#### Odisha tops NITI Aayog's fiscal health index

New Delhi, Jan 24: Mineral-rich Odisha, Chhattisgarh, Goa and Jharkhand have emerged as top-performing 'achievers' among the states listed in NITI Aayog's first Fiscal Health Index (FHI) report released Friday

The report titled 'Fiscal Health Index 2025' covers 18 maior states that drive the Indian economy in terms of their contribution to the GDP, demography, total public expenditure, revenues, and overall fiscal

According to the report, Punjab, Andhra Pradesh, West Bengal, and Kerala were worst-performing states in FHI, each facing significant fiscal challenges.

The report which aims to evolve an understanding of the fiscal health of states has listed Maharashtra, Uttar Pradesh, Telangana, Madhya Pradesh and Karnataka under 'front-runners' category. As per the report, released by Chairman of 16th Finance Commission Arvind Panagariya, Odisha excels in fiscal health with the highest overall index score of 67.8. It tops the debt index (99.0) and debt sustainability (64.0) rankings with better than average scores under quality of expenditure and revenue mobilisation, the report said, adding that Odisha has maintained low fiscal deficits, a good debt profile, and an above average capital outlay/GSDP ratio.

#### State Budget to focus on industry, tourism, jobs: CM

Bhubaneswar, Jan 24: Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Friday said the state Budget will prioritise industry, tourism and fill vacant government

In a pre-Budget consultation meeting attended by former finance ministers, financial experts and association representatives, Majhi emphasised creating a 'people's Budget with focus on strengthening the rural economy.

He invited public suggestions via email, WhatsApp, and social media by January 31.

Majhi said key sectors under focus include steel, IT, renewable energy, textile, petrochemicals, agro-industries, and portbased industries.

"The industry sector, espe cially agro-industry, is critical to improving the socio-economic condition of rural Odisha,' he said. The state Cabinet re cently approved the 'Viksit Gaon, Viksit Odisha' scheme, aimed at creating sustainable income sources in villages to reduce migration to urban areas

#### **Judge blocks Trump's** order restricting birthright citizenship

Seattle, Jan 24: A federal judge blocked Donald Trump's administration Thursday from implementing the Republican president's executive order curtailing the right to automatic birthright citizenship in the United States, calling it 'blatantly unconstitutional.'

Seattle-based US District Judge John Coughenour issued a temporary restraining order at the urging of four Democratic-led states - Washington, Arizona, Illinois and Oregon - preventing the administration from enforcing the order. Trump had signed the order Monday, his first day back in office. The judge, an appointee of Republican former President Ronald Reagan, dealt the first legal setback to the hardline policies on immigration that are a centerpiece of Trump's second term as president.

"Obviously we'll appeal," Trump said of Coughenour's ruling. Trump's executive order had directed US agencies to refuse to recognize the citizenship of children born in the United States if neither their mother nor father is a US citizen or lawful permanent resident.

# Biz growth at 14-month low

Bangalore, Jan 24: India's

business activity grew at the

slowest pace in 14 months in

India's private sector entered the new year with a decelerated growth trend amid a diminished momentum in the services sector and a slow rate of new business intake. The services sector serves as the primary driver of the Indian economy, but recent data has sparked worries about the sustainability of the country's economic performance. According to HSBC's flash India Composite Purchasing Managers' Index, compiled by S&P Global, the overall private sector output expanded at its slowest pace since November 2023. The data indicated a decline in the services sector which offset a strong growth in the manufacturing sector for the month. On top of this. prices for goods and services continued to surge, driven especially by increasing input costs. Meanwhile, government projections indicate a slowdown in the overall growth. forecasting a GDP increase of just 6.4 per cent for this fiscal. All these point to tough times ahead for the economy.

January, a survey showed, highlighting emerging cracks in its world-beating economic growth at start of 2025 although firms hired new staff at a record pace. HSBC's flash India Composite Purchasing Managers' Index, compiled by S&P Global, fell to 57.9 in January, the lowest reading since November 2023, from December's final reading of 59.2. Still, the index has been

above the 50-mark separating expansion from contraction for three-and-a-half years, the longest continuous growth streak since mid-2013. While manufacturing remained buoyant with the PMI index at a six-month high of 58.0 from 56.4 in December, it was more-than-offset by the slump in the services index to 56.8 in January - its lowest in 26 months - from 59.3.

"India's manufacturing sector started the year strong, with output and new orders bouncing back from a relatively weak third



fiscal quarter," noted Praniul Bhandari, chief India economist at HSBC. "The cooling in growth in new domestic business in the services sector, however, highlights a potentially emerging weak spot in the economy."

This divergence was starkly evident in the indicators for demand. Manufacturers witnessed a surge in new orders and output, while services firms recorded the weakest new sales in 14 months.

Despite those headwinds there were some bright spots. International demand improved across the board with overall exports posting the fastest growth in six months.

Composite job creation reached an all-time high since the survey's inception in December 2005. That's good news for the private sector where millions join the workforce each year in the world's most populous country. Providing quality jobs remains a challenge for Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

However, inflationary pressures intensified. Cost inflation eased in manufacturing, but spiked in the services sector to the highest since August 2023. Services firms increased prices faster, suggesting they passed on rising costs to clients.

High inflation risks espe cially amid a weaker currency could add to reasons for the Re serve Bank of India's rate-setting panel, headed by new Governor Sanjay Malhotra, not to kickstart monetary policy easing when it meets next during February 5-7. Meanwhile, the business outlook for the coming year was mixed as buoyant forecasts put manufacturing companies at their most optimistic since May 2024, but the sentiment at services firms slipped to a three-month low due to competition concerns.

# blast leaves 8 dead

Bhandara, Jan 24: Eight workers were killed and five others injured as a blast ripped through a unit of the ordnance factory in eastern Maharashtra's Bhandara district Friday morning, officials said.

At the completion of rescue operations after nearly eight hours, the final death toll stood at eight, said a district official.

"Ordnance Factory Bhandara has constituted an inquiry committee to conduct a probe into the incident," the factory said in a statement late in the evening. The impact of the blast was

so powerful that the building where it took place was completely destroyed. Residents of three villages in the vicinity felt the ground shaking, said a local man whose 20-year-old cousin was among the deceased. Pictures taken immediate-

ly after the explosion showed a huge cloud of smoke rising above the site.

## 250mn kids missed school last year due to extreme weather

Extreme weather events exacerbated by climate change had a huge toll on schoolchildren across the world last year, with at least 250 million kids missing classes, the United Nations Children's Fund said in its latest report. At least one in seven school-going children across the world was kept out of classroom at some point in 2024 because of climate hazards such as heatwaves and flooding. In India, over 5 crore school students were affected by grueling and unprecedented heatwave in 2024. The UN body says that the world's school education system is largely ill-equipped to deal with the effects of extreme weather.

Cape Town, Jan 24: At least 242 million children in 85 countries had their schooling interrupted last year because of heatwaves, cyclones, flooding and other extreme weather, the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) said in a new report Friday.

The report also outlined how some countries saw hundreds of their schools destroyed by weather, with low-income nations in Asia and sub-Saharan Africa hit especially hard.

