Ex-Malkangiri DM faces arrest warrant

Malkangiri, Feb 3: A court here has issued a non-bailable warrant (NBW) against IAS officer Manish Agarwal for not appearing before it in connection with the death of his personal assistant (PA) Deba Narayan Panda during his tenure as the Malkangiri Collector in 2019.

Malkangiri Sub-Divisional Judicial Magistrate (SDJM) court has issued the warrant against the officer while hearing a case relating to the death

of Panda.

Panda, who had gone missing December 27, 2019, was found dead near Satiguda reservoir under Malkangiri Sadar sub-division the next day. His wife. Banaja Panda, later filed a case alleging that Agarwal and three others were responsible for his

In its order passed February 1, the judge said, "It is observed that by keeping in view the importance of the case record, I found the law is well settled that the accused can avail the benefit of dispensation of personal attendance but the same cannot be claimed as a right.'

Raj to make conversion non-bailable offence

Unlawful religious conversion will soon be treated as a cognisable and non-bailable offence in Rajasthan, as the Assembly Monday introduced a Bill to this effect. The Rajasthan Prohibition of Unlawful Conversion of Religion Bill, 2025 makes religious conversion by misrepresentation, force, undue influence, coercion, allurement or by any fraudulent means or by marriage an offence triable by court. The Bill has provisions of imprisonment for a term up to 10 years and a fine of up to ₹50,000. The development comes a few days $after\ the\ Uttarakhand\ government\ implemented\ Uniform\ Civil\ Code$ (UCC) aiming at establishing a unified set of personal laws governing matters such as marriage, divorce, adoption, inheritance, and maintenance for the people of the BJP-ruled state

Jaipur, Feb 3: The Rajasthan Prohibition of Unlawful Conversion of Religion Bill, 2025 was introduced in the ongoing Budget Session of the Assembly

The offence under the anti-conversion Bill will be cognisable and non-bailable and triable by a court. The Bill is aimed at prohibiting unlawful conversion from one religion to another and has provisions for imprisonment of up to 10 years and a fine of up to ₹50,000.

It was introduced by Health Minister Gajendra Singh Khinvsar and will be passed by the House following a debate during the session.

Religious conversion by misrepresentation, force, undue influence, coercion, allurement or by any fraudulent means or by marriage has been made an of-

fence in the Bill. The Bill provisions imprisonment for a term not less than one year but it may extend to five years with a fine of ₹15,000. Those who violate the rules in respect of a minor, a woman

or a person belonging to the Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribe shall be punished with imprisonment for a term of two years which may extend to 10 years along with a fine of ₹25,000. The Bill provisions three years' jail extending up to 10 years and a fine of ₹50.000 in

case of mass conversion. However, those who desire to convert his/her religion shall give a declaration in the prescribed form at least sixty days in advance, to the District

Magistrate. According to the aims and objectives of the Bill, the Constitution of India guarantees religious freedom to all people

which reflects the social harmony and spirit of India. The objective of this right is to sustain the spirit of secularism in

"In the recent past, many such examples have come to light where gullible persons have been converted from one religion to another by misrepresentation, force, undue influence, coercion, allurement or fraudulent means.

The law related to the right to religious freedom already exists in various states of the country but there was no statute on the said subject in Raiasthan. In view of the above. it was decided to enact a law to provide for prohibition of unlawful conversion," the Bill states. As per the Bill, the court shall also grant appropriate compensation payable by the accused to the victim of said conversion which may extend to a maximum of ₹5 lakh. The Bill proposes double punishment for repeat offenders.

Bhubaneswar, Feb 3: Union Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw Monday said the Centre has allocated ₹10,599 crore for development of railway infrastructure in Odisha in the Union Budget for 2025-26 financial year. The amount is ₹13 crore more than the allocation made in the previous Budget.

Addressing a presser in New Delhi, Vaishnaw said the present allocation is a 12.5-fold rise compared to ₹838 crore earmarked during 2009-2014. The Centre had allocated ₹10,586 crore for the rail sector in Odisha in the 2024-25 Budget.

The minister said that over 2.046 km of new tracks have been constructed in Odisha since 2014, surpassing Malaysia's entire rail network in scale. Also, the coastal state has achieved 100 per cent electrification with 1,516 km of track electrified.

Vaishnaw said currently, 48 new track projects are underway, with a total of 4,784 km of tracks being developed at an investment of ₹73,723 crore.

The Budget includes ₹2,379 crore for the development of 59 stations across Odisha, including key hubs like Bhubaneswar, Cuttack, Puri, Sambalpur, and Rourkela.

The minister said Odisha has received over ₹10,000 crore for railway development in each of the past three years, contributing to a total investment of ₹78,000 crore in the state's railway sector Furthermore, an additional ₹20,000 crore worth of projects have been sanctioned during the current government's tenure.

Currently, six Vande Bharat trains are running across Odisha, connecting 17 districts and 25 unique stoppages, offering modern, high-speed travel for passengers, he said.

