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### CM launches 'Bikashita Gaon, Bikashita Odisha'

Bhubaneswar, Feb 5: Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Wednesday launched the 'Bikashita Gaon, Bikashita Odisha' (BGBO) scheme for rural infrastructure developmental projects in the state.

He said the implementation of the scheme will end the divide between villages and towns and people in rural areas will get all facilities that are available in the urban areas.


The CM launched the scheme at Jankia village, about 30 km from here. He said the developmental activities under the BG-BO scheme will reach all 53,845 villages across the state in a span of five years. "We focus on the development of villages as 81 per cent of the state's population live in rural areas," Majhi said.

The BJP government has announced the BGBO scheme after replacing the 'Ama Odisha Nabin Odisha' (AONO) scheme launched by the previous BJD government. Majhi said the state government has made a budgetary provision of ₹1,000 crore under the BGBO scheme for the financial year 2024-25 and ₹5,000 crore will be spent in a span of five years. He, however, said that though the previous BJD government had launched the AONO scheme, it did not make any budgetary provision under it.

"The BJD government had launched the AONO scheme just before general elections in 2024 to mislead the people," Majhi said. Panchayati Raj and Drinking Water Minister Rabi Narayan Naik, local MLAs, and panchayat functionaries were present at the function.

The CM said the BGBO has the provision to take up various sustainable rural infrastructure developmental projects like roads, bridges, culverts, school buildings, civic amenities, kalyan mandaps, sports, and other infrastructure development.

"The facilities which are available in urban areas will be at the reach of people in villages and this is the objective of the scheme," he said, adding that villages dominated by tribals, backward class, and Dalit residents will get priority in the scheme.

### **Got ransom call for** ₹50L: Jaydev Jena

BHUBANESWAR: Senior Congress leader Javdev Jena Wednesday claimed he has received a ransom call demanding the payment of ₹50 lakh.The former Odisha Pradesh Congress Committee (OPCC) president has lodged a complaint with the Capital police station and mailed a letter about the incident to Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi, who also holds the Home portfolio, alleging complete collapse in law and order. "While returning home after addressing a press conference at Congress Bhawan Monday, I received a call from an unknown number... the caller, speaking in Odia, asked me to pay ₹50 lakh or face consequences. He also demanded ₹50,000 immediately. When I asked whether he would kill me if I didn't pay him, he said that cannot be ruled out," Jena told reporters. Asked whether any police action has been taken so far, Jena said, "Police told me they have taken the matter seriously but nothing has happened so far.

## **Trump vows Gaza takeover**

From calling Canada as the 51st state of America to laying claim over faraway Greenland, US president Donald Trump had already laid bare his expansionist agenda after winning the presidential polls in November last year. However, his astonishing remark about wanting the US to take control of and redevelop the war-ravaged Gaza Strip as 'Riviera of the Middle East' has sent ripples across the region, while drawing flak from allies and adversaries alike. Since his return to the White House just over two weeks ago, the former New York property developer's 'America First' campaign appears to have evolved into 'America More,' as he becomes increasingly focused on acquiring new territories. It remains uncertain whether Trump will proceed with his contentious plan, peacefully or militarily, or if he is merely adopting an extreme stance as a bargaining tactic as part of his transactional foreign policy

Washington, Feb 5: US President Donald Trump said the US would take over war-ravaged Gaza and create a 'Riviera of the Middle East' after reset-



tling Palestinians elsewhere, shattering d ecades of US policy on the Israeli-Palestinian conflict and drawing regional condemnation.

The shock move from Trump was swiftly condemned by regional heavyweight Saudi Arabia which Trump hopes will establish ties with Israel. Trump, in his first major Middle East policy announcement, said he envisioned building a resort where international communities could live in harmony. Trump's son-in-law and former aide, Jared Kushner, last year described Gaza as 'valuable' waterfront property.

The casual proposal sent diplomatic shockwaves across the Middle East and around the globe. China said it opposed the

forced transfer of Palestinians and Turkey called the proposal 'unacceptable'

An official from Palestinian militant group Hamas, which ruled the Gaza Strip before fighting Israel in a brutal war there, said Trump's statement about taking over the enclave was 'ridiculous and absurd'.

Trump provided no specifics of his plan, unveiled at a joint press conference on Tuesday with visiting Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu.

'The US will take over the Gaza Strip and we will do a job with it too...we're going to develop it, create thousands and thousands of jobs, and it'll be something that the entire Middle East can be very proud of," Trump told reporters

The announcement followed Trump's shock proposal earlier Tuesday for the permanent resettlement of the more than two million Palestinians from Gaza to neighbouring countries, calling the enclave - where the first phase of a fragile Israel-Hamas ceasefire and hostage release deal is in effect - a 'demolition site.'

The US taking a direct stake in Gaza would run counter to longtime policy in Washington and for much of the international community, which has held that Gaza would be part of a future Palestinian state that includes the occupied West

Trump's proposal raises questions whether Middle East power Saudi Arabia would be willing to join a renewed US-brokered push for a historic normalisation of relations with US ally Israel.

Saudi Arabia said it would not establish ties with Israel without the creation of a Palestinian state, contradicting Trump's claim that Riyadh was not demanding a Palestinian homeland.

Trump said that he plans to visit Gaza, Israel and Saudi Arabia, but did not say when he plans to go.

### Exit polls give BJP an edge over AAP

Wednesday as Delhi voted to elect 70 MLAs even as most exit polls predicted an edge for the BJP over the AAP and no gain for the Congress. However, the exit polls have a track record of often misreading the people's mood and going miserably wrong in their predictions. This was evident in the Lok Sabha and Haryana Assembly elections last year. Even in the 2020 Delhi polls, most exit polls had got their predictions wrong. The AAP is eyeing for a third consecutive term, relying on its track record in governance and various welfare initiatives, while the BJP is making a concerted effort to regain control of the capital after more than 25 years. On the other hand, the Congress, which held power in Delhi for 15 consecutive years until 2013, is working to make a comeback after failing to secure a single seat in the last two

New Delhi, Feb 5: Several exit polls Wednesday predicted a victory for the BJP over the ruling while the Congress was projected to make no significant gains from last elections. Two exit polls, however, predicted a victory for the AAP, and as many showed a close contest between them, with an edge for the BJP. The Election Commission will announce the official results after the counting of votes February 8.

AAP in the Delhi Assembly polls

Among exit polls that predicted a BJP victory, People's Pulse showed NDA was likely to get 51 to 60 seats, while AAP may get 10-19 seats. The Congress it claimed, will not be able to open its account. According to People's Insight, NDA is likely to get 40 to 44 seats, AAP 25 to 29 seats, and Congress 0-1 seat

The P-Marq exit poll predicted 39-49 seats for BJP and allies, 21 31 seats for AAP and 0-1 for Congress. The JVC exit poll said BJF and allies would get 39-45, AAI 22-31 seats and Congress 0-2.

Two surveys predicted AAP's victory - Wee Preside, which gave 46-52 sets for AAP, 18-23 for BJP and 0-1 for Congress, and Mind Brink Media predicted 44 49 seats for AAP, 21-25 for BJP and 0-1 for Congress.

### 'City killer' asteroid may hit Earth in 8 years

Washington, Feb 5: A colossal explosion in the sky, unleashing energy hundreds of times greater than the Hiroshima bomb. A blinding flash nearly as bright as the Sun. Shockwaves powerful enough to flatten everything for miles. It may sound apocalyptic, but a newly detected asteroid nearly the size of a football field now has a greater than one per cent chance of colliding with Earth in about eight years.

Such an impact has the potential for city-level devastation, depending on where it strikes. Scientists aren't panicking yet, but they are watching closely.

"At this point, it's 'Let's pay a lot of attention, let's get as many assets as we can observing it." Bruce Betts, chief scientist of The Planetary Society, told

Dubbed 2024 YR4, the asteroid was first spotted December 27, 2024, by the El Sauce Observatory in Chile. Based on its brightness, astronomers estimate it is between 130 and 300 feet (40-90 metres) wide.

By New Year's Eve, it had landed on the desk of Kelly Fast, acting planetary defence officer at US space agency NA-SA, as an object of concern. "You get observations, they

drop off again. This one looked like it had the potential to stick around," she told AFP. The risk assessment kept

climbing, and January 29, the International Asteroid Warning Network (IAWN), a global planetary defence collaboration, issued a memo

According to the latest calculations from NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory, there is a 1.6 per cent chance the asteroid will strike Earth December 22,



If it does hit, possible impact sites include over the eastern Pacific Ocean, northern South America, the Atlantic Ocean, Africa, the Arabian Sea, and South Asia, the IAWN memo

states. 2024 YR4 follows a highly elliptical, four-year orbit, swinging through the inner planets before shooting past Mars and out toward Jupiter.

