

**Tomato distress** 

sale hits farmers

#### Berhampur/Dhenkanal, Feb 10: Close on the heels of reports about distress sale of tomato in Keonjhar district, farmers cultivating the juicy vegetable in Ganjam and Dhenkanal districts are facing severe losses as prices have crashed to ₹3 to ₹5 per kg at farm level, despite being sold for ₹10 to ₹15 per kg in the market.

Unable to recover even basic production costs, many farmers have been forced into distress sales, while some have aban-

doned their crops altogether. "After spending so much time and money on the crop for the last three months, we are not even recovering the labour costs," said Surath Pahan,

a tomato grower from Satrush-

Friday, he sold around 15 quintals of tomatoes at ₹3 per kg.

"In our area, some farmers even abandoned their crop after traders offered them just ₹2 per kg," said Pahan, who cultivated tomatoes on an acre of land. "Forget about profit, we cannot even recover the basic expenses on seeds, fertilisers, pesticides, and transportation," said Daya Pradhan from Math Mukundapur village of the district.

Instead of selling tomatoes at such a low price, "I decided to feed the crop to my cattle," said Upendra Polai, a farmer from

Ganjam block is one of the major tomato-growing areas in the state.

Kand Jena, deputy director of the Horticulture department, said tomato prices crashed in the district over the past week. "A bumper crop this year is one of the reasons behind the drop in prices," he said.

Several farmers opted to grow tomatoes, a short-duration seasonal crop, leading to an oversupply and a price dip. "In Ganjam, tomatoes were grown on around 1,500 hectares this season," Jena said.

Brundaban Khatei, a farmers' leader and former zilla parishad member, said tomato growers suffered due to lack of

New Delhi: Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who embarked on a five-day trip to France and United States (US), said Monday that his visit to US will be an opportunity to build upon the successes achieved during President Donald Trump's first term in the collaboration between the two countries. He arrived in France Monday on a three-day visit during which he will co-chair an AI Action Summit with French President Emmanuel Macron and hold bilateral talks with him. Modi was warmly greeted by the Indian community when he reached his hotel. On Tuesday, the PM will co-chair the AI Action Summit along with President Macron. Modi and Macron will also hold discussions in both restricted and delegation formats and address the India-France CEO's Forum. From France, the Prime Minister will travel to US on the second leg of his two-nation tour.

# Govt seeks OCA reply in 10 days



Bhubaneswar, Feb 10: Embarrassed over floodlight failure leading to disruption in the second One Day International (ODI) between India and England at Barabati Stadium in Cuttack for around 30 minutes. the state government Monday issued a show-cause notice to Odisha Cricket Association (OCA), seeking a reply within 10 days.

In a letter to OCA secretary Sanjay Behera, state Sports Director Siddhartha Das said, "The OCA is hereby directed to submit a detailed explanation for the cause of disruption and identify the persons/agencies that were responsible for such lapses and outline the measures taken to prevent similar incidents in the future.

The findings must be submitted within 10 days upon receipt of this letter, the Sports depart-

Speaking to reporters, Sports Minister Suryabanshi Suraj



said stringent action would be taken against the persons responsible for the incident and even suggested the arrest of those found guilty.

"This (match disruption due to floodlight failure) is a serious matter and has hurt the sports lovers across the state and pained us. Therefore, the Sports department has issued a show-cause notice to the OCA.

They have sub-committees to look after different aspects. Earlier, we had also reviewed the preparations twice to streamline the system. Still, it is yet to be found out as to which committee was in charge of the floodlight and why the backup generator could not reach the place at the appropriate time,' the minister said. The minister, however, thanked the OCA for proper crowd management.

The OCA secretary had told reporters Sunday that the backup generators could not reach the floodlight tower immediately because the players' bus was parked near it.

"The driver was not in the bus and he was called up and asked to remove the vehicle after which the generators could reach the tower and the power was restored," Behera had said.

Meanwhile, Opposition Congress and BJD have strongly criticised the state government and stated that the incident has brought a bad name for Odisha.

# TRUMP'S NEW TARIFF THREAT

Washington, Feb 10: President Donald Trump said he will soon announce that the US will impose 25 per cent tariffs on all steel and aluminum imports from countries. including Canada and Mexico.

"Any steel coming into the United States is going to have a 25 per cent tariff," he told reporters Sunday on Air Force One as he flew from Florida to New Orleans to attend the Super Bowl. When asked about aluminum, he responded, "aluminum, too" will be subject to the trade penalties. He reaffirmed that he would announce "reciprocal tariffs" — "probably Tuesday or Wednesday" meaning that the US would impose import duties on products in cases where another country

has levied duties on US goods. "If they are charging us 130% and we're charging them nothing, it's not going to stay that way," Trump told reporters.

New Delhi, Feb 10: Social media influencer Ranveer Allahbadia's distasteful comment on parents and sex led to massive outrage across the spectrum Monday, prompting the You-Tuber with almost 16 million followers on social media platforms to apologise and say comedy is not his forte.

The flip remark intended for quick laughs raised hackles instead with politicians, including Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis, activists, social media users and others calling for a ban and slamming him for being crass, vulgar and offensive. The comment was made on the YouTube reality show "India's Got Latent" hosted by comedian Samay Raina, popular amongst some sections for its often offensive content.

Allahbadia, whose podcasts feature the rich and the famous, including top Bollywood stars. was one of the online content creators who received a National

He has over 6,00,000 followers on X, 4.5 million on Instagram and 10.5 million subscribers on his YouTube channel. Allahbadia said the com-

# No water to drink, you daydream about cycle tracks: SC to petitioner

New Delhi, Feb 10: States do not have money to provide affordable housing and people don't have clean water to drink and you are daydreaming about cycle tracks, the Supreme Court said Monday while refusing to hear a plea.

A bench of Justices Abhay S Oka and Ujjal Bhuyan was hearing a plea filed by cycling promoter Davinder Singh Nagi for the creation of separate cycle tracks in the country when it told the petitioner that one needed to get their priorities right and underlined the need to give attention to other "more urgent issues".


better referred to as the budget-seat since the passenger neither gets the privilege of extending those legs a wee bit into the aisle nor gets to lean over a bit towards the airplane window?



# Focus more on preparation: CM to students

Bhubaneswar, Feb 10: Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Monday advised students appearing for their Borad examinations to focus more on preparation rather than on the results.

