85% grievances resolved: Majhi

Bhubaneswar, May 19: Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Monday claimed that around 85 per cent of the grievances he has received so far have been resolved, and the process of addressing citizens' concerns

Majhi said this after attending the 12th CM's Public Grievance Hearing since assuming office in June last year.

Of these sessions, 11 were held in Bhubaneswar, while one was conducted in Sambalpur April 21.

"In a people's government, the highest priority is given to resolving people's problems. The complaints of common people were heard at the new grievance centre at Unit-2 in Bhubaneswar, Officials have been directed to take immediate steps to resolve their problems for the benefit of the complainants," the CM said in a post on X.

Accompanied by a team of ministers and around 20 officers, Majhi began hearing grievances around 8:30 AM. By 1 PM, his team had listened to around 700 people, out of around 1,000 who had registered online for the session.

Majhi said that in view of the hot and humid weather, all arrangements for attendees like shades, fans, coolers, drinking water and toilet facilities. Special provisions were also made for 'divyang' (persons with disabilities) individuals to ensure their accessibility.

Citizens registered their complaints in advance through the state government's portal janasunani.odisha.gov.in or the Janasunani mobile app.

"So far, 85 per cent of the complaints made by the general public have been resolved. and the rest are in the process of being addressed. People have high expectations from us, and that is why they are coming forward with their problems,' Majhi added.

Around 10,000 people from across the state have filed their grievance petitions at different CM's Public Hearing sessions so far, an official said.

State begins tracking illegal Bangladeshis

While India's attention has been focused on its western borders since the Pahalgam tragedy April 22, some major geopolitical shifts have been taking place on the country's eastern front. The interim government of Bangladesh's apparent plan to create a "human corridor" in Myanmar and the ban on the Awami League party are two such instances. In the face of these developments, the Odisha government has begun identifying undocumented Bangladeshi immigrants within the state to thwart potential threats from the country's eastern neighbour. All police stations have been instructed to gather detailed data on undocumented foreigners, particularly Bangladeshi nationals, and to take appropriate legal action. Investigations are also underway to determine how these illegal settlers entered Odisha, what activities they are engaged in, and whether they possess valid documents

Bhubaneswar, May 19: State Law minister Prithiviraj Harichandan Monday said the government has already started the process of identifying Bangladeshis staying illegally in different districts of the state.

The government has issued direction to all district collectors, coastal security agencies and formed a Special Task Force to coordinate the process of identifying the undocumented Bangladeshi immigrants in the state.

"We have already started the process of identifying illegal migrants staying in both urban and rural areas. No foreign national residing without valid legal status will be allowed to stay in Odisha. Different engineering departments of the

state government have been asked not to engage any Bangladeshi or foreign national without valid documents. The government has taken a strong stance in this regard," Harichandan told reporters here.

In April, Odisha's Panchayati Raj minister Rabi Narayan Naik and Food Supplies minister KC Patra had said that the state would identify all foreign nationals staying in the state illegally. Naik had said that illegal settlers are being identified from gram panchayat level, Patra said that the government has decided to deny ration cards availed by such persons in a fraudulent manner.

Meanwhile, the Commis-Police, Bhusionerate of baneswar-Cuttack on Sunday held a meeting of officers-in-charge of all police stations and discussed the issue of illegal Bangladeshi migrants staying in the twin cities.

Bhubaneswar DCP Jagmohan Meena instructed all police stations to gather detailed data on undocumented foreigners, particularly Bangladeshi nationals. and take appropriate legal action. He also asked the police to investigate how these (illegal settlers) people entered Bhubaneswar, their activities, and whether they possess valid documents.

Police sources said that the STF of Crime Branch in this regard had arrested 10 illegal Bangladeshi immigrants, including six men, three women and a juvenile from Bhubaneswar railway station here in March.

The STF has located a large number of such illegal settlers in the districts of Khurda, Cuttack, Kendrapara, Jagatsinghpur, Balasore, Bhadrak, Ganjam and Puri. The illegal settlers are engaged in construction work, scrap collection, and street vending.

In March this year, Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi, while replying to a question in the Assembly, said that the police have registered criminal cases against 41 Bangladeshis in the state during the last 10 years.

No nuclear signalling by Pak: Foreign Secy

New Delhi, May 19: Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri told a parliamentary committee Monday that the conflict between India and Pakistan was always in the conventional domain, and there was no nuclear signalling by the latter, sources said.

Misri reiterated the government's stand that the decision to stop military actions was taken at a bilateral level, as some opposition members questioned US President Donald Trump's repeated assertions about his administration's role in stopping the conflict. The MEA, in a presentation

to the Shashi Tharoor-led Standing Committee on External Affairs, asserted that the initial probe into the Pahalgam terror attack revealed 'communication nodes' of terrorists with their 'masterminds in Pakistan.'

When some opposition members of the committee prodded him on the US leader's repeated attempts to take centre stage, Misri guipped that Trump did not seek his consent for doing so.

No other country has 'any locus standi' to comment on the issue of Jammu and Kashmir, a clear repudiation of the US' suggestion for mediation between India and Pakistan

SC orders SIT probe against MP minister

New Delhi, May 19: The Supreme Court Monday pulled up Madhya Pradesh minister Vijay Shah for his remarks on Colonel Sofiya Qureshi and constituted a three-member special investigation team to probe the FIR lodged against him.

A bench of Justices Surya Kant and N Kotiswar Singh told the minister that it had seen his videos where he made the remarks and his apology and wondered if "they were crocodile tears or an attempt to wriggle out of the legal proceedings"

"The entire nation was in shame due to the comments... We saw your videos, you were on the verge of using very filthy language but somehow better sense prevailed or you did not find suitable words. You should be shameful. Entire country is proud of our Army and you made this statement," Justice Surya Kant said.

The bench further grilled the minister, "What kind of apology was this? You should have simply admitted your mistake and apologised but you say if you have said this and that... then I apologise. This is not the way to seek apology. The kind

WOMAN HELD HOSTAGE FOR 7 DAYS, GANGRAPED

Baliguda, May 19: A woman was held hostage at a rented house and gangraped by three individuals for a week in an area under this police jurisdiction in Kandhamal district, police said Monday.

The incident occurred May 11. and the accused include an auto-rickshaw driver and two of his friends. The driver lured the woman, promising to drop her off at home, but instead took her to a rented house where they held her hostage and raped in turns for a week. The matter came to light after the police arrested the driver Sunday but refused to reveal the names of the accused as their identification parade is vet to be held. This was stated in a press conference by Baliguda SDPO Ramendra Prasad and IIC, along with the IO Sambit Kumar Swain Monday.