For now, it's zooming away

will not come until 2028. "The odds are very good that not only will this not hit Earth, but at some point in the next months to few years, that

from Earth -- its next close pass

probability will go to zero," said A similar scenario unfolded

in 2004 with Apophis, an aster oid initially projected to have a 2.7 per cent chance of striking Earth in 2029. Further observations ruled out an impact.

The most infamous asteroid impact occurred 66 million years ago, when a six-mile-wide space rock triggered a global winter, wiping out the dinosaurs and 75 per cent of all spe cies. By contrast, 2024 YR4 falls

into the "city killer" category. "If you put it over Paris or London or New York, you basically wipe out the whole city and some of the environs," said Betts.

The best modern comparison is the 1908 Tunguska Event, when an asteroid or comet fragment measuring 30-50 metres exploded over Siberia, flatten ing 80 million trees across 2,000 square kilometres.





#### 2 BOYS DROWN DURING IDOL IMMERSION

Bhubaneswar: Two boys drowned in Kuakhai river during immersion of an idol of Goddess Saraswati Wednesday, police said. The deceased boys, both 15 years old, were identified as Sikun Senapati of Ganga Nagar and Dibyajyoti Mahalik of Unit-6 of the City. The boys had gone to Rangabazar area along with their tuition teacher and other students for the idol immersion. The duo carried the idol to the river while others were at the bank. However, they slipped into deep waters and were swept away, police said. The bodies have been fished out and sent for post-mortem. Meanwhile, Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi expressed deep grief over the deaths. The state government announced a compensation of ₹4 lakh each from the State Disaster Relief Fund for the families of the deceased boys.







### HC vacates stay on 2,753 health workers' posting

Cuttack, Feb 5: Two days after imposing an interim stay on recruitment of Multipurpose Health Workers (MPHWs), the Orissa High Court Wednesday vacated the stay, paving way for distribution of appointment letters to as many as 2,753 MPHWs at a job fair in Capital city Febru-



The HC had February 3 directed the Odisha Sub-ordinate Staff Selection Commission (OSSSC) to put on hold appointment of MPHWs after several candidates filed petitions challenging the recruitment process.

Notably, the OSSSC had released a notification April 29, 2023 seeking applications for recruitment of 2,753 female health workers. It conducted in September 2024. However, some candidates had moved the HC alleging that there was negative marking for wrong answers for 100 marks but 13 answers were "wrong" while there was no clarity over answers of eight questions.

The HC then imposed a stay on the recruitment. However, the HC Wednesday withdrew the stay order paving way for the state government to distribute appointment letters to the selected candidates.

The Nijukti Mela (job fair) will be organised at the Capital High School Play Ground February 7 when Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi will distribute appointment letters to the new recruits at 3:30pm, said Director of Family Welfare Sanjukta Sahoo.

It is to be noted here that the Chief Minister had recently announced to fill 1.1 lakh vacant government posts and directed the chairpersons of OSSSC, Odisha Public Service Commission (OPSC) and Odisha Staff Selection Commission (OSSC) to expedite the recruitment process for the same.

### **Tickets sold out amid chaos at counters**

Crowd control became a Herculean task as some unruly cricket fans jostled near the counters, leading to a stampede-like situation that prompted the police to resort to a mild lathi-charge

Cuttack, Feb 5: Offline ticket sale for the February 9 India-England One-Day International (ODI) match at Barabati Stadium here saw thousands of fans jostling, leading to a stampede-like situation, prompting the police to resort to mild lathi charge Wednesday. As per the earlier decision,

four counters were set up on the stadium premises for sale of tickets February 5 and 6. The Odisha Cricket Association (OCA) had Tuesday decided to sell 11,080 tickets at the counters in these two days. However, all the tickets were reportedly sold out on the first day, Wednesday. People from across the state

were seen crowding near the stadium since Tuesday afternoon. "Even some started queuing up. Police, however, dispersed them in the evening,' said an OCA official.

People again began queuing up Wednesday morning. By evening, crowd control became a Herculean task for the security personnel. Some unruly



fans jostled near the counters, leading to a stampede-like situation. Those who managed to get a ticket found it almost impossible to return from the counter. Police resorted to mild baton-charge and even used water cannons to bring the situa-

tion under control

Cuttack Deputy Commissioner of Police Jagmohan Meena said the situation was under control. "Police had to 'show the lathi' to bring the situation under control," he

#### Couple held for loan fraud

**Bhubaneswar:** The Economic Offences Wing (EOW) of Odisha Police Wednesday arrested a couple from the City's Patia area for fraudulently obtaining a loan of 1.05 crore from a private bank. Ashirbad Pattnaik, who ran proprietorship firm 'AB Solutions', and his wife Manogyan, availed the loan by mortgaging the property they had already used as collateral for another loan. According to the EOW, the couple had mortgaged two flats and a duplex to avail a loan of `3.79 crore from Indian Bank in January 2018. In October same year, they used the same property as mortgage to obtain a loan of `1.05 crore from the Cuttack Link Road branch of ICICI Bank. As of January 2025, the loan account has an outstanding amount of `1.30 crore, the investigating agency said. During the course of their fraudulent activities, the couple sold one of the mortgaged flats while the remaining property were seized by Indian Bank as they failed to repay the earlier loan, the agency added

## properties to freehold in City

Bhubaneswar, Feb 5: The Bhubaneswar Development Authority (BDA) has converted 580 leasehold properties into freehold after it received 867 applications seeking the conversion.

"The BDA has so far registered 580 conveyance deeds out of 867 applications submitted Of these, as many as 462 applications were received online," said a notification issued by the development authority.

Significantly, applications for conversion of land can be submitted via BDA's website https://bda.gov.in/.

In the first phase of this initiative, 24 housing schemes have been included for conversion. These schemes include Pokhariput phases I, II, and III, Prachi Enclave plotted scheme in Chandrasekharpur, Lumbini Vihar Housing Scheme in Chandrasekharpur, Udayagiri Vihar in Patrapada, and Lingaraj Vihar in Bhimpur. The development authority also plans to include other housing schemes in a phased manner.

Conversion fee for residential land has been fixed at 3 per cent of the latest benchmark valuation of the homestead land, as determined by the registering authority of the state government (for the year 2024).

BDA has clarified that if a plot is mortgaged to a financial institution, conversion will proceed only after obtaining a no-objection certificate from

the institution. Applicants are also required to submit an affidavit stating that there are no ongoing civil disputes regarding the land. In case of any legal disputes, application for conversion will be reviewed only after the case is resolved and the court order is provided.

Applicants who have en croached upon government land public undertaking land, or BDA land within its jurisdiction are excluded from the scheme unless they first vacate the encroached land. An affidavit confirming the absence of any such encroachment must be submitted.

Those who have made constructions on the allotted plot and are in possession of the plot for more than five years are eligible to apply for freehold status

### Ditched by partner, woman hangs self

Bhubaneswar, Feb 5: A 26-yearold woman, reportedly frustrated over her partner's affairs and betrayal, died by hanging herself from a ceiling fan at her rented accommodation in Laxmisagar police limits here, Wednesday. The deceased, identified as Lopamudra Panda, was learnt to have been in a relationship with her male friend for over four years, according to a police complaint lodged by her younger sister Prakruti Panda.

Prakruti said her sister's partner had promised to marry her. "However, after a brief period of their relationship, Lopamudra discovered that her partner is a

divorcee. Despite this, as Lopamudra insisted on the marriage plan, he turned down her request. Soon, Lopamudra found that his partner's marriage has been fixed with another woman."

An utterly frustrated Lopamudra then approached the man's parents who responded with assaults, threatening her with police complaint, the complainant added. With the pressure mounting, the accused then threatened to make viral her sister's sensitive photos in social media. "This left Lopamudra anguished. Moreover, the constant threats from her partner's family left her on the brink of mental agony," she added.

Bhubaneswar, Feb 5: The Twin City Commissionerate Police is set to launch a special drive against the use of black films, sirens, and multi-toned horns in vehicles starting February 10. The crackdown aims to address safety concerns. enhance road discipline, and ensure compliance with traffic laws. Defaulters will face stringent penalties as per the

existing regulations. Bhubaneswar-Cuttack Police Commissioner, Suresh Dev Dutta Singh, issued an official letter appealing to citizens to follow the rules concerning vehicle modifications. He pointed out that despite clear legal prohibitions many motorists still use tinted glass or black films on their car windows. as well as multi-toned horns. These modifications not only violate traffic regulations but

also pose significant risks to

and are often misused to gain an unfair advantage or intimidate other drivers. Furthermore, they contribute to noise pollution, which is detrimental to public health.

According to the law, car windows must allow at least 70 percent of visible light to pass through the front and rear windows and 50 percent for the side windows. Any vehicle violating these standards will be subject to the special drive beginning February 10.

The Commissionerate Police has urged the public to voluntarily remove tinted films and multi-toned horns from their vehicles before the start of the drive to avoid facing penalties. Those who fail to comply with the legal requirements will be fined ₹5,000, and in some cases, could face imprisonment for up to six months.

