State to deport 12 Pakistanis

Bhubaneswar, April 25: Following Union Home Minister Amit Shah's direction to all states, the Odisha government Friday started the process of deporting Pakistanis residing in the state, a top police official said.
The direction came in the wake of the Pahalgam terror attack in which 26 tourists, including one from Odisha, were gunned down April 22.
"So far, 12 Pakistani nationals have been identified staying in Odisha either on long-term visas (LTVs) or short-term visas (STVs) in different districts," DGP YB Khurania said.
SPs have been directed to ensure the deportation of the Pakistani nationals from their jurisdiction, he added.
"They will have to leave the country within 48 hours of receiving the notices," Khurania added, noting that the order applies both to those with valid visas and to those whose visas have expired and are awaiting extension.
Shah dialled the chief ministers of all states and asked them to ensure that no Pakistani stays in India beyond the deadline set for leaving the country, sources said.
India Thursday announced revoking all visas issued to Pakistani nationals from April 27 and advised Indian nationals residing in the neighbouring country to return home at the earliest.
"Our CM has assured full co-operation to the Centre in this regard and the state Home department has initiated steps to implement the order," a senior officer said.
Law Minister Prithviraj Harichandan has said that the government would soon take action against Bangladeshi infiltrators who have been living in the state for a long time.
"As many as 3,738 Bangladeshi infiltrators have been identified across the state," he said, adding that a separate decision will be taken for them.
The revocation of visas does not apply to the long-term visas already issued to Hindu Pakistani nationals, which "remain valid."
India announced suspending visa services to Pakistani nationals with immediate effect over the cross-border links to the Pahalgam attack, the worst terror strike targeting civilians in the country since the 26/11 Mumbai terror attack.

DOING WEST'S DIRTY WORK FOR DECADES: PAK DEFENCE MIN

LONDON: Pakistan Defence Minister Khawaja Asif has admitted the country's history of supporting, training and funding terrorist organisations as "dirty work" for the West, a mistake for which he said Pakistan had suffered. In an interview with Sky News aired overnight, news presenter Yalda Hakim questioned Asif on Pakistan's response and stance on terrorism in the aftermath of the terrorist attack in Pahalgam that killed 26 people earlier this week.
"You do admit, sir, that Pakistan has had a long history of backing and supporting and training and funding these terrorist organisations," asked Hakim. "Well, we have been doing this dirty work for the United States for about three decades, you know, and the West, including Britain," replied Asif.
"That was a mistake, and we suffered from that, and that is why you are saying this to me. If we had not joined the war against the Soviet Union and later on the war after 9/11, Pakistan's track record... was an unimpeachable track record," he said.
"It is very convenient for... the big powers to blame Pakistan for whatever is happening in this region. When we were fighting the war on their side way back in the 80s against the Soviet Union, all these terrorists of today, they were wining and dining in Washington..." he said.

Pakistan rushes military equipment towards LoC

New Delhi, April 25: Pakistan has reportedly been moving its military equipment towards the Line of Control (LoC) in Jammu & Kashmir in the wake of the escalating tensions with India. Residents in Rawalpindi, Punjab, say they saw large convoys of army trucks and tankers coming toward the area, RT, a Russian state-controlled media reported Friday.
Pakistan military has been put on high alert following India's assertion that it will hunt down the terrorists involved in Tuesday's Pahalgam strike that killed 26 people.
In another development, Indian Army has effectively responded to unprovoked firing by Pakistani military at some places along the LoC in Jammu and Kashmir amid sharp escalation of tension between the two neighbours. Military sources said the Pakistan military resorted to the firing Thursday, adding there were no reports of any casualties. There is no official word from the Indian Army



on the Pakistani firing and the Indian response. "There were incidents of small arm firing at some places on LoC initiated by Pakistan," said a source.
"The firing was effectively responded to," the source added.
As tensions between India and Pakistan rose, Army Chief General Upendra Dwivedi reviewed the security situation in Srinagar with senior Army commanders.
Meanwhile, Pakistan Rangers refused to hand over a BSF jawan, who inadvertently strayed to the other side, for

CM invites steel industry leaders to invest in state

Bhubaneswar, April 25: Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Friday said Odisha was confident of achieving the target of producing 130 million tonne per annum of steel by 2030.
Addressing the Odisha State Roundtable at India Steel 2025 in Mumbai, Majhi said his state is the top producer of both iron ore and stainless steel in India, with 54 integrated steel plants, having a capacity of 41.21 mtpa at present.
"The state has set a target to produce 130 mtpa of steel by 2030, and it would require about 190 million tonne of iron ore. With our strong commitment, I am confident that Odisha is ready to realise this ambitious goal," he said.
Majhi said the state at present produces 58 per cent of the iron ore of the country, and is poised to take it to 70 per cent by 2030-31.
"By that time, India's iron ore consumption is anticipated to grow to 340 mtpa and Odisha is preparing to contribute about 240-245 mtpa," he said.
"I want to assure investors that the government will ensure the availability of suffi-

cient minerals - iron ore, coal, and limestone - for the growing steel industry. Fortunately, all these materials are available in the state, and you don't have to go shopping anywhere else. As the steel manufacturing capacity expands, we will facilitate more production from mines," he said, inviting them to invest in the state.
The CM said his government has undertaken various initiatives, including the formation of a high-level task force comprising top officers to ensure the smooth commissioning of projects.
"From securing raw materials and encumbrance-free land to ensuring connectivity through roadways and railways and providing utilities like electricity and water, the state is committed to meeting the specific needs of every industry operating in this vital sector," he said. Majhi said his government was now setting its sights on developing a comprehensive metal-based value chain, from raw materials to high-end engineering products.
The event was attended by more than 200 delegates, including those from Tata Steel, AMNS, JSW, JSL and SAIL.

SC raps Rahul for Savarkar remarks



New Delhi, April 25: The Supreme Court Friday censured Congress leader Rahul Gandhi for 'irresponsible' remarks on Vinayak Damodar Savarkar at a rally in Maharashtra but stayed the criminal proceedings against him.
A bench of Justices Dipankar Datta and Manmohan said, "Let's not mock our freedom fighters."
The bench further asked senior advocate Abhishek Singhvi, appearing for Gandhi, whether he knew that even Mahatma Gandhi used the words such as "your faithful servant" in his communications to the Britishers.
When Singhvi argued charges of promoting enmity and public mischief were not made out against Gandhi, the bench remarked, "You are most obedient... does your client know that Mahatma Gandhi also used 'your faithful servant' while addressing the viceroy? Can Mahatma Gandhi be called a 'servant of Britishers' merely because he addressed himself to the viceroy as 'your servant'." In those days, even I have seen, our judges of the Calcutta High Court used to address Chief Justice as writing 'your servant'.
Justice Datta added, "Does your client know that his grandmother (Indira Gandhi), when she was the Prime Minister, also sent a letter praising this very gentleman (Savarkar)?"
The judge went on, "So, let's not make irresponsible statements about freedom fighters. You have made a good point on law, you are entitled to stay. We are not saying anything on that."

5,000-yr-old tomb of noblewoman found in Peru

The discovery reveals the important role played by women in the oldest centre of civilisation in the Americas

Lima, April 25: Archaeologists in Peru said they found the 5,000-year-old remains of a noblewoman at the sacred city of Caral, revealing the important role played by women in the oldest centre of civilisation in the Americas.
"What has been discovered corresponds to a woman who apparently had elevated status, an elite woman," archaeologist David Palomino told AFP.
"This is an important burial because it has elements that correspond to a woman of high status," Palomino added, pointing to the way the corpse was wrapped and preservation of

her skin, hair and nails.
The mummy was found in Aspero, a sacred site within the city of Caral that was a garbage dump for over 30 years until becoming an archaeological site in the 1990s.
Palomino said the carefully preserved remains, dating to 3,000 years BC, contained skin, part of the nails and hair and was wrapped in a shroud made of several layers of fabric and a mantle of macaw feathers.
Macaws are colourful birds that belong to the parrot family.
The woman's funerary trousseau, which was presented to reporters at the culture ministry, included a toucan's beak, a



stone bowl and a straw basket. Preliminary analyses indicate that the remains found in December belong to a woman between 20 and 35 years old who was 1.5 metres (5 feet) tall, and wearing a headdress that represented her elevated

Despite facing widespread mockery, Alia has remained unfazed, using humour and self-awareness to turn the narrative around.




Dharam's lost tale of love from partition era

This tender tale came to light when Dharmendra appeared on the game show *Dus Ka Dum*. 



Rabi paddy procurement in 20 dists begins May 1

Bhubaneswar, April 25: The procurement of paddy for rabi season in 20 districts will begin May 1 and conclude June 30, Chief Secretary Manoj Ahuja said Friday.

Briefing media following the state-level paddy procurement committee meeting at Lok Seva Bhawan here, Ahuja said the state government has made extensive preparations for purchase of paddy from farmers in the current rabi season.

"Paddy procurement for the current rabi season will start May 1 and continue till June 30. The state government has set a target to procure 14 lakh metric tonnes (LMT) of paddy in the current season," he said, adding that around 3,37,000 farmers have been registered for the purpose.

This year, paddy will be procured in 20 districts, including

nodal officers and supervisors for mandis. Similarly, it was discussed in the meeting that all facilities will be available for farmers at mandis.

Official sources said like kharif season, Rs 3,100 per quintal, including Rs 2,300 as MSP and Rs 800 as input assistance, will be directly disbursed to a farmer's account within 48 hours of paddy procurement. Complaints can be made through 1967 regarding paddy purchase. "Each mandi will be equipped with CCTV, while vehicle carrying paddy from mandi to mill must have tracking system. District Collectors have been instructed to make special arrangements in view of the unseasonal rains and heatwave to protect paddy and ensuring lifting of paddy on the same day," they said.

Similarly, special squads will be deployed at bordering districts to keep eye on outside vehicles carrying paddy during procurement, they added.

Among others, Mission Shakti Commissioner-com-Secretary Shalini Pandit, Transport Commissioner Amitabh Thakur, Agriculture and Food Production Director Shubham Saxena, senior officers from Food Corporation of India and Odisha State Supply Corporation and various departmental officers were present in the meeting. District Collectors and Civil Supply Officers attended the meeting through videoconferencing.

Kandhamal, Sundargarh and Bhadrak, he said, adding a total of 965 primary agricultural cooperative societies and 200 SHGs have also joined the process.

Food Supplies and Consumer Welfare department Principal Secretary Sanjay Kumar Singh said around 73.45 LMT of paddy was procured from nearly 16,60,000 farmers in the last kharif season.

"For this, Rs 16,853 crore was paid to the farmers as MSP and Rs 5,862 crore as input assistance," he said.

Ahuja directed Collectors of the districts to ensure that eligible farmers are not deprived of paddy procurement. He also appreciated the process of providing token to farmers by validating paddy crop growing areas through satellite imagery technology by ORSAC.

The chief secretary also directed Collectors to deploy

EDITORS' CONCLAVE AT BIRLA SCHOOL OF COMMUNICATION

Transition in journalism more today: Satpathy

Bhubaneswar, April 25: Journalism has always been in transition, and today, more than ever, said Dharitri and Orissa POST Editor Tathagata Satpathy Friday.

Speaking at the inaugural session of the first-ever Editors' Conclave hosted by the Birla School of Communication at the Birla Global University (BGU) here, Satpathy said, "News is something that surrounds us every day, and journalism, as I see it, is always in transition. In fact, the transition today is more than ever."

Satpathy said journalism is the oldest profession as it is linked to the evolution of communication itself. "The evolution of the first form of journalism can be traced to hunter-gatherer days. Since ancient times, humans, or even animals, have shared information about food sources for survival," he said.

He said the responsibility

of delivering accurate information to society rests with the media. "In the present age, every incident spreads rapidly. While the media is busy broadcasting updates about events to the public, they often don't delve deep into the root of the incident. Therefore, it is essential for journalists to investigate thoroughly and bring out fact-based news to the public eye, and editors must ensure that such reports are given due space in their media platforms," he said.

Citing example of the Pahalgam incident, he stated that while everyone is eager to know what actions will be taken after such a terror strike, very few present factual information about the root causes behind such a major event.

"Identifying the causes of such incidents can help in preventing them in the future," he added.