"Since 2014, 522 rail flyovers and under-bridges have been constructed. Additionally, 43 lifts, 18 escalators, and Wi-Fi have been installed at 234 stations. The multi-tracking project from Kolkata to Chenna is progressing rapidly, with significant work completed between Kolkata and Bhadrak. Third line work is already underway, and the fourth line will be processed in the future," he

"The Rail Budget 2025 signals a new era for Odisha's railway infrastructure, bringing unmatched growth, modernisation, and connectivity to the state. The ongoing projects and future investments will strengthen Odisha's position as a key player in India's railway network and contribute significantly to regional economic growth," the minister

RUPEE SINKS TO Beyonce first Black woman to win Best Country Album

Two days after US President Donald Trump announced to impose a punishing 25% tariff on imports from its long-time allies Canada and Mexico, apart from 10% duty on Chinese goods, and a subsequent retaliation by the allies, the impact was largely felt back here in India as the rupee plunged to 87.28 per US dollar before closing at 87.1850, the biggest single-day percentage loss since January 13

Mumbai, Feb 3: The Indian rupee fell to a record low Monday after US President Donald Trump slapped tariffs on imports from the country's three biggest trade partners, stoking fears of a trade war that rattled global financial markets.

The primary reason behind the depreciation of rupee is stated to be the strengthening of US dollar index (approaching 110),

which has been bolstered by

robust US jobs data and higher interest rate expectations. Dollar forward positions have also lined up as rising treasury yields continue to remain attractive.

Asian currencies also slumped after the dollar rallied on Trump's sweeping tariffs that impose a 25 per cent levy on Mexican and Canadian imports into the US, while those from China will attract a 10 per cent charge. The tariffs kick in Tuesday.

Asian and European stocks fell Monday, while US equity futures pointed sharply lower. The Mexican peso tumbled more than 2% to touch its lowest in nearly three years, while the offshore Chinese yuan fell 0.3 per cent.

While intermittent dollar sales from state-run banks helped limit the rupee's decline, the absence of stern intervention by the central bank was seen by many traders as an affirmation that it is allowing the rupee to move in line with its peers.

Los Angeles, Feb 3: Beyoncé Knowles-Carter made history at the 2025 Grammy Awards with 11 nominations and 2 wins, bringing her total to 34 Grammys. She became the first Black woman to win Best Country Album for Cowboy Carter.

The superstar singer triumphed over Taylor Swift, Billie Eilish and others to claim the trophy that had eluded her even as she collected more lifetime Grammys than any other

"I just feel very full and very honored. It's been many, many years," Beyonce said on stage, standing next to her daughter Blue Ivy Carter.

Beyonce's win came on her fifth nomination in the album category. She earned three trophies in total Sunday, bringing her career haul to 35

"Pink Pony Club" singer Chappell Roan was named best new artist and used her time on stage to urge record labels to pay musicians a living wage with healthcare benefits. She recalled a time when she felt "dehumanized" to not have health insurance. "Labels - we got you, but do you got us?" she said.

Swift, who has won album of the year a record four times and was nominated for "The Tortured Poets Department," was shut out this time. She took the stage once to present the Grammy for best country album, an honor that went to Beyonce.

In other tributes to Los Angeles, Lady Gaga and Bruno Mars sang "California Dreamin'.' Firefighters handed out the album prize and received a standing ovation. In between awards, the show wove in vignettes about a florist, a skate shop and other small businesses working



to recover from the fires.

The Grammys also remembered influential music producer Quincy Jones, who died in November. Stevie Wonder led the crowd in singing the famine relief anthem "We Are the World" with a choir of students from schools destroyed in the wildfires, and Janelle Monae performed Michael Jackson's "Don't Stop 'til You Get Enough."





HC asks theft accused to plant saplings while granting bail

Cuttack, Feb 3: The Orissa High Court Monday granted bail to a person, accused of theft, on the condition that he will have to plant at least 200 saplings in and around his village and maintain those for two years.

This was one of several conditions for allowing bail to the accused. Justice SK Panigrahi allowed the bail application of Manas Ati of Jharsuguda district who was arrested by Kolabira Police December 25 last year for allegedly stealing at least six electric poles, worth over ₹2 lakh, of

a power supply company. Without going into the merits of the case and considering the fact that the bail of a co-accused in the case has already been enlarged, the high court directed the lower court to grant bail to



Mishap magnets: 20 killed on Keonjhar roads in Jan

Keonjhar, Feb 3: The rising number of deadly road accidents in Keonihar continues to be a major concern with as many as 20 lives lost in January alone this year in the mineral-rich district. Despite the district administration's efforts, such as organising road safety awareness programmes, rallies, and enforcing measures against speeding, drunken and reckless driving, the roads have become increasingly unsafe with major mishaps becoming the order of

A statistics of the mishaps and resultant loss of lives paints a macabre picture. According to official records. Keonihar district witnessed 698 accidents in 2024, 754 in 2023, 659 in 2022, 680 in 2021 and 649 in 2020

In the last five years, 1,865 fatalities have been reported, further increasing public concern. In 2024, 393 people were killed on the district's roads and highways, in comparison to 395 in 2023, 378 in 2022, 345 in 2021, and 354 in 2020. More than half of these fatal accidents occurred on national and state

Since 2005, a total of 5,779 people have lost their lives in 11,242 road accidents in the

district. Thousands have been injured, with many rendered physically disabled with amputated limbs. These tragic incidents have also left many widowed or orphaned.

Additional Superintendent of Police, Keonjhar, Manoj Rout, identified poor road conditions and drunken driving as the primary causes of road accidents. He noted that low-quality road construction and the movement of heavily loaded iron ore trucks have severely damaged highways, making them death

Illegal truck parking on NH-20, NH-720, and NH-49 has also been a major factor contributing to accidents. The enforcement efforts to clear obstructions have been weak, especially in mining areas from Koira to Rimuli, leading to severe traffic congestion and accidents.


On Friday evening, two people were killed in a road accident near Sanabarabeda village under Ghatagaon police limits.



