wealth is largely unmerited.

The rights group urged governments across the world to tax the richest to reduce inequality, end extreme wealth. and dismantle the new aristocracy. It also sought that the former colonial powers must address past harms with rep-Asia increased by USD 299 bilarations.

Oxfam International's Executive Director Amitabh Behar told PTI here that the new inequality report shows there is an enormous explosion in the billionaire wealth and this is more worrisome due to the growing number of people living with hunger.



This only flags the issue of modern day colonialism in the form of multinational corporates grabbing a huge portion of wealth being created, he said. Behar said Oxfam is strongly pitching for taxing super-rich more and welcomed the growing traction across the world for taxing the wealthiest more. Even bodies like IMF

and World Bank are expressing concern about this level of inequality, he added.

On India and his expectations from the union budget, he said the government must try to address the issue of inequality including by way of much more progressive taxing and more investments in education, among other measures.

A lot of people believed that colonialism ended long back but the fact is it is thriving even today in the form of wealth going out from Global South to the

richest of the Global North.

The billionaire's wealth grew in 2024 at an average of USD 5.7 billion a day, while the number of billionaires rose to 2,769, from 2.565 in 2023.

The wealth of the world's ten richest men grew on average by almost USD 100 million a day even if they lost 99 per cent of their wealth overnight, they would remain billionaires. Oxfam said. Oxfam. whose annual inequity report is debated extensively at WEF Annual Meeting, said that contrary to the popular perception, billionaire wealth is largely unearned -- 60 per cent of billionaire wealth now comes from inheritance, monopoly power or crony connections. Citing Forbes data, it said the largest annual increase in billionaire wealth occurred in 2021 at USD 5.8 trillion, during the COVID-19 pandemic, and termed the USD 2 tril lion surge in 2024 as the second highest

It said that 60 per cent of billionaire wealth is either from crony or monopolistic sources or inherited -- 36 per cent inherited, 18 per cent from monopoly power, and 6 per cent from crony connections.

Oxfam further cited ILO to say that women in the information economy are more often found in the most vulnerable situa tions, for instance as domestic workers, home-based workers or contributing family workers than their male counterparts.

ILO data also shows that mi grant workers in high-income countries earn about 12.6 per cent less than nationals, on average. Oxfam said.

The pay gap between men nationals and migrant wom en in high-income countries is estimated at 20.9 per cent, which is much wider than the aggregate gender pay gap in high-income countries (16.2 per cent), it added.



Manchester, Jan 20: Manchester United manager Ruben Amorim labeled his side possibly the worst in the club's history after a 10th Premier League defeat of the season at home by Brighton & Hove Albion Sunday. United's 3-1 defeat leaves them

in 13th place in the standings and on course for their lowest finish in the Premier League. Brighton cruised to victory

and United have now managed 11 points from a possible 33 since Amorim joined from Sporting in November. It is the first time since 1989-90 that they have lost 10 of their first 22 games of the league season.

'Imagine what this is (like) for a fan of Manchester United. Imagine what this is (like) for me," Amorim told Sky Sports.

We are getting a new coach that is losing more than the last coach (Erik ten Hag). I have full knowledge of that.

"(But) I am not going to change, no matter what. I know we can succeed, but we need to survive this moment. Because I'm not naive and I know that we need to survive now.

"We are being the worst team, maybe, in the history of Manchester United. I know that you want headlines, but I'm saying that because we have to acknowledge that and to change that. Here you go, your headlines.'

The 20-times English champions are as close to the relegation zone as the top eight with 26 points from 22 games. Their worst finish in the Premier League era was last season when they ended in eighth.

Monday. Hamilton is gearing up for his inaugural season with the legendary team, Ferrari, having made the switch from Mercedes to replace Carlos Sainz and partner Charles Leclerc.

Hamilton posted another update, featuring a photo of him standing outside the factory in a sharp all-black suit, alongside a Ferrari F40 sports car. The British driver expressed gratitude for achieving his dream of racing for Ferrari.

This week, Hamilton is expected to complete various pre-season tasks at Maranello, including meeting team members and conducting simulator work, ahead of his first, vet-tobe-confirmed, run in a Ferrari

F1 car. Hamilton finished the last Formula 1 season behind Mercedes teammate George Russell at seventh place with 223 points including two race wins in British GP and Belgian GP. Hamilton drove his final race with Mercedes at the Abu Dhabi Grand Prix last month and finished fourth ahead of Russell to end his 11-year-long association with the Silver Arrows.

The 18-year-old Andrea Kimi Antonelli will fill Hamilton's shoes at Mercedes for the upcoming season with Valtteri Bottas in reserve.

First professional woman speed skater eyes Winter Olympics

New Delhi, Jan 20: Indian skater Shruti Kotwal has set her sights on the Asian Winter Games (AWG) in Harbin, China, next month as a platform to qualify for the 2026 Winter Olympics to be held in Italy.

Kotwal, who is training in the United States, will be leading the country's 41-member athlete contingent in the AWG to be held from February 7 to 14.

Kotwal said the AWG will be a big opportunity for her to test herself against the best



skaters in the world. I'm focusing on the 500m and 1000m events for Olym-

pic qualification. The timing requirements are incredibly challenging - sub-40 seconds

for the 500m and under 120 for the 1000m. My Indian national record is 41.97 seconds and I need to skate under 40 seconds to qualify, Kotwal told SAI Media

This will be Kotwal's second appearance in the AWG after 2017, when the Asian meet was held in Japan.

Countries like South Korea, Japan, and China consistently produce strong skaters who are technically and physically exceptional. I've faced some of these competitors in previous events and understand their strengths. It's a tough field,

said the 33-year-old from Pune. Several Indian speed skaters are training in Korea for AWG and contestants from at least 24 nations are expected to take part in the continental event.

Kotwal said the Khelo India Winter Games have been an ideal platform for skaters aspiring to make a mark at the international level.

Khelo India Winter Games brings everybody together. It really helps to promote the sport. We didn't have that when we started and I think the skaters now are very lucky, said Kotal.