On the occasion, Satpathy delivered an insightful discussion on the evolving landscape of journalism. He emphasised the transformative role, responsibilities, and challenges of editorial leadership in the digital age.

The inaugural session – Media in Transition: The Editor's Perspective Then and Now – saw the participation of prominent media personalities, including OdishaLIVE Editor Nilambar Rath and Outlook's former Editor-in-Chief Ruben Banerjee, who joined virtually.

In his address, Banerjee emphasised the growing challenge of misinformation. "Falsehood spreads faster today due to the

accessibility of social media. Disinformation which is deliberate can be more dangerous than misinformation—unintentional inaccuracies. Fact-checking must be taught from a young age and made part of school curricula," he said.

The session was moderated by Assistant Professor Anvesha Padhi.

The second session – The Future of Media Freedom: Corporate Influence, Editorial Independence, and Regulatory Challenges – featured BBC Editor (Digital Content) Sarvapriya Sangwan, Newsroom Editor Manoranjan Mishra, MBC TV Editor Ashok Kumar Panda, and Nandighosha TV Editor Sisir Bhattamishra.

The session delved into the responsibilities of media in safeguarding freedom of speech while resisting propaganda and maintaining editorial integrity.

Students, faculty, and writers from various media organisations participated in the conclave, which concluded with a Q&A session.

Man booked as pet dog starved to death

Cuttack, April 25: The Puri Ghat police in Cuttack Friday booked a man who allegedly left his pet dog starve to death in his house in Petin Sahi area.

Inspector-in-Charge Biswaranjan Nayak said a case (140/2025) has been filed against Manoj Kumar Singh under the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act. He was brought to the police station for questioning in this regard, Nayak added.

According to police, Singh owned a labrador breed dog. Recently, he went away in connection with some work, leaving the dog locked in the house. A few days later, neighbours found a foul smell emanating from the house and informed the police. When police broke open the door of the house, the dog's carcass was found inside. A necropsy of the carcass was immediately conducted.

During questioning, Singh is learnt to have told police that he had left food and water for the dog before going out. He said he never anticipated the tragedy. However, it was later revealed during investigation that he would often leave the dog alone at home during his outings.

Many firsts: City AIIMS performs robotic knee replacement surgery

Bhubaneswar, April 25: The All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS)-Bhubaneswar has successfully conducted robotic knee replacement surgery on a 66-year-old woman to become the first government facility not only in Odisha but also in the eastern India to perform such tech-assisted procedure, official sources said Friday.

"The Orthopaedics department at AIIMS successfully performed the first robotic knee replacement on a 66-year-old female patient. The procedure, which was carried out with precision and cutting-edge technology, went smoothly, and the patient is now in stable condition following the operation," AIIMS-Bhubaneswar Executive Director Ashutosh Biswas said.

Biswas congratulated the entire Orthopaedics team for their success in performing the landmark procedure.

He emphasised the significance of the robotic surgery facility, highlighting that it ensures access to advanced healthcare services for all segments of society. "With introduction of robotic services, AIIMS-Bhubaneswar has made robo-assisted surgeries accessible to patients across all social strata," Biswas added.

"This technology minimises



the risk of human error and improves surgical outcomes by providing real-time feedback and allowing the surgeon to execute complex steps more accurately," said Orthopaedics department head Bishnu Prasad Patro.

Knee replacement surgeries have long been known as the surgery of the century, transforming lives of people suffering from debilitating knee arthritis. In the past, individuals in their 50s and 60s were often confined to bed due to knee pain, with limited mobility. These days, knee replacement surgeries have become a beacon of hope for many, restoring movement and significantly improving quality of life.

Traditional knee replacement procedures involved use of jigs and cutting blocks,

which, while effective, carried a potential for human error, particularly in complex cases involving severe deformities, previous surgeries, or advanced arthritis. However, robotic technology takes this to the next level by providing real-time feedback to the surgeon, fine-tuning the procedure, and ensuring greater precision, experts said.

Additionally, the robot can carry out certain steps independently using navigation and artificial intelligence, offering a higher level of accuracy and consistency throughout the operation, they added.

AIIMS-Bhubaneswar Medical Superintendent Dr Dillip Kumar Parida, Dr Sujit Tripathy, Dr Gurudip Das and Dr Meganath V Pawar were also present on the occasion.

16 places record temp above 40°C

Bhubaneswar, April 25: Heatwave conditions scorched Odisha Friday, with the mercury crossing 40 degrees Celsius in 16 places, according to the India Meteorological Department (IMD).

A hot and humid climate is likely in the coastal districts of Balasore, Bhadrak, Jajpur, Kendrapara, Cuttack, Jagatsinghpur, Puri and Khurda. Similar weather conditions will prevail in the adjoining Nayagarh, Ganjam and Gajapati districts, the IMD said.

Govt to build 1 lakh houses

Bhubaneswar, April 25: The Odisha government has set a target to construct one lakh houses under second phase of the Antyodaya Gruha Yojana, a flagship rural housing scheme of the state.

Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi March 30 launched the scheme in Kalahandi district.

In the initial phase, orders have been issued for building 60,000 houses under the scheme, Panchayati Raj and Drinking Water Minister Rabi Narayan Naik said here Friday.

For the second phase, a target has been set to cover another one lakh people under the scheme, he said.

"We have issued instructions to Collectors and BDOs to identify the eligible beneficiaries like differently-abled, Padma awardees, victims of natural calamities in the next two months," the minister told media.

The state government has planned to build a total of five lakh houses in the next three years under the scheme. This financial year, a budget of Rs 2,600 crore has been allocated for the scheme, while Rs 7,550 crore will be spent in the next three years, sources said.

2 held for assaulting vehicle owner

Bhubaneswar: The Dhauuli police arrested a 49-year-old man and his minor son for allegedly assaulting a vehicle owner following a petty dispute over parking, near Uttara Chak Friday. IIC Pradipta Kishore Naik identified the accused as Narayan Dash, a resident of Balakati, and his minor son. He said a sword used by them to threaten the victim, Rajendra Sahu, has been seized. Naik said the incident occurred around 6:30 pm Thursday when Sahu asked the boy to move his car as it blocked way to move his motorcycle. However, the minor started abusing Sahu. The IIC said when Sahu objected to the minor's abuses, the latter was joined by Dash, and the duo thrashed Sahu. Matters didn't end there. The enraged minor took out a sword from car's boot and chased Rajendra with an intention to assault the latter. However, people present at the spot came to Sahu's rescue. They caught hold of the duo and handed them over to police, which took them into custody.

46 new civil judge courts in state

Bhubaneswar, April 25: The Odisha government has established 46 new civil judge courts in different parts of the state, officials said Friday.

Five new civil judge courts have been set up in Balasore district, while four such courts each were established in Sambalpur, Mayurbhanj and Sundargarh districts. Jajpur, Kendrapara, Kandhamal and Ganjam districts got three such courts each, while two such courts each were established in Keonjhar, Jagatsinghpur and Cuttack, the Chief Minister's Office (CMO) said in a statement.



One civil judge court each was opened in Rayagada, Puri, Sonepur, Bargarh, Jharsuguda, Khurda, Koraput, Bhadrak, Malkangiri, Dhenkanal and Bolangir districts, it said.

The state government constituted these courts in consultation with the Orissa High Court, it said. With establishment of these courts, the jurisdiction of the existing junior division civil judge courts over these revenue tehsils has been terminated, the statement added.

SUMUM doctors save preterm baby with congenital disorder

Bhubaneswar, April 25: In a remarkable feat of neonatal and surgical care, doctors at SUM Ultimate Medicare (SUMUM) here have saved a preterm baby weighing 1,520 gram, born with complex congenital anomalies. The baby, delivered at 33 weeks of gestation, was diagnosed with Pierre Robin Sequence, a rare condition occurring in approximately 1 in 14,000 live births. The baby was born with a significantly underdeveloped lower jaw, which caused the tongue to be displaced downward, leading to a life-threatening upper airway obstruction. In addition, the baby had a cleft palate, further complicating both breathing and feeding.

Due to the extremely small oral opening, conventional methods of intubation and ventilation were not feasible. In a pioneering move—possibly the first of its kind in Odisha—the medical team performed a delicate tracheotomy, creating a small airway and inserting a tube through an incision in the neck to facilitate breathing. "The team initially attempted a tracheotomy, but the smallest available tracheostomy tube (2.5 mm) could not be inserted due to the baby's anatomy. In a critical on-table decision, the team performed a retrograde intubation through the tracheal port to secure the airway," said Radhamadhab Sahu, Senior Consultant, ENT and Skull Base Surgery.

"Since a smaller-sized tube was not available in the vicinity, we used the 2.5 mm tube with a rare tracheal splitting technique, marking a first-of-its-kind intervention in Odisha," Sahu added. Despite a turbulent stay in the NICU, the baby responded well to intensive care. With improved nutrition and airway support using non-invasive ventilation techniques, the baby is now three and a half months old, gaining healthy weight and breathing independently.

Addressing a press conference, state Congress in-charge Ajay Kumar Lallu said a series of rallies will be organised at the district, division and Assembly segment levels to seek "social, political and economic justice".

The state-level 'Samvidhan Bachao' rally will be held in Bhubaneswar April 28, followed by district-level rallies from May 3 to 10, he said. The campaign would then move to the Assembly level, between May 11 and 17, he added. Lallu said the final phase will involve door-to-door campaigns from May 20 to 30. He alleged that as Rahul



Gandhi has been demanding a caste census to ensure that the rights of SCs, STs and OBCs are protected, the Centre has framed him and his mother Sonia Gandhi in the "fabricated" National Herald case to divert people's attention. "Though the total OBC population of Odisha is 54 per cent, they are getting only 11.25 per cent reservation in government jobs and no reservation in education," he claimed. "Even though Union Education Minister Dharmendra

Pradhan belongs to Odisha and he is an OBC, the OBC students are not getting any reservation in education here," he said. Lallu said the rallies have been organised to make people aware of "threat to the Constitution" under the BJP-led government at the Centre. Congress Legislature Party leader Rama Chandra Kadam slammed the BJP government for not implementing the Panchayats Extension to Scheduled Areas (PESA) Act, 1996, in the state.

3 held for defrauding Agniveer aspirants

Bhubaneswar, April 25: Odisha Police arrested three persons including two serving Navy personnel in Khurda district, on the charge of extorting money from Agniveer aspirants during a recruitment drive in November 2024, an officer said Friday. The arrested were identified as Satyam Chahar, working at INS Kesari, Andaman and Nicobar, Vinay Kumar Ray, posted

at INS Chilika and retired Navy official Bhoosan, a resident of Uttar Pradesh, the officer said. The trio was arrested based on a complaint lodged by Lt Commander Adwitiya Singh, a training correspondence officer at INS Chilika, at Balugaon police station April 19. The case was registered on charges of cheating and extortion. In a statement, INS Chilika claimed that Indian Navy's proactive approach foiled recruitment malpractice attempts. "During

routine surveillance operations coinciding with the ongoing Agniveer recruitment process, INS Chilika detected suspicious activity indicating a possible monetary demand from a candidate," it said. Based on the indication, actions were taken promptly and the Navy surveillance team identified a potential suspect and shared the intelligence with Balugaon police. "Based on this input, the police apprehended the accused. The Indian Navy is extending full cooperation to the police in the ongoing investigation," the Navy said. Khurda SP Sagarika Nath said the arrested were accused of extorting a huge amount of money from Agniveer aspirants by promising them assistance in police verification, physical examination, and securing a job. "As per intelligence inputs, two more persons are suspected to be involved in the racket. Police have so far frozen 12 bank accounts linked to the fraudulent activities," the SP said.

