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CM unveils, lays stones for ₹1.15L-crore projects

Jajpur, May 22: Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Thursday inaugurated and laid foundation stones for 24 industrial projects in this district with a total investment of ₹1.15 lakh crore which are expected to generate employment opportunities for 36,000 people.

Taking part at a function here, the CM inaugurated four projects, including Tata Steel Limited's 5 MTPA Integrated Steel Plant expansion at Kalinga Nagar industrial hub with an investment of ₹47,599 crore. The project is expected to create 4,625 jobs.

Other projects the CM inaugurated are: JSL Group's petroleum and solar power venture (Rs 470 crore), Jatia Steel Limited's 0.75 MTPA TMT Rebar-cum-Wire Rod Mill (Rs 220 crore) and Abis Exports India Private Limited's poultry feed plant (Rs 161.57 crore).

Majhi also laid the foundation stones for 20 industrial projects. Among them is Neelachal Ispat Nigam Limited's 8.52 MTPA

steel plant expansion at an investment of ₹61,769 crore. This unit is poised to become one of the largest steel manufacturing facilities in the region and is expected to create 14,000 direct jobs, an official said.

"Together, these 24 projects will not only bring foreign capital and cutting-edge technology to Odisha, but also serve as a catalyst for job creation, MSME collaboration, and downstream industrial growth in the region," an official said, adding that the state is emerging as a trusted destination for both domestic and international in-

Addressing the gathering, Majhi said, "Today, Odisha stands at a historic turning point. With the inauguration and groundbreaking of industrial projects worth ₹1.15 lakh crore in Jajpur, we are not merely laying foundation stones, we are building the future. Now, 36,000 employment opportunities are being created, ensuring that our youth can grow with pride in their own

The Enforcement Directorate (ED) once again came under the scanner of the Supreme Court which called out the excessive methods applied by the agency in making out cases under PM-LA. "Your ED is crossing all limits," a top court bench of Chief Justice BR Gavai and Justice Augustine George Masih told Additional Solicitor General SV Raju while ordering a stay on the money laundering probe against Tamil Nadu-run liquor retailer TASMAC over alleged corruption in grant of wine shop licences. The CJI also questioned the ED raids over a state government body by saying that the agency is violating the federal concept of governance. The ED has been rapped by several benches of the SC on multiple occasions in the past for allegedly misusing the provisions of PM-LA. Opposition parties, too, have protested against the alleged abuse of PMLA provisions by the Central agency against the government's political opponents.

New Delhi/Chennai, May 22: The Supreme Court Thursday rapped the Enforcement Directorate (ED) and stayed its money laundering probe against Tamil Nadu's state-run liquor retailer TASMAC over alleged corruption in grant of

the Central agency is 'crossing all limits' and violating the

federal concept of governance. 'Your ED is crossing all limits," a bench comprising Chief Justice BR Gavai and Justice Augustine George Masih told Additional Solicitor General SV Raju, appearing for the ED, while issuing notice to the anti-money laundering probe agency on a plea filed by the Tamil Nadu government and Tamil Nadu State Marketing Corporation (TASMAC). Tamil Nadu's ruling DMK welcomed the SC order, saving the stay is a 'big blow' to alleged efforts by the BJP to malign the party-led government in the state and that the ED was

a 'blackmailing organisation'. This is not the first time that the ED has come under fire from the SC. The ED has previously been pulled up by several benches of the SC for allegedly misusing the provisions of the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA). Opposition parties have also protested against the alleged abuse of PMLA provisions by the ED against the gov-

ernment's political opponents. Questioning the ED raids over TASMAC, CJI Gavai said. "The Enforcement Directorate is violating the federal concept (of governance)." The CJI-led bench took note of the submissions of senior advocates Kapil Sibal and Amit Anand



Tiwari, appearing for the state government and the TASMAC, and stayed ED's probe against TASMAC in the meantime.

Raju opposed the order, saying the issue involved corruption of over ₹1,000 crore and the ED is not crossing limits 'at least in this case'. Sibal said that it is the state and the TASMAC which have launched criminal prosecution into alleged illegalities in granting liquor shop licenses. He said as many as 41 FIRs were lodged against purported wrongdoers in cases related to the allotment of liquor shop licences from 2014 and now the ED jumps in the picture and raids the TASMAC

"How can you raid the staterun TASMAC?" the CJI asked.

The DMK government and TASMAC moved the SC against the raids conducted by the ED on the premises of the liquor retailer. The petition challenged an April 23 order of the Madras High Court that upheld the ED's actions, alleging grave violations of constitutional rights

and the federal structure.

"The present petition raises questions of law having wide ramifications including the issue of federalism laid bare by the respondent 1 (ED) exceed ing its remit and attempting to usurp the State's right to investigate offences occurring therein," the state government said.

The plea challenged the legality of the ED's 60-hour search and seizure operation conducted between March 6 and 8, 2025.

"On March 6, respondent 1 (ED) conducted a search and seizure proceeding under Section 17 of the PMLA at the headquarters of respondent 2 (TASMAC) which is a 100% owned instrumentality of the petitioner/state," it said. TASMAC itself is not named as an accused in any of these FIRs and, in several cases, is the complainant, the plea added.

In the absence of any predicate offence involving TASMAC as an accused, the ED had no jurisdiction to initiate proceedings under the PMLA, it said The petitioner also questioned the timing of the search, pointing out the delay in action as the last FIR was registered in 2021.

The ED's actions amounted to a 'roving and fishing enquiry', rather than a targeted investigation, and that the agency failed to demonstrate the mandatory 'reasons to believe' required under Section 17 of PMLA, it was submitted.

ED crossing all limits: SC STATE GOVT PLANS TO BUY SC, ST LAND

Bhubaneswar, May 22: The state government is planning to purchase land directly from people belonging to SC and ST communities to prevent them from being exploited during financial emergencies, Revenue and Disaster Management (R&DM) Minister Suresh Pujari said Thursday.

Pujari said a corpus fund would be created to facilitate

these land purchases and protect marginalised communities from being forced to sell their properties at throwaway prices to wealthy individuals, middlemen, or influential groups.

"SC and ST individuals often face administrative hurdles when they need to sell their land in times of need, despite existing legal protections," the minister said, adding, "Because of these barriers, regular buyers hesitate, leaving room for affluent and powerful groups to

exploit the situation.' To ensure fair land transactions and prevent distress sales, the government intends to step in as a buyer. "This move will not only protect vulnerable landowners from exploitation but will also allow them the opportunity to reclaim their land

in future," Pujari said. He said that a high-level committee has already been formed under the chairmanship of the Additional Chief Secretary of R&DM department. The committee will study the issue and submit its report. Additionally, feedback will be gathered from SC and ST organisations, political parties, the House Committee on SC/ST Development, and legislators.

2 Israeli Embassy staffers shot dead in US

Washington, May 22: Two staff members of the Israeli Embassy in Washington were shot and killed Wednesday evening while leaving an event at a Jewish museum, and the suspect yelled, "Free, free Palestine" after he was arrested, police said.

Israeli Foreign Minister Gideon Saar identified the victims as Yaron Lischinsky and Sarah Milgrim. Lischinsky was a research assistant, and Milgrim organised visits and missions to Israel. They were leaving an event at the Capital Jewish Museum when the suspect approached a group of four people and opened fire, Metropolitan Police Chief Pamela Smith said at a news conference. The suspect, identified as Elias Rodriguez, 30, of Chicago, was observed pacing outside the museum before the shooting, walked into the museum after

the shooting and was detained by event security, Smith said.

When he was taken into custody, the suspect began chanting, "Free, free Palestine," Smith said. She said law enforcement did not believe there was an ongoing threat to the community. The stunning attack prompted Israeli missions to step up their security. The shooting comes as Israel has launched another maior offensive in the Gaza Strip in a war with Hamas that has heightened tensions across the Middle East and internationally. "These horrible DC killings, based obviously on antisemitism, must end, NOW!" President Donald Trump posted on social media early Thursday. "Hatred and Radicalism have no place in the USA.