The SDPO said the woman had gone to the market to buy medicines around 11:30 a.m. May 11, Sunday. She was returning home when the driver, opposite Trivedi Park, assured her he would drop her off at home. However, he drove the vehicle towards a rented house instead of taking her home.

without the Like button, the thumbs-up icon that Facebook and other online services turned into digital catnip. Like it or not, the button has served as a creative catalyst, a

dopamine delivery system and

an emotional battering ram.

As per its origin, a Yelp employee named Bob Goodson sat down May 18, 2005, and drew a crude sketch of thumbs up and thumbs down gestures as a way for people to express their opinions about restaurant reviews posted on the site. Yelp

Like it or not, the Like button has changed the world passed on adopting Goodson's suggested symbol and, instead, adopted the "useful," "funny' and "cool" buttons conceived by Simmons. But the discovery of that old sketch inspired Goodson to team up with Martin Reeves to explore how the Like button came to be in their new book. Like: The Button That Changed The World. The book delves into the convoluted story behind a symbol that's become both the manna and bane of a digitally driven society.

"It's something simple and also elegant because the Like button says, 'I like vou, I like vour content. And I am like you. I like you because I am like you, I am



part of your tribe," Reeves said during an interview with this agency. "But it's very hard to answer the simple question, 'Well, who invented the Like button?'

Although Facebook is the main reason the Like button

became so ubiquitous, the company didn't invent it and almost discarded it as drivel. It took Facebook nearly two years to overcome the staunch resistance by CEO Mark Zuckerberg before finally introducing the symbol on its service on February 9, 2009 — five years after the social network's creation in a Harvard University dorm room.

As happens with many innovations, the Like button was born out of necessity but it wasn't the brainchild of a single person. But Facebook unquestionably turned the Like button into a universally understood symbol, while also profiting the most from its entrance into the mainstream.

By 2007, Facebook engineers had been tinkering with a Like button, but Zuckerberg opposed it because he feared the social network was already getting too cluttered and, Reeves said, "he didn't actually want to do some thing that would be seen as trivial that would cheapen the service.'

Moreover, the button's suc cess encouraged Facebook to take things even further by allowing other digital services to ingrain it into their feedback loops and then, in 2016, added six more types of emotions -"love," "care," "haha," "wow," "sad," and "angry."







Bhubaneswar, May 19: Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Monday said Prime Minister Narendra Modi is scheduled to hold deliberations with the state chief secretary and other officials during which the controversial Polavaram project in neighbouring Andhra Pradesh may be

Majhi, however, said he had no information that the PM was scheduled to convene a meeting with the chief ministers of Odisha, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana and Chhattisgarh May 28 to discuss the project.

Responding to journalists' queries on media reports about the PM's meeting with the chief ministers on the sidelines of a programme here, Majhi said, "I have no information regarding the PM's meeting with chief ministers on the Polavaram project. However, the PM is scheduled to hold deliberations with the Odisha chief secretary and secretaries of the eastern state during which the Polavaram project may be and raise the state's rights at the discussion," he added. The Polavaram Dam in

Andhra Pradesh has already become a controversial project with neighbouring states Odisha, Telangana and Ch hattisgarh opposing it fearing the submergence of land and

The matter is currently pending with the Supreme Court, with petitions filed by Odisha, Chhattisgarh, and Telangana. The Central government has declared Polavaram a national project and sanctioned funds for it in this financial year's

Meanwhile, Odisha's Law Minister Prithiviraj Harichandan accused the previous BJD government of delaying legal action against Andhra Pradesh in the initial days when the Polavaram project was being built.

"The previous government did not raise the issue at the proper time due to certain political interests. Therefore, the only option before the present government is discussion and negotiation to resolve the matter. The present BJP government will certainly fight for Odisha's rights," the minister said.

The Opposition BJD, however, said it has been opposing the Polavaram project for a long time and claimed that Odisha would be severely affected if the present design of the dam was not changed.

Keonjhar: A 60-year old woman was trampled to death by an elephant at Kusumita village under Keonjhar Sadar forest range in this district Monday morning. The deceased was identified as Sunaphula Pradhan in the village. Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi expressed grief over the death. He also directed the Forest department to pay ₹6 lakh to the next of the kin of the deceased. The incident occurred when the woman had gone to collect mangoes from a nearby orchard. She came face to face with an elephant which had straved into the area. The animal picked her on its tusk and pinned her to the ground. As a result, she sustained critical injuries on her head. Family members rushed her to the DHH where doctors pronounced her dead on arrival. Man gets life imprisonment for raping minor

Baripada, May 19: A POCSO court in Mayurbhani district Monday sentenced a 30-year-old man to life imprisonment for raping a 12-year-old girl last year.

POCSO court judge Santosh Kumar Nayak also imposed a fine of $\stackrel{?}{\stackrel{?}{\sim}} 10.000$ on the convict. Hemendra Naik. If he fails to pay the amount, he would have to undergo an additional six months in prison, special public prosecutor Manoranjan Pattnaik said.

The court directed the District Legal Services Authority (DLSA) of Mayurbhanj to pay ₹3 lakh as compensation to the survivor, Pattnaik said.

The judgment was based on the statements of the girl and nine witnesses, besides the medical report, the special public prosecutor said. The incident took place June 4, 2024.


Op Olivia: 6.98 lakh Olive Ridleys protected

lakh Olive Ridley turtles nested at the Rushikulva river mouth in Odisha have been protected under the Indian Coast Guard's annual mission 'Operation Ol ivia', officials said Monday.

Conducted annually from No vember to May, 'Operation Ol ivia' is an important initiative of the ICG aimed at ensuring safe nesting grounds for the tur tles particularly at Gahirmatha Beach and surrounding coastal areas of Odisha, which see the arrival of over eight lakh tur tles each year. In a major boost to marine conservation, the Indian Coast Guard's (ICG) annual mission - 'Operation Olivia -- helped protect a record over 6.98 lakh Olive Ridley turtles nested at the Rushikulya river mouth in Odisha during February 2025, the defence ministry said in a statement. The record mass nesting at the Rushikulya river mouth stands as a testa ment to the ICG's sustained ef forts in safeguarding the endangered species through rigorous patrolling, aerial surveillance, and community engagement, the officials said.

Since the inception of 'Op eration Olivia', the ICG has carried out over 5,387 surface patrol sorties and 1,768 aerial surveillance missions, significantly reducing threats such as illegal fishing and habitat disruption, they said.