Ill-effects of unhealthy habits start showing up at 36: Study

A study has suggested that age 36 is when the ill-effects of having unhealthy habits as a young adult – smoking, drinking and physical inactivity – start becoming apparent. Researchers from the University of Jyväskylä tracked about 370 residents of the Finnish city for over 30 years. Data was collected via surveys and medical tests at ages 27, 36, 42, 50 and 61. Three bad habits – smoking, heavy drinking and a lack of exercise – can lead to declines in health in people as young as 36, according to findings published in the journal *Annals of Medicine*. The team said that unhealthy behaviours in mid-life – 40s and 50s – are known to increase chances of developing health disorders in old age. However, their analysis showed that the ill-effects



of unhealthy behaviours remained similar through the ages 36 to 61, suggesting that the link exists already at age 36 and not only in the later phases of mid-life. Crucially, the ill-effects were apparent by the time the participants were in their mid-30s, the researchers said. "Our findings highlight the

importance of tackling risky health behaviours, such as smoking, heavy drinking and physical inactivity, as early as possible to prevent the damage they do from building up over the years, culminating in poor mental and physical health later in later life," lead author Tiia Kekalainen, a health scientist at the University of Jyväskylä's

MAKING IN ODISHA, GST FILING IN J'KHAND

Tax evasion in heavy vehicle carriage building unearthed

Rourkela, April 25: A large-scale tax evasion racket in the construction of carriages of heavy cargo vehicles has come to light in and around Rourkela, sources said Friday. Though the vehicles are purchased and modified in Odisha, the Goods and Services Tax (GST) filings are being done in neighbouring Jharkhand, thereby resulting in significant revenue losses for the Odisha government.



According to sources, agencies building carriages for heavy vehicles like trailers, tankers, trucks, tippers, and tractors are required to obtain trade licenses. Additionally, certifications from the Automotive Research Association of India (ARAI) in Pune are mandatory for ensuring structural safety and compliance.

However, in Rourkela and nearby areas, very few agencies are officially registered. More than 100 garages operate in localities such as Vedyvas, Kalunga, Kuanmunda, Rajgangpur and along the main road, offering heavy vehicle carriage-building and body modification services.

While the work demands skilled technicians, necessary infrastructure and compliance with safety norms such as the use of specified-grade iron and adherence to weight limits, many unlicensed garages with untrained workers are carrying out the work flouting regulations in place. Notably, GST is applicable on the fabrication of heavy vehicle carriages and bodies. Ideally, the state government

should receive this tax. But in practice, GST registrations for these operations are being carried out in Jharkhand. Despite the labour and raw materials being sourced from Odisha, the 28 per cent GST levied per vehicle body is benefiting neighbouring Jharkhand instead.

Owing to this ongoing cross-border GST filing loophole, Odisha is losing out on crores of rupees in tax revenue annually. Despite being aware of the matter, the state Transport department has allegedly remained silent, according to sources. A truck buyer, speaking on condition of anonymity, claimed that a racket is operating across Odisha and Jharkhand, involving fraudulent individuals who are fabricating truck bodies and evading GST.

As per the allegation, truck bodies or carriages are manufactured in Rourkela and then sent to Jharkhand at lower prices. GST filings are then carried out in that state, using the prepared documents to register the heavy vehicles. These documents are later submitted at the Rourkela

Regional Transport Office (RTO) to obtain fitness certificates for the vehicles, the buyer said.

When contacted, Rourkela Regional Transport Officer Bibhav Bhanjan Samantsinghar stated that only four to five garages in the city are authorised to manufacture truck carriages and bodies. Additionally, a separate license has been granted to the private garages in Vedyvas. The Motor Vehicles Inspector (MVI) team issues fitness certificates only after proper inspections, he added.

Samantsinghar also noted that vehicle registration in other states leads to revenue loss for Odisha, but no formal complaint regarding such a racket has reached the department so far. "If any such complaint is received, appropriate action will be taken," he said.

Rourkela GST Enforcement department's Deputy Commissioner Jagdish Sa, when asked about the matter, said no such complaint has come to their notice. "If such tax fraud is occurring, it would be subject to investigation," he added.

2 looters injured in gunfight with police

Rourkela, April 25: Two miscreants, who were allegedly fleeing after looting an eatery, were injured in a gunfight with the police in Rourkela, an officer said Friday.

They were hospitalised and stated to be out of danger. The incident took place when four miscreants were fleeing after looting a roadside dhaba and firing at its owner Suman Xalxo injuring him Thursday night.

Personnel from Bisra police station chased the gang. While fleeing, they fired targeting the policemen who returned the fire in self-defence injuring two of them, the officer said. The other two managed to flee.

The two injured were admitted to a hospital in Rourkela where their health condition was stated to be out of danger.

The police have recovered one country-made handgun, four empty cases and Rs 4,800 in cash from them. The police have launched a manhunt to nab the two other looters.

2 die after tree falls on auto-rickshaw

Bolangir, April 25: Two people were killed Friday afternoon when a tree fell on a moving auto-rickshaw during a thunderstorm near Kasabahal village under Puintala block in Bolangir district.

The incident occurred during a Nor'wester storm, which brought strong winds and light rain. A large neem tree was uprooted and collapsed onto the auto-rickshaw, killing the driver and a passenger instantly.

The deceased were identified as Gulam Mustafa Mohammad, 24, from Jhilimunda village near Balikhamar under Tarbha police station in Subarnapur district, and Nadi Nanda, 55, from Tandamunda village under Puintala police limits.

According to sources, the storm began at around 4pm with heavy winds and scattered rain. Gulam Mustafa was driving his auto-rickshaw towards Bolangir, and Nadi Nanda, who



was travelling to a wedding celebration in Lirkipali from Atgaon, had boarded the vehicle. At a short distance from Kasabahal bridge, the neem tree fell on the moving vehicle.

The impact crushed the vehicle, killing both men on the spot. Fire brigade personnel and police reached the scene, cleared the fallen tree, and recovered the bodies. The bodies were sent to the mortuary at Bhima Bhoi Medical College and Hospital. Puintala police station IIC Anita Pradhan visited the spot and initiated an investigation.

Local residents demanded immediate government assistance for the families of the deceased, citing their poor financial condition.

Red dump seized in Malkangiri

Malkangiri, April 25: Security forces have seized a Maoist dump in the Chittrakonda block of Malkangiri district, officials confirmed Friday.

According to sources, personnel from the 177 Battalion of the Border Security Force (BSF), stationed at the Ghanabada and Gurusetu camps in Swabhimana Anchal of Malkangiri, launched a search operation following intelligence inputs. The operation targeted forest areas near Ken-



duguda and Salganput villages under Panasput and Jodamba panchayats.

During the operation, the BSF team discovered a Maoist

cache buried underground. Items recovered from the site included four tiffin Improvised Explosive Devices (IEDs) weighing approximately 2kg each, one 12-volt battery, 50 metres of electric wire, a plastic drum, and five small oxygen cylinders.

Man gets 10-year jail term for raping minor

Baripada, April 25: A POC-SO court here in Mayurbhanj district Friday sentenced one person to 10 years of rigorous imprisonment (RI) for raping a 16-year-old girl in 2017.

The Special Court Judge Santosh Kumar Nayak also imposed a fine of Rs 50,000 on the convict Mangal Soren (35). If the convict fails to pay the fine, he will remain in custody for 15 more months.

The court also directed Mayurbhanj District Legal Services Authority (DLSA) to pay a compensation of Rs 4 lakh to the victim.

Special Public Prosecutor Manaranjan Pattnaik said the verdict was pronounced based on the statement of the victim, eight witnesses and the medical report.

On January 1, 2017, the accused entered the house of the girl when she was alone and raped her. The accused was arrested after the victim's mother lodged a complaint with the police.

473 live turtles seized

Malkangiri, April 25: A large number of live turtles were seized by the Motu Forest department in Kalimela block of Malkangiri district, officials said.



Based on a tip-off regarding interstate turtle smuggling, forest officials set up a vehicle checkpoint at the Motu outpost early Friday morning. After some time, a speeding Bolero vehicle approached the checkpoint. When officials tried to stop it, the two occupants fled under the cover of darkness upon noticing the forest personnel.

Upon searching the vehicle, officials found 473 live turtles packed in 13 crates. The vehicle and the turtles were seized. A case has been registered, and an investigation has been initiated, according to the Forest department officials.

5 awarded life sentence for student's death during ritual

Jharsuguda, April 25: A court in Jharsuguda Friday sentenced five people to life in prison for their involvement in the 2017 death of college student identified as Sanyukta Jayapuria, who died during a ritualistic practice falsely claimed to be a form of treatment.

The incident took place March 2, 2017, in Bijapali village under Rengali police limits. Jayapuria, who was reportedly ill, died after being subjected to a ritual known as the "Shiva Tandav" dance. The court found that the ritual, performed by two women and aided by three others, led to her death.

Following a lengthy trial, the Additional District Judge's Court convicted Soudamini Jayapuria, 22; Santoshini Jayapuria, 23; Naveen Bhoi, 22; Sahadev Jayapuria, 19; and Akshay Jayapuria, 19. The court acquitted the victim's parents due to lack of evidence linking them to the fatal act.

The case had triggered statewide outrage after it was revealed that the young woman was subjected to the superstitious practice instead of receiving medical treatment. A Crime Branch investigation confirmed the ritual as the cause of death, leading to the arrest of all involved.

The verdict underscores the judiciary's strong position against superstitious practices that endanger lives.

40 Royal Bengal tigers in Similipal, population may exceed 100 by '36

Baripada, April 25: Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (PCCF) and Chief Wildlife Warden Prem Kumar Jha announced on social media platform X that the number of Royal Bengal tigers in Similipal has increased to 40 — a development that has brought joy to wildlife enthusiasts. Efforts are under way to raise the tiger population to more than 100 by 2036, he added.

Similipal Wildlife Sanctuary in Mayurbhanj district, the largest forest area in Odisha, has officially been declared India's 107th national park. Renowned for its rich biodiversity, medicinal plants, orchids, elephant reserve, and tiger conservation efforts,



Similipal holds immense ecological significance.

Similipal has received national park status after a gap of 45 years. With 845.70 square kilometres designated as a protected area, no individual will have proprietary rights over this land. As there are no human settlements in the region, the tiger population is expected to grow, according to Jha.

Currently, besides the known tigresses 'Zeenat' and 'Jamuna', there are 40 Royal Bengal tigers in Similipal. These include eight cubs, 13 males, and 17 tigresses. The age classification of two adult Royal Bengal tigers is yet to be confirmed. Of the total population, 18 are melanistic tigers (commonly known as black tigers), comprising nine males and nine tigresses.

Over the next decade, the Forest department aims to push the tiger count past 100. Notably, the 2023 tiger census report released by the National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA) recorded 27 Royal Bengal tigers in Similipal, including eight cubs. A subsequent survey conducted by the state government using trap cameras identified 12 additional cubs, raising the count to 39. The department also confirmed that a significant number of these are melanistic tigers.

are ongoing, optimizing MDB balance sheets remains the most effective way to stretch scarce public resources and accelerate sustainable development.

Lastly, our report calls for the development of new financing instruments aimed at mobilizing private capital for climate mitigation and adaptation. For example, we propose establishing a Finance Facility against Climate Change (F2C2)—a special-purpose vehicle designed to issue green bonds backed by future donor commitments. The proceeds would be directed primarily toward climate-mitigation investments in developing countries. If successful, the F2C2 could unlock up to \$1 trillion in private financing.

We also propose a new kind of equity-like instrument to finance climate-resilient infrastructure. Investments in sea walls, flood defenses, and similar systems can significantly reduce the costs of disaster relief and recovery. As the primary beneficiaries, insurance companies must work together with MDBs to develop an instrument capable of translating these savings into returns for investors.

These are all practical, actionable proposals. When combined with technical assistance and policy support, they could significantly improve the growth prospects of developing countries grappling with debt and climate risks. Making debt management both fiscally and environmentally sustainable is not only feasible but also essential to safeguarding global growth, which is in the interest of all countries—not just the poorest.

Today's global economic turmoil is not just about trade. As G20 finance ministers gather in Washington this week during the annual spring meetings of the International Monetary Fund and World Bank, IMF Managing Director Kristalina Georgieva has warned that growing economic uncertainty and financial market stress pose serious threats to developing countries.

The danger is particularly acute for highly indebted economies, which are now facing weaker growth prospects and reduced financial support from the United States and other donor countries. In February, the IMF estimated that nearly half of the lowest-income countries were at risk of debt distress, at which point they may no longer be able to meet their debt obligations. That number is expected to rise as conditions continue to deteriorate.

Compounding the crisis, the world's poorest countries—especially small island developing states—are highly vulnerable to climate change and biodiversity loss. Extreme weather events like hurricanes, droughts, and floods can wipe out critical infrastructure and cripple agricultural production in an instant, while slower-onset changes like rising temperatures and shifting rainfall patterns require continuous and costly adaptation measures.

