Value addition must: PM

Bhubaneswar, Jan 28: Prime Minister Narendra Modi Tues day said he cannot accept raw materials getting exported and finished products being shipped into the country, asserting that value additions must happen in

Inaugurating the 'Utkarsh Odisha, Make in Odisha Conclave' at Janata Maidan here, Modi said he considers eastern India as the growth engine of the country, and the state plays an important role in it.

"The country's development is not possible only by exporting raw materials. Therefore, we are changing the entire ecosystem and working with a new vision," he said.

"The minerals are extracted here and exported to some other country where value addition is done and finished products are then sent back to India. This trend is not acceptable to Modi," he added, citing the example of the export of marine products for processing in other countries. Urging all to recognise the challenges of the global supply chain in a changing world, the PM said India cannot rely on fragmented and import-based supply chains.

"Instead, a robust supply and value chain must be built within India to minimise the impact of global fluctuations. This responsibility lies with both the government and the industry," he said.

The PM said the milestone of a USD 5 trillion economy was 54 MoUs signed on 1st day of Utkarsh Odisha 2025

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not far away for India.

He said India's economy rests on two major pillars -the innovative service sector and quality products. "The potential for green jobs is also growing significantly. There is a need to adapt to the demands and requirements of the times. India is focusing on green technology and a green future, including solar, wind, hydro, and green hydrogen, which will power the energy security of a developed India," he said. The PM said the aspirations of crores of people were driving India's movement on the path of development.

"Today, India is moving on a path of development driven by the aspirations of crores of people. This is an era of AI. However, the aspiration of India, not just AI, is the power of our country. Aspiration grows when the needs of the people are fulfilled. In the last decade, the country has witnessed the benefit of empowering crores of

people. Odisha represents the

same aspiration," he said. Modi said the 21st century is about connected infrastructure and multi-modal connectivity.

"India is building specialised infrastructure at unprecedented speed and scale. It will make India a great destination for investment," he said.

The PM said ASEAN countries have shown interest in strengthening trade ties with Odisha. "I consider eastern India as the growth engine of the country, with Odisha playing a crucial role in this. History shows that during times when India significantly contributed to global growth, eastern India also made important

contributions," he said.

Kumki elephant 'Bhabani' dies

Baripada, Jan 28: Bhabani, one of the most distinguished elephants in Similipal Sanctuary, passed away during treatment in the Jenabil Range elephant enclosure at 6:08 am Tuesday. The 68-year-old elephant, who had become visually impaired due to old age, had been a significant figure in the sanctuary's efforts to protect wildlife and promote tourism. Dr Prakash Chandra Gogineni, Regional Chief Conservator of Forests (RCCF) and Field Director of Similipal Tiger Conservation Project, confirmed the death.

Bhabani was brought to Similipal from Karnataka's Forest department in November 2001 as part of a programme for wildlife protection and tourism development.

Trump threatens tariffs on India

■ A day after Prime Minister Narendra Modi and US President Donald Trump vowed to work towards a 'trusted' partnership with a focus on boosting India-US cooperation in areas of trade, energy and defence, Trump Tuesday threatened to impose tariffs on countries that 'harm' America, naming India, China, and Brazil as those with high tariffs. To justify his move, Trump said the US will create a 'fair system' where funds will flow into the nation's coffers, ensuring that America becomes 'very rich again'. Earlier, Trump had talked about slapping '100 per cent tariffs' on the BRICS grouping, a bloc that includes India as well. Significantly, Trump's announcement comes ahead of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's likely visit to the White House next month.

Washington, Jan 28: President Donald Trump has said that the United States will impose tariffs on countries that 'harm' America, naming China, India, and Brazil as those with high tariffs.

"We're going to put tariffs on outside countries and outside people that really mean harm to us. Well, they mean us harm, but they basically want to make their country good," Trump told House Republicans at a Florida retreat Monday, the first after he became the president for the second term last week.

"Look at what others do. China

is a tremendous tariff maker, and India and Brazil and so many other countries. So we're not going to let that happen any longer because we're going to put America first,"

He said that the US will establish a "very fair system where money is going to come into our coffers and America is going to be very rich again", adding that it will happen "very quickly".

Trump underscored that it was time for the US to return to the system that made it "richer and more powerful than ever before. Referring to his inaugural speech last week, Trump said: "Instead of taxing our citizens to enrich foreign nations, we should be tariffing and taxing foreign nations to enrich our citizens.

"Under the American first economic model, as tariffs on other countries go up, taxes on American workers and businesses will come down and massive numbers of jobs and factories will come home," he said. Earlier, Trump has already talked about slapping "100 per cent tariffs" on the BRICS grouping, a bloc that includes India as well.

During his address, Trump asked companies to come and set up manufacturing units in the US if they wished to avoid tariffs.

"If you want to stop paying the taxes or the tariffs, you have to build your plant right here in America. That's what's going to happen at record levels," he said.

DeepSeek disrupts global AI scene

LONDON/SINGAPORE: Global technology shares sank Tuesday, as a market rout sparked by the emergence of a low-cost Chinese artificial intelligence model entered its second day, making investors question the sky-high valuation and dominance of AI bellwethers

Shares of Nvidia, a leader in the AI chip market, fell 17 per cent Monday, wiping \$593 billion from its market value - a record one-day loss for any company and dragged US stocks lower.

By Tuesday, Nvidia shares were up nearly 6 per cent in Frankfurt, while those in Oracle rose 3.4 per cent and AI data analytics company Palantir rose



2.97 per cent, while tech shares in Europe wilted.

The sell-off was prompted by the release of a free AI assistant launched by China's DeepSeek last week that the startup said uses less data at a fraction of the cost of services currently available. That garnered attention worldwide, although scepticism over DeepSeek's cost claims lingers.


OpenAI CEO Sam Altman called it an "impressive model", while US President Donald Trump called it "a wakeup call for our industries."

'We will obviously deliver much better models and also it's legit invigorating to have a new competitor!" Altman, the head of the AI firm behind ChatGPT, said in a social media post.

DeepSeek bursting onto the AI scene, seemingly out of nowhere, has upended the industry's perception that China was years behind its bigger US rivals.

Investors have dumped tech stocks everywhere, with ripples felt from Tokyo to Amsterdam to Silicon Valley.

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

Kumki jumbo deaths in Similipal spark concern

Baripada, Jan 28: Two back-to-back deaths of trained kumki elephants -Mahendra and Bhabani - in Similipal Wildlife Sanctuary within a span of just 15 days have sparked concern over safety of the gentle giants while allegations have come to the fore about negligence and inaction by the Forest department in arresting the tragedies, according to reports.