Noting that examination time often becomes a cause of anxiety for students and their parents, Majhi said, "A little stress before exams is good, but don't get stressed out too much, follow the advice of teachers, make proper desire to move forward."

Majhi said that students should make good use of the time before the exam, keep themselves mentally strong and not get stressed during the exam, listen to the teacher and study with concentration.

"Never be afraid of exams. When fear comes, concentration goes away from the mind. For concentration, one needs to relax a little. Therefore, to study with concentration for a longer minutes in between and study again," Majhi said.

Noting that the examinations will come and go, Majhi said he firmly believes that a person definitely gets the value of his or her hard work at a certain point of time in life.

"If you continue to work hard with confidence and a desire to always move forward, your efforts will not go in vain. You will achieve success only if you focus more on the exam preparation

The MDA campaign will continue till February 19 in six endemic districts - Bolangir Kalahandi, Rayagada, Cuttack, Kandhamal and Nayagarh— of Odisha. Over 37 lakh beneficiaries from six districts will be given anti-filariasis drugs. While congratulating Uttar Pradesh and Odisha for their work on filariasis elimination, Nadda emphasised on rop ing in women associated with self-help groups for making the campaign successful.

# Govt lifts curbs on tubewell mining

Bhubaneswar, Feb 10: The state government has decided to lift curbs on mining of tubewells in rural areas to address the problem of drinking water during summer, Panchayati Raj and Drinking Water Minister Rabi Narayan Naik said Monday.

Briefing media about mega piped water supply projects in the state, Naik said new tubewells can be sunk against the defunct ones.

"Additional tubewells can be sunk in new habitations without having any tubewell, or in habitations where the population ratio (of people not having piped water connections/private tube wells) is greater than 70:1," he said.



Stating that providing clean drinking water to rural areas is the priority of the government, the minister said in the past years, many drinking water projects in rural areas were shut down due to non-payment of electricity bills.

"Due to this, there was a problem in rural areas of various districts for clean water supply," he said, adding that various measures are being taken to address the problem before the summer.

"The state government has planned to complete and put into operation 72 large drinking water projects by the end of March 2025, 54 by the end of December 2025 and 81 by the end of June 2026,'

District administrations have also been directed to provide clean drinking water through tanks in remote and suburban areas.

Suggestions coming from the public through the hearing of complaints are also being worked on," Naik said.

# **Performance of Odisha** below national average

New Delhi, Feb 10: Expressing concern over Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) missing its December 2024 deadline, the Standing Committee on Water Resources, chaired by BJP MP Rajiv Pratap Rudy, Monday noted that the performance of six states. including Odisha, is below the national average

In a report tabled in the Lok Sabha Monday, the panel urged the Centre to help underperforming states achieve their goals.

Launched in August 2019, the JJM aimed to provide 55 litres of drinking water per person per day to all rural households by 2024. Earlier this month, the government announced an extension of the JJM until 2028.

The panel said it is 'concerned and dismayed' that since the launch of JJM in 2019, only 11 states, including Gujarat, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Mizoram, Puducherry, Punjab and Telangana have reached their 'saturation level' by achieving 'Har Ghar Jal' status.

The committee noted with concern that the saturation timelines projected by states and UTs to achieve 'Har Ghar Jal' status would be till 2027, thereby extending the original 2024 timeline of JJM by three more years.

It observed that the physical progress in the remaining states and UTs ranges from 96.42 per cent to 53.84 per cent. "However, the performance of six states -- Odisha, Andhra Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Jharkhand, Kerala, and Rajasthan -- is below the national average under JJM," it said.

The Jal Shakti Ministry told the panel that long gestation period of multi-village schemes, lack of dependable groundwater sources in drought-prone and desert areas, geogenic contamination, and terrain challenges in hilly and forested areas have slowed down the pace of implementation for the programme in underperforming states.

"Lack of technical capabilities in the states, delay in clearances from nodal agencies and availability of matching state share especially during Covid-induced lockdown as reasons for slow pace of implementation for the programme," the ministry also said.

The committee asked the Department of Drinking Water and Sanitation to play a more proactive role and provide all necessary assistance to all the states and UTs in achieving their set goals expeditiously, while focusing on underperforming ones.

According to government data presented in Parliament earlier this month, 15.4 crore (79.5 per cent) of the total 19.36 crore rural households in the country have been covered under the mis-

# **NHRC** asks **CS** to prepare **SOP** on lightning deaths

Kendrapara, Feb 10: The National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) has directed the state Chief Secretary to formulate a Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) for providing compensation and support to the families of those deceased and injured due to lightning and thunderstorm in the state

by human rights activist Radhakanta Tripathy, the NHRC passed the order last Friday.

In its order, the NHRC observed that "Tripathy had suggested several steps in detail to reduce the fatalities and injuries from lightning.'

The complainant also stressed to formulate an SOP for providing compensation and support to the victims'

"Since, the Odisha government has been working to reduce the fatalities, the NHRC is of the view that suggestions submitted by the complainant, may be considered by the Government of Odisha, for further policy framing in this regard, the directive said.

The petitioner raised the issue of death due to lightning and thunderstorm and



to lightning and thunderbolt have been reported from Kendrapara, Balasore, Bhadrak and Dhenkanal districts

He, however, regretted that the government has not yet made any action plan to minimise the lightning related deaths, he added.

Pursuant to the notice of the NHRC, the state government in its reply submitted, 'Village level street play/folk dance on lightning awareness, rallies with banners on 'dos and don'ts' in Odia language are being taken out for raising awareness on lightning and thunderstorm."

"School and College level awareness programmes on lightning and thunderstorm. awareness meeting with SHG members and local youth club/association/NGO/CBO

thunderstorm awareness meeting with ASHA and Anganwadi workers have been conducted to provide early warning on lightning and thunderstorm," it added.

'Lightning' per se has been recognised as Natural Calamity u/s 3 (1) of the Odisha Relief Code and has been categorised as "State Specific Disaster" by the Odisha State Disaster Management Authority (OSDMA).

Tripathy in his rejoinder suggested several steps in detail to reduce the fatalities and injuries from lightning such as public awareness creation and spread of education.

# Bargarh MP meets Shah, demands nat'l heritage tag for Gandhamardan

Bargarh, Feb 10: Bargarh MP Pradip Purohit Monday met Union Home Minister Amit Shah at the Parliament in New Delhi and demanded national heritage status for Gandhamardan hills.