But other regions weren't spared the extreme weather, as torrential rains and floods in Italy near the end of the year disrupted school for more than



900,000 children. Thousands had their classes halted after catastrophic flooding in Spain.

While southern Europe dealt with deadly floods and Asia and Africa had flooding and cyclones, heatwaves were "the predominant climate hazard shuttering schools last year,' UNICEF said, as the earth recorded its hottest year ever.

More than 118 million children had their schooling interrupted in April alone, UNICEF said, as large parts of the Middle East and Asia, from Gaza in the west to the Philippines in the southeast, experienced a sizzling weeks-long heatwave with temperatures soaring above 40 degrees Celsius (104 Fahrenheit).

"Children are more vulnerable to the impacts of weather-related crises, including stronger and more frequent heatwaves, storms, droughts and flooding," UNICEF executive director Catherine Russell said in a statement.

"Children's bodies uniquely vulnerable. They heat up faster, they sweat less efficiently, and cool down more slowly than adults. Children cannot concentrate in class-

rooms that offer no respite from sweltering heat, and they cannot get to school if the path is flooded, or if schools are washed away.'

Around 74% of the children affected in 2024 were in middle- and low-income countries. showing how climatic extremes continue to have a devastating impact in the poorest countries Flooding ruined more than 400 schools in Pakistan in April Afghanistan had heatwaves followed by severe flooding that destroyed over 110 schools in May, UNICEF said.

Months of drought in southern Africa exacerbated by the El Niño weather phenomenon threatened the schooling and futures of millions of children.

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
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



"The Odisha government today began a survey under the PMAY-G from the land of Lord Jagannath. All the eligible persons will get their desired houses," Naik said.



"It is painful to see that the poorest of the poor families were denied a PMAY house unit during the previous BJD government," the Minister said.

The Minister said the eligibility criteria for availing the benefits under the scheme have been relaxed.

The family income limit has been increased to ₹15,000 per month, Naik said, adding that individuals who are separated from their families, like father and son or husband and wife, can also be accommodated in the survey.

Families with two-wheelers, refrigerators and landline telephones can also be included in the survey.

People can apply for a housing unit under the scheme through online and offline modes, the Minister said. "People can forward their application through their panchayat or a mobile application." Naik said.

The government has also removed the application fees in a bid to ensure maximum registration of beneficiaries, he said.

People who had earlier applied and are still waiting for allot-

ment of houses can also apply again, he said.

Earlier, the Minister had informed the Assembly that about 50,963 applications will be considered in a new survey.

He had said that 28.25 lakh houses have been approved under the scheme, while around 23 lakh homes have been constructed. Naik said families whose houses were damaged in fire mishaps, elephant attacks or other natural disasters will be covered under the Antyodaya Gruha Yojana. "If any eligible household is left out during the survey for PMAY-G, it will be included in the Antyodaya Gruha Yojana." he said

# Odisha man arrested in Delhi over ₹15cr scam

New Delhi/Bhubaneswar, Jan 24: A 48-year-old man from Odisha, accused of duping people of ₹15 crore by promising them to provide work orders for transportation of Covid vaccines across different states during 2021 Covid pandemic, has been arrested by the Economic Offences Wing (EOW) of the Delhi Police, an official said Friday.

The arrested accused –Prafulla Kumar Nayak – resided in Pandav Nagar area of Delhi and hailed from

According to Additional Commissioner of Police (EOW) Amrutha Guguloth, the crackdown came while

investigating a case registered in 2022 following a complaint by Sunil Kaushik.

"The complainant alleged that he was defrauded of ₹4 crore under the pretext of securing government contracts for vaccine trans-

portation," Guguloth said, adding that four more complaints revealed a similar modus operandi, with the accused collectively duping victims of over ₹15 crore.

Investigations revealed that Nayak, who impersonated an officer from the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, played a key role in duping victims by promising work orders related to Covid-19 vaccine transpor-

tation during the pandemic, Guguloth said.

"In May 2021, the accused lured victims by arranging meetings within the premises of Nirman Bhawan, the Ministry's headquarters. Forged work orders were issued and trust was gained by leveraging illicit access to the government complex through a bribed Ministry employee," the officer said. "Eight other accused, including the kingpin, Hermenn Sabherwal, were arrested in 2022. Ministry employees, including a reception officer and two multi-tasking staff, had already been apprehended for their involvement," the officer said in the statement.

Nayak had been absconding since then. "Due to the strenuous efforts of the EOW, he was finally arrested January 21." Guguloth pointed out.

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# **Six-lane NH still a distant dream** in Odisha's commercial corridor

Berhampur, Jan 24: The six-laning of the 110 km stretch on NH 16 between Tangi-Chandpur by-pass and Berhampur is still to be explored, despite the fact that traffic on the key commercial corridor of the state has grown exponentially over

Experts say given the daily increase in the volume of heavily loaded goods carriers, buses, private vehicles and small segment vehicles it has become not only a matter of convenience but also a necessity for the transport department to keep a check on the number of road accidents on the stretch through the much-needed expansion.

Bhubaneswar and Berhampur lie along the stretch of NH 16 passing through the state. And since both cities are growing commercially, transportation and commuting are on the rise on this route as well.

The National Highways Au-

the line of sight and visibility of the drivers.

However, a similar expansion failed to take off on the Tangi-Chandpur by-pass and Berhampur stretch on the highway. From the safety of journey point of view, road accidents can be minimised only when the vehicles have a wider drivable area so that there can be enough space between them to avoid a collision. Although there are flyovers already in place at various critical junctions through the route, some junctions between Chhatrapur and Berhampur still need to have flyovers in view of the repeated occurrence of fatal

Experts say now that much time has already elapsed for six-laning, taking traffic volume into consideration, construction of a separate expressway from Cuttack/Bhubaneswar to Berhampur would be a better option.

## NIT-R develops AI- powered traffic solution

Rourkela, Jan 24: Researchers at National Institute of Technology Rourkela (NIT-R) have developed an AI-based multi-class vehicle detection (MCVD) model and a light fusion bi-directional feature pyramid network (LFB-FPN) tool aimed at improving traffic management in developing countries.

Led by Prof Santos Kumar Das, Associate Professor, Department of Electronics & Communication Engineering (ECE), the research team has leveraged an intelligent vehicle detection (IVD) system, which uses computer vision to identify vehicles in images and videos. This system collects real-time traffic data to optimise traffic flow, reduce congestion, and aid in future road planning.

The findings of this research have been published in the prestigious journal, IEEE Transactions on Intelligent Transportation Systems, in a paper co-authored by Dr Santos Kumar Das, with his research scholars Prashant Deshmukh, Krishna Chaitanva Ravasam, along with Prof Upendra Kumar Sahoo from ECE, NIT Rourkela, and



Prof Sudhan Majhi, from IISc Bangalore.

IVD systems perform well in developed countries with organised traffic, but in a country like India it faces problems where there are a wide variety of vehicles—from cars and trucks to cycles, rickshaws, animal carts and pedestrians—often operating in proximity, making accurate vehicle detection difficult.