The debt and climate crises are closely intertwined. As more public funds are diverted toward disaster relief and recovery, fewer resources are available for climate adaptation, nature conservation, and long-term investment. This, in turn, increases vulnerability, weakens growth prospects, and drives up borrowing costs, shrinking fiscal space even further. The result is a self-reinforcing, vicious circle.

But it doesn't have to be this way. Over the past year, we

have co-chaired the Expert Review on Debt, Nature, and Climate—an initiative launched by the governments of Colombia, Kenya, France, and Germany. In our final report, "Healthy Debt on a Healthy Planet," we outline several steps that emerging and developing economies can take to break free from the debt-climate trap and move toward a virtuous cycle of low-carbon, climate-resilient, and nature-positive growth.

First, climate and nature considerations must be integrated into macroeconomic and fiscal analyses. This is especially critical in the debt sustainability frameworks used by the IMF and World Bank to assess developing countries' fiscal health. Although both institutions have made some progress in recent years, much more needs to be done to ensure that these frameworks fully account for climate-related risks.

Equally important, such assessments must recognize not only the risks posed by climate change but also the economic benefits of investing in resilience. Their value—especially their potential to fuel medium-term growth and reduce a country's financial risks—must be properly reflected in economic and financial models to

encourage governments to act.

Second, many developing countries need assistance in reducing their debt burdens. Some are already in debt distress, while others suffer from liquidity problems. Our report proposes new mechanisms for restructuring and refinancing debt in return for investments in climate adaptation and conservation projects that promote sustainable growth. Borrower countries, major global creditors, the IMF, and multilateral development banks (MDBs) must all champion such solutions.

Third, proven approaches to addressing debt, nature, and climate risks must be scaled up. These include contingency clauses in debt contracts that suspend repayments during natural disasters and various forms of sustainability-linked finance. While debt-for-climate and debt-for-nature swaps are not yet scalable due to a lack of standardization, they have already delivered vital funding for environmental initiatives, demonstrating their value and warranting greater support.

More broadly, MDBs must significantly boost lending to support low-carbon, climate-resilient, and nature-positive growth. While discussions on much-needed recapitalization

Bureaucratic Yoga

If there's one thing India's babus do well, it's dressing up flexibility as policy. Case in point: the latest extensions given to Sonia Narang and Abhishek Goyal, both senior IPS officers on central deputation to the Enforcement Directorate (ED). Their tenures have been extended in "relaxation" of the IPS tenure policy. Now that's babu-speak for "Yes, we made rules. No, we're not always bound by them."

Take Narang. In early April, she was relieved from her ED post and sent back to the Karnataka cadre without explanation. And just like that, she's back in Delhi with a one-year extension. Whiplash, anyone? In her time at ED, she's handled a whole alphabet soup of high-profile cases — PFI, IFFCO, Vivo, Maoists, even the ever-glamorous Khan Market cash trail. Someone decided she's too valuable to let go just yet. But observers are wondering why the unceremonious exit earlier?

Goyal's extension is equally telling. Currently leading the HIU and also handling the Northern Region (including the recently held Maharashtra elections), he, too, gets a one-year bonus round. Perhaps it helps to be where the political action is.

Let's not forget: the post of Special Director is the second-highest rank in the ED hierarchy. There are nine of them. That's a lot of "special" and not a lot of clarity.

So here we are watching the rules bend, twist, and politely look the other way when power and convenience collide. The ACC may call it relaxation. For many others, it's a masterclass in bureaucratic yoga.

Kerala's 'civil war' goes public

Kerala's babudom seems to be experiencing its own version of a reality show, complete with public spats, social media drama, and allegations flying faster than monsoon winds.

At the centre of this storm is IAS officer N Prasanth, affectionately dubbed 'Collector Bro' for his social media savvy. Currently suspended, Prasanth has accused senior bureaucrats A. Jayathilak and K. Gopalakrishnan of corruption and conspiracy, even dragging a Malayalam daily into the fray. He claims his suspension is retaliation for whistleblowing against entrenched corruption and misuse of office—serious charges that can't just be brushed off.

Meanwhile, Gopalakrishnan was suspended for allegedly creating a religion-based WhatsApp group, seen as a violation of service rules. Prasanth's own suspension followed his very public criticism of Jayathilak on social media, which the government called a breach of conduct. The online slugfest has exposed the cracks within Kerala's famously disciplined administrative set-up.

This bureaucratic brawl isn't just about bruised egos; it reflects deeper dysfunction within the administrative framework. The public airing of such disputes, especially on social media, undermines the integrity of the civil services and erodes public trust. And let's not forget, it's also a massive distraction from governance.

In an era where transparency is paramount, perhaps it's time for the babus to embrace openness and address internal conflicts through proper institutional channels. After all, the public deserves a civil service that is as accountable as it is efficient and less prone to becoming an OTT-worthy drama.

Transparency burden

In the power corridors of Madhya Pradesh, a silent discontent brews among babus. While IAS, IPS, and IFS officers are mandated to disclose their immovable assets annually, ministers have sidestepped this transparency for over 15 years. The contrast is as stark as it is telling, and although no one dares say it out loud, the resentment is palpable.

The state's General Administration Department has reiterated that all state employees must submit detailed property disclosures. This includes information on ancestral and self-acquired properties, purchase dates, values, and current market valuations. Non-compliance could result in withheld salaries or stalled promotions — a stiff penalty for mere delay, let alone defiance.

In contrast, ministers have largely avoided such scrutiny. Despite previous commitments, including a 2016 announcement to declare assets online, many ministers have not consistently disclosed their property details. Successive governments have either quietly ignored the issue or kicked the can down the road, possibly to avoid ruffling political feathers.

This discrepancy fosters a sense of inequity among bureaucrats, who are held to stringent standards while political leaders operate with relative impunity. The whisper in government circles is not about whether this is unfair but how long this double standard will continue.

The lack of ministerial transparency undermines the principles of accountability and good governance. For a truly transparent administration, it's imperative that ministers lead by example, embracing the same disclosure standards imposed on bureaucrats.

Until then, babus will keep filing their disclosures under silent protest, watching their political bosses sail above the accountability tide, dry, untouched, and remarkably unbothered.

Enhance credibility of NIRF rankings

In a significant development, the Madurai Bench of the Madras High Court has issued an interim stay order, temporarily barring the Union Education Ministry and the National Board of Accreditation (NBA) from releasing the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) rankings for 2025. This judicial intervention comes amid growing concerns about potential irregularities in the ranking process and follows petitions challenging the transparency and methodology of the NIRF evaluation system. The court's decision underscores the need for greater accountability in India's higher education ranking framework, which has faced criticism in recent years for alleged biases, data discrepancies, and lack of consideration for qualitative aspects of institutional performance. This pause in the publication of rankings provides an opportunity to re-examine and refine the assessment parameters to ensure they truly reflect educational quality and institutional excellence across India's diverse higher education landscape. The stay order will remain in effect until further hearings can address the substantive issues raised about

the ranking process.

The NIRF rankings serve as a critical benchmark for assessing the quality and performance of higher education institutions in India, providing students and parents with transparent, data-driven insights to make informed academic choices. By evaluating institutions on key parameters, NIRF promotes healthy competition among universities to improve their standards, align with global best practices, and attract funding or collaborations. For institutions, a strong NIRF ranking enhances credibility, visibility, and student recruitment, while policymakers use these rankings to identify gaps and allocate resources effectively.

The NIRF evaluates higher education institutions across five comprehensive parameters: Teaching, Learning & Resources (TLR) assesses faculty quality, infrastructure, and academic support systems; Research and Professional Practice (RP) measures research output, patents, and industry collaborations; Graduation Outcomes (GO) tracks student placement rates, higher education progression, and median salaries; Outreach and Inclusivity (OI) examines diversity

initiatives, access for disadvantaged groups, and community engagement; while Peer Perception captures institutional reputation through stakeholder surveys. Together, these criteria provide a holistic assessment of an institution's academic excellence, research impact, student success, social commitment, and national standing.

The NIRF has played a significant role in enhancing quality standards across Indian higher education institutions, yet it faces notable limitations due to its heavy reliance on quantitative metrics and inherent structural biases. By prioritizing easily measurable parameters like faculty-student ratios and publication counts, NIRF often overlooks qualitative aspects such as teaching innovation, student satisfaction, and holistic learning experiences. This marginalizes rural and regional colleges, which face contextual challenges like limited funding and infrastructure but may excel in localized impact or community engagement.

For example, IIT Bombay consistently ranks in the top 5, whereas Maa Manikeswari University struggles to break into the top 200. The fact is that IIT Bombay is urban and

centrally funded, whereas state-funded Maa Manikeswari University is situated in a backward region serving marginalized tribal communities.

Further undermining NIRF's credibility are issues like the opaque 'Peer Perception' parameter, which relies on subjective surveys prone to favoring established brands over lesser-known but deserving institutions.

To enhance the credibility and effectiveness of NIRF rankings, comprehensive reforms must be implemented to eliminate systemic biases, establish specialized benchmarks for different institutional categories, and prioritize qualitative assessment of teaching excellence and societal impact. These reforms should incorporate rigorous on-site verification processes, similar to NAAC's peer-review mechanism, to validate the authenticity of data submitted by participating institutions. Such improvements would align NIRF more closely with global best practices in educational quality assurance while addressing the unique challenges of India's heterogeneous academic landscape.

Sir, The following details from injured tourists and their families shed light on the Pahalgam massacre: Among the 26 tourists killed, only one, a Muslim 'Ghodawalla,' bravely fought back by grabbing a terrorist's rifle. The attackers spoke different languages apart from Pakistani, hinting at the involvement of foreign mercenaries. Local residents did their best to assist the dead and injured. Locals are financially hit with the exodus of tourists, hoping for their return of trust. Chandigarh, April 25: Amid escalating tensions between India and Pakistan following the Pahalgam terror attack, the Kartarpur corridor at Dera Baba Nanak in Punjab's Gurdaspur district remains open for pilgrims to offer prayers at the Kartarpur Sahib gurdwara in the neighbouring country. The Kartarpur corridor links the Gurdwara Darbar Sahib in Pakistan, the final resting place of Sikhism founder Guru Nanak Dev, to the Dera Baba Nanak shrine in Gurdaspur. Devotees Friday continued to visit the Kartarpur corridor at Dera Baba Nanak for paying obeisance at the

historic gurdwara in Pakistan.

The pilgrims sought that the Kartarpur corridor should remain open. "The corridor should remain open for pilgrims," said a Sikh devotee from Shaheed Bhagat Singh (SBS) Nagar district.

A woman pilgrim too said the corridor should not be shut. The pilgrims strongly condemned the dastardly terror attack in Pahalgam and said exemplary action should be taken against the perpetrators.

Twenty-six people, mostly tourists, were killed and several injured when terrorists opened fire at a meadow near the popular tourist town of Pahalgam in south Kashmir's Anantnag district Tuesday afternoon.

The Kartarpur corridor was opened November 9, 2019 on the occasion of Guru Nanak Dev's 550th birth anniversary.

Indian pilgrims of all faiths are allowed to undertake visa-free travel throughout the year to the historic gurdwara in Pakistan.

According to an agreement signed between India and Pakistan, a total of 5,000 pilgrims per day can cross over to the neighbouring country for paying obeisance at the gurdwara.

The Centre Wednesday announced a raft of measures, including expulsion of Pakistani military attaches, suspension of the Indus Waters Treaty of 1960 and immediate shutting down of the Attari land-transit post,

Punjab to recruit 5,500 home guards to strengthen border vigil

Chandigarh: Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann, in the wake of the Pahalgam terror attack, Thursday gave his nod for recruiting 5,500 home guards to strengthen the second line of defence at the International Border. A decision to this effect was taken in a meeting chaired by the chief minister here, an official statement said. During the meeting, Mann said 5,500 jawans in the border wing of the Punjab Home Guards will be deployed in the seven border districts of the state to enhance security cover. In the wake of the terror attack, Mann said, the proposal to set up a second line of defence behind the Border Security Force (BSF) will help to catch anyone that escapes the BSF's net at the International Border. An effective second line of defence will "check nefarious designs of forces inimical to the state", he said. Considering the enormity of the task, the state government will certainly need the Centre's assistance, for which he will soon meet the Union home minister, Mann said.

in view of the cross-border links to the Pahalgam attack.

Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri said Pakistani nationals will not be allowed to travel to India under the SAARC Visa Exemption Scheme (SVES) and any Pakistani national currently in India under the scheme had 48 hours to leave the country.

The decisions were taken at a meeting of the Cabinet Committee on Security (CCS) chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi. It was announced at the meeting that the integrated check-post (ICP) at Attari will be closed immediately and those who crossed over to Pakistan with valid documents may return through that route before May 1.

The Centre Thursday announced revoking all visas issued to Pakistani nationals from April 27 and advised Indian nationals residing in Pakistan to return home at the earliest as tensions between the two neighbours escalated following the Pahalgam attack.

Chandigarh, April 25: Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann Thursday sought support of village panchayats for his government's on-going anti-drug drive 'Yudh Nashey-an Virush' and announced financial assistance for villages declared as "drug free".

Mann further promised to develop these villages into model villages and also announced to hike honorarium for 'Sarpanchs' (village heads) to Rs 2,000 per month.

He was addressing a gathering during the state-level function to mark 'Panchayat Diwas' here.

A village that will declare itself "drug-free" will be given financial



assistance worth Rs 1 lakh, besides other ultra-modern facilities, Mann said. Drug free villages will be developed as model villages and no stone will be left unturned to give fillip to their development, he said.

He asked village 'Sarpanchs' to play a proactive role in this noble cause so that the scourge of drugs is wiped out from the state with active

public support. Mann said the state government will not sit idly and watch smugglers bloom at the cost of bodies and pyres of drug victims.

The state government has already snapped the supply line of drugs and big fish involved in this heinous crime have been put behind bars, the chief minister said.

For the first time, the property of the drug smugglers acquired illegally is being destroyed by the state government so that it acts as a deterrent for others, he added.

Meanwhile, Mann announced that Sarpanches would be given an honorarium worth Rs 2,000 per month starting from the day they were elected.

Kerala bids tearful farewell to Pahalgam attack victim

Kochi, April 25: Under a grey April sky, grief hung heavy over Changampuzha Park, Edappally, Thursday morning. A sea of mourners—across politics, professions, and generations—gathered in silence to bid a final farewell to N Ramachandran (65), who was killed in the Pahalgam terror attack.

His last rites were conducted with full state honours.

Emotional scenes unfolded as his body was kept for public homage at Changampuzha Park and later at his residence. The body, brought from a private hospital mortuary, arrived at the park around 7 am. Accompanied by grieving relatives and close friends, it was placed for public homage, marking a sombre morning in the heart of Kochi.

As mourners gathered, many softly chanted the universal prayer "Loka Samastah Sukhino Bhavantu" (may all beings everywhere be happy). A steady stream of people

others folding their hands in silence. Many consoled his wife, Sheela, daughter Arathi R Menon, and son Suresh Menon.

Kerala Governor Rajendra Arlekar, Goa Governor PS Sreedharan Pillai, Union Minister Suresh Gopi, Kerala Industries Minister P Rajeev, Leader of Opposition V D Satheesan, Kochi Mayor M Anilkumar, Ernakulam Collector NSK Umesh, actor Jayasurya, Kerala High Court Judge Devan Ramachandran and others paid their respects.

At 10 am, as the crowd grew, the body was moved to his residence on Mangattu Road, Edappally, where friends, neighbours, and well-wishers awaited with tearful eyes and heavy hearts. As Ramachandran's final journey began around noon, the air echoed with chants of "Bharat Mata Ki Jai", "Ramachandran Amar Rahe", and "Namallellam Onnane" (We are one)—an acknowledgement of a life cut short by terror, but remembered with dignity and gratitude.

Hundreds joined the solemn procession that ended at the Santhikavadam crematorium, Edappally. The cremation, conducted with full state honours at around 1 pm, was marked by quiet dignity and public solidarity. His son Suresh lit the pyre. A condolence meeting followed at Changampuzha Park.

Later, a steady stream of visitors continued to Ramachandran's home. Higher Education Minister R Bindu, former minister PK Sreemathi, and filmmaker Major Ravi were among those who offered condolences.

Kerala to form traditional knowledge authority under revised IPR policy


Thiruvananthapuram, April 25: After 17 years, Kerala's Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) Policy is set for a comprehensive revamp, featuring a new Traditional Knowledge Authority, a Docketing System, and the launch of Mission IPR to boost IP administration.

The draft IPR Policy, prepared by RS Praveen Raj, Senior Principal Scientist at CSIR-National Institute of Interdisciplinary Science and Technology (CSIR-NIIST), proposes wide-ranging reforms aimed at modernising the state's IP governance framework.

Intellectual Property (IP) is defined as the 'Product of Mind', with IPR being the legally enforceable exclusive right granted to its creator for a limited time.

Other key proposals in the draft include setting up an IPR Academy and making intellectual property education mandatory in schools and universities.

"The 2008 policy primarily focused on the protection of traditional knowledge. Now, we aim to expand its scope by aligning it with the National IPR



Policy. The current effort is more about reinforcing existing rights while broadening the policy's reach," told Praveen Raj to PTI.

Traditional knowledge—comprising centuries-old practices, medicinal wisdom, and innovations passed down through indigenous and local communities—is increasingly vulnerable in the era of globalisation.

Misappropriation, exploitation, and commodification of such knowledge by external parties without proper acknowledgment or consent have raised significant ethical and legal concerns.

"The commodification of indigenous knowledge without appropriate recognition or compensation poses

serious ethical questions. The government is committed to preventing both direct and indirect misappropriation of traditional knowledge, which forms a vital part of our cultural heritage," the draft policy states.

"The focus of IPR Policy 2008 was traditional knowledge protection. The scope of this document is proposed to be broadened in line with the National IPR Policy, 2016. I presented my draft of 'IPR and Traditional Knowledge Policy 2025' at the brainstorming meeting held last month," Raj, who also serves on the state-appointed panel for revising the policy, said.

"The IPR Policy drafting committee has been directed to refine this zero draft," he added.

He further said the draft proposes to include IPR as a mandatory subject in university and school curricula. An IPR Academy is also on the anvil.

"Traditional Knowledge Docketing System (TKDS), 'Mission IPR', and the Kerala Traditional Knowledge Authority (KTKA) are other key highlights," Raj noted. To safeguard this valuable heritage, the policy proposes the creation of a Traditional Knowledge Docketing System (TKDS).

Can't stay law made by Parl when validity presumed: Govt to SC

New Delhi, April 25: The Centre Friday defended the amended Waqf Act in the Supreme Court and opposed any "blanket stay" by the court on a "law having presumption of constitutionality passed by Parliament".

In a preliminary 1,332-page affidavit, the Centre urged the top court to dismiss the pleas challenging the validity of Waqf (Amendment) Act, 2025, pointing out a "mischievous false narrative" surrounding certain provisions.

"While this court would examine these challenges when the cases are heard, a blanket stay (or a partial stay) without being aware of the adverse consequences of such an order in a generality of cases (even on members of the Muslim community itself) were the petitions to be unsuccessful, would be uncalled for, especially in the context of the presumption of validity of such laws," it argued.

The Centre, as a result, urged a bench headed by Chief Justice Sanjiv Khanna, set to hear pleas for passing interim directions May 5, not to stay the law's provisions. The government claimed a "shocking

increase" of 116 per cent in the waqf properties since 2013

It also opposed the arguments over the necessary registration of "waqf by user" properties till April 8, saying if the provision was interfered with by an interim order, it would amount to "creation of legislative regime by judicial order".

The affidavit rebutted the submissions that Muslims might be in the minority in the Central Waqf Council and state Waqf Boards due to the change in the law.

The law is a "valid and lawful exercise of legislative power", one that strengthens the institution of waqf and aligns it with constitutional principles, and facilitates the wholesome realisation of waqfs in the contemporary era, it argued.

The Centre contended it was settled position in the law that constitutional courts would not stay a statutory provision, either directly or indirectly, and decided the matter finally.

Referring to the "reported misuse" of waqf provisions to encroach private and government properties, the affidavit said right before even Mughal era, pre-independence era and post-independence era, the total of waqfs created was 18,29,163.896 acre of land.

COURT REFUSES TO ISSUE NOTICE TO SONIA, RAHUL

New Delhi, April 25: A Delhi court Friday refused to issue notice to Congress leaders Sonia Gandhi and Rahul Gandhi and others in the National Herald money laundering case for now.

Special judge Vishal Gogne was acting on a plea of the Enforcement Directorate (ED), which claimed cognisance of the complaint (ED's equivalent to a chargesheet) cannot be taken without hearing the accused according to the new provisions of law.

"Don't want this order to be prolonged. Let notice be issued," ED, which filed the chargesheet April 9, urged the court. The judge said he had to be satisfied before passing an order. Before court passes any order, it has to see if there is any deficiency, the judge added.

"There are certain documents missing in the chargesheet as

ance to its earlier direction.

However, certain documents were noticed to have not been filed or serialised appropriately, the court was informed by its staff. The ED then informed the court that the investigating officer in the case should rectify any such deficiency.

"Let the documents in question or the serialisation be provided/rectified prior to the next date of hearing. List for further proceedings May 2, 2025," the judge said.


Ex-ISRO chief K Kasturirangan passes away dies

He was 84 and is survived by two sons, family sources said, and added that he was suffering from age-related ailments for the past few months. "He left for heavenly abode this morning at his residence in Bangalore. His body will be kept at Raman Research Institute (RRI) for paying last respects April 27," the officials said.

Condoling his death, Droupadi Murmu said on X: "Saddened to learn that Dr Krishnaswamy Kasturirangan is no more. As head of ISRO, he played a stellar role in the evolution of India's space programme." She also noted that Kasturirangan helped



draft the National Education Policy (NEP), which is already making a profound impact on the shaping of the next generation. In his condolence message, Prime Minister Narendra Modi described him as a "towering figure in India's scientific and educational journey." The space scientist's visionary leadership and selfless contribution to the nation will always be remembered, Modi said on X. He said Kasturirangan served ISRO with great diligence, steering India's space programme to new heights, for which we also received global recognition. His leadership also witnessed ambitious satellite launches and focused on innovation.

Houses of 2 LeT terrorists destroyed

Srinagar, April 25: The house of two Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) terrorists, including the prime suspect of the Pahalgam terror attack, were destroyed when explosives believed to be stored there went off, officials said Friday.

The incidents took place during the intervening night of Thursday and Friday, when the residences of Aadil Hussain Thokar and Asif Sheikh were being searched by security forces at Guree village in Bijbehara and Tral respectively in south Kashmir, the officials said.

Explosives were believed to have been found at the premises during the search

operation, prompting the security forces to evacuate the occupants of the houses as well as neighbours to safety, the officials claimed. Both the houses were damaged in the explosions, leading to their destruction, the officials said.

Thokar, a resident of south Kashmir's Anantnag district, is one of the key accused in Tuesday's Pahalgam massacre, while Sheikh, a resident of Tral in Pulwama district, is suspected to be involved in the conspiracy of the attack.

The family members of both men have claimed that they are not aware of the whereabouts of Thokar and Sheikh.

"You must ensure that your personal conduct and official and social interface with the general public, people's representatives, corporate entities,

civil society organisations, government personnel, all other dignitaries and vulnerable sections of the society is courteous, respectful, dignified and appropriate," read the guidelines issued by Mussoorie-based Lal Bahadur Shastri National Academy of Administration (LBSNAA), a premier training institute for the civil servants.

The guidelines are meant for the candidates selected through the civil services examination 2024, the results of which were announced Tuesday. As many as 1,009 candidates cleared that exam. "As a future civil servant you are expected to be a role model throughout.



Your past actions also will be a reflection of your character and personality throughout your career. You should start displaying exemplary conduct that befits an officer right from this day and not wait for your training to start. You will go on to occupy important positions

in institutions of governance and public service delivery," it said.

Comments and any posts made or facilitated "by you on social media will also reflect on the service," the guidelines said. One should, in particular, refrain from impulsively post-

ing statements on social media, the guidelines said.

The motto of the academy, 'Sheelam Param Bhushanam,' - Character is the supreme embellishment — guides the officers and alumni to conduct themselves with integrity, dignity, humility and rectitude at all times, the guidelines said, adding that their "inner conscience is the best way to go forward" and that these dos and don'ts "can be a good start."