During the meeting, Purohit submitted two separate memorandums urging the government to grant national heritage status to the Gandhamardan hills and include the Kosli-Sambalpuri language in the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution.

One of the memorandums highlighted the cultural and religious significance of Gandhamardan hills in the Padampur Assembly constituency in Bargarh district. The region is home to ancient temples of Lord Nrusinghanath and Lord Harishankar, which attract thousands of devotees annually. The memorandum also referred to Chinese traveler Hiuen Tsang's writings, which mention Gandhamardan hills' historical significance. It noted that the hills were once home to a Buddhist monastery and that renowned Buddhist philosopher Nagarjuna served as its vice-chancellor.

The memorandum also emphasised Gandhamardan's rich mineral reserves including bauxite, limestone, and granite. It recalled how the previous Congress government had leased the area's mineral resources to Balco for 47 years, a move that faced strong opposition from local communities

Under Purohit's leadership an outfit 'Gandhamardan Surak sha Sangharsh Samiti' success fully resisted mining activities in the hills' vicinity to safeguard the ecological and religious integrity of the region.

Highlighting the biodiversity natural beauty, and historical importance, Purohit extended an invitation to Home Minister Amit Shah to visit Gandhamardan and witness its significance

Purohit submitted another memorandum requesting the inclusion of the Kosli-Sambalpuri language in the Eighth Schedule of the Indian Constitution. In his statement, he noted that approximately 20 million people across 11 districts of Odisha speak the language. He emphasised that it is an ancient and rich language serving as a significant symbol of literature, with the Ramayana, the Mahabharata, and the Bhaga vad Gita having been translated

# Manipur: What Next

Inally, Chief Minister of Manipur N Biren Singh has resigned. He took an inordinately long time to step down as he was allowed to remain in power when the north-eastern state was literally burning with the worst ever clashes in recent times between ethnic groups. The resulting violence took a toll of 250 lives and displaced over 75,000 people from their homes, according to official sources. The resignation was long overdue. It took 21 months for Biren Singh to concede the demand made by some of his own party MLAs, people belonging to his majority ethnic Meitei group, and also the minority Kuki-Zomi. He remained unmoved after violence began in May 2023 and reprehensible rapes of Kuki women came to light a couple of months into the violence.

This is a sad reflection of the priority accorded by the Central leadership to this very important and sensitive region of the country. To the Kuki tribals especially, Singh was perceived to be the main culprit who allowed violence to continue on such a large scale and cause so much suffering. No one was in doubt that during the entire ethnic clashes, Singh acted in a partisan manner siding with his own Meitei community through many acts of omission and commission. These included Suspension of Operations agreement only with Kuki insurgent groups while excluding the Meitei groups who had a free run in the state. The armed group belonging to the majority community was virtually allowed to loot arms of security personnel which were used to target the rival community. No credible attempt was made to recover the arms. He also proactively opposed the extension of Armed Forces (Special Powers) Act (AFSPA) to the Valley area dominated by Meiteis. It is because of his ineffective handling of the situation that the peace committees have not been able to even start their work. What is even worse, very limited action was taken on over 10,000 FIRs registered.

Throughout the period of violence, killings and rapes, the Centre acted in a nonchalant manner as if nothing serious had happened. Biren Singh was not upbraided by the Centre for his patent failure to handle the situation. It was then believed that the BJP could not rein in Singh for pitting the majority community against the minority since communal divide has been the cornerstone of the party's policy.

There is speculation as to what has prompted Biren Singh to resign. The suddenness of the development could be attributed to the lack of confidence shown by the ruling party MLAs in Singh's leadership and the possible no-confidence motion from the Opposition which was likely to be tabled in the Legislative Assembly being convened from 10 February. There are reports of BJP MLAs from the state convincing the party's central leadership that the government would be toppled if the no-confidence motion was moved. The only honourable retreat left was Biren Singh's resignation and a likely attempt to replace him with another leader so that the government survives.

However, this may not be the likely scenario since there is no other leader in the party's state unit who commands respect of all the BJP MLAs. This is triggering speculation that imposition of President's rule is the only choice left with the Centre. Next Assembly elections in Manipur are due in 2027. In this backdrop, it is not the loss of 100s of lives of citizens. The very idea of a democratic government implies the system will go all out to protect lives and properties of every single citizen. That core idea also has been a victim in the game of power grabbing. Corruption is not only limited to making money. When a government turns a deaf ear and remains unresponsive at the most critical times, thereby permitting shedding of blood of citizens, it is the biggest corruption that can ever be imagined.

# DRAW A CLEAR LINE

dra Modi heads to a dramatically different and somewhat unstable United States this week for a meeting with the newly elected President Donald Trump. He will be among the few leaders to have a direct meeting in the White House within a month of Trump taking office for a second term. It's too early to say if meeting Trump in the first flush of his disruptive Presidency will work as an opportunity for India or not. A proactive step on India's part amid wild turns in US policy can be a positive. It can help India gauge the mood and explore opportunities in the changed circumstances. But there are also downsides going into discussions this early. when limits are being tested, and long-standing structures are being torn apart. Without any meaningful challenge yet from institutions and sans any guardrails of the 237-year-old US constitution, Trump plays by his own rules. Some of these are simplistic ideas he set out in the book 'Art of the Deal' -

to other fields, and to life itself. Chapter 2 of the vintage 1997 book, republished in a mass market edition in 2005, is titled "Trump Cards: The Elements of the Deal" and it begins thus: "My style of deal making is quite simple and straightforward. I aim very high, and then I just keep pushing and pushing and pushing to get what I'm after. Sometimes, I settle for less than I sought, but in most cases I still end up with what I want."

There is no doubt that Trump will push India on multiple fronts, that he will have many levers to use in the process and that he will deploy the bulldozer to get Modi to sign up on deals that maybe of questionable value for India. American foreign policy has always been about American interests, marked by short termism and

an instrumentality that has many of its claims to principles of openness, democracy or peace sound hollow. Now, the mask is off, the pretence of values is gone, and naked power play is at work.

India will hopefully go prepared for these sets of meetings like never before, expecting to be pushed and ready with its own list of asks and redlines and non-negotiables. In short, the Trump playbook will have to be used against Trump. Modi, and India, would be helped in this if the nation had a foreign policy approach that all parties could sign up, own up and profess as the agreed Indian consensus cutting across political divides. The BJP needs the Congress and other parties on its side to make a set of strong, clear and specific demands on Trump.