There has been growing public demand for strict action against government employees misusing the free rice distribution scheme meant for the poor. The issue has drawn administrative attention, creating panic among ineligible beneficiaries, the Block Development Officers (BDOs) of six blocks in the district said. In response, several officials at the district level have begun publicly disclosing the names of those returning their ration cards.

Despite earning monthly salaries ranging from ₹40,000 to ₹1 lakh, several government employees have fraudulently obtained ration cards meant for low-income individuals and those living below the poverty line. Many of them have been collecting free rice for years, while genuinely needy people in the district struggle to access government food security programs.

Some officials employed outside the district in established organisations have falsely claimed to be poor to avail of subsidised rice. In Dunguripali block alone, 176 government employees were found holding ration cards, of whom 46 have returned their cards. Similarly 37 in Binika block, two in Binika town, 35 in Birmaharajpur block, 21 in Sonepur block, 21 in Subarnapur town, 37 in Tarbha block. eight in Tarbha town, and 32 government officials in Ulunda block have returned their ration cards.

Following media reports, government authorities have launched an investigation. A probe team, including PEOs and supply assistants, has been formed. They are preparing lists of ineligible beneficiaries and collecting applications for the voluntary surrender of ration cards.

250 govt employees renounce ration cards after state's whip



Sonepur, Feb 3: Around 250 government employees in Subarnapur district have returned their ration cards, according to district administration data received by Monday evening.

The individuals returning their cards include lecturers, teachers, nursing officers, constables, and panchayat executive officers (PEOs). Officials expect the number to increase in coming days. The move came after the state Food Supplies and Consumer Welfare Minister Krushna Chandra Patra cracked the whip on ineligible beneficiaries receiving free rice with ration cards and warned of stringent action if they do not return their cards.

The Central and state governments provide free rice to impoverished individuals to combat hunger. However, reports suggest that well-off people have exploited the system, taking advantage of benefits meant for the poor. Some government employees and taxpayers allegedly obtained ration cards under the National Food Security Act (NFSA) and the state's food security programme through

In Subarnapur district, government employees have been accused of illegally obtaining ration cards meant for the underprivileged and collecting free ration every month. A report titled "809 government employees grabbed ration cards" was recently published in a premier Odia daily,

Gaza: Stark Choice

alestinians are returning home to northern Gaza, though hardly any structure of their homes still stands. Their hospitals, schools and other basic infrastructure have been reduced to rubble in the wake of incessant and systematic bombardment by Israeli forces. Yet, in the midst of destruction, scenes of tearful reunions are being witnessed almost daily since the cease-fire has come into force. The most telling fact about the return of a fragile peace in the area is that the devastated millions of Palestinians would rather rebuild their homes from the ruins than seek new settlements in Egypt, Jordan or anywhere else as proposed by US President Donald Trump. If forced to accept, that would be a repetition of the "nakba" catastrophe – that the Palestinians had faced way back in 1948 when

It is also significant that Trump's Middle East envoy, Steve Witkoff, is a real estate investor and a donor of Trump's election campaign, who was in Gaza to assess the ground situation. The real intent of Trump's proposal is clouded in mystery. No one is certain but it may be possible Trump is trying to please the Far-Right ruling Israeli faction posing as a friend of the displaced millions of Palestinians uprooted from their homes in Gaza for the past few months' of Israeli depredation. There is also speculation whether in the name of rebuilding Trump wants to secure contracts for US real estate business in which his family has a large share. At the end of his trip to the region 30 January, Witkoff said "almost nothing left" of Gaza and rebuilding the war-ravaged enclave could take 10 to 15 years. According to his report, people are moving north of Gaza to get back to their homes and see what happened. There is neither water nor electricity there.

His assessment comes days after Trump floated the idea that some Arab nations should get involved with and build "housing at a different location where they (Gazans) can maybe live in peace for a change." Any suggestion that Palestinians leave Gaza, territory they want to form part of an independent state, has been anathema to the Palestinian leadership for generations and repeatedly rejected by neighbouring Arab states since the Gaza war began in October 2023. Witkoff's claim that he had not discussed with Trump the idea of moving Palestinians from Gaza seems to have been meant for public

Also interesting to note is the fact that none of the neighboring Moslem countries that were shedding tears for Palestinian brethren, has come forward with tangible assurances, leave aside actual funds, for the reconstruction of the hugely damaged enclave.

It is anybody's guess how long it would take to rebuild Gaza and that cannot be an excuse for displacing the Palestinians who suspect it to be part of the old game of driving them away from their homes, never to get back. A UN damage assessment released this month showed that clearing over 50 million tons of rubble left in the aftermath of Israel's bombardment could take 21 years and cost up to \$1.2 billion. The debris is believed to be contaminated with asbestos, with some refugee camps struck during the war known to have been built with the material. It is also likely that the rubble may have human remains. The Palestinian Ministry of Health estimates that 10,000 bodies are missing under the debris which is quite likely.

The displaced Palestinians are mostly on foot, travelling through areas now majorly in ruins after 15 months of war between Israel and Hamas. About a million people were ordered out of northern Gaza as the Israeli offensive began in October 2023 following Hamas' attack on Israel.