"Through this drive, we aim to ensure better road safety, reduce accidents, and improve traffic discipline across the Twin City. It is crucial that the public understands the dangers posed by these vehicle modifications and follows the traffic rules to help create safer roads for everyone," said Commissioner Singh.

The Commissionerate Police is also planning to increase awareness about the importance of these rules and encourage voluntary compliance, as it works toward improving road safety and reducing hazards associated with illegal vehicle

### Panel concludes torture probe

Bhubaneswar, Feb 5: The judicial commission, headed by retired judge CR Dash, concluded its inquiry into the alleged torture of an Army officer and sexual assault of his fiancée at Bharatpur police station last year, an official said Wednesday.

The commission completed its inquiry as it is mandated to submit the report by February 28 Subhendra Mohanty, the judicial panel secretary, told reporters.

The state government had formed a judicial commission to thoroughly investigate the alleged incident in which an Army officer was physically assaulted and his fiancée molested in custody at Bharatpur police station on the intervening night of September 14, 2024. Justice Dash was appointed

chairperson of the commission following widespread outrage across the country after the incident. During the inquiry, the commission sought views from the people involved through affidavits, receiving over 500 responses. The commission recorded statements from the Army officer, his fiancée, the accused police officials, and all individuals involved in the incident.

The commission also examined witnesses, evidence, and affidavits. The commission's tenure was initially set to expire January 31. However, it was extended till February 28, 2025.

The incident took place when an Army officer and his fiancée had gone to Bharatpur police station to lodge a complaint of road rage. Instead, they had an argument with the police following which the duo were allegedly tortured in the custody that sparked a major controversy.

## Odisha set to launch month-long deworming drive

The drive to start from February 10, targeting over 16 million children and women to improve health and nutrition

Bhubaneswar, Feb 5: More than 16 million children and women in Odisha will get deworming doses during a month-long drive which will be launched February 10 across the state, a health official said Wednesday.

The Directorate of Family Welfare, in collaboration with Unicef, will launch the drive to improve the health and nutritional status of children and women in Odisha.

A mop-up round will be conducted February 17 for those who miss the initial dose. Simultaneously, a Vitamin A supplementation programme will be implemented to boost



immunity and prevent childhood blindness

The National Deworming Day (NDD) campaign targets all children aged 1 to 19 years through schools and Anganwadi centres. Additionally, women of reproductive age (20-24 years) will receive deworming treatment.

Speaking to the mediapersons, Family Welfare Director Sanjukta Sahoo said, "Children and young women will receive age-appropriate Albendazole tablets from teachers, Anganwadi workers, and ASHAs.

"Simultaneously, Vitamin A doses will be administered to children aged 9 to 60 months at immunisation sites and Village Health and Nutrition Days (VHSNDs) throughout February, she added.

"The initiative will be implemented in all educational institutions, including pri-

vate schools and childcare centres, benefiting approximately 14.6 million children and 1.77 million women, said Nutrition joint director Smrutijit Patnaik.

The drive will cover 24 districts, including Angul, Boudh, Bhadrak, Bargarh, and others. Additionally, the Lymphatic Filariasis-Mass Drug Administration (LF-MDA) programme will be rolled out in select blocks of six districts, including Bolangir, Cuttack, and Kandhamal, targeting children aged 1-2 years.

"National Deworming Day is crucial for improving children's health, nutrition, education, and overall well-being," said Unicef nutrition specialist Sourav Bhattachariee. Unicef nutrition officer Sanjay Sahoo added that deworming would help prevent intestinal worm infections and contribute to a healthier future for children and women in Odisha.

### Youth mobilised to support MDA

BHUBANESWAR: The Odisha government, in collaboration with Project Concern International and the National Service Scheme (NSS), has launched a youth-driven initiative to support Mass Drug Administration (MDA) campaigns aimed at eliminating lymphatic filariasis. ### Pipeline work, heavy traffic hassles for jumbo passage



Keonjhar, Feb 5: The ongoing excavation work for installation of slurry pipelines and heavy traffic on National Highway 20 have emerged as major obstacles for smooth passage of elephants in Sadar and Ghatgaon forest ranges of this district, according to reports.

The pipeline project, which involves breaking of rocks, digging up soil, and clearing forests, is going on for the past few years. This has not only caused extensive environmental damage alongside NH 20, but also created obstacles for safe passage of elephants and other wild animals. Large holes dug during the pipeline work have compounded traffic issues which in turn causes problems for animals attempting to cross

On Monday morning, a bi-

zarre scene unfolded near Nekadaghar in Naranpur section of Sadar Range wherein a herd of elephants could not cross NH-20 due to roadside excavation and heavy vehicular traffic. Stranded on one side of the highway, the jumbos caused alarm among pedestrians and motorists. Some bystanders watched from a distance and captured the moment on their

Had the elephants suddenly moved onto the road, there would have been chance of a mishap. However, Forest department staffers were not immediately present at the

Later, upon receiving information, officials reached the spot and assisted the herd in safe crossing of the road. The elephants eventually moved into Naranpur Reserve Forest. according to Keonjhar divisional forest officer Dhanraj HD.

According to the reports of the Forest department which monitors the movement of wild animals, elephants typically travel in the evening or at night, often damaging crops and vegetation. During the day, they seek shelter in the forest. However, when villagers chase them away, they are forced to roam around villages during day time. Unable to find a safe refuge, they often become agitated and attack people.

Bimbadhar Behera, an elephant conservation advocate, urged the government to prioritise elephant corridors, habitats, and migration paths over corporate interests to ensure the protection of jumbos throughout the district.

Handapa police station inspector-in-charge Namita Nayak and Boinda police outpost in-charge Swarup Ranjan Patri reached the spot, seized the body, and sent it for post-mortem.

Police detained the girl for questioning and returned to the crime scene with a sniffer dog and forensic team Wednesday morning.

The dog traced the movement of the accused to his house, but by then he had already escaped.

"As I came out, I found the wagons just a few metres away from my house and there were several mangled auto rickshaws, trollies and bikes scattered here and there," said one of the resi

Another person said, "I heard



the sound and first thought it was a blast then I stepped out of to see that the fallen wagons are just in front of my house.

Soon after the derailment, traffic on the Malgodown-Basanti Colony Road came to a grinding halt and it took more than four hours to decongest the busy stretch. Railway Protection Force (RPF) jawans and other railway personnel reached the spot and tried to ascertain the cause of the incident.

Bandhamunda assistant rail-

way manager Samir Sourabh said, "I can't exactly say now what has happened. We are going to investigate it and then only things will be clear."

Meanwhile, the slum dwellers demanded compensation for the vehicles damaged due to the mishap.

When contacted, Anil Mishra, general manager of South-East ern Railways confirmed that the mishap was due to a human error. "Whosoever is responsible for the mishap will be taken to task and penalized after a thor ough probe," said Mishra. He, however, denied giving compensation as the mishap occurred on the railway land which has been encroached upon by the slum

### New species of flying fish discovered in Indian Ocean



POST NEWS NETWORK

Berhampur, Feb 5: A team of researchers from Estuarine Biology Regional Centre at Gopalpur in Ganjam district have identified a new species of flying fish, 'Cheilopogon arcticeps', in the Indian Ocean.

The discovery was made by the researchers of Estuarine Biology Regional Centre in Gopalpur in collaboration with the Zoological Survey of India.

According to Anil Mohapatra, the fish was first identified at Petuaghat fish landing centre in West Bengal. The known range of the fish extends from the western Pacific Ocean to the Bay of Bengal. The species is distinguished by its elongated and broad pectoral fins but lacks the characteristic black markings found in other related

Previously, 'Cheilopogon arcticeps' had been documented in China, the Philippines, Indonesia, Vietnam, Japan, and Thailand, These fish are commonly found in coastal waters rather than the open sea.

The species is distinguished by its elongated and broad pectoral fins but lacks the characteristic black markings found in other related species

The research was conducted by Anil Mohapatra, Subhendu Sekhar Mishra, Dipan Roy of Bajkul Milani Mahavidyalaya, and researchers Sanmitra Roy and Tapan Khatua. Their findings have been published in the prestigious Journal of the Marine Biological Association.

Till date, scientists have identified 80 species of flying fish worldwide, with 24 recorded along India's coastal waters. Fortunately, 'Cheilopogon arcticeps' poses no threat to humans.

### Media & Big Tech

s AI slop spreads across the internet, concerns about the future of high-quality information are growing. Without accurate and relevant human-generated data, model collapse – whereby generative artificial intelligence trains on its own output and gradually degrades - seems inevitable. The tech giants, well aware of this risk, have cut corners and skirted copyright law in their pursuit of training data for their large language models.

There is a simple solution: these large US companies could pay for the content they use, whether to develop generative AI or to keep social-media users scrolling. In 2021, Australia's competition authority issued a news media bargaining code requiring platforms to pay for the news from which they profit, which led many tech companies to reach voluntary deals with media organizations. When Meta (which owns Facebook and Instagram) failed to renew these deals in 2024, the Australian government updated the code to include a digital-platform levy. Other countries are considering similar measures.