Doing so with one voice requires the government of the day reaching out, establishing bonds across the aisle and coming together at least on this national task. But with Indian foreign policy itself marked by egoism, the so-called self-proclaimed march of the 'Vishwa Guru', blindsided by its own version of performative behaviour, this opportunity appears unavailable. A bipartisan consensus would greatly strengthen India's negotiation with the US. But political bitterness has been brought even to foreign affairs, the bureaucrat-turned-Foreign Minister S Jaishankar personally feeding into some of it with barbs against Opposition leaders that apparently secure his position in the BJP and with the Prime Minister at the cost of bipartisan support.

Without this forced injection of bitterness into foreign affairs, it should not have been difficult to have an all-party consensus to formally and publicly condemn the way the Trump administration has begun the process of deportation of unauthorised Indians in the US. The use of a military plane, with Indian citizens under deportation orders set in chains, and the act duly promoted in a video by the US agencies, is unwarranted, in poor taste and tries to showcase a negative image of India at the cost of dignity and rights of Indian citizens. It is shocking that Indians are being treated no different from migrants who have been called "high threat criminal illegal aliens" like some Venezuelan gang members who have been deported to the notorious US-run Guantanamo Bay prison camps in Cuba.

Stories emerging from those who were returned on the first military flight back to the safety of India tell us about the hazards faced by ordinary poor fellow citizens, many of them from Punjab, Haryana and Gujarat, as they took enormous risks to their personal wellbeing to look for a better life in a foreign land. These Indians need our support, help and rehabilitation, particularly to recoup losses in time and money spent in their attempt to escape poverty and lack of opportunities in India.

India should condemn the US for treating Indians thus. Instead, the foreign minister has been quoted as saying that this is normal procedure for the US. "The standard operating procedure for deportation by aircraft used by ICE (Immigration and Customers Enforcement of the US), that is effective from 2012, I repeat to you, these are procedures in place from 2012, provides for the use of restraints," he said. How does this help at all?

The planned deportation of 20,000 Indians from the US will require an endless stream of flights, if all of them are to be sent back, not to speak of more who are being caught as raids by US immigration continue. None of them should be allowed to be detained without access to lawyers, medical aid and humane conditions in the facilities they are kept. None of them should be allowed to be sent back in chains

sent back in chains. This is not to speak of other issues on which Trump will push, like the demand that India buy military hardware at full American prices, or cut import tariffs even though Indian trade surpluses are not huge or perform other acts that can well imperil partnerships and long term ties with other nations all to serve American interests. It is good to play along, to feed the ego but it is important to draw a clear line beyond which India will not give in. Modi must not bow before Trump.

# Does globalization have a future?

wildfires raged through Los Angeles in January, the infamous American conspiracy theorist Alex Jones posted on X that they were "part of a larger globalist plot to wage economic warfare & deindustrialize the [United] States." While Jones' suggestion of causality was absurd, he was right that the fires had something to do with globalization. Last year was Earth's hottest since recordkeeping began - and likely the hottest in at least 125,000 years eclipsing the record set in 2023.

Globalization refers simply to interdependence at intercontinental distances. Trade among European countries reflects regional interdependence, whereas European trade with the US or China reflects globalization. By threatening China with tariffs, US President Donald Trump is trying to reduce the economic aspect of our global interdependence, which he blames for the loss of domestic industries and jobs. Economists debate how much of that loss was caused by global trade. Some studies have found that millions of jobs were lost to foreign competition, but that is not the only cause. Many economists argue that the more important factor was automation. Such change can boost overall productivity, but it also causes economic pain, and populist leaders find it easier to blame foreigners than machines.

They also blame immigrants, who may be good for the economy in the long term, but are easy to portray as the cause of disruptive change in the near term. The migration of humans out of Africa is arguably the first example of globalization, and the US and many other countries are the result of the same basic phenomenon.

But can economic globalization be reversed? It has happened before. The nineteenth century was marked by a rapid increase in both trade and migration, but it came to a screeching halt with the outbreak of World War I. Trade as a share of total world product did not recover to its 1914 levels until nearly 1970. Now that some US politicians are advocating a full decoupling from China, could it happen again? While security concerns may reduce bilateral trade, the sheer cost of abandoning a relationship worth more than a half-trillion dollars per year makes decoupling unlikely. But "unlikely" is not the same as "impossible." A war over Taiwan, for example, could bring US-China trade to a screeching halt.

In any case, trying to understand the future of globalization requires us to look beyond economics. There are many other types of global interdependence - military, ecological, social, health, and so forth, Similarly, scientists predict that climate change will have enormous costs as global ice caps melt and coastal cities are submerged later in the century. Even in the near term, climate change is increasing the frequency and intensity of hurricanes and wildfires. The perverse irony is that we may be in the process of limiting a type of globalization that has benefits, while failing to cope with types that have only costs. Among the second Trump administration's first moves was to withdraw the US from the Paris agreement and the WHO.

So, what is globalization's future? Long-distance interdependencies will remain a fact of life as long as humans are mobile and equipped with communication and transportation technologies. After all, economic globalization spans centuries, with roots extending back to ancient

trade routes like the Silk Road. In the fifteenth century, innovations in ocean-going transportation brought the Age of Exploration, which was followed by the era of European colonization that shaped today's national boundaries. In the nineteenth and twentieth centuries, steamships and telegraphs accelerated the process as industrialization transformed agrarian economies. Now the information revolution is transforming our service-oriented economies. The widespread use of the internet began at the start of this century, and now billions of people around the world carry a computer in their pockets that would have filled a large building half a century ago. As AI progresses, the scope, speed, and volume of global communication will grow exponentially.

World wars have reversed economic globalization, protectionist policies can slow it down, and international institutions have not kept pace with many of the changes now underway. But so long as we have the technologies, globalization will continue. It just may not be the beneficial kind.

Imphal, Feb 10: Nongthombam Biren Singh's tenure as Manipur chief minister has been marked by a number of controversies, primarily centered on his handling of ethnic violence, allegations of instigating conflict, and questions regarding his governance.