The academy said that respect to women is central in Indian ethos and the bureaucrats must be gender-sensitive. According to it, the soon-to-be bureaucrats are expected to follow civic manners like following traffic rules, not littering, spitting in public spaces, and follow personal hygiene like turning out well-groomed and dressed appropriately.

The guidelines, issued by

the LBSNAA Director Sriram Taranikanti, said the candidates are expected to abstain from consuming any intoxicant substances in public. The candidates have also been advised to maintain punctuality. The academy said it is also good to familiarise the immediate family members with the cultural norms of the service. 'Not a drop of water for Pakistan'



New Delhi, April 25: The government Friday said it is working on a strategy to ensure not a single drop of water flows from India into Pakistan and asked chief ministers to ensure no Pakistani stays in the country beyond the stipulated deadline as security forces intensified anti-terror operations in the hunt for the Pahalgam killers. Amid increasing Indo-Pak tensions over the carnage in Pahalgam Tuesday that left 26 civilians, mostly tourists dead, Indian military sources said there were incidents of small arm firing at some places on the Line of Control (LoC) initiated by Pakistan on Thursday night. The sources said the Indian Army effectively responded to the firing and there were no reports of any casualties. A security review meeting was held in Srinagar during which Jammu and Kashmir Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha said every perpetrator of the attack must be hunted and made to pay a heavy price for the dastardly act. Chief of Army Staff General Upendra Dwivedi was among those who attended the meeting. The LG asked the Army Chief to take effective steps not only to bring those responsible for the Pahalgam attack to justice but also to intensify efforts to crush infra-

191 Pakistani nationals return home

Chandigarh: A total of 191 Pakistani nationals visiting India returned home through the Attari-Wagah land route in Punjab's Amritsar Friday, after the Centre set a 48-hour deadline for them to leave the country in the wake of the Pahalgam terror attack, officials said. A total of 287 Indian nationals, who were visiting the neighbouring country, have also returned, they added. A few women married in Pakistan but possessing Indian passports alleged that they were facing problems in going back, despite carrying the required documents. They said they had come to meet their relatives in India but had to return after the government set the 48-hour deadline for Pakistani nationals to leave the country.

IndiGo to cancel Almaty, Tashkent flights

New Delhi: IndiGo Friday said it will temporarily cancel flights to Almaty and Tashkent due to aircraft operational range constraints in the wake of the Pakistan airspace closure. The airspace closure has forced Indian airlines operating flights to the West to take longer routes and narrow-body planes might not operate non-stop for long duration. IndiGo operates Airbus narrow-body aircraft to Almaty and Tashkent. The airline said that around 50 international routes operated by it will require longer sectors and hence may be subject to some slight schedule adjustments. "With the same restrictions and limited rerouting options, unfortunately Almaty and Tashkent are outside the operational range of IndiGo's current fleet," it said in a statement.

DRDO makes progress in scramjet engine devt

New Delhi, April 25: The Defence Research and Development Organisation Friday conducted scramjet combustor ground testing for more than 1,000 seconds with the defence ministry saying the DRDO has achieved a "significant" milestone in the field of hypersonic weapon technology.

Defence Research & Development Laboratory (DRDL), a Hyderabad-based laboratory of the DRDO, has taken the initiative in developing a long-duration supersonic combustion ramjet or scramjet powered hypersonic technology. DRDL conducted the "long-duration active cooled scramjet subscale combustor ground testing for more than 1,000 seconds at the newly built state-of-the-art Scramjet Connect Test Facility at Hyderabad", the defence ministry said in a statement. "With the successful test, the system will be soon ready for full scale flight worthy combustor testing," it said. The ground test is in continuation of the earlier test reported for 120 seconds in January, when the ministry

had said that the DRDL had developed these technologies and demonstrated a cutting-edge active cooled scramjet combustor ground test for this duration for the first time in India. The successful ground test had marked a "crucial milestone in developing next-generation hypersonic missiles", it had said.

A hypersonic cruise missile belongs to class of weapons that can travel more than Mach 5 or five times the speed of sound (over 6,100 kmph) for long duration and is powered by air breathing engine. "This test validates the design of long duration scramjet combustor as well as test facility. It is an outcome of an integrated effort put by the DRDO labs along with industry and academia and paves a strong base for the nation's Hypersonic Cruise Missile Development Programme," it added. Defence Minister Rajnath Singh complimented the DRDO, industry partners and academia for the "remarkable achievement". He termed it as a reflection of the government's strong commitment in realising critical hypersonic weapon technologies for the nation.

Three minor girls, one woman gangraped

Balaghat, April 25: Three minor girls and a woman were allegedly gangraped in Balaghat in Madhya Pradesh by seven persons, all of whom have been apprehended, a police official said Friday.

The incident took place between 1:30am and 2am Thursday when the victims, all tribals, were returning home from a marriage function. Superintendent of Police Nagendra Singh told reporters Friday. "The seven accused, who were on two motorcycles, chased away a boy who was



with the victims. The seven gangraped them in the thick forest under Hatta police station limits. After the victims came forward, a case was registered and all seven were held. We

will ensure they get the strictest punishment," Singh said. He identified the arrested persons as Lokesh Matre, Lalchand Khare, Ajendra Bahe, Aju Bagdate, Rajendra Kawre and Maniram Bahe, all in the 20-28 age group.

One of the accused is a minor who has been sent to a correctional home after being produced before the juvenile court, the SP added. The accused have been charged with gangrape and other offences under Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita and Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act, Singh said.

Several districts witness protests

Jaipur: Several parts of Rajasthan Friday witnessed protests against the Pahalgam terror attack that killed 26 people, mostly tourists. Hindu outfits gave bandh calls across many districts. Consequently, markets in Udaipur, Kota, Sikar and Jhunjhunu districts remained partially closed. In Udaipur's Jhalol, slogans, such as "Pakistan Murdabad", were raised, while the flag of Pakistan was burnt in Jaisalmer's Hanuman Chowk by VHP members. Similar protests were also held in Kota and Banswara.

More than 900 markets shut in Delhi

New Delhi: Several of Delhi's busiest commercial hubs, including Connaught Place, Sadar Bazar and Chandni Chowk, were bereft of their usual hubbub Friday as over 900 markets observed a 'Delhi Bandh' in protest against the recent terror attack in Pahalgam. Shops across key sectors such as textiles, spices, utensils, and bullion remained shut. Sadar Bazar, normally buzzing with shoppers, remained silent, with even vegetable and fruit vendors not turning up. Gandhinagar, home to Asia's largest wholesale readymade garment market, was also completely shut, according to a statement by its market association.

Five killed as car falls into deep gorge

Shimla: Five people, including an infant, were killed after their car fell into a deep gorge in Himachal Pradesh's Mandi district Friday, police said. According to police, the accident occurred when a wedding procession was returning after the ceremony. One of the vehicle, carrying an eight-months old infant and the groom's relative, had gone ahead to make arrangements at the groom's house. The driver of the vehicle lost control and they fell into a 200 meter deep gorge near the Pandoh dam in Mandi district.

NIA conducts multi-state searches

New Delhi: The NIA has conducted extensive searches at multiple locations across Punjab, Jammu and Kashmir and other states in a case linked to Pakistan-backed cross-border smuggling of arms and narcotics by Khalistani operatives, the agency said Friday.

Aadil & Adil: Two lives that tell the Pahalgam tale

Srinagar, April 25: This is the story of two Adils -- one who gave up his life trying to save tourists and took three bullets in his chest and the other who opened gunfire on them in the calibrated terror attack that killed 26 people, all men, mostly tourists.

Pronounced the same but spelt differently by security agencies, Aadil Thoker alias Aadil Guree is of the Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT). And Syed Adil Hussain Shah was a braveheart pony 'wallah'. The two men bookending the many shades of Kashmir, their very different lives telling the tale of conflict and also of compassion. Aadil Thoker, a resident of Guree village in Bijbehara in south Kashmir, is in his late 20s, officials said. Adil Hussain was just a little older at 30. On Thursday, the home of Aadil, a key accused in the April 22 strike in the Baisaran

meadow in the upper reaches of Pahalgam, was destroyed in an explosion. Though it is not clear what exactly led to the blast, officials said explosives were kept inside and there was a search operation. He was a little more than a teen when he went to Pakistan on a Valid Travel Document (VTD) in 2018 and disappeared thereafter. Soon, there were reports he had joined the banned Pakistan-based terror group LeT. Officials said he infiltrated back into India through the Line of Control in 2024 and was active in Doda and Kishtwar areas of Jammu region. Investigations into the attack targeting tourists -- the worst in Kashmir since the 2019 Pulwama strike when 40 CRPF personnel were killed -- indicate that the number gunmen could range from five to seven. They were helped by at least two local militants who received



training in Pakistan. Aadil, on the run, was one of them. He was identified by the wife of one of those killed. At least six to seven pictures were shown to eyewitnesses. One of them identified Aadil as the terrorist pulling the trigger. After that, the gunmen vanished into the thick pine jungles of Pir Panjal.



The other young man at the centre of conversation nationwide following the Pahalgam strike has had a very different life trajectory. He, the killer, the other the hero loved and mourned by thousands. Adil, the sole earning member of his family, earned his living taking tourists up six kilometres on his pony from

Aadil Hussain Thoker and Syed Adil Hussain Shah are two individuals with the same names, but their deeds put them on two sides of the Pahalgam tragedy

Syed Adil Hussain Shah was among the 26 deceased and the only local resident to fall victim to terrorists' bullets. The 'pony rider' Adil has etched his name in history with his heroic act and is being hailed by everyone for sacrificing his own life for others

Aadil Hussain Thoker was one of the group of terrorists who hurled bullets at the innocent civilians. He is one of the key suspects behind the attack

tourism, hitting at the root of the economy heavily dependent on tourism.

Sadness over his death hangs like a shroud but there is also enormous pride. His devastated father Syed Haider Shah said he was the kindest of his children. "Many boys from this village go to Pahalgam to find some work but who knew this was going to happen. The terrorists killed my son only because he confronted them and told them not to harm tourists." Doing dirty work for US, West: Pak min

London, April 25: Pakistan Defence Minister Khwaja Asif has admitted the country's history of supporting, training and funding terrorist organisations as "dirty work" for the West.

In an interview with Sky News aired overnight, news presenter Yalda Hakim questioned Asif on Pakistan's response and stance on terrorism in the aftermath of the terrorist attack in Pahalgam that killed 26 people earlier this week.


"You do admit, sir, that Pakistan has had a long history of backing and supporting and training and funding these terrorist organisations," asked Hakim.

"Well, we have been doing this dirty work for the United States for about three decades, you know, and the West, including Britain," replied Asif.

"That was a mistake, and we suffered from that, and that is why you are saying this to me. If we had not joined the war against the Soviet Union and later on the war after 9/11, Pakistan's track record was an unimpeachable track record," he said.

"It is very convenient for the big powers to blame Pakistan for whatever is happening in this region. When we were fighting the war on their side way back in the 80s against the Soviet Union, all these terrorists of today, they were wining and dining in Washington.

"And then came the 9/11 attacks. Again, the same situation was repeated. I think our governments then made a mistake," he said, adding that Pakistan was "used as proxies" at the time.

The minister was pushed on the finger of blame being pointed at Pakistan for Tuesday's terror attack in Pahalgam and that The Resistance Front, which has admitted responsibility for the strike, being an offshoot of the banned Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT).

"Lashkar-e-Taiba doesn't exist in Pakistan anymore. It is extinct. It is extinct if the parent organisation does not exist, how can the offshoot take birth here," said Asif.

Asked if Pakistan fears an escalation as a result of the Pahalgam terrorist attack, the minister said the country is prepared to respond "in kind". "We will measure our response to whatever is initiated by India, according to that. It would be a measured

Documents expose differences over US peace drive for Ukraine

London, April 25: Ukrainian and European officials pushed back this week against some US proposals on how to end Russia's war in Ukraine, making counterproposals on issues from territory to sanctions.

The sets of proposals from talks between US, European and Ukrainian officials in Paris April 17 and in London April 23 laid bare the inner workings of the shuttle diplomacy under way as US President Donald Trump seeks a quick end to the war.

The primary areas of difference in the two texts are over the sequencing for resolving questions over territory, the lifting of sanctions on Russia, security guarantees and the size of Ukraine's military.