During a memorial gathering for Mahendra, animal lovers expressed apprehension that elephants in Similipal are increasingly becoming vulnerable to threats. The sanctuary spread over 2,750 sq km, had deployed trained elephants alongside forest personnel for wildlife security and anti-poaching activities.

Mahendra along with two other female elephants-Shobha and Bhabani—had been brought from Karnataka to aid in guarding the sanctuary, driving out poachers, and preventing illegal timber business.

The trained elephants played a critical role in conservation efforts under tiger protection programme. Forest staffers relied on them to access the core areas of the reserve forest for monitoring tiger movements, which are otherwise difficult to navigate. These elephants facilitated tasks that were otherwise beyond the



Mahendra

reach of the department's

personnel. The deaths began with Shobha, whose passing reportedly altered the behaviour of the remaining elephants, Mahendra and Bhabani. Following Shobha's death, Mahe ndra fell ill and was under veterinary care. Despite efforts, Mahendra died at 10pm, January 12. Distressed over the loss, Bhabani also stopped taking food and water, and was found unresponsive Tuesday morning

Animal lovers and conservationists have criticised the Forest department for failing to provide adequate care and monitoring for the trained elephants, which were integral to the sanctuary's protection efforts. The series of deaths has raised questions about the management and welfare of the animals entrusted to safeguard the biodiversity of Similipal.

Similipal is now home to only one trained elephant, Raikumar. Previously, Rajkumar and Mahendra were relocated to Satkosia Wildlife Sanctuary in Angul district to bolster tiger conservation efforts. However, after four years, both the elephants were taken back to Similipal.

According to Bhanumitra Acharya, an independent director of Odisha Forest Development Corporation (OFDC) and a former honourary wildlife warden, frequent relocations and a lack of proper medical care have led to the death of many elephants. Recently, the unexplained death of elephants in Similipal has sparked concerns about wildlife protection measures.

On January 5, forest officials rescued a baby elephant from a murram pit in Pakamunda village, about 4 km from Karanjia range office. The calf was sent to Nandankanan Zoological Park for treatment but unfortunately it died there. The death of three kumki elephants in a month has raised questions about the adequacy of departmental actions to ensure the safety

of these animals. Despite being recognised as an elephant conservation project, Similipal lacks proper resources to safeguard its elephant population. This inadequacy has forced elephants to stray into rural and urban settlements.

The latest elephant census report shows the presence of 384 elephants in Baripada circle, while 295 of them are residing in the five forest divisions of Similipal. However, Baripada circle, spanning seven forest divisions, has seen a decline of 49 elephants as compared to previous census. However, the Forest department is yet to address this decline or the factors contributing to it.

Environmentalists like Sanjukta Basa have criticised the lack of stringent measures against elephant deaths caused by electrocution, which remain alarmingly high due to negligence of both Railway and Forest departments. Despite efforts by the state and Union governments to implement various conservation measures, their impact has been minimal

She called the couple a few times and received no answer. After cleaning the room, she went away thinking the Panigrahys must be at the temple but when she did not find them there, Bhanumati returned at about 10am and went inside to discover the terrible scene of the couple lying in a profusely bleeding condition on the second floor of their home. When police came in after being intimated by one of the boarders, an ambulance had also been called in. Kunjabihari was shifted to a nearby private hospital where he died during treatment a few days later.

Later, the culprits were arrested and trial began. The incident sent shock waves in the City. raising serious questions about safety and security of senior


He provided practical train ing to students on using vari ous tools for verifying visual content's authenticity.

Rourkela DFO feted for using AI to save elephants

Rourkela, Jan 28: Divisional forest officer (DFO), Rourkela Jasobant Sethi has been conferred with 'Elite 100 Changemakers of Odisha 2024' award for innovative use of artificial intelligence (AI) in protection of wildlife.

He received the award from Governor Haribabu Kambhampati at a function held in Bhubaneswar during the Republic Day celebration.

Sethi, in a pilot project, innovatively used AI in protection of wildlife under Rourkela Forest Division. Implementation of the AI-backed tracking system immediately showed results as it managed to save five elephants that were

perilously closer to the railway tracks. These elephants were part of a larger herd consisting of 28 elephants.

Rourkela and its nearby areas have criss-crossing railway tracks. And the place has an infamous history of elephant deaths due to collisions with

moving trains. Two months ago, one elephant died and another injured near Bisra.

'Keeping these facts in mind, I thought about devising an alarm system with 24 hours monitoring at my office so that precious wild lives can be saved. And AI came as an answer to that," said the DFO. When the towers were established, a chief engineer from Indian Railways visited the spots along with the forest officials.

At this moment as part of the pilot project in Odisha four towers have been set up at strategic locations. "The cameras have the capacity to send real-time pictures to our control room 24x7," informed the officer. During night the thermal images appear at the control room, making it easier to keep track of things like forest fire, poaching, jumbo deaths due to collision of

"Our mock drills using our staff as poachers to spot at night have been successful," he asserted. Each tower costs ₹52.8 lakh for installation and maintenance throughout the year.

AI camera helps nab poachers in Similipal

Baripada, Jan 28: Forest department officials Tuesday arrested two poachers using artificial intelligence (AI) cameras at Similipal Wildlife Sanctuary in Mayurbhanj district. The accused were identified as Rajkishore Naik, 29, of Nachhipur village, and Kalicharan Dehuri, 23, of Pagadadihi village under Kaptipada police station.

The department seized five country-made firearms, explosives, and hunting equipment from the accused. During a raid at their homes, officials also confiscated a Sambar deer horn, a spotted deer horn, two snares, a bow, and three arrows. A case has been filed against the poachers under Wildlife (Protection) Act, and they have been sent to court. Additionally, a separate case will be filed under Arms Act for illegal posses-




sion of firearms, according to Samrat Gouda, deputy director of Similipal Tiger Conservation Project, Southern Division.

According to sources, five poachers had entered

south-western core region of the Similipal Sanctuary with the intention of hunting wildlife. The AI cameras in the forest captured their images. prompting an immediate alert to the authorities. Forest department personnel, along with a special enforcement squad, launched a search operation during which the poachers were apprehended. However, three others managed to flee. The department has requested the court to remand the accused for further investigation, and efforts to capture the absconding poachers are underway.

Despite the use of AI cameras to track poachers, hunting in Similipal remains a persistent issue. Poachers manage to breach security measures such as AI technology, watchtowers, all-terrain vehicles (ATVs), and sniffer dogs, and continue to hunt in the sanctuary's core areas. While smaller herbivorous animals, such as Sambar, spotted deer, and wild boar, are targeted, large-scale poachers, including those hunting elephants and tigers, continue to operate with increased sophistication.