Singh, who started as a footballer, then became a journalist before entering politics, served as the chief minister for two terms — 2017 and 2022. He represents the Heingang Assembly constituency in

Imphal East district. Singh entered politics in 2002, when he joined the Democratic Revolutionary People's Party and won the assembly polls. He retained the seat later

2007 contesting on a Congress ticket af ing party in 2003.

In a short time, Singh became one of the then chief minister Ibobi Singh's trusted lieutenant and was made the minister of irrigation & flood control, youth affairs and sports, and consumer affairs & public distribution

Although he retained his seat in 2012 for a third consecutive term, Singh had a fallout with Ibobi Singh. Eventually finding it difficult to continue, he resigned from the Congress and joined the BJP in October 2016. In the March 2017 elections, where the Congress emerged



Specific villages included in the banned area are Arli, Hansali, and Matyal villages.

Furthermore, the restriction will apply to the region along the Katra-Tikri road, which will also see a 200-metre ban on either side, impacting villages such as Chamba, Serli, and Bhagta.

In addition to these areas the restriction will extend along the Katra-Jammu road,

Kundrorian, Kotli Bajallian, Nomain, and Maghal, within a 200-metre radius on both sides

The ban will also be enforced along the Katra-Reasi road, covering the stretch from Katra to Nau Devian, as well as the Aghar Jitto and Nau Devian markets. The prohibition will be applicable within a 200-metre radius on both sides of the road.

Additionally, the around the Katra-Sool Road railway station and the Panthal-Domail road will be subject to similar restrictions. Specifically, the Katra-Sool Road will see a 200-metre restriction on either side, and the Panthal-Domail road will have a 100-metre restriction on both sides

# NFR to start running electric trains in Assam, Tripura soon

Guwahati/Agartala, Feb 10: The Northeast Frontier Railway (NFR) is continuing hectic efforts to start running the long-expected electric trains in southern Assam and Tripura at the earliest, officials said

An NFR official said that a trial run of the first goods train with an electric locomotive was successfully conducted Thursday between southern Assam's Badarpur station and Tripura's Jirania station, 15 km north of Agartala railway station.

"Necessary infrastructural works including electrification were completed recently in southern Assam and Tripura. After the successful operation of some more goods trains with electric locomotives, the running of passenger trains with electric locomotives would start on the route. We are frantically trying to start running passenger trains with electric locomotives within a month or a maximum of two months," the official told IANS.

Tripura is now well connected with Delhi, Kolkata, Mumbai, Firozpur, Patna and other cities of the country by several express trains but passenger train services have been solely powered by diesel-powered engines.

A ₹46 crore electrification project was launched in 2022 to connect Tripura with the national railway grid with electric trains. The Tripura State Electricity Corporation Ltd (TSECL) would supply power to the railway electric trans mission lines

As the infrastructure with electric railway lines is getting ready, the iconic Vande Bharat Express trains will be extended up to Assam's Silchar and Agartala within the next few months, the NFR official said.

Rajya Sabha member from Tripura Rajib Bhattacharjee earlier said that infrastruc ture is almost ready to operate Vande Bharat Express trains up to Silchar and Agartala and the remaining minor works would be completed very soon.

'Prime Minister Narendra Modi always gives priority to the development of north eastern states. Vande Bharat Express is one of his dream projects," he had said.

The Prime Minister flagged off Assam's first Vande Bharat Express May 29, 2023, connect ing Guwahati with New Jalpai guri (West Bengal). The Guwahati-New Jalpaiguri Vande Bharat Express train journey takes 5 hours and 30 minutes as compared to the previous fastest train on the same route, which takes about 6 hours and

30 minutes. The Guwahati-New Jalpaiguri Vande Bharat Express train operates six days a week.

The NFR operates in the northeastern states, seven districts of West Bengal, and five districts of north Bihar.

# Ladakh hot springs to open for battlefield tourism

This initiative aims to boost border and rural tourism, benefiting local communities and showcasing historic military sites, including a new museum and infrastructure developments

Jammu, Feb 10: Ladakh hot springs located in Galwan Valley area close to the Line of Actual Control (LAC) with China are being thrown open for visitors as part of battlefield tourism from June 15.

Officials said Monday, "Hot springs in Eastern Ladakh will be thrown open for the tourists on June 15 this year, the fifth anniversary of martyrdom of 20 Indian soldiers in clash with People's Liberation Army (PLA) of China which lost its

"At present, even the locals can't visit Galwan Valley. The requisite infrastructure is being

generated to promote tourism. The Ministry of Defence has

taken a decision to this effect and the Indian Army is on board. The Union Territory administration of Ladakh has been briefed about the decision and is making all arrangements for converting Galwan Valley into a battlefield tourism destination.

"The Hot Spring area which also falls close to the LAC in Ladakh is also being opened to tourists with infrastructure development and recce operations already underway.

Officials said, "The move is expected to boost border and rural tourism in the region, providing economic benefits to local communities. From establishing war memorials to commemorate the sacrifices of Indian soldiers to promoting

wildlife and cultural tourism, the initiative holds promise for Ladakh's tourism industry and

regional development.' A recce of the Galwan area

was conducted January 19 by a 10-member team of Tourism Enablers representing ALTOA. Taxi Union, Tempo Union, Bike Union and ALGHA Tourism.

"The recce was organised by the GOC Kharu Division and initially, the plan is to open the area to domestic tourists. Pangong Lake already attracts a large number of tourists and the addition of Galwan as a destination is expected to give a significant boost to tourism.

"Two key infrastructure sites are planned, one at a midway point, 5 kms from Durbuk, where a cafeteria, souvenir shop, and accommodation for around 30 people are being built, and another at 12 kms from Durbuk. Shayok is the last settlement village along the route; beyond that, there are no further settlements. A museum is also being developed in Galwan as part of the 2020 memorial. Tourists will have

the opportunity to admire the breathtaking landscape," the officials said.

"In high risk border zones, visitors are required to coordinate with Army units for safety and clearances, facilitated via a single window, while in high-altitude areas, precautions have to be adopted and acclimatization protocols are also being advised," officials said.

It must be recalled that the Army has been working on transforming some of these historic and active battlefields into accessible tourist destinations

The endeavour will allow Indian citizens to explore sites where soldiers are demonstrate ing exceptional valour, which will also foster a deeper appre ciation for the defence forces.