During this period, 366 boats involved in illegal fishing were detained, reaffirming the ICG's strong enforcement role in pro tecting marine life.

n a powerful retaliation to Pahalgam terrorist attack that claimed the lives of 26 innocent tourists April 22, Indian Armed Forces launched a series of coordinated strikes on Pakistani terror camps on the night of May 6. India launched airstrikes targeting nine terrorist camps in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK) in an operation codenamed 'Operation Sindoor'. What followed was a three-day intense conflict between the two nations. On the nights of May 7, 8 and 9, Pakistan launched missiles and drones targeting several border areas - from Jammu

and Kashmir to Gujarat. It also targeted New Delhi and Golden Temple in Punjab. However, India's advanced air defense systems intercepted and neutralised the flying projectiles in skies. Russian-made S-400 missile defense system, also known as Sudarshan Chakra, played a key role in these precise and calibrated responses by India. Indigenous systems such as Akash missile defence system also helped thwart Pakistani aggression by neutralizing countless drones and missiles. India responded swiftly and decisively from land, air and sea. The Indian forces destroyed key components of Pakistan's air defense and radar infrastructure, while carrying out strikes on 11 airbases and three other military installations, leaving Pakistan's air retaliation capabilities completely crippled. Rattled by India's military might, Pakistan's military and government came on their knees and begged for a ceasefire by May 10 afternoon. India responded to the request affirmatively and temporarily paused its counter-terror operations against Pakistan-backed terror outfits. Indian Armed Forces have been widely applauded across the country, and internationally, for their valour. Every countryman has expressed gratitude as the bravery of our soldiers continues to receive salutes and respect from across the world. The men in uniform have made every Indian proud.

Every Indian is proud of you: PM

of you... you have written history. I have come for your blessings. You are an inspiration for this and the coming generations. I want to salute the Army, Navy and Air Force," said Prime Minister Narendra Modi while expressing his deep gratitude to the armed forces following the successful strikes against Pakistan as part of Operation Sindoor

The terrorists dared us... but you hit them front-on. You wiped out their terror bases and killed 100 terrorists. They have now realised that if they try to attack us, the result will be their destruction... massive destruction," PM Modi said during his address to air warriors at the Adampur Air Force base in Punjab.

He praised India's armed forces for their massive re-



attack. 'Operation Sindoor'-India's swift, coordinated military response -- targeted nine terror bases in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir,

which was followed by hostilities that saw India repelling Pakistani missile and drone retaliation.

'This is our new normal.' PM Modi said, referring to described as India's first tri-service combat operation since the 1971 war. "India's 'Laxman Rekha' against terrorism is crystal clear now. If another terror attack occurs now, India will give a reply – a solid reply. We saw this during the surgical strike, during the air strike. Now, Operation Sindoor is India's new normal," he asserted.

Taking aim at Pakistan's military support for terror outfits, PM Modi declared: "Jis Pakistani sena ke bharose ye aatanki baithhe the, Bharatiya sena, Bharat ki Air Force aur Bharativon ne us Pakistani sena ko bhi dhool chata di hai. (The terrorists who were relying on the Pakistani Army — the Indian Army, the Indian Air Force, and the people of India have made that Pakistani Army hite the dust).

He added that India's grow-

ing military strength should serve as a deterrent. "Our drones, our missiles, just think ing about them will keep Paki stan sleepless for days.

Issuing a sharp warning to Pakistan and its supported ter ror groups in the aftermath of India's strikes on terror camp and infrastructure as part of Operation Sindoor, Prime Min ister Narendra Modi made i clear that India's new doctrine on terrorism involves striking at the source, deep inside ene my territory.

"Hum ghar mein ghus ka marenge aur bachane ka ek mauka tak nahi denge," the Prime Minister thundered.

As the speech ended with chants of 'Bharat Mata ki Jai', the message was clear India will no longer tolerate cross-border terrorism and wil respond not just in defence, but with pre-emptive precision.

This was a trailer

ending a clear and firm message to Islamabad, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh has made it clear that Operation Sindoor is not yet over as the current ceasefire means that India has kent Pakistan on 'probation' on the basis of its behaviour. "If the behaviour improves, it is fine; but if there is any disturbance, harshest punishment will be given, said the defence minister while addressing the

air warriors at Guiarat's Bhuj Air Force station recently. "Our actions were just a trailer, we will show the full picture, if need be. Attacking and eliminating terrorism is the new normal of new India," he said. Singh said Pakistan has again started trying

to rebuild the terror infrastructure destroyed by India recently and that Islamabad will "spend the tax collected from the common citizens of Pakistan to pay around Rs 14 crore to Masood Azhar, the head of the terror outfit Jaish-e-Mohammad" and a UN designated terrorist.



Multiple losses for Pak

Pakistan had to pay a heavy price for abetting and sponsoring town. sponsoring terrorism on Indian soil as the quantum of devastation and losses inflicted by Operation Sindoor emerged.

Pakistan air force has suffered severe losses, with 20 per cent of its infrastructure destroyed in Indian strikes. Many of its fighter jets were destroyed, while more than 30-40 of its armymen are understood to have succumbed.

India targeted at least 10-11 airbases in Pakistan, many of whom are known to host the country's key fighter jets. The strikes caused severe damages, destroying ammunition depots





and Bholari, where the PAF's F-16 and J-17 fighter aircraft were said to be stationed.

India targeted military installations and the airbases of

Nur Khan in Chaklala, Rafiqui in Shorkot, Murid in Chakwal, Sukkur, Sialkot, Pasrur, Chunian, Sargodha, Skardu, Bholari and Jacobabad. The satellite images showed the scale of destruction at many airbases including Shahbaz airbase in Jacobabad. High-resolution satellite images revealed the damages

at the airbases. Over 600 drones launched by Pakistan were simply swatted out of the sky while the rest were repelled by Army Air Defence (AD) units, which were swiftly deployed along the western front. In the satellite imagery, large craters on the runways and damaged aircraft hangars were seen.

A decisive blow to terror infra in Pak

Operation Sindoor signalled a doctrinal shift in India's strategy and also underlined a new red line that Pakistan could no longer ignore. On the intervening night of May 6-7, India annihilated around a dozen high-value terrorists in Pakistan. Among those killed were Yusuf Azhar, IC-814 hijacker and brotherin-law of Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM) chief Masood Azhar, and Abu Jundal (Mudassar), head of Lashkar-e-Taiba's Muridke base. The son of the 2016 Nagrota attack mastermind and several others involved in attacks across Jammu and Kashmir were also killed. Indian intelligence estimates that 130-140 terrorists were neutralized in precision strikes, conducted in retaliation for the Pahalgam killings.

Akashteer: The unseen wall

ndia's indigenously-developed Akashteer air defence Loontrol and reporting system played a pivotal role in neutralising waves of Pakistani aerial attacks including drones and missiles during the four-day military confrontation with Pakistan. While Pakistan relied on imported HQ-9 and HQ-16 systems that failed to intercept Indian strikes, Akashteer showcased India's dominance in automated air

defence, the defence ministry said, adding that it is the unseen wall

stopped a barrage of missiles and drones fired by Pakistan.

Manufactured by state-run Bharat Electronics Limited (BEL), Akashteer was inducted into Indian Army around a year ago.