Traditional IVD and light detection and ranging (LiDAR), are effective in controlled environments, but struggle in adverse weather conditions such as dust or rain, and are also expensive. Video-based systems are good for India. but traditional video processing techniques struggle with fast-moving traffic and demand significant computational

Deep learning (DL) models, a type of Artificial Intelligence (AI), provide an efficient way to detect vehicles in video feeds. These models use convolutional neural networks (CNNs) to identify and analyse traffic images. However, they often fail to accurately detect vehicles of varying sizes and angles, particularly in busy, mixed-traffic environments. Additionally, there is a lack of labeled datasets designed for such complex conditions.

To address these challenges, Prof Santos Kumar Das and his team developed the new MCVD model, which uses video deinterlacing network (VDnet) to efficiently extract key features

vehicles vary in size and shape They also introduced a specialised tool called light fusion bi-directional feature pyramid network (LFBFPN) to further refine the extracted details.

Explaining Prof. Das, said, "What makes LFBFPN unique is that it uses a simpler method without sacrificing its accuracy then processing it through vehicle detection head (MVDH) which helps it accurately detect and classify vehicles in all kinds of traffic situations."

The MCVD model demon strates an accuracy improve ment compared to existing methods. The team tested the model using the heterogeneous traffic labeled dataset (HTLD) which includes data from sev eral cities across India and is available for public use. The model's real-time performance was also evaluated on the Nvidia Jetson TX2.

Prof Das added, "By overcoming the limitations of old er models and addressing the unique challenges of mixed traffic, the MCVD model offers a scalable option for real-time vehicle detection in developing countries.'

## Changing address of house sparrows: A struggle for survival

Mahakalapada, Jan 24: Rapid urbanization, coupled with climate change, environimbalance, mental natural disasters and deforestation, has drastically altered the habitat of house sparrows in areas under this block in Kendrapara district.

chirping of sparrows was believed to bring good luck, and their lively sounds uplifted the mood in villages. Long ago, these birds roamed the



skies freely, forming strong ties with their surroundings. Now, with thatched roofs replaced by concrete structures, their habitat is under threat. Amid the

sparrows are seen gathering sticks and twigs to build nests in risky and unnatural locations. Near the Hanuman Temple on the main road at Mahakalapada, sparrows have created nests in-

side an electric transformer near the Gobari River. Their choice reflects the desperation and the dangers to their lives, as these unstable dwellings could collapse or pose immediate threats.

Local bird enthusiast and environmentalist Subas Chandra Swain recalls that during the 1990s, sparrows were abundant in village homes with thatched roofs. "Their chirping was a morning symphony, and they played a crucial role in maintaining ecological balance. Feed ing on seeds, insects, worms rice grains, mustard seeds, and chickpeas, these birds helped control pests and pollinate crops," Swain points out.

The widespread use of pesticides in agriculture, urbanisation, and proliferation of concrete jungles has significantly contributed to the decline of sparrow populations. "If no immediate steps are taken to protect these birds, they may soon exist only in pictures," Swain

As sparrows struggle to survive, the need for human intervention has become critical. Restoring their habitats and reducing harmful practices could pave the way for their revival. 'Let's ensure future generations hear their cheerful chirping rather than mourn their loss, Swain adds.

## Lessons from Argentina

rgentina has sparked a global conversation with its decision to introduce a mandatory 'suitability test' for 40,000 public servants, a move aimed at streamlining government operations. Announced by Presidential spokesperson Manuel Adorni, the policy mandates that employees on temporary contracts pass an online examination to retain their positions. This initiative is part of President Javier Milei's broader effort to reduce fiscal deficits and enhance governmental efficiency.

The policy has received significant praise from figures like Elon Musk, who lauded the focus on government downsizing, and US President Donald Trump, who commended Milei as a "strong leader." However, it has also raised questions about its implications if introduced in other countries, including India.

In India, the general public perception of babus is far from flattering. Public servants are often criticized as arrogant, corrupt, and indifferent to citizens' needs. Despite some exceptions, this stereotype persists, eroding trust in government institutions. Introducing aptitude tests could address these concerns by holding public servants accountable and ensuring they possess the skills necessary for their roles.

However, the implications of such a policy in India would be significant. Regular assessments could improve performance and public trust, ensuring that only competent individuals remain in service. But the logistics of implementing a standardized testing mechanism in a vast bureaucracy would be daunting. Also, tying job security to periodic evaluations might create stress and resentment among employees, potentially affecting productivity.

Of course, the babus themselves can be expected to resist any such move. The civil service unions and political entities are likely to push back against such reforms, citing risks of politicization and favouritism in the testing process, even though it will be widely welcomed by the public as a much-needed measure to rein in the powerful babus.

The sheer scale of India's administrative apparatus, coupled with entrenched attitudes and political complexities, makes this a challenging proposition. However, if implemented thoughtfully, such reforms could transform how public servants are perceived, bridging the trust gap between the government and its citizens.

#### Whistleblowers or scapegoats?

It's not every day that an anti-corruption investigation makes headlines for all the wrong reasons. In Jammu and Kashmir, three officers of the Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) have been reassigned to the home department, raising quite a few eyebrows. Why? Because they were investigating allegations of large-scale corruption in the Srinagar Smart Cities Mission.

This reshuffle comes just days after one of the officers, SP Abdul Wahid Shah, went public with claims of major irregularities in the project's execution. According to Shah, top officials in the Srinagar



Smart City Limited (SSCL) — the special purpose vehicle set up to implement the mission — were found with assets that didn't match their declared incomes. The ACB even registered a case under the Prevention of Corruption Act and carried out searches at multiple locations. So far, so good, right?

Enter the twist: Instead of applauding the officers for doing their job, the administration decided to send them packing. Former Chief Minister Mehbooba Mufti didn't mince words, calling it a case of "punishing the whistleblower."

The bigger picture here is troubling. The Smart Cities Mission, launched with much fanfare in 2015, was supposed to transform cities like Srinagar. But if allegations of misappropriation and substandard materials are true, the whole project risks becoming another cautionary tale of big promises and poor execution.

Mufti also touched on a deeper issue — the misuse of investigative agencies as tools to silence dissent rather than root out corruption. If this trend continues, it's not just the whistleblowers but the public who lose out. Accountability, it seems, is becoming a rare commodity.

What's worse? Moves like this reinforce the perception that public servants who dare to challenge the status quo do so at their peril. If whistleblowers are punished, who's going to stick their neck out

#### A calculated gamble or insider confidence!

The recent resignation of Shivdeep Waman Rao Lande, an IPS officer of the 2006 batch, has sparked widespread speculation. His decision to step down as IG of the Police Training Centre, Patna, citing personal reasons, is being widely interpreted as a precursor to a political debut. With Bihar's Assembly elections just around the corner, Lande is rumoured to be aligning himself with the Jan Suraj Party, helmed by Prashant Kishor.

This isn't the first time a bureaucrat has swapped the comfort of administrative corridors for the rough-and-tumble of electoral politics. Ambitious civil servants have often gravitated toward established political powerhouses like the BJP or Congress, drawn by the promise of a ready platform and a robust organizational structure. However, Lande's rumoured move to join a fledgling party—one that, despite its founder's larger-than-life reputation, remains an untested entity raises eyebrows. Is this simply a leap of faith, or does Lande know something the aam public doesn't?