Israeli PM Benjamin Netanyahu's office said Thursday that he was 'shocked' by the 'horrific, antisemitic' shooting.

Washington, May 22: For world leaders an invitation to the Oval Office used to be a coveted prize. Under Donald Trump it's become a ticket to a

brutal political ambush. South African President Cyril Ramaphosa became the latest victim in a long line that started with Trump's notorious row with Ukraine's Volodymyr

Zelenskyy in February. Trump has turned what were staid diplomatic 'photo sprays' under his predecessor Joe Biden into punishing, hour-long tests of nerve in the heart of the US presidency, played out on live television. The sight has become all too familiar - a world leader perched nervously on the edge of their gold-upholstered chair in front of the famed fireplace, waiting to see what happens.

Will the 78-year-old Republican lay on the charm? Will he show off the new gold-plated decor he has been proudly installing in the Oval? Will he challenge his guest on tariffs or trade or US military assistance?

Or will he simply tear into them? Nobody knows before they get there. All they know is that when the cameras are allowed into the most exclusive room in the White House, they will be treading the most perilous of political tightropes.

And the hot, confined space of the Oval Office adds to the pressure-cooker environment as the unpredictable billionaire seeks to wrongfoot his guests and gain the upper hand. Trump set the benchmark when he hosted

Zelenskyy February 28 Tensions over Trump's



sudden pivot towards Russia spilled into the open as a redfaced US president berated the Ukrainian leader and accused him of being ungrateful for US military aid against Russia.

Many wondered if it was a deliberate ambush -- especially as Vice President JD Vance appeared to step in to trigger the row. Whether or not it was on purpose, the goal in foreign capitals ever since has been to 'avoid a Zelenskyy'. But Ramaphosa's visit to the Oval Wednesday was the closest vet to a repeat -- and this time it was clearly planned.

Ramaphosa arrived with top

Els and Retief Goosen in tow hoping to take the edge off the golf-mad Trump's unfounded claims of a 'genocide' against white South African farmers. But his face was a picture of bemusement when after a ques

South African golfers Ernie

tion on the issue, Trump suddenly said to aides and said, "Turn the lights down, and just put this on." A video of South African pol iticians chanting 'kill the farmer began to play on a screen set up at the side of the room. A stunned Ramaphosa looked at the screen, then at Trump, and then back at the screen. Yet unlike Zelenskyy who argued back with an increas ingly enraged Trump, the South African president largely stayed calm as he argued his case. Nor was he asked to leave the White House as Zelenskyy was, causing the Ukrainian to miss lunch.





CM lays stones for ₹231cr FDI projects in Jajpur dist

Bhubaneswar, May 22: The state government's renewed focus on attracting foreign direct investment (FDI) seems to have paid off with Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Thursday conducting the groundbreaking ceremonies for FDI projects worth over ₹231 crore in Jajpur district.

While the CM inaugurated and laid foundation stones for projects worth ₹1.15 lakh crore in Jajpur, some investments from Germany, Japan, the UK, and the US were part of the groundbreaking ceremonies.

According to an official statement, TYK Ceramics India Pvt Ltd, a Japanese firm, will invest ₹57 crore to manufacture advanced refractory products for steelmaking, bolstering local production and technology.

Similarly, Almamet India Private Limited, a German multinational, is investing ₹50.6 crore to establish a unit for magnesium granules and calcium carbide, contributing to the state's speciality chemical sector, it said.

The statement also said Neo Industries Metal Processing Pvt Ltd from the US will pump in ₹72 crore in chrome plating and steel surface finishing, improving steel quality and enhancing

Majhi also laid the foundation stone of Odisha-origin IMFA's expansion plant at Kalinga Nagar.

The facility will produce 1,00,000 tonne ferrochrome annually. The first phase is expected to be completed by the first quarter of the 2026-27 fiscal, and the plant will feature cutting-edge technology, a company official said.

The plant will complement its integrated sites at Choudwar and Therubali-enhancing its total production capacity to 3,84,000 tonnes and reinforcing its position as India's leading producer of value-added ferro chrome, IMFA Managing Director Subhrakant



Odisha leads in conservation of Olive Ridley turtles

Bhubaneswar, May 22: As the people across the globe celebrate the 'World Turtle Day' today, the remarkable conservation of the endangered Olive Ridley turtles by Odisha has set a benchmark for wild-life protection and preservation

In fact, Odisha has secured a key place for turtle conservation, especially in playing host to one of the world's largest mass nesting events, called 'Arribadas', for the sea giants at the state's coastal stretches of Gahirmatha as well as Rushikulya, and Devi River mouth

In 2025, Odisha recorded unprecedented nesting figures, reflecting the success of ongoing conservation efforts. At

Gahirmatha Marine Sanctuary, 6.6 lakh Olive Ridley turtles arrived for mass nesting. Similarly, the Rushikulya rookery in Ganjam witnessed a historic turnout with nearly seven lakh turtles nesting. A second phase of mass nesting at Rushikulya River mouth added over two lakh more mass nesting. Rahul M Suresh, a research-

er at Dakshin foundation. which is dedicated to promote and conserve India's coastal, marine, and mountain ecosystems, said, "There are three places in the world where Olive Ridlevs display mass nesting phenomenon - Ostional beach on the Nicoya Peninsula, and Nancite beach in Santa Rosa National Park (both in Costa Rica), and Odisha's coast (Gahirmatha, Rushikulya and at Devi River mouth).

Suresh said what draws the Olive Ridleys towards Odisha beaches is the favourable nesting conditions. "These turtles prefer fresh sandy beaches. The

dynamic beaches at Rushikulya River mouth provide a preferable condition to lay eggs," he said.

Climate expert Ranjan Pan-

da, also known as Odisha's water man, emphasied individual responsibility in turtle conservation efforts. "We must keep our beaches clean and avoid overcrowding these sensitive zones in the name of tourism," he said. Panda also urged immediate action to reduce ocean pollution that poses a threat to marine ecosystems.

Environmentalist Sovakar Behera, former honorary wildlife warden of Puri, raised concerns about Devi River mouth where mass nesting has drastically declined since 1997. He attributed the phenomenon to trawler activity, coastal disturbances following the 1999 super cyclone, and increasing pollution from shrimp farming and artificial lighting.

Every year May 23, the World Turtle Day is celebrated to raise awareness about the conserva tion of turtles and tortoises. and the threats they face. The initiative was first launched in 2000 by the American Tortoise Rescue (ATR), a non-profit dedicated to their rescue and protection.

This year's theme, 'Dancing Turtles Rock,' encourages people to celebrate turtles through creative expressions such as art, dance, and social media outreach, reinforcing the message of conservation with a joyful spirit.

As Odisha continues to make headlines for its conservation efforts, World Turtle Day serves as a timely reminder of the shared responsibility to protect these ancient mariners and their fragile habitats for today and future generations. conservationists said.

amphibians. It is also home to endangered species such as the Olive Ridley turtle and the Irrawaddy dolphin.

Congress stages 24-hour dharna

Das told reporters here. The Congress 'Satyagraha' on the SEBC reservation came a day after Opposition BJD staged a protest rally near Raj Bhavan over a similar demand Wednesday.

DEMAND FOR 27% SEBC RESERVATION



Both the parties hit the streets after the state's BJP government last week announced its decision to provide 11.25 per cent quota for SEBC students in the higher education system. However, there was no provision of reservation for SEBC students in medical, engineering and other technical courses as it has been done for ST and SC students.

Both the parties demanded that SEBC students must get

27 per cent reservation in education including technical education and jobs.


However, the ruling BJP said that the state government will soon make provision for reservation for SEBC students in medical and engineering courses. BJP state president Manmohan Samal said his party introduced the quota for the SEBC students within 11 months of forming the government while the BJD 'failed' to from 2000 to 2024.

The OPCC president said that the Congress' five-point charter of demands include 27 per cent reservation for SEBC students in government jobs, quota provision for them in technical education including medical and engineering courses, reservation should also be implemented immediately in Panchayati Raj elections and in the private sector.