"In the dark skies, a new kind of warrior awakened. It did not roar like a fighter jet or flash like a missile. It listened. It calculat-🍼 ed. It

> struck," the defence ministry said. 'This invisible shield,

Akashteer, is no longer a con cept confined to defence jour nals. It is the sharp edge of India's air defence, the unseen wall that stopped a barrage of missiles and drones on the night of May 9 and 10, when Pakistan launched its deadliest attack on Indian military and civilian areas," it said.

"Akashteer has demonstrated that it sees, decides, and strikes faster than anything the world has fielded," the ministry said in a statement.







Nation First

fter a laudable show of unity by the Indian government and the Opposition on the terrorist attack in Pahalgam on 22 April and the subsequent Operation Sindoor to take on cross-border terrorism and Pakistan's collusion in it, the two sides of India's political establishment appear to be squandering the good will earned and are now showcasing their disunity and enmity towards each other. Even a national crisis of monumental proportions for which precious lives have been snuffed out, fails to prompt them to rise above their familiar partisan politics. The spectacle of a fight between the government at the Centre and the Congress over the nomination of leaders to visit countries in an outreach programme to present India's case in the conflict lowers the country's image before the international community. In another development, a minister belonging to the ruling BJP from Madhya Pradesh has disgraced the nation with his purported derogatory remarks on a woman army officer, who became a prominent face of Operation Sindoor. The court is seized of the matter and has directed the police to lodge an FIR against the minister. On the other hand, a professor of a reputed university has been arrested in BJP-ruled Haryana for airing remarks that he believes did not breach any laws of the land as alleged by the police and the Haryana State Commission for Women (HSCW). The Supreme Court agreed on 19 May to urgently hear the matter.

Surprisingly, the BJP leadership at the central or state level is yet to condemn the minister's remarks that would surely have attracted provisions of the draconian Sedition Laws, had they been made by anyone not belonging to the ruling party. The same party has wasted no time in arresting the professor who claimed his patriotism is beyond question and his criticism was very much within the Constitutional provisions of free speech.

The Narendra Modi government announced the names of seven delegations who would explain the country's position on the handling of the latest terrorist attack and confrontation with Pakistan. The initiative is praiseworthy for bringing together representatives from the ruling party and the Opposition, diplomats and strategic experts since it demonstrates, before the world, that India is speaking with one voice on the heinous killings perpetrated by terrorists. That India is an example of the concept of unity in diversity needs to be loudly and forcefully spelt out globally, even though that image has suffered a massive jolt during the past few years when pluralism has far too often become a casualty. In the past the Narasimha Rao government showed the same sagacity by choosing then Opposition leader AB Vajpayee to represent the country in the UN. Both rose above narrow political considerations and enhanced the image of unity in the country in a remarkable manner.

But in the present case, both the ruling party and the Congress have unseemly let their petty politics get the better of national interests. The Congress sent a list of its leaders to be included in the outreach committees, which was mostly rejected by the government. Instead, the latter selected Congress leaders of its choice. The list of Congress nominees, which excludes some prominent and most articulate voices on international affairs, lays bare its own narrow, internal squabbles. On the other hand, the government should have shown broadness by not foisting its choice on the Congress and accepting its nominees. If it had prepared its own list beforehand, there was no need for asking the Congress to depute its members. The arrest of the professor at this very crucial juncture is a

disturbing and unwarranted development. This is more so when one considers the minister in the BJP government in MP called Colonel Sofiya Qureshi the "sister" of terrorists and he is still not censured by his party, not to speak of sacking him from the state cabinet. This is no time for exacerbating communal tension or stifling independent voices critical of the government. To note that the Congress has objected to the unilateral fashion of choosing its MPs by the government has already dented the image of the parliamentary groups that are to go to various countries to project India's unified stand. Added to this is the withdrawal of the TMC from this initiative. The government should have consulted with Opposition parties' leaders and that would have given a much better image to the country. Sadly, here also the desire to demonstrate one-upmanship is proving negative for India.

ancient Indian epic Mahabharata, Krishna's Yadava clan self-destructs. Many dark omens presage their downfall: nature behaves erratically and pests multiply. Sin, deception, and violence proliferate, eroding trust and solidarity. Clan members humiliate and insult wise elders. When Krishna's extended family goes on a picnic, the men get drunk, argue, and attack each other, until eventually all of them are dead.

This cautionary tale has gained new resonance as geopolitical tensions - including in South Asia - escalate, and many countries embrace protectionist policies. US President Donald Trump's second administration has contributed significantly to the current fragmentation and disorder. But other wealthy countries have exacerbated the situation by failing to show any real solidarity in response to Trump's hostile policies. The lack of development cooperation is a prime example of this growing appetite for mutually assured destruction. To be sure, aid from donor countries was already declining, and recent events have exposed the system's injustices. The COVID-19 pandemic highlighted Western governments' greed, undermining others' trust in their global leadership. Moreover, the fact that these governments have directed most of their dwindling foreign-aid budgets to Ukraine since Russia's 2022 invasion, diverting funds away from other wartorn and desperately poor countries, has underscored the largely self-serving approach to such "charity" flows.

Still, it is surprising – and dispiriting - that other donor countries have not stepped

up after Trump terminated almost all US foreign-aid funding and programming. This would have been the obvious thing to do, not necessarily out of solidarity, but simply because of geopolitical self-interest.

For starters, Trump's indiscriminate attacks on allies and rivals alike have demonstrated the necessity of coordinated action, which requires building alliances, supporting multilateralism, and cultivating soft power. One easy and relatively cheap way to do that is by continuing to support multilateral institutions. Such funding may also defuse some of the anger that many people in the Global South feel about the Western world's complicity in the ongoing decimation and mass killings in Gaza.

Moreover, the massive reduction in US direct aid and financing for international organisations will hinder the provision of global public goods, including health and climate stability. The concept of global public investment suggests that all countries have a stake in solving these challenges, and should thus contribute resources to addressing them, according to their means, and distribute the collected funds based on need and impact. But the response of most rich countries has so far been appalling. Instead of scaling up foreign assistance, several European governments have slashed it, citing the need to channel funds to defense investment. As a result, some of the most immediate needs that fall under a global public investment framework are going unmet.

This is especially baffling because the amounts required to plug the development-financing hole left by the United States are so small as to be trivial. For example, Trump's withdrawal of the US from the World Health Organization which remains absolutely

critical for managing global health threats - means that the WHO faces a \$1.9 billion budget shortfall in 2026-27 - a gap that rich countries and even most large middle-income countries could easily afford to fill.

It's a similar story at other international organizations. The United Nations World Food Programme faces an estimated 40% reduction in funding – equal to roughly \$4 billion. The WFP, which served more than 100 million

bel Peace Prize five years ago, must now downsize its staff by nearly one-third (around 6,000 positions worldwide) and reduce the amount of life-saving food that it provides, because no other countries have offered to offset the shortfall.