It's worth noting that Prashant Kishor himself has a quasi-bureaucratic background, having worked with the United Nations before carving a niche as India's most sought-after political strategist. His transition from international bureaucracy to political manoeuvring mirrors, in some ways, the path that Lande now seems to be consid-

What makes Lande's choice particularly intriguing is the timing and the context. Bihar's political landscape is notoriously complex, and the Jan Suraj Party's grassroots experiment is still in its infancy. Whether Lande's gamble will pay off or add him to the growing list of babus whose political careers failed to take off remains to be seen. For now, it's a bold move, one that reflects the evolving aspirations

member states unanimously pledged to work toward "peace and prosperity for people and the planet" by meeting 17 Sustainable Development Goals by 2030. Although the agenda was unprecedented in its ambition end hunger, slash inequality, spur economic growth, achieve gender equality, arrest climate change, and ensure access to water, sanitation, and energy - many expected that the world would make significant progress. But the sad, hard truth is that only 12% of the SDGs' 140 measurable targets are heading in the right direction, and more than 30% are stalled or moving in reverse.

There is still hope, though. A single sector holds the key to closing half of the outstanding sustainable-development gaps: agri-food systems in Africa. The continent is home to over half of all people facing extreme poverty, and more than half of those facing acute food insecurity. One in five people in the region suffer from undernourishment, and nearly one in three children are affected by stunting. Africa is also home to around onefifth of the global agricultural  $\quad \text{workforce and is projected to} \quad$ become home to 49% of migrants displaced by climate shocks by 2050.

Thus, investing in African agri-food systems can have an outsize impact, allowing us to tackle a range of thorny issues – from hunger and poor health to poverty and under-education - at the scale needed to keep up with the growth of Africa's population, which is expected to double, to 2.4 billion, by 2050.

The biggest hurdle, of course, is financial. African agri-food systems are seriously underfunded: the sector receives less than 3% of global development funds and under 5% of total investments in Africa from public, private, and development funding combined. The average African farmer receives less than \$140 per year

in total investment, far below comparable figures for India (\$800), Brazil (\$1,800), or Thailand (\$2,000). Some Britons and Americans spend more on coffee in the space of a month.

This chronic underfunding has taken a heavy toll. African agricultural productivity is 60% below the global average, and food imports are projected to cost the continent \$110 billion annually by 2030. But with targeted capital and sustained attention, this can change. Boosting agricultural productivity would help feed a growing population, reduce import dependency, protect biodiversity, and restore soil health. Greater investments in the sector can secure the livelihoods of 250 million smallscale farmers and address the urgent need for climate resilience in a region disproportionately affected by global warming.

The benefits of investing in African food systems extend far beyond the continent. Africa's natural carbon sinks will continue to mitigate climate

change, but only if they are preserved. And strengthened agricultural systems can stabilize global food supply chains against disruptions caused by pandemics, conflicts, and climate shocks, by helping to rehabilitate the continent's farmland, 65% of which is degraded.

But unlocking global benefits requires global engagement. Fortunately, African agri-food systems represent a compelling business opportunity. Aside from the fact that the continent boasts an increasingly skilled, youthful labor force and much of the world's remaining arable land, investments in its food systems are 2.5-3 times more effective in raising incomes than those in other sectors.

Investors also stand to gain by coupling agri-food investments with investment in infrastructure such as energy. water, and technology, which will transform African agricultural systems into major sources of growth. Hundreds of small and medium-size enterprises are already moving hauling hundreds of millions of metric tons of food between rural and urban areas every day. This is a strong base for investors to build on.

So, what needs to happen next? At the Paris Peace Forum earlier this year, we unveiled the Agricultural Transitions Lab for African Solutions (ATLAS), a permanent platform to advocate for increased investment, align priorities, and promote transparency and accountability in African agri-food systems. Since then, 30 organizations have joined, demonstrating real momentum behind the initiative. Members span from the private sector, including OCP Group and the Boston Consulting Group, development organizations (including AGRA and ONE Campaign) and leading financiers, such as the International Finance Corporation and the French Development Agency (AFD).

At this year's annual World Economic Forum meeting in Davos, ATLAS is launching the 2x30 Challenge, which calls on leading development funders to commit to doubling total annual investments (from about \$50 billion to \$100 billion) in Africa's agri-food systems by 2030. To ensure that the additional funding does materialize and has a meaningful impact, it will be tracked through an annual in-

vestment barometer. Increasing investment is a first step toward building more productive, sustainable, and resilient African food systems. Supporting Africa's farmers is not just an opportunity. It is indispensable to achieving global development goals.

I spent three years at the Australian High Commission in New Delhi, and I am now Australia's Consul General in Kolkata. I am thrilled to be visiting Odisha. to see how Australia and this wonderful state can partner for our mutual prosperity.

On 26 January, I will celebrate India's Republic Day as well as Australia Day. This ioint day of celebration is just one of many things binding us together. We are both proud, multicultural democracies. We have a Comprehensive Strategic Partnership, a free trade agreement, and we are partners in the Quad.

The Indian diaspora is the fastest growing in Australia. One million strong, in a country of only 27 million, and coming to the fore in all walks of life.

As the Indian diaspora grows, so too does economic engagement, driven by our bilateral Economic Cooperation and Trade Agreement (EC-TA). Since ECTA entered into force. Australia-India trade has grown to nearly Rs three lakh crore per year. ECTA is delivering for India: over the past five vears, India's exports to Australia have grown 66 per cent.

Australia and India have complementary economies: we can plug into and drive each other's economic growth. I am here for Utkarsh Odisha because I think Australian goods, resources, services and technologies can be key enablers of that too. # Ensuring a 'dip-safe' Ganga Jail in Assam becomes farming hub with advanced waste mgmnt

Daily water testing, removal of pooja waste among measures to keep Ganga safe

Mahakumbh Nagar (UP), Jan 24: Daily sample testing of river water by the Pollution Control Board, round-the-clock separation of flowers and pooja material from water a, 200-km temporary drainage system to channel all greywater to treatment facilities and stateof-the-art technology to deal with human waste are among the measures being taken to ensure the Ganga is "dip-safe' during the Maha Kumbh.

Maha Kumbh, a mega-religious event organised everv 12 years, is being held in Prayagraj from January 13 and will continue for 45 days. More than eight crore pilgrims have so far taken a holy dip at the Sangam, the confluence of the Ganga, Yamuna and the Saras-

On major bath days, like on Mauni Amavasya January 29, officials estimate a footfall of 50 lakh visitors. These visitors. the authorities say, are expected to generate nearly 16 million litres of fecal sludge and about 240 million litres of greywater (waste water generated from cooking, washing and bathing) per day. According to Additional District Magistrate (ADM) of the Maha Kumbh Mela, Vivek Chaturvedi, the river water is absolutely safe to take the holy dip.