New Delhi, Feb 10: The Supreme Court Monday questioned the Gujarat Police over an FIR against Congress MP Imran Pratapgarhi for allegedly posting an edited video of a provocative song. A bench of Justices Abhay

S Oka and Ujjal Bhuyan said the Gujarat High Court, which junked Pratapgarhi's petition to quash FIR, did not appreciate the meaning of the poem. "It's ultimately a poem. It is

not against any religion. This poem indirectly says even if somebody indulges in violence, we will not indulge in violence. That's the message which the poem gives. It is not against any particular community," the bench said. Senior advocate Kapil Sibal,

appearing for Pratapgarhi, said the high court order was bad in law as the judge did "violence" to the law. The top court deferred the

matter for three weeks after the state's counsel sought time to file a response. The bench asked the counsel

to "apply mind" and come back to the court.

The apex court January 21 stayed proceedings against Pratapgarhi in a case against him for allegedly posting an edited video of a provocative song

The Congress leader challenged the January 17 order of the Gujarat High Court which dismissed his petition for quashing the FIR filed against him saying the investigation was at a very nascent stage.

Pratapgarhi was booked January 3 for the alleged provocative song during a mass marriage function he attended in Gujarat's Jamnagar.

Pratapgarhi, national chairman of the Congress' minority cell, was booked, among others, under Section 196 (promoting enmity between different groups on the basis of religion, race, etc.) and 197 (imputations, assertions prejudicial to national integration) of Bharativa

The 46-second video clip. uploaded by Pratapgarhi on X. showed flower petals being showered at him as he walks waving his hands with a background song, the lyrics of which the FIR alleged were provocative, detrimental to national unity and hurting religious feelings.

# Delhi HC allows custody parole to jailed MP Engineer Rashid

New Delhi: Clarifying it wasn't a precedent, the Delhi High Court Monday allowed a two-day custody parole to jailed J&K MP Rashid Engineer to attend the Parliament session. Justice Vikas Mahajan, however, clarified the order was passed on account of Rashid having no other remedy due to non-availability of a court to hear his bail plea and the relief should not be construed as a precedent. Rashid was allowed to attend the Parliament sessions February 11 and 13. "If access to justice is a facet of fundamental rights, then non-availability of forum for disposal of applicant's application for bail, either interim or regular, renders the petitioner remediless for the time being, and concomitantly deprives him of the aforesaid right," the court said. The order said it would not "completely negate" Rashid's plea for custody parole. Custody parole entails a prisoner being escorted by armed police personnel to the place of visit.

## How can convicted persons return to make laws, SC asks

New Delhi: Flagging "criminalisation of politics" as a major issue, the Supreme Court Monday asked how could a person return to Parliament after being convicted in a criminal case. A bench of Justices Dipankar Datta and Manmohan therefore sought the assistance of the attorney general of India on the issue. It was hearing a PIL filed by advocate Ashwini Upadhyay seeking a life ban on convicted politicians aside from the expeditious disposal of criminal cases against MPs and MLAs in the country. The court sought the responses of the Centre and the Election Commission of India within three weeks on the challenge to constitutional validity of Sections 8 and 9 of Representation of People Act. "Once he is convicted, and the conviction is upheld...how can people come back to Parliament and legislature? That they have to answer. There is also an apparent conflict of interest. They would be vetting the laws," it said. The bench went on to add, "We need to be enlightened on Sections 8 and 9 of Representation of People Act. A government employee who is found guilty of corruption or disloyalty to state is not considered suitable in service even as a

## Misleading ads: SC summons Delhi, Andhra Pradesh, J&K chief secretaries

New Delhi: The Supreme Court Monday slammed several states, including Delhi, Andhra Pradesh and J&K, summoning their chief secretaries over the "failure" to act against illegal advertisements of Ayurvedic, Siddha and Unani drugs. A bench of Justices Abhay S Oka and Uijal Bhuyan said there was hardly any implementation of its orders. The bench directed the chief secretaries to appear in court through video-conferencing to explain why these states were non-compliant. Senior advocate Shadan Farasat, appearing as an amicus curiae, submitted most states accepted an apology and took undertakings while acquitting violators. "As rightly submitted by the amicus curiae, the issue of illegal advertisements of Avurvedic, Siddha or Unani drugs will be substantially taken care of, if all the states start implementing Rule 170 of the Drugs and Cosmetics Rules, 1945 in its true letter and spirit, Notwithstanding several orders passed by this court, the states are non-compliant. said the bench. The top court directed Andhra Pradesh, Delhi, Goa. Guiarat and Jammu and Kashmir to file affidavits, including the response on the enforcement of Rule 170.

## **Retd IPS officer** gets 3 months jail term in assault case

New Delhi, Feb 10: Senior Congress leader Sonia Gandhi Monday asked the government to complete the population census at the earliest, claiming that around 14 crore people in the country are being deprived of their rightful benefits of free and subsidised foodgrains under the food security law.

In her maiden Zero Hour intervention in the Rajya Sabha, Gandhi said beneficiaries under the National Food Security Act (NFSA) are being identified as per the 2011 Census, and not the latest population numbers and thus many are deprived. "For the first time in inde-

pendent India's history, the decennial census has been delayed by more than four years, despite originally being scheduled for 2021. There is still no clarity on when the census will be conducted," she said in the Upper House.

Gandhi also claimed that the Budget allocations reveal that the updated census is unlikely to be conducted this year as well. "Around 14 crore eligible In-

dians are thus being deprived of their rightful benefits under the NFSA," she said.

The senior Congress leader said the NFSA, introduced by the UPA government in September 2013, was a landmark

# Victory invites fulsome acclaim, defeat a lingering loss

he Delhi State Assembly is finally in the BJP's bag. Victor or vanquished, love and hate are being heaped a plenty depending on the side of the divide. Bouquets and brickbats are exchanging places with shameless singularity based on want, need and greed. Reactions, similarly, range from the pious to the profane. The desperation of the BJP for Del-

hi is akin to the lament of a direct recruit commissioner who missed being promoted to inspector. It has taken 27 vears in the wilderness for the BJP -even after helming India for a decade plus under Prime Minister Narendra Modi, to get into the driver's seat in Delhi. Also pasted on the party has been the humiliation of being reduced to holding 3 and 8 seats respectively at the hands of a babe-in-the woods Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) in the 2015 and 2020 Delhi Assembly elections. Delhi has a 70-member State Assembly.