Similarly, the Joint UN Programme on HIV/AIDS (UNAIDS), which relied on the US for more than 40% of its financing, will need to cut more than half of its workforce and reduce or eliminate some of its essential programmes. (Switzerland and the United Kingdom, two other major UN-AIDS funders, have likewise reduced their contributions). That could lead to six times more HIV infections and a 400% increase in AIDS deaths by 2029, as well as the emergence of new strains, which would have negative repercussions for all countries. But the organization's budget gap is a modest \$58 million – the same shortfall facing the UN Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs, which has to lay off 20% of its staff.

Given these minuscule sums, filling the gap left by the US would have a negligible fiscal impact on traditional donors and large middle-income countries. But only a handful of countries, like South Korea, have responded to the funding crisis, preventing essential organizations' collapse and enabling them to function properly - for now. If wealthier countries refuse to provide for the global common good, the multilateral system as we know it will not survive.

Migrants contribute as scientists, engineers, construction workers, cleaners. and agricultural labourers who produce our food. Migrants serve as soldiers and excel as football and cricket players. Migrants not only bring national and international glory but also bring a diverse set of skills and competencies that sustain the European economy. Their diverse cultural backgrounds not only enrich democratic diversitv but also deepen multicultural society in Britain and Europe.

However, migrants and multiculturalism are often blamed for the persistent problems in the UK and Europe. It has become widely accepted in much of Western Europe today that migrants are a source of trouble. Anti-migrant propaganda and anti-multicultural narratives undermine migrants' essential contributions and reinforce harmful stereotypes. Flawed

political narratives are deliberately manufactured to reinvent a non-existent national identity in Britain and a fabricated European identity across the continent, both based on imaginary shared values. In reality, the historical foundations of shared values that most closely bind Britain with other Western European countries are feudalism, colonialism, racism, capitalism, and imperialism—often branded as a collective foundation of a glorified past. The British Prime Minister, Sir Keir Starmer, has warned that the UK risks becoming an 'island of strangers' due to migration, highlighting the need for stronger visa restrictions. Many people were not only uncomfortable but also surprised by the conservative tone of the Labour Party PM during his Downing Street press conference ahead of the publication of an immigration white paper. His speech echoes Enoch Powell's infamous 1968 'Rivers of Blood' speech, in which Powell warned of the socalled dangers of multiculturalism and claimed that white people were becoming 'strangers in their own country.'

Historically, there is absolutely no surprise in the conservative content of Starmer's speech, which not only panders to white supremacists in Britain but also to those in a racialised Europe.

Health crisis

Much of the political leadership scapegoats secular multiculturalism and blames migrants for the various predicaments faced by Britain and Europe. This is a deliberate political strategy to escape accountability and deflect attention from leadership failures, exonerate the failures of capitalism, and obscure its inherent crises—conditions that provide the lifeblood for far right-wing and reactionary politics to flourish across Britain and Europe. Contrary to dominant narratives and propaganda, it is not migrants or multiculturalism that are responsible for the destruction of livelihoods and sources of income. Despite state support, capitalism has failed to generate adequate employment and income for the majority of the population across the continent.

Migration is neither automatic nor spontaneous, nor is it simply driven by the emotions or personal choices of migrants. Rather, it is deeply rooted in the legacies of European colonialism, wars, conflicts, and ongoing neocolonial strategies of resource exploitation. These forces compel people to leave their homes and livelihoods in search of safety, stability, and the means to survive. However, the alienating, individualistic nature of European culture combined with the absence of

meaningful conditions for assimilation—often compels migrants to rely on their own cultural identities as a means of coping with the harsh realities of a capitalist society, where migrant workers are forced to work overtime just to cover basic living expenses. This reliance on cultural identity is often misrepresented and used to construct illiberal stereotypes about migrants to undermine their contributions in the making of modern Britain and Europe. European capitalism and its accompanying culture reduce migrants to mere economic units—numbers on Excel sheets in foreign offices and border security systems. This reductive approach undermines the very foundation of human dignity that binds individuals to one another.

As reactionary politics fuels anti-migrant sentiment worldwide, it is more important than ever to build solidarity among workers. Workers have no country to hide in, only each other to defend in the face of the onslaught by reactionary corporations, states, and governments. This solidarity is essential to building workers' unity and upholding the ideals of workers internationalism.

Delhi Police to use PTMs to curb drug abuse in students

New Delhi, May 19: In a proactive effort to tackle drug abuse among adolescents, Delhi Police will now utilise parent-teacher meetings (PTMs) in schools as a platform to sensitise and educate parents about the early warning signs of substance use in their children, an official said Monday.

The initiative, being rolled out in collaboration with the Directorate of Education (DoE), aims to build a broad-based awareness framework at the school and community level to address the rising threat of narcotics among school-going children.

The Delhi Police has already conducted training sessions for teachers from schools that opted for the programme, equipping them to identify behavioural indicators and psychological cues that may signal drug use among students, particularly teenagers. a senior police officer said.

"We recently partnered with the Directorate of Education and conducted a training session for teachers to help them understand how to identify early warning signs and behavioural changes in students who might be using drugs,' the officer said.

Building on this, the police will now focus on involving parents directly through



pre-vocational education programme

Apre-vocational education programme will be introduced for students of classes 6 to 8 in government schools of Delhi in the academic year 2025-26 in line with the National Education Policy, the Delhi Directorate of Education has announced. According to a circular issued by the Vocational Education Branch of DoE, 'Kaush al Bodh' will be introduced as a distinct subject for Class 6 in the first phase. followed by Classes 7 and 8 in subsequent years. The initiative is aimed at equip ping students with essential life skills and vocational awareness to prepare them for real-world challenges and opportunities. The curriculum has been aligned with the National Curriculum Framework for School Education (NCF-SE) 2023 and ocuses on three broad categories of work --- Work with Life Forms, Work with Machines and Materials, and Work in Human Services. Students are expected to complete three projects each year, one from each of the three categories, it stated. The programme encourages hands-on learning through activities such as organic farming, pottery, carpentry, cooking with millets, embroidery, and basic electrical work. Teachers will guide students in carrying out tasks safely collaborating in groups, and applying their learning in practical settings, it said Each student will be assessed based on written tests, oral presentations, activity books, portfolios, and teacher observations, with a total of 110 hours allocated annually for these activities, the circular read.

PTMs, ensuring early intervention at the family level.

To further support the initiative, Delhi Police is in advanced discussions with the de-addiction centre at the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) to rope in expert counsellors.

"With the help of professional counsellors from AIIMS, we plan to create short, informative videos that explain the psychological and physical signs of drug use in adolescents. These will be shown during PTMs to ensure the message reaches parents in an accessible, visual format,"

the officer said.