While the terrible wrongs Hamas has done can never be condoned, its assertion that the Palestinians returning to their homes en masse is a repudiation against any suggestion of mass deportation is no exaggeration. Hamas spokesman Abdul Latif al-Qanou claims the scenes represent another failure of the occupation in achieving the goals of the war of extermination and destruction. It may indeed be a message of defiance to any new attempt to displace them but the cost to the innocents who never had anything to do with the Hamas as an organization is mind boggling. Trump's advice might be the best way forward for inhabitants of Gaza. Either they move their homes and lives far away or actively act against terror outfits like Hamas and Hezbollah. This stark choice now befalls the people of Gaza.

day is facing serious problems from the international and domestic fronts. That is the real situation juxtaposed against the vision of Viksit Bharat. Also, the dream of Viksit Bharat 2047 is less than 25 years away. One therefore expected another 1991 moment in this budget. However, the budget has disappointed badly.

While this disappointment is on many fronts, there are some high points. One high point is the relaxation in the income tax rates – no tax up to ₹12 lakh personal income. This will definitely increase the demand in the economy and give a push to growth. About ₹1 lakh crore will be added to the economy through this tax relaxation, and that will have a good multiplier impact. However, the impact will be limited and within our ₹330 lakh crore economy, Around 3.5 crore income tax payers cannot make radical changes in the demand.

Another positive point of the budget is its focus on agriculture, as it is "the key driver of the economy." Programmes like the national mission on high-yielding seeds, Dhan-Dhanya Krishi Yojana, promotion to pulses, and cotton mission are proposed in the budget. However, the funds allotted to agriculture have increased only marginally. The impact of these new programmes will be only marginal if at all.

Again, the focus on "investing on people" in the budget is also desirable. However, the funds allotted to health and education has not shown any significant increase. Though several schemes have been presented, the matching funds are not made available. In the case of education, ₹125638 crore was allotted in the 2024-2025 budget and ₹128650 crore for 2025-2026 - this shows a decline in real terms. Similarly, the increase in the budget for health to Rs

98311 crore also implies only a marginal increase in real terms. Though covering gig workers under insurance and increasing seats in medical education are good steps in the right direction, without additional funds, these programmes may not be effective. It also must be added that the government's focus on insurance has resulted in the neglect of public health services. What people want are good public health services, and not just insurance, which is accessible only when there is hospitalisation. As regards primary health services, the budget allocation to the National Health mission has declined in real terms. It is argued that state governments are expected to spend more on these two sectors; however, the reality is that most states are not spending enough on these sectors. Without strong human capital, economic growth on one hand and the wellbeing of the people on the other hand will suffer badly.

A careful scrutiny of the budget shows that the funds allotted to tribal development, social welfare and rural development including schemes like MGNREGA have declined in nominal or real terms. Also, funds allotted to the PM Poshan Yojana, Swachchata Mission, PM Sadak Yojana, fisheries, Jal Jivan Mission, PM Urban Awas Yojana and many other such schemes and programmes which concern the uplift of poorer and weaker segments have declined in nominal or real terms. In retrospect, the funds allotted to these programmes also appear to be highly underspent. This clearly reveals the actual lack of concern of the government for pro-poor programmes.

The government has not been successful in the field of providing productive employment. However, it took a positive step in the last budget by announcing apprenticeship programmes along with internship. But the government could spend only ₹300 crore out of ₹2000 crore allotted to this scheme last year. This perhaps reveals the government's actual low commitment to this field. This year again, the government has decided to promote the scheme. Let us hope that they are more committed this year.

Given the financial constraints (arising from huge financial incentives to the corporate sector, writing off their debts and frequently their tax evasion) on the one hand and pressure to reduce the fiscal deficit on the other hand, the budget has announced a fiscal ratio of 4.4 % this year. It is clear

change radically to expand fiscal space in the economy. Or the financial constraints will limit public expenditure on social sectors including employment and on development.

Overall, India needs 7 to 8% growth for 25 years continuously to become a developed economy. This does not seem to be plausible or possible at present. It appears that the government is neither able to define the term Viksit Bharat clearly and in detail nor has it been able to design the pathway to Viksit Bharat. For India to move from a per capita income of \$2,697 today to a per capita income of \$23,380 (ILO's benchmark) requires a different growth path. More of the same approach will not work.

The Economic Survey has highlighted trust deficit as a major obstacle to our development, but the budget has nothing to say about how this deficit would be removed. The government wants to ensure that "no one should be left behind" but there is nothing in the budget to assure us of this. $\,$ The rising inequalities in the country have been blatantly ignored. The concerns of a smaller, more affluent section have been covered while everyone else including the poorest are subject to indirect taxes income tax is reformed, but we

have no idea how GST will be! The problem really is that there is no open and free discussion on any policy or programme; there are no objective evaluations of these policies and programmes by experts. Without this openness we will not know what exactly is meant by Viksit Bharat and how to reach there.

As the world marks the tenth anniversary of the Paris climate agreement, there is a heightened sense of urgency about global warming, which has morphed from a future threat into a present emergency. On current trends, the cap on global warming envisioned by the Paris agreement – 1.5° Celsius relative to pre-industrial levels - will not be achieved, and holding this COP in Belém will highlight the pressure on the Amazon. one of the world's most beautiful regions, but also a climate tipping point.

Despite scientists' clear warnings that we are dangerously close to exceeding the planet's limits, emissions records continue to be broken. In 2023, the world generated 57.1 billion tons of greenhouse gases, leading to a carbon dioxide surface concentration of 420 parts per million. The last time Earth's CO2 concentration was so high was 14 million years ago. The Paris agreement's first decade helped the world to redirect the business-as-usual trajectory from an increase of 4-5°C by the end of

this century. As matters stand, if every country meets its 2030 climate targets, the global average temperature is expected to increase 2.6°C. Our role now, at COP30, is to create a roadmap for the next decade to accelerate implementation and to increase ambition to get us to 1.5°C.