The party came to power at the Centre in 2014 on the slogan "minimum government, maximum governance' but has spared no effort thereafter to truncate the powers of the elected body including neutralising the Supreme Court judgment. Nevertheless, the BJP deserves its victory for the sheer elephantine effort of men, ma-

terial and 'manna' it marshalled in the just concluded polls. It outgunned and outmanoeuvred its principal opponents lock, stock and barrel, the Congress to a humiliating blank and AAP to a respectable Opposition's 22

demand,

This, however is neither about the BJP nor it's numero uno. Modi. It is about AAP, the Congress and the Opposition front, Indian National Developmental Inclusive alliance, commonly known by as I.N.D.I.A. For starters, Arvind Kejriwal and

his fledgling AAP deserve compliments for grinding to dust a Modipowered BJP juggernaut in the Delhi Assembly elections in 2015-2020. It was a superb job efficiently executed. AAP achievements in Delhi need to be seen in the light of the fact that they were at the receiving end of the might of the Central investigative sgencies with ministers and even the chief minister finding himself in jail.

A simplistic analysis of the ensuing election results is that a city populace harassed by the constant tug-of-war between the Centre and the state chose discretion as the better part of valour. The municipal corporation of the state capital of Gandhinagar had been a bastion of the Congress since its inception but the former lost to the BJP big time in 2021 after AAP turned it into a triangular contest. The BJP won 41 of the total 44 seats, the Congress 2 and AAP one seat. This continued in other states as well with the Congress losing its government to AAP in Punjab.

It is this self-centred approach that has seen Kejriwal suffer in Delhi at the hands of the Congress. Highly placed sources say that Rahul Gandhi still favoured an arrangement of sorts but the Kejriwal orchestrated move of announcing candidates beforehand put paid to the move.

#### Gambling racket: 23 **Indians held in Nepal**

Kathmandu: Nepal police arrested 23 Indians Monday in the Bagmati province of the Himalayan nation on charges of operating an online gambling racket. The arrests were made in a two-storey building located in Budhanilkantha Municipality, located 10 km north of Kathmandu, according to Deputy Superintendent of Police Apil Kumar Bohara. The 23 Indian nationals were arrested red-handed when the police raided the building based on a tip-off. Police also seized Rs 81,000 cash, 88 mobile phone sets and 10 laptops from their possession. They are being charged under the anti-gambling act, police said.

## 51 dead after bus plunges off bridge

**Guatemala City:** At least 51 people are dead after their bus plunged off a bridge Monday on the outskirts of Guatemala's capital, said Hector Flores, who was helping coordinate the municipal government's response. Firefighting spokesman Edwin Villagran said a multi-vehicle crash sent the bus off the bridge hefore dawn. Others were seriously injured. The bus fell 115 feet (35 metres) into a sewage-polluted stream. It landed upside down and halfsubmerged. The bus had come from Progreso, northeast of the capital. Volunteer firefighting spokesman Oscar Sanchez said children were among the victims. President Bernardo Arevalo offered his condolences and declared a day of national mourning. Images shared by the fire department on social media showed the bus partially submerged in wastewater surrounded by victims' bodies.

## SL imposes power cuts after plant fails

Colombo: Sri Lanka is scheduled to undergo a 90-minute power cut Monday and Tuesday following a breakdown in a coal power plant. Ceylon Electricity Board, the state power entity, decided Monday given the shortage of supply owing to the failure at the 900-megawatt Norochcholai coal power plant in the northwestern region. The Ceylon Electricity Board in a statement said the 90-minute rationing will be in two slots between 3 pm and 9.30 pm in different areas on both days. The statement said Sunday's sudden power outage forced the operations at Lakvijaya power station to shut. Sri Lanka Sunday experienced an island-wide power outage for nearly 6 hours due to a tripping of a Colombo suburb grid station when a monkey came in contact with it.

London, Feb 10: Indian restaurants, nail bars, convenience stores, and car washes were among the targets of what the Home Office Monday described as a "UK-wide blitz" on illegal working in the country

Home Secretary Yvette Cooper said her department's Immigration Enforcement teams had a record-breaking January as they descended on 828 premises -- a 48 per cent rise compared to the previous January, with arrests surging to 609, and marking a 73 per cent increase from the previous year.

The Home Office said that while its teams respond to illegal working intelligence in all sectors, a significant proportion of last month's activity took place at restaurants, takeaways and cafes as well as in the food, drink and tobacco industry.

We also know that many people who end up working illegally are often subjected to extremely poor conditions, so we will continue and protect the most vulnerable," he said. As part of this activity, Immi-

grant Enforcement said it also plays a critical safeguarding role in working closely with organisations to allow employees to report labour exploitation.

In January, it claimed to have smashed its target to drive the removal of foreign criminals and immigration offenders to the highest level since 2018, with 16,400 people removed since the July 2024 general election.

Bespoke charter flights have also removed "immigration offenders" to countries around the world, including four of the biggest migrant returns flights in the UK's history carrying more than 800 people.

Those removed on these flights are said to include criminals convicted of drug offences theft, rape and murder.

# **Pressure by populists:** Romanian prez quits



"The US tariff threats continued to impact the market sentiment. Domestic yield is inching higher as investors stay cautious on riskier assets and navigate their investments to safe haven assets like gold," Vinod Nair, Head of Research, Geojit Financial Services, said.

# **RBI** doubles bond purchase to manage liquidity deficit

Mumbai, Feb 10: India's central bank Monday said it will double the quantum of security purchases under its next tranche of open market operation February 13 to manage the liquidity deficit in the country's banking system.

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) will purchase government securities worth 400 billion rupees (\$4.57 billion), as against 200 billion rupees announced earlier, it said in a release.

The banking system liquidity has stayed in deficit for eight consecutive weeks as of the week ended February 7, and the deficit currently stands at 1.33 trillion rupees. The RBI cut its key interest rate by 25 basis points on Friday to boost the sluggish economy but did not announce any liquidity-boosting measures which led to an uptick in bond yields. At the time, RBI Governor Sanjay Malhotra had said the central bank would continue to monitor the evolving liquidity and financial market conditions and proactively take appropriate measures to ensure orderly liquidity conditions.



The central bank has already infused over 1 trillion rupees through bond purchases and dollar/rupee swaps and another 500 billion rupees through a 56-day repo auction.

# Indian steel industry 'deeply concerned' over US tariffs



New Delhi, Feb 10: Industry body Indian Steel Association (ISA) Monday expressed 'deep concern' over the announcement of the US administration to impose tariffs on steel imports.