Das said his party also demands strengthening of the SC, ST Development Finance Cooperative Corporation Limited. The government should keep ₹5,000 crore in the Corporation so that the SEBC people can take credit and do business,' he said, adding that the population ratio of SEBC in Odisha was above 50 per cent.

Meanwhile, Opposition Chief Whip in Odisha Assembly Pramila Mallik of BJD said that her party would continue to demand 27 per cent reservation for SEBC. "In fact, we are of the opinion that the reservation should be in proportion to the population ratio," she said.

Poachers' electric snares put lives at risk Special drive: Police nab 12

Nayagarh, May 22: Live wires laid by poachers along the forest trails in Ranpur range under Khurda forest division as well as Nayagarh forest division and Mahanadi wildlife division to hunt wild animals have become a growing cause of concern for local residents

Reports indicate that over the past eight years, three people, one elephant, and more than 1.500 wild boars have died in these areas after coming in contact with illegal live wires.

Although the live wires are primarily intended for hunting wild boars that destroy farmlands, they are also leading to unintended deaths of other wildlife, including elephants. Despite the recurring nature of this issue across several forested areas of Navagarh district. little action has been taken to curb the practice.

Reports said poaching activities are on a rise in forests across Nayagarh, driven partly by an expanding boar population, bamboo thickets and declining food availability for the animals. As wildlife venture closer to villages and towns in search of food, poachers are exploiting the opportunity by setting up live wires near farmlands to target them.

These traps, typically made using live electric wires drawn

transmission line to pick up the carcass of the wild animals. The poachers often wait

nearby for the kill. As a result, areas where such electric traps are laid remain without power especially at night. In many villages, power is restored only after the poachers remove the illegal connections.

This issue is particularly prevalent in the forested areas of Kotapokhari, Gadiashahi, Singhapada, Kiajhara and Khalisahi panchayats under the Khandapada block. Owing to frequent laying of live wires for poaching, these villages plunge into darkness during night time.

When contacted, Divisional Forest Officer Kshyama Sarangi said action is taken whenever complaints are received about electric snares in the forest. She confirmed that steps have also been taken after the death of elephants. The Forest department is also conducting awareness campaigns to prevent the laying of live wires for poaching, she added.

6 firearms seized; suspected Bihar link under probe

Berhampur, May 22: In a major crackdown on organised crime, police arrested 12 suspects and seized a cache of weapons including six firearms in Berhampur amid suspicion over their link to arms factories in Bihar's Munger district.

Rayagada, May 22: The Vigilance department Thursday arrested four government officials for allegedly embezzling public money over ₹20 lakh.

On the allegations of misappropriation of government funds without excavation of farm ponds under MGNREGA in Kashipur block of Rayagada district, the Vigilance department conducted an investigation and found that the four were involved in financial irregularities, said an official. Women As Peacemakers


espite all the progress that has been made toward gender equality globally, many are still tempted to view armed conflict as primarily the domain of men. In fact, women often prove decisive in such settings, including in combat, non-combat, and leadership roles. Nonetheless, they are routinely sidelined in formal peace processes and post-conflict governance. This pattern reflects a moral

During armed conflicts, women become more vulnerable to genocide, trafficking, slavery, and sexual violence, with all the associated health risks and psychological trauma. This alone earns them the right to participate in peace processes. But women are not only passive victims of conflict: as we have seen in Ukraine, they make profound wartime contributions on the battlefield, as well as in civil society and as peace advocates.

In this sense, women often increase their agency during times of conflict, despite the risks they face. But when they are then excluded from peace negotiations and what follows - as is the case, so far, in Ukraine – these agency gains are reversed, with outdated gender norms reasserting themselves. This is especially true in conflict-affected countries with more entrenched patriarchal structures.

Legal frameworks promoting women's inclusion in conflict reso-

lution, peace-building, and post-conflict reconstruction have so far failed to turn the tide, owing partly to implementation and operational challenges. For example, United Nations Security Council Resolution 1325, adopted in 2000, "urges all actors" to increase women's participation and "incorporate gender perspectives in all UN peace and security efforts." But, as of 2018, the number of women signing peace agreements had not significantly increased.



None of the peace agreements we studied had a particularly high gender bias index, but even those that used more gendered language - which reflected a somewhat positive bias toward women - were not necessarily associated with significant improvements

in women's agency. In other words, even frameworks that were gender-sensitive (acknowledging gender inequality) did not bring about meaningful change.

The problem is that the mentions of gender were not accompanied by concrete requirements, let alone monitoring and enforcement mechanisms. For example, a peace agreement might advocate for increased women's political participation, but include no targets to be met, and thus produce few, if any, results. This approach can even harm gender equality, by giving the impression that action is being taken when it is not.

Other studies show that peace agreements with disarmament, demobilization, and reintegration (DDR) components rarely mention women. This compromises the post-conflict rehabilitation of women combatants, who might be excluded from the kinds of interventions aimed at their male counterparts.

Evidence shows that including women in conflict-resolution and peace-building processes leads to better outcomes for everyone. As a 2018 analysis found, there is a "robust correlation" between the inclusion of female delegates as signatories of peace agreements and the durability of the ensuing peace. Moreover, agreements signed by women tend to include significantly more provisions focused on political reform, and boast higher implementation rates for such provisions.

In El Salvador, the 1992 agreement that ended the country's 12-year civil war extended DDR benefits to women fighters, and included non-combatant female members of the opposition movement in reintegration programmes. Women went on to play a stabilising role in reintegration processes and to make major contributions to reconstruction efforts. The communities that received more consistent, systematic support through reintegration and reconstruction programmes made greater progress on gender equality and, ultimately, on development. Similarly, in Liberia, women were involved in negotiations to end

more than a decade of civil war in the early 2000s. Female representation in politics subsequently increased significantly, with Ellen Johnson Sirleaf in 2005 becoming the first female elected head of

The message is clear: women must be included in all dimensions of any peace process, from designing, negotiating, and signing agreements to implementing post-conflict stabilisation and reconstruction plans. They also must have access to all relevant benefit programmes, such as those related to DDR, as well as initiatives to address gender-specific needs.

More broadly, peace processes must clearly recognise and directly promote women's agency. This does not mean paying lip service to women's needs and contributions, while relying on ambiguous language to minimise accountability. Rather, supporting women's agency in making peace and forging the post-conflict future demands concrete, enforceable measures to uphold women's rights and expand their participation in all forms of decision-making.

broadcast a contentious video blog, "My Name is Rahim Khan" to reflect upon what it meant to be an Indian Muslim in the age of Hindutva political dominance. I was instantly targeted by the Hindu Right ecosystem which accused me of falsely portraying Muslim 'victimhood' to escape confronting the real problem of rising Islamic extremism. On hindsight, maybe I got the blog name wrong: I should have titled the video blog, "My Name is Ali Khan Mahmudabad."

The recent arrest of the Ashoka University professor of political science for an opinionated Facebook post reveals all that is horribly wrong with a political establishment that has pushed the Indian Muslim to the wall. Ali Khan Mahmudabad's 'crime' was that he had chosen to express himself on Operation Sindoor by questioning what he saw as the hypocrisy of the Right wing commentariat in celebrating the presence of Colonel Sophia Qureishi in the government's media outreach on the Indo-Pak conflict. "I am very happy to see so many right wing commentators applauding Colonel Qureishi but perhaps they could also equally loudly demand that the victims of mob lynchings, arbitrary bulldozing and others who are victims of the BJP's hate-mongering be protected as Indian citizens. The optics of two women soldiers presenting their findings is important but optics must translate to reality on the ground otherwise it's just hypocrisy.