Europe has already taken some steps in this direction. The European  $\,$ Union's Directive on copyright in the Digital Single Market, which came into force in June 2019 and was supposed to be transposed by member states into national law by June 2021, has provided a framework for securing fair compensation for European publishers.

In Denmark, this led to the creation in July 2021 of the Danish Press Publications' Collective Management Organization (or the DPCMO, of which I am CEO). Representing 99% of the Danish news industry, from newspapers and magazines to digital outlets and public-service broadcasters, the DPCMO has been authorized by the Danish

Ministry of Culture to grant extended collective licenses. At first, we had the authority to conclude agreements on behalf of publishers regarding their rights (and neighboring rights) with search engines, social-media platforms, and news apps. In May 2024, the mandate was expanded to include text and data mining by AI firms.

The DPCMO has successfully pushed some tech companies to negotiate collectively with publishers. Interim licensing agreements have been signed with all search engines on the Danish market, including Google, Bing, Yahoo, and DuckDuckGo. We have also reached an agreement with Upday, Axel Springer's

But other firms have been more obstinate. In April 2024, the DPCMO threatened to sue OpenAI if the company did not strike a group deal, as opposed to licensing agreements with individual publications. After OpenAI's lawyer announced that further communication with the DPCMO would not be productive, were quested mediation with OpenAI, and Danish Minister of Culture Jakob Engel-Schmidt is expected to appoint a mediator soon.

Likewise, Apple refused to enter into an agreement with the DPCMO regarding its Apple News app. As a result, the DPCMO, together with the Danish Me-

dia Association, the Danish Rights Alliance and the Danish Union of Journalists, reported Apple to the police, alleging that the app's use of news content constitutes a copyright violation. Apple ultimately made the app unavailable in Denmark

Meta and ByteDance (which owns TikTok) argued that their social-media sites fall outside the scope of articles 15 and 17 of the EU's Directive on copyright, which provide new rules on content-sharing platforms, and subsequently refused to participate in mediation and arbitration with the DPCMO. Together with the Danish Media Association, we brought a complaint against Meta and ByteDance to the European Commission, arguing that the firms have violated the Digital Market Act's data-access regulations. The case is pending.

The reason for filing multiple lawsuits is to uphold EU copyright law, which serves as a crucial framework for regulating relations between the press and Big Tech. We have taken inspiration from the French competition authority (L'Autorité de la Concurrence), which found that Google's conduct in relation to its search engine and generative AI chatbot Gemini(formerly known as Bard) has prevented publishers from assessing and negotiating remuneration for neighboring rights and is thus an abuse of dominance.

In the second half of this year, Denmark will assume the presidency of the Council of the EU, which holds agenda-setting powers. Given that one of Denmark's priorities for the presidency is to rein in Big Tech, we urge Engel-Schmidt to lead an EU-wide effort to improve enforcement of the Directive on Copyright. One way to do this is to introduce a "final offer arbitration" mechanism, whereby arbitration is mandatory, and the arbitrator must choose one of the last offers presented by the parties, as Australia, Canada, and the United Kingdom have done.

As Council of the EU president, Denmark must also focus on accelerating efforts to counter mis- and disinformation, including deep fakes, and, relatedly, to improve media literacy. To that end, EU policymakers should seek input from ordinary citizens, not just experts. Rebuilding trust in the media ecosystem requires collective action and broad support.

Curbing Big Tech's power over news outlets requires policymakers, civil servants, NGOs, academics, collective management organizations, and youth activists to stand together. Perhaps more important, journalists, photographers, and publishers must speak with one voice, so that tech firms cannot divide and rule. If we want to preserve a free and pluralist press – an essential pillar of democracy –our time and energy should be spent fighting these massive companies, not each other.

## RURAL INDIA NOT IN RADAR

the Union budget dle-class oriented, this commentator would have been happier if the thrust had been equally given to the rural sector and the economically weaker sections.

Majority of the population of the country still resides in rural areas, 55 to 60%, and, as such, the thrust areas should be in this sector. But unfortunately, a deep analysis of the Budget over the years reveals that a major share of the investment has been availed by the middle class and urban sector. Obviously, the justification would be that since the latter contributes more than half of the GDP, the allocation has accordingly been done in

India's economic momentum has been slipping with nominal GDP growth for the current fiscal with an ₹2.25 trillion shortfall in projected output. This is because the economy grapples with shrinking consumption, weak wage growth and sluggish private investment. As household savings have fallen, discretionary spending has been low. Besides, capital expenditure, a critical driver of infrastructure-led growth, has lagged. Between April and November 2024, the government spent only ₹5.13 trillion of its ₹11.1 trillion capex budget -46.2% compared with over 58% during the same period

Additionally, there is distressing unemployment and underemployment scenario.

Highly skilled persons as well like engineers and technicians are not finding proper employment. It's strange there's no mention of this in the Budget and the demand of starting an unemployment allowance, at least for skilled personnel, has been overlooked.

The Finance Minister right-

ly put thrust on the agricultural sector, but other measures do not touch the root of the problems. A major section of middle class is relatively welloff and tax exemption from ₹7 lakh could have been put to ₹10 lakh rather than ₹12 lakh, as resources are a key factor in augmenting development expenditure. The needs in an emerging economy like ours are massive. If the tax cut had not happened, expenditure would have gone up by ₹4.4 lakh crore, enough to boost consumption growth. Moreover, if the tax cut was needed why not impose a wealth tax of just 1% on the super-rich?

The emphasis on enhancing agricultural productivity. five-year mission for pulses towards achieving atmanirbharata and Pradhan Mantri Dhan Dhyna Krishi Yojana, expected to benefit 1.7 crore farmers, are steps in the right direction. Also, comprehensive programme for fruits and vegetables, 5-year mission to boost cotton production and creation of a Makhana Board, National Institute of Food Technology, may go a long way in aiding farmers and development of food processing and other allied sectors. However, despite all this, it has to be ensured that incomes of small and marginal farmers increase in tune with market conditions

Though the budget allocation for Agriculture Ministry has been reduced to ₹1.37 lakh crore from revised estimate of ₹1.41 lakh crore in last fiscal, the Ministry of Fisheries witnessed a 37% increase to ₹7544 crore. The country is the second largest producer of fish and aquaculture with seafood exports worth ₹60.000 crore and the hike may help sustainable fishing practices and give a boost to rural sector. Also, food budget has been pegged at ₹2.03 lakh crore, up by 3% from ₹1.97 lakh crore in FY25.

The social infrastructure in rural areas is appalling. While there is talk of IIT capacity expansion and addition of 6500 students plus 50,000 government schools provided with Atal tinkering labs, more central schools are needed-at least two in each district of which one should be in a rural or semi-urban area. The setting up of 5 national cen-

more such centres are needed. However, spread of both school and higher education is not possible with just ₹1.3 lakh crore, slightly up from ₹1.1 lakh crore in 2024-25.

Insofar as health sector, the setting up of day-care cancer centres in all districts within 3 vears has been announced with 200 centres to be operational by 2025-26 itself, there was need to set up at least one wellness centre in each district. The government would do well to convert these day-care centres into integrated wellness centres in the long run.

The health sector's share has fallen from 2.31% in 2019 to 1.9% in 2025-26, making it one of the lowest among major economies.

The problem lies in inadequate infrastructure in block and even sub-divisional hospitals and reluctance of doctors to serve in rural areas. With the states starved of funds. the Centre could have given funds to some such hospitals towards improving infrastructure and/or purchase of basic equipment. The exemption of customs duty for 36 life-saving drugs will benefit people but only those who can afford treatment of cancer.

Another announcement of 50-year interest free loan to states along with allocation of ₹1.5 lakh crore funds to states for capital expenditure and an Urban Challenge Fund (UCF) for new age cities has been a good decision as most states, being cash-starved, must struggle in finding resources to carry forward their development plans. The redevelopment of cities is vital at this juncture due to the high population density of most cities because of migration from rural areas. But should not the rural areas get such a fund for their development, is

a big question?

#### **BENGAL GLOBAL BUSINESS SUMMIT 2025**

Kolkata, Feb 5: West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee reaffirmed her government's commitment to industrial growth and a business-friendly environment at the Bengal Global Business Summit (BGBS) 2025, where Reliance Industries Chairman Mukesh Ambani announced Rs 50,000 crore investment in the state by the end of this decade.

Speaking at the eighth edition of the BGBS, Banerjee announced the formation of a new state-level synergy committee to facilitate ease of doing business in Bengal.

Bhutan's Agriculture Minister Younten Phuntsho attended the summit on behalf of the country, instead of Prime Minister Dasho Tshering Tobgay who was originally expected to lead the delegation.

Banerjee had hinted at possible interference from the national capital over the Bhutan PM's visit, noting Tuesday, "Something is happening in

six economic corridors along national highways. She also announced the for-

mation of a synergy committee to facilitate business in Bengal.