The videos will serve as a conversation starter between parents and teachers and will be tailored to reflect age-appro priate warning signs.

The programme is open to both government and private schools and authorities hope to scale it up citywide in the coming months.

"The initiative will help bridge the gap between schools, families, and law enforcement, fostering a collab orative environment where children are better protected against the growing menace of substance abuse," he added

Chandigarh, May 19: You-Tuber Dhruv Rathee Monday took down his AI-generated video depicting Sikh gurus in the face of the Akal Takht, SGPC and the Shiromani Akali Dal's strong protests against depicting the religious figures in human form or in films.

The Akal Takht, Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee (SGPC) and the Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) had demanded an immediate takedown of the video which features artificial intelligence-generated images of Guru Gobind Singh and his four sons known as 'Sahib-

New Delhi, May 19: The Supreme Court Monday observed the country was not a "dharamshala" or a public shelter to accommodate foreign nationals from across the globe. A bench of justices Dipankar

Datta and K Vinod Chandran was hearing a plea challenging an order of the Madras High Court directing the petitioner. a Sri Lankan citizen, to leave the country after finishing his seven-year sentence in an Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA) case. "Is India to host refugees

from all over the world? We are struggling with 140 crore people... This is not a dharm-



shala that we can entertain foreign nationals from all over the world," the bench said.

The petitioner's counsel said his client was facing threats of arrest and torture in his country as he was a former Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE) member, and that his wife and children had settled

The bench, however, said the fundamental right to settle in India was available only to its

citizens and that there was no violation of his rights under Article 21 (protection of life and liberty) of the Constitution.

"What is your right to settle

here," the bench said, "go to some other country.' The petitioner was sentenced

under Section 10 (penalty for being a member of an unlawful association) of the UAPA Act.

The Madras High Court while reducing his sentence from 10 years to seven directed

him to leave the country imme-

Another apex court bench rapped the petitioners May 16 who claimed 43 Rohingya refugees, including women and children, were dropped in the Andaman sea for deportation to Myanmar and said, "when the country is passing through a difficult time, you come out with fanciful ideas.'

The top court was then informed that some refugees having United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) cards, including women and children, were arrested by police authorities late last night and deported.

"If they (Rohingyas) are all foreigners and if they are covered by the Foreigners' Act, then they will have to be dealt with as per the Foreigners Act," the bench had said while adding that UNHCR-issued identity cards may not be of any help to them under the law.

SC rules one rank one pension for ex-HC judges

New Delhi: The Supreme Court Monday directed uniform pension benefits for all retired high court judges, irrespective of their mode of appointment or tenure, saying "one rank one pension has to be the norm in respect of a constitutional office". A bench comprising Chief Justice BR Gavai and Justices Augustine George Masih and K Vinod Chandran held that any classification in pension benefits based on whether judges came from the bar or district judiciary, or whether they were permanent or additional judges, was discriminatory and violative of Article 14 of the Constitution. He was among the key perpetrators of the crime, in which a woman, Zosangkim, was killed and several houses were set afire and looted in Zairawn village in November 2024, it said.

New e-Zero FIR to help nab cyber criminals

New Delhi, May 19: The Indian Cybercrime Coordination Centre (I4C), which comes under the Ministry of Home Affairs, introduced the new e-Zero FIR initiative to nab cybercriminals with unprecedented speed, Union Home Minister Amit Shah said Monday.

Started as a pilot project for Delhi, the new system will automatically convert into FIRs cyber financial crimes filed on the National Cybercrime Reporting Portal (NCRP) and helpline number 1930, initially above the threshold limit of ₹10 lakh, he said.

The minister said the process of issuing FIRs electronically, irrespective of territorial jurisdiction, will soon be extended to the entire nation. This initiative will enable

easy restoration of money lost by victims and facilitate punitive action against cyber criminals. It leverages the provisions of the recently introduced criminal laws, an official statement said.

(I4C) introduced the new e-Zero FIR initiative to nab any criminal with unprecedented

ED arrests ex-UCO Bank CMD Goel

New Delhi, May 19: The Enforcement Directorate (ED) Monday said it has arrested former UCO Bank CMD Subodh Kumar Goel on money laundering charges in an alleged bank loan fraud case of more than ₹6,200 crore linked to a Kolkata-based company.

Goel was arrested from his residence here May 16 in the case being probed against Concast Steel and Power Ltd (CSPL) and others.

He was produced before the special Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) court in Kolkata May 17 which sent him to ED custody till May 21, the federal probe agency said in a statement.

The ED had raided the premises of Goel and some others in

Spain cracks down on Airbnb

Madrid: Spain has ordered Airbnb to block more than 65,000 holiday listings on its platform for having violated rules, the **Consumer Rights Ministry** said Monday. The ministry said that many of the 65,935 Airbnb listings it had ordered to be withdrawn did not include their license number or specify whether the owner was an individual or a company. Others listed numbers that didn't match what authorities had. Spain is grappling with a housing affordability crisis that has spurred government action against short-term rental companies. In recent months, tens of thousands of Spaniards have taken to the streets protesting rising housing and rental costs, which many say have been driven up by holiday rentals on platforms like Airbnb that have proliferated in cities like Madrid and Barcelona and many other popular tourist destinations. Last year, Barcelona announced a plan to close down all of the 10,000 apartments licensed in the city as short-term rentals by 2028 to safeguard the housing supply for full-time

new deals London: Britain and the European Union hailed a new chapter in their relationship on Monday after they sealed new agreements on defense cooperation and easing trade flows at their first formal summit since Brexit. Prime Minister Keir Starmer, who met **European Commission** President Ursula von der Leyen and other senior EU officials in London for talks, said the deals will slash red tape, grow the British economy and reset relations with the 27-nation trade bloc since the UK left the EU in 2020. Moscow/ Washington, May 19: US President Donald Trump said Monday that Russia and Ukraine 'will immediately start negotiations' toward a ceasefire and an end to their three-vearold war, speaking after he held a call with Russia's President Vladimir Putin.

"Negotiations between Russia and Ukraine will begin immediately," Trump said in a Truth Social post following his call with Putin, which lasted two hours.

ident of the United States that Russia will propose and is ready to work with the Ukrainian side on a memorandum on a possible future peace accord," Putin told reporters near the Black Sea resort of Sochi. There was no immediate

Belarus to top UN court over migrants

Vilnius, May 19: Lithuania is asking the International Court of Justice to rule that Belarus breached its international obligations by allegedly organising the smuggling of migrants to its territory and award it compen-The Foreign Ministry in Vil-

nius said Lithuania filed its case to the court in The Hague Monday. It revolves around alleged breaches by Belarus of its obligations under the United Nations' Protocol against the Smuggling of Migrants by Land, Sea and Air.

The number of migrants arriving at the borders of European Union member countries from Belarus increased sharply last year, and European authorities have accused Belarus of helping migrants to get across.