Animal lovers have called for urgent action to fill vacant positions in Forest department and enforce stricter laws to completely eliminate poaching in Similipal.

AI Push

hen US President Donald Trump unveiled his government's plan for big investment for the development of artificial intelligence (AI) and United Nations Secretary-General Antonio Guterres issued a stark warning about AI's global threats at the recent World Economic Forum summit in Davos, the two underlined both the promise and danger that AI poses to the world.

Trump announced what he called "the largest AI infrastructure project in history" – a \$500bn joint venture between OpenAI, Oracle and SoftBank that aims to build a network of data centres across the US. The new partnership, dubbed Stargate, aims to construct essential data centres and computing infrastructure needed to power artificial intelligence development and, according to Trump, create more than 100,000 American jobs "almost immediately."

However, POTUS Trump and all the US tech companies as well as UN's Guterres must have hit a very bad patch in their respective careers when China launched the latest versions of DeepSeek and Kimi out of the blue a couple of days ago. Tech moves very fast. What America thought would be its moment in the sun was very quickly overturned by the Chinese announcement. While many may argue over the low cost that DeepSeek claims to have invested in its development, the Chinese have snooked the middle finger at the US. Analysts are of the view that DeepSeek's large language model can compete with US giants but at potentially a fraction of the cost. DeepSeek had already hit the top of the chart for free apps on Apple's App Store by Monday, and analysts said such a feat would be particularly impressive given how the US government has restricted Chinese access to top AI chips. Those who have used either or both of the Chinese apps vouch that these AI products are way beyond what OpenAI/ChatGPT or anybody in the US tech industry has ever imagined. The release of DeepSeek and Kimi gave such a jolt to the US stock markets that the American tech companies lost billions of dollars in market capitalisation in a single day. Semiconductor giant Nvidia alone has lost a whopping 590 billion dollars in its market value following a 16.9 per cent fall in its stock price on 27 January. Other Big Tech stocks also took heavy beating, and they pulled the Nasdaq composite index down 3.1 per cent. One can very well guess the disastrous effects of these Chinese apps. Undoubtedly, the Chinese launch has proven that the US is no more the sole tech leader of the world as was being touted till yesterday.

It is interesting to note here that eight years ago Russian President Vladimir Putin had proclaimed that mastering AI would make a nation the "ruler of the world." Western tech sanctions after Russia's invasion of Ukraine may have frustrated Putin's ambitions to lead in AI by 2030. However, it is not for nothing that one of Putin's first moves in 2025 was to align with China on AI development.

The upshot of the latest developments is that the AI race is as much about global influence as technological dominance. Significantly, Putin urges developing nations to unite to challenge the US tech leadership. But, without global regulation the whole AI push is fraught with immense risks. It would be pertinent to remember the prophetic words of Geoffrey Hinton, the AI pioneer and Nobel laureate. He had warned that the breakneck speed of progress may precipitate catastrophe for mankind. In the race to dominate this technology, he reminds the world, the greatest risk is not falling behind, but losing control entirely. It may also be pertinent to remind that such nay sayers have, in history, always warned about technological developments that would endanger mankind. Interestingly, till going to print, it has not done so.



AMERICA'S OWN RAID-RAJ

aghast as Donald Trump, the 47th President of the United States, runs riot. From an Indian perspective, the immediate fallouts stem from the evolving US immigration policy enforcement, given that an estimated four million Indians live and work in the US. This makes Indian Americans the second largest immigrant group in the US, after Mexico. But Indians are also said to be the third largest as a group among unauthorised immigrants in the US, behind Mexico and El Salvador, according to the Pew Research Centre. The number of such Indians is estimated to be between 725,000 (by Pew) and 375,000 (by the US-based Migration Policy Institute, MPI). The term being used for this category now is "illegal aliens," a derogatory and dehumanised framing that was banned under President Joe Biden but is now back in use under Trump. A statement of Jan. 26 by the **US Immigration & Customs** Enforcement (ICE) spoke of raids to keep "potentially dangerous criminal aliens out of our communities.'

Under Biden, the preferred usages were "undocumented non-citizen" or "undocumented non-US citizen" or "undocumented individual," in line with US seeing itself as "a nation of opportunity and of welcome." All that is history as the ICE police acquire a new and nasty edge, raiding homes, schools, bars and places of worships. Any mass operation of this kind will tend to stigmatise all Indians as the license to question, search and detain people is interpreted and executed in a variety of ways that inevitably lead to racial profiling, reinforcing negative stereotypes with minority groups as targets. All Indians save those at or near the top of the socio-economic ladder may well be living under a shadow of suspicion already. This marks a remarkable fall for a land where Indians are among the most visible

and most successful group of immigrants working often in mid and senior roles in corporate America and in the vast services sector

Reports coming in at the beginning of the week about "raids" on gurudwaras across the US in the search for undocumented Indians only serve to underline the severity of the strain that Indo-US goodwill and diplomatic relations will soon come under, if the trend continues beyond its initial frenzy and zeal. Already, we have on hand the reported deportation of some 18,000 Indians who allegedly are illegal migrants, so declared before Trump took office. On a national scale, the number is insignificant, but this is just the beginning, and it speaks of the speed and efficiency with which the process of deportations will likely play out in the US. The manner and time span in which the 18,000 are deported can serve to embarrass the Narendra Modi government and hurt Indo-US ties. It will bring new questions for an image-sensitive government that projects India as a growth engine while an increasing number of Indians, as alleged by the US, look to settle in a foreign land. For now, India is right in asserting that it will take back deportees after verifying that they indeed are Indian citizens.

It'll need deft diplomacy to negotiate relationships with

a mercurial Trump, who will likely fire away on multiple fronts, notably the threat of new tariffs and barriers and the scope and size of the H1-B visa programme where Indians are the top baggers. One response would be to lie low, to bide time and to allow Trump to settle. His bark may well be worse than his bite though the world and India must be prepared for nasty surprises. Do note that among recent Presidents, it was Barack Obama rather than Trump in his first term who deported the most people. George W. Bush (2001-2009) deported a little over a million. Trump in his first term (2017-2021) deported just 3.25 lakh whereas Obama (2009-2017) had almost 1.25 million deportations under his watch, according to a 2021 report by the US-based think tank, Cato Institute. Thus, so far, Obama stands with the title of "Deporter-in-Chief," but this was achieved as part of a carefully laid out policy rather than wildcat raids or arrests.