"A team from the pollution control board is doing sample testing of the river from different ghats on a daily basis and the levels are within control. The second area of attention is the pooja waste which is going into the rivers -- there are flowers, coconuts and other things which are offered as part of rituals. We have deployed maMAHA KUMBH



chines on various ghats to fish these out of the river every two hours," he told PTI.

"There is a team of Ganga Sevadoots, who are stationed on ghats to promptly collect and dispose the material to maintain the purity of the river and the ghats. They work in rotational shifts," he added.

According to Uttar Pradesh government officials, of the ₹7.000 crore being spent by the state government on the Kumbh Mela this year, ₹1,600 crore has been earmarked for water and waste management alone.

Installation of 1.45 lakh toi-

Barpeta (Assam), Jan 24: It might appear to be just another normal prison at first glance, but as one steps inside the Barpeta District Jail complex in Assam, it is nothing less than an agricultural hub with vast fields of multiple crops.

Located in lower Assam the fields in the jail compound are filled with mustard, along with trees laden with fruits and vegetables, a mini bee farm, and even rare crops like nutritious apple berries.

Spread over 127 bighas (almost 42 acres), the Barpeta jail has a capacity to house 413 inmates - 368 men and 45 women. It currently has 335 inmates, including 325 men and 10 women.

"I, along with the jailer, got transferred to this prison around a year ago. At that time, only paddy farming was done. We decided to go for multi-cropping to utilise the land through-

out the year," Barpeta District Jail Superintendent Pranjal Sarma said. Kumar Sarma told PTI.

Thanks to the new initiatives the jail generated a revenue of over ₹1 lakh for the government during the April-December period last year by selling agricultural produce alone, he said.

"Apart from revenue generation, there was another reason for introducing year-long agriculture activities. The inmates are always mentally stressed due to their jail terms and for staying away from home. We tried to reduce their stress level by engaging them in productive work. They laugh and share jokes with each other while working in the fields,'

He said all the produce is purely organic and no chemical or fertiliser is used during farming. What makes this transformation even more special is that the prisoners are engaged in all agrarian activities within the premises, which keeps them engaged and helps them learn a new skill for the life after release from jail.

Jailer Nilotpal Kakati said multi-cropping started from April last year, after the authorities cleared the weeds from the unused barren lands and made

"We could utilise only 35-40 bighas of land as there is short age of manpower. Though we have over 300 inmates, we could engage only 20-25 of them serv ing rigorous imprisonment due to legal restrictions. The law does not allow the rest to work in the fields," he said.

Kakati, however, said the jail authorities are planning to ex pand the farming area this year by engaging a few more people thereby increasing the produce

Asked about the marketing he said, "So far, we have not marketed it outside Barpeta Local vendors come and collect the vegetables from us. The jai inmates also consumed around 1,000 kgs of vegetables last year, resulting in savings for us."

The jailer said that with ex pansion of produce and intro duction of some cash crops, the authorities will explore outside markets later this year.

Vegetables like lady finger. mustard, ginger, brinjal, cab bage, reddish and several cruci ferous ones, including perennia Indian favourites cauliflower and cabbages, are grown in the jail premises. Additionally, the compound houses a small fishery for inhouse consumption.

Another highlight is a small berry farm, housing around 200 trees producing several precious variants of the fruit - Apple Berry, Miss India and Thailand Berry.

## Assam to revamp 252 govt schools

Guwahati, Jan 24: Aiming to revamp the infrastructure of prominent rural schools, the Assam government is developing new buildings for 252 such staterun educational facilities at an expenditure of over ₹1,800 crore, officials said. Director of Secondary Education, Mamata Hojai, told PTI that the 252 government vernacular schools have been selected from each of the 126 Assembly constituencies as per budget announcements last year.

"We are upgrading the infrastructure of these schools as part of a project under the Rural Infrastructure Development Fund (RIDF). The selection of the schools is done according to suggestions of the respective MLAs,' she said. The construction work in most of the schools has begun and will be complete by next year, Hojai said. Asked about the expenditure, she said, "The construction cost for each school will be ₹7 crore to ₹8 crore. The total outlay is of ₹1,827 crore.

In the 2024-25 budget, Assam Finance Minister Ajanta Neog had announced an initiative to improve the infrastructure of government schools across the state.

Ali recalls a turning point from his childhood, "When I was seven. I suffered from leukoderma, leaving my eyes white. Treatments failed until my mother took me to the Ghurdevi temple."

He further said he believes that "applying water from the sacred pindi" helped cure the condition which inspired his lifelong connection to the temple. He said he began actively serving there in 2007 after he had a rather dramatic dream in which the Goddess asked him to care for the temple.

Under Ali's leadership, the temple has flourished. Initiatives like fundraising through grain collections during harvest seasons have generated significant resources. "This year alone, ₹2.7 lakh was raised for temple development," Ali told PTI.

Public contributions and government support have also helped in its renovations, with over ₹30.40 lakh utilised for construction and

Recently, a 5.5-foot Hanuman idol, sourced from Jaipur for ₹2.5 lakh, was consecrated during a five-day ceremony attended by thousands. The invitation card for the event prominently featured Ali's name as the temple committee president alongside local BJP MLA Sureshwar Singh as the chief guest.

District Tourism Officer Manish Srivastava confirmed the temple's inclusion in a religious tourism initiative two years ago, further enhancing its status.

The temple's impact transcends religious lines, attracting Muslim women who join Hindu devotees in prayers.

New Delhi, Jan 24: The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) Friday accused the BJP-led Centre and the Delhi Police of conspiring to "kill" its supremo Arvind Kejriwal and urged the Election Commission (EC) to restore his security cover provided by the Punjab Police that was withdrawn. There was no immediate reaction from the BJP or the Delhi Police to the allegation.

Addressing a press conference here, Delhi Chief Minister Atishi and her Punjab counterpart, Bhagwant Mann, said they have written to the EC demanding "fair grounds" for the AAP in the February 5 Delhi Assembly polls and the restoration of Kejriwal's security cover given by the Punjab Police, along with an audit of "life-threatening" attacks on him.

They alleged that the Delhi Police, which comes under the Centre, has turned a blind eye on the alleged attacks on Kejriwal in accordance with Union Home Minister Amit Shah's order.

"There are two players involved in this conspiracy to kill Kejriwalji -- the BJP and the Delhi Police. They are both conspiring to end Keiriwal's life. Attacks have been attempted on him one after the other. In October (last year), an attack was made on Kejriwal. Upon investigation by us. it was found that the attackers were BJP workers, but police took no action," Atishi alleged.

"We have written to the EC demanding that Kejriwal's security be restored. We do not trust the Delhi Police as it is under Amit Shah's control. she added. The AAP leaders alleged that resorting to "dirty politics" ahead of the Delhi polls, the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) has conspired to get Kejriwal's security removed.

"We write to you with utmost urgency and grave

concern regarding the security arrangements of Arvind Kejriwal, ex-Chief Minister of Delhi and the national convenor of the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP), who has been consistently facing grave threats to his life and deliberate lapses in his security detail.'

It alleged that on different occasions over the last three months, multiple targeted attacks on Kejriwal, including incidents of physical assault and stone pelting during a political rally, were attempted, exacerbating their concerns.