Khan was effectively drawing a distinction between Colonel Qureishi as a token symbol of 'secularism' and the ground reality of growing discrimination against Indian Muslims. It was a sharp personal critique of the Modi government but could it be perceived as an 'act endangering the sovereignty,

unity and integrity of India' or indeed, 'word, gesture or act intended to insult modesty of a woman'? Since when did criticism of government, however provocative, become 'criminalised' to the point where it attracts immediate arrest merely on a complaint by a village sarpanch who is a BJP Yuva Morcha worker, or indeed a notice sent by the Haryana State Women's Commission?

When asked in a television interview to show how exactly Khan had 'insulted the modesty of a woman', Haryana Women's Commission chief Renu Bhatia was clueless. struggling to offer a coherent explanation for any offending line. It was obvious that the Commission, like many a 'sarkari' institution, had simply jumped the gun under 'official' instructions to send off a notice to the professor. Aided by a complicit and ham-handed Delhi police, there was clearly no attempt to follow due process or even a pretense at protecting an individual's right to life and liberty

The case raises several troubling questions. The first is the brazen abuse of power to curb free speech. This is not an isolated case. Almost every government, be it at state or Centre across parties, uses

its executive authority and total control over the police to muzzle dissenting voices. Recall how Marathi actor Ketaki Chitale faced arrest in 2022 for allegedly sharing a derogatory post about Sharad Pawar on social media. Or how the DMK government in Tamil Nadu was silent when Savukku Shankar, a YouTuber and vocal critic of the ruling party was targeted when a 'group' dumped sewage and excreta in his home. Or how a Kolkata professor was charged with forwarding a Mamata Banerjee cartoon and eventually discharged only eleven years after his arrest. In a sense, the Indian political system has embraced the dictum of the infamous Ugandan dictator Idi Amin who was once quoted as saying, "there is freedom of speech but I cannot guarantee freedom after speech.'

Sadly, most state governments have only taken a cue from the Centre where sedition laws in particular have been 'weaponised'. But not only is the law being 'weaponised' to curb free speech, its application is wholly selective. Which raises the second urgent concern. Who comes under the purview of the law is dependent entirely on the whims and fancies of the power elite. Just contrast the

Shah, a Madhya Pradesh minister, who made the most disparaging, sexist and communally loaded remarks against Colonel Qureishi. Instead of sacking the minister or at the very least publicly upbraiding him, the BJP leadership in MP rallied around their colleague, the Centre was conspicuously silent while the minister gave a token apology. It required the high court to insist that a suo motu FIR be filed against the minister and for the Supreme Court to describe his remarks as a 'national shame' And while a court-appointed SIT has been formed to 'investigate' the minister's remarks, the MP police didn't swoop in to arrest the minister as was the case in Delhi with Khan.

Which is why there is a third and more pressing issue that underlies the Khan case. A professor with a doctoral degree from Cambridge University and impeccable academic credentials, Khan has one red mark on his CV: he is an Indian Muslim who is unafraid to speak his mind. That he comes from the erstwhile Mahmudabad royal family and his grandfather Mohammed Aamir Ahmad Khan was a key figure in the pre-Partition Muslim League makes him the perfect 'enemy' figure for a Hindutva-driven ecosystem whose prime objective it to 'demonise' the Indian Muslim as 'unpatriotic', pro-Pakistani and of questionable character.

Post-script: The Supreme Court while granting interim bail to Khan has appointed the SIT to look into his Facebook posts. Just what the SIT can 'investigate' is unclear. What is clear is that we seem to have a number of unemployed cops and a judicial system where the process is the punishment.

he global trade scenario is complex and the situation is unlikely to improve shortly. With the US imposing tariff barriers, it is unclear which countries stand to lose and what will be India's position. India reached a favourable free-trade agreement with the UK which has been hailed by business and industry groups as it is expected to facilitate trade, boost jobs and growth for both economies. Analysts are of the opinion that such a treaty augurs well at a time when Indo-US trade agreement is under negotiations to substantially reduce tariffs.

After the successful trade deal with the UK, India has also firmed up an economic partnership agreement with Chile to build upon the preferential pact that was signed several years ago. The new deal will cover a broader set of sectors, including digital services, investment promotion and cooperation, MSME and critical minerals. Meanwhile, negotiations with New Zealand have already started and are expected to be finalised shortly. Additionally, the one with EU, which has been in the pipeline for nearly two years, is also expected to move faster, especially after Union Commerce Minister's Piyush Goyal parleys with Marcos Sefcovic, the EU Commissioner for trade and commerce earlier this month.

India which has a trade surplus with the US must face a big challenge given its dependency on Washington. Though the spectrum of India's trade has been widening, it has not been successful in penetrating the global market due to lack of proper technology and efficiency in manufacturing. Some sectors such as handloom textiles and hand-knitted carpets endured on the strength of tradition, skill and labour intensity. But many others struggle against efficient and cost-competitive imports.

Though the license permit raj has been abolished, there's corruption in getting clearances from the government. India has the capability to benefit from the changed trade scenario, but substantial measures are needed to make this effective. Challenging China at this juncture is obviously not possible but India may try to come near it through technological collaborations with Western companies.

According to the World

Bank, India's exports of goods and services as a percentage of GDP stood at 21.9% in 2023 as compared to 13% in 2000. The enhancement of the export sector improves foreign exchange reserves, stabilizes the national currency and aids the financial health of the country. Achieving a target of \$2 trillion in exports holds great significance for India in terms of the social and economic aspect.

India's manufacturing sector growth has remained stagnant at 15% of GDP over the years, which should have improved with new policies and incentives of the government. However, it is interesting to note that almost 30% firms plan to invest in upgradation. supporting the robust increase in capital spending for the year despite challenges such as weak demand, geopolitical tensions and high borrowing costs, as per a survey of private sector capital expenditure released by the statistics ministry. The slightly lower capex for 2025-26 at Rs 4.9 lakh crore, though still above 2023-24 levels of Rs 4.2 lakh crore reflects cautious planning after a strong 2024-25 when the intended capital expenditure was estimated at Rs 6.8 lakh crore.

There should be sharp focus on gearing up manufacturing, facilitating proper infrastructure development and ensuring supply of high-skilled per sonnel so as to make products competitive and at the same time cost-effective. Another issue relates to the poor R&D spending by the private sector which is imperative to improve quality of products.

India should also focus on labour-intensive items that have a good market in the West. In this connection. Indian artisans need to be trained to improve the quality of their products.

Meanwhile, the destruction of the liberal international order doesn't presage multi-polarity but rather consolidates the bipolarity that will subsist amid increasing entropy in global politics. The recent Washington-Beijing accord demonstrates that pressure tactics helped China to reduce tariffs as also its capability and expertise in the technological realm.

Analysts have rightly pointed out that India should focus on national interest in finalising the deal with the US, or for that matter any other country or even the EU.

Shifting trade dynamics

Sir, India's recent imposition of trade restrictions targeting goods from Bangladesh—particularly through its northeastern land ports—has triggered significant economic concern, notably for Bangladesh's export-driven garment sector. The move came in the wake of comments by Bangladesh's interim chief advisor, Muhammad Yunus, who referred to India's northeastern states as "landlocked"—a remark New Delhi viewed as undermining regional connectivity efforts. These restrictions impact around \$770 million worth of bilateral imports, or nearly 42% of total trade volume, compelling Bangladeshi exports to be rerouted through Kolkata and Nhava Sheva ports. This diversion has not only disrupted established supply chains but also driven up logistics costs, disproportionately affecting small- and medium-sized enterprises. The ready-made garment (RMG) industry, a cornerstone of Bangladesh's economy with \$618 million in annual exports to India, is particularly exposed. The added transportation costs threaten the sector's global competitiveness, potentially resulting in job losses and reduced margins. The International Labour Organization has cautioned that the disruptions could have enduring consequences on

formal employment as firms struggle to absorb the shock. Amarjeet Kumar, HAZARIBAGH

New Delhi, May 22: It was a degraded land with construction debris, tall grasses and a neglected wetland. A decade later, the Thematic Botanic Garden in Greater Noida is a biodiversity haven with birds, insect life and 3,000 plants, right from high altitude 'rudraksh' trees to cacti usually found in arid deserts.