'I am announcing the forma committee to facilitate ease of doing business in the state. It will be a one-stop destination for all forms of clearance for doing business in Bengal," she

Banerjee also provided a major update on the Deocha-Pachami coal mine project, calling it a catalyst for the state's industrial sector

"Infrastructure is ready; coal extraction could begin as early as tomorrow. Job opportunities will also be provided to land donors. Family members

of the landowners will be provided jobs. The THE STATE'S arrangement for compensation is AND ONGOING fully in place," she announced, signaling a step forward for the state's industrial growth.

Shimla, Feb 5: Himachal Pradesh Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu Wednesday launched the state government's ambitious 'Swachh Shehar Samridh Shehar' programme.

He also launched the 'Citizen Service Portal' of the Urban Development department and said that the portal has been launched with an aim to provide an integrated end-toend online solution to all the Urban Local Bodies (ULBs) of

The portal, an initiative under the 'One State-One Portal' could be accessed using citizenseva.hp.gov.in platform.

Under this program, various initiatives will be taken for cleanliness, environmental protection and waste management in the ULBs, he said.

Calling these initiatives transformative, CM Sukhu said nine essential services will be provided initially. Out of these, seven services will be in line with the needs of the citizens and two have been designed for the management of the ULBs.

'The portal will offer various online public services including trade license, property tax management, grievance redressal, booking of community places to the people. In the coming time, 45 services will be provided through this platform" he said.

The CM said that through the portal, 'garbage IDs' of 2,82,000 households in urban areas would be created for garbage collection and bill issuance.

In future, all these registered units will be provided digital identity plates, he said.

He directed the officials to ensure the completion of the project within a year.

Speaking on the occasion, the chief minister reaffirmed Himachal Pradesh's commitment to becoming India's first green energy state by March 2026. He emphasised that the Dab-

hota Green Hydrogen Plant marks a major milestone in the state's renewable energy journey. "This initiative is a crucial step in the state's efforts to establish itself as a leader in renewable energy and sustainability," he said.

### Bengal to provide more land to BSF

0.05 acres at Binnaguri in Jalpaiguri district and 19.73 acres at Narayanpur in Malda district will be handed over to the BSF

Kolkata, Feb 5: The West Bengal Cabinet Tuesday gave its nod to a proposal to provide land to the Border Security Force (BSF) in two more districts in the state to erect fencing and building outposts along the border and with Bangladesh, a senior official said.

It was decided at a Cabinet meeting, chaired by Chief Minister Mamata Baneriee at the state secretariat Nabanna, that 0.05 acres at Binnaguri in Jalpaiguri district and 19.73 acres at Narayanpur in Malda district will be handed over to the BSF, he said.

In the previous meeting held January 27, the Cabinet decided to give 0.9 acres of land at Karimpur in Nadia district to the BSF to set up outposts or install wired fences



The chief minister recently alleged month that the BSF was allowing infiltration from Bangladesh. The BJP, on the other hand, accused the TMC government of not helping the authorities in erecting fences along the boundary with Bangladesh.

The Cabinet also decided to bring a Bill in the Assembly proposing to impose heavy fines on those spitting in public places after chewing gutka and betel leaves, the official said.

"The CM has expressed her displeasure over the growing practice of publicly spitting

after chewing betel leaves and gutka and defacing the freshly painted walls and buildings. The Cabinet approved the introduction of a Bill in the Assembly Tuesday, where there would be a provision for imposing fines on those found spitting," he said, adding that the fine could likely be Rs 1000.

The Cabinet, eyeing to speed up the process of police investigations, also approved the creation of 12 new posts of Deputy Commissioner in Kolkata Police, the bureaucrat said. Of them, five would lead probe teams.

"All the positions for the new 12 deputy commissioners would be non-IPS cadre officers," he said, adding that officers could be promoted to the post from the chair of Assistant Commissioner(AC) of Kolkata Police.

The state Cabinet also gave its approval to utilise the unused land of tea plantations for homestays, he said.

'Four tea gardens in the Alipurduar and Jalpaiguri districts have been decided to be used for this purpose,' he added.

### Fresh snowfall in tourist towns of Himachal

Shimla, Feb 5: Fresh snowfall was recorded in the higher reaches of Himachal Pradesh. with the Met office issuing a 'yellow' alert for thunderstorm and lightning in some districts Wednesday.

Isolated places in Shimla. Kullu, Kinnaur, Lahaul and Spiti, and Chamba districts received snow, according to the Met office. Snowfall was also recorded in the famous tourist resort towns of Narkanda and Kufri in Shimla district, Dalhousie in Chamba, and Manali and adjoining areas in Kullu.

There were also reports of snowfall in parts of Mandi district, including Seraj, Prashar, Shikari and Kamrunag.

The snowfall kindled hope among hoteliers of an increase in tourist footfall.

### Parents urge people to keep demanding justice for their daughter

*The parents of a doctor* who was raped and murdered at RG Kar Medical College urge public protest on her 32nd birthday, February 9, to demand justice

Kolkata, Feb 5: Parents of the deceased woman doctor, who was brutally killed and raped at RG Kar Medical College and Hospital here last year, Wednesday urged people to take to the roads demanding justice for their daughter on her 32nd birthday February 9.

In a video statement, the parents of the doctor said they will continue fighting until their daughter gets justice.

"For the last six months, we have been fighting for justice for our daughter. We are the parents of the unfortunate daughter whose dreams were dashed and whatever she had achieved through hard work was destroyed. She would have turned 32 February 9. That day we take to the roads protesting the delay of justice for our daughter," the mother said.

She also thanked everybody who supported them and participated in their demands for iustice since the incident took place August 9 last year.

"When she was doing her



MBBS, her birthday was celebrated in the medical college. After she graduated, her birthday was celebrated in her workplace, nursing home and chamber. And then when she got a chance to pursue MD, her

birthday was celebrated at RG Kar Medical College and Hospital," the mother said. "This year, she is not with us

anymore. We will request all working in the hospitals, both state-run and private ones, to light lamps protesting the delay for justice for our daughter. My daughter used to love flowers a lot, so I will request people to plant one flower plant at their homes and workplaces," she said. The case is being investigated by the CBI following an order by the Calcutta High Court.

A Kolkata court January 20 sentenced civic volunteer Sanjay Roy to life imprisonment until death after he was convicted of raping and murdering the on-duty doctor at the state-run RG Kar hospital.

However, the doctor's parents claimed that the investigation was conducted half-heartedly and several other culprits involved in the crime were shielded.







#### Rajasthan: 5 dead in separate mishaps

Jaipur: Five people, including a schoolgirl, died and 25 others were injured in three separate road accidents in Dausa and Jaipur districts of Rajasthan, police said. The first incident occurred Wednesday in the Balaheri police station area of Dausa, where a truck collided with a bike carrying four people. According to SHO Bhagwan Sahay, two people on the bike were killed in the accident, and the other two were injured. All of them were on their way to Mandawar near Patoli village.

#### **Army honours** sniffer dog Teena

Jammu: The Army Wednesday honoured a sniffer dog for exemplary service in detecting explosive materials, including Improvised Explosive Devices (IEDs) in Jammu, officials said. Teena, a highly skilled specialist in explosive detection, was honoured by General Officer Commanding. Tiger Division, Major General Mukesh Bhanwala, at headquarters in Jammu, the defence spokesperson said. "Her exceptional service has been a testament to her rigorous training and resilience," the spokesperson said. Teena's remarkable career has been marked by her unwavering dedication and expertise in detecting explosive materials, he added.

### 4 Noida schools get bomb threats

Noida: Four schools in Noida received bomb threats Wednesday, prompting authorities to rush in police and a bomb disposal squad, officials said. Noida Police said the schools were thoroughly checked but nothing was found and classes were resumed. Police said the threats were received on emails and the cyber team is looking into the matter.

### 5 women among six **Naxalites surrender**

**Dantewada:** Six Naxalites. including five women, surrendered before the security forces in Dantewada district of Chhattisgarh Wednesday, a senior police official said. The Naxalites, who were part of the Malanger Area Committee of Maoists in south Bastar, laid down arms before the police and officials of the Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF), he said. The Naxalites surrendered stating that they were impressed by the police's rehabilitation drive 'Lon Varratu' (return to your home/village) and disappointed with the hollow Maoist ideology, he said in a statement.

# US plane lands in Amritsar with deported Indians

The move comes amid increasing US immigration enforcement measures, particularly targeting individuals who entered the country illegally or overstayed their visas

Amritsar, Feb 5: A US military aircraft carrying 104 illegal immigrants from various states landed here Wednesday, the first such batch of Indians deported by the Trump government as part of a crackdown it resolved to carry out when it was sworn in last month.

Of the deportees, 33 each are from Haryana and Gujarat, 30 from Punjab, three each from Maharashtra and Uttar Pradesh, and two from Chandigarh, sources said.