Unfortunately, emissions and temperatures have continued to climb since 2015, and the geopolitical landscape has become more unstable and fragmented, with ongoing wars in Europe, Africa, and the Middle East, in addition to sharply deteriorating relations between the United States and China. International for a have become political battlegrounds, with little attention paid to the topic under discussion.

This shift was apparent at COP29 - dubbed the "finance COP" - in Baku, Azerbaijan. Some key developed-country governments adopted positions that served their short-term national interests, with no regard for the global consequences. Ultimately, delegates left Baku with an agreement on carbon-market standards and a pledge by rich countries to provide \$300 billion annually in climate finance for developing countries.

At last year's G20 summit, Brazilian President Luiz Inácio Lula da Silva urged member countries to bring forward their climate-neutrality targets from 2050 to 2040 or 2045, while UN Secretary-General António Guterres pushed for implementation of the new targets set in response to the global stocktake.

To enable developing countries to overcome the barriers to pursuing a low-carbon development path - namely, unsustainable debt burdens and high borrowing costs - the global financial architecture must support climate goals. In Belém, we must establish a credible strategy to mobilize \$1.3 trillion for developing countries and create a plan to align financial flows - public and private, national and international – with the Paris agreement targets.

Given the increasing frequency and severity of climate shocks, adaptation has become a top priority, especially in vulnerable communities. Focusing on adaptation does not imply reduced mitigation efforts. For much of the developing world, mitigation and adaptation happen simultane-

ously, as part of development. Every country must come to Belém committed to developing and implementing ambitious national goals, and to creating international enabling conditions that accelerate climate action that leaves no one behind. Only then can we make COP30 the climate turning point the world needs.

No strategy for inflation

Sir, Despite some positive measures, the Union Budget 2025-26 falls short of expectations in some key areas. There is no mention in the budget on structural reforms, there are no offers of incentives to spur private sector investment, and importantly the budget has failed to introduce any new healthcare scheme. Another major slipup is the lack of a clear strategy to tackle inflation which is hitting the common man hard. While the Economic Survey projected an easing of inflationary pressures, the budget did not outline concrete measures to address the root causes of rising prices. In spite of the fact that inflation continues to squeeze the middle class, the Union government is yet to present a robust plan to mitigate its impact. Also, expectations were high for significant investments in railway modernisation, electrification, and new routes. However, the sector has received an allocation of ₹2.55 lakh crore in FY 25-26 when compared with ₹2.62 lakh crore allocated for the previous financial year. This underwhelming budgetary support is likely to slow down the railway expansion projects and impact key stakeholders..

Sir, Over the years, though many tier-2 cities were connected by private domestic airliners, tier-3 cities still had a long way to go. The Economic Survey 2024--25 tabled in Parliament has said that 619 new air routes and 88 additional airports were connected through the Centre's "Ude Desh Ka Aam Naagrik" (UDAN) scheme, also called the Regional Connectivity Scheme (RCS) that saw the light of day in 2016 with a whopping 45,000 million budgetary provision for a period of 10 years. No respite for fisherfolk Illegal immigrations reshaping Delhi's demographics: JNU report

Since June 16, 2024, the Sri Lankan Navv has detained 425 Tamil Nadu fishermen and seized 58 fishing boats

Chennai, Feb 3: Ten fishermen from Rameswaram, Tamil Nadu, were arrested by the Sri Lankan Navy in the early hours of Monday for allegedly crossing the International Maritime Boundary Line (IMBL).

Tamil Nadu coastal police officials confirmed that the fishermen were detained, and their mechanised boat was seized by Sri Lankan authorities. The arrested fishermen, along with their boat, were taken to Jaffna, Sri Lanka. They will be produced before a local court and remanded to judicial

This incident follows a series of similar arrests in recent

On Sunday, January 26, the Sri Lankan Navy arrested 34 fishermen from Rameswaram and Thangachimadam and seized three fishing boats.

The detained fishermen were presented before the Killinochchi Court, which remanded them in custody until February 5. In another incident Tuesday, January 28, as many as 13 more fishermen from Rameswaram were arrested, and their mechanised boat was also seized.

Fishermen's associations have strongly condemned these repeated arrests, calling them a serious threat to their livelihood. In response to the recurring

Nadu fishermen staged a largescale protest in Rameswaram Friday, Janu-Fishermen

and their families participated in significant numbers, demanding immediate intervention from

Antony John, a fishermen's association leader from Rameswaram, expressed deep concern over the escalating arrests. "The Sri Lankan Navy is arresting our fishermen regularly. On Tuesday (January 28), they even fired at our men, injuring two of them. This has to stop," he said.

John further lamented that fishing in the Palk Bay is no longer safe, as fishermen are not only losing their livelihoods but also their boats and fishing equipment to Sri Lankan authorities.

Rajagopal CM, a fishermen's leader from Thangachimadam, criticised the government's inaction, stating that many detained fishermen remain in Sri Lankan prisons, leaving their families in severe financial distress

Fishermen's leaders also pointed out that since 2018, around 270 trawlers have been impounded, significantly affecting their ability to sustain their livelihood.

New Delhi, Feb 3: A new report from Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU) has highlighted the significant impact of illegal migration from Bangladesh and Myanmar on the socio-political, economic, and demographic fabric of Delhi-NCR.