In December, the EU gave a green light to Poland and other countries on its eastern flank to temporarily suspend asylum rights when they believe that Belarus and Russia are "weaponising" migrants



Lithuania said evidence it has collected confirms the direct involvement of Belarus in organising migrant flows, in cluding an increase in flights from the Middle East and elsewhere by Belarusian stateowned enterprises.

It alleges that after arriving in Belarus many migrants were escorted to the Lithuanian bor der by Belarusian security forc es and forced to cross it illegal ly. It added that Belarus' border services refused to work with Lithuania to stop illegal crossings. The Lithuanian Foreign Ministry said in a statement that Vilnius is appealing to the ICJ to hold Belarus accountable under international law for violations of the migrant-smug gling protocol.

BIDEN DIAGNOSED WITH AGGRESSIVE **PROSTATE CANCER**

Washington, May 19: Former President Joe Biden has been diagnosed with prostate cancer, his office said Sunday. The finding came after the

82-year-old reported urinary symptoms, which led doctors to discover a nodule on his prostate. He was diagnosed with prostate cancer on Friday, with the cancer cells having spread to the bone. "While this represents a

more aggressive form of the disease, the cancer appears to be hormone-sensitive which allows for effective management, his office said. "The President and his family are reviewing treatment options with his physicians.

In a post on X Monday morning, Biden posted a photo of himself and his wife, Jill Biden, and wrote: "Cancer touches us all. Like so many of you, Jill and I have learned that we are strongest in the broken places. Thank you for lifting us up with love and support."

Prostate cancers are graded for aggressiveness using what's known as a Gleason score. The scores range from 6 to 10, with 8. 9 and 10 prostate cancers behaving more aggressively.

CENTRIST DAN WINS ROMANIAN PRESIDEN

Bucharest, May 19: Romania's European allies and markets welcomed centrist Nicusor Dan's presidential election victory over a eurosceptic hard-right rival Sunday, relieved that the European Union member had avoided a lurch to a Donald Trump-inspired political path.

Dan, a softly-spoken 55-yearold mathematician and Bucharest mayor, won 54% of votes in the country of 19 million. beating George Simion, a vocal Trump admirer whose strong showing in the first round of voting this month had rattled allies and investors. "I told him Romania will

remain a firm ally in NATO," Dan said, adding defence investment was a focus. "At the same time, we are counting on NATO to guarantee Romania's security.

Dan also spoke to French President Emmanuel Macron and neighbouring Moldova's President Maia Sandu, who had called the election result "a step forward for democratic values and our shared European path. Dan had pledged to fight cor-



ruption, maintain support for Ukraine - where Romania has played an important logistical role - and keep the country in the European mainstream.

In contrast, Simion, a 38-year-old nationalist, had been critical of EU leadership and opposed military aid to Ukraine. His strong position before Sunday's run-off caused the collapse of Romania's pro-Western coalition government.

Dan, who must appoint a new prime minister, was due to meet Interim President Ilie Bolojan to discuss the transition and upcoming coalition talks,

European Commission President Ursula von der Leven was one of the first to congratulate

a political source said.

Dan. "The Romanian people have turned out massively to the polls," she said on X. "They have chosen the promise of an open, prosperous Romania in a strong Europe.'

Portugal's far-right Chega surges as ruling party misses majority

LISBON: Portugal's far-right Chega won a record vote share in Sunday's snap election and was vying to become the main opposition party as the ruling centre-right Democratic Alliance (AD) again fell short of a majority needed to end a long period of instability. Prime Minister Luis Montenegro hailed the result as a vote of confidence in his AD which won most seats in parliament. However, with votes from abroad still to be counted, Chega could supplant the centre-left Socialists as leader of the opposition, ending five decades of dominance by the two major parties. "We've done what no other party has ever achieved in Portugal. We can safely declare in front of all the country today that bipartisanship in Portugal is over," Chega leader Andre Ventura told jubilant supporters in Lisbon. "Nothing will be as it was," he said, highlighting the fact that the continued rise of Chega, which he founded just six years ago, proved most opinion polls wrong. Chega gained eight seats for a total of 58 in the 230-seat parliament, winning a record 1.34 million votes, or 22.6%. In the previous vote, it won two out of four seats reserved for overseas voters. Montenegro, whose AD won 89 seats - up nine - and 32.7% of the vote, has refused to make deals with Chega and said he would form a new minority government. Chega, which has allied with Europe's hard-right, anti-immigration parties, such as Marine le Pen's National Rally in France and Germany's AfD, has proposed tougher sentences for criminals, including chemical castration for repeat rapists. It has also called for an end to "open doors" immigration and accused mainstream parties of perpetuating corruption.

Poland set for knife-edge presidential runoff

WARSAW: The centrist and nationalist hopefuls contesting Poland's presidential election runoff began trying to win over the supporters of eliminated candidates Monday, in a major test of the coalition government's pro-European policies. A broad alliance led by Prime Minister Donald Tusk swept to power in 2023 promising to mend ties with the European Union and undo judicial reforms implemented by the previous Law and Justice (PiS) rulers, which the EU said undermined democracy. However, Tusk's agenda has been stymied by the veto powers of the outgoing president, PiS-ally Andrzej Duda. Rafal Trzaskowski, from Tusk's ruling Civic Coalition (KO), narrowly led Karol Nawrocki, the candidate backed by the conservative-nationalist PiS, on Sunday, by 31.4% to 29.5%, a much narrower gap than opinion polls had suggested. But a surge in support for far-right and anti-establishment candidates left the runoff on a knife-edge. An Opinia24 poll for private broadcaster TVN published after the first round gave Trzaskowski 46% in the runoff and Nawrocki 44%, with 10% undecided or refusing to say. The second round takes place on June 1. "We have to talk to everyone, the most important thing is the arguments," Trzaskowski, the mayor of Warsaw, told reporters. "I'm glad that many young people went to the polls, but it's a great challenge to convince them to vote for me." Nawrocki said he would seek support from both left and right. "My social agenda and the fact that I will be the guardian of the social achievements of the Law and Justice government and Solidarity (trade union) make it an offering for left-wing, socially sensitive circles too," he said. The far right achieved its best result ever. Slawomir Mentzen of the Confederation party and Grzegorz Braun, who in 2023 caused international outrage by using a fire extinguisher to put out Hanukkah candles in parliament, together scored over 21%.

Debt markets also contributed positively through MTM gains, supported by favourable yield movements," according to the Association of Mutual Funds in India's (AMFI) annual report released Monday. Also, the increase in AUM

was attributed to net inflows summing up to ₹8.15 lakh crore during fiscal 2025. The sharp surge in asset base was also reflected in the growing numbers of investors, mutual funds, with the number of folios reaching an all-time high of 23.45 crore and an investor



base of about 5.67 crore.