The deportees included 19 women and 13 minors, they said. The US action comes just days before Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to Washington to hold wide-ranging talks with President Donald Trump.

The C-17 Globemaster aircraft of the US Air Force landed at the Amritsar airport at 1:55 pm. There was heavy barricading outside the airport and police personnel were deployed in large numbers. All the deportees were being questioned inside the airport terminal building by different government agencies, including the Punjab Police, and various state and central intelligence agencies to check if they have any criminal record.

The deportees are expected to be allowed to go to their homes following verification and background checks even

though there has been no official word about it yet. Earlier, media reports claimed that the

205 illegal immigrants. Among the illegal immigrants hailing from Punjab, six are from Kapurthala, five from Amritsar, four each from Patiala and Jalandhar, two each from Hoshiarpur, Ludhiana, SBS Nagar and one each from Gurdaspur, Tarn Taran, Sangrur, SAS Nagar and Fatehgarh Sahib, sources said. According to them, arrangements have been made by the state governments concerned to take the deportees to their hometowns.

An Amritsar-based elderly man, who came for his grandson, refused to talk to the media outside the airport. Talking to PTI videos in the Mohali district. family members of Pradeep, who is among the deportees who landed at the Amritsar airport, demanded that the Bhagwant Mann government repay the debts they incurred to send the youth to the US

They claimed that they had to sell their land and take ₹20-25 lakh loan to send the youth to the US for a brighter future. But since he has been deported, the family members demanded that either the Mann dispensation provides them fiancial assistance to repay their debt or give the youth a government job. Meanwhile, the Congress expressed sadness over "pictures of Indians getting handcuffed

and humiliated" while being deported from the US and recalled that America had to express regret over the treatment meted out to India diplomat Devyani Khobragade in 2013 after the then UPA government retaliated sharply.

Congress MP Shashi Tharoor on Tuesday said the media kerfuffle over the deportation of illegal Indian migrants from the United States obscures a few facts.

"This is not the first such planeload, nor is it directly related to the ascent of @realDonaldTrump. There were 1,100 Indians deported in the previous fiscal vear (ending September 2024), under Biden, not Trump. As of 2022, there were 725,000 undocumented Indian immigrants in the US -- the third-largest group, outnumbered only by nationals of Mexico and El Salvador, he

After Donald Trump assumed office as the US President last month, the country's law enforcement agencies have launched a crackdown against illegal immigrants. Many Indians, who entered the US through "donkey routes" or other illegal means by spending lakhs of rupees, are now facing deportation. Punjab Director General of Police (DGP) Gaurav Yadav said on Tuesday that the state government would receive the immigrants and set up counters at the airport

### PM takes holy dip at Sangam

Mahakumbh Nagar, Feb 5: Prime Minister Narendra Modi Wednesday took a holy dip at the Triveni Sangam and said he felt "blessed to be at the Maha Kumbh" where he was "filled with a spirit of devotion".

The prime minister held 'rudraksh' beads in his hand during the bathing ritual. Dressed in a deep orange jersey and blue lowers, he offered prayers to the sun and the Ganga amid the chanting of mantras.

"Blessed to be at the Maha Kumbh in Prayagraj. The Snan at the Sangam is a moment of divine connection, and like the crores of others who have taken part in it, I was also filled with a spirit of devotion," Modi posted on X. "May Maa Ganga bless all with peace, wisdom, good health and harmony," he added.

In another post in Hindi, he said, "Today I got the great for tune of performing Puja archana after nothing in the holy Sangam at Prayagraj Maha Kumbh. I got immense peace and satisfaction from the blessings of Maa Ganga. I prayed to her for the happiness, prosperity, health and well-being of all the countrymen. Har-Har Gange."

He also shared some pictures of his visit, captioning the post: "The confluence of faith, devotion and spirituality in the divine and grand Maha Kumbh of Prayagraj is overwhelming evervone." His trip lasted around 90 minutes during which there was minimal use of the road barely 3 km in the car. He travelled from Prayagraj airport to a helipad near Sangam in a helicopter and later used motor boat to and fro the confluence of the sacred rivers from Arail Ghat.

This trip was much shorter than Modi's February 2019 visit to Kumbh when he, in a unique gesture, washed the feet of several sanitation workers as a mark of appreciation for



five hours in the Mela. After landing in Prayagraj around 10.30 am Wednesday, Modi took a boat ride from Arail ghat to the Triveni Sangam, the confluence of Ganga, Yamuna and the mythical Saraswati. He was accompanied by Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Aditvanath.

also shared Adityanath pictures of Modi's visit on social media, saying he offered prayers as per rituals for the 'happiness, peace and prosperity" of countrymen. On the way, he acknowledged the greetings of crowds that had lined up on both sides of the riverbanks to catch a glimpse of him.

After the holy dip, the prime minister performed rituals, including an 'aarti' as he got on board a floater, a specially built makeshift platform on the river. He was dressed in a black jacket, white pyjamas, a saffron stole and a Himachali cap for the 'aarti' during which he offered milk and flowers to the holy rivers. He also offered a 'chunari' at the confluence of the rivers. A priest guided the prime minister in the rituals.

Security was stepped up for the prime minister's visit, which comes on a day assembly polls are underway in Delhi and there are bypolls in Milkipur in Uttar Pradesh.

### 6 Oppn-ruled states demand roll back of UGC draft rules

New Delhi, Feb 5: Hitting out at the Centre over the draft University Grants Commission (UGC) regulations, the Congress Wednesday said the justification that the rules have been updated for compliance with the National Education Policy does not withstand scrutiny and must be rolled back.

SWAYAM for connecting recruiters to students.

The Standing Committee on Education, Women, Children, Youth and Sports presented its report in the Rajya Sabha Tuesday on "Review of Education Standards, Accreditation Process, Research, Examination Reforms and Academic Environment in Deemed, Private Universities and other Higher Education Institutions".

The SWAYAM platform facilitates hosting of courses, taught in classrooms from Class IX till postgraduation, to be accessed by anyone, anywhere at any time. All the courses are interactive and available free of cost to learners.

"The committee observes that



the National Digital University (NDU) promises inclusive, flexible, and affordable education aligned with NEP (National Education Policy) goals. However, its foundation, SWAYAM, fac-

es significant challenges. Since 2017, less than 4 per cent of enrolled students have completed SWAYAM courses," the panel said in its report.

"Complaints include outdat-

ed content, inflexible teaching, and poor infrastructure. Teachers report inadequate training, low compensation, and technical hurdles, undermining their efficiency. The 1:15 teacher-student ratio is disregarded in the online model, leading to overcrowded virtual classrooms," it added.

Additionally, only 4 per cent of Scheduled Caste and Schedule Tribe and 7 per cent of Other Backward Classes students have Internet-enabled computers, according to Oxfam India 2022, questioning the NDU's equity claims, the panel further said.

The panel asserted that digital initiatives would only provide "lukewarm response"

in terms of engagement unless the department started proactively assisting in placements, wherever possible, or establishing a platform associated with SWAYAM for connecting recruiters to students.

"The committee, therefore, recommends that the depart ment should also take steps to ensure courses are completed by candidates, since major private online platforms suffer from this," it said. "The department should also consider establishing a separate cell for ensuring greater participation of students from underprivileged sections of society and should also monitor their enrolment and progress diligently," it added.

### K'taka HC issues notice to banks on Mallya's plea



Bangalore, Feb 5: Liquor baron Vijay Mallya has submitted before the Karnataka High Court that the ₹6,200 crore debt he owes to banks has been recovered "multiple times over," and sought a statement of accounts detailing the amounts recovered from him, United Breweries Holdings Limited (UBHL, now in liquidation), and other certificate debtors.

The High Court Wednesday issued a notice to banks in response to the petition filed by fugitive businessman February 3. Justice R Devdas directed the banks to respond by February 13.

Senior advocate Sajan Poovavva, representing Mallva, ar gued that the winding-up order against Kingfisher Airlines and its holding company, UBHL, had been upheld at all judicial levels, including the Supreme Court. He contended the debts had already been recovered, yet additional recovery proceedings continued against Mallya.

Poovaiah informed the court that a debt recovery tribunal (DRT) had ordered Kingfisher Airlines, as the primary debtor, and UBHL, as the guarantor, to pay ₹6,200 crore.

That order attained finality. However, between 2017 and now, the ₹6,200 crore has been recovered multiple times over. According to an admitted statement, as of today, the recovery officer confirms that ₹10.200 crore has been recovered. Additionally, the official liquidator states that the banks have

regained their dues, and even the Finance Minister informed Parliament that ₹14,000 crore has been recovered," he stated.

He clarified that the petition does not dispute the repayment of loans, but argues that under the Companies Act, once the debt is fully repaid, the guarantor company (UBHL) has no remaining liability and can seek revival.