Spread across 10 acres near the eastern boundary of the Shiv Nadar Institute of Excellence (IoE) campus, the garden is now home to 805 species of plants, birds, both resident and seasonal/migratory, insects and also nilgais, wild boars and

"When this university was being built, the idea was to develop a garden where students and faculty can observe variety of plant species, can study them and can, in general, enjoy the environment,' Sanjeev Galande, dean, School of Natural Sciences at the Shiv Nadar IoE, a short drive from the national capital, told PTI.

The eco-restoration is the brainchild of then pro-chancellor Shikhar Malhotra and vice chancellor Rupanjali Ghosh. Assisting them was botanist Jyoti Sharma, who had earlier developed a similar thematic garden in Kerala.

iment of painstakingly converting a rocky site into a living lab. After the debris was removed, a 10-degree slope was created for natural flow of water.

Planting started in February 2015. Sharma travelled to various parts of India and collected vast numbers of plant species, many of them rare and endangered.

These include the barringtonia, baobab (kalpvriksha), Buddha coconut, camphor, chinar, Indian tree of heaven, fern leaf tree, fiddle-leaf fig, kattha, lemon-scented gum, magnolia, mahogany, mahua, red sandalwood, shikakai, reetha, singapore cherry, tea tree and four species of willow.

The result is a phenomenal range that showcases plants found at higher elevation and those from flatlands, almost at sea level, to those from desert areas, all co-existing, albeit in their specially created conditions.

"Many plants were procured from horticultural gardens across the country. Some others came from specific areas of the country. Prof Sharma physically went and brought them here. He and his team studied the plants and their habitat. recreated them here so that those plants can thrive, Galande recalled.

Once the shrubs were old and sturdy enough, they were planted in designated areas.

Ten years on, the plants are now all grown up, some as high as 20 feet.

The team put to test their scientific knowledge of botany, did plant habitat analysis, studied the ecology of the space and used all of that together here to recreate this environment for different thematic areas,' Galande added.

The 12 theme gardens has plants belonging to 475 species.

The themes include those on medicinal plants, ferns and fern-allies, rare, endangered and threatened (RET) plants, aquatic plants, spices, condiments and herbs.

For instance, one stretch has 108 xerophytic plant species that have adapted to life in dry

habitat. The university stands on fertile soil with a high water table where one does not expect cacti to grow. So, cacti were grown on a raised area simulating sand dunes and semi-arid zone with rocky out crops.

The complex also provides an opportunity to observe plants becoming rare due to various anthropogenic factors. Like the khirnee, barhal or kaith fruits that were commonly available 30-40 years ago and can no longer be seen.

About one-fourth of the area, all along the boundary, is part of Bil Akbarpur Wetlands, where a natural population of equisetum, commonly known as horse tail or 'saanp ghaas' in Hindi, is conserved.

According to Amit Tripathi, a postdoctoral research associate, equisetum is one of the oldest living genera of vascular plants and is also the sole living representative of a large and ancient group of equisetales, which inhabited the Earth during the Jurassic

Visitors can walk down the equisetum trail to observe the luxurious growth of the tall grass. Another species that dominates the area around the wetland is the thick plantation of willow trees (Salix Babylonica) that has helped change the ambient atmosphere there.

"During summer, it is extremely hot around here. But compared to the other areas of the campus, you will feel at least one degree Celsius difference in temperature in the thematic garden. Further, when you reach the wetland, the temperature difference is at least 2 to 3 degrees Celsius,' Tripathi said.

Hemraj Sharma, a gardener. proudly pointed to the rudraksha tree generally found at high altitudes in the Himalayas.

'When it was a tinv shrub, we kept it under a net, covered with wet cloth, and watered it a lot. As a result of such care in the initial days, we are proud to tell you that it has now grown into a healthy adult tree," he said.

The sprawling acres now a veritable botanical tapestry, an essential green lung amid a concrete jungle, the garden now also serves as a place to carry out botanical experiments and works to spread awareness about different species.

Yamuna water fails to meet quality standards

According to the report by Delhi Pollution Control Committee, the higher concentrations of BOD, COD and fecal coliform indicate severe organic and bacterial contamination

New Delhi, May 22: The latest monthly assessment of the Yamuna river at most places in the national capital fails to meet basic water quality standards, the Delhi Pollution Control Committee (DPCC) said in

On May 1, water samples were collected from eight monitoring points including -- Palla, Wazirabad, ITO, Nizamuddin, Okhla, and Asgarpur -- which showed high concentrations of biochemical oxygen demand (BOD), chemical oxygen demand (COD) and fecal coliform,

According to the report, the higher concentration of BOD, COD and fecal coliform indicate severe organic and bacterial contamination.

The committee said BOD which reflects the amount of oxygen needed by bacteria to break down organic matter in water, were recorded at extremely high levels ranging from 4.0 milligrams per litre at Palla to 64.0 milligrams per litre downstream at Okhla

The permissible BOD level for Class 'C' water (designated for outdoor bathing) is only 3 milligrams per litre.

It said that COD levels, which indicate the presence of oxidisable pollutants, peaked at 171 milligrams per litre at ITO Bridge -- above the acceptable limit of 250 milligrams per litre for inland surface waters.

Fecal coliform levels, an indicator of sewage contamination, at the ITO Bridge reached 92,000 most probable number of microorganisms per 100 millilitres of a sample -- nearly 37 times the maximum permissible limit of 2,500 MPN/100ml.

Elevated coliform levels were also logged at all other downstream points, pointing to widespread sewage discharge and untreated waste entering the river, the report added.

NGT raps Delhi Jal Board for supplying sewage mixed drinking water

he National Green Tribunal has pulled up Delhi Jal Board for supplying non-potable water to Janakpuri residents in the capital. Households in the area were allegedly supplied sewage-mixed drinking water. In an order May 14 a bench of NGT Chairperson Justice Prakash Shrivastava said, "Supply of drinking water which is unfit to the residents of the city is very serious matter but ignoring such a seriousness the DJB has not taken expeditious action to remediate it and the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) has not done the needful to get the water sample report expeditiously in terms of the previous order of the tribunal. The bench also comprising judicial members Justices Sudhir Agarwal and Arun Kumar Tyagi, and expert member Afroz Ahmad, directed the CPCB to collect water samples from the area and file a fresh report. The tribunal specified that the samples had to be collected from 10 new and old locations each without informing any authority, including DJB, and that the samples had to be analysed expeditiously, particularly for faecal coliform and E. coli bacteria A resident welfare association from the area moved the green body and claimed corroded water supply pipelines led to the mixing of untreated sewage with the drinking water. During the proceedings, the applicant's counsel said the residents were suffering after consuming the contaminated water, and one of the residents was hospitalised

Ammonical nitrogen, a mark er of domestic and industrial waste-water, was also found to be in excess, with levels rising up to 5.75 milligrams per litre at Nizamuddin Bridge. The safe threshold for this parameter is typically below 1 milligrams

Mandoli Jail transforms into agricultural hub

The inmates have already harvested over 310 kilograms of organic fruits and vegetables for internal consumption

New Delhi, May 22: In a bid to cut jail expenses, promote sustainability and impart vocational skills, around 1.5 acres of unused land inside Mandoli Jail has been transformed into a thriving agricultural zone under the 'Sashakt Krishi' project.

The inmates have already harvested over 310 kilograms of organic fruits and vegetables for internal consumption.

The project, launched in jail number 13 of Mandoli complex, is currently in its first phase and employs 25 inmates, who have been selected based on physical fitness, willingness and good conduct.

The initiative aims to engage prisoners in productive, skillbased activity while also reducing the facility's dependence on external food procurement.

"Seasonal and regionally appropriate crops were chosen in consultation with horticulture experts and the Agricultural Department," said a senior jail official, adding that vegetables like bottle gourd, cucumber, okra (lady finger), bitter melon and fruits such as custard apple, muskmelon and banana are being grown.