The letter complained that police "simply acted as mute spectators" and did not make an attempt to protect Kejriwal. The Chief Ministers called

the Union Home Ministry's reported order to withdraw the Puniab Police's security cover for Kejriwal in Delhi a "politically-motivated" decision.

The Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) reportedly asked to withdraw the Punjab Police's security cover for Kejriwal in Delhi as he already enjoys Z-plus security here.

Punjab Director General of Police (DGP) Gaurav Yadav Thursday said the police personnel from his state deployed for Kejriwal's security have been withdrawn.

The AAP leaders urged the EC to "conduct an immediate and thorough review of Arvind Kejriwal's security arrangements and implement robust measures to ensure his safety" and "reinstate or augment the presence of the Punjab Police in his security detail to provide reliable and impartial

protection". "Those who receive Z-plus security are supposed to be provided protection. Yogi Adityanath, for example, gets security from his own state and also receives protection here while campaigning as he is Z-plus protectee.

New Delhi, Jan 24: The CBI has conducted search operations across seven locations after registering a case of ₹350 crore crypto ponzi scam against seven persons, officials said Friday.

The accused persons were allegedly running seven separate modules based in the cities of Delhi, Hazaribag, Bathinda, Ratlam, Valsad, Pudukkottai and Chittorgarh, taking money from gullible investors promising investments in cryptocurrencies, they said.

"These ponzi schemes were be ing promoted through multiple social media groups. An analysis of bank account transactions and cryptocurrency wallets has revealed that the illegal proceeds from these schemes were being



converted into cryptocurrencies to obscure their origin," CBI's spokesperson said in a statement.

It is alleged that they had conducted transactions of over ₹350 crore in these schemes, the officials said.

On Thursday, the agency swooped down at locations in Delhi, Jharkhand, Punjab, Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat, Tamil Nadu and Rajasthan.

During the searches, the CBI seized digital virtual assets totalling \$38,414 (approximately) in the cryptocurrency wallets of the accused persons, which had been digitally secured for investigation.

"The searches resulted in the recovery of cash amounting to ?34.2 lakh(approx), along with

significant digital evidence, including seven mobile phones one laptop, one tablet, three hard disks, 10 pen drives, memory cards, SIM cards, ATM/ debit cards, email accounts and several incriminating documents," the statement said.

The agency registered the case under Indian Penal Code section 120-B (criminal con spiracy), read with Section 420 (cheating) and Section 66D of the Information Technology Act 2000, because it was part of an ongoing investigation that pre dated the introduction of three new criminal laws last year.

"It was alleged that accused persons, acting in criminal conspiracy, have been actively floating various ponzi and fraudulent schemes, promising high returns based on cryptocurrency investments.

## MEA slams disruption of 'Emergency' film in UK

## Dalit votes may split between AAP, BJP, Cong: Experts

New Delhi, Jan 24: As the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) battles to protect its main turf, the Dalit voters of Delhi are in focus in the upcoming Assembly polls in the national capital, with both the Congress and BJP challenging the ruling party, leading to the possibility of a split in the Dalit votes between the three parties, experts say.

Kejriwal, whose AAP is eyeing a third straight term in power in Delhi, has enjoyed the support of the Dalit

voters in the past, even as the experts say that some disillusionment has crept in. On the other hand, the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) has come up with a slew of promises for the Dalits and is holding extensive reach-out programmes in Dalit-majority constituencies.

Shah's remarks in the Rajya Sabha on BR Ambedkar, which had triggered a sharp attack from opposition parties, including the AAP and Congress, added fuel to the war of narratives ahead of the February 5 polls. However, the BJP has countered it aggressively.

In the 2020 Delhi polls, the AAP won all 12 seats reserved for the Scheduled Castes (SCs) and a large chunk of Dalit votes, which helped the party secure its second term in the capital. This time, however, the votes may split three-way, the experts say.

"The two photos that Kejriwal has in his office are of BR Ambedkar and Bhagat Singh, because Dalits are in large numbers in Delhi as well as Punjab. The AAP's election symbol -- broom -- also resonates with the Dalit voters and they can feel a connection. A

huge chunk of Dalit votes had gone to the party. But today, the Dalit community is not as happy with Kejriwal because there has not been much change in their lives," Ambedkarwadi told PTI.

According to data compiled by Subaltern Media Foundation, there are around 1.23 crore Dalit voters in Delhi. The Chamar community, which includes Jatavs, has more than

24 lakh members and presence in all Delhi districts. The number of Valmikis is more than 12 lakh, while the other major Dalit groups include Mallahs, who are over two lakh in numbers. more than 4.82 lakh Khatiks and over 4.18 lakh Kolis.

Other prominent Dalit caste groups include Chohra, Bazigar, Banjara, Dhobi, Julaha, Madari, Pasi, Sapera and Nat. Former Delhi minister Rajen-





# **Accused's father claims false framing**

New Delhi, Jan 24: The father of the Bangladeshi man accused of stabbing actor Saif Ali Khan will soon approach that country's foreign ministry and the Indian High Commission for his son's release, claiming he was being framed for reasons unknown to him.

In a 12-minute interview, Mohammad Ruhul, the father of Shariful Islam, told PTI from Bangaldesh that his son did not have proper documentation for his stay in India and he lived in constant fear of being arrested.

The January 2024 re-election of Sheikh Hasina had forced Shariful to leave Bangladesh,

Ruhul also alleged that the man seen in the CCTV camera footage was not Shariful and added that his son was being framed

"I will get in touch with the Bangaldeshi foreign ministry and also seek help from the Indian High Commission in Dhaka for the release of my son," Ruhul said. He claimed that he learned

about his son's arrest through Facebook and news channels and added he had not been contacted by police in this connection. "The police have not said anything to us," Ruhul said.

A Mumbai court Friday extended till January 29 the police custody of Shariful, arrested for allegedly stabbing Khan at his home during a robbery attempt last week. The police informed the court that they had to conduct facial recognition of the man to ascertain if he was the person seen in the CCTV camera footage from the actor's Bandra building.

Shariful, arrested from Thane city, changed his name to Vijay Das after illegally entering India last year, the poallegedly stabbed repeatedly by the intruder inside his 12th floor apartment in upscale Bandra in the early hours of January 16.

Ruhul claimed that his son was not involved in the stabbing incident, saving it would not have been possible for Shariful to enter the home of a star of Khan's stature and commit such a crime.

"In the video footage we saw, the man (in the footage) has hair till the eyebrows. My son doesn't wear his hair like that. He is 30 years old and has never kept his hair this long, not even as a teenager,"

India is a huge country and possibly one person would bear some resemblance to another, he said. "But the CCTV camera photos that I saw of the (accused) person do not match my son.

He also alleged that his son was being framed by a "third party". "There might be a conspiracy. Ruhul, a local leader of the

Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP), worked at the People's Jute Mill in Khulna district before retiring to his native village in Jhalokathi district.

He said Shariful used to work at a hotel in Mumbai and sent a portion of the salary he received on the "10th, 11th, 12th" of every month. After Hasina became prime

minister again, Shariful realised that he could not survive in Bangladesh. He saw other people leave Bangladesh for other countries and earn a living there. With this in mind, he went to India, Ruhul said.