While some of the divergences have been highlighted



by sources close to the talks, the documents seen by Reuters set out for the first time the differences in full and explicit detail.

The first text says its "terms represent the final offer from the United States to both sides". It contains proposals set out by Trump's envoy Steve Witkoff to European officials in Paris that were passed to the Ukrainians, according to sources close to the talks.

The second text emerged this week from talks between Ukrainian and European officials in London and has been given to the American side, the sources said.

Top Russian general killed in car bombing

Moscow, April 25: A top Russian general was killed in a car bomb blast near Moscow Friday, with the Foreign Ministry describing it as a terrorist act, according to a media report.

Deputy director of the Main Operations Directorate of the General Staff of the Ministry of Defence, Lt General Yaroslav Moskalik, was killed when an improvised explosive device went off, Vesti FM radio cited the Investigative Committee as saying. "Fragments of the device were found at the site and have been sent for examination," Investigative Committee spokeswoman Svetlana Peterenko said.

Moskalik, 59, represented the defence ministry in various negotiations. It was not immediately confirmed whether his assassination was linked to US Envoy Steve Whitkoff's talks with the Kremlin later Friday over Ukraine negotiations.

Russian Foreign Ministry spokeswoman Maria Zakharova described the general's killing as



a "terrorist act". "The main question is how to stop the war in the centre of Europe, the world. We see so many victims every day. Even today, a Russian soldier was killed in a terrorist attack in Moscow," Zakharova was quoted as say-

ing by TASS. Several Russian military officials involved in the Ukraine campaign have been killed near their homes, hundreds of kilometres away from the battlefield, by alleged agents of Ukrainian Intelligence "SBU."

China exempts some goods from US tariffs

Beijing, April 25: China has exempted some US imports from its 125% tariffs and is asking firms to identify critical goods they need levy-free, according to businesses that have been notified, in the clearest sign yet of Beijing's concerns about the trade war's fallout.

The dispensation, which follows de-escalatory statements from Washington, signals that the world's two largest economies were prepared to rein in their conflict, which had frozen much of the trade between them, raising fears of a global recession.

Beijing's exemptions - which business groups hope would extend to dozens of industries - pushed the US dollar up slightly and lifted equity markets in Hong Kong and Japan.

"As a quid-pro-quo move, it could provide a potential way to de-escalate tensions," said



Alfredo Montufar-Helu, a senior adviser to the Conference Board's China Center, a think tank.

But, he cautioned, "It's clear that neither the US nor China want to be the first in reaching out for a deal."

China has not yet communicated publicly on any exemptions. US President Donald Trump

told TIME magazine in an interview that US-China talks were taking place on tariffs, and that Chinese President Xi Jinping had called him. Beijing has so far disputed the US characterization of talks. "He's called. And I don't think that's a sign of weakness on his behalf," Trump told TIME. He did not say when Xi called or what the two leaders

discussed. Equity markets largely shrugged off the interview. European shares remained in positive territory, while US stock futures failed to hold onto early gains and were last little changed on the day.

A Friday statement by the Politburo, the Communist Party's elite decision-making body, focused on efforts to maintain stability at home by supporting firms and workers most affected by tariffs.

The readout, which followed the Politburo's regular monthly meeting, showed that Beijing was also ready to hunker

down and fight a trade war of attrition if needed to outlast Washington in enduring trade war pain.

A Ministry of Commerce taskforce is collecting lists of items that could be exempted from tariffs and is asking companies to submit their own requests, according to a person with knowledge of that outreach.

The ministry said Thursday it had held a meeting with more than 80 foreign companies and business chambers in China to discuss the impact of US tariffs on investment and the operation of foreign firms.

"The Chinese government, for example, has been asking our companies what sort of things are you importing to China from the US that you cannot find anywhere else and so would shut down your supply chain," American Chamber of Commerce in China President Michael Hart said.

UN agency runs out of food aid in Gaza after Israeli blockade

Deir al-Balah (Gaza Strip), April 25: The World Food Programme says its food stocks in the Gaza Strip have run out under Israel's nearly 8-week-old blockade, ending a main source of sustenance for hundreds of thousands of Palestinians in the territory.

The WFP said in a statement that it delivered the last of its stocks to charity kitchens that it supports around Gaza. It said those kitchens are expected to run out of food in the coming days.

Some 80% of Gaza's population of more than 2 million relies primarily on charity kitchens for food, because other sources have shut down under Israel's blockade, according to the UN. The WFP has been supporting 47 kitchens that distribute 644,000 hot meals a day, WFP spokesperson Abeer Etefa told the Associated Press.

Forex reserves swell \$8.31bn to \$686.145bn

Mumbai, April 25: India's forex reserves jumped \$8.31 billion to \$686.145 billion for the week ended April 18, the RBI said Friday.

This is the seventh consecutive week of a rise in the kitty, which had jumped by \$1.567 billion to \$677.835 billion in the previous reporting week ended April 11. The forex reserves had touched an all-time high of \$704.885 billion in end-September 2024.

For the week ended April 18, foreign currency assets, a major component of the reserves, increased by \$3.516 billion to \$578.495 billion, the data released Friday showed.

Expressed in dollar terms, the foreign currency assets include the effect of appreciation or depreciation of non-US units like the euro, pound and yen held in the foreign exchange reserves.

Gold reserves increased by \$4.575 billion to \$84.572 billion during the week, the RBI said. India's reserve position with the IMF also rose by \$7 million to \$4.51 billion in the reporting week.

Direct tax collection for '24-25 fiscal misses target

New Delhi, April 25: The net direct tax collection for the 2024-25 financial year narrowly missed the target, even as it grew 13.57 per cent to over ₹22.26 lakh crore, due to issuance of the highest-ever amount of refunds delivered, official data said Friday.

The government set a target of ₹22,07,000 crore for the direct tax administration as per the budget receipt of July 2024 and revised it to ₹22,37,000 crore during the budget presented this February.

Direct taxes include revenue collected by the Union government under the corporate taxes, securities transaction tax (STT) and non-corporate taxes category (earlier personal income tax). The non-corporate taxes category includes taxes paid by individuals, firms, Hindu Undivided Families (HUFs), local authorities, artificial juridical persons etc.

According to official data, the provisional gross (before adjusting for refunds) direct tax collection for the 2024-25 fiscal that ended March 31 stood at ₹27.02 lakh crore, a growth of 15.59 per cent, when compared to the gross collection of ₹23.37 lakh crore during the 2023-24 fiscal.

Similarly, the provisional figures for net (after issuing refunds) direct tax collections for the 2024-25 fiscal stood at ₹22.26 lakh crore, an increase of 13.57 per cent as compared to ₹19.60 lakh crore in the preceding 2023-24 fiscal, the data shows.

It added that revenue collection from the STT grew to ₹53,296 crore during the last fiscal from ₹34,192 during the preceding financial year of 2023-24.



The provisional net direct tax collections are 100.78 per cent as per the July receipt budget target (₹22.07 lakh crore) and 99.51 per cent of the revised estimate target presented during the February budget (₹22.37 crore).

These direct tax collection figures are provisional and the collections are expected to grow as last stage reconciliation and adjustments for the 2024-25 fiscal are still underway, officials said. The data shows that the tax department issued the highest-ever refunds worth ₹4,76,743 crore during the 2024-25 fiscal which is an increase of 26.04 per cent as compared to the refunds of ₹3,78,255 crore issued during the last fiscal of 2023-24.

"The gross direct tax collection has exceeded the budget target of ₹22.37 lakh crore and the income tax department was able to achieve these high numbers even after issuing a record ₹4.76 lakh crore in refunds," an official said.

India could grow at 6.5% in FY26: EY

New Delhi, April 25: Indian economy could grow at 6.5 per cent in the current fiscal as lower prices of crude oil are expected to ease inflationary pressure and support domestic growth, despite intensifying global trade tensions, EY said Friday.

The 'EY Economy Watch' report for April identifies four key interlinked effects which would have a bearing on India's growth — reduced exports, global slowdown, falling crude oil prices, and the impact of global excess production capacities.

"With suitable fiscal and monetary policies, India may be able to sustain a real GDP growth at about 6.5 per cent in FY26 as also in the medium term, while maintaining a CPI inflation below 4 per cent.

"We also expect global crude prices to remain in the range of \$60-65/bbl in FY26, which may be to India's advantage," EY India Chief Policy Advisor DK Srivastava said.

It said exports may slow due to higher tariffs and weakening global demand, but the overall GDP impact may be limited, given the subdued role of net exports in India's recent growth experience.

Global slowdown may constrain growth worldwide, but India's relatively strong fiscal space and monetary flexibility provide scope for calibrated stimulus.

Falling crude oil prices dropping from \$75/bbl in early April to \$65/bbl by mid-month, and remaining within an expected range of \$60-65 during FY26, is expected to support domestic growth while easing inflationary pressures.

On Friday, the 30-share BSE barometer tanked 588.90 points or 0.74 per cent to settle at 79,212.53. During the day, it dropped 1,195.62 points or 1.49 per cent to 78,605.81.

In two days, the benchmark has lost 903.96 points or 1.12 per cent. The market capitalisation of BSE-listed firms declined by ₹8,88,975.14 crore to ₹4,21,58,900.91 crore (\$4.93 trillion) in two days.

Experts said worries over growing geopolitical tensions after Pahalgam terror attack weighed on market sentiment.

Among Sensex firms, Adani Ports, Axis Bank, Eterna, Bajaj Finserv, Power Grid, Bajaj Finance, Tata Motors, Tata Steel, NTPC and Maruti were the biggest laggards. However, Tata Consultancy Services, Tech Mahindra, Infosys, UltraTech Cement, IndusInd Bank, Hindustan Unilever and ICICI Bank were the gainers. The BSE smallcap gauge tanked 2.56 per cent and midcap dropped 2.44 per cent.

New Delhi: Maruti Suzuki India Friday said its consolidated net profit slipped 1 per cent year-on-year to ₹3,911 crore in the fourth quarter ended March 31, 2025. The country's largest carmaker reported a net profit of ₹3,952 crore in the January-March quarter of FY24. Total revenue increased to ₹40,920 crore during the March quarter last fiscal as compared with ₹38,471 crore in the year-ago period, Maruti Suzuki India said in a regulatory filing.

HZL profit jumps 47%

New Delhi: Vedanta group firm Hindustan Zinc Ltd (HZL) Friday reported a 47.3 per cent increase in consolidated net profit at ₹3,003 crore in the quarter ended March 2025 on the back of higher income. Hurts to see my integrity being questioned: Neeraj

One of India's most decorated athletes is getting hate and abuse for inviting Pak's Nadeem to NC Classic

New Delhi, April 25: Two-time Olympic medallist javelin thrower Neeraj Chopra Friday hit out at those targeting him for inviting Pakistan's javelin thrower Arshad Nadeem for the Neeraj Chopra Classic, saying it was just an "invite from one athlete to another", sent before the Pahalgam terror attack.

The Tokyo Olympics gold medallist and Paris Games silver medallist added that it "hurts" him to see he and his family being abused and their integrity being questioned.

Chopra had invited Nadeem, who had beaten the Indian at the Paris Olympic last year to win gold, for the inaugural edition of the Neeraj Chopra Classic to be held in Bangalore May 24.

Nadeem had declined to come citing other commitments.

"There has been so much talk about my decision to invite Arshad Nadeem to compete in the Neeraj Chopra Classic, and most of it has been hate and abuse. They haven't even left my family out of it," said Chopra in a long post on X.

"I usually am a man of few words, but that doesn't mean I will not speak up against what I think is wrong. More so when it comes to questioning my love for our country, and the respect and honour of my family," he wrote.

Chopra said invites were sent out Monday, two days before the Pahalgam terror attack in which 26 people, mostly tourists, were killed.

"The invitation I extended to Arshad was from one athlete to another -- nothing more, nothing less. The aim of the

NC Classic was to bring the best athletes to India and for our country to be the home of world-class sporting events.

"Invites had gone out to all athletes on Monday, two days before the terrorist attacks at Pahalgam," he added.

Chopra said Nadeem's participation was "completely out of the question" given all that had happened over the last two days.

"After all that has taken place over the last 48 hours, Arshad's presence at the NC Classic was

completely out of the question. My country and its interests will always come first. To those that are going through the loss of their people, my thoughts and prayers are with you. Along with the entire nation, I am both hurt and angry at what has taken place," said Chopra.