The move will further disrupt global trade and intensify challenges for the steel industry, ISA President Naveen Jindal said in a statement. US President Donald Trump

has said that he will announce an additional 25 per cent tariff on all steel and aluminium imports from different countries on Monday. "The Indian Steel Association

expresses deep concern over the US decision to impose tariffs on steel imports. This latest tariff is expected to slash steel exports to the US by 85 per cent, creating a massive surplus that will likely flood India which is one of the few major markets without trade restrictions presently," the industry leader said.

The US, a major steel importer, has historically imposed strict trade restrictions, with over 30 remedial actions in force against Indian steel -- some for more than three decades. Jindal said India's carbon

steel exports to the US are al-

ready negligible due to long standing anti-dumping duty and countervailing duty measures and this decision will only add to the misery and aggravate the situation further.

The association president pointed out that with the US shutting its doors to global steel the surplus steel in the market will be redirected to India, threatening domestic industry with price crashes and unfair competition.

Moody's Ratings has also said Indian steel producers will face increased challenges in exporting their products following the US decision to impose an additional 25 per cent tariff on all steel and aluminium imports as announced by President Don

Over the past 12 months, high steel imports into India have already dampened prices and earnings of steel producers in India, said Hui Ting Sim, assistant vice president at Moody's Ratings. As per think tank Glob-

al Trade Research Initiative (GTRI) data, since the trade war began in 2018, US steel and aluminium imports have continued to rise. Primary steel imports increased to USD 33 billion in 2024 from USD 31.3 billion in 2018.

# Rupee rises 5 paise to 87.45 against USD

Mumbai, Feb 10: The rupee Monday plunged 45 paise and moved closer to the 88 per US dollar-level, weighed down by the strength of the American currency tariff concerns, but eventually settled at 87.45, up 5 paise, following RBI interven-

The American currency gained in the overseas mar ket after US President Donald Trump's plans to impose 25 per cent tariffs on steel and aluminum imports, along with reciprocal tariffs targeting countries taxing US exports.

The move has added jitters over the global trade war with China's reciprocal duties coming into effect, they said.

At the interbank foreign exchange, the rupee opened at 87.94 and touched an all-time intraday low of 87.95 against the American currency during the session.

The local unit, however, nared the initial losses and finally at 87.45, higher by 5 paise from its previous close.

# India face uphill task without Sindhu

Qingdao, Feb 10: Without the services of an injured PV Sindhu, India will face an uphill task in pursuit of an elusive gold medal at the Badminton Asia Mixed Team Championships which get underway here

India hope to improve on their bronze medal finish from the previous edition where Sindhu played a key role in Dubai two years ago. Her absence this year due to an injury will be a significant setback as the team embarks on its campaign in the prestigious bien-

Sindhu sustained a hamstring injury during a pre-tournament training camp in Guwahati February 4, forcing her to withdraw from the tournament at the last minute. Her unavailability puts the onus on world No 29 Malvika Bansod to step up in women's singles. Placed in Group D, India will

open their campaign against Macau Wednesday, followed by a clash with a strong Korean outfit Thursday. A top-two finish in the group will secure a spot in the quarterfinals, and while India is likely to progress to the last eight, advancing further will require exceptional performances from the squad.

While India have never won the gold at the Asia Mixed Team Championships, they did secure mixed team gold and silver at the Commonwealth Games in 2018 and 2022.

India have had notable success in recent team events, including their first-ever Thomas Cup gold in 2022, the 2024 Badminton Asia Team Championships silver in Malaysia, and a historic men's silver at the Hangzhou Asian Games.

The team features many key players from those victories, including HS Prannoy, Lak-



shya Sen, Ashwini Ponnappa, Satwiksairaj Rankireddy, and Chirag Shetty, with all eyes on them to put up an inspired performance.

While Satwik and Chirag have been consistent with semifinal finishes at the Malaysia Open and India Open, Prannov has been troubled by niggles after returning to action following the Olympics, where he was affected by a pre-tourna-

ment chikungunya bout. Syed Modi champion Lakshya, on the other hand, has endured a few first-round exits this season and will need to regain his form quickly.

As expectations will be high for the men's singles and men's doubles, India also boasts strength in women's doubles. with Gavatri Gopichand and Treesa Jolly repeatedly showcasing their skills. The duo re-

cently broke into the world's top 10 on the back of their maiden super 300 title run at Lucknow and qualifying at the BWF World Tour event last year.

Adding to the experience is Ponnappa, who competed at the Paris Olympics alongside young Tanisha Crasto. The duo won the Guwahati Masters Super 100 last December and will look to put up a good show here. The mixed doubles pair of Sathish Karunakaran and Aadya Variyath will also carry confidence into their first team event, coming off a gold medal at the National Games in Deh radun earlier this month.

In the last three editions of the tournament, China clinched the title in 2023 and 2019 while Japan emerged as champions in the inaugural edition in 2017. The event was not held in 2021 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

# Trump attends Super Bowl with a complicated NFL relationship

New Orleans, Feb 10: Greeted with a mix of cheers and boos, U.S. President Donald Trump attended the Super Bowl Sunday, the first sitting president to do so in person, despite a complicated relationship with the National Football League and a controversial history of mixing politics and sports.

Trump watched the game between the Kansas City Chiefs and Philadelphia Eagles from a box in the Superdome in New Orleans, along with his daughter, Ivanka, and son, Eric, as well as several lawmakers who accompanied him on Air Force One to New Orleans. First lady Melania Trump did not attend. The president's visit, some

three weeks after he launched

his second term at the White House with executive orders to crack down on immigration and end government diversity programs, put the Republican at the scene of a classic American pastime that connects people of all political ideologies.

It also put a spotlight on divisions in the country and differing opinions about his policies.

When he entered the stadium, to meet briefly with families of the victims of the New Year's Day attack on Bourbon Street as well as police officers and emergency workers, he was greeted with a mix of cheers and boos from the crowd.

It proved effective, and Trump has continued his crackdown on transgender rights from the White House, last week signing an executive order seeking to exclude transgender girls and women from female sports.

Trump was one of many celebrities at the game. Superstar singer Taylor Swift, who is dating Chiefs player Travis Kelce, was also in the stadium She endorsed Harris in the 2024 election.