"He didn't have any documentation. One who has documents can go and work anywhere. Having valid documents has a lot of advantages,' he said.

Shariful lived in constant fear because he did not have any documents, his father said. "There is no question of him roaming around."

#### Apex court adjourns contempt plea hearing

**DEMOLITION IN SAMBHAL**

New Delhi, Jan 24: The Supreme Court Friday said it would hear after a week a plea seeking contempt proceedings against Sambhal authorities for allegedly violating its verdict on demolition of properties.

Justices B R Gavai and Augustine George Masih posted the matter after a week after the lawyer appearing for petitioner Mohammed Ghavoor sought an adjournment on the ground that the arguing counsel was in a personal difficulty.

He requested the bench to post the matter after a week. In his plea filed through advocate Chand Qureshi, the pe titioner alleged the authorities violated the top court's November 13 2024 verdict which laid down pan-India guidelines and barred demolition of properties without a prior showcause notice and giving 15 days to the

aggrieved party to respond. The plea claimed authorities in UP's Sambhal bulldozed a part of the petitioner's property January 10-11 without a prior notice or an opportunity to him or his family members.

"The petitioner and his family members had all the necessary documents, approved maps and other related documents of the property but, the contemnors came to the premises of the petitioner property and started demolishing the said property," the plea said.

The petitioner, said the plea was aggrieved by the arbitrary and illegal action of the authorities which was in "complete violation" of the top court's verdict

Sambhal district magistrate and others were made respondents in his plea. It said the apex court in its November 2024 verdict directed the state authorities to strictly adhere to the guidelines before bulldozing and demolishing properties in the country.

Authorities disobeyed the guidelines and bulldozed a part of the petitioner's factory situated at Tiwari Sarai in Sambhal without giving any prior notice,

The plea argued the authori ties had no respect for the court and the rule of law and the administration of justice.

Aside from seeking initiation of contempt proceedings against the authorities, the plea sought to restrain them from creating any third par ty interest in the premises in question. It also sought a direction to the authorities to maintain status quo as January 11.

#### US arrests 538 illegal immigrants

Washington: The US has arrested 538 illegal immigrant criminals, including a suspected terrorist, and several illegals convicted of sex crimes against minors, the White House has said. In a series of posts on X on Thursday, White House press secretary Karoline Leavitt said the Trump administration also deported hundreds of illegal immigrant criminals via military aircraft. "The largest massive deportation operation in history is well underway. Promises made. Promises kept," she said. Leavitt said, "The Trump Administration arrested 538 illegal immigrant criminals including a suspected terrorist, four members of the Tren de Aragua gang, and several illegals convicted of sex crimes against minors.

# Trump stuns federal workers

Washington, Jan 24: US President Donald Trump and his team have acted with stunning speed to begin removing or sidelining hundreds of government workers, while he has also sought to give himself the power to fire hundreds of thousands more

The Republican president has been in office less than a week but the wrecking ball he has already taken to parts of the US government has sent shock waves through much of America's federal bureaucracy.

At the National Security Council 160 staffers have been sent home. About 20 senior career attorneys at the Justice Department were reassigned. The heads of the US Coast Guard and Transportation Securitv Administration were fired along with other officials.

Government offices focused on workforce diversity are being permanently shuttered, the staff on leave, while a flurry of executive orders overturning Biden administration policy have left many officials uncertain about their futures, their mandate erased by a blunt stroke of Trump's signature Sharpie marker.

Trump said Tuesday he also plans to fire over 1,000 officials appointed by his Democratic predecessor Joe Biden.

The White House did not respond to a request for com-



ment about government worker concerns.

During his presidential election campaign Trump frequently pledged to slash the size of government and rid it of bureaucrats deemed insufficiently loyal to his political agenda.

Still, the speed of Trump's swift and coordinated moves targeting workers at a swath of government agencies shocked federal employees in Washington and even public sector unions who had spent months anticipating Trump's arrival.

Steve Lenkart, executive director of the National Federation of Federal Employees, faced a similar reaction when he addressed a group of 30 federal employees in a class he was teaching Thursday. "It was just stunned silence," said Lenkart, whose union represents 110,000 workers. "Everyone is on pins and needles."

Lenkart pointed to lesser-known agencies, like the TSA, where it usually takes months before a new administration gets around to replacing the leadership, that were targeted on Trump's first full day in office Tuesday

#### **DIVERSITY OFFICES CLOSED**

Coast Guard Commandant Admiral Linda Lee Fagan, the first female uniformed leader of an armed forces branch, was removed in part for what a Department of Homeland Security official said was her excessive focus on diversity, equity and inclusion policies.

In a memo released Tuesday the Trump administration said that all federal DEI office staff would be placed on paid leave by 5 pm Wednesday, because their offices were to close.

Federal agency heads have been asked to identify by Friday employees on probationary periods, or who have served less than two years. Such employees are easier to fire. Trump also issued a freeze on federal hiring, except for military, immigration enforcement, national security and public safety jobs.

The 160 staff members at the National Security Council were told during a brief call on Wednesday to turn in their devices and badges and head home, a former NSC official said. They were people seconded to the agency from the State Department, the Pentagon and other parts of the US govern-

## West Bank violence imperils Gaza ceasefire

London, Jan 24: Israeli operations in the West Bank have killed at least 12 Palestinians since Tuesday and could threaten the newly agreed ceasefire in Gaza, United Nations Human Rights office spokesperson Thameen Al-Kheetan said Friday.

Hundreds of Jenin residents fled their homes as the military demolished a number of houses on the third day of a major operation in the West Bank city Thursday.

The operation was launched within days of the start of a ceasefire in Gaza that saw the first exchange of Israeli hostages for Palestinian prisoners held in Israeli jails since a brief truce in November 2023.

Israeli officials said the Jenin operation was aimed at what the military said were Iranian-backed militant groups in the refugee camp adjacent to the city, a major hub for armed Palestinian groups for years.

the alarm over the killing of what it said were mostly unarmed people, calling for an immediate end of the violence and a halt on expanding settlements

"Our office has verified that at least 12 Palestinians have been killed and 40 injured by Israeli security forces since Tuesday, most of them report edly unarmed," Al-Kheetan told a televised briefing.

"We are also concerned by repeated comments from some Israeli officials about plans to expand settlements further still and a fresh breach of international law. We recall again that the transfer by Israel of its own civilian population into territories it occupies also amounts to a war crime. Israel has occupied the West

Bank of the Jordan River, which Palestinians want as the core of an independent state. since the 1967 Middle East war It has built Jewish settlements there that most countries deem illegal. Israel disputes this and cites historical and Biblical ties to the land.

Kabul, Jan 24: The Taliban Friday rejected a court move to arrest two of their top officials for persecuting women, accusing the court of baseless accusations and misbehaviour.

The International Criminal Court's chief prosecutor Karim Khan announced Thursday he

had requested arrest warrants for two top Taliban officials, including the leader Hibatullah Akhundzada.

Since they took back control of the country in 2021, the Taliban have barred women from jobs, most public spaces and education beyond sixth grade.