The 114-page study, titled 'Illegal Immigrants to Delhi: Analysing Socio-economic and Political Consequences', reveals that political patronage plays a crucial role in facilitating the steady influx of undocumented migrants, primarily from Bangladesh and Myanmar, including the Rohingya refugees.

According to the findings, this illegal immigration has led to a "notable increase in the Muslim population" in the region, further transforming the city's socio-political dynamics.

In particular, it points to the competition for jobs in low-wage sectors, such as construction and domestic work, where migrant workers have driven down wages, while their exclusion from the tax system

the legitimate workforce. The report also underscores

the severe strain placed on Delhi's public infrastructure, including healthcare, education, water, and electricity.

Unauthorised settlements have resulted in overcrowded neighbourhoods and unplanned urban expansion, contributing to environmental degradation. "Illegal immigration to Del-

hi has significantly altered the city's demographic landscape, with a large influx of migrants from neighbouring countries like Bangladesh and Myanmar. These migrants often settle in overcrowded neighbourhoods such as Seelampur, Jamia Nagar, Zakir Nagar, Sultanpuri, Mustafabad, Jafrabad, Dwarka, Govindpuri, and many more, where they strain resources and disrupt local social cohesion," the report states.

The influx of these migrants is often facilitated by brokers and agents who help them cross the border, offering fake identification documents in exchange for money. This practice undermines legal systems places an additional burden on and electoral integrity, as ma-home countries

ny of these migrants can secure fake voter registrations.

"The environmental impact of migrant settlements includes unregulated waste disposal, which contributes to pol lution and public health haz ards. Migrants' involvement in informal housing markets has led to the proliferation of un safe and unauthorised housing posing risks to both residents and the environment," said the

"Illegal immigration has contributed to the proliferation of criminal networks, which exploit vulnerable migrants for activities such as smug gling and trafficking," it added

As per the report, political patronage has played a crucial role in enabling migration, "Intelligence reports suggest that local political leaders in West Bengal have provided citizenship documents to migrants. thereby creating a captive vote

It also explained that efforts to deport illegal immigrants are often delayed by bureaucratic challenges and the lack of cooperation from migrants

Elections again, 2020 Delhi riot survivors look back at unkept vows

New Delhi, Feb 3: The trust is gone. Five years after riots in northeast Delhi, that is the oft-heard refrain as locals adapt to their changed, polarised neighbourhoods. Shops and houses that were engulfed in flames have been rebuilt but reconstructing lives is quite another thing.

In Shiv Vihar, one of the places most impacted by the communal violence following clashes between supporters and opponents of the Citizenship Amendment Act, the memories linger - somewhat like the ever-present stench from a large



drain that seems never to have been cleaned.

"The area is calm now, but the trust is gone. People live in their own spaces without disputes, but

they no longer trust each other.

said Harpal Singh, a 68-year-old shop owner who moved to the locality 30 years ago

"When I moved here, this place was predominantly Hindu. Gradually, Muslim families also started settling here. Now, about 90 per cent of the Hindus have left after selling their property," he said. People are still selling their property and moving away because they are scared there will be a repeat of the violence, Singh added. Some Muslim families have also left

Mohammad Javed Ali echoes his sentiment, and also his words. "Before the riots, people lived together in harmony. Now, they talk to each other, but the trust is gone. People live side by side, but no one trusts anyone anymore," said the 36-year-old who works in an automobile repair shop in the area.

With its narrow lanes, broken roads and piles of garbage everywhere, Shiv Vihar is a world removed from the affluent colonies of the national capital.

The residents are in despair. acknowledging the grim everyday reality of their lives, the lack of basic amenities, the constant stress - and hoping that change is somewhere on the horizon, maybe with the elections February 5.

According to Singh, relief efforts after the 2020 riots were patchy. "Most of the relief went to Muslim families," Singh, who had to take refuge at a nearby Shiv Mandir for eight days during the riots, alleged.

Defamation case: Tharoor summoned

New Delhi: The Delhi High Court Monday summoned Congress leader Shashi Tharoor on a defamation plea filed by BJP leader Rajeev Chandrasekhar. Justice Purushaindra Kumar Kaurav posted the matter April 28. "Let the plaint be registered as a suit. Issue summons to the defendant (Tharoor). SC terms Maha Kumbh stampede 'unfortunate', asks petitioner to move **Allahabad HC**

New Delhi, Feb 3: Terming as "unfortunate" the January 29 stampede at Maha Kumbh where at least 30 people were killed, the Supreme Court Monday refused to hear a PIL for guidelines over safety of devotees and asked the petitioner to move the Allahabad High Court instead.

A bench comprising Chief Justice Sanjiv Khanna and Justice Sanjay Kumar said, "It is an unfortunate incident, something which is of concern. But you go to the Allahabad High Court."

The stampede took place on the occasion of Mauni Amayasya, one of the most auspicious days of the Hindu calendar, in which at least 30 people lost their lives and 60 were injured in a pre-dawn stampede at Sangam area in Prayagraj.