Modelling how Trump's push will play out or how many people will be deported has little value since the subject, i.e. Trump, remains tricky, unpredictable and fickle-minded. He may do irreparable damage, and yet, he may not really make much of a difference given that the flow of immigrants is essentially dictated by the market. Immigrants move to the US for a better life, but

without the strong pull from the US market that accommodates workers for economic reasons. They are a) available for hire. b) are cheaper to hire, c) are diligent and dependable and d) are willing to put in extra hours. At the mid and lower rungs, they are also exploited, bringing unnaralleled benefits for hirers.

So for purely selfish reasons, business lobbies may not be supportive of the raids for long. Yet, there remains the underlying risks of white supremacists in powerful positions leading deportation operations that will leave many scars for the Indian American population -- the most successful and productive of immigrant groups.

Reports coming in from the $\,$ US have already raised concerns within that country on US citizens being detained, questioned without access to a lawyer and allowed to go after several hours of detention. As of now, raids continue to expand in response to demands from the new administration that more numbers should be rounded up. Yet, such blunt instruments rarely succeed.

In 1902, the United States Commissioner General of Immigration, Terence Powderly, called for stricter health controls on immigrants at a time of peak migration and great diseases; during 1880-1924, 23.5 million immigrants came to the US, mostly through Ellis Island in the New York harbour – a port of immigration that was busy and corrupt. President Theodore Roosevelt in 1902 appointed a young lawyer, whose job it became "to root out dishonest inspectors who had been bilking immigrants of money in exchange for fraudulent naturalisation papers," writes Prof. Alan M.

America has of course come a long way from 1902, or has it?

resolutions this year L it's time to take stock of them. One month has passed and there's a good chance you fall into one of these three categories:

You have kept all your resolutions and are very proud of yourself. You're just waiting for the announcement that you've been awarded the Padma Shri.

You have kept some of your resolutions, but not others. (If you've kept 50 per cent of them, give yourself a passing grade.)

You have failed to keep any of your resolutions and have decided to maintain all your

bad habits until 2026. I made only two resolutions this year, one pertaining to reading and the other to writing. My writing resolution lasted two weeks, while my reading resolution lasted just two days. I was proud of my-

self for those two days though. Should I wait until 2026 to try again? No, I'm going to jump-start both resolutions

again on February 1. I'm go-tails. If only that were true! ing to climb back on the wild horse that threw me off, hoping that this time I'll be able to tame it.

Just because you've failed once doesn't mean you'll keep failing. For evidence of this, look no further than Donald Trump. It took him many tries, but he finally managed to stick to his habit of insulting someone every day.

Some of the good habits I have today, such as exercising regularly and brushing my teeth at night, are ones that I struggled to sustain for many years. But I kept trying and failing — until I finally succeeded.

There's a common belief that it takes 21 days for a new habit to form. If you just keep doing something for three weeks, it will be part of your routine and you won't need much willpower to keep it going. After pushing yourself to avoid alcohol for 21 days, you'll have no trouble sipping a Fanta at a party, while your friends are all enjoying cock-

Habits can take a lot longer than 21 days to form, as a

study co-authored by Dr. Ben Singh has shown. Singh and other researchers at University of South

Australia conducted a systematic review of 20 studies involving 2,601 participants and found that health-related habits take about two months to form, but this can vary considerably from one person to another. It might take my wife, for example, just four days to adopt the habit of going for an early-morning walk, but it might take me almost a vear to adopt the habit of waking up and saying, "Enjoy your walk, dear!"

The research team, whose study was published in the journal Healthcare, found that certain factors can help you be more successful in creating a new habit.

Frequency is important. It's easier to make a habit of something you do every day than something you do three times

ercise every day. Missing a few days due to illness is okay, but it's very important to get back into the routine right away. A habit is like a nervous dog you brought home from the animal shelter — you can lose it faster than you adopted it.

Timing is also important, Singh said. "If you add a new practice to your morning routine, the data shows that you're more likely to achieve it.

7 killed in Baghpat stage collapse

Baghpat (UP), Jan 28: Seven people died and about 60 were injured after a temporary wooden structure collapsed at a religious event in Baraut city of this district Tuesday, officials said.

The incident occurred at around 8 am during a programme organised for the 'Abhishek' of Lord Adinath on Shri Digambar Jain Degree College ground on Gandhi Road in Baraut, they said. A case has been registered against a contractor in connection with the incident, the officials said, adding a magisterial inquiry has been ordered.

The victims have been identified as Saadhna (17) and seven-year-old Radhika. The other three persons -- all men -- are yet to be identified, they added.

SC gives 6-day custody parole to Tahir Hussain PRESS TRUST OF INDIA

New Delhi, Jan 28: The Supreme Court Tuesday granted six-day custody parole to former AAP councillor and February 2020 riots accused Tahir Hussain, who is contesting on a AIMIM ticket, to campaign for Delhi Assembly polls.

Custody parole entails a prisoner being escorted by armed police personnel to the place of visit.

A full bench comprising Justices Vikram Nath, Sanjay Karol and Sandeep Mehta allowed Hussain's plea to campaign in police custody from January 29 to February 3.

The court said he would only be allowed to leave jail along with security for 12 hours, according to the jail manual.

The top court said the former councillor could walk out of jail at around 6 am and return by 6 pm. The bench said Hussain's custody parole would be subject to the deposit of Rs 2.47 lakh per day as part of security expenses, including the police escort. Hussain, said the court, should not visit his Karawal Nagar home, an alleged site of the riots, while restraining him from making any public comments over the case's merits.

It clarified the order will not be treated as a precedent as it was passed in the "peculiar facts and circumstances" of the case. The court said Hussain's bail application in the Delhi High Court should be decided on its own merits without being influenced by the bench's order. Senior advocate Siddharth Aggarwal, appearing for Hussain, argued only four-five days were left to campaign.

Aggarwal said his client was contesting from the Mustafabad seat and he won't visit his house and stay at a hotel aside from sharing the details.

SAIF ATTACK CASE

Police claim strong proof against Shehzad

Mumbai, Jan 28: The Mumbai police probing the attack on Bollywood actor Saif Ali Khan said they have ample and strong evidence against the Bangladeshi national arrested in the case.

Khan was attacked in the early hours of January 16 at his Bandra residence in Mumbai, where he was stabbed six times. On January 19, the police arrested Bangladeshi national Shariful Islam Shehzad Mohammad Rohilla Amin Fakir alias Vijay Das from neighbouring Thane in this connection.