A Foreign Ministry statement condemned the ICC request.

The court was making baseless accusations against Afghanistan's leadership at a time of peace in the country and people had "breathed a sigh of relief". The ministry alleged the court had turned a blind eve to decades of war and crimes against humanity committed by foreign forces and their allies. "This

misbehaviour further destroys the weak credibility of the said structure (ICC) and makes its status and position at the international level completely meaningless," the statement said.

The ministry warned the court against imposing its interpretation of human rights and ignoring the religious and national values of others.

Earlier Friday, an Afghan women's group had hailed the court's move. The Afghan Women's Movement for Justice and Awareness celebrated the ICC decision and called it a "great historical achievement'

"We consider this achievement a symbol of the strength and will of Afghan women and believe this step will start a new chapter of accountability and justice in the country," the group said. An official in the former Western-backed administration said the Taliban leadership was likely to exploit the decision for propaganda purposes by framing it as proof of their

strong faith and resilience. "They may tell their followers that their beliefs are so powerful they have provoked the collective opposition of global powers," Mohammad Halim Fidai said on the X platform.

#### UN suspends all trips into Houthi-held areas of Yemen

**Dubai:** The United Nations Friday suspended all travel into areas held by Yemen's Houthi rebels after more of their staff were detained by the rebels. The Houthis have already detained UN staffers, as well as individuals associated with the once-open US Embassy in Sanaa, Yemen's capital, and aid groups. "Yesterday, the de facto authorities in Sanaa de tained additional UN personnel working in areas under their control," the UN statement read. "To ensure the security and safety of all its staff, the United Nations has suspended all official movements into and within areas under the de facto authorities' control." Before Friday, the UN had a total of 16 Yemeni staff in Houthi detention. Staffers were trying to get a headcount across the UN agencies working in the country and had halted their work, which provides food, medicine and other aid to the impoverished nation.

Cape Town, Jan 24: A community in southern Madagascar has pulled together to save thousands of critically endangered tortoises swept away from their sanctuary and left swimming for their lives in floods this month caused by a tropical cyclone.

The 12,000 radiated and spider tortoises that were housed at the Lavavolo Tortoise Centre had been confiscated from illegal wildlife traffickers but faced a new and unexpected ordeal when Cyclone Dikeledi hit the southern part of the In-

dian Ocean island in mid-January. Flood waters a metre high engulfed the sanctuary, and the tortoises — many of them mere whippersnappers in the tortoise world at about 25-50 years old — were carried away. Sanctuary staff, members of

the community and even police officers joined together in a rescue operation, wading through the water with large containers to collect the bewildered tortoises. Some rescuers converted damaged building structures into makeshift rafts for the tortoises to ride on as they moved around to find others.

#### IndiGo Q3 profit falls 18 per cent

Tokyo, Jan 24: The Bank of Japan raised interest rates Friday to their highest since the 2008 global financial crisis and revised up its inflation forecasts, underscoring its confidence that rising wages will keep inflation stable around its 2 per cent target.

The decision marks the BOJ's first rate hike since July last year and comes days after the inauguration of US President Donald Trump, who is likely to keep global policymakers vigilant ahead of potential repercussions from threatened higher tariffs.

BOJ Governor Kazuo Ueda said the central bank will keep raising interest rates as wage and price increases broaden,

# Djoko quits in semis

Novak Djokovic's bid for the record 11th Australian Open took a major blow as the Serbian great retired with injury

Melbourne, Jan 24: Spectators booed an injured Novak Djokovic as he left the court in Rod Laver Arena after quitting one set into his Australian Open semifinal against Alexander Zverev Friday.

Dealing with a what he said was a torn muscle, Djokovic lost the opener 7-6 (5) when he put a forehand volley into the net, then began shaking his head and immediately walked over to shake Zverev's hand. The 37-year-old Djokovic packed up his equipment and walked off toward the locker room, pausing to respond to the jeers by giving two thumbs-up.

At his news conference, Diokovic said the pain in his taped left leg was "getting worse and worse." He hurt it during his quarterfinal victory over Carlos Alcaraz Tuesday night.

He was bidding for an 11th championship at the Australian Open and record 25th Grand Slam title overall.

But this is the second time in the past four major tournaments he was unable to finish because of an injury: He withdrew from last year's French Open before the quarterfinals because he tore the meniscus in his right knee during a match. Djokovic underwent surgery in Paris and, less than

two months later, reached the final at Wimbledon, then won a gold medal for Serbia at the Paris Olympics.

The No 2-seeded Zverev reached his first title match at Melbourne Park and on Sunday will face the winner of Friday's second semifinal between No 1 Jannik Sinner of Italy, the defending champion, and No 21 Ben Shelton of the United

Zverev, a 27-year-old German, is a two-time runner-up at other major tournaments, losing finals in five sets at the 2020 U.S. Open and 2024 French

"My goal is still to compete

with the big guys and to compete for these kind of tournaments and try to win them," Zverev said.

"For that, I need to get better. I need to improve on the court. I need to improve physically.'

During his on-court interview, Zverev pleaded with the fans not to give Djokovic a hard time. "I know that everybody paid for tickets and everybody

wants to see hopefully a great five-set match," he said. "But you've got to understand - Novak Djokovic is somebody that has given this sport, for the past 20 years, absolutely everything

The only set of Djokovic vs. Zverev lasted 1 hour, 21 minutes and included 19 points that lasted nine strokes or more apiece. The first four games alone last-

ed 31 minutes, slowed both by the lengthy baseline exchanges and Djokovic's deliberate pacing between points, taking the 25-second serve clock down to and occasionally slightly beyond — the full allotment.

The match was grueling and would have been even without dealing with a leg problem that initially became an issue late in the first set against Al-

"I didn't hit the ball (from after the) Alcaraz match until like an hour before today's match," Djokovic said.

"I did everything I possibly can to basically manage the muscle tear that I had. Medications and, I guess, the (tape) and the physio work helped to some extent today," he added.

"But towards the end of that first set, I just started feeling more and more pain and it was too much for me to handle. Unfortunate ending, but I tried."

Zverev said he could sense 'some dents" on the other side of the net in the tiebreaker and noticed that Diokovic was struggling "maybe a bit more."

Two years ago at Melbourne Park, Djokovic hurt his left hamstring but still managed to depart with the trophy. Against Alcaraz, he was down a set against someone who is 16 years his junior but won.

in 2024. She is also in the running for the ICC Women's ODI Cricketer of the Year award. In the home series against

South Africa, Mandhana was in sublime form, beginning with back-to-back centuries in the first two ODIs. She narrowly missed a third

consecutive ton, falling for 90, though her remarkable tally of 343 runs in the series earned her the Player-of-the-Series award.

#### Rohit falls for 28 in second essay

Mumbai, Jan 24: He pulled Umar Nazir for a trademark six, effortlessly lofted Auqib Nabi and Yudhvir Singh for a couple of more hits over the ropes to give a glimpse of his absolute best. But eventually, a fifty on Ranji comeback was not meant to be for India captain Rohit Sharma who fell for 28 here Friday.