A notable trend in the fiscal was a 33.4 per cent year-onyear increase in folios of equity-oriented schemes to 16.38 crore. The scheme continued to constitute a lion's share of the folios at 70 per cent.

Also, the folios of hybrid schemes increased by 16 per cent to 1.56 crore, while other schemes, including index funds and exchange-traded funds (ETFs), surged 48.3 per cent to 4.15 crore folios. In contrast, debt-oriented scheme folios declined 3 per cent to 69.5 lakh.

The systematic investment plans (SIPs) were popular among investors as flows into this segment rose sharply, with

Supreme Court rejects Vi plea for debt waivers



New Delhi, May 19: India's Vodafone Idea had its petition to waive more than \$5 billion in debt it owes to the government rejected by the Apex Court Monday, dealing a major setback to the telecoms giant.

The company has struggled to pay outstanding spectrum and revenue-sharing dues since a landmark 2019 Supreme Court order widened the scope of revenues on which the payments are assessed.

The court also dismissed a similar petition from larger rival Bharti Airtel, but the rejection will have more of an impact on Vodafone Idea, India's third-biggest telecoms carrier with an estimated net debt of \$25 billion as of September. 'We believe... very firmly,

these are misconceived writ petitions," the court said, dismissing the requests.

Vi approached the court after the government rejected its request for a waiver on interest and penalties it owes on \$9.76 billion in dues, which the company said was putting its survival at risk.

Mumbai, May 19: The rupee appreciated 15 paise to settle at 85.42 against the US dollar Monday, on weak US dollar index and a decline in crude oil prices. Forex traders said global investors were also cautious as global rating agency Moody's downgraded US investment grade rating, leading to a fall in dollar index.

At the interbank foreign exchange, the domestic unit opened at 85.43 and moved between the intra-day high of 85.35 and the low of 85.61 against the greenback. The unit ended the session at 85.42, registering a gain of 15 paise over its previ-

ous closing level. Last week, the rupee pared its gains and settled 3 paise lower at 85.57 against the dollar.

"We expect the rupee to trade with a positive bias amid persistent weakness in US dollar index and a weak tone in global crude oil prices." Anui Choudhary - Research Analyst at Mirae Asset Sharekhan said, adding weak domestic equities capped a sharp upside.

'USD-INR spot price is expected to trade in a range of 85.10 to 85.65," he noted. Meanwhile, the dollar index, which gauges the greenback's strength against a basket of six currencies, was trading lower by 0.86 per cent at 100.22. US dollar weakened as Moody's downgraded US credit rating to AA1 from AAA. Economic data from the US released Friday too disappointed the markets, Choudhary said.

BCCI dismisses reports of withdrawal from Asia Cup

New Delhi, May 19: The BC-CI Monday termed as "speculative and imaginary" the report which claimed that it has decided to pull out of men's Asia Cup and women's Emerging Teams

A media report, quoting sources, said that BCCI won't let Indian teams compete in the two Asian Cricket Council (ACC) events at a time when the cricket body is being headed by a Pakistani and just days back the two neighbouring nations were involved in a military conflict.

Pakistan's interior minister Mohsin Naqvi, who is also PCB Chairman, holds the position of President in the ACC.

Defending champions India are the hosts for the Men's Asia Cup, to be played in the T20 format, in September while Sri Lanka have been allotted the Women's Emerging Teams Asia Cup.

"Since this morning, it has come to our notice about some news items about BCCI's decision not to participate in the Asia Cup and Women's Emerging Teams Asia Cup, both ACC events. Such news is devoid of any truth as till now, the BCCI

has not even discussed or taken any such steps regarding the ensuing ACC events, leave alone writing anything to the ACC," BCCI secretary Devajit Saikia to PTI.

In the women's section, players from India, Netherlands, Argentina, Belgium, China, Australia, Germany, Spain, United Kingdom, New Zealand, Ireland, Chile, Japan, USA and Scotland are eligible for registration.

The registration process for 2026 HIL will conclude August 20. "Building on the success of the 2024-25 revival season, which featured eight men's and four women's franchises, the upcoming edition promises to be even bigger," said a Hockey India release.

Scheffler pulls away late for runaway PGA C'ship victory

Largest margin of victory in PGA Championship since 2012

Charlotte, May 19: Scottie Scheffler was put to the test at the PGA Championship Sunday but stood tall in the face of adversity as he corrected swing issues in time to hold off a spirited effort by Spaniard Jon Rahm for a runaway victory and third career major title.

Scheffler began the day with a seemingly comfortable three-shot lead but what many felt was an inevitable victory turned into a back-nine tussle as the world number one golfer struggled off the tee early and Rahm mounted a charge.

But like a true champion, the unflappable Scheffler did not panic and found his stride on the homeward stretch while Rahm, playing two groups ahead, endured a stunning collapse that robbed the final holes

of any drama Scheffler made two key birdies midway through the back nine to regain control just as Rahm was falling apart and went on to card an even-par 71 that left him at 11 under on the week at the year's second



His five-stroke win is the largest at the PGA Championship since Rory McIlroy won by eight in 2012.

Ryder Cup hopeful Harris English, who began his day 11 shots adrift, shot a 65 that was the low round of the day and finished in a distant share of second place alongside fellow Americans Bryson DeChambeau (70) and Davis Riley (72).

Rahm, who began the day five shots back of the lead and playing two groups ahead of Scheffler, took a while to get going in the final round but found his groove right in time to set up some back-nine drama at Quail Hollow Club.

Lineker to step down from BBC after sharing post on Zionism

London, May 19: Gary Lineker, the England soccer great-turned-media celebrity, will leave his role as a presenter for the BBC after facing criticism for reposting an Instagram story about Zionism which featured a picture of a rat.

The 64-year-old Lineker, who is the British national broadcaster's highest-paid presenter on about 1.3 million pounds (\$1.7 million) a year, was set to leave flagship soccer highlights show "Match of the Day" at the end of this season but remain with the BBC to front other soccer coverage, including next

year's men's World Cup. However, the BBC said Monday in a statement that Lineker will step down entirely from the corporation after the final "Match of the Day" episode next weekend in the wake of his decision to

share a post from the group, Pal-

estine Lobby, illustrated with a

picture of a rat, titled: "Zionism

explained in two minutes." Rats, linked to disease and dirt, have been used to represent Jews in antisemitic propaganda throughout history, including by the Nazis in 1930s Germany.

"Football has been at the heart of my life for as long as I can remember — both on the pitch and in the studio. Lineker said in the BBC state ment. "I care deeply about the game, and about the work I've done with the BBC over many years. As I've said, I would never consciously repost anything antisemitic — it goes against everything I stand for. "Howev er, I recognize the error and upset that I caused, and reiterate how sorry I am. Stepping back now feels like the responsible course of action.'