In a press conference, Additional Commissioner of Police (West Region) Paramiit Dahiya shared the development in the probe, and said it was an "excellent, proof-based detection" made by DCP Zone 9 team along with the crime branch. "The Mumbai police have

ample and strong evidence against the accused person, including documentary, physical and technical," he said. "As for ascertaining the iden-

tity of the accused as part of evidence collection before the

filing of the chargesheet, the police have an option of face recognition and we will explore

it," he said.

The police are questioning the people he was in contact with, he added. "We have sent the samples of fingerprints to the Crime Investigation Department (CID). As on today, we have not received any official report about his fingerprints, he said. "The arrested accused is the same (person involved in the attack) and the police have oral, physical and technical evidence against him," he said add ing that they will produce all the evidence before the court.

Last week, Mohammad Ruhul, the father of Shariful Islam, claimed that his son was being framed in the case and that he would soon approach Bangla desh's foreign ministry and the Indian High Commission for his release. Ruhul alleged that the man seen in the CCTV camera footage was not Shariful.

New Delhi, Jan 28: With several INDIA bloc parties backing the Aam Aadmi Party for the February 5 Assembly elections in Delhi, Trinamool Congress and Samajwadi Party leaders are set to campaign for the Arvind Keiriwal-led outfit, leaving aside the Congress, the largest constituent of the Opposition bloc.

Formed ahead of the 2024 Lok Sabha polls to challenge the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), the IN-DIA bloc includes the Congress, Aam Aadmi Party (AAP), Trinamool Congress (TMC) and Samajwadi Party (SP) as its key constituents, among others.

Some other member of the bloc, including the Nationalist Congress Party (SP) and Shiv Sena (UBT), have also extended their support to AAP for the Delhi polls. A source told PTI that actor-politician and TMC MP from Asansol, Shatrughan Sinha, will canvass for AAP in at least three constituencies February 1-2 These include former Chief Minister Arvind Keiriwal's constituency New Delhi, Chief Minister Atishi's Kalkaji, and Jangpura, where the party has fielded its senior leader Manish Sisodia. Sinha, who hails from Bihar, could mobilise Delhi's Purvanchali voters, a term that refers to primarily Bhoipuri-speaking migrants from Bihar and eastern Uttar Pradesh.

BHUBANESWAR: Mining conglomerate Vedanta Tuesday said the company's Rs 1-lakh crore aluminium refinery and smelter project will be set up in Rayagada district the first phase of which is to be commissioned in the next three years, company Chairman Anil Agarwal said.

Speaking on the sidelines of Utkarsh Odisha-Make in Odisha, Agarwal said, "We will establish the aluminium refinery of 6 MTPA capacity and aluminium smelter of 30 lakh tonne capacity in Rayagada district. The total investment will be around Rs 1 lakh crore.'

"The JSW (Group) will set up a 5-MTPA steel plant in Keonjhar district at an investment of around Rs 35,000 crore," Industries department Additional Chief Secretary Hemant Sharma told reporters.

Keonjhar district is located in the iron ore reserves belt, and the minerals were being exported to other areas from the district. As a result, the locals did not get any benefit from the mineral resources, Jindal said.

Police can't serve notice via WhatsApp: Top court

New Delhi, Jan 28: The Supreme Court has said police cannot serve notices to accused persons through WhatsApp or other electronic modes under the Criminal Procedure Code or Bhartiya Nagrik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023.

A bench of Justices M M Sundresh and Rajesh Bindal directed all states and union territories (UT) to issue appropriate directions to police for issuing notices under Section 41A of CrPC, 1973 or Section 35 of BNSS, 2023 only through the mode of service permitted under the law.

"All the states/UTs must issue a standing order to their respective police machinery to issue notices under Section 41-A of CrPC, 1973/Section 35 of BNSS, 2023 only through the mode of service as prescribed under the CrPC, 1973/BNSS, 2023," the bench said on January 21. The top court went on, "It is made amply clear that service of notice through WhatsApp or other electronic modes cannot be considered or recognised as an alternative or substitute to the mode of service recognised and prescribed under the CrPC, 1973/

BNSS, 2023." The direction came when the court accepted a suggestion by



senior advocate Sidharth Luthra, appointed amicus curiae in the matter.

Luthra flagged instances where a notice under Section 41-A of CrPC, 1973 was sent through WhatsApp, but the accused did not appear before the investigating officer. He said the police machinery must not circumvent the mandate of Section 41-A of CrPC, 1973 or Section 35 of BNSS, 2023 by serving notices via WhatsApp or other electronic modes, instead of following the normal mode of service.

The court passed the directions on plea related to the case of Satender Kumar Antil who was assistant provident fund commissioner at Regional Office EPFO in Noida. He was booked under the Prevention of Corruption Act by the CBI. The court had passed a slew of

directions in his case and recommended the Centre to introduce a special enactment in the nature of a "Bail Act" to streamline the grant of bail.

The top court had appointed Luthra to assist the court in the matter and submit suggestions on various issues including grant of bail, issuance of notice by police etc.

The bench further directed all high courts to hold its respective committee meetings to ensure both its past and present decisions were implemented on a monthly basis "at all levels" and monthly compliance reports were submitted by the authorities concerned.

The apex court directed the registrar generals of high courts and chief secretaries of all the states and UTs to ensure compliance within three

Man kills wife, flushes dismembered remains

Hyderabad, Jan 28: An ex-serviceman allegedly murdered his wife, dismembered her body, crushed her bones into powder and flushed down the remains in a toilet, all during a day-long 'operation', police said Tuesday after arresting the accused.

Giving the chilling details of the crime, police described the act as "rarest of rare" and of "barbaric nature"

Rachakonda Commissioner Sudheer Babu said P Gurumurthy (39) was arrested after he gave a "confessional" statement that he killed his wife and then cut her body into small parts, boiled them and later burnt them before crushing the bones into powder.

The accused left his two children at a relative's house with an intention to murder his wife Madhavi (35). On January 16, he had an argument with her and later smashed her head against the wall due to which she fell down, Babu told reporters here.

The accused later strangulated the hapless victim to death. Seeking to cover up the murder, he cut his wife's body into small parts, which he placed in a bucket. He then heated the water using a water heater, boiled the parts, and later burnt them on the single burner gas stove, the police official said.

After that, the accused crushed the bones with a stone roller into powder. The bone powder and small pieces of flesh were disposed of in the toilet, flushed with water sev-

The leftover small bones (remnants) were kept in the household trash bin, intending to be disposed of later. To minimise the foul smell while burning, he kept the doors and kitchen windows open.

He carried out the grisly act of disposing of the body from 10 AM to around 6 PM January 16. Later, he cleaned up the bathroom by using detergent and phenyl to remove any traces of evidence. "I am not able to understand

how a person can behave like this. It is ultimate stature of barbaric nature. Utterly, rarest of rare ways of killing a person," the Commissioner told reporters.