However, this process requires a certification from the recovery officer confirming that the debt has been fully settled, which has not yet been issued. Meanwhile, recoveries continue without clarity on whether the primary debt has been entirely paid. The plea requests the banks to provide a statement detailing the amounts recovered in their favour, along with information about the original owners of the assets used to generate these recoveries, following the amended recovery certificate issued by the DRT April 10, 2017.

Additionally, it seeks a record of any assets belonging to Mallya, UBHL, or third parties that remain with the banks but have not yet been utilised for

### Ismaili Muslim leader Aga Khan dies aged 88

New Delhi, Feb 5: One of the greatest patrons of built heritage and the man behind the revival of decaying sites like Sundar Nursery and Humayun's Tomb, is how experts remembered Aga Khan IV, who died in Lisbon Wednesday at the age of 88.

Aga Khan IV, a spiritual lead er of the Ismaili Shia Muslim community, was known for his development work around the world, including India. He was given the title of "His Highness by Queen Elizabeth in July 1957 two weeks after his grandfather the Aga Khan III unexpectedly made him heir to the family's 1.300-vear dynasty as leader of the Ismaili Muslim sect.



over the decades turned into a business magnate, became famed for building homes hospitals and schools in developing countries. His interests, however,

extended to preserving and revival of cultural heritage across countries, including India, through the Aga Khan Trust for Culture (AKTC)-- a part of his main philanthrop ic organisation Aga Khan Development Network.

Under the trust's patron age, India saw the restoration of the 16th-century Humayun Tomb, a UNES CO world heritage site in Delhi, and the conservation of Sundar Nursery and the Qutb Shahi monuments in Hyderabad. He was designated as the Aga Khan V, the 50th hereditary imam of the Shiite Ismaili Muslims, in his father's will.

New Delhi, Feb 5: Hundreds of hotels or guest houses in Delhi's Paharganj area have been illegally drawing groundwater for over 10 years in the name of the Voluntary Disclosure Scheme the National Green Tribunal has observed and directed the



In an order January 29, a bench of NGT Chairperson Justice Prakash Shrivastava and expert member A Senthil Vel said the scheme was a "kind of a scam" which aside from causing loss to the state exchequer, adversely impacted the environment. The scheme re portedly granted concessions to

hotels for operating borewells "This confirms our apprehension expressed earlier that some kind of scam has taken place which has resulted in not only a huge loss of reve nue and loss of public money but also illegal, unregulated withdrawal of groundwater by hundreds of hotels/guest houses in Pahargani area depleting the groundwater level and adversely affecting the environ ment," it added.

Tracing the genesis of the scheme, the tribunal said despite the VDS not being framed by the government, a committee chaired by the then environment secretary, in a meeting April 21, 2014, decided to issue an advertisement in newspapers for voluntary disclosures of tubewells or borewells.

The tribunal noted that sub sequently a public notice was issued and voluntary disclosure applications were accepted.

It said a "serious" issue arose post the voluntary disclosures by the hotels or guest houses as no water meters to measure the volume of water extracted were installed and no charges were levied.

Amaravati, Feb 5: Nearly four lakh chickens perished in West Godavari district of Andhra Pradesh and vicinity over the past 45 days, prompting the Animal Husbandry Department to send samples for testing to ascertain the cause, said an official Wednesday.

Animal Husbandry Department director Damodar Naidu said samples were sent to a high security lab in Bhopal and also Vijayawada for confirming the

disease causing these deaths. "There is mortality but not to the extent claimed by the farmers. Farmers are also neglecting biosecurity measures, which is the main reason for the spread of diseases," Naidu told PTI. Some farmers dumped dead birds in the canals and on garbage dumps in the streets, leading to the spread of the infection, he said, adding that basic precaution was neglected, resulting in the deaths of the fowls.

#### France govt survives no-confidence vote

Paris: France's government survived a no-confidence vote Wednesday in parliament, and the state budget for 2025 was finally adopted. Prime Minister Francois Bayrou had used special constitutional powers to get the budget bill approved without a vote by lawmakers, which triggered the no-confidence motion. Only 128 lawmakers approved the motion, far from the 289 votes - or half the National Assembly's seats - needed for it to pass. Both the Socialists and far-right National Rally lawmakers had said they wouldn't support the motion. giving it no chance to succeed.

#### Thailand cuts power to **Myanmar border areas**

Bangkok: Thailand Wednesday cut off power supplies to areas in Myanmar where scam networks operate, following a public outcry demanding government action to tackle the problem. Parts of Myanmar bordering Thailand, including Myawaddy and Tachilek, are known as havens for criminal syndicates who have forced hundreds of thousands of people in Southeast Asia and elsewhere into helping run online scams including false romantic ploys, bogus investment pitches and illegal gambling schemes.

### UK diplomat visits Ukraine

Kviv: British Foreign Secretary David Lammy arrived in Kyiv Wednesday, bringing a new support package for Ukraine a day after President Volodymyr Zelenskyy said more than 45,000 of his country's troops had died in the almost three-year war with Russia. Lammy was due to announce 55 million pounds (\$69 million) in new support, including 3 million pounds to send Ukrainian grain to warravaged Syria through the World Food Programme.

#### Philippine vice prez impeached by House

Manila: Philippine Vice President Sara Duterte was impeached by the House of Representatives Wednesday after more than the required number of legislators, many of them allies of the president with whom she has had a bitter political feud, signed a petition to remove her from office. House of **Representatives Secretary** General Reginald Velasco told a plenary meeting of the lower chamber of Congress that at least 215 lawmakers have signed a petition to impeach Duterte, more than enough for the powerful House to impeach her.

# Trump faces global backlash

Washington/Paris, Feb 5: President Donald Trump's proposal for the US to take over war-torn Gaza and create a "Riviera of the Middle East" after resettling Palestinians elsewhere has shattered US policy on the Israeli-Palestinian conflict, sparking widespread condemnation.

The shock move from Trump, a former New York property developer, drew rebukes from international powers including Russia, China and Germany, which said it would bring "new suffering and new hatred". Regional heavyweight Saudi Arabia rejected the proposal outright.

Trump, in his first major Middle East policy announcement, said he envisioned building a resort where international communities could live in harmony after over 15 months of Israeli bombardment devastated the tiny coastal enclave and killed more than 47,000 people, by Palestinian tallies.

It is not clear whether Trump will go ahead with his controversial proposal or is simply taking an extreme position as a bargaining strategy. Trump said that he plans to visit Gaza,

Michael Milshtein, a former intelligence officer and one of Israel's leading specialists on Hamas, said Trump's comments put Israel on a collision course with its Arab neighbours.

"Maybe Trump is trying to promote pressure on the Arab states (so) they will not create any obstacles if he tries to promote a normalisation between Saudi Arabia and Israel," he said.

Trump provided no specifics as he announced his proposal while welcoming Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu to the White House Tuesday. He said he and his team had been discussing the possibility with

### **US withdraws from UN Human Rights Council** PRESS TRUST OF INDIA

New York, Feb 5: President Donald Trump signed an executive order withdrawing the US from the UN Human Rights Council, prohibiting any future funding for the UN agency for Palestinian refugees.

The executive order said that as in 2018, when the US withdrew from the UNHRC, the US will reevaluate its commitment to these institutions and three UN organisations that deserve renewed scrutiny are the UNHRC; the UN Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO): and the UN Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East (UNRWA).

### Senate committee backs Gabbard as US spy chief

Hindu-American Tulsi Gabbard, a former Democratic congresswoman from Hawaii, had faced bipartisan scepticism about her suitability for overseeing the spy agencies

Washington, Feb 5: President Donald Trump's contentious nomination of Hindu-American Tulsi Gabbard as director of national intelligence cleared a major hurdle Tuesday when a Senate committee backed her for confirmation despite doubts

about her lack of experience and past statements seen as supporting US adversaries.

Senator Tom Cotton, chairman of the Senate Intelligence Committee, told reporters the panel had voted to report Gabbard's nomination favorably to the full Senate.

The vote was a narrow 9-8, several committee members said. Two sources familiar with the result said it had been along party lines, as every Republican on the committee backed Gabbard and every Democrat voted against her.

No date has been announced for Gabbard's consideration by the full 100-member Senate, where she cannot afford to lose



the support of more than three of Trump's fellow Republicans and still be confirmed, given unified Democratic opposition.

Kathmandu, Feb 5: The Nepal government has formally ended solo expeditions on Mt Everest and other mountain peaks above 8,000 metres by making one mountain guide mandatory for two climbers, according to revised mountaineering regulations.

The sixth amendment to the Mountaineering Regulation came into force Tuesday after it was published in the Nepal Gazette, the government's official publication.

The revised regulations require a high-altitude support staff or mountain guide to be

assigned for every two climbers for peaks above 8,000 metres, including the 8,849 metres tall Mt Everest For other mountains, the rule

requires at least one guide per group, according to a notice published in the Nepal Gazette. Under the previous rule, one

mountain guide was sufficient for a group of climbers scaling mountains above 8,000 metres. 'The government has made

guides mandatory to ensure the climbers' safety on the mountain," said Arati Neupane, Director at the Department of

Tourism. The amendment was made to minimize the risk associated with mountain climbing,

The government recently hiked the royalty to climb Mt Everest from \$11,000 per person to \$15,000, effective September 1 during the spring season.