Herbs like mint, coriander and green chili — commonly



used in jail kitchens — have also been cultivated. The official said that farming efforts have already made a visible impact.

"About 150 kg of kitchen waste has been converted into compost and used in cultivation. This initiative not only cuts costs but also supports sustainable waste management," he added.

In the upcoming second phase, authorities plan to ex-

pand cultivation by 30 to 40 per cent and introduce vermicomposting (a natural process whereby earthworms convert waste material with rigid structures into compost) using red worms. There are also plans to plant more fruit-bearing trees, including guava, lemon and mango.

A vocational training component in horticulture in partnership with the Skill India Mission will also be integrated to enhance post-release employability of inmates.

The third phase will focus on converting jail number 13 into a model unit for 'green jail' practices. The plans include developing a 'Krishi Van' or green belt within unused jail yards and setting up an inmate-run nursery for plant saplings, which could potentially be sold to the public.

"We aim to replicate this model in other units of Mandoli Jail, with trained inmates from jail number 13 acting as facilitators," the official added.

The project also had a positive psychological effect on inmates, with officials noting improved mood, better sleep and reduced stress among participants.

"Word is spreading and more inmates are expressing interest in joining the initiative,' he said.

Besides supplementing jail meals and enhancing nutritional value, the project has added aesthetic value to the jail environment, the official said.

The initiative was conceptualised and implemented by Jail Number 13 Superintendent Ashish Kumar under Director General (Prison) Satish Golccha's guidance.

Drive to remove illegal encroachments in Delhi

New Delhi: The Delhi Traffic Police conducted a three-day special drive from May 19 to 21 across the New Delhi Range to remove illegal encroachments and ease congestion, officials said Thursday. The massive crackdown targeted key traffic corridors including Arjun Path, Old Delhi-Gurugram Road, Mahipalpur Market, Sarojini Nagar Market and South Campus Ring Road, they said. The crackdown also



targeted Nelson Mandela Road, RK Puram, Khan Market, Barakhamba Road, Janpath Marg and several other high-footfall areas with heavy vehicular movement during peak hours, officials added. A total of 11,361 challans were issued and 302 vehicles were towed for illegal parking or obstruction. Legal action under appropriate sections of law was initiated against the violators, the traffic police said in a statement. According to officials, the drive was aimed at reclaiming public spaces and ensuring smoother flow of traffic by addressing obstructions such as illegally parked autorickshaws, private taxis, e-rickshaws, and street vendors (rehri-partis), which were narrowing roadways and obstructing pedestrian movement.

Punjab & Haryana HC receives bomb threat

Chandigarh: The Punjab and Haryana High Court Thursday received a bomb threat e-mail, prompting the Chandigarh Police to launch a search of the court premises, officials said. Most parts the court complex have been evacuated and public entry has been restricted for the time-being, they said.

3 die consuming liquor in Ludhiana

Pahalgam, May 22: A month after the deadly terror attack on tourists in Pahalgam, locals in the south Kashmir resort town stare at mounting livelihood losses, even as the perpetrators have managed to evade the massive crackdown launched by security forces to track them down.

The locals have now pinned their hopes on the upcoming Amarnath Yatra to undo some of the damage done to their livelihood. While several top terrorists have been killed in various operations launched after the deadly April 22 attack at Baisaran meadows, the terrorists who carried out the massacre have eluded the security forces, officials said Thursday.

Terrorists descended on the picturesque Baisaran meadows of Pahalgam April 22 and shot dead 25 tourists and a local man who tried to save them. Though the exact number of terrorists who carried out the attack is not known, sources

have said there were between four and six terrorists.

Preliminary investigations have revealed that the terrorists shot the victims after verifying their religion by asking them to recite the "kalma", the verse recited to profess Islamic faith. The officials said the secu-

rity forces were conducting relentless operations to track down the terrorists. "They have managed to evade the security forces thus

far but it won't be too long before we get them," a senior police officer said. Thousands of suspects across Kashmir were called in for questioning while hundreds

'The place looks desolate. We used to have thousands of tourists on any given day in Pahalgam, providing livelihood opportunities for everyone shopkeepers, roadside vendors. ponywallahs, cab drivers and noteliers," said tour operator Nasir Ahmad

He said Pahalgam had not worn such a deserted look even at the peak of the early 1990s' insurgency.

"We used to host local visitors (Kashmiris) and that sustained the economy at the worst of times. However, this time, even local visitors are not coming," he said.

Mohammad Irshad, a shopkeeper, said the situation for those earning a livelihood from tourism had started to turn desperate. The locals are now hoping the Amarnath Yatra, scheduled to begin July 3, would bring about a change in their fortunes

'We are hopeful that the Amarnath pilgrims will help change the perception about Pahalgam. cident that took place but it is not what Kashmir is all about. We are hospitable people and highly value our guests," said Sabzar Ahmad, a ponywallah.

As security is always foolproof during the yatra period, the regular Hindu devotees may finally break the trend and arrive for the pilgrimage, he said.

"The arrangements for the yatra are always of the highest order and the locals have played their role in facilitating the pilgrims. We will do it again this year," he added.

Cong slams Modi over silence on Trump claims

New Delhi, May 22: The Congress Thursday alleged that the diplomatic delegations being sent abroad were part of the government's "WMD -- weapons of mass distraction" exercise and demanded Prime Minister Narendra Modi call a special session of Parliament and clarify US President Donald Trump's India-Pakistan ceasefire claims.

Congress general secretary in-charge communications Jairam Ramesh also said that instead of throwing out grand sounding but hollow filmy dialogues in public rallies, as he did in Bikaner Thursday, the Prime Minister should answer the serious questions being asked of him.

'Why are the brutal killers of Pahalgam still free -- accord ing to some reports, they had been responsible for three earlier terror attacks in Poonch. Gagangir and Gulmarg over the past 18 months. Why have you not chaired any all-party meeting and taken the opposi tion parties into confidence?" Ramesh said in a post on X.

He also questioned why the prime minister had not called a special session of Parliament to reiterate the unanimously-passed resolution of February 22, 1994, and update it, given the deep China-Pakistan nexus evident during Operation Sindoor. "Why have you stubbornly remained silent

on the repeated claims being made by President Trump and US Secretary of State Rubio on the US role over the past two weeks especially?' Ramesh asked.

Speaking with PTI, the Con-

gress general secretary cited news reports that the terrorists responsible for the Pahalgam massacre were also involved in three earlier terror attacks in Jammu and Kashmir and said there should be a clarification from the government if this was true as it would make their being at large even more serious. "The continued refusal of the Prime Minister to call a session of Parliament and meanwhile send a delegation of 50 MPs to different countries... is all domestic optics and meaningless," Ramesh said.

These delegations are "meaningless optical exercises", he added. "India and Pakistan have

WMDs (weapons of mass destruction). India has one more class of WMD that Pakistan does not have -- weapon of mass distraction. The sending of these delegations is part of the WMD exercise," Ramesh said in a swipe at Modi.

With Trump repeating his claim that he settled the military conflict between India and Pakistan through the promise of trade, the Congress also said Modi had not rejected these statements even once and asked the reason behind this "thundering silence".

Ch'garh: CoBRA commando, Naxalite killed in encounter

Commando Solanki hailed from Guiarat, According to the officials, the forces are in the area and the operation is underway. Three other Co-BRA troops were injured in the gun battle, the officials said. They said an IAF helicopter was pressed into service to evacuate the injured, who have been admitted to a hospital in Raipur. They are out of danger.

A male Naxalite was neu tralised in the exchange of fire and a weapon was recovered His identity is yet to be ascer tained, they said. The officials earlier said the operation was underway in Sukma district.

UAE, Japan express solidarity with India in war against terror

A statement issued by the Indian Embassy in Japan quoted Iwaya telling the multi-party delegation led by Jha that terrorism cannot be justified in any form and expressed solidarity with India and with the world in the fight against terrorism.