Gurumuthy is a native of Prakasam district of Andhra Pradesh and was employed as a security guard with a defence establishment here. He had even accompanied

his in-laws when they lodged a complaint with the Meerpet police January 18. Police had registered a 'woman missing' FIR then Later, during police interro-

gation, Gurumurthy told them he had killed his wife and dismembered her body, following which the investigation was expedited. The accused had also dumped

some remnants of the body parts at a nearby lake, the po-

BJP richest party with ₹7,113Cr fund balance

New Delhi, Jan 28: The BJP, which claims itself as the biggest political party in the world, has a whopping cash and bank balance of ₹7,113.80 crore against the principal Opposition Congress party's ₹857.15 crore as on March 31, 2024, according to figures provided to the Election Commission.

The BJP spent as much as ₹1,754.06 crore during 2023-24 when Lok Sabha elections were announced, a whopping 60 per cent rise than ₹1,092 crore spent in 2022-23.

In comparison, the Congress spent as much as ₹619.67 crore during 2023-24, against ₹192.56 crore in 2022-23. The Lok Sabha elections were announced March 16, 2024. According to the figures provided to the EC in their annual audit reports the BJP has received voluntary contributions through the now banned electoral bonds of ₹1,685.69 crore during 2023-24 against ₹1294.15 crore in the previous year. The ruling party has also shown having received other contributions to the tune of ₹2,042.75 crore during the year, against ₹648.42 crore in

the previous year - 2022-23. In its audit report to the EC the Congress has shown having received total contributions of ₹1,225.11 crore during 2023-24, including ₹1,129.67 crore through grants, donations and contributions. This also includes ₹828.36 crore received through electronic bonds during the year ended March 31, 2024, which have now been banned by the Supreme Court.

"It is the freedom of speech as an overarching principle which permits one man's subaltern to be another man's naxal; it permits one man's freebie to be another man's welfare; it even

permits one man's martyr to be another man's militant.

NIA conducts raids at 6 locations in J&K

Srinagar/New Delhi: The National Investigation Agency (NIA) Tuesday conducted searches at six locations in Jammu and Kashmir in connection with the killing of two migrant workers from Punjab in Shaheed Ganj area of Srinagar last year. On February 7, 2024, Amritpal Singh and Rohit Masi -- hailing from Chamyari in Amritsai -- were shot by suspected Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) terrorists. Singh died on the spot while Masi succumbed to his injuries at a Srinagar hospital the next day. The NIA took over the probe June 15 last year on the directions of the Union Home Ministry. The NIA had earlier file charge sheet against four accused in the case. "The agency sleuths carried out the searches at the residences of three persons identified as Javaid Ahmad Sheikh, A R Shalla and Nisar Ahmad. Simultaneous raids were also carried out at two places in Srinagar, including a residential house and an office premises belonging to a man hailing from Sopore town," an NIA statement said.

UK cautions against

London, Jan 28: The UK government Tuesday updated its travel advisory for India for a second time within weeks to warn British nationals that they could be "fined or arrested" for carrying or operating satellite phones in the country without a licence.

The Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office (FCDO) reviewed the "Safety and Secu rity" section of its Indian advisory to flag that Britons have been arrested for bringing in such devices illegally to India.

"It is illegal to possess and operate satellite phones and GPS devices in India without a licence, even if you are only transiting through India,' reads the FCDO update.

"This may also cover other satellite-enabled devices, including handheld or cycling GPSs. You can be fined or arrested for possession of these devices without permission and the item can be confiscated," it cautions

The FCDO travel advice notes that a number of British nationals have been "arrested or detained for bringing satellite phones and other satellite-enabled navigational de vices" into India without prior permission and goes on to provide a link to the Department of Telecommunication to request a licence for any such devices in advance.

"Activities involving cameras and binoculars, like photography, birdwatching or plane spotting, may be misunder stood. Be particularly careful near military sites, government buildings, airports and railway stations," the advisory adds.

Belgrade (Serbia), Jan 28: Serbian Prime Minister Milos Vucevic resigned Tuesday, becoming the highest-ranking official to step down amid a wave of anti-corruption protests that have spread across the country.

The anti-government demonstrations sprang up in the wake of the roof collapsing at a railway station in the city of Novi Sad, killing 15 people and leading to calls for Vucevic to quit.

What began as small gatherings in Novi Sad have ballooned and spread to the capital Belgrade as students, teachers and other workers have turned out in their thousands to blame the station disaster on corruption within the government of President Aleksandar Vucic.

The minister for construction, transportation and infrastructure, and the trade minister have already stepped down because of the incident, but that failed to quell the protests. "I opted for this step in order

to defuse tensions", Vucevic told a news conference Tuesday, announcing his resignation. He said the mayor of Novi Sad would also resign "With this we have met all de-

mands of the most radical pro-

testers." The protests, which included students putting up a blockade at a main junction in Belgrade this week, have been largely peaceful. But three protesters in Novi Sad were attacked Monday and

blamed members of Vucic's Ser-

bian Progressive Party (SNS). A young woman sustained head injuries and was hospitalised

Vucevic said an investigation is underway. He blamed foreign interference for stoking the protests, without providing evidence.

The focus for many analysts now is how much this will affect the president, whose party easily won a snap election in 2023 but who has come under increasing pressure.

Opposition parties and rights watchdogs accuse him and the SNS of bribing voters, stifling media freedom, violence against opponents, corruption and ties with organised crime Vucic and his allies deny these allegations.

Mario Bikarski, senior Eu rope analyst at risk consultancy Verisk Maplecroft, did not expect Vucic to be forced out, in part because of a lack of trusted and viable political alternatives. But he expected the protests to continue.

Vucic is also seen as a strate gic player on the international stage in view of Serbia's his toric ties with Russia and the West. Serbia is a candidate to join the European Union, although it must normalise re lations with its neighbour and former province Kosovo.

The opposition Kreni-Prome ni party has called for an interim government made up of experts sanctioned by students who have led the protests. It has urged other opposition parties not to boycott elections if they



Pak's Senate passes PECA amendment bill

Islamabad, Jan 28: Pakistan's Senate or the upper house Tuesday passed the controversial cyberspace laws amidst protest by the Opposition and the media.

The Prevention of Electron ic Crimes (Amendment) Bill 2025 or Peca laws was moved by Minister for Industries and Production Rana Tanveer Hussain, days after its approval by the lower house.