Under the revised regulations, the royalty fee for foreign climbers attempting to climb Mt Everest from the south route in the spring season (March-May) has increased from \$11,000 to \$15,000 per person.

The climbing fee for the autumn season (September-November) has increased from \$5,500 to \$7,500. For winter (December-February) and the monsoon (June-August) season, the fee has increased from \$2,750 to \$3,750.

### Govt accuses Kia of evading taxes of \$155 mln in Volkswagen-like dispute

New Delhi, Feb 5: India has accused South Korea's Kia of evading taxes of \$155 million by misclassifying component imports but the carmaker has denied wrongdoing, the latest fight by a foreign automaker with New Delhi over tariffs, according to a document and two sources.

Kia competes with Hyundai and Maruti Suzuki in the world's third-largest auto market, where it has a share of 6% of roughly 4 million units a vear, and its Kia Seltos and Sonet SUVs are among the top

Foreign companies in India face headaches from high taxes and long-drawn-out investiga-

For example, Tesla has publicly complained about high taxes on imported EVs and Volkswagen last week sued over a demand for a record \$1.4 billion in back taxes that it called "impossibly enormous".

Tax officers sent a confidential notice to Kia's Indian unit in April 2024, flagging alleged tax evasion of ₹13.5 billion, according to a government notice Reuters is reporting for the

The offence centred on incorrect declaration of imports of components for the assembly of the carmaker's luxury Carnival minivan, the notice showed.

In a statement to Reuters, Kia India said it made "a detailed response, supported by comprehensive evidence and documentation to substantiate" its stand and the authorities were still reviewing the matter.

Kia India is committed to complying with all regulations and has "consistently cooperated with" authorities, it added. In its 432-page notice, the

government said tax authorities found Kia's Carnival "car model was being imported in parts or components in separate lots" via different ports. with the "intent to discharge lesser customs duty'

Kia devised the strategy to ensure the imports "could not (be) detected by customs," it added in the notice, issued by a customs commissioner in the southern city of Chennai.

Two sources said Kia's case was similar to that of Volkswagen, accused of evading a higher tax of 30% to 35% applicable on parts imported in "completely knocked down" or CKD form in a single shipment, instead shipping separate parts over

### Services sees slowest pace of growth in over two years

New Delhi, Feb 5: India's services sector activity expanded at the slowest pace in over two vears in January amid softer increases in sales and output, a monthly survey said Wednesday.

The seasonally adjusted HS-BC India Services PMI Business Activity Index fell from 59.3 in December to 56.5 in January its lowest level since November.

In the Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI) parlance, a print above 50 means expansion, while a score below 50 denotes contraction.

'India's services sector lost growth momentum in January, although the PMI remained well above the 50-break-even level. The business activity and new business PMI indices eased to their lowest levels since November 2022 and November 2023 respectively," Pranjul Bhandari, Chief India Economist at HSBC,

In contrast to the trend for total new orders, there was a quicker increase in international sales. Survey participants noted gains from clients in Asia, Europe, the Middle East and the Americas. The overall rate of expansion hit a five-month high.

in late-2024, in line with official data which showed India's services exports shinning in December and capturing a larger share of global trade," Bhandari said.

The survey noted that ongoing improvements in new business intakes and rising capacity pressures prompted service providers to recruit additional staff at the start of the last fiscal quarter.

According to them, full- and part-time positions had been filled. The rate of job creation accelerated from December and was among the fastest seen since data collection started in December 2005

Service providers in India were confident of a rise in business activity over the course of the coming 12 months. Some of the reasons listed for upbeat forecasts include advertising, efforts to price competitively and new client enquiries.

### Odisha, Haryana book spots in women's football final in National Games

Haldwani, Feb 5: The semi-finals of women's football at the 38th National Games saw Odisha and Haryana secure remarkable victories, booking their spots in the final.

In the first semi-final, Odisha defeated Delhi 5-1. Rebecca Zamthianmawi scored Delhi's lone goal, while Odisha's Pyari Zaxa netted one with Malti Munda scored a brace while Sumitra Hembram and Jabamani Tudu got their names on the scoresheet. In the second semi-final, Haryana triumphed over West Bengal 4-1. 'Notwithstanding your spurious intervention in the electoral process of the IGU, we are al so extremely disappointed with your decision to remove golf from the programme of sports at the 38th All India Games.

"It is regrettable that your actions serve to punish the ath letes for political purposes and in direct conflict with Article 27.2.2 of the Olympic Charter whereby the role of an NOC is 'to encourage the development of high performance sport ...'

"This decision does nothing but discourage high-perfor mance golf athletes in India. As such, the IGF implores you to reconsider this decision and to place the athletes' interests above those of personal and political interests," he wrote in the letter, which was also marked to the International

Olympic Committee (IOC). "The IGF is guided by and believes strongly in the values of Olympism and as such it is regrettable that we find ourselves in disagreement with the IOA and that you choose to act with out mutual understanding and respect for the Olympic Charter and for our athletes and National Federation.

"As such we have been compelled to copy the International Olympic Committee on this letter so as they are aware of your inappropriate actions," Scanlon

### OFC CHASE FIRST-EVER WIN AGAINST FC GOA

Margao, Feb 5: Odisha FC will look to secure their first-ever ISL win against FC Goa to bridge the gap and enter playoffs when the two sides lock horns here Wednesday.

The Gaurs are aiming for a third league double against Odisha FC, since they had won the reverse fixture by a 4-2 margin January 4.

In their previous clash, FC Goa lost 1-3 to Jamshedpur FC, which snapped their 12-gamelong unbeaten run that com-

The Gaurs will be eyeing to avoid consecutive defeats in the same season for the first time since April last year, when they were defeated by Mumbai City FC twice.

Odisha FC, on the other hand, have momentum in their side since they won their last away game by 3-2 against Bengaluru FC and then drew 2-2 at home against NorthEast United FC

Prior to the match against the Blues, the Sergio Loberacoached side was on a threegame-long winless streak on the road (D2 L1). The Juggernauts have pre-

viously managed back-to-back away wins only twice, between November-December 2024 and December 2023-February 2024.

FC Goa are placed third in the points table with 33 points from 18 matches, as they have won nine encounters and drawn six times. They will want to surpass the second-placed Jamshedpur FC (34), whereas Odisha FC are also three points (25) adrift the sixth-placed Mumbai City FC (28).

Trump's new order to bar transgender female athletes

### Ronaldo says he is best football player ever

Madrid, Feb 5: Cristiano Ronaldo approaches his 40th birthday with the same confidence and self-esteem as he has always boasted throughout his successful career. Ronaldo, the former Real

Madrid star who now plays in Saudi Arabia, will turn 40 Wednesday and apparently has no doubt about who should be considered the best soccer player ever. "I am the greatest scorer in

history," Ronaldo said in an interview with Spanish television channel La Sexta. "Although I am not left-footed, I am in the top 10 in history for goals scored with the left foot. These are numbers, I am the most complete player who has ever existed.

"I play well with my head, I take good free kicks, I am fast, I am strong, I jump... I have never seen anyone better than me." He had said it before, more

Washington, Feb 5: President Donald Trump will sign an executive order Wednesday designed to prevent people who were biologically assigned male at birth from participating in women's or girls' sporting events.

The order, which Trump is expected to sign at an afternoon ceremony, marks another aggressive shift by the president's second administration in the way the federal government deals with transgender people and their rights.

The president put out a sweeping order on his first day in office last month that called for the federal government to define sex as only male or female and for that to be reflected on official documents such as passports and in policies such as federal prison assignments.

Trump found during the campaign that his pledge to "keep men out of women's sports" resonated beyond the usual party lines. More than half the voters surveyed by AP VoteCast said

He leaned into the rhetoric before the election, pledging to get rid of the "transgender insanity," though his campaign offered little in the way of details.

Wednesday's order — which

coincides with National Girls and Women in Sports Day will involve how his administration will interpret Title IX, the law best known for its role

in pursuing gender equity in athletics and preventing sexual harassment on campuses. 'This executive order re-

stores fairness, upholds Title IX's original intent, and defends the rights of female athletes who have worked their whole lives to compete at the highest levels," said US Rep. Nancy Mace, a Republican from South Carolina. Every administration has the

authority to issue its own interpretations of the landmark legislation. The last two presidential administrations — including Trump's first — offer a glimpse at the push-pull involved. The Biden administration

rolled back that policy last April with one of its own that stipulated the rights of LGBTQ+ students would be protected by federal law and provided new safeguards for victims of campus sexual assault. The policy stopped short of explicitly addressing transgender athletes. Still, more than a half-dozen Republican-led states immediately challenged the new rule in court.

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