The bench noted the submission of the UP government, represented by senior advocate Mukul Rohatgi, that a plea was already filed in the Allahabad High Court and the

SC fixes Feb 12 to hear case against CEC, ECs appointments

New Delhi: The Supreme Court Monday fixed February 12 to hear pleas against ers under the 2023 law. A bench of Justices Surya Kant and N Kotiswar Singh said it would decide the issue on merit and finally. Advocate Prashant Bhushan, appearing for Association for Democratic Reforms NGO, said the matter was listed February 4 but not likely to be heard due to other matters. Bhushan, who referred to the superannuation of incumbent Chief Election Commissione (CEC) Rajiv Kumar February 18, said the matter required an urgent hearing as it was covered by the 2023 verdict of the Constitution bench. He said the 2023 verdict ruled the election commissioners couldn't only be appointed by the government, but by an independent committee comprising the Prime Minister, Leader of Opposition and Chief Justice of India or else it would be a threat to the electoral democracy. "They have brought an Act by which they have removed the chief justice and brought in another minister, effectively making the commissioners appointment only at the pleasure of the government. That's precisely what the Constitution bench said that it is opposed to the levelplaying field and our electoral democracy. You need to have an independent committee to appoint the election commissioners," said Bhushan.

SC dismisses plea alleging misuse of women-centric laws

New Delhi: The Supreme Court Monday dismissed a plea challenging certain provisions of the Dowry Prohibition Act and alleging misuse of women-centric laws. "You can go and raise all these grounds in Parliament," a bench of Justices BR Gavai and K Vinod Chandran told the counsel appearing for the petitioner. The petitioner's counsel said they were seeking to challenge certain provisions of the Dowry Prohibition Act, 1961, including sections 2 and 3. While section 2 of the Act deals with definition of dowry, section 3 pertains to penalty for giving or taking dowry. The counsel said the petitioner was concerned about these laws which adversely impacts men. The public interest litigation (PIL) names laws like the Dowry Prohibition Act, the Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act, and the provision on cruelty to women in the erstwhile Indian Penal Code to question their validity

Assembly polls: Delhi HC says no to plea against AAP minister nomination

New Delhi: The Delhi High Court Monday refused to hear a plea against the nomination of AAP candidate and Delhi minister Mukesh Kumar Ahlawat in the February 5 Assembly elections. Justice Subramonium Prasad observed the petition was not maintainable. "How is this petition even maintainable in law? Either you challenge (his previous) election on whatever grounds ... this is not maintainable," said the court. The plea was then withdrawn by the petitioner. The petitioner, who lives in Sultan Puri, said Ahlawat contested previous elections by concealing and withholding certain facts from the authorities. He alleged while contesting the 2013 polls, the AAP leader filed an affidavit before the election commission but did not disclose information about the criminal cases against him. The plea said the leader also concealed information over his income or assets and the number of his children and wives.



Deshmukh was abducted, tortured and murdered December 9, 2024, for allegedly trying to stop an extortion bid targeting an energy firm in Beed district.

The police have so far arrested seven persons in connection with the sarpanch's murder,

Asked if Munde had come to meet him, Jarange Monday said, "Everyone was meeting me during the elections. He (Munde) came to me and Walmik Karad was also with him at that time."

The activist said their process for contesting the state polls, held in November 2024, was going on at that time.

"I thought of not meeting them, but they were waiting outside. Then I went to meet them. There, Munde told me about him (Karad)," Jarange told reporters at a hospital in Chhatrapati Sambhajinagar where he is currently under-

Jarange said he then asked Munde if Karad was the one

cal support. "It is the same gang. He (Munde) and the other one (Karad) are seen in a photo together. They are misleading (investigation in the sarpanch case)," he charged.

Jarange further claimed that Andhale might have been kept in a nearby area.

"He has been kept hidden because he might know some secrets and truth may come out," the activist said without elaborating.

Pune: A gram panchayat in Maharashtra's Sangli district has passed a resolution supporting the use of ballot papers instead of EVMs in future elections to "protect the Constitution," a gram sabha member has said. Bahe village in Walva tehsil of Sangli district is perhaps the second village in western Maharashtra to pass a resolution discarding EVMs for ballot papers. In December, the gram sabha of Kolewadi village in Karad (south) constituency in Satara district resolved to cast votes in future polls on ballot papers. "The gram sabha in Bahe village passed a resolution recently supporting the use of ballot papers in all future elections instead of Flectronic Voting Machines. We also appeal to other villages and their respective gram panchavats to pass similar resolutions to safeguard and protect the Constitution and democracy," said a Bahe gram sabha member. The villagers submitted the resolution to the tehsildar, he said.



Surge in terror attacks

Islamabad: Pakistan witnessed a sharp increase in terror attacks in January 2025, surging by 42 per cent compared to the previous month, a think tank has said. Quoting the data released by the Pakistan Institute for Conflict and Security Studies (PICSS), Dawn reported Monday that at least 74 militant attacks were recorded nationwide, resulting in 91 fatalities, including 35 security personnel, 20 civilians and 36 militants. The report highlighted an intensified counterterrorism campaign by security forces, which led to elimination of at least 185 militants in January, making it the second deadliest month for militant casualties since 2016. The highest number of militants killed in a single month since 2016 was recorded in December 2024, when security forces neutralised 190 militants. The combined toll of militant attacks and security operations in January stood at 245 fatalities, comprising 185 militants, 40 security forces personnel and 20 civilians.

Syria car blast kills 19

Damascus: A car bomb exploded on the outskirts of a northern Syrian city Monday. killing at least 19 people, all but one of them women, and leaving more than a dozen wounded. hospital workers said. The dead included 18 women and one man, a nurse at the hospital. Taipei: US President Donald Trump's trade war with Canada, Mexico and China is ramping up over the production and importation of the opiate fentanyl, along with trade surpluses and illegal border crossings by migrants from across the globe.