The amendment adds Section 26(A) to the original Peca Act of 2016 to penalise perpetrators of "fake news" online, by providing that anyone who intentionally spreads, displays, or transmits false information likely to cause fear, panic, or unrest in society may face up to three years imprisonment, a fine of up to Rs 2 million, or both.

The bill now awaits President Asif Ali Zardari's assent to become law.



The changes add a key provision for the establishment of a Digital Rights Protection Authority (DRPA) tasked with regulating social media platforms and removing unlawful content. The DRPA will have powers to investigate complaints, remove content, and enforce digital ethics. The amendments also redefine social media platforms and mandate compliance from social media companies, which may require registering and appointing local represen-

The company had reported a net profit of ₹2,033 crore in the October-December quarter of last fiscal. Total revenue from operations was at ₹13,169 crore for the third quarter compared with ₹12,165 crore in the year-ago period, Bajaj Auto said in a regulatory filing. The company said it sold a total of 12,24,472 units in the third quarter, a 2 per cent increase over 12,00,997 units in the same period of last fiscal. Sales in the domestic market declined 9 per cent year on year to ₹7,07,105 units as against 7,78,281 units in the year-ago period.

Colgate-Palmolive profit down 2.2%

New Delhi: FMCG major Colgate-Palmolive India Ltd Tuesday reported a 2.22 per cent decline in its net profit to ₹322.78 crore for the third quarter ended December 2024 on account of soft demand in the urban market and a high base of the previous year. It had posted a net profit of ₹330.11 crore in the October-December quarter a year ago, according to a regulatory filing from the oral hygiene product maker Colgate-Palmolive India Ltd (CPIL). Its sales were up 4.74 per cent to ₹1,452.21 crore during the quarter under review compared to ₹1,386.41 crore in the corresponding period a year ago.

Stocks set for longest monthly losing streak in over 23 years

Mumbai, Jan 28: Indian stocks are on a four-month losing streak, set for their worst such run in 23 years as weak earnings, foreign outflows and economic uncertainty have taken the wind out of the sails of a market that hit record highs just four months back.

The Nifty 50 and Sensex have lost about 3% each in January, the second most in the four-month losing run. They have now tumbled 12.6% and 11.7%, respectively, from their record highs hit on Sept.

The slide started in October as the quarterly earnings reports started coming in.

About 60% of the Nifty 50 members posted results that either met or missed market estimates, their worst performance since March 2020, hurt by curbed government spending post-elections, above-nor-

"The national benchmark indices demonstrated optimism today, primarily driven by gains in the banking sector fol lowing the RBI's announcement of open market interventions to address liquidity concerns. Large-cap stocks outperformed, as their valuations have now reached fair levels and are further supported by expectations that the market correction is nearing its bottom," Vinod Nair, Head of Research, Geojit Financial Services, said. Among the Sensex shares, Bajaj Finance, Axis Bank, Bajaj Finserv, HDFC Bank, Tata Motors, Tata Steel, ICICI Bank, Mahindra & Mahindra, Zomato, IndusInd Bank Maruti Suzuki India and Bharti Airtel were the major gainers. Sun Pharmaceutical, Larsen & Toubro, ITC, HCL Technologies, NTPC, Power Grid, Nestle India, Tata Consultancy Services, and Asian Paints were among the laggards.

While the large-caps racked up records dating back to 2020 in October, the rest of the mar ket is only just catching up.

This month, the small-caps and mid-caps have plunged about 15% and 10%, respectively, in their worst monthly performance since March 2020.

In fact, the small-caps have fallen nearly 19% from their record highs notched in December 2024, while the mid-caps have dropped 15.5% from their all-time high.

Both indices are headed towards a bear market.

"Most small and midcaps stocks have gone up between 2x and even 6x in the last two vears. To justify where these stocks are trading at current levels with their earnings is extremely difficult in a dicey macroeconomic environment, said Mayuresh Joshi, head of equity research India at William O'Neil and Company.

RBI's liquidity booster to ease money market stress

New Delhi, Jan 28: The latest Reserve Bank of India (RBI) measures worth ₹1.5 lakh crore to inject liquidity into the banking system should ease the stress in money markets, while the start of bond purchases is also likely to drive rupee rates lower through signaling effect and expectation channel that RBI will avoid any tightening of liquidity conditions and will potentially need to do more open market operation (OMO) purchases, leading brokerages said Tuesday.

According to a note by HS-BC, the focus will now turn to the Union Budget on February 1 and more crucially, the RBI monetary policy committee (MPC) meeting February 7, with increasing prospects of a reduction in the repo policy rate (HSBC Economics forecast a 25 basis point cut in policy rate).

'We expect OMO auctions to purchase government bonds to lead to a compression of term premiums and we maintain our buy on 10-year government securities," it added.

The central bank will conduct three OMO purchase auctions of government bonds for an aggregate amount of ₹60,000 crore.

Three OMO auctions (Rs 20,000 crore each) will be held January 30, February 13, and February 20. Second, a six-month FX

swap (USD/INR buy/sell swap) auction of \$5 billion will be held January 31. This will be equivalent to about ₹43,000 crore of rupee liquidity. Third, a long-dated variable

rate repo auction (56-day) of ₹50,000 crore will be conduct-



ed February 7.

A 56-day term will ensure that banks' liquidity needs are covered through the end-March period.

According to a note by Emkay Global Financial Services, a turn in the liquidity cycle is a strong stimulant for domestic equities, and BFSI is the best way to play this in the short term.

"This is coupled with other positives -- earnings forecasts have held up through January 2025 and valuations are now more reasonable. This may not be the absolute low for the markets, but we think it is a good time to start nibbling into stocks where valuations are now reasonable," said Emkav Global.

Additional liquidity measures and a rate cut in Febru ary would have a more material impact, said brokerages.

"We believe, however, that this needs to be coupled with the easing of lending curbs imposed on banks and NBFCs since late 2023, especially on unsecured loans. This would bring back momentum to retail lending, and inspire a consumption bounce back in the second half of CY25. Given that the space for fiscal stimulus is low, this should be an important countercyclical imperative," Emkay Global

In total, Renew Exim DMCC will acquire a 72.64 stake in ITD Cementation India.

In October 2024, Renew Exim DMCC announced it had entered into an agreement to acquire a 46.64 per cent stake in ITD Cementation India from

its promoters for ₹3,204 crore. The acquisition also comes with an open offer by Renew Exim to acquire an additional 26 per cent stake in an engineering and construction firm from public shareholders for ₹2,553 crore, if fully subscribed.

The Adani Group expanded its cement business rapidly through a series of acquisitions. In 2022, it acquired Holcim's Indian assets, which made the conglomerate the country's second-largest cement producer.