"I am confident that our country's response will show our strength as a nation and justice will be served," Chopra added.

One of India's most decorated athletes, Chopra, an army man, said it hurts to see his integrity being questioned.

"I have carried my country with pride for so many years now, and so it hurts to see my integrity being questioned. It pains me that I have to explain myself to people who are targeting me and my family, with no good reason," he wrote.

"We are simple people, please don't make us out to be anything else. There are

so many false narratives that certain sections of the media have created around me, but just because I do not speak up, it doesn't make it true."

Chopra also highlighted "how people switch opinions", while mentioning his mother's statement on Nadeem, whom she had described like her child after the Pakistani had won the Paris gold.

"I also find it difficult to understand how people switch opinions. When my mother - in her simplicity - had made an innocent comment a year ago, there was an outpouring of praise for her views. Today, the same people haven't held back from targeting her for that very same statement."

"I, meanwhile, will work even harder to ensure that the world remembers India and looks at it with envy and respect for all the right reasons," he added.

Perth, April 25: After a month-long senior national training camp, the Indian women's hockey team is set for a challenging five-match tour of Australia from April 26 to May 4.

The tour begins with two matches against Australia A April 26 and 27, followed by three matches against the World No 5 Australian senior women's team May 1, 3 and 4 at the Perth Hockey Stadium.

The Indian team last competed in the FIH Hockey Pro League (Women) at home, where they registered two wins and one shootout victory in a mixed campaign. They ended the tournament on a high, clinching a bonus point against World No 1 Netherlands in a thrilling shootout after a 2-2 draw across regulation time.

Hockey India has named a 26-member squad for the tour, with Salima Tete leading the side as captain and Navneet Kaur as vice-captain.

Ahead of the series, Salima Tete said, "We are excited to be here in Perth. This is a great opportunity for us to gain valuable match exposure against strong opponents. These matches will help us understand our team combinations better and test different strategies ahead of the Europe leg of the Pro League and the Women's Asia Cup later this year. All the players, especially the new faces, are eager to make the most of this experience."

Australia have traditionally been a strong opponent, winning 10 of the 16 matches played between the two sides and drawing three.

However, India will take confidence from their recent 1-0 win over Australia in the FIH Hockey Pro League 2023-24 and will look to build on that momentum.

New Delhi, April 25: The Athletics Federation of India (AFI) Friday unveiled a strong 59-member Indian contingent for the upcoming Asian Athletics Championships, scheduled to be held from May 27 to 31 in Gumi, South Korea. The announcement came a day after the conclusion of the Federation Cup in Kochi, which served as the final selection trial for the continental event.

Headlining the squad are some of India's top track and field stars including triple jumper Praveen Chithravel, long jumper Shaali Singh, and sprinter Animesh Kujur, all of whom are expected to lead India's medal hunt. India, currently third in the all-time medal tally of the Asian Championships behind China and Japan, will look to better its previous edition's total of 27 medals including six gold in Bangkok 2023.

The selection process was stringent, with the AFI mak-

ing it mandatory for athletes to meet qualification standards at the Federation Cup and finish in the top two positions to be considered. AFI President Bahadur Singh Sagoo and chief coach Radhakrishnan Nair reiterated the importance of recent form in the final decision.

Notably, sprinters Gurinder Singh and Manikanta Hoblihar, despite meeting the 100m qualifying marks earlier at the Indian Grand Prix-1, were left out of individual events after failing to deliver top finishes in Kochi. However, both have been named in the 4x100m relay squad.

Exemptions were granted to elite international performers such as Avinash Sable and Parul Chaudhary, given their consistent overseas records. Sable will compete in the 3000m steeplechase while Parul is set to participate in the 3000m steeplechase and 5000m events.

Olympic gold medallist Neeraj Chopra, however, will not be a part of the Indian squad due to overlapping international commitments, including the Doha Diamond League and the Neeraj Chopra Classic.

SHORT TAKES

Khushi, Tikam in semis

Amman: Khushi Chand and Tikam Singh were among the Indians boxers who reached the semifinals of the Asian U-15 & U-17 Championships being held here. Khushi (46 kg), a bronze-medallist at the 2024 Asian School Boys & Girls Boxing Championship in Abu Dhabi, forced an early end to her quarterfinal bout against Vietnam's Nguyen Thi Hong Yen after out-boxing her. Tikam (52 kg) got the better of Palestine's Othman Diab in his last-eight contest, which also ended early. In the men's section, Ambekar Meetei (48 kg), Udhham Singh (54 kg), and Rahul Gariya (57 kg) won by unanimous 5-0 decisions, while Aman Dev (50 kg) edged past Jordan's Osamah Al-Khaldi 3-2 in a tight bout. Jiya (48 kg) defeated Vietnam's Thi Ru Na Dinh for a 5-0 win while Jannat (54 kg) overpowered Ukraine's Anhelina Rumiantseva 4-1.

Pakistan not invited for Azlan Shah Cup

Karachi: The Malaysian Hockey Federation has not extended invitation to Pakistan for the annual Azlan Shah Cup in the wake of non-payment of dues to the tune of \$10,349 to the Johar Hockey Association. A source in the Pakistan Hockey Federation (PHF) said the Johar Association has sent a stern official letter to the PHF regarding the dues it needs to pay for the accommodation, travel and other expenses of PHF officials and their families who went to Malaysia with the team in October 2023. The Pakistan team had gone to Malaysia to play in the Johar hockey cup and the PHF officials including their families also accompanied the team.

Italian Cup final: Bologna vs AC Milan

Bologna: Bologna advanced past Empoli to reach its first Italian Cup final in more than half a century Thursday. Thijs Dallinga's 87th-minute header earned Bologna a 2-1 win and the team advanced 5-1 on aggregate. Giovanni Fabbian opened the scoring for Bologna with a header seven minutes in. Then Viktor Kovalenko equalized for Empoli in the 30th by turning in a rebound to finish off a counterattack. Bologna won the first leg 3-0. In the May 14 final in Rome, Bologna will face AC Milan, which eliminated city rival Inter Milan on 4-1 aggregate following a 3-0 win Wednesday.

Bihar take crown from Odisha

Guwahati, April 25: Bihar defeated defending champions Odisha 21-12 to be crowned as the winners of the 12th Senior National Rugby 7s Championship (Women). This marked Bihar's second national championship title, having won it earlier in 2022 on home soil.

The battle for bronze also saw a closely fought contest with Maharashtra defeating Delhi 14-5 to retain their 3rd place. Sunita Ransdah of Odisha emerged as the top scorer of the competition with 13 tries with Anshu Kumari; Arti Kumari from Bihar close behind at 12 tries.

Speaking on the completion of the women's competition, Indian Rugby Football Union (IRFU) President Rahul Bose said, "The 12th Senior Nationals

witnessed some fierce battles between teams and was a testament to the progress women's rugby has made in the country in the last few years.

"All teams from 24 states that participated deserve applause for giving their all on the field. Many congratulations to all the medal winners and especially Bihar on winning their second national championship. The progress that Bihar has made in women's rugby is an example for any upcoming state to follow," he added.

Bose also thanked the Government of Assam for the extensive support provided in hosting the competition.

With the women's competition now over, the action moves to the men's category, where 26 states will be battling it out on April 27 and 28 to be crowned as champions.

SRH all but end CSK's chances with win

Chennai, April 25: Pacer Harshal Patel made the best use of a sluggish Chepauk surface as Sunrisers Hyderabad put Chennai Super Kings on the brink of exit door by winning the battle of back-benchers by five wickets in the Indian Premier League here Friday.

Harshal, a fine exponent of the slower delivery and the knuckle ball, took 4 for 28 as Chennai Super Kings endured another poor outing with the bat and were bowled out for 154 in 19.5 overs.

Despite getting assistance from the dew-laden surface, SRH made a heavy weather of the chase before finally knocking off the target in 18.4 overs.

Ishan Kishan (44 off 34 balls), after his brain fade against Mumbai Indians, played a responsible hand at the top before Kamindu Mendis (32 not out off 22 balls) and Nitish Kumar Reddy (19 not out off 13 balls) got the visitors two points with a 49-run stand. This was SRH's first win at this venue.

With six points from nine games, SRH's play-off qualification hangs by a thread as they need to win all their five matches and that too by a fair margin



to end on 16 points, which is a safe cut-off.

SRH leapfrogged Rajasthan Royals to the eighth position in the 10-team table as Mahendra Singh Dhoni's men remain at the bottom of the heap.

For CSK, their seventh defeat in nine games practically ends their hopes as they now need wins in the next five games and hope that the play-off cut-off remains at 14 for the fourth-placed team.

The confidence of CSK batters has been shot to pieces and the lack of a collective effort from their bowlers only compounded the problems.

Harshal, who cleverly used the change of pace, was com-

plemented well by skipper Pat Cummins (2/21), ambidextrous spinner Kamindu (1/26), veterans Mohammed Shami (1/28) and Jaydev Unadkat (2/21).

Dewald Brevis (42 off 25) was the top scorer while Deepak Hooda (22 off 21) played some lofty shots towards the end to take CSK past 150-run mark.

Young Ayush Mhatre (30 off 19) was, however, going great guns, picking up boundaries at will with his attacking batting against Shami, SRH skipper Cummins and Unadkat. But Shivam Dube (12 off 9) and Brevis (42 off 25) had other plans as they took the attack to the opposition with their power hitting. Shivam Dube (12 off 9) and

Mbappe, Real Madrid eye El Clasico redemption vs Barca

This is the first Copa del Rey final between Spain's biggest rivals since 2014. Barcelona holds a record 31 Spanish cups. Madrid has 20, third place all time

Barcelona, April 25: Barcelona and Real Madrid meet in the Copa del Rey final Saturday with more than just the trophy on the line for the fierce Spanish rivals.

Barcelona wants to grab the first piece of a potential treble of major titles in coach Hansi Flick's debut season. The team is on pace to conquer La Liga, and three days after the cup final it will start its two-legged Champions League semifinal against Inter Milan.

It could also be the last trophy for Carlo Ancelotti, who many Madrid watchers speculate could leave the powerhouse this summer, possibly to take over the Brazil national team.

Madrid arguably has more at stake. Out of the Champi-



ons League, the cup is its best chance to salvage the campaign with some silverware. It is also alive in La Liga, but it needs to overhaul a four-point deficit to Barcelona with five games left — a home stretch that includes

yet another clasico.

For Barcelona, a title won at the expense of Madrid would give it a huge momentum boost for Inter's visit Wednesday as the Catalan club pursues its first European Cup in a decade.

Barcelona dominated their other two meetings this season, beating Madrid 5-2 in the Spanish Super Cup final in January after winning 4-0 at Madrid in the league in October.

The third clasico of the season will be played before 70,000 fans in Seville's La Cartuja

Stadium, where King Felipe VI will award the trophy to the winners.

Filling in for Lewandowski Flick's biggest task will be filling in for the injured Robert Lewandowski, who picked up a left-thigh injury last weekend. The Poland striker is producing another stellar season with a team-high 40 goals across all competitions.

Ferran Torres is likely to

start in his place. The versatile forward has emerged as Barcelona's super sub in this campaign. He has netted 17 goals overall in limited minutes, including five in the cup. Another option, however, could be playing attacking midfielder Dani Olmo as a "false nine" flanked by Lamine Yamal and Raphinha.

Barcelona will also be without starting left back Alejandro Balde. Youth player Gerard Martin is likely to take his place unless Flick wants to slot a more experienced player into that position.

Mbappe's moment?

Finishing the season without a trophy would be a major disappointment after Madrid brought in superstar Kylian Mbappé last summer.

The France striker has scored goals galore but has

failed to produce big in the biggest games of the season. He was jeered when substituted late in the second of two losses to Arsenal in the Champions League quarterfinals.

Vinicius Junior has seen his productivity in attack fade ever since he felt overlooked in the Ballon d'Or award selection earlier this season. But the Brazil forward has previously risen to the occasion in finals.

Midfielder Eduardo Camavinga injured a tendon this week and will miss the rest of the season, joining Madrid's long-term casualty list that includes defenders Dani Carvajal and Eder Militao.

Madrid's main task in defense will be keeping Yamal and Raphinha in check after both ran rampant in the previous clasicos this campaign.