China has reiterated its threat to take "necessary countermeasures to defend its legitimate rights and interests" following Trump's decision to impose 10 per cent tariffs on China for allegedly doing too little to stem the production of precursor chemicals for fentanyl. The Foreign Ministry statement issued Sunday did not mention any specific retaliatory measures, but said "China calls on the United States to correct its wrongdoings, maintain the hard-won positive dynamics in the counter-narcotics cooperation, and promote a steady, sound and sustainable development of China-US relationship." China says the US action violates World Trade Organisation rules and has vowed to bring a case before the body that governs global commerce.

Canadians cancel trips, ban US products

Toronto: Canadians have canceled trips south of the border, boycotted US alcohol and other products and even booed at sporting events after US President Donald Trump announced 25% tariffs on most of Canada's goods Saturday. Though Trump had pledged to put tariffs on Canada and Mexico before taking



office, the perceived act of economic warfare on a country that is so close to the United States culturally and geographically still came as a shock to many Canadians. "It feels like Trump wants to restructure the world order," Drew Dilkens, mayor of the Canadian border city of Windsor, said in an interview. "He's willing to start with his closest ally... If he's willing to do this to Canada, what's he willing to do to everybody else?" Trump slapped a 25% import tariff on all Canadian goods, except energy products, which will carry a levy of 10% while entering the United States.



RBI may cut interest rate by 25 bps: Experts

Mumbai, Feb 3: The RBI is likely to reduce the key interest rate by 25 basis points this week after keeping it on hold for two years, complementing the Union Budget initiatives to push consumption-led demand, though the sliding rupee continues to be a concern.

As the retail inflation has remained within the Reserve Bank's comfort zone (less than 6 per cent) for most of the year, the central bank can take rate action to boost growth hit by sluggish consumption, opined experts.

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has kept the repo rate (short-term lending rate) unchanged at 6.5 per cent since February 2023. The last time the RBI had reduced the rate was during the Covid times (May 2020) and thereafter, it was gradually raised to 6.5 per cent.

Newly appointed Reserve Bank Governor Sanjay Malhotra will be chairing his first Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) meeting starting Wednesday.

The decision of the six-member panel will be announced on Friday (February 7).

"There is a higher probability of a rate cut this time for two reasons. First, the RBI has already announced liquidity enhancement measures, which have improved conditions in the market. This appeared to be a prerequisite for cutting said Madan Sabnavis, Chief Economist, Bank of Baroda.

Sabnavis further said the Union Budget has provided a boost and it may be appropriate to lower the repo rate in tandem to support the same.

The Reserve Bank has announced measures to infuse Rs 1.5 lakh crore worth of liquidity



"We can expect some changes in the forecast on growth in particular as the NSO had projected 6.4 per cent for the year. It would be interesting to see if the RBI would provide a forecast for growth in FY26, though this normally is published in the April policy," he added.

Aditi Nayar, Chief Econo mist and Head -- Research and Outreach at Icra, opined that the growth inflation dynamics have improved since the De cember 2025 policy meeting. "We don't assess the fisca

stimulus provided by the Union Budget to have a significant bearing on inflation. Accordingly, we think the balance is tilted in favour of a rate cut in the February 2025 policy review," she said. However, if global factors

cause a further material weak ening in the INR/USD cross rate over the course of this week, then the anticipated rate cut may get delayed to April 2025. Navar added. Monday, the rupee plunged

New Delhi, Feb 3: A large contingent of investors from four European nation bloc EFTA and Israel are visiting India next week to explore business opportunities, Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal

The European Free Trade Association (EFTA) members are Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway, and Switzerland.

Visit of more than 100 investors from EFTA member countries assumes significance as it has signed a Trade and Economic Partnership Agreement (TEPA) with India on March 10, 2024.

Under the pact, India has received an investment commitment of USD 100 billion in 15 vears from the grouping while allowing several products such as Swiss watches, chocolates, and cut and polished diamonds at lower or zero duties.

The pact is expected to come into force by the end of this year. Goyal said EFTA representatives are coming with over 100 investors. More than 200 investors are expected to visit from Israel. The three-day visit will start from February 10.

"Big companies are coming. People with interests in technology and setting manufacturing units (are coming)," he added.

The EFTA bloc committed an investment of USD 100 billion -- USD 50 billion within 10 years after the implementation of the agreement and another USD 50 billion in the next five years -- which would facilitate the creation of 1 million direct jobs in India. This is a first-ofits-kind pledge agreed upon in any of the trade deals signed by India so far.

Praggnanandhaa beats Gukesh in "crazy, exhausting" final day tie-breaker to clinch Tata **Chess title**

Wijk Aan Zee, Feb 3: The Indian juggernaut in international chess remained unstoppable as Grandmaster R Praggnanandhaa fought through exhaustion and nerves to defeat world champion D Gukesh in a clash of compatriots to clinch the Tata Steel Masters title for the first time in his prolific career.

The bespectacled 19-year-old from Chennai, a city that has become the cradle of Indian chess, came from behind to upstage the 18-year-old world number three 2-1 in the tiebreaker of the event's 87th edition here Sunday.

This was after both players ended up tied on 8.5 points after losing their 13th-round games. While Gukesh lost to fellow Indian Arjun Erigaisi, Praggnanandhaa went down to Vincent Keymer of Germany.

In the tie-breaker, there was huge drama typical of two young players looking to win each and every game they played in the tournament as they played the tie-break.

"I am still shaking, it was such a crazy day. I don't know how to express. I didn't really expect to win. Somehow things went my way," Praggnanandhaa told the official tournament