The government's targeted incentives for fabrication facilities (Fabs) and outsourced semiconductor assembly and testing (OSATs), increased R&D investments and collaborative industry initiatives are key to propelling India's semiconductor sector forward, with significant investment commitments of over \$21 billion by the IESA member companies in last one year, said Ashok Chandak,

President of IESA. At the two-day 'Utkarsh Odisha' – Make in Odisha Conclave 2025' here, the industry body also launched "India Semiconductor Market Report 2030" in the presence of Union Minister of Railways and Electronics

and IT Ashwini Vaishnaw. The report highlighted key recommendations for achieving India's semiconductor ambitions, like continuing the 'Semicon India' programme beyond the initial outlay of \$10

billion and DLI scheme with some modifications.

Other recommendations include setting a target of 25 per cent local value addition by 2025-26 and 40 per cent by 2030 in electronics manufacturing PLI benefits.

The report presents an indepth analysis of India's semiconductor market from 2023 to 2030, covering key industries such as handsets, IT, telecom, consumer electronics, automotive, aerospace, and defence.

It also provides actionable insights into critical components like processors, memory, connectivity, and power solutions, along with recommendations for increasing local sourcing.

Dr V Veerappan, Chairman of IESA, said that India's semiconductor consumption market is valued at \$52 billion in 2024-25 and is expected to grow at a robust CAGR of 13 per cent through 2030.

"Sectors like automotive and industrial electronics present significant value-addition opportunities. Mobile handsets, IT, and industrial applications. which together contribute near ly 70 per cent of the revenue remain the primary growth

drivers," he informed. The report also emphasised the need for innovative R&D to focus on list of high-priority products that cater to domestic and global markets.

DeepSeek founder started out as low-key hedge fund entrepreneur

Bangkok, Jan 28: The 40-yearold founder of China's Deep-Seek, an AI startup that has startled markets with its capacity to compete with industry leaders like OpenAI, kept a low profile as he built up a hedge fund and then refined its quantitative models to branch into artificial intelligence.

Liang Wenfeng, who founded DeepSeek in 2023, was born in southern China's Guangdong and studied in eastern China's Zhejiang province, home to e-commerce giant Alibaba and other tech firms, according to Chinese media reports.

The hedge fund he set up in 2015, High-Flyer Quantitative Investment Management, devel-

oped models for computerised stock trading and began using machine-learning techniques to refine those strategies.

Like many Chinese quantitative traders, High-Flyer was hit by losses when regulators cracked down on such trading in the past year. However, it reportedly manages \$8 billion in assets, ample resources for funding DeepSeek's AI re-

It also has abundant computing power for AI, since High-Flyer had by 2022 amassed a cluster of 10,000 of California-based Nvidia's high-performance A100 graphics processor chips that are used to build and run AI systems, according to a post that summer on Chinese social media platform WeChat.

The US soon after restricted sales of those chips to China

origin or educational history." "If you are referring to the founder of DeepSeek, details about his personal life or academic background have not been disclosed publicly. For more information about Deep Seek, you can visit its official website," it said.

Liang's focused approach fits in with his determination to push AI learning forward. After decades of relying on innovation from the West, he says China should be making its own contributions

"What we see is that Chinese AI can't be in the position of following forever. We often say that there is a gap of one or two vears between Chinese AI and the United States, but the real gap is the difference between originality and imitation," he said in another Waves interview in November. "If this doesn't change. China will always be only a follower — so some exploration is inescapable.'

Indian batters falter against England

Rajkot, Jan 28: Indian batters faltered against an incisive England bowling attack as the visitors raised their game in a must-win scenario to win the third T20I by 26 runs and keep the five-match series alive here

Mohammed Shami made a solid comeback to international cricket after 14 months but it was Varun Chakravarthy's bowling effort that stood out as his five-wicket haul helped India limit England to 171/9.

India should have chased down the target but the batters could only manage 145/9 in 20

India still lead the series 2-1 with the fourth game scheduled in Pune January 31.

While express pace combine of Jofra Archer and Mark Wood did the job in the powerplay, Adil Rashid applied the choke in the middle overs with a skillful display of leg-spin.

Unsettled by the extra pace of Archer in the first two games, Sanju Samson (3 off 6) fell to the England pacer once again while trying to hit a short of length ball out of the park.

opening partner Abhishek Sharma (24 off 14) played some crisp shots before falling to Brydon Carse.

Suryakumar Yadav (14 off 7) started with a trademark pick up shot off Archer that went all the way but a similar shot attempted off Wood brought about his downfall, extending his lean run.

The turning point of India's innings was the dismissal of Tilak Varma (18 off 14) who had returned not out in his last four outings including two hundreds and a half-century.

It took a special ball from Rashid to send back Varma as the leg-spinner got one to turn sharply from outside the off-stump and crash into the middle stump.

Hardik Pandya (40 off 35)

took the game deep but was not able to take his team over the line.

Earlier, England lost their way after a whirlwind fifty from Ben Duckett (51 off 28) as the in-form Chakravarthy ran through the opposition batting on a flat track.

From 83 for one, England slipped to 127 for eight before Liam Livingstone (43 off 24) went on a six-hitting spree to end the innings on a high.

Chakravarthy completed his second five-wicket haul in T20s when he bowled Jofra Archer with a googly. While Ravi Bishnoi (4/46 in 4 overs) and Washington Sundar (0/15 in 1) proved expensive, Chakravarthy (5/24 in four), Hardik (33/2 in 4) and Axar Patel (1/19 in 3) kept things tight from their end.

Shami (0/25 in 3) did not set the stage on first but it was important that he had an incident free outing

After being put in to bat, England made a promising start by coasting to 52/1.

England have struggled against the Indian spinners in the series but Duckett overcame that challenge with some audacious strokeplay on way to his second T20 fifty. He danced down the track, employed the scoop and reverse hits to unsettle the opposition attack.

He was the aggressor in his 76-run stand with skipper Jos Buttler (24 off 22) but the duo fell in quick succession to lose the momentum in the middle overs. Among the shots Duckett pulled off included a scoop over the keeper's head off Shami's second over.

When Shami marked his run up before toss, it was confirmed that he would be playing his first international since the ODI World Cup final in November 2023. On a flat track, Shami, who replaced Arshdeep Singh as the sole specialist pacer in the playing eleven, was tasked with bowling the opening over

He induced a couple of play and misses in his opening spell that read 0/15 in two overs. Shami returned to bowl the 19th over which went for 11 runs, capping off an incident free outing.


Kohli checks in after a decade