In its chargesheet, the CBI has named Malik and his two aides Virender Rana and Kanwar Singh Rana, the offi-

The other persons named in the chargesheet included the then Chenab Valley Power Projects Pvt Ltd (CVPPPL) managing director M S Babu, its directors Arun Kumar Mishra and M K Mittal, managing director of construction firm Patel Engineering Ltd Rupen Patel and private person Kanwaljeet Singh Duggal, they said.

The CBI had conducted searches at the premises of Malik and others in connection with the case in February last year.

The case pertains to the alleged malpractices in the award of the contract worth about ₹2.200 crore of civil works of the Kiru Hydro Electric Power (HEP) Project to a private company in 2019, the CBI had said after the registration of the FIR in 2022.

Malik, who was the governor of Jammu and Kashmir from August 23, 2018 to October 30, 2019, had claimed that he was offered a ₹300-crore bribe for clearing two files, including the one pertaining to the project.

Malik said his residence was raided by the CBI instead of investigating the people he had complained about and who were involved in corruption. "They will not get anything

except 4-5 kurtas and pyjamas. The dictator is trying to scare me by misusing government agencies. I am a farmer's son, I will neither be afraid nor bow down," he had posted online. The central agency had filed

SC reserves interim orders in waqf case

New Delhi, May 22: Reiterating its observation on the presumption of constitutionality in favour of the law, the Supreme Court Thursday reserved interim orders on three kev issues after hearing both sides in the waqf case.

One of the issues relate to the power to denotify properties declared as "waqf by courts, waqf-by-user or waqf by deed" prescribed in Waqf (Amendment) Act, 2025

Before reserving the interim order, a bench comprising Chief Justice B R Gavai and Justice Augustine George Masih heard senior advocates including Kapil Sibal, Rajeev Dhavan, Abhishek Singhvi and Huzefa Ahmadi for those challenging the amended waqf law and Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, representing the Centre, on three consecutive days

On the last day, the CJI said, "I have already said that there is a presumption of constitutionality." On May 20, the CJI noted the same and said, "For interim relief, you have

to make out a very strong and glaring case. Otherwise, presumption of constitutionality

The bench previously identified the three issues, on which a stay was sought by the petitioners, for passing interim orders. Apart from the issue of de-

notification, petitioners have raised questions over the composition of state waqf boards and the Central Waqf Council, where they contend only Muslims should operate except ex-officio members.

The third issue relates to a provision that says a waqf property will not be treated as a waqf when the collector conducts an inquiry to ascertain if the property is government

Moreover, though waqf was an Islamic concept, it was not an essential part of Islam, it added. Sibal, leading the petitioners, described the law as a "complete departure from historical legal and constitutional principles" and a means to "capture waqf through a non-judicial process'

Highlighting the tribal land exclusion clause under the law, he said Scheduled Tribes in scheduled areas were a constitutionally protected class, and the amendment respected that status. The bench asked whether a religious identity could override cultural protections especially if waqf properties were created on tribal land.



High Court judge Martin Chamberlain said after a hearing Thursday that an injunction barring the handover should be removed. He said "the public interest and the interests of the United Kingdom would be substantially prejudiced" if there was a further

The UK government welcomed the ruling, saying "this deal is vital to protect the British people and our national

The UK has agreed to hand Mauritius the Indian Ocean archipelago, which is home to a strategically important naval and bomber base on the largest of the islands, Diego Garcia. The UK would then lease back the base for at least 99 years.



The agreement was due to be signed by British Prime Minister Keir Starmer and Mauritian leader Navin Ramgoolam at a virtual ceremony Thursday morning.

But a judge granted an injunction in the early hours of Thursday, blocking the British government from taking any "conclusive or legally binding step" to hand the islands to a foreign government.

One of the last remnants of the British Empire, the Chagos Islands have been under British control since 1814. Britain split the islands away from Mauritius, a former British colony, in 1965, three years before Mauritius gained independence.

Britain evicted as many as 2,000 people from the islands in the 1960s and 1970s so the US military could build the Diego Garcia base, which has supported US military operations from Vietnam to Iraq and Afghanistan.

Beijing, May 22: Talks to resolve border issue with India and Bhutan "continue to advance", a new white paper on China's national security has said, identifying a host of internal and external threats faced by the country and its one-party political system.

The 23-page security paper released recently in Mandarin has outlined a host of threats and challenges faced by China.

China has settled boundary issues with 12 of its 14 land neighbours and the negotiations with India and Bhutan continue to advance to resolve the border disputes, said the white paper titled 'China's Na tional Security in the New Era'.

Beijing has completed the demarcation of the Beibu Gulf waters between China and Vietnam, signed border defence cooperation agreements with nine neighbouring countries. established border defence talks and meetings mechanisms with 12 countries, and regularly carried out friendly visits. working talks, joint patrols, and joint cross-border crime drills, the paper said.

While China's border disputes with India and Bhutan remain to be resolved, the country has a maritime dispute with several countries, including Japan in the East China Sea, and the Philippines, Vietnam, Malaysia, Brunei and Taiwan

The most fundamental thing is to maintain the leadership and ruling status of the CPC and maintain the socialist system with Chinese characteristics.

If political security is not guaranteed. China will inevitably fall into a fragmented and scattered situation, the great rejuvenation of the Chinese nation will be out of the question, and the fundamental and long-term interests of the people will not be guaranteed, it said.

It is necessary to enhance political sensitivity and political discernment, eliminate various political risks in a timely manner, and prevent non-political risks from spreading into political risks, it said

Any attempt to separate the Communist Party from the people and to set them against each other will never succeed.

Equal treatment for Indian firms in public procurement

This marks a historical trade deal as, UK has agreed to treat Indian firms equally in its public procurement. It indeed is a big achievement because trade and equality came together after ages

New Delhi, May 22: UK for the first time has agreed to accord non-discriminatory treatment to Indian companies in its public procurement system under the free trade agreement (FTA) between the two countries, an official said.

On May 6, the two announced conclusion of negotiations for the FTA. It will be implemented next year.

"For the first time, UK agreed to take binding commitment to provide non-discriminatory treatment to our suppliers under UK's Social Value regime in their public procurement system," the official said.

Under the UK's Social Value law, the British government departments require public authorities to have regard to economic, social and environmental well-being in connection with public services contracts.

According to the UK government, the trade pact will give UK businesses "unique and un-

precedented" access to India's public procurement market, comprising about 40,000 tenders with a value of at least 38 billion pounds a year.

On the other hand, India has agreed to allow British companies to participate in public procurements only in the non-sensitive sectors.

The UK firms, however, will not be allowed to participate in procurements by state government entities and local bodies. "UK-based suppliers would

be allowed to bid for domestic tenders above the agreed thresholds (above ₹200 crore) as deemed Class II local suppliers under public procurement. Carve out is also provided

for India's 'Make in India policy' as well as medium and small enterprises. Earlier, India opened the

government procurement segment in the comprehensive trade pact with the UAE. Under that pact, UAE firms are

allowed to participate in procurement tenders worth over

In 2020, the government modified public procurement norms to give maximum preference to companies whose goods and services have 50 per cent or more local content to promote 'Make in India'.

The revised Public Procurement (Preference to Make in India), Order 2017, has introduced a concept of Class-I, II and non-local suppliers, based on which they will get preference in government purchases of goods and services

Class-I local suppliers will get the most preference in all government purchases because their domestic value addition is 50 per cent or more. They will be followed by Class-II suppliers, whose value addition range is more than 20 per cent but less than 50 per cent.

India's government procurement market is one of the largest in the world and it is estimated at nearly USD 600 billion annually, or approximately 15 per cent of the country's GDP, as per estimates.

This expenditure fuels development across infrastructure, healthcare, power, education, transport, and defence. India emerging as 'key connector' amid global cues

Mumbai, May 22: India's economy remains resilient amid global uncertainties and the outlook for the South Asian nation is one of "cautious optimism", the country's central bank said in its monthly bulletin released late Wednesday.

New Delhi is in the process of seeking to clinch a trade deal with US within the 90-day pause on tariff hikes announced by President Donald Trump on April 9 for major trading partners, including a 26% tariff on

"The global economic outlook remains clouded amidst shifting policy landscapes and lingering vulnerabilities," the central bank said.

"India stands well-positioned to navigate the ongoing global headwinds with confidence ready to harness emerging opportunities and consolidate its role as a key driver of global growth.

In April, the RBI lowered its key policy rate for a second consecutive time, and signalled more cuts by changing its monetary policy stance to 'accommodative' from 'neutral'.

Inflation pressures have eased significantly and the consumer price index is poised for a durable alignment with the target in 2025-26, the RBI said in the bulletin.

India's retail inflation remained below the central bank's 4% target for the third consecutive month in April, slipping to 3.16%, the lowest level since July 2019. "While policy uncertainty

SHIFTING OIL DEMAND: INDIA OVERTAKES CHINA

New Delhi, May 22: China drove global oil demand growth over the last decade, but now India is poised to take the lead in demand growth over the next decade, according to a latest report by Moody's Ratings.

China and India are No. 2 and No.3 oil consumers in the world. But there are notable differences in demand growth in the two

'Demand growth and import reliance will be higher in India." Moody's said. "Demand will grow faster in India than in China over the next decade, as China's economic growth slows and penetration of new energy vehicles accelerates.

Consumption of crude oil, the raw material for making fuels like petrol and diesel- in China will peak in the next 3-5 years, while in India Moody's expect annual growth of 3-5 per cent in the same period.

Stating that both countries rely heavily on oil and gas imports, the rating agency said it expects China's reliance on oil imports to fall, reflecting slower demand growth and increased domestic production.

Investments in complex shale

gas and offshore projects bolster Chinese NOCs' reserves and production, while Indian NOCs face challenges from aging wells and slow investment. Additionally, Chinese NOCs' greater value chain integration mitigates earnings volatility, and they have lower leverage and higher interest coverage. Moody's saw investment focus varv, reflecting national objectives "Chinese NOCs continue to

invest heavily in exploration and development to enhance self-sufficiency. Their investments in the downstream refining and petrochemical sectors will gradually decline over the next 3-5 years as most major projects have been completed. By contrast, NOCs in India will still invest heavily to expand refining and petrochemical facilities over the next five years to meet growing domestic demand," it said.

"Indian NOCs plan to boost domestic oil and gas production but execution remains to be seen," it added.

Government policies in China are more market-oriented, it said, adding that policies in both countries are aimed at maintaining price stability and adequate supply.

Ease in Index trading: ICRA

New Delhi, May 22: Trading activity in index derivatives and options is showing signs of stabilisation, after three consecutive months of decline triggered by regulatory interventions, rating agency ICRA said Thursday.

This stabilisation in index


derivatives and options volumes reflects "strategic recalibrations by market participants", ICRA said in a report. Although margin trading facility (MTF) exposures have

retracted closer to ₹71,000 crore from their December 2024 peak, given their strong correlation with market trends, resurgence in investor confidence could drive the trajectory back towards the ₹1 lakh crore mark, the rating agency said. The phased implementation of

regulatory measures, beginning November 2024, led to a sharp contraction of trading activity in index options. Between December 2024 and

March 2025, the average daily premium turnover had declined by 18 per cent compared to the April-November 2024 period, while the number of options con-

tracts traded fell by 60 per cent. Moreover, order volumes, critical for F&O brokerage, were moderately impacted (down 25-



this, rating agency noted that trading activity remains above historical levels.

In terms of financial performance, securities brokerage houses have observed the impact of reduced trading activity.

In Q4 FY2025, ICRA's sample of nine securities broking firms reported a 19 per cent year-onyear decrease in net revenue and a fall in profitability to 26 per cent, the lowest level in the past 12 quarters.

The report highlighted that "after three consecutive months of declining options volumes. trading activity appears to be stabilising, reflecting strategic recalibrations by market participants. The anticipated uptake of the MSEI-SX40 weekly index options could also help cushion

However, the rating agency warned that overall activity remains highly sensitive to future regulatory developments.

Adjustments in lot sizes and the rationalisation of weekly expiries have shifted trading towards longer-tenure contracts. These changes have notably reduced participation from smaller investors, Deep Inder Singh, Vice President and Sector Head Financial Sector Ratings, ICRA, said. In March 2025, the number of investors with a monthly premium turnover below ₹10,000 on the NSE dropped by 49 per cent YoY, while those in the ₹10,000-Rs 1 lakh crore declined by 37 per cent. The investor count with higher monthly premium turnovers was however less impacted, he added.

growth engine with the industry's PMI jumping to a 14-month high of 61.2 from 58.7. The manufacturing output index held mostly steady at 58.3, maintaining growth momentum.

private sector registered the fastest rate of increase in new orders since April last year with exports at a one-year high.

Businesses remained optimistic on the outlook for the coming year, anticipating healthy demand to support future sales and output.

That allowed companies to recruit additional staff to manage workloads. Employment generation continued its upward trend, reaching a record high since the survey began in December 2005.

"Notably, there is a firm pick-up in the employment, especially in the service sector, suggesting healthy job creation accompanies the expansion of both India's manufacturing and service sectors," Bhandari said.

However, the survey also highlighted escalating infla-

inflation across the private sec tor hit a five-month high, while prices charged for Indian goods and services rose at the fastest pace since November

Manufacturing output prices, in particular, increased at the steepest since late-2013, with firms saying they were able to pass on rising expenses to clients due to strong demand.

Tottenham beat Manchester **United 1-0 for Europa League title and end** long trophy drought

Bilbao, May 22: Tottenham's title drought is finally over.

Spurs beat Manchester United 1-0 to win the Europa League final and lift its first European trophy in more than four decades Wednesday.

It is the first major title for Tottenham since it won the English League Cup in 2008, and first European triumph since it won its second UEFA Cup the equivalent of the Europa League now — in 1984

Brennan Johnson squeezed in the winner at the end of the first half to help Spurs salvage a dismal season in which it will finish near the bottom of the Premier League standings.

"This is what it's all about," Johnson said. "This club hasn't won a trophy for 17 years. This is what it means, it means so much. Ever since I came here it's been, Tottenham are a good team but can never get it done.' We got it done.

The title guarantees Spurs a spot in next season's Champions League, and brings some much-needed relief for manager Ange Postecoglou after he struggled to keep his team on track all year. The victory in Europe's sec-

ond-tier competition comes six years after Tottenham fell short against Liverpool in the Champions League final. Tottenham finished its Eu-

ropa League campaign with 10 wins, three draws and two

No team has won more games in the UEFA Cup-Europa League than Tottenham, accord-

ing to UEFA. Its 98th victory in the competition Wednesday moves it clear of the joint record of 97 it previously held with Roma. Govt revamps funding norms for federations

New Delhi, May 22: In a significant step toward bolstering India's ambitions of becoming a global sporting superpower and potential host of the 2036 Olympic Games, the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports has unveiled revised norms under the Scheme of Assistance to National Sports Federations

This overhaul — the first since February 2022 — aligns with the new Olympic cycle post-Paris 2024 and addresses the growing needs and challenges in India's sports land-

Reflecting the rising cost of training, infrastructure, equipment, and athlete welfare, the revised norms promise en hanced financial aid across key areas. National Championships will now receive increased support, with High Priority sports eligible for ₹90 lakh and Prior ity sports for ₹75 lakh — a sig nificant leap from the earlier ceiling of ₹51 lakh. The budget for hosting international tournaments in India has also doubled, with federations now able to access up to ₹2 crore.

Coaches, often considered the backbone of an athlete's journey, will now see a considerable hike in remuneration Chief national coaches will be entitled to monthly salaries of ₹7.5 lakh, up from ₹5 lakh, while other coaches will see a rise from ₹2 lakh to ₹3 lakh.

In parallel, dietary charges for athletes have also seen a steep hike. Senior athletes will now receive ₹1000 per day, and juniors ₹850 — up from ₹690 and ₹480, respectively.


